The "Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications," revised and published as of January 2, 1957, prepared and released by the Committee on Un-American Activities, United States House of Representatives, Washington, D.C., contains the following concerning the National Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell in the Rosenberg Case:

Pollowing the execution of atomic spies "1. ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG in June 1953, the 'Communist campaign assumed a different emphasis. Its major effort centered upon MORTON SOBELL.' the ROSENBERGS' codefendant. The National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case -- a Communist front which had been conducting the campaign in the United States -- was reconstituted as the National Rosenberg-Sobell Committee at a conference in Chicago in October 1953 and 'then as the National Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell in the Rosenberg Case.' National headquarters remained at 1050 oth Avenue, New York City. Co-chairmen of the newest organization were DANIEL MARSHALL and JOSEPH BRAININ. On 10/25/59, HELEN SOBELL was interviewed on the DAN LUNDBERG TV Show, Channel 13, KCOP, Los Angeles. Topic of the program was "Should Prisoners be Allowed Connubial Visits?"

SOBELL gave an approximately two-minute summary of her husband's trial and conviction, stating she believed he was convicted because of the war hysteria at the time, and stated she knew him to be innocent.

topic, stating she believed communial visits would be good from the point of view of rehabilitation and the fact that prisoners are still people. SOBELL stated she was interested in having a child by her husband, however, she was speaking on the program for all prisoners.

Corrections; Dr. CHARLES B. STONE, Psychiatrist; J. MILLER LEVY, Deputy District Attorney of Los Angeles County; and A. L. WIRIN, American Civil Liberties Union Attorney.

A. L. WIRIN attempted to question SOHELL further about her husband's case, however, LUNDBERG objected, and the questions were thereafter concerning connubial visits. The program was sponsored by the COPLEY newspapers of Los Angeles, directed by JEAN BREHME, produced by DAVE WYNE.

On 10/28/59, a taped interview of HELEN SOBELL was presented on the Channel 7, KABC-TV, news program of LEW IRWIN at 11 p.m. IRWIN announced he was giving Mrs. MORTON SOBELL a chance to tell her side of one of the nation's controversial issues. IRWIN stated he had reported last night on some of the things he had learned about SOBELL and had reported SOBELL was never accused either of spying or of having anything to do with atomic secrets.

HELEN SOBELL then appeared on a TV monitor and stated her husband had been convicted by an atmosphere of McCarthyism and by mistakes made by the prosecution and the FBI," that he was actually brutally kidnaped, which resulted in his prosecution. She stated the government wanted SOBELL as a prosecution witness and when he maintained his innocence and did not give testimony without knowledge, only then was he indicted, together with ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENBERG, in spite of the fact that there never was established any connection between her husband and espionage for the ROSENBERGS.

IRWIN asked who did the kidnaping and Mrs. SOBELL stated "we" learned later through investigation that the kidnaping had actually been arranged by "our PBI and ROY COHN" and was carried out by Mexico City Police without the sanction of the Mexican government.

IRWIN then commented he didnot want to see a traitor free but he did want to see innocent men free

and quoted Professor MALCOLM SHARP, University of Chicago Law School, who stated a 30-year sentence was unwarranted.

IRWIN thanked those who telephoned about his program the previous night, stating "it helps,"



## Morton Sobell

Julius and Ethel Rosenberg and Morton Sobell were convicted in United States District Court, Southern District of New York, on March 29, 1951, on a charge of conspiracy to commit espionage on behalf of the Soviet Union. The Rosenbergs were sentenced to death on April 5, 1951, and Morton Sobell was sentenced to 30 years imprisonment on the same date. Julius and Ethel Rosenberg were legally executed at Sing Sing Prison, Ossining,

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New York, on June 19, 1953; and Morton Sobell is currently serving his sentence at the United States Penitentiary, Atlanta, Georgia.

The first leaflet is in the form of a letter from the Rev. Peter Mc Cormack, San Francisco, California, Former Protestant Chaplain at Alcatraz. According to this leaflet the Rev. Mc Cormack, through his association with Morton Sobell while at Alcatraz and a studied investigation of Sobell's case had become convinced that Sobell is innocent.

The leaflet concludes as follows:

"I am satisfied if the clergy of this land, whose mission it is to "seek justice and judgment" would acquaint themselves with this case, the relentless pressure of that segment of public opinion would compel our courts to re-open the case, freeing it from perjury, politics and prejudice, and in the light of honor and truth restore Morton Sobell to his rightful place as an American citizen, a man vindicated by the weight of public opinion and the justice and honor that we are entitled to expect to emanate from the courts of our land.

"Sincerely yours
"Rev Peter Mc Cormack."

The bottom of this leaflet contains a mimeographed handwritten statement which reads as follows:

"Please read this testimony to Morton Sobell from his Chaplain at Alcatraz. We must match his courage with our courage until justice is granted. Will you join the twenty-five of us who are asking for Presidential clemency?

"Urgently, Alva Tompkins."

The second leaflet is captioned "Appeal To The President On Behalf of Morton Sobell" and is addressed to "President Dwight D. Bisenhower, The White House, Washington, D. C."

This leaflet contains the mimeographed signatures of 24 Ministers, Rabbis, and Professors in the Chicago area and requests the President to advance the cause of justice and mercy by granting Morton Sobell clemency by commutation of his sentence. The bottom of this leaflet contains a space for a person who agrees to join in the appeal to place his name and address and indicate whether or not his name may be made public.

#### Rev. Alva Tompkins

A source advised on April 9, 1959, that the Rev. Alva Tompkins as of April, 1959, was chairman of the American Forum for Socialist Education in Chicago.

# AMERICAN FORUM FOR SOCIALIST EDUCATION, Also known as American Forum



According to an article appearing in the May, 13, 1957 issue of the "Dail Worker", page 1, column 2, A. J. MUSTE, "well known pacifist", announced the formation of the American Forum for Socialist Education (AFSE). Ecording to this article, the American Forum seeks to promote "study and serious untrammeled political discussions among all elements that think of themselves as related to historic socialist and labor traditions, values and objectives. ..however, deep and bitter their differences may have been."

This article reflects that a forty member national committee had been established and, according to MUSTE, these persons serve as individuals and not as delegated representatives of any group.

MUSTE, according to this article, stated that the American Forum is not a membership organization and does not propose to promote united action by various parties or groups, mergers or new organizations.

The article reflects that among other purposes, the AFSE seeks to call attention to the various publications of the groups whose people engage in discussion; to publish bulletins or pamphlets; to organize regional and national conferences; contribute to the building of new morale and ethic, a spirit of fair play, labor militancy, determination and hope among the progressive and radical forces in this country.

The "Daily Worker" is an East Coast Communist daily newspaper which suspended operation on January 13, 1958.



TOMPKINS stated that while the AFSE originated in New York, that no guidance or control has ever! been exercised by the AFSE in New York over the AFSE in Chicago; however, the AFSE in Chicago has been guided by the Precepts of the New York group.

TOMPKINS stated that the AFSE is a broad forum which includes on its executive committee such persons as FRED FINE, HOWARD MAYHEW, JACK SPIEGEL, and FRANK FRIED.

According to a source, FRED PINE is a former member of the National Committee. Communist Party, USA (CP)

According to a second source, HOWARD MATHEW in July of 1959, was a member of the National Committee of the Socialist Workers Party (SWP).

According to a third source, JACK SPIEGEL was a member of a shoe worker's group in the Johnstone Section. OF of Illinois, until the latter part of 1955.

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A fourth source advised that FRANK FRIED, until March, 1959, was Chicago Branch Organizer of the American Socialist Clubs. As of July, 1959, he was a member of this organization.

The CP, USA and the SWP have been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order #10450.






## LIGHTOOT DEFENSE COMMITTEE (LDC)

On May 7, 1956, a source advised that the Lightfoot Defense Committee was formed in the fall of 1954 by the Communist Party (CP), for the purpose of publicizing the arrest of CLAUDE MACK LIGHTFOOT, Chairman of the Illinois-Indiana District, CP, USA, under the Smith Act of 1940, and to raise funds for his defense.

The Lightfoot Defense Committee continued to Operate under the direction of the CP until March, 1956, at which time the CP broadened the scope of the organization and formed the Chicago Joint Defense Committee to Defeat the Smith Act (CJDC), thereby dissolving the Lightfoot Defense Committee.

A source advised on May 3, 1957, that the CJDC was formed by the CP in March, 1956. The majority of the current leadership of the CJDC are known current CP members.



The Communist Party, USA has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.



On 11/2/59, BU 253-S\*, who furnishes information concerning activities at the residence of LEWIN and DEIRDRE GRISWOID, Buffalo Branch WWI Organizer and his wife, reported the following:

About 9:00 PM, 11/2/59, IEW GRISWOLD, in conversation with his wife, DEIRDRE, said that SAM BALLAN (WWP-New York) had called him long distance and had referred to riots in the Belgian Congo which occurred on 11/1/59, and which had been mentioned in the 11/2/59, edition of the New York Times. BALLAN told GRISWOLD that he would like to have a demonstration by 25 to 30 WWP members, with banners, in front of the Belgian Consulate in New York City. BALLAN wanted a representative from the Buffalo Branch WWP and suggested their leaving Buffalo early on Frida, 11/6/59, for the demonstration on Saturday, 11/7/59.

On 11/3/59, LEW GRISWID in conversation with his wife in the late evening, related in DEIRDRE that he had received a long distance call from LVELYN HARRUP (phonetic) whom he identified as with the National Committee to Secure Justice for MORTON SOBELL, in New York City. GRISWOLD told his wife that HARRUP had invited him to the meeting of the Eastern Region of the above Committee which would open on 11/7/59, at 10:00 AM in New York City, followed by an afternoon session and a closing session on Sunday, 11/8/59. GRISWOLD said HARRUP offered to pay his traveling expenses and would find a place to stay for him. GRISWOLD told DEIRDRE that he told HARRUP that he would let her know on 11/4/59. GRISWOLD then mentioned that he might be able to work in the Www demonstration with this invitation.



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



Report of a meeting sponsored by the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee (ECLC) on Friday evening 10/16/59, at the Hotel New Yorker.

The chairman for the evening was CORLISS LAMONT. He referred to an article written 2 years ago by the ECLC about the F.B.I. to show that others are now doing what the ECLC had done. He mentioned the story in the Nation magazine about the F.B.I.; the current story about the F.B.I. in the New York Post. He referred to the F.B.I. as a kind of police terror.

The general theme of the meeting centered around the abolition of the House Committee on Un-American Activities (HUAC), the Senate Internal Security Sub-Committee headed by Senator JAMES O. EASTLAND, D. Mississippi.

The speakers, in general, by the tone of their talks, gave the impression that the United States, because of the existence of these committees, has become a a fearful place for those who support the Constitution of the United States and the Bill of Rights, as the speakers said that they do, to live in.

The speakers associated ulterior motives as the reasons for the continuance of the Congressional Investigating Committees. Some of the speakers stated, HERMAN LIVERIGHT for one, that because a person would be for integration in the South that person would then be called before the Eastland Committee.

A film, prior to the beginning of the meeting, was shown on the "Hollywood 10". It lasted about 20 minutes. It highlighted in a favorable manner the position taken by the Hollywood 10 with respect to their appearances before the HUAC.

HARVEY O'CONNOR stated that the United States is a spectacle in the world because 30 individuals exercised their rights in the free world. He had reference to the 30 people now under indictment for Congressional and/or Judicial Contempt.

He stated that these cases could and should be used to abolish inquisition in America.

called for a unified fight among the 1st Amendment victims. He said that a group of 1st Amendment people, who have been cited for contempt, have gotten together to formulate a plan of action, to pool their ideas, and to speak before groups wherever they would be invited.

PAULINE FEUER stated that the HUAC in the name of law robs society of its most valuable members. That the inquisitional committees have an economic life and death over people because she said that individuals lose their jobs as a result of being called before the HUAC. She stated that as a Psychologist she seriously questioned Sen. EASTLAND's sanity. Also, she said, she would rather face prison that her lose her integrity.

DAVIS, who is acting as his own lawyer stated that there is no crime when a Congressional Committee is operating invalidly.

HERMAN LIVERIGHT accused Congressional Investigating Committees as doing their best to vitate exchange of opinions in the democratic process. He also asked that something be done about freeing MORTON SOBELL from prison.

ALFRED SAMTER, Steelworker from Gary, Indiana stated that the HUAC made it clear in their hearings at Gary that they (HUAC) wanted the company to fire those individuals who exercised the 5th and 1st Amendments before the Committee.

FRANK WILKINSON called for political action in order to offset and defeat the dangers brought out by the inquisitional committees. He stated that along with AUBREY WILLIAMS, and JAMES IMBRIE, through political action, they got Cong. JAMES ROOSEVELT from California to introduce a resolution calling for some form of abolition of the HUAC. He told the story of how he and others

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

recently organized at least 100 teachers in California that were slated to appear before the HUAC in California. He said that through political action they had managed to get Congressman WALTER to call off the hearings.

Dr. WILLIARD UPHAUS said that when he was first called by the Attorney - General of New Hampshire to disclose the names of the individuals attending his summer camp, he instinctively knew that the names would have been turned over to the F.B.I. and that the F.B.I. would then visit their neighbors and ask questions about them and, as a result of all this, a suspicious atmosphere would be cast upon them. This, he said, he could not bring himself to do even if it meant spending the rest of his life in jail. He said that he will continue to represent the cause of peace and the Bill of Rights.

When Dr. UPHAUS was called on to speak, he received a standing ovation. It was repeated after his talk.

VICTOR RABINOWITZ stated that the HUAC has placed its stamp on every segment of our life. Also, that the HUAC has been an effective instrument in the cold war. He said that there is no word of comfort in the Berenblatt decision.



O people in attendance.



A source advised on May 6, 1959 that the Los Angeles Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell was formerly known as the Los Angeles Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case and was also referred to as the Los Angeles Rosenberg-Sobell Committee.

The Los Angeles Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case was cited by the Committee on Un-American Activities report dated August 25, 1956, pages 66 and 67, as "A local auxiliary of the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case. 'Next to New York and Washington the area of greatest focus in the Rosenberg campaign was Los Angeles \*\*\* The Los Angeles campaign was under the direction of SOPHIE DAVIDSON, Chairman of the Los Angeles Committee \*\*\*.'"

Source advised that the Los Angeles Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell adopted that name in the fall of 1954. The avowed purpose of this committee is to secure the release of MORTON SOBELL from prison. Both the Los Angeles Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case and the Los Angeles Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell were from their inception dominated and controlled by the Communist party through the assignment of Communist party members to direct the activities of the committees.

Another source advised on July 27, 1953, that SOPHIE DAVIDSON was then a Communist party member.

Another source advised on May 8, 1959 that the Los Angeles Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell is currently active.

Text of remarks by Professor Thomas I. Emerson of the Tale Law School at a public meeting, chaired by Professor Emerson, in behalf of Morton Sobell, Friday, June 19,1959, Webster Hall, New York City.

The reason for our meeting is, of course, the growing conviction that injustice has been done in the trial, conviction and the continuing imprisonment of Morton Sobell. I share that conviction, and I want, at the outset, to give my reasons to you. They will necessarily be quite brief, but I will do what I can in the time available.

First, a few words as to the facts and the background of the case. The bare facts are, I am sure, known to all of us. Morton Sobell was indicted in October, 1950, along with the Rosenbergs and two other conspirators for committing espionage. It was charged that they had transmitted information essential to the security of the United States to a foreign power, namely the Soviet Union.

The trial of the three defendants (two were not included in the trial), the Rosenbergs and Morton Sobell, took place in March, 1951. They were, as you know, convicted. The Rosenbergs were sentenced to death and Morton Sobell was sentenced to 30 years in prison. He served the beginning of that time, and until 1958 in Alcatraz. In 1958 he was transferred to Atlanta.

By way of further background, I think it is important to remember the tense and hysterical atmosphere at the time of the trial and the subsequent appeals. It was February 9, 1950 that Senator McCarthy made his first speech at Wheeling in which he held in his hand a list of 205 members of the Communist Party in the federal government. It was the beginning of the McCarthy campaign.

On June 25, 1950, the Korean War began. In July, 1950, Julius Posenberg was arrested. In August, Ethel Rosenberg was arrested and Morton Sobell was seized in Mexico. In September, 1950, the Congress passed the Internal Security Act, the furthest reaching sedition law that our Congress has ever passed, and the one containing provision for detention camps.

The trial began on March 6, 1951. On March 8, 1951, the Committee to Unamerican Activities opened its famous hearing on Hollywood, the motion picture industry. And so it went on during .

that period. It was hardly a period for calm consideration or reflective judgment. It was, rather, a period of fear-ridden pant, and intemperate action. We are generally, gradually, I think, becoming ashamed of many of the things we did during that time, or allowed others to do.

How I want to state briefly the reasons why I feel that the continued imprisonment of Morton Sobell infringes upon his rights and upon our feelings of justice. First of all, is the matter of the abduction from Mexico. In June of 1950, Morton Sobell went to Mexico with his family, lived in an apartment there under his own name. Fight ofclock one evening, Mexican Secret Service Police in plain clothes entered the apartment, seised Sobell, took him out to a car, where the united States border, and there he was turned over to agents of the United States who were ready and waiting for him.

Clearly, the abduction was instigated and arranged by the FBI; indeed, although they have had an opportunity to deny that, they have not done so. The action was illegal and outrageous. It was an act of a police state, unworthy of the government of the United States. For various legal reasons, it has not constituted a defense in the case. But the fact is that Morton Sobell, by this action, was deprived of the rights as a citizen of a civilized country. It was also prejudicial to his trial, because it precluded the possibility of Sobell returning voluntarily. It was put up to the jury as dramatic indication that Morton Sobell had a guilty conscience and was attempting to flee. For this reason alone, it seems to me, the conviction of Morton Sobell is a tainted one, and the result should not be allowed to stand.

Secondly, there is considerable doubt concerning the evidence in this case. This is a matter on which there are, of course, differences of opinion. But I think this much is certainly a minimum that can be said, and should be said. The entire case against Morton Sobell rested in the end upon the testimony of a single witness, Max Elitcher. Elitcher, who had been a classmate of Sobell, testified about two things: He testified that Sobell had asked him to supply information for transmission to a foreign country and to get others to do so also. And he testified that Sobell had taken to Julius Rosenberg a can of microfilm containing important information. What the information was, was never disclosed.

This is the only direct testimony that linked Sobell with espionage, or with the rest of the alleged conspiracy. Unless this testimony is believed, there is no case, and the courts have made this quite clear. I think a careful reading of the evidence gives one an impression of very doubtful credibility. In the first place, Elitcher was not a reliable or unprejudiced witness. He, and it was known to the government, had committed perjury in signing a government application, and he was subject to prosecution. He was therefore hardly in an independent or secure position so far as his relations with the prosecution were concerned.

There was no testimony that Elitcher gave information to Sobell, or Sobell to Elitcher. And there was no testimony as to what was in the film that was supposed to have been transmitted. Furthermore, the

whole story of the film is a highly implausible one. The story as given by Elitcher, that he once had gone to see Morton Sobell, told him that he was being followed by FBI agents, and that thereupe Sobell had taken the can of film and, along with Elitcher, had gone, and while Elitcher waited in the car, delivered it to Julius Rosenber It is utterly fantastic to suppose that upon being notified that Elitcher was being followed by the FBI, Sobell would have seised that perticular occasion upon which to deliver the film to Rosenberg.

That is the testimony. It is, I submit, rather difficult to believe. There was also other testimony with regard to trips made by Sobell from Maxico City to other cities in Mexico in which he made inquiries about a trip to other countries. This was not explained, and Morton Sobell did not take the stand. It is evidence, perhaps, of his intention to leave the United States, but it is, of course, entirely collateral and circumstantial, and without Elitcher's testimony, it comes to nothing in itself.

One cannot, therefore, escape the feeling that the jury's decision reflected the hysteria and pressures of the time more than a rational weighing of the evidence before it.

My third reason is the fact that Sobell's case was lumped with the atomic conspiracy involving the Rosenbergs. The main case of the government was against the Rosenbergs, and the main part if that case involved the allegations of transmitting information with respect to nuclear weapons to the Soviet Union. There is not a shred of evidence that Sobell was engaged in any conspiracy with respect to atomic weapons of this sort, even if Elitcher is believed. And dragging Sobell into a trial involving the highly-charged and complex problems with respect to the allegations against the Rosenbergs was talculated and did, I think, result only in confusing and inflaming the jury.

A separate and rational consideration of Sobell's case became almost impossible. It was on this ground that Judge Jerome Frank, in the Court of Appeals, dissented from the majority opinion. He felt that because the Sobell case had been combined with the atomic conspiracy case, Sobell had been given an unfair trial, and that the case, as to him, should have been reversed. With this I agree.

The fourth issue I want to raise is the question of the severity of the sentence. On the facts proved, and assuming they were true, a sentence of 30 years seems all out of proportion to the gravity of the offense. It will be remembered that Dr. Klaus Fuchs pleaded guilty to major atomic espionage and was given 14 years sentence, and is about to be released from jail. This, of course, was in England. Allen Nunn May, also in England, was given a sentence of 10 years, of which he served 6 years and 8 months. David Greenglass, who was obviously much further involved on his own and the government's testimony, was given 15 years. Mrs. Greenglass was not indicted at all. It seems to me that the harshness of the sentence, which I believe to be also a product of the tensions of the period, should now be rectified.

(Applause.)

Finally, there is the matter of the confinement to Alcatras. Until last year, some 52 years, Sobell was imprisoned in Alcatras. This action, it seems to me, was clearly windictive and victous. Alcatraz is a prison for so-called incorrigibles. It is a grim and inhuman place. There is probably no justification for Alcatras itsel but there is certainly no justification for sending Morton Sobell. there. Five and a half years in Alcatras is enough penalty for any man, in my judgment, regardless of his crime. Instead of sending him to Atlanta, Sobell should have been released. (Applause.)

then, are my reasons for feeling that injustice has been done to Morton Sobell: the abduction from Mexico, the flimsy nature of the evidence against him, the mingling of his case with the atomic conspiracy, the severity of the sentence, the cruelty of Alcatras.

As I said at the beginning, a growing number of people have reached the same conclusion that I have put forward to you now. Commencing with Dr. Harold Urey, Nobel Prize winner, and Professor Malcolm Sharp of Chicago, these people include such well-known Americans as Senator Langer, Reinhold Niebuhr, Waldo Frank, Carlton Beals, Roland Bainton. They include such distinguished Europeans as Jean Paul Sartre and Lord Russell. They include the sponsors of the Sobell Committee, the people here on this platform tonight, and thousands of others. Living and glorying in the democratic tradition, we cannot remain silent. Our meeting tonight is called to give voice to our conviction, and to make effective our contention, that justice should now be done.





"a little different location. But with all of this, I'm really in good condition, so you are just to take this as a report on me, and not cause for worry. Inasmuch as I was electrocariogramed, blood tested, and fluoroscoped, checked for cancer, and examined internally, for the first time since I was last hospitalized, I have a feeling of being catagorized, at least.

"A funny thing. MARKO is doing a report on Moses, and I asked him if he hadn't read the story of how it was that Moses came to be living with a foster mother, and how she found him in the bullrushes. After MARKO was in bed he called to me, that he now knew that I was talking about because he had read in another book about it. 'But what did you mean about a herd of cattle?' he asked me. 'Cattle, I didn't say anything about cattle.' Oh yes you did'. 'Oh, you mean the bullrushes.' 'Yes'. So there you have it, a real live Joke.

"Now I must really do a bit of studying up on facts and figures. I tried to call SYD tonight, but she was out, maybe I'll try again later.


"The house is clean, and we want grocery shopping this afternoon so we have plenty of food (probably too much since I am probably the only one who knows all there is, and the refrigerator is a 4 cu. ft. low one which conceals

"its treasures well.) I wanted to make things easy for Mama, but I know they won't be too easy in any event. MARKO is very much engrossed in a Halloween play in which he is a hobo, and since he has been working with the other children, and is, I gather, now one of the in-group, life is very exciting. He spends quite a bit of time on homework these days. Not because there is so much homework, but because he doesn't concentrate. But at least he gets it done, but how he hates drill work but he does it.

"I have pretty well made up my mind to take it easy for the rest of the week so I'll be fresh for California, but we'll see how that resolution will work out. Incidentally, I saw where your concern over weight was born out by the new set of tables. Weight and blood pressure were two very important factors in longevity. At any rate, I'm 13 lbs. below my 'normal' weight. But I'm still working on the problem, although I don't seem to be making too much headway on this front either. An interesting fact that I have noted is that eating nutritious foods does leave me without the craving for sweets which I have had from time to time. In order, however to be well nourished, somehow I must take too .... many calories to lose weight. MARKO is amazing in this recent transaction. He has completely lost his tummy, and looks quite thin again, but his weight and height seem very much the same. It's redistribution, I guess. I was flattered because the nurse set the scale for 99 lbs. for me today. I was 117 with my shoes and gown. This is not also consequential letter, my love, but that's how I feel tonight. I love thee.

The whole program was on a very high level, and all of the men were most respectful. I felt very easy once the program began, but it was quite a drain altogether. In the morning, I had spoken to the forum of the Unitarian Church and all had gone quite well except somehow I became quite emotional when I mentioned that you had been in prison from the time you were 33 until now you were 42, and I had to stop for awhile. But it all came out all right.

"Tomorrow I'll be taping another TV interview program and also there will be a radio program, all of which is very worthwhile. We'll be having company over pretty soon, but I hope it doesn't turn into too late in evening.



The "Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications," dated January 2, 1957, prepared by the House Committee on Un-American Activities, on page 60 states, "Following the execution of atomic spies, Ethel and Julius Rosenberg in June, 1953, the Communist campaign assumed a different emphasis. Its major effort centered upon Morton Sobell, the Rosenbergs' codefendant. The National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg case - a communist front which had been conducting the campaign in the United States was reconstituted as the National Rosenberg - Sobell Committee at a conference in Chicago in October, 1953, and then as the National Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell in the Rosenberg case'...."

The second paragraph should include data properly documented, setting forth any other changes in the name under which the organization was known, including its present name, (other than the ones listed above) together with the pertinent dates of such changes.

The meeting opened at approximately 8:20 P.M. with I.F. STONE presiding as Chairman, and approximately 300 present.



Mr. I. F. STONE first introduced WILLIAM PRICE, a newspaperman who gave a two-minute talk on the legality and necessity of the First Amendment.

Following Mr. PRICE, the following persons spoke for a period of about two to 5 minutes each, along the same or similar lines, some of them describing their experiences after having taken the Fifth Amendment in an effort to avoid testifying before the Un-American Activities Committee. Mr. I. F. STONE introduced each speaker with appropriate descriptions of their background and experience - and in addition to the subject of the First and Fifth Amendments, various other subjects were brought into the talks including the "Cold War", "McCarthyism", "Witch-hunts", "Integration", etc. Following talk by WILLIAM PRICE, the following people spoke in order as follows:

Another confidential source advised that LILLIAN REINER as of March 11, 1951, was not known as a member of the Communist Party at that time, but as Chairman of the American Labor Party was closely associated with Communist Party members.

The above source advised on December 5, 1952, that JANE ANDERSON was a long-time member of the Communist Party at Syracuse, New York.

Bufiles contain no identifiable information concerning the correspondent.

Correspondent advised he has received literature from the Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell, 940 Broadway, New York City, in which a Reverend Peter McCormack, a former chaplain at Alcatraz, appeared to be the principal personality behind the release. The literature urged the recipient to write to the President urging a new trial for Sobell or that Sobell be granted clemency. Correspondent believes a minister has no business in political issues. He requested information as to the loyalty of the committee to the United States and the political loyalty of Reverend McCormack of San Francisco and Reverend Thomas Kilgore, Jr., 170 West 130th Street, New York 27, New York, whose name appeared on the envelope in which the literature had been mailed. He stated if the Bureau wanted the literature he received, he would be glad to forward it.

The report of SA Tollef Jacobson, Jr., dated March 5, 1957, at New York, captioned "In Friendship, Internal Security - C" indicates that Reverend Thomas Kilgore, Jr., of the Friendship Baptist Church was one of the sponsors of this organization which had been organized to provide economic aid to persons suffering reprisals as a result of their efforts to secure their Constitutional rights. (New York file 100-130541)

The May 18, 1957, issue of "The New York Times" in an article captioned "Negroes Hold Rally on Rights in Capital" identified Reverend Thomas Kilgore, Jr., pastor of the Friendship Baptist Church of New York City, as national director of the Prayer Pilgrimage for Freedom. This pilgrimage was sponsored by the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People and was held in Washington, D. C., May 17, 1957.

Bufiles also reveal that by letter dated March 6, 1952, Reverend Kilgore invited the Director to speak before the Paptist Ministers Conference of Greater New York and Vicinity. Bulet dated March 12, 1952, to Reverend Kilgore declined the invitation because of the pressure of official business.

Reverend Peter McCormack, a protestant chaplain at the United States Penitentiary at Alcatraz, was the subject of inquiry in 1957 after receipt of an allegation that he was possibly a "go-between" for Morton Sobell and the Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell. The inquiry failed to establish the allegation. McCormack was later released as chaplain at Alcatraz because of his very close relations with Sobell and his support of a petition by the above committee to obtain Sobell's release. Sobell was then serving a sentence at Alcatraz as a result of his conviction along with Julius and Ethel Rosenberg for espionage. (San Francisco file 140-2639)

The Committee to Secure Justice for Norton Sobell is the subject of a current Bureau investigation. This organization is a successor to the National Committee to Secure Justice for Norton Sobell in the Rosenberg Case which organization has been cited by the House Committee on Un-American Activities as a communist front.

The New York and San Francisco Offices are instructed to check their files for any pertinent information concerning Reverend Kilgore and Reverend McCornack and, thereafter, be guided by current Bureau instructions concerning security investigations.
