The National Guardian held its Eighteenth Anniversary Dinner on Friday, November 4th at the Hotel Americana, in the Imperial Ballroom, 2nd Floor, Seventh Ave at 53rd St

The dining room doors were not opened until 7 P.M.; Cocktails were available in the room next to the dining room from 6:30 - 7:00 P.M.



There were eight celebrities on the dais, plus JIM ARONSON, the Editor of the Guardian. He announced that FELIX GREENE, author and lecturer whose name appeared on the program, had sent a telegram regretting that he would not be able to be present

ARONSON spoke about the number of newspapers that had died so that out of nine daily papers there were only four left. He said that some deserved to die. He criticized the four remaining ones for failing to bring truth to the readers, such as the Guardian does. He regretted the time spent in his past association with the Post. He pointed out that the N.Y. Times was a big paper but not a great one, that BELFRIDGE and BERCHETT had toth received awards for their reporting—BERCHETT in 1965 and BELFRIDGE in 166—as an example of the outstanding equality of reporting.

ARONSON said that it was the job of the Guardian not only to present the clear progressive viewpoint but also to agitate.

The visiting speakers were given five minutes to speak, but most of themspoke longer.

JANE ADAMS, representative of Students for a Democratic Society spoke on the history of the colored movement which she said began with the sit-ins; that it was a moving spirit on its way to give justice and freedom long overdue; that the young have hed to seek the ways to do this without the guides of their elders and unable to fraw upon past situations and experiences because they were not applicable in these times so the students in their protests have had to make their own way in what she called their moving spirit and their rejection of the war in Vietnam as undemocratic.

Dr. CHARLES HAMILTON, President of Lincoln University
he deplored the present day system, said that just because a
system is in operation does not mean the system is right.
He questioned how legitimate is the party system that
spends money to kill Vietnamese and can only be regarded
as a short sighted society; that he considered it his job
and that of other teachers to hope to stimulate students
and to hope to give them channels to work through toward a
legitimate function, and to help them to think it through to

JTM ARONSON announced a surprise film in which WILFRED BURCHETT would speak from Paris as an award winning correspondent in Vietnam. He explained that the film had only been flown into Kennedy Airport just that day

BURCHETT, larger than life as ARONSON described him, praised the Guardian, and all of its angels, highly and that elsewhere people recognize the integrity of the Guardian He criticized President JOHNSON's Asia trip and of his offer of surrender, which he apologized for as a slip of the tongue He said the Vietnamese will never accept it and this has come out of Manilla.

He said he agreed with CEDRIC BELFUDGE that only the Guardian can be relied upon to present the truth; that he was proud on its anniversary to have the honor to pay tribute to it; but hoped that next anniversary there will be peace and he can be with all of the angels of the Guardian in the flesh.

CARL BRADEN of the Southern Conference Educational - Fund made the pitch for contributions. He offered to give . a sample of the kind of laugh he gives over the telephone when Kux Klanners awaken him during the middle of the night Some of the contributions were: \$3,000 from Mrs. "Z" of Arizona, an Indian woman; \$1,000 pledge from ANNA LOUISE ETRONG; \$2500 from friends in Great Neck and Roslyn; CORLIS LAMONT \$3,000; \$1,500 from group of readers in Wexico: \$1.000 - VICTOR PARTMONTMENT Wexico; \$1,000 - VICTOR RABINOWITZ; Dr. MARTIN, \$50 00; LUCILLE HANCOCK, \$50.00; \$50.00 Phile Committee of the Mational Guardian; SIDNEY PRICE, \$50.00, in memory of MARY PRICE; \$100., C & L ABRAMS; \$100 , ROBERT ROUSE; \$50 00, JACOB EPSTEIN; \$50., ANN RUBENBERG; \$50 ROBERT GOODMAN; Dr. & Mrs. SAM SIEGAL \$50.; CHAS. GOULD, \$100; Fir and Mrs BOEHM, \$100; Mr and Mrs. EAM PERLMAN, \$200; Frs. The table collection sums were not all read off because of the lateness of the hour.

MILLARD LAMPELL, Script writer, spoke of his work in Hollywood for Warner Bros. and that he was supposed to write a script on China and the Revolution and while out there he was required to write much of what he didn't believe so he became what he has called others in like position, 1/2 whore. He added that for those unfamiliar with life in a whore house it is a very hard life. He spoke of the dignity of man and that he should not be sent out to murder for profit which is what Johnson is doing in Vietnam.

LINCOLN LYNCH, Congress of Racial Equality complained that they were constantly being asked to wait-wait until this war or that is over. He complained about the sending of black people to Vietnam to fight for a democracy which they do not even have at home. He complained about housing, the ghettos and SHREIVER. He said that the black people were tired of being told to wait

GRACE MORA NEWMAN, Fort Hood Three Defense Committee. She said the Gov't had done her wrong the same as her brother DENNIS MORA; that because of the demonstrations, reprisals had been taken against the three prisoners; that women who give life to their children should have something to say about wars; that women who campaigned for the vote should muster their strength to fight the useless killings of their youths. She complained of the small cells DAVE, JIH and DENNIS had been put in and are not even permitted to lean against the walls.

Rev. A. J. MUSTE, Peace Leader, criticized the self-righteous image of Americans Pres. JOHNSON was making on his trip to Asia. He said that he was deliberately creating the picture that America wants peace and freedom while all of the time he is leading America and the world toward destruction; that it is hypocritical to do nothing about the bombings in the South, or do anything about the children who have been killed, or the sending of our youth to kill Vietnamese for democracy while not upholding the democracy premise here at home. He called the Pres. a murderer and that he was making murderers of


our youth. Sounding like what was a call to arms, he said there was a time not to be cooperative; that now was the time to support the Fort Hood Three; that it was a time for revolutionists to band together and organize the majority; a time to oppose the hypocritical, the inconsistencies of Pres. johnson's self-righteous image of the American people.

ARTHUR KINOY, attorney, spoke of what happened in August in Washington that changed his thinking. He realized that he hadn't learned all he should have about what there was to know on constitutional law and he learned the hard way. He realized that he wasn't teaching his students in the law schools all they should know that he had to learn this August.

Lots of people from all over the country learned something too. They didn't like what they saw on TV and in the papers and on the movie screens with the news--a little fellow being pushed around. He said that everywhere across the country people have been telling him this. He in turn is telling them, along with his students and his clients that it is time to do some re-thinking.

He predicted that in the next few weeks the Un-American Activities Comm. will present the black movements as violent. The Administration will stand by and not do anything to those who will be out to stop the small handful of Flower County, Mississippi Negroes from being elected to County seats. The Administration, he said, is out to deny them their democratic premise because Flower County is in Senator EASTLAND's territory; that the Administration will be withdrawing its help everywhere and pointing to the colored movements as violent to impede its progress.

He called upon the audience to fight this and to prevent what the Administration were try to do in Flower County, Mississippi and elsewhere. He called upon the Guardian audience to unify and fight.



The anniversary celebration ended at 11 p.m.

GENE ROBEL IS NUMBER ONE. He is the test case. The Department of Justice is "tooling up" for a massive blacklist of militant workers in many thousands of plants throughout the country. They picked on Gene because he looked like an easy target. Their aim is to strengthen the growing arsenal of legal weapons to "crack down" on labor.

The "Blacklist" Law is Section 5 of the McCarran Act. Actually it is one part of a 50-page law full of traps for labor. The blueprint for this law came from the National Chamber of Commerce back in 1947. It was passed by a Congress that was moved by fear. President Truman vetoed the law. But a "Congress of Fear" passed it over his veto. That was 1950.

Section 5 of the Law—the "Blacklist" Section—was used for the first time 13 years later. This is the story of Section 5 in operation, against the first intended victim, Gene Robel. This is the story of his fight and of what is at stake in that fight for all working people.

They came down to his job at the Todd Shipyard in Seattle, picked him up and hauled him off to jail. They asked the judge to set \$10,000 bail and put him on trial. The charge? "Maintaining his employment" in violation of Section 5 of the McCarran Act. That was May 21, 1963.

Gene Robel, long-time machinist, long-time Seattle resident, home-owner, father of four and twice a grandfather, on that day faced the threat of a heavy prison sentence plus a fine for the "crime" of working.

Fantastic? Yes. But true. In America today, under this little known section of the McCarran Act, workers who believe that we need a radical change or dissent from prevailing policy in any way can be driven off the job and even railroaded to prison. Gene's case is the first legal test. If he loses, the Establishment will have a handle to use against the growing numbers who see the need to fight -- on and off the picket line -- for better wages, conditions, job security, shorter hours. The big employers will have a piece of heavy legal artillery to use against every militant union struggle.

So there is much at stake. Gene knows it. He and his wife Thorun, and



valiant defense committees have been hard at work for three difficult years. Now the case has come to a crucial point. He is confident that the fight can be won, with your help.

Chalk up Victory No. 1: The judge released him without bail, on his own recognizance, at the time hewas arrested. That in itself raised public doubt as to his alleged guilt of some heinous crime. The Robel family were long established in their community, active in its affairs, respected by their neighbors, co-workers and many friends.

Victory No. 2: He returned to his job immediately upon his release. He has been there ever since. Gene was too well known as a man of decency and integrity to be denied his job while his case was in court.

Victory No. 3: The indictment was dismissed by Judge William Lindberg when Gene's case came before the U.S. District Court in Seattle. This happened in 1965 after two long years of struggle. The Judge raised serious questions as to the constitutionality of Section 5. (Two other sections of the Act have been declared unconstitutional by the U.S. Supreme Court.)

Judge Lindberg's dismissal order should have ended it. Everybody thought it had. Then suddenly the Department of Justice appealed to the Supreme Court. The fight was far from ended.

Gene sees this appeal as being connected with the Administration policy of escalating everything-most of all the unpopular war in Vietnam; profits for the big monopolists; prices, in-



terest rates and taxes; attacks on the rights of labor, with threatened compulsory arbitration. Escalating everything, that is, except domestic programs to meet the needs of the people.

The main battle lies ahead. It depends not so much on Gene and the Defense Committees as it does on thousands of workers learning the facts about the Robel case. They must learn about the little known "Blacklist" Law. They need to learn what is at stake in it for them, and knowing the truth, get into the fight.

Here are some of the questions that fellow-workers have asked Gene, and his answers to them. (If you have further questions or comments, please write us.)

I. Where did the McCarron Act come from?
It came from a National Chamber of
Commerce blueprint, drawn up in
1947. The House Un-American Activities Committee introduced it. It
was passed by a Congress blinded by
the Korean War hysteria in 1950.

McCarthy was riding high. It was part of a package of labor-shackling laws outlined by the big employers' outfit. Taft-Hartley and Landrum-Griffin too came out of the same can of worms.

2. Is the idea of the Act something new?

The idea of the Act is as old as the American trade union movement, as old as the first strike and blacklist. It is the idea of crying "red plot" to divide and weaken the unions. Many veteran unionists remember the Mohawk Valley Formula. The boss has always wrapped himself in the flag and called the workers unpatriotic whenever there was a sharp beef.

What's new in Section 5 is that it would put the Federal Government officially and directly into the blacklist business.

- 3. How many workers are affected by the "Blacklist" Law? Three thousand plants are already listed as "defense facilities" and therefore subject to Section 5. The Secretary of Defense has unlimited power to add more. Practically any plant could be listed.
- 4. What argument does the Department of Justice use in this case? It invokes the Government's war power against the Soviet Union. That makes it easy to foment a spy scare. Against alleged Communists, of course. Yet, as Robel's attorney pointed out, "... the Government cannot point to a single act of this kind of which a Communist was even suspected."
- 5. Doesn't this "Blacklist" law apply only to Communists? The definition of a "Communist" in the law is so broad it could apply to anyone left of Ronald Reagan. Any militant trade unionist could certainly be covered by it. Talk that it applies only to a few is meant

to make most workers think they don't need to fight -- until it's too late.

- 6. Who has spoken out against the McCarran Act? The labor movement, its officers and a large number of other organizations. They need to hear from the membership to back up this formal opposition with effective action.
- 7. Why did they pick on Gene Robel to be the first "Blacklist" victim of the Act? Gene sees part of the reason in the history of Seattle Machinists Local #79. Before McCarthy and the Cold War, a broad coalition led the union to many victories. It helped make Washington State the best organized state in the country. It set an example in winning many contract gains. It fought to eliminate the "white only" clause in the union constitution. It set an example in labor political action. Gene especially remembers the Local's leadership of the successful campaign to raise unemployment compensation and. with the support of the voters, sending a member of the Local to Washington, D.C. as a Member of Congress.

Gene is proud of having been a member of the Local's Political Welfare Committee.

This Local drew the fire of the McCarthyites. Gene was one of a number of militants driven out of the union by House Un-American Activities Committee "red-baiting." All this made him a target for the "Blacklist" Law. It's not that he was a big labor leader. He was simply an active rank-and-filer. But like Sacco and Vanzetti, who were ordinary workers with radical ideas; he was made the goat for bigger game. That game is to divide and weaken the labor movement.

The rest of the story is yet to be written. Gene Robel says:

"I am confident that when the workers learn the facts, they will join in the fight to wipe out this law. With the threat of new anti-labor laws, such as compulsory arbitration, the old lesson of unity needs to get into high gear.

"I am proud," he adds, "of the beliefs I hold. Today the ideas of every worker are needed to work out ways to win wage gains, to protect job rights in the face of automation, and to achieve effective political action. I want to be judged by what I actually stand for, not by a smearing Big Lie."

When the facts are on the table--and we've tried to give them to you straight ,--there's the question of action: What can you do about the "Blacklist" Law?

- Let your Congressman know: The McCarran Act must be repealed.
- Write the President and the Department of Justice: Call on them to drop the case against Gene Robel.
- Build the unity of labor for economic gains and a political program. Don't let red-baiting divide you.
- Fass the hat. It takes money to fight the Robel case. Express your solidarity by sending a contribution NOW to —

For the purpose of consistency and brevity the Committee to Free Morton Sobell will be abbreviated as the CFMS, and the Los Angeles Committee to Free Morton Sobell as the LACFMS in this report



All the meetings and activities reported herein were held in Los Angeles, California, unless otherwise indicated.

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### I. SCOPE

### LA T-1 (3/9/57)

As of March 5, 1957, the LACFMS was composed solely of the Los Angeles area chapter and is commonly called the LACFMS.

### II. CHARACTERIZATION

### LA T-1 (3/9/67)

The LACFMS (See CFMS Appendix) as the Los Angeles, California, affiliate of the CFMS

JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG and MORTON SOBELL were convicted in United States District Court, Southern District of New York, on March 29, 1951, on a charge of conspiracy to commit espionage on behalf of the Soviet Union The ROSENBERGs were sentenced to death on April 5, 1951, and MORTON SOBELL was sentenced to thirty years imprisonment on the same date JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG were legally executed at Sing Sing Prison, Ossining, New York, on June 19, 1953 and MORTON SOBELL is currently serving his sentence at the Federal Penitentiary, Lewisburg, Pennsylvania

### III. AIMS AND PRUPOSES






In the "Los Angeles Times" of February 15, 1967, I-5, was an article reporting that in New York City, Federal Judge EDWARD WEINFELD had denied legal moves to free MORTON SOBELL, this being his sixth appeal to set aside his 30-year prison sentence. Judge WEINFELD stated he spent four months reading the entire record of this case, and ruled SOBELL had received a fundamentally fair trial. Government attorneys charged SOBELL's current brief was designed to "substitute charges for substantiation" with which the Judge agreed.

Informants furnished a letter to the LACFMS, dated September 8, 1966, together with a return addressed envelope and an article from the "New York Times" of August 23, 1966 reporting that two scientists had denounced evidence allegedly used at the trial of MORTON SOPELL as being a "worthless sketch" of the atomic bomb. The letter requested a "maximum" contribution to assist SOBELL in a possible future court hearing.

Informants furnished a leaflet indicating it had been issued by the CFMS, but which bore the return address of Los Angeles Post Office Box 74474, the postal address of the LACFMS. The leaflet was a reprint of an editorial in "The Denver Post" newspaper of October 4, 1966. The editorial commented upon the statements of two scientists to the effect that sketch of the atomic bomb introduced as evidence in the ROSENBERG trial was essentially worthless and incorrect, and could not have revealed secrets of the bomb to Russia. The editorial expressed the opinion that if SOBELL had not been tried with the ROSENBERGs, it was possible he would have received a lesser sentence, and 16 to years was probably sufficient punishment for the "rather vague offense he was accused of".

### COMMITTED TO FREE MORTON SOPELL

A source advised on March 9, 1967, that the Los Angeles Committee to Free Morton Sobell is the Los Angeles, California, affiliate of captioned organization. In August, 1966, the name "Committee to Free Morton Sobell" first appeared on literature issued by the Committee.

"Following the execution of atomic spies ETHEL and JULIUS ROSENEERG in June, 1953, the 'Communist campaign assumed a different emphasis. Its major effort centered upon MORTON SCBELL', the ROSENBERGs' co-defendant. The National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case, a Communist front which had been conducting the campaign in the United States, was reconstituted as the National Rosenberg-Sobell Committee at a conference in Chicago in October, 1953, and then as the National Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell in the Rosenberg Case."

("Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications" dated December 1, 1961, issued by the House Committee on Un-American Activities, page 116.)

In September, 1954, the name "National Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell" appeared on literature issued by the Committee. In March, 1955, the name "Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell," first appeared on literature issued by the Committee.

The Address Telephone Directory for the Borough of Manhattan, New York City, published by the New York Telephone Company on August 18, 1966, lists the above Committee's address as 150 Fifth Avenue, New York, New York.

The "Guide to Subversive Organizations", revised December 1, 1961, pp. 103-104, describes this committee as follows:

1. "A 'branch' of the American Committee for Protection of Foreign Born found to be under the 'actual management, direction and supervision' of Communist Party members. The Los Angeles Committee was reorganized in October, 1950, and reported that it 'shall be affiliated to the national organization known as the American Committee for Protection of Foreign Born \*\*\* The American Committee and the 'various area or local committees \* \* constitute \* \* \* one organization within the meaning of the \* \* \* statute (Internal Security Act)' under which the Subversive Activities Control Board found the American Committee for Protection of Foreign Born to be a 'Communist-front organization' and ordered it to register as such with the Attorney General."

(Subversive Activities Control Board, Docket No. 109-53, Report and Order with respect to the American Committee for Protection of Foreign Born, June 27, 1960, pp. 41, 8, 12, and 51.)

2. "Cited as a 'regional' organization of the American Committee for Protection of Foreign Born and one of its 'most complex affiliates.' 'The Committee on Un-American Activities found that in early publications the local affiliates frankly identified themselves as chapters of the American Committee for Protection of Foreign Born'; their representation of themselves as independent groups came only after enactment of the Internal Security Act which would have required them, as affiliates, to register as Communist-front organizations'.

LOS ANGELES COMMITTEE FOR DEFENSE OF THE BILL OF RIGHTS formerly known as Los Angeles Committee for Protection of Foreign Born, Los Angeles Committee for Defense of the Bill of Rights and Protection of Foreign Born

"Control of the local organizations \* \* \* was made possible primarily by virtue of the fact that the leaders of the local group were Communist Party members and therefore, subject to the discipline of the Party \* \* The local affiliates \* \* \* were actually little more than administrative staffs, whose purpose it was to implement the program of the Communist Party in their respective areas.

"The Lamp of January, 1950, reported that the Los Angeles Committee for the Protection of Foreign Born had been established on November 29, 1949. Publicly identified Communist ROSE CHERNIN served as 'the operation head' since the time of its organization.

"(Committee on Un-American Activities, House Report 1182 on Communist Political Subversion, August 16, 1957, pp. 86, 87, 55, 33, 54, 58, and 59; also cited in Annual Report for 1956, House Report #53, February 11, 1957, p. 5.)"

The "People's World", a West Coast communist newspaper, issue of 4/23/66, contained an account of results of the 16th Annual Conference of the Los Angeles Committee for Defense of the Bill of Rights and Protection of Foreign Born which was held 4/16/66. The accomplishments include a change of name for the organization to Los Angeles Committee for Defense of the Bill of Rights, inasmuch as Defense of the Bill of Rights is all inclusive.

A source advised on 4/25/66 that the Los Angeles Committee for Defense of Bill of Rights, still referred to by many individuals as the Los Angeles Committee for Protection of Foreign Born, is currently active in the Los Angeles area.

### POLITICAL AFFAIRS FORUM

A source advised on May 12, 1966, that the Political Affairs Forum came into being in February, 1963, with the holding of a public meeting in Los Angeles, California, featuring BEN DAVIS, Communist Party National Secretary. At this meeting, DOROTHY HEALEY, Chairman, Southern California District Communist Party (SCDCP), announced that the Political Affairs Forum was created by herself and other local Communist Party functionaries for the purpose of presenting nationally known communist spokesmen. It is not a membership organization but is strictly a name utilized to present semmunist functionaries at public gatherings.

Southern Californians to Abolish the House Un-American Activities Committee. This is now the official name and the new letterhead of the organization carries the name 67D as "Southern Californians to Abolish HUAC".

The "Guide to Subversive Organizations", revised, December 1, 1961, pp. 43-44, describes the CCFAF as follows:

"The Citizens Committee to Freserve American Freedoms \* \* \* specializes in propaganda aimed at abolishing the Committee on Un-American Activities and discrediting the Federal Bureau of Investigation. Created in Los Angeles in 1952, the front organization is run by FRANK WILKINSON, an identified Communist who recently resumed the full-time, paid post of executive secretary after approximately a year's leave of absence to assist in a similar campaign by another front in New York City, the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee.

"When the Committee on Un-American Activities held hearings in Los Angeles, September 2-5, 1958, to inquire into the nature of the Party's recent reorganization in California, the Citizens Committee to Freserve American Freedoms sponsored a series of public meetings to protest the hearings and the very existence of the Committee. Communists subpoenced as witness were guests of nonor.

How the Citizens Committee to Preserve American Freedoms served the Farty in this effort was revealed by (Communist Party) District Chairman DOROTHY HEALEY in a report to the Party's Southern California District Council on September 21, 1958. Mrs. HEALEY declared that the Forty preferred public protest meetings to be held by the Citizens Committee to Preserve American Freedoms rather than under party auspices because Communists could attend without danger of being exposed as members of the Party. She also noted that Communists scheduled as congressional committee witnesses could not appear beforehand at open Communist rallies without creating the impression that the Party was conspiring with witnesses to withhold information from the committee'



A source advised during May, 1966, that the National Committee for Repeal of the McCarran Act (NCRMA) continues to maintain a mailing address of Room 318, 431 South Dearborn Street, Chicago, Illinois, in connection with requests for financial donations.

This source advised on May 11, 1966, that LILLIAN BERMAN, Executive Secretary of the NCRMA, moved from Chicago, Illinois, to New York, New York, in 1965, and continues to operate the NCRMA from that city.

This source advised during May, 1966, that the NCRMA was the outgrowth of an Ad Hoc Committee of Initiators, headed by Professor CLYDE MILLER of New York, who solicited signatures to a Petition to the President of the United States in 1962 which called for the repeal of the McCarran Act. The NCRMA held its formation meeting at Chicago on May 18, 1963; the stated purpose of the committee is to seek repeal of the Internal Security Act of 1950 as amended.

A second source advised in May, 1964, that the Communist Party, USA (CP) interest in NCRMA had been to give it full support and approval, and the CP took the position that the committee composition must be extremely broad and the Party's direct influence must be kept to a minimum. The CP believed the new committee would serve its purpose in fighting the McCarran Act alone and the CP had everything to gain by taking this position. LILLIAN BERMAN, NCRMA Executive Secretary, is not a CP member, but knowingly accepts support and advice from the CP leadership on behalf of this committee.

CLYDE MILLER, according to the "Daily Worker," issue of March 5, 1941, was a signer of a statement to the President defending the CP.

The "Daily Worker" was an East Coast communist daily newspaper which ceased publication January 13, 1958.





This letter, addressed to "Dear Friend" and closing "GERTRUDE SOLTKFR" in part stated that one of the sources of funds of the Chicago Sobell Committee's contributions to the National Office for legal business and funds necessary for the campaign to free MORTON SOBELL has been the purchases from time to time of items the Chicago Sobell Committee was able to offer. The letter went on to state that the CSC has a nice selection of merchandise, jewelry, paintings, etc. for purchase.





# CHICAGO COMMITTEE TO DEFEND THE FILL OF RIGHTS

The Chicago Committee to Defend the Bill of Rights (CCDBR) maintains headquarters in Rooms 301-803, 431 South Dearborn Street, Chicago, Illinois.

A source advised in July, 1960, that RICHARD CRILEY, then a member of the Civil Liberties Commission of the Communist Party (CP) of Illinois, met with key leaders of the CP and was authorized by the CP to form a new organization with broad mass support so long as the new organization would protect the Party interests.



A second source advised on October 31, 1960, that the CCDBR was formally organized on October 26, 1960, with RICHARD CRILEY as Executive Secretary after he motivated organizing the meeting of October 26, 1960.

A third source advised on May 11, 1966, that the original stated purposes for the CCDER continue to be adhered to, with CRILEY continuing as the motivating force behind the Committee. The Board of Directors, however, now includes many individuals in the religious, educational and labor fields who are not known as CP members.

## **APPENDIX**

CHICAGO COMMITTEE TO DEFEND DEMOCRATIC RIGHTS, Formerly known as Chicago Joint Defense Committee to Defeat the Smith Act

A source advised on April 15, 1958, that the Chicago Joint Defense Committee to Defeat the Smith Act (CJDC) was formed by the Communist Party (CP) in March, 1956.

A second source advised on July 17, 1958, that at a working conference of the CJDC held on June 8, 1958, at Chicago, Illinois, the name of the CJDC was changed to the Chicago Committee to Defend Democratic Rights (CCDDR). The purpose of the CCDDR, according to its "Statement of Principles and Organization" was to "...defend and extend the human rights embodied in the Bill of Rights...and to put an end to the political and racial persecution which threaten American democracy today".

The second source further advised on May 18, 1960, that as of May, 1960, the CCDDR continued to function within the framework of its stated principles and that in accordance with its "Statement of Principles and Organization" had a number of "Working Committees" which included the Chicago Smith Act Families Committee, South Side Freedom Committee, and Taft-Hartley Working Committee. The source further stated that as of May, 1960, RICHARD CRILEY was serving as the Executive Secretary of the CCDDR.

This same source advised on February 1, 1961, that the CCDDR continued to operate until October 26, 1960, when the Chicago Committee to Defend the Bill of Rights (CCDBR) was formed and the offices and assets of what was formerly the CCDDR were taken over by the CCDBR. At the October 26, 1960, meeting, a referendum for approval of the above described action was called for, and subsequently votes were solicited from "associates" of the old CCDDR. The source further advised that no formal dissolution meeting of the CCDDR was ever held, but for all intents and purposes, the CCDDR ceased to exist on October 26, 1960, and CRILEY, its Executive Secretary, since that time.

RICHARD CRILEY, according to a third source, was a member of the State Committee, CP of Illinois, as of February, 1961.

CHICAGO SOBELL COMMITTEE, Also known as Chicago Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell

On May 3, 1966, located at 192 North Clark Street, Chicago, Illinois, advised that the Chicago Sobell Committee (CSC) rents Room 714, 192 North 67D

A source advised on April 19, 1962, that the CSC, which is also known as the Chicago Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell and was formerly known as the Chicago Rosenberg-Sobell Committee and Chicago Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case, is a small group of volunteers who do Sobell fund raising and programming in the Chicago area. The Chicago Committee, since its inception in 1952, has been an affiliate of the Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell, which is also known as the National Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell and was formerly known as the National Committee to, Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case, with headquarters in New York.

A second source advised on May 8, 1964, that DAVID L. SOLTKER appeared to be the guiding force behind this Committee and is assisted by GERTRUDE SOLTKER, his wife.

A third source advised on May 10, 1966, that the CSC maintains a bank account at the Amalgamated Trust and Savings Bank, 111 South Dearborn, Chicago, Illinois, and that DAVID SOLTKER is listed in this bank account as the Secretary of the CSC.

The above information cannot be made public except in the usual proceedings following issuance of a subpoena duces tecum.

The files of the Special Committee on Un-American Activities, House of Representatives, as reviewed in August, 1943, reflected that the names of DAVID and GERTRUDE SOLTKER appear as signers of the Communist Party Election Petition submitted to the State of Illinois in 1940.

A fourth source in 1943 advised that GERTRUDE SOLTKER as of 1943 was a member of the Communist Party.

# COMMETTEE TO FREE MORTON SOBELL

"Following the execution of atomic soles Ethel and Julius Rosenberg in June, 1953, the 'Communist campaign assumed a different emphasis. Its major effort centered upon Morton Sobell,' the Rosenbergs' co-defendant. The National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case - a Communist front which had been conducting the campaign in the United States - was reconstituted as the National Rosenberg - Sobell Committee at a conference in Chicago in October, 1953, and 'then the National Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell in the Rosenberg Case'..."

(Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications," dated December 1, 1961, issued by the House Committee on Un-American Activities, page 116.)

In September, 1954, the name "National Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell" appeared on literature issued by the Committee. In March, 1955, the name, "Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell," first appeared on literature issued by the Committee. In August, 1966, the name "Committee to Free Morton Sobell" first appeared on literature issued by the Committee.

The Address Telephone Directory for the Borough of Manhattan, New York City, published by the New York Telephone Company on August 18, 1966, lists the above Committee's address as 150 Fifth Avenue, New York, New York.

# FAIR PLAY FOR CUBA COMMITTEE

The April 6, 1960, edition of "The New York Times" newspaper contained a full-page advertisement captioned "What Is Really Happening in Cuba," placed by the Fair Play for Cuba Committee (FPCC). This advertisement announced the formation of the FPCC in New York City and declared the FPCC intended to promulgate "the truth about revolutionary Cuba" to neutralize the distorted American press.

"The New York Times" edition of January 11, 1961, reported that at a hearing conducted before the United States Senate Internal Security Subcommittee on January 19, 1961, Dr. CHARLES A. SANTOS-BUCH identified himself and ROBERT TIMER as organizers of the FPCC. He also testified he and TABE! obtained funds from the Cuban Government which were applied toward the cost of the aforementioned advertisement

On May 16, 1963, a source advised that during the first two years of the FPCC's existence there was a struggle between Communist Party (CP) and Socialist Workers Party (SWP) elements to exert their power within the FPCC and thereby influence FPCC policy. This source added that during the past year there had been a successful effort by FPCC leadership to minimize the role of these and other organizations in the FPCC so that their influence as of May, 1963, was negligible.

The SWP has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

On May 20, 1963, a second source advised that VINCENT "TED" LEE, FPCC National Office Director, was then formulating FPCC policy and had indicated that he had no intention of permitting FPCC policy to be determined by any other organization. This source stated that LEE believed that the FPCC should advocate resumption of diplomatic relations between Cuba and the United States and should support the right of Cubans to manage their revolution without interference from other nations. LEE did not advocate supporting the Cuban revolution per se.

The November 23, 1963, edition of "The New York Times" reported that Senator THOMAS J. DODD of Connecticut had called FPCC "the chief public relations instrument of the Castro network in the United States." It is to be noted that Senator DODD was a member of the Senate Internal Security Subcommittee which twice conducted hearings on the FPCC.

The December 27, 1963, edition of "The New York World Telegram and Sun" newspaper stated that the pro-CASTRO FPCC was seeking to go out of business and that its prime activity during its lifetime had been sponsorship of pro-CASTRO street rallies and mass picket lines, and the direction of an active propaganda mill highlighting illegal travel-to-Cuba campaigns. Its comparatively brief span of life was attributed to mounting auti-CASTRO American public opinion, the 1962 Congressional hearings which disclosed FPCC fibancing by CASTRO's United Nations Delegation, and ultimately, the bad publicity which the FPCC received from disclosure of activities on its behalf by suspected presidential assassin LEE H. OSWALD.

On February 6, 1964, the previously mentioned second source advised that V. T. LEE had recently remarked that the FPCC was dead and that there were no plans to organize another similar organization.

On April 13, 1964, a third source advised that there had not been any FPCC activity in many months and that the FPCC had been dissolved.

# FAIR PLAY FOR CUBA COMMITTEE, CHICAGO CHAPTER

A source advised in October, 1960, that the Chicago Chapter of the Fair Play for Cuba Committee (FPCC) was formed during the summer of 1960 at Chicago, Illinois, under the direct guidance and leadership of RICHARD CRILEY, a member of the State Committee, Communist Party (CP) of Illinois.

A second source in August, 1960, furnished a leaflet entitled, "What Is Really Happening in Cuba?" distributed by the FPCC in Chicago. The aims and purposes of the FPCC as set forth in this leaflet include the following: "To disseminate the truth, to combat untruth; to publish and distribute factual information which the United States mass media suppresses. In general, to contribute to foundations for peace, friendship, and understanding between ourselves and the Cuban people." The leaflet reflects the FPCC plans to accomplish these aims: "By mailing of informational bulletins; organizing public meetings and forums; providing speakers, movies, and slides for meetings of interested organizations, placing ads in newspapers; to visit Cuba and see for themselves what conditions really are."

A third source advised on March 9, 1964, that there has been no activity of the FPCC in Chicago since late November, 1963, and for all intents and purposes the organization is defunct.

## MIDWEST COMMITTEE FOR PROTECTION OF FOREIGN BORN

A source on December 17, 1965, advised that the Midwest Committee for Protection of Foreign Born (MCPFB) from March, 1962, to the latter part of 1965 maintained an office in Room 422, 431 South Dearborn Street, Chicago, Illinois

advised that the MCPFB was founded at a conference in Chicago, Illinois, on May 25, 1947, and was to operate as the midwest organization of the American Committee for Protection of Foreign Born (ACPFB).

A second source on May 5, 1955, advised that the MCPFB in a "Statement of Principles" issued in April, 1955, noted that "The purpose of the Midwest Committee shall be to seek to perpetuate for the foreign born the fundamental concepts of equality, regardless of race, color, creed, nationality, political belief or place of birth, and to preserve the basic ideals of liberty and hospitality which serve as the guarantees of democracy for all Americans."

According to a third source, as of September, 1965, the MCPFB was still functioning as the midwest organization of the ACPFB but was considering the possibility of dissolving and turning over its work and responsibilities to the Chicago Committee to Defend the Bill of Rights (CCDBR).

This same source on December 27, 1965, advised that the MCPFB had ceased activity and had turned over its office and responsibilities to the CCDBR and for all intents and purposes was defunct.

The ACPFB has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

# NATIONAL LAWYERS GUILD

The "Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications" revised and published December 1, 1961, by the Committee on Un-American Activities, U.S. House of Representatives, Washington, D.C., states as follows on page 121 concerning the National Lawyers Guild:

"1. Cited as a Communist front.

(Special Committee on Un-American Activities, House Report 1311 on the CIO Political Action Committee, March 29, 1944, p. 149.)

"2. Cited as a Communist front which 'is the foremost legal bulwark of the Communist Party, its front organizations, and controlled unions' and which 'since its inception has never failed to rally to the legal defense of the Communist Party and individual members thereof, including known espionage agents.'

(Committee on Un-American Activities, House Report 3123 on the National Lawyers Guild, September 21, 1950, originally related September 17, 1950.)

"3. 'To defend the cases of Communist lawbreakers, fronts have been devised making special appeals in behalf of civil liberties and reaching out far beyond the confines of the Communist Party itself. Among these organizations are the \* \* National Lawyers Guild. When the Communist Party itself is under fire these offer a bulwark of protection.'

# NATIONAL LAWYERS GUILD CHICAGO CHAPTER

A source advised on May 11, 1966, that it was his understanding that the National Lawyers Guild (NLG) was formed around 1936 in New York City, and that the Chicago Chapter of the NLG (CCNLG), which is affiliated with the national group in New York, was formed shortly thereafter, possibly in 1937 by a group of liberal progressive lawyers in protest against activities of the American Bar Association which they claimed was a non-liberal, non-progressive organization. The CCNLG has no established headquarters but occasionally uses the return address of its officials in literature.



On March 27, 1953, WARREN K. BILLINGS informed Special Agents of the Federal Sureauof Investigation that he was not and had never been a member of the CP, but described himself as a "philosophical anarchist."

On April 10, 1967, source furnished a copy of a Dear Frieds" letter, dated March, 67, issued by the BACSC, 345 Franklin Street, San Francisco, by WARREN K. BILLINGS.

In his letter, BILLINGS informed that MORTON SOBELL's petition for a judicial hearing was denied in New York, on February 14, 1967, "in spite of new evidence by two atomic scientists - Professor PHILIP MORRISON and Dr. HEMRY LINSCHITZ, who testified that an atom bomb sketch (key evidence against SOBELL and the POSEPBERGS) was worthless."

Continuing, BILLINGS commented in his letter that one of SOBELL's attorneys had remarked his client would appeal hall the way" while Mrs. HELEM SOBELL declared, "We will continue our efforts for a full and fair hearing, which must."

BILLINGS went on to say in his letter that MOPTON SOBELL would be 50 years old on April 11, 1967, and the Committee was appealing to "all our friends and supporters to join us in celebrating SOBELL's birthday by sending contributions; by arranging house parties; and by sending birthday cards to him.

BILLINGS concluded his letter by remarking that long, legal battles with many appeals lied ahead and funds were needed to carry out the expensive attorneys' fees and printing costs. With continued donations, "We shall one day soon celebrate MORTON SOBELL's freedom."

A characterization of JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG is contained in the Appendix section under "Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell".

The BACSC has not held any formal meetings during the past six months because the BACSC feels that pressure on the public and the federal government has had no effects on helping to free MORTON SCRELL.

For this reason, attempts to release MORTON SOBELL will be left to the attorneys, and the future activities of the BACSC will be directed towards soliciting funds through the mails for paying the attorneys' fees.

On May 11, 1965, a second source advised that the headquarters of the BACSC in the San Francisco Bay Area are located at two addresses, 1561 Fillmore Street, San Francisco, and 345 Franklin Street, San Francisco. The BACSC is continuing to function and plan future Sobell affairs.

On December 18, 1959, a third source advised that MARY KRVAR, a member of the Warehouse Club, Communist Party (CP), East Bay Region, Oakland, California, and the paid organizer for the BACSC, has stated that the CP is interested in controlling the BACSC so that the BACSC will continue to follow the line of the National Sobell Committee in attempting to obtain the freedom of MORTON SOBELL.






