Rebulet 12/7/55, requesting NYO to review names of The City College of New York (CCNY) classmates of JULIUS ROSENBERG and MORTON SOBELL, previously interviewed, to determine those who were cooperative and had information about subversive activities. For information of Newark, NYO was requested to submit recommendations concerning the re-interview of these persons for information re subjects, and to determine whether STUART SRODER, who attended CCNY from 1934-1939, had any connection with ROSENBERG or his associates at CCNY.

In connection with this file review, the following information is set out re SAMUEL LEVINE: (Newark file 65-4557; No Bufile number shown). Bufile of NY 121-10178, of which SAMUEL LEVINE is subject, is 121-24999.

LEVINE was born on 5/2/16, in NYO and attended CCNY from 1933 to 1939, when he received a B.E.E. degree. As of 12/3/53, LEVINE resided at 98 Beachwood Ave., West Long Branch, New Jersey. The current Monmouth County, New Jersey, telephone directory, which covers West Long Branch, contains no listing for LEVINE. As of 2/14/56, NYO was unable to locate a current telephone number for LEVINE through New York Telephone Company Information Service. As of 11/9/53, LEVINE was employed by the Signal Corps Engineering Laboratories

at Fort Monmouth, NJ, where he had been working since March, 1940. Files of NYO contain no information re LEVINE'S employment subsequent to 11/9/53.

LEVINE was interviewed on 11/9/50, 9/24/52, 4/29/53; advised he was acquainted with JULIUS ROSENBERG at CCNY, but that his acquaintance did not extend beyond that; that ROSENBERG was openly Communist while at CCNY and frequently admitted his association with the CP movement; and stated that ROSENBERG continually attempted to interest other students in the principles and activities of various Communist movements at CCNY. On 9/24/52, LEVINE furnished a signed statement re friendship of MORTON SOBELL, MAX ELICHTER, and WILLIAM PERL during period 1933-1938.

Information received in 1953 from CIO indicated that LEVINE was affiliated with PAECT and participated in strikes instigated by the YOL and American Student Union in 1938-1939 at CCNY. LEVINE was described as a "left-winger" by a former CCNY classmate and allegedly supported the Spanish Loyalists during the Spanish Civil war. LEVINE registered in 1938-1939 as an ALP member.

For information Newark, it has been ascertained that STUART SEBORER and JULIUS ROSENBERG were in same Mathematics class at CCNY from September, 1934-February, 1935, and that SEBORER and WILLIAM MUTTERPERL, former associate of ROSENBERG, were in the same Mathematics class from February, 1935 to June, 1935.

The Bureau and Newark are requested to review indices for current information re LEVINE. Newark should determine current residence and employment of SAMUEL LEVINE.

LOUIS VOLP, Chief, Radar Systems Branch, Evans Signal Laboratory, Fort Monmouth, New Jersey, advised SA JONES on 3/23/56 the last known employment of LEVINE, which was about one year ago, was the Teleregister Corporation, Stamford, Connecticut.

In Connection with this review, it was found that SAMUEL LEVINE, born 5/2/16 in New York City, was interviewed and furnished a signed statement regarding the friendship of MORTON SOBELL, MAX ELICHTER, and WILLIAM PERL.

New Haven should verify the residence and employment of SAMUEL LEVINE and advise the New York Office.

The files of the Newark Office are presently being reviewed regarding SAMUEL LEVINE and the New York Office will be furnished all pertinent information that is not already in their possession. P

Ref New Haven letter reported that LEVINE resides at Warnoch Drive, Westport, Connecticut, and is employed by the Teleregister Corporation, 445 Fairfield Avenue, Stamford, Connecticut. No adverse information has been reported to New Haven regarding LEVINE.

As set out in New York letter, 3/1/56, LEVINE knew JULIUS ROSENBERG at City College of New York, and on 9/24/52, furnished a signed statement regarding friendship of MORTON SOBELL, MAX ELITCHER and WILLIAM PERL during the period 1933-1938. LEVINE attended City College of New York from 1933-1939; STUART SEBORER was a student there from 1934-1939.

It is suggested that Bureau authority be given New Haven to interview SAMUEL LEVINE.
