
At 9:15 p.m. SA JAMES HAVERTY, New Haven, phoned regarding a surveillance on subject. He advised that this evening Mrs. RICH met a couple at the railroad station in Darien, Connecticut, who arrived on a train from New York. The couple accompanied her to the Cherry Lawn School where all three are with the subject at this time.

HAVERTY inquired whether we desired that New Haven go to any great lengths to identify this couple. He said this would possibly involve an additional surveillance and probably a surveillance back to New York City with the couple.

After conferring with SA SILVERTHORN, I called SA HAVERTY at 9:30 p.m. and advised him that our immediate purpose of the surveillance was to determine whether subject attempts to abscond in view of SOBELL'S arrest. He was requested to obtain physical descriptions and available identifying data concerning the couple, but that an additional surveillance would not be necessary should they leave town. HAVERTY advised that there are no indications thus far that the subject intends to depart.
