On June 20, 1950, during the interview with the subject, he produced twelve pages of 5" x 8" paper bearing pencil notes. These were made by the subject at his home and were matters that he desired to discuss with the Agents during the interview. It is believed that these notes will be a good specimen of his handwriting and it is not felt that they will be altered in any way.

Also, the subject produced a sheet of paper bearing type writing, dated May 29, 1942, dealing with thermoil granodine. BLACK stated that this paper was typed on his typewriter. BLACK still retains this typewriter; however, the print today is different in that he had a new keyboard, placed on the typewriter several years ago. This is being submitted as a specimen of subject's typewriter as of 1942.

### THIS IS EVIDENCE

Re Philadelphia teletype to the Bureau and other offices dated 6/16/50, which reflects that the subject named as one of his contacts an employee of the Hercules Powder Company, whose first name he believed to be WILLIAM, last name unknown.

Investigation at the Hercules Powder Company, Wilmington, Delaware, disclosed that this individual was WILLIAM W. STAPLER, nor deceased.

Philadelphia subsequently advised that a photograph of STAPLER was shown to BLACK, and he identified STAPLER as his contact at Hercules Powder Company.

The records of the Hercules Powder Company revealed that STAPLER died at Riverdale, New Jersey, on August 15, 1947.

There is being forwarded herewith to the Bureau one pack of exposed film containing photographs of WILLIAM W. STAPLER, as well as photographs of handwriting and handprinting, apparently that of STAPLER.

It is requested that the Laboratory develop the enclosed film so that it may retain the photographic copies of the handwriting and handprinting specimens which are believed to be those of STAPLER.

This material is being furnished to the Bureau as evidence inasmuch as it may be necessary to use the photographic copies of the handwriting as evidence in the future. The Bureau is also being furnished Fig. 44 this material in the event that it is needed for handwriting comparison with any other documentary evidence that may be discovered in the investigation of this case.

At Noon on July 12, 1950, ASAC Hinse, of Philadelphia, called with reference to Philadelphia letter dated June 30, 1950, advising of the hysterical condition and subsequent automobile accident of Dr. Joseph Skilton. who was a dentist in Philadelphia who was interviewed by Philadelphia Agents in connection with this case. You will recall that in so far as we know, Skilton was not involved in the case but was interviewed in connection with his knowledge of Black. Philadelphia has not contacted Dr. Skilton since his accident. Hr. Hinze advised that last night during the interview with Black, Flack stated that Dr. Skilton had committed suicide by using a knife on his stomach on July 8, and his funeral was held vesterday. Black stated that Dr. Skilton could be considered a dope addict, as he had the habit of giving himself jazz on laughing gas. Philadelphia is not contacting the coroner for verification of this, nor are they going to contact Dr. Skilton's wife. Mr. Hinze thought the Bureau should know of this, inasmuch as Agents had interviewed Dr. Skilton; however, there is no reason to believe that the suicide was the result of any action taken by the FBI. A letter is being sent in by the Philadelphia Office giving details.

Hinze stated that Black informed the Agents that he had been in telephonic contact with Ferdinand Heller, who also has been interviewed by Agents of the Philadelphia Office in connection with this case. Heller and Black were friendly in the past, although Heller has refused to see Black recently. The interviews with Heller have reflected that he was involved in industrial espionage in the 1930s, but no case has been built up on him in so far as wartime espionage is concerned. Heller has a record of mental instability. Black advised the Agents last night that he had talked to Heller on the telephone; that Heller is fighting with his mother and drinking heavily; and that Heller said he was going to the country for a couple of weeks, and if his nerves did not clear up, he was going to follow the same course as Dr. Skilton. Elack stated he is going to try to see Heller tonight. Agents of the Philadelphia Office have not interviewed Heller recently and do not contemplate interviewing him again, at least at this time. Hr. Hinze is sending a letter to the Bureau, setting forth further details.

Mr. Hinze stated that the Philadelphia and Newark Offices both feel that the full surveillance on Black should be reduced to a spot surveillance, and in the event Black does contact Heller, no surveillance should be conducted in view of Heller's mental state. I told him not to conduct a surveillance of Heller and to send us a taletype setting forth the reasoning of the Philadelphia Office on reducing the surveillance of Black to a spot surveillance; that if the reasoning were sound, the Bureau would go along with him.

At 2:40 P.M. June 16, ASAC Kaack of the Newark Office called relative to the search being conducted by the Newark Office of the effects of Thomas L. Black under waivers of search given by Black.

Mr. Kaack advised that at the Spruce Chemical Company in Patterson there are ten cartons of effects belonging to Black. Agents are going through them. Mr. Jacob Fast, sole owner of the Spruce Chemical Company is present and is cooperative.

An additional search is being conducted of property of Black at the Van Poznak Storage Warehouse, 92 Howard Street, Mewark. This consists of 127 cartons and two tool chests in storage. It is made up of two loads, one received at the warehouse in 1944 and the other in 1947. Mr. Kaack advised that in the written waiver of search Black had authorized only two Agents by name to conduct the search. He wanted to know whether additional Agents could assist in the search under the waiver. I advised him that the legality of the waiver of search was doubtful anyway but in order to make it as effective as possible, he should call the Philadelphia Office and get the Agents who are interviewing Black to have him authorize as many Agents as are necessary to make an immediate and complete search of these effects. Mr. Kaack said he would do this at once.

It was pointed out to Mr. Kaack that Black is not cooperating and as a result it is essential that all possible leads be covered immediately. He was cautioned to make the search as thorough as possible to pick up any information which might be of assistance in corroborating the espionage activities of Black.

Mr. Kaack advised that the Storage Warehouse is fully cooperative as the Manager has been an informant of the Office in the past. However, there will be a re-sealing charge of \$2.00 per hour to re-seal the cartons after the search. I advised Mr. Kaack the Bureau authorised this payment.

SAC Cornelius called at 12:20 P.M. He advised that they have continued the interview with Black but that he is giving no substantial additional information; that he is still talking and still answering questions; that he is rather definite about certain things that happened in the 1930's but in so far as events that occurred in the 1940 are concerned, he shies away from questions and is indefinite. He pointed out that Black states that he was offered a microscope, which he declined. He was offered a movie camera which he declined. The Soviets wanted to send him to Cal Tech where he could go to school and handle contacts on the West Coast, but he refused. Black said that the Soviets gave him the Contax camera and let him keep it for several years. They then made him return it but later gave it back to him. He insists there was no basis for their returning it to him other than they just did. SA Holmes, who is handling the interview with Black, then talked to me and said that they had tried to further develop the penicillin angle; that Black insists he got all the information which he gave to the Russians from published material. He said he did give the Russians some industrial information which he got at the National Oil Products Company involving industrial processes and he gave it to them just to keep them quiet. He resists all suggestions that what he is saying is not reasonable.

SAC Cornelius then recommended that Ferdinand Heller be interviewed. I conferred with Mr. Ladd and authorized SAC Cornelius to go ahead with the interview of Heller. I told him to keep the Bureau informed regarding developments in this connection.

There is enclosed herewith for the Bureau, New York, and-Philadelphia a copy of a signed statement prepared on July 17, 1950, by JACOB I NEASS at the Spruce Chemical Company, 177 East Railway Avenue. Paterson, Roy Jersey.

During interview by SA'S JOHN R. LYONS and LOUIS G. TURNER. JACOB FASS remarked that he had seen BLACK on July 16, 1950. FASS personally typed out his statement with a minimum of coaching from interviewing agents. He displayed an extremely confident attitude, and it was evident that he had given prior thought and preparation to his remarks.

In addition to the remarks included in his signed statement, FAS also provided the following information concerning himself:

He stated that on one occasion he attended a meeting of the American League for Peace and Democracy but denies ever being a member of the Communist Party. He admitted being tolerant toward the CP but stated that he has changed his mind in view of recent activities of the CP and the Soviet Union. FASS classified CP members as "a species of mut" and remarked that today they are all psychological problems.

He pointed out that his ecusin, SARA HERSHER BROWN, was at least a CP sympathizer and probably a CP member who has been expelled from CP activity as a result of jealousies resulting from her popularity in Negro groups. In this connection, FASS stated that SARA married RAYIROWH, & Negro who has traveled to Australia to make speeches with the Red Dean of ひんもからつ Canterbury.

PASS remarked that another cousin, DELL (ph.) GRAPAM, is also married to a Megro and is probably a CP member.

It is to be noted that FASS was definite in his statement that HLACK ceased contact with the Soviet at the time he broke with the CP in approximately 1933. He excused BLACK's Soviet activity on grounds that it took place in the distant past, and although it may have helped Russia industrially, according to FASS, there was no subversion involved.

Paterson, New Jersey July 17, 1950

I, Jacob I. Fass, make the following voluntary statement to John R. Lyons and Louis G. Turner, who have identified themselves to me as special agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, U. S. Department of Justice. No threats or promises have been made to me for this statement and I know it can be used in a court of law. I have been advised of my right to counsel.

I reside at 367 Miller Avenue, Brooklyn, New York, and my place of business is at the Spruce Chemical Company, 177 East Railway Avenue, Paterson, New Jersey.

I made the acquaintance of Thomas L. Black when we were both employed at the National Oil Products Co. in Harrison, N.J. in 1938. I became better acquainted with him in about 1940-41, and between then and 1944 he confided in me that he had once been engaged in collecting technical information for the Soviet Union. This conversation concerning his activities took place in his apartment at 17 Oxford St., Newark, H.J. My impression was that he confided in me for two reasons. First of all, he felt the need to confide his secret to some one, and he considered me a very close friend. Then, in the course of telling me his story be revealed to me that he was in deathly fear that the CCPU would eventually try to liquidate him, and he asked me, if anything should ever happen to him, to inform an editor of Time Magazine. He pointed to the name in a copy of the magazine, and I did not remember it very clearly, except that the first name was unusual. When the Hiss case broke I realised that Whittaker Chambers was probably the man Black had referred to. He was quite dramatic about these revelations, and told me that he was the only man in the United States to have been awarded the Order of Lenin, though the medal was not delivered to him. It was a fantastic story, and he seemed to think that he had been important, while I felt that his estimate of his role was exaggerated.

As I understood it, his work consisted of gathering technical information from chemists and engineers employed in various commercial companies. Some of it he paid for, others furnished the information free, I suppose. In the course of the conversations we had on this subject I recall only the following incidents being mentioned. In the course of research on penicillin, we came across the name of E. W. Flosdorf, and Ton told me that he knew him: that he had purchased a drying process from him

on behalf of the Soviet Government. He mentioned a communist sympathizer at Calco, and I concluded myself that that person might have been another one of his contacts. He told me vaguely about the apparatus involved. I gathered that Chambers was one of his contacts, perhaps his superior. He said that there was a man on the top floor of the C.P. head warters in N.Y. who directed the Soviet espionage in the U.S. His name was Brown or some such common name, and though the actual personage changed from time to time, the name remained the same. He also said that all Amtorg and other Soviet officials were engaged in espionage. Whether he knew this from personal contact with all of them or by extrapolation, and information gathered through subsequent contacts in the Trotskyite movement, I cannot say.

He had told me previously that he had left the C.P. in 1933 when they had failed to prevent the rise of Hitler. When he decided to cease his activities for the Soviet Union he realized what the conservences might In fact, he told me that when he refused to continue about 2 agents tried to forcibly remove him from the country, and drove him to the Canadian border, in Michigan, if I remember correctly. He escaped by telling them that they could not get away with it: that he would tell the border guards that he was being forcibly taken, and to his surprise the agents could not think of a strategem to stop him from doing this and so released him. Thereafter he had lived in constant fear of his life. Now, as this had all transpired a considerable time ago, I was inclined to minimize his experience, and told him that at this late date it was unreasonable for him to continue fearing the CGFU. He quoted to me the fates of other deserters from the Soviet camp, as Krivitsky, and others, who died under mysterious circumstances. I told him that he had not been bothered since, and that he was probably too unimportant for them to worry about now. expecially since they were now better recognized, and had to be more careful. It was my view that he had been less important then he had thought, and that if, with his known Trotzkyite background since then, be had not been molested, he was probably past danger. Mevertheless, he continued to worry. One day, when I was at his apriment, he got a phone call from some party, and when he hung up he said that it was some one he had known in the past, and that he feared that this person was a representative of the OGPU who wanted to see him again. My impression was that it was a person whom he had known as a communist, though he was not certain that this man was actually involved in espionage activity. I told him to forget about the call, and as far as I know there was no further development along this line.

Workers Party, and had been, as I understood it, since 1933. He remained a member until at least some time before he moved to Philadelphia. To the best of my knowledge, in all of his time in Philadelphia he was no longer active politically, but was a disillusioned former radical. In many conversations between us he explained to me why he had quit the C.P. and what was wrong with their policies. He left in 1933 because he felt

that they should have been able to prevent the rise of the Kazis, considering their great strength in Germany at the time. His feelings were that the mission of the C.P. was to sabotage any real growth of communism or socialism. The views he expressed to me were those that any socialist or Trotzkyite might have given regarding the role of the C.P.: their use of labor unions, front organizations and other groups merely as instruments of Soviet policy, and not for any sincere purposes of improving the lot of the workers or people. While working at his apartment I came across some Kodachrome slides of Trotzky, and he revealed to me that they were pictures that he had taken when he had visited Mexico. I gathered that they were shown at meetings of the S.W.P., and that Tom was an important member of the group. if for no other reason than that there were so few of them. He told me of his trip to Mexico - by plane, I believe - and his visit with Trotzky. One night, in the presence of Charles Freefield, 'he showed me the pictures of Trotzky with a dide projector, along with other pictures. Most of them showed Trotzky tending his pet rabbits. On one occasion he took me on an outing of the SJP to Lake Hopatcong. It was a small group, and every one seemed to know Tom very well. He was called Tom. For all I knew most of the others were using aliases. Among the group was Betty Morrow, the wife of Felix, who was in fail at the time as a result of the Minneapolis trial. After the swimming there was brief seminar, at which a man named George (I forget his full name) gave a talk which was on theoretical economics. There was almost no discussion. It was obvious that Tom was on good terms with all of the members present.

On one occasion Tom gave me a book, written by one of the S.W.P. leaders, giving a history of the Spanish Civil War. He said it would explain how the communists sabotaged the loyalists. The details of this were too complicated for me to follow. It was clear to me, though, that he was a thoroughly sincere Trotskyite, and a severe opponent of the Communists. He always maintained that he was a communist with a small

I knew that Harry Gold was a good friend of Tom's. On about 3 occasions I met Gold, and he seemed an affable fellow, who talked almost exclusively of chemistry. As far as I knew, and as far as Tom knew, Gold had no political interests whatsoever.

When the news of Harry Gold's arrest was published Tom told me how shocked he was. He could not understand it, for he had known Gold as a gentle fellow, and a loyal friend. He could not conceive of this man whom he had known as being guilty of the acts with which he was charged. Because he had known him so well, the shock was very deep. Several weeks after Gold's arrest, and after the P.B.I. had revealed in an interview that they knew about this, Tom told me that he had been told by Gold a few weeks before his arrest that Gold was the man being sought as the contact of Flaus Fuchs. (The time had been one might when he had gone to pick up a radio at the apartment of my cousin. He was home early, and so could not have spoken to Gold for more than a few minutes.) All I could say to him was "Now you tall me." It was too late to do anything now.

From my intimate knowledge of Tom Black I feel that he broke completely and unequivocally with the C.P. and the Soviet Union in 1933. He immediately joined the Trotzkyite movement, so that he could not have continued working for them much beyond that year. Aside from modding to former acquaintances from the C.P. who did not know of his break, he had no contact with members of the C.P. except accidentally or socially. In the course of numerous conversations he convinced me of the depth and sincerity of his anti-soviet feelings. I cannot imagine even the cleverest spy feigning a hatred for the C.P. in such compete detail and with such evident fervor. Since my own aversion to the Soviet system was strong, he was happy to reinforce it with detailed arguments drawn from his experience in the radical parties. In the years 1945 to now, when we were in Philadelphia. I knew almost every step he made, and where he was at almost every time of the day, and to the best of my knowledge he engaged in no political activity of any sort. His contacts with the Trotzkyites were limited to personal gossip of former acquaintances. He had no contacts in Philadelphia. However, his hatred for Stalinism continued, and does to this day.

I never suggested that Black tell the authorities about his activities on behalf of the Soviet Government for the following reasons. First of all, no government documents were involved. He had only transmitted commercial secrets, which at best or worst could help Russia build her economy. Secondly, at the time he had helped them, Russia was a struggling backward country, and not considered a menace to this country. Only dedicated socialists and Trotzkyites considered her a menace then. Finally, it had happened in the past, and the agents involved had probably long since been recalled, according to his own testimeny. Further, he felt that Whittaker Chambers, who had been in a much more responsible position, could have told more than he, and it did not seem he could contribute anything of value.

As for the reason why Tom did not turn Gold in, he told me that he could not do it, because he considered Gold a friend. Hy view is that Tom, who is given to deep emotional feelings, had this strong feeling of friendship for Gold, and could not bring himself to realize that the admirable fellow he had known had another aspect to his personality. He could only remember the Gold he knew. Perhaps on further reflection he would have recognized the other aspect of the man, and taken action. But Gold was arrested before he could come to any decision.

I have personally typed the above statement, consisting of 5 pages, and it is true and correct.



HELIE related that approximately one year ago Mr. C. W. BERG was stricken with an illness from which he was not expected to recover to that point where he could resume active management of the Berg Laboratories. C. W. BERG's prospective successor was his son-in-law ERIC BERG. ERIC BERG and C. W. BERG had personalities which frequently clashed and in addition most of the other employees of C. W. Berg Laboratories disliked E-ic Berg.

In view of this background of employment management, the instant subject contacted HELIE with the suggestion that the two of them, that is BLACK and HELIE, join to promote a new and independent business which they would own jointly. HELIE stated that it had also been his ambition to operate his own business. His discussions with this end in view with BLACK began approximately a year ago and had continued on a very heavy basis up until mid June, 1950. HELIE stated that said discussions with BLACK occurred by telephone, by letter, by his visiting BLACK's home and BLACK's visiting his home at Worcester, Massachusetts.

In the course of these discussions BLACK and HELIE agreed in early January, 1950 that while they possessed the necessary research ability (in BLACK) and sales ability (in RELIE) to launch a new company, they lacked sufficient capital to build a manufacturing plant. Shortly thereafter BLACK came to HELIE's home in Worcester and advised him that he had secured the cooperation of one JACK WASS of Paterson. New Jersey. FASS, according to BLACK, owned the Spruce Chemical Company. FASS was building a new plant and agreed to enlarge it so that the activities of HELIE and BLACK could be conducted on the premises. FASS had also indicated, according to BLACK, that he wished to expand his own company's line, i.e. boiler compounds, and would advance capital for an interest in the HELIE-BLACK company. The original intention of BLACK and HELIE had been to manufacture synthetic soap, mercerizing assistants and a catalytic agent to be used with soap in the washing of woolens.

At about the latter point, January, 1950, C. W. BERG seemed to be recovering and HELIE asserts that it occurred to both him and BLACK that it would be unfair to found the new company in direct competition with their former employer. Accordingly, HELIE contacted EMORY RICHARDS of Glerdale, Rhode Island with the suggestion that RICHARDS join BLACK and HELIE in launching the new company. It was moreover agreed that the new company would specialize in chemicals concerned with the manufacture of cottons. and thus avoid the major part of the competition with the Berg company which specialized in chemicals used in the manufacture of woolens. It was further decided to employ HARRY LODGE, a Berg company employee, whose resignation, which was not voluntary was pending with the Berg company, to handle the woolen sales aspects of the new firm. It was felt that LODGE

would be a former employee of the Berg company competing with BERG whether he was affiliated with BIACK and HELIE or with some other concern. In addition HELIE revealed that he was suffering from a coronary thrombosis condition and desired to avoid travel as much as possible. HELIE stated BIACK was not a particularly good businessman and it would be necessary for someone such as himself to maintain a close watch on the affairs of management in the new concern.

On the weekend of June 17-18, 1950 HELIE went to Philadelphia in company with RICHARDS to meet BLACK and JACK FASS for the purpose of formally setting up their new company described above under the registered name "Thorotex." The men did not plan to incorporate. RICHARDS and HELIE registered at the Alexander Hamilton Hotel in Philadelphia whereat on June 17, 1950 RICHARDS became ill.

The business transactions of the men did not occur with any of the speed which HELIE had contemplated because of RICHARDS's illness and BLACK's very apparent nervous condition. BLACK was ill at ease throughout the day and consumed, according to HELIE, a large number of aspirin tablets and glasses of Bromo-Seltzer.

On the evening of June 17, 1950 while at dinner in the Alexander Hamilton Hotel and with no one else present, BLACK advised HELIE that he had known HARRY GOLD for seventeen years. BLACK stated that as a result of this association he had been through an interrogation by FBI Agents at the Philadelphia Office. He stated that he had never had any business or other association with GOLD but he did not elaborate further.

months earlier, before Christmas, 1949, he had had a similar private dinner with BLACK at the Benjamin Franklin Hotel in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. On this occasion when the men were chatting about affairs not concerned with their business, BLACK had stated that in the late 1920's and early 1930's he was "quite liberal - as were all college graduates of those days." BLACK asserted that his father was a college professor and that his social acquaintances were all in the academic field. Continuing, HELIE alleges that BLACK at that time stated he had been a member of the Communist Party in the early 1930's. HELIE relates that ho then said in as quick a manner as he could, that he was at that time and always had been a Republican. BLACK then quickly stated, "I know now that this is the greatest country in the world." The conversation with reference to political matters terminated at that point.

HELIE stated that the foregoing statements represent an accurate summary of all his relations with BLACK; that as a result of them he had long ago come to the personal conclusion that BLACK is a sincere, idealistic, conscientious and hard working individual. HELIE was of the opinion that BLACK at this time has no association with the Communist movement. HELIE noted voluntarily that if BLACK were a Communist he would do anything that the Communist Party might ask him because he is that type of individual, i.e. exceedingly sincere.

Thereafter HELIE stated that prior to BLACK's having discovered JACK FASS as a potential member of the proposed new company, BLACK had proposed one PETO (phonetic) as a possible source of manufacturing equipment and space. HELIE never met said PETO. PETO was described by BLACK to be a paint manufacturer in Brooklyn who wished to branch out into some other field of business. HELIE reluctantly admitted that he vetoed BLACK's suggestion of PETO as a partner because of PETO's racial origin.

HELIE stated that BLACK made an admission of his interview by Bureau Agents at Philadelphia again in the presence of RICHARDS, FASS and himself.

#### AT GLENDALE, RHODE ISLAND

EMORY A. RICHARDS was interviewed at 11:05 a.m. on June 22, 1950 by Special Agents RICHARD J. GALLAGHER and EDWARD J. SHEILS.

RICHARDS asserted that he first met BLACK in late April or early May, 1950 at the Hotel New Yorker, New York City on a Saturday afternoon. The introduction was performed by PERCY HELIE, mentioned above. RICHARDS stated that he and the subject, together with HELIE, had spent the afternoon and most of the evening on Saturday in discussing the details of a company to be formed by them. RICHARDS asserted that he did not see the subject again until the afternoon of June 17, 1950 and then at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. RICHARDS repeated the information furnished by HELIE with reference to the plans of the men named to form a new chemical manufacturing and sales company. The following details represent only additional information gained from RICHARDS with reference to his business association with the subject.

BLACK had been employed by JACK FASS in the Spruce Chemical Company prior to his employment with the C. W. Berg Laboratories. It was RICHARDS's understanding that BLACK had been employed by BERG for approximately five years

and for approximately five years preceding the latter employment by the Spruce Chemical Company. Both JACK FASS and BLACK had worked at an earlier date for the National Oil Products Company in Harrison, New Jersey.

RICHARDS stated that on the afternoon of June 17, 1950 he was ill, as indicated by HELIE. He does recall, however, that BLACK was extremely nervous and finally told the group that he knew and had associated with HARRY GOLD. BLACK further stated that he had been a member of the Communist Party, a mistake he had made in earlier life and which he regretted. RICHARDS also stated that BLACK gave the impression that he had been connected with HARRY GOLD when both were members of the Communist Party.

Both RICHARDS and HELIE indicated that they did not intend to pursue their business association with BLACK until such time that it is apparent to each of them that BLACK is not involved in any of the illegal activities engaged in by GOLD.





WHERE I WAS TO PICK UP A RADIO WHICH BELONGED TO ME. LATTER REQUESTED DEMONSTRATION OF ABILITY RESULTING IN SEVERAL PRE ARRANGED MEETINGS PROVIDING ANSWERS TO PROBLEMS SET FORTH BY OVAKIMIAN. HELLER LATER DROPPED OUT OF PICTURE. DISINTERESTED. AS PRELIMINARY TO TRIP TO RUSSIA. OVAKIMIAN SUGGESTED BLACK WORK FOR ANTORG ON CONSULTING BASIS. AND AS A CP MEMBER IT WAS BLACK-S DUTY TO FURTHER THE CAUSE OF COMMUNISM IN USA. OFFERS OF COMPENSATION WERE REJECTED BY BLACK SUBSEQUENTLY BLACK WAS INTRODUCED TO ONE PAUL PETERSEN AND IN NINETEEN THIRTYFOUR AND THIRTYFIVE PROVIDING TECHNICAL INFO, ACCEPTING GIFTS OF BOOKS, BUT NO MONEY. GEORGE ABOUT THIRTY FIVE. SIX FEET. THIN, VERY SLIGHT BUILD, ONE HUNDRED FIFTY OR ONE HUNDRED SIXTY LBS. YELLOWISH BLONDE HAIR. LIGHT BLUE EYES. NORDIC TYPE. PROBABLY GERMAN WITH DEFINITE ACCENT BELIEVED GERMAN. GEORGE-S INTEREST WAS ONLY IN TROTSKYITE ACTIVITIES WHICH INFO BLACK CLAIMS HE CONSISTENTLY SIDESTEPPED. ON MARCH TEN, THIRTY EIGHT BLACK HOSPITALIZED FOR TOTAL OF FIVE MONTHS FOLLOWING INDUSTRIAL ACCIDENT VISITED BY HARRY GOLD AT HOSP. AND GOLD TOLD HIM SOMEBODY WANTED TO KNOW WHERE HE WAS. WHILE AT HOSP. ALSO VISITED BY MAN WHO INTRO-DUCED HIMSELF AS DR. ROBERT SWARTZ OR SCHWARTZ. BLACK BELIEVES THIS MAN ACTUALLY AN M. D. BLACK MET JOHN TOW OR THREE TIMES THEN ARRANGED FOR BLACK TO MEET CONTACT NAMED AJACK. JACK DESCRIBED AS CZECHOSLOVAKIAN TO MEET CONTACT NAMED AJACK. SOLIDLY BUILT ABOUT FORTY YEARS. FIVE FT. EIGHT IN. WITH A WEAKNESS FOR BUYING SHOES WHICH STEMMED ACCORDING TO HIM. FROM A SHOELESS CHILDHOOD. IN CONTACTS WITH JACK DURING NINETEEN FORTY AND FORTYONE. JACK NEVER ABLE TO PASS SHOE STORE WITHOUT WINDOW SHOPPING. JACK TOLI BLACK TO FORGET TROTSKYITES AND GET TO MORE SERIOUS BUSINESS. INSTRUCTED BLACK TO GET JOB AT KELLEX. PHONETIC. A SUBSIDIARY OF KELLOG ENGINEERING CO. THIS PROBABLY ABOUT NINETEEN FORTYONE

ABOUT FORTYFIVE YEARS OLD, TALL, GRAYING HAIR, THIN FEATURES, GLASSES. JACK SAID SOVIETS HAD PURCHASED TECHNICAL INFO FROM WILLIAM IN PAST AND WANTED TO REESTABLISH CONTACT. AT MEETING. William Refused any info until he had been paid for previous info.

Sarah weber had been trotsky-s SECRETARY IN MEXICO AND WAS TO RETURN THERE. PETERSEN INSTRUCTED BLACK TO LEARN THE WEBERS TRUE NAME AND THEIR ADDRESS. BLACK BECAME FRIENDLY WITH MRS. WEBER WHO ASKED HIM TO STAY WITH HER HUSBAND WHILE SHE WAS IN MEXICO. AS PRELIMINARY TO TRIP TO RUSSIA. OVAKIMIAM SUGGESTED BLACK WORK FOR AMTORG ON CONSULTING Basis, and as a CP member it was black-s duty to further the cause OF COMMUNISM IN USA. OFFERS OF COMPENSATION WERE REJECTED BY BLACK. SUBSEQUENTLY BLACK WAS INTRODUCED TO ONE PAUL PETERSEN AND IN NINETEEN THIRTYFOUR AND THIRTYFIVE PROVIDING TECHNICAL INFO. ONE HUNDRED FIFTY OR ONE HUNDRED SIXTY LBS., YELLOWISH BLONDE HAIR, LIGHT BLUE EYES, MORDIC TYPE, PROBABLY GERMAN WITH DEFINITE ACCENT BELIEVED GERMAN. UITH A WEAKNESS FOR BUYING SHOES WHICH STEMMED ACCORDING TO HIM. FROM A SHOELESS CHILDHOOD. IN CONTACTS WITH JACK DURING MINETEEN FORTY AND FORTYONE. JACK NEVER ABLE TO PASS SHOE STORE WITHOUT WINDOW SHOPPING. JACK TOLD BLACK TO FORGET TROTSKYITES AND GET TO MORE SERIOUS BUSINESS. INSTRUCTED BLACK TO GET JOB AT KELLEX, PHONETIC, A SUBSID KELLOG ENGINEERING CO. THIS PRODABLY ABOUT HINETEEN FORTYONE OR

At 6:30 p.m. on June 16, 1950, I instructed Special Agent in Charge Cornelius of the Philadelphia Office to cease interviews with Thomas L. Black immediately. Hr. Cornelius was advised that interviews should not be resumed with Black until Bureau clearance was obtained. Mr. Cornelius was instructed to have a physical surveillance conducted of Black as soon as he leaves the Philadelphia Office.

I suggested to Mr. Cornelius that when the interview is terminated that Black should be made to understand that we know he is not telling the truth, that he may desire to think the matter over and consult with us later. Mr. Cornelius advised that the interview would be terminated at once and Black would be out of the office within fifteen minutes, that undoubtedly Black will go to New Jersey over the weekend and a physical surveillance will be instituted at once.
