As the Bureau is aware, during the period from 10/22/53 through 11/20/53, two informants NY 963 - S and NY 964-s, of known reliability, were utilized. The material furnished by these informants hes been closely reviewed, and information which will be set forth hereinafter is believed to be of particular significance in connection with the FINESTONE and GLASEMAK investigations.

NY 964 - S advised that a dinner party took place in the home of FINESTONE and his wife, ANNETTE, during the evening of 10/30/53. This informant stated that at 7:35 pom., two dinner guests by the names of "VIVIAN" and "ERNEST" entered the apartment of FINESTONE at 106 Bedford Street, New York City, New York. According to this informant, these individuals remained at the FINESIGML apartment until 2:40 a.m., 10/31/53.

Later in the evening another couple by the names of "GEORGE" and "JANET", who were then residing in Room 1439 at the ${ }^{\text {i }}$ Hotel stater, New York City, joined the above mentioned individuals.

It is being pointed out that various difficulties were encountered by NY 964-S in monitoring the conversations of these individuals, inasmuch as various background noises were apparent such as the continuous playing of a radio, the

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energetic play activities on the part of youngsters on the outside street, and such interferences as the rattling of dishes, movement of individuals in the apartment, the fact that at various times tie subjecti spoke in subdued tones, and other unaccountable noises which caused interference.

In addition to the difficulties noted above, it is noted that prior to and during dinner at winich the FINESTONES and PATAKIS were present, there were at times several conversations foing on at the same time. At certain intervals durinc the conversation the four people present were discussing one topic. At other intervals there were. conversations going on between ANNETTE FINESTONE and VIVIAN GLASSMAN, on one inand relating to mutual problems of common interest, wille at the same time undercurrents of conversation could be neard between ERNEST PATAKI and MAX FINESTONE. Furthermore, it was noted that no one particular subject of conversation was discussed for a limited period of time, and tinen dropped completely. Rather the conversation would relate to one topic, would subsequently branch off to another and would invariably return to the original topic. All of these factors made intelligent monitoring of the entire conversation extremely difficult.

For this reason, considerable effort has been oxpended.by agents of the New_York office in an attempt to develop from this informant, every phrase possible which. constituted conversation between individuals identified as "VIVIAN" and "ERNEST" and the FINESTONES.

The "VIVIAN" and "HFNEST" referred to above, are believed to be VIVIAN GLASSMAN and her husband, ERNEST PETARI. This identification was effected through the conversation obtained from the informant and also by listening to their volces by SA ROBERT $F$. ROYAL, who has personally interviewed both GLASSMAN and PATAKI.

It is further believed thet the "GEOKGJ" and "JANET" referrec to above are cousins of MAX FIVEStOME, who presentiy resice in the Boston, Massachusetts area.

The New York Office will attempt to definitely identify these two individuals throurh inquiry at the Hotel statier.

It was noted that when "GEORGE" and "JAIET" joined the gathering later in the evening of 10/30/53, no attempt was made by the FIMESTONRS to introdice the PATAFIS by name to "GECRGF" and "JANET". They were merely introduced as friends.

The ensuing conversations after "GEOKGE" and "JinET" joined the eathering, at approximately 10:00 p.m., consisted of ceneral tonics of the day, such as current everts, family situations and respective pregnancies of ANNETTF CEAIT FITESTONE and VIVIAN GIMASSMAN.
betwoen the PATAKIE and FTHESTONEs, discussion tas had between VIVIAL and ANNETTE concerning their respective pregnancios. ViVIAN indicated that she is expecting a baby zt the ond of February, wile ANNETTE is expecting a baby in January, 1954.

VIVIAN inouired concerning the vacation winsch the Fing esomfs-went-on for approximately a month duration, during September and October 1953.: VIVIAN atated, HI understand you went away for month, where did you go?" Annerime replied that they had visited MAX's people. Theroafter VIVIAN inquired by stating, " Catch us up, we inaren't scen you for montles?"

VIVIAN advised AMETTE and NAX that they are looking for a new apartment and have not found one. VIVIA! in this rogard states to $N A X$, "You haven't been to our new epartaent". MAX reolies, "I didn't know you had one". VIVIAN states tinat tinoy are in GLAD's apartment.

It will be noted tinat VIVIAN is currently reciding in the apartment winch was formerly utilized by her sisters, $\stackrel{1}{1}$

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ELEANOR and GLADYS at 343 Enst 8 th strect, Fsu Eork City.
Contínuing, VIVIAl states to the FimmsicNEs, 'You know the apertment, didn't you know thet we noved in?" MAX replies, "No". ANNETTE remarks, "The old place". VIVIAN states, "At the end of Fay, sure". Fiereafter MAX inquires, "Did you let what's the name have your place." VIVIAN states, "No one has our plece." Fiereafter VIVIAN describes to the FINESTCNES her present epartnent. She remorics that they pay 0.8 .00 a month rent, end have a "docent apartment". She states, "You remeber". She advised thom that their apartment hes four lovelj roons which is located on the top floor of their bullding five flights. up.

MAX in conversation with ERNEST inquires whero he is teaching now. MAX also inquires of EnNPSI as to whe ther he can repair fólevision sets. .Thereafter MAX and ERNEST generally discuss the repairing of television sets and discussion is had between the FINESTONES and PAFrIS concerning the electrical engineering fleld in zeneral.

VIVIAN and ERNEST both indicate that $\overline{5} \%$ of all electrical engineers are directly or indirectly enfaged in work concerning the defense of the United States and relāted matters

Certain conversation entered into thereafter is not definitely understandaile, however, it is balieved that VIVIAis and FRBEST throubin inference were indicaning to one another that ERNEST would have an exceedingey difficult time in obtaining employment in the electrical eqgineering field for loyalty reasons.

Although the meaning of the following is not definitely apparent, VIVIAN remarks, "We are already out of and tivere is much more than we looked for. ${ }^{\circ}$ HAT and ERNEST make inaudible replies and thereafter ANNEFIE mikes a roply

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wilich is inaudible except for the following: "but they will, they have started on our organization.... ${ }^{n}$

With reference to the aforementionod conversation, which occurred prior to and during dinner at the FINESTONE home, at which VIVIAN GLASSMAN and her husband, ERNEST PATAKI were present, the following portion of the conversation was considered to be important since it dealt with various aspects of the ROSENBERG case and related matters. For this reason an attempt was made to obtain a verbatim transcript of the conversation as accurctely as possible, considering the various difficulties encountered as mentioned previously.

It will be noted that in some instances in the following transcript certain words have been underlined to indicate the uncertainty of the word as used in the conversation, but at the same time to indicate the best possible interpretation of the word from the phonetic standpoint.

The first names set out below as VIVIAN, CRNEST, ANNETIE and MAX, refer respectively to VIVIAN GLASSIAN, ERNEST PATAKI, ANNETTE FINESTONE and MAX FIINESTONE:

VIVIAN: "....veryd very difficult, but I think that to the extent that we were able to help him (hide it ) (hide him), I think MAX and I worked out our way of operating I mean $M A X$ and $I$ worked out our way of operating.....

ANNETTE: "Did you help him personally as individuals as the Army has itp"

VIVIAN: "No,.... the subject.... because he'sistill on the ropes, and people looked at -"

ANNETTE: "That's right. ${ }^{4}$
VIVIAN: "It bocomes necessary to do something to ease the torture (pressure) upon them - and I think, as they said, we worked out the best kind of arrangement that I could figure out,

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That we worked (were) together... Everyday it is getting worse... 变的y mention. name in it... in every paper.... picture in the papor and everything... Oh, sure it's been in every papor for about a week..." (inaudible response).

VIVIAN: "People call me, I didn't see it in the beginning...."

MAX. "What about. " (inaudible)
MAX: "Does DEAN still have his job by the way? Does DFAN still have his job? (inaudible response)

MAX: "All these stories in the Tribune and the Times I've read all the stories in the Times and the Tribune. The only name I found mentioned, as a matter of fact, in all the New York papers 1s..." (1naudible)

ANHETTE: "You didn't know anything to tell... about my husband, did you?"

VIVIAN: "NO..." (inaudible)
VIVIAN: "I don't know what they did - they did they're supposeã to get you. If they... theylll get you - God damma-:- they're all-in-cahoots.e. (inaudible)

ANNETTE: "The one you fear:.." (inaudible)
VIVIAN: "ROY COFN..."
MAX: "BOUDIN says..." (inaudible)
VIVIAN: "But really this is one of the nicest.... You know - I mean not that anyone should, not tinat i sinould, but in terms of what my friend said you could... (inaudible) meant nothing. ROSENBERG was the type of guy... (inaudible) plans you know, isolate his friends, and keep it secret when the wholo thing - when the wiole thing - when the whole thing tinat's a secret becomes...." (inaudible)

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VIVIAN: "But you didn't read the News.... (inaudible) Oh, tinere's more you should see what they said... I can't remember, $I$ sbid $I$ can't remember everything."

MAX: "You mean about personality?"
VIVIAN: "They asked about what our roles vere, - and to tell what we were doing..." (inaudible)

ERNEST: n.... I hate to do that like tinis - tomorrow I'm going to do.... (inaudible conversation) AKWAADOV."

ANNETTE: "They dropped that."
MAX: ${ }^{2}$ No, no."
ANNETTE: ".......Couple. of days ago, 12 men went down..."
MAX: ".... went down, went down yesterday..." (inaudible conversation)

VIVIAN: ".... but it doesn't make any difference. Oh, I'll have an apartment in Connecticut, oh, you just wait and see-1t-It doesn't-matter (up-in-Haddam)-*-* (inaudible conversation)

MAX: n.... broke down and cried..." (inaudible)
MAX: ".... didn't see any other way out of it.... (inauaible) in that respect.... .

VIVIAN: "... not that my iffe, not that they were endangering my life, but my life was boing endangered by my pride ane that was what was making me brave, they understood... foar - but that was what was making me afraid - I don't have to worry....(inaudible), but not that Imknock, knock gt or.... ${ }^{n}$

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ERNEST: "Congratulations."
VIVIAN: "Do you think ELIZABETH BENTLEE is the only one who can get - be a kept woman..."(inaudible)

ANNETTE: "You're more attractive."
VIVIAN: ${ }^{H_{I}} \mathrm{I}^{m}$ afrald this is going to be.... (inaudible). I don't know if they ever got ELIZABETH BENTLEY... * (1naudible) (laughter).

ANNETTE: ".... are you accusing ...."(inaudible)
VIVIAN: "I don't know what they've got, but I know winat they could have had. I know they went through my stuff, and I know what I had there."

Inaudible response from MAX
VIVIAN: "What are you saying sure Ifke thati"
ANNETTE: "Your the one he took the pictures of " (laughter)

ANMETTE: "You know when I walked into that, in front of-that-Guy MARTI N. . - (inaudible) boy, was he burncd. Ee could have been ADOLPH HITLER for all I know...."(inaudible)

VIVIAN: "... what they can't see they learn..."
ANNETTE: "... How did you get those?. You know...." (inauaíble)

ANNETHE: ${ }^{\text {w }}$ When DAVID went with the FEI, about one in the afternoon.... information... each one of them they would see ... (inaidible). She just brusined by; he just brushed by, but didn't hurt me... " (inaudible)

MAX: ".. must have been somebody with a camera." j. ANNETTE: "It could have been, but you couldn't make out anybody with a camera - a camera that you could see anyway.

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"For instance when AL went to the village.... (inaudible). You know they had a picture of Ai folding the car door open and standing against the car"(inamible response)

ANNETTE: ".... nobody Eround the place."
MAX: "Oh, that day, It could be very easy."
ANNETTE: "Well that's mat I mean - coulc the .; ... same thing be done?"

NAX: "Well it's much exsier to do that at a" station."

AINETTE: "No, this was-in Accord."
MAX: "Oh, in Accorà."
ANNETE: NHith a license for the car to make sure it: was.... (inaudible) the man."

MAX: "Was there someboey in the car?"
ANHETTE: "Darling I hese (had) a camera that is no bigger than my: stocking."

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VIVIAN: "I remember... (inaudible) by the process of elimination... "(inaudible)
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ANETTE: "We had one of those...(inaudible). Yeah, It could have been his motuer... (inaudible) yelling about stopping. I don't see if you were an FFBI agent jou woulda't yell stop... (inaudible). Well anjiow this isn't winy we care. He was a youngster about eighteen.... (inaudiole). It's really unlucky fanfare... butit's quite unlucky...(inaudible) witnesses.n
vivian: Now you know,.... First of all, what is there ... find out

> ANNETTE: "They know very well..." (inauditle)

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VIVIAN: "MAX... (Inaudible). By the time they got in touch with.... it was nine months... (inaudible) over at the party..."(inaudible)

ANNETTE: "Because the summer after that everybody came back, and you know who one family wass"

MAX: "Who?"
ANNETTE: "The MORTONS. They came in from the coast, they'd been there a number of years... careful...." (inaudible conversation).

ERNEST: "....guy who had a conversation...(inaudible) one guest with the other.... (inaudible). No one will ever figure out whether that is espionage... (inaudible). You know what that is, thatis in Yiddiah"

ANNETTE: "Those people...." (inaudible)
VIVIAN: "Now, I like my brother's approach. My brother, this is long ago - the first time I made that trip.. (inaudible) Philadelphia address - all right now LOUIE (iILLIE) FISHER (phonetic)what are you going to do about its Nothing1 I... (inaudible). On my way home $I$ got a paper and right there on the front page... (inaudibie). Listen he says when you get a chance he says youll go down the street, youlli pick up the paper, you'll see that your name is there. Don't get nervous... (1naudible). The phone is clicking away like mad... (Inaudible). He says you know they want to scare you. They want to intimidate you because they - look MILT let's not discuss it now - I know they're iistening, but tinis is what they're doing. All right for them to know, MILT says, he says they didit so they know about it, it isn't no he says they did. (inaudible). I'm coming over. That night everybody was coming over.... (inaucible). The way he says it you know (inaudible). Come to think of it, itis possible."

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ANNETTE: ".... (inaudible) an hour and a half... (inaudible) and that's how it was. GEORGE and JULIUS and ETHEL were close together.... (Ineudible) He faced a secret man from another cell, get that? ${ }^{\prime \prime}$

VIVIAN: "That's right"
ANNETTE: "They were safe to trik about it.! In Philadelphia a guy named FRANK FRANCIS... (inaudible) arrests (arrested) !.. (inaudible). You know what else, ... (Inaudible). FRANCIS... (inaudible) FRANK

MAX: "Russia (Russian) dirty (daughty) (phonetic) money"

ANNETIE: "Well that's one of the four, couple of charges."

VIVIANi "Communists"
ANNETTE: ".... (inaudible)When they were there, the whole bunch of them were ready to be jailed. A guy who deals with an FBI man... (1naudible) took it upon himself... (inaudible) ROSENBERG. This guy, this FRANCIS or FRANK. I never heard of him before... (inaucible). AL has (here is) his number...- (inaudible)....Furthermore, when MIKEAIEOVITCZ (phonetic) was put in charge of the whole four one of the whole four, he is the guy who gives consent to the other. guys..."(inaudible conversation follows)

VIVIAN: "... (inaudible) I don't say he worries about everyone, but he worries about LOUISE and ALFRED."

ANNETTE: ".... (inaudible). Contacts with BETA (possibly BETHA) (phonetic).."(inaudible)

MAX: " $\mathrm{Jh}^{"}$
ANNETTE: "I'll tell you.... (inaudible)

"Jó BLUN, one of tinese fine dayb.... (inaudible). He gotta be careful too...."(inaudible)

Thereafter it acpears that someone made an inaudible reply which sounds like "don't worry about it". Thereafter ANNETTE and NAX mention the name BETTY SANDERS. ANNETIE apparently tells the others about a humorous story Which involves BETTY SANDERS and a person by the name of "JOSH". AMMETLE states, "There is JOSH. $\therefore$ If ever I met one when he took the wastepaper basket, the whole thing and dumped it, they end up, she did a very bright thing, she put the wastopaper basket back and the next... JOSH was looking for something. He knocked over the wastepaper basket again.

ANNETTE: statea, "God - what a queer, hat..." (inaudible)

MAX: ${ }^{-1}$ Two boys as I. remember anyway. ${ }^{n}$
ANNETTE: "Yes".
MAX and AMNETTE enter (into an inaudible discussion and thereafter NAX is heard to "state, "You know them? VIVIAN replies, "Do I know them... I met her sister... (inaudible) MAX says, "Yes, that is where they live."

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The medium utilized by the FINESTONES and户̄̄TAKIS in arranging for the dinner party which took place on 10/30/53 is not known. It is noted, however, that at 6:30 PM, on 10/29/53, according to 耳Y-963-S, ANNETTE FINESTONE contacted an unknown women named either "EADIE", (phonetic) or "BESS", who is possibly the wife of "SAM". ANNETTE advised this woman that she had invited some people over for dinner tomorrow night (10/30/53).

In connection with EAX FINESTONE'S
statement"...I've read all the stories in the Times and Tribune. The only name I found mentioned as a matter of fact in all the NY papers..." it was noted in the 10/16/53 issue of the "NY Times" the names of VIVIAN GLASSMAN and WILLIAM PERL are mentioned. The name of PERL is again mentioned in the "NY Times" issue of 10/28/53, as are the names of GREENGLASS, JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG and HARRY GOLD. On 10/30/53, the mames of MORTON SOBELI and JULIUS ROSENBERG are mentioned in the "NY Times."

It should be noted that VIVIAN GLASSMAN testified as a witness before the $\mathrm{ks}_{\mathrm{c}}$ Carthy Comnittee in NYC (Closed Session) on 10/15/53. VIVIAN mentions the name of ROY COHN, in conversation with AFNETTE FINESTONE. COHN is counsel for the. Mc Carthy Comittee. BOUDIN mentioned by MAX is probably LEONARD BOUDIN, VIVIAN'S attorney in connection with her appearance before Committee.
believed identical with ISMAIL AKHMDOV, who testified before the Jenner Committee in NYC on 10/29,30/53.

The phrase attributed to MAX "... broke down \& cried" possibly refers to CARL CREENBLUM, Nic Carthy Committee witness on $10 / 12$ and 10/16/53. GREENBLTM is the subject of a pending Espionage - R investigation, NI origin.

In noting the reference made ANNETTE, "when DAVID went with the FBI about one in the afternoon" most probably refers to DAVID GREENGLASS. It is recalled that agents of this office approached GREFNGLASS at approximately

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1:46 PM on $6 / 15 / 50^{-}$and he voluntary accompanied agents to the NYO at approximately 5 PM , the same date.

ANNETTE FINESTONE'S reference to "That guy MARTIN" is belleved identical with former ADSA ROBERT MARTIN, SDNY. MARTIN questioned ANNETTE FINESTONE before the FGJ, SDNY on $3 / 2,4 / 53$.

It is noted that VIVIAN GLASSMAN'S brother is named MILTON GLASSMAN. The significance of VIVIAN'S statement "... the first time I made that trip.... Philadelphia address, "All right now LOUIE (or WILLIE) FISHER (ph), what are you going to do about it? Nothing...", is not known. In connection with the ROSENBERG and related ${ }^{\prime}$ investigations, the name of LOUIE or VILLIE FISHER (Dh) is not recalled. The Philadelphia Office is requested to attempt to identify FISHER.

ANNETTE FINESTONE'S reference to "That's how it was.. GEORGE and JULIUS and ETHEL were close together . " may refer to Dr. GEORGE BERNHARD, who was a government witness at the Rosenberg trial and JULIJS and ETHEL ROSENBERG. It is also pointed out that MAX FINESTONE has a brother and a cousin named GEORGE STONE and GEORGE (LNO). respectively.

The identity of FRANCIS or FPAMK from Philadelphia is not known. The Philadelphia Office is also requested to_atterpt to identify this_individual.

Concerning the individual name MIKHAILOVITCH (ph) who ANNETTE FINESTONE states "was put in charge of the whole four, one of the whole four, he is the guy that gives consent to the other guys...." nothing is known. MIKHAILOVITCI (ph) could possibly refer to a sir name of an individual or to a middle name of a Russian. It is not an uncommon custom for an individual to be addressed by their middle name (patronymic name). This could possibly be a masculins patronymic of the father's name. It is also noted in the Soviet Union, some dialects use a form identical to the patronymic for the family name. Consequently, the individual referred to a MIKFAILOVITCH ( ph ) could be either the patronymic or family name. NYO will make every effort

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to identify this individual.



With reference to JOE BLUM, mentioned by ANNETTE FINESTONE during conversation with VIVIAN CLASSMAN and the others in which she states "I'll tell you.. JOE BLOM, - one of these fine days ne got to be careful too ..." it is noted that WILLIAM PERL has a brother-in-law by the name of JOSEPH PAUL BLOM. BLOM, h1s wife and two children, a boy and girl were last known to be in Flushing, NY and employed as an engineer for the Malan Plumbing Co., Long Island City, NY. When ROSENBERG'S apartment, was searched in connection with his arrest, $7 / 17 / 50$, many business caras were found, among those was one for the Mechinical Heating Corp., 2415 Third Avenue, Bronx, NY on which the name JOSEPH P. BLJM was printed. When interviewed he stated that this was his card which as a representative of this firm he distributed to many individuals etc., contactea in connection with his work. He denied knowing ROSENBERG and was unable to explain how ROSETBERG_came_into possession of his business_card.

NYO is initiating an investigation entitled "UNSUB, wa: JOE BLOM; ESP-R ${ }^{\text {n }}$. JOSEPH PAUL BLOM wili be considered as a suspect for the unknown subject. Philadelphia is requested to furnish any informant which might be identical with JOE BLUM.

The reference made to BETTY SANDERS by ANNETTE PINESTONE is believed identical with a person of same name, friend of the FINESTONES and GLASS:MAN, who is the subject of a:SM - C Investigation, NY origin. JOSH mentioned is possibly JOSH WHITE, friend of BETTY SANDERS.

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The identities of "DEAN" (Dh) "AL" and "The MORTONS" (ph) mentioned during the conversation reported herein are not known. The liew York Office will attempt to identify these individuals.

FINESTONE advised this date that he hed only yesterday effected arrangements to exchange apartments with someone. All CI could learn about the new apartacnt is that it will have three rooms and is not located in the Greenulch Village section. The NYO will obtain the new address and immediately advise the Bureau. Consideretion will then be Given to requestina a Tesur survey for FINESTOile's new residence.
