I. PERSONAL HISTORY

The following background information was obtained from the employee's personnel file at the Naval Ordnance Laboratory, United States Naval Gun Factory, Washington, D. C.

WILLIAM DANZIGER presently resides at 1909 19th Street,
N. W., Washington, D. C. He was born April 12, 1918 at New York City. His
father is AVON DANZIGER, born May 1, 1887, Poland. His mother, TILLIE
SCHICKHAN DANZIGER, was born May 22, 1890 in Poland. Both were naturalized
in May, 1920, and presently reside at 699 Beck Street, New York City. His
wife is SYLVIA EHRLICH DANZIGER, who was born SYLVIA SANDRA' FHRLICH on
January 3, 1919 at New York City. DANZIGER attended Stuyvesant High School,
New York City, and graduated from the City College of New York in January,
1938. He attended the University of Maryland at College Park, Maryland
during 1946.

DANZIGER was employed as an Electrician's Helper with the Commercial Electric Company, 160 Spring Street, New York City, from July to September of the years 1936, 1937 and 1938. On November 2, 1938, he was appointed Junior Engineer Electrician, Bureau of Ordnance, United States Navy Department, Washington, D. C. In August, 1941, DANZIGER resigned from the Navy Department and from August to December, 1941, was employed as Electrician Inspector, Fire Department, New York City. On January 1, 1942, he entered on duty with the Industrial Department, United States Navy Yard, brooklyn, New York as an Ordnance Engineer. He served in this capacity until April 2, 1943 when he was transferred to the United States Naval Dry Docks, Terminal Island, San Pedro, California, as an Electrical Engineer. On April 17, 1945, DANZIGER received the first Commendation Award over to be presented at the United States Naval Dry Docks, Terminal Island, California. This Award was given for DANZIGER's suggestion concerning an index of ordnance alterations. The Award stated, "DANZIGER has displayed outstanding initiative and resourcefulness by contributing a suggestion,



"the adoption of which has materially aided war production." On May 1, 1945, he was transferred from the United States Naval Dry Docks, Terminal Island, San Pedro, California, to the Bursau of Ordnance, United States Navy Department, Washington, D. C. DANZIGLER received an intra-agency transfer on March 2, 1948 from Gun Mount Design Engineer, Bursau of Ordnance, to the position of Electrical Engineer, Research Department, Acoustics Division, Naval Ordnance Laboratory, Navy Yard, Washington, D. C. His present position is one of a supervisory capacity.

11. BASIS FOR INVESTIGATION

The House Committee on Un-American Activities files reflect that Mr. and Mrs. WILLIAM DANZIGER, 2819 S Street, 5. E., Washington, D. C., were listed as members of the Washington Committee for Democratic Action.

It should be noted that the Washington Committee for Democratic Action appears on the list of organizations named by the Attorney General, TOM C. CLARK, on November 24, 1947 as being within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

Washington T-1, of known reliability, advised that in Fabruary, 1941, Mr. and Mrs. WILLIAM DANZIGER, 2817 S Street, S. E., Mashington, D. C., were active members of the American Peace Mobilization. (T-1-would-net furnish a signed statement and refused to appear before a Loyalty Review Board.)

It should be noted that the American Peace Kobilization, upon the German invasion of Russia in 1941, became known as the American People's Mobilization.

The American Peace Mobilization appears on the list of organizations named by the Attorney General on November 24, 1947 as being within purview of Executive Order 9535.

III. RESULTS OF INVESTIGATION

The files of the House Committee on Un-American Activities reflect in addition to the above information that Mrs. SYLVIA DANZIGER, Chairman of the Women's Auxiliary, United Public Workers, Washington, D. C., Inter-Racial Nursery School Project, appears in the "Bookshopper", April, 1947, Page 5.

Cited as "subversive and un-American" by the Special Committee of the House Committee on Appropriations Report, April 21, 1943 (Page 3) "on its Labor Advisory Board with BEN GOLD, an avowed Communist and leader of the Joint Board Furriers Union, MICHAEL QUILL, LOUIS WEINSTOCK, and other labor leaders." (New York City Council Committee Investigating the Municipal Civil Service Commission, pt. 11, p. 81). Cited as a Communist Front organization by the Pennsylvania Commonwealth Council before the Reviewing Board of the Philadelphia County Board of Assistants, January, 1942. Cited as a Communist Front (California Committee on Un-American Activities Report, 1943, Page 102). Cited as a Communist Front by the Special Committee on Un-American Activities, March 29, 1944.

At 1909 19th Street, N. W., Washington, D. C., where the employee presently resides, Mr. WILLIAM R. McDONOUGH, Apartment 402, said he has known the employee and his family as neighbors for about two years and that he and Mrs. McDONOUGH until recently have taken care of the DANZIGER children whenever Mr. and Mrs. DANZIGER desired to go out for a social evening. He said, "I consider Mr. DANZIGER to be a left-winger or a liberal." He said he based his opinion to the above statement on the fact that Mr. DANZIGER subscribes to the New York City daily newspaper "P. M." and is a member of the Consumers Union. Mr. McDONOUGH said he considers P. M." to he "a liberal newspaper" because he believes it customarily sponsors the cause of the consumer and the working man against exploitation by business interests. He said he considers the Comsumers Union to be "a liberal organization" because he believes it to be an organization whose efforts are devoted to furthering the extent to which the Government protects the interest of the consumer from false advertising and inferior products which might be offered to the public by business interest.

Mr. McDONOUGH said he considers Mr. DANZIGER to be loyal to the United States form of Government and stated that Mr. DANZIGER's conversations reflect he is very conscientious about trying to properly perform the duties of his job. Mr. McDONOUGH said, "I definitely do not consider him to be radical," and he stated by this he meant, "I do not believe Mr. DANZIGER would have any part in any plan to try to overthrow the United States Government by force or that he would consider such a plan." Mr. McDONOUGH said he knew of no organizations to which the employee might belong other than those

already mentioned. He said he based his statement to the effect that Mr. DANZIGER subscribes to "P. M." and is a member of the Consumers Union on the fact that when in the DANZIGER apartment, he has observed current issues of "P. M." and current publications of the Consumers Union. Mr. NcDONOUGH said he preferred not to furnish a signed statement, but he has no objection to testifying before a Loyalty Review Board.

Mrs. MARY ANN McDONOUGH, wife of Mr. WILLIAM McDONOUGH, said that she and her husband were, until recently, good friends of the DANZIGERS. She said that Mrs. DANZIGER is some kind of officer of an inter-racial mursery school for small children of all races, which school is held in the basement of a nearby church, but she was unable to give the exact location or name of the church. She stated that Mrs. DANZIGER is active in advertising various social events, the proceeds of which are intended for the benefit of the inter-racial nursery school. Mrs. McDONOUGH described Mrs. DANZIGER as being without any racial prejudice and as having expressed her gladness over the fact that her four-year-old daughter can attend such a nursery school. Mrs. McDONOUGH said that Mrs. DANZIGER is a member of the Women's Auxiliary of the local CIO Union to which Mr. DANZIGER belongs. However, she did not know the name of the labor union. She also stated that Yrs. DANZIGER regularly attended meetings of this Auxiliary. Mrs. McDONOUGH said, relative to the associates of the DANZIGERS, that practically all of their friends are employees of some branch of the Government in Washington, D. C.; however, she added that from time to time people from California and New York called on the DANZIGERS when they were in Washington, D. C. Mrs. McDONOUGH said that she based this statement on information furnished to her by Mrs. DANZIGER. Mrs. McDONOUGH said she was unable to furnish the names of these individuals. She further stated that the DANZIGERS have two friends in the persons of a well-educated colored woman and her husband and that this couple are frequent social visitors to the DANZIGER apartment. Mrs. McDONOUGH said she understood from remarks of Mrs. DANZICER's that the colored lady referred to is prominent in the activities of the inter-racial mursery school, She said that Lr. and Mrs. MARK HAMMIS, Apartment 605, 1909 19th Street, N. W., Washington, D. C. are very good friends of the DANZIGERS. She said she had no knowledge of anything bearing directly on the DANZIGERS' loyalty to the United States. Mrs. McDONOUGH said she preferred not to sign a statement but would have no objection to testifying before a Loyalty Review Board.

Mrs. M. J. HUGHES, Apartment 704, 1909 19th Street, N. W., Washington, D. C., said she could not make any statement as to the loyalty of the smployee or his wife and added that her acquaintance with Mr. and Mrs. DANZIGER had been very limited. She further advised that Mr. and Mrs. MARK HARRIS, who reside in Apartment 605 at the above address, are close friends of the DANZIGERS.

"I have worked with William Danziger on two separate occasions at the Bureau of Ordnance, Navy Dept. I have had no social or other outside contacts with him, and any comments I make are based solely on my work contacts with him during the periods 1938 - 1942, and 1945 - 1948.

"I consider his engineering work to have been of high caliber, and I would not question his loyalty to the United States.

"I do not know whether he is or has been a member of Consumers Union, but I have on occasion seen copies of their reports on his desk.

"I beleive he is a member of UPNA. I know of no other groups or organizations of which he is a member.

"I have read the statement on the obverse side of this sheet, and to the best of my knowledge it is correct and true.

Mr. PHILIAS H. GIROUARD, Chief Engineer, Bureau of Ordnance, United States Navy Department, Washington, D. C., stated he has known Mr. DANZIGER in a business way since 1938 when the employee was first attached to the Bureau of Ordnance, Washington, D. C. In 1942, DANZIGER was employed to the Brooklyn Navy Yard, New York, and later was transferred to Terminal 1sland, San Pedro, California. In 1945, the employee returned to the



Bureau of Ordnance, Navy Department, Washington, D. C., and from that time to Earch, 1948, was on duty in Mr. GIROUARD's section. He said Mr. DANZIGER has never committed any acts or said anything which would cause him to question DANZIGER's loyalty in any way. Mr. GIROUARD believes DANZIGER to be entirely patriotic and loyal to our American form of Government.

Mr. CHARLES A. JOHNSTONE, Head of the Missile Launcher Section, bureau of Ordnance, Navy Department, Washington, D. C., said he has been acquainted with Mr. and Mrs. WILLIAM DANZIGER both professionally and socially since the early part of 1945. At that time, Mr. DANZIGER was on duty with the bureau of Ordnance at Terminal Island, California. In 1945, he was transferred to Washington, D. C., where he has been on duty as an Engineer since that time. He stated that during the time he has known DANZIGER, the employee has exhibited high character and there has never been any question regarding his loyalty or patriotism to the Government. Mr. JOHNSTONE said he has no knowledge of any organizations in which Mr. LANZIGER or his wife hold a membership. So far as Mr. JOHNSTONE has been in a position to tell, DANZIGER's friends and associates are people of good character and he has never known anything which would reflect upon their loyalty.

Mr. PAUL W. BURK, Head Engineer, Dureau of Crdnance, Navy Department, Washington, D. C., stated he has known Mr. DANZIGER in a professional way since 1938. He knows nothing concerning the employee's outside activities or associates; however, from his observation, Mr. DANZIGER has never done or said anything which would cause him to question his loyalty in any way. DANZIGER has always been trustworthy, and Mr. BURK believes the employee to be a patriotic, loyal American citizen. Mr. EURK stated he had no knowledge of any clubs or organizations to which the employee might belong.

Mr. MAURICE H. BALLER, Electrical Engineer, Missile Leuncher Section, Bureau of Ordnance, Navy Department, Washington, D. C., said he has known DANZIGER since 1938 professionally and socially. He has a high respect for Mr. DANZIGER and has never heard the employee make any statements which would reflect upon him in any way. DANZIGER is highly trustworthy and Mr. BALLER believes him to be entirely loyal to the United States Government. Mr. BALLER stated that DANZIGER is not a member of any organizations so far as he knows.

Er. Althur J. STANTON, Head Engineer, Research and Development Section, Sureau of Ordnance, United States Navy Department, Washington, D. C., advised that he has known the employee in a professional way since 1938. DANZIGER served with the Bureau of Ordnance from 1938 to 1942 in



Wasrington, D. C. From 1942 to the spring of 1945, DANZIGER was on duty with the Navy in New York and California. In 1945, he returned to the Bureau of Ordnance, Washington, D. C., and is presently serving with the Navel Ordnance Laboratory at White Oaks, Maryland. From STANTON's knowledge of DANZIGER, he believes the employee to be a loyal citizen. STANTON has never had any reason to doubt DANZIGER's loyalty in any way. He stated he could make no comment concerning the employee's outside activities or his organizational membership.

Mr. MAX ELITCHER, 247 Delaware Avenue, S. W., Washington, D. C., Project Engineer, Research and Development Section, Bureau of Ordnance, Navy Department, Washington, D. C., said he has known Mr. DANZIGER since they were students at the City College of New York. While at the City College of New York, the employee was a member of the American Institute of Electrical Engineers. In December, 1938, Hr. ELITCHER and the employee came to Washington, D. C. together and resided at 1316 Delafield Place, N. W., Washington, D. C., from December, 1936, to February, 1939. In 1939, DANZIGER was married to SYLVIA EHRLICH and, since that time, ELITCHER has been a close friend and social acquaintance of the DANZIGERS. He further advised that he and his wife have visited the DANZIGERS in their home on numerous occasions. He also said that he and Mr. DANZIGER are members of Local #3 of the United Public Workers of America, Navy Department Branch, and attend meetings of this organization together. Mr. ELITCHER stated that, when the employee and his wife returned to Washington, D. C. from San Pedro, California, in the spring of 1945, they resided in his home at 247 Delaware Avenue, S. W., for six or eight weeks while looking for a place to live. Mr. ELITCHER feels that Mr. and Mrs. DANZIGER are people of high character and unquestionable loyalty. He stated that he knew of no other organizations with which DANZICER or his wife are affiliated other than the ones mentioned previously by him.

It has been ascertained from a reliable informant that FAX ELITCHER, 247 Delaware Avenue, S. W., Washington, D. C., was a member of the Washington Bookshop Association in February, 1948. The informant further advised that MAX ELITCHER, Engineer in the Navy Department, appeared on the membership list of the Washington Committee for Democratic Action in January, 1941.

United States Navy Department, Washington, D. C., stated he has known Mr. DANZIGER since 1938 in a business way and on occasion has met his wife. However, KINZELMAN does not feel he knows the DANZIGERS socially. During the time he has known the employee, DANZIGER has been strongly pro-union



and is a member of the United Public Workers of America. During the recent Government cafeteria strike, DANZIGER did not patronize the cafeterias and asked other people to cooperate. He also said that Mr. DANZIGER sends his oldest child to an Inter-Racial Nursery School sponsored by the United Public Workers of America, but he could furnish no details concerning this nursery school. According to Mr. KINZELMAN, he has never heard DANZIGER make any remarks or commit any acts which would cause him to suspect his loyalty to the United States Government. KINZELMAN believes the employee is entirely loyal to the United States.

Mr. ARON L. SUSSMAN, Mechanical Engineer, Bureau of Ordnance, Navy Department, Washington, D. C., advised he has been acquainted with the employee since 1937 or 1938 when they were attending City College of New York together. Since their college days, they have been associated professionally in the Bureau of Ordnance, United States Navy Department. He said he has always found DANZIGER to be highly trustworthy. He never heard or saw anything which might reflect in any way upon DANZIGER's character or loyalty. Mr. SUSSMAN said he was not familiar with the employee's outside activities or his associates and, therefore, he could make no statement as to whether DANZIGER or his wife belonged to any organizations such as the Communist Party. From his knowledge of DANZIGER, SUSSMAN does not believe the employee has any sympathies for Communism or that he has ever been connected in any way with a Communist Front organization.

Lieutenant Commander WILLIAM E. JERNEIAH, United States Navy Department, Washington, D. C., stated he knew the employee casually while the employee was working as an Engineer at Terminal Island, San Pedro, California. Commander JEREMIAH said he does not know DANZIGER well enough to make any comment concerning his loyalty.

Captain HENRY T. KOONCE, United States Navy Department, Mashington, D. C., said he has known the employee since 1943 professionally. When he first knew him, DANZIGER was stationed at Terminal Island, San Pedro, California. While there, DANZIGER was very active in the local United Public Workers of America, CIO union, but KOONCE considers none of his actions as reflecting on his loyalty in any way. So far as Captain KOONCE knows, DANZIGER was entirely trustworthy and loyal. He does not know if DANZIGER or his wife are members of any organizations such as the Communist Party.

Er. HAMILTON H. DOW, Civilian in Charge of Design Weights
Section, Bureau of Ships, United States Navy Department, Hashington, D. C.,
advised he has known the DANZIGERS since 1943. In 1943, he and Er. DANZIGER
were employed together at Terminal Island, San Pedro, California. He stated



that while in California, they were also socially acquainted. However, since the spring of 1945, they have only known each other in a business way. While in California, Mr. and Mrs. DANZICER resided at 2270 Belmont Avenue, Long Beach, California. He said that he knew of no organizations to which either the employee or his wife belonged other than the United Public Workers of America. Mr. DANZIGER is pro-labor and was active in the labor union at Terminal Island. He stated that none of these activities would reflect upon DANZIGER's loyalty in any way and he, Mr. DOW, believes DANZIGER and his wife to be entirely patriotic and loyal American citisens.

IT. JOHN V. ATONASOFF, Chief of the Acoustics Division, Naval Ordnance Laboratory, United States Navy Department, White Oaks, Maryland, stated he has only known the employee for the past six weeks during which time the employee has been assigned to the Naval Ordnance Laboratory at White Caks. He stated that from talking and working with DANZIGER during this period, he believes him thoroughly American and has no question regarding his loyalty. He stated that he was unable to make any further comment regarding Mr. DANZIGER.

Wr. CHARLES M. MEDFORD, 925 15th Street, N. W., Washington, D. C., advised that Mr. and Mrs. DANZIGER resided in Apartment 303 at 2517 K Street, N. W., during the latter part of 1939 and early part of 1940. Mr. MMDFORD said he did not know the DANZIGERS well enough to comment on their loyalty to the Government.

Mrs. J. W. MURRAY, Resident Manager of the Apartments at 2517 K Street, N. W., Washington, D. C., who has lived at this address since 1939, Mrs. CARRIE FRIES, resident at above address since 1939, Mr. H. S. NEWMAN and Mr. JOSEPH H. HOSKINS, both of whom have resided at the above address for more than ten years, all advised they did not know Mr. and Mrs. DANZIGER.

Mrs. EDWARD E. SHARLE, JR., Apartment 2, 4332 Halley Terrace, S. E., Washington, D. C., stated she recalled the employee and his wife as former neighbors for a few months during the early part of 1946. Mrs. SEARLE said she had no knowledge of anything bearing on the employee's loyalty or that of his wife.

Mrs. JALES R. O'BRIEN, Apartment 1, 4338 Halley Terrace, S. E., Washington, D. C., said she recalled the employee as a neighbor but could not furnish any information with reference to his or his wife's loyalty.

Mrs. WARION MILES, Apartment 2, 4342 Halley Terrace, S. E., Washington, D. C., said her acquaintanceship with the employee was not of

sufficient duration to enable her to know him well enough to make any comment regarding his loyalty.

Mrs. MARY HEATHERLEY, Apartment 21, 1466 Columbia Road, N. W., Washington, D. C., a resident at this address for more than eleven years, said she recalled that Mr. and Mrs. DANZIGER lived in the apartment house but she could furnish no information relative to their loyalty or character.

Mr. A. STUART BURCH, who has resided at 1314 Delafield Place, N. W., Washington, D. C., since 1927, Mr. J. H. BOWER, who has lived at 1320 Delafield Place, N. W., since 1920, and Mr. ROSS POLLOCH, whose father lived at 1316 Delafield Place, N. W., Washington, D. C., prior to his death in the early 1940's, stated they could furnish no information regarding WILLIAM DANZIGER.

Mrs. EISIE COLE, owner and Manager of the apartment house at 2819 S Street, S. E., Washington, D. C., advised that Mr. and Mrs. DANZICER resided at this address during 1940 and 1941. She said she thought they seemed to be people of good character. She did not know them well enough to comment on their loyalty to the Government. However, she said she never had any cause to question them and she never noticed any unusual activities or meetings in the employee's apartment during the time he resided at this address.

Mrs. J. P. TOWOHIK and Mr. ERWIN FRANK, both residents of 2819 S Street, S. E., Washington, D. C., stated that they did not know Mr. and Mrs. DANZIGER.



Washington T-3, of unquestioned reliability, advised that SYLVIA DANZIGER was a Cashier working at the American Youth Congress Annual Convention in Washington, D. C. on February 7, 8 and 9, 1941.

It should be noted that the American Youth Congress appears on the list of organisations named by Attorney General TOM C. CLARK on November 24, 1947 as being within the purview of Executive Order 9835.



The employee states in his Loyalty Questionnaire that he is a member of the Consumers Union.

The Consumers Union was cited as under Communist control, influenced or in collaboration with the Communist Party by the Committee for Cultural Freedom, Professor JOHN DEWEY, Chairman, April, 1940. Cited as "subversive and un-American" by the Special Committee of the House Committee on Appropriations Report, April 21, 1943 (Page 3) "on its Labor Advisory Board with BEN GOLD, an avowed Communist and leader of the Joint Board Furriers Union, MICHAEL QUILL, LOUIS WEINSTOCK, and other labor leaders." (New York City Council Committee Investigating the Municipal Civil Service Commission, pt. II, p. 81). Cited as a Communist Front organization by the Pennsylvania Commonwealth Council before the Reviewing Board of the Philadelphia County Board of Assistants, January, 1942. Cited as a Communist Front (California Committee on Un-American Activities Report, 1943, Page 102). Cited as a Communist Front by the Special Committee on Un-American Activities, March 29, 1944.

At 1909 19th Street, N. W., Washington, D. C., where the employee presently resides, Mr. WILLIAH R. McDONOUGH, Apartment 402, said he has known the employee and his family as neighbors for about two years and that he and Mrs. McDONOUGH until recently have taken care of the DANZIGER children whenever Mr. and Mrs. DANZIGER desired to go out for a social evening. He said, "I consider Mr. DANZIGER to be a left-winger or a liberal." He said he based his opinion to the above statement on the fact that Mr. DANZIGER subscribes to the New York City daily newspaper "P. M." and is a member of the Consumers Union. Mr. McDONOUGH said he considers "P. M." to be "a liberal newspaper" because he believes it customarily sponsors the cause of the consumer and the working man against exploitation by business interests. He said he considers the Consumers Union to be "a liberal organization" because he believes it to be an organization whose efforts are devoted to furthering the extent to which the Government protects the interest of the consumer from false advertising and inferior products which might be offered to the public by business interest.

Mr. McDONOUGH said he considers Mr. DANZIGER to be loyal to the United States form of Government and stated that Mr. DANZIGER's conversations reflect he is very conscientious about trying to properly perform the duties of his job. Mr. McDONOUGH said, "I definitely do not consider him to be radical," and he stated by this he meant, "I do not believe Mr. DANZIGER would have any part in any plan to try to overthrow the United States Government by force or that he would consider such a plan." Mr. McDONOUGH said he knew of no organizations to which the employee might belong other than those

already mentioned. He said he based his statement to the effect that Mr. DANZIGER subscribes to "P. K." and is a member of the Consumers Union on the fact that when in the DANZIGER apartment, he has observed current issues of "P. M." and current publications of the Consumers Union. Mr. McDONOUCH said he preferred not to furnish a signed statement, but he has no objection to testifying before a Loyalty Review Board.

Mrs. MARY ANN McDONOUGH, wife of Mr. WILLIAM McDONOUGH, said that she and her husband were, until recently, good friends of the DANZIGERS. She said that Mrs. DANZIGER is some kind of officer of an inter-racial mursery school for small children of all races, which school is held in the basement of a nearby church, but she was unable to give the exact location or name of the church. She stated that Mrs. DANZIGER is active in advertising various social events, the proceeds of which are intended for the benefit of the inter-racial mursery school. Mrs. McDONOUGH described Mrs. DANZIGER as being without any racial prejudice and as having expressed her gladness over the fact that her four-year-old daughter can attend such a nursery school. Mrs. McDONOUGH said that Mrs. DANZIGER is a member of the Women's Auxiliary of the local CIO Union to which Mr. DANZIGER belongs. However, she did not know the name of the labor union. She also stated that Mrs. DANZIGER regularly attended meetings of this Auxiliary. Mrs. McDONOUGH said, relative to the associates of the DANZIGERS, that practically all of their friends are employees of some branch of the Government in Washington, D. C.; however, she added that from time to time people from California and New York called on the DANZIGERS when they were in Washington, D. C. Mrs. McDONOUGH said that she based this statement on information furnished to her by Mrs. DANZICER. Mrs. McDONOUGH said she was unable to furnish the names of these individuals. She further stated that the DANZIGERS have two friends in the persons of a well-educated colored woman and her musband and that this couple are frequent social visitors to the DAHZIGER apartment. Mrs. McDONOUGH said she understood from remarks of krs. DANZIGER's that the colored lady referred to is prominent in the activities of the inter-racial mursery school, She said that Mr. and Mrs. MARK HAHRIS, Apartment 605, 1909 19th Street, N. W., Washington, D. C. are very good friends of the DANZIGERS. She said she had no knowledge of anything bearing directly on the DANZIGERS' loyalty to the United States. Mrs. McDONOUGH said she preferred not to sign a statement but would have no objection to testifying before a Loyalty Review Board.

Mrs. M. J. HUGHES, Apartment 704, 1909 19th Street, N. W., Washington, D. C., said she could not make any statement as to the loyalty of the employee or his wife and added that her acquaintance with Mr. and Mrs. DANZIGER had been very limited. She further advised that Mr. and Mrs. MARK HARRIS, who reside in Apartment 605 at the above address, are close friends of the DANZIGERS.



Mr. and Mrs. NEISON BOUFFARD, Apartment 700, 1909 19th Street, N. W., Washington, D. C., advised that they could make no statement regarding the character or loyalty of the employee and his wife.


Mrs. MARK HARRIS, Apartment 605, 1909 19th Street, N. W., Washington, D. C., said she and her husband have known the employee and his wife for more than two years. The two families became acquainted through Mr. HARRIS and Mr. DANZIGER being members of the same local of the United Public Workers, CIO. Mrs. HARRIS said the DANZIGERS were instrumental in the HARRISES being able to rent their present apartment. She stated the two families see a good deal of each other. Mrs. HARRIS further stated that she knew of nothing which might indicate that Mr. DANZIGER is not completely loyal to the United States and its form of Government. She said that, except for Mr. DANZIGER's membership in the United Public Workers union, she had no knowledge of any membership which he might hold in other organizations.

It should be noted that a reliable informant advised the Washington Field Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation that WARK HARRIS, 922 Ridge Road, S. E., Washington, D. C., was a member of the Washington Bookshop Association on February 18, 1944.

It is to be noted that the Washington Bookshop Association, also formerly known as the Washington Cooperative Bookshop Association, appears on the list of organizations named by the Attorney General on November 24, 1947 as being within the purview of Executive Order 9835.



In a previous investigation by the Washington Field Office of the Federal Bureau of <u>Investigation in April</u>, 1942, regarding WARK



The following is a signed statement by SIDNEY HERSH, Bureau of Ordnance, United States Navy Department, Washington, D. C. Mr. HERSH stated that he was willing to testify before a Loyalty Review Board if necessary.

"April 13, 1948

*I, Sidney Hersh, give the following voluntary statement to Special Agent Caleb L. Batten, who has identified himself to me as a Special Agent, Pederal Bureau of Investigation, United States Department of Justice.

"I have known William Danziger since 1937 when we were both students at the College of the City of New York. I knew him only slightly then and became more familiar and friendly with him during the two periods 1938 to 1941 and 1945 to 1948 (approx.) that he spent working in the Bureau of Ordnance, Research and Development Division where I have been

memployed for the past ten years.

"Mr. Danziger, is a member of the United Public Workers, CIO, in which he holds the position of Steward, Defense Branch, Local #3. He is also a member of Group Health, Inc. I believe he subscribes to or is a member of Consumers Union. I can think of no other organization of which ha is a member.

There is no question in my mind as to his loyalty. I am certain that he is completely loyal to the American Government and that he is neither a member of, nor in sympathy with, the Communist Party or the Russian Government.

"I have also met Mr. Danziger's wife and consider her to be loyal to the United States government. I am under the impression that Mrs. Danziger is a member of the Tomen's Auxiliary of the UPW, CIO. I gained this impression from the fact that she is active in the Inter-Racial Nursery School to which she sends her young daughter.

"I have read the above statement, consisting of this and one other page and to the best of my knowledge it is true and correct."

The following signed statement was furnished by Mr. JOHN C. PHILLIPS, Chief Engineer, Bureau of Ordnance, United States Navy Department, Washington, D. C. Mr. PHILLIPS said he would be willing to testify before a Loyalty Review Board.

"12 April 1948

"I, John C. Phillips, give the following voluntary statement to Special Agent Caleb L. Batten who has identified himself to me as a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, U. S. Department

"of Justice.

*William Danziger, Ordnance Engineer (P-4), was employed in the subsection (Re5d) of which I am Chief from 1 May 1945 to 1 March 1948. Through most of this period, Mr. Danziger was under my direct supervision, and I consider him to be a very capable engineer. I have had no contact with Mr. Danziger cutside of office hours and therefore have no knowledge of his social activities or those of his family. I know of no reason to question his loyalty to the United States of America.

"Mr. Danziger has been a staunch defender of labor unions, particuarly those of the CIO, and their rights in informal office discussions. During the recent GSI employees strike he did not patronize GSI cafeterias and suggested that others in the office do likewise. I have no definite knowledge as to his membership in the UPWA Government employees union.

"I have seen copies of Consumer's Union pamphlets on Mr. Danziger's desk; I do not know if he was a subscriber. I have never seen any literature in his possession which I would consider to be questionable. I have no knowledge of his affliations with political, social, professional, or religious organizations.

"I have read the above statement consisting of one page and to the best of my knowledge is correct.

*I, Charles S. Sandler, give the following voluntary statement to Special Agent Caleb L. Batten, who has identified himself to me as a special agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, U. S. Department of Justice:

"I have worked with William Danziger on two separate occasions at the Bureau of Ordnance, Nave Dept. I have had no social or other outside contacts with him, and any comments i make are based solely on my work contacts with him during the periods 1938 - 1942, and 1945 - 1948.

"I consider his engineering work to have been of high caliber, and I would not question his loyalty to the United States.

"I do not know whether he is or has been a member of Consumers Union, but I have on occasion seen copies of their reports on his desk.

"I beleive he is a member of UPMA. I know of no other groups or organizations of which he is a member.

"I have read the statement on the obverse side of this sheet, and to the best of my knowledge it is correct and true.

Washington Confidential Informant T-6, a reliable informant, recently reported that Local #3 of the UPWA is a Communist-dominated union local. T-6 will not give a signed statement or appear before a Loyalty Hearing Board.

Mr. FHILIAS H. GIROUARD, Chief Engineer, Bureau of Ordnance, United States Navy Department, Washington, D. C., stated he has known Mr. DANZIGER in a business way since 1938 when the employee was first attached to the Bureau of Ordnance, Washington, D. C. In 1942, DANZIGER was employed by the Brooklyn Navy Yard, New York, and later was transferred to Terminal Island, San Pedro, California. In 1945, the employee returned to the

Bureau of Ordnance, Navy Department, Washington, D. C., and from that time to March, 1948, was on duty in Mr. GIROUARD's section. He said Mr. DANZIGER has never committed any acts or said anything which would cause him to question DANZIGER's loyalty in any way. Mr. GIROUARD believes DANZIGER to be entirely patriotic and loyal to our American form of Government.

Mr. CHARLES A. JOHNSTONE, Head of the Missile Launcher Section, Bureau of Ordnance, Navy Department, Washington, D. C., said he has been acquainted with Mr. and Mrs. WILLIAM DANZIGER both professionally and socially since the early part of 1945. At that time, Mr. DANZIGER was on duty with the Bureau of Ordnance at Terminal Island, California. In 1945, he was transferred to Washington, D. C., where he has been on duty as an Engineer since that time. He stated that during the time he has known DANZIGER, the employee has exhibited high character and there has never been any question regarding his loyalty or patriotism to the Government. Mr. JOHNSTONE said he has no knowledge of any organizations in which Mr. DANZIGER or his wife hold a membership. So far as Mr. JOHNSTONE has been in a position to tell, DANZIGER's friends and associates are people of good character and he has never known anything which would reflect upon their loyalty.

Mr. PAUL W. BURK, Head Engineer, bureau of Ordnance, Navy Department, Washington, D. C., stated he has known Mr. DANZIGER in a professional way since 1938. He knows nothing concerning the employee's outside activities or associates; however, from his observation, Mr. DANZIGER has never done or said anything which would cause him to question his loyalty in any way. DANZIGER has always been trustworthy, and Mr. BURK believes the employee to be a patriotic, loyal American citizen. Mr. BURK stated he had no knowledge of any clubs or organizations to which the employee

Mr. MAURICE H. BALLER, Electrical Engineer, Missile Leuncher Section, Bureau of Ordnance, Navy Department, Washington, D. C., said he has known DANZIGER since 1938 professionally and socially. He has a high respect for Mr. DANZIGER and has never heard the employee make any statements which would reflect upon him in any way. DANZIGER is highly trustworthy and Mr. BALLER believes him to be entirely loyal to the United States Government. Mr. BALLER stated that DANZIGER is not a member of any organisations so far as he knows.

Mr. ARTHUR J. STANTON, Head Engineer, Research and Development Section, Bureau of Ordnance, United States Navy Department, Mashington, D. C., advised that he has known the employee in a professional way since 1938. DANZIGER served with the Bureau of Ordnance from 1938 to 1942 in



Washington, D. C. From 1942 to the spring of 1945, DANZIGER was on duty with the Navy in New York and California. In 1945, he returned to the Bureau of Ordnance, Washington, D. C., and is presently serving with the Naval Ordnance Laboratory at White Oaks, Maryland. From STANTON's knowledge of DANZIGER, he believes the employee to be a loyal citizen. STANTON has never had any reason to doubt DANZIGER's loyalty in any way. He stated he could make no comment concerning the employee's outside activities or his organizational membership.

Mr. MAX ELITCHER, 247 Delaware Avenue, S. W., Washington D. C., Project Engineer, Research and Development Section, Bureau of Ordnance, Navy Department, Washington, D. C., said he has known Mr. DANZIGER since they were students at the City College of New York. While at the City College of New York, the employee was a member of the American Institute of Electrical Engineers, In December, 1938, Mr. ELITCHER and the employee came to Washington, D. C. together and resided at 1316 Delafield Place, N. W., Eashington, D. C., from December, 1938, to February, 1939. In 1939, DANZIGER was married to SYLVIA EHRLICH and, since that time. ELITCHER has been a close friend and social acquaintance of the DANZIGERS. He further advised that he and his wife have visited the DANZIGERS in their home on mumerous occasions. He also said that he and Mr. DANZIGER are members of Local #3 of the United Public Workers of America, Navy Department Branch, and attend meetings of this organisation together. Mr. ELITCHER stated that, when the employee and his wife returned to Washington, D. C. from San Pedro, California, in the spring of 1945, they resided in his home at 247 Delaware Avenue, S. W., for six or eight weeks while looking for a place to live. Mr. ELITCHER feels that Mr. and Mrs. DANZIGER are people of high character and unquestionable loyalty. He stated that he knew of no other organizations with which DANZIGER or his wife are affiliated other than the ones mentioned previously by him.

It has been ascertained from a reliable informant that WAX ELITCHER, 247 Delaware Avenue, S. W., Washington, D. C., was a member of the Washington Bookshop association in February, 1948. The informant further advised that MAX ELITCHER, Engineer in the Navy Department, appeared on the membership list of the Washington Committee for Democratic Action in January, 1941.

Mr. GERALD KINZELMAN, Bureau of Ordnance, Research Division, United States Navy Department, Washington, D. C., stated he has known Mr. DANZIGER since 1938 in a business way and on occasion has met his wife. However, KINZELMAN does not feel he knows the DANZIGERS socially. During the time he has known the employee, DANZIGER has been strongly pro-union



and is a member of the United Public Workers of America. During the recent Government cafeteria strike, DANZIGER did not patronise the cafeterias and asked other people to cooperate. He also said that Mr. DANZIGER sends his oldest child to an Inter-Racial Nursery School sponsored by the United Public Workers of America, but he could furnish no details concerning this nursery school. According to Mr. KINZELMAN, he has never heard DANZIGER make any remarks or commit any acts which would cause him to suspect his loyalty to the United States Government. KINZELMAN believes the employee is entirely loyal to the United States.

Mr. ARON L. SUSSMAN, Mechanical Engineer, Bureau of Ordnance, Navy Department, Washington, D. C., advised he has been acquainted with the employee since 1937 or 1938 when they were attending City College of New York together. Since their college days, they have been associated professionally in the Bureau of Ordnance, United States Navy Department. He said he has always found DANZIGER to be highly trustworthy. He never heard or saw anything which might reflect in any way upon DANZIGER's character or loyalty. Mr. SUSSMAN said he was not familiar with the employee's outside activities or his associates and, therefore, he could make no statement as to whether DANZIGER or his wife belonged to any organizations such as the Communist Party. From his knowledge of DANZIGER, SUSSMAN does not believe the employee has any sympathies for Communism or that he has ever been connected in any way with a Communist Front organization.

Lieutenant Commander WILLIAN E. JEREMIAH, United States Navy Department, Washington, D. C., stated he knew the employee casually while the employee was working as an Engineer at Terminal Island, San Pedro, California. Commander JEREMIAH said he does not know DANZIGER well enough to make any comment concerning his loyalty.

Captain HENRY T. KOONCE, United States Navy Department, Washington, D. C., said he has known the employee since 1943 professionally. When he first knew him, DANZIGER was stationed at Terminal Island, San Pedro, California. While there, DANZIGER was very active in the local United Public Workers of America, CIO union, but KOONCE considers none of his actions as reflecting on his loyalty in any way. So far as Captain KOONCE knows, DANZIGER was entirely trustworthy and loyal. He does not know if DANZIGER or his wife are members of any organizations such as the Communist Party.

Mr. HAMILTON H. DOW, Civilian in Charge of Design Weights Section, Bureau of Ships, United States Navy Department, Washington, D. C., advised he has known the DANZIGERS since 1943. In 1943, he and Mr. DANZIGER were employed together at Terminal Island, San Pedro, California. He stated

that while in California, they were also socially acquainted. However, since the spring of 1945, they have only known each other in a business way. While in California, Mr. and Mrs. DANZIGER resided at 2270 Belmont Avenue, Long Beach, California. He said that he knew of no organizations to which either the employee or his wife belonged other than the United Public Morkers of America. Mr. DANZIGER is pro-labor and was active in the labor union at Terminal Island. He stated that none of these activities would reflect upon DANZIGER's loyalty in any way and he, Mr. DOW, believes DANZIGER and his wife to be entirely patriotic and loyal American citisens.

Mr. JOHN V. ATONASOFF, Chief of the Acoustics Division, Naval Ordnance Laboratory, United States Navy Department, White Oaks, Maryland, stated he has only known the employee for the past six weeks during which time the employee has been assigned to the Naval Ordnance Laboratory at White Oaks. He stated that from talking and working with DANZIGER during this period, he believes him thoroughly American and has no question regarding his loyalty. He stated that he was unable to make any further comment regarding Mr. DANZIGER.

Mr. CHARLES M. MEDFORD, 925 15th Street, N. W., Washington, D. C., advised that Mr. and Mrs. DANZIGER resided in Apartment 303 at 2517 K Street, N. W., during the latter part of 1939 and early part of 1940. Mr. MEDFORD said he did not know the DANZIGERS well enough to comment on their loyalty to the Government.

Mrs. J. W. MURRAY, Resident Manager of the Apartments at 2517 K Street, N. W., Washington, D. C., who has lived at this address since 1939, Mrs. CARRIE FRIES, resident at above address since 1939, Mr. H. S. NEWMAN and Mr. JOSEPH H. HOSKINS, both of whom have resided at the above address for more than ten years, all advised they did not know Mr. and Mrs. DANZIGER.

Mrs. EDWARD E. SEARLE, JR., Apartment 2, 4338 Halley Terrace, S. E., Washington, D. C., stated she recalled the employee and his wife as former neighbors for a few months during the early part of 1946. Mrs. SEARLE said she had no knowledge of anything bearing on the employee's loyalty or that of his wife.

Mrs. JAMES R. O'BRIEN, Apartment 1, 4338 Halley Terrace, S. E., Washington, D. C., said she recalled the employee as a neighbor but could not furnish any information with reference to his or his wife's loyalty.

Mrs. MARION MILES, Apartment 2, 4342 Halley Terrace, S. E., Fashington, D. C., said her acquaintanceship with the employee was not of

sufficient duration to enable her to know him well enough to make any comment regarding his lovelty.

Mrs. MAUDE E. FRANCE, Resident energy at 1466 Columbia Boad, N. M., for ten years, Mrs. ELMER H. STEPHERS, Apertment 21, above address, and Mr. CARL STECKERL, Apertment 25, the same address, residents of this address for 91 years, all advised they did not know the employee.

Frs. PARY PRADURETRY, Apartment 21, 1466 Columbia Bond, H. W., Vrshington, D. C., a resident of this address for more than eleven years, seld the recolled that Tr. and Ers. PANZING lived in the apartment house but she could furnish no information relative to their loyalty or character.

Mr. A. STUART FURCH, who has resided at 1314 Belafield Flace.
N. W., Washington, D. C., since 1927, Mr. J. H. BOWER, who has lived at 1329 Delafield Place, H. W., Since 1920, and Mr. ROSS FOLLOCH, whose father lived at 1318 Delafield Flace, H. W., Usahington, H. C., prior to his double the early 1940's, stated they could furnish no information regarding MILLIAN DANZIGER.

Mrs. ELSIS COLT, owner and ranger of the systemst house at paid 5 Street, S. C., Mashington, D. C., advised that Mr. and The. DANZIGHE resided at this address during 1940 and 1941. She said she thought they seemed to be people of good character. She aid not know them well enough to comment on their levelty to the Government. However, she said she never had any cause to question them and she never noticed any unusual activities or meetings in the engloyee's apartment Guring the time he resided at this address.

PRO J. P. TOTORIK and or. White MANY, both residents of PRIS S Street, S. E., Washington, D. C., strand that they aid not know My. and Fra. DANZIGER.

Washington M-4 and T-5, Rederal agencies who conduct intelligence and personnel investigations, advised their files show no other additional pertinent information regarding WILLIAM DANZIGER.

The records of the Special Investigations Squad and the Griminal Division-of the Metrop ditan Folice Department reflect no information concerning Mr. DAMZIGGP or his wife. Local credit records show nothing partinent to the employee's levelty.



BACKGROUND:

William Dansiger was investigated by this Bureau under Executive Order 9835. The results of this investigation were transmitted to the Civil Service Commission by letter dated June 4, 1948, and by letter dated February 3, 1950, the Chairman of the Loyalty Review Board advised that Dansiger had resigned or was otherwise separated from Federal service prior to decision on loyalty. The report of Special Agent Caleb L. Batten, dated April 24, 1948, at Mashington, D. C., concerning Dansiger reflects that Mrs. Mark Tarris was interviewed, at which time she stated that she and her husband had known Dansiger and his wife for more than two years. After setting forth the interview of Mrs. Mark Harris, the MFO report reflects disloyal information concerning Mark Earris.

A current investigation is presently being conducted concerning
Mark Harris, a Mavy Department employee, based on information that he was a
member of a Communist Party cell in Mashington, D. C., a member of the Mashington
Book Shop Association, Chairman of a committee of the United Federal Workers of
America, and a member of a branch of the Communist Party in New Jersey. During
the investigation of this individual, the MFO has determined that part of the
disloyal information set forth concerning Mark Harris in their report on William
Danziger does not actually pertain to this Mark Harris, but concerns a Mark Harris


