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

subject with violation of Section 1621, Title 18, United States Code, in that he denied before a Federal Grand Jury, Southern District of New York, on August 18, September 11, and October 4, 1950, that he knew (1) MORTON (4) MICHAEL and ANN SIDOROVICH.

On March 14, 1951, the aforementioned indictment was opened by the Honorable IRVING R. KAUFMAN, United States District Court, Southern District of New York, who issued a bench warrant for the arrest of WILLIAM FERL. - SUMMARY

Subject was arrested on March 14, 1951, at his home, 104 East 38th Street, New York City, by Special

On March 15, 1951, PERL was brought before the Honorable HENRY W. GODDARD, United States District Court, Southern District of New York, for arraignment at which time he entered a plea of not guilty to each of the four counts in the indictment.

The bail was fixed in the amount of \$20,000 and in default of which PERL was remanded to the custody of the United States Marshal and placed in the Federal House of Detention, New York City.

On March 19, 1951, PERL was released in the amount of \$20,000 bail.

On May 18, 1953, the trial of the subject on the aforementioned indictment commenced before the Honorable SYLVESTER J. RYAN, United States District Court, Southern District of New York, and on May 22, 1953, the jury returned a verdict of guilty on counts one and three with a recommendation of clemency. PERL was acquitted on counts two and four.

as a witness in his own defense. In a direct examination PERL festified that at the time he testified before the Federal Grand Jury that he did not know MORTON SOBELL,

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he believed his answer was the truth and that the Federal Grand Jury was asking him whether he was intimately acquainted. Concerning JULIUS ROSENBERG he stated that he did not know ROSENBERG to the best of his recoilection, that he was not intimately acquainted with ROSENBERG and that he had not associated with ROSENBERG. He said that according to his state of mind at that time he believed the answer to be true.

Concerning HELENEELITCHER, he testified that he could not recall the question or answer before the Federal Grand Jury and that his first recollection of HELENE ELITCHER as Mrs. MAX ELITCHER was not until after his indictment and that he made no connection between HELENE and Mrs. MAX ELITCHER when testifying before the Federal Grand Jury.

Concerning the count pertaining to MICHAEL and ANN SIDOROVICH, PERL testified that he did not recall people of that name and could not recognize their photographs.

On May 22, 1953, when the Jury returned a verdict of guilty on counts one and three, respectively, upon motion of the government, Honorable SYLVESTER J. RYAN cancelled subject a bail and remanded him to the Federal House/Detention, New York City, until June 5, 1953, at which time PERL was to be sentenced.

On June 5, 1953, PERL was sentenced by the Honorable SYLVESTER J. RYAN to five years in the custody of the Attorney General on each of counts one and three, sentences to run concurrently,

Honorable SYLVESTER J. RYAN stated for the record that he could not accept the Jury's recommendation for clemency. PERL's bail was cancelled and he was remanded—to the Federal House of Detention, New York City.

An immediate Notice of Appeal was filed on the same date by the subject's attorneys who argued for reinstatement of the bail before the United States District Court of Appeals, Second District, which was denied. 65-15387

On July 15, 1953, PERL was transferred from the Federal House of Detention, New York City, to the United States Penitentiary, Terre Haute, Indiana.

PERL was contacted on April 6, 1954, at the United States Penitentiary, Terre Haute, Indiana, by SA JOHN A. HARRINGTON, at which time he refused to be interviewed.

JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG and MORTON SOBELL were convicted of conspiracy to commit espionage in behalf of the Soviet Union, on March 29, 1951. On April 5, 1951, JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG were sentenced to death and MORTON SOBELL to thirty years imprisonment. JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG were legally executed at Sing Sing Prison, Ossining, New York, on June 19, 1953, and MORTON SOBELL is currently serving his sentence at the United States Penitentiary, Alcatraz, California.

MAX and HELENE ELITCHER advised SA VINCENT J. CAHILL, in 1950, that they were former members of the Communist Party. MAX ELITCHER admitted membership from 1939 to 1948 and HELENE ELITCHER admitted membership from 1943 to 1948.

MICHAEL SIDOROVICH advised SAs LEO FRUTKIN, JOHN B. O'DONAGHUE, and JOHN A. HARRINGTON, on July 24, 1950, that he was a former member of the Young Communist League and Abraham Lincoln Brigade.

The Young Communist League and Abraham Lincoln Brigade have been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

By letter 10-9-56, Legat, London, forwarded book entitled "Comrade I" by G. A. Tokasy published in London by Ecurill Press.

In 1954 Tokaev prote a book entitled Betrajal of an Ideal which dealt with his life from his birth in 1909 until 1935. book was previously reviewed and is in the Burnau library.

"Conrade I" covers Tokasy's life from 1935 until his defection in 1947. We discusses his membership in an anti-Stalin group described as "revolutionary denocrats" which desires a free union of free and equal countries in Russia. Conrade I apparently is a high Soviet official and is the head of this group to which A W. Tokaev belonged. Tokaev deals with the purges and trials of the ? 1930 a in Eussia by which Stalin crushed all opposition as well : the epirit of revolution of the Russian people. Tokaev claims be 25 was in Roscow when the German Army arrived there in 1941 and be describes the complete state of chaos existing in that city. Be states the German Army could have taken Moscow with little or no. opposition had they not stopped to regroup. Thile the German Army wis stopped, winter set in causing the mechanized German Army to 3 to break down and gave the Bussians time to mount a successful countely t citack. Tokasy points out that at this time all claims of communist invinoibility were forgotten and Stalin and other leaders called on the paggle to defend Russia which is the factor which rallied; the Russian people and not any love of Stalin.

Tokaev tells of the distrust and hate of Russian officinis for parsons from the Borth Caucasus region and he tells of how the NOT RECO.

rollowing the war, Tokaev was sent to Berlin where he became part of the Soviet military administration. He tells of the MYD (Russian Intelligence) and its complete distrust of all foreigners as well as those Russians who associated with foreigners. He gives in detail his attempts to locate Professor Kurt Tank, German rocket specialist, on the personal orders of Stalin. Tokaev claims he was attempting to have Tank voluntarily assist him in his research while at the same time General I. A. Serov of the MYD was attempting to kidnap Tank. Tokaev clashed with Serov and it was fear of the MYD which eventually caused Tokaev and his wife and daughter to defect (1) to the West.

Of interest, he notes that while in Berlin "... the wartine ally...loudest in denouncing tyranny... attempted to buy me, kidnap me, spy on me mercilessly and used its knowledge to threaten to betray me to the MGB." Tokase does not further identify this ally.

The book makes no references to the FBI and makes no references to activities in the United States.

that he would be residing with his wife at 7 West 92nd Street, Apartment 73, New York City, where she had previously obtained an apartment. MASTER advised that PERL stated that he does not want to discuss anything concerning the events leading to his arrest and conviction, and his main purpose was to get employment as rapidly as possible. MASTER said that PERL is on a Conditional Release, and will be under the jurisdiction of the Parole Board until December 6, 1957, when his sentence expires.

On April 15, 1957, Mr. MASTER reported that after being turned down by a number of companies, PERL had reported on April 12, 1957, to say that he had just been employed with the Wildman Company, Incorporated, 4001 29th Street, Long Island City, New York, and that he is actually working out of this firm's branch at 583 Hudson Street, New York City. further stated that this company makes engineering surveys in preparation for the construction of electrical conduits under the streets of New York City. He stated that part of his work will be in the field surveying for these conduits, and the remainder of his work will be in the office drafting plans for their construction.

MASTER stated that PERL was very happy being employed again. He pointed out that PERL had been very perturbed over his lack of employment prospects, and had borrowed \$130.00 from relatives in March, 1957, in order to live.

MASTER further stated that PERL has been very conscientious about reporting any proposed visit outside of New York City, and has even insisted on calling the Parole Office when making trips to see his brother in Far Rockaway, New York, although he was told that permission for this trip would not be MRS, WILLIAM AT necessary.

On April 15, 1957, OTTO ENGELMAN, Superintendent, 7 Test 92nd Street, New York City, advised that HENRIETTA TIDGE took Apartment 73 in this building some time , and lived alone in it until recently. Several

in this ago a strange man appeared, and when ENGEIMAN figuired as to his identity, he advised that he was Mr. WILLIAM PERL, husband of HENRIETTA SAVIDGE. ENGEIMAN stated that PERL and his wife have had few visitors, if any, and live very quietly with their young son. He stated that nothing has come to his attention reflecting upon the loyalty of Mrs. PERL or WILLIAM PERL, although he commented that Mrs. PERL has apparently "Communistic tendencies." When asked to explain this, ENGELMAN stated that he merely meant that she is a person who writes to various State agencies complaining about such things as lack of heat, hot water, and other grievances. He stated that in his opinion, people who do this excessively are often people connected with Communist activities.

New York. WACHTEL stated that PERL works under the supervision of HERBERT D'ARCY, foreman of the project on which PERL is being used.

WACHTEL described the above mentioned project as follows. The Waldman Company, electrical contractors, are installing a "pilot cable" from 59th Street and 12th Avenue, New York City, to the new Third Avenue power sub-station of the New York Subway system in Brooklyn. According to WACHTEL, this cable is for the purpose of remotely controlling certain equipment in the Brooklyn sub-station, and is not, in itself, vital to the operation of the subway system. This is true because failure of this cable would only result in operating the equipment at Brooklyn by manual means and would cause no breakdown.

PERL will have opportunity to learn about and have access to various installations connected with the New York Subway system while on this project. It is his understanding that at this time PERL is being used to assist in the job of planning and drafting the route to be used for the above mentioned cable. The completion of this entire project, including installation, will take approximately one and a half years from this time.

WACHTEL stated that PERL was hired by the president of the company, Mr. LOUIS I. WALDMAN, and he does not know how PERL made the contact for this job. He noted that PERL's Social Security Number is 090-32-7600, but had no other information concerning him available except his address, 7 West 92nd Street, New York City. No information concerning LOUIS I. WALDMAN could be found in the indices of the New York Office.

wachtel stated that if PERL is retained by this company he will probably remain on the project described above. His retention at the completion of the pilot cable would depend upon contacts to be fulfilled by the Waldman Company at that time. WACHTEL stated that it would be impossible at this time to predict what such contracts may be, if any. He stated that the firm has performed contracts in the past in such

sensitive locations as Mitchell Air Force Base, Long Island; Brookhaven Laboratories, Long Island; and the Brooklyn Army Base, New York City.

WACHTEL stated that the only way to determine the exact details of the work presently being performed by PERL would be to interview his foreman, HERBERT D'ARCY. A review of the files of the New York Office has disclosed no information concerning any person by this name.

T-1, an organization which maintains records concerning business establishments in the New York area, advised on May 7, 1957, that Louis I. Waldman and Company, Inc., electrical contractors, was founded in June, 1927, by LOUIS WALDMAN, who was born in Rumania in 1890 and came to the United States in 1912. He began work in the electrical line in 1912. T-1 stated that this firm specializes in the construction of electrical generating and distributing plants, pumping stations, sewage disposal plants, etc., and operates as a prime contractor, with 75 per cent of the work assigned to subcontractors. Current net worth was described as \$215,000.00.

On June 3, 1957, HUBERT L. ROBINSON, Assistant Probation Officer, Southern District of New York, advised SA NORMAN E. BLISS that he is now handling the case of WILLIAM PERL.

ROBINSON reviewed his record on PERL and noted that on April 25, 1957, PERL advised by letter that he and his wife have decided to separate, and he anticipates moving from the apartment at 7 West 92nd Street, New York City. On May 3, 1957 PERL wrote that he had moved to 212 West 20th Street, New York City, but on May 14th1957, he wrote that he was now residing at 314 West 94th Street, New York City, apartment 333. There was no additional information available concerning the subject.

On June 4, 1957, OTTO ENGELMAN, Superintendent, 7 West 22nd Street, New York City, advised that the subject's wiff advised him on approximately May 15, 1957, that her husband had left and that a divorce was planned. PERL still separated from wife and residing Vancouver Hotel, 314 West 94th Street, New York City.

DETAILS:

On August 15, 1957, HERBERT D'ARCY, foreman, Waldman Company, Incorporated, Branch Office, 583 Hudson Street, advised Special Agent NORMAN E. BLISS that he supervises the project on which the subject is presently employed.

D'ARCY said that this firm is performing work for the New York City subway

system which involves installation of a "pilot" cable from a power house at 3rd Avenue and 1st Street, Brooklyn. This cable is for the purpose of handling the transfer of power loads from certain powerhouses to various segments of the subway system in case of failure of other power plants.

This project also involves installation of certain actual power lines between the Third Avenue, Brooklyn, power station and another one on Kent Avenue, Brooklyn, to be used in case of power failure of either of these plants.

D'ARCY said that the subject has been working on all phases of this entire project, his chief duty being to draw up plans for the various cables, switches, transformers, manholes, and other technical equipment. Through this work the subject learns about much of the present subway system, its power supply, emergency power supply, and other details.

D'ARCY was asked if the information acquired by his men in this project would be of value to a person intending to disrupt the subway system of New York. He stated that this information would undoubtedly be of value to any person with such an aim inasmuch as much of the Manhattan and Brooklyn portions of the system could be disabled in the event that the above mentioned cables and equipment were put out of commission.

D'ARCY stated that the subject does not discuss anything about his personal affirs while on the job. On the few occasions when he tried to draw the subject out about his family life, previous experience, etc., he had no success, D'ARCY said. He described the subject as an excellent worker who seems to be a capable draftsman-engineer.

8:00 A.M. to 4:30 P.M., and uses the subway to come to work. He said that PERL had done nothing which would reflect upon either his loyalty or character in any way.

D'ARCY stated that the following three men work with the subject and are men whom he has known for ten or more years as loyal citizens of good reputation:

JOHN BROHAN, Babylon, New York.

It was D'ARCY's opinion that there is little chance that any of the above men would know anything concerning the subject's personal activities when away from his job.

On August 19, 1957, HUBERT L. ROBINSON, Assistant Probation Officer, Southern District of New York, advised that on August 6, 1957, the subject made his most recent parcle report, adiving that he is now making \$110 per week and is still residing at 314 West 94th Street, New York City. Still residing at 314 West 94th Street, New York City. ROBINSON stated that the subject expressed some interest in the possibility of getting a driver's permit while on probation, and he was advised by ROBINSON that there was no legal objection to this.

Mr. ROBINSON stated that on the next visit by the subject he intends to inquire as to the present status of the subject's separation from his wife and what his plans for the future are in this respect.

ROBINSON stated that the subject has made no requests for permission to take any trips out of New York City.

On August 26, 1957, OTTO ENGELMAN, Superintendent, 7 West 92nd Street, New York City, advised that the subject's wife still resides in her apartment there and goes out to work on most days. He stated that he has not seen the subject visiting her since the time he left in early summer. He stated that several weeks ago he casually inquired as to where her husbandwas and she replied that this was "none of your business".

On August 26, 1957, FRED STEMERS, Manager, Vancouver Hotel, 314 West 94th Street, reported that the subject still resides in this building in room 333 and is a very quiet tenant. He could recall no persons who have visited the subject, but pointed out that callers would not necessarily be brought to his attention in every case, inasmuch as he does not keep a clerk at the reception desk at all hours.

Rebulet 7/8/57 and report of SA NORMAN E. BLISS, dated and captioned as above.

Rebulet directed NYO to submit recommendations concerning a possible interview of PERL's wife.

It is the opinion of the NYO, after careful consideration, that an interview of PERL's wife at this particular time does not hold sufficient promise of results.

It is noted that PERL will be under jurisdiction of the Parole Board until December 6, 1957, and reports to that agency regularly. It is felt that if Mrs. PERL should disclose to him that she had been interviewed by Special Agents, there is a possibility that he would complain of "harrassment" to the Parole Board and/or others, perhaps complaining that such investigation at this time might jeopardize his status in his new job at a period when he is trying to get reestablished. Also he might seize such an opportunity in effort to embarass the Bureau.

It is noted that there is no reason to believe that PERL is aware that any investigation of him by the FBI has taken place since he was released from prison, and that the investigative advantage gained from this in determining his current activities and associates is of some value. The actual extent and seriousness of the separation of PERL and his wife are not known, as yet, and there is no reason to feel sure that she would not tell him of any interview by Special Agents.

It is felt that the best course at this time is to discreetly attempt to follow the activities of PERL, until December 6, 1957, at which time he will leave jurisdiction of the Parole Board. At that time, depending on results of investigation NYO will make recommendations as to interviewing the subject's wife and as to closing this case.

It has been determined through the Probation Office, SDNY, NYC, that in October, 1957, Mrs. CAROL SCHAEFER SANDERS, 2182 Woodward, Lakewood 7, Ohio, addressed a letter to the Attorney General of the US requesting the present address of the subject. She was advised, in a letter of 10/7/57, from WILLIAM K. MC DERMOTT, Parole Executive, Washington, DC, that PERL is presently under the jurisdiction of the USC, SDNY, to which she could address questions concerning him. It is noted that as of 10/24/57, the Probation Officer, SDNY, had received no communication from Mrs. SANDERS.

Review of the indicies of the NYO disclose no information concerning Mrs. SAUDERS.

For the information of the Cleveland Office, WILLIAM PERL, a member of the JULIUS ROSENBERG espionage group, was convicted of two counts of perjury on 5/18/53, and was sentenced to five years imprisonment. He was released from the US Penitentiary, Terre Haute, Indiana, on 2/10/57, and returned to NYC, where he is currently residing.

He will be under jurisdictionof the Parole Office, SDNY, until December 6, 1957.

NYO is investigating the subject's current activities and contacts. For this reason it is requested that Cleveland report any information concerning Mrs. CAROL SCHAEFER SANDERS in the Cleveland files, as well as discreetly determine her identity and background through investigation. BLISS that he hired the subject when PERL answered a help wanted ad. He stated that he determined relatively little about PERL's proposed and previous employment.

He pointed out that he has no way to estimate FERL's loyalty or lack of loyalty to this country, but only knows that he has been doing good work on the project in which the Waldman Company is presently engaged. WALDMAN stated that this project involves a number of electrical circuits controlling the New York City subway system. He expressed the opinion that information gained by any employee concerning these matters could conceivably be used by persons interested in disrupting New York city transportation.

WALDMAN stated that when he interviewed PERL at the time he was employed, PERL failed to indicate in any way that there was anything in his background which could be considered questionable concerning his character, loyalty, etc.

waldman said that there is no way to determine on what project PERL will be employed by this firm, if he is retained at the completion of the subway project.

On October 6, 1957, HUEERT L. ROBINSON, Assistant Probation Officer, Southern District of New York, advised that on August 27, 1957, the subject, when making a routine report to him, stated that he and his wife are still separated and are interested in obtaining a divorce. PERL expressed the opinion that he would much prefer to be reconciled with his wife, but that this appears impossible and there is not much more that he could do to retain the family intact.

On October 24, 1957, Assistant Probation Officer ROBINSON stated that his office had been forwarded a letter by the Parole Executive, WILLIAM K. MC DERMOTT, in Washington, D.C., which had been sent to the Attorney General of the United States by

one CAROL SCHAEFFER SANDERS, 2182 Woodward, Lakewood 7, Ohio. This letter requested information as to the present location of the subject. Mr. ROBINSON stated that Mrs. SCHAEFFER had been advised by the Parole Executive in Washington, D.C., that the subject is under the jurisdiction of the United States Court, Southern District of New York, to which she could address questions concerning him.

Mr. ROBINSON further stated that on October 15, when making a routine visit to him, the subject expressed interest in how he could proceed to obtain restoration of his various rights which he had lost as a result of his conviction. At this time the subject stated that he is still separated from his wife, but indicated that no definite plans have been made for a divorce.

On November 6, 1957, OTTO ENGELMAN, Superintendent, 7 West 92nd Street, New York City, advised that he has not seen the subject visit his wife, whose apartment is in his building, and he could not recall any other persons visiting her apartment to the best of his knowledge.

On November 6, 1957, FRED SIEMERS, Manager, Vancouver Hotel, 314 West 94th Street, New York City, reported that PERL still occupied Room 333 and has had no visitors that he knows of. He stated that PERL has received only a handful of telephone calls and leads an unusually inactive life. He noted that PERL is usually in his room by approximately 6:30 p.m., and seldom seems to have any reason to leave until the following morning.

On November 12, 1957, Assistant Probation Officer ROBINSON, advised that he had on that day, received a phone call from Mrs. CAROL SCHAEFFER SANDERS, requesting information as to the location of the subject, and he had advised her that such information

could not be given. He suggested that she see him in person in this matter.

On November 14, 1957, Mr. ROBINSON said that he had been visited on that day by Mrs. SANDERS, who told him that she was an acquaintance of the subject, having worked with him on the National Advisory Committee for Aeronautics, Cleveland Hopkins Airport, a number of years ago. She stated that she had admired him considerably and would like to renew her contact with him.

ROBINSON stated that during this conversation, he made mention of PERL's wife and child, and it is his opinion that Mrs. SANDERS was somewhat shaken to find that PERL was a married man. Mrs. SANDERS told him that she was residing at 316 West 27th Street, Apartment 4A, New York City. She further stated that she had lived in New York some years ago, and had now returned to the city.

On December 3, 1957, Mr. ROBINSON advised that on November 26, 1957, he was visited by PERL and asked him if he knew CAROL SCHAEFFER SANDERS. PERL stated that the name meant nothing to him, and when he was told this person was inquiring as to his whereabouts, he expressed complete surprise, and repeated that he did not know such a person.

PERL inquired of Mr. ROBINSON as to what course he should take and ROBINSON stated that this is up to PERL. He furnished PERL with Mrs. SANDERS' address, and PERL did not indicate what his actions in this matter would be.

The indices of the Cleveland Office also reflect that a credit report from the Cleveland Retail Credit Men's Company on July 26, 1954, reflected that Mrs. SANDERS had no credit rating and that she was formerly employed at the W. Bingham Company, and that she had instituted a divorce action against her husband, ROBERT SANDERS, on November 3, 1953.

Mrs. CAROL SCHAEFER SANDERS was interviewed at Hiram, Ohio, by SA KENNETH C. HOWE on Cetober 1, 1954, and Mrs. SANDERS advised that she had been employed since September, 1954, as a fifth grade teacher in the elementary school system of Hiram, Ohio. She stated that she had worked at NACA in Cleveland for about eighteen months in 1948 and 1949 in a personnel training unit and during this period she became acqueinted with WILLIAM PERL. She stated that her contact with him was not intimate and her conversations with him were of a casual nature. She also stated that she had one date with him, which was a new year's eve party held at the home of ABE SILVERSTEIN. She further stated that she never had any political discussions with PERL and she was very surprised when she read the publicity of his involvement or alleged involvement with those suspected of espionege or Communist activity.

Mrs. SANDERS further advised that when she left NACA she took a teaching job with the Dade County Board of Instruction in Miami, Florida, and subsequently she returned to the Cleveland area and worked for a short time with the Bingham Company. She denied having had any personal contact or correspondence with PERL after she left NACA. Mrs. SANDERS stated that she knew of PERL's conviction and imprisonment when she wrote a letter to AEE SILVERSTEIN concerning him, and said that she did this only because she had liked PERL at NACA and she felt that she might be of some help in his rehabilitation when he is released from prison. She also stated she had written to him at Lewisburg but she never received any reply from him.

Mrs. SANDERS also advised that she did not know of PERL's associates and she knew nothing of his inv lvement in any Communist activity. 65-15387

It was the opinion of the interviewing Agent that Mrs. SANDERS was affected in her mannerism and gave evidence of being a little unstable. Mrs. SANDERS described PERL as a high-type, intelligent, kind, considerate type of individual and she felt that he was being truthful in his denials about espicnage activities. On November 14, 1957, Mr. ROBINSON stated that Mrs. SANDERS visited him on that date and stated she was an acquaintance of the subject, having worked with him on the National Advisory Committee for Aeronautics in Cleveland a number of years ago. She indicated that she wanted to renew her contact with him and gave her New York City address as 316 West 27th Street, Apartment 4A.

On February 19, 1958, MYRA PARTINGTON, Superintendent, 316 West 27th Street, New York City, advised that Mrs. CAROL SANDERS occupied Apartment 4A in this building from approximately November 1, 1957, to February 1, 1958. She obtained this apartment by answering an ad in the newspaper. At the time of taking occupancy, she told Mrs. PARTINGTON that she was looking for a job in New York City. 

### RE: WILLIAM PERL

KANTROWITZ advised on 3/11/58 that he was not acquainted with WILLIAM FERL prior to the time PERL became employed at NACA, Langley Field, Virginia. It is to be noted that KANTROWITZ stated that he knew PERL under his birthname WILLIAM MUTTERPERL while at Langley Field. KANTROWITZ was unable to specifically recall the circumstances or the occasion when he met PERL. It is noted PERL began employment at Langley Field 4/8/39.

KANTROWITZ stated that in 4/39, PERL was working in the Full Scale Tunnel (FST). KANTROWITZ, during this period, was working in the Variable Density Tunnel (VDT) on a fusion reactor. KANTROWITZ felt that because he had official reasons to visit the FST on occasion, he was most probably introduced to FERL on one of these occasions. KANTROWITZ also stated that there was a small physics group in the FST in which he occasionally participated along with SAM KATZOFF who worked in the FST and that it was possible that at a meeting of this group he met PERL through KATZOFF.

KANTROWITZ advised that he played handball while at Langley at an indoor court which was located near Langley Field. He was unable to positively identify the location, but stated it was possibly Fort Munroe. He recalled that PERL also played handball with mutual friends and that his meeting with PERL could have occurred here. KANTROWITZ identified HERBERT PASS and EUGENE MANGANIELLO as other handball players. Other Langley employees also played, but KANTROWITZ could mot recall their names.

KINTROWITZ stated that he met PERL at social gatherings or pirties a few times each year while PERL was at Langley. These parties were attended by mutual friends. KANTROWITZ said that their mutual friends were many because "their contacts were peripheral". Among their mutual acquaintances were ROBERT and DORIS JONES, SAM KATZOFF, HERBERT PASS and saveral others whom he could not recall.

The report of SA WILLIS A. BENNER dated 9/7/56 at Richmond in the AEA-A investigation of KANTROWITZ reflects that the records at the Extension Division, University of Virginia, reflect that KANTROWITZ attended classes from 2/3/42 until 5/28/42 under Instructor BRICE L. HICKS.

KANTROWITZ stated that he recalled attending these classes under BRUCE HICKS. In addition, KANTROWITZ stated that he taught classes in Physics (Thermodynamics and Kinetic Theory of Gases) for the Extension Division of the University of Virginia during 1941 or 1942. The classes for the first semester were held in the High School in Newport News, Virginia and for the second semester in his own home which was at the residence of ROBERT JONES in Hampton, Virginia. He recalled that he had approximately eight students in the first semester and three in the second. It was KANTROWITZ' recollection that PERL attended classes taught by him.

KANTROWITZ said that he and PERL never worked on any NACA projects together and that they had no official connection in their duties. KANTROWITZ stated that PERL was an occasional visitor to the residence of JONES and himself. KANTROWITZ recalled that PERL upon receiving his transfer from Langley to the NACA Installation in Cleveland, Ohio, told him that he was glad to be leaving Langley because he could get into more interesting work at Cleveland. KANTROWITZ was unable to provide any details of this conversation.

It is to be noted that PERL was transferred to NACA, Cleveland effective 12/23/43.

During 1944 and 1945, KANTROWITZ visited NACA, Cleveland, on a few occasions on official business and met and talked with WILLIAM PERL within the NACA Installation. KANTROWITZ stated that at this time he personally was working on a supersonic compressor and that he gave talks on his work at NACA in Cleveland. He stated that PERL very probably entered into the discussions on this project which was subsequently taken the part of the project which was subsequently taken to project which was subsequently taken.

KANTROWITZ stated that he never visited any residence of PERL either in Cleveland, Ohio or in New York City, New York. He claimed that he never knew the exact residences of PERL in-New York City.


During the period December, 1943 to 1947, KANTROWITZ said he had no recollection of having any direct communication with WILLIAM PERL by way of correspondence or telephone but stated that they undoubtedly met on occasion at scientific meetings such as meetings of the American Physical Society.

KANTROWITZ advised that in the summer of 1947 while WILLIAM PERL was an assistant to Professor THEODORE VON KARMAN at Columbia University, VON KARMAN was interested in finding a university location for PERL to work. KANTROWITZ was himself at that time a professor at Cornell University and closely associated with Professor WILLIAM & SEARS.

KANTROWITZ described SEARS as a former student of VON KARMAN. It was his recollection that VON KARMAN and SEARS worked out arrangements whereby WILLIAM PERL was permitted to work at Cornell University at Ithaca, New York for the summer of 1947. This work, in part, consisted of working as a consultant under VON KARMAN on the Tullahoma, Tennessee Project. While at Cornell, KANTROWITZ claimed PERL never stayed at his home which was located at 1354 State Street, Ithaca. He was an occasional visitor only.

During this period (summer of 1947) KANTROWITZ was preparing for his examinations for a Ph.D. degree which he obtained from Columbia University in October, 1947. WILLIAM PERL was, during this period, also preparing for . Ph.D. examinations to be taken at Columbia University. KANTROWITZ said he was in possession of some copies of past examinations given by Columbia for this degree which he utilized in his own studies and eventually gave to PERL for his use. It was KANTROWITZ' recollection that he sent these copies of past examinations to WILLYAM PERL by mail in care of the Department of Physics at Columbia University.

KANTROWITZ advised that when he took the Ph.D. examinations at Columbia in October, 1947, he stayed at the King's Crown Hotel Located on West 116th Street near Columbia University, New York City. Buring the examination period, he had no contact with WILLIAM PERL since his exams extended from 9:00 a.m. until 1:00 a.m. the following day.



It was pointed out to KANTROWITZ that the gate register at NASAT Cleveland, reflected that on 8/20/48 he visited that installation and indicated the person he wished to see was ABE SILVERSTEIN. He was asked if, on this occasion, he met with WILLIAM PERL. He stated that he is not sure, but may have casually met PERL in the corridors at NACA. He did remember that on that visit he dined in the evening with ABE SILVERSTEIN alone.

The information in PERL's personal file indicating that he visited Cornell University October 12 and 13, 1948 was brought to KANTROWITZ' attention. He stated that he recalled this visit by PERL wherein PERL delivered lectures at Cornell. He said that PERL during the visit stayed overnight at the home of Professor WILLIAM R. SEARS located on Valley Road in Ithaca, New York.

KANTROWITZ recalled that at SEARS' home, PERL discussed a philosophy of life which included a very strange mixture of political ideas. PERL emphasized spiritual rather than material things. KANTROWITZ could not recall any details of the discussion. His only lasting impression of PERL's conversation is that it contained an odd collection of weird ideas and a strange outlook on life.

KANTROWITZ also stated that he recalls meeting WILLIAM PERL at Columbia University in January, 1951 at a scientific meeting which was probably under the auspices of the American Physical Society. PERL, he stated, was an instructor at Columbia at the time. His only recollection of conversation with PERL on this occasion was that PERL told him that he was happy to be out of classified work.

KANTROWITZ was asked to furnish all the details surrounding his execution of an affidavit in 1950 for WILLIAM PERL. He stated that he had some information in his personal files relative to this incident which he would make available to the Special Agents on March 12, 1958.

KANTROWITZ stated he was not personally acquainted with any of the above. He had read newspaper accounts in which some of these persons were mentioned.

KANTROWITZ positively stated that WILLIAM PERL at no time ever mentioned to him any of his espionage or Communist activities. KANTROWITZ stated that he, in turn, never at any time disclosed to PERL his involvement in espionage.

KANTROWITZ stated that when he traveled from Langley, Virginia to his position in Ithaca, New York, he never visited WILLIAM PERL in New York City or any place else. He stated that while at Langley Field, he had no recollection of ever traveling with WILLIAM PERL, but would not absolutely exclude possible trips on the same train to New York where they both had parents.

KANTROWITZ stated that he never had engaged in any formal study of the Russian language at Langley or any place else. On a few occasions while at Cornell University, he tried informal study from textbooks. KANTROWITZ knew nothing about PERL's study of the Russian language.

On 3/12/58, KANTROWITZ produced a letter addressed to him by WILLIAM PERL dated 4/18/50 in which PERL asked for an affidavit. The letter is as follows:

"16902 Larchwood Ave. Cleveland 11, Ohio Apr. 18, 1950

Dear Arthur,

It is a sad commentary, I suppose, that I must ask your help in the following matter but such matters are almost normal these days. It seems that, in investigating me for AEC clearance, the FBI uncovered 'information' which is now causing the NACA Loyalty Board to re-determine my loyalty.

with people of communistic leanings while attending Columbia University in M.Y. in 1946-48. These 'charges' are untrue and my conscience is quite clear. However, I now have the problem of proving my innocense beyond a legal doubt. To this and, a statement of opinion on your part concerning my political beliefs, loyalty, etc. would be greatly helpful. If you do not care to do this, it's quite all right and no hard feelings, etc. If you do, this so-called affidavit should be notarized and sent to me. It should contain as much detail as you have patience & memory to set down.

"Partly as a result of the preceding situation I now long actively for university life again. I look forward to hearing from you in general and in particular. Needless to say, thanks.

KANTROWITZ sent the following affidavit in response to the letter to PERL at 16902 Larchwood Avenue, Cleveland 11, Ohio:

"Arthur Kantrowitz, being duly sworn, deposes and says:

"that he has known William Perl for more than ten years. They have had discussions on many subjects, including political questions. As a result of these discussion, he is sure that Perl has no Communistic leanings whatever. He believes that Mr. Perl's general frame of mind is, on the contrary, very liberal and very antagonistic to the restraints of civil liberties inherent in the Communist system. He further believes that Mr. Perl has always maintained a very independent viewpoint and that it would be very abhorrent to Als hature to follow anybody's 'line'.

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"that Mr. Perl has made valuable scientific contributions, which are of importance in the defense effort of this country.

"that it is very desirable to have him cleared of these unfounded charges as soon as possible so that he may continue his valuable work.

It is to be noted that the original affidavit was dated April 22, 1950.

KANTROWITZ said that he dictated this affidavit to Miss ALICE ANTHONY, Secretary to Professor WILLIAM SEARS at Cornell. He said the affidavit was his own composition and that some of the ideas and wordings were prompted by PERL's letter. He enclosed no other note with the affidavit when he mailed it to PERL. He said that after mailing the affidavit he had no further correspondence concerning it with PERL. He said he does not recall any details regarding whether it was notarized and by whom.

When questioned about the statement in the affidavit that he had political discussions with PERL, KANTROWITZ said that he had obviously overstated himself. What he meant and what his best recollection was on this point referred to the discussion in the home of Professor SEARS in October, 1948. He repeated that that discussion was more concerned with PERL's outlook on life from a philosophical standpoint rather than any straight political discussion. He said that PERL had completely concealed his activities and political beliefs from him and SEARS and felt that he had been badly "used" by PERL.

Regarding the discussion at SEARS' home, KANTROWITZ stated that (FNU) QUO, a Chinese member of the Cornell Faculty in the Graduate School of Aeronautical Engineering was possibly present. QUO is now back-in China.

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KANTROWETZ advised that THEODORE VON KARMAN recruited several individuals to assist him as consultants on the Tullahoma, Tennessee Project which is also known as the Arnold Engineering Development Center. Among these were JOHN WILD who is still at Tullahoma; WILLIAM PERL; KANTROWITZ, who was assisted by some of his students; Professor WILLIAM SEARS; and H. S. TSIEN, a Chinest Physicist, formerly associated with California Tech in Pasadena, and others. KANTROWITZ said TSIEN is now back in China and his specialty is in the field of Gas Dynamics, the same as his own. KANTROWITZ advised that Sverdrup and Parcel of St. Louis were the designers for the Tullahoma Project and were the actual employers of the consultants. Later, ARO was the employer because they were made a subsidiary of Sverdrup and Parcel. TSIEN possibly identical with Bufile 65-58574.

KANTROWITZ stated that he had no recollection that WILLIAM PERL was an officer in either the AASW or the FAECT. He had a vague recollection that PERL was a member of the FAECT.

It is noted PERL was arrested for perjury in New York City on 3/14/51 and was sentenced to five years on 6/5/53. Sometime subsequent to PERL's conviction, KANTROWITZ received a letter at Ithaca, New York, from PERL's wife whom he had never met. The letter asked KANTROWITZ to write to the judge urging leniency for PERL in his sentence. KANTROWITZ did not write to the judge, nor did he reply to Mrs. PERL.

KANTROWITZ stated that he recalled Dr. THEODORE VON KARMAN was engaged as a consultant on a problem concerning the Aswan Dam in Egypt. To the best of his recollection, VON KARMAN's interest in this dam project was concerned with the problem of the effect of wind blowing on sand. He said that since WILLIAM PERL was VON KARMAN's assistant, it would be quite natural for PERL to be also engaged in consultant work on this However, he had no personal knowledge of PERL being project. He said that he had no information which would so engaged. indicate that WILLIAM PERL $\,$  had traveled to Egypt to work on this project. He mentioned, however, that THEODORE VON KARMAN travels extensively in connection with his various scientific projects and quite possibly could have visited Egypt in connection with the Aswan Dam Project. He said that the foregoing was jurely conjecture on his part. He added that he was not associated in any manner with this Aswan Dam Project and said that it was, in 1947 or 1948, a well known project that was being subsidized by the United States Government. He thought that he possibly heard of the project through either THEODORE VON KARMAN or Professor WILLIAM SEARS. However, he could not be certain as to the exact source although he felt sure he had not discussed it with PERL.


### RE: LEONID SEDOV

KANTROWITZ advised that he was first introduced to LEONID SEDOV, a member of the Soviet Academy of Science, in August, 1956 at a meeting of the International Symposium on Problems of Combustion held at Yale University during the latter part of August, 1956.

KANTROWITZ recalled that he was Chairman of a session of this program and SEDOV wished to deliver a paper at this session over which KANTROWITZ presided. He recalled being introduced to SEDOV who indicated to KANTROWITZ that he was well acquainted with KANTROWITZ' work, particularly that concerning heat capacity lags in gas dynamics. He stated he conversed with SEDOV in German because of SEDOV's inability to speak English. He recalled that he introduced SEDOV to the meeting at which time SEDOV presented a paper relating to "Blast Waves". Upon the conclusion of this meeting, according to KANTROWITZ, he attended a cocktail party at Yale University, given by Professor GLENN WILLIAMS of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

KANTROWITZ recalled that among those present were LEONID SEDOV; GEORGE KISTIAKOWSKY, Harvard University; THEODORE VON KARMAN; Professor GLENN WILLIAMS; and possibly two or three other individuals. At this cocktail party, he stated that he, KANTROWITZ, THEODORE VON KARMAN, and SEDOV were engaged in a conversation and during this conversation, THEODORE VON KARMAN quite bluntly said, "Come now, SEDOV, when are you going to launch a satellite?" KANTROWITZ recalled that SEDOV "lurched back as though struck and composed himself by saying, "Time will tell."

KANTROWITZ said this was the only allusion made to SEDOV's work in ipterplanetary science. He also recalled that Dr. KISTIAKOWSKY of Harvard had warned him of SEDOV's position in the Soviet Satellite Program and had cautioned KANTROWITZ to be careful of what he discussed with SEDOV. KANTROWITZ stated that SEDOV also invited him to a cocktail party to be given by the Russians on the following evening, but after due consideration, KANTROWITZ decided to return to Boston and he had so further contact with SEDOV during SEDOV's 1956 visit.



KANTROWITZ said that during June, 1957, he was a member of the Organizational Committee of the Cosmical Aerodynamics Symposium held at the Astrophysical Laboratory, Cambridge, Massachusetts. At this time, SEDOV attended and was accompanied by three other Russian scientists, one of whom was a woman. He identified these scientists as: V. A. AMBARTSUMIAN, S. B. PICKELNER, and Mrs. A. G. MASSEVITCH.

KANTROWITZ related that aside from meeting the three Russian scientists accompanying SEDOV, he had little contact with At this symposium, he recalled that LEONID SEDOV gave a lecture in German and for the first time introduced a paper on Flight Magneto Hydrodynamics which to KANTROWITZ was a startling disclosure and "a real contribution to flight problems at extremely high speeds". He said it was of particular interest to him because it was related to a problem on which he was at that time engaged. He related that after the exposition by SEDOV in German, he was called upon by Professor GEORGE BATCHELOR of Cambridge University, Cambridge, England to explain to the group what SEDOV had said. stated that he explained to the best of his ability the particulars discussed by SEDOV. He recalled that he also had several cursory conversations with SEDOV following the seminar sessions. These took place at a cocktail party and at a luncheon at which Dr. FRED WHIPPIE of the Astrophysical Laboratory KANTROWITZ said that he also invited LEONID was present. SEDOV to his residence for dinner during SEDOV's visit. those present at this dinner were HARRY PETCHEK, Mrs. PETCHEK, and Mrs. KANTROWITZ. He identified PETCHEK as one of his assistants at the AVCO Laboratory and mentioned that PETCHEK's German was particularly fluent. KANTROWITZ stated that before and during this dinner, conversation with SEDOV was concerned with a comparison of life in the United States with that in the USSR.

KANTROWITZ recalled that SEDOV mentioned that American scientists had made such open comments concerning the high salaries paid Soviet scientists that he, SEDOV, was being subjected to a salary cut upon his return to Moscow. However, he indicated that he would still be able to maintain his second chariffeur. Such a statement indicated to KANTROWITZ that SEDOV lived in a grand manner in the USSR. He also recalled that SEDOV complained of a defect in the Soviet Educational System in that the Soviets had very fine physicists and engineers, but had trained no specialists who could bridge the gap between the physicists and the engineers.

KAN ROWITZ commented that this is an important deficiency in 19th the United States and the Soviet Educational System. He added at no time did LEONID SEDOV attempt to feel him out or elicit information from him concerning the advanced research projects in whith KANTROWITZ was engaged. He also said that SEDOV apparently had been well briefed as to what he could discuss with American scientists and at no time did SEDOV ever indicate any dissatisfaction with the Soviet System.

KANTROWITZ related that since SEDOV's return to the USSR, he has forwarded to KANTROWITZ on several occasions reprints of his scientific publications. KANTROWITZ stated that he has nover admowledged receipt of these publications nor has he exchanged any scientific publications with SEDOV.

Photographs of LEONID SEDOV. VIKTOR A. AMBARTSUMIAN, SOLOMON B. PIKELNER, and ANAL G. MASEVICH were exhibited to KANTROWITZ and he readily identified them as being identical with the Russian scientists with whom he met at the Cosmical Aerodynamics Symposium, Cambridge, Massachusetts in June, 1957.


KANTROWITZ stated that none of the above named Russians, to the best of his knowledge, engaged in any activities which could be considered of an intelligence nature.

# RE: ROBERT and DORTS JONES

KANTROWITZ advised that he has never, at any time, mentioned to either ROBLRT or DORIS JONES his involvement in expionage activities. He said, "ROBERT JONES is a loyal American and a valuable scientist. He is not a deceitful person. He was my closest friend over a long period." He said he last saw ROBERT JONES in December, 1956 at a conference at the Lockheed Aircraft Company, Burbank, California. KANTROWITZ also said that he has no recollection of any discussion with ROBERT JONES concerning WILLIAM PERL's arrest and sentence. He stated that he recalled that ROBERT JONES was active in the FAECT at Langley Field when he himself was a member of that organization.

On March 11, 1958, a photograph of EMANUEL DAVID LOCKE was shown to KANTROWITZ and he stated that LOCKE definitely was not unsub.


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

### ADMINISTRATIVE

On 3/11/58, ARTHUR ROBERT KANTROWITZ, who has admitted being recruited into Sovict espionage in 1935, was interviewed in the Boston Office by Special Agents.

KANTROWITZ recalled having met WILLIAM PERL while both men were working for the National Advisory Committee for Aeronautics (NACA) at Langley Field, Virginia, in 1939. He stated that he met PERL at a few social gatherings while at Langley, but never had worked on any NACA projects with PERL or had any official connection with him. He denied ever visiting PERL in Cleveland, Ohio, or New York City.

KANTROWITZ positively stated that WILLIAM PERL at no time ever mentioned to him any of his espionage or Communist activities, and he, KANTROWITZ, never at any time disclosed to PERL his involvement in espionage.

A review of the facts furnished by KANTROHITZ discloses no espionage or subversive information concerning PERL, or logical leads which should be covered in the PERL case. It is noted that reports in the espionage investigation of KANTROWITZ (Bufile 65-64921) have been classified "Top Secret" because of the highly sensitive nature of his work. In view of these facts, and also because of the possibility that efforts may possibly be made in the future to make a double agent out of KANTROWITZ, it is believed that it is inadvisable to mention the above interview of KANTROWITZ in referenced report.
