PURPOSE:

To inform you that the eligibility of U. S. Congressman Hale Boggs (D-La.), a current gubernatorial candidate in the Summary Democratic primary in Louisiana, has been challenged by another candidate on the ground that Congressman Boggs once had been a member of the American Student Union, a Communist front group. Congressman Boggs brands charge as "absolutely false, low, and vicious."


Attached is a clipping from the October 17, 1951, issue of the Washington Post which carried a New Orleans AP date line story captioned "Boggs Denies Pro-Red Charge." The article states Representative Boggs, a gubernatorial candidate, was charged with once having joined a Communist front organization according to Lucille May Grace, Registrar of the State Land Office and only woman among the 10 Democratic candidates. Miss Grace charged in her petition that Congressman Boggs had been a member of the American Student Union, which organization has been cited several times by the House Committee on Un-American Activities as a Communist front. In answer to this charge, Congressman Boggs is quoted as saying that the charges were "absolutely false, low, and vicious."

Bureau files reflect that the New Orleans Office conducted investigation at Tulane University, where Congressman Boggs received B.A. and L.L.B. degrees, during the early part of 1941. This investigation failed to establish that the American Student Union had ever been affiliated with any organization on the Tulane campus.

The American Student Union was cited in 1944 as a Communist front organization by the Special Committee on Un-American Activities.

During March and April 1941 the New Orleans Office also conducted investigation at Tulane University regarding a group known as "United Students Peace Committee." The Special Committee on Un-American Activities in its report of January 3, 1939, commented as follows regarding the "United Students Peace Committee": \*The American Student Union \* \* \* announced that it set up the 'front' movement, the United Student Peace Committee, in 1938, which has brought into its front 17 national youth organizations."

The October 25, 1949, edition of the publication known as "New York Compass," which has been described by the anti-Communist publication "The New Leader," as following the general line of the

Communist Party, carried an article which was allegedly written by Representative Hale Boggs (D-Ia.), entitled "No: Condemns Picketing as Threat to Dignity of the Judiciary." This article dealt with legislation pending Congress at that time which would make it illegal to picket United States Courts while in session. In this article Congressman Boggs is quoted as saying "It is my opinion that such practices must not only be condemned but must be stopped immediately, therefore, this bill is designed to make such a practice a crime where it impedes, obstructs, or interferes with the court."

Bureau files further reflect that Congressman Boggs was the youngest Democrat in the 77th Congress and prior to his being re-elected to the 80th and 81st Congresses, he served as a naval reserve officer during World War II. In January, 1949, Boggs was appointed to the Ways and Means Committee.

On January 10, 1950, Congressmen Boggs directed a letter to the Bureau in which he stated that he never ceased to be proud of the splendid work which the Director and the FBI consistently performed for our country and its people. Attached to this communication was a letter also dated January 10, 1950, directed to Inspector John P. Mohr at the Bureau wherein he expressed appreciation for the efficient and expeditious manner in which Inspector Mohr handled the problem which they had discussed the previous week. He closed this communication by saying it is a great tribute to you and the splendid organization which you represent.

It was indicated that the Congressman was very sensitive about this matter and there was a question as to whether or not even his office staff had knowledge of this. Inspector Mohr commented following receipt of the above-mentioned communication that following Boggs had expressed deep appreciation for everything the Director had done and had further commented how wonderfully efficient the Bureau was as an organization.

By letter dated June 26, 1950, the Director wrote to Congressman Boggs and thanked him for the thoughtful remarks made by him in Congress concerning this Bureau, which remarks were printed in the June 20, 1950, issue of the Congressional Record.

America is facing an emergency, a crisis which threatens the very future of our

It is the emergency of juvenile delinquency. The tide of youthful lawlessness is rising at a terrifying pace. By 1962 one million of our teenagers will be arrested each year—at the present rate.

My considered opinion is that we must act—and promptly. The time has come for a counterattack against juvenile delin-quency. Unless this counterattack is sucquency. Unless this counterattack is successful, no street or park in the Nation will be safe. Worst of all, every child in the Nation will be exposed to the vicious acts of the delinquent minority.

Thousands and thousands of words have

Thousands and thousands of words have been written recently about the juvenile-delinquency problem. "Are the schools to blame?" "Are the parents to blame?" "Is our whole culture at fault?" are some of the questions which have been argued at length in newspapers and magazines. But now the time has come for action.

I am delighted that This Week magazine has asked me to propose such action in this meries of articles.

Medicine of two kinds series, I will outline what I believe

to be an effective two-pronged counterattack against juvenile delinquency designed to (1) bring existing delinquency under control and (2) prevent future delinquency.

But first let's define the scope of the problem.

During 40 years in law enforcement I have seen thousands of youths skid downward along the path from minor delinquency to vandalism, petty that and progressively more serious crimes. Those of us who recognize juvenile delinquency as the training school for adult crime are seriously alarmed at its increase.

Here are the statistics that worry me and all law enforcement officers: During 1957 persons under 18 years of age comprised 53 percent of all arrests for the major offenses against property. Last year, more than two-thirds of the auto theft arrests, over onehalf of the burglary and larceny arrests, and one-fourth of the arrests for robberies in cities involved juveniles.

No one is immune

Throughout the United States, an estimated 740,000 youngsters under 18 years of age were arrested last year. This is 3.3 percent of the population in the 10 to 17 age group, and it means that 1 out of every 30

youngsters was arrested for violating the law.
Since 1952, our juvenile population has
increased approximately 22 percent. Juvenile arrests in the same period have risen 55

And the offenses committed by young people are characterized by more violence, more pontempt for law and order. In every one of pur cities terror runs down the street as youthful hoodlums grow increasingly bold nd victous.

This is the scope of the problem, a prob-am which cannot be dismissed as affecting only one area or one class. Juvenile delinquency and juvenile crime are not restricted. No child—rich, poor, city dweller, or suburbanite is inherently immune to delinquent behavior.

Delinquency is a worldwide disease. cent study in Great Britain disclosed sharp -

But we're concerned with the causes of juvenile delinquency in the United States. I believe that this mensoing cloud, mushrooming across the Nation with its terrifying portents for the future, is indicative of a deepseated national illness. I am certain that here is proof once again you cannot dance without paying the piper. Over the past quarter of a century all too many Americans have been ignoring the basic traditions of work, discipline, and vigilance on which our Nation was founded.

#### Values are to blame

We seem to have misplaced the sense of value which made this a great Nation. Self-indulgence and the principle of pleasure before duty on a vast and growing scale have become a phenomenon of our adult world. These are warning symptoms of the "decadence disease"—which has contributed to the decay of so many civilizations throughout history.

When children, without discipline and without moral standards implanted by a stable home, are thrust into a culture in which pressures from every direction promote the principle of self-indulgence, what reaction can be expected? To such children, restraints are unbearable. When they want something, they take it.

These children are victims in a very real sense. They are the victims of a society which has substituted indulgence for discipline. They are the victims of a breakdown of authority and moral standards in the home, in the neighborhood, and—too frequently—in the entire community. And they are the victims of those practitioners of expediency who have blurred the lines between right and wrong, good and evil.

So, in large part the juvenile delinquent is a byproduct of our self-indulgent age. As such, he deserves understanding and sympathy, as well as an effort to rehabilitate him. Yet, while seeking to save those who can be salvaged, we must not make the mistake of adding to the problem by repeated, misplaced leniencies.

The treatment accorded youthful criminals must be fair, reasonable, and realistic.

I have been called an advocate of the get tough policy. To an extent, perhaps I am. I have seen too many instances in which repeated leniency has encouraged misbehavior, and I have adso seen occasions when the policies of a realistic judge proved to be very effective deterrents to crime.

The "I can get away with anything—I'm a juvenile" attitude on the part of scores of young hoodiums is a clear-cut indication of how sentiment can supplant sense. Too frequently, misguided sentimentality, along with a policy of blanketing all youthful offenders under a protective covering of anonymity, actually encourages juvenile misbehavior. The knowledge that one can get by, not once but time after time, breeds bitter contempt for law and makes a mockery of our system of justice.

Let me repeat here what I have said many times. I heartily endorse reasonable consideration for children involved in minor delinquencies and first offenses. I do not, however, believe that the umbrella of special privilege should be held impartially over all juveniles, including those who commit heinous crimes or those guilty of repeated offenses. Leniency is misdirected when it is applied repeatedly to those whose every act expresses disdain for law.

When "I can get away with anything—I'm a juvenile!" becomes the scornful sic increasing numbers of youthful cyr need to be wary. Such youngsters, t actual experience, are beginning to vis... themselves as immune from the law. If they get by repeatedly with the little things, the temptation grows. All too often the little things have become a prelude to really victous crime.

Frelude to worse orines

"I do not enggerate when I use the word "victous." The appalling rise in juvenile crime is equalled only by the increase in violence and brutality displayed in the commission of such crimes.

The three most prevalent juvenile offenses are: burglary—in 1957, 54.8 percent of all arrests for burglary involved youths under 18. Example: On the west coast last fall, two boys, aged 15 and 13, were surprised by a merchant while they burglarized his store. One of the boys fired a .22 caliber pistol at the businessman, killing him instantly. gun had been stolen in a previous burglary; larceny-in 1957, 51.8 percent of the persons arrested for larceny were youths under 18. Example: A series of burglaries and larcenies committed on the east coast was finally traced to a small juvenile gang. Among their other crimes: making bombs out of stolen explosives in order to blast open the coin boxes in telephone booths; and auto theft—in 1957, 67.8 percent of all arrests for auto theft were youths under 18. Example: Last June, a young hoodlum arrested in a stolen car admitted a number of crimes in Texas, California, and Arizona. His ambi-tion: to "shoot it out" with the police some "I've taken shots at officers, and I've

been shot at before," he boasted.

The three most vicious youth crimes are—Rape: In 1957, 19.5 percent of all arrests for rape involved youths under 18. Example: On the East Coast a few months ago, a young couple in a parked car was held up by three teen-age hoodlums. The girl, aged 15, was separated from her companion and taken to a remote area where the youths attacked her.

Assault: In 1957, 7.8 percent of the persons arrested for assault were youths under 18. Example: In Washington last summer, 10 youths in two cars stopped their vehicles, jumped out, beat three young sailors, leaving one unconscious, and fied. Two of the youths were apprehended a short time later. They could give no reason for the assault.

Oriminal homicide: In 1957, 6.4 percent of all arrests for criminal homicide were youths under 18. Example: Last December the robbery spree of a juvenile gang ended with the shooting of a liquor-store proprietor. None of the gang members were over 17 years old. For the youth who pulled the trigger, this killing was the culmination of a series of vicious crimes.

In many ways the second list is more frightening than the first. And for a very good reason. In recent years, reports on youth crimes have indicated a mounting savsgery, a senseless brutality which makes one's blood run cold.

I will list just two examples of this nightmarish criminality:

New York—Two young men, refugees from Communist tyranny, were quietly walking along the street. When they stopped to ask directions of a trio of youths, they were attacked and beaten violently. Reason? According to the news account, the three assallants were "toughs" who had been drinking beer for hours on a tenement roof, then had descended to the street "to find some action."

Two of the perpetrators of this vicious attack, each 18 years old, were out on ball pending trial for felonious assault and malicious michief in another case. The third, 16, allegedly greeted his mother with an

The same of the sa

imprintable spithet when his parents are gived at the police station,

Philadelphia—A young foreign student was returning from mailing a letter near the campus of his university last spring when he was accosted by an 11-member juvenile gang. Two youths abackled the student's arms, others knocked off his glasses and began beating him. A blackjack, tead pipe, and hard-toed alone were ured. The young man's face was chopped to unrecognizable pulp, and his clothing was searched for the money he did not have. Within minutes after police arrived on the scene, the victim of this brutal attack was dead. And what had his 11 attackers—all teen-agers—been seeking? The admission price of \$5 cents to attend a neighborhood dance.

Blind, senseless brutality. No conscience. No sense of right and wrong. Violence for the sake of violence. This is the frightening face of juvenile crime in its most terrible form.

Yes, our juvenile-delinquency problem is real, and it is growing. It may even be more serious here than in other areas of the world. Following a trip to the United States to study juvenile criminals, an Austrian educator reported in a lecture that he had found a fundamental difference between juvenile delinquency in Europe and in the United States. He indicated that the American way of life requires more self-control and discipline than the European one and that when the juvenile aggressor casts off his inhibitions, his acts are more ruthless and elemental. In short, the American juvenile delinquent is more deadly than his European counterpart.

Trigger-happy Americans

The Austrian educator said: "If someone in Austria is threatened by a juvenile gangster holding a pistol, he might be able to talk him out of it. No chance of that in America. The young rowdy would pull the trigger."

Much of the trigger-pulling in America occurs in the new urban menace—the juve-

nile gang.

The swift growth of these gangs holds a deadly portent for the future. The drive and purpose of the bopping gang are, with rare exception, alien to juverile groupings of the past. Emotional intensity without moral responsibility renders these packs of young hoodiums increasingly explosive and dangerous. Victous and arrogant, cruel and

dangerous. Victous and arrogant, cruel and cowardly, seeking to rule a specific area of the city by fear and victonee, the modern juvenile gang assembles an arsenal of sip guns, switch-blade knives, steel chains, and other deadly weapons.

The terror which exists in those areas infested by the juvenile gang reaches its ultimate in outbreaks of savage brutality and murder. Witness, for example, the gang killing of a crippled 15-year-old youth and the vicious assault on his companion in New York last year. They were kicked, beaten, and stabbed.

Another aspect of delinquency is the everincreasing juvenile vandalism. Schools have been wrecked, cemeteries and houses of worship have been descrated. And vandalism has led to more than property damage.

Last year a 12-year-old boy admitted starting a fire which took three lives. Police files showed that despite his youth, this boy had an impressive record. He previously had been picked up for throwing rocks, shooting an air gun and placing torpedoes on street-car tracks. He admitted starting four other fires in addition to the fatal blaze.

Terrifying picture

Senseless brutality, gang killings, vandalism—these, together with the other major crimes I have mentioned, add up to a truly

What can we do about juvenile delinquency? In this series, I propose the following two-part counterattack:

First, we must bring under cor **teting** delinquency. To do this, we mu th an immediate program of decisive police, the courts, and parents. a by

Becond, we must prevent future delin-quancy. This means a long-range but posi-tive plan to strengthen the moral fiber of America.

We must act now to halt this spreading sease, which if not stopped, will bring the law of the jungle to every American street. PART II

### Beven steps to half teen-age terror

"I want to be a good burglar, and I figure I'll have to go to prison to learn the busi-ness \* but you know, I'm a pretty good burgler right now." These words were voiced last January by a 10-year-old. He was, indeed, a "pretty good burgiar." This boy had admitted breaking into a bar, a machine shop, and a lunchroom. He had had other brushes with the law—including one in 1957 which had prompted his mother to com-

plain that she could not control him.
Unable to control a 10-year-old child. What an absurd statement. Here is but one which is sweeping across America—the abdication of parental responsibility that under-lies the nightmare growth of juvenile delin-

Last Sunday, I outlined the scope of the problem

In today's article, I wish to present a counerattack, a comprehensive plan to control delinquency, make our streets safe from gang warfare, protect our property and our very lives. It may be summed up in seven points.

We must:

1. Drive home to parents what their responsibilities toward their youngsters are.
2. Improve the effectiveness of juvenile

courts and juvenile aid facilities.

3. Stop coddling known young criminals. 4. Take the protective wraps of secreey and

anonymity off juvenile hoodiums.

5. Crack down hard on the corrupters of

youth-the dope peddlers, pornographers,

6. Attack delinquency problems at the local level, mobilizing community resources for a unified front against immorality and crime.

7. And this is most important: begin today to reestablish a firm moral structure in America to prevent future delinquency.

The first six points in my program make up a plan to control existing delinquency. Let me elaborate on them—and on the urgent need for them—today. I will discuss the final point in next week's concluding article.

#### Responsibility of parents

Any program to combat juvenile delinquency can begin in only one place—the home. Abdication of parental responsibil--a malignant form of self-indulgence before duty—has gained a strange hold on all too many American households today. One jurist said recently:

"The (delinquency) problem is not so much an improper youth as it is an improper home.

Unquestionably, the very heart of the delinquency problem rests with the family.
When mothers and fathers fulfill responsibilities of parenthood, juvenile crime cannot exist.

Everyone is aware of the problems confronting the children of broken homes. But how about the problems of children in "bent" homes? Let me illustrate:

The pressures of business have estranged المراجعين والمحالات المحالات

families the young children are in bed be-fore their father gets home from work. Un-der circumstances such as these, mo have been forced into a role of greate thority and responsibility. The man ( house tends to be looked upon as mer-

Many fathers are forced to hold two lobs in order to make ends meet. In some fami-lies both father and mother are employed.

The result of the above situations is obvious: the children suffer. Repeated rationalizations—"After all, it's in the interest of the whole family"—are small consolation to the youngster who thirsts for the love and attention of his "too busy" parents.

These are the practical problems of what

I call "bent" homes. What about the psy-chological factors?

A terrible degree of moral decay has infected those parents who flaunt press clippings concerning their numerous marriages and divorces. And how much further into degradattion can some mothers and fathers sink after exposing their children to wild parties and thinly veiled promiscuity? Yet, parties and thinly veiled promisculty? parties and tainly venet promises by: I the growing ranks of those "sophisticates" who pride themselves on never permitting moral considerations to interfere with their personal desires.

In a normal child, the stamp of character is imprinted early. And it is imprinted deep. Youngsters learn quickly by the example of their parents.

And even more important, boys and girls who have known little or no real family life invariably long for the security of a genuine home. Subconsciously aware that they are being cheated, they do not understand exactly how life has failed them. So these youngsters react blindly and compulsively, striking out at society in general. This is the beginning of juvenile delinquency.

How can we relate parental neglect to de-linquency? In some States there are laws under which penalties including fines and jail sentences—have been levied against the parents of juvenile offenders. This is one way to make disinterested parents face up to their responsibilities to their children.

Where parental neglect is found to be a factor in delinquency, society has every right to demand that the parents of the young offender be called into court and be required to account for their actions. Neglectful mothers and fathers are no less a menace to the community than are their children. Let them be identified and publicly recognized as such.

#### improvement of fuvenile courts

Every State has special courts or special court procedures to deal with juvenile crime. Yet many of these facilities are sorely inadequate to handle the load.

One Maryland judge complained last June that in his county the juvenile court was expected to function with an inadequate staff, no juvenile detention facilities, no treatment institutions for disturbed chil-dren, and no police officers trained in handling juveniles.

In another community it was revealed that youngsters in immediate need of psychiatric care had to wait from 6 months to a year to get into one of the city's child clinics.

A metropolitan newspaper recently editorialized, "As long as young criminals can, figuratively or otherwise, thumb their noses at police and the courts because they know that usually there's no place to commit them—except in the so-called custody of their parents—just so long will our city be in a corry and perilous fix. The inadequate facilities for neglected children are likewise a disgrace to the city."

It is a common practice to heap a greater The pressures of business have estranged burden upon the existing facilities than they thousands of youngsters from their fathers. possibly can bear. This has been true of

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when the existing staff of officers is required to supervise greater and greater numbers of This also has been true of welfare departments such as the one in which a case worker complained that it was impossible for her to do an adequate job for any of the 90 children sesioned to her.

We need improved and enlarged juvenile court and juvenile aid facilities to help stamp

out delinquency.

Coddling of known young criminals

Frankly, I am alarmed at the extremes to which some authorities have been permitted to go in protecting young offenders. Under a pretext of rehabilitation, tragic blunders have been committed against the American people.

As I said in last week's article, I know that I have been called an advocate of the "get tough" policy. To some extent this is true. I think the time has come when we must be realistic. We must show the hard-core de-linquents who have no respect for law and order that we mean business.

Sometimes the coddling of delinquents takes an ironic form. In a number of cases, misguided humanitarians have succeeded only in ruining the lives of the juveniles they were so earnestly trying to help.
Let me illustrate with an actual case. Last

February a 17-year-old hoodlum was cap-tured after a gun battle with police. He was well known to the authorities in his city. having built up an extensive juvenile record over a 5-year period. A probation officer familiar with this youth's case said that the boy idolized his father. Who is his father! veteran criminal, now serving a 15-year sentence for burglarizing a grocery market

Several months before his gun battle with the police, this teen-ager and his father had been arrested for grand larceny. The youth was convicted, but the charges against his father were dismissed for lack of evidence. Here was an opportunity to remove this young man from the influence of his father, Instead, he was merely placed on probation, and, in effect, permitted to continue his ap-prenticeship in crime.

Coddling of delinquents must be stoppedfor the protection of the youths themselves, as well as the general public.

Protection of delinquents by secreey

Closely linked to the coddling of young criminals is the widespread practice of sheltering them under a cloak of secrecy. A number of investigative agencies have been dangerously hampered in protecting the public by the secrecy which many courts attack to official proceedings involving juveniles.

For example, last Christmas four teen

agers brutally beat an attendant and escaped from the detention hall in a southern city Three of the boys were being held pending their transfer to the State reformatory. They had been picked up for robbery. The fourth boy reportedly was being held as a material witness in a sex case.

Despite the extensive records of these young hoodiums and despite their brutally executed escape, juvenile authorities were said to be powerless to identify them to the public. One juvenile court judge was quoted as stating, "If they are not recaptured within 24 hours, we may name the boys and de-scribe their records as a matter of public welfare. But at the moment we are bound to respect the fact they are juveniles and withhold their identity."

A more realistic approach to delinquency certainly is needed when dangerous teem-agers such as these are permitted to hide under an umbrella of secrecy. Corruption of y. ....

Our country is plagued today by an ugly brand of parasite who commercialises upon the immature judgment and curiosity of young people. In this category I include the filth merchants, dope peddlers, and others who make their living by corrupting youth.
These furtive characters frequently are found loitering near achools, playgrounds, and juvenile hangouts. They also run the mail-order houses which blanket the Nation with promotional material such as the following letter:

Comment :

"My name is Mary.

I'm an art model—pose in the mude you know, and I thought maybe you would like me or my girl friends to pose for you in a very special way."

The Post Office Department, which has jurisdiction when obscene material is sent through the mails, has received thousands of complaints from parents in all parts of the country whose children have received these letters. But our youngsters do not have to send away for indecent pictures and literature. There probably is a generous supply or the shelves of a neighboring

tes, pamphlets, and books at prices rangup to \$75. Two squad cars were needed haul away the filth which was found in s apartment.

As a law-enforcement officer, I am required exercise strict control over my emotions. out frankly there are times when I cannot thelp feeling my blood boll. This is particularly so in cases where an adult has deliberately set out to corrupt the morals of a child.

The examples, unfortunately, are legion. In one city, the head of the juvenile bureau complained that the delinquency problem had been compounded by the fact that homo-sexuals were plying local teenagers with liquor and making advances toward them. In another city, 2 boys, aged 16 and 18, were taught the criminal art of stealing and forging checks by an ex-convict.

And in a third city, a middle-aged mother of 5 children was found to be the supplier of weapons for a gang of young robbers.

But of all the corrupters of youth, perhaps none is more terrible than the dope peddler. The dope pusher entices children to try narcotics, and in many cases the youngsters become addicted to drugs. It is well known that drug addiction leads directly to crime. The addict craves larger and larger doses, and the price is high. To get expensive narcotics, youths often follow the trail which leads from larceny to burglary and to more serious crimes.

All calculated assaults upon the standards of youth should be met with stern law enforcement and punishment. In communities where existing laws are inadequate to thwart the filth merchants, the dope peddlers, and the rest-let's have new laws, laws with teeth in them.

#### · Mobilize community resources

An effective attack against the delinquency problem can be launched in only one place. That is at the community level. Crime and delinquency are essentially local problems.

In the final analysis, immoral conditions paraist within a community only because the last person to recognize his responsibility and acknowledge his blame is the individual citizen. He finds fault with the police de-

partment, ignores the pleas for assistance of youth-serving agencies, berates the schools and complains, "Why hasn't the Fe ' Government done something about t

ion

How absurd. Despite the pleas of a special Federal agency to spe

the fight against delinquency and crime, a want to assure you that the Federal Government has no vaccine or cure-all to overcome moral sicknesses which exist in local communities. If the frightening growth of youth offenses is to be stopped, the forces for good within each community must unite.

As a first step, local efforts must be coordinated. Agencies must pool their re-sources. Petty jealousies and differences must not stand in the way when there is to be done. Church parent-teacher associations, public and private youth-serving agencies, civic organiza-tions and local law-enforcement agencies must all work together-for the benefit of

The second step requires a realistic appraisal of local weaknesses which are a detriment to the cause of decency. Inadequate police budgets, lack of playgrounds in crowded residential areas, obsolete juvenile detention facilities, weakness in existing laws, overcrowded schools, and lack of supervised recreational programs are among the many dangerous conditions which prevail in all too many cities across the Nation. These conditions can best be recognized—and corrected—by the local citizens themselves.

The third step is action. Not only must corrective measures be initiated but each one of them must be carried through.

Them must be carried under.

There you have my plan for the basis of a counterattack on existing delinquency.

Now, what about my seventh point: that we must begin today to reestablish a firm moral structure in America to prevent future delinquency.

I feel this step is tremendously important.

Any plan to control delinquency must look the future as well as to the present. Point Seven calls for a reaffirmation of the moral values that can stop delinquency in the future.

We cannot allow this situation to continue. We must make our towns and cities safe, now and forever, from juvenile terror. Once Americans understand this, I am sure they can do it.

#### PART III

#### Where does discipline begin?

Last summer a very interesting newspaper article came to my attention. It concerned an outdoor camp for boys—one established under the sponsorship of a religious organi-sation. This is no ordinary boys' camp. It caters to youths whom many other camps would reject as undesirable.

After school had closed for the summer, a group of about 100 boys departed for this camp from the crowded streets of a large eastern city. Their ages ranged between 14 and 21. No less than 40 of them had court records, and a number of other belonged to juvenile ganga. Heading the group as it boarded buses for a month's stay at the camp was a youth worker who was only a few years removed from childhood himself. Did this young man have any misgivings about the backgrounds and court records of these boys? Not in the least. In the following words he expressed his attitude toward the challenge presented by these boys:

"We have some of the toughest guys in the city. We know what they've done and what they're capable of doing. But we show them what toughness really is-being able to face up to problems and assume a responsible place in the community."

The man who spoke these words, and the camp in which he works, are doing an effec-tive job in combating juvenile delinquency. would like to contend in this article that his philosophy is our true final answer to this terrifying problem. -

We must show youth what tough: really is. These are profound words. Chacter, pride, resourcefulness, excellence these qualities require real toughness. takes strength and courage to be good, stand for the principles which we all kn are right. If we can help our youth devel this moral toughness, they will become thind of citizens America needs to survive a free Nation.

I cannot overemphasize the arrency of t delinquency situation. The current wave youthful crime and vandalism is mounts in both size and intensity.

In community after community across land, youthful hoodlums are going on rampage. Juvenile arrests are rising at su a rate that 791,000 arrests of persons un-18 years of age are predicted for 1958—4 1 million will be recorded each year beg ning 1962.

As I said 2 weeks ago in my first article this series, juvenile lawiesness must stopped. The time has come for a count attack against juvenile delinquency.

Last week I outlined half of a count attack against juvenile delinquency. I p sented a six-point plan to control exist delinquency by:

1. Accepting the responsibilities of p

2. Improving our juvenile courts and ju nile-aid facilities.

8. Stopping the coddling of young cris nals.
4. Stopping the protection of juves

hoodlums by secrecy. 5. Cracking down of the corrupters

youth.

6. Attacking delinquency at the local le Fighting existing delinquency, however only half the problem. At the same the we must also begin today to reestablish firm moral structure to prevent future linquency. We must stop sowing the se for more frightening delinquency in years to come.

Today, I will suggest an approach to t most difficult problem. I will try to indic a cure for the underlying sickness of our which I call "decadence disease." If a c can be found, if we can restore to Amer the firm moral precepts of our forefathers, can ward off future delinquency.

How can we head off future delinquen How can we convert the arrogant toughn of our teen-agers into a moral, construct toughness? The best way is by example adult example. Yet, as examples thousan of American mothers and fathers are prov themselves dismal failures.

#### . The "decadence disease"

From the examples of these parents, m and more youngsters are learning dam ously harmful lessons: "Rules are made be broken." "If you are smart enough. can get away with anything." "After you only live once."

Corrupt alogans. Parents by their c words and deeds are beckoning youngsten abandon the principles which have made t

a great country.
"Decadence disease" is infecting our cl dran. And self-indulgence, the insiste upon pleasure before duty, the const search for "the easy way"—are its sympto

When a child is exposed to dublous mor ity at home, he invariably becomes confu When glaring inconsistencies exist betw what he is told is right and what he going on, neither praise nor criticism fr his parents can have any real mean Mothers and fathers who bask in self-ind gence are grossly ineffective at disciplin their children or inspiring them tow worth while goals.

Confronted with the charge, "You kids making this a lousy world," one member a tough juvenile gang replied, "Ye That's the way we found it." And if adult atmosphere surrounding this you

They need guideposts

Superficially, they may rebel. But on a deeper level, where character is formed, a child wants to be told what he can and cannot do. He needs guideposts to help him orient himself to the world. He looks to his parents for these guideposts. If parents are lary or indifferent or overindulgent, is it any wonder that a child loses love and re-spect for them? How can a child continue to look up to a parent who continually compromises and yields to him?

No American, regardless of his age, out-grows the need for discipline and self-discipline. In a democracy, restraint and self-control are essential in all phases of life. This fact should be evident to all normal adults, and it should serve as a guide to them

in rearing their children.

Frankly, I become irritated when I hear doting mothers and fathers say. "I love Junior so much that I just can't bring myself to punish him." In reality, these parents do not love their children. It is a strange kind of love indeed which turns a normal infant into a maladjusted child.

And let there be no mistake, an undisciplined child cannot help being maladjusted. Prustration, tension, and resentment con-

front him on all sides.

On the west coast last February, three young boys were caught in the act of letting air out of automobile tires. The father of one of the boys, an 11-year-old, was summoned to police headquarters. Told that the youths had deflated scores of tires, the father unhesitatingly said, "Son, pump them up again." After supervising as the boys inagain." fiated 16 tires with hand pumps, he yielded a bit and rented a power air pump for them to use. But he saw to it that the job was completed.

What a refreshing and praiseworthy attitude. Contrast this with the attitude other parents whom law-enforcement other parents whom law-enforcement agencies encounter day after day:

Oh, no. Not my Harry. You officers are always picking on him. Why don't you let him alone?"

#### A firm hand

Pampering, overprotection, making excuses, and cooling soft words when a firm hand across the seat of the trousers would be more appropriate are practices which create contempt for authority and obstruct decency among youth. These practices are harmful enough when they exist merely in the home. But today we even find them spreading to some of our courts.

In California last year a 17-year-old hood-lum was arrested following an attempted burglary. This young criminal cursed at the arresting officers and boasted that regardless of the kind of report they made, the courts would release him in a couple of days. What made him so certain of this? "I've been armade him so certain of this? "Twe been ar-rested and released before," he sneered in

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in another case local policemen were assaulted by two 17-year-olds who called them ~d o€ obscene names and shouted at a cocople to help kill the officers. D fracas a gun was taken from one of agers. Both of these youths had p ords. Yet, for openly delying the la. of them was sentenced to serve only 60 days in jail and a term of probation.

Let there be no mistake. I do not advo-cate handling all violators under the same rules which are applied to hardened crim-inals. I do feel, however, that the seriousness of violating the law must be impressed upon juvenile delinquents and other young offenders. They must learn that, in spite of the leniencies they may receive in the interest of rehabilitation, and in spite of their youth, society still holds them responsible for their acts. And that repeated violations will not be tolerated—no matter how young the offender may be.

Appropriate punishments

In Cealing with juveniles, it is essential that the punishment fit both the offense and

Earlier this year, six boys in Virginia were convicted of savagely beating and mistreating a mule. They used planks and pum-meled the poor animal so cruelly that it was feared it would lose an eye. The judge who heard the case ordered that the boys be given what many may regard as an appropriate punishment, a good, sound, old-fashioned whipping by their parents. In addition, each of the six was released to the custody of his parents on strict injunction of good be-

havior until he attains the age of 18. In another case, a 17-year-old boy who had committed extensive acts of vandalism in a high school was placed on probation under the provision that he find a part-time job after school and make restitution at the rate of \$20 per month for the damage he had done.

If, as a result of their sentences, the six Virginia youths learn to respect the feelings of animals and the teen-age vandal learns to value the property of others, the courts will have helped them to become better citi-What more can we ask of our juvenile courts than a record of positive accomplishments such as this?

But we must understand that a child will never reach a juvenile court if his parents believe and practice discipline. No child will hate his parents if firm but fair discipline is consistently applied. On the con-trary, the youngster will feel his father and mother care enough about him to want to teach him the differences between right and wrong. Indifference and overindulgence breed contempt. Discipline breeds love.

#### The deadly slogans

Our teen-agers must be taught discipline outside the home, too. Many visitors to our shores simply cannot understand, for example, how an American youth could ever strike a teacher or, for that matter, refuse to obey a teacher's command. The home-lands of these people have a deep-bred re-spect for teachers and other public officials.

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The stereotype of our modern-day troubled teen-ager is an unruly, outspoken, rock-and-roll addict who cruises the streets in a souped-up jalopy, shouting insults out the window. In appearance he aspires to look-ing shaggy and to leaving behind the impression that he has not been near a barbershop in weeks.

The teen-agers who fit into this general pattern are fickle, simless and confused. Whether drag racing down a major highway

or thumping a pencil in dejected bored over their schoolwork, these boys and g feel a basic insecurity. A void exists in the lives, and they are constantly experime ing-shifting from one fad and one "cra to another-trying often pathetically to the gap.

The bravado and self-confident air of the youngsters veil only thinly a basic fear uncertainty, an emptiness which gnaws d in their souls. These children long for sor thing which cannot be found without help of adult society: discipline and di tion.

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If we adults succeed, if we can chang structive toughness to firm moral tough we will have succeeded in preventing d quency in the future. And we will bequeathed to our children—and to our thom—the greatest gift of all. We will given them the toughness, moral strength and courage to keep our N strong and free. we will have succeeded in preventing d





Mr. Boggs is the Democratic representative of the 2nd District of Louisiana.\* There has been previous correspondence with him primarily of an official nature. He is a member of the House Ways and Means Committee. A news clipping from the 10-17-51 issue of "The Washington Post" contained an allegation that Boggs once joined a communist front organization. Boggs was quoted as saying that the charges were absolutely false and vicious. Bureau investigation at Tulane University, his alma mater, failed to reflect that the American Student Union, to which Boggs allegedly belonged, had ever been affiliated with any organization on Tulane's campus. It was reported, however, that Boggs' name did appear as a member of the "United Students Peace Movement" while a student; that he had been a member of a student radical movement, but apparently did not realize the potential seriousness of this at the time. He has had no apparent connection with any front organization since his student days "Mr. Boggs is the Democratic Whip in Congress."

"The Independent American" is allegedly dedicated to the defeat of socialists and communist influences and to the promotion of individuals and organizations which believe that a political party based on constitutional states rights is the answer to socialism. It is published in New Orleans by Kent Courtnand neither he nor his publication has been investigated by the Bureau.

Reference is made to my telegram to you dated July 9th concerning the false impression being created by Mr. T. Hale Boggs in political advertisements in news papers and by direct mail to the misleading effect that you have endorsed him for political office.

In my telegram to you I expressed admiration for your successful 38 years as FBI Director and a reiteration of my belief that you do not engage in political activity. I even reassured my friends that Boggs was creating a false impression by inferring your political endorsement.

Thank you for responding to my telegraphic request that you keep the record straight. The very capable Special Agent of the FBI who called on me in my office last week delivered your reply with great clarity - Neither the FBI nor its Director has endorsed T. Hale Boggs or any candidate. He further advised that the quotation "My associates and I are particularly grateful to you" should have read "My associate and I are particularly grateful to you and your colleagues ----." To have been truthful Boggs should have quoted enough out of the text of your letter to reflect its application to a group, and not to him personally.

As one who greatly admires your record and that of the FBI, I am making this letter public strictly on my own initiative because I believe it is necessary to protect the enviable image of the FBI, which you removed from politics 38 years ago.

The decay of American morality in my opinion is being accelerated by irresponsible public officials who apparently believe there are acceptable degrees of truthfulness, such as the use of "you" instead of "you and your colleagues."



In an effort to rebut these charges, a portion of a sentence from a letter to Boggs from the Director was used out of context implying that Boggs was endorsed by the Director. 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

Mr. BOGGS. Mr. Speaker, it is indeed a pleasure for me to call to the attention of my colleagues in the Congress a very splendid speech given on December 4 in Washington by America's distinguished Director of the Federal Bureau of investigation, the Honorable J. Edgar Hoover. Mr. Hoover, who has served our country faithfully and well for four decades or more, delivered this fine address to members of the Brotherhood of Washington Hebrew Congregation who honored him for his magnificent service to our country. Mr. Speaker, I commend to every Member of the House and Senate this very fine speech in which Mr. Hoover not only recites many eternal truths about freedom and liberty, but also he says them very well. The speech follows:

FAITH IN FREEDOM

(Remarks of J. Edgar Hoover, Director, Federal Bureau of Investigation, before the Brotherhood of the Washington Hebrew Congregation in Washington, D.C., December 4, 1963)

This is a great moment in my life. To be recognized in this manner by the Brother-hood of the Washington Hebrew Congregation is a distinction which I shall cherish always.

I am especially honored by the presence of so many close friends, including the distinguished civic leaders whom you have selected as recipients of other awards.

How have these men come to positions of prominence in our community? It is because they have dedicated themselves to service—they have eagerly accepted the responsibilities of good citizenship, and they are willing to be judged upon their records of positive contributions to the cause of decency and of justice.

Decency and justice—these are the high aims of this brotherhood, just as they always have been an integral part of the Hebrew religion which has given mankind the Ten Commandments and the concept of a monotheistic God. For these sacred gifts, all true religions of the Western World are eternally indebted to you.

Americans of the Hebrew faith are doubly blessed. The rich cultural inheritance that has been handed down since early Biblical times to generation after generation of Jews is combined, in our country, with a proud haritage of freedom. It is a heritage that was won by the sweat, the blood, and the sacrifices of men and women of many nationalities and many religious creeds.

Devotion to God; belief in the inherent dignity of mankind; faith in man's ability, through divine providence, to guide his own destiny—these are the strong ties that hold together our United States, the greatest brotherhood of freedom in the history of the world.

brotherhood of freedom in the history of the world.

No one has a deeper understanding of the true meaning of freedom than the members of the Hebrew faith, for no peoples have suffered more relentless persecution and injustice at the hands of tyranny through the ages.

Today the first of anni-Samitism continue

Today the first of any benitten continue to burn with fierce intensity in many areas of the world. This is particularly true be-

d the Iron Curtain where communism, are bitter enemy of Judaism and of all other religions of the world, seeks to destroy your priceless heritage and the right of your people to live according to the states of God.

During the past generation, the conscience of decent men everywhere has been shocked by the continuing vicious atrocities that have been committed against Jews in the Soviet Union. Rabbis have been arrested and imprisoned or executed; synagogues have been descrated; the traditional Jewish school system has been liquidated; and Hebrew literature, language, and customs have been suppressed by the Russian Communists.

Despite Communist claims of improved

Despite Communist claims of improved conditions for Jews under the Khrushchev regime, the opposite actually is trus. Additional forms of suppression have been

introduced.

The observance of Passover no longer can be held according to tradition; sacred Hebrew burial customs have been obstructed; and a statewide program has been instituted to make Jews the scapegoats for criminal acts affecting the Bussian sconomy. Jews are clearly identified by religion on the internal passport which all Soviet citizens must carry.

Last October, the outrageous extent of this program was disclosed by the Moscow newspaper Investia when it announced the arrests of several persons involved in an alleged criminal conspiracy. The leaders of this gang have Jewish names, investia told its readers in demanding a "short trial" and "death sentences."

Vicious outbursts of religious hatred such as this caused one American newspaper recently to warn its readers, "For reasons best known to themselves the Soviet leaders discriminate heavily against Jews. The evidence is overwhelming and incontrovertible and renewed almost daily by the Russians themselves."

In a joint statement released last summer, three American Jewish organizations denounced the Soviet press for conveying "a vicious negative image of the Jews," and indignantly proclaimed, "Soviet Jews are deprived by official policy of religious and cultural rights \* \* \* and are the victims of discrimination, \* \* \*"

Communism and religion—like communism and freedom—can never coexist, for Marxism is unalterably opposed to all forms of religious belief. Lenin acknowledged this fact more than 50 years ago when he exhorted his followers, "We must combat religion—this is the A B C of all materialism, and consequently of Marxism." Then he declared, "The Marxist must be \* \* \* an enemy of religion."

Since the time of Lenin, atheistic communism has surged forth from Russia to enalave nearly one-fourth of the earth's surface and a third of her peoples. Nowhere are its advance bettalions more active than in our own Western Hemisphers, where agents trained by the Kremlin continue to burrow deeply into countries of the Caribbean and Central and South America. Their deadly objective is to undermine legitimate governments, foment revolutions, and create a Soviet Union of Latin American Republics.

I have said this before and I would like to repeat it here: We are at war with communism and the sooner every red-blooded American realises this the safer we will be. Here in the United States, the cause of international communism is represented by the Communist Party, U.S.A.—a cunning and defiant subversive conspiracy which is financed, directed, and controlled by the Kremlin. Its membership consists today of a hard core of revolutionary fanatics who are knowingly and eagerly subservient to the distance of Moscow. The dupes, the dissidents, and the faint of heart have long since been purged from the party's ranks.

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Today, the Communists are engaged in a vigorous campaign to divide and weaken America from within, Foremost in this campaign are the party's efforts to exploit misunderstandings and capitalize upon areas of dissension and unrest wherever they exist. This is especially true in the intense civil rights movement, for America's 20 million Negroes and all others engaged in this struggle are a major target for Communist propagands and subversion.

It would be abourd to suggest that the aspirations of Negroes for equality are Communist inspired. This is demonstrably not true. But what is demonstrable is that some individuals and groups exploit the tension for purposes not confined to the equality of human rights under the Constitution of the United States. The crusade should not become a vehicle for political radicalism or organized violence.

Devotion to race must not supersede devostion to established institutions

It would be useful if responsible Negro leaders themselves could make it clear to all who follow them that their interest is solely in racial equality.

This Nation was conceived under God and its progress has been under God. There could be no greater disaster for our Nation than that it should deny in any respect, to even the smallest degree, the presence, the power, the guidance, the protection, the in-struction of Almighty God.

There is unmistakable evidence of divine guidance all through the history of our Nation. We must guard it. We must cher-ish it. We must revere it. We must work for it.

The record of our Nation is better than that of any other nation in any part of the world. It is true there are injustices in this Nation toward those of dark skin, as well as light, but even worse injustices prevail in other parts of the world. Whether the people are black- or yellow- or brown- or whiteskinned, these things will have to be worked

America has taken the lead in working them out, and it is taking the lead today. It is doing more for its underprivileged minorities than any other nation in the world, but there is more to be done.

We thank God that where the spirit of the Lord is, there is liberty.

As citizens of a free country, we must judge people as individuals—not by race, creed or color.

Legitimate civil rights organizations must Communists to influence their actions, take over their programs and corrupt their ranks.

Communism feeds upon ignorance, prejudice and sickness of the mind and soul. It probes relentlessly for weaknesses in America's moral armor.

That is why the cause of communism is well served by the hatemongers, the lunatic fringe and other rabble who preach a doctrine of malice and intolerance toward their fellowman,

These venomous fanatics, whether they are extremists of the left or the right, are carriers of a highly infectious disease. They clutter the streets and the mails with their slanderous obscenities, urging impres-sionable teenagers and unstable adults to acts of bate, terror, and intimidation. have brought forth the bombs and ignited the flames that have killed decent Americans and even innocent children and destroyed churches and other temples of worship. They are a national diagrace.

Invariably, these merchants of hate attempted to drape themselves in a cloak of patriotism. But their real objective is to profiteer and capitalize upon ignorance,

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prejudice and bigotry while destroying the very ideals which they claim to uphold

Today, the Communists continue with impunity to breathe out lies and distortions against the United States. Their designs on American youth revolt and anger those steeped in our national ideals of freedom.

The peddling of their dishonest doctrine to high-minded, largely inexperienced, and basically eager-to-believe young people is not unlike the peddling of filth and dope in demoralizing effect. It can undermine patriotiam, create doubts about our social and economic system, and mock the many wholesome youth organizations in this country.

The great majority of American youths are genuinely convinced that they would not fall for the Communist bait. Many never would. But there are others who might never know they were "hooked" until the enormous tragedy of their loss of faith dawned after bitter years of fighting the American way of life, almost unwittingly, as dupes of the Communists.

It has happened to idealistic Americans before.

There is not an avenue to the heart and mind of Americans that is not used to implant their false ideology. Communism can-not be defeated by hysteria and name calling, but it can be defeated by education and living proof that our way of life is best.

The God-given ideals which are responsible for this country's greatness are being at-tacked on many fronts today. Moral lethargy, self-indulgence, neglect of duty these lethal forces are undermining many facets of business, labor, industry, and Gov-

We find their influence in the repulsive at-titude of "half-way Americans" to whom life in this country is the enjoyment of rights and privileges devoid of responsibilities.

We find their influence in those courts of law where the true purpose and intent of our Constitution as a document designed for the protection of society have too often been warped and distorted for the benefit of Offenders.

We find their influence in the continuing increase of crime—a tragic national problem which is growing four times as fast as our expanding population.

Crime has no respect for age, nationality, sex, color, or religious creed. It has turned our streets into virtual jungles of terror and

Today, a brutal crime of violence—a murder, forcible rape or assault to kill—is committed every three minutes. The number of these senseless atrocities will continue to grow until men of strong moral conviction assert greater influence toward the prevention of crime and administration of justice.

Disrespect for law and order is a tragic moral sickness which attacks and destroys the American traditions of honesty, integrity, and fair play. The moral strength of our Nation has alipped alarmingly. National corruption is the sum total of individual corruption. We must follow the teachings of God if we hope to cure this moral illness.

Law and order are bulwarks on which successful government must stand. Without law and order, society will destroy itself.

Pantasy and weakness have too often pre vailed in the administration of justice where stranges and realism are essential needs.

There are some misguided social workers and judges who have perverted the meaning of mercy. When so-called mercy aids society's enemies, it is no longer mercy. It is sheer stupidity, if not worse. Justice is needed—stern justice. Without such justice. our streets and our families will continue to be endangered.

Justice is not served when the innocent

victim and society suffer while the vicious

criminal goes free.
Oliver Wendell Holmes, Jr., observed: "At the present time in this country there is more danger that criminals will escape justice than that they will be subjected to tyranny.

Judge Learned Hand said: "Our dangers do not lie in too little tenderness to the accused. Our procedure has been always haunted by the ghost of the innocent man convicted. It is an unreal dream. What we need to fear it the archaic formalism and

need to fear it the archaic formatism and the watery sentiment that obstructs, delays, and defeats the prosecution of crime." Justice Benjamin N. Cardoso observed: "Justice, though due to the accused, is due to the accuser also. The concept of fairness must not be strained till it is narrowed to a filament. We are to keep the balance true."

Let us proceed to try armed robbers as armed robbers. Let the punishment fit the crime and let us "keep the balance true."

Wherever politics and opportunism remain primary considerations in the appoint-ment of jurists, parole officials, and others charged with the administration of justice, the public should have more adequate guarantees for the immediate removal of those who prove by their unjustifiable ac-tions that they cannot be entrusted with the important responsibilities of their offices.

The fact is millions of free Americans are taking our good way of life for granted. They have ceased to care about our foundstion stones, the "rock from which we were

Let us never forget that religion has made us what we are, given us what we have. Every good thing we enjoy as free Americans came directly or indirectly out of our belief in God.

Our best offensive against crime, subversion, intolerance and all enemies of America's heritage of freedom is brotherhood a brotherhood such as yours, built upon a solid foundation of mutual trust, under-

standing and faith in God.
There must be a moral reawakening in every home in our land.

History shows us the great accomplishments that can be attained by the combined efforts of selfless men and women who are sincerely dedicated to a noble cause. We have such a cause in America—to dispel intolerance, to preserve the rule of law, to protect and strengthen our God-given ideals and faith in freedom,

Lew and public sanctions help to keep our deeds in line—only conscience polices It is much easier to control our thoughts. our actions than our thoughts.

For, "As a man thinketh in his heart so is he." Two hundred years ago, our Founding Fathers had a vision of a nation where men could live together and worship together without fear. Today, we hold this same vision—the determination that faith, courage and decency will prevail over all

enemies of freedom.

In the upper left-hand corner of the envelope, the return address had been blacked out. Mr. Rankin advised that the envelope had contained a rather nasty hate-type letter to the Congressman and the Congressman had mentioned to Mr. Rankin that he would appreciate the Bureau making an attempt to ascertain the writing in the blacked-out area. Mr. Rankin stated that inasmuch as the Congressman is a member of the President's Commission he was passing on the request.

Mr. Rankin advised he did not care to know the actual results of the Laboratory's work in this matter other than to satisfy his curiousity of whether we would be able to come up with the answer. He stated he would appreciate it if the Bureau would furnish the actual information developed directly to Congressman Boggs.

Mr. Rankin was advised this matter would be handled promptly and the Congressman and he would both be advised if we were successful in developing the blacked-out information. NOT RECORDED

Reference is made to the airtel from the Baltimore office in the above-captioned matter indicating a book on the front seat of a car believed belonging to a Member of Congress was seen at Friendship Airport. The book was stamped "Top Secret" and it was a reprint on the Presidential Fact Finding Committee on the Assassination of President Kennedy. The door of the car did not seem locked and the individual reporting this to the Baltimore office thought this was a major breach of security.

This matter has been checked by the Washington Field office and we have ascertained that the black Mercury with Washington, D. C. license 7J173 is a lend lease car by the Lincoln Mercury Division of the Ford Motor Company. The car is supposed to be assigned to the U. S. House of Representatives to the Majority Whip, 261 Constitution Ave. N.W. The Majority Whip of the House of Representatives is Representatives Hale Boggs (D-La.) who is a member of the Presidential Commission looking into the Assassination of President Kennedy.

The Washington Field office in checking this today ascertained that the Secret Service was also interested in this same matter.

Memorandum from Rosen to Belmont dated 4/8/64 set forth information indicating that a book stamped "Top Secret", which was a reprint of the Presidential Fact Finding Committee on the Assassination of President Kennedy, was observed in the front see of an automobile whose license was issued to Representative Hale Boggs (D. La.), who is a member of the President's Commission.

Congressman Hale Boggs was confidentially advised of this on April 12, 1964, by Mr. DeLoach. He stated the car was his; however, the material was irrelevant and also stated the car was locked.

Secret Service Agent Tom Kelley telephoned concerning this same incident and inquired what action the Bureau was taking concerning this incident inasmuch as the Secret Service had been supplied the same data and they did not wish to duplicate action the Bureau might take.

#### RECOMMENDATION:

If approved, Tom Kelley of the Secret Service will be advised that this incident was discussed with a member of the President's Commission, without identifying Hale Boggs as the person it was discussed with, and we are taking no further action.

He was, however, a member of the Tulane Students Peace Committee which was affiliated with the United Students Peace Committee. This latter organization was cited by the House Committee on Un-American Activities (HCUA) as a "front" for the American Student Union which, in turn, was cited by the HCUA as a communist front.

An article in "The New York Times" dated 4/4/37 indicated that this organization was created at Princeton University in February, 1936, and was being disbanded in April, 1937, after having boasted of 60,000 members in 534 chartered posts. The organization was created to satirize the Harrison Bonus Bill which gave a bonus to all veterans of World War I.

### RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that no action be taken with respect to the allegations of against Congressman Boggs.

Congressman Hale Boggs, a member of the Warren Commission called me at 4:25 p.m. 2/27/67, and stated that he would appreciate me coming up to his office to discuss a matter of some importance. I told him I would do so immediately.

After mentioning this matter to you and the Director, I met with Congressman Boggs at approximately 4:45 p.m. He got right to the point and stated he considered District Attorney Garrison in New Orleans to be a mental case. He stated that he personally had been a most conscientious member of the Warren Commission and had tried to do his homework very carefully. He added that since Garrison had made his numerous allegations that he (Boggs) had reread much of the Warren Commission report just to make absolutely certain there were no loopholes. He stated he had found none. The stated he was somewhat worried; however, inasmuch as Garrison had attracted over 100 newspapermen, both domestic and foreign, to New Orleans, and apparently some credence was given to Garrison's remarks inasmuch as these newspapermen were reporting all allegations.

I told him I agreed the newspapermen were reporting all allegations but I doubted that many newspapermen were taken in by Garrison.

Congressman Boggs stated Garrison was making New Orleans and Louisiana the laughing stock of the world. He stated that fundoubtedly a lot of people overseas believe Garrison's statements. The Congressman next praised the FBI and indicated he had always been completely satisfied regarding the FBI's thoroughness. got to the crux of the conversation. He stated he wanted to make absolutely certain that Garrison had nothing which might bring disgrace upon him, Boggs, in his home state as a result of having previously examined evidence as a member of the Warren Commission. He then asked me in a direct manner if the FBI knew anything which would grant credence to Garrison's allegations.

MANI told Congressman Boggs that as he well knew the FBI had conducted its intestigation at the direct request of the President. I mentioned that we had no legal basis for entering the investigation

and that we had no legal basis for making inquiries at this time. I stated that, therefore, we had not sought any information from Garrison and neither did we intend to in the future. I mentioned that while we are not turning down any individual that wanted to volunteer information, we nevertheless would take such information and furnish it to the Acting Attorney General. I stated that Garrison had publicly made statements attempting in a rather crude and vulgar manner to place shame upon the FBI. I mentioned Garrison had told members of the press if he were approached by the FBI he would hand-cuff our Agents. I stated Garrison also indicated he would not cooperate with the FBI nor give us any information in the least. I stated for these reasons we have no intentions of going to Garrison.

Congressman Boggs asked me what I thought his position should be. I stated that Minority Leader of the House, Congressman Gerald Ford, answered the press inquiries by stating, "If Garrison has any information he should turn it over to the appropriate authorities." I mentioned that Congressman Ford, by taking this position, was more or less maintaining a dignified silence and not entering into any name-calling contest with an obvious pathological liar.

Congressman Boggs stated he had noted Congressman Ford's statements and he intended to do the same. He stated in the long run he would probably accomplish more by maintaining such a position.

On the anniversary of his 50 years with the Department of Justice is an occasion to pay public tribute again to J. Edgar Hoover, director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

In a day of much doubletalk and mealy-mouthing excusing the breaching of laws and moral standards, he continues to talk straight to fellow Americans.

When "nonviolent" civil rights leaders pinpoint cities where they say riots may occur, Mr. Hoover lets fly. Their irresponsible action, he says, is an open invitation to hotheads and rabble-rousers to "move into action."

When persons arise to defend filthy-speech movements, he declares that a nation "cannot live with lawlessness, unbridled vulgarity, obscenity, blasphemy, perversion and public desecration of every sacred and just symbol."

When a public grows complacent about communism, he reminds again that the party has a "unified, hard-hitting, well-organized conspiracy to promote class revolution in the United States."

#### DETAILS:

Today, Congressman Boggs telephoned Mr. DeLoach's Office to request that the Director furnish the Congressman a letter in praise of his work in the House of Representatives. Boggs noted that the Director has done this for him previously and, without saying, left the clear impression that he intended to use the letter from Mr. Hoover in his present campaign for re-election.

We have enjoyed very cordial relations with Congressman Boggs over the years. He was a member of the Warren Commission and more recently was selected to serve on the President's Commission on the Causes and Prevention of Violence. He presently serves in the House as the Democratic Whip. Boggs has consistently expressed himself as an admirer of the Director and a staunch FBI supporter.

In February, 1962, following a request by Boggs who had been criticized in a local newspaper for diluting the extent of the communist menace, the Director sent him a letter which restated the dangers of the communist movement without specifically praising Boggs for his support. While it is not known whether or not Boggs used this letter to aid his reelection campaign, he did subsequently quote the Director out of context from another letter which, by innuendo, indicated Mr. Hoover's approval of the Congressman's candidacy. Such an endorsement, of course, was never given to Boggs by the Director, even though on a number of subsequent occasions Boggs has requested other statement of congratulations from Mr. Hoover which have been tactfully declined.

Although Boggs has many times displayed himself as a good friend of the Bureau, he is not a verse to using the Director for personal and political gain. In the climate of this election campaign, it would appear prudent for the Director not to give Congressment Boggs any letter which could be construed in any way as a political endorsement.

## RECOMMENDATION:

That Mr. DeLoach tactfully inform the Congressman it will not be possible for the Director to furnish him a letter along the lines he delires.

of Boggs.

Recently, on 10/22/68, Congressman Boggs, a perennially strong supporter of the Bureau with whom we have basically had very cordial relations, requested the Director furnish him a commendatory letter. Since there was an implication that this letter would be used politically, this was not done.

Boggs has in the past made similar requests and has shown a readiness to use the Director's name for political advantage in his campaigning. In 1962 Boggs used the same aforementioned quotation to further his campaign. The statement itself, which was taken out of context from a letter sent by the Director to Congressman Boggs regarding the Bureau's ability to investigate the communist movement, read in full: "My associates and I are particularly grateful to you and your colleagues who have actively supported the work of the FBI in the field of internal security over the years."





# Rep. Albert Nominated As Speaker

House Democrats elected Rep. Hale Boggs (La.) as their majority leader vesterday in an easy second-ballot victory over Rep. Morris K. Udall (Ariz.).

Boggs won 140 votes to 88 for Udall and 17 for Rep. B. F. Sisk (Calif.), who was the only one of three trailing candidates to stay in the race after the first ballot. With 245 votes east. Boges needed 123 to win.

Boggs led on the first ballot with 95 votes to 63 for Udall, 31 for Sisk, 28 for Rep. Wayne L. Hays (Ohio), and 25 for Rep. James G. O'Hara (Mich.). To win, a candidate needed a majority of all votes cast. Hays then dropped out and endorsed Boggs. O'Hara also got out of the race but endarsed no one.

Earlier, the caucus nominated Rep. Carl Albert (Okla.) for Speaker by a vote of 220 to 20 over Rep. John Conyers Jr. (Mich.). Convers said he ran in protest of Albert's failure to promise support for a chal-? lenge against the Mississippi delegation. Convers led a fight to strip seniority from the five Mississippians because they had refused to run under the banner of the integrated state party organization recognized by the 1963 Demogratic

After electing Boggs, the caucus rejected, 111 to 55, Conyers' motion that the five be dropped to the bottom of the committees on which they serve. Had Convers won, the chairman of the powerful House Rules Committee, Rep. William M. Colmer, would have been deposed and his position would have gone to a northern liberal, Rep. Ray Madden (Ind.).

In a surprise contest, Rep. Olin Teague (Tex.) defeated the incumbent caucus chairman, Rep. Dan Rostenkowski (Ill.) for re-election, 151 to 92. The Texas delegation had decided to put up Teague's name only Monday. Teague said he wasn't eager to run and had voted for Rostenkowski. Udali said he thought Teague won Rostenkowski had because served the traditional limit of two terms and because Teague, chairman of the Veterans Committee, is one of the most popular men in the House.

Put off until a second caucus today were issues of party reform and of whether the party whip, third man in the leadership, should be elected or continue to be appointed by the majority leader and the Speaker.

But Boggs was involved in the first fight for majority leader in 30 years, and a lot; of people thought six months ago that he couldn't make it.

Boggs, 56, has served in the House for 26 years and has been whip for nine years. He was platform committee chairman at the 1968 Democratic convention, served on the Warren Commission that investigated the death of President Kennedy and has performed other major assignments on the nationallevel.

But it appeared on the surface that Boggs was too liberal for the South, too Southern for the North and could not attract support from the growing group of young liberals who wanted to give the party in the House a fresh new

face.

Most of the young members who feel Congress isn't sufficiently responsive to the needs of the times were for Uda'll or O'Hara. But Boggs ran strong in both North and South, and his victory suggests that the Democratic mafority in the House is not yet ready for much real change in the way it conducts its busi-

The majority that voted for Boggs will probably oppose any drastic change today in seniority or other traditions. but may approve a caucus committee recommendation to spread more of the power among younger members by rationing subcommittee chairmanships at one per member.

Udall said after the balloting that Boggs had proven himself a "national Democrat" by winning support in all sections of the country. Members said no bitterness was expressed in the closed caucus. Udall and Sisk moved to make the vote unanimous for Boggs after he had won.

As majority leader, Boggs will get a pay increase from \$42,500 to \$49,500, plus a \$3,000 expense allowance. He also will be given a chauffeured limousine and a larger stair.

I thought you would be interested in the following developments in connection with recent unfounded public statements made by Congressman Hale Boggs charging the FBI tapped telephones of Senators and Congressmen and had Senators and Congressmen under surveillance.

Mr. Stephen Sachs, former U. S. Attorney, Daltimore, Maryland, reported to our Baltimore office en April 7, 1971, he had received a telephone call from a "Washington Post" reporter on April 7, 1971, inquiring whether any recordings were made during the investigation of Congressman John Dowdy. Mr. Sachs, who has been retained by the Covernment as a special prosecutor to handle the trial of Congressman Dowdy set to begin May 3, 1971, refused to make any comment since this is a pending case. The "Washington Post" reporter also inquired of Mr. Sachs whether there was any bugging in connection with the recent Baltimore investigation involving Congressman Boggs. Mr. Sachs states he told the reporter there was none.

Mr. Sachs stated that he was requesting U. S. District Judge Thomsen, Baltimore, to release testimony relative to the recording of conversations between Nathan Cohen and Congressman Dowdy to clear the air, explaining this was done in conjunction with a court order. Mr. Sachs believes Congressman Boggs is a close friend of Congressman Dowdy and may be aware of these recordings. Mr. Sachs was of the opinion that Congressman Boggs may make use of this data in some manner within the next few days to solidify his recent public disclosures.



Deputy Attorney General Richard Kleindienst returned my earlier call to him. I told him I wanted to let him, know of some of the developments. I said we never got a call from Congressman Hale-Boggs and I told SAC Robert G. Kunkel, Washington, D.C., to wait but make no further move on it. I said I think Congress adjourns today although I do not know for what period.

I said there was one other matter as he would recall in 1969, at the request of the Criminal Division we conducted an extensive investigation as to payoffs to former Senator Daniel B. Brewster (D.-Md.) and Senator Russell B. Long (D.-La.) by Victor Frenkil of Baltimore. I said in the investigation, evidence was brought out in the grand jury that Boggs met

I said we interviewed Boggs and he disclaimed any wrongdoing regarding his action with Frenkil. The Deputy interrupted at this point and said before he came on for his part of the program, they alluded to that situation. I said I had a memorandum prepared as I had in mind that former U. S. Attorney Sachs in Baltimore recommended an indictment and the grand jury wanted an indictment and made a sealed presentment to the court, the Department would not allow the indictment or authorize the signing of the grand jury presentment. I salled SAC Robert G. Kunkel of the Washington Field Office and told him I would like to have him go up personally right away and see Congressman Hale Boggs who made the speech on the floor of the House yesterday. I said I was doing this at the suggestion of the Attorney General and the Deputy Attorney General and it was my idea also that it ought to be done and for him to identify himself to whoever receives him and tell them he would like to see the Congressman in order to make some inquiries of him and then when he sees him, tell him who he is and that he has been sent up by me upon the instructions of the Attorney General to request him to furnish any information which he has relative to the tapping of his telephones by FBI Agents and a surveillance by FBI Agents; that both of those things are contrary to orders of the Bureau and this has been so for years but he says he has the proof in a statement he made this morning and we would like him to let us have whatever information he has so we can make appropriate investigation. I told Mr. Kunkel to lay it on the line. Mr. Kunkel said he would do so and I asked him to let me know as soon as he gets back to his office and Mr. Kunkel said he would.

I called SAC Kunkel again and told him I thought he better take some experienced man with him so he would have a witness as to what he said and what the Congressman said. Mr. Kunkel said he would do that. I said otherwise Boggs may captribute statements to him which he did not make and to take a good seasone man. Mr. Kunkel said he would.

Congressman Dante B. Fascell (D-Fla.) called Inspector Bowers this morning and advised he wants Mr. Hoover to know that he has his complete support in the current controversy generated by the irresponsible charges made by Congressman Boggs. Fascell stated that he had received a call late yesterday (4-7-71) from the Associate Press representative who covers the House of Representatives asking if he intended to convene his subcommittee to investigate the FBI. Fascell stated the reporter thought that he is still Chairman of the Subcommittee on Legal and Monetary Affairs of the Committee on Government Operations which has oversight responsibilities for the Department of Justice. Fascell, however, gave up this Chairmanship this year to retain the Chairmanship of another subcommittee and Congressman John S. Monagan (D-Conn.) now heads the Subcommittee on Legal and Monetary Affairs.

Fascell stated he told the reporter that he certainly saw no reason for any investigation by this Subcommittee or any other Committee and that as Ranking Member of the Subcommittee on Legal and Monetary Affairs he would not be in favor of any investigation of the FBI by this Subcommittee. He stated the reporter then asked if he did not feel the charges by Congressman Boggs concerning wire tapping should be looked into. Fascell stated he told the reporter that Boggs had offered no proof and apparently has no proof and that his statement certainly did not warrant any Congressional inquiry.

Congressman Fascell stated that he considered Boggs' comments about the FBI and Mr. Hoover indefensible and stated that as a Democrat he does not like at all one of the leaders of his party popping off 'like an idiot.' Congressman Fascell stated that even if Boggs had good justification for the charges he made, this did not excuse the irresponsible fashion in which he made these charges.

Congressman Fascell also commented that he feels the statemental yesterday by Deputy Attorney General Kleindienst calling for a Congressional investigation of the FBI is a mistake since he feels this puts the FBI squarely in

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# MEMORANDUM FOR MR. TOLSON

While talking to the Attorney General at Key Biscayne, Florida, when I returned his call on another matter, I asked him if he had seen the latest ticker about what Congressman Hale Boggs had to say today. He indicated he had not, so I proceeded to read it to him as follows:

"House Democratic leader Hale Boggs today asked Attorney General Mitchell to dismiss FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover on grounds that the agency is using the 'tactics of the Soviet Union and Hitler's Gestapo.'

"In a short speech, Boggs became the first member of the House Democratic leadership to call for the retirement of the 76-year-old law enforcement officer.

"Boggs said that when the FBI taps telephones of the Rouse and Senate and infiltrates college campuses, and when 'the FBI adopts the tactics of the Soviet Union and Hitler's Gestapo, it's time for the Director no longer to be the Director.'

"The Democratic leader did not elaborate on the wirefapping charges and could not be reached immediately for amplification.....

"Later in another House speech, House Republican Leader Gerald R. Ford said some of Boggs' allegations concerning wiretapping could be determined, but he said Boggs' remarks on Gestpo tactics 'was not a fair allegation.'

Congressman or Senator since I became Director in 1924. I also said that insofar as surveillances were concerned, when we had a man under surveillance and he entered any building of the Capitol compound, the House or Senate or Capitol, the surveillance was dropped and the Agent did not follow him into those buildings. I said that is a matter of record.

The Attorney General said he was surprised at Boggs because he did not think he would stoop to such. I said I never knew him, but I never thought he was a jackal like Senator McGovern. The Attorney General asked if I thought Ford's answer was sufficient. I said I doubt whether it is sufficient because all that Ford says is that "some of Boggs' allegations concerning wiretapping could be determined" but his "remarks on Gestapo tactics was not a fair allegation" and "demanded that Boggs present evidence to buttress his statements with facts." I said I thought a statement issued by him, the Attorney General, stating there has not been, either under his administration or my administration back to 1924, any tapping of telephones of members of the Senate or House. The Attorney General said all right, they would do that and maybe add something on top of that. I told him I thought that would be good, and I mentioned the statement the other day by, I thought, some Congressman from New Mexico and the Attorney General said Montoyo. I said a lot of people believe this, but it is absolutely untrue and the Attorney General said he was sure of that. I said I thought it might be well if there was some statement from him and the Attorney General said he would do it right away.

The Attorney General said there was one other thing -- all of the magazines and papers, as I know, are out with the hue and cry this week and to let the storm blow over and it will pass. I told him I was glad he mentioned that, as I had read Life and Newsweek, which are coming out, but I wanted him to know and the President to know, of course, if at any time my presence embarrasses the Administration, I am willing to step aside. The Attorney General said they could expect that from me, but the thing is going to subside and we will just go on and carry out the business as we should. I said that is what I intend to do but I wanted him and the President to know if at any time it is felt I may be a burden or handicap to the re-election, I would be glad to step aside. The Attorney General said I was a good American and said there was one good thing as we had a superseding indictment in the Berrigan case and the press is beginning to realize what is involved and are taking an entirely different attitude even if they don't have the courage to print it.







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Mr. Kleindienst asked if I thought there was any possibility that anyone in my organization, without my knowledge, would ever have done anything like this. I told him I did not believe so, although you can't ever tell as we used to have so few employees and now have about 20,000 today, but I seriously doubt it because it would have had to be done by the Washington Field Office and that is under pretty close contact and control here at headquarters because of its location.

Mr. Kleindienst said he wondered who should make the release. their office or the Bureau regarding the fact that I dispatched the SAC to see Boggs and he did not see him, as the Attorney General thought we ought to get it out for the morning papers. I said I would do what he wanted if he thought we ought to do it or that it should come from the public relations office of the Department and I would have contact made with the press officer and let him know what has been done and that the SAC asked for an appointment to see Boggs and the appointment has not been confirmed as yet. The Deputy Attorney General suggested he talk to to the Attorney General, and get his opinion as to whether it would be better to come from the Department. I told him I basically think it might be better because when I was at lunch today at the Mayflower, 15 or more reporters were waiting for me to come out of the lobby to get into the car and the manager told me and got me out the back way so I would like to be in the position of not talking to them. Mr. Kleindienst said he thought it would be better if the Department did it and asked if Assistant Director Bishop would be the one to get in touch with and give the details or the SAC. 

SAC Robert G. Kunkel, Washington Field Office, called. He advised he had just finished talking to Congressman Ed Edmondson (D. -Okla dand, in summary, he would like this information to be conveyed to me:

On the floor of the House at noon today at least three Congressmen challenged Congressman Hale Boggs when he came in under the one-minute rule and Boggs could not take it any more and left the floor and has not been back. Edmondson says at least 95% of the House support me with their entire support; he says the leadership is highly concerned and if Boggs does not straighten up, he may lose his leadership; and one of the things about which the leadership is concerned is the fact that within the last three weeks there have been three altercations in which Boggs has been involved: One in Louisiana involving one was Dan Flood's affair for the Governor of Pennsylvania; and the other was the Gridiron Dinner, which was highly publicized. Rooney, Albert, and Mahon are upset and he, Edmondson talked to (phonetic), and he indicates Boggs hasn't any information at all. Furthermore, Boggs has been seen in consultation with the Chief Physician of the House, a Naval 🗄 Admiral. Edmondson suggests one thing and that is maybe a telephone call by me to the leadership of (Carl) Albert and (Gerald) Ford and (Mike) Mansield and (Hugh) Scott to give them my personal assurances that this has not happened  $_{ au}$  in the past as this would be of tremendous assistance to the House and the  $\dot{z}$ leadership may on its own take action in regard to Boggs.

I told Mr. Kunkel that I testified to that before the House Appropriations Committee and that testimony is confidential until it is printed and it will not be out until sometime the latter part of May and when we asked Congressman John Rooney to make some statement on the floor in regard to the Boggs' thing, his reluctance was due to the fact that it would be considered a leak of confidential astimony before it is published. I said when I was before the Appropriations Committee I testified that since I have been Director, since 1924, there had sever been a wiretap or microphone placed on any member of Congress or the Capitol proper and in addition, even a surveillance would be dropped upon an individual going into the Capitol compound so it would not be traced to a Congressman or Senator, but the testimony will not be printed until May.



#### MEMORANDUM FOR MR. TOLSON MR. BISHOP

Senator Rugh Scott returned my earlier call to him and I told him I was sorry to bother him but I did want to talk to him personally and give him the assurance as Republican leader that there has never been a wiretap on the office of any Congressman or Senator or the Capitol building proper since I became Director in 1924; that I have said a number of time publicly and I have so testified before Congressional Committees to this fact to the statement by Congressman Halo Boggs vesterday on the floor in absolutely untrue and he added also this morning on television that the FEI had him under surveillance. I said we have never had any Senator or Congressman under surveillance at any time since I have been Director and I wanted to give that assurance to him, Scott. I said I, of course, want to talk to Senator Mike Mansfield, Speaker Carl Albert of the House and Congressman Gerald Ford so the four of them will have the assurance definitely from me in case any debate comes up.

Senator Scott said that is great and asked if I had any objection to his making a statement that he has had this assurance and that he has confidence in me. I told him I did not and he has been one of our best friends. I continued that years ago we had one man. surveillance but if and when he went to the Capitol to see a Senator or a Congressman, we dropped the surveillance at the door and never went inside even though that meant we lost the man and would have to pick him up some other time, but we have never followed a man into the House or Senate Office Buildings or the Capitol to find out where he was going so we have been leaning over backwards on our part to not infringe upon the privacy of the members of the Senate or House and he, Scott, is free to make a statement as coming directly from me. Mr. Scott said he was glad to do it and he will nd an occasion to do it and thanked me for calling.

## MEMORANDUM FOR MR. TOLSON MR. EISHOP

Congressman H. R. Gross (R.-Iowa) called. He said he was just calling to urge me to sit tight and to tell me I have a lot of friends over on the Hill. I told him I appreciated this greatly; that I have known all along that he has been a strong friend on the Hill and I appreciated his calling and stating what he did. Congressman Gross said this fellow (Congressman Hale) boggs is losing friends every day and this includes the Democratic side, who are people he would have to depend on for support and if he does not change his ways of doing things, he is going to be confronted with a Democratic caucus pretty soon.

I said I think he is a very sick man. I told the Congressman confidentially that Boggs was invited to attend a testimonial dinner for Congressman Bob Sikes at Panama City, Florida; that I was invited but could not get away and declined, but Boggs was listed as the speaker for the occasion and I was told by my representative there that Boggs was so drunk the people who arranged the dinner would not allow him to speak and the Cheriff of the County was in Panama City and threatened to arrest him for the disturbance he created. I said that was Saturday evening and I think Boggs came back and probably had a heavy hangover which caused him to make the statements he did on the floor of the House.

I continued that I have said many times and I have so testified before committees on the Hill that there have never been any wiretaps or electronic devices at any time installed on any Congressman or Senator. I said that, as a matter of fact, if we have a person under surveillance, and I remembered many years ago a fellow named continued often went to the Hill to see some Senators, he knew and our instructions were and are the same today that if the are following a man, and he goes to the Capitol compound and enters a building, we do not follow him but drop the surveillance and take our chances of picking him up at another time and we have leaned over backwards to observe the privacy of members of Congress and that is well known, but, of course, the press, and the Congressman knows, does not give any emphasis

to that as they would to other things. Congressman Gross said Attorney General John Mitchell is taking profty good care of me and I agreed and said he has made two fine statements. I said I have refused all interviews with the press because I do not intend to say anything about Boggs, although I could say a lot of things about what I do not like about him, but I am not willing to get into a cat and dog fight with him.

The Congressman said that was the purpose of his call -- to urge me to sit tight; that there are some members of the House who have not said anything but they are waiting for the right opportunity. I said I hope the opportunity comes soon. The Congressman said he did, too, but for me not to worry about my friends over on the Hill. I told him I would follow his advice. Congressman Gross said they were waiting for a good place and in the meantime, to let him, Boggs, collect his information because he is going to have to produce it or they are going to ask him for it. I said he should put up or shut up.

I told the Congressman that at the suggestion of the Attorney General, I sent a representative of my Washington Field Office to Boggs' office to ask for the information because if it is so, it is a direct violation of the law, and said Eoggs was holding a press conference and then he had to go to the floor of the House and she would call my representative later in the afternoon to make an appointment, but such a call has never come through, so he ducked talking to our man. I said the Attorney General and I felt we ought to challenge him to see what the facts are and see if there is a violation of Federal statutes so they can be investigated and the proper action taken. I said I know he does not have any facts so far as the FBI is concerned, although I do not know what other Government agencies are doing, but we have not.

Congressman Gross said that on Thursday afternoon Congressman (Durwood G.) Hall (R.) of Missouri and he tied into Boggs and he was as drunk as a skunk and that was in the afternoon and they tied into him and then he, Boggs almost got into a fist fight with Hall over Flood's (Congressman Daniel J. 





# Boggs Will Rever Wiretap Evidence

WASHINGTON - (AP) Rep. Hale Boggs (D., La.) said Tuesday he will in the near future "make proper use" of detailed information supporting his demand that FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover resign or be fired.

In a statement elaborating on his House speech Monday accusing the FBI of wiretapping the telephones of members of Congress, Boggs said "numerous members of Congress have reported to me their firm conviction that their telephone conversations and activities are the subject of surveillance by the FBI."

He said a recent poli of public figures disclosed that fully one-quarter reported they have reason to suspect their phones were tapped.

Boggs read his prepared statement over radio and television and declined to elaborate on the prepared text.

The following is submitted in connection with recent unfounded public statements by Congressman Hale Boggs (D -Louisiana) charging the FBI tapped telephones of senators and congressmen and had under surveillance senators and congressmen.

Following extensive investigation at the request of the Attorney General, Congressman John Dowdy and two others were indicted by a Baltimore Federal grand jury 3/31/70. Indictment charges Dowdy with conspiracy to obstruct justice and to commit bribery, interstate transportation in aid of racketeering, aiding and abetting and perjury as the result of an alleged \$25,000 payment to Dowdy 9/22/65, at the Atlanta, Georgia, airport in return for Dowdy's efforts to help Nathan Cohen (Baltimore attorney and businessman) from being prosecuted in a mail fraud case. Trial of Dowdy is scheduled to begin 5/3/71 in Baltimore Federal Court.

By teletype 4/7/71 (copy attached), our Baltimore Office advised Mr. Stephen Sachs (former U. S. Attorney retained by the Government as a special prosecutor to handle the trial of Dowdy) received a call 4/7/71 from a "Washington during the Dowdy investigation. Sachs refused to make any comment as this is pending trial. Eachs states he is requesting U. S. District Judge Thomsen, Baltimore, to to clear the air explaining this was done in conjunction with court orders.

Sachs believes Dowdy is a close friend of Boggs and that Boggs may be aware of these recordings. Sachs also feels Boggs may use this data in some manner within the next few days to solidify his recent public disclosures. "The Washington Post" reporter also inquired of Sachs whether there was any bugging in connection with recent Baltimore investigation involving Congressman Boggs. Sachs stated he told this reporter there was none.

ACTION: Attached is a letter to the Attorney General in the event it is felt desirable to advise him of the foregoing information. A copy of the letter is designated for The Deputy Attorney General in view of his recent public statements concerning Boggs' allegations.



Anderson mentioned Congressman Gerald Ford (R-Illinois) [7] in connection with the investigation of lobbyist Fred Black and vidSSnifed by 2023 in this connection he said that Black made a telephonic breakfast date with Representative Carl Albert (D-Oklahoma) and ex-Senator Mike Monroney. Anderson claimed also that electronic experts checking Senate Office corridors picked up strong indications that the offices of ex-Senators Ralph Yarborough (D-Texas) and Maurine Neuberger (D-Oregon) were bugged, although a search failed to uncover any listening devices. 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Anderson's insinuation that the Director was not entirely candid in denying existence of surveillances on Congressmen is typical of the sensationalist reporting for which Anderson is so well known. Anderson has made use of semantics in his article in a deceiving way.

There are numerous instances where Congressmen have had conversations monitored when they happened to make telephone calls to individuals or establishments covered by electronic surveillances which had approval of the Attorney General. But this is not what Anderson intimates.

### REPRESENTATIVE HALE BOGGS



During our bribery investigation of former Senator Daniel B. Brewster (D-Maryland) and collateral grand jury testimony, evidence was developed that Congressman Hale Boggs (D-Louisiana) allegedly used his influence to have the architect of the Capitol approve payment of claims totaling over five million dollars to Victor Frenkil, growing out of Frenkil's construction of a Government parking garage adjacent to the new House office building. We also learned that in 1966, Frenkil remodeled Congressman's Boggs' suburban Maryland residence at a cost of \$45,082.95, but only billed Boggs \$21,000, for the job. The investigation of Brewster and inquiries regarding Boggs were at the specific request of the Attorney General. During this investigation, we did not have Boggs under surveillance nor did we ever tap his telephones. Former U.S. Attorney Sachs had recommended Boggs et al be indicted; however, Sachs stated this was not approved by the Attorney General.

Anderson contends that Boggs was one of several legislators whose names were picked up on wiretaps during the FBI's investigation of fixer Nathan Voloshen and Ex-House of Representative Aide Martin Sweig. It is pointed out that no wiretaps or any other electronic surveillance devices were utilized in the Voloshen-Sweig investigation.

## EX-REPRESENTATIVE VITO MARCANTONIO

Case file on Marcantonio contains no information that he was ever subjected to electronic or physical surveillance despite his blatant communist sympathies. While Marcantonio was never subjected to electronic surveillance, he was monitored on other electronic surveillances on several occasions in the 30's and 40's

Marcantonio was also monitored on a similar coverage on

Electronic surveillances of Communist Party, USA (CPUSA) establishments revealed scheduled meetings in certain apartments or other locations. This resulted in FBI Agents occasionally observing Marcantonio entering these meetings during the course of their coverage to determine attendance of known or suspected CP members. Marcantonio was never surveilled either to or from any CP meetings covered by FBI Agents.

Our electronic surveillance indices reveal that Marcantonio's name was mentioned during coverage in Chicago in 1959 of a criminal case - Marcantonio had died, however, 5 years earlier in 1954.


"I heard your accusations lefelled against J. Edgar Hoover, and your characterization of the United States as a "Police State." It is evident that your knowledge of "police states" is limited to the words themselves, or you would never have so characterized this country.

You asked "if a member of the House of Representatives of the United States is to be subjected to secret surveillance, what can the 'ordinary citizen' expect? Mr. Boggs, the ordinary citizen elected you, another ordinary citizen, to the position that you now hold. By so doing you were not elevated to some fanciful lofty peak where you are above the ordinary citizen, and are set apart as dome demi-god who is not to approached, or classed with the ordinary citizenry. You may perhaps be right that the FBI has collected information about you. There is no reason to suppose that it hasn't. There are literally hundreds of entities—official, semi-official, and otherwise — that collect information on people in this country and abroad. And if such a state of affairs exists, you, the legislators, must bear a certain amount of responsibility for it. You have abrogated your responsibilities to the Presidency ever since the days of Franklyn Delano Roosevelt, until in some areas you are hardly noticed. If you do not believe such to be the case, do your home work on the history of the United States over the past forty years."

Thought maybe you might be interested in one man's opinion. Lots of people did not like the records I was involved it - personnel work. Lots of people don't seem to like FBI operations. Too bad. Somebody better wake up. The first amendment to the Constitution doesn't include the liberty to blow this country apart, and without your work, it might just well go sky high.



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# Everyone but Boggs denies knowledge of FBI phone tapping

Globe-Democrat Washington-Post News Service

WASHINGTON. — The White House, the Justice Department and the Federal Bureau of Investigation Tuesday reiterated their categorical statements that congressmen's telephones have never been tapped by the FBI.

House majority leader Hale Boggs of Louisian a said he would prove his Monday accu-

sation against the FBI "in the near future." Other members of congress said they shared Boggs' suspicions, but none came forward Tuesday with evidence to support the charge.

FB1 Director J. Edgar Hoover, target of Boggs' criticism, made no direct comment on the sudden upsurge in demands for his resignation. But the 76-

year-old Hoover discussed the situation with Senate minority leader Hugh Scott of Pennsylvania and Scott's office quoted Hoover as saying:

"I WANT to make a positive assertion that there has never been a wiretap of a Senator's phone or the phone of a member of Congress since I became director in 1924, nor has any member of the Congress or the Senate been under surveillance by the FBI."

Hoover's assertion was backed by Attorney General John N. Mitchell, who called on Boggs for an "immediate apology... and a complete retraction of his charges."

White House Press Secretary Ronald Ziegler said Mitchell's statement "reflects the administration on that point," adding that President Nixon "of course does not favor tapping of congressmen's phones."

In the face of the solid administration denials, Boggs — who triggered the uproar Monday with a one-minute speech demanding Hoover's resignation for using "the tactics of the Soviet Union and Hitler's Gestapo" — called a press conference and affirmed "categorically that it is true" that the FBI had been tapping congressional phones.

Boggs said that "numerous members of Congress" had told him privately of "their firm conviction that their telephone conversations and activities are the subject of surveillance by the FBI."

None of the other leaders of congress stepped forward to support Boggs' contentions, and those members who said they shared his belief provided skimpy details of the incidents in which they were involved.

House Speaker Carl Albert said he did not "know anything about the facts" of the case, but said that if the question concerned a tap on one of his phones, "I doubt it" is happening.

In the Senate, Scott and majority leader Mike Mansfield of Montana both said they had no reason to think phones were being tapped.

"No senator has ever come to me," Mansfield said. "As far as I'm concerned, it hasn't happened."

senate Sergeant-at-Arms Robert G. Dunphy said he has clecked phone lines once or tylice a month, at the request of some senator, and had never found a tap on a senator's line.

Hoover Under Siege

Edgar Hoover is one of those misunderstood Americans who frequently serve as lightning rods for the unwarranted criticisms of this nation's Cassandras.



WASHINGTON (Reuters) - House Democratic Leader Hale Boggs of Louisiana said Tuesday, that he had detailed information to substantiate his allegations that the FBI has been tapping the telephones of some members of Congress.

Amplifying his Monday attack on FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover, Boggs said he would make available his information in the near future.

Attorney General John N. Mitchell hotly denied Boggs' charges.

But Boggs told reporters: "I categorically say it is true.

In his one-minute House speech Monday, Boggs said the FBI was adopting "the tactics of the Soviet Union and Hitler's Gestapo."

Boggs issued a formal statement Tuesday saying "in private conversations and communications, numerous members of Congress have reported to me their firm conviction that their telephone conversations and activities are the subject of surveillance by the FBI, much as was done last fall by the military intelligence agencies.

"Several members have made available to me detailed information confirming my own ex-perience which substantiated these allegations, and it is my intention to make proper use of it in the near future," Boggs 1 said.

He told reporters he had a group of lawyers working on the olissue and expected to have another statement in the near future.

Boggs, the first congressional leader to criticize Hoover, 76, said. and request his resignation, He told reporters he decided to said, "There is no justification speak out against Hoover be for an old man who has made as many mistakes as Mr. Hoover. to viorate the Constitution."

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

In accordance with Mr. Hoover's approval Bishop called on Republican Minority Gerald Ford and Speaker of the House Carl Albert today.

Mr. Ford said he was shocked and dumbfounded when Boggs made his charges on the Floor of the House yesterday because he knew they were without foundation and, therefore, he said on the Floor that Boggs should not make such scandalous statements unless he presented proof to support them. He advised that he thought the allegations of Boggs have now become a matter of "politics" which transcend a mere dispute between Boggs and the FBI. He indica that he felt that the Republicans in Congress would force Boggs to "put up or shut up."

Speaker Albert said that he was not aware in advance that Boggs was going to make the allegations he did, and was not aware that he was going to attack Mr. Hoover and the FBI. He said that Boggs has not to this moment furnished him with any facts to support the allegations he has made. He advised that at a news conference this morning he was asked that if he felt his own telephone was tapped and he advised the newsman that he did not.

Bishop has contacted a number of our firiends in Congress concerning this matter and has been advised that a considerable number of our friends are going to take the Floor of the House this afternoon and denounce Boggs for his "scandalous" attack as well as demand that "he put up some facts to support his charges or shut up."

Deputy Attorney General Richard G. Kleindienst returned my earlier call to him and advised that he had just talked to the Attorney General regarding Senator Edmund Muskie's statement and the Attorney Ceneral wanted him to determine just what the facts are with respect to what Muskie alleged and the best way to respond to it.

I said the facts are that the people in that audience and on the platform were individuals such as the poople in the most militant agitators in the country, and a member of the Communist Party; and Mr. Kleindienst interjected the name of the country. I said my feeling is that we should not try to answer Muslie as I thought Ronald Ziegler at the White House did a good job yesterday when he made the statements he did and which have been carried extensively because all Muskie is after is to get publicity and build up his Presidential image. Mr. Kleindienst said that yesterday when this information came down to his desk, he arrived at the conclusion it would be best not to make any comment, but when he talked to the Attorney General, he wanted to know why we did not make any comment and he feels strongly some reply or comment should be made. CONGRESSMAN HALE BOGGS (D. - LOUISIANA)

As you are aware, this individual made some slanderous statements against Mr. Hoover and the FBI on the floor of the House yesterday. He said that the FBI is tapping the telephone of members of the House and Senate, that we are infiltrating college campuses and compared the FBI's tactics to those of the Soviet Union and Hitler's Gestapo.

This morning on CBS news at 8 a.m., Boggs was quoted as stating that he would lay out the details of his charges "in a day or so." He then added a new charge to the effect that the FBI presently has him under surveillance. When Neil Strawser, the CBS newsman, asked him why the FBI would do such a thing. Boggs replied that they were doing it because it is a Gestapo. He then said that if the FBI would do this to the Majority Leader of the House of Representatives, they would do it to anybody in the country.

These charges, of course, are totally false. We are not investigating Boggs and we do not have him under surveillance. In addition, we have never tapped the telephones of any members of the House or Senate. We have received information to the affect that Boggs was drunk when he made his statements on the floor of the House yesterday. It would appear that he could be speaking out of complete "paranoia" when he now claims that the FBI is presently surveilling Trying to talk to him to get the details of his charges possibly would only result in him making some new wilder charges against the FBI. It is felt, however, that some action must be taken about these hallucinations that Boggs is reporting on. Since the Attorney General has issued such a strong denial of Boggs' charges and stated that "Mr. Boggs has reached a new low in political dialogue," it would appear that this is now getting into a situation of the Democrats against the Republicans. Therefore, it is felt that the Democrats should be as interested in getting at the truth of this matter as the Republicans and insure that Boggs retracts his vicious statements if he cannot support them with facts. Accordingly, it is suggested that Bishop call on Carl Albert, the



## BACKGROUND:

An anonymous correspondent has sent the Director a clipping from the 10/17/66 issue of "The Councilor" of Shreveport, Louisiana. This clipping contains an alleged photograph of Congressman Boggs which, in its caption, and in the accompanying article, is described as having been taken 4/21/36 on the Tulane University campus "... where Boggs was a leader of campus Reds" and purportedly shows Boggs giving a clenched fist (communist) salute. The article goes on to claim that "Boggs pleas for communism" may be found in the dockets of the Supreme Court at New Orleans, Louisiana, and in back issues of the "Tulane Hullabaloo" a campus newspaper.

In referring to the above-mentioned clipping, the Director noted: "See if we have any authentication of the attached."

## INFORMATION IN BUFILES:

Bufiles contain no information indicating that "Boggs was a leader of campus Reds" while attending Tulane University. We have conducted no investigation of Boggs based on communist allegations. However, it has been reported that Boggs, while a university student, was a member of the Tulane Students Peace Committee, which was affiliated with the United Students Peace Committee, which was cited as a communist "front" by the former House Committee on Un-American Activities EC 1894

#### **OBSERVATIONS:**

From its available contents, "The Councilor" appears to be typical of ultra-right wing publications. In view of this, and the protracted controversy currently involving the Bureau generated from charges by Boggs of FBI "snooping," it is not recommended that any attempts be made to corroborate "The Councilor's" allegations through independent public source material.



Writings under the name Hale Boggs appeared in the Tulane Hullabaloo and called for Communist takeover of economy. Doubters may see these Boggs pleas for communism in Supreme Court docket No. 40597, New Orleans, and in back issues of the Hullabaloo.

The Times-Picayune on Jan, 15, 1937 named him as a charter member of the American Student Union, an identified part of the Communist network. Thirty years later, there is no evidence that Hale Bogge is a member of the loud, boasting communist organizations and certainly he isn't a member of the Party Iteelf. He is a member of some of the more sophisticated Red outfits such as the Interparlismentary Union.

More important: He still takes instructions from the same people who launched his career in politics. Up for re-election, Boggs will be more difficult to uproot than leftist Jimmy Morrison (defeated recently) because of the power of the Stern-Lehman and Newhouse interests in TV and newspapers of the area.

The first 25 minutes of the 30-minute program consisted of questions concerning Boggs' recent charges that the FBI has been wiretapping and surveilling members of Congress. The last 5 minutes dealt with the Vietnam war. Boggs, in his usual fashion, answered questions with a combination of double talk, vague generalities and unsupported allegations.

Schumacher opened the questioning by referring to Attorney General John Mitchell's statement that Boggs should either "produce some iota of proof that Congress has had its wires tapped by the FBI or should apologize to Mr. Hoover." Shumacher asked if Boggs proposed to follow either of those two courses. Boggs replied, 'Mr. Mitchell, I'm certain, has not read my remarks made in the House of Representatives last week, nor the remarks made by Senator Muskie. Mr. Mitchell is obsessed with tapping wires." Boggs never answered the question posed to him by Shumacher.

Schumacher then asked whether Boggs would come up with any further proof, any further statements, or any further documents on the question of wiretapping in the House. Boggs said that he stands on the statement that he made on the House floor last Thursday. Herman said that during the course of Boggs' hour-long speech on the floor, he made the suggestion very strongly that Congress, over the years, has allowed the proliferation of surveillance in investigation to get out of the control of the oversight of Congress. He said that in rebuttal (Lawrence) Hogan of Maryland said that was ridiculous because once a year, at least, the House Appropriations Committee rakes the

FBI's budget with a fine-toothed comb. Herman said this caused a great deal of merriment on the floor and he asked "What was funny about that?" Boggs responded that "What really happens is Mr. Hoover comes off like a feudal baron and he is greeted with great ceremony. He gives a statement which normally shows another increase of crime in the country. The Committee approves his request. There is no oversight. This has been one of the grave problems about this agency."

Herman asked if the Appropriations Committee did not hire about 28 FBI Agents to do its investigative work? "Should Mr. (George H.) Mahon fire those Agents and give them back to Mr. Hoover?" Boggs replied that there is a fundamental question of a conflict of interests here—the executive branch and the police branch are taking on the functions of the people. Boggs said Congress should release these FBI Agents and hire its own investigators.

Boggs was asked if he was alarmed by the fact that since 1943, the total investigatory responsibility for the House Appropriations Committee is conducted by three FBI Agents on leave of absence from the FBI, who return to the FBI at the end of three years. Boggs said "I didn't know that until it was revealed in the press several days ago."

Boggs was asked whatever happened to the "proof positive" that the FBI had tapped and bugged Congressional phones. Boggs answered by saying that an FBI informer went into Congressman (John) Dowdy's office with a "bug," as Boggs called it, taped to his back and recorded conversations. He said "If that's not bugging I don't know what is."

Herman asked if that was the total of the "proof positive" Boggs had referred to. Boggs responded that a whole series of Senators and Congressme have maintained that they have been tapped or bugged--Senator (Steven) Young, Senator (Ralph) Yarborough, Senator (Birch) Bayh, and Senator (Charles) Percy. Herman said that whenever we check with these people they back off, and this gives rise to Mr. Mitchell's charge you're all guilty of "tapanoia." Boggs said that it's very difficult to prove that a tap has been used, but he thinks the Dowdy case is "proof positive." "You don't need but one (example)," Boggs said.

Boggs said, "There is hardly a member of the House, at least on the Democratic side of the House, who is not fearful to use his telephone." Herman said that such fears are quite different from some kind of proof or evidence which you need to take some action to redress this situation.

Boggs charged that the FBI had seized his telephone records for a period of four years and then started telephoning people that he had phoned regularly. "Whether or not they bugged one of those phones, I don't know."

Herman noted that the major wiretapping cases which Boggs has mentioned involve some type of criminal activity, and that in fact Boggs, himself, was under investigation. He asked Boggs who should investigate members of Congress when they are involved in civil crimes?

Boggs evaded the question. He said, 'I have never contended that a member of Congress should be immune to investigation for criminal violations or alleged criminal violations, "but on the other hand the notion that a member of Congress should be pursued simply because he is a member of Congress, and attempt to manufacture a crime--that was the case in my own situation. That, I think, is totally reprehensible."

Boggs said he thinks President Nixon is thoroughly happy and pleased with Mr. Hoover. "I never anticipated he (President Nixon) would ask Mr. Hoover to retire," Boggs said. "But he will be retired in 18 months when the Democratic President takes over."

Boggs was asked if he had a nomination for Mr. Hoover's successor. He said, "No, I do not."

He was asked if he had any idea what kind of person Mr. Hoover's successor ought to be. Boggs said, "No, I haven't."



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


Dear Mr. Boggs:

#### Dear Congressman Boggs:

I was disturbed to watch the CBS program on Sunday, April 25th, 1971, in which you took to task the Federal Bureau of Investigation en toto, when, in fact, it would seem that you were directing your criticism to the Director himself.

My feeling is that if there is any question in your mind as to the compentency of the Director to continue in his job, then your criticism could be more precise against him rather than what seems to me to be a general indictment of the entire Organization.

In my dealings with the Special Agents of the Department I have always found them to be polite, conscientious and hard working. I cannot think of an instance in my 19 years of practice where they overstepped the bounds of law enforcement as your comments seemed to indicate. I have found the Special Agent to be a dedicated law enforcement officer in spite of the low salary they receive. It would seem odd that they should be faced with your general criticism when in certain instances they earn less than motormen on the New York subway system.

I again most respectfully ask that if you have an argument concerning the Director that the thrust of your argument and the proof thereunder





ubject: CONGRESSMAN <u>HALE BOGGS</u> (D - LA.) CHARGES AGAINST THE DIRECTOR

It has been determined from various sources on Capitol Hill that Congressman Boggs probably will deliver his much publicized speech to offer his "proof positive" concerning his allegations that the FBI has tapped Congressional telephones beginning around 5 p.m. on Thursday, 4/22/71. Congressman Larry Hogan (R - Md.) also has reserved one hour's time for that afternoon and had intended his time to follow that of Congressman Boggs. Boggs, however, apparentl did not officially request the time until sometime after he had publicly announced his intention to do so; hence, Hogan's request actually preceded Boggs' request and Hogan is scheduled to speak first. It is apparent Boggs is attempting to arrange his time as late as possible on Thursday which is the last day the House of Representatives will meet this week, thus attempting to avoid the critical response by other Congressmen.

As of Tuesday evening (4/20/71), various sources on the Hill report Boggs apparently had not as yet prepared a text for his speech. These sources by advised that the best information available indicates Boggs will discuss the FBI's use of a body recorder in taping conversations

the obtaining of toll call records from the telephon company on the phones in his office and the office of former Speaker McCormack. It also was reported that he may bring up an allegation that former Senator Daniel Brewster (D - Md.), who was indicted for bribery in Washington on 12/1/69, was subjected to FBI wiretapping. The charges against Brewster have been dismissed by Federal Court on the grounds of Congressional immunity; however, this is pending on appeal to the Supreme Court. The General Investigative Division has advised that no telephone tap or electronic devices of any type were used in the Brewster investigation. A report also was circulated on the Hill that Boggs may allege the FBI had induced Capitol Hill telephone operators to serve as informant concerning Congressional telephone calls (this report was recorded in the Bishop to Mohr memorandum of 4/20/71 and is being checked out by the Washingt Field Office). 58-6996

Wallace Johnson (Associate Deputy Attorney General) advised his staff is preparing information to refute the various charges Boggs is expected to raise, with the possible thought in mind that Minority Leader Gerald Ford can use this information to immediately refute Boggs' charges on the House floor.

The matter of Boggs' charges against the FBI has been discussed with a number of friendly Congressmen and we have been assured they will be present when Boggs makes his speech and will attempt to immediately challenge him. Several Congressmen have indicated that if Boggs fails to provide specific proof of actual wiretapping on the part of the FBI, they will attempt to get the floor, point out his failure to substantiate his earlier charges, and insist that he owes an apology to the Director, the FBI, and the American people.

One report also was received late on 4/20/71 alleging Boggs had approached Congressman Cornelius/Callagher (D - N.J.) to see if he would join Boggs in attacking the FBI. Gallagher's connections with members of organized crime have been publicity disclosed.


We all know you gerrymandered the Second Congressional District (New Orleans) and removed the areas you knew you would be defeated in ,so you could save your political skin, (just barely at that).



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

Recently I viewed your condemnation of the F.B.I. and Mr. J. Edgar Hoover, Director, on national television, in which you demanded the resignation of Mr. Hoover. I am not speaking from a newspaper article but rather commenting on your own words before the television cameras.







Congressman Boggs appeared on the "Today" show this morning and reiterated charges he made on the floor of Congress yesterday. He said the Justice Department had denied a small segment of the charges he made on April the 5th, but they had not denied other charges he considered much more serious, such as the infiltration of college organizations and the organizations. He said the FBI was using the tactics of the Gestapo and the Soviet Secret Police.

He claimed that in August, 1970, he had discovered that the phone at his residence was tapped but later the telephone company sent him a letter stating c that there had been no tap. He alleged that this was the telephone company policy when the tap was placed by the FBI.

Bill Munro, the Washington editor for the "Today" show, stated that Congressman Hogan had said there was no way to detect a tap once it had been removed. Boggs replied that he was no electronics expert but he was satisfied in his mind that his phone had been tapped. He then read from the Director's letter to Senator Scott in which we denied any wiretaps or surveillance of members of Congress. Boggs then mentioned that the FBI had surveilled Congressmen Libonati and Neal Gallagher. He stated the Justice Department "leaked" that the most brazen type of surveillance had been used on Congressman Dowdy and he referred to it as a case of absolute entrapment. Boggs said that former U. S. Attorney Sachs first denied this but later admitted it, explaining that it was not clear what the Justice Department meant by electronic surveillance.

Munro asked if he had any indication that it was the FBI that tapped his phone and Boggs replied 'No I don't. I'm not so much concerned about that. What I am concerned about is a pattern of what the FBI is up to." He then referred to affidavits in the cases of Senator Brewster and Nathan Voloshen in which the

Justice Department claimed that wiretaps had been used in the interest of national defense. He said the FBI had seized telephone records of Speaker of the House McCormack as well as Boggs' own telephone records for the past four years. The FBI then called some of these people and Boggs made the statement that the FBI may have bugged some of those lines.

Boggs then repeated his allegations that he was concerned about FBI telephone surveillance, infiltration of college organizations, labor unions, black organizations, business organizations and churches. He said the attack made by the FBI on liberal members of the Catholic Church was unbelievable and since the Director countenanced these acts the President and Mr. Mitchell should ask for his resignation. He claimed that every potential Democratic candidate has asked for the Director's resignation.

When asked if he thought there would be a Presidential Commission to investigate the FBI, Boggs said no, the President was satisfied with Mr. Hoover. Boggs concluded by stating that he hoped if a commission was not appointed that the Judicial Committee would make a very thorough investigation of these charges.



# BUGGS TO ASSERT A TAP WAS FOUND

Plans to Tell House Today That Phone Man Saw Evidence of Device

By ROBERT M. SMITH Special to The New York Times

WASHINGTON, April 21—
Representative Hale Boggs of Louisiana, the House majority leader, will tell his colleagues tomorrow that a telephone company investigator found a tap on the Boggs home telephone last summer.

According to sources close to Mr. Boggs, he will explain that he, his family and members of his staff became suspicious of interference on the telephone at his home in Bethesda, Md., and asked the Chesapeake & Potomac Telephone Company to investigate.

According to the sources, Mr. Boggs will tell the House that the investigator from the phone company found that there had been a tap on the phone, but that it had been removed be-

fore his inspection.

Mr. Boggs will also reportedly say that the telephone company wrote in its official report to him that there had been no tap. He will add, however, that he has learned that it is the policy of the company to deny the existence of a tap if the tap was placed by the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

The Congressinan will reportedly make an hour-long speech to support the charges he made on April 5 that the F.B.I. has tapped the telephones of Congressmen. In that brief speech on the House floor, he called for the resignation of J. Edgar Hoover, the director of the F.B.I.

As of tonight, the sources said, Mr. Boggs was trying to decide whether to include in tomorrow's speech the transcripts of tape recordings said to have been made by the F.B.I. of conversations involving other members of congress.

The sources said Mr. Boggs and the F.B.I. transcripts but had not decided whether to include them in his speech, since they involved other officials. The sources also said the conversations involved F.B.I. informants, so the bureau might have obtained the consent of one or more parties to the conversations before recording them. The Supreme Court decided recently that such "consentual" eavesdropping did not require a court order.

In his speech tomorrow, Mr. Boggs will reportedly call again for the resignation of Mr. Hoover. To one of those who worked on the speech, it importance lies not in the evidence that Mr. Boggs will adduce to support his earlier charge but in the fact that the Congressman is continuing to call for the resignation of Mr. Hoover.

Nevertheless, the focus of public attention tomorrow will clearly be on the evidence Mr. Boggs submits to his colleagues. From April 5 until now, the majority leader has been silent, promising that he would provide evidence in time.

Even the person who participated in the drafting of the speech conceded that it was unlikely to satisfy those who expected or wanted "big evidence."

At some point in the speech which will repeat a number of charges already made elsewhere against the F.B.I.—Mr. Boggs will reportedly explain how he was moved to give his first speech on the F.B.I. Sources close to him say he will attribute it to a personal experience several days before.

Mr. Boggs will say that two highly placed career officials of the Justice Department who had worked in and with the F.B.I. came to see him. He will not identify the two men to the House, but will relate that they told him the F.B.I. was being destroyed because it was not being used to fight crime but to protect the position of Mr. Hoover.

Beyond characterizing the conversation in that way, Mr. Boggs will refuse to relate specifically what the two men said, the sources said.

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The first is that the F.B.I. obtained his long distance telephone records. The bureau got records from the Chesapeake & Potomac Telephone Company, according to sources close to the Congressman, for 1966 to 1970, showing all the long-distance calls made from the Capitol Hill office of Mr. Boggs and all the long-distance telephone calls charged to his credit card. The sources said the F.B.L. had, in some cases, called the telephone numbers in the records, some of them in Louisiana, to ask about the calls.

Other sources report that the F.B.I. took those actions at the behest of the Justice Department in the course of an inlvestigation to determine whether Victor H. Frenkil, a Baltimore erivictor H. Frenkii, a Baltimore contractor, had sought to bring influence and pressure to bear to have some construction claims settled favorably. Mr. Frenkii's company, Baltimore Contractors, Inc., built the understand garage of the Bay. derground garage of the Ray-burn House Office Building.

i A grand jury in Baltimore was looking into, among several other things, construction work performed by Baltimore Contractors on the Bethesdal home of Mr. Boggs. Although Attorney General John N. Mitchell refused to allow the grand, wry to issue an indict-

ment in the case, the jury concluded that Mr. Frenkil had done the work for a lower price than was usual in order to curry favor with Mr. Boggs.

Not Aware, He Sald Mr. Boggs has since said he

was not aware that the work on his home was being done for less than the usual price. Tomorrow, the sources said,

Mr. Boggs will also mention that the F.B.I. sent an informant with a hidden tape recorder into the Capitol office of Representative John Dowdy, a Democrat of Texas, and re-cosded conversations between the two without the knowledge of Mr. Dowdy. As has been reported the F.B.I. also monitored and recorded—from the informant's end — telephone ocnversations between the informant and Mr Dowdy.

The F.B.I. took these actions in the Dowdy case with the approval of Attorney General Mitchell and with court orders signed by United States District Judge Roszel C. Thomsen. Mr. Dowdy was subsequently in-dicted on charges of perjury and accepting a \$25,000 bribe and is scheduled to go on trial May In Baltimore.

This morning, 4-22-71, the Attorney General referred SA to an article on page 1 of the 4-22-71 issue of "The New York Times" entitled 'Boggs to Assert a Tap Was Found." Copy attached. 66

In paragraph 2 of that article it is set forth that Boggs contacted the Chesapeake and Potomac Telephone Company to request an investigation as to the cause of interference on his phone. The Attorney General requested that we contact appropriate officials of the Chesapeake and Potomac Telephone Company to determine if Boggs did in actuality contact that company to request an investigation and what information was furnished Boggs by the compant. The Attorney General expressed the opinion that this may merely be talk on Boggs' part and he would like to get a verification if possible. advised him that this would be done. Accordingly, the General Investigative Division will ha the appropriate checks made by our Baltimore Office which covers the location of Boggs' residence. The Attorney General will be advised by an appropriate communication of the results of our inquiry.

### RECOMMENDATIONS:

(1) That the General Investigative Division make a determination through our Baltimore Office whether Boggs did request the Chesapeake and Potomac Telephone Company to investigate interference on his line and what information was furnished by that company to Boggs.

That the results of our inquiry be furnished the Attorney General by appropriate communication.



# McGovern's Anti-Hoover Letter Looks Suspicious

The public can get the measure of what kind of man U.S. Sen. George McGovern is when he uses an anonymous letter in his campaign to discredit FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover.

It is bad enough when McGovern joins the likes of William Kunstler, who can't seem to find anything too bad to say about the U.S., in comparing American bombing raids in Indochina with the barbaric acts of Nazi Germany during World War II. That, in itself, would indicate a certain lack of straightforwardness.

But now he resorts to the kind of tactic decried so fervently by liberals when it was used in the Eisenhower administration to flush out communists. It seems that it was terrible for the late Sen. Joe McCarthy to use vague, anonymous charges to get at subversives, but it is jim dandy for a certified liberal like McGovern to use it against the strongest symbol of law and order in this country. The fact is that it isn't proper against either.

McGovern contends the unsigned letter offers proof that a congressional investigation of Hoover's methods is needed. He says 10 agents are responsible for the letter. In it, he says they claim Hoover has had the FBI

conviction statistics padded and has concentrated on chalking up arrests among minority group members for crimes too insignificant to attract the attention of local police departments because it is easier to get convictions among them.

Anyone familiar with the kind of crime statistics reported by the FBI must wonder what those "insignificant" crimes are. The reports we see list only major crimes. They don't go into anything that doesn't attract the attention of local police departments or concern violations of federal laws, which hardly could be called insignificant.

The wording of McGovern's letter suggests it might be trumped up evidence designed to promote a congressional investigation which the Senator hopes would turn up some real evidence on which he and his ilk could base further smears of Hoover and the great organization he heads.

What McGovern is doing is reprehensible. If he has any real evidence, let him produce it. If not, he should be censured for attacks on the good name of a great American figure based on questionable, if not false, representations.

# Boggs Fails to Present A Case Against Hoover

Hale Boggs to present any evidence that the FBI tapped his telephone — or any other congressman's — his attacks against FBI Director Hoover must be termed irresponsible.

Boggs had his opportunity on the House floor to substantiate his charges. All he could come up with were a number of old criticisms and charges against the FBI which also lack evidence of truth.

His demand for the renoval of Hoover is without sufficient supportive substance. Indeed, he owes Hoover and the FBI an apology because much of what they have done in the past has been at the direction of — and with the knowledge of — the Congress.

It is crass irresponsibility for any congressman to say, as Boggs has, that Hoover has turned the FBI into a secret police "which threatens and places in jeopardy those rights and those liberties essential to the survival of our system."

Boggs is equally irresponsible in claiming that nobody checks on the FBI

and that Hower is accountable to no one. Actually, Hoover's investigative agency works under the Attorney General. The FBI director is accountable to him and to the President. He is accountable to Congress each year in justifying budget requests. In truth, both Congress and the President are in a position to exert controls.

What Boggs and other congressmen are trying to do is create a political issue where there is none. It is rather disgusting to see an agency and its chief maligned and defamed without just cause.

Boggs and the others like him in Congress ought to be ashamed of their tactics. It is one thing to attack an agency when there is evidence it has done wrong, and quite another to condemn an agency for doing what it is supposed to do and to make charges which cannot be substantiated.

The situation says a lot of unpleasant things about the anti-Hoover, anti-FBI crowd.

# Why Laos Fight Brings Denunciation From Russia

The Laos campaign must be hurting the communists a great deal. At least we suspect that is the reason for Soviet Russia's heated denunciation of "the U.S. invasion."

Characteristically, the Kremlin spokesmen ignore the presence of North Vietnamese troops in Laos, which is why the campaign was started in the first place, and talk about "the new escalation of the American aggression..."

In the communist view, Hanoi's troops have a right to use Laos as they please, but Saigon's troops have no right whatsoever to try to cut them off there. We suffer from some of that same kind of confused thinking in this country, too.

Senator McGovern, for instance, was hard pressed the other day to explain

why American-South Vietnam action in Laos was "escalation" while the North Vietnam build-up there wasn't. The impression gained from what he said is that the U.S. somehow is wrong while it is in the "national interest" of the communists to be there.

The Senator should have gotten a royal horse laugh, which is what the Russian statements ought to get, too. when they talk about "the patriots of Indochina defending their legitimate rights..."

What legitimate right does North Vietnam have to invade Laos, take over control of several provinces and use that country as a staging area to fight a war against South Vietnam? None, of course. But you'd never know it by listening to Moscow or some of our doves here at home.



You should know, as I mentioned in my previous correspondence, that the F.B.I. is charged with the responsibility to keep a watchful eye on any and all possible unamerican activities. This may be accomplished in many ways, one being by surveillance. However, you mention that Senator Muskie was, and I quote. ".. today we know that Senator Muskie and others were the subject of surveillance by the Federal Bureau of Investigation on Earth Day, 1970". This is about as misleading a statement as I have ever heard. You know very well that Senator Muskie was not under surveillance. However, the F.B.I. is aware of the element who follow such demonstrations, and it is their duty to be sure they know who comes to town to participate. When you say Senator Muskie was under surveillance on Earth Day, you are telling an absolute falsehood. Certainly the F.B.I. would not have to wait until Earth Day to place a surveillance on Senator Muskie if they intended to do so at all. In fact, Senator Muskie never claimed that he was under surveillance, his contention was that the F.B.I. should not place a surveillance on such a demonstration as Earth Day because these are a different type person who participates in such a march. It was the intention of the F.B.I. to be aware if any radicals or agitators had followed in this group for the purpose of hurting the Earth Day movement. It was not the impression of the F.B.I. that the Earth Day movement is a radical group, and I'm sure you know this to be true.

I'm sure that if you went to the F.B.I. to determine the activities and movements of a certain radical or a number of radicals, and they told you

they did not know whether he was ever in Washington, was in Washington at the time, or anything concerning his whereabouts, you would strongly condemn them for not doing their duty. You would be the first one to ask them... "well, what have you been doing and where have your agents been when they should have been keeping a surveillance on these radical individuals.

In reading your Congressional Record #H-2911 I find that the greater part of it is based on "hearsay" and very little is factual. You simply contend that since the telephone company says they did not tap the telephone in question, then the F.B.I. did.

I will again state as I have stated in my previous correspondence, that you are operating under a false cloak of sincerity, and it is hoped that the people of this country, more particularly of Louisiana, will soon expose you. I do not know how many people contacted you in reference to your recent false accusations, but I'm sure you received quite a few. You state that your office, within twenty-four hours after your television broadcast, began receiving hate mail from every part of the country, impugning your patriotism, loyalty, and character. This should give you some idea of how the public respects the F.B.I. and Mr. Hoover and appreciates their efforts to combat crime, even if you do not.

Whom do you have in mind to replace Mr. Hoover? Certainly you will have a very strong recommendation if Mr. Hoover does retire. Will it be one of your Congressmen, certainly it will not be Mr. Kleindienst or Mr. Mitchell. I am anxiously awaiting to see whom you will endorse as Director of the F.B.I.

May I once again insist that you offer a public apology to Mr. Hoover and the Federal Bureau of Investigation. However, I doubt if you will have the backbone to do so.



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

The surprise punch came in a brief floor speech by House Democratic leader Hale Boggs. Offering no substantiation whatever, he declared that the FBI is guilty of the "tactics of the Soviet Union and Hitler's Gestapo" by tapping telephones of senators and congressmen — a charge flatly and immediately denied by Mr. Hoover's office.

In a subsequent television appearance, the Louisiana lawmaker said that he charges "categorically" that the FBI has his own personal life under surveillance. "I know it," he added vaguely, "because of reports that have come back to me."

We can offer no more fitting comment on this than the official statement issued by John N. Mitchell, attorney general of the United States and Mr. Hoover's immediate superior. Expressing sentiments exactly reflecting our own, he said:

"Americans will be shocked that a reckless speech like this should have come from the majority leader of the House of Representatives. "With total disregard for the facts, Mr. Boggs claims that the FBI has tapped telephones of members of the House and Senate. That is false, and he should know it is false.

"In comparing the FBI to Hitler's Gestapo, Mr. Boggs has reached a new low in political dialogue. He should recant at once and apologize to a great and dedicated American and the men and women who have made the FBI the finest investigative organization in the world."

J. Edgar Hoover, in 46 years as builder and director of his unrivalled anti-crime agency, has certainly earned the kind of support inherent in Mr. Mitchell's comment — and the continued tacit support of President Nixon, at whose pleasure he continues to serve.

It surely is some kind of a disgrace that a man who has spent his life fighting for the highest ideals of Americanism should have become again a major political campaign target.

And it surely is nauseating that their campaign should have sunk so low as to make gravely damaging accusations and insulting comparisons without offering the slightest immediate proof for what is officially denied from top to bottom.

### Coverup of Boggs Follows Tradition

#### BY WILLARD EDWARDS

ASHINGTON, April 14-The spontaneous and instinctive coverup for a colleague in distress-a victim of his own temperament—is a cherished Capitol Hill tradition.



This spirit of compassion is currently operating to protect Rep. Hale Boggs [D., La.], the House majority leader, who provoked an uproar last week with an unexpected House floor tirade against J. Edgar Hoover, director of the Fed-

eral Bureau of Investigation. For a good many members, Boggs' behavior in recent months, climaxed by his anti-Hoover outburst, has created sympathy of the "There but for the grace of

God go I" variety.

But this mood may dissolve. There is speculation about a Democratic caucus to consider removal of Boggs from his leadership post unless he can substantiate his charges that the FBI tapped phones of senators and representatives. thus adopting "the tactics of the Soviet Union and Gestapo."

If Boggs can't come up with proof of these claims when the House returns from an Easter recess next Monday, he'll be in serious trouble.

Boggs was called into a secret meeting with Southern Democratic colleagues soon after his attack on Hoover.

They taxed him directly with a grave political crime—promotion of party disunity when a united front was assential in preparation for the Presidential campaien next year, in which Democrats hope to unseat Mr Nixon.

By this time, Boggs had retreated from his original charge of actual congressional wiretapping by the FBL The important fact, he said, was that many members of Congress were "firmly convinced" that the FBI was listening to their phone conversations.

Then, in apparent response to criticism of the intemperate phrases he had used, be offered a curious defence. Didn't everyone realize, he asked, that he was under daily medication for a blood ailment? He summoned a physician to corroborate this statement.

The implication was never quite spelled out, his listeners said, but it seemed to give meaning to the later statement of Deputy Atty, Gen, Richard G. Kleindienst -that Boggs was "either sick or . . . not in possession of his faculties."

Boggs' eccentric behavior surfaced early this year at a formal dinner for congressional leaders. He grabbed an astonished Sen. Peter Dominick [R., Colo.] by the coat labels, shouting into his face. Later he apologized for this incident.

N MARCH 13, Boggs was knocked O'N MARCH 15, DOGS encounter with former Rep. Edward A. Mitchell [R., Ind.] at the Gridiron Club festivities. Mitchell said he could not tolerate Boggs' loud and abusive language about the Nixon administration.

Speaker Carl Albert [D., Okla.], who has completely disassociated himself from his floor leader's anti-Hoover charges, was highly embarrassed last month when Boggs showed up as an uninvited guest at a conference with Democratic chairmen called to discuss opposition to the Nixon

Demanding a seat next to the speaker, Boggs proceeded to make a number of

impromptu speeches.

On April 2, a planeload of notables, including Florida congressmen and military figures, was kept waiting at the Washington National Airport for an hour by Boggs' tardiness. When he did show up, his exuberance was such that friends sought to dissuade him from speaking at a subsequent dinner in Panama City, Fla., in honor of Rep. F. Edward Hel-La.]. He insisted on making a speech



United Press International (UPI) contains an item on 4/5/71 to the effect that the above-captioned individual asked the Attorney General to dismiss Mr. Hoover as Director of the FBI on the grounds that the agency is using the "tactics of the Soviet Union and Hitler's Gestapo." In a speech on the House Floor Boggs is quoted as stating that "when the FBI taps telephones of the House and Senate and infiltrates college campuses, and when the FBI adopts the tactics of the Soviet Union and Hitler's Gestapo, it is time for the Director to no longer be the Director." The UPI story says that Boggs did not elaborate on the wire-tapping charges and could not be reached immediately for amplification. The UPI story reflects that House Republican Leader Gerald Ford said some of Boggs' allegations concerning wiretapping could be determined but he said Boggs' remarks on Gestapo tactics "was not a fair allegation" and he demanded that Boggs present evidence to buttress his statement with facts.

Our relations with Boggs have generally been cordial and a letter of congratulations was sent to him by Mr. Hoover upon his most recent re-election to the House. It is just not known what has gotten into him to make this statement.

Bishop has received a call from both Stan Hall of UPI and from Mari Brown of Associated Press asking for a comment on Boggs' allegation that the FBI taps the telephones of House and Senate members. # Attacks on FBI Sad and Stupid

By DICK WEST Editorial Director

COMMENSUS everywhere — from Havana to Moscow and from Moscow to Santiago — must be raising their clonched fists with joy.

If J. Edgar Hoover and the Federal Bureau of Investigation can be discredited in the United States, the loss to this country would be greater than destruction of its carriers, Polaris subs and long-range bombers.

News stories in April critical of Mr. Hoover, insinuating he is senile and demanding a congressional investigation of the FBI all come at a critical period in this country's history: They come when the Soviet Union's espionage apparatus is the most sophisticated and effective in its history.

The work of communist agents will be even more effective, if the image of the FBI can be downgraded in this country.

For God's sake, let's not be that stupid.

Every embassy in Washington affiliated with the communist movement is swarming with agents. So is the U.N.

Mr. Hoover and his staff meet daily to combat this broad attack on American freedom. Such an assignment is formidable beyond comprehension; but if Mr. Hoover and his staff are forced to defend themselves against attacks by their own countrymen, the Russians will have won their greatest victory without firing a shot.

The American people should flood the White House, the United States Senate and the House of Representatives with post-cards reaffirming confidence in the FBI and its director of 47 years — a half century of effective and patriotic service without parallel.

WHEN MR, HOOVER was appointed director in 1924, be took over a disorganized service of political hacks. He was only 30.

He set cut to build a protective machine composed of highly skilled agents who must meet the most demanding of qualifications.

Their devotion to the FBI must come before everything else. Their personal integrity must be unquestioned.

The director insisted from the beginning

that he and his staff do their own recruiting, set their own standards, enforce their own rules of discipline.

He was smart enough to know that if Civil Service, Congress or some other government agency be allowed to interfere, the FBI would be nothing.

Through the years, therefore, Mr. Hoover properly constructed a protective wall around the FBI, over which no politician could climb.

Once that wall is scaled, the contemina-

CURRENT CHARGES are ridiculous, when you consider the FBI's record and the rules which Mr. Hoover devised and follows with rigid fidelity.

Any man with his power long ago could have set up his own police state. But he hasn't, and none exists.

The front cover of the April Sissue of ... Life Magazine, showing Mr. Hoover with his lips stuck out and calling him an "emperor." is a disservice to the man and degrading to his organization.

Not even worthy of rebuital is the statement on page 44 of that same issue that the FBI during the 1959s "did almost as much to create the threat of communism in the public mind as it did to root it out in courts."

Just how putrid can the liberal media

There is not one shred of evidence behind such a statement. We trust, after all these years, that the dumbest and most illiterate among us Americans know that nobody had to "create" the threat of communism in the public mind. That threat is real. And it was not "created" here. So was the threat of Hitler, And it was not created here.

FOR YEARS, as a newspaperman, we have watched FBI agents in their work and marveled at their dedication, affectiveness and integrity.

The portrayal of Mr. Hoover as an emperor is unfair, the insimuations by the puny that he has abused his power cannot be sub-

stantiated. On the contrary, here is the rec-

 There is no semblance of a police state in this country.

 The FBI never interferes with local law-enforcement agencies in their work, it hever intervenes in a local or state criminal case unless requested.

 No wiretap is ever made without the approval of the attorney general in writing.

 The Justice Department has all the any on cases to prosecute; the FBI has none. The FBI exists only to investigate and collect facts.

Neither Mr. Hower nor any of his 8,000 agents can participate in any political activity—except to vote.

 A copy of every investigative report goes to the Justice Department.

 Every attorney general and every president, since Mr. Hoover was appointed in 1924, have known in entirety what the FBI is doing.

MR. HOOVER had to plow around enough stumps of discord when the late Bob Kemedy was attorney general. Lyndow Johnson was aware of such discord and promptly put his faith in Mr. Hoover after entering the White House by exempting the director from mandatory retirement at 78.

The director will be 77 on Jan. 1. Many of his top assistant directors are eligible for retirement. He and his organization have earned and deserve the highest of national respect and honor.

But above all, the transition from Mr. Hoover to his successor must no. occur under a contrived cloud of criticism. The transition, when it comes, will be critical and demand the most profound of loyalties. The security of Mr. Hoover is not at stake. Americal us.

SUBJECT CONGRESSMAN HALE BOGGS (D-LA.) CRITICISM OF THE FBI 4

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On the afternoon of 4/20/71 Jack Hushen, Director of Public Information, Department of Justice, advised Bishop that his office had picked up an "inkling" from an unnamed newsman to the effect that among the charges against the FBI which Boggs is to make on the Floor of the House on 4/22/71 is one to the effect that the FBI has utilized Capitol switchboard operators as informants. Hushen stated that if this allegation is true it would be a most devastating one. He asked if a check could be made at the Bureau as to whether or not the Bureau has used Capitol switchboard operators as informants so that, in the event this is not correct, the Department could take immediate steps to issue a flat denial on Thursday in the event Boggs included that in his charge.

Mr. Sullivan has been advised of the above and has stated that he will immediately have steps taken to look into the matter.

### RECOMMENDATION

That appropriate checks of the Washington Field Office and Bure records be made so that Hushen can be advised prior to noon on Thursday whether or not there is any factual basis for this allegation.

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# Boggs Says FBI Probed His, McCormack's Calls

House Democratic Leader Ciale Bogus claims that FBI acents last year obtained records of long-distance calls charged to his office telephones and those of former House Speaker John W. Mc-Cermack.

Sources close to Boggs also say that federal agents placed calls to several of those listed on Boggs' long-distance call bills to confirm that the calls had been made by Boggs.

The Louisiana Democrat has asked permission to address the House of Representatives for an hour Thursday but did not give further details.

[Justice Department officials confirmed yesterday that toll records of Boggs and Mc-Cormack were obtained in connection with criminal investigations directed at former McCormack aide Martin

Sweig and his associate Nathan M. Voloshen and at Baltimore contractor Victor J. Frenkil, who remodeled Boggs' Bethasda home.

They said obtaining such records is standard investigative procedure. The Chesapeake & Potomac Telephone Co. said the records are given only if a subpoena is presented.

Sources close to Boggs insist the Louisiana congressman does not want to give the impression that senators and representatives should be immune from investigation of fliegal acts. But he is understood to be upset that the records were obtained without his or AlcCormack's knowledge and that the act may have been an intrusion into the legislative branch.

The FBI and the Justice Department declined to comment.

The sources say the phone records constitute Boggs' key concrete charge against the IFBI. The charge does not support Boggs' original contention made April 5 in demandling the resignation of FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover that the FBI "taps the telephones of members of this body and of members of the Senate..."

Although the telephone company said the records are given only under subpoena, this reporter last week obtained from the telephone company information on long-distance calls charged to Boggs' House office by claiming to be calling for Boggs. Although the request was made with the permission of Boggs' office, the telephone company employee who disclosed the calls did not verify the identity of the caller.

The employee, upon request, also gave further details of individual calls listed.

For example, she reported that a call to a Princeton, N.J., number was placed person-to-person at 4:32 p.m. Feb. 5 to "Mrs. Sigmund."

The telephone, the employee said, is listed to Paul E.

Sigmund, Mrs. Sigmund is one of Boggs' daughters.

Another number was listed only to Fort Polk, La., but the employee called the number to determine who might have been called by Boggs. There was no answer.

Federal law prohibits telephone company employees from disclosing long-distance customers' call records to others without a subposea or except on demand of "lawini authority." Violation carries the same penalty as whetapping by company employees.

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A telephone company spokeman said yesterday that the practice of giving toll call records to persons who identify themselves as the proper customer relies upon the 'integrity" of customers and "has never caused any difficulties."

"If there is any doubt as to the caller, our business office representative will arrange to call back. If this becomes a problem and we do have to change our procedures." the spokesman sald, "this will not only be an inconvenience to our customers but very costly to the company and would ultimately be reflected in the cost of the service."

Congressmen and senators continued to attack and defend the FBI yesterday.

Sen. George McGovern (D-

SD.) charged that Hoover, tried unsuccessfully to intimidate Trans World Airlines into firing TWA Capt. Donald J. Cook Jr., who criticized as "irresponsible and reckless" an FBI attempt to capture a hijack suspect at Kennedy Airport in Nev York in November, 1969. McGovern said the account was "substantiated by former agents of the FBI, and by Charles C. Tillinghast Jr., Chairman of the Board of TWA."

McGovern charged that President Nixon is afraid to remove Hoover as FBI director even though Hoover has become "irresponsible."

But Sen. Sam J. Ervin Jr. (D.N.C.), who has been investigating government snooping, said he has yet to find any evidence of illegal actions by the FBI.

"I think he (Hoover) has done a very good job in a difficult post," the North Carolina Democrat said. Senate Majority Leader Mike Mansfield (D-Mont.) sald that until a member of Congress has evidence—"not just words"—of wrongdoing by the FBI, and the charge is investigated by the appropriate committee, "I am for the FBI . . . I expect (Hoover) to stay in office."

Mansfield suggested Ervin's

MASHINGTON — House majority leader Hale Boggs became "loud and bolsterous" at a Florida political dinner and created such a disturbance he had to be forcibly restrained, guests at the dinner say.

Some witnesses say Boggs had been drinking earlier in the day. But Boggs and Rep. Robert L. F. Sikes, D-Fla., who was being honored at the \$50-a-plate testimonial, deny the allegations.

"He was not forcibly restrained," Sikes said Thursday. "The man was sick, He was taking antibiotics, and you know how they can affect you."

THE SIKES dinner at Panama City in the Florida panhandle was held April 2, just three days before Boggs, a Louisiana Democrat, charged in a brief and unexpected speech to the House that the FBI was tapping the telephones of congressmen.

Two weeks earlier, Boggs was involved in an altercation with another guest at the annual Gridiron Dinner in Washington. The other guest knocked him to the floor in a hotel men's room.

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The Florida incident came to light when the Panama City Jaycees adopted a resolution last week charging that the local news media covered up for Boggs.

THE JAYCEES said they conducted their own investigation and found that Boggs had created a disturbance "by threatening to make comments from the podium unfavorable to Congressman Sikes."

The majority leader's behavior was so "loud and boisterous," the Jaycees said, that it caused "a threat of physical confrontation between himself and a local dignitary."

"Local law enforcement officers" prevented Boggs from entering the banquet hall, the Jaycees said, and the congressman was "placed in a side room and the door to the banquet hall locked to prevent his entrance."

ALTHOUGH it was announced to the crowd of about 400 at the dinner that Roger was ill and back at his motel room, he eventually entered the hall just as everyone was leaving and gave a speech "generally laudatory toward Congressman Sikes," the Jaycees said.

The Jaycees added that, when Boggs took the microphone, he denied he had been sick.

Besides Boggs, guests at the dinner honoring Sikes, power-

whites are affected equally by changes in economic conditions.

"It seems to defy that old notion that adversity falls hardest on blacks and the young," Brown said.

THE CENSUS Bureau, in another study of U.S. incomes recently, noted that in 1970 there were about 1.2-million more people living in poverty than in the prior year. That study also showed black and whites suffering almost equally in the economic slump—although because of past lags, Negroes are three times more likely to be living in poverty than are whites.

The Census Bureau survey first records the basic money income earned among about 50,000 families sampled. The median, without allowing for changes in consumer prices, was \$9,870 in 1970 — about \$440 higher than in 1969. This increase between 1969 and 1970 was only about half the size of the increase between 1968 and 1969.

When the median income figures were altered to take price increases into account, the result showed the total family income did not rise or fall — for the first time in nine years.

AMONG THOSE in the room where Boggs was allegedly restrained, according to the Jaycees, were "members of the sheriff's department, police officials and the editor of the Panama City News-Herald, Mike Darley."

Darley refused to comment on the Jaycee investigation. "The only thing I've got to say about this thing is that it's all politically motivated," he snapped. "That's all I've got to say."

Bay County Sheriff Tullis Easterling said that, although he was at the Sikes dinner, he did not see Boggs locked in a room or confronting the unidentified "local dignitary" mentioned by the Jaycees.

But Easterling said, "I did hear him (Boggs) make remarks which were derogatory to Congressman Sikes."

AT ONE point during the dinner, the sheriff said, he stepped outside the banquet hall and "gave instructions to one of my men to keep order."

Asked if he gave the instructions because there was a disturbance in volving Boggs, Easterling replied, "There was no disturbance, just these (derogatory) statements made by Congressman Boggs... There was actually no disturbance, and I wanted to be sure there would not be."

Easterling said he went back into the hall and did not see what took place after that.

The president of the Panama City Jaycees, Jerry Gerde, a local attorney, said his organization conducted its investigation by interviewing 16 witnesses, including Sheriff Easterling.

Gerde said he had been at the dinner but declined to describe in detail what he saw. He added, however, that he stood behind his organization's findings.


One witness who is also a newsman, Elbert Dukate, president and majority owner of radio station WPCF, said he saw a "pretty deplorable situation" at the Sikes dinner but did not report or investigate it.

"I'm kind of lazy about that sometimes," Dukate said.

But, spurred by the Jaycee resolution criticizing the local media, Dukate said he took sworn statements from three witnesses, including a law enforcement officer, and then aired an editorial describing events at the dinner.

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# Panama **Jaycees Cite** Boggs, Media

PANAMA CITY (AP) — The Panama City Jaycees have adopted a resolution accusing U.S. Rep. (Hale Boggs, D-La), of creating a disturbance at an April 2 testimonial dinner and lambasting the local news media for allegedly not reporting the incident.

The Jaycee resolution, adopted last Thursday, was particulary critical of the Panama City News-Herald, which carried the resolution in its entirety on Saturday.

The Jaycees specifically cited News-

Herald Editor Mike Darley.

Boggs, House majority leader, was accused of threatening to make unfavorable remarks about Rep. Bob Sikes, guest of honor at the dinner; of having to be restrained by local law enforcement officers and of being locked out of the banquet hall.

Darley, the resolution said, was the one newsman with all the facts, yet printed nothing in his newspaper. It called for denouncement of Darley and the News-Herald, for the owners to reprimand staffers and for owners to review the newspaper's editorial policy.

Darley would not comment on the incident except to say the charges about him and the paper were politically inspired. He pointed out the newspaper had carried the entire resolution without editorial comment.

Boggs could not be reached immediately for comment.

# ACCUSES REP. HALE BOGGS OF CREATING DISTURBANCE

# Jaycee Resolution Rips News-Herald, Other Media

Panama City Jaycees have adopted a resolution accusing U S. Rep. Hale Boggs, D-La., the House majority leader of creating a disturbance at a testimonial dinner here April 2 honoring U. S. Rep. Bob Sikes, D-Fla.

The Jaycee resolution also accused local news media of covering up the alleged incident and was particularly critical of The News-Herald.

The resolution was adopted by Jaycees at a meeting Thursday night and the News-Herald obtained a copy of it Friday.

Some 400 persons from Bay and Gulf counties attended the dinner honoring Sikes, who has represented Northwest Florida in Congress for more than 30 years. The event was held at the Panama City Beach Civic Center)

The full text of the Jaycee resolution follows:

WHEREAS, this committee was empowered by the Panama City Japan to the

vestigate and make recommendations as to the news media coverage of the events surrounding the Bob Sikes Appreciation Dinner held on Friday, April 2, 1971, and

WHEREAS, the committee made this investigation based upon interviews with persons who attended said banquet, persons in charge of the arrangements for said banquet and persons charged with the responsibility for reporting that event, as a news item, and,

WHEREAS, the committee makes the following findings of fact:

- 1. The Bob Sikes Appreciation Dinner was a political function in the interest of the general public, that received widespread publicity in the press, and on the radio and television.
- 2. That numerous local citizens were called upon to show their appreciation to Congressman Sikes through contributions of \$50.00 per person

for a banquet held in his honor.

- That said appreciation dinner was held as scheduled with a large number of local citizens in attendance.
- 4. That universal confusion existed among those attending as to exactly what the proceeds of the affair were to be used for and the only member of the news media to inquire into and to report on this aspect of the banquet was WJHG TV.
- Congressman Hale Boggs, one of the dignitaries present, created such a disturbance at the affair by threatening to make comments from the podium, unfavorable to Congressman Sikes, and by loud and boisterous comments to those in his vicinity, actions on the part of Congressman Boggs resulted in a threat of physical confrontation between himself and a local dignitary, resulted in Congressman Boggs being restrained by local law enforcement offi-

94-37804 150 ENCLOSURE cials from entering the banquet hall to the extent that he was placed in a side room and the door to the banquet hall locked to prevent his entrance, resulted in the possibility of his arrest by local law enforcement officials: sulted in announcements being made to the public that Congressman Boggs was ill and in his motel room and when in fact, Congressman Boggs was in the building itself but not in the banquet room.

6. Among those asked to assume the responsibility of calming Congressman Boggs and preventing him from entering the banquet hall were members of the Sheriff's Department, police officials and the editor of the Panama City News-Herald, Mike Darley.

7. Many of those in attendance knew that Congressman Boggs was in fact in the building and was being restrained from entering the banquet room.

. S. At the close of the banquet, Congressman Boggs gained admittance to the baneuet room, the podium and the microphone and the departing crowd was asked to return and hear his speech, whereupon, among other things, Congressman Boggs denied being ill and delivered a speech generally laudatory toward Congressman Sikes.

9. The committee is unable to determine how many representatives form local radio stations were present and these persons in attendance were unable to comment upon the coverage given to the af-fair by the radio stations with the exception of WMAI-FM, and those persons who heard this broadcast agreed, generally, that it was a fair attempt to report the incidents which occurred.

10. The local television station did, following the affair, make a report touching upon some of the incidents which occurred, at least allowing the listening and viewing public to

arrive at its own conclusion; this news broadcast or TV editorial comment was at least an attempt to report these incidents, but by the admission of those persons in charge of preparing their report, it fell somewhat short of their responsibility, apparently WJHG TV personnel were hampered by the lack of first hand information.

11. The newspaper published in Wewahitchka, Florida, ran an editorial touching upon these incidents, which we find to be the most accurate report of the events which occurred.

12. The Panama City Advertiser-Journal did publish an article some two or three weeks following the event acknowledging, that it had sat on the story, but it felt obligated to report, however belatedly, those things which did occur and of which they had knowledge.

13. We find that at least one member of the local news media, primarily the Panama

City News-Herald in the person of its editor, Mike Darley. had first hand personal knowledge of the events which occurred and chose not to report them. In the article in the Panama City News-Herald the day following the banquet, the affair was reported as a glowing success, with no mention of the events which this committee finds to have existed.

14. Those persons in attendance seem to agree that persons in charge of the local arrangements for the banquet, from the chairman down to the food caterer did an excellent job and that Congressman Sikes and Congressman Hebert acquitted themselves well under difficult circumstances; but most of those present felt that the affair was turned into a disastrous fiasco and a source of embarrassment to those connected with

15. Members of this committee and other Jaycees have been approached by the publisher of the Penama City News-Herald and other local citizens with the admonition that this investigation should be discontinued and that if it were not discontinued, the Jaycee chapter and particularly members of this committee could expect unfavorable treatment; and that the editor of said newspaper would be "turned loose" on

WHEREAS, the Panama City Jaycees feel that a truly free press, and a truly objective and professional press has nothing to fear by an inquiry into the handling of a particular news story, and,

WHEREAS, the Panama City Jaycees feel that the citizens of Panama City and Bay County, Florida, deserve tohave a newspaper which will truly and honestly report the news which affects or may affect the public interest, and,

WHEREAS, the Panama

City Jaycees have, and do recognize that a free press has a responsibility to objectively and professionally report all of the news without regard to political pressures and despite political restraints, so that the public may be informed, and,

WHEREAS, it is our observation that the reporting of this event by the Panama City News-Herald is representative of the type coverage given other events by the Panama City News-Herald, and,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Panama

City Jaycees:

1. That WJHG TV be criticized for its failure to fully report these events but that WJHG-TV be applauded for its recognition that its failure to report these events was not good reporting.

2. That Ed Bandjough and the newspaper of Wewa-hitchka Florida, as well as the Panama City Advertiser-Journal and radio station WMAI-FM be publicly credit-ed for their willingness to handle their coverage of this event in a professional and re-

sponsible fashion. 3. That the Panama City News-Herald and its editor, be denounced for the lack of professionalism and truthfulness in reporting an event of such widespread public inter-

# Panama City Incident

It isn't often that the conduct of a Congressional leader in this general area attracts national attention. But such has happened to House Majority Leader Hale Boggs (D-La.) and the action was at Panama City. As told in Human Events, the Washington, D. C. publication:

House Majority Leader Hale Boggs (D.-La.), who still has not substantiated his wild accusations of FBI wiretaps in congressional offices, now refuses to challenge a report that he disrupted a Panama City, Fla., dinner honoring Rep. Bob Sikes (D.-Fla.) on April 2.

The Panama City Jaycees, angered by the failure of local media to fully report the incident, adopted a lengthy resolution outlining in detail their own investigation into the affair. The state ment appeared last week in the Panama City News Herald.

The Jaycees charge: Boggs created a major disturbance at the \$50-a-plate dinner, threatened to make uncomplimentary remarks about Sikes in his speech and made loud and bolsterous remarks to others. A threat of fisticulfs between the Louisiana solon and a local dignitary reportedly resulted in the rambunctious majority leader being restrained from entering the banquet hall by law officers.

Following the near-brawl, the Jaycees said the 14-term congressman was barred from entering the dining area "to the extent that he was placed in a side room and the door to the banquet hall locked to prevent his entrance." So abusive was the New Orleans Democrat that local law enforcement officials threatened his arrest.

While guests were told he was ill in his motel room, Boggs was actually in the banquet building where local police members of the sheriff's department and dinner committee officials attempted to calm him down and prevent his gaining admittance to the main hall.

At the close of the banquet, the legislator managed to obtain access to the podium, according to the resolution and "the departing crowd was asked to return and hear his speech. Whereupon, among other things, Congressman Boggi denied being ill and delivered a speech generally laudatory toward Congressman Sikas."

One Panama City newsman, when asked if Boggs had been drinking, said: "A let of people were drinking whiskey out there. If we reported the names of all those who were drinking whiskey it would have been longer than the new story was."

When Human Events contacted the

majority leader's office regarding the Jaycees' allegations, Gary Hymel, Boggs' aide, said: "That's a local political fight down there and he (Boggs) ham't commented on it."

We made one more attempt to get a clear answer. Did he comment at all on these allegations?

"Nope," concluded Hymel.

Boggs has in the past told reporters that his intemperate acts resulted from a daily medication necessary for a blood ailment. In fact, Deputy Atty. Gen. Richard Kleindienst stated, referring to Boggs' assault on the FBI, that the legislator was "either sick or...not in possession of his faculties."

WASHINGTON. (UPI) — If ourse Democratic Leader Hale Boggs charged today the FBI has had him under personal surveillance.

The FBI said the claim was "absolutely, utterly false." Attv. Gen. John N. Mitcheli said charges by Boggs against the FBI were "standerous falsehoods."

Those were among repercussions of a demand by Boggs yesterday that Mitchell ask FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover to resign. Boggs ac-

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cused Hoover of "gestapo" police tactics, including tapping of the telephones of some members of Congress.

Boggs was interviewed today on CBS radio.

The Louisiana Democrat said: "I charge categorically the FBI has had me under surveillance, my personal life. I know it because of reports which have come back to me."

An FBI spokesman promptly denied the charge. Mitchell issued a statement yesterday describing Boggs' allegations as "vicjous."

Boggs said today that in a day or two he would expand on his House speech attacking activities by FBI and Hoover.

Besides Mitchell, some congressmen came to Hoover's and the FBI's defense, and others inserted further comments in today's Congressional Record.

Rep. John R. Rarick, D-La., said: "Few around our nation will behold this over-reaction from the leftwing without un-

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## Justice Dept. Asks Hill Inquiry on FBI

Deputy Attorney General Richard G. Kleindienst yesterday urged a congressional investigation into "the whole operation of the FBI" to dispel fear and divisiveness caused by allegations that the bureau taps telephones of senators and congressmen.

Kleindienst also said that Rep. Hale Boggs (D-La.), the House Majority Leader, was either "sick or . . . not in possession of his faculties" on Monday when he accused the FBI of keeping congressmen under surveillance and tapping their telephones.

A few hours after Kleindienst struck back at Boggs in a nationally televised interview, he narrowed his offer of a congressional probe to include only the allegations raised by Boggs.

Kleindienst's offer of a rare congressional look at the FBI elicited from the Senate Constitutional Rights Subcommittee the observation that it has been conducting an investigation of government surveillance activities since last year and without cooperation from the Justice Department.

The subcommittee, whose chairman is Sen. Sam J. Ervin Jr. (D-N.C.), asked the Justice Department March 17 to produce eight documents relating to surveillance guidelines, criteria for intelligence gathering, and specific information on FBI activities in the field.

committee. A Justice Department official said Assistant Attorney General Robert Mardian was awaiting a subcommittee letter detailing what documents it wanted, but subcommittee sources said they had made it clear on March 17 which papers were desired.

🗓 Subcommittee sources said they could not speak firmly for Ervin, who is in North Carolina, but they expect future hearings to deal thoroughly, if quietly, with Boggs' al-degations about the FBI. The sources added that in recent meetings between Ervin and Sen. Edward M. Kennedy (D-Mass.) it was agreed that Ervin's unit would retain jurisdiction "at present" although Kennedy's Senate Administrative Practice Subcommittee would continue its own investigation of government surveillance. Last night, Kennedy said he favored the resignation of FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover.

On the House floor yesterday, Rep. Bella Abzug (D-N.Y.) requested the House Judiciary

Committee to make a broad investigation of the FBI. The request was received noncommittally by Chairman Emanuel Celler (D-N.Y.). Celler recently responded to a Washington Post survey by saying the felt his own telephones had been tapped by someone.

Rep. Wayne Hays (D-Ohio), chairman of the House Administration Committee, announced he would soon sign a contract with a "reputable firm" to check whether House members' telephones are tapped or their offices bugged.

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The Executive Branch routinely brings its own bugging experts to check Senate Foreign Relations and Senate Armed Services committee rooms when spokesmen for the CIA, Defense Intelligence Agency, Joint Chiefs of Staff or Secretary of State testify.

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The FBI has denied that any member of Congress has ever been under surveillance or had his phone tapped in the last 50 years.

The White House said yesterday that Director Hoover still enjoys the "full confidence" of President Nixon. Hoover was also defended in House speeches by Rep. John E. Hunt (R.N.J.) and Rep. John Buchanan (R.Ala.). Hunt said it appears to be "open seasen on the FBI" and Buchanan said Boggs' "unsupported statements do harm to the FBI."

In the Senate, Assistant Democratic Leader Robert C. Byrd of West Virginia challenged Boggs to reveal any evidence he had to support his charges.

"I think there is a good bit of imagination involved here," Byrd said.

Kleindienst, in the first of three network television interviews yesterday, revealed that Hoover sent an FBI agent to Boggs' office Tuesday in search of evidence of illegal wiretapping.

"Congressman Boggs refused to see the agent who was there to get evidence to determine if someone in the FBI had viotated the law. And we were disappointed but not too surprised that Congressman Boggs did not see the special agent...

It was in this early morning CES interview, which was initiated by the Justice Department, that Kleindienst called for a congressional investigation of the "whole operation" of the FBI.

"Its whole role in fair, evenhanded, impartial investigation of crime in this country is threatened. And I would welcome an investigation by Congress of its responsible members so that No. 1, you can put aside the irresponsible statements like Congressman Boggs on the one hand, and clear the air with respect to the essential role and function and methods of the FBI."

A few hours later, in simultaneous interviews sought by ABC and NBC, Kleindienst said Boggs' charges could not be permitted to "hang in the air." Unless they are retracted, he said, the only way public confidence in the FBI can be restored is through a congressional investigation.





Admitting that America faces "serious social problems - problems of malnutrition, of broken homes, of poverty, and of delinquency," the President emphasizes that abortion is not the answer. "A good and generous people will not opt, in my view, for this kind of alternative to its social dilemmas," Nixon says. "Rather, it will open its hearts and homes to the unwanted children of its own, as it has done for the unwanted millions of other lands." The statement is issued in conjunction with the President's order that policy on abortions at American military hospitals be made to "correspond with the laws of the states where those bases are located. If the laws in a particular/state restrict abortions, the rules at the military base hospitals are to correspond to that law. The effect of this directive is to reverse service regulations issued last summer, which had liberalized the rules on abortions at military hospitals. The new ruling supersedes this and has been put into effect by the Secretary of Defense." The President's action should cut down the number of abortions performed in the nation's 165 military hospitals since most states still have fairly restrictive laws against the killing of unborn children.

■ New York, April 5 — Gordon Chase, the Health Services Administrator here, reports that nearly 100,000 legal abortions have been performed in New York City since the new state law went into effect last summer. The exact total of abortions during the

eight-month period from July 1, 1970, through February 28, 1971, is reported as 97,881. Of this number, Chase says that 52 per cent of them were performed on women from out of state. He also says that statistics show that 77.3 per cent of the abortions in January and February were performed in the "safe" first 12 weeks of pregnancy. In addition to the nearly 100,000 unborn children who were killed, 14 mothers also died as a result of the operation.

#### A New Internal Security Act

■ Washington, April 5 - Senate Judiciary Committee Chairman James O. Eastland (D.-Miss.) introduces a wideranging Internal Security Act and five other bills today, which he says are urgently needed to protect the nation's internal security. The six-bill package is designed to "restore efficacy and enforceability" to the Internal Security Act of 1950 and to plug loopholes suggested by various Supreme Court decisions, says Eastland. He declares that the proposed legislation will increase the effectiveness of the Subversive Activities Control Board, "effectively prohibit" the employment of Comm. ... s as workers in defense facilities or as teachers in school systems supported wholly or in part by Federal funds, deny tax exemptions for subversive organizations or individuals, and disallow tax deductions for donations to Communist organizations.

#### More Trade with the Enemy

■ Washington, April 6 - The Senate. without a dissenting word, votes (66 to 1) to increase U.S. trade with the Communist bloc. The key provision, in a bill to extend the life of the Export-Import Bank, eliminates a 25-year-old prohibition against U.S. Government financing of exports to the Soviet Union and its European satellites. Under the provision, American businessmen can seek the help of the bank to finance deals made with Iron Curtain countries, Nixon Administration officials had testified against lifting the ban at this time, but many businessmen, including representatives of the U.S. Chamber of Commerce, appeared in support of the amendment, which was introduced by Senator Walter F. Mondale (D.-Minn.). The only no vote comes from Senator William Proxmire (D.-Wis.), who objected to another section of the bill. The measure now goes to the House of Representatives.

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

Deputy Atty. Gen. Richard Kleindienst suggested today that Congress investigate the "whole operation of the Federal Bureau of Investigation" to help clear the air of charges made against the agency and its chief.

His suggestion was immediately acted upon by its chief. New York Rep. Bella Abzug, one of the bureau's strongest critics. She introduced a resolution for an investigation by the House -Judiciary Committee.

Kleindienst made his suggestion in the course of a CBS interview in which he denied the phones of members of Congress had ever been tapped and said House Majority whip Hale Boggs must have "been sick or lost the use of his faculties" when he made such a charge

--- Cites Fear

Kliendienst urged that "responsible members" of Congress investigate "the whole operation of the FBI so that this matter can be settled once and for all so that this question of fear and divisiveness and apprehension in our society can be eliminated."

Such investigations have been avoided in the past as too politi-cally dangerous. In recent weeks, Sen. Edward M. Kennedy's Administrative Practices subcommittee has been contamplating such an investigation, but Kennedy has not given the go-ahead.

Kleindienst, asked on the CBS show why Boggs made the charge if it is untrue, replied:

"Well, all of us in the Department of Justice have been asking ourselves that and we have come to the conclusion that he was either sick or he was not in possession of his faculties when he made that statement."

Kleindienst said the FBI agent in charge here was sent by Hoover to Boggs' office yesterday to ask for evidence supporting Boggs charge but the congressman refused to see the agent.

Saying the FBI in its 50 years had never been accused of "being a political arm in the government," he said the air needs to be cleared. There is no proof of the charge, Kleindienst said, and Boggs "is extending the very basis of the falsehood that he started himself."

Kleindienst said "the FBI has never tapped the telephone of any congressman or any senator now or in the past and won't do it in the future."

Asked if in calling for an investigation the FBI should open up its files, he replied "no, they shouldn't" but the congressmen should have "fair access ... to the procedures and the policies" of the agency "not only now but, in the past."

The only times the FBI has placed a member of Congress under surveillance, Kleingienst said, were a "few specific instances when members of Congress have been accused of the commission of a specific illegal act." Even then there was no "electronic surveillance." be added.

Meanwhile, Senate Republican Leader Hugh Scott said Hoover has made an unqualified denial

of Boggs' charges.

But Boggs, D-La., has repeated his assertion that he has been personally wiretapped and watched, and that other mem-bers of Congress have reported

the same thing to him.

Scott reported a telephone conversation with Hoover in which he quoted the director as saying, "I want to make a positive assertion that there has never been a wiretap of a senator's phone or of the phone of any member of Congress since I became director in 1924, nor has any member of the Congress or the Senate been under surveil-

He said that in private conversatjons and notes to him "numerous members of Congress have reported to me they have firm conviction that telephone. conversations and activities are the subject of surveillance by the FBI, much as was done last fall by the military intelligence agencies.

"Several members have made available to me detailed information confirming my own experience which substantiates these allegations, and it is my intention to make proper use of it in the near future.

Charges are being made that the FBI is spying on Congressmen and the Army. Some are asking for the resignation of J. Edgar Hoover, and some are coming to his defense. Below are two differing views on this issue, and my thinking

ASKING FOR J. EDGAR HOOVER'S RESIGNATION: Hon. Hale Boggs (D-La.) says, "... What I am going to sa I say in sorrow, Jecause it is always tragic when a great man who has given his life to his country comes to the twi light of his life and fails to understand it is time to leave the service and enjoy retirement. Mr. Speaker, I am talling about Mr. J. Edgar Hoover, the Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. The time has come for the Attorney General of the United States to ask for the resignation of Mr. Hoover. When the FBI taps the telephones of Members of this body and of Members of the Senate, when the FBI stations agents on college campuses to infiltrate college organizations, when the FBI adopts the tactics of the Soviet Union and Hitler's Gestapo, then it is time - it is way past time, Mr. Speaker - that the present Director thereof no longer be the Director.

"The greatest thing we have in this Nation is the Bill of Rights. We are a great country because we are a free country under the Bill of Rights. The way Mr. Hoover is running the FBI today it is no longer a free country. I was astonis ed to read in the paper this morning where Mr. Mitchell says that he is a law-and-order man .... ## Drinking Data Traced

A derogatory report on House Democratic leader Hale Boggs, including the allegation that he drinks heavily, has been traced to FBI sources.

This was the inspiration, it has been suggested, for Deputy Attorney General Richard Kleindienst's crack on television that Boggs must have been either "sick or . . . not in possession of his facultics" when he accused the FBI of tapping congressional phones.

Kleindienst told us he had heard the rumors about Boggs' irinking but not from the FBI. The only FBI report he had scen on Boggs, Kleindienst said, concerned the congressman's alleged role in helping Baltimore contractor Victor Frenkil get the contract for constructing a House garage.

The deputy attorney general said he had reviewed this report about 18 months ago and had joined in the decision that there was no evidence to warrant prosecution." The FBI rundown on Boggs,

seconding to a competent source who has seen it and is in a position to know its origin, is written on plain paper without any FBI identilying marks. In the past, we have seen similar anonymous reports that we knew came at of the FBI.

Titillating Tidbits

It has been the FBI's practice to collect titillating tidbits about prominent people, which turn up in the course of other investigations.

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The FBI learned from its wireiaps at the Soviet Empassy, for instance, that ex-Attor-ney General Ramsey Clark had telephoned Soviet Ambassador Anatoly Dobrynin last December about possibly going to Russia to observe the trial of 12 Russian Jews who allegedly had plotted to hijack a plane to fly them to Israel.

J. Edgar Hoover immediately sent a secret message about Clark's plans, quoting a "high-ly reliable source," on the FBI teletype to the White House, Pentagon, State Department and Central Intelligence Agency.

Perhaps the most notorious FBI report that has come to

our attention was a memo to life of Dr. Martin Luther King. A White House aide showed us the FBI memo. dated Feb. 20, 1968.

It quoted a "confidential informant" who said Dr. King had been having an "illicit. affair" with the "wife of a prominent Negro dentist in Los Angeles."

Continued the memo: "The source related an incident which occurred some time ago in a New York City hotel, where King was intoxicated at a small gathering. King threatened to leap from the 13th floor window of the hotel if this woman would not say she loved him."

The FBI, of course, has no business investigating King's sex life, Boggs' drinking habits, Clark's travel plans or the private lives of any other public figures.

# J. Edgar Hoover and the Retirement Issue

At a time when both J. Edgar Hoover and the Federal Bureau of investigation are the targets of a rising chorus of criticism, Representative Hale Boggs has chosen to make what Attorney General Mitchell has described as "a reckless and cruel attack" on both the man and the institution.

Speaking in the House on Monday, the Democratic majority leader accused the FBI of tapping "the telephones of members of this body and of members of the Senate" and of adopting "the tactics of the Soviet Union and Hitler's Gestapo." Boggs charged Hoover with "suppression of the Bill of Rights" and of making the United States "no longer a free country."

The last three charges are subjective and largely a matter of opinion, farfetched as they may (and do) sound to the average citizen. But the charge that the FBI under Hoover's direction is tapping the telephones of congressmen is both specific and serious. It's either true or it isn't. Having made the charge on the floor of the House so that it now becomes a part of the history of this country, it is Boggs' responsibility to make the charge stick.

To date, there is nothing to suggest. that Boggs does not owe Hoover, the FBI, Congress and the country an apology. Both Hoover and Mitchell "categoricalfly" deny the charge (the FBI denies that it has ever placed a congressman under any form of surveillance except in connection with a criminal charge: Boggs was interviewed by the FBI at least twice in 1969 in connection with the alleged efforts of a Baltimore contractor to bring influence to bear to collect claims pending with regard to the underground garage at the Rayburn Office Building, according to the New York Times). Indeed, not a single member of Congress has presented a shred of evidence to support Boggs' claim, which is described by assistant Senate majority C. Byrd as containing

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On Tuesday, in amplification of his fintement in the House, Boggs attempted to soften his attack, claiming that more important than charges and countercharges is the fundamental fact that a substantial number of members of Congress are firmly convinced their phones are tapped by the FBL.

That is not good enough, and Boggs, a Phi Beta Kappa, a 25-year veteran of the House and a lawyer, knows it is not good enough. It is up to him to present

proof of his allegations. This he has said he will do after the House returns from his Easter recess. The Justice Department has suggested that Congress investigate Boggs' charge and that invitation

certainly should be accepted.

If the Louisiana congressman is unable to come up with convincing evidence of the charges against Hoover and the FBI, it may be that the most generous construction that can be placed on the incident will be that of Deputy Attorney General Richard Kleindienst, who takes the position that Boggs "must have been sick or not in the possession of his faculties" when he delivered his one-minute speech Boggs claimed at the time that he was suffering from "a cold." But a cold can hardly be an excuse for slander, if such Boggs' statement proves to be.

One of the many unfortunate aspects

of the episode is that there is a very real scase for Hoover's voluntary retirement. This has nothing to do with what Mitchell rightly terms Hoover's credentials as a great American" and very little to do with the conduct of the FBI. It has everything to do with the fact that Hoover in 76, and beginning to show it.

John Edgar Hoover has served eight Presidents and tolerated sixteen attorneys general, including (in the latter category) at least one "jellyfish." When the director first unlimbered his submachine gun, 47 years ago, the world was a vastly different place. As Life magazine put it in a recent article on Hoover, "Bonnis had not met Clyde. Charles Lindbergh, 22, was wing-walking above county fairs, and Richard Nixon, 11, was sweeping up in the family store. Red Grange was stupefying tackiers for the University of Illinois, and John Dillinger began serving his first term in the pen."

a Down through the years, Hoover has served the country with unflagging energy, integrity and single-mindedness. He has created an organization which, to his everlanting credit, has carned a reputation for incorruptibility and political limbartiality. He has built the FMI up

from the small, scandal-ridden Division of Investigation into an organization with 17,345 employes, including 7,345 agents. The vast hole on Pennsylvania Avenue which one day will be FBI head-fquarters is Hoover's monument.

Yet such an organization neither was built nor is maintained without cost. However has demanded — and, until recent years, received — the complete personal loyalty of his agents. This has led, according to fairly well substantiated reports, to bureaucratic rigidity, sycophancy and an old-fashioned approach to the problems of an increasingly complex society. The Olympian status which Hoover has achieved is well-illustrated by the fact that the director has allowed no logical successor to emerge within the Bureau.

is his support, is either emotional or politically oriented. Those who oppose him fear that, with the development of computerized data banks, too much power will be concentrated in the hands of an elderly conservative who has shown little tolerance for political dissent. Those who support him do so because they feel he is just the sort of man who should be runaning the FBI at a time such as this.

Hoover's opponents have one point on their side: In recent months, he has been showing his age in a new and unseemly irascibility. His attack on former Attorney General Ramsey Clark, his implication of the Berrigan brothers in a bombing conspiracy two months before their indictment and his dismissal "with prejudice" (preventing him from getting another law enforcement job) of former Special Agent Jack Shaw, who had been imildly critical of Hoover, are disquieting signs.

we also believe that the task of finding a successor will and should be an exhaustive, time-consuming process, and some in which Hoover might want to play a part. his Supreme Court nominations, seems to us that the man should be drawn from outside the Eureau, possibly from the judiciary. What is needed is a man who commands the respect and trust of the widest possible spectrum of modern society. Consideration might also be given to the possibility of separating, as most countries do, the FBI's criminal investigatory functions from surveillance of allegedly treasonable or seditious activities.

But these are matters of detail. The basic point is that, should Boggs' accusations remain unsubstantiated, Hoover, after a decent interval, should announce his intention to retire so that the search for a successor can begin.

In his unprecedented half-century of service to the country, for which each of us is in his debt, Hoover has earned many laurels. In a democracy, no man is indispensable. It is time for J. Edgar Hoover to rest on those laurels.

"I guess you might say we're the welcoming party for everything," said one of the guests at Senators owner Bob Short's pregame luncheon.

strawberry shortcake the fans bought hot dogs and popeorn from vendors glad to be back at work.

Secretary Laird, who occupied the presidential box with five children of POWs, smiled as the fans booed his introduction and read a telegram from President Nixon, who had attended opening game last year with his family.

But none could have been more pleased at the Nats' performance than 58-year-old Bobby O'Neill, a season ticket holder who says he's been to 459 base-

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

Mr. BOGGS thinks this is the second time Congressman LONG saw him about the claim, when he brought him a copy of this letter.

Mr. ECGGS did not consider these contacts by Congressmon LONG as pressure or in any way improper.

Mr. ECGGS stated that no improper pressure was applied to him in any way by anyone in connection with the claim of Faltimore Contractors, Inc., and most definitely no pressure was applied by ECGGS on the Architect of the Capitol, the House Office Building Commission, or anyone else, in connection with the claim.

Mr. EDGGS remarked that his own appraisal of the claim of Baltimore Contractors, Inc., judging by what he heard and without any detailed knowledge of it, was that he did not think much of it.

in. BOGGS stated that he has known VICTOR FRENKIL a long time, and has had many occasions to meet him casually in his (BOGGS') capacity as Vice Chairman of the Democratic National Committee.

Mr. BCGCS recalled that he met FRENKIL one night in the Mayflower Hotel in the company of Congressman EMANUEL CHLLER; this was about the time of the letter from CLARENCE LONG and other members of the Maryland Delegation. FRENKIL said something about the claim, but BCGCS immediately told FRENKIL "that's the ran to talk to you" (referring to Mr. CELLER, who was a member of the House Office Building Commission.)

As to whether he saw WRENKIL on May 4, 1967, at a lawn party, this is entirely possible. BOGGS could not specifically recall attending a dinner on July 12, 1967, hosted by WRENKIL.

BOCGS stated that to understand the number of eccasions on which he had seen FRENKIL, one would have to realize that FRENKIL was seen at every Democratic function held in the Washington area and BOGGS has seen FRENKIL at Democratic functions elsewhere. As to "meetings" at which FRENKIL may have seen BOGGS, BOGGS remarked that such "meetings" would be somewhat as follows: BOGGS would see FICTOR FRENKIL sitting in his reception room. He would may, "Mi Vic," whereupon they would walk down the hallway together. BOGGS remarked, "That's a meeting."

With regard to telephone calls to BOGGS's residence from the offices of BC, during the period 1966 to 1969, BOGGS stated that FREMEIL may have called him once or twice at home, and may have called his residence on occasion and talked with Mrs. BOGGS. BOGGS could not recall anything significant with regard to any of the calls, or anything which would be specifically pertinent to matters concerning which he was being interviewed.

With regard to improvements performed by BC to BOGGS's residence at 5315 Bradley Boulevard, Bethesda, Meryland, in 1966, BOGGS advised as follows. The first time BOGGS was aware of many information from records of BC pertaining to this job, was within the past few weeks when being subposmed by a Federal Grand Jury in Baltimore, Maryland, and made evailable to TOM BOGGS, depics of the records furnished to the Grand Jury concerning improvements to BOGGS's residence.

BOGGS said that in early 1966, he asked MARKIL, on he knew was engaged in home improvement work, as well: as other contract work, to recommend someone to Min to do Dome remodeling work to his residence. BOGGS's wife had previously getten bids for this work, the prices for which ran from \$15,000 up to low \$20,000 figures. The work consisted of converting a "one and one-half car garage" into a kitchen, and adding on to a porch. The work on the porch on the back of the house consisted of adding ten to fifteen feet to the porch and enclosing the entire porch with glass, and a stairway at the back of the porch. BOGGS stated he had no written contract with FRENKIL concerning this work. BOGGS stated that in retrospect perhaps he should have had a contract, particularly inassuch as the work turned out to be: very unsatisfactory. The paint job was "terrible" and the air-conditioning was "terrible", and he even had complaints on the plumbing. He complained about the work to FRENKIL, especially about the paint job. The paint job had to be some over. BOGGS remarked that the unsatisfactory work by BC might have occasioned some of the phone calls referred to above. He noted that these were phone calls to his residence, and that his wife, Mrs. BOCCS, was the one who handled most of the matters in connection with the remodeling work.

BOGGS said that because of the fact that FRENKIL/BC had been the contractor for the improvements to BOGGS's residence, BOGGS made it a particular point never to make any representation of my kind, to any person, with respect to any contract involving BC. BOGGS noted that the meeting, which he had arranged in early 1969, concerning the BC claim, was arranged at the request of Boggressman CLARENCE LONG of Maryland.

BOGGS stated that VICTOR FRENKIL is efinitely not a constituent of his. BOGGS remarked that in his position as a Congressional leader, other congressman are constituents of his.

BOGGS said he had no investment interest or joint venture interest whatsoever with VICTOR FRENKIL or BC, or any of FRENKIL's associates. BOGGS has no financial interest in FRENKIL's business whatsoever.

BOGGS stated that he never received any money or gratuities of any kind, or campaign contributions from VICTOR PREMIL or BC.

BOGGS remarked that he has received exples of letters which ERENIL sent to other persons, copies of which he designated for BOGGS. BOGGS said he threw away such copies of letters and did not act upon them in any way. He said that he sent no letters to VICTOR FRENKIL or BC, with the exception

Congressman Boggs stated he wanted to make it clear that there had been absolutely no meeting of the minds whatsoever between him and Frenkil that he. Boggs, would later do favors for Frenkil in return for any services performed by Frenkil's company. Boggs stated he had never performed any services for Frenkil whatsoever. He admitted that Congressmen Long of Maryland had approached him relative to holding a meeting in his, Boggs', office regarding additional payments that Frenkil felt was due him, over and above the original contract price, concerning the House Office Building garage. Boggs stated that numerous Congressmen came to him in his role as Majority Whip and asked him to hold such meetings. He stated he left this particular meeting long before it was over and, as a matter of fact, the only part he played in this meeting was to recommend to Songitude and others present that Frenkil take his claim up with The General Accounting Office. He stated that on each occasion in the past when Frenkil has called him relative to this matter, he has referred Frenkil to The General Accounting Office. He reiterated that he had done nothing for Frenkil in exchange for any services Frenkil might have allegedly performed for him.

Congressman Boggs stated he considered Frenkil to be a "name dropper" and a "positioner." He stated that Frenkil was attracted to people in high official positions and that he often had trouble avoiding him. He stated that nevertheless he owed Frenkil nothing.

Congressman Boggs stated he realized that he had already been interviewed by FBI Agents but wondered whether or not if could give him any advice as to further action to take on his part. I told him I could give him no advice in the least and this entire matter was under investigation as a result of instructions from U. S. Attorney Sachs, Baltimore, Maryland, and Assistant Attorney General Will Wilson of the Department of Justice. I told him that of necessity the facts he had given me would be made a matter of record and placed in FBI files. He stated he had no objection to this procedure and that, as a matter of fact, he had nothing whatsoever to hide. SACHS recommended prosecution of Senator RUSSELL B. LONG, ROBERT EDWARD HUNTER, DANIEL B. BREWSTER, NATHAN VOLDSHEN, VICTOR FRENKIL and BERNARD SHEPARD (Vice President of Baltimore Contractors, Inc.) for conspiracy to defraud the United States in violation of Section 371, Title 18, United States Code.

MR. SACHS said in his prosecutive memorandum that the final analysis of the Congressmen HALE BOGGS - VICTOR FRENKIL relationship could not be written until MR. and MRS. BOGGS were questioned in light of all information now available.) It was mentioned that the Grand Jury had indicated that they would like to invite Congressman and MRS. BOGGS to the Grand Jury where they could be questioned more fully and under oath about these matters.

MR. SACHS was informed April 16, 1970 by the Department of Justice that the Department had concluded that on the basis of present evidence, there should be no indictment of Senator RUSSELL B. LONG, ROBERT HUNTER or former Senator DANIEL B. BREWSTER.

MR. SACHS was also informed by the Department that the decision was his (SACHS) as to whether or not to indict VICTOR FRENKIL, BERNARD SHEPARD and NATHAN VOLOSHEN. MR. SACHS explained on April 16, 1970 that it was his intention to seek indictments charging these three individuals. MR. SACHS had not yet decided as to the specific charges to be brought against these three individuals. As to Congressman BOGGS, MR. SACHS advised that the Department does not desire that MR. BOGGS be invited to the Grand Jury and MR. SACHS said this would not be done. MR. SACHS said it was his intention, at the moment, to take a deposition from Congressman BOGGS.

The proposed indictment submitted to the Department 5/5/70, by Sachs, outlined in detail numerous contacts Frenkil alimedly had with Brewster, Long and Boggs in his efforts to have them exert pressure of the Architect of the Capitol. The Department responded to Sachs that it desired all references to one and Boggs be deleted from the indictment. Sacha is objecting to this. Our Baltimore office has just learned from George Beall, the new United States Attorney (USA) in Baltimore, that he has conferred with Department officials and has orally recommended to the Department going ahead with an indictment in this case. The Special Federal Grand Jury (FGJ) met briefly 6/10/70, at which time the foreman made a public statement that if the Attorney General (AG) did not authorize prosecution the FGJ would request the court to make public a sealed draft indictment included in its presentment to the court on 5/28/70. The AG reportedly plans to make known his position during the week of 6/15/70.

Investigation in this case was conducted at request of Department and concerns alleged payoffs and other favors by Victor Frenkil (head of Baltimore Contractors, Inc. (BCI)) to former Senator Brewster (D-Md.), Senator Long (D-La.), and Congressman Boggs (D-La.), in return for their exerting pressure on the Architect of the Capitol to approve claims of Frenkil totaling more than \$5 million growing out of the construction of an underground parking garage near the New House Office Building.

Based on extensive Bureau investigation and lengthy grand jury hearings in Baltimore, former USA Sachs (who left office 5/28/70) recommended to the Department the indictment of Brewster, Long, Boggs, Frenkil, BCI and others and conferred with the AG on 5/26/70; however, the AG advised Sachs the following day there was to be no indictment at this time. The AG instructed the new USA review the matter and submit his views. On 5/28/70, the FGJ made a presentment to the court, which was sealed, setting forth its findings and recommendations. A draft indictment was included with the presentment and reportedly names Frenkil and BCI alleging a conspirate to defraud the Government in connection with the underground parking garage project.

This is to advise that our Baltimore office learned this morning (6/15/70) from United States Attorney (USA) Beall, Baltimore, that over the weekend the Department orally instructed him that based on the professional recommendation of the Criminal Division there is to be no indictment in this case. Henry Petersen, Criminal Division, called during evening of 6-20-70, to advise Department has learned New York Times allegedly has surreptitiously obtained a copy of secret indictment returned by Baltimore Federal Grand Jury in captioned matter and proposes to publish its content in the New York City edition but not in the Washington, D. C., edition on Sunday, 6-21-70. Petersen stated Attorney General (AG) desired FBI New York Office obtain copy of this newspaper and have it delivered before 9:00 a.m., Sunday, 6-21-70, to AG's Watergate apartment and to his Office in the Justice Building.

A copy of the Sunday edition of the New York Times was delivered to the AG's apartment as requested but no one was available in his Justice Department Office to accept a copy of the paper delivered there. There is a front page story on the matter (see attached) and it appears that the story is based on the Baltimore Grand Jury findings as set forth in the attached draft of the grand jury's proposed indictment.

BACKGROUND: The Baltimore Federal Grand Jury on 6-17-70, delivered to U.S. District Judge Thomsen a sealed presentment in the form of an indictment signed by the Foreman of the grand jury since the AG had refused to authorize U.S. Attorney to sign the indictment. The indictment recommends that Victor Frenkil (contractor for FBI Academy) be indicted for alleged attempts to influence various individuals including former Senator Brewster, Senator Long and Congressman Hale Boggs to exert pressure on Architect of the Capitol to favorably settle five million dollars in claims Frenkil had outstanding in connection with construction of Capitol Garage. On 6-16-70, Frenkil's attorneys obtained a temporary injunction from Fourth Circuit Court of Appeals restraining U.S. District Judge Thomsen from making public the foregoing grand jury recommendation.

Voloshen last month pleaded guilty in New York to other federal charges of using the Speaker's selfice for influence peddling.

The summary of the preentment also named Bernard Shepard, a vice president of Baltimore Contractors, Inc., as coconspirator, but there was o grand jury recommendaion that he be indicted.

Beall, like his predecessor, tephen H. Sachs, who left ofice May 31, had recommended to the Justice Department that n indictment be returned in be case. Both were barred by litchell from signing the in-



On July 8, 1970, Judge THOMSEN announced a decision not to pursue this particular matter further, although he commented that he does not believe the First Amendment or any other laws of the United States prevents the Court from compelling representatives of the New York Times to make a limited disclosure of the source or sources of the information they received. Judge THOMSEN commented that he had decided not to take any action against the New York Times, as he was satisfied that no member of the staff of the United States District Court, Baltimore, and no member of the Grand Jury had furnished a copy of the proposed indictment to the New York Times.

Judge THOMSEN had commented earlier on June 22, 1970, that he had been informed by legal counsel representing VICTOR FRENKIL on June 20, 1970, that a member of the Grand Jury had furnished a copy of the proposed indictment to the New York Times.

Synopsis

The Special Grand Jury at Baltimore, Maryland, has returned an indictment charging VICTOR FRENKIL and Baltimore Contractors, Inc. with violation of Title 18, Section 371, USC, Conspiracy to Defraud the United States. The indictment was not signed by the USA, Baltimore, on instructions from the Department of Justice, WDC, and Chief Judge ROSZEL THOMSEN ruled on 6/22/70 that there is no case holding that a Grand Jury has the power to present a valid indictment without approval of the Government, and that the indictment here could not properly be considered valid.

### DETAILS:

### At Baltimore, Maryland

On May 13, 1970, former United States Attorney (USA)
STEPHEN H. SACHS advised that he had been informed by
the U. S. Department of Justice, Washington, D. C. that
it was the Department's desire to have the references
to SENATOR RUSSELL B. LONG. CONGRESSMAN HALE BOGGS,
and
Mr. SACHS' proposed indictment of VICTOR FRENKIL and
Baltimore Contractors, Inc. Mr. SACHS stated he had
consented to the deletion of the reference to

On May 28, 1970, Mr. SACHS advised that the Department had not authorized him to sign the proposed indictment of VICTOR FRENKIL and Baltimore Contractors, Inc., and

that it would not be signed by him. He explained that it was apparent that any indictment without the signature of the USA was not valid. Mr. SACHS' last day in office as USA was May 28, 1970, and he advised on that day that he had been told it was the Department's desire to have the proposed indictment reviewed by the incoming USA, GEORGE BEALL.

On May 28, 1970, the Deputy Foreman of the Special Grand Jury, hearing testimony during the past year on this case, made a statement in public to the Court, that the Grand Jury was prepared to present an indictment charging certain individuals as a result of its investigation. However, the Grand Jury had been informed by USA SACHS that the Attorney General had so far refused to authorize him to sign the indictment and without his signature, the indictment would not be effective. The Deputy Foreman said that Mr. SACHS had fully concurred in the Grand Jury's judgment.

In conclusion, the Deputy Foreman told the Court that in view of the above, the Grand Jury was returning a "presentment" to the Court with a request that this, or a similar charge, be drawn and signed by appropriate officials of the Department of Justice as soon as possible.

The draft indictment was presented to the Court in a sealed envelope by the Deputy Foreman. The Court unsealed the envelope, read the indictment, and instructed that it be resealed for the time being.

The court instructed Mr. SACHS to send a copy of the presentment to the Attorney General and suggested the Attorney General, after giving it consideration, make, through his representatives, whatever responses to the Grand Jury he deems appropriate. The court noted that it knew of no clear binding authority as to whether this presentment should be made public or should be kept secret and instructed the Attorney General to inform the court within one week from May 28, 1970 whether the Department of Justice wishes the court to keep the presentment secret or make it public. After hearing from the Department and considering all relevant factors, the court said it would decide whether the presentment should be made public or kept secret.

On a motion prepared by the Department of Justice and filed by USA GEORGE BEALL with the Federal Court in Baltimore on June 3, 1970, a request was made that the Attorney General be given until June 17, 1970 to file an answer to the court as to whether or not the "presentment" in this case should be made public or kept secret.

On June 11, 1970, USA GEORGE BEALL advised that he had informed the Department of Justice that it was his belief there should be an indictment in this case as proposed by the Grand Jury.

On June 15, 1970, Mr. BEALL advised that he had been informed by the Department that based on the professional recommendation of the Criminal Division of the Department, there should be no indictment in this case.

On June 17, 1970, the Special Grand Jury returned an indictment to the Court charging VICTOR FRENKIL and Baltimore Contractors, Inc. with conspiracy to defraud the United States in violation of Title 18, Section 371, USC. This indictment was not signed by the USA, Baltimore, and Mr. BEALL advised he had not done so because he was not authorized to do so by the Department of Justice. This indictment was signed by the Deputy Foreman of the Grand Jury.

There was no public hearing on June 17, 1970, inasmuch as legal counsel representing the defendants had filed "Petition for Writ of Prohibition" with the Fourth Circuit Court of Appeals, June 16, 1970. The Fourth Circuit issued an "Order to Show Cause" instructing Judge THOMSEN not to conduct any public Court session concerning the Grand Jury deliberations pending at that time in this case.

Chief Judge THOMSEN, delivered a lengthy opinion on June 22, 1970 at a public session including sequence of events in this case during the past several months, and the fact that on June 17, 1970 the Grand Jury had returned an indictment to the Court, which was signed by the Grand Jury Foreman, but which was not signed by the USA on instructions not to do so by the Attorney General.

Judge THOMSEN noted that there is no case holding that a Grand Jury has the power to present a valid indictment without approval of the Government and that the indictment here could not properly be considered a valid indictment.

The Court ruled that the Grand Jury did have the power to make a presentment and to present an indictment to the Court such as was done in this case. He commented that this serves a need not available by any other procedure adding that the public has the right to know, etc. The court then ruled that it would make the indictment public except for certain portions which it commented were not in the public interest as it involved people not charged in the indictment. The Court said it would also make a public disclosure of the Attorney General's reason given to the Court for not prosecuting this case. The court said it would immediately start to work on what portions would be deleted and would thereafter make the remaining portions of the indictment public.

USA GEORGE BEALL advised on July 16, 1970, that he did not desire to render a final prosecutive opinion on this case at this time, pending completion of developments on related matters.

Anderson's insinuation that the Director was not entirely candid in denying existence of surveillances on Congressmen is typical of the sensationalist reporting for which Anderson is so well known. Anderson has made use of semantics in his article in a deceiving way.

There are numerous instances where Congressmen have had conversations monitored when they happened to make telephone calls to individuals or establishments covered by electronic surveillances which had approval of the Attorney General. But this is not what Anderson intimates.

### REPRESENTATIVE HALE BOGGS

During our bribery investigation of former Senator Daniel B. Brewster (D-Maryland) and collateral grand jury testimony, evidence was developed that Congressman Hale Boggs (D-Louisiana) allegedly used his influence to have the architect of the Capitol approve payment of claims totaling over five million dollars to Victor Frenkil, growing out of Frenkil's construction of a Government parking garage adjacent to the new House office building. We also learned that in 1966, Frenkil remodeled Congressman's Boggs' suburban Maryland residence at a cost of \$45,082.95, but only billed Boggs \$21,000, for the job. The investigation of Brewster and inquiries regarding Boggs were at the specific request of the Attorney General. During this investigation, we did not have Boggs under surveillance nor did we ever tap his telephones. Former U.S. Attorney Sachs had recommended Boggs et al be indicted; however, Sachs stated this was not approved by the Attorney General. .

Anderson centends that Boggs was one of several legislators whose names were picked up on wiretaps during the FBI's investigation of fixer Nathan Voloshen and Ex-House of Represents tive Aide Martin Sweig. It is pointed out that no wiretaps or any other electronic surveillance devices were utilized in the Voloshen-Sweig investigation.

In addition to the foregoing, we interviewed Boggs on 1/2/70 and 2/24/70, concerning political contributions to him of \$1,000 in 1966, by officials of the Guaranty Bank and Trust Company, and \$500 in 1968, by officials of the Rapides Bank and Trust Company, both located in Alexandria, Louisiana, in violation of Federal statute which prohibits banks from making such political contributions. Boggs was not aware of the foregoing contributions and referred our Agents to his campaign treasurer who verified receipt of these contributions. Bank officials of Guaranty Bank and Trust Company pleaded guilty to charges of making political contributions to Boggs and other State of Louisiana political leaders, and officials of the Rapides Bank and Trust Company are awaiting prosecution on similar charges.

In October, 1968, at the request of the Department, we conducted investigation of allegations made by Boggs to Mr. DeLoach that he was offered a bribe of unlimited campaign expenses by officials of Occidental Petroleum Corporation and its subsidiary, Hooker Chemical Corporation, if he would not attend a hearing in Maine to oppose an application for granting a foreign free trade zone in Maine in which Occidental would build a refinery. We conducted extensive investigation of this allegation and the Department in May, 1969, advised it had closed its file on this matter since there was no evidence to indicate a violation of the Federal Bribery statute.

During the course of the previously noted investigations we did not have Boggs under surveillance nor did we ever tap his phone.

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### BUGGS TO ASSERT A TAP WAS FOUND

Plans to Tell House Today That Phone Man Saw Evidence of Device

WASHINGTON, April 21—
Representative Hale Boggs of
Louisiana, the House majority
leader, will tell his colleagues
tomorrow that a telephone
company investigator found a
tap on the Boggs home telephone last summer.

According to sources close to Mr. Boggs, he will explain that he, his family and members of his staff became suspicious of interference on the telephone at his home in Bethesda, Md., and asked the Chesapeake & Potomac Telephone Company to investigate.

According to the sources, Mr. Boggs will tell the House that the investigator from the phone company found that there had been a tap on the phone, but that it had been removed before his inspection.

Mr. Eoggs will also reportedly say that the telephone company wrote in its official report to him that there had been no tap. He will add, however, that he has learned that it is the policy of the company to deny the existence of a tap if the tap was placed by the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

The Congressman will reportedly make an hour-long speech to support the charges he made on April 5 that the F.B.L has tapped the telephones of Congressmen. In that brief speech on the House floor, he called for the resignation of J. Edgar Hoover, the director of the F.B.L

As of tonight, the sources said, Mr. Boars was trying to decide whether to include in tomerrow's speech the transcripts of tape recordings said to have been made by the F.B.I. of conversations involving other members of congress.

The sources said Mr. Boggs had the F.B.I. transcripts but had not decided whether to include them in his speech, since they involved other officials. The sources also said the conversations involved F.B.I. informants, so the bureau might have obtained the consent of one or more parties to the conversations before recording them. The Supreme Court decided recently that such "consentual" eavesdropping did not require a court order.

In his speech tomorrow, Mr. Boggs will reportedly call again for the resignation of Mr. Hoover. To one of those who worked on the speech, it importance lies not in the evidence that Mr. Boggs will adduce to support his earlier charge but in the fact that the Congressman is continuing to call for the resignation of Mr. Hoover.

Nevertheless, the focus of public attention tomorrow will clearly be on the evidence Mr. Boggs submits to his colleagues. From April 5 until now, the majority leader has been silent, promising that he would provide evidence in time.

Even the person who participated in the drafting of the speech conceded that it was unlikely to satisfy those who expected or wanted "big evidence."

At some point in the speech which will repeat a number of charges already made elsewhere against the F.B.I.—Mr. Boggs will reportedly explain how he was moved to give his first speech on the F.B.I. Sources close to him say he will attribute it to a personal experience several days before.

Mr. Boggs will say that two highly placed career officials of the Justice Department who had worked in and with the F.B.I. came to see him. He will not identify the two mea to the House, but will relate that they fold him the F.B.I. was being destroyed because it was not being used to fight crime but the protect the position of Mr. Hoover.

Not Aware, He Said

Mr. Boggs has since said he was not aware that the work on his home was being done for less than the usual price.

Tomorrow, the sources said, Mr. Boggs will also mention that the F.B.I. sent an informant with a hidden tape recorder into the Capitol office of Representative John Dowdy, a Democrat of Texas, and reseased conversations between the two without the knowledge of Mr. Dowdy. As has been reported, the F.B.I. also monitored and recorded—from the informant's end—telephone ocnversations between the informant and Mr. Dowdy.

i The F.B.I. took these actions in the Dowdy case with the approval of Attorney General Mitchell and with court orders signed by United States District Judge Roszel C. Thomsen. Mr. Dowdy was subsequently indicted on charges of perjury and accepting a \$25,000 bribe and is scheduled to go on trial May 7 in Baltimore.

It has been determined from various sources on Capitol Hill that Congressman Boggs probably will deliver his much publicized speech to offer his "proof positive" concerning his allegations that the FBI has tapped Congressional telephones beginning around 5 p.m. on Thursday, 4/22/71. Congressman Larry Hogan (R - Md.) also has reserved one hour's time for that afternoon and had intended his time to follow that of Congressman Boggs. Boggs, however, apparently did not officially request the time until sometime after he had publicly announced his intention to do so; hence, Hogan's request actually preceded Boggs' request and Hogan is scheduled to speak first. It is apparent Boggs is attempting to arrange his time as late as possible on Thursday which is the last day the House of Representatives will meet this week, thus attempting to avoid the critical response by other Congressmen.

As of Tuesday evening (4/20/71), various sources on the Hill reported Boggs apparently had not as yet prepared a text for his speech. These sources advised that the best information available indicates Boggs will discuss the FBI's use of a body recorder in taping conversations

the obtaining of toll call records from the telephone company on the phones in his office and the office of former Speaker McCormack. It also was reported that he may bring up an allegation that former Senator Daniel B. Brewster (D - Md.), who was indicted for bribery in Washington on 12/1/69, was subjected to FBI wiretapping. The charges against Brewster have been dismissed by Federal Court on the grounds of Congressional immunity; however, this is pending on appeal to the Supreme Court. The General Investigative Division has advised that no telephone tap or electronic devices of any type were used in the Brewster investigation. A report also was circulated on the Hill that Boggs may allege the FBI had induced Capitol Hill telephone operators to serve as informants concerning Congressional telephone calls (this report was recorded in the Bishop to Mohr memorandum of 4/20/71 and is being checked out by the Washington Field Office).

Wallace Johnson (Associate Deputy Attorney General) advised his staff is preparing information to refute the various charges Boggs is expected to raise, with the possible thought in mind that Minority Leader Gerald Ford can use this information to immediately refute Boggs' charges on the House floor.

The matter of Boggs' charges against the FBI has been discussed with a number of friendly Congressmen and we have been assured they will be present when Boggs makes his speech and will attempt to immediately challenge him. Several Congressmen have indicated that if Boggs fails to provide specific proof of actual wiretapping on the part of the FBI, they will attempt to get the floor, point out his failure to substantiate his earlier charges, and insist that he owes an apology to the Director, the FBI, and the American people.

One report also was received late on 4/20/71 alleging Boggs had approached Congressman Cornelius Gallagher (D - N.J.) to see if he would join Boggs in attacking the FBI. Gallagher's connections with members of organized crime have been publicity disclosed.

CONGRESSMAN HALE BCGGS (D-LA) APPEARANCE ON "TODAY" SHOW 4/23/71

Congressman Boggs appeared on the "Today" show this morning and reiterated charges he made on the floor of Congress yesterday. He said the Justice Department had denied a small segment of the charges he made on April the 5th, but they had not denied other charges he considered much more serious, such as the infiltration of college organizations and ther organizations. He said the FBI was using the tactics of the Gestapo and the Soviet Secret Police.

He claimed that in August, 1970, he had discovered that the phone at his residence was tapped but later the telephone company sent him a letter stating that there had been no tap. He alleged that this was the telephone company's policy when the tap was placed by the FBI.

Bill Mun, the Washington edita for the "Today" show, stated that; Congressman Hogan had said there was no way to detect a tap once it had been removed. Boggs replied that he was no electronics expert but he was satisfied in his mind that his phone had been tapped. He then read from the Director's letter to Senator Scott in which we denied any wiretaps or surveillance of members of Congress. Boggs then mentioned that the FBI had surveilled Congressmen Libonati and Neal Gallagher. He stated the Justice Department "leaked" that the most brazen type of surveillance had been used on Congressman Dowdy and he referred to it as a case of absolute entrapment. Boggs said that former U. S. Attorney Sachs first denied this but later admitted it, explaining that it was not clear what the Justice Department meant by electronic surveillance.

Timro asked if he had any indication that it was the FBI that tapped his phone and Boggs replied 'No I don't. I'm not so much concerned about that. What I am concerned about is a pattern of what the FBI is up to." He then referred to afficavits in the cases of Senator Brewster and Nathan Voloshen in which the 58-6996-


Justice Department claimed that wiretaps had been used in the interest of national defense. He said the FBI had seized telephone records of Speaker of the House McCormack as well as Boggs' own telephone records for the past four years. The FBI then called some of these people and Boggs made the statement that the FBI may have bugged some of those lines.

Boggs then repeated his allegations that he was concerned about FBI telephone surveillance, infiltration of college organizations, labor unions, black organizations, business organizations and churches. He said the attack made by the FBI on liberal members of the Catholic Church was unbelievable and since the Director countenanced these acts the President and Mr. Mitchell should ask for his resignation. He claimed that every potential Democratic candidate has asked for the Director's resignation.

When asked if he thought there would be a Presidential Commission to investigate the FBI, Boggs said no, the President was satisfied with Mr. Hoover. Boggs concluded by stating that he hoped if a commission was not appointed that the Judicial Committee would make a very thorough investigation of these charges.

Bepartment and Bureau held that any interceptions of members of Congress were through inadvertance on devices installed for National Security coverage.

Boggs criticizes Bureau's investigation of Haynsworth and Carswell nominations. It is noted in Haynsworth and Carswell cases no investigations were conducted when they were nominated to Supreme Court (this has not been disclosed), and in earlier investigations it was not policy of Bureau to inquire into racial interests and other matters brought out in committee hearings.

Boggs also touched on campus informants, Muskie allegation regarding Earth Day rallies, FBI strategy of fear, daughter of Congressman Reuss and FBI harassment of Catholic liberals. With exception of the Muskie allegation rehashed, the other baseless charges and allegations were undoubtedly based on information contained in documents stolen during burglary of the Media Resident Agency.

The foregoing analysis was made by the General Investigative Division, Administrative Division, Special Investigative Division and Domestic Intelligence Division, and attached is each Division's detailed analysis of Boggs' remarks as it relates to the work of each Division.



## DETAILS COMMENTS OF GENERAL INVESTIGATIVE DIVISION

Allegation of Wiretapping: On page 8 Boggs charges that in summer of 1970, he became suspicious of interference on his home telephones and had the telephone company check his lines. According to Boggs, the phone company reported there were no taps on his telephones and he claims he subsequently learned that telephone company denied the existence of a tap if such has been placed by the FBI.



On pages 12 and 13, Boggs alleges, but offers no proof, various episodes of wiretapping and electronic surveillance of former and present members of Congress, such as, former Senators Ralph Yarborough, Stephen Young, William Benton, and Wayne Morris and present Senators Joseph Montoya, Birch Bayh, and Charles Percy.

We have never tapped the telephones of any members of Congress or used any illegal electronic devices on a Congressman.



Obtaining of Telephone Toll Call Records: On page 11
Boggs alleges that FBI Agents obtained, without his knowledge,
all telephone calls placed from his private office for a
period of four years. He also claims that we seized telephone
call records of former Congressman John McCormack (D - Mass),

During the Bribery investigation of former Senator Daniel B, Brewster (D - Md.) and others

This investigation concerned alleged payoffs to Brewster, Boggs and others in return for their influence in settling claims totalling over \$5 million growing out of the construction of a Government parking garage by Victor Frenkil, a Baltimore, Maryland, contractor.

Boggs claims we used these toll call records to contact his constituents to sew seeds of suspicion and create a climate of fear in his home district.


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#### COMMENTS OF ADMINISTRATIVE DIVISION

On Page 16, Boggs states, "In my mind, in the minds of most of my contemporaries, it has long been fixed that Agents of the Bureau were all men who held degrees in law or accounting. That is what we were told; that is what we have believed, yet, the reality is very different. Only one-third of the Agents are lawyers or accountants. For a decade the standards have been falling. This ought not to be."

As of 7/1/70, 30% of the Agents were law trained or accountants. For years, the Bureau has been considering applicants with four-year degrees and three years of professional, executive or complex investigative experience, as well as applicants with foreign language ability or scientific backgrounds. As far back as 1963, the Director, in his Appropriations testimony, responded to a question as to whether Special Agents are lawyers and accountants by stating, "They are lawyers, accountants, scientists, linguists who possess some special qualifications needed in our work." Likewise, for years, the qualifications statement for the Special Agent position has set forth the modified requirements. By substituting specialized experience for the law or accounting degree, we have in no way lowered the standards and, in fact, have never had applicants with higher personal qualifications and experience appointed to the Special Agent position. A survey made in August, 1970, revealed that the 7,563 Agents then on the rolls had a total of 9,299 degrees and included in that total were 2,106 advanced degrees such as law degrees. Masters degrees and Doctors degrees. The great majority of our applicants have had military service of a responsible nature.

On Page 17 Boggs distorts the facts of the matter involving former Special Agent John F. Shaw, Sr. of the New York Office. He states "it ought not to be that agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation should be rummaging through wastepaper baskets to collect evidence incriminating another agent of having failed to report on the classroom views of a professor, as was the case with Agent Shaw. It ought not to be that a loyal agent, such as Mr. Shaw, should be preemptorily and punitively transferred to a distant outpost in Montana to appease the Director's personal petulance. It ought not to be that the Director of the Bureau--or the Director of any agency in the government -- should be permitted to demand that a college dismiss a professor for views expressed in the classroom critical of the Director himself."



On Page 17 Boggs states, "Around the oldest head of any agency in Government there is clustered a small and unchanging guard of old cronies and old friends whose positions are dependent solely upon their relationship with the Director himself.

"For a decade, the brightest talents within the organization have been leaving, unable to secure or to expect advancement in their careers."


The Bureau has one of the most dynamic, rewarding career development programs found in the Government today. Turnover of our Special Agent personnel has remained at a fantastically low rate. For Calendar Year 1970, Special Agent turnover was 4.4% and excluding retirements and deaths, was 2.9%; thus, conclusively rebutting the false inferences by Boggs.

Representative Boggs has asserted that former Speaker of the House John McCormack had his time taken up in endless hostil interviews by the FBI, which interviews were conducted without compassion, respect, or honor.

Boggs claims that he has seen the FBI build its legion of informers and spread them through the structure of our society's vital private institutions. While this statement would appear to have no application to our use of criminal informants, it is emphasized that in our handling of criminal informants we pay close attention to control and strict adherence to the due process principle in careful avoidance of any form of entrapment.

#### COMMENTS OF DOMESTIC INTELLIGENCE DIVISION

#### INFORMANT ACTIVITY

Boggs makes reference to Bureau informant activity on pages 6 and 18. On page 6 he declares that the Director did not challenge his statement of April 5th or deny that the Bureau is stationing Agents on college campuses to infiltrate student organizations. On page 18 he states that the FBI should not unloose paid informers and conspirators on campuses to organize and encourage the very demonstrations which its Agents are reporting to demonstrate the Bureau's alertness and effectiveness. Of course, the Bureau has never stationed Agents on college campuses at any time. This charge is nothing more than an extension of the hysterical allegations and assertions which were voiced by Senator George McGovern prior to Senate passage of legislation extending the Bureau's investigative jurisdiction on college campuses in connection with bombings.

Boggs has likely injected a hodge-podge of misinformation which has been widely circulated as the result of publication and other exposure of various FBI documents stolen in the Media Resident Agency incident, several of which refer to campus informant or investigative activity on college campuses. Boggs groundless charges are nothing more than an attempt to camouflage his own failure to support his earlier charges.

#### ALLEGATION REGARDING SENATOR MUSKIE

Boggs' rehash of the earlier charges on page 14 of improper FBI coverage of Earth Day rallies, 4/22/70, is but another miserable attempt to rally congressional support to his desperation effort to salvage his political future. It has already been adequately shown to the public that the FBI did not cover Muskie, but rather the radicals appearing on the same platform. This incident requires no further refutation.

#### DAUGHTER OF CONGRESSMAN REUSS

On page 17 Boggs deplored the surveillance of the children of Members of Congress and he stated that this was done in the case of the daughter of Congressman Reuss. This is another instance of Boggs' use of data which was stolen from the Media Resident Agency.

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#### ALLEGED FBI FEAR STRATEGY

On page 15 Boggs refers to formal memoranda which discloses FBI strategy in establishing surveillance on one campus community, to make the citizens believe that there is an FBI Agent behind every mailbox. Boggs is no doubt referring again to the material taken in the Media burglary. One of the documents taken was an informal routing slip from a Supervisor in the Philadelphia Office to other Agents assigned to New Left matters. This routing slip suggested that more interviews be conducted to enhance paranoia natural to New Left circles that there is an FBI Agent behind every mailbox.

another Media document publicized in the news media which erroneously indicated that the FBI had a professor at Swarthmore College under surveillance. This was not true. As part of investigation to locate two Top Ten fugitives, investigation was conducted to determine if was in contact with the fugitives. Boggs has used both documents to distort the facts and mislead the public to cover his own misdoings.

#### HARASSMENT OF CATHOLIC LIBERALS

On page 18 Boggs refers to Bureau harassment and intimidation of Catholic liberals. This probably refers to current investigation of the EASTCON Case. No searches have ever been made in the matter since physical evidence consists primarily of letters already in possession of the Bureau. Part of Boggs' statement in this regard may well be a deliberate effort to relate and thereby purposely mislead concerning an earlier unrelated fugitive investigation to locate the Berrigan brothers. Those fugitives investigations were extensive and it is noted that Phil Berrigan was finally located hidden behind a wall panel in the Rectory of St. Gregory's Roman Catholic Church in New York City.

REMARKS BY U.S. REP. HALE BOGGS, MAJORITY LEADER

On April 5, before this House, I spoke briefly, expressing certain personal views regarding activities of the Federal Bureau of Investigation and the threat which I believe those activities present to both the spirit and the letter of the Bill of Rights.

On the following day, April 6, in a statement to the press, I amplified the previous remarks, announcing that it was my personal conclusion the Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, Mr. J. Edgar Hoover, should resign from the position which he has held continuously since the administration of President Calvin Coolidge.

As my statement said, that conclusion was reached only "with a great deal of sorrow." For years I have numbered myself among the admirers of this dedicated and able public servant. Under his direction, the Bureau has earned the reputation as one of the most effective investigatory agencies in the world. Mr. hoover's own patriotism and dedication have never been — and are not now — in the slightest question. Having said these things, however, I went on to say in my prepared statement that "the time has come for Mr. Hoover to retire and make way for younger men, equally dedicated to the goals he has set."

That is why I speak at this hour.

Under the order granted on Monday, April 19, I have come before this House to renew my request for Mr. Hoover's resignation, and to set forth before the Members the basis on which that request is regretfully made.

I

At the outset, permit me this personal word.

Although I serve as Majority Leader of this body, I am speaking only for myself. I have not asked and do not ask that members of my own party associate themselves with either my request or my remarks, except as their own private convictions may move them to do so. Other Members, of both my own party and others, may wish to ally themselves with Mr. Hoover and with the defense of the activities which I shall discuss. For each Member, that is a matter of personal choice.

Although Mr. Hoover was first appointed by a Republican Attorney General, and although he is presently serving under a Republican Administration, sixty percent of his tenure has been with Presidents and Attorney Generals of the Democratic Party.

The past, therefore, offers no promise of partisan profit.

Whatever our judgments, they should be and must be taken on the basis of the relevant present, with the national interest transcending any thought of personal or party interest.

II

On this occasion, as on the occasion of my prior remarks before the House, I am frank to say that I speak from the stirrings of a newly awakened and aroused sense of responsibility.

Over the 26 years of my service in this body. I have concerned myself with what seemed to be the great issues of these trying and traumatic times. Coming here in the year of Pearl Harbor, I have deemed it my first responsibility to devote my energies to those things required for the support of freedom and the keeping of peace around the globe. I should also stress that I have never asked for the resignation of a high government official.

In addition, I have concerned myself with the strength and success of the economy, with the expansion of our system of personal financial security, with the effective response of the national government to the infinite needs of a growing nation.

Furthermore, in recent years, I have proudly and willingly given my own best efforts toward securing for all our people those rights as Americans to which the Constitution entitles each of us equally.

For these priorities I have no apologies or regrets.

They remain my active priorities still.

In common with many of you, I believed it inconceivable that so long as we still lived under a government of laws, rather than men there would be or could be any serious or concerted effort to abridge the inalienable rights guaranteed from the beginning of our Government.

In common with many of you, I believed that those who forewarmed us of the directions we were taking were, in some instances, more dangerous than the dangers they warmed against. I responded with impatience to their cries of peril. I was not moved to bestir myself with any great sense of responsibility.

It is apally, though, that waters the roots of tyranny.

Today I see what until now I did not permit myself to see.

Our apathy in this Congress, our silence in this House, our very fear of speaking out in other forums has watered the roots and hastened the growth of a vine of tyranny which is ensnaring that Constitution and Bill of Rights which we are each sworn to defend and uphold.

That is why I have chosen to break my own silence and speak as I believe it is the responsibility of all who serve the American people to speak.

#### III

Almost 200 years ago, soon after the birth of the republic, Thomas Jefferson wrote that:

"The natural progress of things is for liberty to yield and government to gain ground."

Over the years since the mid-century, we have seen that wisdom fulfilled in our midst.

While America's sons have faithfully manned the watchtowers of freedom around the globe, the liberty of our own lives has been yielding steadily before the power, prerogatives and privileges of government.

I point no fingers and place no blame elsewhere.

What has occurred could not have occurred without our consent and complicity here on Capitol Hill.

Congress by Congress, session by session, vote by vote, we have been surrendering our duty of oversight over those Bureaus, Agencies and Organizations within the Federal establishment which are most sensitively involved with the lives and liberties of the people.

The postwar years do not make a proud procession.

Over this period, we have authorized and permitted the Bureaus and Agencies to assume powers that belong to Congress.

We have established the rule of the dossier.

We have conferred respectability upon the informer.

We have sanctioned the use of bribes and payments to citizen to spy upon citizen.

We have consented to the accused being denied the right to confront his accuser.

But, this is not all.

Our consent to these abridgments of our own heritage has emboldened the Bureaus and Agencies both to seek and, at times, simply to assume exemption from review by the people's representatives.

More and more of the public money expended by the American Government to monitor the American people is subject to no effective accounting.

More and more of such clandestine activities are subject to no meaningful reporting.

More and more of the devices employed and premises used for the conduct of such activities are off-limits even to Members of this body where the power of the people reposes.

More and more of the governing guidelines and policies for such enterprises are withheld not only from the Congress but from even the appointive departmental officials charged with responsibility for oversight of the Bureaus and Agencies in question.

No Member of this House knows -- or can know with any certainty -- what the Bureaus and Agencies involved with the liberties of the American people may be doing.

Furthermore, no Member of this House knows -- or can know with any certainly -- which or how many such Bureaus and Agencies may be involved in such activities where, against whom, or for what purpose.

This is the result -- these are the fruits -- of our own silence.

Over the postwar years, we have granted to the elite and secret police within our system vast new powers over the lives and liberties of the people. At the request of the trusted and respected heads of those forces, and on their appeal to the necessities of National security, we have exempted those grants of power from due accounting and strict surveillance. And history has run its inexorable course.

Liberty has yielded.

The power of government has gained commanding ground.

Today, as we in the Congress undertake to recover and restore the people's liberty, we find that it is ourselves who are called to account, ourselves who are under surveillance, ourselves who are prisoners of the power which our silence permitted to come into being.

IV

It is in this context that I want to relate to the Members certain of those things which have occurred in regard to my statement on the floor of the House of Representatives two weeks ago.

That statement, as you recall, was very brief.

I will repeat it in its entirety.

When the FBI taps the telephones of Members of this body and Members of the Senate, when the FBI stations agents on college campuses to infiltrate college organizations, when the FBI adopts the tactics of the Soviet Union and Hitler's Gestapo, then it is time -- it is way past time, Mr. Speaker -- that the present Director thereof no longer be the Director.

The greatest thing we have in this Nation is The Bill of Rights. We are a great country because we are a free country under The Bill of Rights. The way Mr. Hoover is running the FBI today, it is no longer a free country.

The response to those remarks has run a revealing course.

Forthwith, the Attorney General of the United States, John N. Mitchell, issued a statement to the press announcing that I "had no factual basis whatever" for my remarks. Further, he demanded that I retract my own statement, saying additionally of me:

He has made a reckless and cruel attack upon a dedicated American and an organization of loyal and devoted men and women.

This was followed by another public statement from

the Deputy Attorney General of the United States, Mr. Richard Kleindienst.

Mr. Kleindienst denounced my statement as "slanderous, false and irresponsible." Then he went on to make a slanderous statement of his own, suggesting to the press that the Majority Leader "must have been sick or not in possession of his faculties."

The results of such leadership were as calculated.

Within twenty-four hours, my office began receiving hate mail from every part of the country, impugning my patriotism, loyalty and character. Letters of support now outnumber letters of opposition.

Within forty-eight hours, my office was being telephoned by prominent newspaper columnists to whom had been released what they describe as the bureau's "Standard Smear Sheet" -- A dossier of scurrilious accusations against me which was compiled, reproduced and distributed at taxpayers expense through the Department of Justice and elsewhere in the first hours after I spoke.

There was a second line of response, however, which is of significance.

Immediately after my statement to the House, the Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation chose to reply. He did not challenge or deny my statement that the Bureau is stationing agents on college campuses to infiltrate student organizations. He did not attempt to refute my statement that the Bureau is adopting tactics associated with the secret police of totalitarian regimes. He did not mention The Bill of Rights.

The Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation carefully chose to direct his entire rebuttal to the first seventeen words of my statement. Through the offices of the Minority Leader of the United States Senate, the Director released the following unqualified statement.

I want to make a positive assertion that there has never been a wiretap of a Senator's phone or the phone of a Member of Congress since I became Director in 1952, nor has any Member of the Congress or the Senate been under surveillance by the FBI.

Two terms employed in the Director's statement have very precise meanings. "Wiretap" refers to a mechanical

interconnection with a telephone wire and it is a procedure which everyone in Washington must know has been rendered unnecessary and obsolete by technological advances. The term, "surveillance" also has a precise Webster's dictionary meaning of "keeping a close watch on a person or group."

On April 7, in a national network news interview, the Deputy Attorney General, Mr. Kleindienst, found it necessary to qualify the Director's statement. There have been instances, he conceded, where Congressmen accused of committing specific illegal acts have been under what would properly be called "surveillance."

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However, the Deputy Attorney General went further, saying:

"But the issue here is whether or not the Bureau has used electronic surveillance or the tapping of telephones of Senators and Congressmen even in a case like that, and the Bureau has not done so."

One week later, on April 14, a Justice Department spokesman was asked whether the Bureau had ever engaged in electronic eavesdropping on any Congressman, and he answered:

"The FBI has never installed an electronic listening device of any kind in the home, office, or on the telephone of a U. S. Senator or Congressman."

On the following day, April 15, another inquiry was made. A reporter asked if the Federal Bureau of Investigation had ever used an electronic listening device to monitor the private conversations of a Congressman without actually installing the device.

The Department of Justice refused to answer the question.

At about this time, I realized that I had made what might be regarded as a mistake. My statement before the House was, of course, supported both by personal experience and by information which had come to me regarding the Bureau's activities toward another member. The mistake which I made was to continue discussing the information which I intended to present to the House on this occasion today.

On the evening of April 16, while watching the Walter Cronkite news program, I came to a better understanding of both present day Washington and the reason that the Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation had

chosen to answer only such a narrow portion of my original remarks.

CBS White House correspondent, Dan Rather, presented this report from which I quote in part:

"The White House calls criticism of the FBI 'blatantly political' ...saying it is 'designed to create a feeling of fear and intimidation among the public.

As for Boggs, the FBI has told the President Boggs found a wiretap on his phone but has no way or proving whose wiretap it was.

Boggs' case is the one where proof is lacking. Thus the White House is trying to focus as much attention on it as possible...Then saying in effect to all those who question FBI tactics: Put up or shut up."

The information reported by Dan Rather is substantially correct. It is information which I had not reported to anyone within the Administration or the White House. The information is this:

In the Summer of 1970, my family, members of the staff and myself became suspicious of interference on the telephone lines at my private residence. The Chesapeake and Potomac Telephone Company was asked to investigate. The investigator determined that a tap had been placed on my private telephone lines but that it had been removed in advance of the inspection. Some time later, the Chesapeake and Potomac Telephone Company transmitted to me its official report on the matter. That report stated categorically that there was no tap on my lines. Subsequently, I learned that it is the policy of the Washington Company and of the regional companies throughout the Bell System to give such reports, denying the existence of a tap, if the tap has been placed by the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

Apart from that information, it was also my intention to present to the House on this occasion an account of the Bureau's activities with regard to Congressman John Dowdy.

On the eve of the return of Congress, when it was expected that I would be addressing the House, selective information regarding the Dowdy case hastily became available. Following the Strategy which had been decided upon to silence "all those who question FBI tactics," the Department of Justice frantically undertook to demolish

my presentation in advance by redefining their own actions in their own terms.

Members are fully aware now of the ludicrous results.

- 1. Congressman Dowdy's telephone conversations, we were told, had not been "tapped," they had been "tapped" -- Taped by FBI agents sitting with an informant whom they had intimidated into calling the Congressman for the express purpose of attempting to incriminate him.
- 2. Congressman Dowdy's personal conversations, conducted in the privacy of his office here on Capitol Hill, had been recorded on an electronic device, but we were told by the Department that the Bureau's hands were clean. The electronic recording device had not been "installed" in the Congressman's office; it had only been carried in and out of the Congressman's private quarters strapped to the back of an informant in the service of the FBI.
- 3. Most astonishingly, we were told that none of this constituted "surveillance" in the Department's definition of the term because the informant knew, if the Congressman did not, that the FBI was taping the telephone calls, and the informant knew, if the Congressman did not, that the FBI had strapped the electronic recording device on his back and that the FBI agents had accompanied him to the door of the Congressman's office and were waiting outside in the corridor.
- 4. Finally, the Department of Justice denied that this practice in any way contravened Mr. Hoover's traditional assurances that the Capitol and the House and Senate Office Buildings were sanctuaries sanctuaries which FBI agents were not to enter when following any person under surveillance. The agents were not following the informant and conspirator to the Congressman's office, we were told: they were accompanying him.

Mr. Speaker, I submit that 1984 is closer than we think.

This has been a sorry and saddening spectacle of a great Department of this Government caught up in two weeks of slander, falsehood, irresponsibility, evasion and doublethink.

By its own actions, the Department of Justice has now supported and proved every aspect of the statement which I made before the House on April 5.

The account which I have unfolded challenges each of us.

A single voice breaking the silence has drawn back the curtain. Secret policies of which we were unaware have been revealed. Secret practices repugnant to American standards have been disclosed. Secret papers on file with American courts have been opened to public scrutiny. Because of a single challenge, raised in this House of all the people, we know far more now than any of us knew two weeks ago about just how much liberty has yielded while the power of Government has gained ground, unchecked and unchallenged.

I take no credit. I should have spoken sooner.

Over my twenty-six years in this Chamber, I have been aware -- as each of you has been aware -- of the directions in which we have been moving.

I have been aware that in the reality of postwar America the character of the Department of Justice has changed, from an agency solely devoted to the quest for justice into an organ with great potential for political control of the American people.

I have seen every postwar President, Democrat or Republican, except Lyndon Johnson, tacitly acknowledge this new character of the Department by installing their campaign managers Or political party chairmen as Attorney General or Deputy Attorney General.

I have seen the size and sweep of the Federal Bureau of Investigation grow and widen and steadily move into closer and closer surveillance of not only the deeds, but the words and thoughts, of the American people.

I have seen the Federal Bureau of Investigation build its legions of informers and spread them through the structure of our society's vital private institutions.

I have seen the Bureau penetrate the Labor Unions and the Corporations and the Colleges and the Churches and the Private Organizations, worthy and unworthy, of private citizens.

I have seen the Bureau awaken reporters in the middle of the night to demand their notes on confidential conversations with leaders of America's largest corporations.

I have seen the Bureau harrass, intimidate and blackmail the most honored leaders of the black community's struggle for equal rights.

I have seen these things -- and many more -- but I have remained silent.

Two years ago, though, it became evident to me that the nature and character of the Bureau was undergoing conspicuous change. That change was apparent by what I saw on the Hill and in this Capitol.

I saw -- as many others saw -- the Bureau lay seige to one of the most honorable and most honored men ever to serve his Country in this Congress -- John McCormack of Massachusetts.

They showed no compassion for age, no respect for position, no honor for the patriotism and loyalty of a grand American. The records of his telephone calls were seized. His time was taken in endless hostile interviews.

I served at that time as Majority Whip. I made no secret of my outrage and indignation at what was being done to the career of a good and faithful public servant. I told many of my colleagues that if this could happen to the Speaker of the House of Representatives -- the man second in line of succession to the Presidency itself -- it could happen to any of us, to any citizen, public or private.

The accuracy of the prophecy was soon brought home to me.

Late in 1969, an employee of the House came to my office and made this report. Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation had appeared at the Capitol, and, without my knowledge, demanded the records of all telephone calls placed from my private office for a period of four years. The records were not released, but this did not matter. The agents promptly obtained the records they sought from the telephone company.

I did not know what information was being sought or why. I soon learned the answer.

Over a period of two months, at the beginning of the election year of 1970, the constituents in my District with whom I talked began receiving telephone calls from the Bureau's agents. Identifying themselves as "FBI agents," they went down the list, one by one, asking those with whom I spoke if on such-and-such a day they had received a telephone call from Congressman Boggs.

As Members can well imagine, the result was to sow seeds of suspicion and to create a climate of fear in my home District.

The political power of this tactic is beyond measuring.

With no harges, no accusations, no hint of their purpose, the agents of the Bureau were able to create a climate of their own choosing within my own District, as the same tactics could do in the District of any Member.

The effect on me, I readily admit, was as intended.

I said nothing before this House or any other forum.

The Bureau had accomplished its aim of silence simply by letting me know that I was under surveillance.

Months later I learned of the tap which had been on my residence telephone.

Again the result was intimidation that assured my silence.

It was this personal experience, however, which caused me to reconsider and reevaluate my own responsibilities. If a Bureau or Agency of the Government could with impunity intimidate the Speaker of the House and the Majority Whip of the House, what Member of either Body of the Congress was free of this control.

In this perspective, the events of these past two years acquired a new meaning.

I had heard before, as each of you had heard, of various episodes relating to Members of the House and Senate.

I knew that former Senator Ralph Yarborough of Texas had been critical of the Federal Bureau of Investigation and found an electronic surveillance device in the intercom system on his desk.

I knew that former Senator Stephen Young of Ohio delivered a speech critical of the Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation and promptly found his telephone lines being monitored.

I knew that former Senator William Benton of Connecticut was critical of the Director's friend, Senator Joe McCarthy of Wisconsin, and was shortly advised to use care in speaking over his telephone.

But I realized that where these cases through the years were individual and isolated, the concern for surveillance on Capitol Hill had escalated to a new dimension over the past two years.

Senator Joe Montoya of New Mexico, engaged in a contest for reelection, had reason to believe his telephone was under surveillance.

Senator Birch Bayh of Indiana, engaged in leader-ship of the confirmation contest over Judge Haynesworth, had reason to believe his private office was under surveillance. He received in his office an official of the Government critical of the Haynesworth appointment. The Senator and the official talked privately and confidentially at the Senator's desk. When the official returned to his office, he was advised that he was under suspicion of having expressed his views to Senator Bayh.

On that evidence, Senator Bayh called in a private expert to search his office in the Senate Office Building for electronic listening devices. The expert located a radio transmission emanating from beneath the carpet of the Senator's office. As an expedient, the expert beat against the spot where the transmission was detected until the radio transmission stopped. It was several days, however, before the Senator's staff could secure the services of the necessary labor to raise the carpet.

When this was finally done, the device transmitting radio signals was gone.

Senator Charles Percy of Illinois related his experience at a hearing on March 22 of the Senate Appropriations Committee. His neighbor discovered that a highly sophisticated listening device -- capable of monitoring telephone calls from the Senator's home without direct interconnection to telephone lines -- had been installed underneath the chassis of the automobile which was normally parked each night in front of Senator Percy's home. The device was removed. Almost immediately thereafter, Senator Percy's wife discovered two technicians at work on the telephone lines entering the Senator's home. When Mrs. Percy asked their purpose, they would only explain curtly that their activities were for "Safety Purposes."

When Senator Wayne Morse was in the Senate he was told by a newsman that there was a listening device in his office. He discounted the report whereupon the newsman quoted to him remarks he had made critical of the Administration in conversation in the office with his Administrative Assistant. The newsman said he had been told this by a Government source.

The Episodes are too many, occurring too frequently, to be ignored or disregarded.

Today, there are Members of this Body so imprisoned by the climate of fear that they will not use their telephones for the conduct of normal business with constituents or fellow Members. Today there is not a Member of the United States Senate currently active in the contest for the Democratic Presidential nomination in 1972 who has not publicly expressed his belief that his telephones are under surveillance.

And today we know that Senator Muskie and others were the subject of surveillance by the Federal Bureau of Investigation on Earth Day, 1970.

There is no question here of standards. The Constitution expressly makes clear that Members of the Congress shall not be exempt from accounting before the law for any violations. But that same document embodies in it for the protection of the people the provisions of Article 1, Section 6. Those provisions provide that Senators and Representatives shall "Be privileged from arrest during their attendance at the session of their respective Houses, and in going to and returning from same." That same section also provides that "For any speech or debate in either House, they shall not be questioned in any other place."

These provisions exist in our Constitution because all the experience of representative government through the ages has demonstrated that those elected to represent the people must be protected against the vengeance of a hostile crown.

It is clear, however, in the pattern now in evidence, that for the views expressed in their respective Houses and other forums, Members of the Congress are being questioned in another place — the Department of Justice and the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

The sham is being stripped away.

Until the Dowdy case, it has been the public contention of the Department and the Bureau that all telephone conversations employed as the basis for criminal prosecutions of Members were intercepted inadvertently on surveillance devices installed for purposes of National or International Security.

This was the pleading made by the Department in the prosecution of former Maryland Senator, Daniel Brewster.

This was the pleading made by the Department in the prosecution of the Voloshen Case, involving Speaker McCormack's office.

Yet, now we find that the Department and the Bureau are engaged in a far more insidious activity which has no  $r_{\rm e}$  al limits.

Furthermore, we learn from the Department's own filings in the Brewster Case appeal that the supposed protection of a court authorization for such surveillance is only meaningless. In that case, the Department has argued that the court cannot deny -- but can only approve -- any request for such authorization.

Let me read one sentence from the Department's petition:

Since the Executive Branch alone possesses both the expertise and the factual background to assess the reasonableness' of such a surveillance, the courts should not question the decision of the Executive Branch that such surveillances are reasonable and necessary to protect the national interest.

The net is very clear. If the Executive chooses to invoke the national interest, neither courts nor Congress should, or under this doctrine, could question its surveillance activities.

Mr. Speaker, not long ago, in a published interview, the Attorney General of the United States, Mr. Mitchell, dismissed what I am describing by saying that Senators and Congressmen are becoming "paranoid."

If that is so, however, it is exactly what is intended.

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Freedom of speech, freedom of thought, freedom of action for men in public life can be compromised quite as effectively by the fear of surveillance as by the fact of surveillance.

We have learned recently that this is a standard objective and tactic of the Bureau.

Formal memoranda of the Federal Bureau of Investigation have disclosed the Eureau's strategy, in establishing surveillance on one campus community, to make the citizens believe that there is an FBI Agent behind every mailbox.

By making the l'embers of Congress believe that there is an FBI Agent listening to every telephone call, the Bureau and the Department are elevating paranoia to the level of calculated national policy.

Our society can survive many challenges and many threats.

It cannot survive a planned and programmed fear of its own government bureaus and agencies.

VI.

Or. Speaker, this is not a court of evidence, and I shall not detain the embers longer with accounts of the many episodes which illuminate this dark passage through which we are traveling.

What moved me to speak as I did two weeks ago was none of these concerns which I have repeated today. It was, rather, a far more personal experience.

Several days before I spoke, two highly placed career officials of the Department of Justice came to see me here at the Capitol. Their coming was itself an act of courage. But they spoke with me without fear and their petition was this.

Over long and uncuestioned careers, they had worked in and with the Federal Bureau of Investigation. They respected and trusted the organization. They believed it to be one of the great assets of our society's freedom and liberty. But their sad conclusion was that the Bureau was being destroyed - being turned into something it had never been - all because it was being used not to perform its mission but to protect the position of its Director.

I will not relate the information which they brought to me about the perverting of this once splendid organization into an instrument of one man's will. But I do ask you to consider with me the evidence which abounds on every hand.

The Tederal Bureau of Investigation today is not the Tederal Bureau of Investigation of film and fiction. The organization of which we were once so justly proud -- and which inspired among us all a sense of security and serenity -- no longer exists. The Bureau and the Director of the Bureau must be judged by the present, not the past.

In my mind, in the minds of most of my contemporaries, it has long been fixed that agents of the Bureau were all men who held degrees in law or accounting. That is what we were told and that is what we have believed. Yet the reality is very different.

Only one-third of the agents are lawyers or accountants.

For a decade, the standards have been falling.

This ought not to be.

In my mind, in the minds of most of my contemporaries, it has also been fixed that the Federal Bureau of Investigation is an organization of young men, directed by young men, overseen by young men. Youth itself is no assurance of effectiveness or discretion. But it has been reassuring

that this was an organization of fine young Americans in touch with their times and giving the Bureau those qualities which youth provides. Yet the reality is very different.

Around the oldest head of any agency in Government there is clustered a small and unchanging guard of old cronies and old friends whose positions are dependent solely upon their relationship with the Director himself.

For a decade, the brightest talents within the organization have been leaving, unable to secure or to expect advancement in their careers.

This ought not to be.

In my mind, in the minds of most of my contemporaries, it has long been fixed that the Federal Bureau of Investigation is the standard to which all other law enforcement agencies should aspire. That lingering legend has, in fact, been the basis of many decisions made here to permit the Bureau to be the center of instruction and training for all the police organizations in the land. Yet the reality is very different.

For a decade, we have seen instance after instance of the Director himself conducting himself in ways which no responsible law enforcement executive would permit himself to enulate. He has vented the spleen of personal vendetta against a great negro leader. He has denounced the Justices of the Supreme Court. He has turned upon his lawful superiors once they and their party were out of office. He has, furthermore, in recent months, seriously compromised the workings of justice by prejudicing grand jury proceedings with proclamations of guilt of defendants four months before sufficient evidence was taken to permit the return of indictments.

This ought not to be:

Mr. Speaker, in this country, it ought not to be that the Federal Bureau of Investigation is devoting itself to surveillance on the children of Members of Congress as this organization has done in the case of the lovely daughter of Congressman Henry Reuss.

Mr. Speaker, in this country and in this age, it ought not to be that agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation should be rummaging through wastepaper baskets to collect evidence incriminating another agent of having failed to report on the classroom views of a law professor, as was the case with Agent Shaw. It ought not to be that a loyal agent, such as Mr. Shaw, should be preemptorily and punitively transferred to a distant output in Montana to appease the Director's personal petulance.

It ought not to be that the Director of the Bureau -- or the Director of any agency in the government -- should be permitted to demand that a college dismiss a professor for views expressed in the classroom critical of the Director himself.

Mr. Speaker, in this country, with crime rampant on the streets, with organized criminals penetrating our cities and our corporations and other corners of our life, it ought not to be that the most intensive investigative in the Bureau's recent history is being directed against orders and individuals of a major church. The conduct of the Bureau in its current harrassment and intimidation of Catholic liberals is itself demanding of appropriate investigation. Agents have been entering the sanctuaries of convents and Holy Orders, searching under beds, searching through luggage and personal belongings of nuns and priests, questioning and intimidating servants -- all without proper warrants.

Mr. Speaker, in this country, it ought not to be that the Federal Eureau of Investigation is unloosing paid informers and conspirators on campuses to organize and encourage the very demonstrations which its agents are reporting to demonstrate the Bureau's alertness and effectiveness.

Mr. Speaker, in this country, none of these things should be.

The Federal Bureau of Investigation is vital and imperative to our security and to the safety and stability of our society. The existence of the Bureau is not in the slightest question. But that Bureau cannot be what it ought to be -- and what it must be -- so long as it runs as it is presently run, beyond the oversight, beyond the control, beyond the accountability of our American system.

We here in Congress cannot disregard the challenge to us.

We have before us the testimony of three successive Attorneys General that they had no effective control over the Bureau under its present Director.

We have before us the testimony of the facts that duly constituted committees of Congress no longer are able to secure answers from the Bureau in response to lawful and orderly requests.

We have before us the testimony of the Bureau's own declining competence in service to the executive. I refer, of course, to the fact that President Nixon himself took a very "bum rap" on both his Haynesworth and Carswell appointments.
