And I don't want you to forget it. We can handle it. All it's going to take is a phone call to 15 do it. And that's why I said we don't have any 16 animosity out here. 17 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, I believe that, I, I 18 really do. 19 JOHN: We want to get this, this damn thing 20 over with and we want to get you all out and we'd like 21 to go home and see our families. 22 MR. SCHNEIDER: Um-hum. 23

until this thing's resolved?

JOHN: And it's not going to happen, is it,

all this -- Even those that I talk to daily, they're anxious themselves, they really are.

JOHN: I mean, can you imagine the first day that all of us started communicating with you people in there? It was very difficult because we had no grasp of that type of setting and that type of environment.

MR. SCHNEIDER: Sure.

JOHN: And your religious beliefs and your, your religious doctrine. We -- It was totally new to use and, you know, all the preaching sessions and all that, hey, that didn't do a lot of -- it did some good, believe me, because it gave us some insight in, into some of these -- Whether we believe it or not, at least you believe it, and, and that's what counts, you know. And, and I think we've, we've try to plant that seed that we're not here to try and sway somebody away from their religious beliefs, we're here because the law has said we will be here. And we're trying to facilitate the process of resolving it as peaceful as possible.

MR. SCHNEIDER: Um-hum.

JOHN: And don't want anything to happen to anybody. That's why when you told me the guy went out and turned out the lights and I didn't know about it, I'm really surprised I didn't get a call from somebody going ballistic. It didn't happen, you know.

SCHNEIDER: I mean, if anybody was to 11 wear black arm bands or anything like that in sadness, 12 I mean, all these people felt that way for the, the 13 young guys that, of course, lost their lives. 14 JOHN: Yep. 15 MR. SCHNEIDER: I mean, nobody --16 JOHN: Nothing, nothing's going to bring back 17 any of those people. 18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Exactly. down the road. And that's all we're looking for.

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2 JOHN: And we're leaving that door open for 3 you and, and it's your decision to make and we're not going to holler, we're not going to scream. MR. SCHNEIDER: I talked extensively today 5 with John in --6 7 JOHN: Yeah. MR. SCHNEIDER: -- regards to a possibility 8 of a neutral mediator or someone maybe from the press. 9 You know, that's --10 JOHN: Who would you have in mind? 11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I told him, you know, 12 if you people have any --13 JOHN: We're not bringing Oprah Winfrey in or 14 15 somebody. MR. SCHNEIDER: No, no, no. You know, I 16 17 mean --JOHN: We're not looking for a celebrity. 18 MR. SCHNEIDER: I know. I remember you 19 saying that and that was passed on. 20 JOHN: But if you have somebody in mind, let 21 22 us know. MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, well, you know, 23 that's -- I said -- I even mentioned it to him, you 24 know, if you have someone, if you have some ideas, you 25 know, I think it'd go a long way.

MR. SCHNEIDER: Um-hum.

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JOHN: Well, we figure we've got the best in the world talking to you right now. MR. SCHNEIDER: Um-hum. JOHN: We really do. We're not tricking you, we're not lying to you. MR. SCHNEIDER: But, you know --JOHN: And I told you you tell me who you want to be waiting down the end of that road for you or wherever, that person'll be there. MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, it'd go a long way to try to help these people with coming out or, you know --JOHN: Just say the word. MR. SCHNEIDER: -- waiting. And it has to do with, you know, the response or the ability of the media to be in touch with us. JOHN: Sure. MR. SCHNEIDER: I mean, that means a lot to these people. They keep on expressing that to me, as they did just before I got on the phone with you. JOHN: Well, you know there's not going to be any open line to the media. We've made it very clear to you, haven't we? That's not going to happen. However, if when you come out you want a particular media representative there, a particular broadcaster 25

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there --

MR. SCHNEIDER: No, what I mean, Wayne tells me that his rights, my rights, all of our rights in here, they're not being upheld in response to have an attorney come here and talk to his clients.

JOHN: Is his client -- I can't tell you right now that he has a right to counsel if he's in a custodial situation, and that means he's been arrested. He has not been arrested, he's free to leave. Until he's arrested or until you're -- until anybody's arrested, you have no right to counsel. None. Because it is not a custodial setting. And once a person is arrested, then all of those rights are explained to you by the courts, right? Every right that you have, a right not to incriminate yourself and every other right that you have, as well as that right to counsel.

And the court will ensure that those rights are upheld. But we are not going to let an attorney go down there, we're not going to let a doctor go down there, because we told you these people are out here and available to you. All, all it takes is somebody to come out. But as I said, if you want somebody to be out here to meet you or you want --

MR. SCHNEIDER: It's going to be --

JOHN: Just tell me.

MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah. I'm saying, though, it's going to be very hard working with and encouraging

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What really brought them to ease, like I told you --JOHN: Uh-huh. 3 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- in those first couple days 4 after this incident took place, when they were ready to all come out with David and make that move was because there had been an open access to the press and they felt comfortable. They, they thought that was part of 8 your doing as the -- as an agency and, for that reason, they thought that you were more than with them and, and 10 looking for some fairness. So they really weren't 11 overly concerned. It's only been since then that the 12 lines have been all cut off and that even an attempt by 13 any kind of a radio station to see how we're doing or 14 to get a response from us in some manner or another, 15 that's what I say, it really went against their --16 JOHN: You know, you know what caused that, 17 don't you? 18 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, I have no idea. 19 JOHN: Oh, yeah, come on. You've got an 20 A promise was made, a promise wasn't kept. 21 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, you and I don't -- I 22 don't believe that. I believe that you would have done 23 it probably, irregardless. 24 No, we wouldn't because David and 25 JOHN:

everybody else would have been out of there.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: To tell you the truth, after 2 talking with three guys today, I'm forgetting who I'm 3 talking to here. It was either Max or John earlier. JOHN: And there's two Johns, and you, you 5 just remember the other one's John Number 2. 6 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, yeah, we'll, we'll 7 remember. Don't forget that now. I tell him the 8 9 same thing. But the, the thing is that you have to --10 Hey, you tell us who you want to be there, you tell us a representative of a particular radio station or a 11 12 particular TV station or a particular newspaper, or you tell me, you know, you want a family member of yours to 13 14 be there. These things are things we can deal with. I'm not going to make you any promises because I need 15 to hear from you --16 MR. SCHNEIDER: You mean you can't promise 17 that ex-President Reagan would be there then, huh? 18 That's kind of pushing it. 19 JOHN: MR. SCHNEIDER: (Laughter.) 20 JOHN: Now, if you ask me for 21 22 Gen. Schwartzkopf, we could probably work on that a 23 little. MR. SCHNEIDER: (Laughter.) 24 JOHN: No, I really can't. 25 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

1 JOHN: Because I have to know who's of interest to you. 2 3 MR. SCHNEIDER: Sure. 4 JOHN: And only you can tell me that. 5 MR. SCHNEIDER: But, you know, of course, my 6 interest is still working with these, trying to get 7 something resolved here and --JOHN: Hey, you can have an interest when you 8 come out of there. 9 10 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- some faith and trust --11 JOHN: To help those people, too. MR. SCHNEIDER: -- working with these people, 12 13 so --JOHN: When you come out, you're still going 14 to have an interest in those people, aren't you? 15 16 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I want to make sure that they all end up --17 18 JOHN: Are cared for. MR. SCHNEIDER: Exactly. Positively. 19 20 JOHN: We've got the same interest. MR. SCHNEIDER: I, I believe that. 21 JOHN: We have the same interest, because I 22 don't have any animosity towards you or any of those 23 24 other people in there. What happened happened and now 25 we've got to live with it. MR. SCHNEIDER: I understand.

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JOHN: You know? And if you say that you 1 were someplace on the telephone, talking to somebody, 2 God bless, I hope it's true, because --3 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, that part --JOHN: -- the people on this end can testify 5 to that, that they were talking to you and --6 7 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, that's -- I was -- You know, that's not even a problem. That's easy to --JOHN: Well, it's always a problem, right? 9 10 Because it's --MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, not --11 JOHN: -- the fear of the uncertain in your 12 mind. 13 MR. SCHNEIDER: Not at all, because right 14 from that very moment that there was, there was sound, 15 Larry Lynch, we hit 911. The man could hear what was 16 17 going on. JOHN: Yeah. 18 MR. SCHNEIDER: We left the, we left the 19 phone -- the line open from that time on. And I stayed 20 there with my head down and there were bullet holes 21 coming right over the top of my -- I, I would -- It's 22 funny that I wasn't nailed even. I was totally 23 shocked. I'll be honest, I was terrified. --24 JOHN: No, it was somebody's will that you 25 weren't, probably.

MR. SCHNEIDER: I was -- Yeah, I think so, 1 but I was terrified that the window that was just 2 before me was going to be blasted open like the one on 3 the other hand of me. And I expected it was over and I . سبع نسف سوّ was just hoping for the best. And, geez, I'll tell 5 you, I've never experienced anything like it. Never 6 7 had an opportunity to say hey, I'm in here, be careful, I'm coming, you know, I'm coming out, I don't know 8 9 what's going on. 10 I mean, you could, you could have been in here with us, you yourself could have screamed at the 11 top of your lungs, it would have made no difference. 12 I know, I know. 13 JOHN: MR. SCHNEIDER: Made no difference 14 15 whatsoever. I sure, I sure can't tell you I know 16 what it would be like, because I have no ungodly idea 17 what it would be like. 18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Total -- I mean, total --19 20 I wouldn't wish that -- on anybody. MR. SCHNEIDER: Honestly, honestly, easily 20 21 kids should have been dead, 'cause, I mean, they, they 22 quickly hit the floor. The bullets missed them by 23 24 fractions. Somebody was looking out for them, 25 huh?

MR. SCHNEIDER: Fractions. I mean, I don't 1 -- What I don't understand is why they'd have turned 2 and started, you know, shooting at windows and, and the 3 They didn't even know who was where or -- I 4 just -- It was hard for me to imagine. 5 JOHN: Hey, a lot of crazy things happen 6 in -- when people are in a, in a setting like that. 7 MR. SCHNEIDER: Five, six people saw the 8 three, the three choppers come over and started 9 immediately firing right out of the choppers at his 10 11 room. They saw it. JOHN: Steve, I'm not here to condone 12 anything that went on. I'm not here to get in an 13 argument. I know --14 MR. SCHNEIDER: But, you know, I mean --15 JOHN: -- it had to be --16 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- you say when you guys --17 JOHN: -- a bizarre sight. 18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Exactly. But usually --19 It was on the --JOHN: 20 MR. SCHNEIDER: But the point is usually when 21 you talk to me and that subject matter comes up --23 JOHN: Yeah. MR. SCHNEIDER: -- it's like we've done 24 something criminal. That, that's the most incredible 25 thing. When, in fact --

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JOHN: Am I accusing you of doing something? 1 2 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, no. No, but I'm talking about, you know, when I come out they're going to be 3 charging all of us. The irony of it all. 5 JOHN: That's --MR. SCHNEIDER: The irony. When, in fact --6 7 JOHN: Listen, be very matter-of-fact about 8 it. They probably will. MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, I've watched this --9 JOHN: And I'm not going to tell you that --10 I've watched this guy --MR. SCHNEIDER: 11 JOHN: -- it's not going to happen. 12 MR. SCHNEIDER: The news press, I've watched 13 the quy, whatever his name is, Dan. I tell you what, I 14 have a hard time with a guy -- with a personality like 15 that, that is so ambiguous, doesn't answer the 16 questions that are posed to him. Whereas this other 17 guy at least, Ricks, attempts to answer almost 18 19 everything. Hey, I'm not going to lie to you about 20 what's going to happen when you come out. It's not 21 going to all peaches and --22 MR. SCHNEIDER: And why is it going to be 23 that way? Why is there like --24 JOHN: It's not going to be peaches and 25 cream.

MR. SCHNEIDER: As far as I'm concerned, all 1 those guys that were involved with that, that came 2 shooting like that -- Here David is opening -- Why would he have opened the door even? JOHN: Hey, when it's all sorted out, the 5 ×2.1 truth is going to come out, isn't it? 6 MR. SCHNEIDER: The man -- David should have 7 been dead. Perry Jones got it. Didn't have a gun, 8 didn't have any reason to be -- I mean, he --9 JOHN: Hey, some others got it, too. 10 MR. SCHNEIDER: You've got it. You -- Of 11 12 course --JOHN: Perry Jones wasn't alone and, and --13 MR. SCHNEIDER: Sixty-four years old. 14 JOHN: Other, other people --15 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- all over the --16 JOHN: -- inside there -- What about, what 17 about the infant? What about Gent? What about Judy's 18 or Kathy's husband? 19 MR. SCHNEIDER: Sure. 20 JOHN: What about the ATF fellows? So, you 21 know, there was a lot of pain, there was a lot of 22 anguish in a lot of people's minds. And the only 23 way -- You know, we could sit and we could hug and we 24 can cry and we can pray together and we can do a lot of 25 things. It's not going to bring those people back.

And we can pray for their souls, and we probably do, huh? But what I'm saying is I'm telling you the same 2 thing today that I told you the first day that I talked 3 to you. 5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Um-hum. 6 JOHN: That we're out here and we're out here 7 with open arms. And, and what it's going to take to bring you people out is I guess to get over the, the 8 9 fear, to get over the anguish. 10 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, that's part of it, you 11 know. 12 JOHN: It is. MR. SCHNEIDER: That's, that's where that 13 14 press part came in and to be involved, as -- expressing 15 to me every day. JOHN: Hey, I know you people have watched 16 movies and you've watched TV and you've watched -- Hey, 17 18 we're going to come out and they're going to beat us 19 and they're going to do this and they're going to --20 MR. SCHNEIDER: Not quite that. 21 JOHN: That's not going to happen. 22 MR. SCHNEIDER: Not, not quite so much 23 that --24 JOHN: You're dealing with very professional 25 people out here.

MR. SCHNEIDER: It bothers these people that

these ATF guys are even in those press conferences answering even, you know, that they're even having a 2 part of that because of the role they played. 3 JOHN: Well, they've got to get used to it 4 because that's life. And that's not going away. And, . تنشق مو 5 and I would be 6 MR. SCHNEIDER: The FBI --7 JOHN: -- crazy if I, if I tried to lie to 8 9 you. MR. SCHNEIDER: -- is being there, 10 researching, doing their job. That's something 11 different, they're not bothered by that as much. 12 13 But --Hey. JOHN: 14 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- I tell you what, no one's 15 real happy about the other. 16 JOHN: Yeah, but it's not, it's not going 17 18 away. MR. SCHNEIDER: -- it was. 19 It's not going away. And I could tell JOHN: 20 you yeah, it's going away, it's going away, and you 21 come out and there it is. I'm not going to do that to 22 I'm going to tell you the truth and I'm going to 23 you. tell you the way it is. 24 MR. SCHNEIDER: The audacity of any human 25

being to take it on himself, using the American people,

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something that they have chosen to have as part of the system to protect them, to actually attack citizens. 2 It's a mind blower. It to me is a total mind blower. 3 JOHN: Well, it's a tough --4 MR. SCHNEIDER: And then say to me you can't 5 7-22 6 say --JOHN: -- tough situation, but we can't 7 change things, can we? 8 MR. SCHNEIDER: I hope we can. 9 JOHN: Well, we can't change what has 10 happened in the past. 11 MR. SCHNEIDER: As long as my life is going 12 on, I'm going to hope that everything I can do in this 13 crazy world to make sure something like that never 14 15 happens again, you know --JOHN: Well, you can try to change the system 16 and I can try to change the system, but we can't turn 17 those events around. 18 MR. SCHNEIDER: I can see why now there --19 why there are so many people clamoring for the, the 20 dissolving of that organization. 21 JOHN: Well, you don't really want to get me 22 to start commenting about that, because --23 MR. SCHNEIDER: No, of course not. 24 -- it wouldn't be the proper thing. 25 JOHN: MR. SCHNEIDER: You're in a fellow, you're in

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a fellow agency that you wouldn't dare do that. 1 JOHN: Well, it's not my business to do that. 2 3 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well --4 JOHN: It really isn't. 5 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- I know it could be. I 6 know your paycheck is --7 I'm not, I'm not clamoring about your, JOHN: your religion. I'm not going to do that. And about 8 9 what's going on in there. 10 MR. SCHNEIDER: I never forced my religion in 11 your face, though. Of course I didn't. 12 JOHN: We, we've had some strong, some 13 strong preaching sessions going on, though, haven't we? And I've listened, haven't I? 15 MR. SCHNEIDER: I believe you have. 16 JOHN: And I, and I have because I 17 want to learn. You know, I'd be crazy to say that I don't want to learn. I want to learn what it's all 18 about because it's something very new to me. 19 20 MR. SCHNEIDER: In honesty, I'd be totally shocked if, you know, if you ever showed even a minute 21 22 interest just because, I mean, if I were in your shoes --23 JOHN: I don't tell you I'm coming -- I'm 24 being -- coming over. 25 MR. SCHNEIDER: Of course, of course not.

JOHN: But I'm learning. 1 2 MR. SCHNEIDER: Of course not. 3 Hey, I don't know --JOHN: MR. SCHNEIDER: But, but let me say, you 4 5 know, being on the other side myself for so many years studying cults and different religions, I'm the -- I 6 7 mean, seriously, I mean, who'd want to ever come out to 8 a place like Waco, Texas, and how could they --9 JOHN: That's what I asked myself last Monday 10 morning. 11 MR. SCHNEIDER: How could this guy, how could this guy have truth when he's in such living conditions 12 13 and, and all the rumors, all the rest that goes with I mean, it's a huge stumbling block that the guy 14 15 might actually have -- or be able to open something up. 16 It's a huge stumbling block. JOHN: A long ways from Hawaii, isn't it? 17 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, a long ways. I mean, 18 you, you could tell obviously I never came here because 19 of any reason other than to hear something. God, I'll 20 21 tell you the truth, I hated --22 JOHN: You didn't just come here for barbecue, did you? 23 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, you know that. I'll tell 24 25 you the truth. I can't stand this state, I never have liked it. When I --

JOHN: That's going to aggravate a lot of 1 2 people. 3 MR. SCHNEIDER: I mean, you know, I --4 JOHN: You may have some Texans in there. 5 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, that's okay. They, they respect my opinions, I respect theirs. They can 7 like it, that's fine. I'm glad that they do. 8 JOHN: But it's a big state. There's a lot 9 of parts of it that are totally different from other 10 parts. MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, yeah. I guess I --11 12 JOHN: Get down on the coast around Galveston and that area and, and the beaches and you'd think it 13 was California Dreaming again. 14 MR. SCHNEIDER: That's about it. 15 JOHN: You would. I mean, it's such an 16 17 enormous state and there's so much diversity to it --MR. SCHNEIDER: Um-hum. 18 19 JOHN: -- that it's different. I mean, 20 people can say -- You spent years out in California, didn't you? 21 22 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, not really. Just a few. JOHN: Well, I mean, look at what people see 23 24 on TV of California. 25 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, I know. I don't really like that state, either. I don't like the --

JOHN: People say it's the land of fruit and 1 2 nuts, for crying out loud. 3 MR. SCHNEIDER: Hey, you've got it. No question about that. 5 But I think the crucial thing that JOHN: 6 you've got to remember is the judicial system is an adversarial system by design, which means both sides have an equal opportunity under the law. And the, and 8 the courts, particularly the federal courts, really are 9 serious when they're talking about both sides. And, 10 11 and that's why I was being very sincere with you when I 12 told you if there's somebody that would make it easier for you --13 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- about that. That reminds 14 me of something. 15 16 JOHN: Go ahead. MR. SCHNEIDER: Let me bring something up, 17 before I forget. I went to -- with Sherri Jewel a year 18 19 ago in February --JOHN: The happy birthday girl. 20 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I don't know about 21 that, but anyway --22 23 JOHN: It's her birthday today. MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, I didn't even know. 24 25 What? JOHN: MR. SCHNEIDER: Anyway, I went with her to

the Michigan Court to gain -- regain custody of her own daughter. She had been a school teacher out in Southern California. She was -- Oh, the recommendations and the affidavits that -- Those that loved her, the students, the teachers, all her peers --

JOHN: Yeah.

MR. SCHNEIDER: Anyway, I went to this court where Marc had come all the way from Australia to go after her, trying to find a weak link in our group where he could --

JOHN: Who?

MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, Marc Breault, of course.

JOHN: Okay.

MR. SCHNEIDER: So I went there and there's Marc Breault his wife, and this older woman, Jean Smith, who I had also met earlier. But while being there, I got to -- on the last day of the testimony given by Marc Breault and some of those that had come from Australia I got to go into the courtroom and sit down and see and watch the reaction of the judge. I want to tell you something. I was not at all pleased at his response to the people that were bringing out the adverse testimony against Sherri Jewel, the way he chuckled and smiled and joked and laughed with them.

JOHN: Was that a federal court?

MR. SCHNEIDER: I don't believe it was. Ι 1 2 don't believe it was. But I --3 JOHN: Let me tell you, you can go in a federal courthouse --4 MR. SCHNEIDER: John, John, let me finish. 5 6 JOHN: -- and hear a pin stop -- pin drop. 7 MR. SCHNEIDER: I was shocked at the way the guy got involved and showed a bias right off. 8 9 JOHN: Sure. MR. SCHNEIDER: Long before the testimony 10 even began on our part. 11 JOHN: Sure. 12 MR. SCHNEIDER: It was a lost -- You could 13 see plainly the man was already -- had believed what he 14 had heard. 15 JOHN: Like the good old boy system? 16 MR. SCHNEIDER: He made some comments that 17 18 showed he had already made his decision, and defense had not even begun to start bringing up their 19 witnesses. It was a lost cause before it even began. 20 And I'm thinking to myself what in the heck, what kind 21 of justice is this? So this is --JOHN: That makes you very concerned, doesn't 23 it? 24 MR. MR. SCHNEIDER: You mean one of the nurses? 14 JOHN: No, no, no. The people I discussed 15 with you, Floyd Houtman and, and --16 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, oh, oh, oh, oh. 17 18 forgot about that. MR. COX: I have no idea. I, I really have 2 no idea what happened to the pups. Whether the SPC --I think the SPCA is holding them. 4 MR. SOMMERS: 'Cause they were supposed to be the children's. 5 6 MR. COX: Well, I'm sure they will be, 7 because they're just holding them to make sure they're cared for right, you know, because the children are 8 9 being kept together. MR. SOMMERS: Um-hum. 10 MR. COX: And, you know, where they're being 11 12 kept together there may not be a -- in a position to take care of all those young pups. 13 MR. SOMMERS: Yeah. 14 MR. 2 19 --3 MR. COX: Eighty-eight? 4 MR. SOMMERS: -- 88 up in --5 MR. COX: Incident? 6 MR. SOMMERS: Incident. And so I've already 7 got a taste of what the justice system is all about. 8 MR. COX: Well, you may have got a taste of 9 a, of a state justice system, but you've -- Unless you've been involved in the federal system, it's like 10 night and day. It's a totally different environment, 11 12 it's -- The courts leave nothing to anybody's question as far as their rights, their constitutional rights, 13 not only to counsel and -- And I told Steve and I'll 14 tell you that there have been at least eight attorneys 15 16 who are a member of I guess a firm here in, in the Waco area, or affiliated with one, and they're not ACLU 17 attorneys, but it's a similar group of attorneys who 18 have already offered their services to assist you 19 20 people in there. So I'm sure that you'll get good 21 representation. And I know David's mother's -- on the 23 news anyhow -- indicated that she had already hired either an attorney or two attorneys from the Houston 24 area to, to assist David when he comes out. 25 MR. SOMMERS: Yeah.

know what to expect, because I was involved in that

1 MR. COX: -- you know, the legal profession has, has been watching the news and they're out there and they're, they're going to see that no one's rights or privileges are abused. And, believe me, the federal system is a lot different than a state or local system. It's not the good old boy network. MR. SOMMERS: Well, I'll be honest, this is 7 my point of view, that that's really hard for me to swallow at this point because I'm already seeing that rights are being refused, even at this point, and we 11 haven't been out yet. MR. COX: What's that? What, what's that? MR. SOMMERS: Such as the communication with the --MR. COX: The media? MR. SOMMERS: -- the media. 16 MR. COX: Well, there's no right there. 17 MR. SOMMERS: Why do you say that? 18 MR. COX: There may be a wish there, there 19 may be a desire there, but there's certainly no right, 20 no legal right that the media has to communicate with 21 22 you or that, that you have to communicate with the It's basically our decision to make, who 23 communicates with who to successfully, peacefully 24 resolve this situation. And we don't want people 25

making up stories and --

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1 MR. SOMMERS: Well, that's obviously --MR. COX: -- a lot of bizarre communications 2 3 and speculation. We feel --4 MR. SOMMERS: Yet, I can sit there and I can 5 listen to the 10:30 --6 MR. COX: News? 7 MR. SOMMERS: -- news, FBI, the ATF consultation with the media and it's, it's not all 8 together. And it's not all correct. 9 10 MR. COX: You mean it's not candid? 11 MR. SOMMERS: It's not all correct. 12 MR. COX: Well, you know, if it's not correct, the only way that it will be corrected is when 13 you and the other people come out of there. And, and 14 as we told -- as I told you, as I told David and Steve, 15 and I guess all told we've talked to, I don't know, 68 16 people in there or something like that, on and off or 17 one way or another, on video, whatever, that you know 18 the road. You walked down the road many times, I 19 guess, carrying those videotapes down there and other 20 things, and, and that's all anybody has to do is walk 21 down the road. 22 23 MR. SOMMERS: Um-hum. MR. COX: And we're not preventing anybody 24 from walking down the road. And you told me that 25 you're in there on your own volition, and David has

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told me -- I've had a lot of lengthy discussions with 1 2 David. MR. SOMMERS: Oh, yeah, he's --3 4 MR. COX: And he has told me that when he . نشق سرّ gets the word he -- He said I'm ready to come out, I am 5 ready to come out of here, I'm ready to leave, and all 7 I have to do is get the word. 8 MR. SOMMERS: That's it. MR. COX: And I said David, I'll give you the 9 10 And that's not the word he's looking for. 11 MR. SOMMERS: No. 12 MR. COX: You know? But that's how anxious I 13 am to see --MR. SOMMERS: Oh, yeah. 14 15 MR. COX: -- see it resolved. MR. SOMMERS: We're all, we're all anxious to 16 see it --17 18 MR. COX: I know you are. MR. SOMMERS: We're just waiting for the 19 word, like you said. 20 MR. COX: I know. And, and I've explained 21 the system to David and to Steve, and I don't lie about 22 23 it, I don't try to kid anybody about it. And it may not be, it may not be the system that you desire, but 24 it's the best one in the world. 25 MR. SOMMERS: I would add something but I

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don't think you guys would probably put that in the press meeting tomorrow. I would wish that you would, 3 but --4 MR. COX: Take your best shot, Greg. 5 MR. SOMMERS: -- I would very doubt it. I'll 6 throw it at you. 7 MR. COX: Go ahead. I'm not thin-skinned. 8 MR. SOMMERS: What's that? 9 MR. COX: I'm not thin-skinned. Go ahead. 10 MR. SOMMERS: Okay. My only request for the world is that they judge not by the sight or by the 11 12 hearing of their ears, but by the truth, which is not being -- Well, you don't have to say which is not being 13 revealed. That time will tell. 14 15 MR. COX: And it will, huh, in time? 16 MR. SOMMERS: It will. MR. COX: You know, it's -- We all get our 17 18 fair day in court, and don't just think that big brother or the government or whatever name you want to 19 tag onto it, because somebody goes to court that means 20 21 they're guilty. Remember, in this society, a person is 22 presumed innocent until proven guilty. And, and that's 23 the nice thing about this system of ours, isn't it? MR. SOMMERS: But you know that always 24 25 doesn't work. I mean --

MR. COX: Hey, as I was telling Steven

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tonight, I just --MR. SOMMERS: But, like I'm telling you, 2 John, I'm not real -- That's not what I -- I'd have to 3 say that I'd have to focus -- The judgment that I fear would be God's judgment. And --5 MR. COX: Hey, we all have to face that 6 7 someday, don't we? Exactly. MR. SOMMERS: 8 MR. COX: There's, there's no getting around 9 that. 10 MR. SOMMERS: Right. 11 MR. COX: We, we all have to answer to him. 12 And, believe me, if you've done nothing wrong in there, 13 you don't have a problem. If you've done something 14 wrong, you're going to have to answer for it. And, and 15 just like anybody will. 16 17 MR. SOMMERS: Right. MR. COX: Whether it's me, whether it's you, 18 whether it's anyone. If, if, if someone on our side of 19 the track does something wrong, we have to answer for 20 21 it. MR. SOMMERS: Um-hum. 22 MR. COX: And if someone in there did 23 something wrong, they will have to answer for it. And, 24 and it all comes out in the end, but I want you to know 25 that, that legal counsel is waiting for you out there.

Our judicial system is fair, particularly the federal judicial system, and it's an honorable system. And, and, believe me, I've gone to court before and lost 3 cases, and it isn't because I didn't think I had a good 4 5 I wouldn't have been there. 6 MR. SOMMERS: Um-hum. MR. COX: You know, if I didn't think it was 7 a good case. And, and I wasn't happy when I lost the 8 case, but I watched the defendant walk free. So, I mean, you know, people think it doesn't happen. But 10 the, the 12 jurors decide in, in their mind that a 11 person has done anything wrong, they're on their way, 12 13 you know? 14 MR. SOMMERS: Um-hum. 15 MR. COX: That's why we've got the best system in the world. And we've got to live with it. 16 Steven come back yet? 17 18 MR. SOMMERS: No. Actually, I'm still waiting for him. What'd he do, fall asleep? Hold on 19 20 just a second. 21 MR. COX: Did he abandon you? 22 MR. SOMMERS: Steve? I don't know what he's 23 up to. 24 MR. COX: Well, I know he was going to go check, check on something. And I don't want you to hang up the phone 'cause I don't want to ring it --

1 MR. SOMMERS: I bet you've got a lot of tired 2 guys over there, huh? MR. COX: Yeah, you're right. You're right. There's a lot of people would like to go home. 4 5 MR. SOMMERS: I feel sorry for all those 6 guys. 7 MR. COX: Believe me, not a whole lot of us 8 from Waco. 9 MR. SOMMERS: Thank God, huh? Thank God. MR. COX: Hey, I'll tell you, the people have 10 been awful nice around here. 11 MR. SOMMERS: Well, that's good. 12 13 MR. COX: And, and I don't have any problem with the people. And I, I don't know if you've, you've 14 ever had any other dealings with law enforcement other 15 than that incident. 16 17 MR. SOMMERS: I'm a pretty good natured guy. 18 MR. COX: But I've met the sheriff here and 19 he seems to be just a nice fellow, pretty easy going Kind of a grandfatherly type that you, you 20 21 picture somebody sitting on his knee. 22 MR. SOMMERS: Yeah. Hey, here's Steve. 23 MR. COX: Good. MR. SOMMERS: He just walked in. 24 25 MR. COX: It's been a pleasure talking to you.

1 MR. SOMMERS: You too, John, and you take care of yourself. 2 MR. COX: Well, I'll see you in a day or two. 3 MR. SOMMERS: All righty, John. 4 5 MR. COX: Okay. 6 MR. SOMMERS: Bye-bye. 7 MR. SCHNEIDER: All right. 18 JOHN: As a matter of fact, they feel that there's some bone damage, clearly, by the presence of 19 it. The fact that the, that the swelling did go down 20 was a good sign. 21 22 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, so --23 JOHN: That's a good sign. But it does not necessarily mean that you can't stop testing for 24 25 infection. MR. SCHNEIDER: Right. Right.

1 And the indicators for infection are, JOHN: you know, when you close the palm that there is pain, 2 and also that there's what they call like a tracking 3 where it's either physically noticeably red spots going 4 up from the hand, up the arm --5 6 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. 7 -- or pain emanating up the arm from 8 the wound. 9 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okav. 10 JOHN: So, in other words, you have two 11 symptoms. 12 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right. 13 JOHN: One, either the actual pain or, two, actual red spots. You know, not like nickels or dimes 14 or anything, but, but redness moving up or radiating up 15 from the position of the wound. 16 17 MR. SCHNEIDER: Um-hum. 18 JOHN: Okay? So how's she doing? How's she feeling? 19 MR. SCHNEIDER: She seems to be -- I 20 haven't -- I was going to go just talk to her and see 21 how, you know, what her response is, too, about the 22 23 finger. And then I got caught up talking to, of course, Oliver, so I never did get to really ask her. 24 I just asked her to wait a minute, and so, of course, 25 I'm talking to you now, so --

Sure. And, Steve, if there's anything that I can do, running it by our physicians here, to 2 3 help out --4 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. 5 -- I'm definitely going to do that for 6 her. You know that. 7 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah. I appreciate that. 8 So there's no question about that. 9 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. 10 JOHN: And we're also concerned about David, 11 too, you know. 12 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right. 13 JOHN: So that's one of the reasons we want 14 to get some vital signs. 15 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, I'm -- I keep on 16 running back over here every now and then to check, to see if, you know, I can't be talking to him. I did for 17 18 the first time get to talk to him a little bit last night when I was talking to John Cox. It kind of 19 surprised me, too, when he had mentioned about the two, 20 because I didn't know that even. 21 22 JOHN: The two men? 23 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah. 24 JOHN: Yeah. 25 MR. SCHNEIDER: I mean, you know, besides Oliver.

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1 JOHN: Um-hum. 2 MR. SCHNEIDER: So -- But I'm still not sure who they are, and I wanted -- I was curious even then, 3 and he says well, talk to me in the morning. Well, of 4 course, here it's late in the morning already. 5 6 JOHN: Late, late, very late, yeah. 7 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah. And so I'm anxious to get in there and see what we can get going here. 8 9 JOHN: Did, did David mention some others besides those? 10 11 MR. SCHNEIDER: That, that was all he 12 mentioned. 13 JOHN: Okay. 14 MR. SCHNEIDER: But in passing, it seemed like there could be more, and he didn't say men or 15 women or what. But it's just the way he phrased or 16 said a few things that -- And I wanted to talk to him 17 18 about that. 19 JOHN: Okay. 20 MR. SCHNEIDER: I've talked to some people around here and you don't always know because, you 21 know, they're -- I don't know, how would you -- What 22 would the word be? They're not saying much, but, you 23 know, it's the look in the face and, and once in a 24 while that's why I'll go around and ask people, well, 25

you know, are you tired of it? Would you like to

leave? It's not a problem with anybody here, don't, don't feel that you're -- don't stay because, you know, 2 3 you see a group of people staying here. 4 And, you know, you try to give them every kind of a way to look at it and think about it so they 5 6 can truly follow what they --7 JOHN: Well, that's, that's great. That's really great, you know. And that's going to keep up 8 the great, the great momentum that's really started 9 10 between us, you know. 11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah. 12 JOHN: Yesterday, the day before, whenever it was. And just -- Is there any chance that you can take 13 a look at him, maybe without disturbing him? 14 possible or --15 16 MR. SCHNEIDER: Boy --JOHN: Okay. 17 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, I mean, put yourself in 18 my place. I mean, I'd like to. Normally, what I do is 19 I just tap at the door there and I'll try to look in. 20 21 I mean, he -- a lot of times he might say who is it or what or something. 22 JOHN: Yeah. 23 24 MR. SCHNEIDER: And a couple of them just 25 knocked at the door, like those nurses did, just minutes ago and there was no response. So they just

walked away. 1 2 JOHN: Let me give you some information --3 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. 4 JOHN: -- on septicemia that might help out 5 your end. 6 MR. SCHNEIDER: All right. 7 JOHN: Okay, basically, what they say is that the treatment for that, they take a blood culture. 8 9 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. 10 JOHN: And when they take a blood culture, then they go to see what type of IV antibiotic is 11 needed. So that's basically the treatment of how they 12 treat septicemia. 13 14 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. 15 JOHN: And, as we said, it's an infection of the blood, okay? And it may be -- It's not separate --16 is separate from and may occur simultaneously with 17 18 gangrene. 19 MR. SCHNEIDER: Mmmmm. 20 JOHN: So that's something we want to keep in mind with Judy, too. We want to keep a real close, 21 22 close eye on that finger. 23 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right. 24 JOHN: Septicemia, gangrene, neither gets better by itself. Okay? MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

1 JOHN: This doesn't cure itself. MR. SCHNEIDER: Right. 2 3 JOHN: Okay? And if it is in the arm or the leg, the answer is that that appendage has to be 5 removed if that is developed. Okay? So --6 MR. SCHNEIDER: So there's nothing to do at 7 that --JOHN: Well, we want to prevent if from, from 8 9 reaching that point. 10 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right. 11 JOHN: So the treatment. Okay? And, in the 12 final analysis, as we both know, if left totally 13 untreated then -- if left untreated, not totally but 14 just simply left untreated, then the results are fatal. 15 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right. 16 JOHN: So that's the, that's the story on 17 that. 18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. 19 JOHN: We want to keep an eye on both these 20 people. We don't want that to happen. We want to do 21 everything we can to --22 MR. SCHNEIDER: All right. 23 JOHN: -- insure that, that we catch this 24 before it gets there. 25 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I'm amazed even at this Scott who took a hit to his thigh or at the top portion

of his leg, and the bullet is still in there. amazed he doesn't have any kind of problems at this 2 time. 3 4 How does the wound look? JOHN: How does Scott's wound look? 5 6 MR. SCHNEIDER: I haven't really seen it. mean, it, it's way up towards his groin area, so I, 7 I've seen him. You know, he's been limping around. 8 He's walking, which he hadn't done for days. 9 10 JOHN: That's amazing. 11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, it is, and he seems to be doing okay. But the bullet in one side and, and 12 lodged toward the other end of the, the thigh, 13 apparently. But I have not taken a good look at that. 14 15 JOHN: You know, we ought to try, if we could, to get him medical treatment because, you know, 16 he may be getting the infection, you know, and not know 17 18 it. And he's young and strong, you know, so -- And then, like I said before, you know, older guys, they go 19 20 down the hill slowly and younger guys feel great, look great, and then it's kind of rapid with, with a younger 21 22 person. 23 MR. SCHNEIDER: And what I'm also going to be doing right now is I'm going to start trying to get as 17 many people together as possible for filming. so strange -- I had a real bad day yesterday around here because the night before that there was a lot of people that said, when I ended that 60-minute tape, they wanted to get on it. They had all this enthusiasm and, and yesterday, when it came right down to it, they -- a lot of them started saying to me well, where's the tape going? Who's going to see it? And 25 how will it be used?

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And I says well, so far, you know, of course

I'm sending it on to some of the guys I've been negotiating with, and they says well, is it, is it 2 going to be seen by our parents or relatives or who or, 3 or is any information in it going to be given to the 4 press? If it's just going to them and it's going 5 nowhere, what's the sense? You know, that's what 6 about, oh, six, seven of them were telling me, that 7 actually had the night before wanted to do it. 8 9 JOHN: Um-hum. 10 MR. SCHNEIDER: So then, all of a sudden, I couldn't get anybody to sit down and film or talk with. 11 12 JOHN: Because they didn't feel it was going 13 out or something? 14 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, yeah. They, they just said well, what is it, a dead-end thing? And I said 15 well, not, not totally, it doesn't seem. 16 17 JOHN: Um-hum. 18 MR. As indicated by the oozing 12 13 called sero-sanguinous, S-A-N-G-U-I-N-O-U-S. MR. SCHNEIDER: Real quick one more time? 14 15 JOHN: Yeah, I'm sorry. 16 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. 17 JOHN: Okay, it's -- he feels that he has a deep-seated infection, as indicated by the oozing. And 18 19 then he -- I think it's just a synonym for oozing, and 20 it's S-E-R-O-hyphen --21 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. 22 JOHN: -- S-A-N-G-U-I-N-O-U-S of the wound in 23 his left buttock. 24 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. 25 JOHN: Okay. Left untreated, this infection will continue to extend and develop into septicemia.

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That's what we were talking about before. 2 MR. SCHNEIDER: I see. 3 JOHN: Okay. MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. 5 JOHN: Once the infection gets into the 6 bloodstream, it will go into every major vital organ, 7 including the brain. 8 Okay. MR. SCHNEIDER: 9 JOHN: Okay? After it gets into his brain, 10 then that's, that's the 24-hour period. Okay, some of 11 the indicators that septicemia has developed is, one, 12 difficulty in awakening; two, sweating. And that's what the other physician had also indicated, that 13 sweating, and that's why I asked about the sweating. 14 15 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. 16 JOHN: Wooziness, hallucinations, dizziness, deviation from patterns of previous patterns of 17 thinking, and change in vital signs. And they 18 mentioned the three things here that I made a note of, 19 20 would be temperature going up, pressure going down, and heart rate or pulse going up. And the reason for that 21 would be that there's less blood, I guess, and the 22 heart is working harder so that the heart rate or pulse 23 24 would go up. 25 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okav.

JOHN: New tenderness, and the emphasis there

is on the word "new." So --1 2 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. JOHN: -- obviously, where there's trauma or 3 a wound, there's tenderness. But a new tenderness. 4 And, of course, swelling. 6 MR.
