MR. KORESH: Moving pretty slow.

JOHN: It's fast by my standards.

MR. KORESH: I know.

JOHN: "The star and its glow are described in an article published today in 'Nature' magazine by astronomer James M. Cordis of Cornell University in Ithica, New York, Cornell graduate student Scott C. Lundgren and Roger W. Romani, a Stanford University Astrophysicist. Romani said the star is trailing a stream of gas and particles as it speeds through space like a jetliner leaving a contrail across the sky. glow of this heated material is in the shape of a quitar but it can only be seen with the most powerful telescopes. Appropriately, the object has been named the Guitar Nebula. Romani said the unusual shape is probably caused by the shockwave from the star crashing through the glass -- the gas clouds of differing densities. The phenomenon called a 'bow shock' is analogous to the wave breaking from the bow of a speeding boat. Cordis described the Guitar Nebula as the most spectacular version of these bow shocks we've It's a fairly average pulsar but it's forward motion is exceptional. The star the formed the nebula is known to astronomers as PSR2224+65. number also gives the location of the star in the constellation Cepheus. Cepheus is low on the northern

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horizon now but will be high in the northern sky in late-summer. 'The star is moving darn fast,' Romani said, pointing out that it has moved into another constellation. In a million years it has moved from Serpens to Cepheus."

MR. KORESH: That's incorrect.

JOHN: Well, all I'm doing is quoting the article.

MR. KORESH: Yeah. So it's --

"Despite that kind of speed Romani said snapping a picture of the nebula required a twohour exposure using special equipment installed in the great 200" Palomar telescope in California. He said the pulsar formed about a million years ago when a star ran out of nuclear fuel and collapsed to a very high density. Pulsars normally move about ten-times faster than ordinary stars but this one is far faster than most pulsars. 'Otherwise' Romani said, 'it seems rather ordinary.' Curt Michael of Rice University's Department of Space Physics and Astronomy said, 'Astronomers cannot explain such high velocities with certainty.' He said he suspects the star was boosted by an off-center supernova explosion which blew some material one way and kicked the remaining neutron star the other. 'Other astronomers more skeptical in that theory, 'Michael said -- another possibility is that the star once was one of a pair of white dwarf stars closely linked by gravity. If one exploded the pair would have been flung apart. 'It's possible for the

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mechanism to work, but how common it is not known,' Michael said. Romani said the crucial task in 2 calculating the speed of the star was to determine its 3 distance which they found to be about 6,000 light years away, well within the Milky Way. A light year in distance light travels in a year about 5.9 trillion 6 7 miles. But Romani said the star's speed is so great that millions of years from now it will escape into 9 intergalactic space." No, Deuteronomy talks about the star, all the prophets talk about the stars. But, you know, the way that travel takes place and throughout the universe is totally different than the way it takes place in this world. You know, everything is measured in wavelengths and forms be it

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through the audio spectrum or the visual spectrum. Everything is measured in lines. When you read in the Psalms and in the prophets about how God stretched forth his line from the beginning of creation, you know, everything is finite or infinite in measure; you know, what the stars are, how they were really created and what matter is and how that when -- well, something man can even understand in the building blocks of creation is the atom. You know, here is a little systematic working tool of the universe and if any force is greater than the force contained in the perimeters of the atom, should such a force compress an atom it can only compress it to the equity of its own pressure and then it explodes either through fusion or fission. Matthew took one source of his experience and elaborated, so, likewise, Mark, Luke and John, and so, you see, there are those who are looking at our situation in different directions of what the light has shined upon. Some --

JOHN: Sure. You've got people looking at it from out here in one, one direction and you have others in there.

DAVID: Exactly.

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JOHN: You know, and, and not that all of them out here are looking in the same manner nor are all of those in there with you looking at it in the same manner.

DAVID: Exactly.

JOHN: And it doesn't mean that these are not good people. Any of them. You know, they are good people. And I know that you're, you are encouraging, whether you think you're encouraging these people, you don't think you're encouraging them. Whether it may be through your prayer or maybe it's through your gestures or, or through the fact that you, you can even give them a nod, but you listen to them, right? Oliver is confused and he's, and he may be torn as to what he should do and what he shouldn't do, and just by listening to him, you're telling him something, aren't

1 you? 2 I've always listened to my students. DAVID: 3 JOHN: Sure. 4 DAVID: Because they only --5 But you're listening to them when you JOHN: 6 don't feel good yourself, you know? 7 DAVID: They can only communicate to me in the light they received. 8 9 JOHN: Well, you're showing them some support so you're, it's easier for them to make a decision when 10 you, you're supportive of them, and --11 12 DAVID: I told Ollie, I said Ollie, two 13 thousand years ago there were those who entered in to 14 the final stages of the judgement. I reminded him that of the twelve that followed Christ, they all forsook 15 16 him but one woman, Mary Magdeline. I explained to him how that, in our witness and testimony for the truth, 17 many of us fail without exercise, to really know where 18 19 we stand in the truth, and so I says, look, outside is 20 no different than inside. Inside, you're gonna have 21 doubts, inside you're gonna have questions, and all of 22 these answers are to be found in scripture. I says, 23 outside, you're gonna have people manifest to you on belief, doubt, they do not know where you stand nor do 24 they know your doctrine. All they see is the effect of a situation that they, themselves, have brought about.

I says, now, if you want to really prove yourself to yourself, 'cause that's where religion is, you know, it's proving ourselves to ourselves. It's not trying to fakishly be a standard to somebody else, 'cause if we tried to be a standard for somebody else, we're going to fall. That's the way it's always been. Paul says, let's let each man have faith in himself, and so within himself, prove himself.

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And so I says, you know, if you have any question, if you're concerned about, you know, your life or your safety or security, I says you got to count the cost. On the outside they promise you, according to their, their system, they promise you a hearing, a judgement, you get to state your cause, I says, and it's still in the hands of God. I says, you don't have to deny what you've been shown out of the book, you know? If, if you feel that you can, you know, go out there and, and show a good faith with what you believe, it, the experience in itself may even strengthen your faith no matter what may come out of it. I says, this is the testimony of all the Prophet's --. No man's faith was tested alone by himself in secret. It's tested by the elements of unbelief, and that unbelief always comes through the mankind who knows not the truth of God.

So I says, you know, you have God's blessing if you go out there. There's, there's no problem. That's

what I've been telling people all along. If my God says to wait and things are developing and I know what's developing, people are making decisions, much talk, much speech, much attitude is being recorded in chronicle all over this world right now in regards to this terrible situation that's developed. JOHN: Well, you know, your God told you to wait. That doesn't mean it told Oliver to wait. DAVID: Exactly, and that's what I 've been telling them all along. They are free, moral agents. JOHN: Sure, sure. DAVID: And so --JOHN: But he needed to hear --DAVID: I've told him that all along. JOHN: -- this from you, you know, I mean, whether, whether he needed to hear your support or your prayers or your assurances. He needed it to come from you and, and I don't know if you've talken, talked to Brad or Kevin, but we understand that they're going to be coming out with Oliver too. I haven't talked to them. DAVID: JOHN: And I don't know if they're younger fellows or, or not, but I'm sure they're gonna need some support from you also, huh? Well, again, you all fail to

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understand what my position is.

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JOHN: No. I think we clearly understand that these people are free.

DAVID: There's a lot of people that, from the outside, know me, and I've never pushed my religion on anyone, they've always had to come to me and ask me questions step by step to dig deeper and deeper into the testament.

No, but these people don't want to leave you, you know that, and they, and it's a very difficult thing for them to leave, not only a spiritual thing for them to leave, but the fear of the unknown. They're gonna leave there and they're gonna come out here and they don't know what's expected of them out here, what's gonna happen to them out here, how they're gonna be treated, and that's, there's a lot of fear of the unknown, and, and I tried to explain to Steven yesterday and the other John did and Max did, exactly what they're going to face when they come out here and how they're gonna be treated and how they're gonna be handled. The fact that your mother has already got a, an attorney to represent you and that there are eight other attorney's that have stepped forward and, and these are very strong attorney's, probably some of the best criminal attorney's in the state, to represent your flock, the other people.

They're, they're some, you know, your mother and,

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and the attorney are here. They're in, are in Waco and 1 you know, they, they want to be supportive and I think it's important that, that when you're talking to Kevin and when you're talking to Brad and as you did to Oliver, you're supportive of them and let them know that people are out here to give them the support and the shoulder to lean on. That's part of the system because I know they've probably never been through something like this before. DAVID: Never. None of us has been through this before, have we? DAVID: Well, like I told him, I said, I, like I said, I told Ollie, I says, Ollie, remember what Christ went through two thousand years ago. He made it. JOHN: Sure. DAVID: And I says --JOHN: And he will too, won't he? DAVID: And I says, well, don't expect, that lamb like me, who speaks like a dragon, to be any less lenient than they were two thousand years ago. JOHN: Well, --DAVID: So he wants to --JOHN: The system works. DAVID: -- he wants to lift up his head, he

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wants to push out his chest, --

They're little monster fishes, but 16 17 they range up from, you know, anywhere to about three sixteenths of an inch up to maybe the max, two inches. 18 19 But in the lowest depth of the oceans all over the 20 world, there's a creature that defies all the laws of nature. He's been created to do so. The scripture 21 22 calls him leviathan, okay? 23 JOHN: I'm listening. 24 DAVID: In ancient times Leviathan, which was seen of men, was known as the great dragon. 25 Now, God says in the scriptures, to, to Job, God says, "Canst

thou draw out Leviathan with a hook? or his tongue with a cord which thou lettest down?" In other words, 2 can you go fishing, can you catch leviathan with a fish 3 hook? "Canst thou put an hook into his nose? or bore his jaw through with a thorn? Will he make many supplications unto thee? will he 6 7 speak soft words unto thee? Will he make a covenant with thee? wilt thou take 8 him for a servant for ever? 9 Wilt thou play with him as with a bird? or wilt 10 thou bind him for thy maidens?" 11 You know, leviathan also has the ability to fly. 12 You've heard of flying fish, haven't you? 13 I've seen flying fish. JOHN: Um-hum. 14 DAVID: They're awesome, aren't they? "Shall 15 thy companions make a banquet of him? shall they part 16 him among the merchants? 17 Canst thou fill his skin with barbed irons? or his 18 head with fish spears? . 19 Lay thine hand upon him, remember the battle, do 20 no more. " You know what that means, don't you? It 21 means you touch this creature, all you remember is from 22 the time that it takes for him to kill you, you're out 23 of here. 24 "Behold, the hope of him is in vain: shall not one 25 be cast down even at the sight of him?"

Now you've seen ancient pictures of mariners, 1 right, where they harbor the great sea dragon? 2 "None is so fierce that dare stir him up: who then is able to stand before me? Who hath prevented me, that I should repay him? 5 whatsoever is under the whole heaven is mine. I will not conceal his parts, nor his power, nor 7 his comely proportion." I mean, these things, I'll tell you how big they 9 are in a second, some of the older ones. 10 "Who can discover the face of his garment", which 11 is his body. "Who can come to him with his double bridle? 13 Who can open the doors of his face? his teeth are 14 terrible round about. 15 His scales are his pride, shut up together as with 16 a close seal. 17 One is so near to another, that no air can come 18 between them. 19 They are joined one to another, they stick 20 together, that they cannot be sundered." 21 By his needings, now, you've heard of the fire 22 breathing dragon, right? I'll explain how this, how 23 this creature does this. You know when a horse -24 sneezes, when a person sneezes? 25

JOHN: Um-hum.

1 A light does shine. Now, I'll DAVID: 2 explain this in a second. "And his eyes are like the eyelids of the 3 morning, " 'cause he's nocturnal. 5 "Out of his mouth go burning lamps, and sparks of - - - · · · 6 fire leap out. Out of his nostrils goeth smoke, as out of a 7 8 seething pot or caldron." Now, the ancient mariners who, you know, records 9 show that guys used to come back from these journeys 10 and they were all insane and crazy, and then we talked 11 about the fire breathing dragon of the ocean, right? 12 JOHN: Yeah. 13 DAVID: You know, it's considered myth today, 14 but yet all over the world men have worshiped and 15 honored this strange creature, haven't they? 16 Especially the more ancient empires. 17 "His breath kindleth coals, and a flame goeth out 18 of his mouth. 19 In his neck remaineth strength, " I mean, even 20 though he has all this fire that he can breath out, he, 21 he, you know, he doesn't get burned himself, and I'll 22 23 explain this in a second. "And sorrow is turned into joy before him". 24 other words, when a man sees this creature, first he 25

gets terrified, right, and then he goes crazy. This

creature will make you go crazy where you started laughing and everything.

The flakes of his flesh are joined together: they are as firm themselves; they cannot be moved.

"His heart is as firm as a stone; yea, as hard as a piece of the nether millstone."

When he raiseth up himself, in other words, when he submerges from the depths of the ocean, right, the mighty are afraid: by reason of breakings --. You ever seen a fish break on the water?

JOHN: Sure.

DAVID: You know, it's sort of this thing.

When the mighty seen, they purify themselves, in other words, they crap in their breeches. If you was out on the ocean, you could have taken a big leisure ship and you saw one of these leviathan's, you would see, you would see a mountain rise up out of the ocean, you'd would see this living creature and you would crap in your breeches, you know, purify yourself.

The sword of him that layeth at him cannot hold: the spear and the dart, nor the habergeon.

"He esteemeth iron as straw, and brass as rotten wood.

The arrow cannot make him flee: slingstones are turned with him into stubble.

Darts are counted as stubble: he laugheth at the

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shaking of a spear.

Sharp stones are under him: he spreadeth sharp pointed things upon the mire.

He maketh the deep to boil like a pot: he maketh the sea like a pot of ointment.

He maketh a path to shine after him: one would think the deep to be hoary," which means dark, but in the lowest parts of the ocean, God says, you know, a few miles down, it says it as bright as bright can be. All there is is molten lava down there, John, you see? Especially in the oceans where Hawaii is and all that, the ocean floor is molten, hot lava, very bright, burning.

Upon the earthy there is not his like, who is made without fear.

He beholdeth all things: he is the king over all the children of pride.

Now, the way this creature is created, all through his digestive system and up through his neck, you know, the hardest substance to man is steel, right?

Different variations of steel are modified to where you get plutonium and all these different kinds of steel, which you don't, they use, they melt iron in steel pipes, don't they?

So, like this creature, there's a substance in the world, I don't have a word in your vocabulary to

describe it, but this creature, in order to keep himself warm in the depths of the ocean, he's allowed to take up this lava and to nest with these, where these bottoms of the ocean are where the lava is, and he submerges, when he submerges he doesn't, you know, creatures, like the smaller fish, when they come up, they blow up. The depressurization destroys them, right?

JOHN: Um.

DAVID: No, not so with Leviathan. And he's able to come up through fresh water and he's also able to fly, and that's where, when he comes up to the tops of the, of the water, he lets out this hot, molten lava 'cause it's very, very, very cold in the depths of the ocean, and that's why they always called him the fire breathing dragon.

Now one of the things that the Psalm's tell you, and one of the things that's gonna happen when the son of man is destroyed by the gentiles in this generation, as the rights that when they have fulfilled the cup of their inequity, and they're proven that they are not willing to learn anything that does not come through their own mind, when they deny the God of the throne in the seven seals.

These leviathan's are gonna submerge out of the ocean. You know, the lochness, and the lochness are

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just babies. They're just baby leviathan's, you know? Jack Cousteau and a lot of people have tried to take documentation and tried to take films and stuff of these creatures. But just like God can hide the seven seals, he's also reserved in the earth though, from prehistoric times, certain creatures that are going to be an active part in, in vindicating the truth of God, and so I just thought I'd share this with you ahead of time so that when you see, when you actually see these things, you can remember who showed these things to you.

JOHN: I appreciate that.

DAVID: And, he's bad, boy.

JOHN: Um-hum.

DAVID: Of course he's my, these are my pets, and they belong to God and the scripture says that that son of God is going to, you know, rule leviathan in the latter days, and, and as all the elements of nature and in the creation of nature, the lot of the wicked are gonna be destroyed by these creatures as well as with the judgments of God.

So, you know, it's not a vain thing, John, to, to get on your knees and to confess to the God of heaven that we don't know, that we don't know his seals, and give ourselves a little room for repentance, just in case, you know, a little humility goes a long ways with

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God, you know? And a lot of people, I mean, Joel says,
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    multitudes, multitudes of our decision, and a lot of
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    people, you know, they, they don't understand my

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    them, and I just hope and pray that as the judgements

CLIVE: -- when I say anybody I'm talking 1 2 about adults. 3 Well, I'd, I'd have to be candid with I'm not going to lie to you --4 you. 5 CLIVE: All right. 6 JOHN: -- that you certainly will be, but I will tell you that the charges that are going to be 7 placed against any adults coming out by the federal 8 government is they're going to be charged as material 9 witnesses. And, and those are the initial charges that 10 will be placed on any adults coming out, as material 11 witnesses against the principals who have, who have 12 been involved in this thing. And, and only you can 13 answer, you know, and through your lawyers what, what 14 part you played. And, and I also pointed out to David 15 that his mother has hired an attorney from, from 16 Houston who is considered one of the paramount criminal 17 lawyers in the state to represent him and there are at 18 least eight other lawyers that are in the Waco area 19 that have said that they would represent the other 20 people inside the, the facility up there. So there is, 21 22 there is --23 CLIVE: Well ----- 24 JOHN: -- legal representation waiting for people out here and, and, you know, they're not being 25 thrown to the wolves if they come out or something. CLIVE: Is Karen being held? JOHN: I'm sorry?

CLIVE: Is Karen being held somewhere?

JOHN: No, she's not, uh-uh. She -- because 1 she called from -- I can tell you the address. It was 2 in La Verne, California, on White Avenue. 3 CLIVE: I understand they raided that place, so I was wondering whether she'd been taken in for 5 7- E. 6 questioning or whatever. 7 JOHN: No, no, uh-uh. Not at all. And she 8 called because she was concerned and because she was formerly was in there to best of my knowledge and 9 10 that --11 CLIVE: So, she just left a message? don't have a recording or anything of what she had to 12 13 say? JOHN: No, uh-uh, no. If I did I'd play it 14 15 for you --16 CLIVE: Okay. JOHN: -- because we have had some recordings 17 by other individuals and we, we'd certainly be happy to 18 19 play them, you know. But --CLIVE: You know, if you -- if she calls 20 again too or you call her, whatever, you can let her 21 22 know that we're okay. 23 That's fine, that's fine. And, and is there any message that you would want us to relay other 24 than that, or is there anyone else that you would like 25 us to contact? CLIVE: No, I don't have too many relatives in this country.

JOHN: Well, the reason I ask is the British

Consulate has contacted us regarding British citizens 1 and we've been contacted by other foreign consulates 2 and consul generals concerning, you know, people from 3 other countries. 4 5 CLIVE: Um-hum. 6 × 2.1. So, if you did have something we'd be happy to contact them or if you wanted to make a 7 recording or if you wanted, wanted her to make some 8 9 recording we can sure pass that on. But --10 CLIVE: I don't --11 JOHN: -- we're hoping this whole thing is going to be resolved in a, in a day or so anyhow so 12 you'll be able to talk to her in person. 13 14 CLIVE: Well, whenever God's ready. That's what we're waiting on is, is God and --15 16 JOHN: Yeah. 17 CLIVE: -- he's the one that's in charge, you 18 know? 19 JOHN: Well, I don't know what kind of a sign it's going to take. You, you almost think a meteor is 20 going to have to fall in that place. 21 22 CLIVE: Who knows? 23 JOHN: Hey --24 CLIVE: I don't know. 25 JOHN: -- it's not easy and, and of course initially it wasn't very easy for us to understand because it was something -- a philosophy that was new to us and, and we've had a lot, we've had a lot of long

dialogue with David and, and we've had a lot of Bible

readings with him and spiritual sessions and, and we have with Steven also.

CLIVE: Um-hum.

JOHN: And basically, David has told us that this evening to work things out with Steven as to how the people are going to be coming out of there. And there -- from what I understand at least three of the men will be coming out tomorrow morning, and, and maybe more. So we're hoping maybe more because they know that we're not vindictive and, and I have no animosity nor does anyone else out here towards anyone in there and justice is going to prevail one way or another and it's the best system there is. And if you want to be in that number that's coming out tomorrow that's fine, you know, that's -- but it's your decision to make, you know, it's not my decision to make. And --

CLIVE: Um-hum.

JOHN: -- as you know and as everyone else knows, we've got a lot of patience and that's all we're going to do is sit and wait out here.

CLIVE: It's a pity it hadn't been handled different to begin with.

JOHN: Yeah, but we can't change that can we?

CLIVE: Not now.

JOHN: What's done is done isn't it?

CLIVE: But --

JOHN: It's, it's, it's a tragedy that occurred and it was a tragedy for the people in there and it was a tragedy for a lot of other people.

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1 I mean, you know we don't hold any animosity toward the individuals that came out here, 2 3 but --JOHN: Well --CLIVE: -- the way they came out. 5 6 JOHN: I, I know David said all the people had to do was come up and knock on the door and it 7 would be changed and I told David that when we started 8 talking to him and when the FBI started talking to him 9 on the phone we were knocking on that door and we're 10 down at the end of the road and our arms are open and 11 all it's going to take is for people to come out. 12 media is out there. The media ensures that, hey, 13 nobody is being abused, no one's rights are going to be 14 offended when they come out and, and David said the --15 CLIVE: They're not exactly hearing 16 everything that's going on though are they? 17 18 JOHN: I'm sorry? 19 They're only -- the media have been blitzed to the point where they only hear what the FBI 20 wants them to hear though. 21 22 JOHN: Well, they're hearing everything that we discuss on the phone with David and with Steven, not 23 word-for-word because --24 25 CLIVE: (Indiscernible) Yeah, sure, I mean I -- people in here have spoken to David and Steve some evenings for seven

or eight hours at a time. So but they're certainly

learning the nuts and bolts and, and the mind-set and

the feelings and the -- you know, they, they've been told that anybody that wants to leave inside there can 2 leave. And that's basically the truth isn't it, that 3 no one's forcing anybody to stay in there? 4 5 CLIVE: Nobody's being forced to stay --6 JOHN: Sure. 7 CLIVE: -- at this point even before this situation. I mean, the fact that there are people on 8 the outside that have visited here or have been members or whatever and have chosen to return to their various 11 states or countries --12 JOHN: Sure. 13 CLIVE: -- or whatever just shows that, you know, nobody is being held prisoner. 14 15 JOHN: No. I mean, the only people that -16 CLIVE: This is a --JOHN: -- that have no -- you know, that 17 really are under control of someone else are the 18 children and they're going to do what their, their 19 parents suggest they do. And, and of course we 20 understand that some of the difficulty is that some 21 children have been released already, what, 21 children 22 and, and two elderly women and, and it would be awful 23 nice if those children were with their mothers and 24 their fathers so they could get some direction and 25 guidance and loving. And we know that David selected the people to leave and, and he's basically acknowledged that he selected the people to leave.

And these people that do have injuries the first place they're going is to some medical facility to be treated to a hospital. And then as our judicial system works is prior to an initial appearance before a U.S. judge where everybody is advised of any charges against them and what their rights are they are interviewed by the U.S. Probation Office which is an arm of the court who answers to the judge to determine their status, you know, their not only financial status but marital status, everything else. And everybody will be allowed to make a statement if they, they desire to make a statement concerning any part they played on Sunday the 28th. And it's up to the court to determine, you know, the seriousness, and it's up to the initial investigation to determine who was involved and who wasn't. And people that weren't involved are certainly not going to be charged with something other than material witness. And they'll be asked to testify as to what they saw, what they observed, the whole nine yards. And, and --

But one of the big tests is, 22 is going to be, and we realize it, that the, the first 23 adults that come out of there, the first males that 24 come out of there -- I know the people on the inside 25 are going to be watching -- to see how they're treated, you know, how they're cared for, and, and we know that. So we're not playing any games with anyone. As far as I'm aware and as far as the information that I have, is

once the government is -- has concluded its, its investigation at Mt. Carmel we have no reason to stick 2 around there. People that were living there before are 3 certainly going to be able to go back there. you've got religious groups here that, that have shelters, other churches, the Red Cross, social 6 services. So there are a lot of people out here that 7 are in a position to help those that, that may not have 8 a residence or, or may not have the warefore -- to take 9 care of themselves right away. And, and I realize 10 there are a lot of people in the same situation that 11 12 you're in --13 CLIVE: Um-hum. 14 -- in, in there that have been there JOHN: for a while, a lot of women that have been there for a 15 while that, you know, are going to feel lost when they 16

come out. And, and there are a lot of social services and there are people that will, will assist them when they come out. So it's just like the children: they're being cared, cared for that came out. But we'd like to get them with their families, you know, because it's the proper thing to do. Okay. The first people I'm going to meet? 1 2 Well, you'll be met at the end of the JOHN: 3 road and --4 CATHY: Well, besides --5 JOHN: Right. 6 CATHY: After, after I see Brian. 7 JOHN: After you see Brian then you'll be taken down to the, the federal courthouse and you will 8 be introduced to someone with the U.S. Probation 9 Department. That's got nothing to do with the FBI and 10 it's got nothing to do with the ATF. The U.S. 11 Probation Office is an arm of the court so it's part of 12 the judicial system and they represent the judge prior 13 to you seeing the judge. And basically what probation 14 does is obtain background information from a person 15 because they will prepare a form and speak to the judge 16 prior to the initial appearance which is probably going 17 to take place in an hour or so after you see probation. 18 And if, if there's a lawyer there that says he 19 represents you then, then that lawyer will represent 20 you, you know? Unless you've got one that you, you 21 have of your own choosing. And you will then be 22 afforded what we call an initial appearance before a 23 U.S. Magistrate Judge. And the initial appearance is 24 where the judge takes the information that you have 25 provided to probation and the judge speaks to you in, in a courtroom. And the judge basically tells you that you have certain rights, you know, the -- all of your legal rights against self-incrimination and a right to,

to an attorney and the whole nine yards and then tells you what you are being charged with. Now, everybody 2 that's coming out of there, you know, certainly isn't 3 going to be charged with something. I would say it's, it's fair for any adult to understand that they're 5 coming out of there, they're going to be charged as 7 material witnesses by the federal government in connection with the case. In other words, their 8 9 testimony will be required at some point during 10 judicial proceedings to testify as to what they saw. And, and then the judge will set a bond and set an 11 arraignment date which is usually sometime down the 12 13 road. But when the judge sets the bond if the attorney 14 posts bond or if the attorney makes arrangements through a bondsman to post bond or through family 15 members, friends, relatives, whatever the case may be, 16 17 once bond is posted you're free, okay? You're free and with a date to appear before the court, and the court 18 will set whatever the arraignment date is. But you are 19 20 free to go as you please until such time as you have to 21 appear in court. 22 CATHY: Would that, would that include 23 leaving the state or no? 24 JOHN: That's up to the court. 25 CATHY: Okay. JOHN: You know? And, and believe me, I am not going to --CATHY: But they can't put --

-- try and, and estimate what a U.S.

That's why it's so important to be candid with probation because 20 whatever you tell probation has got absolutely nothing 21 to do with an FBI investigation or an ATF investigation 22 or anybody else's investigation. They are acting 23 merely as an arm of the court to help the judge --• 24 ··· 25 CATHY: Decide what to do with me. JOHN: -- decide what to do as well as you'll have an attorney there to help you. But one of the most important -- you know, one of the things they look at is do you have children -- you know, you're a

mother, you should be with your children -- and what are your prior criminal offenses. And if you have some 2 3 that's taken into account and if you have none that's taken into account --4 5 CATHY: Right. ----6 JOHN: -- with the court. And, and the courts are not a good-old-boy system or anything else. 7 It is the federal judicial system and I don't know what 8 experience you've, you've ever had with it before. This is going to be something totally new. 10 11 CATHY: I've never been to court. Even when I got divorced I didn't go to court. 12 13 JOHN: Yeah, yeah. Well, that would have been a state court anyhow. It wouldn't be a federal 14 15 court. 16 CATHY: Under what you just said --17 JOHN: Yes? 18 CATHY: -- if there is a lawyer right 19 there --20 JOHN: Uh-huh. 21 CATHY: -- when I meet with the Probation 22 Department --2.3 JOHN: Yes? Yes? 24 CATHY: -- I could meet the -- have my initial appearance within hours you're saying, right? 25 I would say that's a safe bet. JOHN: CATHY: Okay. JOHN: You know, unless the only available judge is sitting on a trial at that time or, you know,

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got something going on. 1 2 CATHY: Right. 3 JOHN: But you will have your initial appearance. It's usually pretty speedy. Now, whether it's an hour, whether it's four hours, I couldn't tell you that. 7 CATHY: Well, I wouldn't get that picky. 8 JOHN: And I'd, I'd be lying to tell you if I 9 would. 10 CATHY: I wouldn't get that picky anyway. I just don't want to sit around waiting for, you know, a 11 12 month just to, just to --13 JOHN: No, no, no, no, no. 14 CATHY: -- just to appear before, you know --15 The federal system as a matter of fact JOHN: is -- you know, when someone is arrested they must be 16 brought before a court in a very reasonable amount of 17 time. And that when, when the court looks at 18 reasonable they don't play around, they're very serious 19 about that. And, and this has got a lot of publicity, 20 right, and a lot of notoriety. So --21 22 CATHY: Is it possible for you to get a list of those lawyers that you say are hanging around so 23 that I can find out -- say maybe speak to Wayne and 24 find out if any of them have a reputation that Wayne may know of them? JOHN: I don't know. CATHY: He probably doesn't.

JOHN: I know -- they're maybe hanging around

I | that courthouse, I know that.

CATHY: Well see, when I get there I've got to know --

JOHN: Because we know that the first person that comes out of there, and I under, I understand that, that you will be coming out early in the morning and of course the earlier you come out the quicker you're going to be reunited and the quicker that, that you're going to get through the procedure. But --

CATHY: As far as my understanding is going it's going to be pretty early.

JOHN: Well, and we know that three other fellows are going to follow you out, you know?

So -- and, and I know the people on the inside are looking at how this is handled and the media is going to look at how it's handled, and everyone else is going to look and make sure that nobody's playing any games with anyone. And, and this is too important for anybody to do anything like that, you know?

CATHY: Okay.

JOHN: So, they -- there, there are a lot of attorneys that are interested in, you know, furthering their careers I'm sure.

CATHY: So you're almost certain now that if I do -- if I am able to see the kids I have to go to Child Protective Services but I probably wouldn't be able to do any of that until after what you just told me, all this happens?

JOHN: To be reunited with the other

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2 CATHY: No, not reunited --3 JOHN: I'm sorry. 4 CATHY: -- to go visit with the other children from here, the other 17 that are still 5 6 together? 7 That's basically true, that's JOHN: basically true. And, and the other thing is that when 8 you come out and you are -- you know, you meet with 9 probation, probation will ask you, you know, if you 10 11 have a lawyer or if you want a lawyer appointed by the court. And the judge himself or herself can appoint a 12 lawyer if you are indigent, you know, in addition to 13 any other lawyer that may say we want to represent you. 14 And believe me, the judge would appoint you with a very 15 good, fair, you know, unbiased lawyer because of the --16 of what's going on here. And, and the courts, the 17 courts have a, have a list of attorneys that have 18 indicated a willingness to represent people. So then 19 20 you and your attorney will have quite a period to sit 21 down and --(End Tape 114) 22 23 24 25
