2 JOHN: -- any of the other nurses get in to
3 see him?

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: You know, in honesty they
5 haven't.

6 JOHN: Um-hum.

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: They haven't yet.

8 JOHN: Yeah, if, if he can get them to do
9 that that might be a good thing --

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right.

11 JOHN: -- to check his vital signs.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: See, what happened is I guess
13 he wanted -- Ollie came -- Oliver, they call him Ollie,
14 he came in there and so he's giving him a little time
15 and trying to encourage him and everything. And he
16 wanted to ask him a few questions and he just told him
17 to remember to, you know, hang onto his Bible and so
18 forth and -- or after he finds a better foundation, you
19 know, follow his conscience of course.

20 JOHN: Right.

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: So, I, I just stepped in
22 there a little bit and he says, you know, if -- you
23 know, just follow right on through so --

24 JOHN: Right. Well --

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

JOHN: -- that's, that's really great and I
really appreciate your efforts very much, I really do.

MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, you know, I mean right
from the beginning, you know, I mean I've always wanted

1 | the best of course, and --

2 | JOHN: I know that, and it's, it's coming
3 | true.

4 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

5 | JOHN: So well, I've, I've really appreciated
6 | everything you've done. And how did David feel about
7 | their leaving? He just said well --

8 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, you know, he's always
9 | believed in, you know, the freedom of one's -- I mean,
10 | that, that was always -- well, right from the time I
11 | met him he was always that way that, you know, what
12 | you're going to hear -- he said step away, wrestle with
13 | it come back. And he's done this with everybody,
14 | including myself. That's why I said I like had six
15 | months. So, you know, like even these people, now he
16 | says you always got to relook at something. It's not
17 | like you're in something once and for the rest of your
18 | life, you know? And so he explained that again. He
19 | says look at it again and again and, and wrestle with
20 | it. So --

21 | JOHN: Yeah.

22 | MR. SCHNEIDER: -- so these feel that it'd be
23 | best for them that they, that they step out.

24 | JOHN: Well, fine.

25 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

 JOHN: Fine, that's --

 MR. SCHNEIDER: And he says, he says he's
with them 100 percent. You know, if that's what you
need to do you've got to follow through he says.

1 | Because of he says I believe that there's a God and
2 | you've got to stand and answer for yourself. So he
3 | says as I do, so that's basically what he told them.

4 | JOHN: Yeah, yeah. Well, you know, I'm
5 | getting back to his health. It does concern me, you
6 | know?

7 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

8 | JOHN: Do you know if he's getting any new
9 | pain like kind of where those wounds --

10 | MR. SCHNEIDER: I didn't, I didn't get to ask
11 | him really too much because I was trying -- I didn't
12 | want to break my attention from --

13 | JOHN: Sure. No, no --

14 | MR. SCHNEIDER: -- you know, Ollie's movement
15 | and --

16 | JOHN: I can appreciate that.

17 | MR. SCHNEIDER: -- and, yeah, once he started
18 | showing the interest I thought I'd better just stay
19 | with that and --

20 | JOHN: Yeah. You're right, you're right.

21 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, so I've, I've done that
22 | more.

23 | JOHN: Good.

24 | MR. SCHNEIDER: And also talked to Kathy to
25 | help her get going along with these -- a couple of
these others that I mentioned. And I've also started
talking with a few more as I told you but I guess
I'll --

JOHN: Great.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- have to spend more time
2 with that still.

3 JOHN: Well, just keep working on it.

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right.

5 JOHN: It sounds like we're making really
6 good progress here --

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right.

8 JOHN: -- good momentum.

9 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

10 JOHN: Good, and thank you for everything.

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, you know, I'm still
12 trying. You know, it seems like it's still short of
13 what one would like, you know, like say from a week
14 ago, of course, you know?

15 JOHN: Sometimes the first step, you know,
16 gets things moving.

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, that's what -- the way
18 I was looking at it too. You know, I mean, from a week
19 ago I thought we all were going to be out, it'd be
20 over. And I did wait for a while and I mean I still am
21 but I still want to work with these people and, and try
22 to get the best done here so --

23 JOHN: Well, you know, I'm really sure that
24 they appreciate what you're doing for them.

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, maybe ultimately they
will. I don't know --

JOHN: They will.

MR. SCHNEIDER: -- now, but hopefully
ultimately they will.

1 JOHN: They will, in the not-too-distant
2 future I'm sure.

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah. Oh, there's -- one of
4 the guys that went and fed the chickens, he's back here
5 by me and he wanted -- what, what did you need now?
6 Oh, would it be okay if two guys went out to feed the
7 chickens and empty some dirty water I guess he's asking
8 me here.

9 JOHN: Let me check on that. I'll --

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

11 JOHN: Hopefully there'll be no problem with
12 it and --

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

14 JOHN: -- I'll just, just make a call on
15 it --

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, and David --

17 JOHN: -- and sure we'll get it done.

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- David, I told him I was
19 going to talk to you and he says, oh, he says, he says,
20 I really do, he says I like John. He says, tell him
21 that if he's been listening to anything on the radio,
22 apparently Paul Harvey made some kind of a statement
23 about there being a lot of UFOs and there was a
24 statement of some astronomer sighting a star moving
25 quickly toward this direction. And I guess there's
been a number of statements on the, on the airwaves
and he --

JOHN: Oh, really?

MR. SCHNEIDER: Yes, he said -- he says that

1 | this is what I've been talking about. He said this is
2 | Psalm 68, he says God has 20,000 chariots. He says one
3 | of those chariots are so large they're able to carry
4 | all the inhabitants of the earth in one. And he says
5 | it's a reality, he says. And I like these guys. He
6 | says I want them to be able to at least take a little
7 | time and look at those things and weigh it, weigh it
8 | out. So he just -- he mentioned that to me. He said
9 | they're, they're coming toward the earth and, and I
10 | guess it's been on a number of broadcasts apparently on
11 | -- news.

12 | JOHN: Oh, is that right?

13 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

14 | JOHN: Well, this could be a sign.

15 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, this is what he was
16 | saying, that's exactly what it is. He says there are
17 | -- well, of course the Bible talks about a lot of that
18 | type of thing happening in the final days.

19 | JOHN: Yeah.

20 | MR. SCHNEIDER: But he, he asked me mention
21 | that to you or pass it on to you and I said I would do
22 | that.

23 | JOHN: I appreciate you doing that.

24 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

25 | JOHN: I, I think that might be something
really significant.

 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right.

 JOHN: And Kathy had mentioned you were, you
were a real source of help to her and --

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

2 JOHN: -- everybody else for that matter,

3 so --

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, good. How long are you
5 going to be there yet, John?

6 JOHN: I'll be here until 6 o'clock.

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

8 JOHN: But if you need -- if you want me to
9 stay around a little bit I will.

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, what I'm going to do is
11 I haven't been able to -- actually, about four or five
12 hours have gone by. I haven't been able to use the
13 facilities here. You know, once you get talking with
14 somebody I just figured that was more important.

15 JOHN: Yeah, I think so too.

16 MR. SCHNEIDER: I'm kind of walking around
17 here right now, so --

18 JOHN: I think so too.

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. I --

20 JOHN: Well, why don't you go ahead and get a
21 chance to do that?

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay, and I'll be getting
23 back with you. I'm going to try to talk to a few more
24 and I'll get back to you.

25 JOHN: I'll talk to you later. Thank you
very, very much.

MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay, no problem.

JOHN: Right.

MR. SCHNEIDER: Talk to you later, John.

1 JOHN: Talk to you later, Steve.

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: Bye-bye.

3 JOHN: Bye.

4 (Phones hung up.)

5 JOHN: Yeah, Steve?

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, I was just going to
7 call back. Do you know, I -- these guys are pestering
8 me here. They -- I forgot to get an answer about them
9 feeding the chickens and throwing the water out I
10 guess. John?

11 JOHN: Yes, I'm sorry. Yes --

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, okay --

13 JOHN: -- absolutely go ahead.

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. They'll just probably
15 be out there for a few minutes and they'll be right
16 back in again.

17 JOHN: That's fine. Go ahead.

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay, thanks.

19 JOHN: Thank you.

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: Bye-bye.

21 JOHN: Bye-bye.

22 (Phones hung up.)

23 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #1 John Tremont?

24 JOHN: Yes, one moment, please. Hi.

25 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #1: Hello, Mr.
Tremont?

JOHN: Mr. Tremont?

UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #1: Yes.

JOHN: No, no, I'm sorry. Mr. -- there's no

1 Mr. Tremont at this number. This is a newly-issued
2 number.

3 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #1: Okay. Sorry
4 to disturb you.

5 JOHN: That's no problem. Thank you.

6 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #1: Okay, bye-bye.
7 (Phones hung up.)

8 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #2: Hello?

9 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #3: Is Robin
10 there?

11 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #2: Pardon me?

12 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #3: Robin?

13 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #2: I think you
14 have the wrong number.

15 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER #3: All right,
16 thanks.

17 (Phones hung up.) (Phone ringing)

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Hello?

19 JOHN: Steve?

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

21 JOHN: John.

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: John Cox?

23 JOHN: Hey, how you doing?

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: Not too bad, not too bad.

25 JOHN: Had a pretty good day, huh?

MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, yeah, real good day.

Real good day. I was -- about an hour or so ago I was
in there talking to David too and he was saying well,
if he -- if you talk to any others encourage whoever

1 | and so I'm still talking to a few people around here.

2 | JOHN: How does he feel?

3 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Pardon?

4 | JOHN: How does David feel?

5 | MR. SCHNEIDER: He -- he went back to sleep
6 | again -- I, I sat in there for a little while talking
7 | with him --

8 | JOHN: Yeah.

9 | MR. SCHNEIDER: -- and someone said they
10 | heard on the, the radio that the message was that he --
11 | he talked -- no, I forgot what they told me, but it was
12 | not so; you know, they had to ask permission to go or
13 | something, that's not true at all. You know, I mean
14 | the, the names were mentioned some of the names I
15 | mentioned so it would have only had to --

16 | JOHN: Yeah.

17 | MR. SCHNEIDER: -- come through there of
18 | course. But --

19 | JOHN: Yeah.

20 | MR. SCHNEIDER: -- no, they didn't ask his
21 | permission at all.

22 | JOHN: Okay.

23 | MR. SCHNEIDER: But Oliver did want to talk
24 | to him. He went in there and asked --

25 | JOHN: Sure.

 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- about some religious
things and that's what he was talking to him about,
but he had already told me he wanted to go and I worked
with him for a while on that.

1 JOHN: Well --

2 MR. SCHNEIDER: But I am still talking with a
3 few other people here and I guess they're all looking
4 to -- sometime in the morning then.

5 JOHN: Okay.

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: And I was hoping to do a
7 little more communicating with David though, but, you
8 know, because of this crazy illness, the wound --

9 JOHN: I think, you know, what you heard on
10 the media was probably just some press speculation.

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, they maybe chose their
12 own words or something --

13 JOHN: I really do, because --

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- so I don't know.

15 JOHN: Hey, they've been doing plenty of
16 that, huh?

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, yeah, oh, yeah.

18 JOHN: The -- John was telling me that David
19 said he heard on Paul Harvey that he mentioned a star
20 heading this way and --

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, I guess it was on a
22 couple of -- well, David didn't hear it and neither did
23 I, but a couple of others listening to radios came --

24 JOHN: Oh, okay.

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- and all told us the same
story. A star --

JOHN: You, you ready for this?

MR. SCHNEIDER: Go ahead.

JOHN: The Houston Chronicle, today's

1 | paper --

2 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

3 | JOHN: -- captioned, "This Is One Hot Guitar:
4 | Neutron Star Is Moving Darn Fast Through Our Galaxy."
5 | They've got a whole article on it.

6 | MR. SCHNEIDER: John, could I ask you a
7 | favor?

8 | JOHN: You bet.

9 | MR. SCHNEIDER: They did a series of course,
10 | The Tribune, The Waco Tribune --

11 | JOHN: Uh-huh.

12 | MR. SCHNEIDER: -- and we -- the last thing
13 | we got to see about that was from Gonzalez, Robert
14 | Gonzalez. He brought the Sunday paper over and of
15 | course it went then from I guess it was Monday on
16 | through to Friday and we never got -- we were to get
17 | papers delivered here but we've never seen them. I
18 | just wanted -- it's mainly Mark Bro (phonetic) story of
19 | course and I'm just curious as to what he had to write
20 | about us. I can basically guess.

21 | JOHN: Uh-huh.

22 | MR. SCHNEIDER: But is, is there any way we,
23 | we could get copies of that given to us and maybe that
24 | Houston -- what is it, the Houston Chronicle?

25 | JOHN: The, the article that I have here?

MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah. It's --

JOHN: Yeah, it's kind of remarkable where it
talks about this guitar-shaped heated material and it's
been named the Guitar Nebula. I mean --

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: No kidding? David will --

2 JOHN: Some timing, huh?

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: I, I tell you one thing, he's
4 got a lot to say about it. I know you guys -- John,
5 and I know it's too weird, too wild, I know you don't
6 believe it. But if you ever heard the man get into
7 physics and astronomy, that was one of the biggest
8 things that blew -- all my life I've loved astronomy,
9 took classes, listened, watched. And I run into him
10 and he went so beyond any astronomer and I -- that made
11 me say to him, "Where did you get the information?"

12 JOHN: Uh-huh.

13 MR. SCHNEIDER: I said, "What school did you
14 go to?" I didn't know that he was not a graduate from
15 some university, and he said that he dropped out of
16 school in high school. So, I mean, that's what started
17 already getting my attention. But yeah, it's, it's
18 definitely interesting about what --

19 JOHN: It's kind of bizarre isn't it?

20 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, to him it isn't because
21 he --

22 JOHN: Oh, I know.

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- he said he will -- he
24 wants to actually to get on the phone and tell you guys
25 more things that are going to happen ahead of time so
when they happen you can see them develop. You know,
he mentioned Psalm 68 and he mentioned -- he'll get
into the Book of Job which is a very deep book and the
Chapter 38, 39 and so right in there, 37, 38. Deep

1 | mysteries to do with the universe, matter, antimatter,
2 | astronomy, so forth.

3 | JOHN: Hey, I'd rather have David come out
4 | and talk to me about it though. Huh?

5 | MR. SCHNEIDER: John, I, I mean I --

6 | JOHN: Wouldn't we all.

7 | MR. SCHNEIDER: I -- well, I believe that.

8 | JOHN: Sure.

9 | MR. SCHNEIDER: I mean I, I know you would
10 | want that.

11 | JOHN: Sure.

12 | MR. SCHNEIDER: But I mean, there's a,
13 | there's a part of these things that he wants you to be
14 | able to see and judge and if it's not so well you lost
15 | a little time.

16 | JOHN: Well, I -- the, the biggest thing that
17 | concerns me right now is you and I both know that David
18 | hasn't been doing too well for a while and -- or he
19 | would have been out -- up and about. Because he --

20 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, you're right, he
21 | hasn't --

22 | JOHN: -- he was in, he was in pretty good
23 | shape.

24 | MR. SCHNEIDER: He hasn't been up and about
25 | in the last two days, that's true.

 JOHN: He was down for a while then he, then
he really pepped up and started feeling much better.

 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right.

 JOHN: And, you know, all the, the vibes that

1 we're getting is that with this seepage and
2 everything --

3 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah.

4 JOHN: -- it, it's not good and it could turn
5 into septicemia in nothing flat and become gangrenous.

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well -- I, I seriously have
7 been doing the best I can since the time I -- I tell --
8 it's, it's so draining and wearing when you're sitting
9 down talking to people and trying to give them other
10 perspectives.

11 JOHN: Oh, I'm sure.

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: You know what I mean? I mean
13 it has --

14 JOHN: Oh, sure.

15 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- been a long day. Last
16 night even I went down and talked to those people. I
17 tried to pick up right away this morning. I went off
18 and found them, went and talked to Oliver again, went
19 and talked to a few more and -- by talking to Kathy and
20 spending time with her. She decided to make her
21 decision. And, and we -- and in fact David, I even
22 said to him, you know, we don't want to even use it as
23 a bargaining anything. You know, that's never been the
24 thing in the first place, John. I mean, you realize
25 that.

JOHN: Sure.

MR. SCHNEIDER: So, we want to get these
people out. They, they made their choice and, you
know, I'm -- whoever wants to do whatever, you know,

1 I'm for that. That's the main thing.

2 JOHN: Well, did you get a chance to talk to
3 Floyd and --

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: I -- he --

5 JOHN: -- Cleve Doyle or Clive Doyle or --

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, I went -- last night
7 when I went, went to see them Floyd was already
8 sleeping and --

9 JOHN: Yeah.

10 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- I called his name, he
11 answered, and I says that's okay, I said I'll talk to
12 you in the morning.

13 JOHN: Yeah.

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: But what I could do if you
15 want, I could -- you know, I can go -- they're up and
16 around --

17 JOHN: You know, before it gets too late.

18 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, yeah.

19 JOHN: Because there was -- I know there were
20 four others and you were able to get Greg on the phone,
21 but there were four others.

22 MR. SCHNEIDER: Right, right.

23 JOHN: And would you like -- you'd like to
24 get this article in there, the --

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, I'd love to, you know,
just for myself. I'm kind of -- I'm definitely curious
to see that about the stars. Is, is -- it's probably
not very long. It's probably a little caption or --

JOHN: It's -- no, it gets -- it's three full

1 | columns. I can read you part of it --

2 | MR. SCHNEIDER: No kidding?

3 | JOHN: -- if you'd like to hear it.

4 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Sure, sure. I'd love to.

5 | JOHN: It's -- it starts off, "Some very hot
6 | licks from the fastest star ever found has created a
7 | heavenly guitar-shaped glow says astronomers."

8 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Holy, do me a favor.

9 | JOHN: Yeah.

10 | MR. SCHNEIDER: I would love to have if you
11 | can tomorrow can we work it out where you can get me a
12 | copy of it, seriously?

13 | JOHN: We'll get it in to you tonight.

14 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Even if you run a copy off
15 | a -- great, but it's pouring out there.

16 | JOHN: Sure. No problem. That's no problem.

17 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I guess we'll have to
18 | dress somebody up in some kind of a plastic suit here
19 | or something.

20 | JOHN: You got a slicker in there I'm sure,
21 | huh?

22 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, yeah, there must be
23 | something in here.

24 | JOHN: Yeah.

25 | MR. SCHNEIDER: All right.

JOHN: And it's talking how this thing is
traveling at 1,800 kilometers a second and, you know,
it's, it's, it's a very interesting article.

MR. SCHNEIDER: Wowie! I, I would

1 appreciate --

2 JOHN: They've already named it the Guitar
3 Nebula.

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: I think that would really
5 lift David up, I would. I mean, I'd, I'd wake him up
6 for that for sure.

7 JOHN: Hey --

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: Because he's into the hot
9 licks --

10 JOHN: -- he probably needs something to --

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- he's, he's an awesome,
12 he's an awesome guitarist. This whole message was to
13 go by stringed instruments is all the prophecies talk
14 about, John, all of them do. It's called shiggaion.
15 But anyway, I mean, it's very -- the language you were
16 reading there is what he's always been into.

17 JOHN: Well, he could probably use something
18 to lift him up a little, huh?

19 MR. SCHNEIDER: Oh, yeah, oh, yeah,
20 definitely.

21 JOHN: He's I'm sure at a, at a low ebb
22 physically.

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, yeah, yeah.

24 JOHN: Maybe not, maybe not emotionally.

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: Not mentally or spiritually.
He, he -- see, all the prophecies talk about one day
how God gets up off his throne and comes on down. You
can look in any book of the Bible, Ecclesiastes 12, you
can look in all the Psalms, Daniel 12:1 it talks about

1 God getting up off the throne, the Throne of Judgment
2 and coming down and this is what he's talking about.
3 He, he said that God showed him -- God hasn't told him
4 anything but wait -- but he was showing a picture of
5 seeing God getting off the throne, there being a lot of
6 activity in the heavens. And he says you tell these
7 guys to watch the heavens, you're -- they're going to
8 see a lot more taking place. They're not going to
9 believe it, they're going to count it as, as, as --

10 JOHN: Hey, could be something he's, he's
11 been looking for, huh?

12 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- as a coincidence.

13 JOHN: Could be something he's looking for.

14 MR. SCHNEIDER: Well, I know you don't
15 believe that, but of course, you know, I have hopes.

16 JOHN: Hey, I believe he does.

17 MR. SCHNEIDER: John, well, that's about it.
18 You got that right.

19 JOHN: You know, and, and his -- you know, I
20 can't, can't deny that. I believe he does.

21 MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, right.

22 JOHN: Let me, let me --

23 MR. SCHNEIDER: John --

24 JOHN: -- just give you one --

25 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

JOHN: -- the second paragraph on this thing.

MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay, yeah, do so.

JOHN: It says, "The tiny object is a neutron
star only 10 miles in diameter, it's moving through our

1 | galaxy, the Milky Way, at a tremendous rate, perhaps
2 | 1,800 kilometers per second, or fast enough to travel
3 | from New York to California in a bit over two seconds,"
4 | you know, and it goes on and on. And it's --

5 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Right. Well, mention the
6 | part about the hot licks again and the guitar so I can
7 | get that in my mind real --

8 | JOHN: "Some very hot licks from the fastest
9 | star ever found has created -- " --

10 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

11 | JOHN: --- "--- has created a heavenly guitar-
12 | shaped glow says astronomers."

13 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Let me call you back, okay,
14 | John?

15 | JOHN: Yeah.

16 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. Call you right back.

17 | JOHN: Bye.

18 | (PPhones hung up.)

19 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Hello, John?

20 | JOHN: Hey.

21 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, I'm, I'm talking here
22 | to David. He'd like to hear that article from the
23 | paper.

24 | JOHN: Yeah.

25 | MR. SCHNEIDER: Could you read the entire
thing to him?

 JOHN: Sure.

 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. Do you have it there?

 JOHN: You bet.

1 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. Here he is. Just a
2 moment.

3 JOHN: Okay.

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay.

5 JOHN: You ready?

6 MR. SCHNEIDER: Just a minute.

7 JOHN: Okay.

8 MR. SCHNEIDER: He's -- we're trying to move
9 something so we can get the phone in here. Hello?

10 JOHN: Yeah.

11 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. Here he is.

12 MR. KORESH: Hello, John.

13 JOHN: Hey, bud, how you doing?

14 MR. KORESH: I'm all right.

15 JOHN: Not too hot, huh?

16 MR. KORESH: Huh?

17 JOHN: Not feeling too well, huh?

18 MR. KORESH: I'm trying to recuperate.

19 JOHN: Well, maybe this will help you a
20 little bit. You ready?

21 MR. KORESH: I'm ready.

22 JOHN: Okay. The caption of the article is,
23 "This is One Hot Guitar: Neutron Star Is Moving Darn
24 Fast Through Our Galaxy," and it's a Houston Chronicle
25 science writer in Today's Houston Chronicle. It starts
off, "Some very hot licks from the fastest star ever
found has created a heavenly guitar-shaped glow says
astronomers. The tiny object is a neutron star only 10
miles in diameter. It's moving through our galaxy, the

1 Milky Way, at a tremendous rate, perhaps 1,800
2 kilometers per second, or fast enough to travel from
3 New York to California in a bit over two seconds."

4 MR. KORESH: Moving pretty slow.

5 JOHN: It's fast by my standards.

6 MR. KORESH: I know.

7 JOHN: "The star and its glow are described
8 in an article published today in 'Nature' magazine by
9 astronomer James M. Cordis of Cornell University in
10 Ithica, New York, Cornell graduate student Scott C.
11 Lundgren and Roger W. Romani, a Stanford University
12 Astrophysicist. Romani said the star is trailing a
13 stream of gas and particles as it speeds through space
14 like a jetliner leaving a contrail across the sky. The
15 glow of this heated material is in the shape of a
16 guitar but it can only be seen with the most powerful
17 telescopes. Appropriately, the object has been named
18 the Guitar Nebula. Romani said the unusual shape is
19 probably caused by the shockwave from the star crashing
20 through the gas -- the gas clouds of differing
21 densities. The phenomenon called a 'bow shock' is
22 analogous to the wave breaking from the bow of a
23 speeding boat. Cordis described the Guitar Nebula as
24 the most spectacular version of these bow shocks we've
25 ever seen. It's a fairly average pulsar but it's
forward motion is exceptional. The star that formed the
nebula is known to astronomers as PSR2224+65. The
number also gives the location of the star in the
constellation Cepheus. Cepheus is low on the northern

1 horizon now but will be high in the northern sky in
2 late-summer. 'The star is moving darn fast,' Romani
3 said, pointing out that it has moved into another
4 constellation. In a million years it has moved from
5 Serpens to Cepheus."

6 MR. KORESH: That's incorrect.

7 JOHN: Well, all I'm doing is quoting the
8 article.

9 MR. KORESH: Yeah. So it's --

10 JOHN: "Despite that kind of speed Romani
11 said snapping a picture of the nebula required a two-
12 hour exposure using special equipment installed in the
13 great 200" Palomar telescope in California. He said
14 the pulsar formed about a million years ago when a star
15 ran out of nuclear fuel and collapsed to a very high
16 density. Pulsars normally move about ten-times faster
17 than ordinary stars but this one is far faster than
18 most pulsars. 'Otherwise' Romani said, 'it seems
19 rather ordinary.' Curt Michael of Rice University's
20 Department of Space Physics and Astronomy said,
21 'Astronomers cannot explain such high velocities with
22 certainty.' He said he suspects the star was boosted
23 by an off-center supernova explosion which blew some
24 material one way and kicked the remaining neutron star
25 the other. 'Other astronomers more skeptical in that
theory,' Michael said -- another possibility is that
the star once was one of a pair of white dwarf stars
closely linked by gravity. If one exploded the pair
would have been flung apart. 'It's possible for the

1 mechanism to work, but how common it is not known,
2 Michael said. Romani said the crucial task in
3 calculating the speed of the star was to determine its
4 distance which they found to be about 6,000 light years
5 away, well within the Milky Way. A light year in
6 distance light travels in a year about 5.9 trillion
7 miles. But Romani said the star's speed is so great
8 that millions of years from now it will escape into
9 intergalactic space." That's the article.

10 MR. KORESH: Well, at least they see
11 something.

12 JOHN: You want it sent in to you so you can
13 read it?

14 MR. KORESH: No, I, I was, I was just --

15 JOHN: The reason I ask is we have another
16 video of the children and we could certainly put a copy
17 of this article with the video of the children and send
18 it on in to you.

19 MR. KORESH: That's all right. We do a lot
20 of discussion here about stars and the constellations
21 and their origin and about God and matter and
22 antimatter and why the universe is the way it is and
23 it's one of the schedules that we teach our students.

24 JOHN: Um-hum.

25 MR. KORESH: A lot of guys who have been into
astrology and astronomy have come here and in very
simple terminology they've been blow away when they've
learned things about the structure of humanity and the
images of humanity and its relationship to the

1 universe. It's -- we always used to say that today's
2 inspiration which is the knowledge within is tomorrow's
3 common knowledge and man becomes quite familiar with
4 common knowledge to where it becomes indifferent. You
5 know, many people in the world don't know what makes a
6 toaster toast?

7 JOHN: Um-hum.

8 MR. KORESH: You know? They use them but
9 they never could fix them could they?

10 JOHN: Yeah.

11 MR. KORESH: So --

12 JOHN: Well, do you think this is what you
13 meant when Steve said that this may be a sign?

14 MR. KORESH: Oh, no, no, no, no, no,
15 it's --

16 JOHN: Yeah.

17 MR. KORESH: -- the -- you're going to,
18 you're going to see a lot of strange events happening
19 in our atmosphere. There's a, there's a lot of,
20 there's lot of aid already assisting here now, you
21 know, the 20,000 chariots have already arrived anyway
22 long ago anyway. It's, it's just a matter of, you
23 know, the finishing of the probation of this
24 generation. And you have to admit, John, that even
25 though the detailed truth has not been permitted to be
given, you have to admit that just the announcement of
seven seals is the last subject matter of the Bible.
You know, it's the last book. And whether a man is
allowed to have their third chance to teach these

1 | things or not, just the announcement of them is
2 | something that's going to cause men to search their
3 | hearts and their own reasoning because that's where it
4 | all begins anyway. If a person looks at these subjects
5 | and says within their soul the light within them that
6 | well, I don't know these things and they start
7 | searching, well, that's a good probationary sign the
8 | cross still covers them. But like Psalms 1 says,
9 | "Those who scoff and those who transgress and those who
10 | make a play with their own carnal knowledge and defy
11 | the mystery are defying the very subject of God." It
12 | says they will not stand in the judgment.

13 | JOHN: Um-hum.

14 | MR. KORESH: Their attitude -- "and every man
15 | by his words you shall be justified and by your words
16 | you shall be condemned in the judgment." And besides,
17 | everybody has already subject to judgment now because
18 | everyone's already read Matthew, Mark, Luke and John
19 | haven't they?

20 | JOHN: Um-hum.

21 | MR. KORESH: The Gospel has already been
22 | given and everybody knows the righteousness of Christ.
23 | All they lack to know is the mystery, something
24 | additional, it's extra oil, you know? No, Deuteronomy
25 | talks about the star, all the prophets talk about the
stars. But, you know, the way that travel takes place
and throughout the universe is totally different than
the way it takes place in this world. You know,
everything is measured in wavelengths and forms be it

1 through the audio spectrum or the visual spectrum.
2 Everything is measured in lines. When you read in the
3 Psalms and in the prophets about how God stretched
4 forth his line from the beginning of creation, you
5 know, everything is finite or infinite in measure; you
6 know, what the stars are, how they were really created
7 and what matter is and how that when -- well, something
8 man can even understand in the building blocks of
9 creation is the atom. You know, here is a little
10 systematic working tool of the universe and if any
11 force is greater than the force contained in the
12 perimeters of the atom, should such a force compress an
13 atom it can only compress it to the equity of its own
14 pressure and then it explodes either through fusion or
15 fission. But of course that law does not always hold
16 true and probabilities such as Einstein was given to
17 know if there was a force far beyond and greater than
18 the atom then the atom can be compressed to where it
19 becomes antimatter. And if it is antimatter hypothesis
20 states that it still retains not its own equal force or
21 energy, but it increases on the opposite spectrum. So
22 this is where you get into the realms of spirituality
23 by like the Apostle Paul saying that the things are not
24 seen are greater than the things that are seen, and the
25 things that aren't seen have more power than the things
that are seen because the things that aren't seen are
more real than the things that are. Visual things are
more primitive than invisible things. Of course, you
know, the angels are invisible aren't they?

1 JOHN: Yeah, I haven't seen any.

2 MR. KORESH: Exactly. Unless they

3 (indiscernible) unless they take on the atomic form.

4 Of course, it's also a proven fact that man is

5 constructed of the elements of the earth. We're dust.

6 We're dirt, you know? And what holds us together?

7 Well, if we break it down in the scientific realm,

8 there's no explanation what causes molecule and atom to

9 combine and to form the way it does. We call it a

10 hidden law, called genetic, call it information. But

11 where did the information come from, who established

12 the law? From the conception of the sea, you know,

13 what determines the image of a fish, the image of a

14 man, the image of a horse? Now, you got to go all the

15 way back to the beginning to start a foundation before

16 these questions even have their perfect visual

17 foundation to even begin to start answering, but

18 there's answers to these things. For the simple at

19 heart there's answers and wisdom. Now, when Isaiah

20 talks about God commands Israel to look into the

21 heavens and behold all the stars. God says behold who

22 hath created these things? Bringest out their host by

23 number. Well, there are many galaxies, many universes

24 of galaxies and many stars that are unseen, many

25 universes beyond universes of universes, you know? If

it's true that my father sits on a throne, but if it is
true that he gave me a book, then I'm not really a cult
leader. As a matter of fact, there's far more stars
than there are people, and there's far more planets

1 | than there are stars, and there's far more inhabitants
2 | of those planets than there are planets and they all
3 | believe in the seven seals.

4 | JOHN: Well, that -- what you're talking
5 | about is faith though isn't it?

6 | MR. KORESH: No, it's reality.

7 | JOHN: Well --

8 | MR. KORESH: You see, it's reality for me --

9 | JOHN: What, what --

10 | MR. KORESH: -- but it's faith for those who
11 | have to pick up a book. And it's a simple little --
12 | see, because you cannot bring upon the minds of men
13 | realities far above and beyond their reality. Just as
14 | today if me and you was to jump in our new car and
15 | drive back 200 years ago we would be worshiped as gods
16 | wouldn't we? Wouldn't we?

17 | JOHN: Um-hum.

18 | MR. KORESH: The mind and perception of that
19 | era of time -- it's just like even in your own
20 | documentaries of this world, your scientists of this
21 | world who've been blessed with small, teeny-tiny rays
22 | of light, they've compiled documentations from all over
23 | the world to where ancient empires have, have had
24 | landing strips and places to honor those who have
25 | visited this world from ancient times, you know? The
Chariots of the Gods is a documentary, it's a
scientific documentary. And they've through
hieroglyphic forms of art have shown that the
possibility of man flying into the atmosphere was a

1 reality of their mind, you know? And it shows them in
2 space vehicles and it shows them in, you know,
3 different vehicles. That's why, you know, like when
4 Nahum tries to explain about the last controversy with
5 Messiah he says there'll be a messiah or a war with
6 messiah and it'll involve chariots with flaming
7 torches, you know? It's tanks, John. And right there
8 in Nahum the prophet if, if he saw something for true
9 maybe, maybe he was assisted, maybe he was assisted by
10 beings from other worlds. I mean, I know about beings
11 from other worlds but you couldn't believe me because I
12 told you so.

13 JOHN: Doesn't mean I don't believe you do
14 though.

15 MR. KORESH: Right, I do, and no one can take
16 that from me.

17 JOHN: No. I don't think anyone's --

18 MR. KORESH: It's just like --

19 JOHN: -- anyone's trying to either, do you?

20 MR. KORESH: No, no. It's just the elemency
21 of unbelief like Paul states in Hebrews to when Hosea
22 delivered Israel from Egypt then he had to destroy them
23 in wilderness because of unbelief. So that's why he
24 warns the New Testament era, he says, "Therefore let us
25 fear least a promise being left unto us that we should
enter into God's rest any of us should seem to come
sure of it." He goes on to explain that when God
begins to unfold his mysteries it'll always be
something beyond man's normal reality but yet the

1 | reason why this is done is so man can prepare his heart
2 | and mind to see these realities become present reality.
3 | It's just, you know, like Ezekiel's chariot when you
4 | read in Ezekiel's prophecy about that lightening, that
5 | flaming, that awesome vehicle. Have you ever read
6 | Ezekiel 1 and 2?

7 | JOHN: No, I don't believe I have.

8 | MR. KORESH: Well, you know, the reason why
9 | that God's never passed judgment on the world is
10 | because God cannot pass judgment on the world until
11 | Daniel's prophecy is fulfilled. In other words, man
12 | has to first be given sufficient evidence that these
13 | prophets were true and no one could understand their
14 | subjects of flaming chariots who travel with the sound
15 | of thunder and, and travel at the speed of lightening
16 | and all that until man can begin to see the
17 | possibilities. I mean, you have your little jets, you
18 | know, you have your little airplanes, you have your
19 | spaceships, you know, you're -- they're, they're quite
20 | primitive. But, you know, man's gone to the moon
21 | hasn't he and they've sent their satellites throughout
22 | the planets of the -- of our solar system haven't they?

23 | JOHN: Well, we're looking at man's standards
24 | there though aren't we, you know?

25 | MR. KORESH: And the ancient prophets have
spoken of this long before.

 JOHN: Um-hum.

 MR. KORESH: You know, God's not only the god
of the Jews, you know, God has also conversed with many

1 | ancient empires, you know? The Koran and all, all, all
2 | forms of people --

3 | JOHN: Um-hum.

4 | MR. KORESH: -- and all people are God's
5 | people. The people of the four divisions of the Tower
6 | of Babel, the red, yellow, black and white. The
7 | Orientals have, have been far more religious and
8 | spiritual towards their god than Israel has. And on
9 | the contrary, the most rebellious people of all in the,
10 | in the records has been Israel. And, you know, the
11 | Caucasian race of all races have been predominant and
12 | more arrogantly set forth as any other type of people
13 | which God has brought forth from the four faces of the
14 | earth. But it's just like I was explaining to one of
15 | the gentlemen about the twelve laminations, the
16 | precious gems that are below the City of God, you know,
17 | in the Book of Revelation. The world knowing about
18 | laser and how that light is refracted and how that
19 | light can be solidified through opposing energies and
20 | polarities of energies. You know, these are -- there's
21 | a natural force that generates through our universe.
22 | There's a natural power that if the key of harnessing
23 | was obtained there's no limits to what man's
24 | possibilities could be. Of course, man's made in the
25 | image of God too, both form and feature and also in his
mind, you know? But --

 JOHN: Let me, let me ask you something.

 MR. KORESH: Sure.

 JOHN: You know, we haven't talked to you in

1 | about Lord, it's almost been three days, huh? And,
2 | and --

3 | MR. KORESH: Seems like one night.

4 | JOHN: Pardon?

5 | MR. KORESH: I've done a lot of sleeping.

6 | JOHN: Well, I guess you've done a lot of
7 | praying too, huh?

8 | MR. KORESH: Well, my mind's in continual
9 | connection with that --

10 | JOHN: Yeah.

11 | MR. KORESH: -- source of information.

12 | JOHN: And it really -- you know, you had
13 | your bad days to begin with and then boy, you really
14 | sounded great. And you --

15 | MR. KORESH: I've been shot.

16 | JOHN: -- and you were -- you really seemed
17 | to be picking up and, and then I guess you, you --

18 | MR. KORESH: The human body, you know how it
19 | goes through --

20 | JOHN: We went through some difficult times,
21 | but did, did Steve talk to you about septicemia?

22 | MR. KORESH: I'm sorry. What did you say
23 | again?

24 | JOHN: Did Steve talk to you about the
25 | concerns that we were getting from our medical people
about septicemia, the infection of the blood?

MR. KORESH: No.

JOHN: And that it was important that you
make sure that you --

1 MR. KORESH: Consider those things.

2 JOHN: -- constantly monitor your blood
3 pressure and your pulse rate because it's a serious
4 thing. You remember Jim Hensen and the Muppets and,
5 and that's exactly what, what happened to him and it
6 was a very, very sudden thing and your temperature is
7 important.

8 MR. KORESH: Did he, did he die?

9 JOHN: You bet he did --

10 MR. KORESH: Hmmm.

11 JOHN: -- in about 24 hours once, once it
12 formed. And if formed from, from a very minor, minor
13 thing where an infection got into the blood system and
14 very, very similar to a gangrenous situation.

15 MR. KORESH: Machine, machine broke down I
16 guess.

17 JOHN: You bet, you bet. We don't want to
18 see that happen either.

19 MR. KORESH: No.

20 JOHN: You know, you don't want to see it
21 happen, we don't want to see it happen.

22 MR. KORESH: No, there's too much of this
23 judgment that has to finished.

24 JOHN: Yeah, and you've got to be healthy and
25 lead your flock out of there, huh? And a healthy --
not only emotionally mentally healthy David, but a
physically healthy David.

MR. KORESH: I'm stronger than what people
realize.

1 JOHN: Well, you sure had us concerned
2 because we hadn't, we hadn't heard anything from you,
3 you've been doing a lot of sleeping and that's one of
4 the things that our medical people tell us occurs,
5 excessive sleeping. And, you know, if you've got a
6 good RN there you'd better keep her busy and let her
7 watch you and let her tend to you because it's going to
8 be important. And I'm, I'm sincere when I tell you I
9 don't want anything to happen to you.

10 MR. KORESH: I don't want nothing to happen
11 to you all too.

12 JOHN: Well, we're in a little different
13 environment out here than you're in in there and --

14 MR. KORESH: You want to hear about a
15 mystery?

16 JOHN: A mystery?

17 MR. KORESH: About some pets that I have in
18 store for you all?

19 JOHN: Some what?

20 MR. KORESH: Some pets.

21 JOHN: Pets? P-E-T-S?

22 MR. KORESH: Yeah, pets.

23 JOHN: What's that?

24 MR. KORESH: Well, you know what a submarine
25 is don't you?

JOHN: Sure.

MR. KORESH: You know what sonar and depth
and, and all the sophisticated sciences of

3 | JOHN: Um-hum.

4 | MR. KORESH: You know, I want to show you --
5 | I want to read something here to you. It's found, it's
6 | found in, in Job 38. It's a lot of mysteries that
7 | scholars have never understood. But I want to tell you
8 | about these pets. There are some in Africa and there's
9 | some in South America and there's a whole bunch of them
10 | out there in your great big little water trough called
11 | the oceans and you all are fixing to see these pets.

12 | JOHN: Well, you want to explain it to me?

13 | MR. KORESH: Sure. You ever heard of the
14 | leviathan? You ever heard of behemoth?

15 | JOHN: Uh-uh.

16 | MR. KORESH: Okay. Have you heard -- you
17 | all, you all, you all for a long time have heard of the
18 | Loch Ness Monster, right?

19 | JOHN: Why, sure. Everybody's heard of that,
20 | huh?

21 | MR. KORESH: Okay, and for ever since
22 | mariners since the beginning of time even through
23 | ancient China and all that they've always talked about
24 | the great sea dragons, right?

25 | JOHN: Um-hum.

 MR. KORESH: Well, once upon a time in this
world --

 JOHN: Of course, some of us think that those
may have been giant squid and they have been other

1 | things also, right?

2 | MR. KORESH: That's what some think.

3 | JOHN: Yeah.

4 | MR. KORESH: But there's also records found
5 | in the manuscripts of God.

6 | JOHN: Um-hum.

7 | MR. KORESH: I mean, surely a Christian is
8 | going to believe the Bible, right? Uh-huh.

9 | JOHN: Certainly hope so.

10 | MR. KORESH: Okay. Now, in the beginning
11 | Genesis tells us that the spirit of God, the
12 | (indiscernible) of Elohim, moved on the face of the
13 | waters. And of course when you look up into the Nebula
14 | of Orion you see a lot of gaseous material don't you?
15 | And that in a form that's, that's spirit. And God
16 | said, "Let there be light," and the origination of
17 | light is something that as we say before has its equity
18 | with darkness, you know, one is the same than the
19 | other, it's just they're on two sides of dimension just
20 | like you're on one side of the sun or the other side of
21 | the sun, there's always one dark side of the moon isn't
22 | there where light shines and where light doesn't shine?
23 | But anyway, without getting into the philosophies,
24 | let's just take a look here, and this is found in Job
25 | 38. "Then the Lord answered Job out of the whirlwind."
Now, remember the whirlwind is just -- it's something
that causes the atmosphere to spin around and around,
right?

JOHN: Um-hum.

1 MR. KORESH: And says to Job, "Who is this
2 that darkeneth counsel by words without knowledge?" A
3 lot of, a lot of the things that men say they just say
4 out of their feelings, they really don't know what
5 they're talking about. I'm sure you, you know about
6 that. So God says to Job, "Gird up now thy loins like
7 a man; for I will demand of thee, and answer thou me."
8 In Verse 4 God says to Job, "Where wast you when I laid
9 the foundations of the earth? Declare, if those has
10 understanding." I mean, you know, yeah, where was Job?
11 In the mind of God? You know, I mean where did we come
12 from? How did we originate? How do we have
13 personality? How come we have individuality? Is there
14 anything like us? Is there another equal to us? "Who
15 hath laid the measures thereof, if thou knowest, and
16 who hath stretched the line upon it? Whereupon are the
17 foundations thereof fastened?" You know, the world
18 just hangs in space doesn't it? "Or who laid the
19 corner stone thereof? When the morning stars sang
20 together, and all the sons of God shouted -- " you
21 know, sons, that's plural isn't it?

22 JOHN: Um-hum.

23 MR. KORESH: "Shouted for God -- for joy?"

7 mean, this day spring takes on a masculine identity.
8 But it might take hold of the ends of the earth. But
9 the wicked might be shaken out of it. Now, this day
10 spring is suppose to have power to shake the wicked out
11 of the earth, right? It, the day spring, is turned as
12 clay for the seal. What are men made out of, John?
13 Clay?

14 JOHN: Sure.

15 DAVID: When the son of man comes, in
16 Revelation 10, he comes to the faces of where the sun
17 clothing the cloud, he has a little book opened,
18 remember?

19 JOHN: Um-hum.

20 DAVID: And seven thunders are uttered? And
21 that mystery of his coming will be as he declared to
22 the Prophets, right? And when he comes, he comes to
23 bring a seal, doesn't he? The seal of the living God,
24 right? And they stand as a garment.

25 Nobody knows what another person's thinking in the
flesh, but what God thinks is revealed in the seven

1 seals and only the lamb can reveal the seven seals.
2 We've already gone through all that, but inside of the
3 lamb there is a hidden mystery and the lamb, when he
4 comes, he comes in the form of humanity clay, so that
5 only those who have the humility to listen to man will
6 be able to find the mystery, and from the wicked, their
7 light, which is within, is withholding. So the wicked
8 will never learn the seven seals, John, 'cause they
9 don't believe Christ comes in the flesh, you see? And
10 the high arm shall be broken.

11 Okay. So there's a Prophecy about Christ, you
12 see? Now, over here, --

13 JOHN: Let me interject something here with
14 you.

15 DAVID: Sure.

16 JOHN: Okay? And it's, it's getting away
17 from this a minute, but I understand that some folks
18 are going to be coming out in the morning.

19 DAVID: Yeah, some, some people that we've
20 talked and --

21 JOHN: And I want to tell you that I
22 appreciate what you're doing.

23 DAVID: Well, it's what they would want to
24 do. They're, --

25 JOHN: Well, --

DAVID: -- they're free, moral agents.

1 JOHN: Yeah, but you've given them some
2 encouragement, haven't you?

3 DAVID: Well, I haven't really given them too
4 much of any encouragement 'cause I haven't really been
5 around anybody for the last, I don't know, day or two.

6 JOHN: No, but I know that Oliver probably
7 had to speak to you.

8 DAVID: Oliver came in this morning with
9 tears in his eyes and, and he feels he's weak --

10 JOHN: Well, I know that --

11 DAVID: And I says, --

12 JOHN: -- Kathy had to speak to you too.

13 DAVID: I says, well, Kathy, she's, she's,
14 like I said in the beginning, I told you people to give
15 this body time.

16 JOHN: Um-hum.

17 DAVID: You see, you all fail to understand
18 that a lightbulb in a room shines upon many objects and
19 whereas if there be five people, one person may choose
20 to behold one object, another person may choose to
21 behold another object, another person may choose to
22 hold yet a third and a fourth and a fifth object. Now
23 should their be objects good or should there be objects
24 evil, each person, by the same light, will choose to
25 behold the object they are interested in. So,
likewise, with the truth of God, not all of the

1 apostolic writers took up their pen and elaborated on
2 the same thing. Matthew took one source of his
3 experience and elaborated, so, likewise, Mark, Luke and
4 John, and so, you see, there are those who are looking
5 at our situation in different directions of what the
6 light has shined upon. Some --

7 JOHN: Sure. You've got people looking at it
8 from out here in one, one direction and you have others
9 in there.

10 DAVID: Exactly.

11 JOHN: You know, and, and not that all of
12 them out here are looking in the same manner nor are
13 all of those in there with you looking at it in the
14 same manner.

15 DAVID: Exactly.

16 JOHN: And it doesn't mean that these are not
17 good people. Any of them. You know, they are good
18 people. And I know that you're, you are encouraging,
19 whether you think you're encouraging these people, you
20 don't think you're encouraging them. Whether it may be
21 through your prayer or maybe it's through your gestures
22 or, or through the fact that you, you can even give
23 them a nod, but you listen to them, right? Oliver is
24 confused and he's, and he may be torn as to what he
25 should do and what he shouldn't do, and just by
listening to him, you're telling him something, aren't

1 | you?

2 | DAVID: I've always listened to my students.

3 | JOHN: Sure.

4 | DAVID: Because they only --

5 | JOHN: But you're listening to them when you
6 | don't feel good yourself, you know?

7 | DAVID: They can only communicate to me in
8 | the light they received.

9 | JOHN: Well, you're showing them some support
10 | so you're, it's easier for them to make a decision when
11 | you, you're supportive of them, and --

12 | DAVID: I told Ollie, I said Ollie, two
13 | thousand years ago there were those who entered in to
14 | the final stages of the judgement. I reminded him that
15 | of the twelve that followed Christ, they all forsook
16 | him but one woman, Mary Magdeline. I explained to him
17 | how that, in our witness and testimony for the truth,
18 | many of us fail without exercise, to really know where
19 | we stand in the truth, and so I says, look, outside is
20 | no different than inside. Inside, you're gonna have
21 | doubts, inside you're gonna have questions, and all of
22 | these answers are to be found in scripture. I says,
23 | outside, you're gonna have people manifest to you on
24 | belief, doubt, they do not know where you stand nor do
25 | they know your doctrine. All they see is the effect of
 | a situation that they, themselves, have brought about.

1 I says, now, if you want to really prove yourself to
2 yourself, 'cause that's where religion is, you know,
3 it's proving ourselves to ourselves. It's not trying
4 to fakishly be a standard to somebody else, 'cause if
5 we tried to be a standard for somebody else, we're
6 going to fall. That's the way it's always been. Paul
7 says, let's let each man have faith in himself, and so
8 within himself, prove himself.

9 And so I says, you know, if you have any question,
10 if you're concerned about, you know, your life or your
11 safety or security, I says you got to count the cost.
12 On the outside they promise you, according to their,
13 their system, they promise you a hearing, a judgement,
14 you get to state your cause, I says, and it's still in
15 the hands of God. I says, you don't have to deny what
16 you've been shown out of the book, you know? If, if
17 you feel that you can, you know, go out there and, and
18 show a good faith with what you believe, it, the
19 experience in itself may even strengthen your faith no
20 matter what may come out of it. I says, this is the
21 testimony of all the Prophet's --. No man's faith was
22 tested alone by himself in secret. It's tested by the
23 elements of unbelief, and that unbelief always comes
24 through the mankind who knows not the truth of God.

25 So I says, you know, you have God's blessing if
you go out there. There's, there's no problem. That's

1 what I've been telling people all along. If my God
2 says to wait and things are developing and I know
3 what's developing, people are making decisions, much
4 talk, much speech, much attitude is being recorded in
5 chronicle all over this world right now in regards to
6 this terrible situation that's developed.

7 JOHN: Well, you know, your God told you to
8 wait. That doesn't mean it told Oliver to wait.

9 DAVID: Exactly, and that's what I've been
10 telling them all along. They are free, moral agents.

11 JOHN: Sure, sure.

12 DAVID: And so --

13 JOHN: But he needed to hear --

14 DAVID: I've told him that all along.

15 JOHN: -- this from you, you know, I mean,
16 whether, whether he needed to hear your support or your
17 prayers or your assurances. He needed it to come from
18 you and, and I don't know if you've talken, talked to
19 Brad or Kevin, but we understand that they're going to
20 be coming out with Oliver too.

21 DAVID: I haven't talked to them.

22 JOHN: And I don't know if they're younger
23 fellows or, or not, but I'm sure they're gonna need
24 some support from you also, huh?

25 DAVID: Well, again, you all fail to
understand what my position is.

1 JOHN: No. I think we clearly understand
2 that these people are free.

3 DAVID: There's a lot of people that, from
4 the outside, know me, and I've never pushed my religion
5 on anyone, they've always had to come to me and ask me
6 questions step by step to dig deeper and deeper into
7 the testament.

8 JOHN: No, but these people don't want to
9 leave you, you know that, and they, and it's a very
10 difficult thing for them to leave, not only a spiritual
11 thing for them to leave, but the fear of the unknown.
12 They're gonna leave there and they're gonna come out
13 here and they don't know what's expected of them out
14 here, what's gonna happen to them out here, how they're
15 gonna be treated, and that's, there's a lot of fear of
16 the unknown, and, and I tried to explain to Steven
17 yesterday and the other John did and Max did, exactly
18 what they're going to face when they come out here and
19 how they're gonna be treated and how they're gonna be
20 handled. The fact that your mother has already got a,
21 an attorney to represent you and that there are eight
22 other attorney's that have stepped forward and, and
23 these are very strong attorney's, probably some of the
24 best criminal attorney's in the state, to represent
25 your flock, the other people.

 They're, they're some, you know, your mother and,

1 and the attorney are here. They're in, are in Waco and
2 you know, they, they want to be supportive and I think
3 it's important that, that when you're talking to Kevin
4 and when you're talking to Brad and as you did to
5 Oliver, you're supportive of them and let them know
6 that people are out here to give them the support and
7 the shoulder to lean on. That's part of the system
8 because I know they've probably never been through
9 something like this before.

10 DAVID: Never.

11 JOHN: None of us has been through this
12 before, have we?

13 DAVID: Well, like I told him, I said, I,
14 like I said, I told Ollie, I says, Ollie, remember what
15 Christ went through two thousand years ago. He made
16 it.

17 JOHN: Sure.

18 DAVID: And I says --

19 JOHN: And he will too, won't he?

20 DAVID: And I says, well, don't expect, that
21 lamb like me, who speaks like a dragon, to be any less
22 lenient than they were two thousand years ago.

23 JOHN: Well, --

24 DAVID: So he wants to --

25 JOHN: The system works.

DAVID: -- he wants to lift up his head, he

1 wants to push out his chest, --

2 JOHN: And be proud.

3 DAVID: He wants to take a look at his God
4 that he's been shown --

5 JOHN: Huh-huh.

6 DAVID: -- and he wants to take whatever you
7 can dish out to him.

8 JOHN: Well, that's, that's not the way I
9 want to put it.

10 DAVID: He want's, he want's to stand alone
11 in his faith for God and his commitment to his spirit
12 into the hand of God, just like the 24th Psalm says.

13 JOHN: Well, that's good. That's good. And
14 he's got nothing to fear by doing that, does he?

15 DAVID: He doesn't want to hide behind me.

16 JOHN: Well, well, --

17 DAVID: So let's learn about --

18 JOHN: No, no one's hiding behind you, are
19 they?

20 DAVID: Some may be, that's why I was telling
21 --

22 JOHN: Well, they're looking for support,
23 they're looking for guidance.

24 DAVID: Well --

25 JOHN: Like I, I mentioned to Steve, and look
at some of the people that we saw on the videos and,

1 | you know, some of the women and the children and the
2 | other people that there is a concern on --

3 | DAVID: Oh, the women know me better than
4 | anybody else, you know that.

5 | JOHN: -- their part. Yeah, but what happens
6 | when they come out and their looking for the guidance
7 | when they leave that compound and they're out here and
8 | they're out here alone, and it's going to be a very
9 | difficult thing for them, isn't it?

10 | DAVID: It'll, it'll be, it don't, they're
11 | already set. There's no problem with them.

12 | JOHN: You know, but they'll have relatives
13 | out here and other people to give them some support
14 | and the support that they need, but there's that
15 | question of the unknown, and somebody has to let them
16 | understand that there are a lot of people here that
17 | will be supportive of them and they're not just going
18 | to be --

19 | DAVID: Well, they know --

20 | JOHN: -- left on their own.

21 | DAVID: -- that, whereas the system may have,
22 | may not be looking at it's own deeds as, as
23 | discriminately as, as, as we would like. We know that
24 | God is gonna to give everybody the just recompense and
25 | judgment they deserve. That's what I teach. So, --

 JOHN: It's kind of, --

1 DAVID: Let's learn about --

2 JOHN: -- hard to argue with that, isn't it?

3 DAVID: It's very hard.

4 JOHN: Sure, sure.

5 DAVID: Whether we accept it or not. Okay,
6 this is --

7 JOHN: Let me, let me, let me ask you.

8 DAVID: -- Psalm -- 40.

9 JOHN: Let me ask you. Have you been, in the
10 last couple of days, you know, 'cause we haven't talked
11 in about three days, huh?

12 DAVID: I don't remember.

13 JOHN: Well, it's probably 'cause you were
14 going through some difficult physical times. Not only
15 emotional times and --

16 DAVID: Thursday.

17 JOHN: -- hey.

18 DAVID: Thursday?

19 JOHN: You missed a couple of days. You
20 know?

21 DAVID: Yeah.

22 JOHN: You really did. At least physically
23 you did, and whether you were dizzy, whether you were
24 going through some, some heavy sweating, excessive
25 sleeping --

DAVID: No sweating, no dizziness --

1 JOHN: Well, I know you were having
2 migraines, huh?

3 DAVID: Just, oh, yeah, that was terrible.
4 Just regeneration.

5 JOHN: Well, do me --

6 DAVID: Part of the physiological process --

7 JOHN: -- a favor, will you? Do me a favor.

8 DAVID: You know, you have to admit, did you
9 see the film?

10 JOHN: Which film?

11 DAVID: The video we sent.

12 JOHN: You sent two.

13 DAVID: Okay, did you see the one, did I show
14 you my bullet holes?

15 JOHN: Yep.

16 DAVID: Now, was that real or was that fake?

17 JOHN: Sure it was real.

18 DAVID: Now, you know, that --

19 JOHN: We saw, we saw Judy's too.

20 DAVID: Right. That bullet tumbled in my
21 body.

22 JOHN: Um-hum.

23 DAVID: And, you know, I did pretty well,
24 now, you have to admit. You know, --

25 JOHN: Have you had any seizures?

DAVID: No seizures, no.

1 JOHN: You sure now?

2 DAVID: I'm positive.

3 JOHN: Remember, today's thursday and you
4 missed a couple of days?

5 DAVID: Why would I have a seizure?

6 JOHN: Well it's, it's a possible thing that
7 you could have had as a result of that. If you were
8 slipping in and out of any kind of consciousness.
9 We, we've also showed the, the video --

10 DAVID: I had peaceful rest and I had --

11 JOHN: -- to medical people out here.

12 DAVID: Uh-huh.

13 JOHN: And they say that it, it's quite
14 possible that you're gonna, infection can set in. You
15 know and I know it.

16 DAVID: God knows it.

17 JOHN: Hey. We don't want it to happen,
18 though, do we?

19 DAVID: No.

20 JOHN: And do you have the medication in
21 there? Are you still taking medication?

22 DAVID: My orange juice.

23 JOHN: Medication.

24 DAVID: I'm taking iron.

25 JOHN: Well, you know what I'm talking about.

DAVID: I'm not, what medication am I

1 | supposed to have?

2 | JOHN: You said that you had been taking some
3 | blue pills.

4 | DAVID: Never. I never said that. That's
5 | not true.

6 | JOHN: You did.

7 | DAVID: I never said that. It's not --

8 | JOHN: Whether it was for pain or whether it
9 | was for infection --

10 | DAVID: No, I do not take pain pills. I
11 | never said that. Now, I know we had, we have some,
12 | some stuff here for, for people that can't take the
13 | pain. I know, Scott, you know, he was hit in the leg
14 | and, you know, he's --

15 | JOHN: No antibiotics?

16 | DAVID: We have some powder and some liquid
17 | stuff. But as far as injectional antibiotics, no. We
18 | have aknasion (Phonetic) garlic, the most natural
19 | source of, the most powerful, natural source of
20 | antibiotic. You want to learn about Bohemians?

21 | JOHN: I want to learn about your health and
22 | I want to learn about resolving this situation. You
23 | know that.

24 | DAVID: Shall I hand you back to Steve then?

25 | JOHN: Why don't you do that for a while.

 DAVID: All right.

1 JOHN: And you get some rest. And you're
2 gonna talk to Brad? You gonna talk to Kevin?

3 DAVID: Well, probably not.

4 JOHN: Why?

5 DAVID: Why should I?

6 JOHN: To give them some support that they're
7 gonna need as to what to expect coming out of here
8 because I'm sure there's a lot of fear in these
9 people's mind.

10 DAVID: Look, these people fear God, okay?
11 You do not --

12 JOHN: They fear the unknown, though.

13 DAVID: Bear, bear with me, then. Turn to
14 Job 41 for me. You'll do that for me, won't you?

15 JOHN: You're gonna have to give me a minute.

16 DAVID: Okey-doke.

17 JOHN: 'Cause I have to find something to
18 turn. You understand?

19 DAVID: Yeah.

20 JOHN: I don't have it right with me.

21 DAVID: You got a King James or a New
22 American Standard mess up?

23 JOHN: Hang on, hang on.

24 DAVID: Remember the patience of Job?

25 JOHN: Yeah. I hope you have a little here
for, for a minute.

1 DAVID: Oh, I do. Now, the dinosaur era, --

2 JOHN: We're almost there. Job 41?

3 DAVID: Job 41.

4 JOHN: You can't imagine how much moving and
5 shaking you just caused.

6 DAVID: Okay. This, this is about my little
7 pet.

8 JOHN: Uh-huh.

9 DAVID: The reason why I'm letting you in on
10 this is so that I can show you ahead of time that the
11 supernatural that we're speaking of is really very
12 natural.

13 JOHN: Uh-huh.

14 DAVID: In your, in your ocean there are
15 little creatures, little fishes that, oh, they look,
16 they look terrible. They're little monster fishes, but
17 they range up from, you know, anywhere to about three
18 sixteenths of an inch up to maybe the max, two inches.
19 But in the lowest depth of the oceans all over the
20 world, there's a creature that defies all the laws of
21 nature. He's been created to do so. The scripture
22 calls him leviathan, okay?

23 JOHN: I'm listening.

24 DAVID: In ancient times Leviathan, which was
25 seen of men, was known as the great dragon. Now, God
says in the scriptures, to, to Job, God says, "Canst

1 | thou draw out Leviathan with a hook? or his tongue
2 | with a cord which thou lettest down?" In other words,
3 | can you go fishing, can you catch leviathan with a fish
4 | hook? "Canst thou put an hook into his nose? or bore
5 | his jaw through with a thorn?

6 | Will he make many supplications unto thee? will he
7 | speak soft words unto thee?

8 | Will he make a covenant with thee? wilt thou take
9 | him for a servant for ever?

10 | Wilt thou play with him as with a bird? or wilt
11 | thou bind him for thy maidens?"

12 | You know, leviathan also has the ability to fly.
13 | You've heard of flying fish, haven't you?

14 | JOHN: Um-hum. I've seen flying fish.

15 | DAVID: They're awesome, aren't they? "Shall
16 | thy companions make a banquet of him? shall they part
17 | him among the merchants?

18 | Canst thou fill his skin with barbed irons? or his
19 | head with fish spears?

20 | Lay thine hand upon him, remember the battle, do
21 | no more." You know what that means, don't you? It
22 | means you touch this creature, all you remember is from
23 | the time that it takes for him to kill you, you're out
24 | of here.

25 | "Behold, the hope of him is in vain: shall not one
be cast down even at the sight of him?"

1 Now you've seen ancient pictures of mariners,
2 right, where they harbor the great sea dragon?

3 "None is so fierce that dare stir him up: who then
4 is able to stand before me?

5 Who hath prevented me, that I should repay him?
6 whatsoever is under the whole heaven is mine.

7 I will not conceal his parts, nor his power, nor
8 his comely proportion."

9 I mean, these things, I'll tell you how big they
10 are in a second, some of the older ones.

11 "Who can discover the face of his garment", which
12 is his body.

13 "Who can come to him with his double bridle?

14 Who can open the doors of his face? his teeth are
15 terrible round about.

16 His scales are his pride, shut up together as with
17 a close seal.

18 One is so near to another, that no air can come
19 between them.

20 They are joined one to another, they stick
21 together, that they cannot be sundered."

22 By his needings, now, you've heard of the fire
23 breathing dragon, right? I'll explain how this, how
24 this creature does this. You know when a horse
25 sneezes, when a person sneezes?

JOHN: Um-hum.

1 DAVID: A light does shine. Now, I'll
2 explain this in a second.

3 "And his eyes are like the eyelids of the
4 morning," 'cause he's nocturnal.

5 "Out of his mouth go burning lamps, and sparks of
6 fire leap out.

7 Out of his nostrils goeth smoke, as out of a
8 seething pot or caldron."

9 Now, the ancient mariners who, you know, records
10 show that guys used to come back from these journeys
11 and they were all insane and crazy, and then we talked
12 about the fire breathing dragon of the ocean, right?

13 JOHN: Yeah.

14 DAVID: You know, it's considered myth today,
15 but yet all over the world men have worshiped and
16 honored this strange creature, haven't they?
17 Especially the more ancient empires.

18 "His breath kindleth coals, and a flame goeth out
19 of his mouth.

20 In his neck remaineth strength," I mean, even
21 though he has all this fire that he can breath out, he,
22 he, you know, he doesn't get burned himself, and I'll
23 explain this in a second.

24 "And sorrow is turned into joy before him". In
25 other words, when a man sees this creature, first he
gets terrified, right, and then he goes crazy. This

1 creature will make you go crazy where you started
2 laughing and everything.

3 The flakes of his flesh are joined together: they
4 are as firm themselves; they cannot be moved.

5 "His heart is as firm as a stone; yea, as hard as
6 a piece of the nether millstone."

7 When he raiseth up himself, in other words, when
8 he submerges from the depths of the ocean, right, the
9 mighty are afraid: by reason of breakings --. You ever
10 seen a fish break on the water?

11 JOHN: Sure.

12 DAVID: You know, it's sort of this thing.
13 When the mighty seen, they purify themselves, in other
14 words, they crap in their breeches. If you was out on
15 the ocean, you could have taken a big leisure ship and
16 you saw one of these leviathan's, you would see, you
17 would see a mountain rise up out of the ocean, you'd
18 would see this living creature and you would crap in
19 your breeches, you know, purify yourself.

20 The sword of him that layeth at him cannot hold:
21 the spear and the dart, nor the habergeon.

22 "He esteemeth iron as straw, and brass as rotten
23 wood.

24 The arrow cannot make him flee: slingstones are
25 turned with him into stubble.

Darts are counted as stubble: he laugheth at the

1 shaking of a spear.

2 Sharp stones are under him: he spreadeth sharp
3 pointed things upon the mire.

4 He maketh the deep to boil like a pot: he maketh
5 the sea like a pot of ointment.

6 He maketh a path to shine after him: one would
7 think the deep to be hoary," which means dark, but in
8 the lowest parts of the ocean, God says, you know, a
9 few miles down, it says it as bright as bright can be.
10 All there is is molten lava down there, John, you see?
11 Especially in the oceans where Hawaii is and all that,
12 the ocean floor is molten, hot lava, very bright,
13 burning.

14 Upon the earthy there is not his like, who is made
15 without fear.

16 He beholdeth all things: he is the king over all
17 the children of pride.

18 Now, the way this creature is created, all through
19 his digestive system and up through his neck, you know,
20 the hardest substance to man is steel, right?

21 Different variations of steel are modified to where you
22 get plutonium and all these different kinds of steel,
23 which you don't, they use, they melt iron in steel
24 pipes, don't they?

25 So, like this creature, there's a substance in the
world, I don't have a word in your vocabulary to

1 | describe it, but this creature, in order to keep
2 | himself warm in the depths of the ocean, he's allowed
3 | to take up this lava and to nest with these, where
4 | these bottoms of the ocean are where the lava is, and
5 | he submerges, when he submerges he doesn't, you know,
6 | creatures, like the smaller fish, when they come up,
7 | they blow up. The depressurization destroys them,
8 | right?

9 | JOHN: Um.

10 | DAVID: No, not so with Leviathan. And he's
11 | able to come up through fresh water and he's also able
12 | to fly, and that's where, when he comes up to the tops
13 | of the, of the water, he lets out this hot, molten lava
14 | 'cause it's very, very, very cold in the depths of the
15 | ocean, and that's why they always called him the fire
16 | breathing dragon.

17 | Now one of the things that the Psalm's tell you,
18 | and one of the things that's gonna happen when the son
19 | of man is destroyed by the gentiles in this generation,
20 | as the rights that when they have fulfilled the cup of
21 | their inequity, and they're proven that they are not
22 | willing to learn anything that does not come through
23 | their own mind, when they deny the God of the throne in
24 | the seven seals.

25 | These leviathan's are gonna submerge out of the
ocean. You know, the lochness, and the lochness are

1 | just babies. They're just baby leviathan's, you know?
2 | Jack Cousteau and a lot of people have tried to take
3 | documentation and tried to take films and stuff of
4 | these creatures. But just like God can hide the seven
5 | seals, he's also reserved in the earth though, from
6 | prehistoric times, certain creatures that are going to
7 | be an active part in, in vindicating the truth of God,
8 | and so I just thought I'd share this with you ahead of
9 | time so that when you see, when you actually see these
10 | things, you can remember who showed these things to
11 | you.

12 | JOHN: I appreciate that.

13 | DAVID: And, he's bad, boy.

14 | JOHN: Um-hum.

15 | DAVID: Of course he's my, these are my pets,
16 | and they belong to God and the scripture says that that
17 | son of God is going to, you know, rule leviathan in the
18 | latter days, and, and as all the elements of nature and
19 | in the creation of nature, the lot of the wicked are
20 | gonna be destroyed by these creatures as well as with
21 | the judgments of God.

22 | So, you know, it's not a vain thing, John, to, to
23 | get on your knees and to confess to the God of heaven
24 | that we don't know, that we don't know his seals, and
25 | give ourselves a little room for repentance, just in
 | case, you know, a little humility goes a long ways with

1 | God, you know? And a lot of people, I mean, Joel says,
2 | multitudes, multitudes of our decision, and a lot of
3 | people, you know, they, they don't understand my
4 | doctrine, they just understand what's being told to
5 | them, and I just hope and pray that as the judgements
6 | finishing up that, you know, at least someone like
7 | yourself has enough reasoning powers to say, well, hey,
8 | this is in the bible and maybe this thing can be true,
9 | and you know, man has not even really scratched the
10 | surface of inner space, has he? The ocean, right?

11 | JOHN: Well, the other, the other question
12 | that comes up is, you know, we're all fallible, aren't
13 | we?

14 | DAVID: Well, not myself, but --

15 | JOHN: And we, okay, all right.

16 | DAVID: I mean, let me explain that to you.
17 | If God talks about a person in the latter days --

18 | JOHN: Well, for some of these people to
19 | understand you, and, you know, I think we've all come a
20 | long way since last --

21 | DAVID: Sunday.

22 | JOHN: -- Sunday, last Monday in, --

23 | DAVID: Praise the Lord for that.

24 | JOHN: -- in attempting to understand, because
25 | it, hey, it was something unique to all of us out here
whether it was --

1 DAVID: Strange.

2 JOHN: -- whether it was Henry or Max or John
3 or, you know, Dick or whomever, Jim, you know, whomever
4 was talking to you.

5 DAVID: Uh-huh.

6 JOHN: It's something unique to us, it's
7 something new to us.

8 DAVID: Strange and different.

9 JOHN: Well, it is. It really is.

10 DAVID: Almost frightening.

11 JOHN: And, and difficult to comprehend, and,
12 you know, I'd be a fool to tell you that it wasn't, but
13 the only way, and it's very difficult for people
14 outside here that don't know you --

15 DAVID: Impossible.

16 JOHN: -- to comprehend. Maybe some
17 theologians do --

18 DAVID: (Inaudible)

19 JOHN: -- and maybe some people, you know,
20 at, at Baylor University and other, other places, maybe
21 they do.

22 DAVID: They almost beat me up at Baylor one
23 time.

24 JOHN: Well, that doesn't mean they don't
25 understand where you're coming from.

 DAVID: Well, they just --

1 JOHN: They won't accept it, that's all.

2 DAVID: They was, they was proven wrong right
3 there in front of a lot of other people and --

4 JOHN: They're gonna reject it, right?

5 DAVID: It's sad to say that's the way it
6 looked.

7 JOHN: But, there're a lot of people out
8 here, the vast majority are in that same position, and
9 the media and, you know, Joe citizen. All of these
10 people are very confused and they don't understand and
11 the only way they're gonna learn, they're not gonna
12 learn by you staying in there.

13 Now, I was hoping that you'd get healthy and you'd
14 walk out of there like you want to do, and you do,
15 don't you?

16 DAVID: These days are approaching.

17 JOHN: You do want to get healthy.

18 DAVID: These days are approaching.

19 JOHN: Well, I know, --

20 DAVID: Like I say --

21 JOHN: -- but it almost looked like you were
22 taking a turn for the worse for about three days.

23 DAVID: Well, the thing of it is, my, look, I
24 go night and day, night and day, I do not take drugs -

25 JOHN: Yeah, but you were constantly
sleeping, and that had us concerned. You know?

1 DAVID: Well, sleeping, resting, just tired,
2 you know? I --

3 JOHN: Yeah, but infection can set in, things
4 can get serious, and before you know it, you can have a
5 major problem. Now I realize that problem is only
6 gonna be of this world, but it's this world that your
7 people are concerned about as well, you know, not just
8 another world, another place, another time.

9 DAVID: Would they --

10 JOHN: 'Cause we're all gonna be --

11 DAVID: Did you, did you listen to me? Did
12 you all, did you give me the time? Yes, you have, so
13 far.

14 JOHN: You bet.

15 DAVID: And I tried to explain to you, that,
16 as a negotiator, the first thing is that you need to
17 let individuals within this rank, think, of which
18 they've been doing so, and their decisions, I will of
19 no wise affect. I have affected them some one, two,
20 three, four, five, six years.

21 JOHN: Um-hum.

22 DAVID: Now, it's time for them to come to
23 fruition. No man is made perfect by a bookshop
24 religion. There is no profession in --

25 JOHN: Well, they're being forced to come
under fruition by an event and a, and a difficult event

1 and an event that we can't change and we can't turn it
2 around, aren't they? You know? That's what's forcing
3 them to do this and it's sad, but it's true. It
4 happened.

5 DAVID: Well, like, two thousand years ago,
6 the disciples were hit unawares 'cause they didn't
7 listen.

8 JOHN: No, and then even when things happen
9 they didn't believe it right away, did they?

10 DAVID: And when the crisis hit, they had
11 time by themselves to meditate and think and they had
12 to even accept, re-learn and accept the resurrection,
13 didn't they?

14 JOHN: Um-hum.

15 DAVID: Okay, so --

16 JOHN: Now can you imagine how difficult that
17 was?

18 DAVID: I know how difficult it was.

19 JOHN: Well, --

20 DAVID: And even what's more difficult -

21 JOHN: -- then for us that --

22 DAVID: -- is that --

23 JOHN: -- that are of a different hilt, it is
24 very difficult to understand, right? And it would have
25 been for the disciples.

DAVID: Even the reincarnation of Christ and

1 the flesh for the judgment of the gentiles.

2 JOHN: You bet.

3 DAVID: The same thing. I'm just a man to
4 anybody that wants to see me.

5 JOHN: Well, --

6 DAVID: That's who I claim to be, --

7 JOHN: And we want you to have the strength
8 to have your flock follow you out so that you can let
9 others learn and you can let others hear your word
10 because they're not going to hear it while you're in
11 there, are they? Only a very few.

12 DAVID: Well, you got to know the rest of the
13 plan.

14 JOHN: The rest of the story?

15 DAVID: The rest of the story. Remember,
16 we're in the fifth seal now. You know what the sixth
17 seal is, don't you? Look it up. Okey-doke, so --

18 JOHN: Hey.

19 DAVID: Sir?

20 JOHN: You get healthy.

21 DAVID: I'll get, I'll eat some spinach right
22 now. All right?

23 JOHN: And you get some rest. Do me a favor,
24 will you?

25 DAVID: We'll try.

JOHN: I won't ask you to do me many favors.

1 I want you to do me a favor though. You get, if you
2 have any faith in that nurse that's in there, or
3 however you want to do it, --

4 (tape skipped)

5 DAVID: -- right now and I'll have him call
6 you right back.

7 JOHN: Can you do that for me?

8 DAVID: I'll do that for you.

9 JOHN: 'Cause I am concerned.

10 DAVID: Okey-doke.

11 JOHN: You believe me?

12 DAVID: I believe you.

13 JOHN: Huh?

14 DAVID: I believe you, John.

15 JOHN: Good.

16 DAVID: Think about that fish in leviathan.

17 JOHN: I will.

18 DAVID: You don't want that fishy to come out
19 and spit all his, spit hot coals on you, do you?

20 JOHN: Well, I know it won't.

21 DAVID: Okay. I hope so.

22 JOHN: Well, I know it won't.

23 DAVID: Do you believe in the son of man too?

24 JOHN: I'd be crazy if I didn't.

25 DAVID: Do you believe he's gonna come and
teach seven seals?

1 JOHN: Well, I don't know.

2 DAVID: Well, what did he say?

3 JOHN: I, I haven't, I can't say that I
4 totally believe that, but I believe you do.

5 DAVID: Well, read the revelation.

6 JOHN: And that's what counts.

7 DAVID: Serve, serve in the fear of God and
8 read.

9 JOHN: Sure.

10 DAVID: Seek ye out of the book of Lord and
11 read, Isaiah 34, 16 to 17 says, no one of these shall
12 fail, none will be without her mate. You want a
13 perfect mate? Would you like to have a perfect mate,
14 John?

15 JOHN: Well, I've got one.

16 DAVID: Well, would you like to have a
17 perfect one?

18 JOHN: I hear you.

19 DAVID: I'm saying that in the restitution of
20 all things, they came to Christ and they said, master,
21 there was a woman, she had seven husbands.

22 JOHN: Um-hum.

23 DAVID: Now each one of these husbands had
24 her and each one died, not giving her any seed. In the
25 resurrection, whose wife shall she be? Christ says,
you do greatly error not knowing the scriptures. So,

1 | the answer's in the scriptures, isn't it?

2 | JOHN: Um-hum.

3 | DAVID: Nor the power of God.

4 | JOHN: Well, it's the interpretation of the
5 | scriptures.

6 | DAVID: Well, Christ knew it, didn't he? He
7 | knew the interpretation, didn't he? For those who are
8 | worthy of that resurrection, neither marry nor are
9 | given in marriage, but as the angels of God. Of course
10 | the mystery of that is that we have Cherubim, Seraphim.
11 | Cherub are masculine and Seraphim are feminine. You
12 | know, God's image is male and female, you know that,
13 | don't you?

14 | JOHN: I certainly do.

15 | DAVID: Okay, so they're just perfectly
16 | mated. God has the ability to reach inside you to take
17 | of the spirit that he gave you from the womb of your
18 | mother and to turn you into two.

19 | You see, there's only one spirit. The spirit that
20 | said, let there be light, is the spirit that was breed
21 | into the nostrils of Adam, and from that same spirit
22 | came forth Eve, that's why --

23 | JOHN: You, you know that you and I don't
24 | have any argument there, don't you?

25 | DAVID: I hope not.

 JOHN: Well, we don't, but there's a lot --

1 DAVID: 'Cause what other creation has there
2 been the woman?

3 JOHN: -- there're a lot of other people that
4 haven't had the opportunity to hear you. Now, whatever
5 that form may be and whatever that platform may be, you
6 can make the choice and you can make the decision, and
7 you can do it, and like we said earlier, you were told
8 to wait, right?

9 DAVID: That's what I'm doing.

10 JOHN: You, you were told to wait. But that
11 doesn't mean everyone else was told to wait, and
12 they're your children and they're gonna follow your
13 lead and you know that and I know that, and I want you
14 to get healthy and I want you to lead 'em out, and I
15 want you to take those vital signs and I want you to
16 have Steve give me a call back.

17 DAVID: He'll call you back in a minute,
18 okay?

19 JOHN: Okay.

20 DAVID: Okay. (inaudible)

21 JOHN: You take care. Shalom.

22 DAVID: Shalom.

23 JOHN: Thank you.

24 MR. SCHNEIDER: This is, this is John.

25 JOHN: Uh-huh.

CLIVE: Hello, John?

JOHN: Hey, Clive. How are you?

CLIVE: Oh, I'm doing fine under the
circumstances.

1 JOHN: Well, you healthy?

2 CLIVE: Sure.

3 JOHN: Good, good. We got a phone call I
4 guess, whether the FBI got it or ATF, the local
5 sheriff's office, I'm not sure, but at least it came in
6 and it was brought to our attention, that your daughter
7 Karen had called to see how you and, and Sherrie were
8 doing. And you, you have another member of your family
9 in there also or just the two of you?

10 CLIVE: It's just the two of us right now.

11 JOHN: Well, I guess Karen was concerned how
12 the two of you were doing so we said -- we've told
13 people that call in that if, if they'd like us to, to
14 talk to people in there, make sure they are healthy
15 and, and doing all right that we would and we'd get the
16 message back to them. And that's the main reason why I
17 want to talk to you, to, to see that you are all right
18 and that your daughter Sherrie is all right --

19 CLIVE: Yeah, she's okay.

20 JOHN: -- and that you're healthy and, and
21 that you're in there on your own accord, your own
22 volition, no one's forcing you to stay in there --

23 CLIVE: That's true.

24 JOHN: -- you know, and you're, you're free
25 to leave if you want to leave. Because that's
basically what David has told us, you know, that --
matter of fact, I just got off the phone with David a
little while ago and he said hey, anybody that wants to
leave they're certainly free to leave and we --

1 CLIVE: Yeah, no one's being held against
2 their will.

3 JOHN: I'm sorry?

4 CLIVE: I said nobody is being held against
5 their will.

6 JOHN: Well, that's good, that's good. And,
7 and David has told me many times and told the other
8 people that have talked to him many times that, you
9 know, he's ready to come out. All he's waiting here is
10 the word and, and we, we discussed the fact that the
11 word is going to tell him when, when he can leave and
12 anybody else can leave whenever they want to leave, you
13 know? They're, they're going to be treated fairly and
14 they're going to be treated humanely and, and the, the
15 system is the best system we have to deal with it. Do,
16 do you have any questions about, about leaving or, or
17 what will be on the outside here, how, how things will
18 be handled on the outside when you come out? Any, any
19 questions that I could answer for you?

20 CLIVE: Well, I imagine anybody leaving would
21 be arrested.

22 JOHN: I'm sorry?

23 CLIVE: I said I imagine anybody leaving
24 would be arrested.

25 JOHN: Well, that's not really true because
there are a lot of children in there, there are a lot
of youngsters and teenagers that --

CLIVE: Well --

JOHN: -- certainly --

1 CLIVE: -- when I say anybody I'm talking
2 about adults.

3 JOHN: Well, I'd, I'd have to be candid with
4 you. I'm not going to lie to you --

5 CLIVE: All right.

6 JOHN: -- that you certainly will be, but I
7 will tell you that the charges that are going to be
8 placed against any adults coming out by the federal
9 government is they're going to be charged as material
10 witnesses. And, and those are the initial charges that
11 will be placed on any adults coming out, as material
12 witnesses against the principals who have, who have
13 been involved in this thing. And, and only you can
14 answer, you know, and through your lawyers what, what
15 part you played. And, and I also pointed out to David
16 that his mother has hired an attorney from, from
17 Houston who is considered one of the paramount criminal
18 lawyers in the state to represent him and there are at
19 least eight other lawyers that are in the Waco area
20 that have said that they would represent the other
21 people inside the, the facility up there. So there is,
22 there is --

23 CLIVE: Well --

24 JOHN: -- legal representation waiting for
25 people out here and, and, you know, they're not being
thrown to the wolves if they come out or something.

CLIVE: Is Karen being held?

JOHN: I'm sorry?

CLIVE: Is Karen being held somewhere?

1 JOHN: No, she's not, uh-uh. She -- because
2 she called from -- I can tell you the address. It was
3 in La Verne, California, on White Avenue.

4 CLIVE: I understand they raided that place,
5 so I was wondering whether she'd been taken in for
6 questioning or whatever.

7 JOHN: No, no, uh-uh. Not at all. And she
8 called because she was concerned and because she was
9 formerly was in there to best of my knowledge and
10 that --

11 CLIVE: So, she just left a message? You
12 don't have a recording or anything of what she had to
13 say?

14 JOHN: No, uh-uh, no. If I did I'd play it
15 for you --

16 CLIVE: Okay.

17 JOHN: -- because we have had some recordings
18 by other individuals and we, we'd certainly be happy to
19 play them, you know. But --

20 CLIVE: You know, if you -- if she calls
21 again too or you call her, whatever, you can let her
22 know that we're okay.

23 JOHN: That's fine, that's fine. And, and is
24 there any message that you would want us to relay other
25 than that, or is there anyone else that you would like
us to contact?

 CLIVE: No, I don't have too many relatives
in this country.

 JOHN: Well, the reason I ask is the British

1 | Consulate has contacted us regarding British citizens
2 | and we've been contacted by other foreign consulates
3 | and consul generals concerning, you know, people from
4 | other countries.

5 | CLIVE: Um-hum.

6 | JOHN: So, if you did have something we'd be
7 | happy to contact them or if you wanted to make a
8 | recording or if you wanted, wanted her to make some
9 | recording we can sure pass that on. But --

10 | CLIVE: I don't --

11 | JOHN: -- we're hoping this whole thing is
12 | going to be resolved in a, in a day or so anyhow so
13 | you'll be able to talk to her in person.

14 | CLIVE: Well, whenever God's ready. That's
15 | what we're waiting on is, is God and --

16 | JOHN: Yeah.

17 | CLIVE: -- he's the one that's in charge, you
18 | know?

19 | JOHN: Well, I don't know what kind of a sign
20 | it's going to take. You, you almost think a meteor is
21 | going to have to fall in that place.

22 | CLIVE: Who knows?

23 | JOHN: Hey --

24 | CLIVE: I don't know.

25 | JOHN: -- it's not easy and, and of course
initially it wasn't very easy for us to understand
because it was something -- a philosophy that was new
to us and, and we've had a lot, we've had a lot of long
dialogue with David and, and we've had a lot of Bible

1 readings with him and spiritual sessions and, and we
2 have with Steven also.

3 CLIVE: Um-hum.

4 JOHN: And basically, David has told us that
5 this evening to work things out with Steven as to how
6 the people are going to be coming out of there. And
7 there -- from what I understand at least three of the
8 men will be coming out tomorrow morning, and, and maybe
9 more. So we're hoping maybe more because they know
10 that we're not vindictive and, and I have no animosity
11 nor does anyone else out here towards anyone in there
12 and justice is going to prevail one way or another and
13 it's the best system there is. And if you want to be
14 in that number that's coming out tomorrow that's fine,
15 you know, that's -- but it's your decision to make, you
16 know, it's not my decision to make. And --

17 CLIVE: Um-hum.

18 JOHN: -- as you know and as everyone else
19 knows, we've got a lot of patience and that's all we're
20 going to do is sit and wait out here.

21 CLIVE: It's a pity it hadn't been handled
22 different to begin with.

23 JOHN: Yeah, but we can't change that can we?

24 CLIVE: Not now.

25 JOHN: What's done is done isn't it?

CLIVE: But --

JOHN: It's, it's, it's a tragedy that
occurred and it was a tragedy for the people in there
and it was a tragedy for a lot of other people.

1 CLIVE: I mean, you know we don't hold any
2 animosity toward the individuals that came out here,
3 but --

4 JOHN: Well --

5 CLIVE: -- the way they came out.

6 JOHN: I, I know David said all the people
7 had to do was come up and knock on the door and it
8 would be changed and I told David that when we started
9 talking to him and when the FBI started talking to him
10 on the phone we were knocking on that door and we're
11 down at the end of the road and our arms are open and
12 all it's going to take is for people to come out. The
13 media is out there. The media ensures that, hey,
14 nobody is being abused, no one's rights are going to be
15 offended when they come out and, and David said the --

16 CLIVE: They're not exactly hearing
17 everything that's going on though are they?

18 JOHN: I'm sorry?

19 CLIVE: They're only -- the media have been
20 blitzed to the point where they only hear what the FBI
21 wants them to hear though.

22 JOHN: Well, they're hearing everything that
23 we discuss on the phone with David and with Steven, not
24 word-for-word because --

25 CLIVE: (Indiscernible)

JOHN: Yeah, sure, I mean I -- people in here
have spoken to David and Steve some evenings for seven
or eight hours at a time. So but they're certainly
learning the nuts and bolts and, and the mind-set and

1 the feelings and the -- you know, they, they've been
2 told that anybody that wants to leave inside there can
3 leave. And that's basically the truth isn't it, that
4 no one's forcing anybody to stay in there?

5 CLIVE: Nobody's being forced to stay --

6 JOHN: Sure.

7 CLIVE: -- at this point even before this
8 situation. I mean, the fact that there are people on
9 the outside that have visited here or have been members
10 or whatever and have chosen to return to their various
11 states or countries --

12 JOHN: Sure.

13 CLIVE: -- or whatever just shows that, you
14 know, nobody is being held prisoner.

15 JOHN: No. I mean, the only people that -

16 CLIVE: This is a --

17 JOHN: -- that have no -- you know, that
18 really are under control of someone else are the
19 children and they're going to do what their, their
20 parents suggest they do. And, and of course we
21 understand that some of the difficulty is that some
22 children have been released already, what, 21 children
23 and, and two elderly women and, and it would be awful
24 nice if those children were with their mothers and
25 their fathers so they could get some direction and
guidance and loving. And we know that David selected
the people to leave and, and he's basically
acknowledged that he selected the people to leave.

CLIVE: So, those people that have small

1 | children that have already been let go --

2 | JOHN: Uh-huh, uh-huh.

3 | CLIVE: -- are they going to be united with
4 | them or --

5 | JOHN: You bet they are.

6 | CLIVE: -- what's the deal, you know?

7 | JOHN: As far as I know they will be, sure.
8 | You know, unless there are some serious charges pending
9 | against people and that's what lawyers are for and
10 | that's what the system is all about. But it's not --

11 | CLIVE: How do you know --

12 | JOHN: -- it's not our intention --

13 | CLIVE: -- charges against --

14 | JOHN: I'm sorry?

15 | CLIVE: I said how do you know which ones
16 | that are going to have the serious charges and which
17 | ones will just be held as material witnesses?

18 | JOHN: Well, everyone is going to be
19 | charged --

20 | CLIVE: That'll be brought out in the trial
21 | wouldn't it?

22 | JOHN: No, it'll be brought out long before
23 | then. The, the -- obviously children aren't going to
24 | be charged as material witnesses, right?

25 | CLIVE: No, I'm not talking about that
 | (indiscernible).

 | JOHN: But adults, adults that come out are
 | going to be charged as material witnesses. They will
 | be interviewed at length by the U.S probation system

1 | which is an arm of the courts. You know, I don't know
2 | how familiar you are with our judicial system, but
3 | everyone that comes out initially will -- if their
4 | anybody that -- people that are injured and we're
5 | certainly aware that, that several are injured because
6 | we viewed some injuries on videotapes. They've --
7 | David has sent out a couple of videotapes that Steven
8 | narrated of interviews with people. And these people
9 | that do have injuries the first place they're going is
10 | to some medical facility to be treated to a hospital.
11 | And then as our judicial system works is prior to an
12 | initial appearance before a U.S. judge where everybody
13 | is advised of any charges against them and what their
14 | rights are they are interviewed by the U.S. Probation
15 | Office which is an arm of the court who answers to the
16 | judge to determine their status, you know, their not
17 | only financial status but marital status, everything
18 | else. And everybody will be allowed to make a
19 | statement if they, they desire to make a statement
20 | concerning any part they played on Sunday the 28th.
21 | And it's up to the court to determine, you know, the
22 | seriousness, and it's up to the initial investigation
23 | to determine who was involved and who wasn't. And
24 | people that weren't involved are certainly not going to
25 | be charged with something other than material witness.
And they'll be asked to testify as to what they saw,
what they observed, the whole nine yards. And, and --

CLIVE: So, where will they stay, for
instance like say these people that leave tomorrow?

1 | Once they're -- let's say they're held as a material
2 | witness, where will they be staying --

3 | JOHN: Well, they'll --

4 | CLIVE: -- since this their --

5 | JOHN: -- they'll --

6 | CLIVE: -- home you might say?

7 | JOHN: Well, they'll --

8 | CLIVE: They can't just go home.

9 | JOHN: No.

10 | CLIVE: You know?

11 | JOHN: They'll initially appear before a
12 | federal judge --

13 | CLIVE: Um-hum.

14 | JOHN: -- and they'll probably be
15 | incarcerated and bond will be set. You know, the court
16 | will set bond as to --

17 | CLIVE: All right.

18 | JOHN: -- because they will be afforded legal
19 | counsel, they'll be afforded an attorney and the court
20 | will set bond and, and as soon as they make bond
21 | they're going to be released on bond.

22 | CLIVE: Yeah, but they can't come back here.

23 | JOHN: Not, not hardly.

24 | CLIVE: I mean, where do they stay? Where --

25 | JOHN: No, I mean that's -- I mean it's
logical that they can't go back there because the
authorities are going to have to -- once everyone is
out of there they're going to conduct what we would
call a crime scene investigation --

1 CLIVE: Right.

2 JOHN: -- because crimes were committed, you
3 know? And so that has to be done. So remember, in our
4 judicial system everybody is innocent until proven
5 guilty, right?

6 CLIVE: It didn't appear that way Sunday.

7 JOHN: I said in our judicial system.

8 CLIVE: Okay.

9 JOHN: You know?

10 CLIVE: Somebody made a judgment --

11 JOHN: Well --

12 CLIVE: -- already.

13 JOHN: Hey, what can I say? What happened
14 happened, huh? But anyhow, once people make bond and
15 if they have relatives and if they have friends and
16 associates they get with their relatives and friends
17 and associates and lawyers and get the advice of their
18 lawyer as to where they'll stay, where they'll go, who
19 they'll be with. I mean, what kind of plans would you
20 have when you come out?

21 CLIVE: I live here. I've lived here since
22 1966 off and on. So I mean it's home. You know what
23 I'm saying?

24 JOHN: Well, I'm, I'm saying what plans would
25 you have when you come out? Obviously, you're not
going to be spending the night --

CLIVE: I don't have any plans at this point.

JOHN: -- at Mt. Carmel.

CLIVE: I don't have any plans at this point.

1 I don't --

2 JOHN: Relatives and friends?

3 CLIVE: I don't know anywhere I could go at
4 this point.

5 JOHN: Well, you've got a daughter, huh, in
6 California? You certainly --

7 CLIVE: That's a long way from the scene of
8 the alleged crime.

9 JOHN: Well, you certainly could stay with
10 your daughter in California I guess couldn't you?

11 CLIVE: Possibly, if, if that was acceptable.

12 JOHN: Strictly up to the court and if the
13 court accepts it and, and you make bond that's where
14 you're going to be. You, you have the same rights and
15 privileges of, of anyone else. But remember, any
16 allegations against anybody in there have to be proven
17 and remember that the medical community is looking at
18 this thing, the public is looking at it, the media is
19 looking at it. So it's not something that's going to
20 roll up and fade away. You know, it's, it's getting an
21 awful lot of, of media attention and, and attention of
22 the people in this area. But one of the big tests is,
23 is going to be, and we realize it, that the, the first
24 adults that come out of there, the first males that
25 come out of there -- I know the people on the inside
are going to be watching -- to see how they're treated,
you know, how they're cared for, and, and we know that.
So we're not playing any games with anyone. As far as
I'm aware and as far as the information that I have, is

1 | once the government is -- has concluded its, its
2 | investigation at Mt. Carmel we have no reason to stick
3 | around there. People that were living there before are
4 | certainly going to be able to go back there. And
5 | you've got religious groups here that, that have
6 | shelters, other churches, the Red Cross, social
7 | services. So there are a lot of people out here that
8 | are in a position to help those that, that may not have
9 | a residence or, or may not have the warefore -- to take
10 | care of themselves right away. And, and I realize
11 | there are a lot of people in the same situation that
12 | you're in --

13 | CLIVE: Um-hum.

14 | JOHN: -- in, in there that have been there
15 | for a while, a lot of women that have been there for a
16 | while that, you know, are going to feel lost when they
17 | come out. And, and there are a lot of social services
18 | and there are people that will, will assist them when
19 | they come out. So it's just like the children: they're
20 | being cared, cared for that came out. But we'd like to
21 | get them with their families, you know, because it's
22 | the proper thing to do. Do you, do you think there are
23 | some others that would be interested in --

24 | CLIVE: In coming out?

25 | JOHN: -- in coming out? Or, or, or what the
reluctance is?

CLIVE: No, it's up to them. I'm -- you
know --

JOHN: I know, you can only speak for

1 | yourself and for your daughter, right?

2 | CLIVE: Well, my daughter can speak for
3 | herself. She's 18, but --

4 | JOHN: Well, you're still her father, huh?

5 | CLIVE: I'm still her father.

6 | JOHN: Sure.

7 | CLIVE: But I -- you know, I don't pressure
8 | her to make decisions. She makes most of her own
9 | decisions.

10 | JOHN: No, but you give, you give her some
11 | fatherly advice every now and then I guess, huh?

12 | CLIVE: Oh, yeah.

13 | JOHN: We all do that have children don't we?

14 | CLIVE: But --

15 | JOHN: Sometimes they listen, sometimes they
16 | don't. They reach a point where they have a mind of
17 | their own don't they?

18 | CLIVE: Just a minute. Yeah, go ahead.

19 | JOHN: I said, the youngsters reach a point
20 | where they have the mind of their own.

21 | CLIVE: Um-hum.

22 | JOHN: But that's human nature. Do you have
23 | any questions I could answer for you, you know,
24 | anything else?

25 | CLIVE: Not that I could think of right now.
I just --

JOHN: Well, if you do --

CLIVE: I was -- I had the understanding
that, you know, you had a recording and I was --

1 JOHN: No. We had a phone call.

2 CLIVE: Yeah.

3 JOHN: But it's been a pleasure to talk to
4 you and --

5 CLIVE: Well --

6 JOHN: -- and I'm sure everything's going to
7 work out.

8 CLIVE: -- you sound like a nice guy. I just
9 hope, you know, that when it's, it's all over that God
10 will judge everybody that's played a part in this
11 according to, you know --

12 JOHN: There's --

13 CLIVE: -- sincerity and whatever.

14 JOHN: Well, you know we will. And --

15 CLIVE: Kathy Schroeder wanted to talk to you
16 a bit here --

17 JOHN: Sure.

18 CLIVE: -- as soon as we're through. So --

19 JOHN: That's fine.

20 CLIVE: -- if you want me to hand her over to
21 you?

22 JOHN: Well, I'll --

23 CLIVE: I'll let you know if I get any
24 feelings of wanting to leave or anything.

25 JOHN: Okay. Well, and if you want to chat
again you know where the phone is on your end, huh?

CLIVE: Okay. I didn't know we could call
out until just --

JOHN: You sure can. All you got to do is

1 | pick up the phone. It's been a pleasure talking to
2 | you, huh, and we'll see you soon.

3 | CLIVE: Okay. Bye-bye.

4 | JOHN: Uh-huh.

5 | CATHY: Hello?

6 | JOHN: Hi, Cathy, John.

7 | CATHY: Hi.

8 | JOHN: How are you?

9 | CATHY: Fine. I had made a request earlier
10 | and I just wanted to check up on it.

11 | JOHN: Okay.

12 | CATHY: I asked if it would be possible for
13 | me to see the children tomorrow or whenever.

14 | JOHN: As far as I know, it will. Are you
15 | going to be there for, for a few minutes?

16 | CATHY: Um-hum.

17 | JOHN: As far as I know, you will. At least
18 | I know your -- you've got a son Brian, huh, that's
19 | here?

20 | CATHY: Yes, he --

21 | JOHN: And your other -- and you have three
22 | other children, I know that.

23 | CATHY: Well, the other three have already
24 | been given to their father.

25 | JOHN: They've been reunited with, with Mr.
Maab (phonetic spelling).

CATHY: Um-hum.

JOHN: Yes.

CATHY: And --

1 JOHN: But you're talking about the other
2 children that are here?

3 CATHY: Right. I was wondering if I could
4 see them. I mean there's a lot of --

5 JOHN: I presume you can, and you could -

6 CATHY: -- there's a lot of mothers here that
7 want me to check on them and, you know --

8 JOHN: You bet.

9 CATHY: -- give them hugs and stuff.

10 JOHN: Hey, that's the natural thing to do
11 isn't it?

12 CATHY: Yeah.

13 JOHN: You, you bet. As far as I know, it's
14 something that's going to have to be kicked around with
15 Social Services but you're going to see your own son
16 and all of them are being kept together so I'm sure you
17 will. And if there are messages to be brought --

18 CATHY: Well --

19 JOHN: -- be brought out --

20 CATHY: -- well, we -- John I talked to
21 earlier today --

22 JOHN: Yeah.

23 CATHY: -- is making arrangements with them
24 tomorrow --

25 JOHN: Yes.

 CATHY: -- to bring Brian over to where you
are right now --

 JOHN: Yes.

 CATHY: -- so that when I come out tomorrow

1 | he'll be right there.

2 | JOHN: That's exactly what's going to happen.

3 | CATHY: From there though if it's -- and I'd
4 | also like to find out where my other three children
5 | are. Have they already left the state or is Mr. Maab
6 | still around? I don't even know where the other three
7 | children are.

8 | JOHN: Well, the answers will be waiting for
9 | you --

10 | CATHY: You probably don't even --

11 | JOHN: -- when you come out, I know that.

12 | CATHY: Okay.

13 | JOHN: But something else that I think John
14 | mentioned to me, I call him John too --

15 | CATHY: Um-hum.

16 | JOHN: -- mentioned to me that we will let
17 | you -- you know, once you're reunited with Brian here
18 | --

19 | CATHY: Uh-huh.

20 | JOHN: -- we will let you make a call back
21 | inside to probably Steven if David's resting and --

22 | CATHY: Right.

23 | JOHN: -- and at, at least let him know that
24 | yes, this is what happened and, and we certainly didn't
25 | renege on, on any promise or any agreement with you.

 CATHY: Right. That, that's understandable.
I understand you don't want to go too far with, with
that per se. But I know -- I'm going to go through the
system and everything --

1 JOHN: Yeah.

2 CATHY: -- and I'm probably going to be tied
3 up for a while but --

4 JOHN: But just remember, you're going to be
5 afforded legal representation throughout this whole
6 thing, right?

7 CATHY: As, as, as long as there --
8 how -- what's the word? As long as they're good at
9 their job, you know?

10 JOHN: Well, as I talked -- as I explained to
11 David and as I explained to Steven, David's mother has
12 already got a lawyer to represent him and as of earlier
13 today there were eight attorneys that are a member of a
14 group here in, in I guess the Waco area that's very
15 similar to --

16 CATHY: Probably vying for a position to
17 take, take a case, huh?

18 JOHN: Standing in line.

19 CATHY: Yeah.

20 JOHN: But there are eight anyhow that were a
21 member of a group and, and I don't have the name off
22 the top of my head but it's similar to the ACLU, okay?
23 That said that they would be happy to represent anyone
24 coming out. And when people come out and have an
25 initial appearance before a federal judge the judge
might --

 CATHY: Do you think that appearance will
happen soon or --

 JOHN: Sure.

1 CATHY: -- or I mean, you know --

2 JOHN: Yes.

3 CATHY: -- it's my children. See, the reason
4 I'm asking is I mean I don't mind being tied up in the
5 court system and I know it's something I got to go
6 through. The reason I'm asking about the time frame
7 though --

8 JOHN: Uh-huh.

9 CATHY: --- is because if my other three
10 children have gone to South Dakota I would --

11 JOHN: Uh-huh.

12 CATHY: -- want to go there and visit at
13 least with them, you know --

14 JOHN: Well, I can tell you --

15 CATHY: -- as soon as I can get through the
16 system.

17 JOHN: -- I can tell you the way the system
18 is going to work and, and -- to the best of my
19 knowledge and, and of my years of experience with them.
20 That when you come out John told you that Brian will be
21 waiting for you here and that you'll be reunited with
22 him, you'll communicate back inside.

23 CATHY: You guys better take pictures, you
24 know that.

25 JOHN: I'm sorry?

CATHY: You all better take pictures.

JOHN: What do you mean?

CATHY: Leave a message. Take pictures when
Brian first sees me.

1 JOHN: Oh, sure.

2 CATHY: That's going to be --

3 JOHN: A nice reunion, huh? You bet.

4 CATHY: Yeah, that's going to be something.
5 People are going to want to see those pictures.

6 JOHN: Oh, I'm sure, I'm sure. And then what
7 will happen is you'll be taken down to the federal
8 courthouse.

9 CATHY: Um-hum.

10 JOHN: And the first people that you will
11 meet there will be from the U.S. Probation Office
12 which --

13 CATHY: And Brian comes with me, right?

14 JOHN: As far as I know.

15 CATHY: Okay.

16 JOHN: You'll be met by representatives of
17 the U.S. Probation Office which they are an arm of the
18 court and they answer to the federal judges. And what
19 they do basically is get some background information
20 from you and family environment and, and all this sort
21 of thing where -- any places you've lived and worked,
22 etc., etc. So they can go to the court -- to the judge
23 and saying all right, here's this individual and here
24 is her background and --

25 CATHY: Can you hang on a second, John?

CATHY: You bet.

MR. SCHNEIDER: Hello, John?

JOHN: Yeah.

MR. SCHNEIDER: Yeah, I'm going to have

1 her -- she's a real good secretary here, Cathy is --
2 I'm going to have her write it all down --

3 JOHN: Okay.

4 MR. SCHNEIDER: -- and then I'll probably go
5 over it with some of the others.

6 JOHN: Okay.

7 MR. SCHNEIDER: Okay. So you can take your
8 time with her. She'll -- I'll get you something --
9 let me see here --

10 JOHN: He's going to have you --

11 CATHY: I'm sorry, John.

12 JOHN: -- he's going to have you taking
13 shorthand, huh?

14 CATHY: Steve's pretty busy right now. No, I
15 don't take shorthand, but --

16 JOHN: (Laughter)

17 CATHY: -- but I can get the basics down.

18 JOHN: Sure.

19 CATHY: He's pretty busy right now. I did
20 want him to, to go --

21 JOHN: What you got him doing, cooking
22 dinner?

23 CATHY: (Laughter) Yeah, he cooks breakfast
24 and lunch too. You should try it sometime.

25 JOHN: That's all right. I'll, I'll pass.

CATHY: He's going to get me something to
write this down on --

JOHN: Okay.

CATHY: -- and then I can go over it with him

1 | and he can --

2 | JOHN: Okay.

3 | CATHY: Because I'm sure that others coming
4 | out will --

5 | JOHN: Well, the, the other, the other person
6 | that you can go over it with is Wayne on the inside.

7 | CATHY: I did talk to him a little bit and --

8 | JOHN: Wayne Martin?

9 | CATHY: -- basically his advice is don't say
10 | anything until you get legal counsel.

11 | JOHN: Well, that's right.

12 | CATHY: You know how lawyers are.

13 | JOHN: Hey, I'm not asking you to say
14 | anything either --

15 | CATHY: Right.

16 | JOHN: -- you know? I'm, I'm just going to
17 | tell you the way it is. And -- but Wayne is a well-
18 | educated lawyer. As far as I know he's a Harvard
19 | graduate and he's --

20 | CATHY: Yeah.

21 | JOHN: -- and he's got a keen mind and, and
22 | he can certainly give you some good legal advice as to
23 | what to do, what not to do and, and then you make up
24 | your mind from there. You get your paper?

25 | CATHY: (Talking to somebody in the
background) Yeah, and just half a second here. Thank
you.

JOHN: Okay.

CATHY: Okay. Now, let me sit down.

1 JOHN: Do you see the drawings on the wall?

2 CATHY: Yeah. Aren't they cute?

3 JOHN: (Laughter) I don't know. I haven't
4 seen them --

5 CATHY: You should (indiscernible).

6 JOHN: -- but I under, I understand that are
7 some drawings of the, the people that Steve and David
8 have been talking to.

9 CATHY: Jim, Gary --

10 JOHN: Uh-huh.

11 CATHY: -- Henry, Dick and John Cox. Which
12 John are you?

13 JOHN: What, what about Max?

14 CATHY: This was an early, this was an early
15 one done and we've met new people that aren't on this
16 one.

17 JOHN: You'd better get Max on there too.
18 He's going to feel left out.

19 CATHY: Which, which John are you?

20 JOHN: John I.

21 CATHY: We only have one John in pictures,
22 John Cox.

23 JOHN: That's it.

24 CATHY: That's you?

25 JOHN: Yeah.

CATHY: Okay.

JOHN: The other is John II.

CATHY: Oh, John II. Okay. He's, he's got a
higher voice than you do. You got a deeper voice.

1 | Okay. The first people I'm going to meet?

2 | JOHN: Well, you'll be met at the end of the
3 | road and --

4 | CATHY: Well, besides --

5 | JOHN: Right.

6 | CATHY: After, after I see Brian.

7 | JOHN: After you see Brian then you'll be
8 | taken down to the, the federal courthouse and you will
9 | be introduced to someone with the U.S. Probation
10 | Department. That's got nothing to do with the FBI and
11 | it's got nothing to do with the ATF. The U.S.
12 | Probation Office is an arm of the court so it's part of
13 | the judicial system and they represent the judge prior
14 | to you seeing the judge. And basically what probation
15 | does is obtain background information from a person
16 | because they will prepare a form and speak to the judge
17 | prior to the initial appearance which is probably going
18 | to take place in an hour or so after you see probation.
19 | And if, if there's a lawyer there that says he
20 | represents you then, then that lawyer will represent
21 | you, you know? Unless you've got one that you, you
22 | have of your own choosing. And you will then be
23 | afforded what we call an initial appearance before a
24 | U.S. Magistrate Judge. And the initial appearance is
25 | where the judge takes the information that you have
provided to probation and the judge speaks to you in,
in a courtroom. And the judge basically tells you that
you have certain rights, you know, the -- all of your
legal rights against self-incrimination and a right to,

1 to an attorney and the whole nine yards and then tells
2 you what you are being charged with. Now, everybody
3 that's coming out of there, you know, certainly isn't
4 going to be charged with something. I would say it's,
5 it's fair for any adult to understand that they're
6 coming out of there, they're going to be charged as
7 material witnesses by the federal government in
8 connection with the case. In other words, their
9 testimony will be required at some point during
10 judicial proceedings to testify as to what they saw.
11 And, and then the judge will set a bond and set an
12 arraignment date which is usually sometime down the
13 road. But when the judge sets the bond if the attorney
14 posts bond or if the attorney makes arrangements
15 through a bondsman to post bond or through family
16 members, friends, relatives, whatever the case may be,
17 once bond is posted you're free, okay? You're free and
18 with a date to appear before the court, and the court
19 will set whatever the arraignment date is. But you are
20 free to go as you please until such time as you have to
21 appear in court.

22 CATHY: Would that, would that include
23 leaving the state or no?

24 JOHN: That's up to the court.

25 CATHY: Okay.

JOHN: You know? And, and believe me, I am
not going to --

CATHY: But they can't put --

JOHN: -- try and, and estimate what a U.S.

1 District Judge --

2 CATHY: Okay.

3 JOHN: -- is going to do.

4 CATHY: But they do have the power to tell me
5 I can't leave the state? That is correct I think,
6 anyway.

7 JOHN: They have the power to tell you you
8 can't, they have the power to tell you you can.

9 CATHY: Okay.

10 JOHN: You know? And but see, the important
11 thing that probation talks to you about I guess as much
12 as anything --

13 CATHY: Yeah, they'll get the information and
14 they'll understand my situation with my children and
15 then --

16 JOHN: Yes, they will.

17 CATHY: -- the judge may say I can leave the
18 state based on that?

19 JOHN: They will, absolutely. That's why
20 it's so important to be candid with probation because
21 whatever you tell probation has got absolutely nothing
22 to do with an FBI investigation or an ATF investigation
23 or anybody else's investigation. They are acting
24 merely as an arm of the court to help the judge --

25 CATHY: Decide what to do with me.

JOHN: -- decide what to do as well as you'll
have an attorney there to help you. But one of the
most important -- you know, one of the things they look
at is do you have children -- you know, you're a

1 | mother, you should be with your children -- and what
2 | are your prior criminal offenses. And if you have some
3 | that's taken into account and if you have none that's
4 | taken into account --

5 | CATHY: Right.

6 | JOHN: -- with the court. And, and the
7 | courts are not a good-old-boy system or anything else.
8 | It is the federal judicial system and I don't know what
9 | experience you've, you've ever had with it before.
10 | This is going to be something totally new.

11 | CATHY: I've never been to court. Even when
12 | I got divorced I didn't go to court.

13 | JOHN: Yeah, yeah. Well, that would have
14 | been a state court anyhow. It wouldn't be a federal
15 | court.

16 | CATHY: Under what you just said --

17 | JOHN: Yes?

18 | CATHY: -- if there is a lawyer right
19 | there --

20 | JOHN: Uh-huh.

21 | CATHY: -- when I meet with the Probation
22 | Department --

23 | JOHN: Yes? Yes?

24 | CATHY: -- I could meet the -- have my
25 | initial appearance within hours you're saying, right?

JOHN: I would say that's a safe bet.

CATHY: Okay.

JOHN: You know, unless the only available
judge is sitting on a trial at that time or, you know,

1 | got something going on.

2 | CATHY: Right.

3 | JOHN: But you will have your initial
4 | appearance. It's usually pretty speedy. Now, whether
5 | it's an hour, whether it's four hours, I couldn't tell
6 | you that.

7 | CATHY: Well, I wouldn't get that picky.

8 | JOHN: And I'd, I'd be lying to tell you if I
9 | would.

10 | CATHY: I wouldn't get that picky anyway. I
11 | just don't want to sit around waiting for, you know, a
12 | month just to, just to --

13 | JOHN: No, no, no, no, no.

14 | CATHY: -- just to appear before, you know --

15 | JOHN: The federal system as a matter of fact
16 | is -- you know, when someone is arrested they must be
17 | brought before a court in a very reasonable amount of
18 | time. And that when, when the court looks at
19 | reasonable they don't play around, they're very serious
20 | about that. And, and this has got a lot of publicity,
21 | right, and a lot of notoriety. So --

22 | CATHY: Is it possible for you to get a list
23 | of those lawyers that you say are hanging around so
24 | that I can find out -- say maybe speak to Wayne and
25 | find out if any of them have a reputation that Wayne
 | may know of them?

 JOHN: I don't know.

 CATHY: He probably doesn't.

 JOHN: I know -- they're maybe hanging around

1 | that courthouse, I know that.

2 | CATHY: Well see, when I get there I've got
3 | to know --

4 | JOHN: Because we know that the first person
5 | that comes out of there, and I under, I understand
6 | that, that you will be coming out early in the morning
7 | and of course the earlier you come out the quicker
8 | you're going to be reunited and the quicker that, that
9 | you're going to get through the procedure. But --

10 | CATHY: As far as my understanding is going
11 | it's going to be pretty early.

12 | JOHN: Well, and we know that three other
13 | fellows are going to follow you out, you know?
14 | So -- and, and I know the people on the inside are
15 | looking at how this is handled and the media is going
16 | to look at how it's handled, and everyone else is going
17 | to look and make sure that nobody's playing any games
18 | with anyone. And, and this is too important for
19 | anybody to do anything like that, you know?

20 | CATHY: Okay.

21 | JOHN: So, they -- there, there are a lot of
22 | attorneys that are interested in, you know, furthering
23 | their careers I'm sure.

24 | CATHY: So you're almost certain now that if
25 | I do -- if I am able to see the kids I have to go to
Child Protective Services but I probably wouldn't be
able to do any of that until after what you just told
me, all this happens?

JOHN: To be reunited with the other

1 children?

2 CATHY: No, not reunited --

3 JOHN: I'm sorry.

4 CATHY: -- to go visit with the other
5 children from here, the other 17 that are still
6 together?

7 JOHN: That's basically true, that's
8 basically true. And, and the other thing is that when
9 you come out and you are -- you know, you meet with
10 probation, probation will ask you, you know, if you
11 have a lawyer or if you want a lawyer appointed by the
12 court. And the judge himself or herself can appoint a
13 lawyer if you are indigent, you know, in addition to
14 any other lawyer that may say we want to represent you.
15 And believe me, the judge would appoint you with a very
16 good, fair, you know, unbiased lawyer because of the --
17 of what's going on here. And, and the courts, the
18 courts have a, have a list of attorneys that have
19 indicated a willingness to represent people. So then
20 you and your attorney will have quite a period to sit
21 down and --
