1 (Tape 144)

2 JOHN: Good. Well, that's good.

3 DAVID: Okay. So anyway --

4 JOHN: I know we didn't want to bother you
5 today and we --

6 DAVID: Are you, are you -- you're not at,
7 you're not at the sheriff's department, are you?

8 JOHN: No, no.

9 DAVID: Oh, I see. Okay. So the -- all
10 right then.

11 JOHN: That's why we had to patch you
12 through.

13 DAVID: Have you read that Micah 7, John?

14 JOHN: I'm sure I read it a long time ago
15 with you.

16 DAVID: Not Micah 7.

17 JOHN: You don't think so?

18 DAVID: No.

19 JOHN: How could I have missed?

20 (Bell ringing.)

21 DAVID: See, see a lot of things is --
22 people, people don't realize that, you know, God
23 requires what's been in the past. Well, there's a
24 statement in the world. You know, we have no fear of
25 the future so we forget what, you know, has been
learned in the past.

1 JOHN: Yeah.

2 DAVID: But oh, boy, I tell you. It's -- I
3 hope the best for these guys.

4 JOHN: They'll be all right.

5 DAVID: Yeah, I know they will.

6 JOHN: And they'll be, you know, well cared
7 for. And the Sheriff's a man of his word. He doesn't,
8 he doesn't go back on his words. And he's, he's been a
9 real class guy to deal with here and, and he's treating
10 everybody very fairly. Plus they'll have some -- I'm
11 sure they've already had some legal representation.
12 And you know --

13 DAVID: Maybe we should stock the sheriff's
14 department up with MREs.

15 JOHN: Oh, they've got plenty of good food.
16 Plenty --

17 DAVID: Yeah.

18 JOHN: -- plenty of good, fresh food.

19 DAVID: Yeah.

20 JOHN: Don't you think so?

21 DAVID: Yeah. (Laughing.)

22 JOHN: Some home cooking, huh? Yeah.

23 DAVID: Some homely cooking. (Laughing.)

24 JOHN: Oh, no. Don't say, don't say that to
25 the man.

DAVID: Hey, you haven't eaten --

1 JOHN: He's been pretty gracious to everybody
2 here.

3 DAVID: I've, I've eaten down there before.

4 JOHN: Have you?

5 DAVID: Yeah. (Laughing.)

6 JOHN: Don't tell me it wasn't much to write
7 home about. Because he was pretty gracious to all of
8 us.

9 DAVID: Well, he was, you know, they, they
10 did us real good when we was down there last time.

11 JOHN: Sure. Sure. We going to get
12 something working this evening?

13 DAVID: We're working on it.

14 JOHN: Good. Good.

15 DAVID: Like I say it's -- when, when you get
16 forced into the Scriptures a lot of the things are not
17 readily understood.

18 JOHN: Um-hum.

19 DAVID: People don't realize that, that what
20 naturally is accepted in this generation as being just
21 business is condemned by God.

22 JOHN: Um-hum.

23 DAVID: So you know, it's just like where do
24 you start with somebody, John? Where do you start?
25 Where do you find a level point in the mind of one man
towards another to where you can start building up on

1 | the, the foundation? You know, you could say well,
2 | look at Christ. But of course, not everybody is like
3 | Christ. People can't do what he did, right?

4 | JOHN: Sure. That's right.

5 | DAVID: Then how come God let him do it, and
6 | God let the apostles do it, and somehow somebody has
7 | missed the boat and no one can do that no more? Wonder
8 | what happened? Somebody went wrong somewhere, huh?

9 | JOHN: You bet. You bet.

10 | DAVID: We got to find out where the kink in
11 | the (indiscernible) of the hose is, don't we?

12 | JOHN: Well --

13 | DAVID: Oh, wouldn't it be --

14 | JOHN: -- got a few, a few kinks in the hose,
15 | huh?

16 | DAVID: Yeah, a few of them.

17 | JOHN: That's for sure. Listen, we, we had a
18 | request from the Sheriff earlier when, when I discussed
19 | some things with the, the fellows that relieved me this
20 | morning --

21 | DAVID: Uh-huh.

22 | JOHN: -- I told them that, that we expected
23 | a female this evening.

24 | DAVID: Right.

25 | JOHN: And we got a request just a little
while ago, Jack, the Sheriff, contacted us and wanted

1 | to make sure that a female was coming, because they
2 | were making arrangements for a female.

3 | DAVID: Okay.

4 | JOHN: And is it safe to go ahead and
5 | reassure him that he can plan on that?

6 | DAVID: Yeah, see --

7 | JOHN: Okay.

8 | DAVID: -- Rita, like I said, Rita is, Rita
9 | is kind of petrified.

10 | JOHN: Well --

11 | DAVID: And she's, she's just --

12 | JOHN: Try to be reassuring to her, because I
13 | sure tried last night to talk to her. And, and I'll be
14 | happy to, to, you know, if you want me to talk to her
15 | again this evening, I'll be happy to do that too.

16 | But --

17 | DAVID: Well, I mean she's, she's more
18 | concerned about her spiritual interests than she is
19 | about her --

20 | JOHN: Sure.

21 | DAVID: -- her civil rights.

22 | JOHN: Hey. Well, you, you know she's going
23 | to be able to keep her Bible. You know she's going to
24 | be able to keep up with everything from a spiritual
25 | standpoint. And none of that's going to be taken away
 | from her. And it's not going to be hampered in any

1 way. So we're certainly not going to do that.

2 DAVID: Okay.

3 JOHN: We respect that. But they are setting
4 aside so many facilities for females if, if there are
5 females coming out and, and we're certainly prepared to
6 handle her and anybody else at any time you want to let
7 us know.

8 DAVID: Okay. Like I say it's -- what we're
9 doing right now is we're just getting confirmations.

10 JOHN: Sure. Well, and be --

11 DAVID: You ever gone to the, you ever gone
12 to the priest before and made confession?

13 JOHN: Many times.

14 DAVID: Before, before you went on a job?

15 JOHN: Sometimes it was lengthier than
16 others.

17 DAVID: (Laughing.)

18 JOHN: And I sure have. Sure have.

19 DAVID: I believe you.

20 JOHN: You know, I really have. And --

21 DAVID: I don't, I don't take confessionals.
22 I just, I just --

23 JOHN: No, but --

24 DAVID: -- confirm to people --

25 JOHN: -- you listen and you, you're
supportive of people. And you listen to them, and

1 | you're giving them some support. And that's what they
2 | need.

3 | DAVID: These guys, old Kevin and Brad, were
4 | really messes in the beginning --

5 | JOHN: (Laughing.) So you have to use a
6 | carrot, a stick?

7 | DAVID: No, no. Like I say, people meet me
8 | and --

9 | JOHN: They do.

10 | DAVID: They meet me and they, you know, you
11 | got to be all things to all men. And they try to
12 | figure me out. And I start talking to them. And like
13 | Brad was in a bar, was down at a club one night.
14 | And --

15 | JOHN: Uh-huh.

16 | DAVID: -- Brad was there drinking a beer.
17 | And he was -- and Brad's the kind of guy that spends
18 | all his money on everybody else. And he's sitting
19 | there and he, he says hey, want a beer, want a beer,
20 | want a beer. You know, like one of these kind of guys,
21 | right?

22 | JOHN: Uh-huh.

23 | DAVID: And I was talking to the owner about
24 | the card, Cyrus Production card, and some of the
25 | passages on it. And, and this guy says oh, wow. He
 | says you know, he says I used to go to church years

1 | ago. He says but I never learned anything like this.
2 | And we was talking, and Brad overheard us and he, he
3 | butted in and started telling us all about the
4 | revelations and about all these different things. So I
5 | sat there and listened to him for about, I don't
6 | know --

7 | JOHN: Uh-huh.

8 | DAVID: -- thirty minutes to an hour. I says
9 | really, really, really. So anyway, he was just really
10 | getting off, because somebody was listening to him, you
11 | know? So then I started asking him questions and --

12 | JOHN: Put him on the spot.

13 | DAVID: Well, you know, and before you know
14 | it we went off to Denny's and had dinner together, and
15 | we started opening up to Scriptures, and we met a U.S.
16 | marshal there that was sitting next to us.

17 | JOHN: Um-hum.

18 | DAVID: And we started opening up Scriptures
19 | to him and stuff. And then we just had a real good
20 | time that night. And he's been, you know, ever since
21 | he's just, he's just been real hungry to know these
22 | things.

23 | JOHN: That's great. Really is. And
24 | because --

25 | DAVID: Because we are --

 JOHN: -- a lot of people have that thirst

1 | for knowledge, and they don't know where to reach for
2 | it, where to grasp for it.

3 | DAVID: They don't know where the real source
4 | comes from. They don't know about God on the throne.
5 | They don't know about the path that God's already laid
6 | out for all men to see.

7 | JOHN: No, and you got so many, so many
8 | youngsters that, you know, their, their families are
9 | supportive up to a certain point. And then they,
10 | they're "mature", right. And they, they're out on
11 | their own, and they start swaying away from it. And a
12 | lot of us have, have done that over the years. And
13 | then we realize there's something there for, for us,
14 | and we better get back in touch with our God.

15 | DAVID: Maybe mom and dad were smarter than
16 | we thought.

17 | JOHN: Yeah. You bet. You bet.

18 | DAVID: Yeah, absolutely. You know, theory,
19 | when, when it comes to theory, theory doesn't work in
20 | reality. And a lot of kids have a lot of theories
21 | given to them about God. When it comes to a working
22 | reality, that God is not really there when they need
23 | it. And so they don't understand that truth has a
24 | certain curriculum that has to be followed.

25 | Like Brad, Brad has always been a, had a
 | problem with alcohol, you know.

1 JOHN: Yeah.

2 DAVID: And there's a lot of people out there
3 in the streets of LA and stuff that I've, that I've
4 dealt with and stuff that, you know, "have a love for
5 God." But of course, their God doesn't give them power
6 to overcome their vice.

7 JOHN: Um-hum.

8 DAVID: And, and they felt very separate and
9 lost, and they feel like they're going to hell. But
10 they don't understand according to the covenants that
11 in the latter days God allows vices to rule over his
12 people, because it keeps them humble. You know --

13 JOHN: Sure.

14 DAVID: -- you get a guy that, that seems to
15 be doing well in life and, and goes to church and, and
16 seems to do everything that he thinks is right. He
17 gets very proud and arrogant, you know. Very self-
18 righteous. You know, and it's like Christ explains in
19 the parable. He says there was a Pharisee in the
20 synagogue, and then there was a sinner. And the
21 Pharisee says I thank thee, O God, that I'm not another
22 man. I pay tithes of all of that I own. And I fast
23 twice a --

24 JOHN: There's a lot more to it than just
25 going to church though, isn't there?

DAVID: Well, exactly.

1 JOHN: Sure. Sure.

2 DAVID: Going to church, Christ talks about
3 your body being the temple of God. You are a walking
4 church if you have the knowledge of truth in you. It's
5 a 24-hour-a-day thing, 7-day-a-week thing.

6 JOHN: Yeah. Yeah.

7 DAVID: And the church is supposed to be
8 for --

9 JOHN: Well, these guys are --

10 DAVID: -- instruction.

11 JOHN: You know, David -- David -- Kevin and
12 Brad are -- I'm sure they've appreciated this, you
13 know. And, and they're learning a lot from it. And
14 they've got a lot more to learn. You know. But at
15 least they'll have the opportunity to do it. The one
16 thing that we certainly don't have any intention to do
17 and, and I mean we on the outside which includes the
18 sheriff's department and everyone else is to jeopardize
19 anybody's religious freedoms. You know, they're
20 cherished freedoms and, and they have to be respected.
21 And if, you know, you can reassure Rita and anyone else
22 that no one's going to interfere with those freedoms
23 and those rights and they can't.

24 DAVID: Well, they already have. But like I
25 say, it deals with a misunderstanding that --

JOHN: Well, they're not going to do it when,

1 | when they come out, that's for sure. In addition to
2 | the, the legal representation, nobody's going to
3 | interfere with their religious beliefs or their
4 | convictions or their ability to, to continue their,
5 | their study.

6 | DAVID: Now whether we're bonded in the flesh
7 | as long as we know where our minds are we can be free
8 | in our spirits.

9 | JOHN: Sure. You're absolutely right.

10 | DAVID: John the Revelator was bonded in the
11 | flesh on the Isle of Patmos. He was considered a
12 | treasonist (sic). He was considered a bad person. But
13 | of course, in the spirit he was in heavenly places,
14 | wasn't he?

15 | JOHN: Yeah.

16 | DAVID: Okay. All right, so let me finish up
17 | working here and --

18 | JOHN: Okay.

19 | DAVID: -- we'll get something going and --

20 | JOHN: Would you --

21 | DAVID: -- and we'll give you a call back
22 | real quick, okay?

23 | JOHN: Okay. Would you let me talk to Steve
24 | for a minute?

25 | DAVID: Okay.

 JOHN: If he's around. Because I've got a

1 message to give to him.
2 DAVID: Okay. Here. Rachel, take the phone
3 to Steve.
4 JOHN: Thanks.
5 [gap]
6 RACHEL: Hello?
7 JOHN: Hello, Rachel.
8 RACHEL: John Cox.
9 JOHN: You're right.
10 RACHEL: How are you?
11 JOHN: Fine. How about yourself?
12 RACHEL: Good.
13 JOHN: Good.
14 RACHEL: Here -- Steve, he just went to get a
15 bite to eat, that's all.
16 JOHN: He did?
17 RACHEL: Yeah.
18 JOHN: I bet he doesn't want a What A Burger,
19 huh? Not after what --
20 RACHEL: What A Burger --
21 JOHN: Not after what David told me last
22 night.
23 RACHEL: Really greasy, nasty. We've --
24 JOHN: David really put one on me last night
25 about What A Burger.
RACHEL: David said they were going to go to

1 hell. (Laughing.)

2 JOHN: (Laughing.) Particularly the chicken
3 sandwiches.

4 RACHEL: Oh, really?

5 JOHN: Yeah. He said those chickens are
6 laying around for 30 --

7 RACHEL: The devil -- sorry. He said the
8 devil wouldn't eat it. (Laughing.)

9 JOHN: (Laughing.) Could be.

10 RACHEL: Fuddruckers is a little better --

11 JOHN: Depends how hungry the devil gets.

12 RACHEL: Yeah. Well, you know, he's a health
13 reformer that, you know?

14 JOHN: Uh-huh.

15 RACHEL: Here's Steve.

16 JOHN: Thank you.

17 [gap]

18 STEVE: Hello, John?

19 JOHN: Hey.

20 STEVE: What's happening?

21 JOHN: I had a message from John 2.

22 STEVE: Okay.

23 JOHN: That I guess he spoke to you about
24 talking to your sister, Susan.

25 STEVE: Okay.

JOHN: And the attorney and the legal process

1 and everything. And he left me a note to tell you from
2 her that when you come out she'll be there to, to see
3 you.

4 STEVE: Oh, really?

5 JOHN: And -- yeah.

6 STEVE: Well, she doesn't need to do that.

7 JOHN: Well, I think she's made her mind up
8 that she wants to see you and let you know that she
9 loves you.

10 STEVE: Okay.

11 JOHN: Hey, it's the right thing. I spoke to
12 David last night, because I missed you last night.
13 You, you must have snuck out and decided that you
14 wanted to get some sleep last night, huh?

15 STEVE: Yeah, I think I did.

16 JOHN: Well, I got to spend a little time
17 with --

18 STEVE: You did, huh?

19 JOHN: -- with David last night. Yeah, and
20 he snookered me. Four hours and five minutes worth.

21 STEVE: Four hours and five minutes he said
22 he talked with you last night. (Laughing.)

23 JOHN: His nose is --

24 STEVE: John, were you -- you were timing it,
25 huh?

JOHN: Hey, his nose is growing too.

1 STEVE: He says your nose is growing too.

2 JOHN: Yeah. When I talked to him, I
3 mentioned to him that we had had some messages for
4 several people in there.

5 STEVE: Okay.

6 JOHN: And after he gets done --

7 STEVE: Did you want to pass, did you want to
8 pass them on now maybe or --

9 JOHN: Well, he -- I know he's busy, you
10 know. He's doing something right now. He's --

11 STEVE: Yeah.

12 JOHN: -- he's talking to some folks. And
13 one of the people that we had a message from was a
14 Sandra Hardial, H-A-R-D-I-A-L. And he --

15 STEVE: Want me to call her to the phone then
16 or --

17 JOHN: He said he didn't have any record of
18 her being --

19 STEVE: He didn't, he didn't never -- no,
20 none of us really ever knew her last name.

21 JOHN: Okay.

22 STEVE: But, but I do know of such a person
23 here. But I even myself --

24 JOHN: Okay.

25 STEVE: -- didn't know what her last name
was.

1 JOHN: Okay. What I would like to do is once
2 he, once he talks --

3 STEVE: They, they call her Sandra. So that
4 might have thrown him off too.

5 JOHN: Okay. Once he talks to Rita, and he
6 talks to the other folks and --

7 STEVE: Yeah.

8 JOHN: -- we resolve that issue, why don't we
9 make arrangements to talk to her and, and maybe some of
10 the other folks.

11 STEVE: All right. So you --

12 JOHN: Okay?

13 STEVE: Not just yet then.

14 JOHN: No.

15 STEVE: So I'll give you a call -- after he's
16 talking do you want to call me, or I'll call you or
17 something?

18 JOHN: When he's done doing whatever --

19 STEVE: Okay.

20 JOHN: -- lecture with Rita and Rita -- you
21 know, he wants to --

22 STEVE: (Indiscernible) lecture with Rita and
23 all that I --

24 JOHN: He said that he wanted to talk to her,
25 and kind of reaffirm the fact that yes, she'll be able
to take her Bible. She'll be able to continue her

1 religious study and, and there were some others that
2 he --

3 STEVE: Okay.

4 JOHN: -- wanted to talk to. So why don't --

5 STEVE: So give you a call then?

6 JOHN: Yeah.

7 STEVE: Okay.

8 JOHN: Give, give me a call when, when you're
9 done doing that.

10 STEVE: Sounds good.

11 JOHN: Okay?

12 STEVE: Talk to you then.

13 JOHN: Thank you.

14 STEVE: Bye.

15 * * *

16 STEVE: Hello.

17 JOHN: Steve?

18 STEVE: Yes.

19 JOHN: How we coming along?

20 STEVE: Just a minute.

21 [gap]

22 STEVE: How, how we coming along?

23 DAVID: Tell him leave us alone until we get
24 this done.

25 JOHN: (Whispering.) He's pissed.

DAVID: We're working on it.

1 STEVE: Okay. We're working on it still.
2 JOHN: Good.
3 STEVE: Yeah.
4 JOHN: Good.
5 STEVE: And I'm, and I'm going to call you
6 just as soon as we're done.
7 JOHN: Do you need, need me to answer any
8 questions?
9 DAVID: Okay, now --
10 STEVE: Not at the moment.
11 DAVID: When it says (indiscernible) --
12 JOHN: Okay, fine.
13 STEVE: Yeah.
14 JOHN: Thanks.
15 STEVE: I'll be giving you a call.
16 JOHN: Thank you.
17 STEVE: Okay, sure. Bye.
18 JOHN: Bye-bye.
19 * * *
20 JOHN: Hello?
21 STEVE: Hello, John?
22 JOHN: Hey, how are you?
23 STEVE: Not too bad.
24 JOHN: Good.
25 STEVE: Hey, do you have in your records
there if a Herbert Leon has called in from Britain at

1 all?

2 JOHN: I do not have that name right in front
3 of me. Do you know --

4 STEVE: It's his --

5 JOHN: Hang on. Hang on. Let me flip
6 through a couple of things. You got a second?

7 STEVE: Yeah.

8 JOHN: Hold on. Just doesn't ring a bell.
9 We had the --

10 STEVE: He said he's an actor that's been in
11 like I think it's Alien 3 and a number of other movies.

12 JOHN: What we've had is many of the calls
13 coming for any of the Brits were from the British
14 Consul.

15 STEVE: Oh, they're -- most of them are from
16 the consul.

17 JOHN: Many were and --

18 STEVE: Yeah.

19 JOHN: -- I've got the name of the vice
20 consul that called for, you know, to give the message
21 to Melissa. And I'd really have to look through some
22 other things but --

23 STEVE: Okay.

24 JOHN: -- in the list in front of me are the
25 names that I gave David last night. I did not have
that name at all, and it doesn't ring a bell.

1 STEVE: Okay, let --
2 JOHN: And I've been, I've been looking
3 through everything I can find --
4 STEVE: -- let me check on the last name then
5 real quick.
6 JOHN: Okay.
7 STEVE: Just a minute.
8 JOHN: Okay.
9 [gap]
10 (Radio playing in background.)
11 STEVE: Yeah, I've got it right here.
12 JOHN: Okay.
13 STEVE: His mother is here, and her name is
14 Victoria Hollingsworth. What? Victorian.
15 JOHN: It's a male?
16 STEVE: No, it's his mother.
17 JOHN: Okay. Hollingsworth.
18 STEVE: Yeah.
19 JOHN: And it would have been Leon is the
20 fellow's last name?
21 STEVE: That's her son, yes. Last name Leon.
22 JOHN: Okay. And his first name was what?
23 STEVE: The first name was Herbert.
24 JOHN: Uh-uh.
25 STEVE: Nothing there?
JOHN: Nothing that I have. And I've got a

1 | list of -- I can tell you right now --
2 | STEVE: Let me find the -- okay.
3 | JOHN: -- the British Consul General's Office
4 | inquired initially, okay, about a lot of people --
5 | STEVE: Okay.
6 | JOHN: -- who they believed were in there --
7 | STEVE: John, can we, can we give you a
8 | number where he could be called?
9 | JOHN: They, they just want us to -- she'd
10 | just like to have us call and give some assurances?
11 | STEVE: Well, and probably --
12 | JOHN: Sure.
13 | STEVE: -- make some kind of a connection for
14 | her. Or I'm not sure what. You know, she's, she's an
15 | older person that was here and, and --
16 | JOHN: Uh-huh.
17 | STEVE: -- has been during this whole time
18 | right from the time it started has been sick in bed.
19 | JOHN: Well --
20 | STEVE: In fact, through all of this she's
21 | lost weight. Hey, I don't even know if he's going to
22 | recognize her after the last few weeks. She's man,
23 | lost a lot of weight.
24 | JOHN: Why don't we try and do something for
25 | her, huh?
 STEVE: That's true.

1 JOHN: You know?

2 STEVE: She's been too sick to even want to
3 worry about it for a while. But now I, I think she's
4 doing a little better so, you know, now we can at least
5 make -- hope that she can maybe make it out okay.

6 JOHN: Well, you can have a couple of people
7 help her out.

8 STEVE: That's true.

9 JOHN: I don't mean that they have to do
10 anything themselves but can walk --

11 STEVE: Right.

12 JOHN: -- walk her out there and --

13 STEVE: Well, that's true.

14 JOHN: Hey, we'd be happy to, to meet her.

15 STEVE: Okay.

16 JOHN: Do you have a number in a town or
17 something like that? And I can try --

18 STEVE: Yeah.

19 JOHN: -- and research. Because --

20 STEVE: Sure.

21 JOHN: -- I'm looking at a list that I had
22 from the British Consul General's Office, and her name
23 is not on it.

24 STEVE: All right. Vicky, do you have a
25 number or would you have, would you have to get it, or
do you know it? Okay. Here it is.

1 JOHN: Go ahead.

2 STEVE: (Vicky's voice in background not
3 discernible.) It's what? 071 --

4 JOHN: Uh-huh.

5 STEVE: -- 263 --

6 JOHN: Uh-huh.

7 STEVE: -- 6973.

8 JOHN: Okay. And where is that?

9 STEVE: That would be London I would imagine.

10 JOHN: Okay.

11 STEVE: I think that to call out of here I
12 think it's like 011 and then --

13 JOHN: Okay.

14 STEVE: 11 -- yeah. 011 and then it's 44 and
15 then the number you have.

16 JOHN: 01144.

17 STEVE: Yeah. And then the number you have
18 there.

19 JOHN: Okay. Well, we can sure, sure try and
20 get a hold of him --

21 STEVE: Okay.

22 JOHN: -- and let him know that, you know --

23 STEVE: Let me ask how they want to connect
24 on that or, or just what might, what they might want to
25 do here. Just a minute.

JOHN: Yeah. Yeah.

1 [gap]

2 (Unidentified voices in background not
3 discernible.)

4 JOHN: We threw that bone once. Tell him
5 that we can maybe try and make the call, and give her a
6 message.

7 STEVE: Okay. I guess it would be good if
8 her, you know, if you could let her know, I mean let
9 him know about being here for her. And we're still
10 working with Rita coming out right now.

11 JOHN: Okay.

12 STEVE: But it seems like she's getting ready
13 to come out herself --

14 JOHN: Okay.

15 STEVE: -- Vicky is, so.

16 JOHN: Well, do you think Vicky could come
17 out with Rita maybe?

18 STEVE: That, that sounds good. That
19 probably would be a big help.

20 JOHN: I'll, I'll tell you what we could do.

21 STEVE: Okay.

22 JOHN: Is if you want her to do that, we
23 would, we would try and hook her right up with him on
24 the phone.

25 STEVE: Okay, just a minute.

JOHN: If you want us to try and do that.

1 [gap]

2 STEVE: I guess if, if (indiscernible) Vicky
3 up with Rita and he could just hook her up with him on
4 the phone (indiscernible). (Unidentified voices in
5 background not discernible.)

6 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: Let's get her
7 out. Let's get her out.

8 STEVE: Could you have what? Oh. She's
9 saying, she -- Vicky I mean. She's right here. And
10 she's asking me, she says could I have a couple of
11 days? Because I'm still feeling sick, and I don't know
12 if I can be getting up yet.

13 JOHN: Well, the best thing to do is
14 probably --

15 STEVE: And, and David's saying that she
16 needs to go as soon as possible because of that --

17 JOHN: Well --

18 STEVE: -- because she's been down and out
19 for quite a while now.

20 JOHN: Why, why don't you and David try and
21 encourage her to --

22 STEVE: Yeah, he is. He, he --

23 JOHN: -- come out. And we've got --

24 STEVE: He has been.

25 JOHN: -- we've got the medical assistance
right down at the end of that road. And --

1 STEVE: Vicky, he says --

2 JOHN: -- when we --

3 STEVE: -- they got the medical, you know,
4 everything that you might need.

5 JOHN: We've had the doctors talk to people
6 and, on the phone before, and we've had doctors tend to
7 people coming out.

8 STEVE: Right.

9 JOHN: She can come out with Rita. We can
10 get her to some medical attention and get her on the
11 phone with her son and he can be -- she can be
12 reassuring to her son when she comes out.

13 STEVE: Yeah. Just a minute. Yeah.

14 JOHN: And, and the other thing that could be
15 done is Rita probably could make a phone call back in
16 and let you know that she's made contact with her son
17 and everything's fine.

18 STEVE: Okay. Just a minute. (David's voice
19 in background not discernible.) Oh, she was even --
20 well, I don't know.

21 JOHN: What?

22 STEVE: You mean what cars do we have left?
23 I don't know. Most of them are bullet shot up and --

24 JOHN: What?

25 STEVE: -- you know, like Rita had a real
nice car. It was one of those Preludes, a Honda

1 | Prelude. But --

2 | JOHN: Uh-huh.

3 | STEVE: -- just Friday the tank came in and
4 | shoved her car all over the place along with the bus
5 | and a number, a couple, three, four cars here.

6 | JOHN: Well, you know, we have one of those
7 | Bradleys that is --

8 | STEVE: Ooh, man. I don't know if she could
9 | handle that.

10 | JOHN: No. No, no. I don't --

11 | STEVE: Okay.

12 | JOHN: Hey. I'm not talking about somebody
13 | driving a Bradley. We have --

14 | STEVE: No, I know. Not, not

15 | (indiscernible) --

16 | JOHN: -- a Bradley that is an ambulance,
17 | okay?

18 | STEVE: Okay.

19 | JOHN: It's designed as an ambulance. And we
20 | can have that Bradley right up the road and -- hold on
21 | just a second.

22 | STEVE: All right.

23 | JOHN: Hold on.

24 | [gap]

25 | STEVE: He's checking on it now.

 DAVID: We still got keys to the Blazer

1 | still, don't we?

2 | STEVE: I guess. He's talking about bringing
3 | a Bradley right up here. The ambulance Bradley.

4 | DAVID: Right up to the, to the front?

5 | STEVE: Pretty close anyway. Whatever we
6 | want.

7 | DAVID: They, they can probably do that.

8 | STEVE: All right. He's talking about
9 | tonight, you know. He's talking about now, this
10 | minute. Okay.

11 | VICKY: (Indiscernible.)

12 | DAVID: You need to go, Vicky. I mean let's
13 | start exercising some faith in what I'm doing.

14 | VICKY: (Indiscernible.)

15 | JOHN: Steve. Steven.

16 | STEVE: Yes.

17 | JOHN: Okay. Going through a couple of
18 | options here. And, and I want your help on it. Okay?

19 | STEVE: Okay.

20 | JOHN: Your help and David's help. We can
21 | get a Bradley up pretty close if, if that would be of
22 | assistance.

23 | STEVE: Okay, I, I --

24 | JOHN: I mean -- and I don't mean in any
25 | threatening manner or anything.

 STEVE: No, no, no. I think that would be

1 | okay --

2 | JOHN: Because we have one that is designed
3 | like an ambulance would --

4 | STEVE: Okay.

5 | JOHN: -- have a doctor in it. Okay?

6 | STEVE: Okay.

7 | JOHN: And maybe Rita could help her out or
8 | anybody else could help her out into the Bradley, and
9 | then the two of them could leave that way. And she
10 | could -- Rita could be a little more reassuring to her,
11 | huh?

12 | STEVE: Well, yeah. He's, he's mentioning
13 | how Rita could be a little more reassuring to her
14 | and --

15 | DAVID: Rita is a basket job.

16 | STEVE: And right now David's saying to me
17 | Rita's a basket job right now.

18 | JOHN: Well, do you have somebody else
19 | then --

20 | STEVE: Do, do we have someone else that
21 | could --

22 | JOHN: -- that could help the two of them?

23 | STEVE: -- two of them that could help her?

24 | JOHN: You know?

25 | STEVE: Possibly he says.

 DAVID: Tell him I'll call (indiscernible) --

1 JOHN: You know, I know --

2 STEVE: Can he, can he call you back in 15?
3 Because we haven't really, you know --

4 JOHN: You can, sure. But I, I know if, if
5 you're concerned about, you know, he mentioned others,
6 you know --

7 STEVE: Yeah.

8 JOHN: -- look at the others and see if maybe
9 they --

10 STEVE: Right.

11 JOHN: -- could help the two of the ladies
12 out of there if Rita's really having some problems.
13 And we can have Victoria hooked up or at least try. I
14 mean dial a number and see if her son is there and, and
15 put her on the phone with him. If it's necessary for
16 Rita to drive her car out --

17 STEVE: Excuse me. Yeah, but you know Vicky
18 is doing very physically, mentally very poorly.

19 JOHN: Yeah, yeah.

20 STEVE: So you, she said --

21 JOHN: Well, we want to get her to a hospital
22 then. And if, and if it's essential that Rita drive a
23 car out, we can do it. You know, we'd rather not.

24 STEVE: Yeah.

25 JOHN: But if it's a necessary thing, we can
do it.

1 STEVE: Okay. Yeah, well let me call you in
2 15 minutes.

3 JOHN: Fine.

4 STEVE: Okay. I'll call you right then,
5 John.

6 JOHN: Okay, 15 on the money.

7 STEVE: Right.

8 JOHN: All right.

9 STEVE: Okay. Bye.

10 * * *

11 JOHN: Hello?

12 STEVE: John?

13 JOHN: Yeah.

14 STEVE: Yeah. I just wanted to make sure I
15 called on time. He's still working with them. You
16 know she is -- the older lady she is, she's sick. And
17 she is -- he's trying to convince her and talk to her
18 that --

19 JOHN: Okay.

20 STEVE: -- that now she'll get to hell and
21 that --

22 JOHN: Sure.

23 STEVE: -- you know, she just -- she's
24 pleading and asking if she can't lay down yet until
25 maybe at least daylight and --

JOHN: Well --

1 STEVE: And --
2 JOHN: Let me tell you what we can work out.
3 STEVE: Okay.
4 JOHN: We can, we can bring one of those
5 Bradleys right on up to the bend of the road.
6 STEVE: Okay.
7 JOHN: I guess there are some lights out
8 there.
9 STEVE: Right.
10 JOHN: We can bring it right up there, one of
11 them that's designed as an ambulance and --
12 STEVE: Okay.
13 JOHN: -- you can have Rita and whomever else
14 you want to have --
15 STEVE: Right.
16 JOHN: -- bring her right on out. And
17 whoever comes out just will plan on leaving.
18 STEVE: All right.
19 JOHN: Okay? And there will be medical
20 assistance in the Bradley.
21 STEVE: Okay.
22 JOHN: All right? And then we will go
23 through the same procedure we've gone with everyone
24 else. And we will certainly make arrangements for her
25 to speak to Herbert, her son.
STEVE: All right. Okay, let --

1 JOHN: And you can be, you know --

2 STEVE: Right.

3 JOHN: -- be as reassuring to her as you can
4 and --

5 STEVE: Right. I have been.

6 JOHN: -- and let David do it. And if it
7 takes two people to help her --

8 STEVE: Um-hum.

9 JOHN: -- if it takes four people to help
10 her, whatever it takes, you know, you be the judge of
11 that. And, and David be the judge and hey. We don't,
12 we don't want anything to happen to the woman. We know
13 you don't either.

14 STEVE: Okay --

15 JOHN: You know, so we're all looking out for
16 her welfare --

17 STEVE: Right.

18 JOHN: -- and her well-being and --

19 STEVE: Okay. Let me go back in and try to
20 help her and encourage her a little bit, and see if we
21 can't get her going --

22 JOHN: Just use your best judgment --

23 STEVE: We're doing --

24 JOHN: -- you know. You've been working
25 hard. You've been working hard in the past --

STEVE: Oh, yeah, believe me.

1 JOHN: -- and --
2 STEVE: Voice is again is getting kind of
3 sore.
4 JOHN: Let's just continue to build on the
5 good things just like we're doing now.
6 STEVE: We're doing it. We're doing it.
7 JOHN: Okay.
8 STEVE: Okay. I'll call you right back.
9 JOHN: About how long?
10 STEVE: I, I don't know. You know, as long
11 as I'm --
12 JOHN: Well --
13 STEVE: -- still going to talk to her. And
14 I'm hoping to get her going here real quick.
15 JOHN: Ten, fifteen minutes or --
16 STEVE: Well, I hope. But you know, I
17 mean --
18 JOHN: Okay.
19 STEVE: -- he's even trying to talk to her
20 now and --
21 JOHN: That's all right. That's all right.
22 STEVE: -- tears are coming from her eyes and
23 all that.
24 JOHN: Hey, hey. Do what you have to do.
25 STEVE: Okay.
JOHN: Okay?

1 STEVE: I'll call you, I'll call you back.

2 JOHN: Thank you, Steve.

3 STEVE: Sure. Bye.

4 JOHN: Bye.

5 * * *

6 STEVE: Hello?

7 JOHN: Hey, Steve.

8 STEVE: Yeah.

9 JOHN: How's it going?

10 STEVE: Okay, we're getting it pretty now --
11 we're just about done.

12 JOHN: Great.

13 STEVE: We kind of worked out now and --

14 JOHN: God bless you.

15 STEVE: Good.

16 JOHN: You're doing good.

17 STEVE: He says, yeah, can you get the
18 Bradley ready then? The ambulance one?

19 JOHN: Yeah. All you have to do is tell us,
20 you know, 2 or 3 minutes or something like that and --

21 STEVE: Okay.

22 JOHN: -- and then we'll call you back and go
23 through the numbers with you.

24 STEVE: Yeah, well, he's just about done.
25 And I've been talking to them. And we're just trying
to get the last few minutes --

1 JOHN: Hey, just be strong with them, huh?

2 STEVE: Oh, yeah. I have been. You know,
3 it's, it's not been easy. Because --

4 JOHN: Oh, I know. I know.

5 STEVE: Physically sick and all that and --

6 JOHN: I know.

7 STEVE: Like she's never gotten up since even
8 before this all happened.

9 JOHN: Hey. She relies on David. She --

10 STEVE: Yeah.

11 JOHN: -- relies on you and --

12 STEVE: Oh, yeah.

13 JOHN: -- everybody else in there. And
14 that's who she's been relying on for years probably.

15 STEVE: Yeah. So we're trying to talk her,
16 you know --

17 JOHN: Good.

18 STEVE: -- it will be okay. And you know,
19 just, just hang in there so --

20 JOHN: Good.

21 STEVE: I'll give you a call right back.

22 JOHN: You got any idea if, if it's just
23 going to be --

24 STEVE: I think it's just moments, you know.
25 Because --

JOHN: The two of them, or is someone else

1 | going to help them out?

2 | STEVE: I don't know. Because I'm starting
3 | to talk to a few more.

4 | JOHN: Okay. Just --

5 | STEVE: So --

6 | JOHN: -- do what you have to do.

7 | STEVE: Okay.

8 | JOHN: And you call me back.

9 | STEVE: Okay. I'll do that.

10 | JOHN: Thank you.

11 | STEVE: Sure. Bye.

12 | * * *

13 | STEVE: Hello, John?

14 | JOHN: Yes, sir.

15 | STEVE: Yeah. Well, tell you what we're
16 | working on right now. We're talking to the two nurses.

17 | JOHN: Uh-huh.

18 | STEVE: And Vicky, she's, she's in the
19 | process, she's going for sure. And we're trying to
20 | talk one of the two nurses to go along.

21 | JOHN: Okay. Great.

22 | STEVE: And they're, you know, it's kind of
23 | one of these things well, which one should go. And
24 | they're kind of looking at each other and we're just
25 | about got convinced at least one of them to go, you
 | know --

1 JOHN: Okay.

2 STEVE: -- with her and everything so -- and
3 it's kind of a surprise to them. You know, it's late
4 at night. And they're, they, they don't --

5 JOHN: Yeah.

6 STEVE: -- like the idea of going in the
7 dark. And I'm trying -- we're trying to say well,
8 they'll, they'll be gentle with you and --

9 JOHN: You bet your life.

10 STEVE: You know, they, they always want to
11 wait until the morning when the sun's up and all that.
12 And we're saying well, you know, Vicky she needs --

13 JOHN: Well, would it do any good if I talked
14 to them do you think or no? I mean you got to make the
15 best judge --

16 STEVE: I think I can, I think I can convince
17 them, you know. Because I've told them I've talked
18 to -- I said the nice -- I really like these guys John
19 Dolan and John Cox. I've spent a lot of time with them
20 as David has. John Cox, he's listened to a lot of
21 studies.

22 JOHN: (Laughing.)

23 STEVE: You got to at least give him --

24 JOHN: I don't have to go to church for 6
25 months, Steve.

STEVE: (Laughing.) John, you're all right.

1 JOHN: You know?

2 STEVE: Oh, boy. I tell you. Yeah, one of
3 them are coming. I'll call you right back to let you
4 know which. In fact, he's even right now saying come
5 on, ladies, you know. Vicky needs --

6 JOHN: The other, the other two are pretty,
7 pretty well ready?

8 STEVE: I guess he -- what's her name --

9 JOHN: Vicky and Rita?

10 STEVE: Rita. She wants to hold on a little
11 bit. She's weak in the knees. She said she just wants
12 to ask him a few more questions. She's --

13 JOHN: Yeah.

14 STEVE: -- she's -- in her mind she wants to
15 go, of course.

16 JOHN: Yeah.

17 STEVE: You know, she says let me, let me
18 wait until a time of day at least, and I can get my
19 head straight here and --

20 JOHN: Well --

21 STEVE: -- and so we said well, Vicky, now
22 she wants to go. And now we're trying to tell one of
23 the nurses come on, let's -- you know, help out here.
24 Help out here.

25 JOHN: Because --

STEVE: So you know, Dave --

1 JOHN: Hey, if it takes --

2 STEVE: -- he's, he's telling them himself,
3 John. He says hey, I'm going out there myself. He
4 says but I'm trying to get you people together and,
5 and --

6 JOHN: Sure.

7 STEVE: -- get yourself moving here now.

8 JOHN: Sure.

9 STEVE: So that's kind of where he's at. So
10 you know, you know, you know how it goes. They're weak
11 in the knees, and they're a little afraid and
12 apprehensive and all that and --

13 JOHN: Well, basically what we need is 15
14 minutes to tell the people --

15 STEVE: You do. Okay.

16 JOHN: -- to bring that ambulance up there.

17 STEVE: Okay.

18 JOHN: And --

19 STEVE: So let, let me go and talk --

20 JOHN: -- do you want me to have them move it
21 up there now?

22 STEVE: You know, you actually could. But
23 then in the process they might need to go to their
24 rooms and kind of -- because they haven't even thrown
25 their things together. This is the first they know of
it. You know, he's been telling everybody, you know,

1 | get ready to go. Because we're going to be asking you.
2 | You got to get yourselves together, you know. Ever
3 | since this happened, you know, a lot of --

4 | JOHN: Yeah.

5 | STEVE: -- these women, the older ones, you
6 | know, they, all they heard was -- they never saw
7 | anything, anybody. They just heard bullets and --

8 | JOHN: Yeah, yeah.

9 | STEVE: You know, it's just been a scary
10 | experience for them and so --

11 | JOHN: Who, who will the nurse be, do you
12 | know?

13 | STEVE: It's going to either be Zilla
14 | (phonetic sp.) Henry or Netta. And I don't know what
15 | her last name is. I only know her by the first name.

16 | JOHN: Okay. Okay.

17 | STEVE: So even --

18 | JOHN: Well, if it's Zilla --

19 | STEVE: Yeah. She's already got an attorney
20 | and her husband (indiscernible) --

21 | JOHN: Do you want to have her children come
22 | out with her?

23 | STEVE: They don't even know yet. I think a
24 | lot of them --

25 | JOHN: And we can handle it. If you want to
 | have her children come out, if that would give her some

1 | more support, that's fine.

2 | STEVE: Okay, I'll go mention it to, to her
3 | then.

4 | JOHN: You know. It, it may be easier to, to
5 | have the children be supportive of her.

6 | STEVE: David's calling me. Just hang on one
7 | second, John.

8 | JOHN: Okay.

9 | STEVE: Maybe there's something else here
10 | that's happened.

11 | JOHN: Okay, go ahead. I'll hold on.

12 | [gap]

13 | STEVE: John?

14 | JOHN: Yes, sir.

15 | STEVE: I'm going to give you to David here.
16 | Just hang on. Because you know, we're talking with
17 | some of them right now and --

18 | JOHN: Go ahead. Go ahead.

19 | STEVE: Okay, hang on. Trying to get the
20 | phone here, got a long cord and -- okay. Okay, here he
21 | is.

22 | JOHN: All right.

23 | [gap]

24 | DAVID: Say, John?

25 | JOHN: Hey, David.

 DAVID: Could you all, could you all send

1 | another bug in here, please?

2 | JOHN: (Laughing.)

3 | DAVID: I wish you could hear some of this.

4 | JOHN: I wish I could too, huh?

5 | DAVID: The things -- no, seriously.

6 | JOHN: What, what kind do you want?

7 | DAVID: I need one of those ones that you had
8 | before.

9 | JOHN: Just any old one?

10 | DAVID: Hey, wait a minute. We could put one
11 | of those things back together, huh, Steve?

12 | (Unidentified voices in background not discernible.)

13 | Okay. Just you know, you think you guys are
14 | negotiators. I mean, you know --

15 | JOHN: Hey.

16 | DAVID: -- you know, people are really --

17 | JOHN: You've got the Lord on your side.
18 | Remember that.

19 | DAVID: Yeah, I know. But remember, remember
20 | the disciples 2,000 years ago?

21 | JOHN: Lord.

22 | DAVID: Remember that?

23 | JOHN: Yes.

24 | DAVID: I mean they were really confirmed,
25 | they were really strong with Christ around, weren't
 | they?

1 JOHN: Well --
2 DAVID: But when --
3 JOHN: -- be strong. Be strong.
4 DAVID: I know. Well, here's the thing now,
5 John.
6 JOHN: Yeah.
7 DAVID: They're being strong, but like I say,
8 they're, they're being shown the prophetic word again.
9 That's all they've got now. Remember that.
10 JOHN: Well, I know they've got the fear of
11 the unknown too, don't they?
12 DAVID: Well, you see the -- what's known is
13 clear in front of their eyes according to the flesh.
14 JOHN: Well, I mean the fear of unknown, of
15 coming out and --
16 DAVID: But no, no, no. That's not the
17 thing. The fear of the --
18 JOHN: You don't think so?
19 DAVID: No. The fear of the unknown is
20 whether God's going to do what he says or not.
21 JOHN: Well, you know we're doing what we
22 say.
23 DAVID: Yeah, I know. I know.
24 JOHN: And we're not, we're not --
25 DAVID: But I understand.
JOHN: -- playing games that way or anything

1 | else, you know.

2 | DAVID: Understand. Like I say, the
3 | confirmation of the word of God is the final hope of
4 | mankind anyway. Okay, so, so anyway, go ahead and send
5 | the Bradley.

6 | JOHN: Okay.

7 | DAVID: And --

8 | JOHN: I mentioned, I mentioned to Steve, and
9 | I'll pass it by you for your thoughts on it. He said
10 | that one of the nurses will probably accompany Vicky
11 | and Rita out. And the --

12 | DAVID: Well, Rita's --

13 | JOHN: Excuse me.

14 | DAVID: -- Rita's going to stay until the
15 | morning.

16 | JOHN: Okay. All right.

17 | DAVID: Okay?

18 | JOHN: But he said one of the, one of the --
19 | she just --

20 | DAVID: Rita's always given me problems.

21 | JOHN: She's just a little hesitant, huh?

22 | DAVID: (Laughing.) Yeah. Wait until you
23 | meet her.

24 | JOHN: Well, I've talked to her a couple of
25 | times.

 DAVID: Yeah.

1 JOHN: And --
2 DAVID: She's from North Carolina. You know
3 how those girls are out there, right?
4 JOHN: She's got tar between her --
5 DAVID: Yeah.
6 JOHN: -- toes, huh? Tarheel.
7 DAVID: Yeah.
8 JOHN: But he mentioned that, that Zilla may
9 be one of the nurses coming out and if --
10 DAVID: Oh. It's --
11 JOHN: Okay.
12 DAVID: -- what's, what's your complete name?
13 What's the complete one? Anetta Richards.
14 JOHN: Annette --
15 DAVID: Annetta --
16 JOHN: Uh-huh.
17 DAVID: -- Richards.
18 JOHN: Okay.
19 DAVID: What's your son's name? And write
20 this down. Vivian --
21 JOHN: Um-hum.
22 DAVID: -- Wilson. Vivian Wilson. Huh?
23 Yeah, it's a nephew. He's like your son though.
24 JOHN: Her, her nephew is Vivian --
25 DAVID: Vivian Williams. Wilson. Wilson.
 JOHN: Okay.

1 DAVID: Wilson. And if you would, if you
2 would, if you could contact him, he's in, he's in
3 Canada.

4 JOHN: We may try to make some arrangements
5 for her to contact him too --

6 DAVID: Okay.

7 JOHN: -- when she comes out.

8 DAVID: Okay. Well --

9 JOHN: We're, we're certainly not opposed to
10 doing something like that.

11 DAVID: Well, that's what I told her and
12 everything. And she definitely would like to talk to
13 him.

14 JOHN: Okay. So she will be accompanying
15 Vicky out then?

16 DAVID: Right.

17 JOHN: Okay. Don't, don't --

18 DAVID: We're, and we're --

19 JOHN: -- have her come out until I call back
20 in though. Because I'm going to call them and tell
21 them to send the, the Bradley that's configured like an
22 ambulance forward.

23 DAVID: Right.

24 JOHN: Okay.

25 DAVID: Now remember, and Vicky like I say
she, she needs her -- well, you know, she needs, she

1 | needs some, she needs some care and stuff.

2 | JOHN: Well, she's going to have a doctor
3 | look at her right away.

4 | DAVID: Okay.

5 | JOHN: When she comes out. Do you know
6 | specifically what problems she has?

7 | DAVID: Well, she's on --

8 | JOHN: I mean is she a diabetic or anything
9 | like --

10 | DAVID: She's on heart medication.

11 | JOHN: And she knows what type of medication.

12 | DAVID: Yeah. As a matter of fact, she'll
13 | bring it out with her.

14 | JOHN: Fine.

15 | DAVID: You know, just, they -- I'm sure they
16 | worked it out last night with the guys. Because you
17 | know, it disturbed a lot of people here last night with
18 | the guys, you know, hollering and screaming.

19 | JOHN: Yeah.

20 | DAVID: It sounded like, you know, another
21 | raid out there. But --

22 | JOHN: Yeah.

23 | DAVID: If they, if they want to, they can
24 | shine lights on these ladies and everything, you know,
25 | and --

 JOHN: I'm sure they will.

1 DAVID: And --

2 JOHN: And the place is probably pretty well
3 lit up anyhow, huh?

4 DAVID: Right.

5 JOHN: Will they be carrying anything?

6 DAVID: Just their Bibles --

7 JOHN: Uh-huh.

8 DAVID: -- and what else, what else you all
9 going to be carrying?

10 [gap]

11 DAVID: Well, well now, well see, when they
12 come, when they come back here, they'll, they'll sort
13 everything out and stuff like that. So don't worry
14 about that kind of stuff, okay? You don't need, you
15 don't need to take your suitcases or nothing. Just
16 take your immediate clothes and everything that you
17 got, you know, what you're wearing. And then we'll
18 work that all out later, okay?

19 She wanted to know if she should take all her
20 suitcases and all that and --

21 JOHN: Yeah. No.

22 DAVID: How old are you, Vicky? She's 59 so.

24 is?

4 DAVID: Well, it's like this. It's like you
5 can, you know, like you can bring Israel out of Egypt,
6 right? Right?

7 JOHN: Um-hum.

8 DAVID: But you can't get Egypt out of
9 Israel, can you?

10 JOHN: Not easy, is it?

11 DAVID: Well, you know.

12 JOHN: And the Palestinians are looking for a
13 home. Aren't they?

14 DAVID: Well --

15 JOHN: And I, and I know you, you had to be
16 awful reassuring with the two ladies, particularly I'm
17 sure Vivian --

18 DAVID: Well, I had, I had to grab them out.

19 JOHN: Yeah. Yeah.

20 DAVID: I mean I showed them right something
21 from the Second Testament. I said now wait a minute.
22 I said, you know, here you are saying you believe in
23 me. I said now wait. Those that believe in me don't
24 believe in me. You can't believe in me. You got to
25 believe in the book that I show you.

JOHN: Sure.

1 DAVID: I said now here you are, and I'm
2 showing you right here the second part of this. I mean
3 I'm not -- you know, stop looking at me. Look at the
4 words. What does God want?

5 JOHN: Yeah.

6 DAVID: And, and now you're, and now you're
7 drawing back? I said that don't do you no good.

8 JOHN: Uh-uh.

9 DAVID: You know, you can't, you can't
10 worship God in the flesh. It's impossible. 2,000
11 years ago --

12 JOHN: Well, I think if you, if you reassure
13 them that, that you're all going to be together outside
14 there anyhow and --

15 DAVID: Well, they know better than that you
16 know.

17 JOHN: Well, you will. You'll see one
18 another out there.

19 DAVID: Yeah. Maybe eventual.

20 JOHN: And as I, as I told Steven, we're
21 probably going to get Vicky over to a hospital to make
22 sure she gets a good, thorough check-up and, and Jack
23 the Sheriff has said that he's going to make
24 arrangements for her to call her son. And --

25 DAVID: That will work.

 JOHN: -- and I think that will be a little

1 | more reassuring for her too, huh?

2 | DAVID: Yeah, that will work.

3 | JOHN: That -- yeah, yeah.

4 | DAVID: Good old Jack.

5 | JOHN: Hey. I was just talking to him a
6 | little while ago, and he's quite a guy. Nice fellow.

7 | DAVID: See, the thing about, the thing about
8 | the Waco Sheriff's Department is that well, there was
9 | a, there's a black guy. I forgot his name. I wish I
10 | could remember his name.

11 | JOHN: A lieutenant?

12 | DAVID: Well, he actually, he was on a beat
13 | out here for a while. Kind of a heavysset guy.

14 | JOHN: Uh-huh.

15 | DAVID: And we're not talking about
16 | Dickerson. This is a guy, a younger guy.

17 | JOHN: Uh-huh.

18 | DAVID: And when we first got arrested in
19 | '88, we all went down there, you know. And none has
20 | ever been in jail before. And they took our
21 | fingerprints. They're like cramming my fingers and
22 | stuff into the, into the ink and on the paper. I mean
23 | talking about really rough.

24 | JOHN: Uh-huh.

25 | DAVID: And I said ouch. I said hey, you
 | know, could you be a little easier on my fingers,

1 | please? And the guy looked at me like huh? You know.
2 | Most guys that get in there are all tough guys, you
3 | know what I mean?

4 | JOHN: Yeah.

5 | DAVID: Back mouth and all that kind of --

6 | JOHN: Oh, I got to believe he runs a pretty
7 | tight ship.

8 | DAVID: Huh?

9 | JOHN: I think Jack runs a pretty tight ship
10 | and has good people working there, you know?

11 | DAVID: Yeah, some of them are.

12 | JOHN: And I don't think he'd put up with a
13 | lot of nonsense.

14 | DAVID: Some, some of them are gunslingers
15 | though, you know. Some are, some are good and some are
16 | gunslingers. This one black guy, he just really, he
17 | just really warmed up to us a lot, you know?

18 | JOHN: Yeah.

19 | DAVID: Because like I say, the jail cell
20 | system got turned around when we were in there. And a
21 | lot of the guys that were in there, you know, piped
22 | down and everything. Because we showed them truth, you
23 | know. We showed them the truth when we were there.
24 | Because the guys that were there were -- there's a lot
25 | of guys in prison they're religious supposedly, right?

 JOHN: Yeah.

1 DAVID: They gap the gap.

2 JOHN: Religious in quotes?

3 DAVID: Yeah, you know. They got no other,
4 no other thing to be, you know?

5 JOHN: Yeah.

6 DAVID: You know, we presented our, our
7 positions and all that, and the only one that got hell
8 after a while was the Sunday preacher that kept coming
9 in Sunday, and he was getting questions he couldn't
10 answer --

11 JOHN: (Laughing.)

12 DAVID: -- from the inmates.

13 JOHN: Putting him on the spot?

14 DAVID: Yeah, you know. And that -- and like
15 I say, where Floyd and them were at, there were some
16 guys in there, pretty tough guys, you know. And they
17 all -- well, there was this one guy that was really
18 bad. He was a second murder. I mean the guy wasn't in
19 there on attempted. He had murdered another guy. The
20 guy was a black guy. He, he had a, had one cut off.
21 He had just like a stub.

22 JOHN: Uh-huh.

23 DAVID: And he would just knock the crap out
24 of people, you know? He'd just hit them with his stub.

25 JOHN: (Laughing.)

 DAVID: And so --

1 JOHN: He was an inmate?

2 DAVID: Yeah, he was an inmate.

3 JOHN: Yeah.

4 DAVID: And you know, what happened was is
5 Floyd and Stan were in, in that cell. Because they
6 were older guys.

7 JOHN: Um-hum.

8 DAVID: And Floyd, Floyd is from New Bedford,
9 Mass., and he, he'd been, he'd been semi-boxer for
10 years and stuff. So he can hold his own, you know?

11 JOHN: What are they all going to fight for
12 one bunk or something?

13 DAVID: No. Well, what happened was is, you
14 know, Floyd told this guy, you know, he says, you know,
15 hey, puts his trust in the law, you know. Kind of a
16 black guy. He said I put my trust in the law, you
17 know. And there's some things, you know, that, that
18 you need to know, you know, bros. No need for fighting
19 and all that, you know. We need to, need to learn some
20 things from God, you know. The guy says what, what can
21 you show me about God, you know? So Floyd started
22 showing him.

23 JOHN: Um-hum.

24 DAVID: So, so the guy went around and he
25 started, he started telling the other inmates they were
going to come in for Bible studies or he's going to

1 | whip their butt. You know, Floyd had to tell him you
2 | can't do that either, you know.

3 | JOHN: (Laughing.)

4 | DAVID: So you know, it's, it's a wild thing
5 | there inside that, inside those prisons, you know.
6 | It's just a, it's just a wild thing, you know.
7 | There's, there's a lot of people in there, they got
8 | nothing more to do but think about God. But a lot of
9 | them get this hope, and the first thing they hit the
10 | door when they go out, they throw that Bible away. You
11 | know what I mean?

12 | JOHN: Yeah, yeah.

13 | DAVID: Because they never got the first
14 | insight on it anyway.

15 | JOHN: You know, it's amazing. Because I've,
16 | I've been in and out of a bunch of correctional
17 | facilities over the years though. And like you say,
18 | the minister comes in on Sunday to talk to them. And
19 | he can't answer their questions. And if you get the
20 | right personality and the right person in there talking
21 | to those people, they want to hear. And they want to
22 | listen. And they want to learn. If you can get to the
23 | right individuals.

24 | DAVID: They've got time, don't they?

25 | JOHN: One thing they have plenty of, isn't
 | it?

1 DAVID: They got time.

2 JOHN: Sure. You bet they do.

3 DAVID: What were you in for?

4 JOHN: I was in interviewing people usually.

5 DAVID: Oh, I see.

6 JOHN: Or teaching schools.

7 DAVID: What do you -- what did you teach?

8 JOHN: Well, I had to teach various classes
9 to police officers.

10 DAVID: Oh, I see.

11 JOHN: And corrections officers and things
12 like that. Try and educate them a little bit.

13 DAVID: Yeah.

14 JOHN: And it's always an experience. But
15 you know, you'd spend time talking to some of the, the
16 people that were in there. And never had any
17 difficulty communicating with them.

18 Of course, some of them weren't what you'd
19 call rocket scientists. Room temperature IQ would be
20 kind of high for some of them. And then others were
21 very bright, you know.

22 And you, you had people in there that had
23 committed one crime in their life and, you know, it may
24 have been a crime of passion or something and --

25 DAVID: Some for --

 JOHN: -- they were model, they were model

1 inmates. Yeah. Whether, whether it was even a rape or
2 a murder or something. But it was a one-time deal
3 because of a crime of passion. And --

4 DAVID: The law of Moses had a remedy for
5 that. Cities of refuge, if a person got into a fight
6 with another person --

7 JOHN: Yeah.

8 DAVID: -- then what would happen is, is they
9 didn't mean to do it, you know. They'd run to a city
10 of refuge which God appointed in different places
11 throughout Judaea. And that way they would like have,
12 you know, like if you, if you run into a church, you
13 know. Like if you feel like that you really need an
14 extra hearing. It's not, not what it appears to be.

15 JOHN: Uh-huh.

16 DAVID: Then that way that Moses would come
17 in the situation and Aaron and stuff, and they would
18 take it before the Lord, and the Lord would make the
19 final judgment. And that way a guy could get a real
20 fair trial.

21 JOHN: Uh-huh.

22 DAVID: Otherwise, the obvious is an eye for
23 an eye, a tooth for a tooth.

24 JOHN: Um-hum.

25 DAVID: But anyway. And of course, if a
person, you know, had veniciously (sic) you know

1 premeditated hurting somebody else, then if he tried to
2 run to a city of refuge they would bring Moses and
3 stuff in, and he'd still get the electric chair, you
4 know.

5 JOHN: Um-hum.

6 DAVID: Couldn't hide.

7 JOHN: Well --

8 DAVID: But you know, there's a lot of people
9 that -- just one that used to always bug me about
10 judges.

11 JOHN: Uh-huh.

12 DAVID: Is that, you know, a lot of judges
13 they see so many cases they get tired of it. And
14 they -- like in our trial in '88, our judge kept going
15 to sleep.

16 JOHN: (Laughing.) You got to be kidding.

17 DAVID: I mean he -- seriously. We, we
18 would, he would -- the prosecuting attorney was, was
19 producing the evidence. And all --

20 JOHN: Uh-huh.

21 DAVID: -- of a sudden everyone started
22 hearing (snoring).

23 JOHN: That's a little embarrassing.

24 DAVID: He was -- it was a sideshow. And,
25 and then there --

JOHN: Well, I've never seen one do that in

1 federal court. But --

2 DAVID: I guess --

3 JOHN: -- I, I can't deny it probably had to
4 happen. That's unbelievable though.

5 DAVID: Judge Roy Bean's court you --

6 JOHN: Was he just an old-timer?

7 DAVID: Yeah he was.

8 JOHN: Was he?

9 DAVID: He was old.

10 JOHN: Probably should --

11 DAVID: Real old.

12 JOHN: -- probably should have retired a few
13 years ago, huh?

14 DAVID: He -- a kid came in and had a little
15 pink comb.

16 JOHN: Uh-huh.

17 DAVID: And the woman, the woman brought,
18 brought this child in, right? One of my kids.

19 JOHN: Uh-huh.

20 DAVID: And then she had a little pink comb
21 and the judge, judge says wait a minute now. He says
22 ma'am, he goes ma'am, you -- the child can't have an
23 ice cream cone in the court now. Now you need to take
24 that out.

25 JOHN: (Laughing.)

DAVID: And then we were like looking

1 around --

2 JOHN: His, his vision wasn't real good
3 either, huh?

4 DAVID: Tell it wasn't. And I mean it's
5 like, you know, well, Your Honor, it's, it's a comb.

6 JOHN: Uh-huh.

7 DAVID: Oh, oh. I'm sorry. I'm sorry. Go
8 ahead, ma'am. Sit down, you know.

9 JOHN: (Laughing.)

10 DAVID: And this is a judge. And he let
11 George talk -- I mean George got up there on the, on
12 the jury stand.

13 JOHN: Uh-huh.

14 DAVID: I mean not on the, on the --

15 JOHN: On the witness stand.

16 DAVID: -- on the witness stand. And George
17 went off on all this hellicious (sic), you know,
18 metaphoric language and all that. And the judge just
19 sat there and talked and talked and let him talk. And
20 I got up on the, on the witness stand. And all of a
21 sudden, you know --

22 JOHN: Did the defense attorney object to any
23 of it?

24 DAVID: No. He wanted George to talk.

25 JOHN: Did he?

DAVID: He told me afterwards.

1 JOHN: Yeah.

2 DAVID: He said the more George talked, the
3 better it looked for you all guys.

4 JOHN: Yeah. And it was -- was it right? It
5 worked?

6 DAVID: Well, that was his whole -- he told
7 me later that was his whole, his whole thing. You
8 know, George was just crazy all along --

9 JOHN: Sure.

10 DAVID: -- and everybody knew it. But, but
11 the thing of it was is I wanted the actual facts being
12 brought out too which our attorney didn't take that
13 position. He says look, you know, you may have the
14 facts. Everything is in your favor both ways. So you
15 know, let him work against himself.

16 And so anyway, so George talked and talked
17 and talked. And when I got up there and I was asked
18 questions, I always just had yes or no. Yes or no.
19 Yes or no.

20 JOHN: Yeah.

21 DAVID: And so then when I'd try to explain
22 things, then I was just cut off every time. Cut off
23 every time. See, I already know how that system works.
24 And so what happened was after the, after the trial and
25 everything, I looked over at the judge and I says, I
said Your Honor, I says can I ask you a question,

1 please? And he goes well, why not, you know. And I
2 says --

3 JOHN: (Laughing.)

4 DAVID: -- why was it that when George spoke
5 you listened to him. You let him run on and on. And
6 when I tried to explain, you stopped me.

7 JOHN: Um-hum.

8 DAVID: He goes -- looks over at me and he
9 winks at my eye and he goes well, he says, the truth of
10 the matter is I was kind of scared of George. We know
11 he's crazy.

12 JOHN: (Laughing.)

13 DAVID: I mean you know and --

14 JOHN: That's bizarre.

15 DAVID: It's, it's -- you never, you never
16 saw this around here. I mean I've never -- this,
17 this -- they should make a series on TV about some of
18 the court cases that take place here in Waco.

19 JOHN: Well, I don't think you'll run into
20 that in the federal system. Because it's, it's kind of
21 an austere system. It's -- there's not a lot of --

22 DAVID: (Indiscernible) put them away. Yeah,
23 I know.

24 JOHN: There's not a lot of horsing around.
25 It's very matter of fact. And you know, they just
don't put up with a lot of nonsense. And everybody --

1 | when they say you get your day in court, they're,
2 | they're very sincere about it that it's a fair shake.
3 | And you don't get this good old boy concept and it's
4 | serious. And federal judges take their jobs very
5 | seriously.

6 | DAVID: Yeah, they got to, don't they?

7 | JOHN: Sure they do.

8 | DAVID: They get higher and higher in
9 | position.

10 | JOHN: Yeah, they do. I mean even though
11 | it's, it's not an elected position, it's an appointed
12 | position by the, the President with the consent of the
13 | Senate. They give a lot of thought to who's appointed
14 | to federal judgeships. Because they're looking for
15 | people with a real smart judicial backgrounds. You
16 | know, and you, you find very few young federal judges.
17 | (Unidentified male voice in background not
18 | discernible.)

19 | I guess the big thing that you see more of is
20 | federal judges that don't have a lot of criminal
21 | background. That's you know, criminal law background
22 | as opposed to civil law background. If, if I would say
23 | there's a shortcoming anyplace that, that could be it.
24 | But, but they're all pretty learned men, you know. And
25 | pretty wise men. And --

 DAVID: I hope they are.

1 JOHN: -- they're fair.

2 DAVID: I hope our judge is wise.

3 JOHN: You know he will be. And you know
4 he'll be fair. And the other thing is the, the court
5 system in, in this particular issue, Lord, it's going
6 to be thorough. I mean you know it's going to be
7 thorough. Because of it's not just the eyes of Waco
8 looking at this. The, the eyes of the country are
9 looking at this.

10 DAVID: It's not just the eyes of the
11 country, John.

12 JOHN: Well, I hear you.

13 DAVID: Twinkle, twinkle little star.

14 JOHN: I hear you.

15 DAVID: Look up.

16 JOHN: I hear you. But you, you know what I
17 mean. The media is going to, has been giving it so
18 much attention so far you can --

19 DAVID: Oh, that -- now come on, John. That
20 media is being fed hogwash. You know that. You all
21 got that --

22 JOHN: No.

23 DAVID: -- you all got that wrapped up, boy.
24 Come on (indiscernible) --

25 JOHN: Well, you, you stimulated the media
with almost an hour's worth of dialogue.

1 DAVID: No, no, no (indiscernible) --

2 JOHN: And you really stimulated them.

3 DAVID: Yeah, but like I said in the, in the
4 meeting, you know, people don't know how to categorize.
5 They're too, they're too used to sermonizations (sic).
6 A person doesn't --

7 JOHN: Well, how many members of the media
8 even are familiar with Mt. Carmel or Branch Davidian?
9 I mean --

10 DAVID: Everybody right now.

11 JOHN: But they're only --

12 DAVID: What is the Branch Davidians?

13 JOHN: -- somewhat familiar with it, right?
14 It may be a slanted familiarization.

15 DAVID: Right. How many people are really
16 familiar with the actual knowledge of the gospels.
17 Very few, right, John?

18 JOHN: You bet. You bet.

19 DAVID: I mean you know, they really don't
20 know the real meaning of -- what's so great about God
21 dying on a cross? I mean come on. You know how many
22 Jews died on the --

23 JOHN: No, they may know some concepts or
24 whatever they've been taught on how many --

25 DAVID: Portions, yeah.

 JOHN: -- how many -- well, you can look at a

1 lot of them, and how many really if, if they're raising
2 a family. If they're, if they're working long hours
3 and they're doing other things, maybe they just don't
4 have the time.

5 DAVID: Right.

6 JOHN: And I'm, I'm not using that as an
7 excuse.

8 DAVID: That's realistic though. It's a
9 fact.

10 JOHN: I am. I am.

11 DAVID: It's a good, it's a good reality of
12 seeing that.

13 JOHN: Yet you know, I'd be the first to tell
14 you that there are a lot of religions that, you know,
15 you get your education as a youngster, and you go up
16 through the whether it's parochial system, whatever.
17 And then zoom.

18 DAVID: Called tradition.

19 JOHN: You kind of slide away.

20 DAVID: This is the matter of the fact
21 whether you understand it or not. Now quote it back to
22 me.

23 JOHN: Yeah. Yeah. You got it.

24 DAVID: You want to, do you want a star next
25 to your name? Quote it back to me.

JOHN: But that's the way you were taught in

1 school too when I was taught in school. It wasn't --

2 DAVID: I wasn't taught that way though in
3 school.

4 JOHN: Well --

5 DAVID: You got to remember --

6 JOHN: -- I'm not talking from a parochial
7 standpoint.

8 DAVID: No, no. I'm talking about regular
9 school. See I failed all my grades all the way
10 through. There's not one grade in school that I didn't
11 fail in.

12 JOHN: Really?

13 DAVID: Seriously. You get, check my report
14 cards. I'm sure that will come out in the movie or
15 whatever. I just did not have the ability to
16 understand their format of teaching.

17 JOHN: Well, maybe they didn't understand
18 you.

19 DAVID: Evidently.

20 JOHN: You know. I mean maybe they really
21 didn't understand you.

22 DAVID: Failed the first grade twice. I mean
23 goodness.

24 JOHN: But you and I both know that you're a
25 very bright person so --

DAVID: Well, I have the ability to teach

1 | now --

2 | JOHN: I mean I can look at a little fellow
3 | that used to be, a little boy that used to be one of my
4 | neighbors. And he has like Tourette's Syndrome.

5 | DAVID: Uh-huh.

6 | JOHN: People thought that he, he had a
7 | totally different problem for years in school. Nicest
8 | little kid in the world.

9 | DAVID: Um-hum.

10 | JOHN: But he had the, the tick, right? And
11 | he could be sitting someplace, and an obscenity would
12 | come out and other things. He couldn't control that
13 | until -- it took years to find the absolute proper
14 | medication. And the poor little guy was having all
15 | kinds of problems in school, because people didn't know
16 | what his problem was.

17 | DAVID: Yeah. They tried to see the obvious.

18 | JOHN: Oh, sure. They thought he was, you
19 | know, something really mentally wrong with him.

20 | DAVID: That's like little Joshua. You all
21 | got little Joshua down there?

22 | JOHN: Oh, yeah, yeah.

23 | DAVID: I mean, you know --

24 | JOHN: God bless him, huh?

25 | DAVID: He's, he's very, very, very hyper and
very -- you can look in his eyes, and you can see that

1 | not all the light bulbs are burning there.

2 | JOHN: Yeah, yeah.

3 | DAVID: You know.

4 | JOHN: Well, what's, what's Wayne's little
5 | boy?

6 | DAVID: His name is -- Wayne's little boy
7 | is --

8 | JOHN: You know the one I'm talking about?

9 | DAVID: Yeah, Jamie.

10 | JOHN: Jamie, yeah.

11 | DAVID: That was a doctor's mistake.

12 | JOHN: Was it really?

13 | DAVID: Yeah, that was strictly a doctor.

14 | He, he was taken in for jaundice.

15 | JOHN: Uh-huh.

16 | DAVID: The, the first stage of jaundice
17 | and --

18 | JOHN: Oh, it wasn't something from birth,
19 | huh?

20 | DAVID: No, he was a perfectly born baby.

21 | JOHN: Oh, boy.

22 | DAVID: And when you meet the other of
23 | Wayne's kids, they're all good-looking, smart,
24 | intelligent people.

25 | JOHN: Yeah. Yeah.

 DAVID: But she took him in to check him for

1 | jaundice.

2 | JOHN: Uh-huh.

3 | DAVID: And the doctor says no. You know
4 | just, you know, a lot, a lot of general practitioners
5 | do that. They just kind of like --

6 | JOHN: Just a misdiagnosis.

7 | DAVID: Yeah. He just miss got a diagnosis.
8 | And it developed more. And when they finally caught it
9 | it was, it had already gotten, you know, gets up to the
10 | brain. Something that is kind of like polio or
11 | something. You can completely avoid it now, you know?

12 | JOHN: Yeah. But there's no turning it
13 | around now, huh?

14 | DAVID: No. No. Only, only the next phase.
15 | You know, they did a lot --

16 | JOHN: What a tragedy, huh?

17 | DAVID: You know, it allows the --

18 | JOHN: What a tragedy.

19 | DAVID: -- it allows parents to stop and
20 | consider, you know?

21 | JOHN: Yeah, well like I told you before. I
22 | got a little goddaughter that's a little Down syndrome
23 | child. And she's in her thirties. And it's -- you
24 | give them a lot of extra love. Because most never live
25 | to be that old.

 DAVID: Right.

1 JOHN: You know, because of heart murmurs and
2 other problems. But they need a lot of love in there.
3 I know, I know Jamie does, too. A lot of love.
4 Because he probably understands what you're saying,
5 huh?

6 DAVID: He can -- no, the way, the way he
7 communicates is, is he, he becomes familiar with the
8 way his senses perceive presence.

9 JOHN: Uh-huh.

10 DAVID: Like he can hear base signals. He
11 can, he can understand, you know, that signals from his
12 father's voice, from his mother's voice.

13 JOHN: But he knows his mother and his father
14 though, huh?

15 DAVID: Oh, yeah. Definitely.

16 JOHN: Yeah. Yeah.

17 DAVID: You know, it's just like --

18 JOHN: And his, and his sisters and brothers
19 and whatever.

20 DAVID: Yeah, you know. And he knows when
21 his mother's around he's ready for eats. See, he had a
22 problem to where the way, the way his mind is working
23 like if he puts his finger in his mouth and bites.

24 JOHN: Uh-huh.

25 DAVID: You got to watch him, because it will
hurt so he keeps biting harder.

1 JOHN: Oh, is that right?

2 DAVID: That's right. You know. So that was
3 a problem that had to be dealt with. He had to learn
4 that instead of, instead of increasing his pain by
5 biting harder he needs to, to let go.

6 JOHN: Sure. Got to have a lot of patience
7 with him, huh?

8 DAVID: Oh, yeah. It took, it took therapy
9 on our part. And it also took therapy on the, on the
10 State's part.

11 JOHN: Yeah. Because I spent a lot of time
12 in the room with him here when he, when he first came
13 out. Well, he came out with I think two other
14 youngsters came out the same time that he --

15 DAVID: How -- you know how old he is, don't
16 you?

17 JOHN: He's like 9, isn't he?

18 DAVID: What is Jamie, 13?

19 JOHN: I thought he was 9 or 10 or something
20 like that.

21 DAVID: Oh I think he's older than that.

22 JOHN: Really. But I mean he's just like a
23 little baby.

24 DAVID: Oh, yeah. He's a baby all the way
25 through.

JOHN: Yeah, yeah.

1 DAVID: You know, he's like, he's like 1 year
2 old.

3 JOHN: How you, how you feeling today?

4 DAVID: Well, just tired. Like I say it's --

5 JOHN: Well, I know it was the Sabbath for
6 you. And --

7 DAVID: And I -- and we, we tried to, we
8 tried to preach to you all night long and --

9 JOHN: Yeah.

10 DAVID: Then I had to deal with other people
11 too afterwards.

12 JOHN: Yeah. Well --

13 DAVID: I sure would like to read something
14 to you.

15 JOHN: I bet you would, wouldn't you?

16 DAVID: Oh, come on, John. You

17 (indiscernible) --

18 JOHN: You had -- hey. Your nose has got to
19 be growing after last night.

20 DAVID: No, it's not.

21 JOHN: Huh?

22 DAVID: There's no -- well, you know, I'm
23 going to be made into a real boy too.

24 JOHN: Do what?

25 DAVID: I'm going to be changed into a real
boy too after all this.

1 JOHN: You are?

2 DAVID: My godmother's going to -- remember?
3 Change me into Pinocchio and then he's going, I'm going
4 to learn my lesson and be turned into a real boy.

5 JOHN: (Laughing.) That's right. That's
6 right. The -- you've been busy this evening though. I
7 know that. You and Steven both, you know, have been
8 real busy.

9 DAVID: Well, you'll, you'll like I say --

10 JOHN: Are, are -- do you think you're going
11 to have -- I know Rita was reluctant to come out
12 tonight.

13 DAVID: She's sitting right over here right
14 now eating. She didn't even eat supper.

15 JOHN: Really?

16 DAVID: She's, she's terrified of you. You
17 didn't eat all day, huh?

18 JOHN: Of me?

19 DAVID: Well, you know, of, of the dragon out
20 there.

21 JOHN: Well --

22 DAVID: The lamb-like beast that speaks as a
23 dragon.

24 JOHN: Tell her not to be, huh? I mean you,
25 you can --

DAVID: That's what I'm trying to explain.

1 I'm trying to say look.

2 JOHN: You've talked to --

3 DAVID: Here I am --

4 JOHN: -- the other people, you know, other
5 people that have come out of here. You've seen the
6 children that have come out of here. And we certainly
7 don't abuse people that come out, and we take care of
8 them. She'll be able to bring her Bible. She'll be
9 able to continue her studies. We haven't lied to you
10 about it. Not going to either. If I thought I had to
11 lie to you to try and resolve this thing, I'd go home.

12 DAVID: Now, John.

13 JOHN: Believe me, I'd go home.

14 DAVID: Now John. Whose nose is growing?

15 JOHN: Not mine. What have I, what have --
16 when have I lied to you? You tell me.

17 DAVID: When have you had the authority to
18 speak the complete truth?

19 JOHN: Well --

20 DAVID: Remember, you're one phase.

21 JOHN: I am.

22 DAVID: You're the door.

23 JOHN: I am. But I'm not going to lie to
24 you.

25 DAVID: But, but the guy behind you might.

JOHN: That's why he's not talking to you.

1 DAVID: I know.

2 JOHN: Okay. We --

3 DAVID: Everything I say is true until
4 otherwise.

5 JOHN: Hey --

6 DAVID: John, I love you guys.

7 JOHN: We're all --

8 DAVID: Like I say, I'm, I'm trying to pick
9 at you every chance I can to try to impart to you a
10 thought here or there or to think to yourself hmm.
11 Hmm, hmm.

12 JOHN: Hmm. You don't think I'd try and do
13 that to you, do you?

14 DAVID: Well, I mean because we already agree
15 with you.

16 JOHN: Sure. Hey --

17 DAVID: I mean you're not coming -- I haven't
18 asked you to come in here to me. You've asked me to
19 come out to you.

20 JOHN: Well, you offered to let me come in
21 there though.

22 DAVID: Yeah, I did. And bring a Bible.

23 JOHN: I know. And I told you I'd meet you
24 halfway. And you're a little reluctant to do that.

25 DAVID: No, that's not the case.

 JOHN: What's the case?

1 DAVID: Well, because if I came out too
2 early, you wouldn't get anybody else out of here.

3 JOHN: If you --

4 DAVID: Let me tell you about human nature
5 (indiscernible) --

6 JOHN: Hey. If you, if you walked out that
7 door, it would be like a duck with all her ducklings --

8 DAVID: You're wrong.

9 JOHN: -- coming right on out.

10 DAVID: You're wrong.

11 JOHN: You really believe that?

12 DAVID: I, I know that as a fact. See, you
13 got to understand about human nature. You've got to
14 understand --

15 JOHN: Yeah.

16 DAVID: -- that for instance in the Jim Jones
17 situation.

18 JOHN: Well, that was a little bent.

19 DAVID: The majority of those people did not
20 die willfully.

21 JOHN: No, I know they didn't. A lot of them
22 didn't.

23 DAVID: A lot of them didn't.

24 JOHN: No. No.

25 DAVID: Okay, and another thing. You see,
when a person teaches speculation, theory, philosophy,

1 | people reach up and grab mental perceptions, and they
2 | incorporate this because it works in the mind. But
3 | event and situation proves it does not work in the
4 | flesh. Philosophy is for a couple of men sitting down
5 | talking the bull over a game of dominos. Okay?

6 | In other words, when you go to Sunday church
7 | and when you go to Sabbath church, whichever one you
8 | choose, and you go and you and you hear philosophies of
9 | men, you hear of concepts and principles, things that
10 | appear to be right, things that seem to be right. But
11 | as soon as you go out that door, John, and you can bear
12 | me witness, that philosophy is left back in that church
13 | building. When you step out into the real world --

14 | JOHN: You think so?

15 | DAVID: We know so. In other words, the
16 | thought --

17 | JOHN: I don't know.

18 | DAVID: Now wait a minute, John. Now the
19 | thought of being like Christ --

20 | JOHN: Uh-huh.

21 | DAVID: -- and the thought of not lying, the
22 | thought of not stealing, cheating, killing.

23 | JOHN: Uh-huh.

24 | DAVID: These thoughts and concepts of
25 | helping your fellow man all are good in theory. When
 | it comes to actually driving home because you're hungry

1 on Sunday morning, Sunday evening after church.
2 Everyone's got a good appetite by that time, don't
3 they?

4 JOHN: Uh-huh.

5 DAVID: When you see the guy on the side of
6 the road with a flat tire, that doesn't mean you're
7 going to stop and help him even though the preacher
8 said so.

9 JOHN: Uh-huh.

10 DAVID: And also is the fact that everybody
11 knows that very few preachers practice what they
12 preach.

13 JOHN: Well, you hope more than a few.

14 You --

15 DAVID: First of all --

16 JOHN: -- you really hope, huh?

17 DAVID: -- here we see the preachers preach
18 Christ. Now if we look at Christ according to the
19 gospels, we see a man that's a pauper. We see a man
20 who made himself with no reputation except by the
21 works.

22 JOHN: Well, I --

23 DAVID: You see what man --

24 JOHN: -- can't tell you that all priests and
25 ministers and rabbis are going to go running around in
sackcloth and ashes.

1 DAVID: Now, Christ didn't wear sackcloth.
2 He wore a very well -- well, let's say it was a very
3 expensive garment. But it was not --

4 JOHN: Yeah, but he lived a very moderate
5 life.

6 DAVID: -- flashy. It was high quality. It
7 was high quality. I mean let's, let's don't cut it
8 down to Levi blue jeans now.

9 JOHN: And but he led a very moderate life
10 though per se.

11 DAVID: Exactly. In other words, he was his
12 doctrine in, in expression, in life.

13 JOHN: Sure.

14 DAVID: And the disciples followed the same
15 example.

16 JOHN: But different churches look at this in
17 different, you know, whether -- whatever church are
18 involved then they have a little different view on
19 ministers, pastors, priests, rabbis, etc.

20 DAVID: Well, definitely they do.

21 JOHN: Sure.

22 DAVID: Look how they live.

23 JOHN: And many of them all believe that
24 they're the true church. And --

25 DAVID: And those, and those --

 JOHN: -- and whatever. I'm not going to get

1 | in a debate over --

2 | DAVID: It's not a debate, John. It's --

3 | JOHN: -- what is and what isn't.

4 | DAVID: -- it's just a reality. I mean
5 | there, there are ministers who live very luxuriously
6 | today.

7 | JOHN: Sure. You bet they do.

8 | DAVID: They make a lot of money off talking
9 | about Jesus.

10 | JOHN: Hey, we had one down in Louisiana that
11 | did until some things caught up with him.

12 | DAVID: Yeah, IRS. And that's where the
13 | church and state policy becomes something to consider.

14 | JOHN: Old Jimmy.

15 | DAVID: Yeah, but what happens is this. You
16 | see, the state realized that people will pay their ties
17 | a lot more freer than they'll pay their income tax.

18 | JOHN: Hey, can you imagine how many people
19 | still swear by this man?

20 | DAVID: Why? They feel he's being
21 | persecuted.

22 | JOHN: That and I guess his charisma, huh?

23 | DAVID: That's charisma. Paul says that the
24 | Jews had a zeal but not according to knowledge.
25 | Tradition that's ingrained from the birth, that's
 | ingrained by tradition, by the activities of a person's

1 upbringing and life, are like the colors of spots on
2 the back of a horse. An Appaloosa is known by its
3 spots. You know? And it's virtually impossible for
4 man to be able to change that. That's why Jeremiah
5 says can an Ethiopian change the color of his skin or a
6 leopard his spots? No. What nature has placed there
7 is there.

8 Okay. So man who is of nature may go in and
9 hear words about God. May hear words about Christ.
10 But if the real spirit or the power of God who is the
11 creator of all things is not attaining those words,
12 it's just empty words. And a person cannot change of
13 himself. So you find in religions a lot of people do
14 hear words, but they don't have the power assisting the
15 words.

16 Paul says that there are those that have a
17 form of godliness but do not have the power thereof.
18 They don't really have the real present, true spirit
19 amongst them. So we have a form of religion. We have
20 a copy of religion. But the power doesn't assist it,
21 okay? So instead of having miraculous power to these
22 people, God has decided since the days of John to give
23 them truth. That's why the seven seals are a truth
24 which is the missing key to the door. If we want
25 power, then we have to go through these seven steps.
We have to know in ourselves where the problem is.

1 Now we all know we need Christ. Without
2 Christ we can do nothing for God. We could only do for
3 ourselves. Man has the power to eat, to sleep, to
4 work, to think, and we get by in this world. As long
5 as it rains we got, we got, you know, seed for the
6 ground, we got something to eat. As long as someone
7 gets off their rear-end --

8 JOHN: As long as you just use a little
9 initiative sometimes, huh?

10 DAVID: Yeah. You got to get yourself, push
11 yourself.

12 JOHN: You sure do.

13 DAVID: No work, no eat is the principle of
14 God. You know. But of course, there's other ways and
15 means that the world has built up through economics
16 where some people don't have to work hard to eat good.
17 You know, you get a little bit of collateral. You
18 start using usury, little bit of money made off of
19 other people's money. You know, you get these real
20 sophisticated systems to where hey, power and riches
21 are found through other means besides labor. And this
22 is where the world becomes very complex. And this is
23 where the prophets start talking about this era. It
24 actually cheats men from real experience of life.

25 So you know, I thought I just, I just wanted
to share something with you. And see, saw what you,

1 | you know, see what you think about it.

2 | JOHN: Um-hum.

3 | DAVID: It's, it's a statement that's made
4 | in, in Matthew 23 and 24. You know, just take it word
5 | for word. You know, Christ didn't come to pat the back
6 | of the churches, did he, in his day?

7 | JOHN: Uh-uh.

8 | DAVID: He came to witness against them,
9 | didn't he? Well, the Pharisees were living high off
10 | the hog, weren't they?

11 | JOHN: I can assume.

12 | DAVID: But they couldn't really give the
13 | people anything, could they? Except more laws and more
14 | rules.

15 | JOHN: Um-hum.

16 | DAVID: Well, Christ came, and he didn't live
17 | like that. So his life was a testament against him,
18 | wasn't it? So he says in Matthew 23, it says, you
19 | know, that Christ said to the multitude and to his
20 | disciples saying, he says hey, the scribes and the
21 | Pharisees sit in Moses' seat. Now we know anciently
22 | that Moses was one man, right? Moses didn't live high
23 | off the hog either, did he?

24 | JOHN: Uh-uh.

25 | DAVID: No. But he was the leader of Israel,
 | wasn't he?

1 JOHN: Um-hum.

2 DAVID: Now here we got a situation in
3 Christ's day where all the leaders of the churches of,
4 of the synagogues are all trying to be Moses, right?
5 And then Christ says all therefore whatsoever they bid
6 you observe, that observe and do; but do ye not after
7 their works: for they say, and do not. Now that's a
8 low blow, isn't it? You think that made him popular
9 with the Pharisees?

10 JOHN: Not necessarily.

11 DAVID: Yeah. Then he says for they bind
12 heavy burdens and grievous to be borne, and lay them on
13 men's shoulders; but they themselves will not move them
14 with one of their fingers. I mean they want you to do
15 all these things, but they don't do it. But all their
16 works they do is to be seen of men. Oh they make broad
17 their phylacteries. You know what a phylactery is,
18 don't you? It's the little, it's the little shroud
19 that they wear, you know, it has little fringes on it.

20 JOHN: Uh-huh.

21 DAVID: And they enlarge the borders of their
22 garments. You know, they got these nice robes. And
23 they love the uppermost rooms at feasts, and the chief
24 seats in the synagogues where everybody can see them.
25 They love greetings in the marketplace and to be called
of men, Rabbi, Rabbi, which means master. But be ye

1 not called Rabbi: for one is your Master, even Christ,
2 and all of you are brethren. Because now he's just
3 promoting himself, right?

4 And call no man your father upon earth: for
5 one is your Father, which is in heaven. Neither ye be
6 called masters: for one is your Master, even Christ.
7 But he that is greatest among you shall be your
8 servant. And whosoever shall exalt himself shall be
9 abased; and he that shall humble himself shall be
10 exalted. But woe unto you, the scribes and Pharisees,
11 hypocrites!

12 JOHN: Do you think I'm going to be exalted
13 for what I've been doing here in the last twenty some
14 days?

15 DAVID: I hope so --

16 JOHN: I've been humbling the hell out of
17 myself.

18 DAVID: Yeah, to listen to this old fool
19 talk, right?

20 JOHN: (Laughing.)

21 DAVID: God's going to, God's going to give
22 you a seat right next to his throne.

23 JOHN: I hope so.

24 DAVID: To endure all this?

25 JOHN: We'll, we'll be there together, huh?

DAVID: I hope so.

1 JOHN: Hey. Hey. You know it.

2 DAVID: Okay. So it says woe unto you,
3 scribes and Pharisees. He's not talking about -- he's
4 talking about these scribes and Pharisees. He calls
5 them hypocrites. For ye shut up the kingdom of heaven
6 against men. Now to think that religious leaders can
7 keep men from knowing the truth, right?

8 JOHN: Um-hum.

9 DAVID: For ye neither go in yourselves,
10 neither suffer ye them that are entering in to go in.
11 Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For
12 ye devour widows' houses. You know how they, how today
13 the ministers will say dedicate your home and all that
14 to the church so when you die, you know, they can have
15 the means to spread the gospel?

16 JOHN: Yeah.

17 DAVID: They did that in the days of the
18 Sanhedrins too.

19 JOHN: Many are successful too, aren't they?

20 DAVID: Oh, lots of them. For -- and for
21 pretence ye make long prayer.

22 JOHN: Maybe I missed my calling.

23 DAVID: Huh?

24 JOHN: Maybe I missed my calling.

25 DAVID: Well, it's better not to be like
that.

1 JOHN: Well.

2 DAVID: Therefore ye shall receive the
3 greater damnation. Woe unto you, scribes and
4 Pharisees, you hypocrites! For ye compass sea and land
5 to make one proselyte. You know, to convert someone?
6 And when he is made, ye make him twofold more the child
7 of hell than yourselves. This Christ is radical, isn't
8 it? Well, he's really nailing these guys, isn't he?

9 Woe unto ye blind guides which say, whosoever
10 shall swear by the temple, it is nothing; but whosoever
11 shall swear by the gold of the temple, he is a debtor!
12 See when you, when you made a pledge to bring gold, you
13 know, for the temple, then they wanted you to hold onto
14 it.

15 Ye fools and blind: for what is greater, the
16 gold, or the temple that sanctifieth the gold? The
17 temple represents the house of God, right?

18 And whatsoever -- whosoever shall swear by
19 the altar, it is nothing; but whosoever swear by the
20 gift upon the altar, he is guilty. Because see, when
21 you brought a gift to the altar, guess who got it? The
22 priest. You see? Ye fools and blind: for what is
23 greater, the gift, or the altar that sanctifieth the
24 gift?

25 And whoso swear by the temple, sweareth by
it, and by him that dwelleth therein. And he that

1 | shall swear by heaven sweareth by the throne of God,
2 | and him that sitteth thereon.

3 | Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, for ye
4 | pay tithe, you know, 10 percent, of mint and anise and
5 | cummin which are herbs, right? But you have omitted
6 | the weightier matters of the law such as judgment,
7 | mercy, faith. These ought ye to have done, and not
8 | leave the other undone.

9 | Now it says over here, ye blind guides, woe
10 | unto you. For ye make clean the outside of the cup and
11 | of the platter, because they were very careful with
12 | washing their dishes, you know what I mean? It was a,
13 | it was a religious thing. But with -- they still do it
14 | in Israel now. But within they are full of extortion
15 | and excess.

16 | I mean, you know, if you eat too much food,
17 | you get gas, right?. Your body can only digest so much
18 | at a time. And these Sanhedrin and Pharisees were
19 | real, real big, real big, chubby men. And they are
20 | today too. They love feasting, you know?

21 | JOHN: Many of them are, aren't they?

22 | DAVID: Huh?

23 | JOHN: Many of them are, aren't they?

24 | DAVID: They, they pattern themselves after
25 | Santa Claus, don't they?

 JOHN: Yeah.

1 DAVID: Thou blind Pharisees, cleanse first
2 that which is within the cup and the platter, that the
3 outside of them may be clean also. Yeah, you know,
4 wash your dishes. But be careful what you put on it.
5 You know? Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees,
6 hypocrites! For ye are like unto whited sepulchres,
7 which indeed appear beautiful outward, but are within
8 full of dead men's bones, and all uncleanness.

9 Even so ye also outwardly appear righteous
10 unto men, but within ye are full of hypocrisy and
11 iniquity. Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees,
12 hypocrites! Because ye build the tombs of the
13 prophets, and you garnish the sepulchres of the
14 righteous, and you say, if we had been in the days of
15 our fathers, we would not have been partakers with them
16 in the killing of the prophets.

17 Wherefore ye are witnesses unto yourselves,
18 that ye are the children of them which killed the
19 prophets. Fill ye up then the measure of your fathers.
20 Ye serpents, oh generation of vipers, how can ye escape
21 the damnation of hell?

22 Wherefore, behold, I send unto you prophets,
23 and wise men, and scribes: and some of them ye shall
24 and crucify; and some of them shall ye whup (sic) in
25 your synagogues. That upon you may come all the
righteous blood shed upon the earth, from the blood of

1 | righteous Abel unto the blood of Zacharias son of
2 | Barachias, whom ye slew between the porch and the
3 | altar.

4 | Verily I say unto you, all these things shall
5 | come upon this generation. O Jerusalem, Jerusalem,
6 | thou that killeth the prophets, then stonest them which
7 | are sent unto thee, how often would I have gathered thy
8 | children together. See, all the prophets talk about
9 | God gathering his people together as one nation again.
10 | But the problem is even as a hen gathered her chicks
11 | under her wings, and ye would not!

12 | Behold, your house, which is their temple, is
13 | left unto you desolate. Now here's a religion,
14 | Judaism. They've got the law. They got the prophets.
15 | They got everything. And yet they're rejecting Christ,
16 | right?

17 | JOHN: Um-hum.

18 | DAVID: And Christ is telling them now, from
19 | this day forward, he says for I say unto you, ye shall
20 | not see me henceforth, until ye shall say, blessed is
21 | he that cometh in the name of the Lord.

22 | It says Jesus went out of the temple and
23 | departed from the temple. His disciples came to him to
24 | shew him the buildings of the temple. Because you
25 | know, these were beautiful buildings. And Jesus said
 | unto them, see ye not all these things? In other

1 words, take a look at this. Verily I say unto you,
2 there shall not be left here one stone upon another,
3 that shall not be thrown down.

4 And as he sat upon the mount of Olives, the
5 disciples came to him privately, saying, tell us, what
6 shall -- when shall these things be? When would the
7 temple be thrown down, right? What shall be the sign
8 of thy coming? They thought Christ was going to do it,
9 didn't they? And of the end of the world? Now in
10 Daniel 9 and all that in the prophecies it talked about
11 this would happen. So the disciples, they think yeah,
12 this is fixing to really come down now. So when is it
13 going to happen?

14 Jesus answered unto them, take heed that no
15 man deceive you. For many shall come in my name,
16 saying, I am Christ; and shall deceive many. What's
17 going to happen? Many will come saying Christ is Lord
18 and shall deceive many, right? And ye shall hear of
19 wars and rumours of wars: see that ye be not troubled:
20 for all these things must come to pass, but the end is
21 not yet.

22 For nation shall rise against nation, and
23 kingdom against kingdom: there shall be famines, and
24 pestilences, and earthquakes, in diverse places. You
25 know, the making of Europe was bloody, wasn't it? When
Rome -- when the Nomadic kingdom started fighting

1 | against Rome, and it started splitting up. Lots of
2 | wars, right?

3 | All these things are the beginning of
4 | sorrows. Then shall they deliver you up and to be
5 | afflicted, and ye shall, they shall kill you: and ye
6 | shall be hated of all nations for my name's sake. Then
7 | shall many be offended, and shall betray one another,
8 | and shall hate one another. And many false prophets
9 | shall arise, and shall deceive many. And because
10 | iniquity shall abound, everybody's doing wrong, the
11 | love of many shall wax cold. You can't trust anybody,
12 | right?

13 | But he that shall endure unto the end, the
14 | same shall be saved. And this gospel of the kingdom
15 | shall be preached in all the world for a witness unto
16 | all nations; and then shall the end come. What gospel?
17 | You know, endure to the end. Keep your love, right?

18 | JOHN: Um-hum.

19 | DAVID: All right. When ye therefore --

20 | JOHN: It's amazing how many people find that
21 | love at the end, isn't it?

22 | DAVID: Well, hopefully now here's what the
23 | end comes whenever --

24 | JOHN: They find, they find the love in the
25 | beginning. And then they -- as a child. And then they
 | find the -- that be, that love at the end on their

1 deathbed. And they --

2 DAVID: Yeah.

3 JOHN: -- they seem to forget what's in
4 between. Awful lot of people that way, aren't they?

5 DAVID: Yeah, it's kind of sad too. I mean
6 everybody wants to be the thief on the cross, don't
7 they? Catch it right at the last second, huh?

8 JOHN: Yeah. Yeah. Yeah.

9 DAVID: But you know, like in your job,
10 you've, you've seen a lot of people that have done
11 wrong.

12 JOHN: Yeah, I sure have.

13 DAVID: But you have to keep your mentality
14 to a point to realize that problems come, and problems
15 have to be resolved. It's just like, it's just like --

16 JOHN: Well, I also have to remember that we
17 don't resolve problems the way we did 100 years ago
18 either. And the system has changed an awful lot over
19 the years. And a lot of the hopefully the, the abuses
20 that were there aren't here anymore. And I can --

21 DAVID: You mean the lynch mobs?

22 JOHN: All of -- well, not only that but, you
23 know, somebody gets arrested, and someone says I want a
24 confession and I, you know, I want a confession.
25 Things have changed. Police -- I've been teaching
police officers for oh, 20 years, in various courses.

1 And I've just seen so much improvement in
2 professionalism.

3 DAVID: You mean they don't put a guy in a
4 seat now anymore with a big, bright light in his face
5 anymore, right --

6 JOHN: Not in the least.

7 DAVID: Huh? (Laughing.)

8 JOHN: Not in the least. No.

9 DAVID: Yeah.

10 JOHN: I mean and it's remarkable to see
11 those changes and to appreciate those changes. And I
12 won't tell you that you still don't have abuses, and
13 you still don't have problems places. But the system
14 has improved so much over the years.

15 Listen, let me tell you. Vicky is at
16 Hillsboro Hospital right now.

17 DAVID: Okay. Good news.

18 JOHN: She's there, and I asked them to let
19 me know when, when she was there and, so she's going to
20 be taken care of.

21 DAVID: Good.

22 JOHN: Plus either you or I guess Steve said
23 that she was taking her medication out with her so
24 they'd know exactly what she was on and --

25 DAVID: Right. So in doing --

JOHN: You, you didn't know of any other

1 | problems, did you, that she was having?

2 | DAVID: No, that's it. It's just, you know,
3 | she was --

4 | JOHN: Other than that ankle. You said she
5 | had a --

6 | DAVID: Yeah, well, she had that taken care
7 | of before.

8 | JOHN: Okay. But there was no --

9 | DAVID: She was just --

10 | JOHN: -- reoccurrence of a problem there,
11 | huh?

12 | DAVID: No. She just, she just wanted, she
13 | just wanted to, you know, she went for the past few
14 | days realizing that, you know, that this, this was it
15 | and, you know --

16 | JOHN: Yeah.

17 | DAVID: -- she was going to stand her fates
18 | and, and you know. She just, she didn't want to, she
19 | didn't want to die out there, you know. She wanted to
20 | die here. And I kept saying wait a minute. That's
21 | not, that's not our purposes. We never taught that.

22 | JOHN: You bet. You bet. And I think Steve
23 | said that she had been in bed for some time too.

24 | DAVID: Yeah. She just kind of folded up
25 | like a snail, you know, and went into hibernation for a
 | while.

1 JOHN: Really. Really. Well --

2 DAVID: I've had to ask about a lot of people
3 here because --

4 JOHN: I'm glad that you and he were very
5 supportive with her, you know. Because we're going to
6 take care of her.

7 DAVID: Okay. So he that endure --

8 JOHN: Go ahead.

9 DAVID: -- unto the end, the same shall be
10 saved, right?

11 JOHN: Uh-huh.

12 DAVID: Endures like what? Like Christ.
13 Christ doesn't make money off of his doctrine. The
14 disciples didn't make money. They were charitable.
15 They went around doing good. Even though people hated
16 them, they continued to love. Even though people
17 killed them, they continue to love. You know, and this
18 is Christ talking. Christ is the example, you see?

19 Now and this gospel of the kingdom, Christ is
20 the gospel. You know, forgiving. When Christ forgave
21 the woman, the, the prostitute, Mary Magdalene, he told
22 him, he says I am the light of the world. Right? Who
23 can cast the stone, right? This is an example for all
24 Christians, you know? You can't judge according to the
25 appearance of things.

Now it says here when ye therefore shall see

1 | the abomination of desolation, spoken of by Daniel the
2 | prophet. Christ is referring to something Daniel told
3 | us about, right?

4 | JOHN: Um-hum.

5 | DAVID: Stand in the holy place, whoso
6 | readeth, let him understand. Which means that Christ
7 | is directing his disciples to what? To read the
8 | prophecy of Daniel, right?

9 | JOHN: Um-hum.

10 | DAVID: Then let them which be in Judaea flee
11 | to the mountains: Let them which is on the housetop
12 | not come down to take any thing out of his house:
13 | Neither let him which is in the field return back to
14 | take his clothes. I mean that was a pretty exaction.
15 | Those are heavy exactions, aren't they?

16 | But woe unto them that are with child, and to
17 | them that give suck in those days! Why? Because you
18 | can't even go back for your baby, can you?

19 | JOHN: Yeah.

20 | DAVID: What is this abomination then? It
21 | must be bad. But pray that your flight be not in the
22 | winter, neither on the Sabbath day. So Christ still
23 | honors the Sabbath even for the future, doesn't he?
24 | Right?

25 | JOHN: Yeah.

 DAVID: For then shall be great tribulation,

1 such as was not since the beginning of the world to
2 this time, no, nor ever shall be. And except those
3 days should be shortened, there should no flesh be
4 saved: but for the elect's sake those days shall be
5 shortened. Now who are this -- who are these elect?

6 Then if any man shall say unto you, lo, here
7 is Christ, or there; believe it not. For there shall
8 arise false Christs, and false prophets, and shall shew
9 great signs and wonders; insomuch that, if it were
10 possible, they shall deceive the very elect. Behold I
11 have told you before.

12 Wherefore if they shall say unto you, behold,
13 he is in the desert; go not forth: behold, he is in
14 the secret chambers. Secret means he's hiding, right?

15 JOHN: Um-hum.

16 DAVID: Can't be found. Believe it not. For
17 as the lightning cometh out of the east, and shineth
18 even to the west; so shall also the coming of the Son
19 of man be. It will be so clear no one can deny it,
20 John. No one will be able to deny it, will they? When
21 the lightning shines, hey, can you see? You can see,
22 right? For wheresoever the --

23 JOHN: Had enough of that over here last
24 night, didn't we?

25 DAVID: Exactly. When it, when it goes boom,
crack and you see that -- hey, no one's going to tell

1 | you that was a flashlight. That --

2 | (End of tape 145.)

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
