Paul says that there are those that have a form of godliness but do not have the power thereof. They don't really have the real present, true spirit amongst them. So we have a form of religion. We have a copy of religion. But the power doesn't assist it, okay? So instead of having miraculous power to these people, God has decided since the days of John to give them truth. That's why the seven seals are a truth which is the missing key to the door. If we want power, then we have to go through these seven steps. We have to know in ourselves where the problem is.

Now we all know we need Christ. Without

Christ we can do nothing for God. We could only do for

ourselves. Man has the power to eat, to sleep, to

work, to think, and we get by in this world. As long

as it rains we got, we got, you know, seed for the

ground, we got something to eat. As long as someone

gets off their rear-end --

But of course, there's other ways and means that the world has built up through economics where some people don't have to work hard to eat good. You know, you get a little bit of collateral. You start using usury, little bit of money made off of other people's money. You know, you get these real sophisticated systems to where hey, power and riches are found through other means besides labor. And this is where the world becomes very complex. And this is where the prophets start talking about this era. It actually cheats men from real experience of life.

So you know, I thought I just, I just wanted to share something with you. And see, saw what you,

you know, see what you think about it. 2 JOHN: Um-hum. It's, it's a statement that's made 3 in, in Matthew 23 and 24. You know, just take it word for word. You know, Christ didn't come to pat the back of the churches, did he, in his day? 7 JOHN: Uh-uh. 8 DAVID: He came to witness against them, 9 didn't he? Well, the Pharisees were living high off 10 the hog, weren't they? JOHN: I can assume. 11 DAVID: But they couldn't really give the 12 people anything, could they? Except more laws and more 13 rules. 14 15 JOHN: Um-hum. 16 DAVID: Well, Christ came, and he didn't live 17 like that. So his life was a testament against him, wasn't it? So he says in Matthew 23, it says, you 18 know, that Christ said to the multitude and to his 19 disciples saying, he says hey, the scribes and the 20 21 Pharisees sit in Moses' seat. Now we know anciently that Moses was one man, right? Moses didn't live high 22 off the hog either, did he? 23 24 JOHN: Uh-uh. 25 DAVID: No. But he was the leader of Israel,

wasn't he?

JOHN: Um-hum.

DAVID: Now here we got a situation in Christ's day where all the leaders of the churches of, of the synagogues are all trying to be Moses, right? And then Christ says all therefore whatsoever they bid you observe, that observe and do; but do ye not after their works: for they say, and do not. Now that's a low blow, isn't it? You think that made him popular with the Pharisees?

JOHN: Not necessarily.

DAVID: Yeah. Then he says for they bind heavy burdens and grievous to be borne, and lay them on men's shoulders; but they themselves will not move them with one of their fingers. I mean they want you to do all these things, but they don't do it. But all their works they do is to be seen of men. Oh they make broad their phylacteries. You know what a phylactery is, don't you? It's the little, it's the little shroud that they wear, you know, it has little fringes on it.

JOHN: Uh-huh.

DAVID: And they enlarge the borders of their garments. You know, they got these nice robes. And they love the uppermost rooms at feasts, and the chief seats in the synagogues where everybody can see them. They love greetings in the marketplace and to be called of men, Rabbi, Rabbi, which means master. But be ye

JOHN: Hey. Hey. You know it. 1 2 DAVID: Okay. So it says woe unto you, 3 scribes and Pharisees. He's not talking about -- he's 4 talking about these scribes and Pharisees. He calls 5 them hypocrites. For ye shut up the kingdom of heaven 6 against men. Now to think that religious leaders can 7 keep men from knowing the truth, right? JOHN: Um-hum. 8 DAVID: For ye neither go in yourselves, 9 neither suffer ye them that are entering in to go in. 10 Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For 11 12 ye devour widows' houses. You know how they, how today 13 the ministers will say dedicate your home and all that 14 to the church so when you die, you know, they can have 15 the means to spread the gospel? 16 JOHN: Yeah. 17 They did that in the days of the Sanhedrins too. 18 19 Many are successful too, aren't they? JOHN: 20 DAVID: Oh, lots of them. For -- and for pretence ye make long prayer. 21 22 Maybe I missed my calling. 23 DAVID: Huh? 24 JOHN: Maybe I missed my calling. 25 DAVID: Well, it's better not to be like that.

JOHN: Well.

DAVID: Therefore ye shall receive the greater damnation. Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, you hypocrites! For ye compass sea and land to make one proselyte. You know, to convert someone? And when he is made, ye make him twofold more the child of hell than yourselves. This Christ is radical, isn't it? Well, he's really nailing these guys, isn't he?

Woe unto ye blind guides which say, whosoever shall swear by the temple, it is nothing; but whosoever shall swear by the gold of the temple, he is a debtor! See when you, when you made a pledge to bring gold, you know, for the temple, then they wanted you to hold onto it.

Ye fools and blind: for what is greater, the gold, or the temple that sanctifieth the gold? The temple represents the house of God, right?

And whatsoever -- whosoever shall swear by the altar, it is nothing; but whosoever swear by the gift upon the alter, he is guilty. Because see, when you brought a gift to the altar, guess who got it? The priest. You see? Ye fools and blind: for what is greater, the gift, or the altar that sanctifieth the gift?

And whoso swear by the temple, sweareth by it, and by him that dwelleth therein. And he that

shall swear by heaven sweareth by the throne of God, and him that sitteth thereon. 2 3 Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, for ye 4 pay tithe, you know, 10 percent, of mint and anise and cummin which are herbs, right? But you have omitted 5 the weightier matters of the law such as judgment, mercy, faith. These ought ye to have done, and not leave the other undone. 9 Now it says over here, ye blind guides, woe unto you. For ye make clean the outside of the cup and 10 of the platter, because they were very careful with 11 washing their dishes, you know what I mean? 13 it was a religious thing. But with -- they still do it in Israel now. But within they are full of extortion 14 and excess. 15 I mean, you know, if you eat too much food, 16 you get gas, right? Your body can only digest so much 17 at a time. And these Sanhedrin and Pharisees were 18 real, real big, real big, chubby men. And they are 19 today too. They love feasting, you know? 20 Many of them are, aren't they? 21 22 DAVID: Huh? Many of them are, aren't they? 23 DAVID: They, they pattern themselves after 24

JOHN: Yeah.

Santa Claus, don't they?

25

Thou blind Pharisees, cleanse first 1 2 that which is within the cup and the platter, that the 3 outside of them may be clean also. Yeah, you know, wash your dishes. But be careful what you put on it. You know? Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, 5 6 hypocrites! For ye are like unto whited sepulchres, 7 which indeed appear beautiful outward, but are within full of dead men's bones, and all uncleanliness. 8 9 Even so ye also outwardly appear righteous unto men, but within ye are full of hypocrisy and 10 iniquity. Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, 11 12 hypocrites! Because ye build the tombs of the 13

prophets, and you garnish the sepulchres of the righteous, and you say, if we had been in the days of our fathers, we would not have been partakers with them in the killing of the prophets.

Wherefore ye are witnesses unto yourselves, that ye are the children of them which killed the prophets. Fill ye up then the measure of your fathers. Ye serpents, oh generation of vipers, how can ye escape the damnation of hell?

Wherefore, behold, I send unto you prophets, and wise men, and scribes: and some of them ye shall and crucify; and some of them shall ye whup (sic) in your synagogues. That upon you may come all the righteous blood shed upon the earth, from the blood of 1 righteous Abel unto the blood of Zacharias son of 2 Barachias, whom ye slew between the porch and the 3 altar.

Verily I say unto you, all these things shall come upon this generation. O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, thou that killeth the prophets, then stonest them which are sent unto thee, how often would I have gathered thy children together. See, all the prophets talk about God gathering his people together as one nation again. But the problem is even as a hen gathered her chicks under her wings, and ye would not!

Behold, your house, which is their temple, is left unto you desolate. Now here's a religion,
Judaism. They've go the law. They got the prophets.
They got everything. And yet they're rejecting Christ, right?

JOHN: Um-hum.

DAVID: And Christ is telling them now, from this day forward, he says for I say unto you, ye shall not see me henceforth, until ye shall say, blessed is he that cometh in the name of the Lord.

It says Jesus went out of the temple and departed from the temple. His disciples came to him to shew him the buildings of the temple. Because you know, these were beautiful buildings. And Jesus said unto them, see ye not all these things? In other

words, take a look at this. Verily I say unto you, there shall not be left here one stone upon another, that shall not be thrown down.

And as he sat upon the mount of Olives, the disciples came to him privately, saying, tell us, what shall -- when shall these things be? When would the temple be thrown down, right? What shall be the sign of thy coming? They thought Christ was going to do it, didn't they? And of the end of the world? Now in Daniel 9 and all that in the prophecies it talked about this would happen. So the disciples, they think yeah, this is fixing to really come down now. So when is it going to happen?

Jesus answered unto them, take heed that no man deceive you. For many shall come in my name, saying, I am Christ; and shall deceive many. What's going to happen? Many will come saying Christ is Lord and shall deceive many, right? And ye shall hear of wars and rumours of wars: see that ye be not troubled: for all these things must come to pass, but the end is not yet.

For nation shall rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom: there shall be famines, and pestilences, and earthquakes, in diverse places. You know, the making of Europe was bloody, wasn't it? When Rome -- when the Nomadic kingdom started fighting

against Rome, and it started splitting up. Lots of 2 wars, right? 3 All these things are the beginning of sorrows. Then shall they deliver you up and to be 4 5 afflicted, and ye shall, they shall kill you: and ye shall be hated of all nations for my name's sake. 6 shall many be offended, and shall betray one another, 7 and shall hate one another. And many false prophets 8 shall arise, and shall deceive many. And because 9 iniquity shall abound, everybody's doing wrong, the 10 love of many shall wax cold. You can't trust anybody, 11 right? 12 But he that shall endure unto the end, the 13 14 same shall be saved. And this gospel of the kingdom shall be preached in all the world for a witness unto 15 all nations; and then shall the end come. What gospel? 16 17 You know, endure to the end. Keep your love, right? Um-hum. JOHN: 18 DAVID: All right. When ye therefore --19 It's amazing how many people find that 20 JOHN: 21 love at the end, isn't it? DAVID: Well, hopefully now here's what the 22 end comes whenever --23 They find, they find the love in the 24 25 beginning. And then they -- as a child. And then they find the -- that be, that love at the end on their

deathbed. And they --1 2 DAVID: Yeah. JOHN: -- they seem to forget what's in 3 Awful lot of people that way, aren't they? 4 between. DAVID: Yeah, it's kind of sad too. I mean 5 everybody wants to be the thief on the cross, don't 6 they? Catch it right at the last second, huh? 7 JOHN: Yeah. Yeah. Yeah. 8 DAVID: But you know, like in your job, 9 you've, you've seen a lot of people that have done 11 wrong. JOHN: Yeah, I sure have. 12 DAVID: But you have to keep your mentality 13 to a point to realize that problems come, and problems 14 have to be resolved. It's just like, it's just like --15 JOHN: Well, I also have to remember that we 16 don't resolve problems the way we did 100 years ago 17 either. And the system has changed an awful lot over 18 the years. And a lot of the hopefully the, the abuses 19 that were there aren't here anymore. And I can --20 DAVID: You mean the lynch mobs? 21 22 All of -- well, not only that but, you know, somebody gets arrested, and someone says I want a 23 confession and I, you know, I want a confession. 24 Things have changed. Police -- I've been teaching 25 police officers for oh, 20 years, in various courses.

And I've just seen so much improvement in 2 professionalism. 3 DAVID: You mean they don't put a guy in a seat now anymore with a big, bright light in his face 4 5 anymore, right --6 JOHN: Not in the least. 7 DAVID: Huh? (Laughing.) JOHN: Not in the least. No. 8 9 DAVID: Yeah. I mean and it's remarkable to see 10 JOHN: 11 those changes and to appreciate those changes. And I won't tell you that you still don't have abuses, and 12 you still don't have problems places. But the system 13 has improved so much over the years. 15 Listen, let me tell you. Vicky is at 16 Hillsboro Hospital right now. 17 DAVID: Okay. Good news. She's there, and I asked them to let 18 JOHN: 19 me know when, when she was there and, so she's going to 20 be taken care of. DAVID: Good. 21 22 JOHN: Plus either you or I guess Steve said that she was taking her medication out with her so 23 they'd know exactly what she was on and --24 25 DAVID: Right. So in doing --JOHN: You, you didn't know of any other

problems, did you, that she was having? 2 DAVID: No, that's it. It's just, you know, 3 she was --JOHN: Other than that ankle. You said she 4 5 had a --6 Yeah, well, she had that taken care DAVID: 7 of before. JOHN: Okay. But there was no --8 9 DAVID: She was just --10 JOHN: -- reoccurrence of a problem there, huh? 11 12 She just, she just wanted, she No. just wanted to, you know, she went for the past few 13 14 days realizing that, you know, that this, this was it and, you know --15 16 JOHN: Yeah. 17 DAVID: -- she was going to stand her fates and, and you know. She just, she didn't want to, she 18 19 didn't want to die out there, you know. She wanted to 20 die here. And I kept saying wait a minute. 21 not, that's not our purposes. We never taught that. 22 JOHN: You bet. You bet. And I think Steve 23 said that she had been in bed for some time too. DAVID: Yeah. She just kind of folded up 24 25 like a snail, you know, and went into hibernation for a while.

Really. Really. Well --1 JOHN: 2 I've had to ask about a lot of people DAVID: here because --3 4 JOHN: I'm glad that you and he were very 5 supportive with her, you know. Because we're going to 6 take care of her. DAVID: Okay. So he that endure --7 JOHN: Go ahead. 8 9 DAVID: -- unto the end, the same shall be saved, right? 10 JOHN: Uh-huh. 11 DAVID: Endures like what? Like Christ. 12 Christ doesn't make money off of his doctrine. The 13 disciples didn't make money. They were charitable. 14 They went around doing good. Even though people hated 15 them, they continued to love. Even though people 16 17 killed them, they continue to love. You know, and this is Christ talking. Christ is the example, you see? 18 19 Now and this gospel of the kingdom, Christ is 20 the gospel. You know, forgiving. When Christ forgave the woman, the, the prostitute, Mary Magdalene, he told 21 him, he says I am the light of the world. Right? Who 22 can cast the stone, right? This is an example for all 23 Christians, you know? You can't judge according to the 24 25 appearance of things.

Now it says here when ye therefore shall see

the abomination of desolation, spoken of by Daniel the prophet. Christ is referring to something Daniel told 3 us about, right? JOHN: Um-hum. 5 DAVID: Stand in the holy place, whoso readeth, let him understand. Which means that Christ 6 7 is directing his disciples to what? To read the 8 prophecy of Daniel, right? Um-hum. 9 JOHN: DAVID: Then let them which be in Judaea flee 10 to the mountains: Let them which is on the housetop 11 12 not come down to take any thing out of his house: Neither let him which is in the field return back to 13 take his clothes. I mean that was a pretty exaction. 14 Those are heavy exactions, aren't they? 15 16 But woe unto them that are with child, and to 17 them that give suck in those days! Why? Because you can't even go back for your baby, can you? 18 19 JOHN: Yeah. DAVID: What is this abomination then? 20 21 must be bad. But pray that your flight be not in the winter, neither on the Sabbath day. So Christ still 22 honors the Sabbath even for the future, doesn't he? 23 24 Right? 25 JOHN: Yeah.

DAVID:

For then shall be great tribulation,

_

such as was not since the beginning of the world to 2 this time, no, nor ever shall be. And except those 3 days should be shortened, there should no flesh be saved: but for the elect's sake those days shall be 5 shortened. Now who are this -- who are these elect? 6 Then if any man shall say unto you, lo, here 7 is Christ, or there; believe it not. For there shall arise false Christs, and false prophets, and shall shew 8 9 great signs and wonders; insomuch that, if it were possible, they shall deceive the very elect. Behold I 10 have told you before. 11 12 Wherefore if they shall say unto you, behold, he is in the desert; go not forth: behold, he is in 13 14 the secret chambers. Secret means he's hiding, right? JOHN: Um-hum. 15 16 DAVID: Can't be found. Believe it not. 17 as the lightning cometh out of the east, and shineth even to the west; so shall also the coming of the Son 18 It will be so clear no one can deny it, 19 of man be. John. No one will be able to deny it, will they? When 20 21 the lightning shines, hey, can you see? You can see, right? For wheresoever the --22 23 JOHN: Had enough of that over here last night, didn't we? 24 25 DAVID: Exactly. When it, when it goes boom, crack and you see that -- hey, no one's going to tell
