1 (Tape 171) I mean of course I don't 2 STEVE: -- to him. 3 expect you to ever buy something like that. I wouldn't myself if I was in your position. But --4 5 That's, that's pretty objective of JOHN: 6 you --7 STEVE: Well, no, but I --JOHN: 8 -- Steve. -- I -- you know, John, I've always 9 10 been that way. I've never -- I'm not into supernatural 11 phenomena, and I'm, I'm an extreme skeptic. I quess 12 coming up with the kind of a background I have, being 13 into comparative religion, having some friends like Dr. Libra (phonetic sp.) of the University of Hawaii who 14 himself was atheistic but yet did a lot of comparison 15 studies in that sort of phenomena, witch doctors, 16 17 gurus, that, that sort of thing. I mean I've weighed 18 the evidences myself. And I've never seen or believed in anything like it. 19 20 So when I did meet David this is what I've 21 told some of the other negotiators. I mean it's not, 22 it's not a simple another cult and a cultic leader with some bizarre this and -- there's more to it. 23 24 logic here. I mean why would -- I, I tried to even 25 raise the question to them why would I leave my

Hawaiian home which I said I'd never leave Hawaii. I
love Hawaii. I liked what I was doing over there
JOHN: Would you like to go back there
someday?
STEVE: Well, no well, you know, if this
is all there was in life was this world, this earth, I
would go back there now. I'd go back there right this
moment.
JOHN: You know, I, I expect to leave this
world someday too. But in the interim, you know, I
want to be with my family and
STEVE: No, I John, I that's
commendable. I mean that's the way it should be.
JOHN: Enjoy the earth so to speak, you know.
STEVE: But what, but what if there's a
source in the world called the Bible which really is
true in its wholeness. And all these prophets
finally the last Book of Revelation says that there's a
time that comes when all those prophets are tied
together clearly as many pieces to a puzzle. Well,
then the logical thinker is going to look at that and
say maybe, just maybe.
Now to me there's never been 100 percent
perfection of evidence for anything. But what I've
always done for years is gone by a weight of evidence,

If our agents perceive that their lives or the life of someone else is at risk, 6 7 they will take appropriate action to ensure their own safety. No one will be allowed to aim a weapon from a 8 window, as this may be perceived by our agents as a 9 threat to their lives or the life of others and compel 10 them to act accordingly. Anytime you exit the building 11 and are approaching our agents, you must fully comply 12 with any verbal instructions to avoid exposing yourself 13 to potential risk. 14 This has been a station 15 STEVE: 16 identification. 1 JOHN: Yeah. 17 STEVE: Okay. 18 Did you ask if anyone is coming out? 19 STEVE: Yes, I did. And, and they said they 20 didn't want to -- they all told me they didn't want to 21 speak about it on the Sabbath day. That's what they 22 23 told me. It was very strong.
