You're going to have to see a DICK: magistrate. Some will be charged, some will not be charged when the facts come out. You and only you -- I mean you, meaning the rest of you folks in there, can tell us what happened in there. And you think that we're just going to say that, that, you know, what ATF says is accurate is accurate? Absolutely untrue. Absolutely untrue. We're going to interview each and every one of you people and you tell us what happened, what you saw happening, what's your thoughts, what's your impressions, and what happened. And then we're going to have to deal. Some attorney at some point for the government is going to review what is said by both parties in this -- plural. And there's going to be a determination made.

I will guarantee you that there is not going to be, you know, running you folks down to the jail and throwing away the key. Isn't going to be done. It is never done because in this country we're guaranteed by the Constitution that we have to do things in a certain way. My guess is and, again, I'm not going to tell you anything that I -- if I tell you I'm guessing, you know, I'll tell you it's a guess. If it's something I

know for a fact, I'll tell you that. You may well have 1 2 to appear before Congress, you and David or others, 3 perhaps, might want to to tell what happened. There is absolutely no person in this country that is not 4 5 interested in what happened Sunday, okay? It's going to come out. As a law enforcement officer, I will not 6 7 stand for any less. I do not want to be accused of, of 8 circumventing the law and people's rights. I've been 9 an agent for a long time. I have never done --10 STEVE: I like what I hear. 11 DICK: -- and will not be done. We will not 12 allow it to happen. 13 STEVE: I really do believe they are a lot of 14 good men like yourself that have, you know, high standard and, and that want nothing but the best, an 15 16 improvement for all -- like the country at large. 17 I've always been one of those kind of people also. Ι 18 like the freedom of choice and also elections. But I 19 -- it bothers me when you see certain elements in the society that are very powerful over a long period of 20 21 time that are gaining more and more control. But see, -- and then I've got to ask myself, why is this? What 22 23 have we done? Have we left down our -- the vigilance 24 and the watch dog of keeping our freedoms like Abraham 25 Lincoln warned about, Jefferson, Madison. And this is exactly --

It's going to have to be 20 resolved. But everybody's going to be treated 21 professionally. Everybody is going to be treated well. 22 There's not going to be any incident here that would 23 cause --24 Well, that's not what happened to STEVE: 25 these young guys on this property back in '87. Man, if you ever hear the story from the young guys themselves,

1 you would be guite amazed. DICK: 2 Okay. Listen, I don't know who, who -- what agencies they were dealing with, okay. 3 It was the local Sheriff's 4 STEVE: 5 Department. 6 DICK: Okay. Again, I wasn't here. 7 please, I'm not going to -- I'm not going to address those issues. 8 9 The way they roughed them up in the 10 gravel on the road and there were fire ants crawling 11 all over them, biting them, and they were cussed at and 12 told that, as they were laying face first on the 13 gravel, they were told they should have thought about that ahead of time. 14 15 DICK: Okay. 16 STEVE: And here they were actually 17 encouraged. They had gone to the Sheriff's Department 18 and said there was a man that should -- there was --19 what was it, corpse abuse. And they wanted the 20 Sheriff's Department to come out and arrest the man or 21 at least check it out. But instead of the department 22 doing that, they were told they should. So, these 23 young guys actually took a camera late at night or 24 wandered around on this property trying to get a 25 picture of this casket that this man, George Roden, had literally dug up.

1 DICK: Okay. 2 STEVE: And in the process, they got the pictures, took it back to this man by the name of 3 Dickerson who's no longer -- I guess he's retired. But 4 5 he said, boys, this isn't enough. We need to see 6 bones. 7 DICK: So, you -- listen --8 STEVE: But -- here's what I'm saying --9 DICK: Okay. 10 STEVE: -- but when the day comes that he 11 encourages them to go back onto the property, the 12 Sheriff's Department knew about it. They're the ones 13 that told these young guys to do this very thing. 14 DICK: Okay. Steve? 15 STEVE: Then -- wait, I just want to tell you something so you can see where we're coming from --16 17 DICK: Okay. 18 STEVE: -- in regards to this. 19 DICK: I understand where you're coming from 20 because I've heard this before. 21 STEVE: Okay. 22 DICK: About mistreating people. 23 STEVE: Oh, yeah, --24 I don't mistreat people and it will 25 not be done. And this is the -- I don't -- this is the 3 4 way it was cause I knew these young men from Hawaii. 5 They were friends of mine, businessmen and so forth. Never -- they're not into guns, they're not into 6 7 anything. No records, no, no problems ever with 8 anybody. So, these young men they take a shotgun or 9 two along. They take a .22 rifle. I think one did have a mini 14, whatever that is. 10 11 DICK: Okay. 12 STEVE: And these men -- the reason they 13 brought them along is because Dickerson says, when you 14 go back on the property, there's some dangerous 15 elements on the property, and he implied that they 16 should protect themselves. He actually did. So, they 17 went back onto the property and it got to be light, the 18 time of day. The man came out with an Uzi semi-19 automatic, apparently, because of a dog barking and he 20 starts shooting and firing at two, three of these guys 21 that are walking along in the open. Well, the only 22 thing that happened is one or two of the guys used 23 their rifles or .22s, whatever, and shot them in the 24 air for getting a distraction from the man, a

diversion, so they could all get out of there.

I'm going to tell you, 17 it is not going to cost you -- I'm telling you, people 18 are standing in line to get, to get to you. I mean 19 people want to hear what happened here. My God, this 20 is something that's never happened in the history, in 21 law enforcement history. This is not an everyday 22 event. You think that people are going to mistreat you when you come out of there? If that's what you think, 23 24 I'll stand up there and meet you and walk you in. 25 Well, I don't, you know, -- really, that's almost irrelevant. I don't know whether they

DAVID: What's this now? 3 4 I say with a man with that kind of money, he, he and I are -- like to get together, I 5 6 think. 7 DAVID: (Laughs) 8 DICK: Do you think he needs a business 9 partner, David? 10 DAVID: I'm not really sure. 11 DICK: Not sure. 12 DAVID: But the point of it was is that like 13 Paul, when he heard the message, you know, and he heard the simplicity of it, you know, he wanted to, to turn 14 15 this business over to me. 16 DICK: Uh-huh. 17 DAVID: Now, that's, you know, that's, that's 18 a, that's a nice, -- that's a nice feeling. 19 DICK: Shows a lot of -- a lot of faith in you, doesn't it? 20 21 DAVID: Well, it -- definitely it does 22 because you see the scripture in itself does have a 23 challenge. I mean a lot of people put faith in the That's, that's for sure. 24 pontiff. 25 DICK: Uh-huh. DAVID: Or Billy Graham or Rex Humbard or --

DICK: All men with strong conviction and --

2 DAVID: All men of great show.

3 DICK: Compassion.

1

You know. But we wonder if men of 4 DAVID: such deportment really are genuine. Well, like I say, 5 6 the, the Bible -- and when, when it's time -- when it's 7 time, you know, every phoney is found out. That's the way it always has been, you know. There was one time 8 9 when even the pontiff was uncovered politically as an 10 imposter. I mean in 1798, Napoleon's General Berthier 11 overthrew Vatican, you know. Because of -- well, it 12 really revolved around an awakening of the, of the 13 general world public of Europe at that time. I mean when you had people like Hush Jerome (phonetic) and 14 Tydnall Weinert (phonetic), trying to do certain things 15 16 and the papacy, you know, burning them and dragging 17 them and, and formulating all the iron maidens and 18 guillotines of those days, you know, they called them 19 and derided them as heretics. But finally, you know, 20 in the 15th century, Martin Luther made a statement so 21 clear and so plain that men and lawyers and judges and 22 those prelates that were connected to the papacy, they, 23 they said to themselves, now, wait a minute, you know. 24 This man here has got something. And it's, it was --25 it's based right out of the Bible, you know.

DICK: David, a lot of people have made those

1 same comments about you. I'm not from this area but I constantly have contact with people back in my own area 2 3 of the country and, and they've made a number of favorable comments directed toward some of the things 4 you had to say. But I know one thing that my wife who 5 is a devout follower, Christian, said, you know, I like 6 what he had to say but I'm, I'm kinda concerned about, 7 you know, his failure to follow through on the thing. 8 9 I mean that, that comes from a lay person, from a person who, you know, is married to a law enforcement 10 11 officer but certainly it does not restrict, you know, 12 her knowledge to, to that area, fortunately. And she 13 suggested to me, you know, I like some of the things he 14 has to say but is, is he a man of his word? And I 15 said, well, you know, I think, I think he's --16 Well, it's like this -- it's like DAVID: 17 this, Dick. I talked with Jim right off the beginning, 18 okay. And I explained to Jim very clearly that in the picture that's developed by the New Covenant, by the 19 New Testament, you know, and in, in the picture that's 20 21 developed by our, our nation, you know, our nation 22 under God -- isn't that what it says on our currency? 23 DICK: It does. 24 DAVID: It, it defines a God in which we 25 trust, right?

DICK: Uh-huh.

1 DAVID: Okay. Now, in this nation or in this 2 Constitution which allows liberty of conscience, freedom of conscience, freedom of conviction, you know, 3 4 it's, it's still, it's still in a large degree a system 5 that is governed by individuals who have their beliefs and their religions and it's also -- it's a tendency 6 7 in, in the system to, to develop categorizations and to bring people of like faith into the positions of 8 government, just as it is to proselyte people into the 9 convictions of religion. In other words, over periods 10 11 of time you might find that certain governmental 12 offices and certain governmental institutions finally, 13 you know, although not openly but somehow sometimes under cover, may bring a majority of one type of faith 14 15 into a system, making it not only a bureaucracy, 16 politically, but also a bureaucracy religiously. Do you understand what I'm saying? 17 18 DICK: I understand what you're saying, 19 certainly. 20 DAVID: Okay. Now, for instance, when the 21 United States of America which is, according to 22 religious faith from the forefathers, protestant, one 23 has to ask the question, well, what are they protesting 24 against? You know, you go back to the Mayflower and 25 all these things, you know. You know, what was the big gripe in the first place for men to risk their lives,

1 to venture the great sea, to come to another hope, to 2 another land. Well, it was because of the tyranny of, 3 of Europe. It was because of the tyranny of the old country. And what was that tyranny? It was, it was 4 5 political oppression that was -- or actually based or 6 propagated by religious conviction. It was the Roman Catholicism. 7 It was how Rome ruled the, the world, the 8 basic world at that time for approximately 1,500 years and how that the, the doctrines and the great men and 10 all that were all highly associated and connected to 11 the great pontiff, the religio-political system. 12 That, you know, basically, he's the vice chairman, I mean he's God on earth, you know. And when the 13 14 Eucharist is taken and stuff, the priest becomes the 15 incarnate body of Christ and, and the exactions and the -- well, anyway, what I'm saying is is that that faith 16 17 finally was contended by Martin Luther. The celibacy 18 of the priest was contended over, you know. Doctrines 19 in regards to after life and, and the purgatory and the 20 baptism, by sprinkling and the child baptism. All 21 these things were questioned by other people who rose 22 up, such as John Knox, Wesley and Campbell, begin to 23 say, really, the, the church of our fathers, the church 24 was born in this great papacy. Is it really on the foundation of the written truth that is the written 25 word of the Apostles, you know. We found out that,

1 that not all churches really stand firm on the 2 foundation of, of the Apostles, which were the personal witnesses of Christ. 3 Okav. Now, now the point we're making is is that 4 when we see the last testament, we see that Matthew has 5 6 written about Christ according to what he perceived, 7 correct? 8 DICK: That's correct. 9 DAVID: And people that believe in Jesus 10 believe in those things. And --11 And they take great comfort from it, DICK: 12 David. 13 DAVID: Well, definitely, although there are 14 many who, who hope for healing and many who hope for 15 the miracles. Christ does not do those things today. 16 And some people would like to make you think that he 17 does but we have documented proof from the very 18 scriptures that those things are not being done, 19 although they might be a deception. By anyway, the 20 point is Matthew, Mark, Luke and John have given 21 testimony and record of the controversy and the belief 22 that they have. Now, what they're telling us, if you 23 really look, is they're telling us that a man came 24 through a virgin birth but they're telling us that the 25 Sanhedrim and the Pharisees, when they confronted Christ, they told Christ pointblank and clear that they

were not sons born of fornication. So, they're telling 1 2 us in the Gospels that though they believe he was a 3 virgin, you know, from a virgin child, according to 4 Isaiah 8, they're saying that the -- the leaders of the day were saying that he was a, an illegitimate child. 5 He was born of fornication. 6 7 Like I read in that original presentation, it 8 says that, you know, according to John 7 and all it 9 says that even his own brother did not believe in him, 10 though he had done so many miracles, you know. 11 Sometimes seeing is not believing. There has to be 12 another element to be reviewed. There has to be 13 another perception for us to really see what we're 14 really looking at. 15 But anyway, so, it comes down to the point 16 these men are telling us that when Christ came in the 17 flesh, nobody would know him. Nobody would know him 18 and there was a reason for it, you know. Any, any 19 time, any time a truth comes that demands our full 20 attention and our works and actions in harmony with it, 21 men are going to have to sit down and count the cost. Usually in such a time, the men are in doing their own 22 23 works, they're building their own little empires, 24 they're, they're evaluating their own little 25 perceptions of life. And if any truth came, well --

for instance, if Christ was to come right now, I mean

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right now, I mean, I mean --

MR. KORESH: -- Christ, right? The boss is back, right?

DICK: The boss is back.

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MR. KORESH: Okay, and likewise the Lutherans and the Presbyterians and the Methodists and Christ can say to those who were given talents, you know, well, you've -- I've given you five talents, you've increased them to ten, I've given you four -- I increased them to eight, you know, and sad to say there might be those religious institutions that had one talent and you just buried it in the ground, didn't, didn't produce any increase for their Lord, right? But then, you know, that would be so idealistic, you know -- you know, Christ is going to come, you'll see glorious things bigger than anybody else, nobody can fight against him, no opposition, you know, no quibble of mine, just straight across the table. But it, it seems to appear very clearly, as a matter of fact very factually, that the revelation of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John develops a few mysteries such as Christ talking with his disciples about his second coming. In Matthew 24 he begins to make it very plain, you know, about his second coming. Though he refers to the prophet Daniel, he says, "When you shall see the abomination and desolation," spoken of by the prophet Daniel he tells about his followers leaving Jerusalem. Okay, and then

1 he says, "In wars and rumors of wars they shall kill 2 you for my name's sake." He says, "Because iniquity will abound (indiscernible) but you endure the same 3 shall be saved." Says, "There will be great tribulation," and the -- and that tribulation, you 5 know, people don't understand the dark ages what kind 6 7 of tribulation there was. He says, "In the tribulation 8 afterwards when they shall say to you he's in the 9 desert he says go not forth; when they shall say he's 10 in the, in the secret chambers," in other words, you 11 know, no one knows where he's at and -- he's in heaven, he's, you know, you know, right? He's up there in the 12 13 secret chambers. "Believe it not. For as lightening 14 shines out of the East even the West will also shall be 15 the coming of the son of man." Now, does this mean 16 like lightning that shines in the East even to the West like, you know, big lightening bolt he's going to come 17 or does it mean that it'll be as clear? 18 I mean, just -19 - when you see literal lightening in nature shine it's 20 clear, isn't it? It's obvious, it's right there in 21 front of you, right? 22 DICK: Well, it should be, David. I, I would 23 agree. 24 MR. KORESH: Okay, but then the next 25 statement that Christ makes according to what these men say is, he says, "Wheresoever the carcass is -- " --

no, after he makes the statement of it'll be like 1 2 lightening that shines in the East even in the West, and he says, "For wheresoever the carcass is there will 3 be eagles be gathered together." So, you know, a 5 statement like that puts the, the mind of man into a, 6 into a query saying well, what does that mean? You 7 know, because the statement is not made to be very obvious, is it? 8 9 Well, it's difficult for a lot of DICK: 10 people to understand those kinds of statements, David, 11 and it's --12 MR. KORESH: But we know Christ would know 13 what it means. 14 DICK: Absolutely. 15 MR. KORESH: And we would know that many 16 would come in his name and he said -- said, "I am 17 Christ (indiscernible)" Now, now, Matthew said Christ was Christ, Mark said Christ was Christ, Luke said 18 19 Christ was Christ and John says Christ was Christ. 20 there comes a later comer in the scripture when you 21 begin to see the book of Acts how it on the day of 22 Pentecost those who had received him were given power, a definite sign of their acceptance in their purpose to 23 24 carry the good news not with just words of wisdom but 25 with power. They were given the cloven tongues of fire which definitely had some kind of meaning to it.

1 they were cloven -- two tongues of fire. And they 2 began to explain about -- Peter says, you know, that this Christ same Christ in the heavens shall come again 3 4 and he shall remain in the heavens until the 5 restitution of all things spoken of by the holy prophets. Now, of course if a person is ignorant of 6 7 the holy prophets and what they have stated, then again Peter will be making a statement in which the sun would 8 be shadowy. But anyway, as we progress through the 9 10 Acts we see the Acts talks about certain individuals 11 who were very zealous and persecuting the things they 12 did not understand like Saul or Tarsius (phonetic sp.) 13 and we find that Saul finally got an awakening on the 14 way to Damascus to persecute more Christians when 15 scripture says Christ himself personally appeared in a 16 great light and blinded this man and smote this man to 17 the ground and says to this man, "Saul, Saul, why 18 persecutest thou me? It's hard to kick against the 19 pricks." Now, a lot of people wouldn't understand 20 again why Christ would, would state it's hard for Paul 21 to kick against the pricks. I mean, there's, there's a 22 lot of lingo and statements made by Christ and the 23 apostles which are not of the obvious, more or less in 24 the mysterious. But of course, if a person understood 25 in the day of Moses, Moses, you know, trying to be a deliverer in his own strength (indiscernible) Egypt

have killed an Egyptian, right? And being brought before the judiciary he, he made a run for it and landed up in the land of Goshen over near Midian and there he finally found employment with the priest of Midian and ended up marrying one of his daughters and a good 40 years later deprogramed him from his pride and arrogancy, his kingship type, you know, the way he was raised in the house of Pharaoh, and basically taught this man how to just simply live simple and love simple and, and love to take care of sheep and take the burden of a shepherd. And when the man finally had just about become deprogramed from all of his high deals of being somebody high and mighty, then all of a sudden he beheld down to Ararat up the mountain (indiscernible) and he saw there a burning bush. Now, of course, you know, if a person understood, you know, the Hebrew, I mean there is kind of a translation problem sometimes, they would understand that this bush was a thorn bush. And Moses went down to see this great sight because the thorn bush was all on fire but it wasn't being consumed. And then of course the thorn bush turned out to be God, right? You know, and, and we find out this thorn bush later on was really Christ before he became So again, you know, Moses having been deprogramed from his (indiscernible) was ready to take on the work that God was going to do through him, okay?

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1 So then Moses had to confront the greatest nation of 2 the day and very humbly present has plea in behalf of God and when the nation was stubborn and wouldn't 3 4 listen finally God had to retaliate because they 5 started retaliating on Israel and God finally subjected and destroyed that nation so that all nations might be 6 7 prepared to realize that God was back in the saddle again and he was coming into town. 8 9 DICK: He was coming into town, huh? 10 MR. KORESH: Oh, yeah, you know, God's a 11 cowboy. He's, he's got some horses don't he in the 12 book of Revelation? You know, God's definitely a 13 Now, what we're talking about again is that in 14 the days of the new covenant where Christ is being 15 crucified, being handed over to the Roman judiciary, we see a little bit the way corruption sometimes becomes 16 17 obvious in political systems and that well, Pilot, 18 Pilot in his position knew. I mean, Pilot wasn't one 19 of these crazy religious fanatics. You know -- one 20 time a person said years ago and I remember this that a 21 fanatic is a person who's lost sight of their goal and 22 try twice as hard to accomplish it. You know, and it always struck me, and I said, you know, though it's a 23 24 statement of man it's very inspired. 25

DICK: Is that always a negative though, David?

1 MR. KORESH: What, a fanatic? 2 DICK: Yeah. 3 MR. KORESH: Well, like I say, fanaticism is something where men are running in the dark as fast as 4 5 they can to get to where they don't know where they're 6 going. 7 DICK: Well, 8 that's --9 MR. KORESH: It could be a dangerous thing. 10 DICK: It certain can, but I, I would guess 11 that on the other hand it can be -- it could also be a 12 good thing couldn't it? MR. KORESH: Well, I don't think so. 13 14 that being zealous --15 DICK: Okay. 16 MR. KORESH: -- is a good thing, is putting 17 your full strength into something knowing what you're 18 to accomplish and being zealous is being a good thing, 19 but fanatic --20 DICK: Well, can I offer perhaps a personal 21 observation? You know, in, in certain respects I 22 consider myself a fanatic. That is, I'm -- I, I want to ensure that while I'm with this law-enforcement 23 24 organization that the constitution is first and 25 foremost in, in terms of what I do with my day-to-day activities and I deal with people that the constitution

1 is the measure of what, what I should do. And I, I'm 2 very fanatical about that to some degree, that that is, 3 is what I'm about, you know? I want to ensure that 4 when I'm doing the job that I protect the rights of the 5 citizens that I deal with and that's, that's of prime 6 importance. I know this morning Steve was -- indicated 7 to me well, you know, once you folks leave what is 8 going to happen? I said, one thing that we're going to 9 tell you that's going to happen is that the 10 constitution is going to be strictly adhered to. 11 is, that no one is going to circumvent any of your 12 constitutional rights, we will not allow that to 13 I know you had expressed several concerns 14 that, that I personally sitting here with, with Jim for 15 the last couple of days have, have shared your concerns with to include the safety of your -- of the children. 16 17 And I, I think you saw this morning on the press 18 conference that the kids -- there was some suggestion 19 in the media that the kids had been sent out to, to foster homes. Totally, totally inaccurate. And we 20 have prepared for you a, a videotape that will, will 21 22 show you, you know, in color -- living color that that 23 is not the case at all.

MR. KORESH: Well --

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DICK: These kids are being, being treated well and we will not allow anything to happen to those

1 | children. We treat, we treat them like our own.

MR. KORESH: Well, the statement was is that it was a planning in the social workers to locate them to foster homes.

DICK: Well --

MR. KORESH: See, that was the actual statement. In other words -- now, I, I know these ladies down here, you know, I know Mrs. Koon and -- DICK: You have some differences with them I understand.

MR. KORESH: Well no, wait a minute. My -like, like my, my position is is that when we had them
evaluate us, you know, I mean and it comes to the point
to where I could become very picky in that well, first
of all I don't believe that a fat lady that sits on her
butt all day long and over eats is really a very good
mother. Now, if she has a problem to where, you know,
you know, she -- thyroid or something like that, you
know, she cannot help but to gain that weight then a, a
fat mama is a fat mama. But, you know, what I'm saying
is --

DICK: (Laughter)

MR. KORESH: -- what I'm saying is a woman that is fat and working all day in, in an institution that is always putting feminine tendencies above reason, you know, is not really --

1 David, I couldn't agree --DICK: 2 MR. KORESH: -- is not really a social work. 3 Now, they --4 DICK: I couldn't agree with you more, 5 couldn't agree with you more. б MR. KORESH: Now --7 DICK: We want to ensure that that does not 8 happen. We -- you know, all of us I think hear of 9 instances where, you know, where kids are, are sent to 10 foster homes with little regard about anything more 11 than this is a place to put the children. We're not 12 going to let that happen. This is not going to happen. 13 MR. KORESH: What's going on? 14 I'm sorry. You listening to somebody 15 in the background? 16 MR. KORESH: Well, it's just, just some 17 little commotion took place and --18 DICK: Okay. 19 MR. KORESH: -- I've got, I've got to hold 20 these people down as --21 DICK: Well --22 MR. KORESH: -- much as can -- I can. 23 DICK: Well, I know yesterday when you were 24 talking to Jim I took it upon myself to, to ensure that 25 some of these things got done because I can hear the concern in your voice, as a father I hear that concern

in your voice. And, and not only in your voice but the 1 2 other parents out there are equally concerned. 3 MR. KORESH: Well, what I was -- what was breaking Jim down was is that like I say, you know, I 4 5 commended Jim for, for his expertise, you know, but the thing of it is is that, you know, as you all are saying 6 7 one thing to me I, I had to get a little strong with 8 Jim yesterday. And I had to point blank say, you know, 9 now Jim, you are a liar. Now, here's the deal. 10 original, the original program was is that Jim had 11 confirmed and promised that the -- these little, these 12 little tanks and stuff were going to stay on the 13 perimeter of the property. Now, as they -- as, as they 14 all have been saying one thing we have been observing 15 and watching something totally opposite, of course 16 which you all keep saying it's not so which 17 idealistically shows us the fallibility of your ability 18 to, to perceive and know what's going on out here. 19 Now --20 DICK: Could I tell --21 MR. KORESH: -- I kept saying --22 DICK: -- could I tell you something in 23 confidence, David? 24 MR. KORESH: Go ahead. 25 In confidence? You know, we here are trying to do the very best we can and there are a

1 | number of different agencies that we're dealing with.

MR. KORESH: I understand that.

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And you and I both know, let me continue just a second. We all know that sometimes tactical people, you know, they, they like to drive their -- they like to put on their, their gear, they like to jump out of helicopters and they like to do those kinds of things, they like to drive around those little tanks and they're -- you know, they're young, they're not a little older and mature that I -- as you and I are perhaps. A certain amount of that -- it's like kids -- your kids going outside over there and doing some things perhaps that you don't necessarily agree on but you say hey, these are young kids, they've got to live their life like you and I did. Some of these folks driving those tanks, you know, this may be the only opportunity they ever have to drive one of those Bradleys and boy, I want to get that Bradley up and down the road and, you know, they, they get, they get impatient, they get, they get excited: hey here's my chance, let me push this vehicle, let's, let's see what this baby will do. It's like -- if I can draw an analogy like, you know, those Camaros that you have out I used to have a Camaro years ago and loved it, little Mustang, same way. Hey, this is just another vehicle for them to drive to shift a few gears and, and

probably they don't have a lot of expertise. 1 2 MR. KORESH: What's your name, Mike? 3 DICK: Dick. MR. KORESH: Dick, okay. 4 5 DICK: Yeah, Dick. Dick, let me interrupt you real 6 MR. KORESH: 7 quick. 8 DICK: Okay. 9 MR. KORESH: These, these young men 10 I'm sure feel very confident in their little vehicles, 11 you know? The, the tactical force, the ATF, says they, 12 they prepared eight months for this. 13 DICK: Um-hum. 14 MR. KORESH: Well, we prepared ever since 15 1985, okay? Now, what I was trying to tell Jim in all earnestness and in all passion is that when this little 16 tank keeps coming around back here it's going to get 17 18 blown to pieces. Now, that's what I was trying to tell 19 him honestly. You see, that thing -- that Bradley, we know the specs and everything on that little tank with 20 2.1 the 25 mm gun and everything and along with, along with 2.2 Henry -- I kept trying to explain to Henry that when 23 such a vehicle, you know, comes in -- onto our 24 perimeter and crushes over a building that had stored 25 someone else's belongings not associated to this organization and then goes and tears the camper shell

out at the front of the property, runs over these 2 buildings and then has the audacity to run right beside our gymnasium right here and, and stand approximately 3 45 -- well, not even that much, 75 -- let's say 75 4 feet, you know, behind us, whoever those kids are they 5 are subject to be fired upon. And in being fired upon, б 7 they're not going to be hit with no 50 caliber. know, we --8 9 DICK: Well, that's why we tried --10 MR. KORESH: -- understand that if it be, if 11 it be (indiscernible) load or whether it be armor-12 piercing, that there's only four or five fatal points 13 on that armored vehicle. But, but what they are going to be hit with is not a 50 caliber. Now, if, if --14 15 DICK: David, you've got our assurances that 16 nothing is going to happen --17 MR. KORESH: Well now, let me explain to you. 18 That was in my good favor, you see, because I explained 19 to Jim because I love, I love you individuals and you 20 do not understand what you're dealing with and I 21 understand that. You see, you do not understand the 22 importance of where my communication comes from, you 23 know? You do not understand how I labored for the past 24 month and a half with the ATF agents across the street. 25 Very few people understand where I'm coming from and

this is why I will spend the time on the phone with you

or anybody else that's willing to reason together with Because see, I'm being, I'm being blockaded from the public which that's all right too because what was done the other day is sufficient for every honest person in this nation to be able to say now, okay, everything aside what did that guy teach the other day? Let's see, he teached something about Jesus not being believed on in his day, huh? And he teached something about a revelation of Jesus Christ God gave him, let's see, God on a white horse and something about a mystery of God when there's time no longer, about seven thunders that the prophets know about. And that guy went back to what, Psalms 45 after showing us about the Key of David, something about the Key of David that unlocks something to do with David. Yeah, David did write the Psalms. Now, what does that Psalm 45 say? Oh, well, that -- yeah, that's right, that is the same as the first seal, oh, and that is the same as Revelation 19, the marriage of the Lamb, blessed are those that are called to the marriage supper of the Well, I don't see -- that, that sounds right -that's right there in the Bible, that's in harmony. Well, individuals right now as we speak that are, you know, looking into these things and becoming honest; it doesn't make no difference what they think about me as a person because it's a (indiscernible) and a snare,

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you see? 1 2 DICK: Um-hum. MR. KORESH: When Jeremiah the prophet of old 3 who tried to warn Israel about the pending doom of 4 5 Judea through Babylonian armies they laughed at him and they mocked at him but finally Babylon did overthrow 6 7 Judea. 8 DICK: Well, David, there, there -- you know, 9 we're certainly not laughing or mocking anybody here. T'm --10 11 Well, I understand. MR. KORESH: 12 DICK: I'm very willing to listen to you and 13 I'm trying to work with you to try to get some of these 14 things done. I understand that you asked Henry last 15 night for a suture kit. And we have, we have that and we should have available very, very shortly. 16 17 MR. KORESH: Okay. Well, I appreciate that. 18 DICK: In addition to that we, in addition to that we've got photos and, and tape for you on the 19 20 kids. 21 MR. KORESH: Well, we was asking, asking for 22 the milk if at al possible. 23 DICK: And, and we're going -- you know, let me -- you know, I tried to explain this a little bit to 24 25 Steve. Can you, can you give a couple minutes of your

time to listen to this?

MR. KORESH: Sure, sure.

2 I'm here to help you in any fashion I 3 can and, you know, if it were just you and I, I'd have that -- I'd be -- you know, as I told Steve I'd be 4 riding down the lane now with milk. But I have to --5 you know, I have to send that up and decisions 6 7 sometimes in other areas are made by other people. 8 and I can work together, I have absolutely no question 9 in my mind about that, and I -- and you've got my word 10 that I'm dealing with this issues and -- with that 11 issue and, and I have dealt with the other issues. 12 I've, I've gone out on my own yesterday based on what, 13 you know, your request to Jim was and I, and I went up. I said, listen, let's get this done for this -- for, 14 15 for these folks out here and in turn they, they 16 considered these things and, and they said let's get 17 this suture kit in and the photos, obviously all of us 18 are concerned about the kids, we have the photos for 19 you and we're going to get that in to you and, and it's 20 not going to be much longer before, before those are 21 available. But you know what, my experience in dealing with some of the, some of the bosses is such that --22 23 again, this is in confidence just the two of us here, 24 we need to go to them and say listen, boss, I mean, you 25 know, they've been in the Bureau longer than I have and they expect certain things of me. And sometimes they

don't understand as well as, as I do what it is to deal 1 2 with, with folks like this because it's been a long 3 time since they've been out there, you know, they, they desire to do other things, I've always had aspirations 4 5 of dealing with people all the time. And they 6 always -- they want something. I said, hey, David, 7 make me look good, make me look good to these people or help me out, I can do these things for you and I have 8 9 done them for you and we'll, we'll have that shortly. How do you want to do -- pick up out at the same point 10 out there? 11 12 Yeah, right out at the front. MR. KORESH: 13 We'll send a girl out there to pick it up. 14 DICK: Okay. Can you do something for me? 15 What is it? MR. KORESH: 16 DICK: Well, can you, can you, can you help 17 me out with -- make me look good up front up there? 18 MR. KORESH: Well, here's another thing. 19 made Jim look real good but as he continued to lie to me and lie to me, remember, what you do not see is more 20 21 dangerous to you than what you do see. 22 DICK: Well --23 MR. KORESH: Now, what -- now, let me -- hear 24 what I'm saying because see, with your mode of 25 communication you've already changed the subject on me three times.

Christ is an unseen thing. All we can see 22 is what men have said based in a book. And that's the 23 truth isn't it? Isn't it, Dick? Isn't that the truth? 24 DICK: It is the truth. I, I --25 It is the truth. And so --MR. KORESH: DICK: It is the truth. But you've --

1 MR. KORESH: -- people say -2 DICK: -- got a gift to be able to get that, that truth out to people. 3 4 MR. KORESH: Well --5 I don't think anybody would argue 6 that. 7 MR. KORESH: This is from the bureau, the social workers, okay? 3 This is not -- see, your organization, the FBI, is not in position to deal with 4 5 child-care custody. 6 DICK: Absolutely. 7 MR. KORESH: Okav. That is a separate bureau 8 altogether with a separate expertise. 9 DICK: Right. 10 MR. KORESH: Now, the reports from that 11 expertise is that the children are extremely abnormal 12 in the respect that after a dramatic experience they're 13 very pliable, they're very decent, they're very obedient and it's just not normal. Well now, there may 14 15 be a reason why our children are so well-behaved in regards to the way of their, their upbringing. 16 17 DICK: Um-hum. 18 MR. KORESH: You will observe that our 19 children are not beaten, they do not have, you know, 20 marks of cruelty and bruises over them, they're not 2.1 beaten into subjection. But there is a statement in 22 scripture regarding to a man Abraham in which God says, 23 you know, shall we hide anything from Abraham seeing 24 that he's the heir of all things and he will direct his children after him? There's a terrible statement in 25

the carnal world, a statement that is used by a lot of

1 fathers to their sons saying, "Don't do as I do, do as 2 I say." Now, that, that's hypocritical. Okay. children, as I say, that see a unity of mind and a 3 maturity of purpose they will not only see but they 4 will be influenced and learn how this principle works. 5 First of all, all of our children see that any 6 7 association we have with one another or with anybody else that comes we're very hospitable, very pliable --8 9 DICK: Um-hum. 10 MR. KORESH: -- very agreeable, and then in the projection of truth these children have seen it in 11 12 studies, they have seen it in illustrations and they 13 have been able to understand and discern to a large 14 degree what direction we as a people are going. 15 Another thing is is that in scripture in the testament 16 of the Bible of which men say in this country they believe, there are children spoken of in prophecy that 17 18 are the direct product of a truth or a doctrine which 19 comes from heaven. Now, not all the children that you 20 have there have been with us for very long. 21 DICK: Um-hum. Varying degrees. 22 MR. KORESH: Some of those children, you 23 know, are just fresh baked out of the good old system, you know? But the thing of it is is that they, 24 25 children, learn faster from children than they do from

KORESH: I had a father that made me fly 19 like a kite when I got mine. And I had a father that 20 because I was a, a student like with dyslexia, learning 21 -- a learning disability, you know, I mean I didn't 22 know my alphabet until the third grade. 23 Well, you sure overcame that if that 24 was a problem. 25 MR. KORESH: And he -- well, this all, this all took place in 1985.

DICK: Um-hum. MR. KORESH: I used to, I used to stutter quite a bit. I had a speech problem and stuff. DICK: Um-hum. MR. KORESH: But in 1985 that was all taken care of for me. But here's the thing. My dad, I'm telling you, he, he used to grab me by the arm and he, he, he spanked me with bailing wire, he spanked me with sticks, he spanked me with what --(End Tape 53.)
