2           DAVID: -- his covenant and return to his own  
3 land. Okay? At the time appointed he should return,  
4 come towards the south, but it shall not be as the  
5 former, or as the latter. For the ships of Chittim,  
6 whatever they are, shall come against him; therefore he  
7 shall be grieved, and return, and have indignation  
8 against the holy covenant.

9           JOHN: Covenant.

10           DAVID: So shall he due; he shall even  
11 return, have intelligence with them that forsake the  
12 holy covenant. So he has to go around and understand  
13 dark senses. Now he has to go around and find those  
14 people that once had a chance to know it but turned  
15 away from it. Okay?

16           Like for instance you know that I have  
17 certain students that I taught a period of time, and  
18 all of a sudden they say I'm wrong. But yet they never  
19 teach people what I teach though. Huh.

20           So he has this intelligence, and then what  
21 did he do? He collects arms. Arms shall stand on his  
22 part, and they shall pollute the sanctuary of strength,  
23 and shall take away the daily, and they shall place the  
24 abomination that maketh desolate.

25           Now what does he use? He uses arms doesn't  
he?

1 JOHN: Um-hum.

2 DAVID: What are arms? Weapons, right? Now  
3 they go to pollute the sanctuary of strength to take  
4 away the daily. We learned about that earlier, didn't  
5 we?

6 Verse 32. And such as do wickedly against  
7 the covenant shall be corrupt by flatteries. In other  
8 words, all those that go against this covenant,  
9 whatever it is, he'll say good boy. Good boy. But the  
10 people that do know their God shall be strong, and do  
11 exploits.

12 They that understand among the people shall  
13 instruct many; yet they shall fall by the sword, by  
14 flame, and by captivity, and by spoil, many days. Now  
15 when they shall fall, they shall be (indiscernible)  
16 with a little help: but many shall cleave to them with  
17 flatteries. Okay?

18 Now it says over here in verse 36. And the  
19 king shall do according to his will; he shall exalt  
20 himself, and magnify himself above every god. He shall  
21 speak marvelous things against the God of gods, and  
22 shall prosper till the indignation be accomplished:  
23 for that that is determined shall be done.

24 Neither shall regard the God of his fathers,  
25 nor the desire of women. What's -- who's the desire of  
women? We know Psalms 45, the Lamb, hearken, O

1 daughter, consider? What girl would not want to marry  
2 the Lamb, right? Or any God. For he shall magnify  
3 himself above all.

4 But in his estate he shall honour the God of  
5 forces. That's military. And a god whom his fathers  
6 knew not shall he honour with gold, silver, and with  
7 precious stones, and pleasant things. Thus shall he do  
8 in the most strong holds. You know, strong, fortified,  
9 military. With a strange god, whom we shall  
10 acknowledge and increase with glory: he shall cause  
11 them to rule over many, and shall divide the land for  
12 gain.

13 Okay. Now what does it mean over here when  
14 it says verses 43. He shall have power over the  
15 treasures of gold and of silver. Pretty nice, isn't  
16 it?

17 JOHN: Um-hum.

18 DAVID: And of all the precious things of  
19 Egypt; and the Libyans and Ethiopians shall be at his  
20 steps. But all of sudden, but tidings out of the east  
21 and out of the north shall trouble him. Isaiah says  
22 I've raised up one from the north, and he shall come  
23 from the rise in the sun. I bet that guy's going to  
24 rise up and give a message that's going to trouble this  
25 guy. Therefore he shall go forth with great fury to  
destroy, and utterly to make away many. He shall plant

1 the tabernacles of his palace between the seas in the  
2 glorious holy mountain.

3           On Mount Zion, what sits on Mount Zion right  
4 now, do you know?

5           JOHN: Tabernacle.

6           DAVID: What kind? A Catholic church, right?

7           JOHN: Okay.

8           DAVID: And he shall come to his end, and  
9 none shall help him. Why? So that time shall Michael  
10 stand up. He's sitting down, you know. The great  
11 prince which standeth for the children of thy people:  
12 and there shall be a time of trouble, such as never was  
13 since there was a nation even to that time.

14           You know, the father, the father kicked some  
15 butt like you never heard. Habakkuk says I'll execute  
16 judgment and vengeance on the heathens as they've never  
17 heard. That's what Micah says. Okay? And at that  
18 time thy people shall be delivered, everyone is found  
19 written in the what? In the book, right?

20           JOHN: Um-hum.

21           DAVID: What book? Well, when I come with my  
22 reward to give to every man according as his word shall  
23 be, well, we're doing the work. And you're written in  
24 the book. Because you're working according to the will  
25 of the Lamb. The seven seals. And many of them that  
sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake, some to

1 everlasting life, and some to everlasting shame and  
2 everlasting contempt. You know what contempt of court  
3 is, don't you?

4 JOHN: Sure do.

5 DAVID: It's when you're out of rule, when  
6 you're out of order, right? In my Father's court,  
7 there's seven seals. And there are those who in the  
8 days of the prophets wouldn't hear them, and there are  
9 those in the days of the prophets who will not learn  
10 them. And they that be wise shall shine as the  
11 brightness of the firmament.

12 Remember their faces shall be as flames?  
13 Remember that? You learned in Isaiah 13? And they  
14 that turn many to righteousness as the stars for ever  
15 and ever. But thou, O Daniel, shut up the words, and  
16 seal the book, even to the time of the end. Which the  
17 book is now open. I could teach it to you in more  
18 detail if you wanted to come out here and learn it.

19 Many shall run to and fro, and knowledge  
20 shall be increased. Hebrews says great knowledge shall  
21 be increased. We're in that time right now.

22 Then I Daniel looked, and, behold, there  
23 stood other two, the one upon this side of the bank of  
24 the river, the other side of the bank of the river.  
25 Okay. And one said to the man clothed in linen, which  
was on the waters of the river, How long shall it be to



1 | the end of these wonders? And I heard the man clothed  
2 | in linen, which was upon the waters of the river, when  
3 | he held up his right hand and left hand to heaven, and  
4 | sware by him that liveth for ever and ever which is the  
5 | Father. It shall be for a time, times, and a half.

6 |           We learned about that before, haven't we?  
7 | Revelation told us about it, Daniel tells us about it  
8 | and it's repeated again. And when he, that is the king  
9 | of the north, whoever he is, shall have accomplished to  
10 | scatter the power of the holy people, which is being  
11 | done right now, all these things shall be finished.

12 |           And I heard, but I understood not, Daniel  
13 | says. Then said I, O my Lord, what shall be the end of  
14 | these things? And he says, Go they way, Daniel: for  
15 | the words are closed up and sealed. Until what time?  
16 | Until the time of the what? End.

17 |           Now remember earlier I already showed you  
18 | that whatever Daniel 11 and 12 teaches us remember it  
19 | must be noted in the scripture of truth. So we've got  
20 | to harmonize Isaiah. We've got to harmonize Micah,  
21 | Hosea, Obadiah, Zephaniah with this book perfectly,  
22 | right? To get the full picture.

23 |           But we know one thing. That during this time  
24 | many shall be purified, and made white, and tried; but  
25 | the wicked shall do wickedly. And how many? None of  
   | the wicked shall what?

1 JOHN: Understand.

2 DAVID: But the wise shall what?

3 JOHN: Understand.

4 DAVID: And from the time that the daily  
5 shall be taken away, and the abomination that maketh  
6 desolate set up, there shall be a thousand two hundred  
7 and ninety days.

8 Blessed is he that waiteth, and cometh to the  
9 thousand three hundred five and thirty days. 1,335  
10 days. But go thou thy way till the end be: for thou  
11 shalt rest, Daniel, and stand in they lot at the end of  
12 the days.

13 How would you like Daniel and all the  
14 prophets to be raised up from the graves, John? Would  
15 you like to meet them?

16 JOHN: Wouldn't you?

17 DAVID: Oh, I'm going to. Again. I have  
18 before. And I will again. But would you want them to  
19 come?

20 JOHN: Well, I'd just, I'd just like to meet  
21 them once.

22 DAVID: Well, that's fine.

23 JOHN: Uh-huh.

24 DAVID: But you --

25 JOHN: And I'm sure I will.

DAVID: But you don't want them to come and

1 | beat your rear end, do you?

2 |           JOHN: Well, they're, they're not saying  
3 | they're going to necessarily beat mine in particular,  
4 | did they?

5 |           DAVID: Well, the thing of it is this.

6 |           JOHN: Huh?

7 |           DAVID: The thing of it is this. When you  
8 | reject the one that they foretell.

9 |           JOHN: Yes.

10 |           DAVID: The prince of the covenant, then  
11 | you're rejecting them. It's kind of a family thing,  
12 | you know?

13 |           JOHN: Yeah, and again we're talking  
14 | interpretation.

15 |           DAVID: Yeah.

16 |           JOHN: Yeah. Hey, just remember. When you  
17 | come out, you'll have the opportunity to teach many,  
18 | won't you?

19 |           DAVID: A lot.

20 |           JOHN: Huh?

21 |           DAVID: A lot.

22 |           JOHN: Have you given any thought to, to what  
23 | we discussed about sending your word out to the media  
24 | and trying to straighten them out a little bit?

25 |           DAVID: Well, like I said, the, the options  
that you've given me is that I make a tape --

1 JOHN: Well, I don't, I don't want you to, to  
2 think the options are that as restricted as you  
3 initially heard them.

4 DAVID: Look, John.

5 JOHN: Go ahead.

6 DAVID: This message is going to be --

7 JOHN: Um-hum.

8 DAVID: -- enlightened to the whole world.  
9 Honestly. Believe me.

10 JOHN: Um-hum.

11 DAVID: I do not mind coming out to you. I'm  
12 ready to come out to you.

13 JOHN: Oh, I'd love to sit down and talk to  
14 you.

15 DAVID: The thing of it is, though, John, is  
16 that my Father tells me to wait. And I cannot go  
17 beyond his commandment.

18 JOHN: Okay.

19 DAVID: I love him. And I'm (indiscernible).

20 JOHN: Then wait.

21 DAVID: It may not be that long.

22 JOHN: Hey.

23 DAVID: And the people here are being  
24 tried --

25 JOHN: If you have to wait --

DAVID: Look. The people here are being

1 | tried, too.

2 |           JOHN: Uh-huh.

3 |           DAVID: They believe on God by the word that  
4 | I've shown them.

5 |           JOHN: Are the --

6 |           DAVID: They're, and they're being tried --

7 |           JOHN: -- are those little children being  
8 | tried in there too?

9 |           DAVID: The little children --

10 |          JOHN: Huh?

11 |          DAVID: -- are my children.

12 |          JOHN: Well, they're all your children.

13 |          DAVID: That's true too. But these are my  
14 | biological children.

15 |          JOHN: And we are all God's children.

16 |          DAVID: To a degree.

17 |          JOHN: Well, what degree?

18 |          DAVID: Some greater than others.

19 |          JOHN: Well, I'm not going to --

20 |          DAVID: He that is of God --

21 |          JOHN: -- I'm not going to dispute that one.

22 |          DAVID: He that, he that is of God hears  
23 | God's word. Now the more you learn of God's word, the  
24 | more you're going to think about this.

25 |          JOHN: Uh-huh. But I mean you're saying that  
all of those people in there including the children,

1 right?

2 DAVID: Right.

3 JOHN: Well, what about the children that,  
4 that you let come out?

5 DAVID: Well, those children are safe, aren't  
6 they? Didn't you promise me that?

7 JOHN: Well, they're all safe, aren't they?

8 DAVID: Oh, John, you're funny.

9 JOHN: Hey. Son of a gun. I'd love to sit  
10 down with you.

11 DAVID: Well, we're -- you're sitting down.  
12 I'm --

13 JOHN: And I know we will, huh?

14 DAVID: -- I'm laying down. I plan on it,  
15 John.

16 JOHN: No, you're lying down.

17 DAVID: I'm lying down now.

18 JOHN: Huh?

19 DAVID: I'm lying down. Yeah, I'm in a --  
20 this is one of my most prone positions these days.

21 JOHN: Well --

22 DAVID: Hopefully I'm going to be able to  
23 walk out of here. Because like I say --

24 JOHN: I know you will.

25 DAVID: -- the Father's been -- the Father's  
healing me quite well. The, the holes are -- I'm going

1 to take a picture and show this to you so you can take  
2 a look at it.

3 JOHN: Hey, will you?

4 DAVID: I will.

5 JOHN: You got a camera in there?

6 DAVID: You bet.

7 JOHN: You got a Instamatic?

8 DAVID: Steve.

9 JOHN: Huh?

10 DAVID: Steve?

11 JOHN: Oh, don't wake him up.

12 DAVID: Okay. Wait a minute. All right.

13 JOHN: Listen, I --

14 DAVID: Yeah, it's just I know we've got  
15 one --

16 JOHN: -- I didn't ring that phone last  
17 night. I let you sleep all night.

18 DAVID: Yeah, I'll show you these holes so  
19 you can see what you think about it.

20 JOHN: Let me, let me ask you something now.

21 DAVID: Go ahead.

22 JOHN: You know, initially I guess what, this  
23 afternoon, this afternoon -- I look track of days,  
24 right? Yesterday afternoon, yesterday morning when you  
25 were talking to Dick or Steve was talking to Dick. I  
guess you were -- both of you talked to him, huh? And

1 they made that proposition and, and basically you felt  
2 that was kind of an unwieldy proposition.

3 And the one that I gave you some food for  
4 thought, to make a tape and to correct any, any errors  
5 that you think have been made or assertions that have  
6 been made by the media and give it some thought. And  
7 I'm not talking about a lengthy, lengthy tape, but a  
8 15-minute tape to refute some comments that they may  
9 have made.

10 And if you release some of those youngsters  
11 out of there, we will play the tape. But you send the  
12 tape out, we'll listen to the tape. Then you send the  
13 youngsters out, the tape gets played. And, and send a  
14 picture out. Because I'd like to see a picture. You  
15 don't want one of me in return, I know. But send a  
16 picture out.

17 DAVID: You never met my babies, have you?

18 JOHN: No, I haven't. But I'd love to. I've  
19 met some of these other youngsters that came out. And  
20 I tell you the one that was, the one that, you know, I  
21 guess I felt warmest about was Jamie.

22 DAVID: Oh, yeah. (Indiscernible) medical --

23 JOHN: But I have a reason for that. I've  
24 got a goddaughter that's got Down's Syndrome. And I've  
25 got a reason for that.

DAVID: Right.



1           JOHN: And you love them even more, don't  
2 you?

3           DAVID: (Indiscernible). Oh, you bet.

4           JOHN: Huh? They need a lot of love.

5           DAVID: And we figured that, you know, you  
6 all weren't going to give us the milk like you promised  
7 and stuff like that. And so, you know, he needs, he  
8 needs a lot of special care that, you know --

9           JOHN: He's getting that special care too. I  
10 just wish I could give it to him myself. You probably  
11 do too, don't you?

12          DAVID: It will be done.

13          JOHN: Well, why don't you give it some  
14 thought? I mean don't totally reject the, the ability  
15 to play a tape. Because you're going to, you're going  
16 to watch TV in the morning or CNN during the night or  
17 whatever. And you're going to hear everybody's got  
18 their ideas. And everybody's got their theories. And  
19 everybody's got their speculation. And you know and I  
20 know it's a bunch of nonsense.

21                Because you know how it's going to work out,  
22 and I know how it's going to work out. You're going to  
23 walk out of there. You're going to lead those people  
24 out of there. And you're going to do the right thing.

25          DAVID: Always.

             JOHN: Then you're, then you're going to let

1 | some other people listen to your word. And I'll tell  
2 | you if you come out of there, you can meet the press.  
3 | You can sit down with the press. And if there's  
4 | someone in particular that you want to meet you when  
5 | you come out of there, all you got to do is name them.  
6 | They'll be there.

7 |           And if you want me to meet you when you come  
8 | out of there, I might be the last person you want to  
9 | meet. But I'd love to meet you coming out of there.

10 |           DAVID: Well, John --

11 |           JOHN: And greet you.

12 |           DAVID: -- just don't be too hard.

13 |           JOHN: What?

14 |           DAVID: Just remember, whoever falls on this  
15 | rock shall be broken, right? Whoever this rock falls  
16 | on shall be ground to powder.

17 |           JOHN: Uh-huh.

18 |           DAVID: Now think what that means.

19 |           JOHN: You going to philosophize me right  
20 | into the, into the evening, huh?

21 |           DAVID: No. What I'm going to say is I'm  
22 | going to say that learn about that little red horse in  
23 | Zechariah. It says those prophets are wrong. You have  
24 | nothing to worry about. Those prophets are right.

25 |           JOHN: What about planting the, the seed of  
the seven seals on a tape?

1           DAVID: Well, the thing of it is --

2           JOHN: Huh?

3           DAVID: -- is remember I'm sitting here --

4           JOHN: And I know you'd rather discuss it in  
5 person, wouldn't you?

6           DAVID: I'm sitting here jabbering all over  
7 the place.

8           JOHN: Uh-huh.

9           DAVID: And I'm working with you right now.  
10 And I'm telling you --

11          JOHN: Boy, it's not easy either, is it?

12          DAVID: Oh, sure it is.

13          JOHN: No.

14          DAVID: Sure it is. Because remember, the  
15 last laugh and the last laugh that's laughed.

16          JOHN: Well, they also say he who laughs last  
17 is an ass for not have laughing sooner too, didn't  
18 they?

19          DAVID: Well, there's the whole thing, isn't  
20 it?

21          JOHN: Uh-huh.

22          DAVID: So in Isaiah 11 when that prophet  
23 goes ahead says that there shall come forth a rod out  
24 of the stump of Jesse, you know, and his Branch shall  
25 bear fruit. It shall be the spirit of knowledge and  
wisdom and understanding and the fear of the Lord.

1 JOHN: Uh-huh.

2 DAVID: Make him of quick understanding,  
3 smite the earth with the rod of his mouth. Remember  
4 with the breath of his lips he slays the wicked. What  
5 he promises, what he says of God is going to come to  
6 pass. So when those people say aha, aha --

7 JOHN: Um-hum.

8 DAVID: -- even in their heart, that's all  
9 right. He can laugh too.

10 JOHN: Well, so much, so much of this is  
11 perception. You know, when I tell you I want to meet  
12 you when you come out of there, I'm not lying to you.  
13 I want to meet you.

14 DAVID: I'll meet you.

15 JOHN: I'll sit down and talk to you. Or I  
16 wouldn't be sitting here talking to you on the phone.  
17 You know, nobody's making me do this. Nobody's forcing  
18 me to do this. You know, I, I want to do it. And, and  
19 I want to see everything work out in a peaceful manner  
20 for all of us.

21 DAVID: I love peace, John.

22 JOHN: And you do too. I know that. Don't  
23 you?

24 DAVID: I know that.

25 JOHN: Huh?

DAVID: I know that.

1           JOHN: Why don't you give some thought to  
2 putting together a tape. And, and you watch the news.  
3 You hear what's on the news. And you hear people  
4 saying things. And if they're not true, clarify them.  
5 You know, you can do that.

6           DAVID: Why don't you give me a live?

7           JOHN: You know that's not going happen,  
8 don't you.

9           DAVID: Why?

10          JOHN: Huh?

11          DAVID: Why not?

12          JOHN: It's not going to happen. It's --

13          DAVID: Why not?

14          JOHN: -- as simple as that.

15          DAVID: Oh, that's where you get real big and  
16 tough, right?

17          JOHN: No. I'm not being big and tough. I'm  
18 just telling you that some things are very matter of  
19 fact. And that's not going to happen.

20          DAVID: Oh, okay.

21          JOHN: And I'm not saying I'm playing --

22          DAVID: Well, talk to you later, John.

23          JOHN: Hey.

24          DAVID: (Laughing.)

25          JOHN: Uh-huh.

          DAVID: Oh, boy. You think I'm laughing.

1 JOHN: Now, now don't --

2 DAVID: You think, you think I'm laughing,  
3 John. If you, if you knew --

4 JOHN: Don't go, don't go away mad, now.

5 DAVID: No, I'm not. If you knew in Psalms 2  
6 who's really laughing. I mean, you know, you guys like  
7 I say.

8 JOHN: Uh-huh.

9 DAVID: Since the foundation of the world  
10 there's a certain group of people that never learn.

11 JOHN: I'm one of those?

12 DAVID: John, let's hope not.

13 JOHN: Well, I hope not.

14 DAVID: That's your decision, okay?

15 JOHN: I hope not. Now don't be kicking  
16 Steve and waking him up now, huh?

17 DAVID: I'm not going to kick Steve.

18 JOHN: You were going to.

19 DAVID: He gave me, he gave me a, he gave  
20 me --

21 JOHN: You --

22 DAVID: -- let me tell you, he'd have been a  
23 great guy. He gave me a working over when I first  
24 tried to teach him.

25 JOHN: That's what he said.

DAVID: Then he --

1           JOHN: He said he was not your easiest  
2 student.

3           DAVID: Well, he had such a good position  
4 though being a teacher of comparative religion and all  
5 that.

6           JOHN: Uh-huh.

7           DAVID: Men look up to one of those --

8           JOHN: Where, where did he teach?

9           DAVID: Some place in Hawaii.

10          JOHN: Boy, he did give up a lot, didn't he?

11          DAVID: Well, a lot of people did, you know.

12          JOHN: Uh-huh.

13          DAVID: A lot of people gave up jobs making,  
14 you know, 100, 200,000 a year.

15          JOHN: Really.

16          DAVID: Six million a year, yeah.

17          JOHN: Uh-huh.

18          DAVID: But you know, the thing of it was is  
19 like I say they -- I used to freak them out, because I  
20 would tell them to turn their money and stuff over to  
21 somebody else. Hey.

22          JOHN: Um-hum.

23          DAVID: But the truth will always win.

24          JOHN: Always wins in the end, doesn't it?

25          DAVID: Always.

          JOHN: Uh-huh.

1           DAVID: Okie doke.

2           JOHN: You -- hey, you going to let me speak  
3 to some of those girls in the morning that --

4           DAVID: Any person you --

5           JOHN: -- that the relatives calls?

6           DAVID: Any person you want to talk to you  
7 may talk to them freely here. Anyone.

8           JOHN: Well, I, I asked last night I asked --  
9 I'm not talking about this night. Last night, 24 hours  
10 ago, I asked Steve, and I gave him the names of the  
11 family members that called in and the names of the  
12 people. And I got to speak to, to Lisa, and I got to  
13 speak to Rita. But neither one of those were on the  
14 list that I gave him.

15          DAVID: Well, what are some of the names  
16 then? Run them by me.

17          JOHN: Okay. Belinda Gaynum (phonetic sp.)  
18 called about David Thibodeaux (phonetic sp.).

19          DAVID: Okay. He's here.

20          JOHN: And Lonnie Little called about Jeff  
21 Little.

22          DAVID: He's here.

23          JOHN: And Ursula Gurman (phonetic sp.)  
24 called about --

25          DAVID: Marguerita.

          JOHN: -- Marguerita Vega.



1               DAVID: Yeah, she's here.

2               JOHN: Then of course we had someone call  
3 about Ms. Madsen (phonetic sp.) who is out already.  
4 And --

5               DAVID: Was that her daughters that called  
6 or --

7               JOHN: Diana McClintock's. Yes. Her --

8               DAVID: Yeah, okay. Okay.

9               JOHN: -- one of, one of her daughters or her  
10 daughter, whomever, yeah, called about her mom. And I  
11 don't know if it was Mr. or Mrs. Mosher called about  
12 Sherri Jewell but their daughter.

13              DAVID: Okay.

14              JOHN: And Mary Jane Borst' son called.  
15 And --

16              DAVID: Wait, wait a second, now.

17              JOHN: Mary Jean Borst.

18              DAVID: Okay, Mary Jean, yeah.

19              JOHN: And then --

20              DAVID: That's Brad. Brad? Yeah, he called,  
21 right? Brad Borst?

22              JOHN: No.

23              DAVID: No? Must be the other older ones.  
24 Okay. Go ahead.

25              JOHN: And what do you have, Greem, Graeham  
Leonard Craddock. Okay.

1           DAVID: Yeah, he's here.

2           JOHN: Yeah. He had a family member call for  
3 him. Douglas Wayne Martin, Sheila Martin, they had  
4 several people call to see how they're doing.

5           DAVID: Uh-huh. Now that family is all  
6 Harvard graduate family is a graduate of the --

7           JOHN: Uh-huh.

8           DAVID: -- all honors at Harvard, and they're  
9 doctors and lawyers and all that. I imagine they get a  
10 lot of calls.

11          JOHN: Well, his parents aren't, aren't  
12 lawyers, just hardworking folks.

13          DAVID: No, no, no, no. They're not lawyers.  
14 But --

15          JOHN: Yeah.

16          DAVID: -- in the ministry, ministers.

17          JOHN: Uh-huh. And then Paul Fatta and  
18 Colani (phonetic sp.) Fatta had some people call.

19          DAVID: Uh-huh.

20          JOHN: You know, so I would just -- like I  
21 told Steve I said hey, why don't you -- and I told him  
22 Friday night, you know, not Saturday night. I said why  
23 don't you let me say hi to these people and just let  
24 them know that their loved ones are calling and  
25 expressing an interest about their welfare, and he said  
sure, I'll take care of that.

1           DAVID: Well, give us a ring in the morning  
2 and let's let these people, let them talk to you.

3           JOHN: You going to, you going to be able to  
4 handle that?

5           DAVID: Why not?

6           JOHN: Well, okay. Well, I'm just asking,  
7 because it didn't happen today.

8           DAVID: Well, I, I didn't know anything about  
9 it. This is the first time you're telling me about it.

10          JOHN: Well, I told Steve, you know. And  
11 there must have been a breakdown in communications,  
12 huh?

13          DAVID: Well, Steve, Steve doesn't have the,  
14 the leniency of, of insult that I do.

15          JOHN: Hey.

16          DAVID: As long as I do.

17          JOHN: It will all work out though, huh?

18          DAVID: Yeah.

19          JOHN: I'll give you a call about 5 o'clock?

20          DAVID: In the morning?

21          JOHN: No. Hey, you were lucky. I gave you  
22 a break yesterday morning. Didn't call until what --  
23 as a matter of fact, I had Dick call about what --

24          DAVID: Why don't you, why don't you take a  
25 nap, and give us a call at about 7 o'clock then.

          JOHN: I don't take a nap. But I'll call you

1 at 7. And who else? Oh. Somebody just put a note  
2 here. Melissa, the little girl that --

3 DAVID: Uh-huh (yawning).

4 JOHN: Hang in there. This won't take much  
5 longer.

6 DAVID: Go ahead.

7 JOHN: (Laughing.) Show no respect at all to  
8 your elders.

9 DAVID: Why, just because I'm yawning?

10 JOHN: Yeah.

11 DAVID: I may be older than you, John. You  
12 just don't know.

13 JOHN: Uh-oh. No. I'm talking about earthly  
14 years, okay?

15 DAVID: Oh, all right.

16 JOHN: And you're not. They talked to  
17 Melissa yesterday about coming out.

18 DAVID: Uh-huh.

19 JOHN: And I guess then her mom talked to, to  
20 Steven or someone else. And then she, she changed her  
21 tune because of something that pertained to Robert.  
22 Now I know she didn't know Robert from the man in the  
23 moon.

24 DAVID: Yes, she did.

25 JOHN: But her mother did.

DAVID: No. She knew Robert too.

1               JOHN: Well, this little 6-year-old girl  
2 didn't know him to ask the questions that were being  
3 asked so --

4               DAVID: Yeah.

5               JOHN: -- she was being prompted. And I  
6 understand that. I appreciate that.

7               DAVID: Well, that's the mother's right and  
8 responsibility too. Because they know no one can talk  
9 to Robert --

10              JOHN: Well, the mother was being prompted by  
11 someone else. She'd have never asked that question.

12              DAVID: Well, now the thing of it was that  
13 normally she did not really want to go. And I asked  
14 her, I said Melissa --

15              JOHN: Well, then why in the world was --

16              DAVID: -- if you get a chance to talk to  
17 Robert -- I'm making negotiations with her too.

18              JOHN: Yeah.

19              DAVID: You know. Because otherwise I got to  
20 send them out anyway.

21              JOHN: Well --

22              DAVID: But I'm giving her a chance. I said  
23 look, if we get to talk to Robert would you go? And  
24 she looked at me, and she smiled and she says yes.

25              JOHN: Don't want to force anybody to do  
something against their will, huh?

1           DAVID: (Laughing.)  
2           JOHN: I'm being serious. You don't, do you?  
3           DAVID: Have I?  
4           JOHN: Not that I know of. But you don't  
5 want to, huh? How about making some arrangements in  
6 the morning for me to talk to those folks.  
7           DAVID: Okie doke.  
8           JOHN: Okay?  
9           DAVID: Give us a call.  
10          JOHN: Keep your powder dry. Hang in there.  
11          DAVID: All right. Will do.  
12          JOHN: Okay. Take care.  
13          DAVID: Malatov (phonetic sp.). Shalom.  
14          JOHN: Shalom.  
15                   \* \* \* \* \*  
16          STEVE: Hello?  
17          DICK: Steve?  
18          STEVE: Yes.  
19          DICK: Dick here.  
20          STEVE: Dick. Hi, did you get some rest?  
21          DICK: I got a little rest, and I understand  
22 you got a little rest.  
23          STEVE: I might have had an hour.  
24          DICK: They told me to get back to you around  
25 7.  
  
          STEVE: Oh, boy.

1           DICK: We gave you a little, we gave you a  
2 little extra time, Steve.

3           STEVE: They told them -- I told them try me  
4 about 9 o'clock.

5           DICK: Ooh, let's -- hey, we got the milk for  
6 you.

7           STEVE: You do, huh?

8           DICK: We got the milk for you. I'll tell  
9 you what we're going to do here with the milk. We --  
10 listen, we've got a container. We've got it iced for  
11 you. It will be here shortly.

12           This is what we'd like to do. We'll bring  
13 the milk down. We'll drop it off. I know you're  
14 concerned that we're -- I want to show you that we will  
15 do in fact what we say we will do. We're going to  
16 bring the milk down, drop it at the drop point and move  
17 back.

18           In return, we want four of your kids to come  
19 up, and we're going to give you the milk for the kids.  
20 We'll let one adult go up with it. You take one adult  
21 up to bring the milk back, and send us the kids. And  
22 we're prepared to do that momentarily. You get the  
23 kids ready, and we'll have it there.

24           STEVE: Hold on. (Indiscernible.) He was up  
25 quite late with John, you know, David was.

          DICK: Yes.

1           STEVE: And when it comes to the, the  
2 decisions about children -- now individuals, the  
3 children's are usually the parents. Then he can a lot  
4 of times say well, give it some thought or something  
5 and try to encourage them. But --

6           DICK: You can't do this yourself? I mean  
7 this is just milk.

8           STEVE: Not with the four children I can't.  
9 Jeff? I'm aware of that.

10          DICK: This is -- Steve.

11          STEVE: If you, if you --

12          DICK: Put David on. I'll talk to him  
13 directly then.

14          STEVE: No, he fell asleep at 5:30 this  
15 morning.

16          DICK: All right. But you want the milk in  
17 there --

18          STEVE: He was, he was awake --

19          DICK: Pardon me?

20          STEVE: He was awake with John all that time.

21          DICK: Well, that's, that's fine. Then --

22          STEVE: Then --

23          DICK: -- I assume that you can go ahead and  
24 make a decision on this matter, can't you? I know you  
25 guys --

          STEVE: See, I don't know which four



1 children. I can't go choose and say hey, I want your  
2 children to go out there and see, I mean these -- they  
3 won't comply with me in the first place, Dick. They  
4 really wouldn't.

5 DICK: Well, you're agreeable to it, are you  
6 not?

7 STEVE: I've always been from the beginning.

8 DICK: Absolutely. I mean this is --

9 STEVE: But I've --

10 DICK: -- what you asked for, and I got it  
11 done for you. While I was not here I've been working  
12 with these folks again.

13 STEVE: You, you guys are so funny. I say  
14 that because, you know, look at the, the techniques you  
15 use? You know, coercion and all of the other --

16 DICK: Now, listen, Steve, please.

17 STEVE: No, no, no, no. I'm going to --

18 DICK: How is this coercion?

19 STEVE: -- listen, no, no. No, no. Listen  
20 now. I'm going to put the phone down. Don't, you  
21 know --

22 DICK: Let's don't argue about this. We'll  
23 get it for you. You asked us for it --

24 STEVE: Okay, now, now listen to me.

25 DICK: -- and we've gotten it done for you.

STEVE: Listen. Are you ready to listen?

1           DICK: Certainly.

2           STEVE: All right. That was an agreement  
3 like 3, 4, 4, what was it, 4 days ago already, Dick,  
4 about the milk?

5           DICK: You asked for it and we've been  
6 working on it --

7           STEVE: Yeah, I asked for the milk. Nothing  
8 to do with four children. So you know, if you want  
9 to --

10          DICK: Steve --

11          STEVE: -- continue to talk about four  
12 children and the milk, talk to David. I can't --  
13 there's --

14          DICK: I know. I'll be happy to.

15          STEVE: I'm trying to be honest with you. I  
16 can't do anything about it.

17          DICK: But bear this into mind when you two  
18 discuss it, okay?

19          STEVE: All right.

20          DICK: We told you there has to be a give and  
21 some take. Okay, we're willing to bring the milk down  
22 to show you that in fact the milk will be there. It's  
23 all -- we're, we're, you know, we can do it  
24 momentarily. I sold this -- you know, I've sold a  
25 number of issues for you. And it took some time and  
it, these things do take time. We're willing to give

1 | you the milk. We want some kids for it. I mean it  
2 | comes down to that. You guys have to give some. We  
3 | give some.

4 |           STEVE: I realize that. But what can I do?  
5 | Can you give him another hour or two maybe? Because he  
6 | fell asleep at 5:30.

7 |           DICK: Okay. Well, you know, that's not  
8 | unreasonable. You like the idea though, don't you?

9 |           STEVE: I'm open to anything, Dick. I really  
10 | am.

11 |           DICK: Sure. Well, that's what -- we'll work  
12 | together and we're working together. So you know,  
13 | it's -- we've gone beyond this impasse I think to  
14 | work --

15 |           STEVE: Yeah. But I was just trying to give  
16 | as an example, you know, like Rose. You know, I --  
17 | there's -- I can't tell her -- I watched her spirit and  
18 | attitude with the child. It was obvious she did not  
19 | want her, you know, her child to go.

20 |           DICK: Um-hum.

21 |           STEVE: And that's why I just -- we left it  
22 | up to her. And David says well, would you mind he  
23 | asked her, you know, would you be willing for the child  
24 | to go if I had a chance to speak with Robert? I mean  
25 | I'm not bringing that up for now. That was then.

          But I mean so I don't -- there's nothing I

1 can really do when it comes to the mother and the  
2 children or whatever. Do you understand? About the  
3 father, whatever.

4 DICK: Well, I understand that.

5 STEVE: Okay.

6 DICK: But that you can't force them to go  
7 obviously. But my belief is based on the conversations  
8 I've had with you and with David that, that it's likely  
9 that some folks would want to go. And with, with the  
10 milk coming in there would be no opposition to that.  
11 Certainly for those that stay behind they want the milk  
12 for those kids, I think they would be completely  
13 supportive of that. And of course, you, you know that  
14 the kids are getting --

15 STEVE: I'll tell you what, Dick --

16 DICK: -- very good care outside.

17 STEVE: Call back right at 9 on the head.

18 DICK: Let's, let's make it 8:30.

19 STEVE: Make it 9. Because when -- I mean he  
20 fell asleep at 5:30. I will try to --

21 DICK: Okay, we'll make it 9 o'clock.

22 STEVE: -- try to see what I can do then.

23 DICK: Sure, 9 o'clock is fine. We'll get  
24 back to you then. And then also in talking with John,  
25 I know there was some, some conversation between you  
and he concerning these folks that you and I talked

1 about yesterday verifying that some of these folks were  
2 in there and that John had indicated that you said that  
3 they would be available for us to talk to so we can  
4 feel comfortable, and the press can feel comfortable  
5 that they're free to go. And, and John suggested that  
6 you said that was fine.

7           So I'll be, you know, I'll be looking forward  
8 to speaking with them in, you know, over the next time  
9 period here. And we'll get that, we'll get that issue  
10 straightened out. John wanted me to mention that to  
11 you directly, because I know you had made arrangements  
12 with him to do that.

13           STEVE: Well, see that's what I -- like I had  
14 said earlier that's always been something that is open  
15 to them --

16           DICK: Sure, they're free to do it.

17           STEVE: Yeah. And I passed around a number  
18 of times, and like I had told you, they were standing  
19 here waiting. Even by the way when you called at 4  
20 o'clock, there was a number of people standing here to  
21 talk to you. But you and I got on some other issues --

22           DICK: Sure, so --

23           STEVE: -- the other never came back up  
24 again, and I never talked to you again after that.

25           DICK: Well, round them up, and I'll be happy  
to speak with them.

1           STEVE: They had been, they had been standing  
2 here though.

3           DICK: Good. Well that, you know, that makes  
4 it easy then. You can run them down and tell them that  
5 we're -- I'm ready to talk to them and to talk to them  
6 about their fears and concerns.

7           STEVE: I believe children got on the phone  
8 with him along with some adults.

9           DICK: Good. Well, let's go through the rest  
10 of them then --

11          STEVE: (Indiscernible.)

12          DICK: -- and there will be others in there,  
13 I'm sure, that would like, like us to explain to them  
14 about certain fears that they might have. And, and  
15 I'll be happy to do that.

16          STEVE: Okay.

17          DICK: We'll answer all those questions for  
18 them and, and we'll work together.

19          STEVE: Okay, call me at 9.

20          DICK: Very well.

21          STEVE: Okay, talk to you --

22          DICK: Talk to you.

23          STEVE: Okay, bye.

24          DICK: Bye, now.

25                           \* \* \* \* \*

          STEVE: Hello?

1           DICK: Steve?  
2           STEVE: Hello.  
3           DICK: Dick again.  
4           STEVE: Right.  
5           DICK: You got David up there?  
6           STEVE: Just let me take a look here.  
7           DICK: Okay.  
8           STEVE TO DAVID: (Indiscernible.) You want  
9 to talk to Dick?  
10           [gap]  
11           STEVE: Okay. David's right over here. He  
12 says them that that milk thing is starting to get kind  
13 of sour. They're joking about it. You know, 4 days  
14 ago it was, it was something that was requested.  
15 Today, you know, when I mentioned it to him a minute or  
16 two ago just before you called he mentioned tell them  
17 to send 6 gallons of ice cream and --  
18           DICK: (Laughing.)  
19           STEVE: -- and two children back.  
20           DICK: Listen. I told you that there was  
21 some opposition to the milk.  
22           STEVE: I know you did. That's why I told  
23 him also. So I mean why even bring it up anymore?  
24           DICK: You're the one that wants the milk.  
25 And this is a positive thing that we're doing for you.  
            STEVE: Yeah, 4 days ago that's what I did

1 | say --

2 |           DICK: I understand but --

3 |           STEVE: -- (indiscernible) now.

4 |           DICK: -- but is there a less need for milk

5 | today than there was 4 days ago?

6 |           STEVE: If they made it 4 days without it I

7 | guess they can make it further.

8 |           DICK: Well, I'll tell you, those children

9 | need the milk. I assume that that's why you originally

10 | asked for it --

11 |           STEVE: Oh, yeah, but they --

12 |           DICK: -- because the kids need it.

13 |           STEVE: Of course. They're crying.

14 |           DICK: Sure. And there's no less need today.

15 | In fact, there's probably more today. So we're willing

16 | to do it. And this is a positive thing. Let's move

17 | forward.

18 |           STEVE: David, David says and he is taking it

19 | very personal, because they are his babies.

20 |           DICK: Well, let me talk directly to him.

21 |           STEVE: Just a moment.

22 |           [gap]

23 |           STEVE: He says I don't want to talk to him

24 | right now.

25 |           DICK: Well, let's work it out then between

the two of us. And you can go to him then and, and



1 make the point. Obviously, you've got the interest in  
2 the children the same as I do, the same as David does.

3 STEVE: Well, he said to me, he said  
4 (unidentified male voice in background not discernible)  
5 tell him to go have a milkshake.

6 DICK: A milkshake. Now listen. I don't, I  
7 don't think this is something to joke about. We --

8 STEVE: I'm not. Believe me --

9 DICK: We're getting --

10 STEVE: I'm telling you the honest truth.  
11 He's not smiling. He's not laughing. If you wanted to  
12 see his face he's extremely --

13 DICK: I know. But that, that reference to a  
14 milkshake. You know, I can understand --

15 STEVE: Well, you know, meaning that --

16 DICK: -- be a little facetious.

17 STEVE: That --

18 DICK: I know, you're being a little  
19 facetious. But --

20 STEVE: It doesn't need -- the subject  
21 doesn't even need to come up anymore unless that six --  
22 a thousand dollars was sent. And that was -- it  
23 sounded to me like there was no stipulations the day  
24 that it was mentioned. (Unidentified male voice in  
25 background not discernible.) It sounded like you guys  
were just going to send some materials that were

1 needed. Oh, and by the way, send 6 gallons for the  
2 babies. They need it.

3 DICK: Uh-huh.

4 STEVE: It didn't sound like any big deal.

5 DICK: Well --

6 STEVE: And it's turned into be one of the  
7 biggest things of all.

8 DICK: Well, again, I was, you know, it would  
9 have been my hope that we could have gotten it in  
10 earlier. But we've gone to the, to the committee  
11 there. And we've gotten their okay. And we're ready  
12 to do it right now.

13 And, and I -- again, this morning I came to  
14 you with what I thought was a, you know, an effort on  
15 our part to get this thing moving, a positive effort.  
16 And I've done it. We're ready to do -- and then you  
17 guys just reject it once again out of hand. You've  
18 made all kinds of requests of us, and we don't do them  
19 as soon as you want, and so all of a sudden it's not  
20 good enough. You got to understand --

21 STEVE: That isn't true.

22 DICK: -- and give us some latitude here.

23 STEVE: I can do only what, you know, what  
24 you can do. I mean sometimes these requests change  
25 because if they don't, you know, like you say. You  
know, half of a week goes by or more, and what are you

1 going to do?

2 DICK: That doesn't lessen the need for it  
3 though, Steve, for the kids, does it?

4 STEVE: Well, I --

5 DICK: Huh?

6 STEVE: -- that's what I would have thought  
7 on your behalf that you'd have recognized that right  
8 away.

9 DICK: Well, I tried to. And again I make  
10 these requests for you --

11 STEVE: So there's -- I'm sure there's some  
12 things he may negotiate with you like playing that  
13 couple seconds spot on the radio for a couple children  
14 so frequently. But things like that to him are an  
15 insult. They really are. So --

16 DICK: Listen. Let me just discuss that for  
17 a moment.

18 STEVE: All right.

19 DICK: Yesterday in one of the conversations  
20 we had, you made reference to one of the two gentlemen  
21 that was on the TV suggesting we would send the food in  
22 to care for the babies. You, you made a big point out  
23 of that. And we're ready. We've, we've done it.  
24 We've got it here.

25 Again, you know, I've gone to the, to the  
bosses for you. And we've gotten the okay. And then

1 all of a sudden you reject it.

2 STEVE: Well, no, no, no.

3 DICK: You reject it. Everything that we  
4 do --

5 STEVE: I like the way --

6 DICK: -- for you, you reject it.

7 STEVE: No, Dick. I like the way you word  
8 things. You can try to play, you know, on one's  
9 sympathies and all the rest. But what the man said was  
10 aside from any negotiations on TV. He made it very  
11 clear that they had our interests in mind when it came  
12 to or needs in mind when it came to things of that  
13 nature. And even when it came to the dead or the  
14 wounded and so forth just as Jim had stated way back  
15 Sunday.

16 The annoyance was that on one side it was  
17 being stated before the public. On the other, you and  
18 I are negotiating and bargaining over things that were  
19 not mentioned on, on the program at all. I mean if you  
20 want to send us sutures, or you want to send us  
21 pictures of the children, you know, that was your  
22 suggestion about that. None of us here even requested  
23 such stuff.

24 DICK: But it was only after you expressed  
25 concern about the welfare of the kids and had suggested  
that the kids had been split up. You wouldn't accept

1 my word that the kids had not been split up. So we  
2 talked about what --

3 STEVE: Okay, fine.

4 DICK: -- we could do to show you that that  
5 was true. And we did do something.

6 STEVE: That's fine.

7 DICK: So you know, we're making the effort,  
8 Steve.

9 STEVE: That's always what I, what I was  
10 saying, though, are those things that were requested  
11 from this place, you know, days and days have gone by.  
12 And to us, they were very minor things. Substantial  
13 things to the children, of course, but it shows us, you  
14 know, a different spirit that's manifested on TV then  
15 what is in actuality to us.

16 DICK: Well, Steve, you know, you've asked  
17 for things for instance the suture kit. We sent the  
18 suture kit.

19 STEVE: Did we ask for that?

20 DICK: What do we -- what in return you do  
21 nothing. I mean we -- you want milk. We're ready to  
22 send the milk in. You reject it. You know, I'm  
23 starting to believe that you ask for these things  
24 feeling that we won't give them to you, and then you  
25 can complain about it. We are giving them to you --

STEVE: No, no.

1           DICK:  -- and we have them ready for you.  
2 And then you, and then you go on to something else.

3           STEVE:  Dick, truly I believe as the rest  
4 here that 6 gallons of milk would have showed up within  
5 about an hour.  From the way we were talking that day  
6 the -- was that you on the other side of the phone?  
7 I -- it's so many days ago, and it's gone back and  
8 forth so many times.  I don't -- was it originally put  
9 out to Henry?  I think it was, wasn't it?

10          DICK:  It was.

11          STEVE:  And it seemed like from the response  
12 like it was not a big deal.  It seemed like it have  
13 been just sent right out when we were still bringing  
14 children out and all the rest.  Well, all of a sudden  
15 being that it -- well, we're, we're not going to do it  
16 or this or that.  Well, see after a while it starts  
17 becoming a very sour, and I don't mean that to be  
18 funny, but a very sour issue.

19          DICK:  Well, you know, we've done so many  
20 positive things for you in return received little or  
21 nothing.

22          STEVE:  What positive things?  You mentioned  
23 the sutures, and that's about it.  What, what else have  
24 you done?

25          DICK:  Well, the, the written statement from  
David.

1           STEVE: We have sent Heather. We've sent  
2 Kevin. We've sent Mark.

3           DICK: Open up the phone line. I mean we  
4 opened up communications with you right after the  
5 Sunday thing as quickly as possible.

6           STEVE: Wait a minute, now. With that, with  
7 that phone business, it was our -- we are the ones that  
8 initiated with --

9           DICK: Absolutely. You asked us to --

10          STEVE: -- with you people on the, wait now,  
11 with the telephone even in behalf of trying to get your  
12 wounded out.

13          DICK: I understand. We appreciate that.

14          STEVE: We, we didn't want anybody hurt and  
15 wounded in the first place. But in fact, we wanted  
16 them to even move quicker than what they were.

17          DICK: And that works to your advantage.  
18 Absolutely true. Absolutely true. You could have --  
19 someone could have shot the agent that was down in the  
20 back --

21          STEVE: That's true.

22          DICK: -- and you allowed to bring them out.  
23 So that obviously is in your favor. ATF appreciates  
24 that as does we -- as do we. You offered -- you asked  
25 for a couple of other things. Play a tape on national  
TV and you'll come out. We play the tape. We see no

1 response. Rita asked play the tape during prime time.  
2 And we did. The rest of the children will come out.  
3 No. David wants 150 feet of cord and a telephone. We  
4 send it in. In response, we get nothing.

5 STEVE: No, no. Wait, wait. What that was  
6 about -- now let's not, let's not take it out of the  
7 context of that it was spoken about. That was asked  
8 for for your benefit and mine in that we could  
9 communicate without a break in the line.

10 DICK: Okay. Okay.

11 STEVE: And mostly as much for yourselves as  
12 us.

13 DICK: Steve, you --

14 STEVE: Because originally when Jim was  
15 talking to me, the phone would stop and break. He says  
16 what can we do about it? I says we're -- look. Here,  
17 David's going to send some money. He -- the two of  
18 them talked it out. And that's why the phone because  
19 we'd accept another phone with a line so that we can  
20 continue.

21 DICK: Okay.

22 STEVE: Because they wanted as much as us.

23 DICK: But I'm just showing -- I know. But  
24 I'm -- what I'm saying is we're trying to work together  
25 with you.

STEVE: I, I know what you're trying to say



1 and do. I see what you're trying to do and what you're  
2 saying. I, I do see it clearly.

3 DICK: You know, the public sees our effort  
4 on the one side and sees nothing coming from you.

5 STEVE: This is true. And this is the way --

6 DICK: Isn't that true?

7 STEVE: -- this is the way you would have it.

8 DICK: No, this is the way it is.

9 STEVE: No, this is the way --

10 DICK: But we're trying to work together.

11 STEVE: You are right. We are cut off from  
12 them. But you have total access as we have watched to  
13 make any kind of a statement you want. And we've got  
14 to spend days trying to correct little things. After a  
15 while, you know, you tell them what you feel you need  
16 to tell them. Because you know we have nothing to say  
17 about it anyway.

18 DICK: Listen. Let me read you an article  
19 today. I, I want to point out to you folks in there.  
20 I know you're concerned about support. Let me read  
21 just excerpts from, from an article that appeared in  
22 the paper today that I think --

23 STEVE: What paper? The local --

24 DICK: Yeah, the local -- no, it's the Fort  
25 Worth Star Telegraph.

STEVE: Fort Worth Star Telegraph.

1           DICK: Right. Let me read you just some  
2 paragraphs from this thing. It quotes this man that,  
3 that by Tim Sullivan of the Star Telegraph. He's a --

4           STEVE: All right.

5           DICK: -- reporter that had spoken with a  
6 local person up there. He said, this is quote what  
7 this fellow is saying. He said that the February 28th  
8 raid on the compound by federal agents was an attempt  
9 to suppress religious activities because its members  
10 live communally and by their own rules. He goes on to  
11 say the government has become a police state. They  
12 want everybody to bow down to them.

13           Again, he said the raid's violence which left  
14 four ATF agents and at least some Branch Dividians dead  
15 was the fault of the government. You attack a man's  
16 home, and he will fight back. I think this was a set-  
17 up, this man says, by the government. I want people to  
18 understand that government doesn't act properly. This  
19 is the kind of support that people are giving you out  
20 there. But when, when --

21           STEVE: What, what do you think of a  
22 statement like that?

23           DICK: I think that a man that you're able to  
24 make a statement like that in this country you can make  
25 statements like that every day, and we all respect that  
ability and that right which is given to us by the

1 Constitution. I'm not, don't oppose that. Certainly I  
2 don't oppose that.

3 I may not always agree with what I read. But  
4 people have the latitude in this country to do that,  
5 and that's exactly what you're going to be able to do  
6 when you guys come out of there is make these kinds of  
7 statement. I mean it's -- you're not isolated in  
8 there. You're going to have the ability to make these  
9 kinds of statement to the press.

10 You'll -- they'll have total access. And,  
11 and we're going to address that issue I hope on this  
12 morning's press conference. Because I, I suggested to  
13 the folks that you were concerned about your inability  
14 to talk with people at some point in time. And I said  
15 hey, tell the media that. They will know that you're  
16 concerned about that. And I'll tell you, they'll beat  
17 your doors down to get the story. They will beat the  
18 doors down. They'll have you lined up on --

19 STEVE: Dick --

20 DICK: -- to be interviewed at length.

21 STEVE: Okay. What time did you leave  
22 yesterday?

23 DICK: What time did I leave?

24 STEVE: Yeah.

25 DICK: Oh, probably, you know, 9 o'clock last  
night.

1 STEVE: There was --

2 DICK: 9:30, 10.

3 STEVE: Did the guys in the Bradleys, what  
4 did they think of the music?

5 DICK: (Laughing.) The guys in the Bradleys,  
6 what did they think of the music, huh?

7 STEVE: Yeah.

8 DICK: Well, I don't know. Some of them I  
9 guess would like everybody else would like the music.

10 STEVE: Some did, huh?

11 DICK: Others would find it not to their  
12 liking. It's like me down here in Texas. I'm, I'm,  
13 you know, I'm listening to these Texas stations here  
14 with the cowboy music. And --

15 STEVE: Right.

16 DICK: -- where I live I don't hear much  
17 cowboy music. So you know --

18 STEVE: See, what the prophecies actually  
19 stated was that the final message to the world -- this  
20 was, this was shown to me 6-1/2 years ago. I wasn't  
21 even into music. I've never really cared for that kind  
22 of music myself. But --

23 DICK: Um-hum.

24 STEVE: -- finally it grew on me. But here's  
25 the thing. In the prophecy of Habakkuk it talks about  
shigionat (phonetic), the turbulent lyrics, there is to

1 be a message of salvation, seven seals that were to be  
2 given by this form of communication, music, the highest  
3 form of communication that there is.

4 DICK: Um-hum.

5 STEVE: And we decided, David decided to at  
6 least play something for the guys. And so --

7 DICK: Well, they've -- some of them  
8 appreciated it. Others I'm sure did not appreciate it.  
9 But you know, that's -- you guys go ahead --

10 STEVE: Oh, yeah.

11 DICK: -- and do whatever you want in terms  
12 of playing music.

13 STEVE: The lyrics are what are very awesome.  
14 I mean --

15 DICK: Yeah.

16 STEVE: -- very, very deep (indiscernible) --

17 DICK: Well, did you appreciate it in there?  
18 I mean you liked it, didn't you? And that's all that's  
19 important.

20 STEVE: Oh, yeah.

21 DICK: Because I know you did it for your,  
22 for the good of your folks in there.

23 STEVE: Yeah --

24 DICK: Let me talk to David. And let's try  
25 to work this deal out.

STEVE: I'm, I'm trying to. Okay, let me see

1 again. Okay?

2 DICK: Okay.

3 STEVE: Can I talk to David? (Unidentified  
4 male voices in background not discernible.)

6 STEVE: He said it's so cold he'll --

7 (End of tape 78.)

2 STEVE: -- talk to him? He says --

3 DAVID: Tell him to go drink a glass of milk.

4 STEVE: He says, he says nah, go drink a  
5 glass of milk.

6 DICK: Listen. We have it ready for you.

7 STEVE: (Indiscernible.)

8 DICK: So this is going to be another  
9 rejection on, on our, on your part toward the efforts  
10 that we've made. Let me, let me go into -- you  
11 remember this article I spoke to you about this  
12 morning?

13 STEVE: Dick says, Dick says I guess this  
14 will be another rejection on your part.

15 DAVID: Another what?

16 STEVE: Rejection on your part to the efforts  
17 that are being made.

18 DAVID: (indiscernible).

19 STEVE: He says you're making no damn  
20 efforts.

21 DICK: Well, and what you define what I just  
22 offered to you, to David? Have David define what that  
23 is if that's not an effort on our part?

24 STEVE: Could you define what that is today?  
25 What their, their offer of the 6 frozen gallons for  
four children?



1           STEVE: I mean even if those children we sent  
2 out would have remained here, they would have got some  
3 of that milk before they went out, but they'd have  
4 still gone out. He, he -- it had nothing to do with  
5 anything like that.

6           DICK: Steve, let -- you know, we talked  
7 earlier about negotiations. You, you make repeated  
8 effort -- or statements concerning negotiations.  
9 Negotiations on the basic level are a tit for tat, a  
10 concession on both parts, a backing down in some  
11 instances, a moving forward in other instances. It's,  
12 it's --

13           STEVE: You know, a wiser -- okay.

14           DICK: -- an agreement to agree not --

15           STEVE: A wiser question on your behalf might  
16 be David, what could we do if anything at all, you  
17 know. What we'd like to do is see maybe another child  
18 or two or whatever. Is there anything that we could do  
19 to maybe ensure that one or two could come out? I  
20 would think that you might just want to ask that, put  
21 it in his head, and see what he has to say about it or  
22 as a reaction.

23           DICK: Well, I'll tell you what. Listen.  
24 Send two kids out, and we'll send the milk in.

25           STEVE: No, you --

          DICK: Tell, tell David --

1           SITA: I (indiscernible).

2           DICK: I know you're tired. Sita, trust me.  
3 We're -- I'm going to take, make sure that those kids  
4 are, are handled properly. Please. If there's nothing  
5 else that happens here, understand that I will ensure  
6 and we will ensure the FBI that those kids are properly  
7 cared for. And the only way we can improve on that  
8 care is for you to come out and take care of those kids  
9 themselves -- yourself. (Unidentified voice in  
10 background not discernible.) And you know, you and I  
11 both know that, Sita, that you're --

12           SITA: Excuse me. There is a girl want to  
13 talk to you.

14           DICK: Okay. What -- who is this I'm  
15 speaking with?

16           SITA: She's Nick. And she's the brother  
17 who -- (unidentified female voice in background not  
18 discernible) -- the sister of the brother who died  
19 wanted -- (unidentified male voice in background not  
20 discernible) --

21           DICK: Okay, put her --

22           SITA: That wouldn't take, excuse me --

23           DICK: Put her on. I'll be happy to speak  
24 with her.

25           SITA: Just a minute.

1           NICOLE: Hello?

2           DICK: Hi. Who's this?

3           NICOLE: This is Nicole.

4           DICK: Nicole, how are you this morning?

5 This is Dick. Have I spoken with you before?

6           NICOLE: No. I spoke to Jim. But I --

7           DICK: Okay.

8           NICOLE: -- haven't spoken to you before.

9           DICK: Good. I'm glad to have the

10 opportunity to speak with you.

11           NICOLE: I think personally you're a real

12 asshole myself.

13           DICK: Now that's, that's -- thank you. I, I

14 appreciate that.

15           NICOLE: Okay? I'm pretty teed off with the

16 whole situation.

17           DICK: Okay. What are your concerns? Tell

18 me specifically what your concerns are.

19           NICOLE: I will. I will tell you very

20 specifically.

21           DICK: Okay. And I'll answer. Give me one

22 at a time, and we'll answer them one at a time.

23           NICOLE: Number one.

24           DICK: Okay.

25           NICOLE: You send your agents here, you

murder my twin brother.

1 DICK: Who, who is that?

2 NICOLE: Peter Gent.

3 DICK: Peter Gent is your brother.

4 NICOLE: He's been laying --

5 DICK: Okay, please accept my, my regrets.

6 NICOLE: Your regrets --

7 DICK: Nicole, I was not there. The FBI was  
8 not there. That was an ATF attempt to serve that  
9 warrant. And they are as upset about this obviously,  
10 they lost four agents.

11 NICOLE: Well, they --

12 DICK: They're as upset as you are about it.

13 NICOLE: I don't think so. We let them come  
14 in here and take their dead man, their wounded. And  
15 you guys won't even take my dead brother out of here.  
16 I think it's sick. You people are sick in the head.  
17 And I'm really --

18 DICK: We will try to do that. We understand  
19 your concern.

20 NICOLE: We'll try. When? Next year? He is  
21 down -- he's dead. And I bet --

22 DICK: I know that.

23 NICOLE: -- you haven't even notified my  
24 parents, have you? They've come all the way from  
25 Australia. You -- I'm just so teed off with this whole  
situation. I have a little baby. David sends out

1 \$1,000, and you don't even have enough human decency to  
2 send in 6 gallons of milk.

3 DICK: Nicole, I spoke with him about that.  
4 We're ready to send that milk in.

5 NICOLE: When? We asked for that 4 days ago.

6 DICK: It's here. We will -- we're ready.  
7 We're ready to go on that. We're ready to go on it.

8 (Unidentified male voice in background not  
9 discernible.) I just told Steven about that and David  
10 too.

11 NICOLE: David says stop bullshitting, all  
12 right?

13 DICK: We're not --

14 NICOLE: I mean you --

15 DICK: We're not doing that at all.

16 NICOLE: You are. Because you're trying to  
17 develop some sort of trust here. And from what I can  
18 see in observation, there is none. You have been  
19 telling lies. I've seen with Steve you've just been  
20 telling lies over and over again. You've got your  
21 bulldozers all around this place trampling over things.  
22 I mean who do you people think you are?

23 DICK: Nicole, I understand your frustration.

24 NICOLE: You don't understand my frustration.  
25 You're not in here. You're not in, sitting in my room  
with my kids trying -- and I've got a stupid --

1 DICK: I know. I know.

2 NICOLE: -- bulldozer aimed right at my room.  
3 I mean you've got jerks in those tanks. You need to  
4 get your act together.

5 DICK: Nicole, I understand what you're  
6 saying.

7 NICOLE: You don't understand what I'm  
8 saying.

9 DICK: Yes, I do. Yes, I do.

10 NICOLE: You guys have done nothing,  
11 absolutely nothing.

12 DICK: I know you're concerned. We're  
13 concerned, and we're trying to work this out together.

14 NICOLE: You want David to release people on  
15 what elements? There is no trust.

16 DICK: Well, yeah, that's exactly true. And  
17 we --

18 NICOLE: Exactly.

19 DICK: -- we -- listen, Nicole, yesterday we  
20 offered to move our Bradleys back --

21 NICOLE: Well, how come they --

22 DICK: -- and to do other --

23 NICOLE: -- how come they keep rolling back  
24 in here? Every time they go out --

25 DICK: Because David won't, won't help us.  
He won't work with us.

1           NICOLE: David?

2           DICK: You're going to have to, you're going  
3 to have to talk with David and get David to work with  
4 us.

5           NICOLE: You're not working with us. That's  
6 what the point is. You have not proven yourself at  
7 all.

8           DICK: Really?

9           NICOLE: Really, you have not.

10          DICK: What are these offers that we have  
11 made for, to you repeatedly over time and, and the  
12 things we have done already.

13          NICOLE: What have --

14          DICK: We send you pictures for the kids.

15          NICOLE: And you cut off all their hair. Are  
16 they still together? You're going to send them out to  
17 foster parents. They were all given out --

18          DICK: We're not. We're not.

19          NICOLE: -- with addresses.

20          DICK: I know that.

21          NICOLE: You're not -- I don't trust you  
22 guys. I really don't trust you guys at all.

23          DICK: Well, then you know the answer to that  
24 is?

25          NICOLE: Where's our line? Where's our  
phone?

1 DICK: You know what the answer --

2 NICOLE: Where's our phone line to the press?

3 DICK: It's -- that's all in place.

4 NICOLE: We have none.

5 DICK: We suggested yesterday that we would  
6 make people available when you come out -- you can pick  
7 people that you want to be there to ensure everybody's  
8 safety when you come out. We'll do that.

9 NICOLE: I'm not coming out. I am not coming  
10 out. Based on what you guys have done, I'm not coming  
11 out. I don't want to come out. I am not coming out.

12 DICK: Okay. Well, that's your option. I'm  
13 not trying to convince you to do that.

14 NICOLE: Good. Don't.

15 DICK: I'm suggesting that, that David has  
16 said that that's an option and that if, if at --

17 NICOLE: An option?

18 DICK: -- a point in time you want to do that  
19 then, then please, we will, we'll love to have you out  
20 here. You can care for your children. Now one child  
21 apparently I was told at least one child asked to have  
22 his hair cut.

23 NICOLE: What -- David said your option is  
24 you're going to burn hot and in hell. I mean this is  
25 ridiculous.

DICK: Well, I'm sorry you feel that way.



1 We're --

2 NICOLE: Oh.

3 DICK: -- we're just doing the best we can  
4 under --

5 NICOLE: I don't think so.

6 DICK: -- this is a difficult situation for  
7 all of us. And we're doing the best we can, and what  
8 we ask is in return for you to work with us. And we'll  
9 get, we'll get things worked out. It may not be as  
10 quickly as you would like. And it may not be as  
11 quickly as I would like.

12 NICOLE: Quickly. How long does it take to  
13 get a dead body out of this place?

14 DICK: Again, we're trying to deal with all  
15 these requests of yours. And again it's not getting  
16 done as quickly --

17 NICOLE: Look.

18 DICK: -- as you want, Nicole.

19 NICOLE: You came in here. When you guys  
20 fired on us, you guys fired first. I have bullet holes  
21 in my son -- I'm glad he wasn't in his bed. He would  
22 have been killed.

23 DICK: Nicole, you need to tell the world  
24 that very same thing.

25 NICOLE: Well, then why don't you give us a  
line out?

1           DICK: You will have the opportunity to do  
2 that.

3           NICOLE: When? When, Dick? When?

4           DICK: You know, listen. Let me tell you  
5 what again, very briefly what we went over this morning  
6 with Steven concerning a local article that was written  
7 in the Forth Worth Star Telegraph where a person writes  
8 in and says that the, the attack, he calls it an attack  
9 on the compound by federal agents was an attempt to  
10 suppress religion simply because the members live  
11 communally.

12           And he goes on to say the government has  
13 become a police state. They want everybody to bow down  
14 to them. Goes on to say, he said the raid's violence  
15 which left four ATF agents and at least some Dividians  
16 dead was the fault of the U.S. Government.

17           Now that's the kind of support you're getting  
18 out there. But you need to, to ensure that that is  
19 communicated by the people inside that can tell what  
20 happened from their viewpoint.

21           NICOLE: Dick, don't try and patronize me.

22           DICK: ATF is --

23           NICOLE: You don't want us to have a line.  
24 You don't want us to have a line out. That is a,  
25 that's a fact. You don't. Because you would have  
given it to us a long time ago.

1           DICK: Your best line is to walk out of there  
2 and talk to whomever you want to talk to.

3           NICOLE: I'm not walking out of -- oh,  
4 freedom of speech. What happened to the Constitution  
5 of America? It doesn't exist.

6           DICK: What did I just tell you? You have  
7 the ability to talk to anyone you wish. When you come  
8 out of there absolutely. And I told David and Steve  
9 there will be so many requests to talk to you folks  
10 you'll be able to get your story out in any fashion --

11          NICOLE: That's a load of baloney.

12          DICK: It isn't a load of baloney.

13          NICOLE: It's -- that's bullshit, Dick.

14          DICK: Listen, Nicole. Let me review a  
15 couple of things for you, the things that we've done at  
16 your request. Not specifically yours. But the folks  
17 inside that were done for you, okay? A phone line was  
18 opened up. Obviously --

19          NICOLE: (Indiscernible.)

20          DICK: -- that was for both. That was for  
21 both of us.

22          NICOLE: Keep going.

23          DICK: Okay, but it was done. You had the  
24 same interest in it as we have. And that was done on  
25 the 28th, Sunday.

          And then David wanted to make a statement,

1 and in return for that he said I will bring all my  
2 people out. He gets an hour on the telephone -- or I'm  
3 sorry. An hour in the media after he does a statement  
4 of his own choice. He puts it together. Nobody,  
5 nobody edited that statement. He put exactly what he  
6 wanted on there. And it was played verbatim.

7           Then we get, we get a reference to play the  
8 tape on national TV and they will come out. Now that  
9 comes from Scott. It's, it's played. Again, you don't  
10 come out. Then someone suggested, Rita I believe, said  
11 play the tape during prime time, and the women and the  
12 children will come out. Of course, it's played during  
13 prime time. Nobody comes out. Or you know, the group  
14 doesn't come out.

15           David wants 150 feet of phone line. We  
16 furnish that to him.

17           NICOLE: You, you don't hook it up?

18           DICK: Well, how can we hook it up? We're  
19 not in there. We sent in a telephone for it.

20           NICOLE: Why did you cut off all  
21 communication in the first place?

22           DICK: That -- and again I told you I'm not  
23 going to lie to you. That is commonly done --

24           NICOLE: Commonly done.

25           DICK: -- in these, in these situations.

          NICOLE: Freedom of speech. Commonly done.

1 DICK: No.

2 NICOLE: Yes.

3 DICK: There's actually has nothing to do  
4 with freedom of speech. It has to do with as I  
5 suggested to some of the guys yesterday when you have  
6 this kind of incident, as unfortunate as it is, there  
7 are all kinds of people out there that, that want to  
8 involve themselves to some degree. And some, just people  
9 with some off --

10 NICOLE: Dick --

11 DICK: -- the wall things --

12 NICOLE: Dick the truth is --

13 DICK: -- to say will call in.

14 NICOLE: -- David and Steve were on, on the  
15 press. They were speaking live to the people on radio.  
16 And they were telling what you happened, and you guys  
17 didn't like it. So you cut our lines. That's what  
18 happened. (Unidentified male voice in background not  
19 discernible.)

20 DICK: Absolutely.

21 NICOLE: Absolutely.

22 DICK: We did --

23 NICOLE: You didn't like what they were  
24 saying.

25 DICK: No, I'm saying we cut the lines. It's  
not because what, of what you were saying --

1           NICOLE: Because you didn't like it. Because  
2 they told how the BATF --

3           DICK: Um-hum.

4           NICOLE: -- came in here and started firing  
5 first. And they did not know that. They accused us of  
6 that first.

7           DICK: Nicole, there's been a national  
8 inquiry made, a Congressional inquiry made reference to  
9 yesterday in the paper.

10          NICOLE: (Indiscernible.)

11          DICK: They're opening up an inquiry on that.  
12 And you'll all get a chance to say exactly what you  
13 saw, what you did, and what you saw the ATF do. That  
14 is -- it's your right. It's your responsibility. And  
15 the world will demand it.

16          NICOLE: Dick, it doesn't make one hell of a  
17 difference, all right? So that's not -- still until I  
18 start seeing some milk or, or some --

19          DICK: We've got the milk.

20          NICOLE: -- such element here, I, I really  
21 have nothing more to say to you.

22          DICK: Nicole, we have the milk.

23          NICOLE: Well, where --

24          DICK: And I made that clear to both --

25          NICOLE: Are you going to let it go sour?  
Are you going to let it sit out there and go sour?

1           DICK: No. We're -- I told, I told the  
2 fellows in there that we're, we're prepared to, to give  
3 you the milk and to send the kids out and the milk will  
4 go in.

5           NICOLE: No, we're not sending the kids out.  
6 We want the milk here.

7           DICK: That's exactly where it's going to be.

8           NICOLE: Well, why --

9           DICK: We're going to send the milk in.

10          NICOLE: Okay. And we're not sending the  
11 kids out. We, we need the milk here for the babies.

12          DICK: I hear what you're saying, Nicole.  
13 But as I indicated to Steve and to David --  
14 (unidentified male voice in background not  
15 discernible) -- we need to make concessions to one  
16 another. This is how you --

17          NICOLE: Look, these are David's babies, all  
18 right? They need milk.

19          DICK: I know.

20          NICOLE: They've had none for 3, 4, 5, 6 days  
21 because the mothers are so stressed out with all this  
22 baloney, garbage stuff you're throwing up at us.

23          DICK: Well, it's not garbage. I am sorry  
24 you feel that way. Because we are ready to send the  
25 milk in. And --

          NICOLE: Well --

1 DICK: -- and I've said that repeatedly this  
2 morning. Was the first thing I said to --

3 NICOLE: You keep saying, Dick. But we  
4 haven't seen it.

5 DICK: What did I tell them? Did they tell  
6 you what I suggested?

7 NICOLE: You want kids out.

8 DICK: Absolutely.

9 NICOLE: Well, then what, what point --

10 DICK: And the milk will come in.

11 NICOLE: -- is there in bringing milk in?

12 DICK: Pardon me? What, what does that have  
13 to do with bringing milk in? My bosses have indicated  
14 they're willing to do that if you're willing to send  
15 some people out. We have to work with one another.  
16 There has to be some give and some take. And we're  
17 willing to do that.

18 NICOLE: Look.

19 DICK: And you're going to have to be willing  
20 to give and take.

21 NICOLE: Dick, there's seven seals, all  
22 right? And I've been in this message for 5 years, in  
23 this truth.

24 DICK: Um-hum.

25 NICOLE: I have seen more than what you could  
have ever seen. I have an experience that you don't



1 understand. God said wait. And so I'm waiting.  
2 Because I am trusting in something that I have seen,  
3 that I have experienced. I don't trust in you kind of  
4 people.

5 DICK: Well, I think we've shown you a lot of  
6 good trust and good faith and reason for you to --

7 NICOLE: No, you've shown me no trust at all.

8 DICK: No, that's not --

9 NICOLE: No trust.

10 DICK: -- true. I'm sorry you feel that way,  
11 Nicole. But that is --

12 NICOLE: Lamb-like and you speak like a  
13 dragon. That's what I've experienced.

14 DICK: Nicole, we're interested in ensuring  
15 your safety and all the other folks in there --

16 NICOLE: My --

17 DICK: -- and your kids.

18 NICOLE: You come in here and start blasting  
19 the place while it's full of kids. You don't, you  
20 don't come with your arrest warrant. I was down there  
21 when Robert Gonzales came in here, all right?

22 DICK: Um-hum.

23 NICOLE: I was there. I noticed -- I was  
24 very suspicious of his behavior.

25 DICK: Okay.

NICOLE: The way he was in the study.

1 DICK: Um-hum.

2 NICOLE: I was very suspicious. And then he  
3 said he wasn't going to come back until Monday. He  
4 shows up on Sunday morning with a newspaper with an  
5 article on our members here full of baloney from the  
6 press. He comes in. He sits down.

7 DICK: Is that the first time you had seen  
8 that article?

9 NICOLE: No. We, we -- that was -- we'd  
10 already had one the day before.

11 DICK: Okay.

12 NICOLE: Okay?

13 DICK: Okay.

14 NICOLE: And he came in here. I remember  
15 standing at the window. I was about to walk off. And  
16 he looked up at me. But the expression he had on his  
17 face made me even more suspicious again. Okay?

18 DICK: I understand what you're saying.

19 NICOLE: Then he leaves. Ten minutes later  
20 we've got the whole place in bullets. I mean --

21 DICK: Nicole, all of us -- please. I am as  
22 appalled about what happened as you are. You'll have  
23 to believe that. I don't want to ever see anything  
24 like this happen. I was not there. I'm with another  
25 agency. They're --

NICOLE: You have, you have agents that have

1 left your agency for this very reason. Because they're  
2 trigger happy.

3 DICK: From the FBI?

4 NICOLE: The BATF.

5 DICK: Well, see, again I'm not with the  
6 BATF.

7 NICOLE: It's all the same thing.

8 DICK: Well, no, it isn't.

9 NICOLE: You're all lamb-like and speak like  
10 a dragon.

11 DICK: That's like saying your religious  
12 group -- that's like saying your group is the same as  
13 every other religious group. And that's not true, is  
14 it?

15 NICOLE: You're all under the same  
16 government.

17 DICK: Absolutely. We all are under the same  
18 God too.

19 NICOLE: Exactly.

20 DICK: And we're all under the same God. But  
21 yet you have --

22 NICOLE: No, we're not all under the same  
23 God.

24 DICK: Well --

25 NICOLE: But we're judged by the same God.

DICK: We, we all believe in a form of a God,

1 do we not? I mean most of us. Let's face it, most of  
2 us do.

3 NICOLE: You don't know our God.

4 DICK: In the same fashion the FBI and the  
5 ATF are not even under the same department in the  
6 government. We're not even under the same department.  
7 And I will tell you that all our respective agency  
8 heads are just, just devastated by the way this thing  
9 was handled on Sunday. We do not condone it. We do  
10 not accept it. We will not accept it. And everything  
11 that we do in not only ATF --

12 NICOLE: Dick.

13 DICK: -- but the FBI will be scrutinized so  
14 that --

15 NICOLE: Dick.

16 DICK: -- make sure that doesn't happen  
17 again.

18 NICOLE: I have a 1-year-old little girl.

19 DICK: Okay.

20 NICOLE: Okay?

21 DICK: What's her name.

22 NICOLE: Her name is Paigis (phonetic sp.).

23 DICK: Paigis?

24 NICOLE: Okay? And she hasn't had any milk  
25 for 5 days.

DICK: Okay.

1 NICOLE: Okay, I'm doing the best that I  
2 can --

3 DICK: You as a mother then should demand  
4 that we, that, that David allow us to get that milk  
5 into you then. They say they're no longer interested  
6 in milk, because it came up 4 days ago, and because  
7 it's there you no longer have an interest. It would  
8 seem --

9 NICOLE: We have an interest.

10 DICK: -- to me that interest would be even  
11 greater now.

12 NICOLE: Why don't you send it in?

13 DICK: We are prepared to send it in.

14 NICOLE: Well, just send it in. I don't know  
15 what the big hold up is.

16 DICK: David, David is not agreeable to that.

17 NICOLE: He's not agreeable for you to send  
18 the milk in.

19 DICK: Exactly.

20 NICOLE: I have nothing more to say to you,  
21 Dick.

22 DICK: Well, I hope you're doing well. I  
23 hope your child is doing well. And, and I hope that --

24 DAVID: Dick, listen to me.

25 DICK: I'm listening.

DAVID: The God that you do not understand in

1           You can go ahead, and you can listen to me  
2 talk, and you can listen to me rattle. And you can  
3 listen to me go line upon line, precept on precept,  
4 here a little, there a little and show you all over the  
5 book the comparisons of the same ideology as the  
6 prophets. But what you fail to understand is the fear  
7 of that God who's going to back those words. Ezekiel  
8 says there will come a time when there will be the  
9 effect of every vision. Now you're going to be in  
10 trouble.

11           And you know something, one of the greatest  
12 things that's going to be done to people like you is  
13 that for 100 years all the great men, the mighty men,  
14 the wicked men of the earth are going to be hurled  
15 together. And that's going to be your hell. You're  
16 going to live in a world where pride and arrogance  
17 (sic) opinion and self is going to be predominant. And  
18 you know what? There's people in the world that's been  
19 bigger than you, more deceptive than you.

20           Now, I asked for you milk for the children.  
21 They're neutral. And God is registering exactly  
22 everything --

23           DICK: David, I understand they're neutral.  
24 Send those kids out. They are neutral. Send them out.

25           DAVID: Hey. I told you my God said wait.  
Now if you want to make a move, buster, go ahead and

1 | make a move.

2 |           DICK: We -- David I'll assure you --

3 |           DAVID: Now --

4 |           DICK: -- that there is not going to be any  
5 | move made.

6 |           DAVID: Listen to me. It doesn't make any  
7 | difference to me at this point. Because like I said,  
8 | you're going to learn the hard way. And I got a gift  
9 | for you. You read Psalms 137 and let me remind you it  
10 | shall be filled upon you and your family to the letter.  
11 | Do you understand? Read this Psalm and try to observe  
12 | some wisdom. And that's from God.

13 |           DICK: David, you said you cared about me the  
14 | other day. And then all of a sudden now you're mad at  
15 | me. I don't understand why.

16 |           DAVID: Hey. You're getting me mad. And  
17 | that's all right --

18 |           DICK: Well, I'm not trying to.

19 |           DAVID: -- because in Psalms 2 you don't want  
20 | to kiss with me, then go ahead and make me angry.  
21 | Remember, it's just the Bible. If it's not true, you  
22 | have no fears. But if it's true, you have a great fear  
23 | to come upon you unlike you've ever known.

24 |           DICK: David, I read an article to, to Steve  
25 | and to Nicole with that, you know, is representative of  
   | some of the stuff that people are saying. Can I give

1 OLIVER: This is Oliver.  
2 DICK: What's your name, please?  
3 OLIVER: My name is Oliver.  
4 DICK: Oliver?  
5 OLIVER: Gyarfas.  
6 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: Oliver.  
7 DICK: Spell that last name?  
8 OLIVER: G-Y-A-R-F-A-S.  
9 DICK: Okay. What can I do for you?  
10 OLIVER: I'm Hungarian.  
11 DICK: Okay.  
12 OLIVER: Yeah, I have a sister here that has  
13 a young baby.  
14 DICK: All right. What is her name, and  
15 what's the baby's name? (Unidentified voices in  
16 background not discernible.)  
17 OLIVER: Her name is Isha (phonetic sp.)  
18 Gyarsas. She's my sister.  
19 DICK: Okay. And, and she has a baby? What  
20 age is the baby?  
21 OLIVER: She's around 1, 1-1/2.  
22 DICK: She needs some milk is what you're  
23 saying.  
24 OLIVER: Yes, she needs the milk. You know,  
25 she's real hungry. She, she's dependent on it.  
DICK: I absolutely am willing to get that



1 | milk in to you. I've communicated that to Nicole,  
2 | Steve and David this morning a number of times.

3 |           OLIVER: She's also fixing to have another  
4 | one.

5 |           DICK: Well, what time is she going to do  
6 | that? I mean how far along is she?

7 |           OLIVER: It's quite soon. I'm not really  
8 | sure as to the date but, you know --

9 |           DICK: Okay. Well, let's get the milk in.  
10 | We're, we're willing -- you know. We're willing and  
11 | we're ready to do it.

12 |           OLIVER: Well, when? You know --

13 |           DICK: As soon as you get the children with  
14 | their coats on and send them out. (Unidentified male  
15 | voice in background not discernible.)

16 |           OLIVER: I don't, I don't think we can send  
17 | the children out, you know.

18 |           DICK: You know, David just told me that the  
19 | kids are neutral. That means that there is no reason  
20 | for the children to stay there. (Unidentified male  
21 | voice in background not discernible.) We've asked that  
22 | four children come out, and we will send in milk. An  
23 | adult will come out with them and take the milk back  
24 | in, and the children will be, will remain with us. And  
25 | we will ensure their safety and their, and their care  
and their well-being. Your sister, please, have her

1 send one of her children out.

2 OLIVER: See we, we understand that. But at  
3 the moment, we want to keep the kids. And while we're  
4 keeping the kids we'd, we'd like some milk for the  
5 kids, you know? I mean --

6 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: That's what you  
7 want.

8 DICK: That's exactly what I want to do.

9 OLIVER: -- I'm sure we'd send them out  
10 eventually. But you know, it's -- we, we want milk  
11 right now, because they need it right now.

12 DICK: I understand. And we're ready to go  
13 right now. We're ready to go right now. You have to  
14 tell David and others -- and you guys sit down and talk  
15 about this.

16 OLIVER: Believe me, we have.

17 DICK: Don't let somebody make your decision  
18 for you.

19 OLIVER: Oh, no.

20 DICK: Talk it over amongst yourselves. Get  
21 together with your sister.

22 OLIVER: Hey, if I wanted to leave, buddy,  
23 I'd leave right now.

24 DICK: I'm not suggesting you'd leave at all.  
25 Not at all.

OLIVER: I want to stay here with my family.

1           DICK: Great. Great. I feel, I feel happy  
2 for you. However, those children are not old enough to  
3 make that decision on their own, are they? You -- we  
4 have to help one another out here. And we need some  
5 show of your good faith and willingness to, to work  
6 with us. And we're happy to do that.

7           OLIVER: We just want some milk. It's no big  
8 deal.

9           DICK: The milk, the milk is ready.

10          OLIVER: We gave you money. We gave you  
11 \$1,000.

12          DICK: Listen, we're -- the money. You know,  
13 we'll send the money back to you folks if you're  
14 concerned about the money.

15          OLIVER: No, we want milk. We don't want  
16 money. We want milk.

17          DICK: Well, no, that's not an issue then.  
18 The money is not an issue. The milk we will have for  
19 you. We have the milk for you.

20          OLIVER: Well, send it over for God's sake.  
21 What's your problem?

22          DICK: Pardon me? Pardon me?

23          OLIVER: Send it over for God's sake.

24          DICK: We're ready to send it to you. You  
25 know, I don't know how I can, I can tell you any -- you  
know, we're ready. We're ready to go. It's here.

1 It's a demonstration of what we're willing to do for  
2 you. But yet on the other hand, you're unwilling to do  
3 anything for us.

4 OLIVER: We sent you a lot of kids, buddy.  
5 We, we did send you, send you a lot of kids.

6 DICK: There are a number of kids that came  
7 out. And is that something that we're supposed to be  
8 happy about? It's these children --

9 OLIVER: Well, sure --

10 DICK: -- that we're interested in caring  
11 for. I mean you, you think that's something, you know,  
12 is that for me? Or I mean what it is it's for the  
13 welfare of those children and the families.

14 OLIVER: Oh, yes.

15 DICK: You said -- David said that all of you  
16 would come out if we allowed you to do certain things  
17 which we allowed. We -- you, you put the tape  
18 together. We didn't edit it. It got on national  
19 television in its entirety. No editing. David assured  
20 us that as soon as that was done all of you were coming  
21 out. So we took David at his word.

22 OLIVER: Okay. There's someone else who  
23 wants to talk to you, another mother. Okay?

24 DICK: Put, put her on.

25 [gap]

KATHY: Hello?

1 DICK: Good morning.  
2 KATHY: Good morning.  
3 DICK: Who is this?  
4 KATHY: This is Kathy.  
5 DICK: Kathy, how are you this morning?  
6 KATHY: Just fine (indiscernible).  
7 DICK: I hope you're doing better.  
8 KATHY: I'm sorry?  
9 DICK: I hope you're doing well.  
10 KATHY: Well, I'm trying. It's hard with the  
11 babies when they're hungry and crying for the milk  
12 we've asked for.  
13 DICK: Kathy, I'm a father of two children.  
14 KATHY: Then you should understand.  
15 DICK: I completely understand.  
16 KATHY: Doesn't seem like it.  
17 DICK: I understand your concern. And I will  
18 agree. I want to get the milk in. I've told David  
19 that. I've told Steven that. I've told that to  
20 Nicole. I'll tell it to you. And, and the fellow I  
21 just spoke with. I've told you all the same thing. We  
22 have the milk. We'll, we'll get the milk in to you.  
23 But --  
24 KATHY: Oh, you have the milk. Good, good.  
25 DICK: The milk we --  
KATHY: Will we be expecting it today, then?

1           DICK: You will expect it as soon as you send  
2 the kids out to us.

3           KATHY: As soon -- we don't need the milk to  
4 send the kids out to you.

5           DICK: Pardon me?

6           KATHY: Not only that, but I don't really  
7 want to send my child out to you. Know why? Because  
8 you did not keep your promise. Those children were to  
9 be sent to their homes with people they know, they're  
10 familiar with. You go off, you keep them at some  
11 house. I don't know where they are.

12          DICK: Kathy, they're all together.

13          KATHY: Cut off their hair. Oh, my God.

14          DICK: Kathy, that's completely in error.  
15 One child asked to have his or her hair cut.

16          KATHY: One child asked to have his hair cut?  
17 Which one?

18          DICK: I don't know which child it was. I  
19 don't have the name. However, those children are being  
20 well cared for. And there was some concern, and I'm  
21 sure you had some concern, too, about how the kids were  
22 going to be cared for. So rather than have somebody  
23 accept my word, we got a videotape --

24          KATHY: Dick, Dick, Dick, Dick. Why did  
25 Nahara have his hair cut?

          DICK: Pardon me?

1 KATHY: Why did Nahara have his hair cut?

2 DICK: I have no idea. But you know what, I  
3 will find that out for you. That's --

4 KATHY: Thank you. I would appreciate that.

5 DICK: We will do that. And please tell Sita  
6 that we will find that out.

7 KATHY: Okay.

8 DICK: We'll be happy to. But Sita was  
9 worried about her child having pork. And I've assured  
10 her that that child is not having pork. You know --

11 KATHY: Good --

12 DICK: -- I know you folks are concerned  
13 about the care of those kids. The only person that  
14 will do a better job is the mother or the father. And  
15 you have that option, but you're not going to exercise  
16 that option. So --

17 KATHY: We, we really have no choice in that  
18 matter --

19 DICK: Are you going to hold me --

20 KATHY: -- as far as your treatment, as far  
21 as what you've done.

22 DICK: We are treating those children very,  
23 very well.

24 KATHY: When you find out why Nahara got his  
25 hair cut, please make sure you call us back and tell  
us. We're very concerned.

1           DICK: I'm going to run that down certainly.  
2 I'll --

3           KATHY: Good.

4           DICK: -- I'll find out. Kathy, I will have  
5 the milk there for you. Please, talk among yourself  
6 and, and let's work together on this. And, and you  
7 folks get together. And the overriding concern in this  
8 whole, this whole thing is for the care of those  
9 children immediately.

10          KATHY: Okay, well, when you find out all  
11 these things and when you get the milk sent out, please  
12 call back, okay? Goodbye.

13                   \* \* \* \* \*

14          SCOTT: Hello?

15          DICK: Hello, this is Dick. Who's this?

16          SCOTT: Scott.

17          DICK: Scott, listen. I just wanted to let  
18 you folks know, and I'm sure you have not forgotten.  
19 But the daily press briefing that I know you have a lot  
20 of interest in --

21          SCOTT: Um-hum.

22          DICK: -- is going to be on in short moments.  
23 And we'll get back to you after the conclusion of that.

24          SCOTT: Okay.

25          DICK: All right. Very well.

          SCOTT: Okay, bye.



1 DICK: Bye now.

2 \* \* \* \* \*

3 DICK: We didn't do something right. We got  
4 no ringing.

5 \* \* \* \* \*

6 STEVE: Hello?

7 DICK: Hello?

8 STEVE: Hello?

9 DICK: Hello, Steve?

10 STEVE: Yes. Dick?

11 DICK: Can you hear me?

12 STEVE: Yes, I can hear you.

13 DICK: Okay, well, I can't hear you well.

14 STEVE: You can't?

15 DICK: How about now?

16 STEVE: Yeah, I -- you're fine. I can hear  
17 you very plainly.

18 DICK: Listen, you've got a guy up in your  
19 tower there with a balaclava on and cammy paint.  
20 What's going on out there? You think this is a game?

21 STEVE: Listen. I don't even know what  
22 you're --

23 DICK: Well, get --

24 STEVE: -- what's -- tell me what's happening  
25 now?

DICK: I'm telling you that you've got a man

1 in cammy paint and a balaclava --

2 STEVE: Wait, what's -- I don't even know  
3 what --

4 DICK: Camouflage paint.

5 STEVE: Okay, there's a guy with camouflage  
6 paint and he's where at?

7 DICK: In your tower.

8 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: Upper left-  
9 hand --

10 STEVE: Well, what do you mean there's a --

11 DICK: Upper left-hand window of your tower  
12 in the center back side.

13 STEVE: And what is he supposed to be doing?

14 DICK: Well, the question is you think this  
15 is a game? You think this is a game we're playing?

16 STEVE: I don't even know -- what are you  
17 talking about, Dick? Make yourself plain. There's a  
18 guy in the tower. What does that mean?

19 DICK: With camouflage paint as though he's  
20 looking the area over and making some sort of a move on  
21 something. Is that what you want to do?

22 STEVE: I don't -- now this is the first I've  
23 even heard of it. I don't even know what you're  
24 talking about. I'd have to go investigate.

25 DICK: Well, then you better find out what  
we're talking about. You're the person in charge in

1 | there, you and David. You better take care of these  
2 | kinds of things, and you better control those people in  
3 | there.

4 |           STEVE: Or what? Do you want to take us --  
5 | do you want to come in and take us out?

6 |           DICK: No. That's exactly what we do not  
7 | want to do.

8 |           STEVE: Okay, just relax a minute. Let me  
9 | find out what is going on.

10 |           DICK: You find, you find out --

11 |           STEVE: This is the first I've heard  
12 | anything. I don't even know what you're talking about.

13 |           DICK: You find out. It's the --

14 |           STEVE: Look, I'll call you back.

15 |           DICK: -- upper window on the tower. You  
16 | find out what --

17 |           STEVE: I'll call you back, Dick.

18 |           DICK: Very well.

19 |           STEVE: Okay, bye.

20 |                           \* \* \* \* \*

21 |           DICK: Hello?

22 |           STEVE: Hello, Dick?

23 |           DICK: Yes.

24 |           STEVE: I went and checked it out. Someone  
25 | was looking out the window. They might -- they had a  
   | camouflage jacket on. Is that what you're talking

1 about?

2 DICK: And a balaclava.

3 STEVE: And a bottle of what?

4 DICK: A balaclava.

5 STEVE: I have -- what is a balaclava.

6 DICK: Well, you check with your people and  
7 find out what a balaclava is if you don't know what it  
8 is.

9 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: Hood.

10 STEVE: I have no idea.

11 DICK: It's a hood. It's a hood.

12 STEVE: It's a what?

13 DICK: It's a hood that goes over the face.

14 STEVE: We don't even have such a thing. I  
15 don't know where on earth you have that. There's a  
16 woman up there -- we got some jackets a long time ago.  
17 Some guy sold us some things. They were cheap like a  
18 dollar or so for the clothes. So the -- and they're  
19 100 percent cotton. There's a woman up there that had  
20 a jacket on that is looking out the window.

21 DICK: Let me tell you something, Steve. I'm  
22 sitting here trying to work with you getting no  
23 cooperation from you --

24 STEVE: Are you, are you hearing me though?

25 DICK: And then --

STEVE: That's -- I'm telling you what it is.

1 I checked it out. That's exactly what it was.

2 DICK: Well, I'm glad you did. But let's  
3 caution those people in there about those kinds of  
4 things. We've got people out there that get concerned  
5 when they see that kind of thing.

6 STEVE: See someone looking out the window?

7 DICK: No.

8 STEVE: No, no. You listen to me. We --

9 DICK: Making those kind --

10 STEVE: -- get concerned when you're on our  
11 damn property and you have never come around and said  
12 what you would do from the beginning. I am tired of  
13 even dealing with you, Dick. I really am tired of it  
14 day after day after day going on this merry-go-round  
15 with you. Over and over again the same thing. Remove  
16 your crap off our property, and we might get serious  
17 with you like you originally said.

18 You call me threatening me because we have a  
19 human being in our building looking out the window with  
20 a bala what is it, whatever it is? You speak your  
21 stupid, crazy language. I don't even know what you're  
22 talking about. Don't accuse me and threaten me of  
23 anything. If you want to take me out and take these  
24 people out, do so. You don't believe in God. You  
25 don't believe in the Bible. Try it and find out. I'm  
anxious to see myself.

1 UNIDENTIFIED MALE SPEAKER: See if they  
2 believe in God.

3 STEVE: See if you believe in a God. I know,  
4 I really know you don't.

5 DICK: You think you're the only one that  
6 talks to God out there?

7 STEVE: I have never said that, Dick. But I  
8 mean these, the way your manner has been round and  
9 around, we've only -- we've been so clear about things  
10 from the beginning with you --

11 DICK: If anything that you have been clear  
12 about --

13 STEVE: -- you guys, you have not complied --  
14 no, no, no. You have not complied from day one with  
15 having your vehicles on our private property which you  
16 agreed to. You agreed to that, Dick, you and your  
17 people there. And still they wander around, and you've  
18 got the audacity to call me up because a human being is  
19 looking out a window when you've got guys in our  
20 automobiles, moving our motorcycles, doing things that  
21 you never called me about.

22 You know what I want to say to you? And I'm  
23 trying to hold back. Because I still love you and your  
24 soul and those people down there. I do want to  
25 communicate with you. We all do. But what is this  
one-sided business, Dick? Let's start being real

1 | serious.

2 |           DICK: That's our point.

3 |           STEVE: No, no, it is not your point. You  
4 | start looking at what and then -- and you're recording  
5 | everything. You look to hear what you're saying. It  
6 | becomes very redundant when you're repetitively saying  
7 | the same thing -- (unidentified male voice in  
8 | background not discernible) --

9 |           DICK: Listen --

10 |          STEVE: Listen. And you're evading your  
11 | statements. You asked me to look at that press  
12 | conference. I did. It made me sick also.

13 |          DICK: Listen, when you fired on federal  
14 | officers, you lost some of your private property  
15 | rights.

16 |          STEVE: No, when they fired on human beings  
17 | that are to be protected by this very government which  
18 | is for the people, by the people. They should be stuck  
19 | in jail right now. That investigation should -- just a  
20 | minute. Here's David.

21 |          STEVE TO DAVID: He says we lost our rights  
22 | when we fired on them.

23 |          DAVID: Now, Dick, let me say something. You  
24 | think the only people in this organization is here at  
25 | this camp? You ask Robert Gonzales what I told him,  
   | what I've told everybody else. I've gone all around

1 | this world ever since 1985. We're not the only people  
2 | that believe this message.

3 |           DICK: David, you're not the only one that  
4 | listens to God either.

5 |           DAVID: No. Let me tell you something. My  
6 | God has seven seals. Your God does not. You do not  
7 | know the seven seals. You therefore are out of rank  
8 | with the living God. And this nation is going to learn  
9 | of a living God. As little David of old went before  
10 | Goliath, I stand before you. You and this nation's  
11 | going to learn there's a God in heaven. He has a  
12 | truth, and just because you wish to evade it, just  
13 | because you do not know the fear of the Lord does not  
14 | mean you're going to be without responsibility. You  
15 | are going to pay.

16 |           Now keep your press conferences going. Keep  
17 | communications going. But remember, I'm telling you  
18 | there's a lot more of us than you know. A lot more  
19 | than you realize.

20 |           DICK: What is that supposed to imply?

21 |           DAVID: That implies you go ahead and you do  
22 | with us what you feel. You go ahead and tell the press  
23 | what you want.

24 |           DICK: We're trying to --

25 |           DAVID: Because that's what you're doing.

          DICK: -- communicate to you in part --



1           DAVID: And I am trying to communicate with  
2 you. Everything I've said you've got recorded. Now  
3 you -- I suggest to you you review in the fear of God  
4 very prayerfully what I've shown you all over that  
5 scripture, all over that Bible.

6           DICK: Listen, David, we're going to work  
7 together to resolve this issue. We are --

8           DAVID: Oh, you, you --

9           DICK: -- going to do that.

10          DAVID: -- we, we referring to you and who  
11 else there?

12          DICK: No. That we meaning we here and you  
13 in there are going to work together to resolve this  
14 issue. And the sooner that we agree on that, the  
15 sooner we're going to get it resolved appropriately  
16 with --

17          DAVID: Do not call us up and tell us that  
18 someone is looking out the window. We have the right  
19 to look out. This is God's world. His sun is shining  
20 outside. We can look out if we want to.

21          DICK: I did not tell you to look out the  
22 window. I said take care in the manner in which you do  
23 that so nothing --

24          DAVID: Right. You fire on us --

25          DICK: So that nothing happens.

          DAVID: -- you fire on us and it starts.

1 DICK: There is no firing going to be done.

2 DAVID: Okay. So you don't have to warn us  
3 about looking out the window then.

4 DICK: I am telling you that the safety rules  
5 need to be followed. We talked --

6 DAVID: Okay. So follow them.

7 DICK: -- about that. You understand them.  
8 We understand them.

9 DAVID: Follow them.

10 DICK: And as long as we both understand  
11 them, there will be no problem.

12 DAVID: Follow them then, Dick. Okay?

13 DICK: Do we agree? They're -- the safety  
14 rules --

15 DAVID: We agree.

16 DICK: -- are going to be followed. Is that  
17 correct?

18 DAVID: Mine and yours.

19 DICK: Absolutely. There will be no  
20 problems. But we'll work together with one another to  
21 ensure that does not happen.

22 DAVID: Are you worried about dying, Dick?

23 DICK: Am I worried about dying?

24 DAVID: Yes.

25 DICK: Not today or tomorrow, now.

DAVID: Okay. That's good. We share the

1 same.

2 DICK: Well, then let's get this worked out  
3 between us and ensure that there is no further injury  
4 to anybody on either side. And to do that --

5 DAVID: Well, then why are you calling us up  
6 now? What's the nature of this call?

7 DICK: The nature of the call is to --

2 DICK: -- we must communicate with one  
3 another.

4 DAVID: So in other words every time we look  
5 out the window we have to call and tell you?

6 DICK: No, that is not what you have to do.  
7 However --

8 DAVID: Are you saying that someone was  
9 looking out the window with a high-powered rifle scoped  
10 in on one of your men? Is that what you're saying?

11 DICK: No. But there is some concern that  
12 given what had happened there if people are wearing  
13 camo paint -- you know what camo paint is, do you not?

14 DAVID: Yes, I do.

15 DICK: All right. We're concerned when we  
16 see people wearing balaclavas on a nice day like this  
17 looking out the window with black face paint on.

18 DAVID: Well, what's wrong with that?

19 DICK: Well, what does that indicate to you?

20 DAVID: It indicates war, Dick.

21 DICK: Well, that's not what we want. And  
22 that's not what you want.

23 DAVID: Okay. Then why are you bringing this  
24 military equipment here for war? Why did the ATF  
25 agents come in here after I had been --

DICK: For the safety of all parties

1 involved --

2           DAVID: No. For the safety of themselves so  
3 they could come in, push around a bunch of people, kick  
4 people down on the ground and exalt about it the next  
5 few days about how they pushed American citizens  
6 around. That's going to stop, Dick.

7           DICK: I read to you this morning --

8           DAVID: Do you understand me?

9           DICK: -- what the press, what the response  
10 was.

11           DAVID: This is just the beginning, Dick.  
12 There's a lot more of us than you realize, Dick.

13           DICK: I understand what you're saying,  
14 David. But let's end --

15           DAVID: You do not understand.

16           DICK: -- let's end it now that's still --

17           DAVID: Mr., Mr. General Public is also  
18 watching too.

19           DICK: Absolutely. I read you an excerpt  
20 from a, from a article this morning concerning the  
21 people in the public that are, are concerned and are  
22 watching. And they support the fact that your  
23 contention that the government was at fault. There are  
24 a lot of people that understand that --

25           DAVID: I am saying --

          DICK: -- an would agree with you.

1           DAVID: I'm not saying that the government at  
2 large is at fault. I am saying that the government  
3 which is supposed to be of the people, for the people,  
4 by the people are ignorant that there are certain  
5 powers in the hands of certain individuals who are not  
6 responsible enough to hold those positions.

7           DICK: Then take the opportunity to explain  
8 that.

9           DAVID: I am going to as soon as I get my  
10 message --

11          DICK: Well, then we're in agreement. We  
12 agree on that, do we not?

13          DAVID: Now -- yes. So stop calling us up  
14 and making these bogus and very silly and stupid  
15 offers.

16          DICK: Let's follow the rules for our --

17          DAVID: The babies are innocent. Now --

18          DICK: Absolutely.

19          DAVID: -- send the milk for the babies.

20          DICK: Let's -- absolutely. We're ready to  
21 go. You send the kids out as we have agreed and what  
22 we talked about, and the milk will get in.

23          DAVID: We never agreed to that. You agreed  
24 to that. I did not agree to that. You agreed to that.

25          DICK: Well, let's agree to it then. Let's  
agree to it then.

1           DAVID: Absolutely not. You send the milk  
2 for the --

3           DICK: Let's get it done.

4           DAVID: Look. Three children ago we agreed  
5 on the milk. You've lied three children ago.

6           DICK: There was no lie.

7           DAVID: Mark -- yes. Mark was the one that  
8 we agreed on the milk. Jim says I'll see what we --

9           DICK: That is absolutely untrue. David,  
10 listen. Don't --

11          DAVID: Oh, it isn't. I'm a liar then. We  
12 can't do nothing I say.

13          DICK: Don't put words in my mouth. I will  
14 not put words in your mouth. Let's have mutual respect  
15 for one another. I will listen to you. You will  
16 listen to me. Is that agreed?

17          DAVID: To a degree.

18          DICK: Let's talk. Let's get this done.

19          DAVID: What is the talk accomplishing?

20          DICK: Let's get off, let's get off the  
21 center mark here. We'll get the milk in to you. You  
22 send kids out.

23          DAVID: You stated on the TV, you stated on  
24 the TV that you offered us the milk and we refused it.

25          DICK: That's exactly true.

          DAVID: Oh, it is. Oh, wait a minute.



1           DICK: We offered you -- I am offering you  
2 once again the milk. Right here and now I am offering  
3 you the milk.

4           STEVE: We heard such a one-sided thing. You  
5 never brought in how it was part of a negotiation, that  
6 it was a part of a bargaining process, an exchange.  
7 It, it came -- hello, Dick?

8           DICK: I'm here.

9           STEVE: Okay. You know yourself it came  
10 across loud and clear like you were offering to us but  
11 for some crazy reason we rejected it. Over and over  
12 again --

13           DICK: You reject our terms. Did you not  
14 reject our terms?

15           STEVE: That was not made clear that it was  
16 terms or anything else. It was --

17           DICK: Absolutely. It was very clear to me.

18           STEVE: I listened to this very well.

19           DICK: I watched the same thing you did. I  
20 watched the same thing you did, and it was very clear  
21 to me.

22           STEVE: The, the -- in fact, breaking that  
23 whole session down, the connotations that were given  
24 and a lot of phrases that were made I was, I was  
25 amazed. It seems like it is breaking down just by the  
very person Bob Ricks the way he was speaking.

1 Sometimes he came through okay. Show complete  
2 honesty --

3 DICK: Show us a sign, Steve.

4 STEVE: -- in regards to these negotiations.

5 DICK: Show us a sign that you care one iota  
6 about what we're trying to --

7 STEVE: We have --

8 DICK: -- accomplish here.

9 STEVE: -- Dick, haven't we have been?

10 DICK: Show us one sign. Show us one sign.

11 STEVE: Haven't we been by sending out  
12 children and all the rest?

13 DICK: When did you send out your last child?

14 DAVID: Not because (indiscernible).

15 STEVE: And that -- that's right. And that's  
16 not even because you asked. It's because David  
17 originated the thing to begin with. Is that --

18 DICK: Fine. I am --

19 STEVE: -- not true?

20 DICK: -- asking now and I have been asking  
21 for several days as has John Cox. Let's get together.  
22 Send those children out. We'll send the milk in.  
23 We'll get that resolved on the television next time  
24 around --

25 STEVE: Can I ask you? You be frank with me  
now. What was the reason for you calling me up over

1 | such a thing with that kind of a spirit and --

2 |           DICK: Because --

3 |           STEVE: -- tell me what that was about.

4 |           DICK: -- I will tell you. Okay, would you

5 | listen to me? I've told --

6 |           STEVE: I am listening.

7 |           DICK: -- you that before.

8 |           STEVE: I am listening.

9 |           DICK: We have people outside as you well

10 | know. These people are somewhat exposed at times, all

11 | right? They're concerned about their safety on the

12 | outside as well as you're concerned about your safety

13 | on the inside. When someone goes to a window with a

14 | balaclava which you were not familiar with. I will

15 | explain that --

16 |           STEVE: We don't have, we don't have such a

17 | thing by the way. That is wrong. It's incorrect.

18 | Take a picture and show it and send it to me.

19 |           DICK: And -- well, how about black paint on

20 | the face?

21 |           STEVE: No black paint on the face. You're

22 | looking at a dark-skinned woman that was looking out a

23 | window.

24 |           DICK: A dark-skinned woman --

25 |           STEVE: That's correct.

          DICK: -- looking out the -- in camouflage?

1 STEVE: No, that had a camouflage jacket on.

2 DICK: I will relay that to those folks who  
3 made the report.

4 STEVE: The excitement of you who's in a safe  
5 place. These people are in Bradleys, and they're  
6 reporting such things, someone looks out. I mean  
7 incredible.

8 DICK: Well, what are you reporting to us?  
9 Did you not report to us --

10 STEVE: Everything. We, we were getting  
11 back --

12 DICK: -- things that concern you?

13 STEVE: -- remember how this morning how I  
14 talked to you about bringing some kerosene in for  
15 heaters, because there was a chill. It was cold. We  
16 had run out.

17 DICK: I heard you talk about, yeah.

18 STEVE: Yes. And you didn't respond to that.  
19 I was waiting for you to call back after that session  
20 and we pick up to where we were.

21 DICK: It was not --

22 STEVE: And instead of you calling back with  
23 something of substance, you're calling back with  
24 something that is so foolish. Here are full-grown  
25 military men in armor, iron clad vehicles, and they're  
concerned about someone's face looking out the window

1 with a bala whatever it is on their face. In the first  
2 place it's not even true.

3 DICK: Would you have us just stand out there  
4 on the road? Is that what you would prefer that we  
5 did?

6 STEVE: Did I say anything like that?

7 DICK: Okay. Then understand what those  
8 Bradleys are for.

9 STEVE: Don't we show -- aren't we showing a  
10 lot of trust with yourself, because we're not squawking  
11 and screaming like these people are constantly?

12 DICK: (Unidentified male voice in background  
13 not discernible.) Listen, the Bradleys will remain  
14 there with the people in them for protective. Okay,  
15 for protective reasons.

16 STEVE: Have I said any --

17 DICK: All right?

18 STEVE: -- and did I ever say anything about  
19 that, Dick?

20 DICK: Yes, you did.

21 STEVE: No, only from what Jim --

22 DICK: We have talked about that at length  
23 over the last 2 days.

24 STEVE: Only from -- hey, Dick, but only from  
25 what Jim gave us from the beginning. And in fact it  
was conversations in the beginning right after that one

1 | which had said --

2 |           DICK: Things -- Steve, things are fluid  
3 | here, all right? We make -- we do certain things as a  
4 | result of what you do or do not do. We will continue  
5 | to do that to ensure our safety. We are trying to  
6 | ensure your safety as well.

7 |           STEVE: And you should -- that's why I have  
8 | reiterated to you, Dick, that our concern for your very  
9 | people -- we do not -- we didn't fire first that time.  
10 | And this time watch and see what happens. Never have  
11 | we ever attempted to take human life. We are the ones  
12 | that wanted these guys to get out of here safely to a  
13 | hospital. Not only did we agree with them, we were  
14 | amazed at how slow they were coming on and taking off  
15 | the wounded. Just a moment. Here's David.

16 |           DAVID: I was talking with some of the guys.

17 |           DICK: Okay.

18 |           DAVID: Did you know there was three of your  
19 | agents that were being held at gunpoint? Did you know  
20 | that?

21 |           DICK: Three of the ATF agents?

22 |           DAVID: Yeah, one guy -- yes. One guy, 6'3",  
23 | was crying please, don't shoot. Don't shoot. And the  
24 | guys --

25 |           DICK: What, what are -- what point are you  
making there?

1           DAVID: And, and the guys did not shoot him.

2           DICK: Well, I, I --

3           DAVID: Now did you know that Wayne, did you  
4 know that Wayne faced one of your ATF agents too.  
5 These guys were scared to death.

6           DICK: You think our agents didn't or the ATF  
7 agents didn't face some of your people?

8           DAVID: Oh, I know they did. They tried to  
9 shoot them.

10          DICK: Let's face it.

11          DAVID: They tried to shoot them.

12          DICK: Both sides were concerned, confused  
13 and probably scared.

14          DAVID: No, no. We weren't confused, and we  
15 were not scared, no. The women were the ones taken by  
16 surprise.

17          DICK: Well, listen, listen. If you were not  
18 scared --

19          DAVID: Now look --

20          DICK: -- when somebody is firing at you  
21 then, then, you know, you're, you're an unusual person.

22          DAVID: Hey, I was the one that went -- I was  
23 the one that went to the door, remember? I was the one  
24 that first met them all. I was the one first fired at  
25 several times.

          DICK: Fine. All right.

1           DAVID: You like to -- that's all right.

2           Okay, cool. Now --

3           DICK: No, I'm saying I will believe you.

4           DAVID: Okay, here's the thing.

5           DICK: Tell me that.

6           DAVID: Here's the thing. That agent that  
7 shot me, you see what I'm saying, the only reason why  
8 he --

9           DICK: Okay.

10          DAVID: -- he shot me was because I was going  
11 to say something to him, and he wasn't fired upon.

12          DICK: All right.

13          DAVID: Otherwise, he would have never shot  
14 me. You don't seem to understand our appreciation for  
15 life --

16          DICK: David, make that point.

17          DAVID: -- or our love for souls.

18          DICK: David, if you have a self-defense  
19 defense, then make that case. Make that case.

20          DAVID: I'm going to.

21          DICK: That's all we want you to do. And  
22 that's what we've been telling you for several days.

23          DAVID: You want me to come out.

24          DICK: Absolutely.

25          DAVID: I told you I'm going to come out. My  
problem is -- your problem is you don't understand that



1 | there's a chain of command here. You don't --

2 |         DICK: The question is, David --

3 |         DAVID: -- where I got this information from.

4 | You do not believe. You are not a believer in the  
5 | spirit of prophecy.

6 |         DICK: David, you gave us your word that you  
7 | would leave that compound --

8 |         DAVID: Yes. Now you take it up with God.

9 |         DICK: Listen to me now. Listen to me. You  
10 | told us that you would leave that compound with all the  
11 | folks out there --

12 |         DAVID: Immediately.

13 |         DICK: -- after you were allowed to make a  
14 | broadcast over the Christian Broadcast Network.

15 |         DAVID: That's exactly what I said. I agree  
16 | with you.

17 |         DICK: Now did you break your word? Did you  
18 | break your word?

19 |         DAVID: Yes, I broke my word. Did you break  
20 | your word?

21 |         DICK: No.

22 |         DAVID: Yes, you did.

23 |         DICK: We followed up --

24 |         DAVID: Oh.

25 |         DICK: -- as a result of your non-compliance.

       DAVID: Now --

1 DICK: Did we not?

2 DAVID: No.

3 DICK: Now answer me that question?

4 DAVID: Wrong.

5 DICK: Did you agree to come out?

6 DAVID: Wrong. Yes.

7 DICK: You just told me you agreed to come  
8 out.

9 DAVID: Yes. Now you want to start twisting  
10 words and start getting nowhere? You want to play the  
11 rubber band word routine? (Unidentified male voice in  
12 background not discernible.) Now my God stated to  
13 wait. Things are being developed at this very moment.  
14 Okay?

15 DICK: Things are being developed by the law  
16 enforcement community here at the same time. You  
17 understand that?

18 DAVID: I do understand that.

19 DICK: Well, you better understand it, David.

20 DAVID: I do.

21 DICK: Because we got to work out a  
22 resolution to this.

23 DAVID: You big boys do what you got to do,  
24 and we'll do what we have to do. All right?

25 DICK: Let's --

DAVID: If you don't want to sit and wait

1 | like I asked, then make your move.

2 |           DICK: We're working together. Nobody's  
3 | going to make a move. But you're going to have to work  
4 | with us. We're going to have to work together to get  
5 | this resolved safely.

6 |           DAVID: Look. The talk is becoming vain. I  
7 | told you I am ready and willing to come out. You do  
8 | not understand me. You do not understand what I'm  
9 | saying. You do not believe me. I've already sent  
10 | children out to you. I made that move. You did not  
11 | require --

12 |           DICK: You told me that the children are  
13 | innocent, do you not this morning?

14 |           DAVID: Oh, sure they are.

15 |           DICK: Then let's send them out. Let's send  
16 | them out of that house right now.

17 |           DAVID: No.

18 |           DICK: Let's send them out.

19 |           DAVID: So just --

20 |           DICK: You're telling me the children are  
21 | innocents --

22 |           DAVID: So they are.

23 |           DICK: -- but yet you want to keep them in  
24 | there?

25 |           DAVID: Look, I'm keeping --

          DICK: What is the purpose for that?

1           DAVID: Hey, none of your business.

2           DICK: Well, give me a reason for it.

3           DAVID: I don't have to.

4           DICK: Give me a reason. Give me --

5           DAVID: I don't have to.

6           DICK: -- give me a cogent reason for those  
7 kinds of things.

8           DAVID: I have right to remain silent.  
9 Anything I say can and will be held against me in a  
10 court of law. There is my Miranda rights.

11           You, you people just are so arrogant, so  
12 proud and so foolish. Why don't you learn the  
13 everlasting gospel? Why don't you believe Revelation  
14 14? Why don't you fear God and give him glory? Know  
15 what his judgment is? His judgment is he gave a book  
16 to his son. Why don't you believe that? Then you know  
17 the other part about Babylon is fallen. Your confusion  
18 would be gone. If you were to look at Psalms 2, you'd  
19 realize who you're fighting against.

20           DICK: David --

21           DAVID: Now look at --

22           DICK: -- you're not the only one that  
23 believes in God or a God, all right?

24           DAVID: No, no, no. I'm the only one that  
25 has the proper understanding of God and the light of  
the seven seals. Now contend with me on that. What's

1 the third seal? Where is it found? Tell me. Come on.  
2 You got the prophecies there in front of you. You got  
3 the Bible. Where's it at?

4 DICK: I'm not going to argue about the seals  
5 with you.

6 DAVID: Okay. Okay. Now look. You're --  
7 I'll give you an honest opportunity before God blows  
8 your rear-end away. You get on the phone. You call  
9 Vatican. You call everywhere you want to in the world.  
10 You find a priest. You find a teacher. And you tell  
11 him to tell you and show you where the third seal is.

12 DICK: David --

13 DAVID: Then I'll send you out another child.

14 DICK: -- listen. The seals are all well and  
15 good. And we will deal with --

16 DAVID: You don't know what they are.  
17 They're, they're evil against you though.

18 DICK: David, you can tell me about that.

19 DAVID: They're going to destroy you and  
20 punish you with immense torments. They're good for us.  
21 Bad for you though.

22 DICK: David, let's get those innocent  
23 children out of there.

24 DAVID: Okay. Call me up and show me where  
25 the third seal is, and then I'm going to send you more  
children out.

1           DICK: David, I told you that I am not in a  
2 position --

3           DAVID: Oh, what? Oh, so you don't want to  
4 take up God's little task here, huh?

5           DICK: It's not -- that's not the point.

6           DAVID: Father, it looks like you're going to  
7 have to do your work.

8           DICK: That is not the point, David.

9           DAVID: Oh, it is the point where I come  
10 from. You may not fear God. You may not fear his  
11 judiciary. You may laugh and scoff at his judgment.

12           DICK: David, I have never done that in all  
13 the conversations we had.

14           DAVID: Yes, you are doing that right now my  
15 friend. And you need to understand. That's what  
16 you're doing. And you're starting to make me mad. Now  
17 why don't you read Psalms 2 one more time. Let's try  
18 to calm down --

19           DICK: David, do you respect what I'm trying  
20 to do with you, for you?

21           DAVID: I respect nothing of you. Because  
22 you have not deserved such respect.

23           DICK: You don't believe that I have  
24 represented you --

25           DAVID: You do not respect what I'm trying to  
do for you, do you? You don't respect what I'm trying

1 | to do for you, do you?

2 |         DICK: David, I hear what you're saying.

3 |         DAVID: But you do not perceive it. Just  
4 | like Isaiah the prophet said. Having ears you hear  
5 | not, and having eyes you see not. A fat hard that's  
6 | put you to sleep. Hey, you need to read Isaiah 28 too.  
7 | It's a good prophecy about the drunkards.

8 |         DICK: David, I'm going to give you what my  
9 | understanding of the third seal is. And I want you to  
10 | get the kids in their coats and send them up the  
11 | street, and I will tell you what my belief concerning  
12 | the third seal is.

13 |         DAVID: I don't want your opinion. Give me  
14 | the prophetic fact.

15 |         DICK: The black horse and the rider. All  
16 | right? I'm going to give you part of it. You send  
17 | those kids out, and I will go into detail with the rest  
18 | of it. The measure of wheat for a penny. Three  
19 | measures of barley for a penny. Hurt not the oil and  
20 | the wine. Revelation 6, verses 5 and 6. Get those  
21 | children together, and send them out the door.

22 |         DAVID: That's your interpretation?

23 |         DICK: (Unidentified male voice in background  
24 | not discernible.) That is the third seal. My  
25 | understanding is based on some of the things that you  
told us and some our examinations of Revelation 6,

1 verses 5 and 6. Now if I am in error or if I am in  
2 wrong that may be in part. However, we are making an  
3 effort to determine what those are and to listen to you  
4 and to deal with what those things that you're telling  
5 us about.

6 In turn, I expect you to get those children  
7 together and send them out as we have agreed. I have  
8 done what --

9 DAVID: You keep saying as we have agreed.

10 DICK: You suggested --

11 DAVID: Where is the third seal found?

12 DICK: Revelation 6, verses 5 and 6 is a --

13 DAVID: (Making interruptive noise.) That  
14 seal must be a mystery of God he declared to the  
15 prophets. Where in the rise of the prophets is it  
16 found?

17 DICK: David, I'll be glad -- I'll be very,  
18 very glad to talk with you about that, okay? I'm not  
19 an expert on this.

20 DAVID: Steve, I think it's going to be  
21 time --

22 DICK: David, I'm not an expert on this.  
23 I've admitted that to you.

24 DAVID: I know. And because you're rejecting  
25 knowledge, God's going to reject you.

DICK: David, I don't reject any knowledge.



1 A person would have to be a fool to reject knowledge,  
2 would they not?

3 DAVID: Look. Let's hang up and let's calm  
4 down.

5 DICK: We'll talk about it.

6 DAVID: And you call me back --

7 DICK: We'll talk --

8 DAVID: -- a little bit later, all right?

9 DICK: We'll talk about it. Now listen --

10 DAVID: Because --

11 DICK: -- we talk about --

12 DAVID: -- I'm also human too.

13 DICK: I understand. And we talk about the  
14 third seal, and you're going to let some children leave  
15 the compound. Is that correct?

16 DAVID: You are going to show me the third  
17 seal, and I will let some children leave the compound.

18 DICK: David, how am I going to accept from  
19 you that what you say that -- (unidentified male voice  
20 in background not discernible) -- in other words, I  
21 tell you what the third seal is or what we believe the  
22 third seal might be. But then you're going to say no,  
23 that doesn't -- just like you did before. No --

24 DAVID: No, no, no. I never did that.

25 DICK: That's not, that's not the definition.  
That's not my explanation. That's not God's

1 | explanation. And then --

2 |           DAVID: It's self-obvious. It's in the  
3 | prophecies. It's obvious.

4 |           DICK: David, what's obvious to you may not  
5 | be obvious to others.

6 |           DAVID: Hey. Psalms 45 is obvious. That's  
7 | the first seal. It's obvious. Even you know that.  
8 | The same king, the same crown, the same bow.  
9 | Everything in Psalms 45 is the same as the first seal.  
10 | That's obvious. The second seal, the man on the red  
11 | horse. Hey, Zechariah's prophesy, the man on the red  
12 | horse. The same truth. The same seal.

13 |           DICK: They shall kill one another. He was  
14 | given a great sword.

15 |           DAVID: Yeah.

16 |           DICK: Great horse rider power was given to  
17 | him --

18 |           DAVID: But that revolved, that revolves  
19 | around --

20 |           DICK: -- to take peace from the earth.

21 |           DAVID: -- that revolves, that revolves  
22 | around Zechariah Chapter 1 and 2.

23 |           DICK: David, when I try to understand what  
24 | you're saying, you reject that out of hand. All right?

25 |           DAVID: I'm going to reject your opinions.  
But when you're showing me right out of the Bible,

1 reading it word for word, I'm going to accept it.

2 DICK: Hey, I'll be happy to read whatever it  
3 is that you feel that will help me understand this from  
4 the Bible. I will do that. There, you know, I'm not  
5 disagreeing with that. I don't --

6 DAVID: Look.

7 DICK: -- want to reject knowledge at all.

8 DAVID: Let's unwind. Your voice is becoming  
9 monotonous. Let's give it a fair chance. Sit back.  
10 Take control of yourself. Sit down. Sit with those  
11 other wise men of yours. And let's find that third  
12 seal.

13 DICK: David, I will agree to sit down and  
14 talk if you will agree to sit down and do the same  
15 thing with the folks out there. Okay?

16 DAVID: I am.

17 DICK: I explained --

18 DAVID: I already told you you could talk to  
19 the women.

20 DICK: I know. I know.

21 DAVID: It's not -- there's a lot of women  
22 here who want to talk to you.

23 DICK: I know that. But I'm, I'm suggesting  
24 that you talk together about the mutual welfare and,  
25 and concern that you have for your children out there.

DAVID: Look. You either are going to comply

1 with our small requirements --

2 DICK: I'm going to look. I'll give you my  
3 word.

4 DAVID: Or, or, or --

5 DICK: I'll give you my word on that.

6 DAVID: -- you're going to come in here and  
7 try to blow us up.

8 DICK: We're not going to do that.

9 DAVID: Look.

10 DICK: So we can start from that premise.

11 DAVID: You're going to try.

12 DICK: We're not going to do that. We're not  
13 going to try to do that. We can agree on that. And  
14 I'll call you back shortly with -- and we'll get  
15 together again.

16 DAVID: And there's some girls that want to  
17 talk to you.

18 DICK: I'll be happy --

19 DAVID: They, they want to give you a piece  
20 of their mind.

21 DICK: I'll be happy to talk with them.

22 DAVID: And you can do what you wish to. You  
23 can talk with them and, and, you know, convince them  
24 that they need to come out. And if they desire to,  
25 it's fine.

DICK: Well, kick --

1           DAVID: But right now, right now they're  
2 really interested in those 6 gallons of milk.

3           DICK: Okay. David, please, do me a, do me a  
4 favor at the same time. You talk amongst yourselves  
5 and determine if you think that the welfare of these  
6 children and the milk is worth some consideration. And  
7 I'll get back to you shortly.

8           DAVID: It's always been. It's the chief  
9 one.

10          DICK: Okay. I'll, I'll get back to you on  
11 it then. Okay?

12          DAVID: All right.

13          DICK: All right. Bye now.

14                               \* \* \*

15          STEVE: Hello?

16          DICK: Hello, Steve. Dick.

17          STEVE: Yeah, Dick. How you doing?

18          DICK: May I speak with David, please?

19          STEVE: Just a minute.

20               [gap]

21          STEVE: Totally out cold.

22          DICK: Well, wake him. I've -- he's  
23 suggested that he would talk to me as soon as I did  
24 some looking at the third seal and spent some time  
25 trying to understand and define the third seal. I've  
done that. It's been a couple hours, and I would like

1 | you to ask him to, to go ahead and talk with me,  
2 | please.

3 |               STEVE: I'll try to wake him but, you know,  
4 | I'm not going to shout or scream or anything. But I  
5 | will try. I'm looking right at him. He's, he's  
6 | definitely out. Just a minute.

7 |               DICK: Well, he -- I'm doing this at his  
8 | request.

9 |               STEVE: Just a minute. (David and Steve  
10 | speaking in background, not discernible.)

11 |               [gap]

12 |               STEVE: Okay. What have you found on the  
13 | third seal?

14 |               DICK: Well, I need to communicate this to  
15 | David.

16 |               STEVE: Why to him?

17 |               DICK: Well, because he's the one that asked  
18 | me to do it. And he told me that he would talk with me  
19 | and then --

20 |               STEVE: He said he would, he would talk with  
21 | you?

22 |               DICK: He did. And that once we were able to  
23 | resolve this third seal that he would send out  
24 | children.

25 |               STEVE: He wants to talk to you, because  
   | you're the one that told him that.

1           Here he is. Hang on, Dick.

2           DAVID: I'm here.

3           DICK: David.

4           DAVID: Yeah.

5           DICK: Dick.

6           DAVID: Go ahead.

7           DICK: I spent some time at your request  
8 looking at this third seal.

9           DAVID: All right.

10          DICK: And I believe your question to me is  
11 what is the third seal and what is -- what does the  
12 third seal represent?

13          DAVID: Where is it found in the Bible?

14          DICK: And it's my understanding that once --  
15 that you're going to send some children out once we get  
16 this, once we discuss this at some length. Is that --

17          DAVID: Uh-huh.

18          DICK: -- is that -- that is the agreement  
19 we're talking about, is it not?

20          DAVID: Yeah, where is it found.

21          DICK: And I appreciate your getting up. I  
22 know you're tired, but I appreciate your getting up  
23 and, and helping me out with this thing.

24          DAVID: Okay. Go ahead.

25          DICK: All right. We're -- the third seal  
we're talking about a famine condition that could be

1 brought on the Roman empire as a result of their  
2 persecution of the Christians in Asia Minor. We're  
3 dealing with a black horse and rider.

4 DAVID: Dick --

5 DICK: It has to do with possibility of  
6 famine and that people should, should measure out their  
7 wheat and that the days' wages --

8 DAVID: Dick. You know, I love you guys so  
9 much. But would you like me to share with you what the  
10 third seal is?

11 DICK: Certainly. But David --

12 DAVID: (Indiscernible.)

13 DICK: -- do I have your agreement, do I have  
14 your agreement that once we share this information with  
15 one another I will, I will give you what I, I've tried  
16 to determine and tried to find out. And I will listen  
17 to your representation.

18 DAVID: Now, wait a minute. Here, turn the  
19 light on, sweetheart. Thank you. Where's my Bible at?  
20 I'm going to -- got your Bible there, Dick?

21 DICK: Yes, I do.

22 DAVID: Okay. Did you ever get in touch with  
23 Robert?

24 DICK: No. We have not been in touch with  
25 Robert.

DAVID: Wait one second here, all right?



1 (David speaking in background, not discernible.)

2 [gap]

3 DAVID: Okay. You know, this is the most,  
4 this is the most profound and awesome riddle the world  
5 has ever received, isn't it?

6 DICK: Yes, it is.

7 DAVID: And you know it's -- and the end of  
8 the world ends on this riddle, you know? Okay.  
9 Let's -- let me remind you. In the third chapter of  
10 Revelation, Christ talks to the church of Philadelphia.  
11 And he tells them that he has the key of David, right?

12 DICK: Yes.

13 DAVID: He can open and none can shut, right?  
14 Now if it's true that in Chapter 10 of Revelation when  
15 Christ comes down as the mighty angel there's a mystery  
16 to his coming. He cries as when a lion roareth.  
17 There's the symbol, Lion and tribe of Judah, right?  
18 And he utters seven thunders, doesn't he? Seven  
19 thunders uttered their voices, right?

20 DICK: David, what verse are we reading,  
21 please? Let me follow along with you.

22 DAVID: Oh, okay. In Chapter 10 of  
23 Revelation.

24 DICK: Chapter 2 of Revelation.

25 DAVID: Ten. Chapter 10.

DICK: I'm sorry. I'm sorry. I

1 misunderstood you. Chapter 10 of Revelation.

2 DAVID: Chapter 10, yeah. I'm trying to wake  
3 up here.

4 DICK: All right. All right.

5 DAVID: Now we find out during the sixth --  
6 now remember, the seventh seal is contained in Chapter  
7 8. And in this seal, the seventh seal, the trumpets  
8 are being administered, right?

9 DICK: In the seventh seal, yes.

10 DAVID: Okay. Now during the sixth trumpet,  
11 what happens is, is that there's a, there's a picture  
12 of a large company of warriors, okay?

13 DICK: All right.

14 DAVID: There's 200 million.

15 DICK: 200 million warriors.

16 DAVID: Right. So where it says right here  
17 that -- okay, it tells us here that verses 13, and the  
18 sixth angel sounded, and I heard a voice from the four  
19 horns of the golden altar which is before God, saying  
20 to the sixth angel which had the trumpet, loose the  
21 four angels which are prepared which are bound in the  
22 great river Euphrates. Now Euphrates was the river  
23 that went under Babylon, right?

24 DICK: David, yes. But tell me where are you  
25 reading from?

DAVID: I'm reading from Revelation 9 --

1 DICK: Okay.

2 DAVID: -- 13.

3 DICK: Verse 13. Right. The sixth angel.

4 DAVID: Yes.

5 DICK: Sounded his trumpet.

6 DAVID: Exactly.

7 DICK: All right.

8 DAVID: Okay. So what happens is, is that  
9 Euphrates was the river that ran underneath Babylon,  
10 okay?

11 DICK: All right.

12 DAVID: Okay. And the four angels were  
13 loosed, which were prepared for an hour, a day, a  
14 month, and a year to slay the third part of men. Okay?

15 DICK: All right.

16 DAVID: And the number of the army of the  
17 horsemen were two hundred thousand thousand --

18 DICK: Or 200 million.

19 DAVID: Which is 200 million. Okay, now  
20 right now, these four angels which are loosed are  
21 liberated. They're really not bound. But what happens  
22 is, is that in Chapter 7 of Revelation these four  
23 angels were the same angels --

24 DICK: Standing at four corners of the earth.

25 DAVID: Of the earth holding the four winds  
of the earth, that the wind should not blow upon the

1 | earth or the sea or tree or anything. And the angels  
2 | in the east, their commander says hurt not till we have  
3 | sealed the servants of our God on their forehead.

4 |           Now in Jeremiah 30 and 31 refers to the  
5 | whirlwind of the Lord, it goes forth with a fury. When  
6 | those four winds are let loose, right?

7 |           DICK: All right.

8 |           DAVID: It creates a whirlwind. A gigantic  
9 | whirlwind. That's when Isaiah 21 says as whirlwinds in  
10 | the south go through. Talks about the anger of the  
11 | Lord. Okay? In Isaiah 27 what happens is, is this is  
12 | the time referred to in prophecy called the filling of  
13 | the 144,000. I'll go over here real quick and, and  
14 | show you real quick here. It's in 27th Chapter of  
15 | Isaiah. I'm reading this, because that way --

16 |           DICK: 27th Chapter of Isaiah?

17 |           DAVID: Yeah.

18 |           DICK: All right.

19 |           DAVID: In the 26th Chapter, the first of the  
20 | people have God that been under attack. So then that  
21 | day shall this song be sung in the land of Judah; We  
22 | have a strong city; salvation will God appoint for  
23 | walls and bulwarks. The same as Zechariah, Chapter 1  
24 | and 2 that I read last night where God will be a wall  
25 | of fire and about Jerusalem. So it says open ye the  
gates, that the righteous nation which keepeth the

1 | truth may enter in. And only those who keep the seals.  
2 | Thou wilt keep him in perfect peace, whose mind is  
3 | stayed on thee: because he trusteth in thee. Trust ye  
4 | in the Lord for ever: in the Lord God is everlasting  
5 | strength.

6 |           For he bringeth down them that dwell on high.  
7 | That's you guys. The lofty city he bringeth, layeth it  
8 | low, layeth it low, even to the ground; he bringeth it  
9 | even to the dust. That's the fall of Babylon.

10 |           The foot shall tread it down, even the feet  
11 | of the poor, and the steps of the needy. Now the way  
12 | of the just is uprightness: thou, most upright, which  
13 | is the Father who sits on the throne dost weigh the  
14 | paths of the just. That's the seven seals.

15 |           Yea, in the way of thy judgments, O Lord,  
16 | have we waited for thee. Because see we know the seven  
17 | seals. The reason being is the desire of our souls to  
18 | thy name. That's why the 144,000 in Chapters 14 has  
19 | the seal of living God which is the name of the Father  
20 | on their foreheads.

21 |           And to the remembrance of thee. With my soul  
22 | have I desired thee in the night; yea, with my spirit  
23 | within me will I seek thee early. Because they learn  
24 | the truth when the Lamb comes as it is right now to  
25 | show them the truth that is written.

          DICK: The Lamb, Lamb will show the truth.

1           DAVID: Yeah. That's why I'm here. I  
2 brought my reward to give to every man. I'm here to  
3 teach these seals.

4           DICK: All right.

5           DAVID: Same as in Psalms 2. The heathen  
6 raged. They imagine a vain thing. Kings of the earth,  
7 rulers take counsel. Gather against the Lord and  
8 against me saying let's break his bands asunder and  
9 cast his cords from us. You all don't want these  
10 seals. He that sits in the heavens, my Father, is  
11 laughing at you right now. And the next step is the  
12 Father fixing to, to speak to you, and you're going to  
13 be in big trouble anyway.

14           So it says here when thy judgments are in the  
15 earth --

16           DICK: David, David, let me -- where, where  
17 are you again now?

18           DAVID: We're here at Chapters 26 of Isaiah.

19           DICK: Okay.

20           DAVID: Verses 9.

21           DICK: Okay. Hold on for just a minute here.  
22 Let me, let me catch up with you a little bit, 26, 9.

23           DAVID: Well, you remember, remember what we  
24 already read, right?

25           DICK: Right. Okay. My soul yearns for you  
in the night.

1           DAVID: Okay. This is takedown of what it  
2 states about in that day, Chapter 26, verse 1. Shall  
3 this song be sung land of Judah. Psalms 40 is the song  
4 of the Lamb. He brings seven seals. A new song.  
5 Psalms 40. Song of the Lamb. Same as Revelation,  
6 Chapter 15. Song of Moses, Deuteronomy 32. And the  
7 song of the Lamb. Okay.

8           DICK: All right.

9           DAVID: And that day shall this song be sung  
10 land of Judah. We have a strong city; salvation will  
11 God appoint for walls and bulwarks. Mean God's going  
12 to save these people, right?

13           Open ye the gates, that the righteous nation  
14 which keepeth the truth may enter in. What truth is it  
15 they've got to keep? We got to find out, don't we?

16           Thou wilt keep him in perfect peace, whose  
17 mind is stayed on thee: because he trusteth in thee.  
18 Trust ye in the Lord, for in the Lord Jehovah is  
19 everlasting strength. For he bringeth down them that  
20 dwelleth on high, that's Babylon, the lofty city, he  
21 layeth it low, he layeth it low, even to the ground; he  
22 bringeth it even to the dust. The feet of the poor  
23 shall tread it down, even the steps of the needy. Feet  
24 of the needy, poor, steps of the needy.

25           The way of the just which is the path we walk  
in is uprightness: thou, most upright, which is the

1 Father who's got the book, dost weigh the path of the  
2 just. He directs our steps, don't he?

3           Yea, in the way of thy judgments, O Lord,  
4 have we waited for thee. There are seven seals you  
5 understand. The reason why the desire of our soul is  
6 to thy name. That's what I was saying. The 144,000 in  
7 Chapter 7 of Revelation are sealed by the angel from  
8 the east who has the seal of the living God which is a  
9 scroll with seven seals. That's why in Chapter 14 the  
10 144,000 stand on Mt. Zion with the seal of the living  
11 God in their foreheads which is God's name.

12           To remembrance of thee. With my soul have I  
13 desired thee in the night; yea, with my spirit within  
14 me will I seek thee early for when thy judgments are in  
15 the earth, which is the fulfillment of these terrible  
16 things such as the seals teach, the inhabitants of the  
17 world will learn righteousness.

18           Now here's what Christ had to suffer so much  
19 for and he let you guys have. Let favour be showed to  
20 the wicked. That's what I'm trying to do right now to  
21 you guys. Yet will he not learn righteousness. In the  
22 land of uprightness if you all are allowed to be in  
23 this kingdom that all the prophets talk about, okay,  
24 will he deal unjustly, and will not behold the majesty  
25 of the Lord.

          Now my Father sits in heaven, he sits on the



1 throne. He gave me a book. There's seven seals. If  
2 you don't know these seals, you're not a part of my  
3 kingdom. You have nothing to do with me.

4 But anyway, Lord, when thy hand is lifted up,  
5 you know what's in God's hand, don't you? The book  
6 with seven seals. He upholds his word above heaven.  
7 They will not see. You guys aren't looking very good.  
8 But you're going to see. And you're going to be  
9 ashamed for your envy at the people, those who know  
10 these things. Yes, the fire of thine enemies shall  
11 devour them. It's going to backfire. What you all are  
12 going to do is going to backfire on you.

13 Lord, thou wilt (indiscernible) peace for us:  
14 for thou hast also wrought all our works in us. O Lord  
15 our God, other lords beside thee have had dominion over  
16 us, such as teachers and preachers and government  
17 officials and stuff like that. But by thee only will  
18 we make mention of thy name. Because they're going to  
19 be dead. They're not going to live. They'll be  
20 deceased. They will not rise. Therefore thou hast  
21 visited and destroyed them, and made all their memory  
22 to perish. That's what's fixing to happen to you guys,  
23 you see?

24 DICK: That's a reference to the fourth seal.

25 DAVID: Now listen. What we're doing here is  
we're fixing, we're going into the, into the third

1 seal. That's the thing we're talking about. This is  
2 not the fourth seal.

3 DICK: All right.

4 DAVID: Let me show you.

5 DICK: Okay.

6 DAVID: Thou hast increased the nation, O  
7 Lord. Just like Psalms 18 when I read to you guys.  
8 You've got it there on record. After you're punished,  
9 after God makes an example out of you, and after you  
10 find out beyond question who I really am, then I'm  
11 given a kingdom just like Daniel 7 and all the prophets  
12 teach, Isaiah 2, Michael 4.

13 And then the rest of the nations are asked if  
14 they want any of this, if they'd like to have a cup of  
15 God's wrath. Of course, at that time they're going to  
16 disarm. Hopefully they're going to come and learn of  
17 God's ways and allow me to finish teaching them the  
18 truth.

19 So this is where it says thou hast increased  
20 the nation. Thou art glorified: thou hadst removed it  
21 far unto all the ends of the earth. Lord, in trouble  
22 have they visited thee, they poured out a prayer when  
23 thy chastening was upon them.

24 Like a woman with child, that draweth near  
25 the time of her delivery, is in pain, and crieth out in  
her pains; so have we been in thy sight, O Lord. We

1 have been with child, we have been in pain, we have as  
2 it were brought forth wind. (Makes "raspberry" noise.)  
3 You know what I mean? We have not wrought any  
4 deliverance in the earth; neither have the inhabitants  
5 of the world fallen.

6 Well, the way this happens is there's going  
7 to be a resurrection. Now let me explain about these  
8 angels. Thy dead men shall live, together with my dead  
9 body shall they arise. Awake and sing, ye that dwell  
10 in the dust: for thy dew is the dew of herbs, and the  
11 earth shall cast out the dead.

12 Come, my people, enter thou into thy  
13 chambers, and shut thy doors about thee: hide thyself  
14 as it were for a little moment, until the indignation  
15 be past. For the Lord cometh out of his place to  
16 punish the inhabitants of the earth for their iniquity.  
17 And the earth shall also disclose her blood, and shall  
18 no more cover her slain.

19 So in that day, the Lord with his sore and  
20 great and strong sword shall punish leviathan the  
21 piercing serpent, which is your leader. Even leviathan  
22 that crooked serpent; he shall slay the dragon in the  
23 sea. In that day sing ye unto her, A vineyard of red  
24 wine.

25 I the Lord do keep it; I will water it every  
morning: lest any hurt it, I will keep it night and

1 day.

2 DICK: David, as you're going along, can you  
3 give me some references so I can kind of follow along  
4 with you too?

5 DAVID: Okay.

6 DICK: I'm trying to, I'm trying to keep up  
7 with you but I'm, I'm having difficulty, you know --

8 DAVID: We're in verse 4 now, okay?

9 DICK: Verse 4 of --

10 DAVID: I'm taking the eucharist right now.  
11 Hold on a second.

12 [gap]

13 DAVID: Okay. All right. 27, verse 4.

14 DICK: Isaiah 27, verse 4.

15 DAVID: 28, verse 4. I'm sorry.

16 DICK: 28, verse 4.

17 DAVID: Yeah. During the time that the  
18 kingdoms of this world are to be overthrown, Isaiah 14  
19 refers the same as Isaiah 28 -- excuse me, 27, I'm  
20 sorry. Fury is not in me. You got that verse there?

21 DICK: I've got Isaiah 28, 4.

22 DAVID: 27, 4.

23 DICK: Okay. We're going to 27, 4, all  
24 right? 27, 4. I am not angry. If only there were  
25 briefs and thorns confronting me. I would march  
against them in battle. I would set them all on fire.

1           DAVID: Right. Okay. So you got the New  
2 American Standard?

3           DICK: I do.

4           DAVID: Verse 5. Or let him take hold of my  
5 strength. Right?

6           DICK: Right. Refuge, right.

7           DAVID: That he may make peace with me; and  
8 he shall make what?

9           DICK: And let them make peace with me.

10          DAVID: In other words, what's God's  
11 strength?

12          DICK: The ability to make peace.

13          DAVID: Nah. It's his word.

14          DICK: Well, through his word but to make  
15 peace through his word.

16          DAVID: Seven, seven seals is the negotiation  
17 here. If you reject the seven seals, you're rejecting  
18 me. If you reject me, you're rejecting my father. And  
19 then judgment cannot be diverted. You will be  
20 punished. And your great nation, the United States of  
21 America, the great land shadowing with wings that all  
22 the prophets talk about. The lamb-like beast of  
23 Revelation 13 is going to be made an example of above  
24 all nations. It's all going to come to end in 1 hour.  
25 This is what Revelation 18 is talking about, the fall  
of Babylon.

1           Now I know you don't understand these things,  
2 and I know you think you're too big for this to happen.

3           DICK: No, I don't. I have Revelation 18  
4 here.

5           DAVID: But the, but the day of judgment is  
6 here at hand. Now watch. Well, he will cause them  
7 that come of Jacob, right, to take root: Israel shall  
8 blossom and bud, and fill the face of the world with  
9 fruit. Israel shall be preserved out of this.

10           Now read verse 7 to me from your translation.

11           DICK: 28, 7?

12           DAVID: Yes.

13           DICK: Okay. 28, 7.

14           DAVID: Right.

15           DICK: And these also stagger from wine and  
16 reel from beer, priests and prophets stagger from beer.

17           DAVID: No, no, no, no. Verse 7 of 27.

18           DICK: Verse 7 of 27.

19           DAVID: Right.

20           DICK: All right. Verse 7. Has the Lord  
21 struck her as he struck down those who struck her. Has  
22 she been killed as those were killed who killed her.

23           DAVID: Right. In other words, that's going  
24 to be something in verse 8 what are you going to do  
25 when this question is asked?

          DICK: By warfare and exile you contend with

1 her. With his fierce blast he drives her out as I on a  
2 day the east wind blows.

3 DAVID: Oh, what a sorry translation. Okay.  
4 Now --

5 DICK: You don't want the -- I mean this  
6 translation's not --

7 DAVID: No, no, no. No, now wait a second.  
8 Let's look here.

9 DICK: Okay.

10 DAVID: It says according to the King James,  
11 verses 7, hath he smitten him, as he smote those that  
12 smote him? Or is he slain according to the slaughter  
13 of them that are slain by him? In measure, when it  
14 shooteth forth, thou wilt debate with it: he stayeth  
15 his rough wind in the day of the east wind.

16 Now remember that in the seal we've learned  
17 that an angel is ascends from the east, correct? With  
18 the seal of the living God, right?

19 DICK: Right.

20 DAVID: Telling the four ends -- four angels  
21 to hold the four winds that it would not blow upon  
22 earth or sea, right?

23 DICK: Right.

24 DAVID: In other words, you know, hold the  
25 winds, and let not the winds blow. Hurt not until  
we've sealed the servants of our God on their

1 | foreheads. That's why Isaiah states here that he  
2 | stayeth which means he holds in check his rough wind.  
3 | When those four winds are loosed, the whirlwind of the  
4 | Lord that all the prophets talk about, what all the  
5 | prophecies is let loose, and God's anger as in Jeremiah  
6 | says the fierce anger of the Lord shall not return  
7 | until he's performed the intents of his heart. In the  
8 | latter days you shall consider it.

9 |           It says behold, the whirlwind of the Lord  
10 | goeth forth with fury. A continuing whirlwind. For it  
11 | shall fall with pain upon the head of the wicked. In  
12 | the latter days you shall consider it perfectly.

13 |           Now that's where the question is hath he  
14 | smitten him. Now God's allowing me to be smitten. And  
15 | I've been smitten by you.

16 |           DICK: All right.

17 |           DAVID: Okay. But am I going to be smitten  
18 | as God's going to smite those that smote me? No. Or  
19 | am I going to be slain according to the slaughter of  
20 | them that's going to be slain by me? No. Now it says  
21 | here everyone's going to get to see who wins in this  
22 | confrontation. Everybody in the world is going to get  
23 | to see who's going to come out of this smelling like a  
24 | rose and who's going to come out of this looking bad.

25 |           Now in measure thou wilt debate with it.  
There's seven measures. There's sevens seals. Thou



1 | wilt debate with it. We're supposed to debate with  
2 | this. And while we're debating, God's holding his  
3 | rough wind. The angels aren't letting those winds  
4 | loose yet.

5 |           If your eyes could be opened to the invisible  
6 | powers that are confronting this world right now, you  
7 | would understand that there are four angels, four  
8 | commanding angels, that are holding back legions and  
9 | legions of angels. And you know, angels are beings  
10 | just like people of the world. It's just they're not  
11 | as, they're not as, as embodied in, in such limited  
12 | beings. They're not of dirt in other words.

13 |           DICK: From the four corners of the earth.

14 |           DAVID: From the four corners of the earth.  
15 | Now this is so that the seal of the 144,000 can take  
16 | place. But it says here by this therefore shall the  
17 | iniquity of Jacob be purged; and this is all the fruit  
18 | to take away his sin; when he maketh all the stones of  
19 | the altar as chalkstones that are beaten in sunder,  
20 | groves and images which are idols shall not stand up.

21 |           Yet the defenced city shall be desolate, and  
22 | the habitation forsaken, and left as a wilderness:  
23 | there shall the calf feed, and there shall he lie down,  
24 | and consume the branches thereof. When the boughs  
25 | thereof are withered, they shall be broken off: women  
   | come and set them on fire. You'll learn about those

1 | women too. For you are a people of no understanding.  
2 | That's what we're dealing with now. Therefore he that  
3 | made you will not have mercy on you, and he that formed  
4 | you will shew you no favor.

5 |           And it will come to pass in that day, that  
6 | the Lord shall beat off of the channel of the river  
7 | unto the stream of Egypt, and ye shall be gathered one  
8 | by one, O children of Israel. And it shall come to  
9 | pass on that day, that a great trumpet shall be blown,  
10 | that's the seventh trumpet. And they shall come which  
11 | were ready to perish in the land of Assyria and the  
12 | outcast land of Egypt and shall worship the Lord in the  
13 | holy mount at Jerusalem. Okay, this is where the  
14 | gathering comes.

15 |           DICK: That's seals four through seven.

16 |           DAVID: No. Let me go back now. You know,  
17 | under our circumstances it's kind of a frustrated study  
18 | here. And I know your man's swimming. But the point  
19 | we're doing right now is we know there's a strong city,  
20 | salvation God will appoint.

21 |           Now let me explain what happens when these  
22 | four angels let the winds loose, okay?

23 |           DICK: All right.

24 |           DAVID: Now we're going back to Chapter 9 of  
25 | Revelation to confirm this prophecy. Remember, all the  
books of the Bible, all the prophecies, all the

1 warnings and terrible exactions against mankind are  
2 brought to focus and view in the Book of Revelation so  
3 that nations will be without excuse in the latter days  
4 when God finally has to bring these things to pass upon  
5 the sons of men.

6 DICK: So Revelation 9 is where we're going  
7 to go.

8 DAVID: Revelation 9.

9 DICK: The fifth angel sounded his trumpet --

10 DAVID: Fifth angel.

11 DICK: -- and I saw a star that had fallen  
12 from the sky to the earth.

13 DAVID: No, we're talking about the sixth  
14 angel now. Because we're --

15 DICK: The sixth.

16 DAVID: -- developing a point.

17 DICK: All right.

18 DAVID: Go ahead. Go ahead.

19 DICK: I'm looking. I'm going down. We're  
20 starting at 9, verse 13.

21 DAVID: Okay.

22 DICK: The sixth angel sounded his trumpet,  
23 and I heard a voice coming from the horns of the golden  
24 altar that is before God. It said to the sixth angel  
25 who had the trumpet release the four angels who are  
bound at the great river Euphrates. And the four

1 | angels who had been ready or kept ready for this very  
2 | hour and day and month and year --

3 |         DAVID: Month and year.

4 |         DICK: -- were released to kill a third of  
5 | mankind.

6 |         DAVID: Exactly.

7 |         DICK: The number of amount of troops was 200  
8 | million.

9 |         DAVID: Exactly.

10 |         DICK: Or a hundred thousand hundred  
11 | thousand.

12 |         DAVID: Hundred thousand thousand.

13 |         DICK: I -- right. I heard their number, 200  
14 | million.

15 |         DAVID: Go ahead.

16 |         DICK: The horses' riders I saw in my vision  
17 | looked like this. Their breastplates were fiery red,  
18 | dark blue, and yellow as sulphur. The heads of the  
19 | horses resembled the heads of lions. And out of their  
20 | mouths came fire, smoke and sulphur. A third of  
21 | mankind was killed by the three plagues of fire, smoke  
22 | and sulphur that came from their mouths.

23 |         DAVID: Um-hum.

24 |         DICK: The power of the horses was in their  
25 | mouths and in their tails for their tails --

       DAVID: Remember, these aren't real horses

1 now, either. The prophet has to explain to you that  
2 there's a little vehicle, a little machine here that  
3 seems to be a horse as in the days of ancient Israel  
4 like in the book of Nahum where it says they're in  
5 chariots with flaming torches --

6 DICK: Right.

7 DAVID: -- that jostle in the broad ways and  
8 they have the, have the noise of thunder.

9 DICK: The Bradleys.

10 DAVID: Well, it's -- well there's more --  
11 it's more involved than just little Bradleys. But  
12 yeah, it's -- the prophet's trying to explain that the  
13 vehicular transport is quite different than what they  
14 were accustomed to in their day.

15 DICK: All right.

16 DAVID: Okay. Go ahead.

17 DICK: The rest of mankind that were not  
18 killed by these plagues still did not repent of the  
19 work of their hands. They did not stop worshipping  
20 demons and idols of gold, silver, bronze, stone and  
21 wood.

22 DAVID: Exactly.

23 DICK: Idols that cannot see or hear or walk.  
24 Nor did they repent of the --  
25 (End of tape 80.)

2 DAVID: -- translation.

3 DICK: He was robed in a cloud with a rainbow  
4 above his head. His face was like the sun. And his  
5 legs were like fiery pillars.

6 DAVID: Uh-huh.

7 DICK: He was holding a little scroll which  
8 lay open in his hand.

9 DAVID: Uh-huh.

10 DICK: He planted his right foot on the sea  
11 and his left foot on the land.

12 DAVID: That's the Book of Revelation.  
13 That's what we're dealing with right now. Go ahead.

14 DICK: And he gave a loud shout, like the  
15 roar of a lion. When he shouted, the voices of the  
16 seven thunders spoke.

17 DAVID: Uh-huh.

18 DICK: And when the seven thunders spoke, I  
19 was about to write, but I heard a voice from heaven  
20 say, seal up what the seven thunders have said and do  
21 not write it down.

22 DAVID: Okay. Go ahead.

23 DICK: Then the angel I had seen standing on  
24 the sea and on the land raised his right hand to  
25 heaven, and he swore by him who lives forever and ever

--

1           DAVID: That's the father.

2           DICK: Who created the heaven's and all that  
3 is in them, the earth and all that is in it and the  
4 sea, and all that is in it, and said, there will be no  
5 more delay. But in the days --

6           DAVID: Time no, time no longer, in other  
7 words.

8           DICK: But in the days when the seventh angel  
9 is about to sound his trumpet, --

10          DAVID: Uh-huh.

11          DICK: The mystery of God will be  
12 accomplished, just as he announced to his servants, the  
13 Prophets.

14          DAVID: Exactly. Okay? Now, whatever the  
15 Prophets have stated, remember, these events of  
16 revelation are the previews of the events that are to  
17 soon take place against this great nation known as  
18 Babylon.

19          Now, remember, in Daniel 2, Babylon is a  
20 cessation, a continuation of the empires that will rule  
21 over Israel to the end of time when God will break the  
22 yoke of all nations from off his people, that God may  
23 set himself up a kingdom.

24          Now the nations are as such in Daniel 2. The head  
25 of gold is Babylon, the arms of silver, which is part  
of the same mind of man, the same spirit, is the Meso-



1 Persians, Alexander, excuse me, Fires and Derias  
2 (phonetic), and then we'll come into the empire of  
3 Grecia, the belly of brass, and then Rome will come in,  
4 the legs of iron, and then Rome will apparently fall,  
5 but not so, it will evolve itself into ten toes  
6 representing many nations, partly strong and partly  
7 broken, known as Europe. In other words, Rome will  
8 still rule through Europe because Daniel tells us there  
9 will rise up a power that will get involved in a  
10 religion known as Roman Catholicism, and it will rule  
11 the world and it'll have pre-eminence in the world  
12 until the time the ancient of days comes and judgments  
13 given to the saints of the most high. That's why those  
14 ambassadors are sent to Vatican right now all the time,  
15 you see? You know, there's the greatest world,  
16 political and social libraries of all empires contained  
17 in the Vatican. Upon us is a great religious  
18 figurehead, it has the smallest nation, a little horn,  
19 the smallest nation in all the world but yet one of the  
20 most prominent nations of the world.

21 Now, what we're looking at here is we know  
22 whatever the seven thunders are, they must be found in  
23 the testimony of the prophets. So as we said before,  
24 as we open the first seal, the white horse, the bow,  
25 the crown, it is brought to view in the 45th Psalm.  
You know, you agree with me so far, right?

1           DICK: I'm following you, yes.

2           DAVID: Okay, now, we've already been shown  
3 that the truth of that 45th Psalm tells us who's going  
4 to win this battle, who's the mightiest of them all,  
5 and the reason it's giving is so that the definite  
6 threat may be known that men might fear God, 'cause  
7 Christ doesn't really want to hurt anybody. That's up  
8 to them. If they want to go ahead and take a punch,  
9 the prophet's have given the details of the aftermath  
10 of that.

11          Now, but the point is, is that the girl brought to  
12 view in Psalm's 45, Hearken O daughter, and consider,  
13 brings us to Revelation 19, where the marriage of the  
14 lamb does come, and the wife does make herself ready,  
15 and the invitation there is blessed is everyone that is  
16 called to the marriage supper of the lamb. And that's  
17 what we're trying to do, we're trying to invite people  
18 to life eternal, to become one with the spirit of God.  
19 The spirit of man and the spirit of woman should be  
20 unity. Their minds should be as one, their hearts  
21 should as one.

22          On the later days in the doctrine of God, God has  
23 something on his mind. God's got seven seals. Christ  
24 is one with the father. Christ, likewise, has seven  
25 eyes, he knows what the seven seals are and all those  
are unity with me and knowledge of the seven seals

1 shall be a part of the marriage of the lamb, that event  
2 of Revelation 19, which clearly tells you that after  
3 that subject is brought to view in the 19th Chapter,  
4 then John sees the heaven depart and the man on the  
5 white horse is there and righteously this judge and  
6 make war.

7       Now, no one's going to get hurt until it is  
8 fulfilled that the probation of man has not been  
9 sufficient in regards to God's allowing him to have the  
10 privileges which they again will reject. That's what  
11 Isaiah 27 is all about. Let righteousness, -- show the  
12 wicked, you -- learn righteousness. They just don't  
13 care about God's magistrate, they just don't care about  
14 his judiciary, his throne and his word.

15       Now, the second seal, the man on the red horse who  
16 has the great sword, if they should kill one another is  
17 the events referring to Zechariah's testimony where  
18 Zechariah Chapter 1, he explains that God's angry at  
19 the Jews 'cause they would not listen to the former  
20 prophets. Zechariah sees a vision, a man riding on the  
21 red horse --

22               DICK: In committing war and bloodshed.

23               DAVID: No, that's not what it says.

24               DICK: Okay.

25               DAVID: The key note is that the events  
reveal that in the word of God, God is able to entail

1 the future, and because the testimony of Christ, which  
2 is the spirit of prophecy, we see the warfare comes in  
3 the fact that in the vision, Zechariah's shown four  
4 horns and he questions the angel of the Lord, which is  
5 on this red horse, what be these? And he says, these  
6 are they which scattered Judah, Israel, and  
7 Jerusalem, that there be nobody and no place, that they  
8 can now lift up their head. Now, that was the four  
9 horns of Babylon, Medopersia (Phonetic), Greece and  
10 Rome. And the prophet says that they will come back  
11 one day to Jerusalem as carpenters to build. In other  
12 words, the Jews, having been scattered, by war, by  
13 confrontation, by political power, which is people  
14 killing one another, just as the seal tells us, they  
15 will come back one day to build there.

16 Well, we know in Jerusalem today, on Mt. Zion,  
17 there's a catholic tabernacle there. We know that all  
18 religions of the world from all of these empires today,  
19 known as Europe, all have places and churches in  
20 Jerusalem.

21 God states clearly though, that when he gets ready  
22 to take over Jerusalem, 'cause he's jealous for -- the  
23 great jealousy, it'll be manifested by a wall of fire  
24 around the bout. When God is ready to set up his  
25 kingdom there, there's not going to be a multitude of  
religions and a multitude of professions, because

1 that's just confusion. There's one God and there's one  
2 book and there's one set of seals and there's one lamb,  
3 then if there's not a unity in that, then only that and  
4 that truth shall win and prevail.

5 Now, the third seal, we turn to the Book of  
6 Revelation again, as in Chapter 10, the seven thunders,  
7 which are uttered, whatever this sixth seal, sixth  
8 trumpet is about this 200 million, which is definitely  
9 more troops than you got out here, isn't it?

10 DICK: It certainly is.

11 DAVID: I think you're outnumbered my friend.  
12 We find out there in the third seal, it says right  
13 here, and there went out, this is Revelation 6 verses 4  
14 --

15 DICK: Hold on for a second, David.  
16 Revelation 6, verse 4.

17 DAVID: This horse, which was red, had power,  
18 second seal, now, Chapter, verse, verse 5, when he had  
19 opened the third seal, I heard a third beast say, come  
20 and see. And behold lo a black horse. He that sat up  
21 on him, had a pair of balances in his hand. And I  
22 heard a voice in the midst of the four beasts say, a  
23 measure of wheat for a penny, and three measures of  
24 barley for a penny. See thou hurt not the oil and the  
25 wine. Okay, now --

DICK: Which were very precious in that day.

1           DAVID: No. That day is not that day. These  
2 seals are to be revealed --

3           DICK: No, I understand.

4           DAVID: -- in the end of the world.

5           DICK: But I understand. Oil and wine were,  
6 are a very precious thing in --

7           DAVID: Oil and wine were basic --

8           DICK: -- extreme.

9           DAVID: -- every day commodities of Israel.  
10 The olive trees flourished, everybody had it, just like  
11 today everybody's got margarine and everybody's got  
12 Crisco.

13          DICK: All right.

14          DAVID: You know? I mean, everybody's got  
15 these things, you know, they were never scarce.

16          DICK: All right.

17          DAVID: Now, but remember, that, which must  
18 be hereafter, revolves around seals that, when there's  
19 time no longer, will be finished. So these events, the  
20 prophecies, are projected to events in the last  
21 movements that God makes in the world of unbelief  
22 before He brings the greatest empire, the greatest  
23 nation, to ruins. Just like the days of Egypt. God  
24 didn't pick on the third world countries. God went to  
25 pick on the greatest nation. God's a contender. You  
know, there's only one nation in the world that's above

1 all nations. The United State's of America is No. 1,  
2 Mr. Big Daddy-O. And that's why this is taking place  
3 here today. You know, we need a challenge. We need a,  
4 -- that's not really a challenge, you know what I'm  
5 saying? But at least let's let the world think it is.  
6 Let's see if these big, smart pronosticators and  
7 intelligent people, soothsayers and magicians and  
8 astrologers and psychologists, let's see if they can  
9 play the game, Name That Seal. Let's see who wins this  
10 game.

11       Okay, now, as we found Psalm's 45 to give us light  
12 on the first seal, as we found Zechariah's testimony to  
13 give us light on the second seal, whether we have  
14 discerned the entailed truth or not, we definitely see  
15 the evidences of these prophets for telling on these  
16 events, right?

17             DICK: Okay.

18             DAVID: So likewise, we must find the third,  
19 fourth, fifth, sixth and seventh seals also contained  
20 in the testament of the prophets.

21       Okay, now, the third seal, if you'll turn in your  
22 Bible to the Book of Hosea, --

23             DICK: Okay, hold on for just a moment.

24 Okay, Hosea.

25             DAVID: Okay.

              DICK: What chapter?

1           DAVID: We turn to Chapter 12.

2           DICK: I'm sorry. Hold on for a minute. You  
3 have to bear with me. I've got a lot of material here.

4           DAVID: I'm doing everything in my power to  
5 negotiate with my God and my kingdom of heaven to do  
6 so. We're giving this nation every opportunity  
7 possible for you to wise up to realize what you're  
8 dealing with here.

9           DICK: Bear with me, bear with me.

10          DAVID: Okey-dokey, it's right in front of  
11 Joel.

12          DICK: Right. I'm looking here, just a  
13 second.

14          DAVID: You don't have a King James Bible  
15 there anywhere?

16          DICK: You know, I don't, David. I really  
17 don't. Okay, I've got Hosea, Chapter --

18          DAVID: Chapter 12.

19          DICK: Chapter 12, verse?

20          DAVID: Well, let's take a look at this  
21 'cause, like I say, each one of these books contain a  
22 seal now.

23          DICK: Okay.

24          DAVID: Now, Ephraim, which was the ten  
25 tribes after the split between Judah and the other  
ten tribes, Ephraim began to become the political



1 leader of the northern kingdom's of Israel. But now,  
2 it says here Ephraim feedeth on wind, and followeth  
3 after the east wind, he daily increaseth lies and  
4 desolation and they do make a covenant with the  
5 Assyrians, and oil is carried into Egypt.

6 Lord also hath a controversy with Judah, and will  
7 punish Jacob according to his ways, according to his  
8 doings will he recompense him.

9 He took his brother by the heel in the womb.  
10 Remember the stories of Jacob and Esau? And by his  
11 strength he had power with God. Remember how Jacob  
12 pled with the angel of the Lord?

13 DICK: He struggled?

14 DAVID: Uh-huh. Remember that?

15 DICK: Uh-huh.

16 DAVID: Before the night he thought he was  
17 going to be destroyed, and yet God delivered him from  
18 the hands of Esau, right? Yeah, he had power over the  
19 angel, he prevailed, he wept, and made supplication  
20 unto him. He found him in Bethel. Means the House of  
21 God, right?

22 DICK: All right.

23 DAVID: And there he spake with us. When  
24 (Indiscernible) came out of Egypt, that's where God  
25 spoke to him. Even to the Lord God of hosts, the Lord  
is his memorial. Which Jacob put a rock at Bethel and

1 Jacob set up a rock there and says, you know, this is  
2 the place where I've talked with God and this is God,  
3 this is a rock.

4 Therefore turn thou unto thy God, keep mercy and  
5 judgment and wait on thy God continually.

6 He is a merchant, the balances of deceit are in  
7 his hand. Huh. He loveth to what?

8 DICK: Defraud.

9 DAVID: Oppress. Okay? Now, in what seal do  
10 you know that something deals with Christ pertain to a  
11 man on a black horse with a pair of balances in his  
12 hand?

13 DICK: Third seal.

14 DAVID: Now, the key is that there are three  
15 measures of barley for a penny and a measure of wheat.  
16 Now, which of those two is a better deal? The wheat or  
17 the barley?

18 DICK: The wheat.

19 DAVID: No, the barley. You get three scoops  
20 of barley. You only get one scoop of wheat.

21 DICK: I'm sorry, right, I'm sorry. One  
22 measure of wheat and three of barley.

23 DAVID: Okay, now, in the grain harvest, the  
24 first ripe grains of the ceremonial law of Moses which  
25 represented the harvest of man is the wave sheaf. The  
wave sheaf were the first of the first fruits. They

1 | were the barley, okay? Now, we know that on the 18th  
2 | day of the first month, 2000 years ago, that when  
3 | Christ was resurrected, others were resurrected with  
4 | him, correct?

5 |           DICK: All right.

6 |           DAVID: The multitude came out of the graves  
7 | and that they, for 40 days, according to ceremonial  
8 | law, gathered a 120 who were to be presented before the  
9 | Father on the day of Pentecost, which represented the  
10 | wheat or the two loaves of bread. Now, that was called  
11 | the wave loaves, that's the first wheat harvest.

12 |           DICK: The wave loaves, okay.

13 |           DAVID: The wave loaves. Now, the reason why  
14 | there's three measures of barley, well, like I said,  
15 | and I know you don't want an extensive study on all  
16 | these things, but here's the key right here. Now, it  
17 | says right here, he is a merchant, in other words,  
18 | we're doing some dealing here aren't we? Now, he knows  
19 | something you don't know, and the thing of it is, the  
20 | balances of deceit are in his hand, he loveth to  
21 | oppress. What causes the oppression, do you think? He  
22 | knows more than you know, don't he?

23 |           DICK: He certainly does because he uses the  
24 | dishonest, -- you're talking about the merchant who  
25 | uses the dishonest scales?

          DAVID: Exactly. And who is this? Who's

1 | doing this? The Lord. Right? Therefore turning thou  
2 | into thy God, keep mercy and judgment and wait on thy  
3 | God continually, why? He's a what? A merchant. The  
4 | balances of the deceit are in his hand.

5 |           DICK: All right.

6 |           DAVID: And Ephraim said, yet I am become  
7 | rich. Ephraim thinks he has something, don't he?

8 |           DICK: Rich and wealthy he says.

9 |           DAVID: I have found me out substance, in all  
10 | my labours they shall find none iniquity in me that  
11 | were sin. But what does God say in verse 9?

12 |           DICK: I am the Lord, your God who brought  
13 | you out of Egypt.

14 |           DAVID: Go ahead.

15 |           DICK: I will make you live in tents again as  
16 | in the days of your appointed feast.

17 |           DAVID: Which is the feast of tabernacles.  
18 | Well, what's the deal then, in verse 10 then?

19 |           DICK: I spoke to the prophets, gave them  
20 | many visions and told parables through them.

21 |           DAVID: Uh-huh. Go ahead.

22 |           DICK: Verse 11.

23 |           DAVID: Yeah.

24 |           DICK: Is Gilead, we wicked if people are  
25 | worthless, do they sacrifice bulls, their altars will  
   | be like piles of stones on a plowed field.

1           DAVID: God's going to destroy their form of  
2 worship, isn't he?

3           DICK: Exactly.

4           DAVID: Okay, verse 12.

5           DICK: Jacob fled to the country of Eraham  
6 (Phonetic). Israel served to get a wife, and to pay  
7 for her he tended sheep.

8           DAVID: Okay.

9           DICK: The Lord used a prophet to bring  
10 Israel up from Egypt, by a prophet he cared for him.

11          DAVID: Uh-huh.

12          DICK: But, Ephraim was bitterly provoked him  
13 to anger.

14          DAVID: Go ahead.

15          DICK: His Lord will leave upon him the guilt  
16 of his bloodshed and will repay him for his content.

17          DAVID: Okay, so, why do you think the Lord's  
18 a merchant man for? Because who do you think the  
19 barter is, what's the bargain here? Well, here's the  
20 bargain, my friend, in the third seal, if you  
21 understood everything pertaining to what the prophets  
22 taught, you know, the knowledge of the prophets, the  
23 knowledge of their truth, right? Is the ransom for  
24 your soul. Your soul and everybody that sits in there  
25 with you. Everyone in this nation. We're trying to  
work a deal with you. We're trying to help you

1 understand the whole tenor of what the third seal is  
2 right now.

3 Now, let's go over here to Chapter 1 of Hosea, and  
4 let's see if we can't do a little bit of, of background  
5 work here. We see over here in Chapter 1, verses 9,  
6 then said God, what? Call his name Lo-ammi, right?

7 DICK: All right, I'm at Chapter 1, verse 9,  
8 sort a battle by horses, in horsemen, but by the Lord,  
9 their God.

10 DAVID: No, no, you're, we're looking at  
11 Hosea Chapter 1, verses 9.

12 DICK: Oh, I'm sorry, verse 9.

13 DAVID: Okay.

14 DICK: Chapter 1.

15 DAVID: Okay.

16 DICK: Verse 9 is as I just read it to you,  
17 in this edition that I have. Hosea.

18 DAVID: Uh-huh, Chapter 1, verse 9, then said  
19 God, Call his name Lo-ammi.

20 DICK: That's not in the translation -- I'm  
21 sorry, I'm, that's, I'm sorry, my apologize, I was  
22 reading the wrong verse.

23 DAVID: Okay.

24 DICK: Then the Lord said, Call him Lo-ammi,  
25 for you are not my people, and I am not your God.

DAVID: Okay, verse 10.

1           DICK: Yet the Israelites will be like the  
2 sand on the seashore which cannot be measured or  
3 counted. In the place where it was said to them, you  
4 are not my people, they will be called sons of the  
5 living God. The people of Judah and the people of  
6 Israel will be united, and they will appoint one leader  
7 --

8           DAVID: Uh-huh.

9           DICK: And will come up out of the land --

10          DAVID: For great shall be the day of  
11 Jezreel.

12          DICK: Right.

13          DAVID: Who, do you know who that leader is?

14          DICK: I believe I know who that leader is.

15          DAVID: Okay, well, let's find out over here  
16 who that leader is. It says right over here, in  
17 Chapters 3. Go ahead, read Chapter 3 to me. You'll  
18 see who that leader is.

19          DICK: The Lord said to me, go, show your  
20 love to your wife again though she is loved by another  
21 and is an adulteress. Love her as the Lord loves the  
22 Israelites.

23          DAVID: Okay.

24          DICK: Though they turn to other gods and  
25 love the sacred raisin cakes.

          DAVID: Go ahead.

1           DICK: So I brought her 15 skilled sheckles  
2 of silver and about a homer and a, is that pronounced  
3 levic (phonetic)?

4           DAVID: Uh-huh.

5           DICK: Of barley. Then I told her, you are  
6 to live with me many days. You must not be a  
7 prostitute or be intimate with any man and I will live  
8 with you.

9           DAVID: Okay.

10          DICK: For the Israelites will live many days  
11 without king or prince, without sacrifice --

12          DAVID: Without a king, uh-huh.

13          DICK: -- or sacred stones without ephod or  
14 idle. Afterward, the Israelites will return and seek  
15 the Lord their God, and David their king. They will  
16 come tempting to the Lord and to his blessings in the  
17 last days, trembling to the Lord and to his blessings  
18 in the last days.

19          DAVID: Okay, okay. So who is this David the  
20 king they're going to be enlightened to in the latter  
21 days? Throughout the realms of Babylon, Meda-Persia,  
22 Greece, Rome and Europe, Israel will not have a king.  
23 They will not have a sacrifice, they will not have  
24 (indiscernible), they will not have the images or the  
25 implements of the sanctuary, not until who comes again?  
Christ.



1           DICK: All right.

2           DAVID: Now, remember, the seven seals of the  
3 Book of Revelation, the same God of the gentiles is  
4 still the God of Israel. In the Romans 11, what we've  
5 been shown, is Paul made it very clear that God did not  
6 cast away his people which he knew. For the redeemer  
7 we find, according to Paul, says that all Israel will  
8 be saved as it is written, and he quotes the prophecies  
9 of Isaiah, that the redeemer shall again one day return  
10 to Zion and shall turn away and -- from Jacob and this  
11 is the covenants that I will make with them when I  
12 shall take away their sins. Because we're seen and  
13 we're judging to see whether you gentiles, whether you  
14 who claim to spiritual Israel are going to be any more  
15 decent and any more respective to your messiah, but  
16 when I'm trying to show you the seals and what the Jews  
17 were 2,000 years ago. You've got to learn these seals.

18           Now, Hosea very clearly states that they're going  
19 to seek the Lord their God in the latter days. Is that  
20 true or is that false?

21           DICK: That is true.

22           DAVID: So would there not be a truth here  
23 worth knowing pertaining to the latter days?

24           DICK: There would be.

25           DAVID: Okay, now, we go over here and we see  
in Chapter 6, -- 'cause remember, my students, I, I

1 open up these whole books --

2 DICK: All right.

3 DAVID: -- to them. You know, they feel that  
4 truth is, is worth enough time to spend sufficient time  
5 and fully comprehending every measure of statement in  
6 these books, comparing them with all the statements to  
7 the other prophets, okay?

8 Now, we see in Chapter 6 of Hosea. What does it  
9 say to us?

10 DICK: Israel is unrepentant.

11 DAVID: Well, go ahead. Chapter 6 of Hosea.  
12 Verse 1.

13 DICK: Come, let us return to the Lord. He  
14 has torn us to pieces but he will heal us. He has  
15 injured us but he will bind up our wound.

16 DAVID: By scattering amongst the nation. Go  
17 ahead.

18 DICK: After two days he will revive us. On  
19 the third day he will restore us and we may live in his  
20 presence.

21 Let us acknowledge the Lord. Let us press on to  
22 acknowledge him as surely as the sun rises, he will  
23 appear, he will come to us like the winter rains.

24 DAVID: Okay. So the angel who is sent from  
25 the east are sent just like the sun arises, doesn't he?  
And what's the great light that he has? He has the

1 words of the seven seals. Go ahead.

2 DICK: Like the spring rains, the water, the  
3 earth, Chapter, or Verse 4, what can I do for you? And  
4 from what can I do for you, Judah? Your love is like  
5 the morning mist, like the early dew that disappears.

6 DAVID: It doesn't last long, does it.

7 DICK: Just a short while. Therefore, I cut  
8 you in pieces with my prophets. I killed you with the  
9 words of my mouth. My judgments flash like lightning  
10 upon you.

11 DAVID: Okay. For the covenant of the son of  
12 man, it's suppose to be lighting from the eastern side  
13 to the west, seven seals. What else can merciful God  
14 in heaven do for you people? If you cannot believe in  
15 the warnings and the forward nations of Gods testament,  
16 if you cannot sit here and reason with us, and back  
17 down and humble your hearts before God, everything  
18 written by the mouth of the prophets will come upon you  
19 in perfect order.

20 I'm afraid for you. You, you're saying, on the  
21 one hand, that you, that you respect my religion, and  
22 on the other hand, I'm playing a life and death riddle  
23 with you, I'm trying to be a merchant with you, I'm  
24 trying to deal with you in mercy as best to my ability,  
25 and you say that my actions are contrary to your laws.  
I agree, but remember, your actions, likewise, shall be

1 uncovered. Your deeds and your activities shall be  
2 investigated to the very light of, of reason, and  
3 everything that you and your nations ever done. I'm  
4 willing to throw these records out, but you have to  
5 first acknowledge God. Forget about me, I'm just a  
6 middle man. Forget about me. I am nothing more than  
7 what God has permitted me to be. But the seven seals  
8 are definitely important things.

9 Now, verse 6, what did God desire?

10 DICK: Mercy, not sacrifice.

11 DAVID: Yes, and the knowledge of what?

12 DICK: Acknowledgment of God rather than  
13 burnt offering.

14 DAVID: And how do we know God but by his  
15 seven seals, when there's time no longer, right?

16 DICK: Right.

17 DAVID: Okay. Now, it's very important then,  
18 I'm hoping you're being able to see. Very important.  
19 Okay. Now he says here, over here, that in Chapter 7,  
20 verses 15. What does that verse mean there to you?

21 DICK: Verse 15?

22 DAVID: Right.

23 DICK: Okay, hold on for a second. Train  
24 them and strengthen them that they do not plot evil  
25 against me. Educated and strengthen so they won't plot

--

1           DAVID: The evil against God, right?

2           DICK: Exactly.

3           DAVID: So verse 16, what do they do then?

4           DICK: They do not turn to the most High.

5 They are like a faulty bow, their leaders will fall by  
6 the sword because of their insolent words.

7           DAVID: Rage of their tongues, go ahead.

8           DICK: For this they will be ridiculed in the  
9 land of Egypt.

10          DAVID: Okay.

11          DICK: They will be ridiculed by God.

12          DAVID: Okay. Because something to do with  
13 their tongues, raging against someone, right?

14          DICK: Um-hum.

15          DAVID: Okay, so we go over here, in verses  
16 11 and 12, and what does your scripture say there?

17          DICK: Verses 11 or 12 or are we talking  
18 about Chapter 11 and 12?

19          DAVID: No, verses 11, 12, Chapter 8.

20          DICK: Okay. Though Ephraim built many  
21 altars for sin offerings, these had become altars for  
22 sinning.

23          DAVID: Okay.

24          DICK: Wrote for them the many things of my  
25 law, but they regarded them as something alien. So  
they didn't, they didn't follow the law --

1           DAVID: No, wait a minute. I have written to  
2 them the great things of my law, --

3           DICK: Okay.

4           DAVID: -- but they were counted as a strange  
5 thing.

6           DICK: All right.

7           DAVID: The last part of God's law is his  
8 truth, the seven seals, of which you and your gentlemen  
9 there and people of this country, are thinking are very  
10 strange.

11          DICK: No, David, I don't believe that's  
12 accurate.

13          DAVID: Oh, it is accurate.

14          DICK: We may, no, we may not understand them  
15 all, but I don't think that we say they're strange.

16          DAVID: Look, let me say something.

17          DICK: Okay.

18          DAVID: In your, in your public reports, your  
19 stating that I go into these very unique, strange  
20 biblical babblings. Okay? Now, if there's a babbling  
21 here it's you guys, it's not me. Just because you're  
22 not subduing yourselves to have respect towards me, for  
23 you have no knowledge of what respect I deserve, you  
24 know, you think that these things, 'cause I have to --  
25 I have to in very limited time project to you these  
statements.

1           Now, you know Hosea says something about the Lord  
2 being a merchant man, right?

3           DICK: Right.

4           DAVID: Balances, right?

5           DICK: Balances, yes.

6           DAVID: Okay, now you also know very clearly  
7 that in the third seal Christ is revealed in a work  
8 that will pertain to a black horse and he will have a  
9 pair of balances, right?

10           DICK: Right, to measure the wheat and the  
11 barley.

12           DAVID: Okay, not to measure the wheat and  
13 the barley, but what happens is, is that the offering  
14 is three measures of wheat --

15           DICK: For a penny.

16           DAVID: And three, and a measure, excuse me,  
17 three measures of barley for a penny and a measure of  
18 wheat for a penny.

19           DICK: Right.

20           DAVID: Now, that's the thing that you don't  
21 yet understand. But, do you understand the Book of  
22 Hosea as of yet?

23           DICK: Well, David, I'm not going to say that  
24 I understand the whole, the whole book. You know, I'm  
25 understanding as you're telling me about the book. You  
know, these things that you've learned, you know, it's

1 taken you some time, you've learned this through a  
2 period of time.

3 DAVID: No, it hasn't. I learned it in a  
4 matter of five minutes, the whole book. You know,  
5 you've got to be foolish. Here you sit, a man of this  
6 generation, and you have telephone lines and access to  
7 the greatest scholars of all the world. Men that are  
8 in their 50's, 60's, 70's and 80's.

9 DICK: Okay.

10 DAVID: And you should be able to call them  
11 up and inquire to them and say, hey, I've got a  
12 situation, there's this young, 33 year old guy out here  
13 in Waco, Texas, no place, nobody, and he's telling us  
14 that the seals are found in the prophecies, can you  
15 give me a quick run down on where the seals of  
16 revelation meet their parallels in the prophetic  
17 (Indiscernible) so I can answer this guy so we can get  
18 all these kids out? You would think that'd be so  
19 simple, wouldn't you?

20 DICK: David, I'm trying to understand. I'm  
21 trying to understand --

22 DAVID: Let me tell you what you should  
23 understand. You should understand that God who says no  
24 man will know, I don't care how many translators and  
25 how many times people have read this Bible over and  
over and over again. God, who has the power over the



1 minds of men has kept from the eyes of man the  
2 knowledge of the seals so that in judgement, thanks to  
3 Christ who forgave you for not knowing what you're  
4 doing, you'll not be judged by the law in latter days,  
5 but be judged by the spirit of truth.

6 Now, there's one simple test.

7 DICK: Okay.

8 DAVID: That stands between you, heaven and  
9 hell. You've got a decision to make. You want to go  
10 to hell, stand next to the law and be measured by your  
11 actions and faults everything that breaks the law you  
12 should receive a just recompense or would you like a  
13 free gift?

14 DICK: Of the seven seals?

15 DAVID: Would you like the righteousness of  
16 Christ, everything Christ has received in heaven?

17 DICK: Certainly.

18 DAVID: Well, then, what you must do is  
19 humble yourself, realize who you're dealing with and  
20 simply play God's little game. It's a test of wisdom.  
21 It's a test of honest childlike wisdom. Show me the  
22 seven seals from the prophecies and I'm yours. Or, let  
23 me show you and you are mine.

24 You can't get any fairer than that. God is being  
25 very fair with this nation. God is being very sober  
and very fair.

1 DICK: Okay.

2 DAVID: Now you have access all over the  
3 world to gather your scholars and your teachers, the  
4 men of your high deportment, to show you these seals.

5 DICK: All right. My understanding is that  
6 if we show the seven seals, that you and your followers  
7 will, will then understand that we know what the seven  
8 seals are and that we will prepare to answer to God.

9 DAVID: Well, yeah, then, like I say, if you  
10 know the seven seals, then I'm wrong. Then, so, then I  
11 don't have a God then, everybody knows it then, so,  
12 man, I'll just come on out. I mean, the only reason  
13 why I'm here is because my God tells me to wait.

14 DICK: All right.

15 DAVID: I have no intention of, of, of  
16 sitting here rotting and dying. I'd rather live in  
17 prison than have to live here in this cold place.

18 DICK: Tell me again, David. When will you  
19 come out with, with your folks?

20 DAVID: You see, where I stand right now is  
21 this, when I was a child I had communications all the  
22 days of my life, okay?

23 DICK: Okay, okay.

24 DAVID: In 1985, I was taken, when I was in  
25 Israel, --

DICK: All right.

1           DAVID: I was taken, in my perceptions of my  
2 being, to a place where I was shown all things  
3 pertaining to the seals. This is my work.

4           DICK: All right, in 1985, then, all right.

5           DAVID: Okay. From 1985, to the present  
6 time, I am not a person who studies the Bible night and  
7 day. You can ask anybody that knows me.

8           DICK: All right.

9           DAVID: What I'm saying is, is that if I am  
10 wrong, then, the seven seals, which are a mystery of  
11 God, the God already told the prophets, right?

12          DICK: Okay.

13          DAVID: Then the prophecies, hey, they're  
14 scholars and teachers in the world who are 60, 70, 80,  
15 90 years old who are great scholars and theologians of  
16 the world, yes or no?

17          DICK: Certainly.

18          DAVID: Great learned men, men who know  
19 several languages. You know, -- language, arabic,  
20 hebrew, right?

21          DICK: Certainly.

22          DAVID: Greek? Well, then, they should know  
23 these things, shouldn't they?

24          DICK: I'm sure, I'm sure that there are  
25 several that do.

          DAVID: Well, like, get on the phone and get

1 | them and get, and let them show you where the seals are  
2 | at. Call me up and show me the references and I'm out  
3 | of here.

4 |           DICK: All right --

5 |           DAVID: Because I have no foundation then.

6 |           DICK: All right, let me ask you a question  
7 | in light of what you just said, David. Is not this  
8 | open to interpretation? In other words --

9 |           DAVID: No, no. Psalm's 45 clearly shows you  
10 | the king, the bow, his horse. You can't deny that.  
11 | You can't be stupid and deny that.

12 |           DICK: I'm certainly not denying anything you  
13 | say.

14 |           DAVID: You cannot deny that Zechariah says  
15 | right there, a man on a red horse.

16 |           DICK: All right.

17 |           DAVID: Who do you think that man is? Come  
18 | off of it. You can't deny Hosea. He is a merchant  
19 | man, he has balances in his hand, come on. Revelation  
20 | says, point blank, he's got a pair of balances.

21 |           DICK: I understand. We're talking about  
22 | Hosea for the second seal then.

23 |           DAVID: The third seal.

24 |           DICK: I'm sorry, please, the third seal.  
25 | With the black horse, the rider with the balances.

          DAVID: Exactly.

1 DICK: All right. Hosea for the third seal.

2 DAVID: Does he have a pair, -- is the  
3 Revelation of Christ, does it not say he has a pair of  
4 balances?

5 DICK: Exactly what it says.

6 DAVID: Does Hosea say he is a merchant man,  
7 he's got the balances in his hand?

8 DICK: He does, it does.

9 DAVID: Okay. I'm not stupid, are you stupid?  
10 Maybe I am stupid.

11 DICK: Well, I don't think that I am stupid,  
12 I --

13 DAVID: The prophet says, the prophet says  
14 he'll be one way and the Revelation says he'll be that  
15 same way.

16 DICK: All right. So my understanding is  
17 then, David, we can show you where the seals are found,  
18 the information concerning the seals is found, then you  
19 will, and your folks, will come out.

20 DAVID: Exactly.

21 DICK: All right.

22 DAVID: Do you understand the reasons why I  
23 would say that?

24 DICK: Well, I understand you want us to  
25 understand --

DAVID: Because if my God, if my God told me

1 that he'd give me the shadow of his hand, that's what  
2 he told me. Right there in Isaiah, he told me that  
3 audibly.

4 DICK: And God wants you to teach the seven  
5 seals.

6 DAVID: He says he will, he will keep me as a  
7 secret and a wonderment to many until I manifest myself  
8 in the sacred scriptures by revealing the key notes of  
9 the sacred scriptures to men, that men might know me by  
10 the word of God instead of knowing me by miracle and  
11 wonderment, right?

12 DICK: All right.

13 DAVID: Then --

14 DICK: I'm sorry, go ahead, David. I didn't  
15 mean to interrupt.

16 DAVID: Then my trust is in God. And so God  
17 speaks to me, right?

18 DICK: Right.

19 DAVID: And he tells me to wait and I wait.

20 DICK: All right.

21 DAVID: But, if you show me these things,  
22 then that means my God lied to me. So why should I  
23 obey him?

24 DICK: David, what I would like to do then,  
25 is to go ahead and work on that and I'm going to take  
that to my bosses. Now, as a sign of good faith on

1 | your part, and we talked about this earlier, you'll  
2 | send out some children while we go to work on the rest  
3 | of the seals.

4 |           DAVID: Absolutely not. You did not show me  
5 | the third seal, I showed it to you.

6 |           DICK: We worked together on it.

7 |           DAVID: No, we didn't. I didn't work at all.  
8 | I knew it all along and I know what it entails  
9 | completely. Now it's time for you to go and work and  
10 | get all of your wise men together and really search  
11 | this out. Now, if these men of religion, men of the  
12 | cloth, really believe in God and love and mercy, they  
13 | will seek into God for the knowledge of these things,  
14 | will they not?

15 |           DICK: That's --

16 |           DAVID: Let God reveal to them. God talks to  
17 | them. Don't God talk to them? They say God does.  
18 | Okay, it's time for them to get with God, just like in  
19 | the days of ancient Babylon when Nebuchadnezzar had a  
20 | dream, right. He asked the wise men and astrologers,  
21 | the religious men of his day to answer his dream?  
22 | Okay, let's see.

23 |           DICK: David, I'll take that, exactly what  
24 | you said, to my bosses. Now, I know what they're going  
25 | to tell me, because we've been, we've been talking back  
and forth with one another for several days now.

1 They're going to tell me that you must show a sign of  
2 good faith.

3 DAVID: I did. I gave you this simple test.

4 DICK: And, and I took the test and I, and I  
5 walked with you through several books of the Bible.

6 DAVID: You didn't show it to me. I showed  
7 it to you, now, come on.

8 DICK: David, I'm not a biblical scholar --

9 DAVID: Okay, well, find someone that is.  
10 Put me in touch with someone that is.

11 DICK: We can do that. We'll work, we'll  
12 work on that, but please, show us a sign of your good  
13 faith.

14 DAVID: I did already. You've got several of  
15 my children there. Now, work on it. Wait a second,  
16 someone wants to say something to you.

17 WAYNE: Hello?

18 DICK: Yes. Who is it that I'm speaking  
19 with?

20 WAYNE: This is Wayne.

21 DICK: Wayne.

22 WAYNE: Who am I speaking with?

23 DICK: Dick.

24 WAYNE: Hello, Dick.

25 DICK: How are you doing this afternoon?

WAYNE: All right, and you?



1           DICK: Good. I'm glad to hear from you.

2           WAYNE: Why?

3           DICK: Well, I know that, that you're an  
4 attorney in there and one of the concerns that folks in  
5 there had is that when they come out, how will they be  
6 treated, in what fashion will they be treated and what  
7 are the procedures that will be followed, and I've  
8 asked them to ask you to confirm some of the things  
9 that I've told them. I hope they've come to you to do  
10 that.

11           WAYNE: Well, we know, we know that you're  
12 not following legal procedures. Everything you've done  
13 is unconstitutional. You've thrown the constitution  
14 out of the window. I mean, weak judges have  
15 interpreted the constitution so that it doesn't mean  
16 anything anymore. You know that and I know that.

17           DICK: David, we have followed the letter of  
18 the law --

19           WAYNE: This is Wayne talking now.

20           DICK: I'm sorry, Wayne, please. I'm, I'm  
21 just getting a little groggy here. We have followed  
22 the law. We will continue to follow the law and you,  
23 and you can explain to those folks inside what law must  
24 be followed, and that is, as you suggested, the  
25 constitution.

          WAYNE: You don't serve a warrant by piling

1 out of your vehicle with your guns blazing.

2 DICK: Couldn't agree more. Couldn't agree  
3 more.

4 WAYNE: I'm an eyewitness. It happened.

5 DICK: Absolutely, and you're an attorney.

6 WAYNE: Arrest those men. Investigate the  
7 people that gave them orders to do that.

8 DICK: Okay, Wayne.

9 WAYNE: And then we'll start putting some  
10 confidence in what you're telling us.

11 DICK: Tell the world what those men did. I  
12 wasn't there.

13 WAYNE: Well, then give us, give us the  
14 communication link to the world if you want us to tell  
15 the, tell the world something.

16 DICK: You'll you'll have that communication  
17 link then --

18 WAYNE: When?

19 DICK: We said that all along.

20 WAYNE: When?

21 DICK: As soon as you come out.

22 WAYNE: Give it to us now.

23 DICK: Wayne, listen.

24 WAYNE: We don't trust you.

25 DICK: Okay. I understand that. But listen,  
we suggested yesterday, that we are agreeable to bring

1 out people to witness your coming out so that you feel  
2 comfortable with the arrangements that have been made.  
3 And, and they're, they're folks of your, of your  
4 picking and your choosing. We are agreeable to doing  
5 that. I know that there are concerns in there that  
6 your folks will not be well treated, and we can, we can  
7 deal with those issues by bringing people here that  
8 you're comfortable with to witness the whole thing.

9 WAYNE: I'm comfortable with the  
10 constitution.

11 DICK: As are we.

12 WAYNE: Okay, how about starting with the  
13 Bill of Rights first amendment, freedom of the press?  
14 How about giving us a right to talk to the press?

15 DICK: We're going to give that to you in  
16 detail. You're, you know how many people out here want  
17 to speak to you folks, Wayne?

18 WAYNE: No, I'm not talking future, I'm  
19 talking now. How about opening up a link between us  
20 and the press?

21 DICK: Wayne, we've opened up, we've done a  
22 number of things that you've asked us to do and we've,  
23 we've offered a number of things to you that you've  
24 asked for. However, we have not gotten any show of  
25 good faith from you. We have gotten, not gotten any  
positive response to anything we've done.

1           WAYNE: We could have wasted every ATF on  
2 this, on these grounds. And that's what we did for  
3 you. We let you come in and take the wounded off, we  
4 didn't fire on them, --

5           DICK: I know that.

6           WAYNE: -- and now you want to forget that.  
7 You said we haven't done anything for you?

8           DICK: Wayne, I wasn't there, I'm talking  
9 about --

10          WAYNE: I don't care if you weren't there.  
11 You represent them. Have you ever heard of the law of  
12 agency? You, you are their agents. You're working for  
13 them. You're not working for us. You name me one  
14 attorney that's working for us out there.

15          DICK: Wayne, people are going to be standing  
16 in line to represent you folks, you know that.

17          WAYNE: I'm not talking future, I'm talking  
18 now. Why isn't there a federal lawsuit to, to make the  
19 press have the right to talk to us now? Why isn't  
20 there one filed right now?

21          DICK: I'm sure there might be at some future  
22 point.

23          WAYNE: No, not future, right now. How come  
24 when attorney's try to call up the FBI, you won't even  
25 identify yourselves. Are you chicken or something?

          DICK: Now, what are you responding to?

1           WAYNE: How come no one can get service on  
2 you guys?

3           DICK: How do you mean that Wayne?

4           WAYNE: What I'm saying, the attorney's, they  
5 call up the FBI, they say they have a lawsuit, they  
6 want to file it, and then they ask for somebody to  
7 stick their neck out and tell them who they are so they  
8 can put it on the lawsuit and have it filed and you  
9 guys hang up on the telephone.

10          DICK: I don't know who it is you're  
11 referring to. I have no knowledge --

12          WAYNE: I'm talking about all of you.

13          DICK: Let me tell you what my personal --

14          WAYNE: You call them.

15          DICK: My personal experience has not been  
16 that way.

17          WAYNE: Okay, call Steve Brasher (Phonetic)  
18 in Dallas.

19          DICK: What would Steve tell me if I were to  
20 call him?

21          WAYNE: He'll tell you what attorney's been  
22 trying to file lawsuits on the FBI and the ATF.

23          DICK: Well, that's a, that's a subject of  
24 which I know nothing. I'm not from Dallas --

25          WAYNE: Well find out.

          DICK: I'm not from Dallas, but --

1           WAYNE: Well find out.

2           DICK: Listen Wayne, we're not dealing with  
3 that issue. We're dealing with this issue here and  
4 now. Not what happened in the past, but what's  
5 happening here and now at this time, in this place.  
6 That's what we're dealing with and that's what we must  
7 deal with to get, to get things moving. To get you  
8 folks in a position where you can, where you can confer  
9 with attorneys and where you can confer with the public  
10 at large, and those kinds of people.

11          There have been many, many letters of support that  
12 have been published in the newspaper, one I read to the  
13 fellows out there today, indicating that many people  
14 thought what ATF did was completely unlawful and  
15 inexcusable.

16          WAYNE: Is congress investigating?

17          DICK: Congress, the article I -- two days  
18 ago there was an article in the newspaper indicating  
19 there would be a congressional inquiry in this matter.

20          WAYNE: When are they gonna start it?

21          DICK: It's presently ongoing. We're  
22 gathering all kinds of information.

23          WAYNE: We haven't heard anything in the  
24 media about congress investigating the ATF.

25          DICK: It's being done. We're trying to  
gather reports.

1           WAYNE: It is not being done. Don't lie to  
2 me, mister.

3           DICK: Wayne, listen, --

4           WAYNE: It is not being done.

5           DICK: What's the most important part of that  
6 inquiry? The information coming --

7           WAYNE: That they get it started. That's the  
8 most important part.

9           DICK: They need the information from you  
10 folks inside there to do this in a reasonable manner.  
11 They can't take the information from the ATF only.  
12 They need the information from you folks inside. How  
13 would they deal with inquiry without the information  
14 from you folks within? It's impossible.

15           WAYNE: It's impossible to deal with, with  
16 you, if you're not going to respect the constitution,  
17 then we're not dealing with the government. You know  
18 what we're dealing with? You know what you are?

19           DICK: I'm sure you're going to tell me.

20           WAYNE: You're un-American.

21           DICK: Really?

22           WAYNE: Really.

23           DICK: All right, you're certainly entitled  
24 to your opinion. That, that's your opinion and,  
25 please, you're welcome to it. And we can deal with  
that issue too. You have the right to, to give us, and

1 we demand that information. You think that we want to  
2 see a reoccurrence of, of the events of Sunday?  
3 Absolutely not. You're the folks that can tell your  
4 story to the American public. You have a forum, you  
5 need to use that forum. It's imperative that you use  
6 the forum. It's your responsibility to use that forum  
7 to see that nothing like this ever happens again.

8 WAYNE: You're telling me the whole legal  
9 profession doesn't have one lawyer out there that has  
10 the nerve to go down to the federal court and file a  
11 lawsuit for us?

12 DICK: I can't answer that question for all  
13 the lawyers, you know that. That's, that's a question  
14 you know I can't --

15 WAYNE: But you nobody's done it.

16 DICK: Now, what control do I have over that?  
17 I have absolutely no control over that as you well  
18 know.

19 WAYNE: I don't believe you.

20 DICK: Wayne, you know what you just said  
21 makes absolutely no sense. What, what remedy do you  
22 suggest? What is your suggestion as to how to get this  
23 past this point of impasse?

24 WAYNE: We're demanding that you give us our  
25 constitutional access to the media.

DICK: You're going to have access to the



1 media.

2 WAYNE: Not going to, give it to us now.

3 DICK: You will --
