

FELIPE DE DIESO EMPLOYED AT BARKER ASSOCIATES INTERVIEWED TODAY. DIESO ADMITTED UTILIZING ALIAS JOSE PIEDEA, MAKING TRIPS TO WOC WITH BARKER, ET AL, AND FURNISHED FOLLOWING SPECIFICS: U

ON MAY THREE, SEVENTYTHO, BARKER, DIEGO, GONZALEZ,
MARTINEZ, FIGRINI, REINALDO PICO AND FOUR OTHERS WENT TO WDC
NATIONAL AIRLINES (VAL) FLIGHT ONE ZERO EIGHT. THE SOLE
PURPOSE OF THE FLIGHT ACCORDING TO DIEGO'S KNOWLEDGE WAS TO
PAY RESPECTS TO DECEASED FBI DIPECTOR JOHN EDGAR HOOVER.

AFTER LEAVING ROTUNDA ON MAY THREE, SEVENTYTWO, THEY IMMEDIATELY OBSERVED A GROUP OF SEVERAL THOUSAND PERSONS DEMONSTRATING AGAINST THE US AND THE DECEASED FBI DIRECTOR. PROUP BECAME SO INCENSED THEY INITIATED AN ALTERCATION AGAINST THE DEMONSTRATORS WHICH INCLUDED PHYSICAL VIOLENCE TEARING DOWN SIGNS AND A TENT AND GAINING ACCESS TO THE PUBLIC ADDRESS SYSTEM WHEREIN MIAMI GROUP PEMONSTRATED AGAINST THE DEMONSTRATORS FOR THESE UNAMERICAN ACTIVITIES. DIEGO REITERATED NUMEROUS TIMES THIS TRIP NOT RELATED IN ANY WAY TO CAPTIONED MATTER AND ALL PARTICIPANTS RETURNED TO MIAMI THE FOLLOWING DAY. U

IN CONNECTION WITH MAY TWO IND, SEVENTYTWO, TRIP FROM MIAMI TO WDC, DIEGO IDENTIFIED THE SIX INDIVIDUALS DEPARTING MIAMI AS BARKER AND FRANK CARTER, REINALDO PICO AS J. GRANADA, FIORINI AS J. DI ALBERTI, GONZALEZ AS RAUL GODDY, MARTINEZ AS GENE VALDES, AND DIEGO

AS JOSE PIEDRA. ALL REGISTERED AT THE HAMILTION HOTEL, WDC, ON MAY TWO TWO, SEVENTYTHO, WHERE THEY STATED UNTIL MAY TWO SIY, SEVENTYTHO, WHEN THEY MOVED INTO THE WATERGATE. ROOM APPANGEMENTS WERE GONZALEZ WITH DIEGO, FIROININ WITH PICO, AND BARKER WITH MARTINEZ. U

BARKER IS THE LEADER OF THE GROUP RECRUITED FROM MIAMI AND DIEGO WAS NEVER ADVISED OF THE PURPOSE IF THIS TRIP.

THE ENTIRE TIME WAS SPENT BY HIM AND SOME OF THE OTHERS

AWAITING INSTRUCTIONS WHICH NEVER CAME TO DIEGO. DIEGO

NEVER SAW ANY AMERICANS MEETING WITH OTHER MEMBERS OF THE MIAMI GROUP. HOWEVER, THE SIX WERE NOT TOGETHER CONSTANTLY AND HE CANNOT SPEAK FOR THE ACTION OF THE OTHERS DURING THAT SEVERAL DAY PERIOD. HE HIMSELF DID NOT PARTICIPATE IN ANY ACTIVITY OTHER THAN SOCIALIZING AND NORMAL DAILY LIVING ACTIVITIES. GEORGE LEONARD, EDWARD WARREN, MC CORD, HUNT, BALDWIM, LIDDY UNKNOWN TO DIEGO. He advised he has been a very close personal friend of McCord and his wife for a number of years and still considers McCord a friend of his. He has been thinking about this case and would certainly have no objection to making a contact with Mrs. McCord or McCord himself. If such was done he would point out to McCord that he was talking to him not only as a friend but as an FBI Agent and would make plain to him his rights in any such interview. Guthrie feels that McCord would be better off to discuss his involvement in this matter and Guthrie thinks McCord would talk with him about it. // Guthrie also informed he would do anything the FBI and Mr. Gray wanted him to do in this case and he felt he would not only be helping a friend but would be assisting the FBI in a difficult investigation. DETAILS: This investigation was instituted upon receipt of information from the Philadelphia Division of the FBI advising that the subject and others in this matter were apprehended by the Washington, D. C., Police Department in the Democratic Party Headquarters on June 17, 1972, and had in their possession and in their apartment a total of \$6,000 in \$100 bills, some of the bills in numerical sequence. A trace of these bills was requested in an effort to determine who paid the subjects to burglarize the Democratic offices.

The Federal Reserve Bank in Philadelphia, Pa., determined that nine bills in the subjects' possession were part of a shipment to the Girard Bank of Philadelphia on April 3, 1972. The Girard Bank of Philadelphia, in turn, made various shipments of the bills to various locations during April 3-5, 1972. On April 5, 1972, a shipment of \$10,000 in \$100 bills was made to the Everett Bank, Everett (Bedford County), Pa. The nine bills being traced have serial numbers CO3642255 through CO3642264.

The following investigation was conducted by SA WILLIAM T. HENDON, JR.

On June 20, 1972, MRS. MARJORIE SPONSLER, Cashier, Everett Bank, Everett, Pa., advised that her bank received a \$10,000 shipment of \$100 bills on April 10, 1972, from the Girard Trust Company, Philadelphia, Pa. The serial numbers of these \$100 bills were not recorded on receipt. The \$100 bills were in two \$5,000 packs. She still has one of these packs intact. The other pack has been broken down and distributed to the tellers.

MRS. SPONSLER is the only officer at the bank who approves checks for over \$1,000, and she has received no such checks since April 10, 1972. She has checked all of the \$100 bills in her bank and none of them is close to being in sequence to serial numbers C03642255 through 264.

The tellers at her bank have not given out a large amount of \$100 bills except routinely to businesses in the area for payrolls. U

The Everett Bank has no branches and is located in rural Bedford County, Pa. U

On June 22, 1972, SAMUEL BOHN, Executive Vice President, Everett Bank, Everett, advised that his bank received a shipment of \$10,000 in \$100 bills from the Girard Bank, Philadelphia, on April 10, 1972. The shipment was verified by his employees, but the serial numbers of the bills received were not recorded.

Third Avenue, Waltham, Massachusetts, advised that FRANK JAMESON, Vice President, Special Operations, B & H, is presently out of town on a business trip and is expected to return on June 30, 1972.

JAMES advised he would attempt to answer questions concerning the captioned matter through his conversations with JAMESON.

JAMES said that JAMESON gave a technical demonstration regarding the R-F Alarm System (i.e. this is a security type of an alarm system comparable to the type used for security of the Federal Bureau of Investigation offices). JAMES indicated this alarm system may be modified to suit the needs of the individual using organization.

JAMES stated he believed that WILLIAM MC CUIN, 350 Strathmore Rcad, Havertown, Pennsylvania, made arrangements for the aforementioned demonstration with U.S. Secret Service officials unknown to JAMES.

JAMES advised that JAMESON did not specifically travel to Washington, D. C. for the said demonstration. JAMES said the demonstration apparently was on November 30, 1971, since this was the date reflected on JAMESON's secretary's schedule calendar. JAMES indicated that JAMESON related to him that the said demonstration lasted approximately one and one-half hours, and there were about fifteen to twenty people present during this period; however, this group of people varied because individuals would come in, stand a few minutes and leave again. acquainted with any of the people present at the aforementioned demonstration, with the exception of MC CUIN, B & H representative, and ALBERT WONG, of the U. S. Secret Service.

JAMES said, according to JAMESON, ALBERT WONG was accompanied by several other individuals.

JAMES related that JAMESON indicated to him that one of the individuals with WONG asked numerous questions about the alarm system, but JAMESON did not know this individual's identity. JAMES said, subsequent to the demonstration, JAMESON inquired about the identity of the individual asking questions because he was annoyed at the nature of the questions. JAMES said apparently JAMESON learned the identity of the individual might be JAMES W. MC CORD; however, JAMESON related to JAMES that he was not sure if this information was correct since his source of information was an unknown individual present at this demonstration.

JAMES stated that JAMESON subsequently attempted to contact the individual described to him as MC CORD, by addressing a letter to the United States Secret Service, 1800 G Street, Washington, D. C., assuming MC CORD was affiliated with the Secret Service since apparently he was present at the aforementioned demonstration. JAMES said he believed JAMESON was trying to pursue the sales of the R-F Alarm System and this is the reason he attempted to correspond with MC CORD, the individual identified to him as making the inquiries concerning the alarm system at the sales JAMES, according to information he demonstration. received from JAMESON, stated that no reply had been received to JAMESON's letter.

JAMES advised JAMESON related that he subsequently was told that MC CORD was not present at the said sales demonstration. JAMESON told JAMES that he was unable to determine if MC CORD was present at the sales demonstration.

JAMES said he believes that MC CUIN would be able to resolve all questions on the aforementioned demonstration since he arranged same.

JAMES stated MC CUIN, apparently as a follow-up to the letter by JAMESON, in order to pursue the sales of the R-F Alarm System, learned of the address of MC CORD through associates in Washington, D. C.

JAMES advised that the aforementioned sales demonstration had absolutely nothing to do with equipment subsequently purchased by MC CORD Associates, Incorporated, 414 Hungerford Plaza, Suite 220, Rockville, Maryland.

JAMES further advised the only equipment purchased by Mc Cord Associates, Incorporated, was reflected in Purchase Order Number 1326, dated April 24, 1972, and a copy of this Purchase Order has been previously furnished to the Federal Bureau of Investigation, (FBI). JAMES reiterated that Purchase Order 1389, dated May 25, 1972 to McCord Associates, Incorporated, had not been filled by Bell and Howell.

JAMES, during the course of the interview, was telephonically contacted by JAMESON and JAMESON advised the following regarding this matter:

JAMESON stated he was not acquainted with anyone at the aforementioned sales demonstration of the R-F Alarm System. JAMESON said the only individuals known to him that were present were WILLIAM MC CUIN, B & H representative, and AL WONG, affiliated with the U.S. Secret Service.

JAMESON indicated that approximately fifteen people were present at this demonstration that lasted about one and one-half hours; how-

ever, the majority of the people present would come in, stand a few minutes and leave again. JAMESON said he believed most of the people present during the sales demonstration were affiliated with the U. S. Secret Service or Federal Protection Service (FPS).

JAMESON stated that he believed electrical equipment furnished to MC CCRD Associates, Incorporated, as reflected in Purchase Order Number 1326, dated April 24, 1972, was ordered through WILLIAM MC CUIN. JAMESON said also that Purchase Order Number 1389 dated May 25, 1972 was likewise ordered through MC CUIN; however, JAMESON added that Purchase Order 1389 was not filled by' B & H.

JAMES, subsequent to the interview, made available a Xerox copy of the letter from FRANK J. JAMESON addressed to JAMES MC CORD, U. S. Secret Service, 1800 G Street, Washington, D. C., dated January 27, 1972. JAMES advised he will continue to be of assistance to the FBI.

ALLEGED LEAK OF INFORMATION FROM FBI

On 6/22/72, CHARLES W. COLSON, Special Adviser to the President, was interviewed by Special Agents ANGELO J. LANO and DANIEL C. MAHAN in the presence of JOHN DEAN, Legal Counsel to the President. During this interview, Mr. COLSON brought out that Mr. E. HOWARD HUNT had occupied the office located in room 338 of the Executive Office Building and that office had not been used since HUNT's termination at the end of March, 1972, as he was hoping to use this office space for an addition to his administrative staff. Mr. DEAN stated that this was the first he was aware of this office. In response to an Agent's request to examine the office, DEAN advised the White House would provide the FBI with any contents belonging to HUNT. U %

1-1-4787-342 On 6/26/72, Special Agenes MAHAN and MICHAEL J. KING traveled to the office of JOHN DEAN in order to pick up the contents of the office of E. HOWARD HUNT, described above. This was in response to a telephonic request from DEAN. Upon arrival, Mr. DEAN provided the Agents with a large cardboard box containing numerous office supplies, White House stationery and a metal box containing one Colt .25 Automatic Revolver. Mr. DEAN stated that another box existed with other materials taken from HUNT's office but that he did not know its whereabouts and that his assistant, Mr. FRED FIELDING, would provide that box at approximately 1:30 p.m. that afternoon. At approximately 4:00 p.m., after the foregoing Agents waited? at the White House from 1:30 on, FIELDING made available another sealed cardboard box marked "Top Secret." Upon

The Agents then returned to the Washington Field Office with both boxes containing the alleged effects of HUNT. Upon returning to the Washington Field Office, the second box was opened. In the second box was located a black attache case which, when opened, contained the ancillary electronic equipment and four manuals for operation of the Kel-Com Transceivers manufactured by Bell & Howell Company. In addition, this attache case contained two maps, the first a travel map of the Mobil Oil Company depicting the District of Columbia and surrounding states. The second map was an Avis Rent-A-Car map of Washington, D. C., and Baltimore, Maryland.

On 6/29/72, Special Agents DANIEL C. MAHAN and ROBERT E. LILL went to the White House in response to Mr. DEAN's invitation to interview the individuals involved in the chain of evidence of the aforementioned two boxes. Mr. DEAN initially advised that the effects of Mr. HUNT were removed by GSA employees from room 338 of the Executive Office Building to room 522 of the Executive Office Building on the afternoon of 6/19/72. It is noted that these effects were allegedly contained in one cardboard box and a two-drawer file safe. It was later determined that Mr. HUNT's effects were to be examined that evening but a combination to the aforementioned safe could not be found. Consequently, two employees of the Safemasters Company of Washington, D. C., were contacted, responded to the White House and opened the safe. The contents were first examined by Secret Service Agent BAKER to determine if the safe contained any classified materials. Mr. BAKER observed an envelope marked "Eyes Only" and immediately shut the drawer. That evening the contents of the safe were removed into a second cardboard box by Mr. FIELDING and Mr. BRUCE KERHLI Staff Secretary to the President, and moved to Mr. KERHLI's office by GSA employees that night.[]

Mr. DEAN then stated the aforementioned boxes were brought to his office by GSA employees on the morning of

6/20/72 and reviewed by him and Mr. FIELDING that afternoon. Mr. DEAN explained that the box containing the office supplies remained in his office until such time as they were turned over to the FBI on 6/26/72. He stated that the classified material was placed in one of his file cabinets where it remained until turned over to the FBI on the afternoon of 6/26/72.

Mr. DEAN did not take the opportunity to explain the inconsistencies in the interviews conducted in his presence on 6/22 and 6/29/72.

Federal authorities have seized a Tally Daded Spanish-made automatic piston, diagrams of the Democratic National Committee headquarters and an electronic eavesdropping device from Howard E. Hunt's desk in the Old Executive Office Building next door to the White House, The Washington Daily News learned today.

Sources say the federal officers searched Mr. Hunt's desk, located in the office soite of Charles Colson, special counsel to President Nixon. The found floor plans of the Democratic offices in the Watergate building and what was described as a "partially dismantled bug" similar to the ones taken from five men breaking in the Democratic headquarters, June 17.

Mr. Hunt was first linked to the bugging plot when lawmen discovered his name and phone number in the address books of two of the burgiary suspects. Police said that next to his name in one of the books was the notation "W. House," and in the other book Mr. Hunt's name was followed by the inscription "W.H."

After this discovery, the FBI quizzed Mr. Hunt but agents reported that he avoided most of their questions and "shed no light on the investigation."

That was the last communication police are known to have had with Mr. Hunt who broke contacts with his friends and employer here and "disappeared" after he became publically connected with the burglary suspects.

Mr. Hunt, 54, a writer for the public relations firm of Robert R. Mullen whose offices are diagonally across the street from the White House, had been working as a special consultant to the President on the de-classification of the Pentagon Papers and on narcotics have enforcement. He was last reported at the White House on March 29.

The he had a desk in Mr. Colson's office suite, white House sources said that Mr. Hunt often worked for other officials in the Executive building.

Mr. Colson, described as a behind-the-scenes man for the President, yesterday refused to answer any phone calls concerning the search of Mr. Hunt's desk or the bugging of the Democratic offices.

The two men met in 1966 at the Brown University Club where Mr. Colson served as president and Mr. Hunt as vice president. Mr. Colson, a White House spokesman said, recommended Mr. Hunt for the consulting job at the White House.

Mr. Hunt, a CIA agent from 1949 to 1970 was hired by the Mullen firm two years ago with endorsements from CIA director Richard Heims and conservative columnist William F. Buckley.

Five days after the burglary the Mullen Co. "suspended" Mr. Hunt. A speker-man said yesterday that Mr. Hunt had made one long distance call to the office since that time, but "he made it a point not to tell us where he was."

As a CIA agent Mr. Hunt was involved in

the planning for the ill-lated Bay of Pigs invasion where he worked closely with one of the burglary suspects, Bounard Barker, then assigned to coordinate on the invasion.

Earlier this month, officials say, Mr. Hunt traveled to Miami where he met with Mr. Barker.

Long alter the Bay of Pigs and his work with the CIA, sources said Mr. Hunt continued to support the anti-Castro Cubans exiled in Miami.

Mr. Hunt, author of 42 novels, is listed in Who's Who as a former writer for Life magazine and a contributor to political journals. He owns a \$200,000 estate in the presingious Potomac area of Montgomery County.

Meanwhile the FBI and local police continue to assemble evidence for the grand jury investigation of the burglary in which the five men, all wearing surgical gioves, were cornered by police in the inner offices of the Democratic beadquarters on the sixth floor of the Watergate Office Building at 2000 Virginia—av nw.

.Police say there is evidence that the men were in the offices to remove "dead bugs", emplaced earlier in the Democratic offices.

Besides Mr. Barker, police have charged: James McCord, an ex-FBI agent and CIA employe who was chief of security for the GOP and the Committee for the Re-Election of the President: Frank Florini, a soldier of fortune who fought for Castro and later defected to lead anti-Castro groups in Miami; Eugenio Martinez a wealthy Miami real estate broker, and Virgilio Gonzalez, a locksmith associated with anti-Castro groups.
