Attached sets forth summary of investigation conducted 7/28/72, of burglary of Democratic National Committee Headquarters.

Reinterview of Maurice Stans produced the following:

George Gordon Liddy received authorization for intelligence gathering operation prior to Stans joining Finance Committee to Re-elect the President. Stans received Dahlberg check and within minutes handed same to Hugh Walter Sloan, Jr., in view of April 6 law. Stans knew of only one disbursement of cash to Liddy. Sloan came to him after Liddy requested \$30,000 from Sloan. Stans referred Sloan to Jeb Magruder. Sloan advised prior to 4/6/72, \$350,000 in cash on hand. Additional like amount added after 4/6/72; the latter amount included Dahlberg and Mexican checks which were eventually deposited as cash on hand around 5/30/72. Stans acknowledged aware of Sloan's possible resignation soon after he (Stans) entered on duty from third party.

Stans claimed he had not given instructions to Texas Committee to Re-elect the President (CRP) to refer any inquiries regarding anything to him (Stans). Stans indicated Mexican checks possibly received by Mexican attorney Manuel Ogarrio from third party possible state CRP contributor. Stans would not elaborate until afforded opportunity to discuss with counsel. At this point, Stans served with subpoena requiring his presence before Federal Grand Jury (FGJ), 8/1/72.

This memorandum is for the purpose of furnishing information concerning the identity of those who subpoenaed telephone records of Bernard L. Barker or had access to them.

On 6/21/72, a subpoena was issued in U. S. District Court, Miami, Florida, for the toll records of Barker's residence and his business, Barker Associates. These toll records were set forth in the Miami report dated 6/28/72, which was disseminated to Assistant Attorney General Henry Petersen, Criminal Division, and to the U.S. Attorney's office, Washington, D. C., for use in connection with Federal grand jury hearings. In addition, the toll records have been used by Miami and Washington Field Office for lead purposes in our investigation. The toll records revealed

7/20/72 Miami has information that Richard was received from Gerstein, States Attorney, Miami, subpoenaed Barker's toll records. He also previously subpoenaed records of Barker's bank account. Reportedly these records were obtained by Gerstein for review in connection with a "vague allegation } that there was a conspiracy in Dade County, Florida."

Miami advised Gerstein has the reputation of being a very ambitious Democratic politician. It is possible he subpoenaed these records at the request of some member of the Democratic Party and is the source of information in the news media regarding the calls between Barker and the Committee Reelect the President.

Attached sets forth investigation conducted 7/21/72, of burglary of Democratic Party National Headquarters.

(1) Jeb Magruder, Deputy Campaign Director, Committee to Re-elect the President (CRP), advised he hired George Gordon Liddy as counsel for CRP and authorized Hugh Walter Sloan, Jr., to give Liddy up to \$250,000 to handle problems of surrogate candidates and convention sites. He specifically instructed Liddy not to embarrass CRP or violate the law.

(2) Fred C. LaRue, Special Consultant to Campaign Manager, admits hiring Baldwin based on resume from James W. McCord. He said he received instructions on hiring people, especially guards, from either Mr. or Mrs. John Mitchell. LaRue said Robert Mardian wrote memorandum to Maurice Stans that Liddy should be dismissed for failure to cooperate with FBI. LaRue terminated Liddy when Liddy refused to resign. LaRue said Liddy was general counsel to CRP, also legal counsel to the Finance Committee, and was a sometime head of an intelligence group.

LaRue called Sloan on 7/6/72, requesting him to travel to California and said he next saw Sloan on day he resigned. Washington Field Office notes this was same day when Maurice Stans advised Bureau Agents Sloan's whereabouts were unknown.

(3) Kenneth W. Parkinson and Paul O'Brien, attorneys for CRP, claim attorney client privilege and efforts to interview negative.

(4) John Ehrlichman, on 7/21/72, admitted meeting Hunt and Liddy on one occasion and said they worked on leak program at one time. He denied knowledge of any illegal activity at the Committee.

(6) Sloan will appear U.S. District Court, Monday, 7/24/72, for debriefing.

(7) Liddy excused from grand jury until 7/25/72, when handwriting and major pase prints will be obtained.





"I maintain a residence in Wayzata, Minnesota, and a winter home in Boca Raton. Florida. On April 10, 1972, and for a considerable time before this date I was in Boca Raton, Florida. While in Boca Raton, Florida, I was engaged in raising funds to re-elect the President. I had accumulated a large amount of cash as a result of my fund raising activities and not wanting to travel to Washington, D.C. with such a large amount of cash, I obtained a Cashiers Check in the amount of \$25,000.00. This check was obtained at the First Bank and Trust Company, Boca Raton, Florida, The check was made payable to myself, and to the best of my recollection it was dated April 10, 1972. have no account at the First Bank and Trust Company and my only reason for obtaining the Cashiers Check at this bank is that it is close to my residence.

"On April 10, 1972, I flew from Boca Raton, Plorida, to Washington, D.C. and on the following morning, I attended a meeting of the State Chairmen of the Finance Committee to Re-Elect the President which was held at the Washington Hilton Hotel, Washington, D.C. During a recess of this meeting I endorsed the Cashiers Check in the amount of \$25,000.00 and turned it over to MAURICE H. STANS, who is chairman of this finance committee. There were other individuals in the room at the time I gave this check to Mr. STANS, but I have no recollection of who might have observed this transaction. I did not obtain a receipt for this check.

"I have no knowledge whatsoever what happened to this Cashiers Check after I turned it over to STANS. I do not know how this check got into the possession of BERNARD BARKER since this man is unknown to me.

"I have no knowledge concerning the burglary of the Democratic National Headquarters in Washington, D.C., and I wish to emphatically state that I had nothing whatsoever to do with this matter. In national magazines I have seen the names and photographs of the men reported to have been involved in the burglary and none of these men are known to me.



MC WINN advised he was not acquainted with any of the subjects of this case, specifically BERNARD L. BARKER and did not recall any possible contact with this individual.

MC WINN said he has been a practicing attorney for two years specializing in the labor field, although he has some civil litigations. He added he has no present plans connected with real estate in Florida and has never been to Washington, D.C., further that he is not connected with any political activities and has no specific party affiliation. Mr. MC WINN appeared very cooperative and indicated he would assist the Federal Bureau of Investigation in any manner possible.

A review of the current telephone directory for Gretna, Florida, failed to show a listing in the name of EDGAR SOPO. The telephone information operator advised she was unable to locate a listing in the name of EDGAR SOPO for Gretna, Florida.

On July 10, 1972, Mrs. J. W. THOMPSON, Post Mistress, Gretna, Florida, advised that the name of EDGAR SOPO was unknown to her and to her knowledge no one by that name is or has received any mail through the Gretna Post Office.

**DETAILS** 

I. INVESTIGATION REGARDING GEORGE GORDON LIDDY, ALIAS GEORGE F. LEONARD, 1601 WASHINGTON AVENUE, KANSAS CITY, KANSAS.

A previous report in this matter reflected information that an individual using the name of GEORGE F. LECNARD, 1601 Washington Avenue, Kansas City, Kansas, may have been involved as a co-conspirator with five subjects arrested June 17, 1972, while in the process of burglarizing the National Headquarters of the Democratic National Committee. It was also previously reported that 1601 Washington Avenue, Kansas City, Kansas, was a fictitious address and efforts by Kansas City Division to locate GECRGE F. LECNARD met with negative results.

Based on information developed by the Miami Division of the FBI that the name GEORGE F. LEONARD was an alias used by one GEORGE GORDON LIDDY the following additional investigation was conducted by the Kansas City Division.

It is noted that although 1601 Washington Avenue is a fictitious address, there is a 1601 Washington Blvd. in Kansas City, Kansas. This location is housed by the Solar Apartment building.

The following investigation was conducted by SA LEONE J. FLOSI, on June 30, 1972:

Mr. FRED EARNHARDT, Proprietor, Solar Apartments, 1601 Washington Blvd., Kansas City, Kansas, advised that he does not now have nor has he ever had in the past any individual residing in his apartments with the name of GECRGE GCRDON LIDDY. Mr. EARNHARDT further stated that he owns 45 apartment units in the immediate area of 1601 Washington Blvd. and has never had anyone with the name LIDDY as an occupant in any of these apartments.





On June 30, 1972, a review was made of Kansas City, Missouri, Metropolitan area City and Telephone Directories for the name of GEORGE GORDON LIDDY with negative results. The only listing for LIDDY in the Kansas City Metropolitan area is a Mr. FRED LIDDY, wife ROZANNE, 8541 Russell Avenue, Overland Park, Kansas, telephone 913-649-1431. The city directory reflects Mr. FRED LIDDY is retired.

11. INVESTIGATION CONCERNING A 25 CALIBER COLT AUTOMATIC SERIAL NUMBER 321-803 PROPERTY OF EVERETT HOWARD HUNT.

The following investigation was conducted by SA ROY L. HUMPHREYS at St. Joseph, Missouri:

On July 7, 1972, Mr. CHARLES BOCHERT, Salesman, Wyeth Company, St. Joseph, Missouri, advised that Colt 25 caliber automatic serial number 321-803 was sold by the Wyeth Company on April 17, 1923, to Oliver and Holbert Hardware, Newton, Kansas.

The following investigation was conducted by SA LARRY D. WELCH at Newton, Kansas:

On July 10, 1972, Mrs. MERLE OLIVER, 220 West 8th Street, Newton, Kansas, widow of MERLE OLIVER, and BRADFORD WELLS, 1407 Hillcrest, nephew of MERLE OLIVER, advised that the Oliver-Holbert Company of Newton, Kansas, was owned by MERLE OLIVER and HERBERT SYDNEY HOLBERT. However, the company terminated business in 1930. MERLE OLIVER died of natural causes August 9, 1944, and HERBERT SYDNEY HOLBERT committed suicide on April 27, 1937. Above individuals have no idea regarding the whereabouts of any records maintained by the Oliver-Holbert Hardware Company.

III. INVESTIGATION AT TWA TO LOCATE AIR TRAVEL OF GEORGE GORDON LIDDY AND EVERETT HOWARD HUNT UNDER THEIR TRUE NAMES AND KNOWN ALIASES.

The following investigation was conducted by SC JAMES W. WRIGHT at Kansas City, Missouri:



Mr. MICHAEL G. ALEXANDER, Deputy United States Marshal temporarily assigned, Washington, D. C., United States Marshal Service, voluntarily appeared at the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), Washington Field Office (WFO), at which time PAUL P. MAGALLANES and JOHN W. MINDERMAN identified themselves as Special Agents of the FBI. Mr. ALEXANDER was advised that the nature of the interview concerned his relationship, if any, with JAMES MC CORD. Mr. ALEXANDER furnished the following information:

Mr. ALEXANDER viewed the following six black and white photographs: FRANCIS XAVIER DOLAN, SR.; VIRGILIO R. GONZALES; BERNARD BARKER; JAMES W. MC CORD; EUGENIO R. MARTINEZ; and FRANK STURGIS.

Mr. ALEXANDER could not identify any of the above photographs as being identical with JAMES MC CORD. Mr. ALEXANDER stated, however, that an individual who identified himself as Mr. JAMES MC CORD had telephoned him on about three occasions, approximately December, 1971, and February and March, 1972, in order to ascertain whether Mr. ALEXANDER was interested in employment with the firm Mc Cord Associates, Rockville, Maryland.

Mr. ALEXANDER advised he had, prior to retiring from the United States Army, submitted resumes with the Department of Army for purposes of employment after he retired from service. He stated the Army has a project, Project Referral, which attempts to place retired Army personnel in positions relatings to security and to law enforcement.

Mr. ALEXANDER stated that MC CORD, in his telephone conversations, had attempted to persuade Mr. ALEXANDER to join his firm and said that the position would be in the security field. When Mr. ALEXANDER attempted to pinpoint Mr. MC CORD as to specific duties of the position, MC CORD stated he would rather talk to him in person at his Rockville Office and would

not discuss the security position over the telephone. learning that Mr. ALEXANDER would probably find employment with the United States Marshal Service in Baltimore, Maryland, Mr. MC CORD stated that he would pay Mr. ALEXANDER more money than the United States Marshal Service offered Mr. ALEXANDER. Mr. ALEXANDER, however, stated that he had no desire to commute from Baltimore to Washington, D. C. on a daily basis. At this point Mr. MC COKD stated that there was a posibility that Mr. ALEXANDER could obtain employment in Baltimore, Maryland in a position which would relate to railroad security. Mr. MC CORD indicated, however, that he would need to personally talk with Mr. ALEXANDER at his Rockville office of employment. Mr. ALEXANDER stated that he had subsequently made an appointment to discuss employment with Mr. MC CORD but that he never kept the appointment, inasmuch as the United States Marshal Service hired him prior to the date of the appointment.

Mr. ALEXANDER stated that Mr. MC CORD had said that he had employed other men for his firm through the Army project referred to above. Mr. MC CORD also indicated that he had contacts at the Pentagon, Arlington, Virginia and that he received all of the names of the military retirees in the Washington, D. C. area.

Mr. ALEXANDER stated he never made Mr. MC CORD's acquaintance and that insofar as he is aware all of his telephone conversations were with a male who identified himself as being JAMES MC CORD of Mc Cord Associates, Rockville, Maryland.

Mr. CAJLFIELD stated he contacted a Mr. AL WONG, Assistant Director, Technical Division, U.S. Secret Service regarding someone who could fill the security officer position at the Committee. Mr. WONG indicated to Mr. CAULFIELD that Mc Cord Associates, namely JAMES W. MC CORD, could probably handle the assignment and that he (MC CORD) had had considerable experience in the security field. Mr. MC CORD was subsequently hired by Mr. ODLE as security officer for the Committee to Re-elect the President.

Mr. CAULFIELD said that he became acquainted with Mr. MC CORD while being employed at the Committee and that his relationship with MC CORD was casual. He stated that about 4 months ago he had mislaid some personal property at the Committee headquarters and that he had requested Mr. MC CORD to ascertain its location. Mr. MC CORD subsequently telephoned Mr. CAULFIELD at his residence and advised him of the location of his property.

Mr. CAULFIELD stated that he did not know Mr. MC CORD from a social standpoint and that his dealings with Mr. MC CORD were strictly business. Mr. MC CORD never indicated to him at any time his activities in the security field.

LOUIS RUSSELL was interviewed by Special Agents of the FBI who identified themselves as agents of the FBI and advised RUSSELL of the nature of the interview. He supplied the following information:

He does not recall ever receiving a phone call on April 25, 1972 from McCord Associates to the phone number 234-9746 which is the pay telephone located in the hall of the rooming house where he resides. He advised that he does know JAMES MCCORD of McCord Associates and that he is employed by JAMES MCCORD. He stated that the phone call could have been taken by any of the tenants living in the rooming house formerly owned by Mrs. KATHERINE M. ROBINSON, who died around February, 1972. The house is now owned by her niece and the rooming house houses several Spanish speaking persons as well as Iranians.

He first met JAMES MCCORD in January or February of 1972 at Scholls Restaurant in Washington, D.C. at which time MCCORD asked him to work for him as an investigator for the Hational Committee to Re-Elect the President. stated that MCCORD said that he was recommended to him by someone, whose name he did not disclose. RUSSELL advised that this is probably correct as he has done investigative work in and around Washington, D.C. for some time. He said his first job was to do a background check on a female, name "JANE" (Last Name Unknown) who was in the employ of the National Committee to Re-Elect the Presidenti. He said for that job he received \$40.00 paid by check in advance by MCCORD. His next job was a background check on a male "Hippie" who was a messenger for The National Committee to Re-Elect the President and for this job he received \$25.00. He advised he was also asked to check out a magazine by the title of "The Sociables", and a woman by the name of RITA GERIN. gave written reports to HCCORD on all the above cases.

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On June 1, 1972, MCCORD put him on retainer of \$710,00 per month to continue until the Presidential Election was over with the purpose of investigating JACK ANDERSON to determine the source of ANDERSON'S information. He furnished MCCCRD with one report on ANDIRSON for which he received \$75.00. He stated that he worked this case solely during the month of June but that now that the "Democratic Committee Bugging Incident Occured", he does not know if he will still be employed by MCCCRD. He advised that he also worked for MCCORD as a Security Guard at 1701 Pennsylvania Avenue, Northwest, Washington, D.C., 2nd Floor, for about two weeks prior to being put on retainer by MCCORD. He said that it was his understanding he was employed by The National Committee to Re-Elect the President and was hired by JAMES MCCORD. His checks were drawn on the Maryland National Bank on the account of Mr. and Mrs. JAMES MCCORD or McCord Associates. He couldn't remember which.

He said that he saw JAMES and Mrs. MCCORD last night at their home, but that they did not discuss the break in of the Democratic National Headquarters nor did MCCORD give him any information as to RUSSELLS current employment status with The National Committee to Re-Elect the President. As far as the ANDERSON investigation was concerned RUSSELLstated that he was never told what person or persons in The National Committee to Re-Elect the President was interested or requested the ANDERSON investigation.

RUSSELL advised that his background concerning investigative work started in 1937 when he was a Special Agent for the Federal Bureau of Investigation. He was employed by the Federal Bureau of Investigation from June, 1937 until 1944, when he left the Federal Bureau of Investigation, because of personal reasons; ie, first wife committing suicide and his becoming a heavy drinker. He stated that most of his work in the Federal Bureau of



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Investigation was in the Washington, D.C. area. After 1944, he worked in may varied jobs and found work wherever he could. From 1945 until 1954 he worked as an investigator for the House Committee on UnAmerican Activities and was fired in 1954 for drinking, but was reinstated in 1957 by FRANCIS B. WALTER. He stayed with the House Committee on UnAmerican Activities until 1967. Since that time he has worked varied jobs but mainly doing investigations and background checks for clients. He admitted that at one time he was an alcoholic and a memb r of Alcoholics Anonymous. He ran a home for Alcoholics Anonymous for a year (February 1969-1970) at 401 East Hume Street. Alexandria, Virginia. He has resided at 1743 Q Street, Northwest, Washington, D.C. from about February 1970 until the present time. He stated that his name has appeared in the following books:

The Witness - By WHITAKER CHARGERS

He advised that he has never been employed by the CIA and that he knows nothing concerning the bugging of the Democratic National Headquarters. He stated that the last time he was in Miami was around 1949.

Third Avenue, Waltham, Massachusetts, advised that FRANK JAMESON, Vice President, Special Operations, B & H, is presently out of town on a business trip and is expected to return on June 30, 1972.

JAMES advised he would attempt to answer questions concerning the captioned matter through his conversations with JAMESON.

JAMES said that JAMESON gave a technical demonstration regarding the R-P Alarm System (1.e. this is a security type of an alarm system comparable to the type used for security of the Federal Bureau of Investigation offices). JAMES indicated this alarm system may be modified to suit the needs of the individual using organization.

JAMES stated he believed that WILLIAM MC CUIN. 350 Strathmore Road, Havertown, Pennsylvania, made arrangements for the aforementioned demonstration with U.S. Secret Service officials unknown to JAMES.

JAMES advised that JAMESON did not specifically travel to Washington, D. C. for the said demonstration. JAMES said the demonstration apparently was on November 30, 1971, since this was the date reflected on JAMESON's secretary's schedule calendar. JAMES indicated that JAMESON related to him that the said demonstration lasted approximately one and one-half hours, and there were about fifteen to twenty people present during this period; however, this group of people varied because individuals would come in, stand a few minutes and leave again. JAMES advised he does not believe that JAMESON was

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acquainted with any of the people present at the aforementioned demonstration, with the exception of MC CUIN, B & H representative, and ALBERT WONG, of the U.S. Secret Service.

JAMES said, according to JAMESON, ALBERT WONG was accompanied by several other individuals. JAMES related that JAMESON indicated to him that one of the individuals with WONG asked numerous questions about the alarm system, but JAMESON did not know this individual's identity. JAMES said, subsequent to the demonstration, JAMESON inquired about the identity of the individual asking questions because he was annoyed at the nature of the questions. JAMES said apparently JAMESON learned the identity of the individual might be JAMES W. MC CORD; however, JAMESON related to JAMES that he was not sure if this information was correct since his source of information was an unknown individual present at this demonstraction.

JAMES stated that JAMESON subsequently attempted to contact the individual described to him as MC CORD, by addressing a letter to the United States Secret Service, 1800 G Street, Washington, D. C., assuming NC COFD was affiliated with the Secret Service since apparently he was present at the aforementioned demonstration. JAMES said he believed JAMESON was trying to pursue the sales of the R-F Alarm System and this is the reason he attempted to correspond with MC CORD, the individual identified to him as making the in- . quiries concerning the alarm system at the sales JAMES, according to information he demonstration. received from JAMESON, stated that no reply had been received to JAMESON's letter.

JAMES advised JAMESON related that he subsequently was told that MC CORD was not present at the said sales demonstration. JAMESON told JAMES that he was unable to determine if MC CORD was present at the sales demonstration.

JAMES said he believes that MC CUIN would be able to resolve all questions on the aforementioned demonstration since he arranged same.

JAMES stated MC CUIN, apparently as a follow-up to the letter by JAMESON, in order to pursue the sales of the R-F Alarm System, learned of the address of MC CORD through associates in Washington, D. C.

JAMES advised that the aforementioned sales demonstration had absolutely nothing to do with equipment subsequently purchased by MC CORD Associates, Incorporated, 414 Hungerford Plaza, Suite 220, Rockville, Maryland.

JAMES further advised the only equipment purchased by Mc Cord Associates, Incorporated, was reflected in Purchase Order Number 1326, dated April 24, 1972, and a copy of this Purchase Order has been previously furnished to the Federal Bureau of Investigation, (FBI). JAMES reiterated that Purchase Order 1389, dated May 25, 1972 to McCord Associates, Incorporated, had not been filled by Bell and Howell.

JAMES, during the course of the interview, was telephonically contacted by JAMESON and JAMESON advised the following regarding this matter:

JAMESON stated he was not acquainted with anyone at the aforementioned sales demonstration of the R-F Alarm System. JAMESON said the only individuals known to him that were present were WILLIAM MC CUIN, B & H representative, and AL WONG, affiliated with the U.S. Secret Service.

JAMESON indicated that approximately fifteen people were present at this demonstration that lasted about one and one-half hours; how-

ever, the majority of the people present would come in, stand a few minutes and leave again. JAMESON said he believed most of the people present during the sales demonstration were affiliated with the U. S. Secret Service or Federal Protection Service (FPS).

JAMESON stated that he believed electrical equipment furnished to MC CORD Associates, Incorporated, as reflected in Purchase Order Number 1326, dated April 24, 1972, was ordered through WILLIAM MC CUIN. JAMESON said also that Purchase Order Number 1389 dated May 25, 1972 was likewise ordered through MC CUIN; however, JAMESON added that Purchase Order 1389 was not filled by B & H.

JAMES, subsequent to the interview, made available a Xerox copy of the letter from FRANK J. JAMESON addressed to JAMES MC CORD, U. S. Secret Service, 1800 G Street, Washington, D. C., dated January 27, 1972. JAMES advised he will continue to be of assistance to the FBI.



A. ROBERT CHERIN. Secretary-Treasurer, Enloe, Stalvey and Associates, Incorporated, 1140 Connecticut Avenue, N.W., was interviewed at his place of employment and provided the following information:

CHERIN advised that in April and early May of 1972, he was in the process of looking for a new job and had contacted the Ex-Agents Society in both Washington, D.C., and New York City, New York. Sometime during the first week in May, 1972, he was telephonically contacted by a JAMES W. MC CORD who advised that he was working for the Committee to Re-elect the President and that he had obtained CHERIN's name from the Ex-Agents Society. MC CORD stated that he had a job opening a sa Security Officer and asked CHERIN if he would be interested. CHERIN stated that he might be and they agreed to meet for lunch a few days later.

Two or three days following the telephone conversation, CHERIN met MC CORD in MC CORD's office at the Committee to Re-elect the President, 1701 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W. They talked briefly and then went cut to lunch. At this time, MC CORD stated that the security position involved being in charge of the security for Mrs. MARTHA MITCHELL and included traveling with Mrs. MITCHELL and making the security arrangements as they traveled from place to place. MC CORD advised that the salary for this position would be roughly in the \$17,000 to \$20,000 per year range. MC CORD further stated that the job would only be good through the Presidential election in November, 1972, however, this particular position would be a good start for someone interested in higher Government positions.

The total conversation lasted approximately 45 minutes, after which, MC CORD stated that if CHERIN was interested in the position he would need several additional interviews with some of MC CORD's superiors. At this point, CHERIN stated that he was not interested in the position. The interview was then terminated and CHERIN has not seen MC CORD or heard from him since that time.

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CHERIN further advised that he had not been acquainted with MC CORD prior to this meeting and job offer. CHERIN further advised that MC CORD had indicated to him that he was talking with other ex-agents, Secret Service Agents and Central Intelligence Agents regarding the same security position. CHERIN stated that no other names were mentioned to him by MC CORD.

On June 19, 1972, he requested the personal effects of Mr. E. HOWARD HUNT to be moved from room 338 to room 522 of the Executive Office Building, (OEB), and thereafter requested that these effects which included a file safe be opened in room 522. Mr. KHERLI stated that he made the moving arrangements with Mr. CHARLES ROTCRFORD, area manager of General Services Miministration (GSA), and that the safe was opened in room 522 storage room, in the presence of a United States Secret Service Agent by the name of BAKER, by they Safemasters Company of WDC. Mr. KEHFLI advised that BAKER notified him when the safe was open and that he traveled to the fifth floor of the EOB and advised Agent BAKER that his services were no longer needed. In the meantime, a Mr. FRED FINLDING of the President's Legal Counsel Office arrived and assisted him, KERLY, in taking the items from the file safe and placing them in a cardboard container.

Mr. KFHRLI then arrived with Mr. ROTCHFORD to have two cardboard boxes, containing Mr. HUNT's effect, moved from room 522 of EOB to his office which was located in the basement of the west wing of the White House.

time these boxes were transported to his office. The boxes were then placed in his office and he locked both the inner and outer doors of that office and returned to his home for the evening. On June 19, 1972, Mr. BRUCE KEHRLI requested that they use from 333, EOB and that Mr. ROTCHFORD was to meet Mr. KERRLI at that office. Upon doing so, Mr. KEHRLI entered this office with another man and they requested that one cardboard box and one two drawer safe file be moved from that office to a storage room on fifth floor of the EOB. Mr. ROTCHFORD made arrangements with General Services Administration (GSA) employees to move the aforementioned to room 522. of the EDB. Upon doing so, the door to room 522 was locked; later that day Mr. KEHRLI requested that the safe that was moved to room 522 by opened. However, the combination to the safe could not be located and it was necessary to employ two men from Safemasters Company, NDC to open the safe. The above mentioned safe was opened by the Safemasters Company on the evening of June 19, 1972, in the presence of a United States Secret Service Agent. Mr. KEIRLI then came to the fifth floor and assisted in taking the items contained within the safe and placing them in two cardboard boxes. At this time Mr. KERKLI requested that two cardboard boxes by moved from room 502 of the EOB and be taken to his, KEHRLI's office, located in the West wing of the White House. Mr. ROTCFFORD made the arrangments for these two boxes to be transported to KEHRLI's office that evening.

On June 20, 1972, Mr. ROTCHFORD then made arrangements with other GSA personnel for these two boxes to be transported to the office of Mr. JOHN DEAN, Legal Counsel to the President in the EOB.

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JAMES GEORGE HAKER, Supervisory Security Specialist, Protective Security Division, United States Secret Service, Room 23, Executive Office Building, was interviewed in the office of JOHN DEAN, Counsel to the President, and in the presence of Mr. DEAN and his Assistant, FRED FIELDING. He provided the following information:

On Monday, June 19, 1972, he received a call from his supervisor, Mr. MURPHY, informing nim that Mr. ROCHFORD of General Services Administration (GSA) at the White House had arranged for lafe Master representatives to come to the Executive Office Building to open as safe. It is standard operating procedure for him to accompany these people and decide if the contents of the opened safe require storage.

At 7:30 p.m. that evening, Mr. ROCHFORD himself called to advise him that the Safe Master representatives were there. He met ROCHFORD and the two safe men, and they all proceeded to Room 522. He explained Room 522 is the storage room and the safe to be opened was stored there.

The four of them entered the room and the two safe mendrilled the safe open in approximately 20 minutes. Before opening the safe drawers, the two safe men were excused. He then opened the top drawer to determine if any classified documents were contained therein and the first envelope he picked up was stamped "Eyes Only".

He immediately closed the drawer and Mr. ROCLEORD called Mr. KEHRLI. Mr. ROCHEORD determined that Mr. KEHRLI would take responsibility for the contents and then called for cardboard boxes to be brought to Room 522 for the contents in the safe. He and Mr. ROCHEORD waited approximately 15 minutes

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until Mr. KEHRLI arrived. At that point, he was told there was no further need for him to remain and he returned to the duty desk where he was night supervisor that particular evening.

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JAMES ROSS SHEPLER, Safe Technician, Safe Master Company, 1800 Martin Lither King, Jr., Avenue, S.E., Washington, D.C. (WDC), was interviewed in the office of JOHN DEAN, Counsel to the President, and in the presence of Mr. DEAN and his Assistant, FRED FIELDING. He provided the following information:

Approximately 6:00 p.m., June 19, 1972, he received a call at home from a Mr. ROCHYORD at the White House, stating he had a safe at the White House that had to be opened. He was told to be at the White House at 7:30 p.m. that evening. He then called EDDIE WAYNE RICHARDSON, also employed as a Safe Technician at the Safe Master Company, to help him with the job.

They met at the Safe Master Company and drove to the White House, arriving at 7:30 p.m. They were cleared and immediately went to Room 522, accompanied by Mr. ROCHFORD and a United States Secret Service Agent, name unknown. In this room was a two-drawer file safe with a combination lock. They drilled the lock on the safe for 20 minutes until both drawers could be opened, but they did not open either drawer or see any of the contents. They then picked up their equipment and left.

JOHN W. DEAN, III, Counsel to the President, advised he did not want Federal Bureau of Investigation Agents making any inquiries or investigations within the confines of the White House or the Executive Office Buildings with White House Staff without his knowledge or permission. Clearance for contacts should be made through his office by SA SAUNDERS.

DEAN further advised he would obtain the following and submit to SA SAUGDANS:

- (1) Identities of all persons who in any way had contact with the material in the office safe of HCMACO HUNT.
- (2) Toll records involving HUNT's office.
- (3) The availability of access lists and appointment clearance cards for HUNT and MC CORD.

As regards item one above, DEAN originally advised JA SAUNDERS (on June 25, 1972) that his assistant FRED FIFLDING had searched LUNT's office and subsequently turned over to Federal Bureau of Investigation Agents all material from this search.

On June 27, 1972, SA SAUNDERS was informed by FIELDING that he did not gather this material. That in fact the material was obtained from HUNT's safe which was located on the fifth floor of the Executive Office Building.

Subsequent contact with DEAN verified the statement by FIELDING. DEAN advised the search operation was



handled by his (DEAN's) request. DEAN informed SA SAUNDERS the chain of evidence would be preserved as regards this material. SA SAUNDERS made it clear to DEAN that time was an important factor and to advise the Federal Bureau of Investigation of this information as soon as possible.

explained to him there are no records mintained on toll calls made through the White House operator or if the person uses the WATTS line (by dialing 80). There should be records available on toll calls placed over White House lines if the person dials 9 for an outside line and then dials direct. Whatever records are available he will turn over to SA SAUNDERS.

Item 3 - DEAN advised he would not permit any outside agency to indiscriminately peruse the cards for clearance appointments to the White House and the Executive Office Building. Anyone allowed to examine these records would be able to determine the identity of visitors to all the offices. DEAN agreed to request from the Executive Protective Service (White House Police) a schedule of appointments to the office of HUNT and an examination of these records to determine if McCORD entered the premises of the White House. DEAN advised he has no idea where HUNT is presently staying. He will immediately notify SA SAUNDERS if any information comes to his attention regarding the location of HUNT.

White House Area, General Services Administration (GSA), advised SA GEORGE E. SAUNDERS he was unable to locate the movers who transported the safe and box of material from HUNT's office, Room 338, to Room 522. He stated he has several moving crews who do nothing but move office equipment from one office to another because of changes in staff personnel. Instant moving assignment involved one two-drawer safe and one box of office supplies. The movers would have moved this material in less than 15 minutes. ROTCHFORD believes this was such a minor job in the course of the day, that the movers evidently were unable to recall this move. ROTCHFORD questioned both the day and night moving crews with negative results.

SA MAHAN advised Mrs. HUNT that she was being contacted concerning information she may possess concerning a burglary at the offices of the Democratic National Committee Headquarters, Watergate Office Building, 2650 Virginia Avenue, N.W., Washington, D. C., which occurred on June 17, 1972.

Mrs. HUNT stated that she does not feel that she possesses any information which is directly related to the burglary at the Democratic National Headquarters and that the only information she possesses concerning this burglary is what she has read in the local newspapers. Mrs. HUNT noted that she has read considerable information to the effect that her husband, EVERETTE HOWARD HUNT, JR., may have been associated with the individuals who were arrested for the burglary of the Democratic National Committee Headquarters (DUCH) but stated that she does not feel that her husband is involved with these men.

SA MAHAN displayed a series of two black and white photographs of unknown white males and a series of letters which were signed "BOB" and JUAN CARLOS.

Mrs. HUNT identified the photographs as photographs of ERNESTO HERRERA IENA, also known as "CHANGO", a citizen of Argentina whom she met in Tokyo, Japan, and the other a

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photograph of JUAN CARLOS QUAGLIOTII, a Uruguayan National.



SA MAHAN then displayed to Mrs. HUNT a .25 caliber

SA MAHAN then displayed to Mrs. HUNT a .25 caliber colt automatic pistol serial number 321803 and asked if she was familiar with the weapon.


Mrs. HUNT stated that this is her personal weapon and stated that she is surprised that it is in the hands of the FBI as she thought that the weapon was in a closet at her residence at 11120 River Road, Potomac, Maryland. Mrs.

HUNT stated that she was given this weapon prior to 1946 when she traveled to China to work on the behalf of the U.S. Treasury Department. She stated that she had nearly forgotten about the gun but stated that she does not know how or when this gun was removed from her residence. She stated that her husband possesses a German Luger pistol and that she is certain that it is still at her residence as she observed it during the evening hours of June 24, 1972.



Mrs. HUNT stated that at the present time she believes her husband to be employed at the White House as a consultant, at the Robert R. Mullen Company as a writer and holding an unknown position with the Committee to Re-Elect the President. Mrs. HUNT stated that in the Spring of 1972, her husband made two trips to Miami, Florida, and one trip to Los Angeles, California, for what she believed to be negotiations concerning the change of the Republican National Convention from San Diego, California, to Miami, Florida.

May 31, 1972, when she departed with her daughter for a vacation tour of Europe. Mrs. HUNT stated that she last spoke to her husband on June 21, 1972, by phone in London, England, and he advised her that there was a "problem" here in Washington and that he was going to go to New York, New York, to do television commercials. Mrs. HUNT stated that her husband claimed that there was considerable harassment from reporters and that he was going to New York, New York, to do the television commercial and then go on a vacation for a few days to lure the reporters away from their residence.

Mrs. HUNT stated that she has not heard or spoken with her husband since that time and that she has no idea concerning his present whereabouts.

Mrs. HUNT stated that the items that were displayed to her earlier in the interview may have been kept by her husband in a safety deposit box they maintained at the Riggs National Bank at Wisconsin and M Street, N.W., WDC. Mrs. HUNT

stated that she would be willing to meet with SA's MAHAN and STUKEY at that bank at 1:30 p.m., on June 28, 1972, to review the contents of that safety deposit box for any further information that might be of value to the investigation being conducted by the FBI.

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United States Government records, reviewed by SA KENNETH J. HASER on June 30, 1972, disclose that E. HOWARD HUNT was last issued Passport B-1811567 at Washington, D.C. (WDC), on July 21, 1971, for proposed business travel for one month to France, England and Balgium. In his application, dated July 21, 1971, he stated his intention to depart by air about September, 1971, and expected to take another trip abroad within two years. This passport was valid for five years' travel to all countries except Cuba, North Korea and North Vietnam.

Under passport regulations, this individual may use this passport for lawful travel within the period of its validity whenever and as often as desired without further notification to the Department of State or other Government agency. The Passport Office does not receive information as to whether or when a passport is used for foreign travel.

Hunt stated that he was born on October 9, 1918, at Hamburg, New York, and the file reflected that his birth certificate has been seen by passport authorities. He gave his permanent residence and mailing address as 11120 River Road, Potomac, Maryland, home telephone 299-7366, business telephone 293-2900. In the event of death or accident, he requested that DOROTHY LOUISE HUNT, his wife, be notified at the home address.

These records show that this individual as EVERETTE HOWARD HUNT, JR., was first issued Passport 638014 at WDC on June 22, 1939, for proposed pleasure travel for two months to England, Scotland, France, Iceland, Norway, Sweden, Denmark and Holland. He planned to depart from New York City on the "Oslofjord" on July 5, 1939. This passport was valid for two years. His permanent residence was then listed as 125 Lancaster Avenue, Buffalo, New York. His father served as his identifying witness. By letter received in the Passport Division on June 3, 1941, his father, on his stationary as an attorney at 163 Allon Street, South, Albany, New York, asked if his son's passport




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should be sent in for change of address, noting that his son was then on duty with the Navy and residing at that Albany address. He was informed by letter dated June 7, 1941, that the passport should be sent in to Washington for retention under then existing rules. His father submitted same on June 14, 1941.

EVERETTE HOMARD HUNT, JR., was next issued Passport 13850 at New York City on February 20, 1943, to expire on August 20, 1943, not valid for travel in any country except Australia for newspaper work and necessary countries en route. This application dated February 10, 1943, at New York City was supported by a letter dated February 9 1943, from DANIEL LONGWELL, Executive Editor, "Life", stating that HUNT was a member of the staff of that magazine who was proceeding abroad with the Pacific fleet with eventual assignment with an Army unit somewhere in the Pacific. His draft board number 343 at Albany issued the appropriate permit. He gave his permanent residence at that time as 192 Euclid Avanue, Albany, New York. He stated that he had been in Iceland, Norway, Denmark, Sweden, Holland, France, England and Scotland from June to September, 1939. He listed his father as EVERETTE HOWARD HUNT, born at Hamburg, New York, in December, 1889, and his mother as ETHEL JEAN HUNT, born at Carnegie, Pennsylvania, in May, 1893.

By undated letter, HUNT requested renewal of his 1943 passport for proposed travel that year and next under a Guggenheim Memorial Foundation scholarship. On September 19, 1946, he was informed that the 1943 passport would be expiring on February 20, 1947, so he might like to apply for a new one. He wrote again on September 24, 1946, stating that he would seek a new passport and requested cancellation of and return of his earlier passports.

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





Mr. ROBERT C. CDLR, JR., Director of Administration for the Cormittee to Re-Elect the President, located at 1701 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., furnished the Following information:

Mr. ODLE stated that the Committee to Re-Elect the President had paid for the following items used for security and that these items had been ordered by Mr. JAMES W. MC CORD, their Security Officer. Closed circuit TV, cameras, cables and receivers, which are presently installed, alarms for doors and smoke detectors. Mr. ODLE advised that Mr. MC CORD had never charged the Committee for any radio equipment to date and the only other piece of security equipment they had billed for was what Mr. ODLE described as a machine for detecting out-going Radio Transmissions and he assumed that this machine would monitor any attempt to transmit clandestine radio signals or detect any bugging devices which might be placed in the office.

Mr. CDLE said that Mr. MC CORD had retained three security men which he himself brought in and that they were paid on a stipendiary basis once a month through MC CORD. When MC CORD traveled for the Committee, he was on an expense account basis and Mr. ODLE advised that he never submitted large claims in connection with his travel. Any expenses which MC CORD claimed were reported to the Controller General as per regulations governing such matters and that MC CORD always maintains a reasonable expense account. Mr. CDLE advised by reasonable he meant that MC CORD submitted expense account claims similar to \$1.50 to \$2.00 for breakfast, \$3.00 for lunch, \$10.00 for dinner and the normal charges for hotel rooms and accommodations.

Re-elect the President (CRP), 1701 Pennsylvenia Avenue, N.W., Washington, D. C. (WDC), furnished the following information to the interviewing agents in the presence of H. DONALD KISSLER, attorney for the Committee to Re-elect the President:

In approximately late November or early December of 1971, SEDAM asked one MONICO BURGATO, a retired U. S. Navy Chief who was then employed at the White House, if he knew of anyone trustworthy SEDAM could hire to do some yard work around his home. BUNGATO stated he would look around for someone.

Sometime later (exact time period unrecalled) before Christmas, SEDAM was contacted by JAMES NG CORD, Security Chief of the Committee to Re-elect the President, who told him (SEDAM) that he (NC CORD) had just the person to work around his home. SEDAM had no idea how MC CORD learned of his need for someone to work adding BUNGATO said nothing to him (SEDAM) about mentioning the matter to MC CORD. However, MC CORD Highly recommended to SEDAM an individual named JUAN ACCIZ, whom he described as the most trustworthy, outstanding student in his class at Montgomery County Junior College.

MC CORD had suggested paying RUIZ \$3:50 an hour, but SEDAM stated this was too much and agreed to pay him \$2.50 or \$2.75 an hour.

SEDAM did not recall the exact date RUIZ started working around his house, but estimated it was the latter part of March. The weather was still cool enough for RUIZ to wear a jacket. RUIZ worked long enough to accumulate earnings of \$40.00, although SEDAM did not recall exactly

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. ن**ج**ر how many days RUIZ worked. The work was done on weekends and consisted of raking leaves and other yard type work. SEDAM's wife did not particularly care for RUIZ due to his apparent haughty attitude that yard work was beneath his dignity. SUDAM told his wife that people with foreign accents often appear overly proud. RUIZ called on several occasions saying he would not be able to come to work due to illness. He reportedly had a stomach ulcer.

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RUIZ seemed very interested in discussing political issues and politics in general. SEDAM could specifically recall discussing the busing of minority children to school. These discussions generally took place in SEDAM's kitchen when, due to the cold weather, he asked RUIZ inside for hot chocolate. SEDAM could not recall RUIZ inquiring about anything relating to his (SEDAM's) job which would be of a secure or sensitive nature. RUIZ impressed SEDAM as an intelligent foreign student simply interested in the American political system.

To the best of SEDAM's recollections, RUIZ was never alone in any part of his (SEDAM's) home. He knew of no special ability RUIZ might have in electronics. SEDAM stated he supposed the possibility of RUIZ electronically "bugging" or tapping his phone existed. They sat near a phone in SEDAM's kitchen when engaged in conversation. The telephone lines to SEDAM's home are underground although they do emerge in an area of the yard where RUIZ worked. The SEDAMS were always home when RUIZ worked for them.

RUIZ's last day of employment was on April 15, 1972, when SEDAM wrote out his pay check for \$40.00. Upon RUIZ's request, SEDAM made this check payable to a DON HEATH, whom RUIZ stated he was living with in McLean, Virginia. SEDAM recalled SEATH as being employed at the U.S. State Department or the Agency for International Development (AID). However, SEDAM relephoned RUIZ on a couple of occasions and described speaking to someone, a male, who spoke with a "thick, Spanish access." He was supposed to return but called approximately a week and a half later stating he would not be returning

due to the fact he was now employed full time by Mc Cord Associates. He had told SEDAM earlier he was working part-time in Mc Cord's office but never stated in what capacity.

SEDAM recalled RUIZ driving an older model, black Ford Falcon station wagon, which was often difficult to start. He could not remember exactly but recalled the license plate as being Virginia license.

Mr. ROBERT L. HOUSTON, Security Coordinator for the Committee to Resolest the President, located at 1701 Pennsylvania Avanue, N.W., Turnished the following information.

Katu! Mr./HOUSTON advised that he has had 28 years of military service with the United States Army and recently retired. Upon retiring, Mr. HOUDTON submitted a resume to the Department of Defense Placement Bureau, and as a result of that resume was contacted by Mr. JAMES W. MC CORD. MC CORD contacted Mr. HOUSTON regarding employment in the security field and set up an interview with HOUSTON. Mr. MC CORD obtained HGUSTON's services for the Republican National Committee with the understanding that HOUSTON would then go to the staff of the Committee to Re-elect the President when it was formed. Mr. HOUSTON began employment with the Republican National Committee in January, 1972, and was then transferred to the Committee to Re-elect the President on February 11, 1972.

Mr. HOUSTON stated that he was in the military police while serving with the Army and that in this role, . he received training in the security field.

His job at the Committee to Re-elect the President was Security Coordinator and Mr. MC COAD's job was Security Advisor. As Security Coordinator, Mr. HOUSTON was to issue pins for identification, keys, and passes. Mr. HOUSTON also handled administrative matters and worked directly with the staff as far as liaison was concerned.

Mr. HOUSTON advised that previously McCord Associates had two personnel assigned to the guard force who manned the post on the second floor. FcCord Associates people were used for this job due to the fact that it consisted of a 12:00 midnight to 8:00 a.m. shift in an area where 24 hour security was needed and the posts were manned when secretarial personnel were not in the area. The McCord Associates security men were paid hourly wages and since then

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have been replaced by people HOUSTON interviewed personally and hired.

Mr. HOUSTON advised that MC CORD seldom called him at home but when he did it was usually concerning the fact that MC CORD would not be available the following day or that MC CORD had jobs for him to do at the committee. Mr. HOUSTON recalled MC CORD calling him on April 16, 1972, and at that time, MC JORD advised him that there would be an anti-war demonstration in the area of 1701 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., and that he wanted HOUSTON to place a security man in the lobby so that the security of the offices could be insured in that the man could control access to the building.

When MC CORD came to the committee, he briefed the staff on security measures and held small demonstrations where he pointed out various areas that the staff should be aware of regarding office security.

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

Mr. HOUSTON stated after viewing the above list of photographs that he recognized Mr. JAMES WANTER NO CORD as having been the former security man for the Committee to Re-Flect the President.

Mr. HOUSTON further advised that he recognized a photograph of ALFRED CARLETON BALDWIN, III. He stated that he had seen BALDWIN in the security office on the third floor of 1701 Permsylvenia Avenua, N.W., and that he knew him as "HURRED C. TALDWIN." He said that BALDWIN was a security man for Mrs. MARTHA MITCHELL. To his knowledge BALDWIN was from New Angland, Maine or Connecticut.

He last saw BALDWIN in April, 1972, when he saw him three or four times and that BALDWIN had come to see Mr. JAMES IN CORD, he did not know the nature of BALDWIN's visits or his association with MC CORD.

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Mr. HOUSTON commented that the photograph of BALDWIN must be very recent in that it closely resembles him at the present time.

BALDWIN had stopped in to see MC CORD during the first two weeks of April, 1972 (to the best of his recollection), and this was the first time he saw BALDWIN.

He knew that BAIDWIN had accompanied Mrs. MITCHELL to Michigan and New York on an eight to nine day speaking tour. Mrs. MITCHELL had found BALDWIN to be unsuitable in that "he talked too much." Hr. HOUSTON said that on the aforementioned trip the train that Mrs. MITCHELL and BALDWIN were on, struck a man and that BALDMIN could see the man's remains out of the train window and he related a vivid description to Mrs. MITCHILL. After this trip BALDWIN was replaced by another security man for Mrs. MITCHELL.

Mr. HOUSTON advised that he had received a call from the FEI one day regarding BALDWIN's attempt to get through a security line at the Comitol during recent demonstrations. He also knew that BALDWIN had been arrested by Armed Forces Police at Andrews Air Force Base on Armed Forces Day. Mr. HOUSTON said the arrest occurred as a result of BALDMIN's inquiry as to the whereabouts of a demonstration.

BALDWIN would attend these demonstrations and report to MC CORD if there was any possibility the demonstrators might come to the vicinity of 1701 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W.

On 2 occasions he received telephone calls from law enforcement officers attempting to ascertain BALDWIN's association with the Committee for the Re-Election of the President.

One such call came from a person who identified himself as an FBI agent who called when there was a demonstration at the U. S. Capitol Building which BALDWIN attended.

The second call came from the Military Police, Andrews Air Force Base where EALDWIN had also gone to cover a demonstration.

Both times the caller was advised by HOUSTON BALDWIN was employed on the Security Staff of Mr. MC CORD who was in charge of the security of the Committee.
