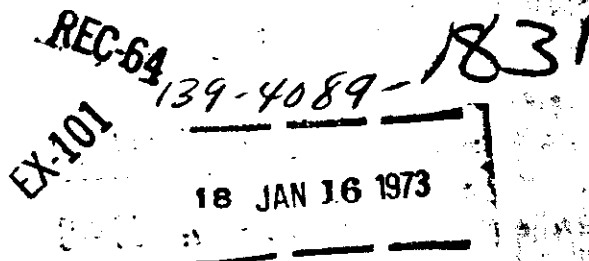

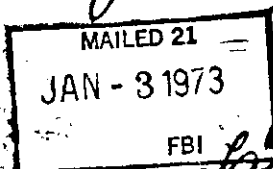

Police Commander, RICHARD MC CURRIE, Eighth District, Chicago Police Department, furnished the following information:

United Airlines Flight 553, en route from Washington, D. C. to Chicago Midway Airport, crashed while approaching Midway Airport on December 8, 1972. To date, 45 persons are known dead. The cause of the accident was believed to be mechanical failure and/or pilot error. There was no evidence of an intentional destruction of the plane. There were 18 survivors.

Among the dead was one DOROTHY HUNT, 11120 River Road, Potomac, Maryland. She was identified from personal effects on her person, and a visual identification was made by her husband, EVERLETTE HOWARD HUNT.

Recovered from a purse containing identification of Mrs. HUNT was \$10,000.00 in one hundred dollar bills. This money is now in the custody of the Evidence and Recovered Property Section of the Police Department under their inventory number 10765. He felt certain that no inventory was made of the bills by serial number. He was not aware of any checkbooks or passbooks recovered from Mrs. HUNT.

Lieutenant PAUL DUELLMAN, Acting Chief, Evidence and Recovered Property Section, Chicago Police Department made available for observation the \$10,000.00 in one hundred dollar Federal Reserve Notes recovered from the purse of Mrs. DOROTHY HUNT. It was noted that the money was in good condition, but the bills were not newly issued. The bills bore the symbols of numerous Federal Reserve Banks, but the most prominent was that of New York. The police inventory indicates that Patrolman KORZOWICZ found the money, but DUELLMAN knows that to be incorrect. KORZOWICZ received the money from Chief Fire Marshal JEROME VOLKANER at the crash scene on December 9, 1972. The money apparently had been recovered from an unknown searcher and turned over to VOLKANER.

OLSON said he knew nothing regarding the specific activities or function of the Robert Mullen Company. He said it was his understanding from general conversation that the company was basically engaged in public relations and in lobbying activities in connection with the U. S. Congress. He said he recalled hearing an individual with the last name HUNT being mentioned by either BENNETT or possibly FLETCHER as being connected with the Mullen Company; however, he did not become acquainted with HUNT or even know his full name. He said he merely assumed after all the recent publicity regarding EVERETTE HOWARD HUNT, JR. that this person was identical with the individual he had heard mentioned in connection with the Mullen Company previously.

OLSON said ROBERT FLETCHER, JR. was currently residing with his parents, Mr. and Mrs. ROBERT FLETCHER, SR., 25 Dorchester Road, Summit, New Jersey.

Mrs. DAVIS volunteered she is currently separated from her husband, ROBERT THURSTON DAVIS, and is now residing with her mother-in-law, RUTH KEENE in Hutchins, Texas. She last saw her husband in July, 1972, when she returned to the Dallas area from Ft. Belvoir, Virginia. ROBERT stayed in their rented home on the base. While living in the Washington area she recalls that her husband had in his possession several black film strips which appeared to be negatives. She is not familiar with what was exposed on the negatives. Additionally, she observed numerous cassette tapes in DAVIS's automobile which were later placed by him in a dresser drawer in their house. The tapes were lying loose in the drawer and she recalls the film strips were contained in a yellow envelope. She does not know the content of the tapes.

When Mrs. DAVIS returned to Hutchins from Ft. Belvoir, she brought none of her husband's belongings but only took her clothing and clothing for her children. The only tape she could produce was a Scotch Cassette entitled, "Shelly school and Driver Linges." Mrs. DAVIS furnished this tape to the interviewing Agents and stated she believes it is a recording of a telephone conversation between herself and either Deputy U. S. Marshals JIM GARDNER or JIM COLOSANTO of Washington, D. C. The conversation deals with her attempts to obtain a driver's license and reasons her children were not re-enrolled in school.

Mrs. DAVIS reiterated she was in possession of no other tapes or film strips or negatives belonging to her husband. She noted she was aware of very little of her husband's activities and is now in the process of obtaining a divorce. In the event she learns of anything pertinent, she will cooperate fully with the Federal Government and furnish same to the interviewing Agents.

Mrs. SALLY DAVIS, 733 Crockett Street, Hutchins, Texas, was contacted at her place of employment, Modern Home Appliance Company, 219 Preston Valley Shopping Center, Dallas, Texas, and was interviewed in private. She then furnished the following information:

She reiterated she has no tape or film negative belonging to her husband other than the cassette previously furnished the interviewing Agents. She does not recognize the names BARKER or MC CORD as being acquaintances of her husband and does not recall any friend of her husband who drove a yellow Ford LTD. Her husband, however, drove a yellow LTD for about two months in the spring of 1972. This vehicle was rented from an unknown auto rental agency at National Airport by her husband, using the name ROBERT HARRSTON. The Ford did not have Ft. Belvoir stickers.

During the time Mrs. DAVIS lived with her husband in the Washington area, which was November, 1971, to July, 1972, she was aware of no employment on his part with the Secret Service, nor does she recall any charter flights her husband made, but did remember that on three occasions he left the house stating he was going up in a helicopter with a serviceman stationed at Ft. Belvoir. She did recall a brief trip he made to Memphis, Tennessee, where he made contact with an unknown individual while utilizing a microphone and tape recorder secreted on his person. She believes this work was performed at the request of the United States Attorney's Office in Memphis. This is the only instance she is aware of involving his use of wiretaps or similar devices.

She advised her husband has two girl friends she knows of and they might possibly have information about his activities not known to her. They are VIRGINIA "PEACHES" BRITT, a go-go dancer at the This-Is-It Club in Washington, and JERRI HICKMAN, whom she suspects moved into their house after Mrs. DAVIS left.

Mrs. DAVIS again promised that if she learned any additional information concerning her husband's tapes or photographs, she would immediately contact the interviewing Agents.

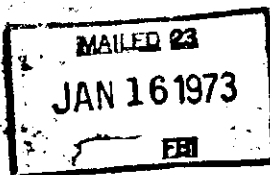

Petersen on January 23, 1973, that the FBI interview Allen Michael Fitzgerald based on a letter reportedly received by the Washington Bureau of the "New York Times" indicating that Mr. Fitzgerald had connections with James McCord in Mexico.

On January 23, 1973, Mr. Fitzgerald was contacted but declined to be interviewed, however, he stated that his wife Cheryl Kathleen Fitzgerald, who allegedly authored the letter in question [REDACTED] b7c [REDACTED] e advised he had no knowledge of the letter to the "New York Times" and had no part in writing it. Mrs. Fitzgerald was interviewed on January 24, 1973, at which time she stated her husband wrote the letter and that she recalls in October or November, 1971, he met an individual in Mexico whom she believes was Frank Sturgis. She was unable to identify a photograph of Sturgis. Additionally, Mr. Fitzgerald told her on November 27, 1972, that approximately 3 years ago, he met McCord in a Los Angeles, California, hotel.

On January 26, 1973, our Los Angeles Office learned that Allen Fitzgerald reportedly has contacted "Playboy Magazine" claiming to have an "inside story" regarding the Watergate incident, and that the magazine intends to furnish him with legal assistance in return for his story.

In view of the above, no additional investigation is being conducted by this Bureau concerning the Fitzgeralds in the absence of a specific request from the Criminal Division of the Department.

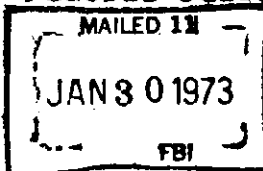

Attached advises Chief Judge John Sirica on 1/11/73, rejected Hunt's offer to plead three counts of indictment; Hunt then entered plea to entire indictment after which he was ordered held in lieu of \$100,000 bond; Hunt later made bond and presentence investigation ordered.

First witness officer Metropolitan Police Department placed into evidence aerial photographs of Watergate complex; Carl Munford of FBI Exhibits Section, placed into evidence sketches of Howard Johnson and Watergate complex. Eric Jaffe, Treasurer, Democratic National Committee, testified as to authenticity of drawing made by Munford.

Robert Fletcher testified as to his introducing Hunt to Thomas J. Gregory via telephone and letters; Gregory testified contacted by FBI regarding association and knowledge of Hunt and thereafter gave statement to FBI and U.S. Attorney regarding his involvement in case.

Issue of photographic identification arose and motion now underway to suppress Gregory's photo identification of subjects.

Trial recessed until 9:30 a.m., 1/12/73.

Assistant U.S. Attorney Earl Silbert advised he does not desire any attempt be made by FBI to interview Hunt at this time.

This case involves the burglary of the Democratic National Committee Headquarters at the Watergate Office Building, Washington, D. C., on 6/17/72.

On 7/17/72, Washington Field Office teletype to the Bureau, at the request of AUSA Earl Silbert, U. S. District Court, asked for the services of the Exhibits Section to prepare certain charts and diagrams for use as trial aids during the Government's prosecution of this case.

Accordingly, Visual Information Specialist, George C. Mumford, Jr., Exhibits Section, went to the crime scene where he made measurements, took photographs, and observed pertinent areas. Construction plans of the Watergate Office Building and Howard Johnson's Motor Lodge were also obtained.

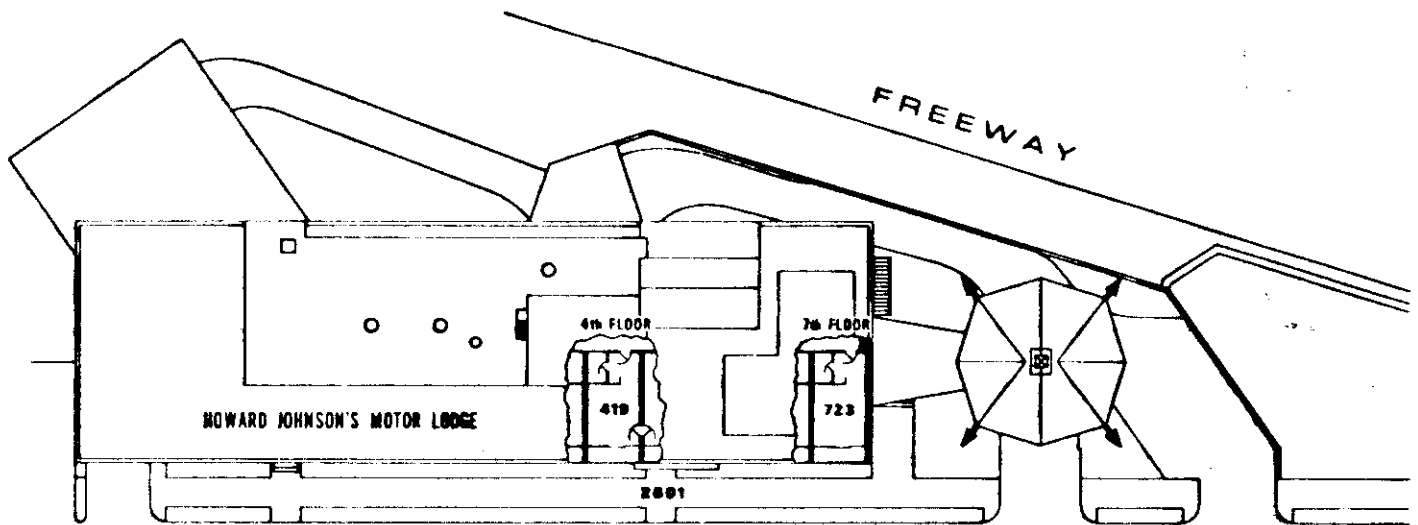
Trial of this case opened on 1/8/72 in U. S. District Court, Washington, D. C.

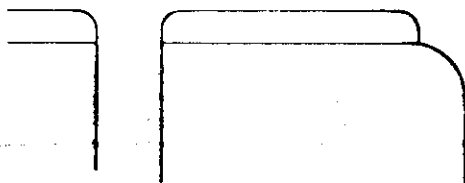

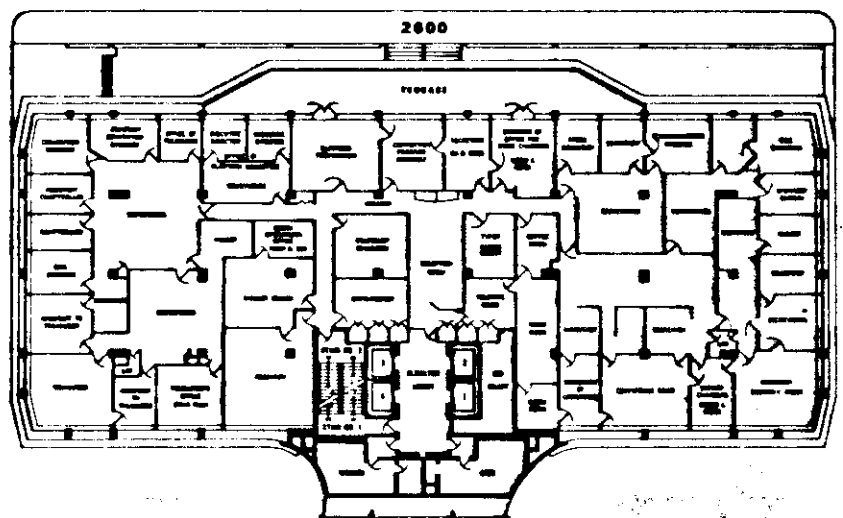
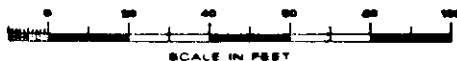

PLOT PLAN



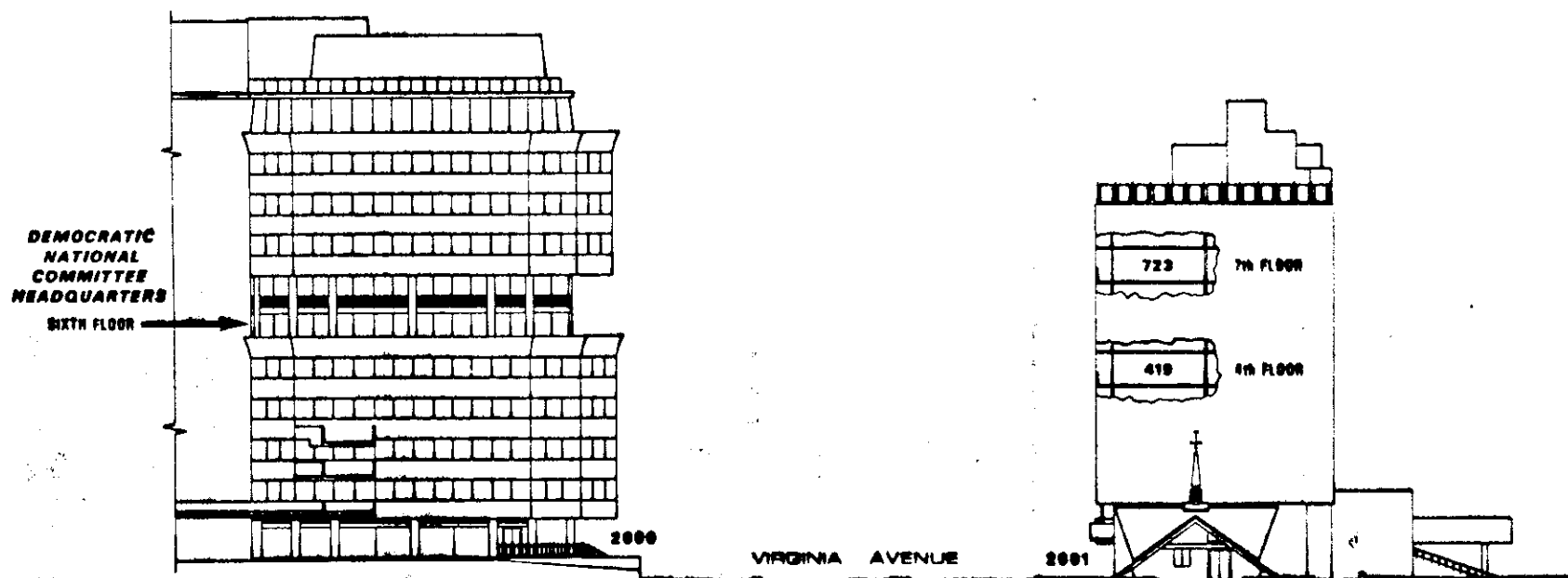

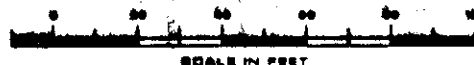

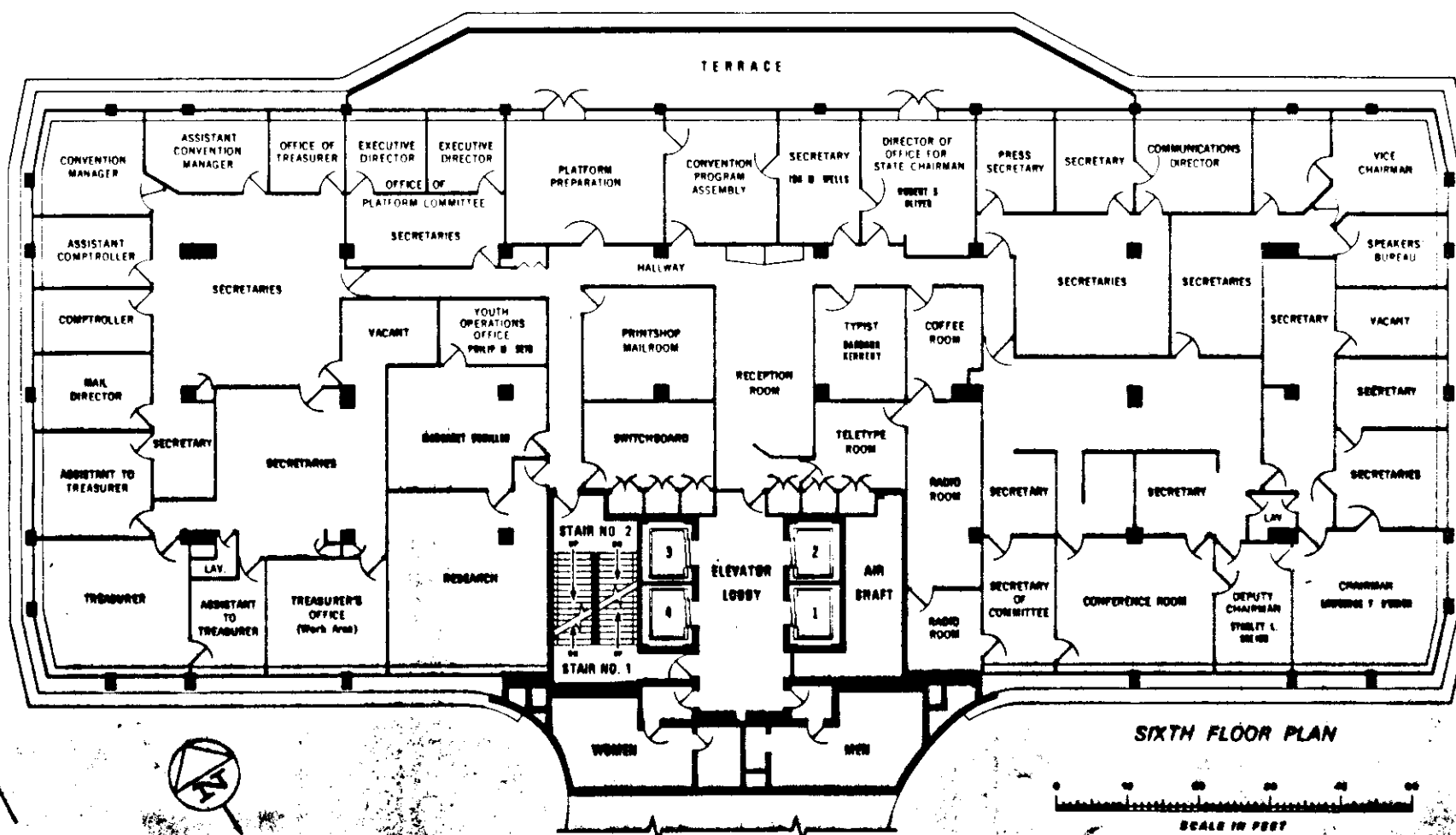
HOWARD JOHNSON'S MOTOR LODGE

C., that one Thomas Addcox, about May, 1972, told the anonymous caller that Addcox was working for Howard Hunt on an Intelligence Gathering Operation. According to the caller, Addcox worked as a captain in military intelligence until late April, 1972.

FBIHQ indices contain no information identifiable with Addcox and he has not previously come to our attention during the Watergate investigation. Efforts are presently being made to identify Addcox and when this is done, he will be interviewed.

Attached advises Thomas James Gregory completed testimony U.S. District Court, again identified all seven subjects in case, and explained how Liddy and McCord went over McGovern Headquarters layout and setup.

Officer Barrett, Metropolitan Police Department, testified regarding his search of DNCH, location of subjects behind partition, and as to what each subject had in his possession at time of arrest; Officer Scholfler testified also as to his search of DNCH; Officer Hamilton testified as to discovery of what he thought was "bomb" in AWOL bag (gym bag). Detective Sergeant Leeper stated he located now known bug on desk outside O'Brien's Office in DNCH and put same in AWOL bag without inspecting it; Officer Lanville testified he responded to bomb threat at Second District Headquarters and after dismantling now known Ari Smoke Detector, left precinct and went to Watergate where he caused further search of premises to be made because he thought device may have been timing device for bomb; former Watergate security guard testified as to finding of tape on basement doors on two occasions and after second occasion alerted police department.

Trial recessed until 9:30 a.m., 1/17/73.

Attorney Newmeyer, representing Miami defendants, not available for contact 1/16/73; efforts to contact him again will be made 1/17/73, in an attempt to interview these four defendants who pleaded guilty 1/15/73.

This case concerns burglary of Democratic National Committee Headquarters, Washington, D.C., 6/17/72.

Attached advises subjects Barker, Fiorini, Gonzalez, and Martinez, after releasing attorney Rothblatt and being represented by attorney Newmeyer, entered guilty plea in entire indictment.

After entering plea, Judge Sirica questioned them regarding whether or not any higher officials involved, where money came from, and whether or not they were employed by Central Intelligence Agency (CIA). All defendants involved in this case stated they received money in part from unknown sources; Judge Sirica ordered them held in lieu of \$100,000 bond each and remanded them to custody U. S. Marshal.

Only witness to testify 1/15/73, was Thomas James Gregory who identified all seven subjects as being persons he knew who wanted to "bug" McGovern Headquarters on or about 5/22/72; Judge Sirica denied defense motion for mistrial.

Attorney for Hunt advised he will not make Hunt available for interview by FBI; he stated Hunt facing subpoena from Senate Subcommittee and involved in civil suit regarding this case.

S. Attorney handling this case. He stated he will deliver above documents to Pittsburgh Office morning 1/18/73, after which Pittsburgh Office will forward to Washington Field Office for examination. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] No pertinent identifiable information on Schuler in our files.

Trial of remaining two defendants continued 1/17/73, with Officer Dennell, Metropolitan Police Department, testifying as to search of Watergate hotel room and location of money and pertinent address books; also, Officers Muncy and Cherry testified as to finding certain burglary tools and items which indicate someone wearing wig during stay at hotel.

Alfred Carlton Baldwin (former Bureau Agent) testified as to how he became acquainted with McCord, the move from Roger Smith to Howard Johnson Hotel, and stated up to 6/16/72, he monitored over 200 conversations. Government moved to have Baldwin identify persons whose conversations intercepted at which time American Civil Liberties Union attorney objected and courtroom cleared; Judge Sirica advised he would hear about conversations in closed court and render decision morning 1/18/73, regarding what Baldwin will be permitted to relate in open court.

The Miami Office advised that as soon as Martinez' and Barker's address books were received from WFO, the books were examined by Miami Special Agents who are familiar with the Latin community and who were familiar with the McCord case. Miami indices were searched concerning the names in these two books. Targets for interviews by Agents were selected by Miami based on the judgment of the Special Agents who reviewed the books, taking into consideration any information concerning the people which may have been contained in Miami's files. The name of Fernando Madrigal did not appear significant to the Agents reviewing the books, there was no reference to him in the Miami indices, and accordingly, he was not contacted. Miami did conduct investigation at the Fountainbleau Hotel, primarily to endeavor to place any of the subjects at the Hotel during the period 12/1/71 to 6/17/72. There was no record of any of the subjects staying at the Hotel during this period other than George F. Leonard (Liddy) and an individual named Warren (Hunt) who were at the Hotel from 1/21/72 through the morning of 1/24/72.

Miami has advised that based upon judgment of the Special Agents reviewing the address books, about twenty five interviews were conducted out of the approximately 120 notations in Martinez' book. Barker's book contained about 110 identifiable notations and approximately 50% of these people were interviewed.

OBSERVATION: It is believed that Miami's approach to the Martinez and Barker address books, mentioned above, was proper at the time, taking into consideration the fast moving, extensive investigation which was then being conducted, which was focused on tying Hunt and Liddy into the Conspiracy. However, since all individuals contained in these books have not been interviewed, it is believed that Miami should be instructed to identify and interview these people at once.

RECOMMENDATION: That the attached teletype be ☐ sent to Miami instructing that all individuals mentioned in Martinez' and Barker's address books who have not previously been interviewed be interviewed at once.

Attached is an article from the 1/18/73 "Washington Post Newspaper" dealing with the address books of Bernard L. Barker and Eugenio R. Martinez, which address books were introduced into evidence at the trial on 1/17/73. The attached article states that the name of one Fernando Madrigal of the Fountainbleau Hotel is listed in Martinez' address book and that the FBI has not interviewed Madrigal although the address book has been in FBI hands for six months. The Acting Director inquired as to what are the facts concerning this, and if Madrigal was not interviewed, why?

The Barker and Martinez address books were obtained as a result of the search of the two rooms at the Watergate Hotel, occupied by the arrested subjects on 6/17/72. The search warrants which legally authorized search of these two rooms were obtained by Washington Metropolitan Police Department (MPD) Officers and items seized as a result of the searches were taken by the Police Officers.

On 6/26/72 Assistant U. S. Attorney Silbert, requested the FBI to take possession of the evidence seized and this was done subsequently. About 6/23/72 SA Angelo Lano, Washington Field case Agent, through contact with MPD Officers, obtained access to the Barker and Martinez address books for investigative use. The books themselves were returned to MPD and were not officially turned over to Washington Field by MPD until about 6/28/72.

Nixon Unit's Miami Apartment Listed in Barker Address Book

An apartment rented by President Nixon's re-election committee in Miami is listed in the address book of Bernard L. Barker, one of the men who pleaded guilty in the Watergate bugging trial Monday.

The address book, introduced as evidence in the trial yesterday, lists a two-bedroom apartment and phone number in the Octagon Tower apartments, 1881 Washington Ave., Miami Beach.

Three of the men indicted with Barker worked for either the White House or the Committee for the Re-election of the President—both of which have denied any role in the bugging. The entry in the address book is the first indication that Barker may have had direct contact with other officials working in the President's re-election campaign.

The apartment manager said last night that the apartment was rented as a clerical office to Steven D. Nostrand, 27, of the Republican Convention staff.

Nostrand was in charge of arrangements for young supporters of the president attending the party's national convention last summer. He is listed on the official payroll of the Committee for Re-election of the President as a member of the convention staff.

Spokesmen for three Miami area colleges have said that two of the other Watergate defendants—Eugenio R. Martinez and Frank A. Sturgis—sought convention housing for nearly 3,500 Young Republicans last spring.

Nostrand could not be reached for comment last night, but last June he said he knew nothing of attempts by the two men to find convention housing for young

supporters of the President or Young Republicans.

Powell Moore, formerly a spokesman for the Committee for the Re-election of the President and now a member of the Inaugural Committee staff, said last night he did not "have the slightest idea" why the address and phone number of Nostrand's office would be in Barker's address book.

Barker's address book also contained the following entry: "Lawrence O'Brien, Sonesta Hotel, Gulf Stream Suite, Key Biscayne Pt., Feb. 21-22-23, Warren, Airport Inn, #306."

The chief prosecutor in the Watergate case said last week that Lawrence F. O'Brien, the former chairman of the National Democratic Committee, was a primary target of the spying operation allegedly conducted by the seven men indicted in the case.

An official at the Miami Sonesta Hotel said last night that O'Brien was not at the hotel from Feb. 21 to 23, but that other Democratic Party officials stayed in the hotel's Gulf Stream suite on those dates.

Warren is the alias used by former White House aide E. Howard Hunt Jr., who pleaded guilty in the Watergate case last week, court records show. The Miami Airport Inn is about 30 minutes drive from the Sonesta Hotel.

The night manager at the Airport Inn said last night that he could not obtain the records to see if there was a person named Warren registered there during those dates.

It is known that Hunt, using the alias Edward J. Warren, stayed at the Dupont Plaza Hotel in Miami 10 days earlier from Feb. 11 to 12.

A pop-up address book belonging to Eugenio R. Martinez, another Watergate defendant, has the name and address of the man in charge of electrical and telephone ar-

rangements at the Miami hotel used by the Democrats during their National Convention in July.

Martinez' address book was introduced into evidence at the trial yesterday. The entry is: [Fernando Madrigal, 1202 NW 31st Ave., Fountainbleau Hotel, 649-1007.]

Madrigal, 32, was reached at his home last night by telephone and said that he is the assistant chief engineer for the Fountainbleau Hotel. He said that he does not know Martinez and does not have any knowledge of the Watergate case.

Madrigal said that he is in charge of everything "from electricity to plumbing" and specifically worked with the electrical contractors handling the conventions for both political parties. The Fountainbleau Hotel was the headquarters for both Democrats and Republicans at their Miami conventions last summer.

Though Madrigal's name is clearly listed in the address book, which has been in the hands of the FBI for six months, Madrigal said last night that he has never been questioned by the FBI or any law enforcement officials about the matter.

On the afternoon of 1/18/73, Mr. Gray advised me that he had received allegations FBI Agents working on the Watergate case were very disturbed when it was decided the FBI would not investigate the allegations of political espionage on the part of Donald Segretti. Mr. Gray advised this displeasure on the part of Agents supposedly occurred after a conference between former Section Chief Charles Bolz, who has since resigned, and Assistant Attorney General Petersen in October, 1972, after which a decision was made by Mr. Petersen that no investigation should be made concerning the allegations as they relate to Segretti. Mr. Gray instructed that I contact Mr. Bolz and ascertain if any FBI Agents indicated any protest or displeasure at this decision.

I telephonically contacted former Section Chief Bolz at the Department of Housing and Urban Development. Bolz advised that no Agent had indicated to him any protest, displeasure or disturbance over the decision of Mr. Petersen that the FBI should not investigate any allegations concerning political espionage on the part of Donald Segretti. Mr. Gray was informed of Mr. Bolz's answer telephonically at 3:40 p.m.

This relates to the Acting Director's inquiry as to (1) whether Miami searched each name in Barker's address book and in Martinez' address book through the Miami indices and (2) who made the decision in Miami as to the persons to be interviewed.

The attached advises that (1) all Miami area numbers from these books were identified as to the subscriber; leads were set out to identify all out-of-town subscribers; and the names in these books were searched through Miami indices. Supervisor Robert L. Wilson of Miami telephonically advised 1/19/73, that Miami's instructions to other offices relative to the out-of-Miami numbers included a request for advice to Miami as to the identity of the subscriber. When the subscriber was determined to be an individual (i.e., not a hotel or some business) the name was searched through Miami's indices and those individuals were considered for interview. All persons listed in the books and all persons who were identified from numbers in the books were searched through Miami's indices and evaluated for interview. (2) Supervisor Wilson selected the targets for interview after thorough review and evaluation of these books by five Special Agents assigned exclusively to Cuban matters and Central Intelligence Agency liaison and after several conferences held by Supervisor Wilson with his fourteen man squad of Agents, making a total of nineteen Agents who participated in review of the books.

Miami notes that the review of these books identified aliases used by six of the seven subjects as well as the telephone number used by Hunt at the White House and numbers used by Liddy at the Committee to Reelect the President. The 6/27/72 teletype mentioned by Miami (copy attached) shows the partial results of review by Miami of these books and the setting forth of leads.

The attached reports that Friday, the U. S. Court of Appeals ruled two to one against the Government's motion to grant authority to disclose in open court the contents of conversations monitored by witness Alfred C. Baldwin. The Appeals Court stated the contents of these conversations were not required to prove the charges and that such disclosure would frustrate the purpose of Congress in making wire tapping a crime.

Baldwin completed direct testimony Friday identifying Everette Howard Hunt and George Gordon Liddy leaving the area of the Watergate prior to the other subjects being escorted out. Baldwin is expected to undergo cross-examination Monday, 1/22/73.

The attached reports results of interview with Allen Michael Fitzgerald, whose name had not come to our attention during the Watergate investigation, who is an inmate at the Adult Correctional Institute, (ACI) Rhode Island, which was conducted at the request of Assistant Attorney General (AAG) Henry E. Petersen, Criminal Division, based on a letter reportedly received by the Washington Bureau of the "New York Times" indicating Fitzgerald had connections with James McCord in Mexico.

Fitzgerald was contacted by our Agents on 1/23/73, and declined to be interviewed, however, he stated that his wife, currently residing in Van Nuys, California, and who allegedly authored the letter in question [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] He stated he had no knowledge of the letter to the "New York Times" and had no part in writing it.

Prison officials described Fitzgerald who is incarcerated on an Interstate Transportation of Stolen Property charge as the "biggest con man" ever received at ACI and a completely deceitful person.

Leads have been set out for our Los Angeles Office to interview Mrs. Fitzgerald after which AAG Petersen will be advised.

Dr. JONES stated that his wife, ELIZABETH D. JONES is the first cousin to EVERETT HOWARD HUNT, JR. Dr. JONES also stated that he knows HUNT through his wife; however, the two families rarely see each other, but communicate frequently by telephone and letters.

Dr. JONES advised that his family's acquaintance with the HUNT family is strictly on a social basis, but he was aware that HUNT at one time was employed by the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA), but he is not familiar with any of the details regarding HUNT's employment with the CIA. Dr. JONES said he was also familiar with the fact that most recently HUNT was employed as a public relations man with a firm in Washington, D.C., but he was not able to recall this firm's name at the present time.

Dr. JONES advised that HUNT had also been a consultant at the White House and, in fact, HUNT had in the past written letters to the JONES family on White House stationery.

Dr. JONES emphatically stated that at no time did HUNT ever mention any of the subjects' names or known aliases involved in the burglary of the Democratic National Committee Headquarters, Washington, D.C. Dr. JONES further advised that at no time did HUNT ever in any reference, ever mention the aforementioned matter to him. Dr. JONES said his only familiarity with the case is the accounts of it he has read in the newspapers.

Dr. JONES stated that his wife and he drove to Charlottesville, Virginia, on June 15, 1972, to visit their son at the University of Virginia Medical School. On June 19, 1972, according to Dr. JONES, they arrived in Washington, D.C. for a medical conference which lasted

the entire week. Dr. JONES said they arrived in Washington, D.C. at 10:30 p.m., and checked into the Holiday Inn on Connecticut Avenue, where they had reservations for the week. Dr. JONES advised his wife called HUNT on that Monday subsequent to arriving in Washington, D.C., and discussed having dinner with him during the week. The discussion, according to Dr. JONES, was strictly domestic and the Watergate Incident was never referred to. Dr. JONES said that they never did have dinner with HUNT because HUNT's son contacted them on Tuesday and advised that his father had left town on business.

Dr. JONES indicated that his wife left Washington, D.C. on June 22, 1972, and flew home to Newton, Massachusetts, and he left Washington, D.C. at the termination of his medical conference on Sunday evening, June 25, 1972.

Dr. JONES advised that his wife is currently attending HUNT's wife's funeral. Dr. JONES advised that they were aware that HUNT was a defendant in the aforementioned matter, but they had not discussed this matter with him; however, they had contacted him numerous times since June 19, 1972, by letter and telephone. The communications between the two families remained strictly social.

This case involves the burglary of the Democratic National Committee Headquarters at the Watergate Office Building, Washington, D. C., on 6/17/72.

My memorandum of 1/12/73 set forth details of the preparation by the Exhibits Section of six charts and diagrams for use as trial aids during the prosecution of this case as requested by Assistant U. S. Attorney Earl Silbert, U. S. District Court. Trial opened on 1/8/73 and is now in progress.

On 1/23/73 SA Angelo Lano, Washington Field Office, picked up from Exhibits Section three charts which had been revised at the request of Assistant U. S. Attorney Silbert to reflect more up-to-date information concerning long distance telephone calls and the movement of money. Small copies of each chart were also furnished to SA Lano.

These three charts replaced those previously furnished to Assistant U. S. Attorney Silbert on 1/5/73, and identified as item #1, item #2 and item #3 (copies enclosed).

Visual Information Specialist George C. Mumford, Jr., Exhibits Section, was called to testify on 1/24/73 for the purpose of admitting these three charts into evidence. Mr. Mumford's testimony was not needed, however, as the charts were admitted by stipulation on 1/24/73.

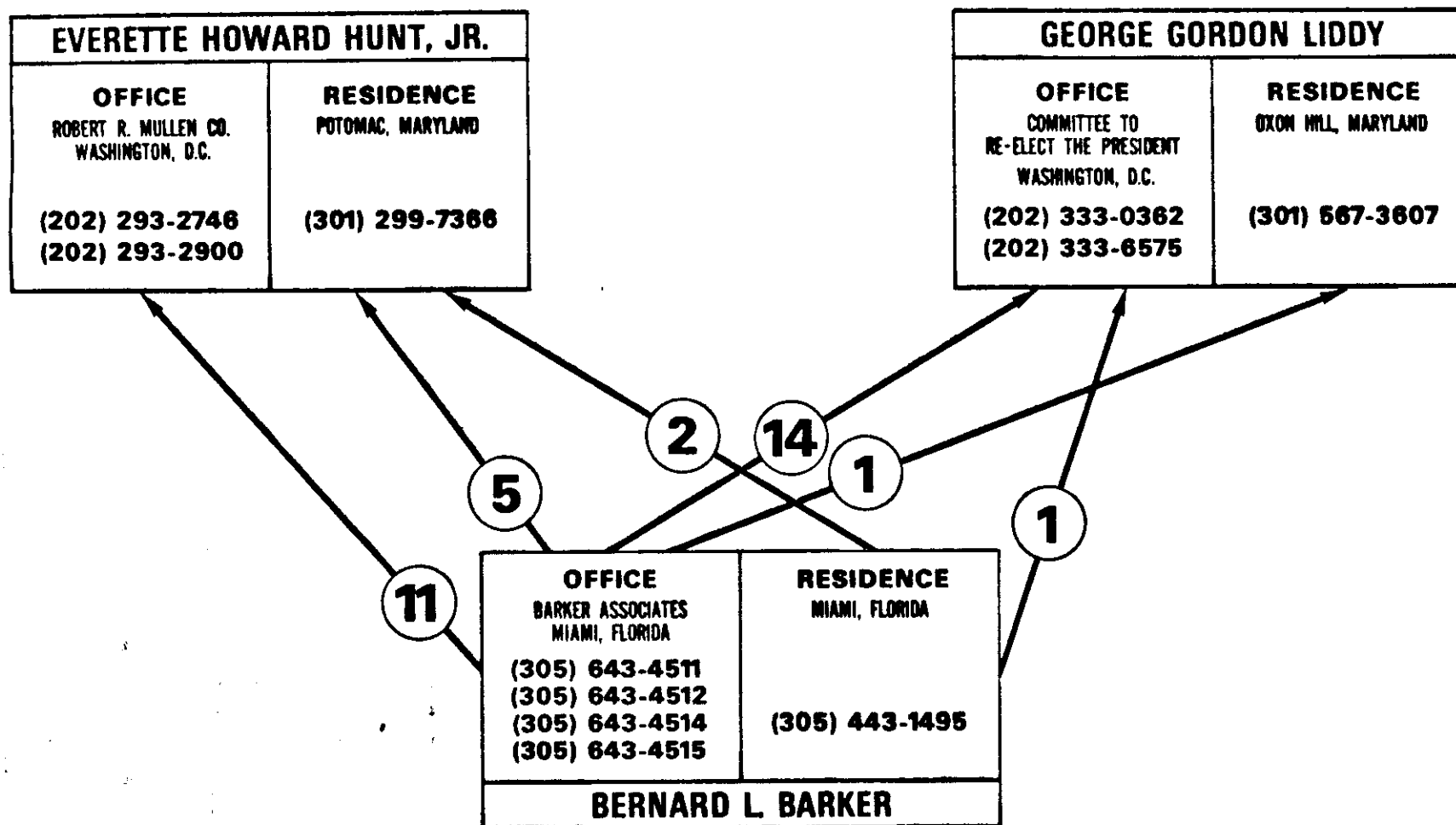

Everette Howard Hunt, Jr., and Marion Lazo, formerly a prominent Cuban attorney, now a U. S. citizen and resident, were guests on William F. Buckley's Firing Line on 1/21/73, 10:00 to 11:00 pm, on Channel 26 TV. Most of the program was taken up with discussion of the "Bay of Pigs" invasion of Cuba in 1961 and the involvement in that venture of the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA), Hunt, Bernard L. Barker and other anti-Castro activists.

Hunt made limited comments about the Watergate case but stated that the break-in was executed in the spirit of a CIA operation. Hunt was asked if the public could be secure in the belief that the break-in was not a CIA operation as CIA was restricted to foreign operations only. Hunt replied in the negative stating that CIA has in the past conducted certain domestic operations citing its report on the National Students Association

Concerning the Watergate, Lazo said that he received reports from Cuba that Cuban (Communist) funds had been funneled into the McGovern campaign and that the Watergate defendants were endeavoring to disclose this. He also observed that the Watergate subjects may have been attempting to discover the source of security leaks of classified information and intelligence concerning anticipated riots at the Republican Convention site. Lazo stated that the Watergate subjects should be decorated rather than prosecuted. Mr. Lazo's name did not come to our attention during this investigation. Our files characterized him during 1971 as the author of "Dagger in the Heart," a book dealing with Castro's regime in Cuba. Bureau file 62-110321-3, 2, shows prior to the Castro regime, he represented the U. S. Embassy in Cuba in legal matters.

A tape recording of the entire broadcast is being maintained.

In visit with her husband on 11/27/72 at ACI Allen Fitzgerald at that time asked Cheryl if she recalled him telling her approximately 3 years ago of meeting McCord in Los Angeles, Calif. hotel. Cheryl replied in affirmative and Allen Fitzgerald indicated this was same individual in "Watergate" matter. Cheryl believes Allen, while in Mexico in October-November, 1971, met an individual who she believes to be Frank Sturgis, however, she failed to identify photo of Sturgis from set of six photos. Cheryl also advised of receiving telephone call from New York Times 1/22/73 requesting more information regarding husband's connection with "Watergate" matter.

ALDEN W. GALLUP II, 1630 Oxford, was advised of the identities of the interviewing Agents as Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation and that the purpose of the interview was to obtain any knowledge he had regarding the burglary of the Democratic National Committee Headquarters, Washington, D.C. on June 17, 1972. GALLUP was orally advised of his rights by SA KILLEHER as set forth on the standard Warning and Waiver of Rights form. GALLUP was furnished a copy of this form which he read and signed, stating that he understood his rights.

GALLUP furnished the following information: He has no knowledge of the burglary of the Democratic National Committee Headquarters, Washington, D.C., other than that which has been reported by the news media. He advised he does not know any of the people responsible for the burglary.

GALLUP advised that he has been telephonically interviewed by reporters for the New York Times, Washington Post and Detroit News because his telephone number appeared on the telephone company records of calls made by one of the defendants in this matter, namely EVERETT HOWARD HUNT.

GALLUP advised that his mother told him that she was interviewed by the FBI regarding these calls and also mentioned that she has no knowledge of the burglary.

GALLUP advised that the news reporters asked him if he worked for the McGOVERN or NIXON campaigns and he told them that he worked for the McGOVERN campaign. GALLUP advised he is a firm backer of McGOVERN and had volunteered to work for the McGOVERN campaign. GALLUP denied having been recruited or hired by anyone to work for McGOVERN. GALLUP advised that he considers himself very liberal and anti-NIXON. GALLUP advised he follows the news reports of the burglary and trial connected with it very closely because he thinks the whole matter is disgusting and should be thoroughly investigated and exposed.

GALLUP advised that he can understand how the reporters got the impression that he was involved with the burglary. GALLUP advised he admitted working for McGOVERN on the east side of Detroit but would not furnish them any information regarding the telephone calls.

Reference is made to your memorandum dated December 7, 1972, captioned James McCord, Jr., et al.; Burglary of the Democratic National Committee Headquarters, June 17, 1972, Interception of Communications, attaching reports of interviews with Dwight Chapin and Donald Segretti. You requested to be advised whether the alleged acts of political sabotage by Segretti and others, reported in newspaper articles, warrant further investigation by the Bureau.

We have reviewed the material forwarded with your memorandum and noted that Mr. Chapin stated that he had knowledge that Segretti had secured the publication of material relative to the Presidential campaign of Senator Edmund Muskie, which set forth false information concerning the scheduling of Muskie's campaign activities. Our analysis of 18 U.S.C. 612 and its legislative history indicates that this statute could apply to the publication of such information. In this connection we recently requested an investigation in a related matter captioned "Possible Violations of 18 U.S.C. 612-Patricia Griffin". Therefore, should it develop that Segretti caused the publication of written material which contained such false scheduling information and which in addition failed to identify Segretti as the person responsible for said publication, violations of 18 U.S.C. 612 could possibly be involved.

In order to assist this Division determine whether such violations have occurred, the Bureau is requested to re-interview Mr. Chapin to ascertain any further information he may be able to provide concerning this matter. In particular, we would be interested in knowing the dates and places where false scheduling materials were published or distributed by Segretti, whether such materials revealed that Segretti was responsible for their publication, and the nature of the source from which Chapin received his information concerning Segretti's activities in this regard.

Attached is letter to White House and memorandum to The Attorney General, The Deputy Attorney General and Assistant Attorney General, Criminal Division, enclosing letterhead memorandum (LHM) setting forth details as to the burglary of Democratic Party National Headquarters, Washington, D. C., on 6/17/72.

BURGLARY: At approximately 2:30 a.m., 6/17/72, security guard, Watergate Apartments, notified Metropolitan Police Department (MPD) of discovery of tampered locks on doors in the building. Shortly thereafter, five individuals were arrested by MPD in executive conference room of Democratic Party National Headquarters on sixth floor of the building. These individuals have been identified as James Walter McCord, Jr., Bernard L. Barker, Virgilio R. Gonzales, Eugenio Rolando Martinez y Creaga and Frank Anthony Fiorini. These subjects when arrested were in possession of a quantity of burglary tools, eavesdropping equipment and photographic equipment (the Laboratory is examining pertinent items of physical evidence). It was noted at the time of the arrests that the subjects had removed ceiling tiles, a telephone jack and an air conditioner cover from the executive conference room, apparently preparatory to installing the eavesdropping devices.

BACKGROUND OF SUBJECTS: McCord is a former FBI Agent who identified himself at time of arrest as Edward Martin, but was identified through his fingerprints. He served as a radio operator for the Bureau in 1942-1943; entered the military service in 1943; and was reinstated as a Special Agent in October, 1948. He resigned in February, 1951 to enter private business. He was employed by CIA from August, 1955.

PROSECUTIVE ACTION: All subjects were arraigned on burglary charges 6/17/72, and all except McCord are being held in lieu of \$50,000 bond. McCord is being held in lieu of \$30,000 bond in view of his Rockville, Maryland, residence. Other four subjects appear to be from the Miami area. A preliminary hearing is set for 6/29/72. No Federal process obtained to date.

SEARCH OF SUBJECTS' HOTEL ROOMS: Pursuant to authorized search warrant issued by Assistant U. S. Attorney, Washington, D. C., \$3,500 in new \$100 bills was located, which bills were of same numerical sequence and series as twelve \$100 bills found on subjects at the time of their arrests. Investigation continuing to determine source of these funds.

During the search of hotel rooms, an envelope containing a check drawn by E. Howard Hunt was located. He has been determined to be Everette Howard Hunt, Jr. [REDACTED]

We conducted Special Inquiry investigation on him in July, 1971, for a White House Staff position. Inquiry of Mr. Alex Butterfield at the White House revealed Hunt was used about nine months ago by the White House as a consultant on "highly sensitive confidential matters" but has not been used recently. Hunt has declined to be interviewed concerning captioned burglary until he has had an opportunity to consult with his attorney who he did not identify.

It is noted that at time of Special Inquiry, Hunt listed as a reference a Washington, D. C., attorney, Michael Douglas Caddy. Caddy is the attorney who gratuitously appeared at MPD early Saturday morning to represent the five subjects, none of whom had made any telephone calls. Caddy declined to tell U. S. Attorney how he was notified but

subsequently admitted to Bureau Agents he received a call concerning subjects' arrests from a person whom he would not identify.

Extensive file review being conducted on all individuals involved and any pertinent details will be incorporated in subsequent memoranda.

RECOMMENDATION: That the attached letter be sent to White House and memorandum to The Attorney General, The Deputy Attorney General, and Assistant Attorney General, Criminal Division, enclosing LHM as to foregoing. Investigation is proceeding vigorously.

At approximately 2:30 a.m., June 17, 1972, officers of the Washington, D. C., Metropolitan Police Department (MPD), acting on information received from the security guard, Watergate Apartments, 2600 Virginia Avenue, N. W., Washington, D. C., that locks in the building had been tampered with, arrested five individuals in the office of the Democratic Party National Headquarters. These individuals have been identified as: James Walter McCord, Jr.; Bernard L. Barker; Frank Anthony Fiorini; Virgilio R. Gonzales; and Eugenio Rolando Martinez y Creaga. These individuals had in their possession burglary tools and a quantity of eavesdropping and photographic equipment.

At the time of the arrests, it was observed that several ceiling panels had been removed, as well as a telephone jack and an air conditioning cover, apparently in preparation for concealment of the eavesdropping devices.

All subjects have been charged with burglary, in violation of Section 1801, Title 22, District of Columbia Code, and all except McCord are being held in lieu of \$50,000 bond. McCord is being held in lieu of \$30,000 bond. A preliminary hearing is set for June 29, 1972. All subjects have declined to be interviewed concerning this matter.

At the time of their arrests, the subjects were in possession of \$2,400, including thirteen new \$100 bills. A search of rooms rented at the Watergate Hotel by these individuals, pursuant to a search warrant authorized by Assistant U. S. Attorney Charles Work, Washington, D. C., disclosed an additional \$3,500 in new \$100 bills of the same series and originating serial numbers as those found at the time of the arrests.

Investigation reveals the following information concerning the background of the persons arrested:

James Walter McCord, Jr., of Rockville, Maryland, who at the time of his arrest gave the name Edward Martin, has been determined to have been employed as an FBI Agent from October, 1948 to February, 1951; have been employed by Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) August, 1951 to August, 1970; and is presently reported to be Chief of Security for the "Committee to Reelect Nixon," 1701 Pennsylvania Avenue, N. W., Washington, D. C. In addition, McCord, in February, 1972, was reportedly in charge of security for the family of former Attorney General John N. Mitchell.

Frank Anthony Fiorini, also known as Fred Frank Fiorini, Attila F. Sturgis, Anthony Sturgis and Edward Joseph Hamilton, was arrested on July 30, 1958, for illegal possession of arms in Florida. Prosecution was declined concerning that matter. Sources in the Miami area report he is a "soldier of fortune" and allegedly was a gun runner to Cuba prior to the Castro regime. Sources in Miami say he is now associated with organized crime activities, the details of which are not available.

Virgilio R. Gonzales, also known as Raoul Godoy, is a native of Cuba, currently residing in Miami, Florida.

Eugenio Rolando Martinez y Creaga, also known as Eugenio Rolando Martinez, Gene Valdes and Jean Valdes, is a native of Cuba. He was arrested November 24, 1958, for violation of immigration laws in Miami, Florida, and was deported to Havana, Cuba, on January 2, 1959. He reportedly arrived in the United States by boat on June 18, 1968, from Cuba. Sources in Miami report Martinez is a friend of Barker and is possibly in the real estate business with

It is to be noted at the time of the search of the subjects' hotel rooms, a stamped, sealed envelope was located. This envelope contained a check drawn by E. Howard Hunt in the amount of \$6.39 and a bill from Lakewood Country Club, Rockville, Maryland, to Hunt in care of Weybright & Talley, New York City. Hunt has been determined to be [REDACTED] Everett Howard Hunt, Jr. [REDACTED]

B/ [REDACTED] on whom the FBI conducted a Special Inquiry investigation in July, 1971, for a White House staff position. Mr. A. P. Butterfield, Deputy Assistant to the President, advised that Hunt was used as a consultant by the White House on "highly sensitive, confidential matters" about nine months ago. To Mr. Butterfield's knowledge, he has not been used since. Hunt was interviewed, admitted the check in question is his, but refused to discuss this matter or the individuals involved without consulting his attorney. C

It is noted that shortly after the subjects were arrested, a Washington, D. C., attorney, named Michael Douglas Caddy, appeared at the 2nd District, MPD, stating he was representing the five subjects. It is known that when the subjects were arrested, they refused the opportunity to make a telephone call and had no way of contacting Mr. Caddy. He was asked how he became aware of the arrests but refused to furnish any information stating he would recontact Assistant U. S. Attorney Work in a few days after thinking the matter over. Subsequently, he advised FBI Agents he received a call at 3:00 a.m., June 17, 1972, from a person whose identity he would not reveal. It is noted that Caddy, during FBI investigation of Hunt, was listed by Hunt as a personal reference and at that time Caddy advised he had known Hunt for about two years.

Investigation of this matter is continuing by the FBI to determine whether there is a violation of the Interception of Communications Statutes or any other Federal statutes.

At approximately 2:30 a.m., June 17, 1972, officers of the Washington, D. C., Metropolitan Police Department (MPD), acting on information received from the security guard, Watergate Apartments, 2600 Virginia Avenue, N. W., Washington, D. C., that locks in the building had been tampered with, arrested five individuals in the office of the Democratic Party National Headquarters. These individuals have been identified as: James Walter McCord, Jr.; Bernard L. Barker; Frank Anthony Fiorini; Virgilio R. Gonzales; and Eugenio Rolando Martinez y Creaga. These individuals had in their possession burglary tools and a quantity of eavesdropping and photographic equipment.

At the time of the arrests, it was observed that several ceiling panels had been removed, as well as a telephone jack and an air conditioning cover, apparently in preparation for concealment of the eavesdropping devices.

All subjects have been charged with burglary, in violation of Section 1801, Title 22, District of Columbia Code, and all except McCord are being held in lieu of \$50,000 bond. McCord is being held in lieu of \$30,000 bond. A preliminary hearing is set for June 29, 1972. All subjects have declined to be interviewed concerning this matter.

At the time of their arrests, the subjects were in possession of \$2,400, including thirteen new \$100 bills. A search of rooms rented at the Watergate Hotel by these individuals, pursuant to a search warrant authorized by Assistant U. S. Attorney Charles Work, Washington, D. C., disclosed an additional \$3,500 in new \$100 bills of the same series and originating serial numbers as those found at the time of the arrests.

Investigation reveals the following information concerning the background of the persons arrested:

James Walter McCord, Jr., of Rockville, Maryland, who at the time of his arrest gave the name Edward Martin, has been determined to have been employed as an FBI Agent from October, 1948 to February, 1951; have been employed by Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) August, 1951 to August, 1970; and is presently reported to be Chief of Security for the "Committee to Reelect Nixon," 1701 Pennsylvania Avenue, N. W., Washington, D. C. In addition, McCord, in February, 1972, was reportedly in charge of security for the family of former Attorney General John N. Mitchell.

Frank Anthony Fiorini, also known as Fred Frank Fiorini, Attila F. Sturgis, Anthony Sturgis and Edward Joseph Hamilton, was arrested on July 30, 1958, for illegal possession of arms in Florida. Prosecution was declined concerning that matter. Sources in the Miami area report he is a "soldier of fortune" and allegedly was a gun runner to Cuba prior to the Castro regime. Sources in Miami say he is now associated with organized crime activities, the details of which are not available.

Virgilio R. Gonzales, also known as Raoul Godoy, is a native of Cuba, currently residing in Miami, Florida. [REDACTED] 31

Eugenio Rolando Martinez y Creaga, also known as Eugenio Rolando Martinez, Gene Valdes and Jean Valdes, is a native of Cuba. He was arrested November 24, 1958, for violation of immigration laws in Miami, Florida, and was deported to Havana, Cuba, on January 2, 1959. He reportedly arrived in the United States by boat on June 18, 1968, from Cuba. Sources in Miami report Martinez is a friend of Barker and is possibly in the real estate business with

It is to be noted at the time of the search of the subjects' hotel rooms, a stamped, sealed envelope was located. This envelope contained a check drawn by E. Howard Hunt in the amount of \$6.39 and a bill from Lakewood Country Club, Rockville, Maryland, to Hunt in care of Weybright & Talley, New York City. Hunt has been determined to be [REDACTED] Everett Howard Hunt, Jr. [REDACTED]

31 [REDACTED] on whom the FBI conducted a Special Inquiry investigation in July, 1971, for a White House staff position. Mr. A. P. Butterfield, Deputy Assistant to the President, advised that Hunt was used as a consultant by the White House on "highly sensitive, confidential matters" about nine months ago. To Mr. Butterfield's knowledge, he has not been used since. Hunt was interviewed, admitted the check in question is his, but refused to discuss this matter or the individuals involved without consulting his attorney. (c)

It is noted that shortly after the subjects were arrested, a Washington, D. C., attorney, named Michael Douglas Caddy, appeared at the 2nd District, MPD, stating he was representing the five subjects. It is known that when the subjects were arrested, they refused the opportunity to make a telephone call and had no way of contacting Mr. Caddy. He was asked how he became aware of the arrests but refused to furnish any information stating he would recontact Assistant U. S. Attorney Work in a few days after thinking the matter over. Subsequently, he advised FBI Agents he received a call at 3:00 a.m., June 17, 1972, from a person whose identity he would not reveal. It is noted that Caddy, during FBI investigation of Hunt, was listed by Hunt as a personal reference and at that time Caddy advised he had known Hunt for about two years.

Investigation of this matter is continuing by the FBI to determine whether there is a violation of the Interception of Communications Statutes or any other Federal statutes.

On 6-19-72 after briefing you concerning developments in this case, I conferred with the Attorney General at 2:00 p. m.

This concerns the trial of the remaining two defendants of the Watergate case.

Attached summarizes activities in this case 1/23/73. Columnist Jack Anderson in the 1/23/73 edition of "the Washington Post" alleged he had seen the Martinez diary and although it contained no information about Watergate that he had previously written, three initials noted therein alleged to be those of Robert Odle, Herbert Porter, and James McCord.

Assistant U.S. Attorney Earl Silbert in response to questions about this by Trial Judge verbally attacked Anderson for writing untruths about the initials. Trial Judge requested who the initials represented and after contact with our Miami Office, the Judge was informed that Anderson did not even depict closely the initials in the diary, the initials being those of FBI Special Agents who initialed the book as it was located in the search of Martinez's car in Miami on 6/21/72.

Testimony on 1/23/73 summarized covering that of Robert Bennett, R. Mullen and Company relative to Hunt and Liddy, Committee to Re-~~elect~~ the President (CREP). Robert Odle testified concerning hiring of James McCord and that George Gordon Liddy was counsel to numerous committees at the CREP. Jeb Magruder testified relative to authorized funding of intelligence gathering group stating he never authorized the operation for any illegal purpose and never received any information from the Democratic Committee wiretapping. Herbert Porter testified concerning his designation by Magruder to accept certain sums of money upon request from Hugh Sloan and the disposition of same. Ectore Reynaldo, Vice President, Republic National Bank, testified regarding Barker's bank record, the four Mexican checks and the Dahlberg check.

This concerns the trial of the remaining 2 defendants in the Watergate case.

Attached summarizes testimony of witnesses 1/24/73. Former employee of Maryland banking institution testified concerning cash deposits made by McCord in May and June, 1972.

Employee of Democratic National Committee (DNC) Headquarters testified file cabinets locked when she left office 6/16/72, and found them open upon arrival for work 6/17/72. Some files moved but could not find anything missing.

Stanley Greigg, Deputy Chairman, DNC, advised he filed complaint against subjects who were arrested inside DNC Headquarters 6/17/72, and also viewed subjects at precinct and did not recognize any as employees; did not give them permission to enter premises after hours.

Melvin Stern testified as to Frank Sturgis' income and employment with his company.

Harry Collot testified Virgilio Gonzalez employed by him during past several years and Gonzalez quite capable of picking locks. Collot examined some recovered property and stated certain devices used for picking locks and others for key making.

Morton B. Jackson, California attorney, testified Hunt and Liddy sought his legal aide in June, 1972. Hunt paid a fee; Liddy paid \$1 retainer.

Linda Jones, employee Mullen Company, testified worked as secretary during 1971 and 1972 for Hunt at Mullen during which time Hunt instructed her to accept calls for Ed Warren on his private telephone. Also received numerous calls from Tom (Last Name Unknown). This would be Thomas Gregory.

SA Joseph Parson, FBI Laboratory, testified regarding wiretapping devices and bug found in possession of subjects at time of arrest. He testified as to how they work and their capabilities.

Attached advises of request by Assistant U. S. Attorney (AUSA) Donald Campbell for interview of one Allen Gallup, Grosse Pointe Woods, Michigan. According to AUSA Campbell, early 1/26/73, he was confidentially informed by a Washington Post reporter that Gallup had been interviewed by a Post reporter and although he would furnish no details, did say the FBI should interview Allen Gallup. Detroit has been instructed to immediately locate and interview Allen Gallup who the reporter said claims to be acquainted with the McGovern Headquarters operation and who allegedly left employment there on 6/16 or 17/72.

As a result of leads set forth by WFO on 6/30/72, to various offices, including Detroit, for identification of subscribers to a number of telephone numbers revealed from review of Hunt's long distance telephone calls and interview of the subscribers, Allen Gallup was contacted on 7/1/72, by Detroit which was seeking the location of his parents, whose telephone number was called by Hunt. No information was then available to indicate Allen Gallup had any association with Hunt and he was not interviewed then.

Allen Gallup's parents, Alden and Barbara Gallup, were interviewed by Denver at Crestone, Colorado, on 7/2/72. Mrs. Gallup at that time advised she has known Hunt for about 30 years.

Attached advises of information received by Los Angeles that Allen Michael Fitzgerald reportedly has contacted "Playboy Magazine" claiming to have an "inside story" regarding the Watergate incident and allegedly that magazine is going to furnish legal assistance to Fitzgerald in return for the "inside story."

By way of background, as set forth in previous Boston and Los Angeles teletypes, Fitzgerald is incarcerated in the Adult Correctional Institute (ACI), Howard, Rhode Island; has a lengthy arrest record; and on 11/15/72, was indicted by the Federal grand jury, Providence, Rhode Island, for Interstate Transportation of Stolen Property. His wife, Cheryl Kathleen Fitzgerald, was indicted for aiding and abetting by the same grand jury. On 1/23/73, Boston contacted Allen Fitzgerald at the request of Assistant Attorney General (AAG) Henry Petersen who had received information from a New York Times reporter to the effect Fitzgerald had written a letter to that paper indicating that he had connections with James McCord in Mexico. Fitzgerald declined to be interviewed and stated he had no knowledge of a letter to the New York Times.

According to officials of ACI, Allen Fitzgerald is the "biggest con man" ever received at that institute and is a completely deceitful person.

On 1/24/73, Los Angeles interviewed Mrs. Fitzgerald and she denied writing the New York Times. She did relate that in November, 1972, her husband reminded her he had met McCord in a Los Angeles, California, hotel about 3 years ago and she further believes that her husband, while in Mexico in October-November, 1971, met an individual she believes to be Frank Sturgis. However, she was unable to identify a photograph of Sturgis.

Gallup advised he told reporters he had worked for McGovern committee as volunteer in East Detroit, Michigan, and never in Washington, D. C. States never hired by Republican National Committee or any person or group to work for McGovern campaign. Denied knowing any of Watergate subjects or anyone involved in the incident, including Everett Howard Hunt, and knows nothing about the Watergate incident other than what was in the newspapers. States he can see how newspaper got impression he was holding back information because he told them he worked for McGovern but refused to divulge reason for phone calls.

Gallup states why he is very liberal and has been to Washington, D.C., during past demonstrations, he has never been to McGovern headquarters at the Watergate and has no knowledge about Watergate incident other than what was in newspapers.



This concerns the trial of the remaining 2 defendants in the Watergate case.

Attached summarizes testimony of witnesses 1/26/73. Kathleen Chonow testified she worked for David Young, White House Aide, that E. Howard Hunt, George Gordon Liddy during her employment worked for Young, that Hunt requested to install private phone from which she made and received calls for Hunt to a person named Bernard Barker. She said Hunt and Liddy worked closely together. Former Democratic National Committee (DNC) employee testified concerning the four documents McCord had on his person when arrested and Michael Brennan testified Martinez purchased several airline tickets for various persons and paid for same in new \$100 bills. Miguel Suarez testified about his relationship with Barker and that Ameritas was his company and he never gave Barker permission to use the name for any purpose. Watergate Restaurant employee testified as to recognizing photo of Hunt as person who signed check using name Ed Warren and Hunt was same person who drank scotch and milk.

Chief Judge John Sirica struck Government witnesses Jack Stewart and Leonard Glasser giving his reason their information was prior to indictment and not material. Official Bell and Howell testified regarding equipment sold to McCord. Federal Communications Commission official testified regarding letter authorizing McCord to use certain frequencies in connection with Republican National Convention.

Staff secretary, White House, testified that orders of John Dean, Counsel to President, caused search of Hunt's office to be made and turned over items to FBI and FBI Agent testified regarding same.

Maxine Wells, former DNC employee, employed during pertinent period did not authorize anyone to ~~accept~~ calls.
