IRWIN M. SHULMAN, 4 Wendover Road, Eastchester, New York, Accountant, Harvey Bennett Associates, Certified Public Accountants, 317 North Avenue, New Rochelle, New York, was interviewed at his office in New Rochelle concerning the \$20,000 payment received by VICTOR LASKY in 1972.

SHULMAN advised that he does income tax returns for VICTOR and PATRICIA LASKY and does not manage their accounts on a regular basis. He made available a year-end work sheet made out by PATRICIA LASKY, believed by SHULMAN to be in her own handwriting, listing the LASKYs' income for 1972. This sheet revealed an entry for \$20,000 for VICTOR LASKY from the Financial Committee to Pe-elect the President, and the entry was dated May 17, 1973. The sum was entered under a column headed "Freelance-Magazines, Books, Newspapers".

SHULMAN stated that he was in contact with Mrs. LASKY on July 3, 1973, concerning the entry, and it was her opinion that she had entered the May 17, 1972 date in error and that the date should be April 17, 1972. She advised SHULMAN that LASKY did not meet with JEB MAGRUDEP in May. SHULMAN stated he had no other records concerning this entry.

Included on the work sheet was an entry dated July 11, 1972, disclosing a payment to PATRICIA LASKY from the Financial Committee to Pe-elect the President in the amount of \$9,750. SHULMAN produced a W-2 form from the Financial Committee to Pe-elect the President showing the sum \$9,750 as income paid to PATRICIA LASKY in 1972.

INTERCEPTION OF COMMUNICATIONS

By letter dated June 15, 1973, the office of the Special Watergate Prosecutor, requested the Federal Bureau of Investigation to interview Victor Lasky concerning the receipt of \$20,000 from Jeb Stuart Magruder sometime around February or March, 1972. Accordingly, Lasky was interviewed and the results of the investigation are set forth:

Mr. ~~VICTOR LASKY~~ was interviewed at his residence, Number 821, Watergate South, Washington, D. C. (WDC), by Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) Agents who identified themselves and stated the purpose of interview. LASKY provided the following information:

LASKY advised he is a free-lance writer. He has written speeches, articles for magazines, and several books. *DC*

DC Sometime before April, 1972, LASKY talked to W. RICHARD HOWARD about doing some writing for the Committee to Reelect the President. Sometime after this conversation, LASKY was contacted by FREDERICK C. LARUE about doing some writing for MARTHA MITCHELL. In April, 1972, LASKY took a trip to California on another writing job. Prior to this trip, he was contacted by LARUE and told that it was set up that he was to write some speeches for MARTHA MITCHELL and he would be paid a retainer of \$20,000.

LASKY could not recall the exact date he left for California. However, his wife, PATTY, checked her diary and found the date was April 4, 1972. LASKY stayed at the Holiday Inn in San Rafael, California. ROBERT REISNER called LASKY when he was in California and said the deal was okay and to come in and pickup the \$20,000 when he returned to Washington. LASKY said he was suppose to get the money before he left California, but did not have time. *DC*

LASKY could not remember when he returned from California. However, his wife checked her diary again which disclosed LASKY's return on April 17, and then April 18 he saw JEB STUART MAGRUDER. *DC*

LASKY met JEB STUART MAGRUDER at 1701 Pennsylvania Avenue to pick up his \$20,000 retainer. At this time, MAGRUDER made a quick phone call to HUGH W. SLOAN, JR., regarding the retainer. MAGRUDER then asked LASKY if he wanted the \$20,000 in cash or check. LASKY said he wanted it in cash. MAGRUDER paid him the \$20,000 in cash. 16

LASKY advised that he took the \$20,000 and put it in a safe deposit box which he rents at The Riggs National Bank located at the Watergate Apartments. LASKY then notified his accountant, IRWIN M. SHULMAN, 4 Wendover Road, Eastchester, New York, telephone number 914-DE7-8956 that he had received the \$20,000. LASKY explained that he does this in order for his accountant to keep records of his income and file a quarterly report with the Internal Revenue Service. LASKY said this \$20,000 was reported to the Internal Revenue Service.

LASKY advised that he wrote approximately a dozen speeches for MARTHA MITCHELL, some one line jokes, and several magazine articles which he does not believe were published. He said he wrote non-political speeches and jokes concerning her telephone conversations. LASKY advised that he had met with Mrs. MITCHELL and FREDERICK LARUE to find out what type material she wanted to have written.

LASKY advised that he had met MAGRUDER in 1969 when he had written a book titled The Nixon Years. This book was given to the Putnam's Publishing Company. LASKY was paid a \$40,000 advance by Putnam's for this book. This book was rejected by Putnam's on November 1, 1971. LASKY then returned the advance to Putnam's.

LASKY advised he has some copies of speeches he wrote for MARTHA MITCHELL; however, he did not want to produce them. He advised that Mrs. FORESBURG has some of this material at the Committee to Reelect the President.

~~AT LASKY~~ On July 5, 1973, Irwin M. Shulman, Accountant, who resides in Eastchester, New York, advised a representative of the Federal Bureau of Investigation that he does handle Income Tax returns for Victor Lasky and his wife, Patricia, and does not manage their accounts on a regular basis. Shulman made available for review, the year end worksheet made out by Patricia Lasky in her handwriting which showed an entry for \$20,000 from the Financial Committee to Re-Elect the President. The entry was dated May 17, 1972. The entry was made under the column "Free Lance - Magazines, Books and Newspapers." Shulman advised he discussed the date May 17, 1972, with Patricia Lasky. She is of the opinion that she made an error on the worksheet and that the date should be April 17, 1972. Shulman advised he had no other records of this entry.

Included on the worksheet was an entry dated July 11, 1972, from the Financial Committee to Re-Elect the President to Patricia Lasky. The amount noted was \$9,750. Shulman displayed a W-2 form from the above Committee made out to Patricia Lasky for the amount \$9,750.

In view of the material set forth above, no further investigation of this matter is being conducted.

This will confirm information furnished to you in referenced call to the effect that Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS), Washington, D. C., through Bureau liaison, advised of the arrest by INS in El Paso of one ~~Arshed Marhmoor~~, reportedly a Palestinian who deserted a Greek ship in May, 1973, at an unnamed location. Marhmoor is reported to have claimed to have in his possession five hours of recordings concerning foreign involvement in the Watergate matter.

Immediately contact INS authorities in El Paso and arrange to interview Marhmoor to obtain whatever information he may have. In the event he does have recordings having bearing on the case, advise the Bureau in order that efforts may be made to obtain appropriate legal process to legally take possession of these items. In the event Marhmoor has no information, set forth the allegation received and results of your contact with him in a letterhead memorandum which should be furnished to Bureau by cover airtel in order that the office of Special Prosecutor Cox may be informed.

During 9/71 the office of Daniel Ellsberg's psychiatrist was burglarized by the so-called "Plumbers." By memorandum 7/9/73 Special Prosecutor's office has requested telephone records of the Beverly Hilton Hotel be reviewed in an effort to obtain telephone calls placed from the hotel by G. Gordon Liddy and E. Howard Hunt Jr., as well as Bernard Barker, Felipe de Diego and Eugenio Martinez. Memorandum supplied possible alias used by these individuals. In addition, the Special Prosecutor's office requested that individuals called by these persons be identified and interviewed regarding their knowledge of the burglary with the exception of Bill Krogh, David Young and other White House or former White House personnel.

Please refer to pages 60-62 of the Bureau's investigation report concerning the above-referenced subject (Bureau File No. 65-74060). The Bureau is requested to secure all telephone records of the Beverly Hilton Hotel which reflect telephone calls placed from the room(s) occupied by G. Gordon Liddy, E. Howard Hunt, Edward J. Warren. Also, all room records and telephone records reflecting calls from such rooms should be secured for the period from September 1 to September 6, 1971, for the following individuals: Bernard Barker, Felipe de Diego, Eugenio Martinez who probably registered under one or more of the following aliases: G. Valdes, F. Carter, Fran Carter, Frank Carter, Di Alberto, R. Godoy, Raul Godoy, Onelio de Juan, Armanda Acosta, Jose Aleman, Benjamin Acosta, Manuel Garcia, Jose Valdez, Ramon Hernandez, Arturo Garcia, Raul Ortega, Ramon Guerra, J. Grand Jose Piedra, or similar aliases. Also, the Bureau should check room and telephone records for the same period for the following names: George Larimer, Edward J. Hamilton. Both of those names are Hunt and Liddy aliases.

After securing said telephone records, all telephone numbers to which calls were placed should be investigated to determine the individual or entity in whose name such number is listed. Those individuals should then be interviewed to determine the purpose of the telephone communication, their knowledge of the burglary of Dr. Fielding's office, their knowledge of and association with G. Gordon Liddy, E. Howard Hunt, Jr., Bernard Barker, Felipe de Diego, Eugenio Martinez. (If the recipients of any calls are Egil Krogh, David Young, or other White House or ex-White House personnel, they should not be interviewed at this time).

The Office of Special Prosecutor Cox has requested a reinterview of Clifton DeMotte to determine what contact he had before 7/26/71, but after January, 1969, with John Caulfield, Anthony Blawieck or any persons who indicated a connection with the White House. The nature of these contacts should be discussed with DeMotte. The Special Prosecutor received a telephonic call from DeMotte on 6/18/73, at which time he said he was calling because he was upset over an article in Jack Anderson's column concerning interviews previously conducted of him. The Special Prosecutor has requested that when he is contacted, DeMotte be assured that any information he furnishes will not be supplied to persons outside the Department of Justice and that he is being contacted at the specific request of the Special Prosecutor's Office.

Reference is made to the memorandum of Mr. James Vorenberg dated July 3, 1973, captioned as above.

This will confirm discussions of July 10 and July 11, 1973, between Mr. Philip Heymann of the Special Prosecutor's Staff and Special Agent Charles A. Nuzum of this Bureau. With reference to item 22 captioned "Richard Best." Mr. Heymann was advised this individual undoubtedly is Richard Lee Bast, proprietor, Redex Corporation, 1404 New York Avenue, N. W., Washington, D. C., who has been the subject of an extensive Interception of Communications (IOC) investigation by the FBI concerning alleged violations by Bast of the IOC Statutes. Bast was indicted by the Federal grand jury, Washington, D. C., on February 23, 1972, for advertising, possessing and transporting in foreign commerce devices used primarily for surreptitious electronic surveillance. A superceding indictment was returned by the grand jury on May 26, 1972, which charged him with six counts of Section 2512, Title 18, U. S. Code (IOC), and one count of violation of Section 1934, Title 22, U. S. Code (exporting implements of war in violation of Department of State regulations).

On September 22, 1972, the U. S. District Court granted a defense motion to quash a search warrant executed on January 10, 1972, at Redex Corporation, which resulted in evidence which was the basis for indictment of Bast. At the present time the Government has an appeal pending in the U. S. Court of Appeals, Washington, D. C., concerning the decision of the U. S. District Judge.
