In addition, 16 persons were injured. These consisted of 9 Negro males, 5 Negro females and 2 white females. The rear end of the church was badly damaged. fire marshal in Birmingham advised that in his opinion, approximately 10 sticks of dynamite had been dropped on the road surface near the church and ignited with a fuse-type igniter. He estimated the damage to the church at \$20,000 to \$30,000. Our Birmingham Office immediately instituted a full investigation into this bombing. 

ASAC Robert Jensen advised at 2:50 p.m. that he was receiving inquiries from the press and intended to answer them to the effect that the FBI has entered this case and a full investigation is being conducted. This was cleared with Mr. Leinbaugh of Mr. DeLoach's office who indicated that this press release would be sufficient for press inquiries but any formal press release should be issued from Bureau headquarters.

ASAC Jensen made a request for some 35 millimeter It was arranged for this film to be transported Tri-X film. to Birmingham by SA and SA the Laboratory who accompanied three Departmental attorneys to Birmingham by military jet transport which left Andrews Air Force Base at 6:30 p.m.

In addition to SA Departmental and attorneys Burke Marshall, Joseph Dolan and John Nolan flew to Birmingham on the evening of 9/15/63. At 5:30 p.m. Mr. Belmont called SA or or o insure that personnel dealing with the situation are aware of the instructions that we will not furnish the Department a blow by blow description of our investigation into this matter. Any inquiries should be answered to the effect that we are conducting an investigation. Mr. Belmont also desired that Birmingham be instructed not to be furnishing spot reports to Departmental personnel. At 5:35 p.m. these instructions were passed on to SAC Faisst and at 6:55 p.m. to ASAC Jensen.

At 5:35 p.m. SAC Faisst advised he had received a call from Chief United States Deputy Marshal Dan Moore in Birmingham who in turn received word from Chief Marshal John McShane that Mr. Katzenbach desired United States Marshals to escort Negro children to school on 9/16/63. This is being done.

SAC Faisst advised that the Chief of Police Jamie Moore had made a request that 150 uniformed officers of the Alabama Highway Patrol be sent to the city of Birmingham to maintain order.

SAC Faisst indicated that the area of the church bombing was hazardous in that some of the walls of the church might collapse. A light tan Oldsmobile which had been stopped by the Birmingham Police Department with two white men in it have been checked out by the Police Department and the occupants accounted for their activities.

SAC Faisst was instructed to immediately start checking out Asa Carter and his Volunteers for Alabama and Wallace.

SAC Faisst was instructed to maintain close contact with informants and to indicate to them the Bureau would pay a substantial amount for the immediate solving of this crime.

ASAC Jensen was telephonically contacted at 6:55 p.m. to inform him that the Air Force plane containing Bureau personnel and Departmental personnel will arrive in Birmingham at 6:30. Central Standard Time.

I called Inspector Moore in Birmingham shortly after 9:00 P. M. 9-15-63 and reiterated instructions that no blowby-blow reports of our investigation are to be furnished to Departmental attorneys on the scene in Birmingham.

Mr. Moore made a request for the assignment of a Chief Clerk with background on major case handling. مرم or his assistant from Charlotte requested that be assigned.

I instructed Inspector Moore to call SAC Kissiah at Charlotte and make arrangements.

Inspector Moore will be either at the office or at his room in the Bankhead Hotel, Room 908, Birmingham, Alabama.

SAC Faisst, during this call, advised that Agents had heard shots and had observed a Negro male with blood on his shirt. The Negro male was taken from the scene in a police car. Indications are that the Negro was dead. Birmingham is checking into this and will furnish details.



At 12:40 P.M., Eastern Daylight Savings Time, Special Agent in Charge Raymond Faisst of the Birmingham Office telephonically advised SA Extra Duty Supervisor, that the Sixteenth Street Baptist Church, Sixteenth Street and Sixth Avenue, South, Birmingham, Alabama, was bombed at 10:25 A.M., Central Standard Time. The rear end of the church was badly damaged and several persons injured. Faisst stated he was on the way to the scene of the bombing with Agents of the Birmingham Office.

At 1:45 P.W., Eastern Daylight Savings Time, Assistant Special Agent in Charge Robert Jensen, Birmingham, advised the SAC and Agents of the Birmingham Office were at the scene of the bombing conducting investigation. They had determined from Fire Marshal Rosenfeld that he estimated ten sticks of 40 per cent dynamite had been dropped on the road surface near the church and ignited with a fuse-type igniter. He stated damage to the church was extensive, probably as much as \$20,000 to \$30,000. Investigation is being coordinated with the Birmingham Police Department and Lieutenant House of the Birmingham Police Department is at the hospital attempting to identify the dead and injured.

Jensen advised it had just been reported to him that a Negro woman had observed the bombing of the church and described the car as a 1957 or 1958 blue Buick. The license number which she furnished was registered to Birmingham, for a





At approximately 10:19 a.m., Central Standard Time (CST), 9/1 the 16th Street Baptist Church, located at 16th Street and 6th Avenue, North, Birmingham, Alabama, was bombed. This is a large Negro church in which many pro-integration demonstrations have been held during the past year.

The following individuals are reported to have died in the Carol Robertson, aged 14; Addie Collins, aged 14; Denise/ McNair, aged 10; Cynthia Wesley, aged 14, all Negro females. In addition, 16 other persons were injured, consisting of 9 Negro males 5 Negro females and 2 white females.

The rear end of the church was badly damaged. A fire marshal in Birmingham estimated that 10 sticks of dynamite had been dropped on the road surface near the church and ignited with a fusetype igniter. He estimated the damage to the church would run as high as \$20,000 to \$30,000.

A full investigation was immediately instituted by our > Birmingham Office and SAC Raymond L. Faisst promptly proceeded to the scene to take charge of our investigation and to coordinate activities with the Birmingham Police Department (PD).

Deputy Attorney General Katzenbach, who called Mr. Evans on 9/15/63 concerning the bombing, was advised that we had initiated an immediate investigation into the matter and that a Bureaux Inspector and a special squad of Agents had been sent into Birmingham.

Ten Special Agents, two stenographers and five Bureau cars were immediately dispatched to the Birmingham Office from other offices on special assignment. In addition, SAC Roy Moore of the Little Rock Office was sent in toppead up the investigation. 157-1025-24

Two Laboratory representatives, Special Agents and departed at 6:30 p.m., 9/15/63 via military jet transport from Andrews Air Force Base for Birmingham. Assistant Attorney General Burke Marshall and Departmental Attorneys Joseph Dolan and John Nolan were also on the plane.

BAC Faisst and ASAC Robert Jensen were telephonically advised that no blow-by-blow reports of our investigation are to be furnished to Departmental Attorneys on the scene and if any problems are encountered in this regard they are to communicate with the Bureau

Instructions were issued to the Birmingham Office and eight neighboring offices to immediately initiate interviews of all known Klansmen and hate group members, particularly members of the National States Rights Party (NSRP), and to establish the whereabouts of all bombing suspects during the pertinent period and to conduct appropriate interviews of them. The offices were instructed to at first single out Klan members and hate group members who would most logically deplore instant bombing and who would be likely to furnish information of possible assistance. The tactic of first interviewing lesser persons in Klan and hate groups is being utilized in view of the heinous nature of the crime and the possibility that such individuals would not condone such a crime. The normal procedures of interviewing key individuals in these organizations are, of course, also being followed.

The Birmingham Office has completed interviews with persons who reported they had information of possible value and are proceeding with interviews of possible witnesses who were in the area at the time of the explosion. No information of value has yet been developed concerning the identities of the individuals responsible for the crime. Two automobiles, which were reported as possibly being involved, have been checked out and no pertinent information developed.

A preliminary examination of the crime scene by the two representatives from the FBI Laboratory confirmed the opinion of the local fire marshal that a high order explosive, possibly dynamite, was used in the bombing. A detailed foot-by-foot crime scene search will be conducted on the morning of 9/16/63 during the daylight hours.

Memorandum for Mr. Belmont RE: UNSUBS: BOMBING OF 16TH STREET BAPTIST CHURCH

Dynamite sources are being checked out for possible leads and inquiries are also being made as to any recent thefts of dynamite in the Alabama area. Detailed neighborhood investigations have been initiated including inquiry at service stations, hotels, motels, restaurants, taxicab companies and similar places to obtain information regarding any suspicious persons who may have been in the area at the pertinent time. Our informants have been alerted and close contact is being maintained with them.

In addition to the deaths which occurred as a result of the church bombing, two other Negroes were killed in Birmingham on 9/15/63. In one incident Johnny Robinson, aged 16, was shot and killed, reportedly by an officer of the Birmingham PD as an outgrowth of Negroes throwing bricks and rocks at police officers in the vicinity of 8th Avenue and 26th Street, North. In the second incident, Virgil Ware, aged 13, was shot and killed on Sandusky Road, between Adamsville and Graysville, Alabama, suburbs of Birmingham. The Jefferson County Sheriff's Office, which is investigating the Ware killing, has advised that two unidentified white males on a motor scooter are suspects in this case.

The Birmingham Office will keep the Bureau advised of pertinent developments regarding the deaths of Robinson and Ware.

With regard to the situation in Birmingham, the city remained relatively quiet during the night. Chief of Police Jamie Moore advised our Birmingham Office that he had requested that 150 uniformed officers of the Alabama Highway Patrol be sent to Birmingham to assist in maintaining order. These officers arrived in Birmingham on the night of 9/15/63. Units of the Alabama National Guard in Birmingham have reportedly been alerted and a number of National Guardsmen are reportedly standing by at armories in Birmingham.

ACTION:

This matter is receiving close personal supervision and pertinent developments will be immediately brought to your attention.

In connection with the above matter, the Director approved sending SAC Roy Moore from Little Rock to Birmingham to take charge of the special squad looking in on the bombing of the Baptist Church and the recent bombings there. An additional ten men and stenographic assistance and cars were sent in by Mr. Mohr's office.

Katzenbach called me shortly before 8:00 p.m., 9/15/63, indicating that he was sure he need not call but wanted to express his interest in this case. He told me that he had called a number of Negro leaders in Birmingham and had urged that they see to it that anyone with information should come forward with it and give it to the FBI. He said he spoke to the Reverend Martin Luther King and his brother, the Reverend A. D. W. King, and other leaders.

He was assured that we were going all out in this investigation; that no holds would be barred; that all our facilities were available and would be used in the event needed. Katzenbach was most pleased with the action which we have taken and wanted to express it.

Upon SAC Moore's arrival at Little Rock, I pointed out to him instructions previously issued to the office that there was to be no blow-byblow reporting to the Department as to what we were doing. This was to include no information about how much manpower we had on the case nor what our plans are. The position would be that we are conducting an all-out investigation and we plan to pursue all phases of the case most vigorously. There could be no doubt that we were going to do our job. SAC Moore was advised to make sure that Faisst understood this even though he had been told previously. 157-1025-53

With reference to the attached article in the Washington Evening Star written by Miriam Ottenberg, captioned "Signs Of U. S. Violation Puts FBI In Bomb Case," I thought you should know that we talked to Miss Ottenberg about this yesterd

Miss Ottenberg had talked with Jack Rosenthal in Guthman's office in the Department and called here to "get her facts straight" as she put it.

The story as put together by Miss Ottenberg after talking with Mr. Rosenthal was completely distorted, facts were wrong and the impression was given the FBI had not solved any cases and not investigated any cases and was doing ittle in the civil rights field. ma suma to

We told Miss Ottenberg that we could not help her too much on the current matter. We then explained most carefully the FBI's jurisdiction in civil rights cases, the accomplishments of the FBI in these cases and the provisions of th Civil Rights Act of 1960. We pointed out that the FBI entered the September 15th church bombing at once because of an indication of a violation of Federal law and that we have closely and carefully advised the Department of Justice of the facts in the other bombings in Birmingham and that there are four cases wherein the Department authorized investigation following an indication of a violation of Federal law within the FBI's jurisdiction.

Miss Ottenberg said she wished to point out the difficulties encountere by the FBI in this type of investigation and wished to give the FBI all credit possible for its fine work in the civil rights field.

Signs of U.S. Violation Puts FBI in Bomb Case

By MIRIAM OTTENBERG Star Staff Writer

FBI agents moved in on the Negro church bombing in Birmingham Sunday because there was an immediate indication a Federal law had been violated, an FBI spokesman said today.

The FBI declined to disclose what information prompted agents to take over active investigation, but under the 1960 law giving the FBI jurisdiction in bombing cases under the Civil Rights Act, it would have to be an indication that the dynamite had been taken across State lines or that suspects were crossing State lines the avoid capture or prosecution.

Although there have been more than a score of bombings in Birmingham, the FBI has played a major investigative role only in four cases. The FBI emphasized that it investigates only where there is evidence of a Federal violation.

FBI at All Bomb Scenes

The FBI has gone to the scene of all the recent bombings but picked up the investigation in these three cases before the church bombing:

The May 11 bombing of the home of the Rev. A. D. King. The bombing of the A. G. Gaston Motel on the same night. The September 14 bombing of the home of Arthur Shores, a civil rights attorney. Mr. Shores' home had been bombed a month earlier, but the FBI did not enter the investigation in that case.

Although limited in its own investigative role to the cases indicating direct violation of Federal laws, the FBI has offered its laboratory and identification facilities to local police and has pursued out-of-State leads.

The FBI can and does investigate bombings and similar violence under other Federal laws. Thus, FBI agents investigated the bombing of a Freedom Riders' bus at Anniston, Ala., as a violation of interstate commerce laws and investigated church burnings in Georgia as a violation of laws forbidding intimidation of vot-

Cines Are Scarce

None of the four cases the FBI has under active investigation has been solved. The difficulties in bombing cases are legion. Most of the usual investigative techniques cannot be used.

There is no gun to trace, and in Birmingham particularly, dynamite is readily available because of its widespread use in industry. The search of the crime scene is usually non-productive because the bombs have destroyed such promising evidence as fingerprints. The scene itself is usually trampled because of the need to renjove the injured.

Informers are practically the only source of clues. That's why FBI agents and local police have taken on the jeb of interviewing literally thousands of potential witnesses.

into the church bonders makes it a crime to transport or aid another to transport supplies interstate with the knowledge or intent to use explosives to destroy property "for the purpose of interfering with its use for educational, religious, charitable, residential, business or civic objectives or of intimidating any person pursing such objectives."

Possible Death Penalty

The penalties provide imprisonment for not more than one year or up to \$1,000 fine or both. If personal injury results, the prison sentence can go up to 10 years and a fine up to \$10,000. If death results from the bombing, as it did in the Birmingham church, imprisonment can go up to life, or the court may impose the death penalty on recommendation of a jury.

The 1960 law also provides that possession or use of an explosive to damage properly covered by the Civil Rights Act creates an assumption that explosive was transported interstate. But a person cannot be convicted under this law unless there is evidence aside from the presumption that State lines were crossed.


