

The Birmingham Office has advised that the U. S. Attorney, Macon Weaver in Birmingham contacted SAC Raymond Faisst and advised that U. S. District Judge Clarence W. Allgood desires a conference today, 12/30/63, concerning the possibility of giving the current Federal Grand Jury in Birmingham some sort of summary in February, 1964, concerning developments in the bombing of the Sixteenth Street Baptist Church.

SAC Faisst is meeting with Judge Allgood today and it should be noted that Judge Allgood is very friendly to the Bureau. SAC Faisst will obtain particulars concerning the request of Judge Allgood but will make no commitment without prior clearance from the Bureau.

In this regard it should be noted that our investigation of the bombing of the church does not indicate any basis for Federal jurisdiction since there is no indication of interstate transportation of explosives.

#### APPENDIX

#### UNITED KLANS OF AMERICA, INC., KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN (UNITED KLANS)

Records of Superior Court of Fulton County, Georgia, show that this Klan organization was granted a corporate charter on February 21, 1961, at Atlanta, Georgia, under the name United Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc.

A source advised on February 27, 1961, that United Klans was formed as a result of a split in U. S. Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Inc. According to the source, the split resulted from a leadership dispute and United Klans has the same aims and objectives as the parent group. These are the promotion of Americanism, white supremacy, and segregation of the races.

The first source and a second source advised in July, 1961, that United Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc., merged with Alabama Knights, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan. The merged organization established headquarters in Suite 401, the Alston Building, Tuscaloosa, Alabama. The organization is directed by Robert Shelton, Imperial Wizard, and is the dominant Klan group in the South with units in several southern states.

On August 14, 1961, the second source advised that the organization formerly known as United Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc., would be known in the future as United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan. The second source said the name was changed by a resolution adopted at the National Klonvocation held July 8, 1961, at Indian Springs, Georgia.

Second source advised that at a meeting at Prattville, Alabama, on October 22, 1961, a majority of the Klaverns of the U. S. Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan merged with the United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan.

#### APPENDIX

#### NATIONAL STATES RIGHTS PARTY

On November 26, 1957, a source advised that the United White Party (UWB) was organized at a convention held in Knoxville, Tennessee, on November 10, 1957. An article in the November 26, 1957, issue of the "Greenville Piedmont," a newspaper of Greenville, South Carolina, reported that a "Ku Klux Klan spokesman of Greenville reported the recent formation of a new political party to be known as the United White Party." According to the article, the party was formed at a recently held meeting in Knoxville, Tennessee, at which many Klansmen were represented. The UWP was reported as being opposed to all "race mixing organizations and individuals."

The July, 1958, issue of "The Thunderbolt," self-described as the "official Racial Nationalist Organ of the National States Rights Party" (NSRP) reported that rank and file "States Righters" had merged with the UWP under "the banner of the National States Rights Party," with national offices at Post Office Box 261, Jeffersonville, Indiana.

In November, 1958, a source advised that the NSRP is composed of past members of the Ku Klux Klan and notorious anti-Semites.

Issue No. 19, dated June, 1960, "The Thunderbolt" announced the address of the headquarters of the NSRP had been changed from Jeffersonville, Indiana, to Post Office Box 783, Birmingham, Alabama.

On June 17, 1960, a source advised that EDWARD R. FIELDS, the Information Director of the NSRP, is the individual who "runs the NSRP."

"The Thunderbolt" continues to publish articles attacking Negroes and persons of the Jewish faith.







Your letter of January 16th has been received.

The FBI's jurisdiction to investigate bombings comes from the Civil Rights Act of 1960 which became effective on May 6, 1960. It is broad in scope, but the Department of Justice has stated that Congress clearly indicated there was no intention in the statute to usurp investigative and prosecutive authority in bombing matters from state and local authorities. The Department has instructed that the FBI should not initiate investigations into such cases without special Departmental authorization.

The facts of each bombing incident are presented immediately to the Department, and the FBI enters a case when requested by the Department to do so. Due to the nature of the September 15th bombing at Birmingham in which four children were killed, the FBI began an immediate investigation and advised the Department of the action being taken. The complete resources of this Bureau are still being utilized to solve this case. Although the FBI does not actively investigate all bombing cases, it does cooperate in every way possible with state and local authorities. The full facilities of the FBI Laboratory and Identification Division are available to render any assistance.

Acting within the law, the FBI has recorded a number of accomplishments in the civil rights field. For example, FBI investigations have enabled the Department of Justice to file more than forth suits in five states to end racial discrimination in voting. FBI Agents solved the case involving the burning of a Greyhound bus transporting "Freedom Riders" through Alabama in 1961. Six persons have been convicted for their part in this crime. An FBI investigation in September, 1962, led to the arrest and conviction in state court

(3) that since the cache of the 137 sticks of dynamite was recovered and three individuals charged with the possession, there have been no further bombings, and,

(4) State investigators expect to develop a confession from one of the defendants.

It should be noted that the defendants are prime suspects who were arrested by the Alabama Highway Patrol for possession of the dynamite when the State Patrol found out that we were concentrating our efforts on them. The State had no concrete evidence against them. defendants are Charles Cagle, Robert Chambliss, and John Wesley "Nigger"



U.S. ATTORNEY MACON L. WEAVER, BIRMINGHAM, ADVISED THAT FEDERAL GRAND JURY FOREMAN CLARENCE PINSON IS INSISTING THAT SOME INFORMATION CONCERNING BAPBOMB INVESTIGATION BE PRESENTED TO GRAND JURY CONVENING BIRMINGHAM FEBRUARY TENTH, NEXT. PINSON WAS SUCCESSFUL IN SELLING U. S. DISTRICT COURT JUDGE CLARENCE W. ALLGOOD ON THE IDEA, AND ALLGOOD HAS NOW TAKEN THE SAME POSITION, ACCORDING TO WEAVER. WEAVER STATED THAT HE CAN NO LONGER RESIST THIS PRESSURE AND FEELS THAT WE WOULD HAVE NO ALTERNATIVE BUT TO MAKE SOME FORM OF A TOKEN STATEMENT TO THE GRAND JURY. HE STATED THAT HE IS FACED WITH THE PROPOSITION OF CONVEYING THE GRAND JURY'S REQUEST TO US AND SAID HE WOULD ISSUE A SUBPOENA FOR SAC. HE WAS TOLD THAT IF AT ALL POSSIBLE A SUBPOENA SHOULD NOT BE ISSUED BECAUSE IF IT WAS AGREEABLE TO THE BUREAG AND DEPARTMENT WE WOULD CERTAINLY PREFER TO APPEAR ON FEBUOL INTARY BASIS 6 M





AND THAT SAC DID NOT LIKE THE IDEA OF ANY ELEMENT OF COMPULSION BEING INVOLVED OR POSSIBLY PUBLICIZED. WEAVER STATED HE WOULD, THEREFORE, HOLD OFF ON THE SUBPOENA, BUT SAID THAT HE SIMPLY HAS TO GET WORD TO THE GRAND JURY AND TO THE JUDGE NO LATER THAN THURSDAY, FEBRUARY SIXTH, AS TO WHAT ACTION WE CONTEMPLATE TAKING.

WEAVER STATED THAT THIS GRAND JURY IS THE SAME ONE WHICH INDICTED THE NATIONAL STATES RIGHTS PARTY MEMBERS FOR OBSTRUCTION OF JUSTICE IN CONNECTION WITH THE SCHOOL DESEGREGATION MATTER IN BIRMINGHAM THIS PAST FALL, AND THAT BY AND LARGE THE GRAND JURORS APPEAR TO BE A SUBSTANTIAL GROUP OF CITIZENS AND HE FEELS THAT THEY WOULD MAKE NO UNREASONABLE REQUEST. BY UNREASONABLE HE SAID HE MEANS THAT A GENERAL STATEMENT WOULD PROBABLY SATISFY THEM AND THERE WOULD BE NO RECORD MADE OF THE COMMENTS OF THE BUREAU REPRESENTATIVE AND THERE WOULD BE NO SPECIFIC REQUEST FOR DETAILS WHICH WOULD JEOPARDIZE THE SUCCESS OF ANY INVESTIGATION NOR WOULD THERE BE THE REQUEST FOR THE IDENTITY OF INFORMANTS. WEAVER NOTED THAT EVEN IF THERE WAS A POSSIBLE SEEPAGE OF GENERAL INFORMATION FROM THE GRAND JURY WE COULD CONVEY THE IMPLICATION THAT WE KNOW A LOT MORE ABOUT THIS THING THAN WE ACTUALLY DO AND IF THIS FILTERED BACK TO SOME OF THE SUSPECTS IT MIGHT HAVE A SALUTARY EFFECT ON



This memorandum will confirm the conversation between Mr. John L. Murphy of your Division and Mr. Richard B. Lavin of this Bureau on February 5, 1964. United States Attorney Macon L. Weaver, Birmingham, Alabama, advised our Birmingham Office that the Foreman of the Federal Grand Jury, Clarence Pinson, has requested that some information be furnished to the Grand Jury concerning this Bureau's investigation into the bombing of the Sixteenth Street Emptist Church. The Grand Jury will convene on February 10, 1964.

According to Mr. Weaver, United States District Judge Clarence W. Allgood also desires that a statement be made to the jury. Hr. Weaver indicated that he would be willing to issue a subpoena for the presence of the Special Agent in Charge of our Birmingham Office; however, he was informed that this would not be necessary and this Bureau would prefer to voluntarily make a representative of the Bureau available to the Grand Jury providing the Department of Justice would be agreeable to such a procedure. 157-1025-



I called SAC Faisst and stated that in reviewing his teletype February 5, 1964, it appeared that the use of the word prosecutive summary was improper inasmuch as we have no case which is prosecutable at this time. It was pointed out that the Birmingham wire specifically states that we have no Federal violation; consequently, the use of the word prosecutive summary would be improper. Faisst indicated that he would, therefore, call this an investigative summary and his correspondence will reflect that.

It was indicated that it appeared that if U. S. Attorney Weaver was such a good friend of the FBI office Faisst could talk with him about getting an opinion to him on February 7 rather than today. It was indicated that I did not think we ought to be pushed to the point where this situation could not be given proper consideration. He said he would call Weaver and, unless we heard from him to the contrary, we could assume that Weaver will go along. He felt that Weaver would be amenable to this suggestion.

I inquired as to whether we had turned anything over to the United States Attorney or to the State in the nature of a report concerning this matter. He stated that we had not. We had, of course, furnished information of interest to the State periodically. I indicated that I was familiar with this and that such information as was given to the State was on a liaison basis which was perfectly satisfactory and that we should continue to furnish the State information which they need to know.

He indicated that Pinson of the Grand Jury is a brother of the County Commissioner and apparently is a reliable individual.

I discussed the type of information which I thought should be furnished to the Grand Jury. I indicated that I did not think it desirable at all to name names, dates, or places or to indicate who our suspects were. It was indicated

that I thought all that should be given was a brief statement that the FBI had initiated an extensive special investigation at the very outset of this case and that we were continuing to exert all-out effort to bring this thing to a logical conclusion; that we had cooperated with the local authorities throughout the investigation and were continuing to cooperate; that we had conducted extensive technical examinations of various types of material which may have a bearing upon the ultimate solution of the case through the facilities of our technical services at the Bureau, the Laboratory, Identification Division in particular. It was indicated that I thought SAC Faisst should appear and state to the members of the Grand Jury our position and assure them that we were continuing our investigation looking to a solution of this matter and that we were continuing to cooperate with the local authorities.

I advised Faisst he would be given advice as to the Bureau's position and that he would have this advice by February 7.

He indicated he was preparing a summary of the information which they developed which he thought might be given to the Grand Jury. This would be given to U. S. Attorney Weaver also and it would name names and give the identities of principal suspects and the nature of the investigation being conducted. I advised him this was most undesirable, I thought, and that I did not think we would approve furnishing any specific information at this time-inasmuch as we had no Federal violation. It was indicated when we were ready to present this case on the basis that there was a Federal violation in existence we would then be in a position to give the United States Attorney a report. Until that time there did not appear to be any obligation on the part of the Bureau merely to give what could be considered an inadequate presentation to the United States Attorney. I did not think this desirable.

The above information is for record purposes in connection with the teletype which Mr. Faisst furnished to the Bureau on February 5. It is my impression that Macon Weaver might be pushing for some comment in view of the fact that Judge Allgood had called this Grand Jury just about the time of the bombing and, of course, everyone in the area was commenting on their personal interest in the case.

### NARRATIVE OF OFFENSE

The Sixteenth Street Baptist Church (Negro), located on the northwest corner of Sixteenth Street and Sixth Avenue, North, Birmingham, Alabama, was bombed at about 10:22 A.M. on September 15, 1963. Four teen-age girls were killed and sixteen other church members were injured. Examination of scene revealed that explosion had occurred along the east wall of the church and at the foot of the stairs leading from the ground level to the main floor. The explosion caused extensive damage to the church and numerous windows were broken out in the neighborhood. It was concluded that a high order explosive was used and the damage caused was approximately equivalent to that of an explosion of about ten sticks of dynamite.

### PRELIMINARY PROSECUTIVE ACTION TAKEN

There has been no preliminary prosecutive action taken.

Special Agents or the Fbi

These Agents on the night of September 15, 1963, conducted an examination of damage to Sixteenth Street Baptist Church at 1530 Sixth Avenue, North. These Agents can testify to having found the following conditions present:

The characteristics of the damage, the distribution of debris inside and outside the church, and the type of debris, indicated a high-order type explosive, such as dynamite, had been placed on the ground in front of a double window of the church and under an outside concrete stairway that partially covered the double window. The stairway leads from the ground level to the second floor level and is located at the northeast corner of the church. The double windows are in a basement room of the church known as the ladies lounge, and are covered on the outside by heavy gauge protective wire screens, as are all the basement windows of this church.

The floor of the lounge was approximately four feet below the window sill. The window sill was 8" above ground level. The church foundation was 30" thick at this point and consisted of a 10" stone facing over a 20" thick brick and masonry wall.

The explosion fragmented the outside concrete stairway. Directly beneath the stairway and opposite the window sill, in the ground, was a crater measuring 5½ feet wide, 2½ feet deep, and it extended from the wall of the church to the inner edge of the sidewalk, a distance measuring 3 2/3 feet. The explosion fragmented the solid limestone window sill and tore cut the foundation of the church immediately beneath the window sill. The window glass, window frames and heavy wire gauge protective screens were shattered and blown into the ladies lounge. Extensive

damage was caused in the interior of the ladies lounge. A large hole, approximately 7' x 7', directly opposite the window and 16 feet from it was blown out of a partition forming one side of the lounge. This wall was constructed of two thicknesses of brick and covered with wet plaster. At the time of the examination, the floor of the lounge was covered with 6" of debris consisting of brick, stone, concrete, glass, mortar, plaster, wood lath, and wood from a partition and from underneath and inside stairway.

The main supporting beams in the northeast corner area of the church were weakened. Numerous windows throughout the church were broken by the blast effect.

The main effects of the blast inside the church were confined to the ladies lounge.

Although there is no way of accurately determining the amount of explosives used, the damage caused by the bomb appears to be consistent with that which would be produced by more than ten sticks of dynamite, or its equivalent.

These two Agents can testify that a thorough search was made of the explosion crater, damaged building, and the surrounding area on September 16, 1963, being assisted by several additional agents. The search consisted of a piece-by-piece examination of all debris. The following material was found:


- (1) Pieces of heavy gauge wire from the screen coverings over the windows in the ladies lounge.
- (2) Pieces of window frame from the windows in the ladies lounge.
- (3) Fragments of drapery material that covered the windows in the ladies lounge.
- (4) Part of the metal frame of the wire screen covering the windows in the ladies lounge.
- (5) Scrapings from window sill in ladies lounge.

No burned safety fuse, fragments of a timing device, container fragments, fragments of blasting or electric blasting caps, wires, igniter fragments, or other materials which could be associated with a bomb, were found.

On September 20, 1963, the FBI Laboratory advised the specimens submitted failed to reveal any foreign residue or fragments which were indicative of a specific type of explosive or fusing device.



ROBERT EDWARD CHAMBLISS resides at 2505 32nd Avenue North, Birmingham, Alabama. He is a white male, having been born on January 14, 1904, at Pratt City, Alabama. He is presently married to FLORA MANNING CHAMBLISS, and they have no children. By a former marriage he has two grown sons living in Florida. He is very well known by people in many walks of life as being a rabid segregationist, and has been identified on numerous occasions as being associated with groups and movements advocating segregation.

These two agents interviewed ROBERT EDWARD CHAMBLISS in the Birmingham Office, Federal Bureau of Investigation, on September 28, 1963. He was advised that he did not have to make a statement and that amy statement he made could be used against him in a court of law; further, that he had the right to consult an attorney before making a statement. He was not threatened in any manner nor was he promised anything to obtain his cooperation.

CHAMBLISS admitted that he had joined the KU KLUX KLAN and was active in that organization until 1951, at which time he resigned from Eastview Klavern No. 13, KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN. At the time of his resignation he was the Exalted Cyclops of the group. He said he resigned due to the unfavorable publicity which had been afforded him personally and unfairly because of his alleged acts of violence against Negroes in the Birmingham, Alabama, area. One particular incident got an unusual amount of publicity which involved the forcing of a Negro couple to move from a formerly allwhite neighborhood. Due to this unfavorable publicity he was fired from his position with the Department of Street and Sanitation of the City of Birmingham. He felt this action by city officials was unfair as he had been doing what he was told to do by "BULL" CONNER, the Birmingham Police Commissioner at that time. CONNER had failed to intercede for him and he was fired outright.

CHAMBLISS stated he attends open meetings only, but is still very much interested in the KU KLUX KLAN and is an admitted strong segregationist, and feels that some type of definite action must be taken against the Negroes if the segregation cause is not lost.

CHAMBLISS recounted his association with the UNITED AMERICANS FOR COMMERVATIVE GOVERNMENT, which group he feels is the best organization in the segregationist groups operating at the time and the most likely to be successful.

CHAMBLISS denied being involved in any bombings in the Birmingham area, and stated he has no direct knowledge of any of them other than that afforded through news coverage.

CHANBLISS furnished what he stated was his best recollection of his activities during the pertinent periods of bombings occurring since the May 11, 1963, bombing of the residence of Rev. A. D. W. KING and the Gaston Notel on that day.

These agents again attempted to interview CHAMBLISS on October 29, 1963, at his place of employment, Rebuilt Auto Parts Company, 1508 3rd Avenue South, Birmingham. He showed a hostile attitude and furnished little information except criticism of the FBI.

# SECTION TWO CONSPIRACY TO COMMIT CERTAIN CRIMES

### NARRATIVE OF OFFENSE

Set forth below is a list reflecting bombings that have occurred in Birmingham since December of 1956, which list is not complete nor was the bombing of December, 1956, the first bombing of a Negro home. It is noted that these are bombings of Negro properties. Most of the bombings of residences, except as indicated, were in the Fountain Heights Section of Birmingham, often referred to as Dynamite Hill. These were homes of Negroes moving into a previously all-white area.

April, 1957, home of ASBURY HOWARD, Negro labor leader at Bessemer, Alabama.

January 16, 1962, BETHEL BAPTIST CHURCH.

January 16, 1962, St. Luke's Zion Church.

January 16, 1962, Triumph Church of God.

January 22, 1962, Four-unit apartment house for Negroes under construction.

December 14, 1962, New Bethel Baptist Church.

March, 1963, residence of HOWARD ROBINSON.

May 11, 1963, residence of Reverend A. D. W. KING.

May 11, 1963, A. G. Gaston Motel.

August 20, 1963, residence of ARTHUR SHORES.

September 4, 1963, residence of ARTHUR SHORES.

September 15, 1963, Sixteenth Street Baptist Church.

September 25, 1963, an explosion at 1601 Center Street.

It is noted the bombing of the Sixteenth Street Baptist Church was the only case that anyone was killed by the blast.





PURPOSE OF MEMORANDUM:

Pursuant to an inquiry from United States Attorney (USA) Macon Weaver, Birmingham, this recommends that SAC Raymond L. Faisst voluntarily appear at a session of the Federal grand jury in February, 1964, in Birmingham to give a brief statement concerning the Bureau's participation in the investigation of the bombing of the Sixteenth Street Baptist Church. This conclusion is based on the following facts.

#### BACKGROUND:

USA Weaver in Birmingham has advised that the Federal Grand Jury Foreman Clarence Pinson has requested that some information concerning the investigation into the church bombing be presented to the grand jury which convenes in Birmingham on 2/10/64.

U. S. District Judge Clarence W. Allgood has taken the same position according to USA Weaver and the USA has indicated that he would issue a subpoena for the Special Agent in Charge (SAC).

USA Weaver was informed by SAC Faisst that if at all possible a subpoena should not be issued and if it was agreeable with Bureau headquarters and with the Department we would prefer to appear on a voluntary basis without any element of compulsion being present. USA Weaver has advised he would not issue any subpoena until he heard from Faisst. - 1025 RFC- 13

USA Weaver believes that this particular grand jury is composed of ... substantial citizens and they would not make any unreasonable request. He believes that a statement concerning our investigation would probably satisfy

them and there would be no record made of the comments of the Bureau representative and there would be no specific request for details which might jeopardize our investigation.



#### SAC'S RECOMMENDATION:

to whom this case is assigned and who has just concluded a review of voluminous material for the preparation of an investigative summary on the case, be authorized to appear before this grand jury and furnish a brief summary of the investigation conducted. According to SAC Faisst, such summary would include an identity of principal suspects and in some fashion what evidence is available to justify their consideration as suspects. The objective nature of our investigation would be pointed out noting specifically that all possible suspects irrespective of their race would be given appropriate consideration and investigative attention.

#### RECOMMENDATION:

This matter has been discussed with Faisst and also the Department and it is believed that the recommendation of the SAC goes too far in the amount of information that should be furnished to the grand jury. At the present time, although we have developed extensive information concerning the activities of the principal suspects, we have not established a Federal violation; consequently all that should be given to the grand jury is a brief statement that this Bureau initiated an extensive investigation at the very outset of this case and that we are continuing to exert all-out effort to bring this matter to a logical conclusion; that we have cooperated with the local authorities throughout the investigation and are continuing to cooperate; that we have conducted thousands of interviews; that we have conducted extensive technical examinations of various types of

material which may have a bearing upon the ultimate solution of the case through the facilities of our Laboratory and Identification Divisions. Therefore, SAC Faisst should appear and assure the grand jury in line with above.

#### DEPARTMENTAL OPINION:

The above request of the USA was discussed with Mr. John L. Murphy of the CRD of the Department on 2/5/64.

It was pointed out to Murphy that as he knew following the bombing, we immediately entered the investigation, sent a special squad of Agents into the area and conducted thousands of interviews both in Alabama and neighboring states in an attempt to bring about a solution. It was pointed out to Murphy that we had voluminous memoranda and reports on the bombing but that in view of the fact we had no prosecutable evidence to prove a Federal crime, we were not disseminating the information. Murphy agreed and indicated that he was satisfied that the Bureau was conducting an extensive investigation and until such time as there was something concrete to go on or someone to prosecute the Department did not require reports. He indicated it would be proper to appear before the grand jury and indicate we are continuing to investigate this matter in line with the above recommendations.

#### ACTION TO BE TAKEN:
