



This is the case involving the bombing of the Sixteenth Street Baptist Church, Birmingham, Alabama, 9-15-63, in which four Negro girls were killed.

By letter dated 12-7-66, the Department was advised that 11 microphone surveillances and 7 technical surveillances were used during the investigation of this matter. No pertinent information to this investigation was obtained from any of them.

These installations were on prime suspects. Several of the prime suspects in this case were prematurely arrested in the early stages of this investigation by the Alabama State Highway Patrol. This has materially hindered the FBI from obtaining admissible evidence. Results of our investigation have been furnished to the Department. There is no indication that the Department contemplates prosecution in this matter in the future.

It appears that the Department's request is an outright instance of a fishing expedition; therefore, the Department will be advised in writing that in the absence of any indication that it intends to prosecute this matter, the request will not be honored



NATIONAL KU KLUX KLAN KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN (HKKK)


A source advised that on May 22, 1960, the National Grand Council of the Knights of the Ku Klux Klan met at Atlanta, Georgia, to discuss consolidation of the klans unity of effort and activities, to establish a National Fund and a National Secretary and to design a new flag. The meeting was attended by representatives of the Federation of Ku Klux Klan, Alabama; Association of Arhansas Klans, Arkansas; Florida Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Florida; Southern Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Florida; Association of Georgia Klans, Georgia; Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, North Carolica; Association of South Carolina Klans, South Carolina; Dixie Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Tennessee; and Hyksos Klan, Texas.

This source advised that at a consolidation meeting at Atlanta, Georgia, September 2-5, 1960, at which the North Carolina and Texas Klans were not represented, it was resolved and passed that their name be changed to National Ku Klux Klan.

This source also advised that at a consolidation meeting at Savannah, Georgia, October 23, 1960, it was resolved and passed that in any future meetings of this group the name "Majority Citizens League" was to be used.

A second source advised that at a national klonklave meeting at Texarkana, Texas, on February 11-12, 1962, a motion was carried that there were to be at least six national meetings a year to be held any time from one week to twelve weeks after the last meeting. The time and meeting place were to be decided by the newly-elected chairman. This second source also advised that at each meeting a new chairman and acting secretary were to be elected to serve at the next meeting. A national secretary had not been appointed.

A third source advised that at a national meeting on November 11-12, 1961, United Klans of America, Inc. (UK) was invited to meet with NKKK and it was agreed they would meet together, but there was no talk of consolidation.

This third source further advised that as of the national meeting on May 5-6, 1962, no national fund, headquarters or secretary had been established and no plans had apparently been made to do so. A temporary chairman and acting secretary were to be appointed for each meeting. The name "Majority Citizens League" was not being used in connection with meetings.



As you were advised prior to assuming your duties as Special Agent in Charge at Birmingham, captioned cases and all others involving racial violence must receive thorough and preferred investigative attention by the Agents assigned to your office and close personal supervision on your part. In order to be successful in these matters it is imperative that you take affirmative steps to intensify the coverage of groups existing in your territory having a propensity for racial violence.

Tou are reminded that Bapbomb, Greenbombs and related cases must receive your personal attention and supervision. These cases must continue to be handled as specials on a continuing basis by Agents specially designated to handle them exclusively. They must continue to receive sustained intelligent investigative attention and supervision until they are brought to a logical conclusion.



NOTE:

Bapbomb is the case involving the bombing of the 16th Street Baptist Church, Birmingham, Alabama, 9/15/63, in which four Negro girls were killed.

Greenbombs is the case involving the bombing devices located in Birmingham, Alabama, in March and April, 1965.

Since March, 1965, these cases have been handled as specials under the direct on-the-scene supervision of an inspector and later the personal supervision of the SAC. Prior to his departure for his assignment in Birmingham, SAC Hall was reminded of the importance of these cases. The change in SACs in the Birmingham office should not be allowed to adversely affect the continuous penetrative investigation that is necessary to bring these cases to a logical conclusion.

In this regard, the type of bomb used, origin of the explosives, type of timing device, and its origin should be obtained. Specific information concerning the exact role each of the alleged participants played should also be fully developed. Identities of all persons who would have a knowledge of this crime even though they were not participants should be obtained from the informant.

Of course, no action should be taken by your office which might compromise the confidential relationship between and his informant. However, all practical avenues or investigation must be considered to completely resolve this matter. In view of the allegations made by the Police Department informant, you should advise by return airtel the action you contemplate with regard to the suspects maned by this informant and your plans to establish the reliability of his information.

This article states that David William Ferrie and two associates may have been the "Birmingham bombers." It also contains statement "The Councilor was told that Lee Harvey Oswald may have belped plan the Birmingham bombings in addition to two men still alive. In 1964 an airline pilot told The Councilor that Ferrie was a frequent visitor in Birmingham and that Oswald was a visitor with him on one such occasion." This article also indicates that "The Councilor has furnished its facts, tips, and background information to the Birmingham Police Department and the Alabama State Police.

This same article contains statements indicating that "The Councilor" suspected David Ferrie of being the strange pilot in a "sympathy bombing" of a Negro Masonic Lodge and the fishing camp of a Negro dentist in Bossier Parish, Louisiana. It is alleged that these bombings launched a "hate-the-South campaign." According to the article, "The Councilor" believed That this was part of an elaborate plan to kill President Skennedy in New Orleans on 5/4/62. There is also a reference in the article to one of the alleged victims of the Bossier bombings as being C. O. Simkins.

For the information of Birmingham, it should be noted that on 4/25/62 explosions occurred in a Negro Masonic Lodge

in the vicinity of Lake Bestinean near Shreveport, Louisiana, a recreation camp for Negroes in a state park on Lake Bistinean, and at a summer camp owned by Dr. C. O. Simpkins, a local Negro leader in the vicinity of Lake Bestinean. All of these bombings were investigated by the FBI.

The Bureau has no information indicating that Ferrie or Oswald were ever linked to any of the Birmingham bombings or the bombings at Lake Bistineau, Louisiana.

Although it appears that the information set forth in the Birmingham Independent is the result of stories concerning the investigation of the Kennedy assassination being conducted by Jim Garrison, District Attorney, New Orleans, Louisiana, this is not entirely clear. The article frequently refers to "The Councilor" as a source of its information.

If you have not already done so, you should immediately contact reliable sources in the Birmingham Police Department to ascertain the original source of the information published in the Birmingham Independent. Any material concerning the Birmingham bombings or Louisiana bombings, or other matters of interest to the Bureau which has been furnished to the Birmingham Police Department should be completely reviewed. If any substantive information not previously developed concerning captioned case is obtained, immediate investigation should be undertaken.

Within three days of the receipt of this communication advise Bureau by airtel of the results of your review of material in the possession of the Birmingham Police Department and advise the Bureau what additional action, if any, is contemplated concerning any allegations and insinuations contained in the Birmingham Independent.

NOTE:

This is the case involving the bombing of the 16th Street Baptist Church, Birmingham, Alabama, September 15, 1963, in which four Negro girls were killed.


The Birmingham Independent is a small weekly independent newspaper which described itself as "conservative." Other newspapers and news media have not carried similar articles.

David William Ferrie, recently deceased, was a person named as a conspirator in the President Kennedy assassination plot by Jim Garrison, District Attorney, New Orleans, Louisiana, during his free wheeling investigation of the Kennedy assassination. Lee Harvey Oswald was shot and killed by Jack Ruby after Oswald was arrested for President Kennedy's assassination.
