SEARCH OF CHURCH AND SURROUNDING AREA COMPLETED. TWO CARS PARKED ALONGSIDE OF CHURCH AND NEAREST TO POINT OF EXPLOSION EXAMINED. AND FOUND TO BE SEVERELY DAMAGED BY FLYING DEBRIS AND BLAST EFFECT. CARS THOROUGHLY EXAMINED FOR PHYSICAL EVIDENCE SUGGESTIVE OF TYPE OF EXPLOSIVE USED AND MANNER IN WHICH IT MAY

HAVE BEEN DETONATED. FRAGMENTS OF CONCRETE FROM THE PREFORMED

DETONATED. OR CONTAINER IN WHICH IT POSSIBLY PLACED. EXAMINATION OF BURNED FIFTYEIGHT CHEVROLET IMPALA SPORT COUPE BEARING SECRET SERIAL NO. FIVE EIGHT N ONE FOUR FIVE THREE ZERO TWO CONDUCTED. ALL COMBUSTIBLE MATERIAL IN CAR, INCLUDING ALL TIRES ON CAR, AND TIRE IN TRUNK REDUCED TO ASHES. PLASTIC AND LOW MELTING POINT METALLIC FIXTURES MELTED INTO NONDESCRIPT MOLTEN MASSES. COLOR OF CAR COULD NOT BE DETERMINED. APPEARANCE OF CAR SUGGESTS ACCELERANT POSSIBLY USED. TYPE OF ACCELERANT NOT KNOWN. NOTHING FOUND FROM EXAMINATION OF ASHES FOR ASSOCIATION WITH AN EXPLOSIVE SUBSTANCE OR BOMB ACCESSORY. NOT POSSIBLE TO DETERMINE QUANTITY OF EXPLOSIVES USED IN CHURCH BOMB BUT EXTENT OF DAMAGE CONSISTENT WITH THAT CAUSED BY A HIGH ORDER EXPLOSIVE CHARGE SUCH AS TEN OR MORE STICKS OF DYNAMITE OR ITS EQUIVALENT. SINCE NO EVIDENCE THAT COULD BE ASSOCIATED WITH A BOMB UTILIZING A TIME DELAY DEVICE SUCH AS ELECTRIC BLASTING CAP WIRE, BATTERY OR CLOCK FRAGMENTS SUGGESTS BOMB MAY HAVE BEEN TYPE DETONATED BY SAFETY FUSE AND BLASTING CAP, BOTH OF WHICH POSSIBLY CONSUMED BY DETONATION OF EXPLOSIVE CHARGE. BOMB BELIEVED PLACED ON OR NEXT TO LIMESTONE SILL OF A DOUBLE WINDOW NEAR NORTHEAST CORNER OF CHURCH. OUTSIDE CONCRETE STAIRWAY FROM GROUND BACK TO SECOND FLOOR OF CHURCH PARTIALLY END PAGE TWO.

PAGE THREE.

COVERED WINDOW AND BOMB COULD HAVE BEEN EASILY CONCEALED ON OR NEXT TO WINDOW SILL UNDER STAIRWAY. FORCE OF EXPLOSION DEMOLISHED STAIRWAY PROPELLING CONCRETE FRAGMENTS OF STAIRS IN ALL DIRECTIONS. U-SHAPED CRATER IN FIRM EARTH NEXT TO WINDOW SILL MEASURED APPROXIMATELY SIX FEET IN WIDTH TAPERING TO A LENGTH OF FOUR FEET AND MEASURED APPROXIMATELY TWO FEET IN DEPTH. SILL OF DOUBLE WINDOW CONSISTED OF SOLID PIECE OF LIMESTONE APPROXIMATELY EIGHT FEET IN LENGTH SHATTERED BY BLAST. LARGE PIECES LIMESTONE PROPELLED INTO LADIES LOUNGE OF WHICH DOUBLE WINDOW WAS A PART. A HOLE APPROXIMATELY SEVEN FEET SQUARE IN PARTITION AT BACK OF LADIES LOUNGE OPPOSITE DOUBLE WINDOW ALSO CAUSED BY PROPELLED BRICK AND STONE FROM BLAST. FRAME OF DOUBLE WINDOW AND GLASS PANES SHATTERED. HEAVY WIRE MESH SCREEN OVER OUTSIDE OF DOUBLE WINDOW BADLY DISTORTED AND BROKEN FROM FRAME PROPELLED INTO LADIES LOUNGE. PRINCIPAL BOMB DAMAGE TO CHURCH CONFINED TO LADIES LOUNGE AND ADJOINING REST ROOM HOWEVER, EVERY WINDOW AND EVERY ROOM IN THE CHURCH, AS WELL AS THE SUNDAY SCHOOL ASSEMBLY ROOM AND MAIN CHURCH AUDITORIUM WAS AFFECTED BY THE BLAST.

THE FUNERAL SERVICES FOR THREE OF THE FOUR CHILDREN KILLED IN
THE EXPLOSION OF THE SIXTEENTH STREET BAPTIST CHURCH TOOK PLACE
TODAY AT THE SIXTH AVENUE BAPTIST CHURCH. THE FUNERAL WAS AT THREE
THIRTY PM CST AND THE CHURCH WAS FILLED TO OVERFLOWING AND THE CROWD
OUTSIDE THE CHURCH ESTIMATED AT ABOUT FIVE THOUSAND PERSONS. IN THE
CROWD THERE WAS A GROUP OF APPROXIMATELY TWO HUNDRED FIFTY PEOPLE
FROM A NEARBY CATHOLIC CHURCH. THE GROUP FORMED AT THE CATHOLIC
CHURCH AND WENT IN PROCESSION TO THE SIXTH AVENUE BAPTIST CHURCH.
THE GROUP WAS ABOUT EQUALLY DIVIDED BETWEEN WHITE AND NEGRO PEOPLE.
THERE WERE ABOUT FIFTEEN WHITE AND NEGRO PRIESTS IN THE PROCESSION.

In connection with our inquiry into the possibility of a stolen automobile having been used in the bombing, we are checking out the circumstances of the theft of a 1958 Chevrolet on 9/9/63 at Montgomery,

Alabama, which was found burned about ten miles from Birmingham on 9/16/63 by local officers. The car, a tan coupe bearing no license plate, may have been saturated with gasoline prior to burning, according to the local officers.

Auxiliary offices which are interviewing known Klan and hate-group members and accounting for bombing suspects in their respective Divisions located and interviewed an additional 125 such individuals on 9/17/63. Although these interviews resulted in no definite information of value.

The Birmingham Office is already checking on the activities of Chambliss and several other members of the United Americans for Conservative Government, a segregation group, of which Chambliss is a high-ranking member.




The Birmingham and auxiliary offices are continuing with this extensive investigation on a continuous and preferred basis and all leads are being covered promptly.





BIRMINGHAM, ALABAMA SEPTEMBER 15, 1963 BOMBING MATTERS

Our investigation of the bombing of the Sixteenth Street Baptist Church, Birmingham, Alabama, on 9-15-63, is being pressed vigorously by the special squad of Agents who were rushed to Birmingham as well as by our other Divisions.

Interviews of known Klan and hate group members and bombing suspects are continuing on a preferred basis and approximately 110 such interviews of Klansmen and members of hate organizations, including officers of such groups, were conducted 9-20-63.

With respect to the activities of Birmingham Klansman, who on the day of the comping changed the seat covers in his car, removing a set of covers with an orange substance thought possibly to be residue from a safety fuse (wax-like), the Laboratory has determined the stain consisted of enamel chips The wires from windows, wood from window frame, rather than wax. drapery fragments and metal frame from window, scrapings from window sill obtained at the scene of the bombing were examined by the Laboratory but the examination disclosed no foreign residues or fragments pertinent to the investigation.

Twenty-nine additional individuals residing in the neighborhood of the Sixteenth Street Baptist Church, Birmingham were interviewed on the basis of which a was located as a possible witness.



Investigation to identify such a vehicle either as having been operated by a Klansman, member of hate organization, bombing suspect or other person is being pursued vigorously.

Photographs of cars, National States Rights Party Headquarters (NSRP) and persons entering NSRP Headquarters are being checked closely for possible connection with the Rambler described by







Integration of public schools, 1962 and 1963, and integration of theatres, restaurants, ball parks, motels, hotels, and other facilities has been accomplished without incident or demonstrations on the part of white individuals at Chattanooga. In fact, the elementary school covering the district where a large number of DK, KKKK, Inc., members formerly lived and some continue to live, Avandale Elementary School, previously all white, was integrated the Fall of 1963 and resulted in a ratio of about two Negroes to one white, all this completed without incident.

Of the six individuals mentioned in referenced teletype regarding Chattanoogans, who were considered at one time or other as suspects in the Bombing Matters at Chattanooga during 1960, the following information regarding each is set forth for the information of the Bureau, Birmingham, and Atlanta:


Investigation by local officers regarding theft of four cases of dynamite, E. I. Dupont Company storage magazine, Walker County, Ga., 9/18-19/63, is being conducted by Georgia officials. Liaison with these officials being handled by Atlanta Division. Liaison being maintained by Knoxville with local law enforcement agencies, Chattanooga, Tenn., regarding this matter and regarding any similar situations which might be reported.

. Under Bureau instructions regarding interviews with all Klansmen, 51 individuals have been interviewed this week, Chattanooga, Tenn., as possible members of

the DK, KKKK, Inc. Of these, 36 have admitted current membership, six additional have admitted membership, but not active and not sure if their name continues to be on the current membership rolls of DK, KKKK, Inc. Four individuals refused to answer if they were or were not members.

denied membership, and no information available to prove or disprove this, either through informants or other sources. Only two individuals known as possible members, DK, KKKK, Inc., on current basis remain uninterviewed. One of these is confined with cancer, local hospital, recovering from a recent operation and not being interviewed. The other is reportedly working out of Chattanooga, and efforts being made to obtain his current address.

The overall results of these interviews is that members, leaders, and the organization as a whole opposes violence, describes their organization as a political and religious organization, but very definitely opposed to integration; however, any action in opposition to integration to be accomplished by legal means and principally by voting. Of those who were not belligerent, they advised generally that if they had information regarding persons responsible for the bombing matter, instant case, they would report same to the FBI or to some law enforcement agency. However, almost without exception, all reported the DK, KKKK, Inc., was a secret, fraternal organization, and they would not furnish information regarding other members and activities where no violation of the law existed.

Dear Senator Dirksen:

The heartless murder of four Negro children in the bombing of a Birmingham church, is an act that threatens to leave one speechless, but one must protest, one must somehow maintain the human identity which we so precariously cling to.

In the Monday edition of the New York Times, September 16, I note that the cowardly and inhuman attack upon the 16th Street Baptist Church, is the twenty-first bombing of Negro churches and homes in the past eight years. I also note that none of the fifty bombings of Negro property since World War II in the same area, has been solved. These facts are a shocking indictment of the state of law and order in Birmingham and in Alabama. They are also, however, a pathetic commentary on the competence of the Federal Bureau of Investigation to cope with this serious threat to the rights and the very bodies of American citizens. Either the Federal Bureau of Investigation has been lax in its function, or else it is incapable of functioning in this area. It goes without saying that our laws need strengthening in the area of civil rights, and that the administration's proposed legislation should be passed by the Congress without delay. But it will also be necessary to assure the adequacy of law enforcement. The Federal Bureau of Investigation should be called upon to justify its lack of success and to give evidence of action being taken to rectify its incompetence in the area of civil rights.

I received your letter of September 20th forwarding the communication you received from Mr. Oscar B. Goodman concerning FBI investigations of bombings in Birmingham. I certainly welcome the opportunity to point out to you that Mir. Goodman's charges against the FBI are completely baseless.

Both sides in the racial issue have used the FBI's name in recent months to gain support for their respective points of view. Obviously, neither side has spoken with any authority since their statements have dealt with cases on which no public announcement has been made regarding the results of our investigations.

Our jurisdiction to investigate these bombings which have occurred in Alabama comes from the Civil Rights? Act of 1960 which became effective on May 6, 1960. It is broad in scope, but the Department of Justice has stated that Congress clearly indicated there was no intention in the statute to usurp investigative and prosecutive authority in bombing matters from state and local authorities. The Department has instructed that the FEI should not initiate investigations into such cases without special Departmental authorization.

The facts of each bombing incident have been presented immediately to the Department, and the FBI has been requested to investigate five bombing cases in Alabama, including the one on September 15th in which four children were killed. Due to the nature of the September 15th bombing, the FBI began an immediate investigation and advised the Department of the action being taken. Although the FBI does not actively investigate all bombing cases, it does cooperate in every way possible with state and local authorities. The full facilities of the FBI Laboratory and Identification Division are available to render any assistance.

In spite of these facts, we are accused of both exceeding and shirking our duties. Some of these charges stem from a fack of understanding, but many of them come from persons who have a personal interest and distort the truth to suit their own purposes.

The FBI has achieved a number of accomplishments in the civil rights field. Our investigations have enabled the Department of Justice to file more than forty suits in five states to end racial discrimination in voting. FBI Agents solved the case involving the burning of a Greyhound bus transporting "Freedom Riders" through Alabama in 1961. Six persons have been convicted for their part in this crime. An FBI investigation in September, 1962, led to the arrest and conviction in state court of four persons for burning a Negro church in Terrell County, Georgia. Byron De La Beckwith, the man charged with the murder of Medgar Evers, was also arrested by FBI Agents.

Senator Jim Eastland, Chairman of the Senate Judiciary Committee, called me at 10:30 a.m. today and wanted to know if I could come up to his office.

Upon seeing the Senator he told me that some prominent men from the State of Alabama who were in town to see the President had confided in him that the FBI knew that the

was responsible for the bombing, however, the FBI refused to make an arrest because this would embarrass the Administration. The Senator stated he knew this to be false but just wanted to hear it from us.

I asked the Senator if he had ever known the FBI to enter into such a scurrilous deal of this nature. He replied in the negative. I told him that Mr. Hoover would never be a party to any such matter and that for his information we had made no arrest in this matter, neither had we identified anyone as yet who was responsible for the bombing. I told the Senator that whenever the FBI had sufficient confirmatory evidence to procure a warrant that we would go ahead and initiate such action and let the chips fall where they may. The Senator stated he knew all of this but just wanted to talk the matter over.

The Senator and I discussed a number of things regarding Commissioner George Edwards who is attempting to be a Federal Judge. Edwards will appear before the Senate Judiciary Committee within several days. Senator Eastland plans to give him a hard time. The Senator also told me that the Scripps-Howard newspapers are going to launch a campaign against Edwards.

Evidenced by the mail I am receiving concerning the church bombing in Birmingham, there appears to be considerable confusion in the public mind about the role which the Federal government is playing in Alabama.

I believe existing law empowers Federal intervention to a degree by making it a Federal crime to cross a state line in order to escape prosecution resulting from a crime such as a church bombing. Does the FBI use this provision as a basis for Federal investigation of such a crime? Is the FBI currently active in investigating the Birmingham church bombing as a help to state and local law enforcement agen-Your advice on these points and any other information you wish to give me will be extremely helpful in explaining the situation to my constituents many of whom now feel that the Federal government will not or cannot take steps to intervene in a situation such as now exists in Birmingham.

My dear Congressman:

I have received your letter of September 25th in which you inquire about the role of the FBI in civil rights matters in Alabama.

Our investigations of bombing cases are based on the jurisdiction given us under the provisions of the Civil Rights Act of 1960. The Honorable A. Willis Robertson placed a letter I wrote him on this topic in the "Congressional Record" on September 25, 1963. A copy is enclosed for your ready reference.

The FBI also aids local law enforcement by apprehending felons who have fled interstate to avoid prosecution, custody or confinement. We enter these cases under the Fugitive Felon Act at the request of local authorities who have legal process for the arrest of the fugitive. There must be an indication that the fugitive has fled the state where he is charged with the felony and the United States Attorney must authorize a Federal warrant.

I am sending a newspaper article and some literature I trust you will find pertinent to your inquiries.

UNKNOWN SUBJECTS; Bombing of the Gaston Motel, Birmingham, Alabama, May 11, 1963 BOMBING MATTERS Bufile 157-881 Birmingham file 157-241

An explosion occurred at the A. G. Gaston Motel, 1510 5th avenue, North, Birmingham, Alabama, at 11:58 p.m., May 11, 1963. Crime scene revealed that a charge of high explosive, such as dynamite, was detonated near the west brick wall of the motel, leaving a large hole in the brick wall and damaging house trailers on an adjoining lot. One eye witness claims to have seen two white males in a 1960 hard top white over blue Buick and stated passenger behind driver hurled package from such car toward the motel. another witness describes a 1961 white over blue Buick with three white males passing motel, going west, shortly before bombing. Extensive investigation to date has not developed positive information re perpetrators, This motel is located within a block and a half of the 16th Street Baptist Church, and is owned by a wealthy and prominent Negro businessman.

> UNKNOWN SUBJECTS; Bombing of the Residence of Reverend A. D. W. KING, Birmingham, Alabama, May 11, 1963 BOMBING MATTERS Bufile 157-881 Birmingham file 157-244

Two explosions occurred at the residence of Reverend A. D. W. KING, 721 12th Street, Ensley Section, Birmingham, Alabama, at approximately 11 p.m., May 11, 1963. The first explosion was detonated at a spot approximately three feet from the sidewalk and about twenty-five feet from the front of the KING residence. The second explosion, which occurred one to three minuses afterward, was detonated near the front of the house. FBI Laboratory examination concluded dynamite was used as the explicite. Intensite neighborhood investigation

failed to develop eye witnesses to dynamiting or any description of automobile. KING is brother of MARTIN LUTHER KING, well-known Negro integration leader.

UNKNOWN SUBJECTS; Bombing of Residence of ARTHUR SHORES, 1021 Center Street, North, Birmingham, Alabama, Night of August 20, 1963
BOMBING MATTERS
Bufile 157-979
Birmingham file 157-331

About 9:26 p.m., August 20, 1963, the residence of ARTHUR SHORES, a prominent Negro attorney who has handled civil rights matters in Birmingham area in the past, 1021 Center Street, North, Birmingham, Alabama, located in an area now popularly known as "Dynamite Hill," was damaged by an explosion believed to have been caused by dynamite. SHORES was home alone at the time and was not injured. No threats were received prior to explosion, which occurred at the southwest corner of the house, where the garage, which is part of the house, is located. A crowd of about 1,000 Negroes gathered and hurled stones at Birmingham Police Department officers attempting to control them and preserve the crime scene. Several police officers received injuries from stones and several Police Department tires were slashed. Order was restored about 1 a.m., August 21, 1963, after numerous shots had been fired over the heads of the crowd. Reward of over \$10,000 available. No suspects developed to date.

UNKNOWN SUBJECTS; Bombing of Residence of ARTHUR SHORES, 1021 Center Street, North, Birmingham, Alabama, September 4, 1963 BOMBING MATTERS Bufile 157-1011 Birmingham file 157-339

About 9:36 p.m., September 4, 1963, the SHORES residence was again damaged by an explosion believed to have from the sidewalk and about twenty-five feet from the front of the KING residence. The second explosion, which occurred one to three minuses afterward, was detonated near the front of the house. FBI Laboratory examination concluded dynamite was used as the explosive. Intensise neighborhood investigations

sticks in intensity. Mrs. SHORES was slightly injured as she was asleep in the bedroom located nearest to the point of the explosion. A large crowd again gathered. Rocks were thrown at police and gun fire was heard emanating from this crowd. Police returned fire and the crowd was eventually dispersed. One Negro was killed by Police Department officers when he came running from his house shooting a gun at them. Crime scene search conducted by Police Department and carbonaceous smears noted on dirt from perimeter of explosion, although no conclusions as to the type of explosive used definitely made. No definite suspects developed.

UNKNOWN SUBJECTS; Bombing of 16th Street Baptist Church, Birmingham, Alabama, September 15, 1963
BOMBING MATTERS
Bufile 157-1025
Birmingham file 157-352

At 10:19 a.m., on September 15, 1963, there was an explosion, generally believed to have been caused by ten or more sticks of dynamite, at the 16th Street Baptist Church, Birmingham, Alabama (Negro), taking the lives of four children, who were among approximately 100-125 people in attendance at Sunday School. Twenty or more persons were injured. The church is located at the corner of 6th Avenue and 16th Street, North, near the downtown section of the city. The point of impact was outside the church, a brick building, on the 16th Street side under some concrete steps and against the wall. Damage to the church building was estimated to be \$30,000-\$40,000 and undetermined amount of damage to surrounding buildings.

This church had been a meeting place in the past for racial demonstrators. This bombing, one of a series in the recent past in Birmingham, is possibly attributable to racial extremists.

The crime scene search has failed to develop evidence indicating that the explosion was detonated by any specific type of detonator. It is unknown at this point whether a fuse or a timing mechanism was used.

Birmingham newspapers on September 18, 1963, state that a fund for rewards in this case has reached \$76,000.

UNKNOWN SUBJECTS; Explosion at 1601 Center Street, South, Birmingham, Alabama, September 25, 1963 BOMBING MATTERS Birmingham file 157-407

About 1:30 a.m., September 25, 1963, persons in the vicinity of 1601 Center Street, South, a well maintained Negro neighborhood of medium priced homes, reported an explosion to the Police Department. At 1:45 a.m., a second explosion of greater intensity, possibly several sticks of dynamite, occurred at the corner adjacent to the captioned address. This second explosion shattered a telephone pole, blew a small crater in the curbing and showered the neighborhood with high oxidized nuts, bolts and other metal fragments, which caused extensive shrapnel damage to surrounding property but no injuries. Laboratory reports dynamite residues on fragments. First explosion believed to have occurred within ten feet of the second and was believed to be lure to cause neighbors and police to be injured by the second blast.

Intensive investigation of all of the above bombings by Police Department, Sheriff's Office and FBI has failed to develop positive information identifying the perpetrators.







Indications were that Chambliss was taken to the city jail at Midfield, Alabama, on the outskirts of Birmingham, but subsequent information disclosed that he had been taken to the AHP station in Midfield.

At 12:50 a.m. CST. 9/30/63 information was received that a second man had been arrested by the AHP and he was also taken to the AHP station in Midfield, Radio reports in Birmingham, attributed to the Governor's office, indicated that two white men were arrested in connection with the church bombing but their identities were being withheld "in the interests of continuing investigation." Efforts to identify the second man arrested through the AHP at Midfield were made by the Birmingham Office but the AHP refused to give out any information. The Birmingham Office asked to speak to Colonel Lingo and was told he was not available. It was learned through other sources that the second man was Charles Arnie Cagle.



Information was also received by Birmingham that other individuals are presently being questioned by the AHP at Midfield.

On September 29, 1963, I was advised that the office of Governor George Wallace of Alabama had released a statement to the press at 8:30 p.m., Central Standard. I talked with SAC Roy Moore, at Birmingham, this morning, to ascertain whether there were any new developments.

He told me that he feels that this situation will probably backfire on the state authorities for having picked up Chambliss and This appears to be true for as yet no charges have been file against either and they are being held on an open charge of investig tion.

He pointed out that yesterday Robert Shelton of the Klan had been riding around in a state police car most of the day. Shelton is outspoken in his support of Governor Wallace and is the most voca of the Klan leaders in the area.

SAC Moore is of the opinion that the state authorities obviously knew that we had been putting tremendous pressure on the Chambliss group. Obviously the word got back to Shelton's crowd and they apparently felt they had to jump in and beat the Federal authorities to it by taking some action.

It is possible that this will backfire and that these people may be subjected to a law suit. Moore indicated that Chambliss used to work for the city and he was with them for about 8 years in the transportation department and knows -enough about the law to know th he has a right to demand to know the charges which are outstanding against him, if any. SAC Moore, in spite of the above, is not changing his positi-We are going forward with our interviews, keeping the pressure on 63 and trying to create as much conflict as we can among the group that we have under investigation.

I talked with SAC Roy Moore who advised me that yesterday. Shelton rode around with the State Police most of the day. It is Moore's opinion that Luna, the investigator for the Klan, obviously talked with Hall and Cash and others who were told of the pressure being put on by the FBI. Luna obviously got in touch with Shelton concerning this and, in turn, this information was given to Posey, the investigator for the State of Alabama (Alabama Highway Patrol). It appears this may be the basis for the procedure followed by the Alabama Highway Patrol in trying to jump the gun and pick up these persons with the hope that they might have gotten a confession. So far it does not appear they have been successful because both Chambliss and Cagle are being held on open charges by the Birmingham Police Department for the Alabama Highway Patrol.

While talking with Moore I pointed to the teletypes sent to Birmingham concerning the examination of the evidence which was submitted as having come from the crime scene search at the explosion at 16th and Center Street on September 25, 1963. I called attention to the piece of coathanger cut with a pinching tool such as a diagonal cutting pliers or electricians pliers; also, the other items which might be susceptible of identification. Moore indicates that he is aware of this and they are pressing every possibility to come up with this, particularly one part which they felt came from a Hudson automobile and might have some bearing on the possibility of further identification.

With reference to the trip which Chambliss took to Florida, this was a regular run. He delivered parts which had been previously sold by salesmen. Nothing of significance was developed although we had him under surveillance.


Memo to McGowan from Rosen

The report concerning the Hercules Powder Company having sold some dynamite on August 23, to a "redneck" concerning whom a license number was obtained has been washed out. The individual was identified and eliminated, according to Moore.

There was no meeting of the United Americans for Conservative Government (Chambliss' outfit) yesterday. Not a car appeared in the open area along the river where they meet. Moore indicated, however, that the technical equipment which they tested out worked excellently. They were able to communicate with Agents who were in the woods with good fidelity at distances up to one mile. The Agents had on one of the portable transmitting and receiving sets which are carried on the body.

Yesterday Birmingham had the second of the office for two or three hours. They came in voluntarily. Saturday night they had Chamblis in. Obviously this would become known after they left the office. We will continue to put the pressure on these people and talk with them repeatedly as we have in the past.

Concerning the surveys which are being made, Roy Moore advises there is a real problem because it appears that the telephone company is getting numerous reports from all of the neighbors and friends of this group (Chambliss, et al), which has resulted in the telephone company having to check out suspicious persons in the area. One individual was caught climbing a pole and it developed he had nothing to do with any attempt to put in any device. Moore pointed this out to show the attitude of the local people and indicated that with Chambliss and the rest being as conscious as they are they were going to move a little slowly in recommending any coverage; however, they would continue to survey the situation.

In July, 1955, Chambliss was reportedly present at a cross burning and public speaking at Fort Oglethorpe, Georgia.

In 1956 the "Birmingham News" had an article which stated that Robert E. Chambliss had distributed reprints from "The Daily Worker" and other leaflets tending to inflame racial prejudice at the University of Alabama.

In October, 1957, information was received that Robert E. Chambliss was elected Exalted Cyclops of the Alabama Knights of the Ku Klux Klan.

Memorandum to Mr. Rosen RE: BAPBOMB

In July, 1958, Public Safety Commissioner Eugene "Bull" Connor advised that "Dynamite" Chambliss was arrested in connection with the bombing in North Birmingham on 7/17/58 but was released.

In October, 1958, Chambliss was interviewed concerning the bombing of the Clinton, Tennessee, High School on 10/5/58 and the bombing of the Jewish Temple, Atlanta, Georgia, on 10/12/58. Chambliss denied participation and stated he no longer belonged to the Ku Klux Klan or any similar group. He admitted that if Negroes tried to integrate his community, he himself would take care of the situation.

Chambliss on 10/13/58, upon interview, indicated that he had severed his Klan connections due to ill health and his dissatisfaction arising from the arrests of three men in connection with the July dynamiting in the Fountain Heights residential area of Birmingham.

The files of the Birmingham Office indicate that Chambliss has been frequently a suspect in connection with dynamiting of Negro residences in Birmingham in the past and has voiced threats of violence against Negroes and Jews. Birmingham Police Department has questioned him on practically all bombings of Negro residences in Birmingham but has never obtained definite proof connecting him with such acts.

In 1961 Chambliss was deleted from the potential bombing suspect list of the Birmingham Office since investigation of several bombings failed to indicate that Chambliss was involved in any of them. Established sources accounted for his whereabouts on all occasions.

During an interview on 5/21/63 Chambliss of 2505 32nd Avenue, North, Birmingham, Alabama, advised that it was none of the FBI's business as to his whereabouts on Saturday, 5/11/63 (the date of the bombing of the Gaston Motel and the residence of A.D. W. King.). He stated he knew where he was on that evening and it was "up to the FBI to find out." He denied participation in the bombings and indicated that if he did possess any information he would not furnish such information to the FBI.

Some Rumors Exploded

Because of rumors that Negroes caused the bombing of the 16th Street Baptist Church last Sunday the United States Attorney felt it necessary yesterday to issue a public statement.

The statement said all agencies investigating the nombing—the FBI, the Sheriff of Jefferson County and city police are agreed that the bomb, "a high-order explosive," was placed underneath of the church. The four children who were killed were inside the ground-level basement of the building near the steps.

The announcement was not news. The concrete steps, which reached from the sidewalk to a first-floor back entrance, were cleanly removed from the side of the building by explosion and deemolished. From the first, police have assumed the bomb was placed -not thrown from a carbeweath these outside steps.

The announcement con-

sinued with another unnewsworthy item:

No evidence has been uncovered to date indicating the identity of the person or persons responsible for the bombing. But, the statement said, "the public can rest assured that when his identity is uncovered, regardless of who he may be, it will be made public."

These rumors are similar to others under way even before Sunday's bombing. They gained strength from a remark Gov. George C. Wallace made last week to the effect that the Justice Department could not be trusted to make public anything about previous bombings that might embarrass civil-righters.

The spread of the rumors indicates no mistrust in the FBI. Instead, it indicates monumental mistrust of the chief of the Justice Department, Robert F. Kennedy, whose name is anathema in much of Alabama.

However, Mr. Kennedy's statements on Birmingham, which were carried here on television Thursday morning, were so tempered that they were joyfully received by the city administration. Mr. Kennedy said he didn't think Federal troops were necessary here. He added that he doubted anything could be secomplished by saying, "Everyone's going to get along or we'll prick you with a bayonet."

The tone of his remarks made it easier for Mayor Albert Boutwell later in the day to ask the Attorney General's brother, the President, to receive an official white delegation from Birmingham. In Birmingham, it is an act of political daring to seek direct communication with a Kennedy.

The Mayor's delegation will tell the President on Monday the city administration's side of the story in an effort to balance some of the views expressed to the President Thursday by seven Negro leaders headed by the Rev. Dr. Martin, Luther King jr.

Meanwhile, leaders of both

races appeared willing to epoperate with the two-man task force being sent here by President Kennedy—Kenneth C. Royal and Earl "Red" Blaik. They voiced the opinion that the two will have to concern themselves with Birmingham's economic problems, not just the outward signs of racial conflict.

The basis of the discontent of Negroes "is their lack of participation in the mainstream of the city's economy," said Arthur Shores, Negro attorney whose home has been bombed twice.

W. C. Hamilton, executive secretary to the Mayor, agreed that the basis is economic, but discounted the implication of discrimination. He put it this way: "There is a wide lack of opportunity for both Negroes and whites, particularly in unskilled jobs."

Also citing the economic aspect of the conflict was the Most. Rev. Thomas J. Toolen, Archbishop of the Mobile-Birmingham Diocese. In a pastoral letter that will be rad tomorrow from all Catholic pulpits in Alabamp and northwest Florida, he said:

"We see the fair city of Birmingham slowly being destroyed. For neither business nor industry will come into a city in which there is so much hatred and destruction."

As for the church-bombing, he said: "It is difficult to understand how a civilized human being could have in his heart such hatred."

Attendance at the three Cesegregated schools continued to rise yesterday, but Mrs. Ray McFall, a leader of the private school movement, said this "does not mean we're schmitting defeat." She added: "This is a temporary will we get our private school set up."

MEMORANDUM FOR THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

With reference to the two arrests by the Alabama Highway Patrol yesterday in alleged connection with the recent bombing of the Negro church in Alabama, I wanted to bring to your attention certain observations concerning this matter.

The Alabama Highway Patrol arrested Robert E. Chambliss and Charles Arnie Cagle. They have not filed any charges against them and they are being held for investigation. I am reliably informed that the Alabama Highway Patrol has very little substantial evidence against these two individuals.

These two individuals have been among the principal suspects in the bombings which have occurred in Birmingham. We have interviewed them and their associates a number of times and have also given lie detector tests to them. They have admitted in our interrogations that they had been in possession of dynamite but beyond that they would make no statement. By reason of our intensive investigation of Chambliss, Cagle and their associates it has become generally known that the FBI was pressing vigorously its investigation of this particular group which has had active connection with the United Americans for Conservative Government. Chambliss himself in the past has been a member of the Ku Klux Klan. The question naturally arises as to why this Bureau was not advised by the Alabama Highway Patrol of the contemplated action in arresting Chambliss and Cagle. Ey doing so they have certainly "flushed" the case and I doubt that they will be able to hold these two men beyond the seventy-two hours allowed for detention for investigation.

As has been indicated to me on a number of occasions, there is a strong feeling upon the part of the Negro elements in the South that they cannot work with ar report to the FBI and information because of our conrad cooperation with the local actnodities. told, that such close cooperation prejudices the FBI and results in no results being obtained. That, of course, is an absolute fallacy for we have obtained results in a number of church bombings and other civil rights violations.

However, in order to minimize as much as possible the unwarranted criticism which the FBI has received, we have over the last year refrained from close contacts or connection with the local authorities. This I have regretted because a gulf has gradually developed and we are not kept informed as we have been in the past of actions contemplated and developments in cases handled by the local authorities. In the late twenties and early thirties there was great reluctance upon the part of the local authorities to cooperate with the FBI and it took us several years before we could break down this reluctance, but we finally did so and from that time until within the last year we have had the closest cooperation from the local authorities in all matters including civil rights. That cooperation has now practically ended by reason of our refraining from dealing with the local authorities. I personally do not approve of this policy because I think law enforcement should work as a team, and the mere fact that we have had in the past cordial relationships with local authorities did not mean that we favored them if they violated any Federal statute. As a matter of fact, our record shows that we have vigorously investigated and successfully prosecuted local authorities when Federal laws have been violated.

Another aspect of this matter which I think should be drawn to your attention has been the constant complaint made by the Negro elements in the South that there was no use to report matters to the FBI because all of our Agents in the South were Southerners. This complaint was untrue. Martin Luther King several months ago made a speech in which he claimed that all of our Agents in Albany, Georgia, where there had been violent racial demonstrations, were born in the deep South and Negroes should not report matters to that office. We have five Agents at Albany, Georgia, and I checked into the matter and found that four of the five had been born in northern states and that only one had been born in what could be called the deep South. I made an effort to effect an appointment with Martin Luther King so as to correct his impression, assuming he had been misinformed, but he refused to make an appointment so I, therefore, have to conclude that he was deliberately lying when he made the statement he did. Nevertheless the effect of his statement in the South and the statements of other Negro leaders has resulted in the impression that practically all of our southern offices are manned by Agents who were born in the South.

Memorandum for the Attorney General

This is likewise untrue but, in order to minimize the criticism as much as possible, I initiated the program a year ago transferring southern-born Agents from southern offices and replacing them with northern-born Agents. I did not think that this was a wise action to take but I took it in order that the criticism which has arisen against the Bureau in its work in the civil rights field might to some degree be minimized.

Now the climax seems to have finally been reached because last week in conferences with Blaik and Royall the Negro leaders in Birmingham claimed that they could not put any reliability in the FBI because the northern Agents who have been assigned to southern offices have married or are marrying girls born in the South. I certainly do not intend to issue any orders forbidding any Agent in this service to marry a girl irrespective of where she may be born, I think the limit of palliation and appeasement has been reached. The Bureau has and intends to continue to vigorously investigate any violations of the civil rights statutes which are authorized by the Department. You, no doubt, have noted that in the newspapers in the last week quite a number of Negro leaders have referred to the fact that there have been forty-six bombings in Alabama and none has been solved by the FBI. This again is a falsehood. Under the procedure set up by the Department we must submit to the Civil Rights Division a report on any bombing which takes place and the Civil Rights Division then determines whether the FBI should initiate a full and thorough investigation. Out of the forty-six bombings which have taken place in Alabama the Bureau has been authorized to investigate only five by the Civil Rights Division.

Because of the contention of the Civil Rights Division, and I think a very sound one, that the law as passed by Congress which raises a presumption that the explosive used in a bombing has been transported interstate does not relieve the local or state authorities from active investigations of such bombings, in instances where there is even a substantial indication that the explosives have been transported interstate the Department has authorized full investigations and the Bureau has made them.

I wanted to set forth my views concerning this matter because there is becoming more and more misunderstanding about just what the FBI's authority is and what it does and the reason why it does it.

Memorandum for the Attorney General

I do not believe that even within the Department the situation is fully understood. A week ago a newspaper reporter was furnished by the Department with the report concerning the forty-six bombings and the fact that the FBI had solved none. It was not pointed out to that reporter that the FBI had been authorized to investigate only five of the forty-six bombings so, as the article was written, it very improperly gave the impression that the FBI was dragging its heels in actively investigating the bombings in Alabama.

The individuals picked up by the Alabama Highway Patrol (AHP) on the night of 9/29/63 and early morning 9/30/63 for interrogation following the arrests of Robert E Chambliss and Charles Arnie Cagle in connection with the Birmingham bombings were released during the early morning hours of 9/30/63 Chambliss and Cagle are still in custody at the city jail in Those released included John Wesley Hall and Levil Yarborough. 

Memorandum to Mr. Belmont

Chambliss and Cagle have indicated they are quite concerned about the arrests and have consulted with an attorney regarding having them released on writs of habeas corpus. Indications are the attorney was prevailed upon to withhold such action until the morning of 10/1/63. According to sources of the Birmingham Office the only charge conceivable that could be brought against Chambliss and Cagle at this time is a state charge of illegal transportation of dynamite, a misdemeanor punishable by a \$300 fine. The source stated that it is doubtful that this charge could be sustained in court.

Reliable news media sources have informed the Birmingham Office that they are poised editorially to take the AHP and the Governor apart and that the 'man in the street' is presently asking embarrassing questions and feels that he has been duped by the Governor and AHP.

In addition to the intensive investigation which is continuing concerning the Chambliss group other phases of this investigation are also receiving close attention. Additional members of the victim church and persons located in the neighborhood of the church were interviewed 9/30/63.

SEPTEMBER 15, 1963 **BOMBING MATTERS** The Attorney General called shortly after 8 o clock this morning and asked about developments in this case in Birmingham, particularly the reports that the State Police had arrested two individuals. He was informed that we had been keeping Assistant Attorney General Burke Marshall of the Civil Rights Division informed during the night as to these developments. He was furnished the same information that had been given earlier to Mr. Marshall, which satisfied him, and he asked to be apprised as to any further information developed. After his arrival at the office, the Attorney General was contacted personally. He was informed that as a result of the constant complaining by the integration groups about our Agents working with the local authorities in the South, we have had to withdraw in this regard so that we don't get information as to their plans as we have in the past: that there had been a time in the past when the local authorities did not trust or work with Federal Agencies, but that by concerted effort over the years we had overcome this insofar as the FBI is concerned, and had built up a close association, and we knew what action the local authorities were taking. Because of the criticism that FBI Agents have been too close to the police in the South, we have had to back off, and as a result have lost our contacts. It was further brought to the Attorney General's attention that we had been replacing southern-born Agents assigned to that area with Agents born and reared in the North. Now the Negro leaders have cast aspersions on these northern Agents because some of them have married

southern girls and this allegedly brings the Agents too close to the South
