

At 11:56 p.m. SAC Earl Dalness advised that the sources close to the Governor in the Alabama Department of Public Safety both of whom are investigators in the Investigative and Identification Division of this department and both members of the National Academy were presently working this case in Birmingham and attempts to reach them by phone at their known places of lodging had been unsuccessful. 



Indications were that Chambliss was taken to the city jail at Midfield, Alabama, on the outskirts of Birmingham, but subsequent information disclosed that he had been taken to the AHP station in Midfield.

At 12:50 a.m. CST. 9/30/63 information was received that a second man had been arrested by the AHP and he was also taken to the AHP station in Midfield, Radio reports in Birmingham, attributed to the Governor's office, indicated that two white men were arrested in connection with the church bombing but their identities were being withheld "in the interests of continuing investigation." Efforts to identify the second man arrested through the AHP at Midfield were made by the Birmingham Office but the AHP refused to give out any information. The Birmingham Office asked to speak to Colonel Lingo and was told he was not available. It was learned through other sources that the second man was Charles Arnie Cagle.



Information was also received by Birmingham that other individuals are presently being questioned by the AHP at Midfield.

At 11:10 p.m., CST, an investigator for the Alabama Highway Patrol was observed placing Robert E. Chambliss under arrest. At 12:50 a.m., CST, September 30, 1nformation was received that a second man; Charles Arnie Cagle, was arrested by the Alabama Highway Patrol. Both men were reportedly taken to the Alabama Highway Patrol station at Midfield, Alabama, on the outskirts of Birmingham. Radio reports attributed to the Governor's office indicated only that two white men had been arrested in connection with the church bombing, but their identities were being withheld in the interests of continuing investigation. The Alabama Highway Patrol declined to furnish any information concerning the arrests or the identities of the two men.

BOMBING MATTERS

I talked with SAC Roy Moore, at Birmingham, this morning, to ascertain whether there were any new developments.

He told me that he feels that this situation will probably backfire on the state authorities for having picked up Chambliss and This appears to be true for as yet no charges have been file against either and they are being held on an open charge of investig tion.

He pointed out that yesterday Robert Shelton of the Klan had been riding around in a state police car most of the day. Shelton is outspoken in his support of Governor Wallace and is the most voca of the Klan leaders in the area.

SAC Moore is of the opinion that the state authorities obviously knew that we had been putting tremendous pressure on the Chambliss group. Obviously the word got back to Shelton's crowd and they apparently felt they had to jump in and beat the Federal authorities to it by taking some action.

It is possible that this will backfire and that these people may be subjected to a law suit. Moore indicated that Chambliss used to work for the city and he was with them for about 8 years in the transportation department and knows -enough about the law to know th he has a right to demand to know the charges which are outstanding against him, if any. SAC Moore, in spite of the above, is not changing his positi-We are going forward with our interviews, keeping the pressure on 63 and trying to create as much conflict as we can among the group that we have under investigation.

I talked with SAC Roy Moore who advised me that yesterday. Shelton rode around with the State Police most of the day. It is Moore's opinion that Luna, the investigator for the Klan, obviously talked with Hall and Cash and others who were told of the pressure being put on by the FBI. Luna obviously got in touch with Shelton concerning this and, in turn, this information was given to Posey, the investigator for the State of Alabama (Alabama Highway Patrol). It appears this may be the basis for the procedure followed by the Alabama Highway Patrol in trying to jump the gun and pick up these persons with the hope that they might have gotten a confession. So far it does not appear they have been successful because both Chambliss and Cagle are being held on open charges by the Birmingham Police Department for the Alabama Highway Patrol.

While talking with Moore I pointed to the teletypes sent to Birmingham concerning the examination of the evidence which was submitted as having come from the crime scene search at the explosion at 16th and Center Street on September 25, 1963. I called attention to the piece of coathanger cut with a pinching tool such as a diagonal cutting pliers or electricians pliers; also, the other items which might be susceptible of identification. Moore indicates that he is aware of this and they are pressing every possibility to come up with this, particularly one part which they felt came from a Hudson automobile and might have some bearing on the possibility of further identification.

With reference to the trip which Chambliss took to Florida, this was a regular run. He delivered parts which had been previously sold by salesmen. Nothing of significance was developed although we had him under surveillance.


#### Memo to McGowan from Rosen

The report concerning the Hercules Powder Company having sold some dynamite on August 23, to a "redneck" concerning whom a license number was obtained has been washed out. The individual was identified and eliminated, according to Moore.

There was no meeting of the United Americans for Conservative Government (Chambliss' outfit) yesterday. Not a car appeared in the open area along the river where they meet. Moore indicated, however, that the technical equipment which they tested out worked excellently. They were able to communicate with Agents who were in the woods with good fidelity at distances up to one mile. The Agents had on one of the portable transmitting and receiving sets which are carried on the body.

Yesterday Birmingham had the second of the office for two or three hours. They came in voluntarily. Saturday night they had Chamblis in. Obviously this would become known after they left the office. We will continue to put the pressure on these people and talk with them repeatedly as we have in the past.

Concerning the surveys which are being made, Roy Moore advises there is a real problem because it appears that the telephone company is getting numerous reports from all of the neighbors and friends of this group (Chambliss, et al), which has resulted in the telephone company having to check out suspicious persons in the area. One individual was caught climbing a pole and it developed he had nothing to do with any attempt to put in any device. Moore pointed this out to show the attitude of the local people and indicated that with Chambliss and the rest being as conscious as they are they were going to move a little slowly in recommending any coverage; however, they would continue to survey the situation.

In July, 1955, Chambliss was reportedly present at a cross burning and public speaking at Fort Oglethorpe, Georgia.

In 1956 the "Birmingham News" had an article which stated that Robert E. Chambliss had distributed reprints from "The Daily Worker" and other leaflets tending to inflame racial prejudice at the University of Alabama.

In October, 1957, information was received that Robert E. Chambliss was elected Exalted Cyclops of the Alabama Knights of the Ku Klux Klan.

Memorandum to Mr. Rosen RE: BAPBOMB

In July, 1958, Public Safety Commissioner Eugene "Bull" Connor advised that "Dynamite" Chambliss was arrested in connection with the bombing in North Birmingham on 7/17/58 but was released.

In October, 1958, Chambliss was interviewed concerning the bombing of the Clinton, Tennessee, High School on 10/5/58 and the bombing of the Jewish Temple, Atlanta, Georgia, on 10/12/58. Chambliss denied participation and stated he no longer belonged to the Ku Klux Klan or any similar group. He admitted that if Negroes tried to integrate his community, he himself would take care of the situation.

Chambliss on 10/13/58, upon interview, indicated that he had severed his Klan connections due to ill health and his dissatisfaction arising from the arrests of three men in connection with the July dynamiting in the Fountain Heights residential area of Birmingham.

The files of the Birmingham Office indicate that Chambliss has been frequently a suspect in connection with dynamiting of Negro residences in Birmingham in the past and has voiced threats of violence against Negroes and Jews. Birmingham Police Department has questioned him on practically all bombings of Negro residences in Birmingham but has never obtained definite proof connecting him with such acts.

In 1961 Chambliss was deleted from the potential bombing suspect list of the Birmingham Office since investigation of several bombings failed to indicate that Chambliss was involved in any of them. Established sources accounted for his whereabouts on all occasions.

During an interview on 5/21/63 Chambliss of 2505 32nd Avenue, North, Birmingham, Alabama, advised that it was none of the FBI's business as to his whereabouts on Saturday, 5/11/63 (the date of the bombing of the Gaston Motel and the residence of A.D. W. King.). He stated he knew where he was on that evening and it was "up to the FBI to find out." He denied participation in the bombings and indicated that if he did possess any information he would not furnish such information to the FBI.

# Some Rumors Exploded

By William G. Wing Of The Herald Tribune Staff BIRMINGHAM.

Because of rumors that Negroes caused the bombing of the 16th Street Baptist Church last Sunday the United States Attorney felt it necessary yesterday to issue a public statement.

The statement said all agencies investigating the nombing—the FBI, the Sheriff of Jefferson County and city police are agreed that the bomb, "a high-order explosive," was placed underneath of the church. The four children who were killed were inside the ground-level basement of the building near the steps.

The announcement was not news. The concrete steps, which reached from the sidewalk to a first-floor back entrance, were cleanly removed from the side of the building by explosion and deemolished. From the first, police have assumed the bomb was placed -not thrown from a carbeweath these outside steps.

The announcement con-

sinued with another unnewsworthy item:

No evidence has been uncovered to date indicating the identity of the person or persons responsible for the bombing. But, the statement said, "the public can rest assured that when his identity is uncovered, regardless of who he may be, it will be made public."

Macon L. Weaver, Attorney for the Northern District of Alabama, said his announce-ment was made "to dispel certain false and misleading rumors concerning the bombing "

partment is trying to cover up any clues to the crime that may damage the Negro cause.

These rumors are similar to others under way even before Sunday's bombing. They gained strength from a remark Gov. George C. Wallace made last week to the effect that the Justice Department could not be trusted to make public anything about previous bombings that might embarrass civil-righters.

The spread of the rumors indicates no mistrust in the FBI. Instead, it indicates monumental mistrust of the chief of the Justice Department, Robert F. Kennedy, whose name is anathema in much of Alabama.

However, Mr. Kennedy's statements on Birmingham, which were carried here on television Thursday morning, were so tempered that they were joyfully received by the city administration. Mr. Kennedy said he didn't think Federal troops were necessary here. He added that he doubted anything could be secomplished by saying, "Everyone's going to get along or we'll prick you with a bayonet."

The tone of his remarks made it easier for Mayor Albert Boutwell later in the day to ask the Attorney General's brother, the President, to receive an official white delegation from Birmingham. In Birmingham, it is an act of political daring to seek direct communication with a Kennedy.

The Mayor's delegation will tell the President on Monday the city administration's side of the story in an effort to balance some of the views expressed to the President Thursday by seven Negro leaders headed by the Rev. Dr. Martin, Luther King jr.

Meanwhile, leaders of both

races appeared willing to epoperate with the two-man task force being sent here by President Kennedy—Kenneth C. Royal and Earl "Red" Blaik. They voiced the opinion that the two will have to concern themselves with Birmingham's economic problems, not just the outward signs of racial conflict.

The basis of the discontent of Negroes "is their lack of participation in the mainstream of the city's economy," said Arthur Shores, Negro attorney whose home has been bombed twice.

W. C. Hamilton, executive secretary to the Mayor, agreed that the basis is economic, but discounted the implication of discrimination. He put it this way: "There is a wide lack of opportunity for both Negroes and whites, particularly in unskilled jobs."

Also citing the economic aspect of the conflict was the Most. Rev. Thomas J. Toolen, Archbishop of the Mobile-Birmingham Diocese. In a pastoral letter that will be rad tomorrow from all Catholic pulpits in Alabamp and northwest Florida, he said:

"We see the fair city of Birmingham slowly being destroyed. For neither business nor industry will come into a city in which there is so much hatred and destruction."

As for the church-bombing, he said: "It is difficult to understand how a civilized human being could have in his heart such hatred."

Attendance at the three Cesegregated schools continued to rise yesterday, but Mrs. Ray McFall, a leader of the private school movement, said this "does not mean we're schmitting defeat." She added: "This is a temporary will we get our private school set up."

Robert E Chambliss told officers of the AHP he had purchased a case of dynamite on 9/15/63 at Navels (phonetic) Hardware Store near Brookside, Alabama. Investigation by the Birmingham Office in Brookside disclosed no such store and no stores selling dynamite. It was determined, however, that Negron's Appliance and General Merchandise Store at nearby Blossburg, Alabama, does sell dynamite. Brookside and Blossburg are on the outskirts of Birmingham.

### MEMORANDUM FOR THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

With reference to the two arrests by the Alabama Highway Patrol yesterday in alleged connection with the recent bombing of the Negro church in Alabama, I wanted to bring to your attention certain observations concerning this matter.

The Alabama Highway Patrol arrested Robert E. Chambliss and Charles Arnie Cagle. They have not filed any charges against them and they are being held for investigation. I am reliably informed that the Alabama Highway Patrol has very little substantial evidence against these two individuals.

These two individuals have been among the principal suspects in the bombings which have occurred in Birmingham. We have interviewed them and their associates a number of times and have also given lie detector tests to them. They have admitted in our interrogations that they had been in possession of dynamite but beyond that they would make no statement. By reason of our intensive investigation of Chambliss, Cagle and their associates it has become generally known that the FBI was pressing vigorously its investigation of this particular group which has had active connection with the United Americans for Conservative Government. Chambliss himself in the past has been a member of the Ku Klux Klan. The question naturally arises as to why this Bureau was not advised by the Alabama Highway Patrol of the contemplated action in arresting Chambliss and Cagle. Ey doing so they have certainly "flushed" the case and I doubt that they will be able to hold these two men beyond the seventy-two hours allowed for detention for investigation.

As has been indicated to me on a number of occasions, there is a strong feeling upon the part of the Negro elements in the South that they cannot work with ar report to the FBI and information because of our conrad cooperation with the local actnodities. told, that such close cooperation prejudices the FBI and results in no results being obtained. That, of course, is an absolute fallacy for we have obtained results in a number of church bombings and other civil rights violations.

However, in order to minimize as much as possible the unwarranted criticism which the FBI has received, we have over the last year refrained from close contacts or connection with the local authorities. This I have regretted because a gulf has gradually developed and we are not kept informed as we have been in the past of actions contemplated and developments in cases handled by the local authorities. In the late twenties and early thirties there was great reluctance upon the part of the local authorities to cooperate with the FBI and it took us several years before we could break down this reluctance, but we finally did so and from that time until within the last year we have had the closest cooperation from the local authorities in all matters including civil rights. That cooperation has now practically ended by reason of our refraining from dealing with the local authorities. I personally do not approve of this policy because I think law enforcement should work as a team, and the mere fact that we have had in the past cordial relationships with local authorities did not mean that we favored them if they violated any Federal statute. As a matter of fact, our record shows that we have vigorously investigated and successfully prosecuted local authorities when Federal laws have been violated.

Another aspect of this matter which I think should be drawn to your attention has been the constant complaint made by the Negro elements in the South that there was no use to report matters to the FBI because all of our Agents in the South were Southerners. This complaint was untrue. Martin Luther King several months ago made a speech in which he claimed that all of our Agents in Albany, Georgia, where there had been violent racial demonstrations, were born in the deep South and Negroes should not report matters to that office. We have five Agents at Albany, Georgia, and I checked into the matter and found that four of the five had been born in northern states and that only one had been born in what could be called the deep South. I made an effort to effect an appointment with Martin Luther King so as to correct his impression, assuming he had been misinformed, but he refused to make an appointment so I, therefore, have to conclude that he was deliberately lying when he made the statement he did. Nevertheless the effect of his statement in the South and the statements of other Negro leaders has resulted in the impression that practically all of our southern offices are manned by Agents who were born in the South.

#### Memorandum for the Attorney General

This is likewise untrue but, in order to minimize the criticism as much as possible, I initiated the program a year ago transferring southern-born Agents from southern offices and replacing them with northern-born Agents. I did not think that this was a wise action to take but I took it in order that the criticism which has arisen against the Bureau in its work in the civil rights field might to some degree be minimized.

Now the climax seems to have finally been reached because last week in conferences with Blaik and Royall the Negro leaders in Birmingham claimed that they could not put any reliability in the FBI because the northern Agents who have been assigned to southern offices have married or are marrying girls born in the South. I certainly do not intend to issue any orders forbidding any Agent in this service to marry a girl irrespective of where she may be born, I think the limit of palliation and appeasement has been reached. The Bureau has and intends to continue to vigorously investigate any violations of the civil rights statutes which are authorized by the Department. You, no doubt, have noted that in the newspapers in the last week quite a number of Negro leaders have referred to the fact that there have been forty-six bombings in Alabama and none has been solved by the FBI. This again is a falsehood. Under the procedure set up by the Department we must submit to the Civil Rights Division a report on any bombing which takes place and the Civil Rights Division then determines whether the FBI should initiate a full and thorough investigation. Out of the forty-six bombings which have taken place in Alabama the Bureau has been authorized to investigate only five by the Civil Rights Division.

Because of the contention of the Civil Rights Division, and I think a very sound one, that the law as passed by Congress which raises a presumption that the explosive used in a bombing has been transported interstate does not relieve the local or state authorities from active investigations of such bombings, in instances where there is even a substantial indication that the explosives have been transported interstate the Department has authorized full investigations and the Bureau has made them.

I wanted to set forth my views concerning this matter because there is becoming more and more misunderstanding about just what the FBI's authority is and what it does and the reason why it does it.

### Memorandum for the Attorney General

I do not believe that even within the Department the situation is fully understood. A week ago a newspaper reporter was furnished by the Department with the report concerning the forty-six bombings and the fact that the FBI had solved none. It was not pointed out to that reporter that the FBI had been authorized to investigate only five of the forty-six bombings so, as the article was written, it very improperly gave the impression that the FBI was dragging its heels in actively investigating the bombings in Alabama.

Through interviews with suspects released the Birmingham Office has ascertained that representatives of the AHP were of the opinion that they might scoop other law enforcement officers by the wholesale pick up and interrogation of suspects whose identities they learned from various individuals under investigation as suspects by the Bureau and Birmingham police No charges have yet been filed against Chambliss and Cagle and they are being held for the AHP on "open charges" or for investigation. 
The following information was furnished by a source who has furnished reliable information in the past.



PROPERTY OF FBI - This memorandum contains neither recommendations nor conclusions of the FBI. It is the property of the FBI and is loaned to your agency; it and its contents are not to be distributed outside your agency.

Chambliss and Cagle have indicated they are quite concerned about the arrests and have consulted with an attorney regarding having them released on writs of habeas corpus. Indications are the attorney was prevailed upon to withhold such action until the morning of 10/1/63. According to sources of the Birmingham Office the only charge conceivable that could be brought against Chambliss and Cagle at this time is a state charge of illegal transportation of dynamite, a misdemeanor punishable by a \$300 fine. The source stated that it is doubtful that this charge could be sustained in court.

Reliable news media sources have informed the Birmingham Office that they are poised editorially to take the AHP and the Governor apart and that the 'man in the street' is presently asking embarrassing questions and feels that he has been duped by the Governor and AHP.



In addition to the intensive investigation which is continuing concerning the Chambliss group other phases of this investigation are also receiving close attention. Additional members of the victim church and persons located in the neighborhood of the church were interviewed 9/30/63.

Information has been received that due to the intensive inquiries being conducted by the Birmingham Office concerning members of the National States Rights Party (NSRP) that organization has been seriously hindered in its operations which are reportedly at a standstill. Investigation concerning the possible involvement of members of the NSRP is continuing.

SEPTEMBER 15, 1963 **BOMBING MATTERS** The Attorney General called shortly after 8 o clock this morning and asked about developments in this case in Birmingham, particularly the reports that the State Police had arrested two individuals. He was informed that we had been keeping Assistant Attorney General Burke Marshall of the Civil Rights Division informed during the night as to these developments. He was furnished the same information that had been given earlier to Mr. Marshall, which satisfied him, and he asked to be apprised as to any further information developed. After his arrival at the office, the Attorney General was contacted personally. He was informed that as a result of the constant complaining by the integration groups about our Agents working with the local authorities in the South, we have had to withdraw in this regard so that we don't get information as to their plans as we have in the past: that there had been a time in the past when the local authorities did not trust or work with Federal Agencies, but that by concerted effort over the years we had overcome this insofar as the FBI is concerned, and had built up a close association, and we knew what action the local authorities were taking. Because of the criticism that FBI Agents have been too close to the police in the South, we have had to back off, and as a result have lost our contacts. It was further brought to the Attorney General's attention that we had been replacing southern-born Agents assigned to that area with Agents born and reared in the North.
