During a September 2004 meeting Los Angeles was assigned various tasks. The following is a summary of the disposition of these tasks and a summary of relevant topics discussed at the meeting identified by Field Office:

### LOS ANGELES

1. Send photographs of the unknown male seen in the June 2000 LAX videotape to detainees (in-country and overseas) for identification.

On 10/13/2004, Los Angeles submitted an E.C. to FBIHQ, Counterterrorism Division (CTD) requesting that photographs of three unknown males depicted at Los Angeles International Airport (LAX) on 06/10/2000 with 9/11 hijackers Khaled Al-Midhar (Al-Midhar) and Nawaf Al-Hazmi (Al-Hazmi) at LAX screening areas be shown to multiple detainees. On April 1, 2005, Los Angeles contacted CTD to requested the status of the October request and was advised that the photos had not been sent to the detainees because they were not in the correct format. On 04/11/2005, Los Angeles provided CTD with an additional copy of the photographs in the requested format. Los Angeles will continue to follow up with CTD to determine the results of the request.

2. Conduct interview and polygraph of former (G)
Ellsworth Elmer Black (Black) regarding his statements that Mohdar
Abdullah (Mohdar) had advance knowledge of the 9/11 plot.

A review of the polygraph report revealed that Black passed the polygraph examination when asked two questions. One question was whether Modhar said he had met the hijackers and the other question was if Mohdar said he had given two of the hijackers a ride. Additional follow-up questions were not asked during the interview to address more specifically Mohdar's exact comments regarding his interactions with the hijackers. Los Angeles will attempt to re-interview Black to address these areas not covered during the polygraph interview.

Los Angeles ran the relevant plates through all LAX Airport Police records with negative results.

- 4. Determine where Al-Bayoumi obtained his passport photograph in Los Angeles.
- SA (S) and Det. (S) visited two Kinko's Copy Service Stores located close to the Fox Hills Mall in Culver City, CA, where Al-Bayoumi was believed to have gone to have his passport photograph taken. Interviews with Kinko's personnel at each location revealed that at the time the photograph was taken Kinko's did not maintain records of passport photograph purchases. Further investigation is not warranted.
- 5. Conduct telephone analysis of Al-Bayoumi's telephones to identify subscribers to Los Angeles telephone numbers in contact with Al-Bayoumi. Review subscribers to determine if these individuals were possibly connected to Al-Bayoumi.

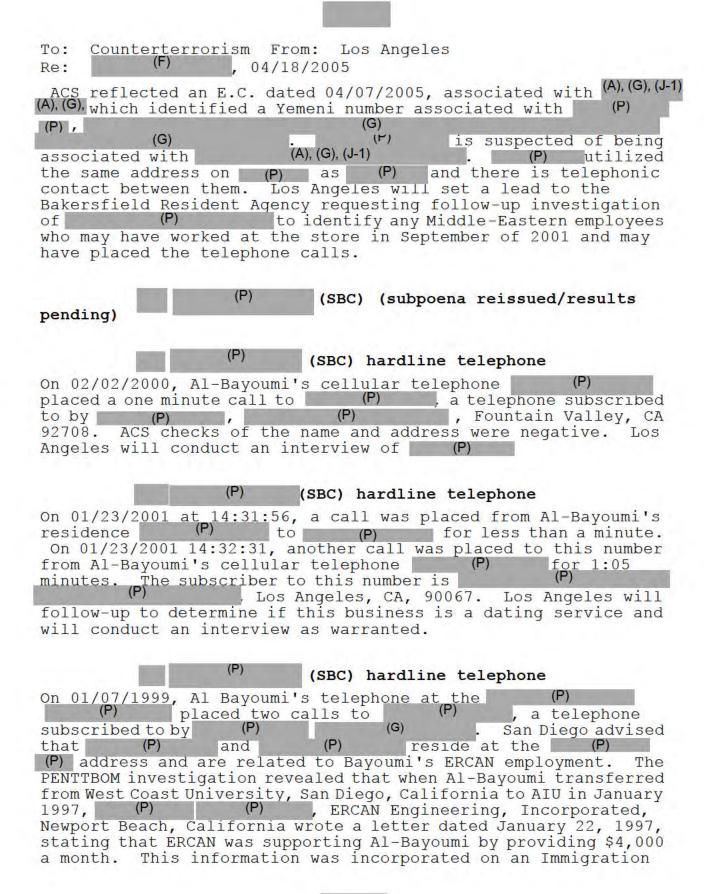

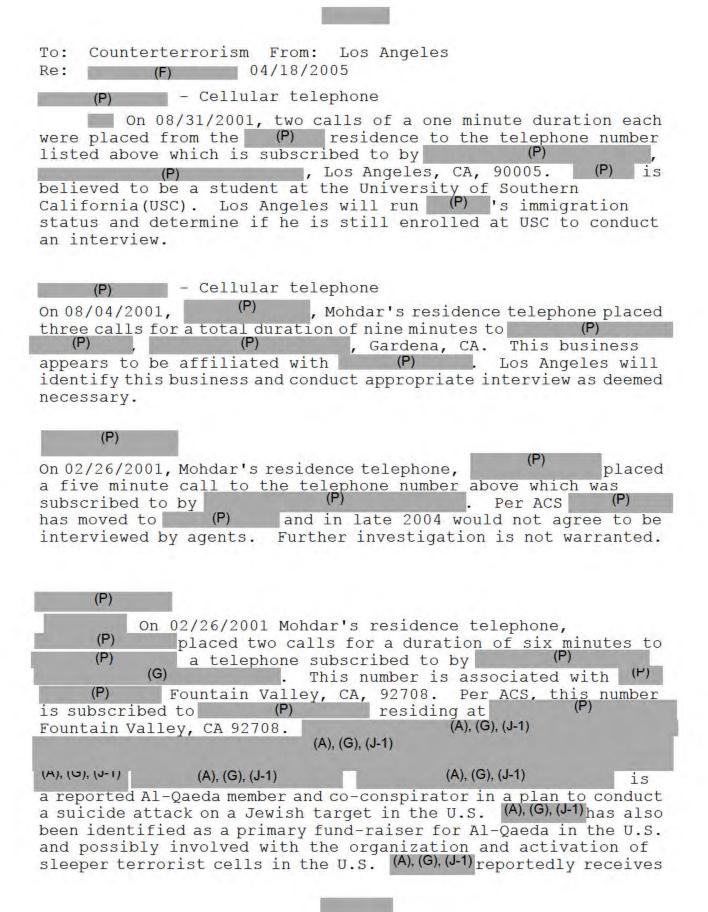

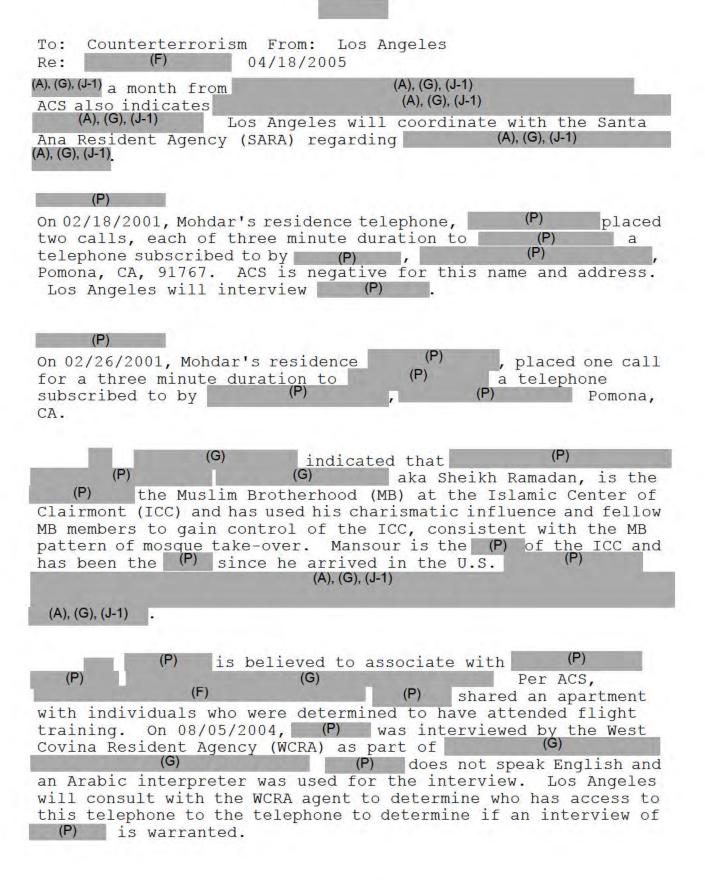

Los Angeles reviewed the flight manifest for Lufthansa flight 457 and ran the Middle-Eastern sounding names through California Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) records to identify and individuals who were on Al-Midhar's Riyadh flight. Twenty-three names of interest were identified. For seventeen of the names, California DMV information was located. Photos of these individuals were obtained and the addresses were run through ACS with negative results. The names of the other six individuals were run through ACS with negative results.

A review of the DMV photographs by the attendees at the 04/05/2005 meeting revealed that the individuals identified on the same flight as Al-Midhar did not appear to be any of the three unknown males that passed through the LAX screening area on 06/10/2000 with Mohdar, Al-Midhar and Al-Hazmi. The investigation and review of the flight manifest information is summarized in a separate E.C.

From JFK he was scheduled on Royal Jordanian Airlines (RJA) #262 departing on 07/16/2000 to Amman, Jordan. On 07/17/2000 at 11:45 p.m., he was scheduled to fly from Amman to Sanna, Yemen on RJA #261. Mohdar's travel history was reviewed by San Diego Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) representative to confirm when Mohdar traveled on a different flight. The ICE representative advised that Mohdar's immigration file would also be requested.

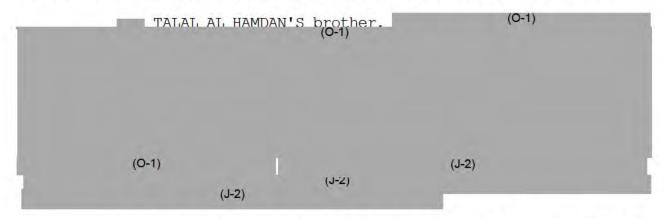

(G) Details: On 11/02/2005 and 11/03/2005 a meeting was held at the FBI San Diego Field Office (SDFO) to discuss captioned cases and to review the results of the investigation conducted thus far by Los Angeles and San Diego and to identify additional investigation/leads. The meeting was attended by SSA (S) (S) (S) (S) , SA , SA SA (S) and IA of the SDFO, SA (S) and Los Angeles Police Department SA (S) Detective of the Los Angles Field Office (LAFO) and of the New York PENTTBOM Team. SSA During the last meeting held in April 2005 various tasks were assigned to each division. The following is a summary of the disposition of these tasks and a summary of relevant topics discussed at the meeting identified by Field Office: LOS ANGELES ASSIGNED TASKS: 1. Send photographs of the unknown male seen in the June 2000 LAX videotape to detainees (in-country and overseas) for identification. On 10/13/2004, Los Angeles submitted an EC to FBIHQ, Counterterrorism Division (CTD) requesting that photographs of three unknown males depicted at Los Angeles International Airport (LAX) on 06/10/2000 with 9/11 hijackers Khaled Al-Midhar (Al-Midhar) and Nawaf Al-Hazmi (Al-Hazmi) at LAX screening areas be shown to multiple detainees. On 07/22/2005 and 07/23/2005, the following detainees were interviewed: Abdullah Al Razz AQ Al Taming(ISN ), Sa'ad Muhammad Husayn Qahtani (ISN (G) ), Humud Dakhil Humud Said Al-Jad An (ISN ), and Ahmed Muhammed Darbi (ISN (G)).

Qahtani identified the UNSUB in photograph number 4, (male wearing a yellow over blue shirt) as possibly one of the 9/11 hijackers, known to him as "Said Abdullah Alghamdi." Qahtani took an Islamic studies course with Alghamdi at a mosque located at the Imam Muhammad bin Saud Islamic University in Abha, Saudi Arabia, for about four months in 1999. Qahtani did not socialize with Alghamdi and only knew him as a classmate. After the 9/11 attacks, Qahtani saw photographs of the hijackers and recognized Alghamdi. Qahtani added that in 1999, Alghamdi had a beard, so Qahtani was not completely confident in his identification of the UNSUB in photograph 4. 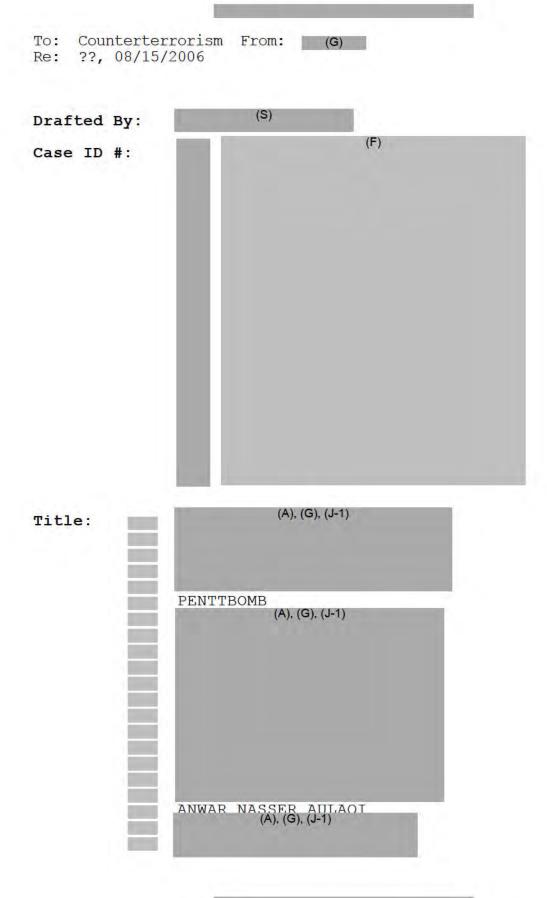

Given the above description of (A).(G).(J-1) and his connections to four terrorist attacks, (G) is increasingly concerned with what relationship (A).(G).(J-1) may have with international terrorism and the intelligence gaps that exist with relation to his activities. Even though source reporting continues to indicate (A).(G).(J-1) espouses mostly conservative rhetoric, (G) believes his behavior could be indicative of the infamous Ramzi Yousef (mastermind of the 1993 WTC bombing), who himself kept a very low profile prior to the attack. Unlike Yousef, (G) isn't speculating (A).(G).(J-1) may be planning an attack himself. It is simply becoming more plausible that (A).(G).(J-1) may have had prior knowledge of past attacks and could have current knowledge of pending ones.

Nevertheless, it could be justified that just because you associate with individuals who have been involved with terrorist attacks doesn't mean you yourself had knowledge of those attacks. In fact, shortly after the 9/11 attacks it was reported

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that likely nobody in the U.S. but the hijackers themselves were aware of the 9/11 plot. However, the Los Angeles recently came across information leading them to believe the hijackers had assistance inside the U.S.; thus, leading them to reopen their PENTBOM-related investigations. Thus, as will likely be revealed in the Los Angeles reinvestigation, many more people may have known about these other attacks than what was once believed.

Below are detailed descriptions of the connections has to the four referenced terrorist attacks:

# 1993 WORLD TRADE CENTER BOMBING and 2003 BOMBING IN RIYADH, SAUDI ARABIA (subjects of both are interconnected)

(S) On February 26, 1993, a massive explosion occurred in the parking garage at the World Trade Center in New York City. During the initial weeks of the investigation, a number of subjects were identified and arrested as being responsible for the bombing. Ramzi Yousef, the mastermind behind this attack, was eventually arrested in 1995, after he had fled the U.S. Yousef is the nephew of 9/11 mastermind, Khalid Shaikh Mohammed.

Another individual convicted for his role in the 1993 WTC attack and who is the common link between (A) (G) (J-1) and several of his associates, is Ahmad AJAJ. Even though AJAJ was incarcerated at the time of the attack, he was nevertheless convicted for his role based on his association with Ramzi Yousef. According to (F), in September 2002, Ajaj and Ramzi Yousef arrived together at JFK airport in New York. Since Ajaj was holding an illegal passport, he was detained and not allowed to enter the country. In his possession were several bomb making manuals. Based on this association and others later identified during the course of the (A) (G) (J-1) investigation, AJAJ was convicted for his role in the attack.

AJAJ reportedly met Ramzi Yousef in Pakistan in April 1992, just after AJAJ hurriedly fled from Houston, where he was living. According to (F), AJAJ and his friend, were hastily driven to the airport by (P) where they boarded a plane destined for Peshawar, Pakistan. AJAJ had used the name of his (G) friend, (P) to purchase the tickets. Once in Peshawar, AJAJ, (P) and Ramzi Yousef all stayed in a safe house for mujahideen fighting jihad in Afghanistan. AJAJ was in constant contact with Yousef after this meeting in Pakistan and as

During the latter part of the 1990's, after being incarcerated for his role in the 1993 WTC bombing, AJAJ was transferred from his prison in Colorado to the federal prison in Beaumont, Texas. According to (F) shortly after his move to Beaumont, AJAJ requested the following telephone numbers be added to his list of numbers he was permitted to call: (P) The first number was the main line to the Holy Land Foundation (of which (P) was the leader), and the second number was the main line to (P) barber shop. Both numbers rang at the physical location of the barber shop (the HLF office was located inside the shop). AJAJ later made several calls to these two numbers.

AJAJ is also associated with (P) through AJAJ's relationship with (P) Recall information provided above which indicates AJAJ used (P) name to purchase his airline tickets for the trip to Pakistan. While AJAJ was living in Houston, (P) was renting one of (P) houses.

One of the most significant details discovered regarding the (A).(G).(J-1) surrounds a small gathering that took place at a park near Kingsville, TX, just weeks before the 1993 WTC bombing (F) At this gathering, (P) and his two co-leaders explained that the "group in Kingsville" needed to learn how to "kill and destroy" and that the others didn't have the same devotion to jihad as did the group leaders. Then one of the leaders addressed the group alone and told them it was time to quit talking and begin to "truly organize". After this, (P) and the other leaders proceeded to detonate a small bomb made out of putty. (G) the purpose of this demonstration appeared to be for the purpose of showing the group that the three leaders had the capability of detonating an explosive device.

#### (P) ASSOCIATION WITH (P) AND AHMAD AJAJ

The fact that (P) took part in detonating an explosive device just weeks before the 1993 WTC bombing is of concern given (P) association with both (P) and Ahmad Ajaj. Recall Ajaj is one of the individuals identified above and convicted for his role in the 1993 WTC bombing. Ajaj had lived in Houston less than a year before the WTC bombing and was associated with some of the same individuals (P) associated with.

A review of documents found in Ajaj's possession after his arrest revealed a letter from an Ibrahim Ahmad to "Sheikh Hasan" with the address and listed phone number of a Texaco gas station in Houston. According to (F), this letter was destined for (P) (DOB: (P-1), who was the owner of the gas station referenced in the letter. The basic topic of the letter was that a car owned by Ahmad was left for (P) to sell. In the letter, Ahmad was asking that

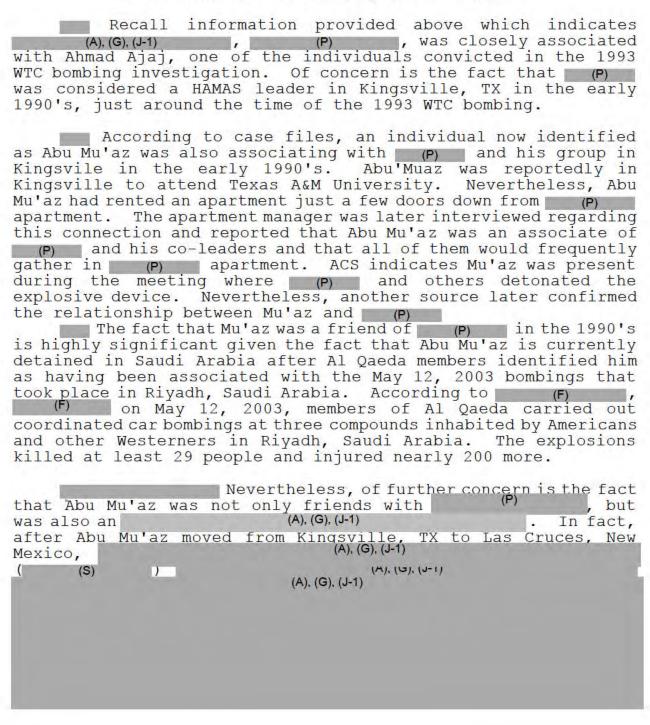

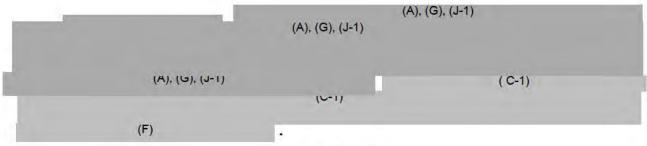

(LDI), which is based in Kuwait and was designated a terrorist group by OFAC in January 2003. This intelligence brings the connection to (P) and the 1993 WTC bombing full circle since (P) is currently listed as the Registered Agent for the North American branch of the LDI terrorist group. Recall information provided above which indicates (P) is involved in suspicious wire transfers to/from an entity in Kuwait; thus, these transfers could be associated with LDI. Wadih El-Hage (G), who is believed to have been the leader of the Kenya cell, was sentenced to life in prison for his role in the bombings. At the time, El-Hage was a senior associate and business partner to Usama Bin Laden. El-Hage later admitted to being Bin Laden's personal secretary. 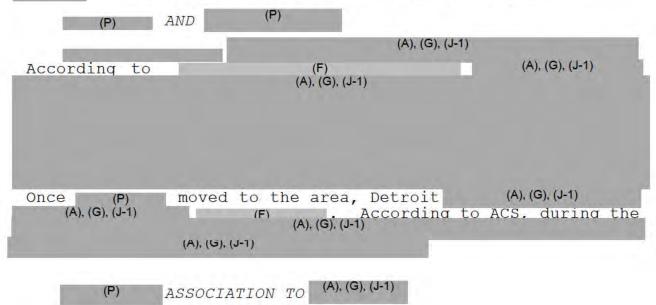

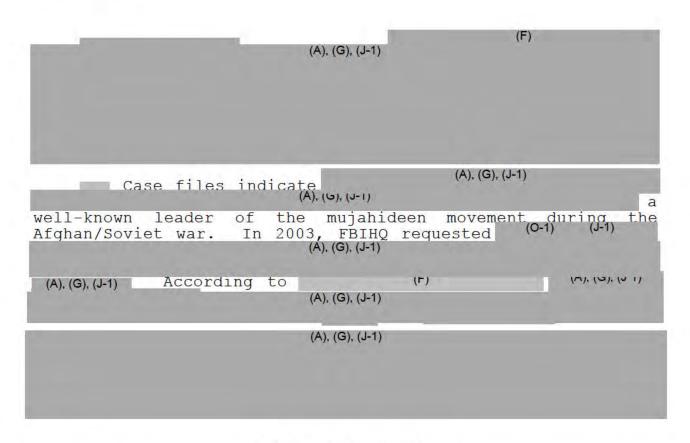

(S) On 9/11/01, 19 hijackers overtook four U.S. airliners and crashed them into the World Trade Center, the Pentagon, and a field in Pennsylvania. Two of these hijackers were Nawaf Al-Hazmi and Khalid Al-Mihdar. Prior to their moving to the D.C. area before the attacks, they were living in San Diego, CA. They first arrived in the U.S. at Los Angeles, where they stayed for approximately two weeks. However, from there they moved to San Diego.

#### ANALYSIS

After analyzing the above information, believes an extensive terrorism network exists within the United States and that high-ranking members of the network all had prior knowledge of the four terrorist attacks described. It is believed this network has existed since the early 1990's and continues to exist today. Even though several members have been incarcerated, it is likely the network continues to be run by those involved but not yet convicted or by those who fled the country prior to any conviction. This belief comes from the fact

that many of the individuals involved in one terrorist attack are also associated with other terrorist attacks or are at least associated with those convicted for these other attacks. Whereas individual terrorism "cells" (once thought to be autonomous) may exist in various cities across the U.S., (S) believes a level of leadership exists whereby the leaders are aware and approve of various terrorist attacks occurring within the U.S. and overseas.

#### MORE BACKGROUND:

The investigation of the San Diego subjects commenced within hours of Flight 77 crashing into the Pentagon, when a car was found parked at the hourly lot in Dulles International Airport on 9/11/2001 that was registered to NAWAF AL-HAZMI, one of the passengers on Flight 77. It was quickly determined that the vehicle was registered by AL-HAZMI , in Lemon Grove, a suburb of San Diego, California. Investigation by San Diego FO found the building was owned by ABDUSSATTAR SHAIKH, who was renting a room therein to OMER SALMAIN SALEH BAKARBASHAT (aka OMAR BAKARBASHAT), DOB (P-1), SSAN ■ BAKARBASHAT, a foreign student from Yemen who had dropped out of college and was out-of-status, admitted to associating with AL-HAZMI and AL-MIHDHAR and was arrested (D) and later deported for immigration fraud. BAKARBASHAT further identified MIHDAR MOHAMMAD AL-MIHDAR ZAID (aka MOHDAR MOHAMED ABDOULAH, aka MOHDAR ABDULLAH), DOB (P-1), as a close associate of AL-MIHDHAR and AL-HAZMI. ABDULLAH in turn admitted meeting the hijackers at a San Diego mosque in early 2000, where OMAR AL-BAYOUMI tasked ABDULLAH with acclimating them to the U.S. At the time, ABDULLAH was residing at St, (P) La Mesa, another San Diego suburb, with several others.

The hijackers were housed, through AL-BAYOUMI, at the Parkwood Apartments, 6401 Mt. Ada Rd, (P) San Diego, CA 97111, just off Balboa Avenue, in an apartment in the same complex where AL-BAYOUMI had been residing with his wife and three children (in Apt (P) at 6333 Mount Ada Rd) since September 1999. AL-BAYOUMI was a Saudi national who entered the U.S. in 1993 J-3) attending school in San Diego. He acted as manager/facilities supervisor for the MASJID AL-MADINA AL-MUNAWAR MOSQUE, 511 Magnolia Ave. South, El Cajon, California (aka the Kurdish Community Islamic Center, or KCIA), but claimed on his rental paperwork at Parkwood to be a student supported by his family

As noted above, at AL-BAYOUMI's request, MOHDAR ABDULLAH helped AL-HAZMI obtain a driver's license, a car, a Social Security number and enrollment in a Florida flight training school and arranged local instruction in English. ABDULLAH also accompanied AL-HAZMI on June 10, 2000 as he drove KHALID AL-MIHDHAR to the Los Angeles International Airport (LAX) to catch a flight to Muscat, Oman via Frankfurt, Germany, to visit his wife and new-born daughter. AL-HAZMI then moved out of the Parkwood Apartments into the afore-mentioned (P) building owned by SHAIKH, which SHAIKH claims the hijackers found via an ad he had placed at the Islamic Center of San Diego ( F), Serial (F)). AL-HAZMI and ABDULLAH continued to maintain close contact, visiting each other, dining and even working together washing cars at (P) a Texaco gas station at , La Mesa, CA 91941. BAKARBASHAT also worked at the same gas station. Soon after the arrival of the eventual

Flight 77 hijacker/pilot, HANI HANJOUR, on 12/8/2000, AL-HAZMI introduced HANJOUR to ABDULLAH and the hijackers departed for La Mesa, Arizona days after HANJOUR's San Diego arrival.
AL-BAYOUMI introduced AL-HAZMI and AL-MIHDHAR to the Saudi-Yemeni community in San Diego during a party at his apartment and brought them to the AL-RIBAT AL-ISLAMI CENTER, a mosque at 7173 Saranac St, La Mesa, CA 92115. The Imam of the Mosque was ANWAR NASSER AULAQI (aka SHEIKH ANWAR AL-AWLAKI, aka ABU BAKR AL SIDDIQ, aka ANWAR AL-AWLAKI) DOB (P-1), the subject of (F), and as it was later discovered, a childhood neighbor of MOHDAR ABDULLAH in Yemen. In January of 2006, the FBI learned via photo comparison that AULAQI was also identical with Yemeni Extremist ANWAR AL-AWLAKI ABU ATIQ, who was incarcerated in June 2006 by the Government of Yemen in connection with a plot to attack oil interests.
AULAQI was born in Las Cruces, New Mexico to immigrant Yemeni parents, who returned with him to their native land when AULAQI was about 11 years old. AULAQI's father, NASSER AL-AULAQI, eventually became the President of Sana'a University and visited the U.S.  ANWAR AULAQI meanwhile, returned to the U.S. in 1990 to attend school in Colorado and moved to San Diego in late 1995. AULAQI resided in San Diego, preaching at the AL-RIBAT Mosque, until at least August 2000, then traveled to Yemen and returned to California on 10/23/2000 two weeks after the Cole bombing and moved to Virginia in March, 2001. AULAQI served as Imam of the DAR AL-HIJRAH Mosque in Falls Church, before returning to Yemen in March, 2002, where he has remained aside from a brief sojourn in October-November 2002 in Virginia, Santa Clara and San Diego, California. While it is known that AULAQI had contacts with NAWAF AL-HAZMI and KHALID AL-MIHDHAR in San Diego, California and may have had contacts with AL-HAZMI and HANI HANJOUR at the DAR AL-HIJRAH Mosque in Virginia, AULAQI's exact relationship with the hijackers remains unclear.

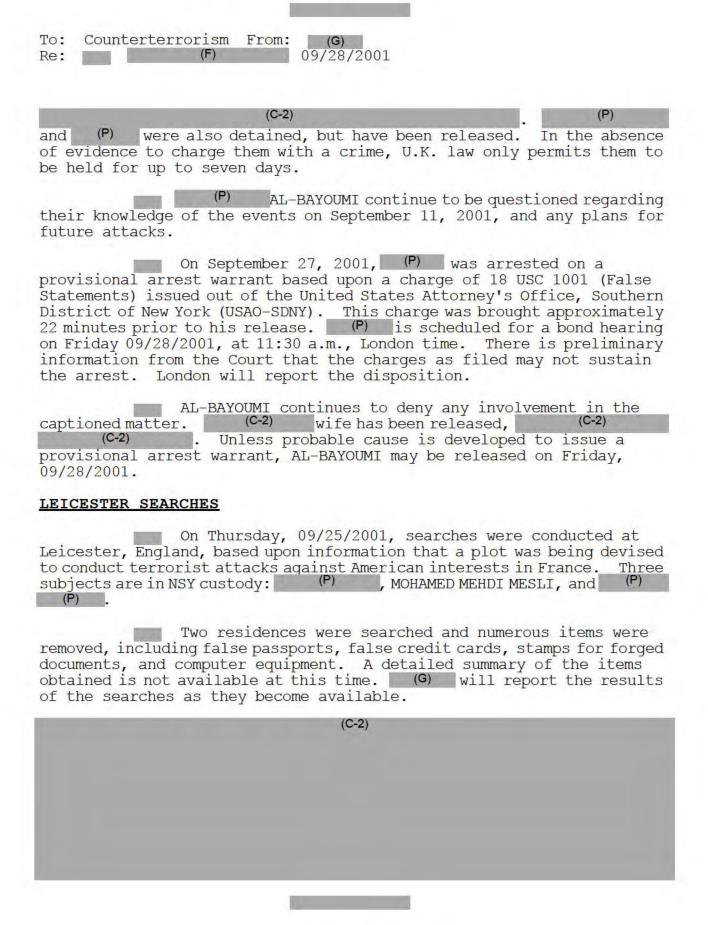

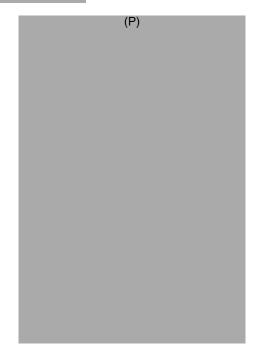

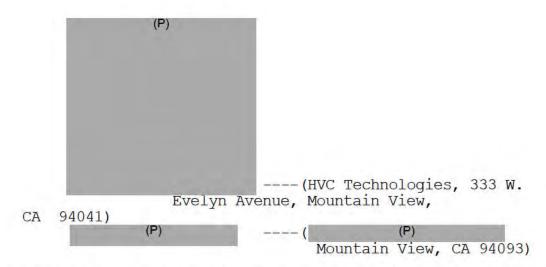

Arrested under the provisions of section 41 Terrorism Act 2000 were BRAHIM BENMERZOUGA, DOB:

KAMEL DAOUDI is believed to be connected to one of these cells and made good his escape to the UK from France, residing between the two addresses listed above.

In Leicester, a quantity of computers were recovered as a result of warrants executed at the addresses and motor vehicles belonging to these people. Investigations in Leicester together with information received from other law enforcement agencies reveal that BENMERZOUGA and MEZIANE can be directly linked with DAODI. They are engaged with others in large scale systematic credit card fraud across Europe. Their lifestyle indicates that money raised from this activity is not used for their personal benefit and is strongly suspected and supported by information that they are raising funds for terrorism. Evidence to substantiate this is still being sought at Leicester.

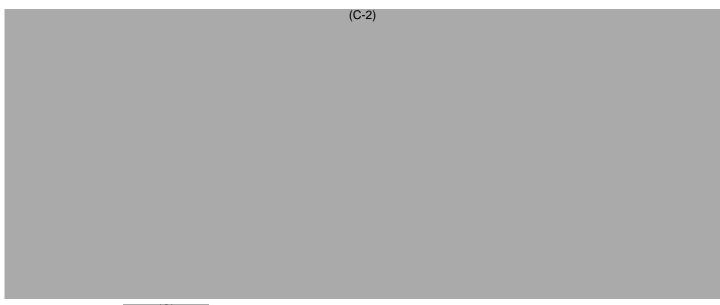

OMAR AHMED AL BAYOUMI was arrested in September 2001 following the September 11 terrorist attacks in the US. When he was arrested, his home address was searched and a filofax was found. Contained within this filofax were a number of e-mail addresses together with a number of web page addresses.

Initial investigations into these web pages reveal that AOL operate a system called 'Hometown' were visitors can create and publish a limited size web page (2mb). Paying members of AOL can also use this system but can have a larger memory allocation (20mb). None of these web pages are currently accessible but may still remain on the servers at AOL-US.

The MET seeks the contents of these web pages, and subscriber details to the Yahoo! e-mail address.

- 1. BASSNAN admitted that he lived at the same apartment complex as two of the terrorist hijackers, determined to be Nawaf Al-Hazmi and Khalid Al-Midhar.
- 2. BASSNAN admitted that he would "see" AL-HAZMI and AL-MIDHAR at the apartment complex when BASSNAN, AL-HAZMI, and AL-MIDHAR were all living there.

NOTE: An interview preparing the transcript about the meaning of the word "see" in context which it was used, determined that BASSNAN at least admitted that he knew who they were, saw them around the complex, but did not necessarily associate with or engage in conversations with AL-MIDHAR and AL-HAZMI. However, the use of the word "see" in the context did not preclude BASSNAN having a more close association with AL-MIDHAR and AL-HAZMI and possibly talking directly with AL-MIDHAR and AL-HAZMI. BASSNAN provided no further clarification on how extensive the relationship with the AL-MIDHAR and AL-HAZMI was.

3. BASSNAN acknowledged and spoke frankly that he was good friends with Omar Al-Bayoumi who did live with AL-MIDHAR and AL-HAZMI, provided references for AL-MIDHAR and AL-HAZMI to rent an apartment, and provided financial support to AL-MIDHAR and AL-HAZMI.

NOTE: In an earlier debrief of Source, Source positively identified the picture of Omar Al-Bayoumi who was arrested in Great Britain on September 21, 2001. In the post consensual meet debrief of September (G), 2001, Source positively affirmed that during the meeting, BASSNAN and Source discussed and referred to an "Omar," and that the "Omar" they were referring to is the same "Omar" Source positively identified as AL-BAYOUMI.

Statement indicates that BASSNAN knows some information regarding the events surrounding the September 11, 2001 terrorist attacks that CW is unaware of. It also suggests that BASSNAN is not inclined to openly discuss his knowledge of these events with CW.

- BASSNAN spoke of another person he knew as "Abdullah," who also lived at the same apartment complex with AL-MIDHAR and AL-HAZMI. who, according to BASSNAN, returned to the (A).(G).(J-1) when the FBI visited the apartment complex. This statement indicates that BASSNAN also knows this "Abdullah" who was so concerned regarding the investigation into AL-MIDHAR and AL-HAZMI, and possibly "Abdullah's" involvement with AL-MIDHAR and AL-HAZMI related to the events of September 11, 2001, that "Abdullah" chose to flee the United States.
- In a yet un-transcribed portion of the meeting, BASSNAN also told CW that BASSNAN spoke with AL-BAYOUMI before AL-BAYOUMI left San Diego, California and told AL-BAYOUMI to call him if AL-BAYOUMI had any problems because BASSNAN would be able to help AL-BAYOUMI with any problems AL-BAYOUMI may have.

In an earlier debrief, CW confirmed that during the time AL-BAYOUMI was associating directly with AL-MIDHAR and AL-HAZMI, CW directly observed BASSNAN engage in at least five telephone conversations, a combination of incoming and outgoing calls, between BASSNAN and AL-BAYOUMI on BASSNAN's mobile telephone assigned telephone number (P) (hereinafter TARGET TELEPHONE #1).

The September <sup>(G)</sup>, 2001 admission by BASSNAN that he directed AL-BAYOUMI to call him if he had problems, combined with the fact of telephone conversations between AL-BAYOUMI and BASSNAN during the time AL-BAYOUMI was directly associated with and assisting AL-MIDHAR and AL-HAZMI, provides direct evidence that BASSNAN is communicating over TARGET TELEPHONE #1 with AL-BAYOUMI and provides probable cause to believe that AL-BAYOUMI and BASSNAN had conversations over TARGET TELEPHONE #1 in support of a conspiracy to aid and abet AL-BAYOUMI, a suspected co-conspirator with the terrorist hijackers AL-MIDHAR and AL-HAZMI.

An anonymous caller, concerned for their safety if their cooperation with law enforcement were discovered, within the last few months observed members of BASSNAN's family answering telephone calls (P) on the BASSNAN's home telephone (hereinafter TARGET TELEPHONE #2). The anonymous caller, who understands Arabic, said that BASSNAN's wife and other members of BASSNAN's family answered several telephone calls on TARGET TELEPHONE #2, spoke in short conversations in Arabic with incoming callers telling them in paraphrased summary "not now, call back later." The anonymous caller characterized the actions by members of BASSNAN's family as unusual, suggesting that members of BASSNAN's family could not speak openly with the incoming caller in the presence of other people. Source has most often observed BASSNAN engaging conversations with others on TARGET TELEPHONE #1, but also confirmed that BASSNAN also uses TARGET TELEPHONE #2. On September (G), 2001, Source engaged with a consensually recorded telephone conversation with BASSNAN's wife over TARGET TELEPHONE #2. 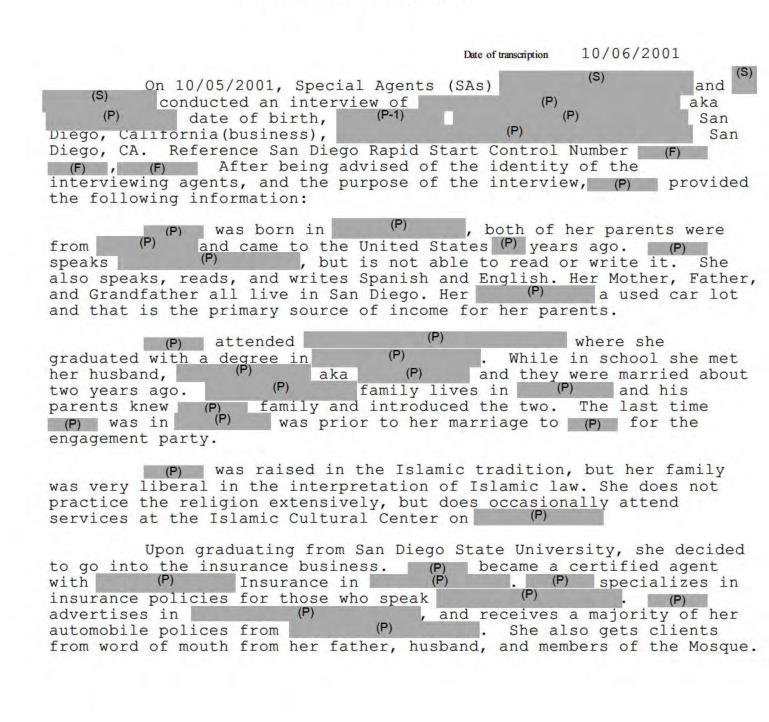

On or about February 4, 2000, Al-Bayoumi came into the Parkwood office and paid for the deposit and the first month's rent for Al-Hazmi and Al-Mihdhar, by furnishing (P) with a Bank of America Cashier's Check number (P-1) . The cashier's check was in the total amount of \$1,558.00, which represented \$775.00 for the deposit, \$8.00 for the insurance and \$775.00 for February's rent. When Al-Bayoumi brought in the cashier's check he was by himself. Al-Bayoumi stated that the cashier's check was for Al-Hazmi's and Al-Mihdhar's apartment and he further stated that (P) could trust him and that he would take care of them. After all the paperwork was done and Al-Hazmi and Al-Mihdhar were ready to move into apartment (P-1), Al-Bayoumi said that they do things for their brothers, inferring that what Al-Bayoumi was doing was culturally based. This statement was made almost as an afterthought.

(P) was under the impression that Al-Hazmi and Al-Mihdhar were residing with Al-Bayoumi in his apartment while they were waiting to move into apartment (P-1) even though she never saw them there.

After Al-Bayoumi paid for the deposit and first month's rent, a second payment was made on or about February 15, 2000, in the form of a Bank of America Cashier's Check number (P-1) in the name of Khalid Al-Mihdhar for \$1,010.00. It was unknown why Al-Mihdhar paid \$1,010.00, when the rent was \$775.00.

In April 2000, Al-Mihdhar paid for the rent by writing a check from his personal checking account at the Bank of America, account number (P-1), in the amount of \$478.00.

In May 2000, Al-Mihdhar paid for the rent from the same personal checking account, however he wrote two checks one in the amount of \$775.00 for the rent, and one in the amount of \$8.00 for the insurance.

Approximately six months after Al-Hazmi and Al-Mihdhar moved into apartment (P-1) Al-Bayoumi began traveling a lot. Al-Bayoumi was gone for months at a time.

When (P) obtained the documentation to furnish it to the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), (P) determined that someone had reviewed and copied the February 2000 deposit slip and accounting ledger with Al-Hazmi's and Al-Mihdhar's payment information, due to the fact that the staple had been removed and re-stapled, as well as someone made a copy of the deposit slip and stapled the copy to

the documents instead of the original. The only two people that knew where to find these files and knew the accounting system were (P) the Parkwood Apartment Complex, who left in 2000 and (P) who resigned on September 17, 2001.

At AT&T, we are committed to keeping you informed about industry-wide issues that affect your AT&T account. The Federal Communications Commission (FCC) has ordered a restructure of the access charges which companies such as AT&T pay to local phone companies for connection to their networks. Since January of this year, AT&T has been passing along some of the restructured access costs in the form of a monthly fee designed to recover charges AT&T incurs from local phone companies. Initially, this was a flat fee identified on your bill as Carrier Line Charge.

Beginning with bills issued on or about July 27, AT&T has changed the way the Carrier Line Charge is calculated. Instead of a flat fee, it will be based on the number of phone lines which are subscribed to AT&T. Businesses with a single phone line will be assessed a \$.53 Carrier Line Charge; while businesses with multiple lines will be assessed \$2.50 per line. While we recognize the shift to a per line fee may represent a substantial increase for some, at \$2.50 per line, AT&T is recovering less than the maximum level set by the FCC, and, in some cases, less than the line charge which AT&T must remit to the local phone company.

**Synopsis:** To document San Diego's contact with the Metropolitan Police Service (MPS), also known as New Scotland Yard, and San Diego's authority to disseminate information to the MPS with regard to the captioned investigation.

Details: On September 21, 2001, OMAR AL-BAYOUMI was detained in the United Kingdom by agents of the Metropolitan Police Service (MPS) at the request of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI.) San Diego's request was transmitted by EC to Legat (G) Subsequent to the detention of AL-BAYOUMI, San Diego SA (S) and New York SA (S) traveled to (G) in order to assist Legat (G) liaison efforts between the FBI and the MPS. In the course of their investigation, agents of the MPS interviewed the subject and searched his home, office and vehicle. Information obtained by the MPS was disseminated to the FBI through liaison with Legat (G). That information was covered under electronic communication previously prepared by SA (S).

Upon completing their investigation of OMAR AL-BAYOUMI, agents of the MPS coordinated official travel from London to New York with Legat (G) and New York SA (S). The MPS agents had meetings during a one-week period with New York case agents and New York Federal prosecutors. SA (S) advised San Diego that the MPS agents involved in the investigation of OMAR AL-BAYOUMI would be traveling to San Diego in order to further the FBI's investigation. SA (S) advised SA (S) that the United States Attorney's Office, Southern District of New York, had authorized the dissemination of information to the MPS for the purpose of furthering the case being pursued in New York. SA (S) was advised that this authorization extended to Federal Grand Jury Material.

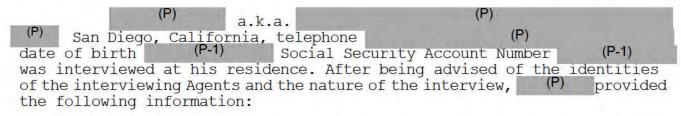

## PENTTBOMB MAJOR CASE 182

Original investigation in San Diego regarding Osama A. Nooh was based upon an interview of the (P) for (P) Khalid Al-Yazez (AKA Khalid Abdulrab). (P) indicated that Abdulrab had stated that his brother knew Osama Bin Laden. A review of California DMV records indicated that Abdulrab had received a traffic ticket in a car registered to Nooh. In an attempt to locate Nooh for an interview, investigation conducted in Newport, Rhode Island indicated that Nooh, a Saudi naval officer had returned to Saudi Arabia on or about 09/18/99. (US Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS) records indicate 10/12/99.)

However, recent investigation in San Diego indicates that Nooh was in telephonic and probably personal contact with several San Diego subjects three months before the events of 09/11/01. San Diego has determined that Nooh was registered as a guest at the Marriott Residence Inn, La Jolla, CA from 06/17/01 to 06/26/01. Furthermore, telephone toll analysis indicates that during this timer period, Nooh was in contact with San Diego subject Omar Albayoumi, and other associates. Source information also indicates that one of these subjects (A). (G). (J-1)

San Diego believes this information to be significant based on the combination of for the following factors: First, Nooh, after an absence of almost two years, returned to the US three months before the September 11, 2001 terrorist attack. Second, Nooh (J-3)

(J-3) Third, and most significantly, as referenced above, telephone tolls indicate that Nooh, while in San Diego, had contact with these San Diego subjects.

For the information of the receiving offices, Albayoumi was a close associate of Flight 77 hijackers Khalid Almidhdar and Nawaf Alhazmi during their stay in San Diego. Albayoumi, while living in San Diego, appears to have been financially supported by the government of Saudi Arabia (Albayoumi was temporarily held in England for possible extradition to the US.)

On 11/06/01, Sami Hussein, Officer in Charge, RICTLT, Royal Saudi Naval Forces, at the Pensacola Naval Air Station (NAS), was subsequently interviewed by the FBI and NCIS. Hussein admitted to being good friends with Nooh and provided no disparaging information regarding Nooh. Hussein also advised that the three individuals referenced above as receiving driver's licenses with his home address were brother-in-laws who had come to visit his wife.

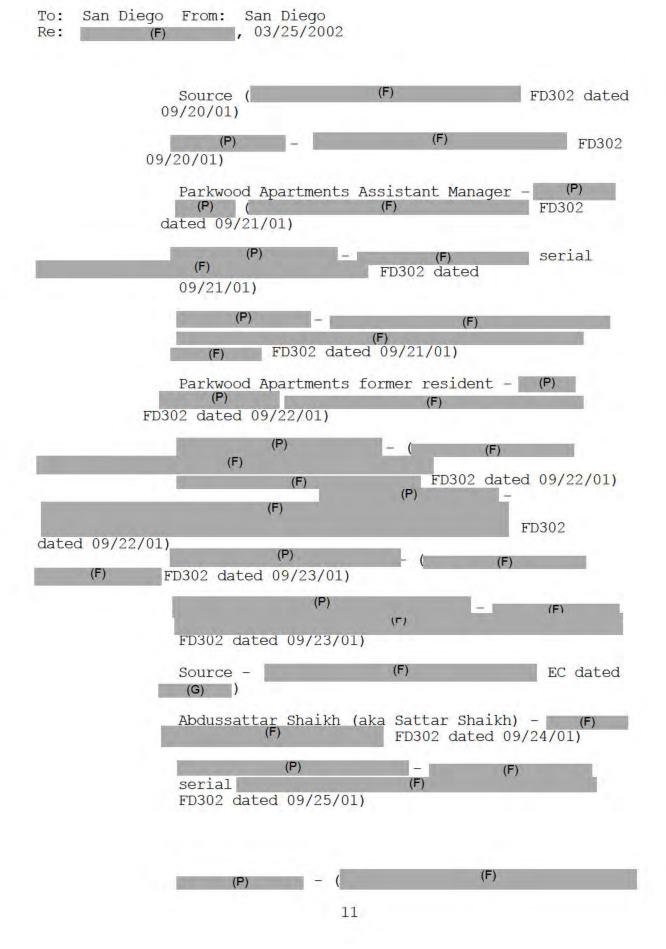

On February 15, 2001, Omar Abdi Mohamed, date of birth in Somalia, residing at telephone (P-1) was interviewed by Special Agents (SAs) Mohamed was advised of the identities of the interviewing SAs and the purpose of the interview. Mohamed advised as follows; (Reference (F))

Mohamed stated he wants to cooperate with the FBI and is willing to submit to an interview, without an attorney present. Mohamed noted he is from a rural area in the southern part of Somalia and his family is not considered wealthy. Mohamed's father encouraged him to pursue his education and as a result, he received a business undergraduate degree from a government institution in Africa (not further identified). Mohamed commented he is happy to be in the United States and although he has family in Somalia, he has no desire to return, noting that if he did return, Somali warlords would surely kidnap and kill him. He added there is little hope for Somalia due to the fact many Somalians are addicted to an indigenous drug, a leafy substance, that they chew on to get high. Mohamed pointed out that as a consequence, the Somalia family structure has been totally destroyed. Mohamed has not seen the movie "Black Hawk Down" but he knows the story of the US involvement in Somalia. He believes the US tried to do the right thing by feeding starving Somalians, but he complained the US rolled out the red carpet for the Somali warlord, Aidid, who along with his son, killed many innocent people.

Mohamed is currently employed by the San Diego School District as an advisor and youth counselor. In addition, Mohamed works with the Somali community at the Somali Community Center, 4979 University Avenue, San Diego. He observed that many American blacks do not understand the Somali culture and as a result there has been problems in the schools. Mohamed has worked to educate people about the Somali culture and his efforts have helped to reduce the tensions between the cultures.

Educationally, Mohamed is seeking his Masters and is focused on administration of HMOs (Health Maintenance Organization).

Concerning the 9/11/01 attacks, Mohamed stated he is upset by the events of 9/11/01 and he is worried that these events have given Muslims a bad name. Mohamed heard the speculation that Usama bin Laden is hiding in Somalia, but he dismissed the rumors, noting that it would be impossible for bin Laden, or anyone from a different culture, to hide out in Somalia. Mohamed commented that he is very fortunate to live in the US, adding that the only problem he has ever had was when a black guy stuck a gun to his head and robbed him of \$5 in a New York subway.

Mohamed was shown 29 photos depicting the 9/11/01 hijackers and their associates. He identified photo #20 (Omar Albayoumi) as a Saudi he knew by the name of Bayoumi, who was associated with the Medina Mosque in El Cajon and the Islamic Center of San Diego. Mohamed described Bayoumi as a social butterfly who seemed to know everyone. Bayoumi performed various tasks at the mosque, including answering the phone. Mohamed stated he did not know Bayoumi well, but they had a few conversations in person and on the telephone. Mohamed recalled that on one occasion, Bayoumi offered to supply the Somali community with Korans and on another occasion, Mohamed requested Bayoumi to ask the Kurdish Mosque if they would donate money to Somali refugee camps, in Kenya.

Mohamed also selected photo # 28 (Mohdar Abdullah) and identified him as Mohdar, a Somali/Yemeni refugee. Mohamed saw Mohdar at the Ribad Mosque and also the Somali Community Center. Mohamed recalled that sometime in 1999(?), Mohdar appeared at the Somali Community Center, claimed to be a Somalian and asked for an official letter identifying him as a Somalian national. Mohdar was told he needed two witnesses that would vouch for him before such a letter would be issued. Mohamed does not recall if he, or someone else at the Somali Community Center, dealt with Mohdar and provided him with the letter.

Mohamed advised that he is willing to cooperate and if he hears anything about terrorist activities, he would contact the FBI.

Date of transcription 03/07/2012 On 03/05/2012, (hereinafter referred to as (P) ), date of birth phone number interviewed by SA SA and SA (S) at a public restaurant in San Diego, California On a previous meeting with SA (S), (P) had been shown a handwritten document (hereinafter referred to as the document) that was seized pursuant to a search conducted by Metropolitan Police Service (MPS) in the United Kingdom at the residence of OMAR AL-BAYOUMI (BAYOUMI) in late September 2001. The document contained a handwritten equation along with other handwritten calculations. After being advised of the identities of the interviewing agents and that the purpose of the interview was to have (P) review the document again this time in conjunction with a theory developed by SA (S) and SA (P) provided the following information: (P) is a pilot who flew for for (P) years and commercially for (P) (P) years. He retired from (P) in for (P) flew (P)

for (P) years. He retired from (P) in (P) flew to (P) from (P) on several occasions.

(P) had identified MOHAMED ATTA as a person posing as a pilot seated in one of the jumpseats in the cockpit on one of his flights originating out of Boston. ATTA had asked a lot of questions about the instrumentation and specifically about changing course to New York. He also told (P) that he was going to mainline Delta to fly 767s. (P) thought that it was odd that a young pilot would go straight to flying 767s, since those spots are typically reserved for those with seniority.

The first time (P) had reviewed the document, he had not seen any correlation between the equation on the document and piloting a plane. However, after reviewing the theory by SA (S) and SA (S), (P) admitted that Diagram 2, associated with the theory, provided him more insight into the equation and that it could be used to calculate a rate of decent when flying a plane. Given a distance from a target, the altitude at that location, and the current airspeed one could calculate the rate of decent and plug it into the computer on the plane in order to initiate a decent to that target. would be reasonable to use the equation in the document in order to calculate the decent rate of an aircraft.

All large airports have GPS plates located in their runways that send a signal to an aircraft relaying the latitude and longitude (GPS coordinates) of that runway. This signal provides pilots the information they need to set an accurate decent rate to the runway from a given location in the sky. However, if somebody wanted to land a plane at a location where there are no GPS plates, they would need to plug in a decent rate into the computer and they would need to know either the GPS coordinates of that location or how far the aircraft was from that location. With a known distance from a given location and the altitude of the plane, a decent rate could be calculated by the pilot. This calculation that would have be done by hand since there is not a way for the plane's computer to perform this calculation. It is not likely that the use of the aircraft computer for navigation would not have been known by a person who had taken only minimal fight lesson, since that type of instruction was only taught in advanced training. In commercial aviation, a typical decent rate would be approximately 2,000 to 2,500 feet per minute.

In 2001 it may have been difficult for an average citizen to establish the latitude and longitude of a certain location. As a pilot, P had access to a Mark 6 plotting board-map, which provided calculations based on a known location, where if the latitude and longitude of a certain location was known, then one could calculate the latitude and longitude of a nearby location using the this board-map.

(P) was familiar with the flight path between (P) and (P) Due to the air traffic in the vicinity of (P) not all planes taking off from (P) would immediately climb to an altitude of 35,000 feet. It was not unusual for commercial flights out of (P) to level off around 8,000 to 10,000 feet in that area for as far as 100 to 150 miles, in order to avoid traffic. The airspeed of a commercial airliner flying from (P) to (P) would be approximately 360 to 380 nautical miles per hour (knots) due to head-winds experienced by an aircraft when flying west. However, from (P) to (P) a plane may experience tail-winds up to 120 to 140 knots, which would significantly increase the plane's airspeed going from west to east (FBI note: (P) was speaking of airspeed and not speed over the ground, where airspeed is the speed of the aircraft

relative to the air, taking into consideration head-winds and tail-winds which can be significant at high altitudes). At an altitude of 8,000 to 10,000 feet, one would be able to see for approximately 100 miles on a clear day and even be able to identify various landmarks.

As a pilot, (P) had access to maps that had the mileage listed on the legs between various waypoints along flight paths. These waypoints typically had a latitude and longitude associated with them. If one wanted to get the mileage (in nautical miles (nm)) along a flight path, one could either add the mileage of the legs between the waypoints or measure by hand the distance of the flight path. If he were to calculate the distance along a flight path by hand using these waypoints, he would have started from the beginning and not worked backwards starting from the destination. When measuring a distance by hand between waypoints on these maps, one could be accurate within 0.5 nm or better.

In a case where a pilot would have to change a plane's course, such as on 9/11, the pilot would not necessarily need to disable the autopilot for this type of course redirection, and could even utilize autopilot after the change in course.

(P) could not think of any other reason for the equation given the parameters set forth on the document than to calculate a decent rate from a given altitude.

The investigation of AL-THUMAIRY was predicated on his association with OMAR AL-BAYOUMI. AL-BAYOUMI played a major role in getting the American Airline Flight #77 hijackers NAWAF AL-HAZMI and KHALID AL-MIHDHAR established in the San Diego community including finding them an apartment, and providing them with financial assistance.

An in ew of PENTTBOMB (G) (P)

AL-BAYOUMI. AL-BAYOUMI stated that he had visa issues to resolve at the Saudi Consulate in Los Angeles. AL-BAYOUMI and DYSON had lunch at the Gourmet Restaurant, located at 10863 Venice Boulevard.
