Parkwood San Diego, California 92111, telephone pager and 8 Executive (P) , Irvine, California 92614-6746, telephone cellular telephone were interviewed at the office of Parkwood Apartment Homes. After being advised of the identity of the interviewing agents and the nature of the interview, and (P) provided the following information:

According to Parkwood's property management records system, 6401 Mount Ada Road, apartment number (P) telephone (P) was rented by Nawaf Al Hazimi and Khalid Al Mihdhar in February 2000. Al Hazimi and Al Mihdhar were recommended to the property manager by Omar Al Bayoumi, also know as (aka) Omar Al Bayaemi, another former resident of Parkwood Apartment Homes. Bayoumi co-signed with Al Hazimi and Al Mihdhar for apartment number (P). Al Hazimi and Al Mihdhar vacated apartment number (P) in June 2000. (P) described Al Bayoumi, Al Hazimi, and Al Mihdhar as students. Al Bayoumi also occasionally paid the rent for Al Hazimi and Al Mihdhar at Parkwood, and always seemed to have cash available.

(P) has been (P) at Parkwood Apartment (P) for (P) years. Parkwood Apartment Homes contains 175 rental units. (P) 's immediate supervisor's name is (P) , (P)

Al Bayoumi, Social Security Account Number (SSAN) (P-1)

(P-1), cellular telephone (P) resided in Parkwood Apartment
Homes, apartment number (P). Al Bayoumi moved into apartment number

Mohdar was unaware of the location they stayed in Los Angeles or how they arrived in San Diego. At that time, Omar was the Manager/Leader of a Kurdish Mosque, located on Magnolia Street in El Cajon, CA. Omar was residing in an apartment complex located behind a Burger King restaurant on Balboa road, San Diego. Mohdar and Omar were acquainted through the Mosque mentioned above. Mohdar has not had contact with Omar for approximately six to eight months. Mohdar last knew Omar was currently located in London, England, working towards a Doctorate degree from an unknown University. Mohdar knew that Omar was a member of the Aviation Board for Saudi Arabia while he was the leader of the Mosque in San Diego.

Omar brought Nawaf and Khalid to an Islam Mosque located on Saranac Street, Lemon Grove, CA, to make the introduction to Mohdar. Omar asked Mohdar to become acquainted with Nawaf and Khalid, acclimate them to the area and assist in any way in their affairs.

Three days after meeting them, Nawaf and Khalid came to Mohdar's apartment to ask a favor of him. Mohdar was living at (P) Apartment number (P) Lemon Grove, CA, with several The favor was to take them to the United Airlines ticket roommates. station and ask if the two airline tickets they had could be exchanged for a different flight. Nawaf and Khalid had two round trip United hard tickets in their possession from Bangkok to LAX with a set return date of approximately three months later. They had already used one trip each on the round trip tickets from Bangkok to LAX.

Nawaf needed Mohdar to translate to the ticket agent that they wanted to trade in the two remaining flights to Bangkok for a credit towards two one way tickets to Jiddah, Saudi Arabia. Mohdar drove them to the United Airlines ticket center located in a shopping center on Genessee road in La Jolla, CA, next to a Starbuck's coffee shop. The ticket agent advised them that the request could not be granted due to the special rate they received on the original flight from Bangkok. Nawaf became verbally abusive towards the ticket agent, (identity unknown), as they departed. Mohdar noted that Nawaf told him not to tell anyone that they had taken an excursion trip to Malaysia after arriving in Bangkok.

Mohdar considered his relationship with Nawaf and Khalid as close on a social and religious basis. However, Mohdar had to make several inquiries into their personal business because Nawaf was very secretive. At times Nawaf would refuse to answer personal questions asked by Mohdar stating seek Allah's help and finish your private matters secretly. Nawaf told this quote to Mohdar in Arabic. and Khalid were always together when associating with Mohdar.

As they became acquainted, Nawaf inquired as to how to obtain a social security card and a drivers license. Mohdar was requested to make telephone calls for them to attend flight lessons with a company, (identity and city unknown), using an 800 number in Florida. Nawaf had the name of the company and telephone number written on a small piece of scratch paper and handed it to Mohdar. Mohdar made the call using a public pay telephone located outside his employment and made the inquiry for Nawaf. Mohdar spoke to an unidentified male individual working for the flight school of Nawaf's interest in flight lessons.

The male stated that Nawaf had to have legal status with the Immigration and Naturalization Service in order to enroll in the class. Since Nawaf and Khalid had visitors visas', the instructor advised them to change the visas to a student visa which would qualify them to enroll. The cost of the flight class was approximately \$12,000.00 to \$15,000.00 dollars. Mohdar made telephone calls, at the request of Nawaf, to Coleman College in reference to enrollment in a computer class. He also made telephone calls using calling cards at public telephones to English language schools in San Diego to enroll Nawaf. Khalid was not interested in enrolling in any schools.

Nawaf was also interested in getting married to an American Mohdar used his computer to obtain information through several matrimonial website for Nawaf. Khalid was married and his wife gave birth to their first and only child in Saudi Arabia while he was in San Diego. Khalids' family was in Saudi Arabia. Nawaf and Khalid were childhood friends and were raised in the holy city of Mecca.

Nawaf said his father or family back home was funding his classes and living expenses. Khalid told Mohdar that he owned a business that rented boats and was spending the profits here. Nawaf and Khalid always paid for daily expenses in cash. Mohdar was unaware of their financial affairs in reference to checking and savings accounts, banks, investment companies. Mohdar never witness Nawaf and Khalid enter a business that receives or sends wire transfers of money. Mohdar never witnessed Omar pay any of their expenses. Mohdar only recalls Nawaf and Khalid traveling outside San Diego once. He knew they traveled in the Toyota to Los Angeles, however, he did not know the purpose of the trip or the date.

Nawaf purchase a blue, Toyota, Corolla, for \$2,500.00 dollars while in San Diego from an unknown individual. Nawaf stated he had received a good deal on the car. Mohdar only witnessed Nawaf and Khalid driving this vehicle. Nawaf and Khalid would regularly attend Islam services at several mosques in the San Diego area. The primary mosque in which they attended was the one off of Balboa Avenue. Their apartment was closest to this mosque. Mohdar never visited them at their apartment, however, he knew the apartment complex because Omar lived in the same complex.

In approximately the summer on 2000, Mohdar traveled with Nawaf in the Toyota to take Khalid to the LAX Airport in Los Angeles, CA. Khalid was returning to Saudi Arabia to be with his wife and newborn female child. Khalid traveled commercial airlines from LAX on Luthansa Airline. After dropping off Khalid at the airport, Mohdar and Nawaf visited the Fahad Mosque in Culver City, CA. They returned to San Diego the same day.

After Khalid departed, Nawaf moved from the apartment on Balboa into a room at the residence of Abdussattar Shaikh, (P)

Lemon Grove, CA. Nawaf, Mohdar and Shaikh, prayed together at the residence in a room devoted to prayer. Nawaf had a gifted voice for leading the prayer at the residence and at the Mosque. Mohdar did not reside at the (P) residence but he visited often.

At the time, Mohdar resided with several roommates at the apartment on (P) Both Nawaf and Khalid visited that apartment, on a regular basis and often ate dinner and entered in prayer. Mohdar ate out with Nawaf and Khalid on numerous occasions. Nawaf favored eating at the Little Caesars pizza restaurant in Lemon Grove, CA. The roommates with Mohdar where (P) and (P) and (P) and (P) address. Mohdar stated that (P) and (P) were friends of Nawaf and Khalid. At no time did Nawaf and Khalid live at the (P) address.

Nawaf and Khalid did not have legitimate employment while in San Diego. Nawaf attempted to work at the Texaco gas station at (P) (P) La Mesa, CA. During the three week period Nawaf worked at the Texaco as a car wash detailer, Mohdar was employed at the station and still is currently employed at the Texaco. Mohdar believed Nawaf was paid cash because he did not have a permit to work. Mohdar could not recall the dates of Nawaf's employment but believed it was after Khalid departed.

to Nawaf's employment. Nawaf would regularly make long visits at the Texaco.

In December 2000, or January 2001, Nawaf made a visit to Mohdar at the Texaco station with Hani Hanjour. Nawaf introduced Hani to Mohdar as his long time friend from Saudi Arabia, however, Hani currently lived in Mesa, Arizona. Nawaf also told Mohdar that Hani was a pilot and that he, Nawaf, was going with Hani to Arizona and attend the same flight school Hani attended. Nawaf told Mohdar he was making the visit to inform him it would be the last visit because he was leaving San Diego. Nawaf and Hani departed together in Nawaf's Toyota, Corolla.

Shortly thereafter, Nawaf telephonically contacted Mohdar at the Texaco and stated he was in San Francisco, CA, and would be attending flight school. Mohdar asked Nawaf if he knew how expensive it was to live in San Francisco and to pay for flight school. replied that he was actually going to attend flight school in Oakland, Approximately, two weeks later, Nawaf again telephonically contacted Mohdar at the Texaco and advised that he was in Arizona attending flight school. Nawaf did not provide Mohdar with any further details, nor did Nawaf provide Mohdar with a telephone number or e-mail address for future contact.

Mohdar heard a rumor that Khalid had telephonically contacted a news station in Aljazeerah and stated that he was still This took place after his name was announced as one of the alive. terrorists.

Mohdar is in the United States under Somalia Asylum awaiting resident alien status. He currently is earning \$7.00 dollars an hour working as a service station attendant at the Texaco mentioned above. He attended Grossmont College and is currently enrolled at San Diego State University working towards a bachelors degree in IDS.

Mohdar denied any participation or knowledge of any terrorist attacks which have taken place in the United States. Mohdar denied participation or knowledge of any future terrorist attacks towards the United States. Mohdar denied knowledge of terrorist activities particularly in reference to Nawaf and Khalid or any other members of his mosque.

Some of them were sleeping on the floor of the apartment. I saw one adult female wearing the traditional gown outfit with a scarf or veil over her face. There were three kids and they stayed upstairs. One was a seven or eight year old boy, the girl was probably in middle school and there was a toddler. The kids were friendly."

The family conversed in their traditional Middle Eastern language which (P) is unfamiliar with. The little boy appeared to attend the local elementary school in the area. The young girl arrived home later in the day from another school in the area.

One such primarily friend was proximately 21 years old. Bugshan also had friends from the United Arab Emirates. 

On Tuesday, February 12, 2002, YASSAR AL-ZHARNI, a Saudi Arabian male, date of birth (P-1), was interviewed at PINNACLE FLIGHT ACADEMY, Wiley Post Airport, Bethany, Oklahoma. He was advised of the identity of the interviewing agents and the nature of the interview. He provided the following information:

Al-ZHARNI is from Jeddah, Saudi Arabia. His father is AHMMED AL-ZHARNI. His father's phone number is (P-1). His father is a former investigator for the Jeddah Police. YASSAR AL-ZHARNI is employed as a flight attendant with SAUDIA AIRLINES; however, he is currently on a leave of absence to pursue flight training. He entered the United States on April 2, 2001 and traveled to Fresno, California to attend English language training prior to attending flight training at PINNACLE FLIGHT ACADEMY. He could not recall the date he arrived in Oklahoma; however, he believed it was some time in June of 2001.

AL-ZHRANI provided the interviewing agents his passport for review. The passport listed his name as YASSER AHMED A AL ZAHRANI and indicated he was on a Bl Visa. The Visa control number was (P-1). The passport number was

AL-ZHARNI currently resides at the (P) in apartment (P) and his phone number is (P-1) His lease is due to expire and he is expecting to finish his flight training in the next few weeks. He may be moving to apartment (P) if he has not finished by the time his lease expires. His allotted time for his leave of absence is almost up and he is scheduled to report back to work for SAUDIA AIRLINES on February 21, 2002.

AL-ZHARNI advised he has a credit card with BANK OF AMERICA. He has on occasion used his credit card to make payments on his flight school bill. He recalled making telephone calls to BANK OF AMERICA regarding his credit card bills; however, he had great difficulty dealing with the people because of his limited English. He is living on money he receives from his father in Saudi Arabia. AL-ZHARNI

advised, he uses different spelling of his name because of his problems with converting from Arabic to English.


AL-ZHARNI was then asked about his August 2001 phone bill and the numerous calls to Saudi Arabia, Colombia and Lebanon. Al-ZHARNI advised, the phone was used by himself and several of the other Saudi students. Al-ZHARNI and his friends ran up a high bill and AL-ZHARNI worked out a payment plan with the phone company. When AL-ZHARNI would get a bill he would make his friends pay him for their calls. The calls to Lebanon were made by ABDUL RAHMAN AL GHAMDI. AL-GHAMDI has a girlfriend who lives in Lebanon. The calls to Colombia were made by (P) has a girlfriend who lives in (P). AL-GHAMDI recently completed his flight training and returned to Saudi Arabia. (P) , who is also a flight student and has (P) , is currently in Saudi Arabia and is going to return to the United States soon to finish his training. AL-ZHARNI reviewed the phone bill and identified most of the numbers as those of his parents or girl friends.

AL-ZHARNI was then asked if he knew anyone in Florida. He advised, he has a cousin who moved there about one month ago. He was then asked about two August 2001 calls to Kissimmee, Florida which appeared on his bill. AL-ZHARNI stated, his cousin was visiting in late summer; however, he could not recall the exact dates. He did know it was before the events of September 11, 2001. His cousin spent about seven days in Oklahoma City with AL-ZHARNI and then went to Florida for a few days. While in Florida, his cousin called him collect. AL-ZHARNI attempted to spell his cousin's name in English; however, he had difficulty. He thought it would translate as (P) He also wrote the name in Arabic.

Upon completion of his flight training, AL-ZHARNI will go back to work as a flight attendant for SAUDIA AIRLINES. He believes it will take one and one half to two years for him to become a pilot with the airlines. AL-ZHARNI did not know any of the individuals associated with the attacks of September 11, 2001. He has never seen any of the individuals other than on the television. Al-ZHARNI was calm and cordial throughout the interview and could not provide any additional information.

The investigation in the U.K. was predicated upon reporting received by NSY from French DST, which indicated that one of the suspects, KAMEL DAOUDI, in the plot had fled France for the U.K. using a false Algerian Passport. DAOUDI's role within the cell was believed to be the procurement of documents on behalf of other members. Another suspected member of the cell, TRABELSI, was arrested on September 13, 2001, in Belgium, along with two other men and a large quantity of chemicals, the potential core constituents of Home Made Explosives (HME). Six other individuals were arrested in Paris on September 21, 2001. Investigation in the U.K., traced DAOUDI to an address in Leicester, England, the residence of a man known as IBRAHIM. On September 24, 2001, six search warrants were obtained under the U.K. Terrorism Act 2000 (TACT 2000). Searches were conducted at the following locations: (P-1) Leicester, LE5 3RS, - the address were DAOUDI and IBRAHIM were believed to be staying. Administrative: Reference meeting held at FBIHQ on 02/09/2004 attended by representatives of the PENTTBOM Investigative Team, Los Angeles Division, and 9/11 Commission Task Force.

Details: As FBI Los Angeles is aware, investigation is ongoing in order to determine the location of residence and activities of KHALID AL-MIHDHAR and NAWAF AL-HAZMI (hijackers of American Airlines Flight 77 on 09/11/2001) during their apparent stay in the Los Angeles area from 01/15/2000 to approximately 02/04/2000. Of predominant interest throughout this investigation are the "two Saudi males" that were introduced to OUALID MONCEF BENOMRANE by FAHAD AL-THUMAIRY.

For background information, BENOMRANE was detained on 03/05/2002 by the former Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS) and interviewed on multiple occasions before being deported to Tunisia in 07/2002 (reference (F)). When interviewed, BENOMRANE stated that he had been introduced to two Saudi Arabian males at the King Fahad Mosque by AL-THUMAIRY. Because the two Saudi males could not speak English, AL-THUMAIRY asked BENOMRANE to assist them during their time in Los Angeles. BENOMRANE agreed and gave his taxicab business card to the two Saudi males. BENOMRANE advised that over the next few days after meeting the two Saudi males, he drove them on two separate occasions around the Los Angeles area and to Sea World in San Diego. BENOMRANE was not able to provide a specific date or time period of when he met the two Saudi males, other than advising that it happened before 09/11/2001. BENOMRANE also advised that the two Saudi males spent approximately one month in Los Angeles. In order to identify the two Saudi Arabian males that were known to BENOMRANE, and to confirm or deny if they were in fact KHALID AL-MIHDHAR and NAWAF AL-HAZMI, further investigation in Los Angeles is necessary. The PENTTBOM Team therefore requests that the following investigation be conducted in Los Angeles: While living in the Los Angeles area, BENOMRANE was employed as a taxicab driver. When interviewed, BENOMRANE advised that he paid insurance fees to (P), last known address (P) , Los Angeles, California, 90066. Furthermore, investigation between 11/2001 and 03/2002 determined that BENOMRANE operated taxicab (P) of the Sunshine Cab Company, Yellow Cab Dispatch Service, California license plate (P), vehicle identification number (VIN) (P) As of 01/20/2000, the titled owner of this vehicle was (P), Santa Monica, California. On 12/21/2000, the title of this vehicle was transferred to (P), (P) Los Angeles, California. BENOMRANE acquired the title to the vehicle on 02/20/2001. When interviewed, BENOMRANE stated that he had given the two Saudi males his taxicab business card. It is unknown, however, the specific time period during which BENOMRANE was employed as a taxicab driver. Specifically, it is unknown if BENOMRANE was working as a taxicab driver between 01/15/2000 and approximately 02/04/2000, the time period during which AL-MIHDHAR and AL-HAZMI were in the Los Angeles area. If BENOMRANE was not employed as a taxicab driver during this period of time, the possibility is decreased that the two Saudi males were AL-MIHDHAR and AL-HAZMI.

In order to determine if BENOMRANE was employed as a taxicab driver during the time period in which AL-MIHDHAR and AL-HAZMI were in Los Angeles, the PENTTBOM Team requests that FBI Los Angeles locate and interview (P) and (P) in regards to their knowledge of BENOMRANE's employment.

- 2) BENOMRANE advised that he had heard that the two Saudi males had arrived at Los Angeles International Airport (LAX) and were taken to an apartment that already had been rented for them. The apartment was identified by BENOMRANE as having been at the Avalon Westside Terrace Apartments, 3636 Sepulveda Boulevard, Los Angeles, California, 90034. BENOMRANE later stated that the two Saudi males stayed at the Hilton Hotel on Century Boulevard near LAX upon their arrival into Los Angeles, prior to moving into the apartment.
- In order to determine if KHALID AL-MIHDHAR and NAWAF AL-HAZMI ever stayed at the Hilton Hotel near LAX during their stay in the Los Angeles area, the PENTTBOM Team requests that FBI Los Angeles conduct appropriate investigation at the Los Angeles Airport Hilton, 5771 West Century Boulevard, Los Angeles, California, 90045, telephone number 310-410-4000. Such investigation should consist of a search of hotel records for either of these names for the time period from 01/15/2000 to approximately 02/04/2000.
- BENOMRANE advised that he had been told by AL-THUMAIRY that the two Saudi males were in Los Angeles to visit their sick father. BENOMRANE first advised that their father was in a local hospital; BENOMRANE later stated that their father stayed in their apartment and that their father had accompanied them on the day that BENOMRANE drove the two Saudi males around the Los Angeles area. To date, there is no evidence or intelligence indicating that the father of either KHALID AL-MIHDHAR or NAWAF AL-HAZMI, or another elder male individual, accompanied AL-MIHDHAR and AL-HAZMI to Los Angeles.
- Furthermore, records from the Avalon Westside Terrace Apartments were obtained for rentals in the name of FAHAD AL-THUMAIRY. A review of these records determined that AL-THUMAIRY rented two apartments at approximately the same time during the summer of 2001; specifically, AL-THUMIARY rented apartment (P) from 07/03/2001 to 08/15/2001 and also rented apartment (P) from 07/10/2001 to 08/14/2001. Records also indicated that AL-THUMAIRY rented apartment (P) from 12/27/2001 to 02/13/2002 and apartment (P) from 04/18/2002 to 02/01/2003. It is currently unknown why AL-THUMAIRY held two simultaneous apartment rentals at Avalon Westside Terrace during the summer of 2001.

When interviewed in Los Angeles in 05/2003, AL-THUMAIRY advised that he once had rented an apartment for an associate, (LNU), who had traveled to the United States with his sick father to obtain medical treatment at the University of California - Los Angeles ). AL-THUMAIRY further (UCLA) (reference (UCLA) (reference (F) ). AL-THUMAIRY further advised that the father of (P-1) passed away, after which (P-1) returned to Saudi Arabia. Additional details regarding (P-1) are unknown at this time, such as the name of his father, the type of medical treatment received at UCLA, and the time period during which (P-1) stayed in Los Angeles; however, investigation will continue to identify (P-1) and determine the contact, if any, between BENOMRANE, (P-1) and (P-1) s sick father s sick father. BENOMRANE advised that an unknown individual from Yemen also had contact with the two Saudi males. BENOMRANE described the Yemeni individual as being between 30-36 years old, having a full beard, and driving an American-made off-white minivan and a blue car of unknown make. The Yemeni individual also was an attendee of the King Fahad Mosque. The PENTTBOM Team requests that FBI Los Angeles conduct appropriate investigation to identify this Yemeni individual. If possible, investigation should include inquiries with all sources and cooperating individuals within the King Fahad Mosque to determine any familiarity with a Yemeni individual as described by BENOMRANE. ALI AL-QAHTANI, AHMAD AL-JOHANI, ABDULAH AL-GORAIBI, GONIM M. AL-MOTAIRI, and MOHAMAD AL-GORAIBI. FAHAD AL-OBTAIBI took the course 1999-2000. AL-MOTAIRI is the senior officer of the group. While in San Diego AL-MOTAIRI, AL-JOHANI, and AL-GORAIBI stayed on the base in San Diego. ABDULAH AL-GORAIBI lived in Imperial Beach. All of these individuals are back in Saudi Arabia.

AL WOHAIBI stated he is on standby to leave for Saudi Arabia this Friday (9/28/01) and for Tuesday (10/2/01).

Abdullah went to Grossmont College and later transferred to San Diego State University.

(P) did not know what Abdullah wanted to open his own business, but (P) did not know what type of business it was.

(P) did not know what type of professional life.

Abdullah was originally from Yemen. Abdullah did not have any family in the San Diego, California area. Abdullah did have family in Yemen. (P-1) interrupted the interview saying that, one time during the ten months that Abdullah was staying (P) Abdullah went back to Yemen. (P) could not remember the date that Abdullah had traveled back to Yemen. Except for the trip to Yemen, (P) did not remember Abdullah ever traveling outside of San Diego, California.

Abdullah had a private telephone line in his room.

Abdullah's telephone account was with Cox. (P) did not believe that Abdullah had a computer, a television, a walkie-talkie, or any other communication device. At this point in the interview (P-1) interrupted his father and stated that Abdullah did own a cellular telephone. (P) asked (P-1) what the telephone number was but (P-1)

did not know. Abdullah did, on occasion, use telephone cards. The only car that Abdullah owned was a red Geo Metro.

- (P) owned a computer. Both Abdullah and (P-1) used to use computer a lot. Abdullah used the computer to access the internet and print documents. However, the printer broke and Abdullah had not used the printer for a long time. (P) prohibited Abdullah from using the internet after (P) received a very expensive Pac Bell telephone bill. children. (P) said that Albayoumi had a lot of money, but all
Saudi's had a lot of money so the fact that Albayoumi had money wasn't
unusual.

(P) also recognized photograph number 27 as being (P) had seen (P) at mosque but didn't have any more information about (P)

At one point during the interview, a lawyer named (P) representing Mohdar Abdullah called (P). (P) indicated that (P) told (P) that (P) didn't have to talk to the FBI if he didn't want to. (P) indicated to SA (S) that he wanted to continue speaking with the FBI because he had nothing to hide.

Later in the interview, FBI Special Agent
showed (P) several unused 7.62mm rifle cartridges that had been found
in Abdullah's room. (P) indicated that he never knew Abdullah was
involved with weapons. (P-1) interrupted (P) and told him that he
was aware of Abdullah going to a shooting range to practice shooting.
(P) then told (P-1) to be quiet and not say anything more about
Abdullah.

SA (S) also showed (P) a document with the name (P) with a mailing address of (P) did not recognize the name and stated that (P) had never lived in the apartment.

(P) believed that the attacks on the World Trade Center and the Pentagon were tragic and that they were not permitted under Islamic Law. A jihad was a war fought for the cause of Alla and that according to Islamic teachings no innocent people should ever be killed. (P) believed that the perpetrators of the attack should be executed because according to Islam if you kill some one you should then be killed.

(P) has not heard any one in the mosque speak about hating the United States or being glad that Americans were killed in the attack. He observed NAWAF AL-HAZMI and KHALID LAST NAME UNKNOWN (Hereinafter LNU) exiting the "Guest" room on the second floor of the mosque building, then entering the library also on the second floor. Less then a minute later, Imam ANWAR AULAQI, spiritual leader of Al-Ribat, exited the Guest room, locked the door, then proceeded downstairs to lead evening prayer. ABDOUN did not see any other persons exiting the guest room.

Upon seeing AL-HAZMI and KHALID LNU exit the Guest room, ABDOUN became angry and had an argument with MOHDAR, because ABDOUN thought that NAWAF and KHALID were living in the Guest room. When ABDOUN was homeless, he was told that Al-Ribat had a policy that persons could not live at the mosque. He thought he was being discriminated against because he was not an Arab. MOHDAR assured him that NAWAF and KHALID were just meeting in the room and were not living there. MOHDAR advised that KHALID and NAWAF were in charge of opening the library for three days. MOHDAR was the person who introduced NAWAF and KHALID to the Al Ribat mosque.

Within two weeks of the Al-Ribat mosque incident, he heard that KHALID had left the United States to return to Saudi Arabia. He heard that NAWAF was staying with an old man identified as Dr. SHAIKH. NAWAF left the San Diego soon after KHALID left the U.S. MOHDAR told

He was detained as a Material Witness in this investigation. He is currently in federal custody in San Diego facing charges of providing false information to the United States Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS) to obtain asylum. Abdullah, who is a Yemen national, falsely claimed to be from Somalia in order to apply for asylum in the United States. Abdullah entered the United States from Ottawa, Canada in December 1998. He has been in custody since his arrest on September 21, 2001.

Abdullah resided at California, telephone (P) between 1999 and 2000. His roommates included (P) (P) (last name unknown), (P) (last name unknown), (P) (last name unknown), and (P) He later moved to (P) El Cajon, California and rented a room from (P) . (P) was born (P-1) in (P) . Abdullah's personal cell phone at this address was

Telephone billing records of Abdullah's cell phone obtained during a search of his residence indicated that he called Italian number on 105 different occasions. The majority of all of his calls were of very short duration, usually only one minute. Abdullah also used multiple prepaid calling cards in addition to his cell phone. The last call to the Italian number was an 18 minute call made on August 24, 2001. Abdullah only made one other call after this one (to a number in Texas), then he quit using the phone. He did not terminate the phone service at this time.

Abdullah, when interviewed by agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation in October in the presence of his attorney, stated that he lived in Italy between December 1997 to April 1998. He has a brother named (P) who lives in Rome. Abdullah stated that he maintains



Alp Karli, DALLAH AVCO (DA) Director of Contracts and Finance, and Presidency of Civil Aviation (PCA) was interviewed. Employees Abdullah Alghanmi, Yousif Salam, and one other person, name unknown attended the meeting. Present also were

This meeting had been suggested after having met with representatives of the Dallah Albaraka Group (DAG) the prior week

DAG owns and operates DA. Though four individuals were present during the interview, Alp Karli provided the majority of the answers. Karli provided the following information:

DA is a contractor to the PCA (the equivalent of the U.S. Federal Aviation Administration) and in that capacity DA supplies personnel on a three year revolving contractual basis. The approximately 650 foreign national personnel DA hires provide logistical support on PCA responsibilities including runway engineering, radar, and navigational aids. Mr. Alghami, as an employee of the PCA, coordinates payments to DA and other PCA contractors. The PCA contracts with a number of companies such as DA for various types of support pertinent to air travel administration.

Omar Al Bayoumi, a Saudi Arabian citizen, was employed by the PCA from 1977 through 1995 in various administrative positions including Aviation Fees Checker, Budget Clerk, Accounts Checker, Section Head, and Accountant. Al Bayoumi obtained a Bachelors degree from Saudi based King Abdul Aziz University while working for the PCA. In 1995, Al Bayoumi discussed with Karli the possibility to study abroad in order to achieve career advancement within the PCA. recalled that Al Bayoumi had vacationed in the U.S. and as a result desired advanced education there. Karli explained that such requests are encouraged and are part and parcel of a program known locally as Based upon Saudization, Saudi nationals are allowed leave from civil employment to pursue additional education abroad with the intent that they return to a civil position upon completion of the degrees or training. The Saudization philosophy resulted in an informal agreement between DA and the PCA in which Al Bayoumi has been, since June 1995, temporarily released from the PCA. From that point to the present, DA has paid Al Bayoumi as a Senior Data Processing Technician.

Al Bayoumi, as part of the agreement, was expected to obtain higher education degree(s) in the U.S. or other English speaking countries. As an aside from obtaining the degrees, Al Bayoumi was expected to improve his English reading and writing skills. abroad, Al Bayoumi was paid by DA a combination of salary, housing and family expenses further detailed in pages 24 through 49 out of a total of 98 documents provided and certified by Karli. Karli explained that generally the housing allowance equals two months salary, transportation equals one months salary, and other allowances are determined by negotiation. Karli mentioned that Al Bayoumi's salary was intended to include the funds for him to pay for tuition and books though Al Bayoumi did at times request additional funds for tuition as documented on pages 95 through 97. Al Bayoumi is required by DA to submit receipts for his tuition payments.

Al Bayoumi's payments by DA were made via deposits into his Saudi American Bank account. Karli provided copies of said deposits, which are detailed in attached pages 61 thorough 92. Al Bayoumi's salary at the PCA was suspended when DA began their payments. was not aware if Al Bayoumi made payments from his DA salary to the General Organization for Social Insurance (GOSI) (like the U.S. Social Security) while he was abroad. Karli mentioned that when he learned Al Bayoumi was receiving additional funds for his assistance in establishing a Mosque in San Diego, he lowered DA's payments by an unstated amount. There are no expectations that Al Bayoumi would pay back the funds paid to him by DA while abroad. While Karli could not recall any circumstances in particular, he stated that while DA made no loans to Al Bayoumi they could have given him advances to be applied against future salary.

Al Bayoumi is expected to complete his education in England by March 2002 and subsequently return to Saudi Arabia for employment by the PCA. By the time he returns, Al Bayoumi will have obtained both a Masters and Doctorate degree. Al Bayoumi is required to show proof of completion of the two degrees to both DA and the GOSI. The GOSI would reduce Al Bayoumi's retirement payments if the courses he took abroad were not completed. Karli noted that Al Bayoumi is hoping to get Karli's position upon his return to Saudi Arabia though with his level of education, he is technically over qualified for the job. Karli continued that it would take him about six months to train Al Bayoumi for his position.

Karli, upon approval of the PCA employees present, provided the interviewing agents copies of 98 pertinent documents which detail

the extent of his relationship to Al-Bayoumi and to determine if he had any dealings with the two Flight 77 hijackers.

On 09/24/2001 Seattle contacted and interviewed (P) who confirmed he was in fact the (P) who lived with (P) in San Diego.

(P) was shown photos of Al-Bayoumi and the two hijackers. He said he saw Al-Bayoumi once at his apartment; that Al-Bayoumi at the time was talking with another roommate of his who was Jordan and whose name he could not recall. With regard to the two hijackers, (P) said he never saw them before.

(P) was very friendly and cooperative during his contact with Seattle agents.

on 09/25/2001 Seattle contacted and interviewed at his apartment in Burien, Washington. He and (P) are currently roommates. (P) is registered as a student at South Seattle Community College taking General Education courses. He acknowledged living in San Diego and attended Grossmont College there enrolled in English as a Second Language courses. When SA (S) showed him a photo of Al-Bayoumi, he acknowledged meeting him at a mosque near his apartment. He knew him as "Omar", but did not know his last name. He met Omar's wife and children and understands he is presently in England studying for his doctorate degree. He said Omar was a very friendly person and visited him at his apartment a couple of times. They never talked about politics or any controversial issues in the world. 

Of the above mentioned photographs, (P) identified photograph #20 of Omar Ahmed Albayoumi. However, the Visa expired and Bassnan remained in the US illegally. Prior to moving to San Diego, California, Bassnan studied engineering at a college in Los Angeles, California. 1999, Bassnan claimed to be married to three women. One of these women was a US citizen who Bassnan had a son with. (P-1) (currently approximately Bassnan's son, (P-1) years old) resides with Bassnan in San Diego, California. Bassnan divorced two of his previous wives (including the mother and remained married to a Palestinian women from Israel. Bassnan claims that his current wife had a cousin that was a member of the militant Islamic group "Hamas," and was killed in combat.

The Source (A).(G).(J-1) Bassnan at the "Fumari Café" (known to the agents to be located at (P), San Diego, California). Further, Bassnan claimed to be in frequent telephonic contact with members of Bin Laden's family living in the US. The Source believed that Bassnan engaged in calls to and from members of Bin Laden's family using Bassnan's mobile telephone. Bassnan has utilized the same mobile telephone number (P) for the past (A),(G),(J-1) years for the past  $^{(A),(G),(J-1)}$ years. telephone number, Bassnan also claimed that when he lived in Saudi Arabia, Bassnan frequently traveled to the country of Egypt to meet with a group espousing extreme actions in support of Islam. This group promulgated very passionate rhetoric in support of their beliefs.

Speaking of the US's involvement in the Persian Gulf War in 1991, Bassnan expressed the opinion that the US's sole reason for fighting that war was oil. Further, Bassnan stated that Saddam Hussein must have been working for the US otherwise he would have been killed or overthrown.

Bassnan also expressed his happiness and approval of the 2000 bombing of a US Navy ship (USS Cole) in Yemen. Bassnan expressed the view that the US was getting what it deserved for "putting its nose" into everything in the Middle East. Bassnan expressed his admiration at the skill and devotion of the suicide attackers.

In approximately March, 2001 Bassnan expressed (A),(G),(J-1) his disapproval and anger about a Palestinian child who was killed by Israeli soldiers in the "West Bank." Bassnan verbally expressed the opinion that the Palestinian people should engage in suicide bombings in order to fight back against perceived injustices perpetrated by the Israeli people against the Palestinians.

Bassnan receive an incoming telephone call on his mobile telephone (P) After the call, Bassnan advised that the caller was calling from Saudi Arabia and was a very wealthy

grandson or great grandson of the Saudi Arabian King Fahd. The caller instructed Bassnan to make arrangements for a Saudi Arabian male, first name unknown (FNU), last name unknown (LNU), in his early twenties, who was living in Santa Monica, California, to come to San Diego, California, in order to "study." Soon thereafter Bassnan arranged with a Middle Eastern taxi driver named (P) LNU to travel to Santa Monica and transport this FNU LNU to San Diego. Bassnan paid (P) LNU \$300.00 to do this. (P) LNU is from Sudan and obtained political asylum in the US. FNU LNU from Santa Monica was further described as a Saudi Arabian male approximately 6'3" in height, thin with a dark complexion.

Source was shown a photograph of Omar Albayoumi, date of birth (P-1) Source stated the photo looked very much like a person he knew as Omar LNU from Jordan. Omar LNU (hereinafter referred to as Albayoumi) usually wore eyeglasses and was not wearing eyeglasses in the photograph.

In approximately September, 2000, Bassnan met Albayoumi. The Source recalled between approximately January, 2001, and sometime in the Spring of 2001, Albayoumi was living with the two young Middle Eastern males in or near the La Mesa, California area. The Source thought one of the males staying with Albayoumi was Lebanese. Albayoumi and Bassnan were very close friends and the Source saw Bassnan and Albayoumi together on at least two separate occasions.

Bassnan looked after Albayoumi who was in need of financial assistance. Bassnan often invited Albayoumi over to his house and both Albayoumi and Bassnan professed to be devote Muslims. Both men spent a lot of time together at a Muslim Mosque in San Diego, California.

On at least five separate occasions, the Source observed Bassnan talking telephonically on his mobile telephone (P-1) with Albayoumi. These calls were a combination of incoming and outgoing calls between Bassnan and Albayoumi. The last time Source observed Bassnan speaking on the phone with Albayoumi was sometime in the Spring of 2001, the end of the same time frame when Albayoumi was living with the two young Middle Eastern males in or near La Mesa, California.

Bassnan received a call on his mobile phone from (P) LNU. After the call, Bassnan immediately left the restaurant and met (P) LNU parked out front in his new Mercedes Benz car. The Source thought his behavior was out of character for Bassnan. Bassnan usually spoke openly about the nature of his association with his friends and where they were going when Bassnan departed the company of others. However, Bassnan never mentioned the nature of his relationship with (P) LNU and never related where he was going with (P) LNU. The Source believed that Bassnan and (P) LNU had some sort of secret or confidential business together. Bassnan and LNU's relationship with each other was also noteworthy because they had very different personalities.

During the Summer of 2001, Bassnan and (P) LNU traveled to Arizona together and stayed there for four days before returning to the San Diego, California area. Bassnan claimed business was the purpose of the travel.

When Source became aware of the September 11, 2001, terrorist attacks in New York City, New York, and Washington, DC, the Source remembers having the immediate thought that Bassnan may have something to do with the attacks. This thought was strengthened when the Source became aware from television news coverage that two of the terrorists were from the San Diego, California, area. Bassnan has stated that he believes that if he were to die fighting against the enemies of Islam, he would go to heaven.

Upon completion of the interview, at approximately in the presence of the agents, the Source placed a consensually recorded telephone call to Bassnan at mobile telephone number (P) The telephone conversation was in Arabic (A), (G), (J-1) Immediately after the call, the Source advised that Bassnan seemed distracted and (A), (G), (J-1)

On September (G) 2001, Source viewed a small black and white photograph known to be that of Omar Al-Bayoumi. Source positively identified the person in the photograph as a person known to Source as "Omar," who was friends with BASSNAN. During the interview of September (G), 2001, Source was shown better quality color photographs of Omar Bakarbashat and Omar Al-Bayoumi side by side. During a consensually recorded conversation on September (A).(G).(J-1) 2001, BASSNAN referred to the terrorist hijackers who had lived in San Diego, California as "boys" or "youth," according to the English translation of the recorded conversation. Source informed that the Arabic word used by BASSNAN was "ayel." According to Source's definition, the Arabic word "ayel" means a young person who has a close relationship to the speaker. For example, a person would refer to their own children or other younger relatives as "ayel" but would not use "ayel" in reference to a younger person who is a stranger. In sum, Source indicated that the use of the word "ayel" by BASSNAN when referring to the hijackers was a term of endearment.

In an unintelligible portion of the recording BASSNAN referred to confusion in the United States in two or three years. More specifically, BASSNAN was telling Source that in two or three years the United States would cease to exist in its current form and would be broken up similar to the former Soviet Union.

For the past eight months, BASSNAN has regularly driven a car registered to, Majeda Ibrahim Dweikat, previously identified. DWEIKAT is BASSNAN's wife. In April or May, 2001, BASSNAN drove this car to Arizona with a (P), last name unknown (LNU) to attend what BASSNAN described as a business conference. (P) LNU has been previously identified as a very wealthy middle eastern (P) year old male who had some sort of confidential business with BASSNAN.

(P) LNU from (P) works at (P) in Pacific Beach, California. (P) LNU used to work for (P), previously identified, who owns the (P) in San Diego, California. (P) 's former business partner (P) LNU told (P) LNU that the FBI had approached (P) and interviewed him because the (P) was suspected of providing pilot training to the terrorist hijackers while they were in San Diego, California.

In approximately April or May, 2001 BASSNAN got into a fight with his wife, DWEIKAT, and had to move out of his

residence for three days. BASSNAN went and lived with BAKARBASHAT for three days at BAKARBASHAT's residence somewhere near the La Mesa, California area of the San Diego metropolitan area. At the time BASSNAN went to live with BAKARBASHAT, two middle eastern males described known to be students were living with BAKARBASHAT and working at a gas station.

BASSNAN was known to reach out to young people of Arabic descent who had recently arrived in the San Diego area and needed to find work or housing. BASSNAN was known to approach them and remind them of their religious duties as Muslims and encourage them to be faithful to Muslim beliefs. In one particular incident (P) LNU was in the United States on a student visa and was purportedly attending school in the downtown area of San Diego, California. (P) LNU approached BASSNAN and informed BASSNAN that he was in danger of being deported out of the United States because he was not attending school regularly enough. BASSNAN told (P) LNU not to worry. BASSNAN said he would talk to someone BASSNAN had a relationship with at the school in order to convince the school to not deport (P) LNU despite his lack of the required days of attendance in order to maintain a student visa.

BASSNAN was known to help several other young persons or students of Arabic descent as well. BASSNAN would often invite and encourage these young people to attend the local mosque.

(P) was working at the (P) at the time Al-Bayoumi arrived in San Diego, California. Al-Bayoumi was living on Beadnell Way, San Diego, California.

Al-Bayoumi asked (P) to help him with computer problems Al-Bayoumi would have. (P) has been to Al-Bayoumi's Beadnell Way apartment several times to fix Al-Bayoumi's computer. On those occasions (P) would have tea and sometimes eat dinner with Al-Bayoumi. (P) also fixed Al-Bayoumi's computer when he moved into the Mount Ada Road apartments.

On one occasion (P) met a retired teacher at Al-Bayoumi's apartment. (P) believed the retired teacher (unknown name) was teaching Al-Bayoumi English. (P) only met the retired teacher once. The retired teacher and Al-Bayoumi were discussing the Presidential election. Al-Bayoumi favored former President Clinton, while the retired teacher favored President Bush. Al-Bayoumi's English was okay, but he had an accent, which was why (P) believed Al-Bayoumi was taking English lessons.

- (P) recalled attending a party three or four years ago with Al-Bayoumi. It was a going away party for (P) Last Name Unknown (LNU), who attended the Islamic Center. Invitations went to a lot of people who attend the mosque including (P). Al-Bayoumi also invited (P) later and (P) advised he already had an invitation. Al-Bayoumi and (P) drove together to the party. The party was held in Mission Valley on Friars Road in an apartment complex. (P) was unable to recall the address. Al-Bayoumi knew (P) LNU very well. 

Approximately six months ago, Bayoumi told members at ICSD (including (P) ) that he was leaving for the UK to go to school to receive his PHD. (P) has had no subsequent contact with Bayoumi since that time and believes Bayoumi is currently in the United Kingdom (UK) studying for his PHD. Bayoumi used to live on (P) in San Diego in an apartment. (P) never visited him however.

Bayoumi indicated he was living in San Diego on a scholarship from the Saudi government. It also appeared he was being supported financially by the government. It is unknown how Bayoumi received his funding. Possibilities include wire transfer, checks, or obtaining the money from someone associated with the Saudi consulate. Bayoumi claimed he had friends at the Saudi consulate in Los Angeles, CA.

Bayoumi is described as approximately 5'10", medium build, in his late 30's to early 40's. P) recalls that Bayoumi may have made mention that he worked for the Saudi Airlines and possibly could have received his scholarship from them. P) is not positive about this however. P) believes that Bayoumi may have worked for one of the Saudi princes with his business. This was based upon past comments made by Bayoumi to P).

Bayoumi attended Phoenix University while in San Diego. He and his family came to San Diego in 1992 or 1993. He has three children. Bayoumi's wife's name is Rolla (phonetic). Bayoumi was involved in raising money and the building of a new mosque in El Cajon, CA. Approximately two or three years ago Bayoumi purchased a gold colored Nissan or Chevrolet.

ABDULLAH made it very clear that he wanted to marry an American Muslim girl. He indicated that his dream girl would be someone very much like (P) but she would have to be more traditional, not wear any make-up and definitely cover her face.

(P) currently lives with her mother, (P) sisters and brothers. (P) is the eldest. (P) father is still residing in but will be coming to the United States soon.

ABDULLAH normally attended the Apabukar and the Al Ribat (phonetic) Mosques. Based on the Muslim religion, they must pray five times a day. For fun, ABDULLAH enjoyed going to the beach and barbequing. (P) was unaware of ABDULLAH enjoying target shooting. She felt that ABDULLAH was too much of a nervous person to actually shoot a gun. She said that he was a very careful driver and did not like showing off.

ABDULLAH was very lonely here in America because he did not have any family here. He always indicated that all his brothers were still back in the country. ABDULLAH had no sisters. 





At approximately 3:45 p.m., OMER SALMAIN SALEH BAKARBASHAT, date of birth (P-1) Social Security Account Number (P-1) (P-1) of (P) , Lemon Grove, California (CA), was interviewed at the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) San Diego office. Special Agents (SA) (S) and (S) (S) and SA (S) After being advised the identity of the interviewing agents and the purpose of the interview, BAKARBASHAT provided the following information:

BAKARBASHAT admitted he attempted to utilize software he obtained via the internet which would enable him to create false documents. The website advertised claimed the software would enable the user to create several types of documents. These documents included fake or forged Social Security cards, drivers licenses, green cards, college transcripts and various other documents.

BAKARBASHAT possessed the legitimate Social Security Account Number of (P-1) and held a Social Security card. However, the card was stamped "Not Valid For Employment". Due to this stamp, BAKARBASHAT was unable to legally obtain a job. He did not possess a valid work permit.

He purchased a blank Social Security Card for \$20.00 from an African American male he met at the airport and unsuccessfully attempted to forge the document. BAKARBASHAT believed if he had been successful in the forgery, he would have possessed an identification card which would have enabled him to obtain a job.

BAKARBASHAT found a job at Texaco gas station, Spring Street, La Mesa, CA, whereby his work permit status or visa status was inconsequential. He was paid in cash. (P) of the business was (P) was cognizant of the fact BAKARBASHAT did not possess proper work permit status. (P) several other gas stations in the San Diego, CA area. BAKARBASHAT knew of other employees at Texaco who were paid in cash.

BAKARBASHAT admitted he was in the United States illegally as his student visa had run out. He no longer attended school.

BAKARBASHAT could not recall the owner of email address

(P) . However, he stated it was a friend who worked with him at the Texaco gas station on Spring Street. BAKARBASHAT believed he moved to (P) .

ABDULRHAMAN ALATTAS was a high school friend who received his masters degree in accounting from Denver University. He moved back to Saudi Arabia where he lived with his wife and children.

KHALID AL YAFAI was a fellow student at the English Language School (ELS) in San Diego, CA. He moved back to Saudi Arabia six months ago. While in San Diego, AL YAFAI lived with an American family near Genessee and Clairemont Mesa Boulevard.

It should be noted that SA (S) provided BAKARBASHAT a soft drink at the onset of the interview. At approximately 5:00 p.m., BAKARBASHAT went to the restroom and was permitted to pray. (BAKARBASHAT, a Muslim, prays at specific times of the day, five times per day).

It should also be noted that BAKARBASHAT was asked questions pertaining to information revealed from a consensual search of his computer. The results of the search are memorialized in a separate report.



Al BAYOUMI asked for a personal recommendation from ALSHAMI but ALSHAMI refused. ALSHAMI did not know Al BAYOUMI and could not make a recommendation for someone he does not know. Al BAYOUMI was disappointed and thought ALSHAMI should have made the recommendation.







Faisal confirmed his date of birth to be (P-1) and his place of birth as Jeddah, Saudi Arabia. He verified he possessed a State of California driver's permit, number (P-1), but not a valid California drivers license. Faisal showed an international drivers license bearing the number (P-1), issued on December 9, 2000.

Faisal provided his Saudi passport bearing number (P-1) The passport bore a stamp dated February 4, 1999 which Faisal confirmed as his date of entry into the United States from Saudi Arabia. His reason for entering the U.S. was to study English and advance his accounting aspirations.

Faisal's father is Ahmed Abdulazziz Suleiman Al-Hamdan. Faisal described his father as a high-ranking Saudi Government official who works as a director within the Ministry of Finance. Faisal's father is responsible for the oversight of Government accounting affairs in Western Saudi Arabia. Faisal reported his father has worked for the Saudi Government his entire life. Ahmed Al-Hamdan is to retire from his post with the Saudi Government in October 2001.

Faisal's family is comprised of his father, mother, and six siblings including himself. Faisal's two brothers, Talal and Abdulazziz, presently reside with Faisal in Riverside, California and are college students. Abdulazziz attends Chaffey College near Riverside, California. Currently, Talal is not taking classes but will attend Compton Community College in Los Angeles, California.

Khalid, another brother of Faisal, is a part-time student in Saudi Arabia. Khalid is twenty-seven years of age and is employed part-time in the marketing field. Abdulalah, Faisal's fourth brother,

is ten years old and attends grade school in Saudi Arabia. Dania is Faisal's only sister and is a 25 year old college student in Saudi Afaf is Faisal's mother and has spent her life raising her children. She has never worked outside her home in any capacity.

Upon his entry into the Unites States, Faisal attended the ELS Language Center (ELS) at 1200 Third Ave., San Diego, California 92101, to study English as a second language. Faisal resided at Lake Village Apartments, La Mesa, California, 91942, with his brother Talal while attending ELS. confirmed the signing of his lease at Lake Village Apartments coincided with the initiation of classes at ELS. Talal was in the U.S. prior to Faisal's arrival. During this time period, Talal stayed at a hotel located at Hotel Circle in San Diego, but Faisal could not recall the name of the hotel.

At no time during his stay in the U.S. did Faisal have a roommate aside from his brother Talal. Faisal may have allowed an acquaintance from the mosque he attended to stay in his apartment overnight, but he could not recall a specific time when this occurred. The Islamic mosque Faisal and Talal attended while residing at Lake Village Apartments was located in La Mesa, California.

Faisal left the Lake Village Apartments in December 1999 to return to his home in Jeddah, Saudi Arabia. He stayed in Jeddah for approximately two months to visit his family and rest before returning to the U.S. in January 2000. Upon his return, Faisal leased another apartment at Lake Village Apartments. Talal had signed all lease documents on behalf of Faisal prior to leaving the U.S. Once at home in Jeddah, Talal provided the new apartment keys to Faisal. took residence in the apartment when he returned to the U.S. to take English courses at the American Language Institute (ALI) at San Diego State University (SDSU). After living alone at Lake Village Apartments for approximately three months, Faisal moved to La Mirage Apartments, , San Diego, California, 92124 with Talal as a roommate.

Faisal left San Diego in late December 2000, in order to be with his family in Jeddah for Ramadan. Faisal returned to the U.S. in February 2001. He stayed with his brothers Talal and Abdulazziz approximately one month at Riverside, California.

Faisal returned to San Diego where he continued his English courses. During this time period, he was attending Grossmont Community

College. Faisal again resided at La Mirage Apartments, but at Apt. <sup>(P)</sup> . Faisal left La Mirage in late May 2001 once he had finished classes at Grossmont Community College and returned to Riverside, California to live with his brothers at the Lochmoor address.

Faisal reconfirmed that at no time during his stay in the U.S. did he or his brother invite or permit any strangers to reside with them for any period of time. Also, Faisal reconfirmed that neither he nor his brother ever allowed any acquaintance or friend to stay overnight for more than one 24-hour period. Faisal could not recall a specific event when this occurred, but speculated he might have allowed a friend to stay overnight at some point. Being a rare event, Faisal could not recall the name of any friend who might have stayed overnight at his apartment.

Faisal advised he rented only one Post Office Box during his stav in the U.S. That box address was located at San Diego, California, 92120 and was opened November 27, 2000. He closed the box in June 2000 upon his return to Riverside, California.

Faisal is not taking any college courses at the present time. He intends to sit for the Certified Public Accountant test in the near future. In the meantime, he will research where he will take additional accounting courses. Faisal obtained his bachelors degree in accounting from King Abdulazziz University in Saudi Arabia.

Faisal confirmed he listed Omar Al-Bayoumi as the emergency point-of-contact on his ELS and ALI applications. Faisal knows of Al-Bayoumi, but characterized him as a business associate of his father, Ahmed Al-Hamdan. Faisal had heard his father mention Al-Bayoumi's name on occasion, but Faisal did not recall Al-Bayoumi ever visiting the Al-Hamdan family at their residence in Jeddah, Saudi Arabia. Faisal met Al-Bayoumi for the first time upon arriving in San Diego in February 1999. He met Al-Bayoumi with his brother, Talal, in the Abu Bakar mosque in San Diego. Faisal confirmed the mosque was located on Eckstrom Street when provided with area street names by the interviewing agent.

Faisal described Al-Bayoumi as a person who was somewhat well known by his father. Faisal knew that Al-Bayoumi was one of many subordinates working for his father, but he could not recollect Al-Bayoumi's specific employment title.

Faisal approximated that he and Talal visited Al-Bayoumi at his Beadnell Way apartment in San Diego on ten separate occasions. He estimated that Al-Bayoumi visited him and Talal at their Lake Village Apartment on three occasions. Faisal described these meetings as formal in nature. Al-Bayoumi would ask the majority of the questions which were generally centered around school. Faisal was advised by his father to reach out to Al-Bayoumi upon arriving in San Diego. his father's portrayals, Faisal understood Al-Bayoumi to be an experienced and reliable point-of-contact in San Diego. Al-Bayoumi told Faisal he could not locate any in Birmingham. Faisal was confused by the request feeling it unusual that Al-Bayoumi could not find the volleyballs or nets in Birmingham. Regardless, Faisal said he would try to locate the equipment locally. Al-Bayoumi said Faisal could deduct the expenses of the equipment from the proceeds from the sale of his wife's car.

Faisal did not put significant effort into locating the sports equipment Al-Bayoumi was seeking. During a later telephone conversation, Al-Bayoumi told Faisal that someone else had purchased the sports equipment with their own credit card, but Al-Bayoumi hoped that Faisal would pay the purchaser cash so the purchaser could avoid any interest charges on his credit card account. Faisal identified the purchaser as (P) , an employee of in San Diego. Faisal told Al-Bayoumi the timing was bad and asked him to wait for two additional weeks to pay (P). (P) began calling Faisal to ask the status of re-payment for the Al-Bayoumi equipment. Faisal e-mailed Al-Bayoumi to advise him of (P) 's constant phone calls and requested that Al-Bayoumi intervene. Later, Al-Bayoumi e-mailed Faisal stating that someone else had handled payment to (P) Faisal did not keep any of the e-mails sent by Al-Bayoumi and showed the interviewing agent the contents of his e-mail box.

Regarding his travel in the U.S., Faisal stated he visited Los Angeles approximately four to five times. He went there as a tourist to see Sunset Boulevard and Century Mall. Faisal has visited two Arabic cafes in Los Angeles named Gypsy and Habibi. Some time in 2000, Faisal visited his friend, (P) in Pueblo, Colorado. Faisal met (P) when he was attending ELS and (P) was attending ALI in San Diego. Faisal also visited his sister, Dania, at in Houston, Texas. Dania had Faisal stayed at a hotel near the hospital. He could not recall the name of the medical center or the hotel.

Faisal reported he never traveled overseas except to visit his family in Jeddah, Saudi Arabia during the time period he was residing in the U.S.

Al-Towayan and Al-Bayoumi became friends and related to each other since they were both from Saudi Arabia. (P) found an apartment for Al-Towayan in the same complex Al-Bayoumi lived in. (P) went with Al-Towayan when he filled out the rental application. Al-Towayan used Al-Bayoumi as a reference or referral to the apartment complex. On 12/15/01, (P) was interviewed for the second time at the United States Embassy in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia.  After he was advised of the identities of Special Agent (S) and Supervisory Special Agent (S) and the nature of the interview. (P) then voluntarily furnished the following information:
(P) was presented with a photo album containing photographs of twenty-eight (28) different individuals. The photographs consisted of the hijackers from AA flight 11, UA flight 93, UA flight 175, AA flight 77 and nine (9) San Diego associates as provided by the San Diego Division.
While examining the photographs, (P) pointed out photo number 20 and stated "that's him." When asked who he was referring to, (P) stated that the photograph is that of "Mr. Bayoumi." A review of the sheet containing the corresponding names in the photographs (name list) identified photograph number 20 as that of OMAR AL-BAYOUMI.
(P) continued to examine the photograph book and pointed to photograph number 28 and stated "I recognize him from somewhere." (P) explained that he recognized the man's face but did not know his name. (P) added that he thought the man was a student from Yemen whom he had met at the RIBAT mosque in El Cajon, California.
(P) had met the man on his last trip to the US which was approximately one and one half years ago.
A review of the same name list identified photograph number 28 as that of MOHDAR ABDULLAH. (P) was not able to recall the name and was not provided with it by the interviewing Agents.

A copy of a photograph [known as attached 1A envelope] was shown to (P). He advised that he had never seen the individual. He also added that he had a very good memory for faces, but not for names.

Upon inquiry, (P) advised that when he had traveled to Yemen, he had not visited any other countries. advised that he had been invited to visit Sudan by an Islamic scholar, but that he had declined the invitation. other country that (P) had thought of traveling to was Saudi Arabia for a pilgrimage to Mecca. He advised that on his way to Yemen he transited through Frankfurt, and stopped in Rome before arriving at San'a. On his return from Yemen, he stopped over in London for 24 hours. He ate halal food at a deli in the Marble Arch area of London. (P) advised that he also met a Muslim male on the Underground and inquired where he could find an Islamic center. Because it was so late at night, (P) only made a call to the center, but did not visit. From London he flew directly to Los Angeles LAX, and then to Santa Barbara where his family lives. He added that he had not had any trouble obtaining a Yemeni visa, which he had applied for prior to the bombing of the U.S.S. Cole.

(P) advised that he believes he was granted a visa because he is a Muslim.

While in Yemen, P) advised that he had attended a type of mosque that had a "very correct view". However, he stated that all of the mosques in Yemen have problems with American foreign policy. He also advised that Usama Bin Laden and his Al Qaeda organization could have recruited from the mosque that he attended, as well as any other mosque in Yemen. Upon inquiry, P) denied ever having met ABDUL MAJI ZINDANI in Yemen. He advised that he had met somebody at the University of Light, which he knew to be ZINDANI's school. Upon embarking on his study of Islam there, he realized that the books were written by Wahabis, therefore P) was no longer interested in studying at this school. (P) advised that he stayed away from any Wahabi influences as he did not agree with their beliefs. He added that there were very few Wahabis in Yemen.

(P) was asked whether he had ever been approached in any way to do something in the name of Islam. (P) advised that he had been approached three times in Yemen. The first time, he was asked whether he would travel to Saudi Arabia to propagate Islam to the U.S. military because he was an American (P) (P) advised that he had declined the offer. The second time he was approached, (P) was asked whether he wanted to travel to meet USAMA BIN LADEN. He declined that offer as well. The third time (P) was approached was when Intifada broke out in Israel. He was asked whether he was ready to go to jihad, to which he responded that he was waiting for the real jihad that has a leader, according to Islam.

On whether he had ever been asked to study Islam in Saudi Arabia, (P) responded that he had been asked to study in Egypt when he was in San Diego. He had visited with the Egyptian Ambassador, but after doing some research, he learned of many restrictions there which created doubts in his mind.

(P) decided not to accept this offer. (P) advised that the Muslim people that he associated with had encouraged him instead to go to Saudi Arabia because it was more suited to his Islamic beliefs. At the present time, (P) has never traveled to or studied in Saudi Arabia.

Upon inquiry, (P) advised that he knew no one by the name of (P). He also added that most of the Muslim population in the (P) area was Somali, and that that was not a Somali name. However, he had never met anyone with that name anywhere.

In advised that there were two mosques. The mosque closest to downtown ( $1\frac{1}{2}$  to 2 miles) was the (P) Mosque on (P) Street. This mosque is also known as the Islamic Center of (P). The other mosque is Mosque on (P) Avenue, which is west of the city, closer to the airport. This mosque is Shia, a sect of Islam that has different religious beliefs than (P) (he is a Sunni Muslim). (P) stated that he had never been to this mosque, and that he does not know the (P) there, although he has e-mailed him recently. He added that there is another mosque in (P), but that he had never been there because it was too far away. He also advised that the Islamic (P) but is in that he has had no contact with that institution either.

According to P), the Islamic Center of does not have an Islamic scholar. Upon inquiry, P) advised that he has no knowledge of any of the Somali members of the mosque who may have participated in the conflict with the United States in Somalia. He stated that, in general, the Somalis are still "smarting from the American invasion" into their country, but that he does not consider any of them to have the radical beliefs of other Muslim groups. However, P) advised that because he does not know their language, he is unable to take part in their discussions. He also added that most of the Somalis in the

Somalia to the United States in the past five years.

At the present time, (P) advised that he is not on good terms with the (P) . There had been conflicts in the past between (P) and the other members due to his preference to do things "by the book", and their lack of observance of certain restrictions. (P) advised that he believed the Somalis were ignorant of certain important Islamic restrictions, and that because he often voiced his displeasure at their lack of observance, a rift had been created. This rift increased when (P) gave an (P) earlier this week that portrayed him as an traitor. Becaus of this, the (P) of the mosque made a public statement condemning (P) and forbidding him to worship at the mosque.

(P) advised that he had not met with any of the hijackers prior to September 11, 2001. He stated that he had not seen them since he had left San Diego in the early spring of 2000. He also added that his wife at that time, (P) had told him that the Muslim community that he associated with in San Diego was laughing at him behind his back. Because of this, when (P) left the area, he intentionally did not retain any of their addresses or telephone numbers.

In describing OMAR AL-BAYOUMI, (P) advised that he was courteous, friendly, and very religious. He only met NAWAF AL-HAZMI and KAHLID AL-MIHDHAR through AL-BAYOUMI.

(P) believes that if anything had been being planned among this group of people, he would have known about it. However, because he was unaware of any terrorist plots, (P) believes that this could be because they were helping other Muslims, unaware of the overall plans. Because of this, (P) believes that his friends may have just been helping other Muslims, unaware of participating in any terrorist plots.

(P) advised that when he consulted Islamic

scholars regarding their view of the attacks on September 11, 2001, the response was that they were unequivocally wrong.

(P) was then asked whether any of the scholars he had consulted with believed in the appropriateness of USAMA BIN LADEN's beliefs.

(P) advised that he has studied Islam extensively and that a martial side definitely exists. Based on these beliefs, many of the theories of BIN LADEN are Islamically correct, despite the fact that he is a Wahabi.

Upon inquiry, (P) advised that he had met (P)

American (P) in San Diego when he was living there. He advised that he had met a man named (P) an American (P)

who was a friend of AL-BAYOUMI. (P) described him as a nice person who was passionate about learning Islam. (P) was a Caucasian male in his mid-30's. (P) added that he had visited him once, but that he did not remember the location of his residence. He also recalls (P) moving and possibly looking for roommates. When asked about (P) who were (P) in the U.S. military, (P) remembers an African American Muslim who was in the armed forces, but he does not him to be a (P) had met him once in the mosque, but could not recall his name.

(P) advised that he had visited three mosques during the time he was in San Diego: the Abu Bakr Mosque on Balboa. He also attended the mosque on University Avenue in East San Diego, and the Kurdish mosque.

When questioned about USAMA BIN LADEN, (P) stated that he did not have an opinion about him since he had not met the man. He only knows him as a Muslim who practices Islam.

meetings, all Middle Eastern males, in the parking lot of the Villa West apartments. She stated many of the men who attended these meetings drove large, luxury cars. (P) advised they would raise their voices and argue during these meetings. (P) and her husband eventually told them they could no longer meet in the parking lot and they began to threaten them. After (P) called the police, these individuals began meeting in apartments (P) and (P) advised she reported this information to an FBI Agent in San Diego named (S). She believed she last spoke to (S) in March or April of 1999.

recalled another Middle Eastern male in apartment number (P) (Villa Balboa) named (P), who said he was a student from Pakistan. She stated he had several roommates staying with him that were not on the lease, and she could not recall their names. She stated another individual named (P) lived in apartment number (P) (Villa Balboa) and left a \$4,000.00 and a \$10,000.00 telephone bill when he moved out.

(P) stated she remembered that all of these individuals lied and could not keep track of the lies they had previously told.

(P) recalled there was another Middle Eastern individual named Khalid who lived with either (P) or (P). She stated Khalid would always get "in her face" and was very loud.

(P) remembered (P) as non-confrontational and he would call her on the phone rather than talk to her in person. (P) advised she may be able to recognize Khalid and (P) if she saw them again.

(P) provided one page of handwritten notes she had made the previous evening about her recollection of these individuals. She stated she may be able to identify some of the above-listed men if she saw photographs of them. (P) was told the interviewing Agent would send her some photographs.

On December 13, 2001, P advised she reviewed the photographs sent to her by the interviewing Agent. She stated she recognized the photograph of Majed Moqed (Flight #77) as roommate. P stated she knew him as "Al". P stated he was in her office two to three times a week and told her he was an engineering student in San Diego. She believed he began living there in 1997 for approximately one year. P advised she did not think he was listed on the lease. She stated he told her he was from Saudi Arabia and was leaving for Paris.

(P) advised she also recognized the photograph of Khalid Almihdhar (Flight #77) as the person she knew as Khalid in apartment number (P). She stated he was not on the lease either and left within six months of when they took over as property managers.

After (P) moved to Seattle, BAGADER telephoned her regularly. Many of the calls were made when (P) was not home and BAGADER would speak briefly with one of her children. When (P) and BAGADER did have conversations, BAGADER did not appear to be happy. (P) believes that she (P-1) BAGADER's biggest complaint was about money. She talked about having nice clothes and furniture but lacked the means of acquiring same. She speculated that her husband was receiving money from someone since he was able to pay for classes while the family could not afford the things that BAGADER wanted.

(P) believes that AL-BAYOUMI moved to England about three years ago leaving his family in San Diego. She said that BAGADER's money complaints increased after this and she was forced to ask here father in Saudi Arabia to send her money. (P) recalled that BAGADER and AL-BAYOUMI took their entire family to Saudi Arabia for a visit once while (P) was their neighbor. Later, after (P) moved away, BAGADER went to Saudi Arabia with only her youngest son.

After AL-BAYOUMI went to England he may have returned to San Diego for one short visit. Just before July, 2001, BAGADER told that she was going to England to join her husband and that they were then going to return to Saudi Arabia. (P) has not heard from her since then.

On 01/10/2002 and 01/11/2002, SA (S) and Air Force Special Agent (S), conducted a canvass of various hotels located on Sepulveda Blvd. in Culver City, California. The purpose of the this canvass was to determine if any of the individuals associated with the attacks of September 11, 2001 had stayed at these hotels.

Los Angeles had obtained information from FBI San Diego and FBI New York that Mr. AL MOHDAR MOHAMED ABDULLAH AL MOHDAR, a resident of San Diego who was interviewed as part of a proffer agreement at the Southern District of New York, had been introduced to NAWAF AL HAZMI and KHALID AL MIHDHAR, two of the hijackers on American Airlines Flight 77, by Mr. OMAR BAYOUMI, the spiritual leader of a Kurdish mosque in Magnolia, California. MOHDAR had further stated that in late Spring/early summer 2000, he and AL HAZMI and AL MIDHAR had taken a trip from San Diego to Los Angeles in order to drop off AL MIDHAR at the Los Angeles International Airport for a Lufthansa Airlines flight to Saudi Arabia. While in Los Angeles, the three stopped off at the King Fahad mosque in Culver City, California before continuing to an unnamed motel where they spent the night prior to going to the hotel. MOHDAR had further added that he did not know the name of the hotel, but advised that the hotel was the "middle one" of three in a row. MOHDAR recalled that AL HAZMI singed the register and paid for the room in cash, although MOHDAR did not recall whose identification AL HAZMI used to rent the room.

Additionally, discovered registration forms from 12/20/1999 for Mr. ABDULLAH A S AL JRAITHEN and ALBAYOUMI, OMAR, address San Diego, CA. 92111, telephone number: registration form indicated that the JRAITHEN and ALBAYOUMI checked into the hotel on 12/20/1999 and checked out on 12/21/1999.

Additionally, SA's discovered a registration form for Mr. ABDULLAH ALGHAMDI, who had stayed at the hotel from 05/08/2001 to 05/15/2001. ALGHAMDI had provided the following information: address: Sasref P.O. Box 10088, Aljubail, Saudi

Arabia; credit card number (P-1) vehicle: Toyota Corolla, California license plate: (P-1) Investigation of the attacks of September 11, 2001 has revealed that AHMED ALGHAMDI and HAMZA S. ALGHAMDI were two of the hijackers on United Airlines Flight 175, and that SAEED ALGHAMDI was one of the hijackers onboard United Airlines Flight 93. The registration forms were seized by SA (S) and secured at the FBI Los Angeles evidence facility.

Furthermore, (P) informed the agents that many individuals that visit the King Fahad mosque stay at their motel due to its close proximity to the mosque.

Possible believes that AL-BAYOUMI was a college student, residing in the U.S. with permission under a student visa. Possible believes that AL-BAYOUMI has moved to England, address unknown. Possible does not know what subjects AL-BAYOUMI was studying or where he was resided in San Diego. AL-BAYOUMI drove a large white American made car while he resided in San Diego.

(P) estimated that he saw AL-BAYOUMI under these circumstances approximately fifty times.

AL-BAYOUMI was known to (P) as a person who associated with scholars who came from other countries to visit San Diego during Ramadan. AL-BAYOUMI was also known to sponsor foreigners who came to live or study in San Diego. AL-BAYOUMI was rarely seen by himself, and mostly associated with men from Saudi Arabia. One man that (P) knows to be a friend of AL-BAYOUMI is

Upon viewing the photos, (P) identified the photo of OMAR AL-BAYOUMI. (P) did not recognize Khalid AL-Mihdhar. The photo of NAWAF AL-HAZMI looked familiar, but (P) could not identify the man.

(P) told SA (S) that he had heard from other people connected with the ICSD that one of the pilots of a hijacked airplane involved in the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001, had participated in the ICSD (P) program. (P) believes that NAWAF AL-HAZMI could have been someone who participated in the ICSD (P) program while (P) was coaching. (P) said he and his attorney notified the FBI of this shortly after the terrorist attacks. (P) saw the television and newspapers' publications of photos of the hijackers when they were being published, but did not recognize any of the men.

At the conclusion of the interview, (P) agreed to contact SA (S) if he learns of any new information concerning the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001. (P) advised SA (S) that any contact on the part of the FBI with (P) should be arranged through him, as he is representing both men.

On October 4, 2001, YAZEED AL-SALMI was interviewed in the offices of the United States Attorney, Southern District of New York. Also present for the interview were AUSA (S) and AL-SALMI's attorneys, (P) and (P). AL-SALMI was interviewed in English pursuant to the execution of a proffer agreement. AL-SALMI provided the following information:

AL-SALMI stated that he had entered the United States in August of 2000. AL-SALMI stated he had departed Saudi Arabia and flown to New York and then on to San Diego to attend Grossmont College in San Diego, California. AL-SALMI entered on a student visa and was studying accounting. Upon arriving in San Diego, AL-SALMI went to the Abu Baker Mosque on Balboa Avenue in San Diego, where he met Sheikh ABU SATAR. Sheikh ABU SATAR rented AL-SALMI a room for approximately a month in Lemon Grove, California. While living at the SATAR residence, AL-SALMI met an individual named NAWAF ALHAZMI. AL-SALMI stated that ALHAZMI was already renting a separate room at ABU SATAR's residence.

AL-SALMI stated that another individual named KHALID ALMIDHAR was living in Los Angeles before he moved to San Diego with NAWAF ALHAZMI. AL-SALMI recalls that ALMIDHAR left the U.S. and San Diego to return to Saudi Arabia because his daughter was born in August of 2000. AL-SALMI recalls that NAWAF ALHAZMI lived at ABU SATAR's residence from August 10 through September 2000. there, AL-SALMI recalled NAWAF reciting the Koran daily. also recalled that NAWAF ALHAZMI worked at a Texaco gas station on Spring Street in La Mesa, California, two days a week. AL-SALMI also recalled an individual named (P) who had visited NAWAF at his apartment one day. He had also seen (P) at the Al Ribad Mosque on Saranac Street in El Cajon. AL-SALMI again stated that NAWAF ALHAZMI was in Los Angeles with his friend KHALID ALMIDHAR before coming down to San Diego. AL-SALMI recalls NAWAF extending his tourist visa to stay in the United States.

AL-SALMI recalled Sheikh ABU SATAR as a retired professor from India. He believed ABU SATAR to be a U.S. citizen. AL-SALMI

recalled that Sheikh ABU SATAR considered NAWAF ALHAZMI a son. NAWAF learned English but did not speak it very well. He and an individual named MOHDAR ABDULLAH had several mutual friends. From October of 2000, AL-SALMI moved to Saranac Street to the present with an (P) named (P). Also in the apartment at the time was an Algerian named SAMIR ABDULL and (P) who moved back to (P). Another individual named OMAR ABU BAKR BASHAT also lived at Saranac for a month before returning to Saudi Arabia. (P) the left also and went to Kurdistan and an individual named ALI last name unknown (LNU) took his place at the apartment. In December of 2000, ABU SATAR and NAWAF left San Diego with an unknown friend and either went to Arizona or San Francisco, California. AL-SALMI last saw NAWAF in November of 2000.

AL-SALMI recalled that MOHDAR ABDULLAH also worked at the Texaco gas station in El Cajon, California, with NAWAF ALHAZMI. SALMI stated that NAWAF earned between \$35 and \$40 a day at the gas station, with approximately \$25 in tips. NAWAF ALHAZMI worked at the Texaco station twice a week. When AL-SALMI got his California driver's license, NAWAF ALHAZMI had helped him get insurance under NAWAF's policy. A female named (P) LNU, an insurance agent, put the policy under NAWAF ALHAZMI's name. AL-SALMI believed he got his car insurance in September of 2000 and he took NAWAF's car to NAWAF and AL-SALMI spoke Arabic to (P). NAWAF ALHAZMI appeared to feel comfortable with her. AL-SALMI believed (P) is originally from Palestine. NAWAF ALHAZMI told AL-SALMI that he likes the life in the United States. He stated that it was much more organized and as an example, he used the Department of Motor Vehicles in California.

AL-SALMI does not recall NAWAF ALHAZMI ever expressing any views concerning U.S. foreign policy or his views about Americans. AL-SALMI stated that to him, jihad is a spiritual avoidance of forbidden things, or when the enemy comes to your country and destroys your property or people. Jihad is not going to come unless someone tries to destroy your property. NAWAF and AL-SALMI never discussed jihad. NAWAF and AL-SALMI did discuss religion, specifically the Koran and Islam. NAWAF knew how to pray and seemed

to have recently become religious. AL-SALMI believes NAWAF ALHAZMI did become religious but did not succeed in marrying a woman from Saudi Arabia who he was interested in.

AL-SALMI recalls NAWAF having a bank account at the Bank of America on Balboa Avenue in San Diego, California. NAWAF never mentioned to AL-SALMI receiving money from his family. NAWAF would use phone cards and talk on the phone outside of his apartment often. NAWAF ALHAZMI introduced AL-SALMI to many people at the gas station. AL-SALMI never recalls translating for NAWAF.

YAZEED AL-SALMI was shown a series of photographs and recognized the following. Picture #1 he recognized as an individual named (P) who was . (P) worked as (P) Picture #3 AL-SALMI recognized as an individual named OMAR AL BAYOUMI, aka Abu Emad. AL-SALMI recalled OMAR AL BAYOUMI being from Jedda, Saudi Arabia. AL BAYOUMI lived with his family and approximately seven months ago had moved to the United Kingdom to pursue his Master's. AL-SALMI recalled that OMAR AL BAYOUMI knew NAWAF ALHAZMI well. AL-SALMI believed that OMAR AL BAYOUMI worked for the Saudi Aviation Administration and that AL-SALMI's uncle is OMAR AL BAYOUMI's boss. AL-SALMI recognized a picture of ABU SATAR and that he had visited with OMAR AL BAYOUMI often. ABU SATAR had seen the pictures of NAWAF ALHAZMI and KHALID ALMIDHAR on the news and was shocked that they were two of the hijackers on September 11. AL-SALMI stated that OMAR AL BAYOUMI and his family had lived near NAWAF ALHAZMI and KHALID ALMIDHAR. BAYOUMI's son told AL-SALMI that he had gone to Los Angeles for a day with NAWAF ALHAZMI in September of 2000. He believes another individual named (P) possibly went also. AL-SALMI recalls that the Saudi Aviation Authority had paid for OMAR AL BAYOUMI to come to the United States. AL-SALMI also recalled that NAWAF ALHAZMI had told him that he had been to Malaysia visiting people. AL-SALMI did not recall who NAWAF ALHAZMI had visited in Malaysia.

AL-SALMI recognized a photograph of MOHDAR ABDULLAH as a student at Grossmont College and San Diego State University. ABDULLAH also worked at the Texaco gas station with NAWAF ALHAZMI.

ABDULLAH had introduced AL-SALMI to KHALID ALMIDHAR. AL-SALMI recalls that (P) had a computer. AL-SALMI used the email to communicate with his father. AL-SALMI does not recall if NAWAF ever used that computer.

of the identity of the interviewing agents and the nature of the
interview, MUSTAFA provided the following information.

MUSTAFA first visited the United States (U.S.) with his father in 1993 for approximately 40 days. During this time, MUSTAFA and his father spent time in Florida with MUSTAFA's (P) before accompanying (P) on his move to San Diego, California. Together with his father and (P) MUSTAFA drove from Florida to San Diego. After this initial trip to the U.S., MUSTAFA returned to Saudi Arabia In 1995. MUSTAFA came to the U.S. and lived with (P) in San Diego, California, for approximately two months while he attended English classes.

MUSTAFA then returned to Saudi Arabia where he worked as a contract employee of Microsoft from 06/1999 to 11/1999. MUSTAFA came back to San Diego, California, at the end of 1999 for a few days before and stayed with his (P) (P) moving in with a friend of named [ph] (LNU). (P) is a (P) whom MUSTAFA met through (P) advised that currently be employed by Microsoft. MUSTAFA had gone to live in San Diego because was there. owns a store and has lived in the United States for approximately 25 years.

In 01/2000, MUSTAFA traveled to Redmond, Washington, to apply for a job in the United States with Microsoft. MUSTAFA spent approximately ten days in Washington State during this trip that was paid for by Microsoft. In 02/2000 Microsoft informed MUSTAFA that he had gotten the job and that after

receiving documentation before 04/2000 he would have to return to Saudi Arabia for six months before returning to the U.S. on a H-1 visa. At this time, MUSTAFA informed his roommate that he did not want to pay his entire rent for the coming month because he was going to be leaving. MUSTAFA then began looking for another place to stay.

MUSTAFA had met NAWAF AL-HAZMI and KHALID AL-MIHDHAR at the Abu Bakr Mosque on Balboa Avenue in San Diego, California. MUSTAFA advised that it is possible that he was introduced to AL-HAZMI and AL-MIHDHAR by OMAR AL-BAYOUMI. MUSTAFA would see AL-HAZMI and AL-MIHDHAR approximately once per week at the mosque, and at Friday night prayers at the mosque. AL-HAZMI and AL-MIHDHAR were living at Parkwood Apartments and told MUSTAFA that he could stay with them. MUSTAFA moved into their apartment in 03/2000 and stayed with them for approximately 15 to 16 days. While living at the apartment, MUSTAFA shared the only bedroom with AL-HAZMI and AL-MIHDHAR slept in the other room. AL-HAZMI and AL-MIHDHAR told MUSTAFA that he did not have to pay rent since he was only staying for a short period of time, but MUSTAFA did pay them \$150 in cash for letting him stay at the apartment.

MUSTAFA's Syrian passport was about to expire at that time, so he sent it to the Syrian Embassy, Washington, DC, and made telephone calls from the apartment (telephone number (P)) in order to have it renewed. While living with AL-HAZMI and AL-MIHDHAR, MUSTAFA helped (P) at (P)

Neither AL-HAZMI nor AL-MIHDHAR knew MUSTAFA's

AL-HAZMI and AL-MIHDHAR then told MUSTAFA that they were going to change apartments and that he needed to move out. MUSTAFA advised them that he would be traveling back to Saudi Arabia before 04/2000. MUSTAFA moved out of the apartment at Parkwood Apartments and stayed with returning to Saudi Arabia. (P) was a friend of (P) s (P) and owned a local (P). MUSTAFA did not speak with AL-HAZMI or AL-MIHDHAR after moving out of their apartment.

MUSTAFA first met OMAR AL-BAYOUMI in 01/2000 or 02/2000 at the mosque. (P) knew AL-BAYOUMI, and MUSTAFA may have been introduced to AL-BAYOUMI by (P).
MUSTAFA described AL-BAYOUMI as social and friendly, and stated

that AL-BAYOUMI was respected by others. While living with AL-HAZMI and AL-MIHDHAR, OMAR AL-BAYOUMI would make short visits to the apartment. AL-BAYOUMI lived across the parking lot in the same complex, Parkwood Apartments on Balboa Avenue, with his wife and children. MUSTAFA visited AL-BAYOUMI's apartment on two occasions. AL-BAYOUMI kept an office in the Al Medina Mosque in El Cajon, California, which Mustafa advised is a Kurdish mosque. There is a large Kurdish population in El Cajon. MUSTAFA did not know what kind of work AL-BAYOUMI did at the mosque or outside of the mosque, nor did he ever ask. MUSTAFA believed that AL-BAYOUMI had a lot of money to be able to live in the U.S., and that he may have been employed by Saudi Airlines because he had a Saudi Airlines picture hanging in his office at the mosque. MUSTAFA believed that AL-BAYOUMI may have been from Jeddah, Saudi Arabia, but AL-BAYOUMI never stated what he did for work in Saudi Arabia nor did he ever talk about his family in Saudi Arabia. MUSTAFA did not know AL-BAYOUMI to be connected to the Saudi Arabian government.

MUSTAFA did not know of any welcoming party that was held upon the arrival of AL-HAZMI and AL-MIHDHAR to the San Diego area. AL-HAZMI and AL-MIHDHAR came from Mecca, Saudi Arabia, and MUSTAFA assumed that they held Saudi Arabian passports. Both AL-HAZMI and AL-MIHDHAR had international driver's licenses from Saudi Arabia, and drove a 1990 or 1991 AL-HAZMI advised MUSTAFA that his father had dark blue Corolla. a lot of money, and MUSTAFA assumed that both AL-HAZMI and AL-MIHDHAR received money from their respective fathers. MUSTAFA never observed, nor did he ever hear of, AL-BAYOUMI or anyone from the mosque giving AL-HAZMI and/or AL-MIHDHAR money.

MUSTAFA believed that AL-HAZMI and AL-MIHDHAR had lived in the apartment at Parkwood Apartments for a couple of months before MUSTAFA stayed with them, but he described the apartment as "empty". AL-HAZMI and AL-MIHDHAR then purchased a couch, table, and television from a male individual (NFI) in El Cajon, California. MUSTAFA rented a truck to move the furniture because he had a California driver's license. MUSTAFA never accompanied either AL-HAZMI or AL-MIHDHAR to rent a recreational vehicle. MUSTAFA advised that there might have been some books in the apartment as well as a radio. MUSTAFA gave an Arabic-English dictionary that he had owned to AL-HAZMI and AL-MIHDHAR as a gift.

AL-HAZMI and AL-MIHDHAR did not have telephone service in the apartment when MUSTAFA came to stay with them. then used a payphone to call Pacific Bell Telephone Company to obtain telephone service at the apartment. Neither AL-HAZMI nor AL-MIHDHAR used the telephone, and MUSTAFA did not observe any telephone calling cards in the apartment.

AL-HAZMI and AL-MIHDHAR talked about learning English, and MUSTAFA took them to one English class at a local church. AL-HAZMI and AL-MIHDHAR also spoke of getting married, and MUSTAFA believed that they wanted to stay in the U.S. Even though AL-MIHDHAR had a wife in Yemen, he wanted a wife in the United States. MUSTAFA advised that while staying at the apartment, he was busy visiting (P) and preparing for his employment with Microsoft. MUSTAFA stated that his "mentality was different" than AL-HAZMI's and AL-MIHDHAR's, and that he usually engaged in general conversation with them. MUSTAFA stated that they often talked about the problems in the Middle East and about Israel. MUSTAFA never heard AL-HAZMI nor AL-MIHDHAR speak of jihad. Neither AL-HAZMI nor AL-MIHDHAR (nor AL-BAYOUMI) talked about flying airplanes, and MUSTAFA did not observe anything in the apartment to indicate an interest in MUSTAFA never heard AL-HAZMI, AL-MIHDHAR, nor AL-BAYOUMI talk about Mexico.

MUSTAFA advised that with the exception of his family, no one had knowledge that he had worked as a Microsoft contract employee while living in Saudi Arabia. Furthermore, no one outside of his family was aware that he was applying to work in the United States for Microsoft. Neither AL-HAZMI nor AL-MIHDHAR ever asked MUSTAFA about Microsoft. MUSTAFA was never asked by either AL-HAZMI or AL-MIHDHAR to call anyone in Saudi Arabia, nor did they ask him to carry any items back to Saudi Arabia.

During the time that MUSTAFA stayed at the apartment, AL-MIHDHAR wanted to receive a picture of his newborn baby. MUSTAFA recalled that the baby was born in the beginning of 03/2000, but did not recall if it was a boy or a girl (MUSTAFA did use the word "son" at one point during this discussion). MUSTAFA advised AL-MIHDHAR to purchase WebTV to get the picture through email. They then went to a Target store and purchased WebTV and a modem, and paid \$20 for service. MUSTAFA set up the system and AL-MIHDHAR received a picture of the baby through email. After a short while, AL-HAZMI and AL-MIHDHAR told

MUSTAFA that they did not want to pay for the WebTV service anymore because MUSTAFA utilized it more than they did. MUSTAFA did not want to pay, so the system was returned to the store.

During the time that MUSTAFA stayed with AL-HAZMI and AL-MIHDHAR, a party was hosted at their apartment in honor of the Imam from the Al Medina Mosque in El Cajon, California. Approximately 20 people from the mosque were present at the party, to include three Imams (from Al Medina Mosque and Abu Bakr Mosque) and AL-BAYOUMI. Food was served, but MUSTAFA did not know who paid for the food. MUSTAFA videotaped portions of the party, and also recited poetry. The party lasted approximately two to three hours.

MUSTAFA recalled a collection box that was located at the Abu Bakr Mosque on Balboa Avenue. The purpose of this box was to accept charitable donations. MUSTAFA advised that most individuals would place \$1 to \$3 in cash into the box. Another way of donating to the mosque was to deposit money directly into a bank account in the mosque's name. MUSTAFA did not have knowledge of an organization named AL HARAMAIN.

MUSTAFA never traveled to Los Angeles, California, with AL-HAZMI, AL-MIHDHAR, or AL-BAYOUMI. MUSTAFA visited Los Angeles once with (P) and once with the Imam for the Al Medina Mosque. During their trip to Los Angeles, MUSTAFA and the Imam purchased clothing and ate at a restaurant. They did not visit a mosque while in Los Angeles, instead they prayed outside of the car. MUSTAFA has never visited the Culver City, California, mosque.

MUSTAFA last spoke with AL-BAYOUMI in 03/2000 or 04/2000 when MUSTAFA called AL-BAYOUMI in Saudi Arabia. has not seen nor spoken with AL-BAYOUMI since that time. MUSTAFA does not know the current whereabouts of AL-BAYOUMI, nor does he know if would know the whereabouts of AL-BAYOUMI.

MUSTAFA did not know that his former roommates were two of the hijackers involved in the terrorist attacks on September 11, 2001. MUSTAFA advised that he does not own a television nor does he receive or buy newspapers. MUSTAFA uses the internet to read about current events. MUSTAFA advised that he does not like watching the news because the reports usually contain bad news and "make people sad". MUSTAFA was aware of the events of

September 11, 2001, and watched reports of the attacks on the internet on the same day. MUSTAFA did not follow the subsequent news reports to find out more information.

When asked if he discussed the terrorist attacks with MUSTAFA advised that he has not spoken with in approximately one year. also lives in San Diego, California, where he studies English. (P) moved to San Diego in 04/2001 or 05/2001, and is currently in the process of applying for MUSTAFA speaks on the telephone to approximately once per week, but (P) did not know AL-HAZMI, AL-MIHDHAR, nor AL-BAYOUMI.

MUSTAFA advised that his personal email address is and his business email address is (P-1) MUSTAFA utilizes email to communicate with his brother and sisters, as well as his father who is and resides in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia. MUSTAFA believed that AL-BAYOUMI was familiar with the system of email and used it to send messages.

MUSTAFA did not know or recognize the names MOHDAR , or ABDULLAH,

MUSTAFA was shown the photograph book, and identified photograph #3 in both "traditional" and "western" series as KHALID AL-MIHDHAR. MUSTAFA advised that AL-MIHDHAR had a mustache when he stayed at their apartment. MUSTAFA also identified photograph #14 in both "traditional" and "western" series as NAWAF AL-HAZMI. MUSTAFA recognized the photograph of MOHAMMED ATTA from the widespread appearance of the photograph in the media.

MUSTAFA also was shown a series of photographs in which he consistently identified photographs of OMAR AL-BAYOUMI. MUSTAFA identified the male individual located in the bottom left of photograph #34, series PSS42, as possibly NAWAF AL-HAZMI. MUSTAFA identified the male individual located on the left of photograph #40, series PSS42, as (LNU), the Imam of the MUSTAFA identified a male (P) , as ABDUSATTAR individual in photograph #718, SHAIKH. MUSTAFA advised that SHAIKH worked at the American Language Institute. MUSTAFA was acquainted with SHAIKH in 1995 when MUSTAFA had to meet with him regarding his I-94 form.

(P) obtain a computer for Saud. Hamid had requested that bought an Epson laptop computer in California. He paid cash for this computer and had English/Arabic software (Windows 3.11) and the (P) stated that he spent quite a bit of time keyboard installed. with Saud on the first occasion when they were "setting up" the laptop. Saud's English was very good and he (Saud) was very proud of his language abilities and wanted to display it to that he met Saud a total of approximately six times between 1996 and 1997. All of these meetings took place at Hamid's office at PCA. During these meetings, Saud talked about a number of different subjects to include the fact that he was in school in Jiddah; however, he never indicated what school. (P) left Jiddah in approximately June, 1997, took over, arriving in approximately July, 1997, and saying until approximately July, 1998. met with Saud a couple of times at Hamid's PCA office and once at a social function sponsored by Dallah in Jiddah. (P) advised that on one occasion, he met Hamid's wife, who he believed is the mother of Saud, on a flight from Jiddah to Dubi. She was dressed in an ultra conservative fashion with complete face mask and gloves, etc. He stated that she stayed in this attire even while they were in Dubi, when most women changed into a more liberal western attire.

- (P) and (P) advised that they never met any of Hamid's other children, however, they believed that he had a total of six ranging in age from four to sixteen years old. They indicated that they believed most, if not all, were girls except for Saud.

- (P) and (P) advised that they last saw Hamid in Duba in approximately 2000.
- (P) stated that from information that Hamid told them, he (Hamid) is related although distantly to Prince Al-Rasheed of Jiddah. Hamid told them that he has visited the Prince's residence on a couple of occasions, but that they are not very close.
- (P) and (P) advised that the "bag man" for all of the money filtering operations by Dallah, PCA, etc., was Mohamed Basharil of Columbus, Ohio, telephone number (P) (P) and (P) indicated that Basharil would direct where all of the money would go as he described in his April 8, 2002 interview. (P) advised that Basharil's Arabic and English were flawless. Basharil would travel extensively and Basharil's family was from England. Basharil's sister ran a travel agency in London.

BLACK advised that he and ABDULLAH had been inmates together at the Detention Facility for approximately two years. According to BLACK, ABDULLAH and fellow inmate SAMIR ABDOUN had independently stated that ABDULLAH had learned of the intentions of two of the 09/11/2001 hijackers (known to be NAWAF AL-HAZMI and KHALID AL-MIHDHAR) after becoming associated with them in San Diego. Based on BLACK's statements, inmate (P) had also was also interviewed (reference been detained at the Detention Facility during the same time period. According to (P), ABDULLAH stated that he had been contacted and told that the two hijackers were arriving in the United States to conduct a terrorist attack. ABDULLAH reportedly informed (P) that he had been instructed to pick up the hijackers in Los Angeles; ABDULLAH then drove them to San Diego. Also based on BLACK's statements, was interviewed (reference currently incarcerated at the Atlanta, Georgia, Federal Prison, but had been at the CCA Immigration Detention Facility, San Diego, in 2003. (P) recalled hearing ABDULLAH stating to BLACK that he (ABDULLAH) had given the two hijackers a ride from San Diego to Los Angeles [Note: Investigation has determined that on 06/09/2000, ABDULLAH drove AL-HAZMI and AL-MIHDHAR to Los Angeles where they spent the night before AL-MIHDHAR departed the United States the next day from Los Angeles International Airport]. (P) did not recall any other discussions with either ABDULLAH or BLACK regarding the hijackers or terrorism-related matters. The interview of (P) therefore did not corroborate any of the information provided by either BLACK or (P) While both BLACK and (P) independently advised that ABDULLAH had prior knowledge of the 09/11/2001 terrorist attacks, the details of their individual accounts appear to have considerable

differences; specifically, the accounts of BLACK and (P) differ in regards to the initial meeting between ABDULLAH and the hijackers and in regards to the time at which ABDULLAH learned of the terrorist plot.

Initial Meeting Between ABDULLAH and the Hijackers

According to BLACK, ABDULLAH had explained that he initially had met the hijackers at a mosque in San Diego in 2000. According to (P), however, ABDULLAH stated that he was contacted and given instructions to pick up the hijackers at Los Angeles International Airport (LAX) (ABDULLAH did not say how he had been contacted or by whom). ABDULLAH told (P) that he had picked up the hijackers in Los Angeles (not known if from LAX) and drove them to his apartment in San Diego.

Previous investigation determined that AL-HAZMI and AL-MIHDHAR arrived in the United States at LAX on 01/15/2000. On approximately 02/01/2000, AL-HAZMI and AL-MIHDHAR met OMAR AL-BAYOUMI and ISAMU DYSON at the Mediterranean Gourmet Restaurant in Los Angeles. By 02/04/2000, AL-HAZMI and AL-MIHDHAR had traveled to San Diego (means of transportation unknown) and signed an apartment lease at the Parkwood Apartments with the assistance of AL-BAYOUMI. To date, investigation has not found any contact between ABDULLAH and AL-HAZMI and/or AL-MIHDHAR prior to their arrival in San Diego in 02/2000.

## Time at Which ABDULLAH Learned of the Terrorist Plot

According to BLACK, ABDULLAH became aware of the hijackers' intention to carry out an attack after close daily contact with them. ABDULLAH told BLACK that he first learned of the plot during dinner at a restaurant in San Diego with the two hijackers and a fourth unidentified individual. BLACK further advised that the hijackers had invited ABDULLAH to join them on the airplane and participate in the attack. BLACK advised that ABDULLAH knew that the attack would consist of an airplane flying into a building, but ABDULLAH did not know which building. In a follow-up interview, BLACK stated that ABDULLAH made the statement that he (ABDULLAH) knew there was going to be an attack on the United States three weeks before the attacks occurred. According to (P), however, ABDULLAH had stated that he was informed of the 09/11/2001 terrorist attack by the advance contact he received prior to the hijackers' arrival in Los Angeles. ABDULLAH was told at that time that the two hijackers were coming to the United States to conduct the attack. (P) advised that ABDULLAH did not provide any further information about this advance contact.

## Approximate Date of Dinner And The Unidentified Individual

BLACK advised that during the same dinner, the hijackers wanted ABDULLAH to take over the remainder of their apartment lease. ABDULLAH advised BLACK that OMAR BAKARBASHAT had moved into the apartment. Investigation has determined that AL-HAZMI and AL-MIHDHAR appear to have vacated their apartment at the Parkwood Apartments in 05/2000, prior to the expiration of the lease. Additionally, when interviewed by the FBI, BAKARBASHAT advised that he had entered into an agreement with AL-HAZMI and AL-MIHDHAR to reside in their apartment for approximately

one month until the end of the lease, during which time he paid them half of the rent.

Furthermore, in regards to the fourth unidentified individual who was present at the dinner, investigation to date has found that AL-HAZMI, AL-MIHDHAR, and HANI HANJOUR were never all present in San Diego at the same time. AL-HAZMI resided in San Diego from 02/2000 to 12/2000; AL-MIHDHAR resided in San Diego from 02/2000 to 06/2000; HANJOUR arrived in San Diego on 12/08/2000 and relocated to Arizona with AL-HAZMI within days. If, based on the date that AL-HAZMI and AL-MIHDHAR vacated their apartment, the alleged dinner took place in approximately 05/2000, only AL-HAZMI and AL-MIHDHAR were present in San Diego at that time.

## Polygraph Examinations

On 05/14/2004, BLACK voluntarily submitted to a polygraph examination (reference (F)). The examination included two relevant questions: (1) Is your story false, that MOHDAR ABDULLAH told you he was connected with the 9/11 hijackers?; and (2) Are you misleading the FBI about MOHDAR ABDULLAH telling you he was involved with the 9/11 highjackers? BLACK answered "no" to both relevant questions; the results of the polygraph examination were deemed inconclusive. As investigation has determined that ABDULLAH was in fact associated with AL-HAZMI and AL-MIHDHAR, the relevant questions of the polygraph examination are not specific in addressing the issue of ABDULLAH's prior knowledge of the 09/11/2001 terrorist attacks.

In order to further determine the validity of information provided by BLACK and (P), the PENTTBOM Team provided additional information and requested that FBI San Diego conduct polygraph examinations of BLACK and (P) (reference (F)). The PENTTBOM Team requested that the polygraph examinations specifically address their statements that ABDULLAH had prior knowledge of the 09/11/2001 terrorist attacks. After scheduling the requested polygraph examinations, FBI San Diego was informed by Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) that both inmates had been released from the CCA Immigration Detention Facility.

Contact information held by ICE for BLACK and indicates that these individuals are residing in Los Angeles and Modesto, California, respectively. Therefore, the PENTTBOM Team requests that FBI Los Angeles and FBI Sacramento/Modesto RA locate BLACK and (P) to conduct polygraph examinations if BLACK and (P) are so willing. These polygraphs examinations should specifically address their statements concerning MOHDAR ABDULLAH's prior knowledge of the terrorist attacks on 09/11/2001. #### Case Synopsis/Examiner's Conclusion:

Ellsworth Black (Black) had been an inmate at the CCA Immigration Detention Facility, San Diego, California, where he met Mohdar Mohammed Abdullah (Abdullah). According to Black, Abdullah told Black he had become acquainted with two of the 9/11 hijackers. Other inmates who had met Abdullah have also been interviewed and have made similar statements about what Abdullah said. However, their accounts of Abdullah's statements differ somewhat from what Black told investigators.

In an attempt to verify the information furnished to investigators by Black, he was polygraphed on 05/14/2004 in San Diego. That examination was determined to be inconclusive. Black agreed to a second polygraph and voluntarily appeared at the Victorville Resident Agency, Los Angeles Division, to partake in a scheduled polygraph. He was furnished copies of forms and which he read, stated he understood and signed.

During the pre-test phase of the polygraph, certain issues and questions were reviewed with Black for clarification prior the formulation of test questions. These issues and questions were founded upon previous statements given by Black. The questions and Blacks response are as follows:

- 1) Did Abdullah tell you that he knew before Sept 11 that there was going to be a terrorist attack? Black advised that Abdullah only said he knew the hijackers "were up to something big" and that no mention of a terrorist attack was made.
- 2) Did Abdullah tell you that he knew the attack would consist of an

airplane flying into a building? Black responded "No."

- 3) Did Abdullah tell you that the hijackers had invited him to join them on the airplane and participate in the terrorist attack? Black advised that Abdullah told him they invited him to participate in their activities, what ever they may be, but never mentioned anything about a terrorist attack or an airplane.
- 4) Did Abdullah tell you that he had been contacted prior to the arrival of the two hijackers in the United States? Black stated that he could not remember if Abdullah had told him this.
- 5) Did Abdullah tell you that he had been told that the two hijackers were coming to the United States to conduct a terrorist attack? Black responded "No."
- 6) Did Abdullah tell you that he was instructed to pick up the hijackers at the Los Angeles International Airport? Black responded "No." Black advised that Abdullah told him he gave the two hijackers a ride to pick up some false identification.
- 7) Did Abdullah tell you that he picked up the hijackers in Los Angeles? Black responded "No."

Since the time of Black's first interview and this polygraph examination, his statements about his conversations with Abdullah have changed. After further discussion with Black it was apparent that the only issues that remained unchanged were that Abdullah had met the hijackers prior to 9/11, that they were up to something, possibly illegal, and that he had given them a ride. A polygraph examination was crafted and the following were the relevant questions asked:

### Series I

- 1. Did you overhear Mohdar say that he had met two of the hijackers? Answer Yes.
- 2. Did Abdullah Mohdar say that he knew the hijackers were up to something big? Answer Yes.

It is the opinion of the examiner that the recorded responses are inconclusive. A post-test interview was conducted and Black advised that the second question above was not accurate. Abdullah never said "something big." Black used this phrase as his interpretation of what Abdullah said. A second series was administered and the relevant questions asked were as follows:

Series II

- 1. Did Mohdar say he had met two of the hijackers? Answer Yes.
- 2. Did Mohdar say he had given two of the hijackers a ride? Answer Yes.

It is the opinion of the examiner that the recorded responses are not indicative of deception.

# **Methods:**

Items of evidence submitted to the (G) for examination may be examined visually, examined with various light sources, and/or processed with chemicals and powders to detect the presence of latent friction ridge prints. The specific sequence of examinations and processes depends upon the nature of the evidence.

Friction ridge print examinations are conducted using the Analysis, Comparison, Evaluation, and Verification methodology (ACE-V), which includes an assessment of the quantity and quality of the information present. The steps of ACE-V are applied to each examination as appropriate.

Analysis is the assessment of a friction ridge print to determine if sufficient reliable details are present to conduct a comparison with another print and to reach an identification conclusion. If these conditions are met, the print is determined to be of value.

Comparison is the direct side-by-side observation of friction ridge prints of value to determine whether or not the information in two prints is in agreement.

Evaluation is the formulation of a conclusion based on the information gathered during the analysis and comparison of the friction ridge prints.

Conclusions that can be reached are as follows:

- Identification the determination that there is sufficient quality and quantity of detail in agreement to conclude that two friction ridge prints originated from the same source.
- Exclusion the determination that there is sufficient quality and quantity of detail in disagreement to conclude that two friction ridge prints did not originate from the same source.
- Inconclusive the determination that corresponding areas of friction ridge prints are absent and/or unreliable and therefore cannot be identified or excluded.

Verification is the independent application of the analysis, comparison, and evaluation phases of the ACE-V methodology to a friction ridge print by another examiner.

# **Interpretations:**

The presence of a friction ridge print on an item of evidence indicates contact was made between the source and the item of evidence. The presence of a friction ridge print alone does not necessarily indicate the significance of the contact or the time frame during which the contact occurred.


Due to the many factors involved in the deposition of a friction ridge print, neither the absence of a friction ridge print on evidence nor the exclusion of a friction ridge print with a given source disassociate that source from having touched the evidence.



**Synopsis:** To request interviews of employees of the Saudi Arabian Presidency of Civil Aviation.

Details: Investigation has determined that OMAR AHMED MUSTAFA AL-BAYOUMI met NAWAF AL-HAZMI and KHALID AL-MIHDHAR (hijackers of American Airlines Flight 77 on 09/11/2001) for the first time in Los Angeles on approximately 02/01/2000. Upon their subsequent arrival in the San Diego area in early 02/2000, AL-BAYOUMI assisted AL-HAZMI and AL-MIHDHAR in securing an apartment by obtaining a cashier's check for them, for which he was reimbursed, and by signing as a guarantor on the lease application.

AL-BAYOUMI has worked for the Presidency of Civil Aviation (PCA), Saudi Arabian Ministry of Defense and Aviation, since 1977. In 1995, AL-BAYOUMI was reassigned to the Dallah Avco Trans Arab Company, a private subcontractor of the PCA, and AL-BAYOUMI relocated to the United States to attend school. AL-BAYOUMI resided in San Diego, California, from 1995 to 2001, at which time he relocated to Birmingham, England, to continue his education.

While attending school outside of the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, AL-BAYOUMI received a salary as well as allowances for housing and transportation. In addition, employment and financial records indicate that AL-BAYOUMI received other allowances during certain periods of time. For example, in

addition to his salary and allowances for housing and transportation, it has been determined that AL-BAYOUMI received an allowance of SR 1,742 from 10/1998 to 03/2000. In 04/2000, AL-BAYOUMI began receiving an additional SR 14,271. In 09/2001, the payment of this other allowance ended. While there has been no information developed to date indicating that AL-BAYOUMI was a witting facilitator of the terrorist attacks of 09/11/2001, the sudden substantial increase in his allowance has remained a controversial issue in this investigation because the increase occurs approximately two months after AL-HAZMI and AL-MIHDHAR arrived in San Diego. Furthermore, the additional allowance paid to AL-BAYOUMI ceases in 09/2001.

In order to develop a complete understanding of the employment of AL-BAYOUMI and, in particular, the purpose of the other allowance that inexplicably increased to more than double its amount approximately two months after the future hijackers arrive in San Diego, Legat (A), (G) is requested to obtain from the (A), (G), (J-1) all PCA personnel records of AL-BAYOUMI, to include all records pertaining to the additional allowances paid to AL-BAYOUMI. The information gained from the interview of AL-BAYOUMI was instrumental in providing clarification as well as corroboration of many outstanding issues. Similarly, the interviews of the individuals from the PCA and/or Dallah Avco Trans Arabia Company will provide the information necessary to clarify the ambiguity surrounding the additional allowances provided to AL-BAYOUMI, in anticipation that the investigation of AL-BAYOUMI will be able to conclude.



investigation. The PENTTBOMB (G) is							
investigating the attacks which occurred on 9/11/01 in New York,							
Pennsylvania and Washington, DC. The focus of the PENTTBOMB							

investigation are the attacks and the 19 individuals who perpetrated the attacks (19 Hijackers).

On 11/6/01 a PENTTBOMB was formed to determine which of the items collected by (G) are directly related to the PENTTBOMB Investigation (the relevant data). The team consisted of one agent each from New York, San Francisco, Dallas, Chicago and Washington Field. SA (S) is the Dallas agent assigned to the (G)

Approximately 600 Gigabytes of data out of the 37 thousand Gigabytes collected by (G) were determined by the team to be relevant. Additional data were identified as being relevant, but was not yet available to the team as it had not been integrated into the (G) data, and so was not included in the 600 gigabyte figure. The (G) is in the process of examining the relevant data to ensure additional leads are identified and set.

The information developed will be used as a guide to examine the images in the relevant data. This examination process will ensure that all of the relevant information is reviewed for the global aspects of the investigation. As part of the review, the team will perform disk scans for evidence of steganography tools, perform a complete review of logs, email and other forms of communication to include instant messaging and Internet telephony, commonly referred to as "voice over IP." This step will ensure all relevant subjects and computers are identified and investigated in the most efficient and expeditious manner.

On 12/3/01 (G) obtained required approval for the purchase of the equipment and submitted a Concept of Operations for accreditation of the proposed (G) On 12/5/01 the equipment was ordered. The (G) were delivered to FBIHQ and copies of most of the relevant data from (G) were loaded to the servers and shipped to the respective Field Offices.

NYO requested assistance of (G) agents to effectively and efficiently review electronic evidence. NYO requested assistance of the (G) agents currently assisting to continue the Cyber investigation due to their knowledge of the specific case details and the relevant data identified. This request for assistance was limited to the duration of the time required to complete the identified tasks. Dallas received the review equipment in late December 2001.



Source was then shown photographs (copies of which are attached hereto) of two additional individuals whom he immediately recognized as 9/11 hijackers KHALID AL-MIHDHAR and NAWAF AL-HAZMI. Source stated that he had had some interaction with them (A), (G), (J-1)

(A), (G), (J-1) Writers questioned Source as to how AL-MIHDHAR and AL-HAZMI could seemingly so easily "plug into" the local Muslim community in Los Angeles (A), (G), (J-1)

(A), (G), (J-1) Without hesitation, Source advised that "they must have had tazkia." Source wrote out tazkia in Arabic as follows:

Source explained that "tazkia" was a protocol for giving a person a recommendation or vouching for their trustworthiness that operated mostly in the Arabian Peninsula (primarily in Saudi Arabia and Yemen), but was well known throughout the "Arab and Islamic world." Source offered an example of how "tazkia" would function by explaining that if a person was to "travel to a new place" where they didn't know anyone "most Saudis" and some Yemenis would get "tazkia" before they left home. Source stated that "tazkia" could be given either in a written form or could simply be a person's name and phone number, i.e. merely contact information of the person who was to assist in the new location. After 9/11, however, many people are reluctant to provide a written "tazkia," advised Source. When writers advised Source that they were unfamiliar with this phenomenon Source added that many Arabs "don't feel comfortable talking about it," since it is a rather intimate part of their culture.

Source advised that from his experience with AL-MIHDHAR and AL-HAZMI, they were "organized" and would not have arrived in the U.S. without "tazkia." Source added that neither AL-MIHDHAR nor AL-HAZMI had the "personality type" to operate in the U.S. without at least some initial introduction to the community, which "tazkia" would have provided. Writers asked source to explain why he thought this, to which Source stated that AL-MIHDHAR and AL-HAZMI could not "shmooze" or "strike up conversations" with strangers very well, which according to Source they would have needed to do if they were to integrate and meet people in the local Muslim community. Source indicated that without some help AL-MIHDHAR and AL-HAZMI "would have failed" in their mission. (A).(G),(J-1)

(A), (G), (J-1) Source offered this as evidence of AL-MIHDHAR and AL-HAZMI's inability to perform basic functions in the U.S. due to their lack of knowledge of English (A), (G), (J-1)

Source believed that AL-MIHDHAR and AL-HAZMI may have been assessing Source for possible recruitment to assist them further their plans. Source explained that he believed this because AL-MIHDHAR and AL-HAZMI would often question him as to his religious beliefs and then, he now believes, he was "tasked" to (A), (G), (J-1) mentioned above. When Source "failed" this tasking (A), (G), (J-1) he was eliminated as a potential recruit.

Writers presented an additional photograph (a copy of which is attached hereto) which Source recognized as the former Imam of the King Fahad Mosque (KFM) in Los Angeles, named AL-THUMARY (NOTE: The photograph is of FAHAD AL-THUMARY). Source advised that AL-THUMARY was an "extremist" and a "conservative," but was also generally "quiet." Source stated that AL-THUMARY was placed at the KFM by an organization named ABN TAIMIA. Source added that he recalls that AL-HAZMI mentioned to Source that AL-HAZMI had a "formal" meeting with AL-THUMARY at "a school or hotel." Source explained that by "formal" he meant that the meeting was pre-arranged at a specific time and place, not simply AL-HAZMI stopping by the KFM. Writers questioned whether AL-THUMARY could have provided AL-MIHDHAR and AL-HAZMI the "tazkia" into the local southern Californian Muslim community. Source replied that that would comport with what he was able to observe, but that someone would have had to provide "tazkia" to meet AL-THUMARY, which probably came from abroad.

Source advised that he had heard of a MAJID or MAJED AJAJI. Source recalled hearing AJAJI's name mentioned "several times" in the KFM. In addition, AL-THUMARY had talked about him on multiple occasions. Source recalled meeting AJAJI at the end of 1999, beginning of 2000 in Los Angeles, probably at the KFM but could not remember any other details.

England with his wife and four children. One of the children is a newborn baby. The baby was born within the last six months in San Diego. (P) has corresponded with Al-Bayoumi by e-mail since Al-Bayoumi moved to England sometime between April, 2001 and June, 2001. met Omar Al-Bayoumi at a mosque located at Balboa Avenue near I-805 in San Diego. (P) and Al-Bayoumi both attended (P) services at the mosque. On one occasion, needed a ride home from the mosque, and Al-Bayoumi offered to take (P) home. This was approximately 2 ½ to 3 years ago. From that initial contact, the two became friends. Since that time, they have lived as neighbors in an apartment complex on Beadnell Avenue in the Clairemont area of San Diego, near the mosque where (P) met Al-Bayoumi. While Al-Bayoumi resided at he apartment on Beadnell Avenue, (P) would visit Al-Bayoumi at his apartment three to four times each week. (P) last saw Omar Al-Bayoumi on or about April 09, 2001, at the (P) campus located on Camino del Rio South, San Diego. (P) believed that this was a Saturday, and was not sure of the date, but knew it was either April 09 or the Saturday closest to that date. (P) and Al-Bayoumi were both students there, and used computers there to send and receive e-mail. (P) was aware of two e-mail accounts that Al-Bayoumi used. One was (P-1) and the other was an AOL account with the same screen name. (P) believed that Al-Bayoumi has cancelled the AOL e-mail account, but probably maintains an Internet webpage through AOL.

Omar Al-Bayoumi has kept in touch with (P) by way of email from England. Al-Bayoumi provided (P) with a home telephone in England, by e-mail. (P) searched his e-mail account archives for the e-mail from Al-Bayoumi that contained the home phone number. (P) was unable to locate the e-mail, and believed that he had deleted that particular e-mail. (P) did locate at least three e-mails currently stored in his account that were correspondence to and from Al-Bayoumi.

During this interview, (P) signed an FBI form FD-26, giving his consent to SA (S) for a search of records of (P) e-mail account identified as (P) A search of that account was done in the presence of the interviewing agents and (P) at the FBI, approximately 5:00 p.m. on 09/18/2001. SA (S) , San Diego FBI, was present during that search and maintained printed copies of the e-mail correspondence retrieved from (P) account described above. A separate FD-302 prepared by SA (S) covers that search.

(P) , lives in San Jose, California. (P) works for (P) as a (P) and (P) and (P) are close friends who talk frequently on the telephone. More than two years ago, Omar Al-Bayoumi, (P) and (P) were involved in a financial arrangement for the purchase of a building located on (P) Avenue in El Cajon. The building was a mosque, being rented from the property owner. A man from Saudi Arabia regarded as being very wealthy engaged in a business deal with Omar Al-Bayoumi and (P) to purchase the mosque property. Omar Al-Bayoumi was unable to accomplish the purchase of the property through (P) and the man from Saudi Arabia.

Bayoumi. (P) visited the mosque and saw that Omar Al-Bayoumi had an office in place at the mosque for a few months after the mosque opened under the new ownership. (P) said that this man had a reputation for being very wealthy and interested in investing his money with Omar Al-Bayoumi in the U.S., and in exporting to Saudi Arabia any product made in the U.S. (P) explained that anything made in the U.S. can be easily re-sold in Saudi Arabia. (P) knows that this man has much influence in the Muslim community of San Diego, and makes visits to San Diego approximately every two months.

Hashim Al Attas is a mutual friend of (P) and Omar Al-Bayoumi. Hashim Al Attas lived in El Cajon, California, for about seven years. He was involved in the mosque there and is regarded as a computer expert. Al Attas is a male, originally from Saudi Arabia. Attas is about 24 years old, heavy set. Al Attas about nine months ago. (P) last had contact with Al Attas about nine months ago. (P) had no record of that contact, which was made by e-mail.

(P) was shown photographs of the nineteen subjects of this investigation. The photographs were previously made a part of this investigation. After viewing the photographs, (P) said that all of the men who appeared in the photos looked very familiar and may be people he had met at the mosques in San Diego. Details: Per a telcall from San Diego (S) to Unit Chief (S) and SSA (S) on 9/25/2001, San Diego is requesting the immediate examination and analysis of evidence recovered in connection with captioned investigation.

On 9/22/2001, pursuant to a Federal Search Warrant from the Southern District of New York, a search was executed on a red GEO Metro vehicle registered to Mohdar M. Abdullah, date of birth (P-1) Prior to the search, Abdullah was arrested in San Diego, CA, pursuant to a federal material witness warrant issued out of the Southern District of New York as a result of his alleged association and possible support provided to individuals involved in the terrorist incidents on 9/11/2001. The subsequent search of Abdullah's vehicle revealed a spiral notebook which contained handwritten notes that make reference to "hijacking" and "planes falling from the sky", as well as references to mass killings. The notebook, suspected to be Abdullah's, contains numerous incriminating statements with significant correlations to the recent terrorist incidents.

San Diego is requesting that the notebook and latent lifts found in an on Abdullah's vehicle be examined for latent fingerprints in order to link Abdullah to the notebook, as well as identify any possible associates. Additionally, San Diego would like the notebook examined for possible indented writing which may provide added evidence to identify additional associates and/or establish a possible date and time the notes were written.

San Diego is also requesting that the writing within the notebook be analyzed by members of the (G) Unit to develop a behavioral profile on Abdullah.

To date, San Diego has been unable to establish any evidence to determine when the notations were made in the notebook or who wrote them. Furthermore, no handwriting exemplars are available for comparison. San Diego has provided two original fingerprint cards obtain from Abdullah subsequent to his arrest. Also provided, was an original Personal Identification fingerprint card from a Special Agent that accidently handled the notebook without gloves.

For background purposes, San Diego investigation has determined that Mohar Abdullah was a close associate of Nawaf Al-Hazmi and Khalid Al-Midhar. Both Al-Hazmi and Al-Midhar were listed on the passenger manifest for AA flight#77 and are believed to be two of the five hijackers on board that flight. Subsequent interviews of Abdullah by San Diego have confirmed Abdullah's association with Al-Hazmi and Al-Midhar. Abdullah was introduced to Al-Hazmi and Al-Midhar by Omar Ahmed

Al-Bayoumi; a manager or leader of a Mosque in El Cajon, CA. Abdullah developed a close relationship, socially and religiously, with Al-Hazmi and Al-Midhar. Abdullah assisted

Al-Hazmi to obtain flight lessons at a flight school in Florida. In December 2000 or January 2001, Al-Hazmi introduced Abdullah to Hani Hanjour, another one of the five suspected hijackers of AA flight# 77.

Due to the time limitation placed on a federal material witness warrant, Assistant United States Attorney

On September 16, 2001, Omer Salmain Saleh Bakarbashat, address (P-1) Lemon Grove, California, social security number (P-1) , date of birth (P-1) , hereafter Omer, was interviewed. It should be noted that Omer was previously interviewed on September 15, 2001, as well as having undergone a polygraph examination on September 15, 2001. After being advised of the identity of the interviewing agents and the purpose of the interview, Omer voluntarily provided the following information:

Omer was advised of his constitutional rights as set out in in form FD-395. Omer understood his rights and declined to have legal representation present. Omer then signed the FD-395, Advise of Rights Form. The FD-395 was placed in a 1A envelope, along with this report.

Omer knows of three other individuals who are paid with cash at the Texaco service station in La Mesa. Omer has a friend that works with him at Texaco named Mohdar Abdullah, who is paid by check. Omer is not aware of the stores merchant account number.

Omer arrived in the United States in 1998, wherein he resided with a host family

Subsequent to residing with P Omer moved to a house on P where he resided for approximately eight months. While residing at P address, Omer had three roommates, P Mohdar Abdullah, and P Omer then moved to P Omer then moved to P Omer and a half. While living on P Omer roomed with P Who was studying to get a P I slicense. Omer resided on approximately one month ago, wherein he moved to P Omer roomed with P Omer roomed with S Omer approximately one month ago, wherein he moved to S Omer denied ever living with Nawaf Alhizimi or Khalid Almahdhar.

Omer currently has no legal right to be in the United States, as his student Visa has expired. Omer has been focused on trying to renew his Visa so as to improve his life and stay in the United States. Consequently, Omer has not socialized, nor has he made strong friendships while in America. Omer advised that since his Visa has expired, he is not able to return to Saudi Arabia and therefore has no place to go. Omer stated that his Visa was issued from Yemen and that he is a citizen of Yemen, although he has never been to Yemen. Omer's parents were citizens of Yemen, and therefore through his birth, Omer is currently a Yemen citizen.

Omer attends a Mosque by Balboa, as well as a Mosque in Lemon Grove. Any socialization that Omer participates in is done through the Mosque. Omer has seen Nawaf Alhizmi and Khalid Almahdhar at the Balboa Mosque. Nawaf and Khalid were very close friends and were always seen together. Khalid did not speak English well, nor was he interested in learning. Omer last spoke with Nawaf in approximately January 2001, wherein Nawaf advised Omer that Khalid went back to Saudi Arabia. Since that time, Omer has learned that Nawaf went to Orange County and then to Arizona.

In an effort to stay in the United States, Omer was trying to enter a contractual agreement, wherein he would marry an American citizen, thereby enabling Omer to stay in the United States. Omer advised that in typical circumstances an individual would pay \$500 to agree to a marriage and continue paying \$250 a month while married. Typically there would not be a romantic involvement between the two individuals and that it was strictly a business agreement. Omer was hopeful he would be able to find an American citizen who was Saudi Arabian and legally marry, but has been unable to do so.

Omer advised that Nawaf and Khalid lived average lives and did not spend a lot of money. Omer had no knowledge of Nawaf and Khalid having jobs.

Omer was asked about the organizational structure and operations of a terrorist group that would be able to carry out a terrorist act of the magnitude of the World Trade Center/Pentagon airplane attacks. Omer provided the following description:

For an operation like the attack on September 11, 2001, it would take approximately 50 people to plan and perform. There would always be a backup contingency and would never rely on one individual.

The individuals who hijacked the plane were known as Shahied, which is translated as meaning "more than a hero and doing it for the sake of God." The Shahied would be recruited over a long period of time. The Shaheid would be recruited from their home country (Saudi Arabia, Afghanistan, Pakistan, or some Middle Eastern country).

There would be at least two individuals in each region who would provide the money for the operation(s). These individuals would probably be approximately 40-50 years old, successful businessmen, and very wealthy. They would utilize their businesses to launder money into the United States.

There would also be an individual outside the United States to smuggle the money to the businessmen inside the United States. That individual would also have a backup in place to ensure the plan would not fail.

There were also individuals in place to organize and supply the hijackers with their individual needs, such as flight documents, flight plans, and other equipment needed carry out the operation(s). There would probably be approximately four to five individuals organizing the operation(s). The location of these individuals would probably be in Arizona.

If weapons or explosives were to be used in a terrorist operation, they would be purchased in the United States. This would be

done due to the difficulty of smuggling equipment into the United States versus smuggling money into the United States.

Omer was asked if he knew anybody involved in this operation or if he knew anyone who would be likely to participate an operation of this nature. Omer denied having any knowledge of participants or likely participants. The interviewing agents asked specifically about (P) wherein Omer opined that (P) would not have done this job due to him not caring about the Islam religion. Omer further stated that (P) is not stupid and that he has too much to loose to participate in an operation of this magnitude. (P) has a wife who is Muslim and two to three kids. (P) is (P) and has brothers and sisters residing in (P).

It should be noted that accompanying the aforementioned interview, a consensual search was performed wherein several documents were found. Al-Bayoumi liked the United States and wanted to stay here to study. Al-Bayoumi eventually went to England to go to school. (P) could not identify the school that Al-Bayoumi was attending. (P) found out that Al-Bayoumi was going to England when Al-Bayoumi said good-bye to people at the mosque. Al-Bayoumi went to England last year and left his family in the United States. Sometime this year, Al-Bayoumi returned to the United States to get his family and move them back to England.

After the World Trade Center(WTC) bombing, (P) asked his class to stand for a moment of silence. (P) advised that he does not have a regular schedule for praying at the mosque. Sometimes (P) prays at noon or at night.

(P) heard no information circulating throughout the mosque prior to the WTC bombing that there was going to be a bombing.

On one occasion, (P) went to Al-Bayoumi's residence after being invited for tea. There were scholars from Saudi Arabia there discussing things such as how beautiful some of the individual states in the United States were. (P) only stayed for approximately 15 minutes before leaving. (P) only attended this event because he felt he would embarrass Al-Bayoumi if he turned down the invitation.

(P) does not know Al-Bayoumi's phone number in England nor has there been any recent contact by either phone or e-mail between the two. (P) never telephonically contacted Al-Bayoumi at his residence when Al-Bayoumi lived in San Diego. There was no chemistry between (P) and Al-Bayoumi when they talked and (P) wasn't very comfortable talking with Al-Bayoumi.

Al-Bayoumi did not talk in front of (P) about any hatred for the United States.

(P) was shown a color photo spread of 24 individuals.

(P) immediately recognized photo 21 as someone who attended the mosque on Balboa Ave. (P) did not know the name of the individual in photo 21 but had seen the individual many times at the mosque over the last 2-3 years. Details: Investigation at San Diego has identified Omar Ahmed Al-Bayoumi as being involved with hijackers Nawaf Al-Hazmi and Khalid Al-Mihdhar during their time in San Diego. Al-Bayoumi co-signed for Al-Hazmi and Al-Mihdhar's apartment lease at the Parkwood Apartments, (P), San Diego, California which is same complex at which Al-Bayoumi resided. Further, Al-Bayoumi's address appears on the lease application as Al-Hazmi and Al-Mihdhar's previous address. Al-Bayoumi is reported to have paid rent for Al-Hazmi and Al-Mihdhar on several occasions.

Records maintained by the Parkwood Apartments indicate

Al-Bayoumi, his wife Manal Bagader and three children resided at (P)

(P), San Diego, California from June 1999 to

June 2001. Information obtained by San Diego indicated he and his family had returned to Saudi Arabia or perhaps moved to England.

On September 21, 2001, Al-Bayoumi was arrested and questioned by the Municipal Police Service (MPS) in Birmingham, United Kingdom. Although he admitted knowing Al-Hazmi and Al-Mihdhar, he denied any knowledge of their activities relative to the September 11, 2001 hijackings. 

(P) advised he had spoken to the Board on the evening of September 26, 2001, and advised them of the interview scheduled for September 27, 2001, with the Federal Bureau of Investigation. The Board agreed to assist the FBI in any way.  (P) asked the (P)  (P) to meet with the FBI on September 27, 2001. The (P) reiterated the Board wanted to assist and would allow the FBI to go into Al-Bayoumi's office.  (P) did ask if the FBI had any court papers for the search.  (P) was presented with a copy of the search warrant and the appropriate attachments.
(P) advised since September 25, 2001, when the interviewing agents spoke to (P) last, he checked his telephone bills to determine when he last spoke to Omar Al-Bayoumi. (P) called Al-Bayoumi on July 10, 2001, in England and left a message for him. On July 17, 2001, (P) called Al-Bayoumi in England and spoke with him for approximately five minutes. (P) advised Al-Bayoumi that the Board for the mosque had been re-elected. These two calls (P) found on his telephone bill. July 17, 2001, was the last time spoke with Al-Bayoumi.
England to speak to (P) Al-Bayoumi wanted (P) to go to Al-Bayoumi's house and pick up some book shelves and some money for the mosque. (P) called the Board members together and advised them of the situation. The Board decided to take the book shelf and money, but two Board members would go to get the items. there was no money, but the mosque was welcome to take the book shelf.

(P) and the Board decided not to get the book shelves. Al-Bayoumi telephoned (P) later and asked why he had not picked up the book shelves. (P) advised there was not any money and they did not want the book shelves. Al-Bayoumi claimed he never offered any money. The mosque never did pick up the book shelves.

After being advised of the identities of the interviewing agents and the nature of the interview, (P) provided the following information:

(P) advised there were several people who worked in Iraq, but for foreign organizations during the Gulf War. At the conclusion of the Gulf War the message that the Iraqi citizens received was that if they had worked for an outside organization that Saddam Hussein would kill those individuals. The outside organizations paid to relocate those workers to the United States. (P) advised he was one of those workers and that was why there was a large Kurdish population in the area.

The Kurdish mosque originally rented a building on Lexington Avenue next to the post office in El Cajon, California. The members attempted to raise money to purchase the building, but they were unable to do so. (P) advised the mosque needed to be purchased and paid in full, since it is against Islam to pay interest. (P), a Saudi Arabian, came to the mosque on Lexington Avenue to pray. (P) and others solicited him to find a buyer in Saudi Arabia, who would purchase the building for the mosque. The members sent flyers and other paperwork to Saudi Arabia in order to entice a buyer.

In 1998, Omar Al-Bayoumi arrived at the Lexington Avenue mosque and advised them Saad Habib from Saudi Arabia would purchase the building and Al-Bayoumi was going to arrange the paperwork for Habib. The members of the Kurdish mosque found a better suited building located at 511 South Magnolia Avenue, El Cajon, California. Habib agreed to purchase the building for the mosque. Al-Bayoumi arranged all the paperwork and Habib arrived in the United States to sign the papers. Habib advised he was buying the mosque for the Kurdish community, but the building would remain in his name. Habib also advised the Kurdish community that the mosque was to be used for Islamic reasons only. There was to be no political functions or a supporting of any one political faction allowed in the mosque. The

mosque was to be used for prayer only, and if the mosque was to be used for any other reason, Habib would take the mosque away from them and give it to someone else.

After the mosque was purchased, the members elected nine individuals to the Board, (P) was elected as (P). Habib chose Al-Bayoumi as the building manager, who was in charge of building maintenance. Al-Bayoumi moved into the current mosque on 511 South Magnolia Avenue, before anyone else and took the best office, according to (P)

The bills in regards to property tax, repairs, and Al-Bayoumi's private telephone line would come to the mosque in Al-Bayoumi's name. The mosque has a P.O. Box and a mail box at the mosque. Al-Bayoumi received mail only at the mosque mailbox. When mail was received for Al-Bayoumi it was slid under the door to his office. The mosque applied to be a non-profit organization, and the request was granted. The Kurdish mosque no longer pays property tax.

[P] advised Al-Bayoumi received letters from a bank, which [P] believed to be Bank of America. When the roof needed to be repaired, the mosque payed for half and Al-Bayoumi payed for half. [P] understood that Habib was suppling the money for the repairs and Al-Bayoumi was taking care of the bills.

Al-Bayoumi had a key to the mosque and could come and go whenever he wanted or needed to. When the mosque was first purchased, Al-Bayoumi would come often. He would be there every other day and at least once a week. As time passed Al-Bayoumi would show up at the mosque less and less. Al-Bayoumi only visited the mosque for management purposes, but if it was prayer time he would pray with the other members. Al-Bayoumi brought his son (P-1) a couple of times and came with some other people on different occasions, but (P) could not remember when or who.

In December 2000, during the Ramadan, Al-Bayoumi brought a Saudi Arabian student. The student sat in the front and read part of the Koran. (P) advised that only the best speakers sit in the front and are allowed to read the Koran. The Saudi Arabian student was twenty-five to thirty years old, and was very bad at reading the Koran. Al-Bayoumi was asked not to bring him or anyone else again to the mosque without the permission of the Board. Al-Bayoumi claimed he was only trying to help.

(P) questioned Al-Bayoumi on what he was doing in the United States. Al-Bayoumi advised he was going to school, studying

business administration. Al-Bayoumi never stated what school he was attending. After awhile, (P) did not believe Al-Bayoumi was a student because it was taking him so long to finish school. Al-Bayoumi replied to (P) when questioned about the length of time he had been a student, the more you study the more you learn.

In 1999, Al-Bayoumi had given a business card to P) that had the name of the mosque on it, Al-Bayoumi's name and his title General Supervisor, and a telephone number of P-1 , and a telephone number and fax of P-1 . Also hand written underneath the other number was P-1 . (P) was upset when he read that Al-Bayoumi titled himself General Supervisor. Al-Bayoumi was advised he was not the Supervisor of the mosque. The Kurdish members and the Board are overseeing the issues of the mosque and that Al-Bayoumi's only job was to take care of the building. (P) told Al-Bayoumi that the members would not put a nail in the wall or take one out without letting Al-Bayoumi know, but that was his only responsibility. Al-Bayoumi claimed he did not need such titles or positions, because he received all the praise and prestige from his home country, Saudi Arabia.

Al-Bayoumi does not receive money for his service as the building manager from the mosque. Al-Bayoumi advised (P), he does not receive payment from Habib either. Al-Bayoumi advised he received money from the Saudi Arabian government.

Al-Bayoumi provided the mosque with a check that was issued from the Saudi Arabia Embassy, but Al-Bayoumi claimed the money was from him. The check came without any other documentation. (P) did not want to accept the check, so he called the board together to decide. The Board voted to accept the check.

(P) has been to Al-Bayoumi's apartment a couple of times, but never inside. He recalled Al-Bayoumi lived in an apartment on the first floor near the Islamic Center on Balboa Avenue. (P) met him in the parking lot to get some tapes and books for the mosque. (P) also stopped by and delivered tax papers to Al-Bayoumi's son. (P) knew there was a separate telephone line into Al-Bayoumi's office, but did not know the number. (P) was unaware what calls were made, how many calls, or any other details about the private telephone.

Al-Bayoumi produced a check to the mosque for approximately \$2,700.00. The check was written from Al-Bayoumi's personal account with Bank of America. (P) inquired where the money was from and Al-Bayoumi told him it was from people who wanted to help, but did not

want to be known. P) once again did not want to accept the check without knowing where the money was coming from. P) spoke with other members who stated Al-Bayoumi told them who the money was from, but they could not recall the name. P) confronted Al-Bayoumi on telling others who donated the money, but not advising him. Al-Bayoumi still refused to tell P) where the money came from, and said it was for the teachers at the mosque. P) advised Al-Bayoumi he would not accept the check unless he knew where the money came from. Al-Bayoumi said fine give the check back.

(P) called a meeting with the Board members to advise them of the situation. The Board decided it was up to the teachers to decide whether to take Al-Bayoumi's check. The teachers decided to keep the check. Al-Bayoumi gave the check to (P) who deposited it into the mosque account and withdrew the cash to give equally to the teachers. Some of the teachers re-donated the money back to the mosque.

(P) described another incident involving money and Al-Bayoumi. Last Ramadan, December 2000, Habib sponsored a speaker for Ramadan, and agreed to pay for the speaker. At the end of Ramadan, (P) asked Al-Bayoumi for the money. Al-Bayoumi advised that the money must have been lost between Saudi Arabia and the United States. Al-Bayoumi was checking to see if Habib could rewire the money. time for the speaker to leave San Diego, California, and he needed and wanted to be paid. The price for the speaker was \$5,033.00. borrowed the money from (P) and paid the speaker. (P) contacted Habib by fax in Saudi Arabia to inform him of the situation. responded with a fax stating he already sent the money to Al-Bayoumi and that if there was a problem the problem was in the United States. Ahmed showed Al-Bayoumi the fax, and within one week Al-Bayoumi wrote a check for the \$6,833.00, which included the \$5,033.00 for the speaker and \$1,800.00 for repairs that the mosque had done to the building and needed to be reimbursed.

Al-Bayoumi sent a letter to Saad Habib advising him that the Kurdish mosque was discriminating against Arabs and the Kurdish members were using the mosque for political reasons. Habib responded, telling the Board he was going to kick them out of the mosque. The Board wrote Habib a letter asking him to send someone to check on the mosque and to not believe someone who did not live among them. Habib sent (P), who was the individual that the Kurdish members solicited in the beginning for the mosque. (P) stayed twenty-one days and stayed at the Holiday Inn in La Mesa, California. After (P) returned to Saudi Arabia, Habib responded to the mosque stating, what I

heard was not true. (P) feels that Al-Bayoumi is not a good person and Habib is a genuine person. (P) believed Al-Bayoumi may have written the letter to Habib after (P) confronted him on being the General Supervisor.

Habib was sent a proposal from the members in regards to selling the mosque and purchasing land to build a mosque. Habib agreed. After looking around the Board decided to keep the current building and expand it to make it bigger. The Board re-contacted Habib and advised him of the new plan. Habib responded, that he trusted their judgement and agreed with whatever they needed. The Board and Habib communicated by faxes. The last they have heard from Habib was August 28, 2001, regarding the above agreement.

- (P) was shown several photographs. (P) recognized a picture of Mohamed Atta from television along with a photograph of Marwan Al-Shehhi. Ahmed recognized the photograph of Al-Bayoumi and identified him as the individual he had been discussing and the individual who occupied the office in the mosque. (P) recognized a photograph of (P) but did not know his name. He recognized (P) from a couple soccer games where (P) was standing on the sidelines at the Islamic Center at Eckstrom Avenue, San Diego, California.
- (P) did not trust Al-Bayoumi and felt that he was a undercover agent for Saudi Arabia. (P) wanted to fire him as the building manager, but the Board felt Al-Bayoumi was not that bad.
  (P) had asked Al-Bayoumi, who was going to take care of the building while he was in England. Al-Bayoumi advised he was going to be able to manage the mosque from England. the Board has not cleaned out the office since Al-Bayoumi left, because the mosque has been expecting him to return.







ISAMU (P) DYSON, also known as (aka) CLAYTON (P) MORGAN, date of birth (DOB) (P-1) , Social Security Number (P-1) , (P) home phone number (P) , e-mail address (P) , was interviewed at the (P) Resident Agency of the FBI. After being advised of the identity of the interviewing agents and the purpose of the interview, Dyson provided the following information:

Additional details regarding the trip Dyson took with OMAR AL-BAYOUMI (DOB: (P-1)) to Los Angeles (LA) sometime between December 1999 and February 2000, are provided below. (For reference, see FD-302s of interviews with Dyson on 10/06/2001 and 10/07/2001).

One day Al-Bayoumi ("Omar") mentioned to Dyson that his visa was going to expire. Al-Bayoumi needed help and asked Dyson about the paperwork. Al-Bayoumi showed Dyson some of the forms and papers. Al-Bayoumi was under the impression that he had to leave the country and get his visa renewed. Then he would be able to return to the United States (U.S.). Dyson advised Al-Bayoumi against leaving the country and told him he should take care of the matter through the embassy in the U.S. Dyson told him to call the embassy. This conversation occurred at Al-Bayoumi's Mt. Ada Road apartment in San Diego.

Approximately one or two weeks passed and he saw Al-Bayoumi at the Islamic Center of San Diego (ICSD) mosque. Al-Bayoumi brought the visa subject up once again. Al-Bayoumi said he called the Saudi embassy and they advised they could take care of the matter. Bayoumi invited Dyson to come along on the trip Al-Bayoumi needed to take to the consulate in LA. Al-Bayoumi told Dyson he knew a good restaurant to stop at and eat in LA. Al-Bayoumi advised that restaurant serves good food and is Halal. He asked Dyson if he ever saw the new mosque in or near Culver City. Dyson had not been to the Dyson believes the mosque is on or near Washington Street. Al-Bayoumi said they would visit the mosque afterwards. The trip had no set criteria. It centered around Al-Bayoumi going to the consulate. Al-Bayoumi wanted to go the following day and extended the invitation. Dyson agreed to go. There was no pressure or coercion. Dyson noted that in Islam one does not reject invitations unless there is a good reason. Al-Bayoumi asked if he should pick Dyson up. Dyson said he

would come over to Al-Bayoumi's apartment the next morning. Al-Bayoumi suggested to be there around 8:00 a.m. Al-Bayoumi indicated he would drive.

The following day Dyson walked from his apartment on (P) to Al-Bayoumi's apartment. This was on a weekday, but definitely not a Friday, as that is prayer day. He knocked on Al-Bayoumi's door. Al-Bayoumi came outside and they left in Al-Bayoumi's gold Nissan Altima. Al-Bayoumi needed to be at the consulate by a certain time. During the drive up to LA, they spoke mostly about religion. the drive, Al-Bayoumi (hereinafter referred to as OMAR) mentioned that he needed to stop and obtain some photographs of himself for the visa process. They began to look for a place to obtain the photos. stopped at a Kinkos, but they did not do photographs. They then stopped at a large mall off the I-405 freeway on Sepulvada (phonetic). They walked in together and encountered a photo booth near the entrance. Omar got his photo taken in his traditional headwear or This was apparently necessary for the visa. Omar was wearing western clothing, including a sport jacket. After obtaining the photos, they got back into the car and drove straight to the consulate in LA.

The consulate is a large white clearly marked building with underground parking. They parked underground and exited the car. had his paperwork with him. They went into the reception area. waited in the lobby. Soon a man came out and greeted Omar. described the man as being in his 40s, approximately 5'8" in height, with a black/grey beard down to his chest, who was wearing a suit. appeared that Omar and the man from the consulate knew each other. was obvious they had met before. The conversation was in Arabic Dyson did not understand what was exactly said. introduced Dyson to the man as a friend who man switched to English and spoke to Dyson briefly. Dyson asked for information regarding Saudi Arabia. Shortly thereafter, Omar and the man went behind closed doors. Dyson waited in the lobby for up to approximately thirty minutes. Omar and the man came out together. Dyson asked the man for a packet of information on Saudi Arabia. man told him to wait there and retrieved some items for Dyson. The information included a packet of information and Islamic books. the encounter Omar was formal, brief, and official, as if he had a business purpose. After being at the consulate for up to a maximum of one hour, Omar and Dyson left. They returned to the car and Omar once again drove. They spoke about how nice the interaction was. indicated he was successful in getting the visa extension. Dyson estimated the time was now well past noon.

While driving they talked of their plan to go to the restaurant because they were both hungry. They drove several miles to the restaurant through surface streets looking for it. They did not have a map and were playing it by ear. Omar said the restaurant had good food and said he had taken his family there before. That is why he wanted to take Dyson there. Omar found the restaurant awhile ago. They made a few U-turns, got confused trying to find it, and missed some turns. When questioned further about these driving methods, Dyson said Omar was not doing those maneuvers intentionally. He found no reason to believe they were being followed or attempting to evade anything.

They finally found the restaurant and parked on the street. They walked inside the small establishment. Dyson observed it be a butcher shop, with deli or bakery style refrigerator cases inside. There were no other customers. Omar inquired in Arabic to one of the employees. The three workers inside talked Arabic to Omar briefly. Omar told Dyson they informed him that they do not serve food any longer at the establishment. They only sell meat and operate a butcher shop. The restaurant portion of the establishment was closed down. The people inside recommended another restaurant that serves Halal that was close by. They walked to this new restaurant.

Dyson described it as a Mediterranean café, which could not be any larger than 500 square feet. After entering, Omar mentioned that it was time to pray. They both ordered some food, which included humus and grape leaves. There were some other customers, such as take out customers. There were no other dine in customers at this time. Since it was time to pray, out of consideration Omar asked if Dyson wanted to go to the mosque to pray. Dyson said he would pray right here. Omar went to the bathroom to wash up before prayer. He was out of Dyson's sight for less than five minutes. Dyson waited a short time, took water from the table and went outside to wash up for prayer. This was partially because he realized there was only one bathroom. Whether it was a public or employee bathroom is unclear to Dyson. Dyson washed near a tree outside. While he was outside washing, Omar came outside. Omar laid down a cloth to pray on. They then prayed together for approximately five minutes. They then returned inside to eat.

The only time Omar was apart from Dyson was the less than five minutes he was washing in the bathroom. When asked why he did not mention that in earlier interviews, Dyson responded that he did not consider that time as Omar being away, because it would have been synonymous with prayer or preparing to pray. He did not bring it up because he still considered himself to be together with Omar. It was

purely a matter of semantics and misunderstanding. When asked if Omar could have been making phone or cell phone calls during this time away, Dyson doubted it. He did not notice a public phone in the establishment. Omar did have his cell phone with him but Dyson did not remember him getting or making any calls at the restaurant. Dyson did not think Omar would have had the time to be making calls while he was washing.

There were two workers inside the café. They both spoke English. Omar did not appear to know either of them. There was an older man cooking in the back. The female waitress indicated that he was her father.

While eating, they engaged in normal conversation. came into the establishment. (The men were later determined to be NAWAF AL-HAZMI DOB: (P-1) and KHALID AL-MIHDHAR DOB: Dyson now realizes that the men were Nawaf Al-Hazmi and Khalid Al-Mihdhar. Al-Hazmi and Al-Mihdhar sat down inside. They appeared to be Arabic, even though they were dressed in western clothes. Dyson was wearing western clothes, but may have also had a head covering. not sure. How the first interaction occurred between the two men and Dyson and Al-Bayoumi is unclear. The best possibility is that they overheard the men speaking Arabic or the men overheard Dyson or Omar say something Islamic. Dyson is not positive who approached who first. At any rate, it seemed like a coincidental meeting. There was nothing to indicate Omar knew the two men or they knew Omar. Dyson did not know either man. Introductions started and Omar was "the host" from the beginning to the end of the meeting. Omar translated and let Dyson know what was occurring during the conversation between Omar, Al-Hazmi, and Al-Mihdhar. This was because the conversations were in Arabic and Dyson did not understand it well.

Omar invited Al-Hazmi and Al-Mihdhar to eat with them. Dyson did not find this unusual as this was the type of person Omar was. Omar is very generous. They sat at a table right next to Omar and Dyson. Al-Mihdhar and Al-Hazmi sat across from each other, as Dyson and Omar were doing. Dyson drew a rough diagram of the restaurant and where they were sitting. (The diagram will be maintained in the 1A section of the case file).

The conversation continued. From Dyson's perspective, it did not seem serious. The three of them were smiling, laughing and getting to know each other. Dyson recalls Al-Hazmi and Al-Mihdhar having "chi" or tea. They also shared some of Dyson and Omar's food after being

offered. Dyson estimated the meeting lasted for awhile, but not any longer than one hour.

During the conversations, Dyson learned that Al-Hazmi and Al-Mihdhar just came from Saudi Arabia and were students. They wanted to study English. They were currently living in LA, somewhere in the area of the restaurant, and did not like LA. Al-Hazmi was doing most of the talking with Omar. Al-Mihdhar was less talkative. At the end of the meal/meeting, Omar gave his phone number to Al-Hazmi. Dyson is not sure, but believes Omar also got their phone number. Omar told Al-Hazmi and Al-Mihdhar that they lived in San Diego and invited them to San Diego to check it out. Omar told them if they liked San Diego, he would be able to and was happy to help them. Omar and Dyson left the restaurant first. Al-Hazmi and Al-Mihdhar stayed behind.

Omar and Dyson left in Omar's car. They went to the Culver City mosque for sunset prayer. They spent approximately fifteen to twenty minutes there. The mosque was a few blocks from the restaurant. It could possibly be located on Washington Street. After prayer, Omar drove them back to San Diego. Dyson recalls Omar calling his wife on his cell phone advising her he was on his way home. They made no additional stops. When they reached San Diego, Omar dropped Dyson off on (P) and departed.

Dyson was asked why he previously reported the first time he met Al-Hazmi and Al-Mihdhar was at the party they had at their Mt. Ada Road apartment after moving to San Diego. Dyson reminded the agents (P-1) Although he does have a that he has good memory, he remembers some things better than others. The direct questioning by SA (S) yesterday regarding the meeting and surrounding circumstances jarred his memory. When he was at Al-Hazmi's and Al-Mihdhar's apartment on the day of the party, he spent four or five hours there. He specifically remembered this event right away because of the significant amount of time he spent with them that day. At the time of the earlier interviews (10/04/2001) and 10/06/2001, he believed that the party was the first time he met the individuals until later realizing he did have an earlier chance meeting with them. as Dyson explained to SA (S) yesterday, he was confusing two events at the same restaurant and was unsure who he met during one of the occasions. Dyson was hesitant to provide misleading or inaccurate information to the agents, or say something he was unsure of. also noted the difficulty in remembering something that occurred nearly two years ago.

After Dyson and Omar returned from the LA trip, he heard Omar mention Al-Hazmi and Al-Mihdhar in passing on approximately two occasions. The conversations are difficult to remember because Dyson did not consider them significant. On one occasion, Omar asked Dyson if he remembered the men they met in LA. Omar indicated something to the effect that they will possibly move to San Diego and came down to visit. Another time Omar mentioned that they were coming down, possibly meaning they were moving to San Diego.

There was a housewarming/welcome party for Al-Hazmi and Al-Mihdhar after they moved into their Mt. Ada Road apartment. This is

the party that Omar threw for them, as explained in previous statements. Dyson recalled this as his "first significant interaction" with Al-Hazmi and Al-Mihdhar, until his memory was refreshed yesterday. This event was the strongest thing in his mind at the time. This partially caused Dyson to report this as the first time he met Al-Hazmi and Al-Mihdhar. During the party, there was a large piece of plastic in the middle of the floor. Everyone sat on the floor around the edges. The attendees ate from containers placed in the middle of the plastic. Omar, Al-Hazmi, and Al-Mihdhar were doing the preparation, cooking, and serving. Dyson, at the request of Omar, filmed some of the party. At one point, Omar got in front of the camera and said a few words. This included why they were gathering and the date. Al-Hazmi and Al-Mihdhar were captured on the tape as well. Some attendees were sensitive about not being filmed.

On 10/08/2001, Abdussattar Shaikh (a.k.a. Sattar Shaikh) (hereinafter Shaikh), (P-1) , Lemon Grove, California, telephone (P-1) , date of birth (P-1) , SSAN (P-1) , was interviewed at his residence. After being advised of the identities of the interviewing agents and the nature and purpose of the interview, and after being advised that he could terminate the interview at any time, Shaikh voluntarily provided the following information:

(This interview was Shaikh's fourth by the FBI pertaining to the terrorist attacks on 09/11/2001. Shaikh was previously interviewed by SAs (S) and (S) during a consensual search of his residence, and by the below-referenced reporting agents of the San Diego Division. The results of those interviews are contained in separate FD-302s.)

(Shaikh indicated that all dates provided are approximate, are to the best of his recollection and may not be accurate.)

\* \* \*

Shaikh first met Yassar Bushnak (hereinafter Bushnak) in approximately September or October of 2000. He was introduced to Bushnak by Nawaf Alhazmi (hereinafter Alhazmi) while Alhazmi was living in his (Shaikh's) home. On occasions prior to his introduction to Bushnak, Shaikh spoke to Alhazmi of the property he owned (P-1)  $^{(P-1)}$  , Lemon Grove, California and how this property was in jeopardy of foreclosure because of Shaikh's financial position at the time. An Islamic mosque founded by Shaikh was located on this property. purpose of Alhazmi introducing Shaikh to Bushnak was to assist Shaikh in finding someone who would donate money to assist him in paying the debt on the property. Bushnak had a lot of money (the source of which Shaikh remains unaware,) and used his money for philanthropic purposes like Shaikh's mosque. Bushnak agreed to assist Shaikh and the two made arrangements for the donation. Before Bushnak was able to provide Shaikh with the funds, however, the Islamic Center of San Diego (hereinafter ICSD) learned of the deal between Shaikh and Bushnak. leaders at the ICSD requested that Shaikh allow the ICSD to essentially broker the donation so that they would be able to politically gain from

the deal. Shaikh felt that he had no choice but to agree and allow the ICSD to become involved. The ICSD's involvement led to obfuscation of the purpose of the donation and Bushnak decided not to provide the funds.

On another occasion, sometime around December of 2000, or January of 2001, Shaikh was invited to dinner by Omar Albayoumi (hereinafter Albayoumi) at his (Albayoumi's) home. Present at this dinner was Bushnak. Shaikh spoke little to Bushnak on this occasion.

On June 16, 2001, Shaikh attended a fund-raiser dinner at the Holiday Inn hotel on Shelter Island in San Diego, California. This dinner was sponsored by the Holyland Foundation, a group which raises money for the Palestinian struggle against Israel. Shaikh and Bushnak sat together at the same table during this event. Shaikh and Bushnak did not engage in any substantive conversation during this event.

Shaikh continued to see Bushnak from time to time at the ICSD mosque in the Clairmont area of San Diego. In approximately July of 2001, Shaikh is aware that Bushnak went to New York to visit with his uncle. Shaikh is also aware that Bushnak's uncle has a business in New York.

Bushnak is a quiet and apparently shy individual. He always seemed to have money. On one occasion, Bushnak paid \$3,000.00 for two weeks of English lessons. The last time Shaikh saw Bushnak, he observed him driving a new rented light brown Toyota Avalon vehicle. Shaikh is unaware whether Khalid Almihdar ever met Bushnak. Shaikh never observed the two together. (Shaikh provided the following telephone number for Bushnak; (P-1)

Sometime in approximately September of 2000, Alhazmi wrote a check to (P) (hereinafter (P)) for approximately \$2,000.00. Alhazmi did not know (P). The purpose of the check was to assist Shaikh. Shaikh did not have a bank account at the time. He indicated to Alhazmi that he needed to obtain a check to send to (P) for a past debt Shaikh owed to him. Alhazmi offered, to save Shaikh the expense of purchasing a cashier's check, to write the check for him payable to (P) since he (Alhazmi) had a checking account. Shaikh agreed and gave Alhazmi cash. Alhazmi then wrote a check to (P).

The Hotmail email account, (P-1) is Shaikh's personal email account. He has corresponded with Alhazmi and others on this account. Most recently, Shaikh uses this account to find a husband for his (P) (no last name) (which means (P) (P) ).

\*\*\*

The account (P-1) is the account Alhazmi used when he no longer lived in Shaikh's home. Shaikh has corresponded with Alhazmi, sending his messages to this account.

\*\*\*

Shaikh does not know anyone named (P) .

\*\*\*

(Shaikh was shown an email generated from his account, (P-1), in December of 2000, which closed, "...and say Assalamo Alykum to Hani.")

Shaikh did recognize most of the text in the electronic message and acknowledged to the reporting agents that he sent the message to Alhazmi. With regard to the reference at the end of the communication wherein the name Hani appears, Shaikh indicated that he knows many individuals named Hani, since this is a common middle-eastern name, he does not, however, know any Hanis which Alhazmi might know. Shaikh was not able to offer any explanation for the reference to Hani in his communication with Alhazmi. Shaikh was unable to

provide the identities of any individuals named Hani which Alhazmi might have known. Shaikh reiterated that he has never met Hani Hanjour. Shaikh agreed with the reporting agents that the reference to Hani in the message he acknowledges sending was strange given Shaikh's lack of knowledge of anyone named Hani as related to Alhazmi.

(In a previous interview with the reporting agents, Shaikh viewed a photograph of Hani Hanjour as one of several photographs of individuals established to be involved with, or suspected to have been involved with, the 09/11/2001 terrorist bombings. Shaikh indicated during that interview that he did not recognize the individual in the photograph.)

Sometime in approximately March of 2001, Shaikh sent a Blue greeting card to Alhazmi at the (P-1) address. Mountain greeting card to Alhazmi at the Blue Mountain is a company which provides free online greeting cards which are sent to their intended recipients by email. The purpose of the card Shaikh sent Alhazmi was to wish him a happy Eid Adah day. Adah is a holy day in the Muslim religion. The text of the greeting card was simply to have a happy Eid Adah day and nothing else. Shaikh did not recall Alhazmi sending him a response.

The (P) advised that (P) , Dr. Shaikh, has resided at (P) , Lemon Grove, California for approximately 15-20 years. Dr. Shaikh, an (P) Muslim, has been divorced from his former wife, (P) for approximately 9-10 years. The (P) still remain friends with (P) and she can be contacted at (P) , Culver City, California 90230, telephone (P) . At some point in the past, Dr. Shaikh had told the (P) that he had a doctorate in (P) .

On September 14, 2001, the (P) had received a telephone call from a reporter, (P), of the Los Angeles Times. (P) had asked the (P) if they had been contacted by the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). (P) stated that Dr. Shaikh was interviewed by the Los Angeles Times on September 14, 2001.

(P) and (P) stated that in mid August 2000, Dr. Shaikh introduced the (P) to two individuals who, at that time, were described to the (P) as being children of a friend of Dr. Shaikh, from Saudi Arabia. After Dr. Shaikh was interviewed on September 14, 2001, Dr. Shaikh called the (P) and informed them that he had, in fact met the two men at the Mosque in Lemon Grove, California. Dr. Shaikh informed the (P) that the two men were in need of a room to rent and he provided rooms to them. The (P) did not know the names of the two individuals but one drive a white car and the other drove a red car, possibly a Honda.

The (P) were shown a series of photographs of the nineteen hijackers as well as associates of the hijackers.

On October 15, 2001, Talal Ahmed Al-Hamdan, date of birth (P-1), residential address (P-1) Riverside, California 92507, cellular telephone number (P), was advised of the identities of the interviewing agents, and the nature of the interview. Talal Al-Hamdan volunteered the following information.

The Al-Hamdan family originates from a bedouin tribe once located in Western Saudi Arabia. The family is not part of the royal family. Talal Al-Hamdan was born in Jeddah, Saudi Arabia. Talal has six brothers and one sister. Talal is currently rooming in the Riverside apartment with his older brother Faisal and younger brother Abdul Azziz.

Talal misses Saudi Arabia. He enjoys wearing traditional Saudi clothing. Upon his final return to Saudi Arabia, Talal plans on taking four wives. He currently has one future marriage arranged for him.

Talal's father, Ahmed Abdul Azziz Suleiman Al-Hamdan, is one of three Finance Ministry officials employed under the Deputy Finance Minister of Saudi Arabia. He is responsible for the Western Region of Saudi Arabia, to include Jeddah and Mecca. As this area is considered the most important region, his position is more important than the other two officials at his level.

Talal's father is responsible for financial projects which originate in Jeddah and Mecca, to include construction and large equipment purchases for the Saudi government. Although Talal's father is not related to the royal family he has reached this high position because he is smart. Talal's father has a bachelor's degree in accounting from King Abdul Azziz University.

Talal's father is married to one woman.

The Al-Hamdan family is fairly well known and wealthy. The family owns two large houses with at least one swimming pool in Jeddah, as well as another house in Mecca. Each male in the family has a BMW or Mercedes automobile. Additionally, the family has a limousine driven by an Indonesian. No one would say no to Talal in Jeddah.

Talal is subsidized in the United States by his father and by scholarship money from the government of Saudi Arabia. Depending on the particularly need for money, sometimes Talal's father pays and sometimes the Saudi government pays. Talal's father wanted his sons to come to the U.S. for English language immersion type study and to gain knowledge of the world before returning home.

Talal came to the U.S. to study English about four years ago. He attended English language classes at George Washington University in Washington D.C. He resided with a sponsor, (P) who also was an employee of the Saudi Embassy in Washington D.C. (P) left employment at the Embassy at the end of 1996. (P) 's residence was located in (P) Maryland. (P) had some type of advanced educational degree like a doctorate.

Talal did not enjoy living in Washington D.C. The English language school was located near Dupont Circle; Talal did not approve of the gay lifestyle in the area.

After about a year, Talal's father became concerned that Talal's English was not improving quickly enough. In Washington D.C. Talal was convening mainly with other Arabs. Talal's father suggested moving to San Diego, as there were fewer Arabs living in the city, and Talal would be forced to speak English. Moreover, Talal's father had visited San Diego at several years before, and thought it was a very nice city. Talal remained in Washington D.C. for approximately one and one half years before moving to San Diego in 1998.

After arriving in San Diego, Talal resided for approximately four months, from May 9, 1998 through September 9, 1998, at the La Pacifica Hotel (now Motel 6) at 1546 2nd Street San Diego. During this period Talal took English language classes at ELS centers. Again, Talal's English language skills did not improve rapidly while he was at ELS. Talal was forced to converse with other foreign students with very little English language comprehension. During this period, Talal did not have many friends and generally kept to himself. Talal stayed in the hotel by himself, without roommates.

At the end of his stay, Talal had an argument and misunderstanding with the hotel manager. After a long argument regarding how much the room was worth and how much Talal owed on his bill, the manager said forget it, the bill is taken care of. Later, while out of town, Talal discovered that the hotel still had an outstanding balance on the bill. Talal directed Omar Al-Bayoumi to pay

the bill. Talal gave Al-Bayoumi the money to pay the bill and Al-Bayoumi paid the outstanding debt.

Talal then resided with another sponsor, a single woman, whose name Talal could not recall. However the woman's residence was very close to Grossmont College. Talal found the room for rent on the bulletin board at Grossmont College.

Talal also stayed in a hotel in the Hotel Circle Area of San Diego, next to the Holiday Inn.

During this time Talal attended the Abu Bakar Mosque on Eckstrom Street, (also know as the Islamic Center of San Diego). Talal only attended services on Fridays. He entered, prayed and left.

Talal's brother Faisal, date of birth (P-1), arrived in early 1999, after attending King Abdul Azziz University. Talal secured an apartment with Faisal at the Lake Murray Village Apartments, 5421 Lake Murray Boulevard (P) La Mesa California 91942. Talal found out about the apartments through the Apartment Finder.

Although other Arabs, and even other Saudi students, lived in the Lake Murray Boulevard apartment complex. Talal and Faisal did not associate with them. The other Saudis were from Riyadh and were not friendly.

During this period Talal and Faisal began attending Friday services at the Al Medina Mosque in La Mesa, California.

At some point later, Talal and Faisal moved to the La Mirage Apartments in San Diego, where the brothers paid \$1225 per month for a two bedroom apartment.

Before the summer of 2001, Talal moved to Riverside to room with his brother Abdul Azziz. Faisal remained in San Diego, attending school.

Talal first met Omar Al-Bayoumi at the Abu Bakar mosque. Talal did not know Al-Bayoumi previously. In a telephone conversation Talal's father told him there is a guy at the mosque that they should meet, Al-Bayoumi.

Al-Bayoumi knew Talal's father in Saudi Arabia. Al-Bayoumi worked as a finance officer for some company. As such, Al--Bayoumi was required to have Talal's father sign documents.

On one occasion during a document signing, Al-Bayoumi asked Talal's father for a recommendation or a reference to apply for Saudi scholarship money to pursue a master's degree in the U.S. Talal's Talal's father helped Al-Bayoumi get a scholarship. father agreed.

Al-Bayoumi approached Talal and Faisal at the Mosque. visited Al-Bayoumi's residence, near the Abu Bakar mosque, at least three times and Al Bayoumi's visited Talal and Faisal's residence approximately 10-12 times. Talal saw Al-Bayoumi at both mosques. Bayoumi was well known in the Muslim community. Previously Al-Bayoumi also visited Talal during Talal's stay at La Pacifica Hotel.

Al-Bayoumi was always friendly and courteous to Talal and Faisal.

Al-Bayoumi has four children.

Al-Bayoumi is now in England pursuing a doctoral degree. He left the U.S. with his family during this past summer.

Talal, Faisal and Abdul Azziz travel from the United States back to Saudi Arabia each year to observe Ramadan each year. This year they are scheduled to travel the first week of November. The eldest Al-Hamdan brother, Khalid, works in Jeddah for a business company. Khalid is scheduled to be married through an arranged marriage near the end of December. Talal and Faisal will attend the wedding and will probably stay in Saudi Arabia from early November 2001 until January 2002, when they plan to return to the U.S. and resume attending college.

Talal carries a Kingdom of Saudi Arabia Special Passport. is not a diplomatic passport. However, it allows for special treatment for Talal when in arab countries, similar to a diplomatic passport. Talal's father could obtain a diplomatic passport if he desired.

Talal first entered the U.S. in 1993 with an F1 visa to attend a camp type school in Boston Massachusetts.

Talal has traveled to many countries in the world, including Switzerland and Austria.

Talal does not like to go to the Saudi Consulate in Los Angeles. The people there are fake, not friendly, and they are not that helpful. Talal prefers to have immigration issues handled at the INS office.

Talal admits getting into trouble with his California driver's license. He recognizes that he owes a fine and believes that he needs to secure an attorney. He will go to the California DMV to straighten out the problem. Talal is currently driving a Nissan Maxima. Faisal, because he is the older brother, is driving a brand new Mercedes sedan purchased from the Mercedes dealer in Escondido, California.

Neither Talal, nor his brothers have experienced any physical violence as a result of retaliation. However, when they are in stores they do get dirty looks and whispers. Talal's neighbor across the hall will not acknowledge nor greet any of the brothers.

Talal visited friends in Tucson and Tempe, Arizona in April 2001.

Talal's father speaks to Talal every day by telephone from Saudi Arabia. He is very worried about the safety of Talal, Faisal and Abdul Azziz. He is encouraging the brothers to move back to Saudi Arabia as soon as possible.

Talal's father told Talal after the September 11th attack to expect to be contacted by the FBI.

Regarding the September 11th attack, Talal feels it was so bad killing people as they went to work.

Talal's favorite televison program is BBC America. He prefers classical music, particularly Beethoven.

Talal recognized a photograph of Omar Bakarbashat as someone he saw at the Mosque.

Talal enjoyed living in San Diego. Talal used to frequent a dance club on University Avenue in San Diego. Talal doesn't like Riverside as much, although he likes to go to the dance clubs in Los Angeles. He has been to the Century Club in Los Angeles. He has not found a girlfriend from the clubs because they drink alcohol.

Talal originally decided to move to Riverside because a person he became friends with while in Washington D.C. was attending University of California Riverside. This individual was from the United Arab Emirates, Saeef Al-Rashidi. Al-Rashidi has since left the U.S.

There is a secured and gated parking garage under the structure at the south end of the structure. According to Dyson, this is the garage they entered and parked in. After leaving the Saudi Consulate, Dyson and Al-Bayoumi went to eat and proceeded to the first restaurant that Al-Bayoumi had in mind. Dyson showed the agents the route Al-Bayoumi drove to get there. The route was as follows: south on Sawtelle Boulevard; left/east onto Venice Boulevard; left/north onto Overland Avenue; left/west onto McCune Avenue; left/south onto Glendon Avenue; and right/west onto Venice Boulevard, where they then parked near the restaurant in the 10800 block of the street.

The first restaurant Omar Al-Bayoumi brought Dyson to was pointed out by Dyson. It is currently Dream Pizza, 10855 Venice Boulevard, Los Angeles, California 90034, phone (P). On the occasion Al-Bayoumi and Dyson went to the establishment it was a Mediterranean Meat Market/Restaurant. However, when they went inside the workers advised they no longer were serving sit down meals, and only the butcher shop portion of the establishment was operating. They suggested a place nearby that served similar food Al-Bayoumi and Dyson were looking for. According to Dyson they spent a very short amount of time at the establishment. Once they learned of the situation, they almost immediately left to go to the other establishment.

There was a sign on the front facade of Dream Pizza indicating it was celebrating it's one year anniversary. SA (S) spoke to (P), (P) of Dream Pizza. He indicated that prior to being a pizza parlor, the establishment was a Mediterranean Meat Market. This included the time period of approximately one and one-half to two years ago. 





The duration of the interview between (P) and (P) lasted approximately five minutes. (P) was also present at the above interview. (P) provided (P) with personal information, a resume, and completed an application for the Scholarship program.

(P) told (P) he, (P) , was leaving that same day to travel to Saudi Arabia and he will submit (P) application for approval. (P) was unaware of the approval process. Approximately, two weeks later (P) received his acceptance letter, by mail, into the scholarship program at a private University named (P).

The scholarship program was explained to (P) as a foundation established by businessmen in Saudi Arabia who donate the money needed to send non-speaking Arabic students to colleges in (P). (P) worked for these businessmen in seeking students for the scholarship program. (P) was accepted into the Arabic study program in the fall of (P), but did not enter the program until the beginning of (P). He elected to stay in San Diego to help his father with a small business selling (P) from (P) at the swap meet in Costa Mesa, California.

The end of January (P), (P) traveled on Lufthansa Commercial Airline, from San Diego to (P), with stops in Chicago and Frankfurt, Germany. (P) obtained a visa in Frankfurt before traveling to (P). (P) obtained the airline ticket through an unknown travel agency in New York. The travel agent was related to a friend of (P) father. (P) obtained approval and purchased the airline ticket using the credit card of (P). The scholarship program reimbursed (P) for the ticket. (P) parents were aware of his plans and in favor of the Scholarship program, however, again his parents could not afford to pay for the airline ticket. The travel agent mailed the airline ticket to the residence of (P) (P) apartment number (P) El Cajon, California.

The first semester (P) resided with several roommates who shared a house with a (P) family. (P) was the only American residing in the house. The homeowner was named Abusubhi who lived with his wife and children on the first floor of the residence. The second floor of the house was where the students resided.

The roommates were all from Albania, (P) knew them by the names Hudathafia, Khalil, Ibrahim, Zainy, Abdelsalam, Amer, Abdel-Aziz, Abdel-Khaliq, Yousef, Anis, Abdullah, and Sulieman. The residence was located in the neighborhood of (P) in (P).

The scholarship paid the rent for (P) and gave him (P)

(P) Also, called (P) for living expenses each month.

The program paid the tuition and books at the University. An individual named, Jamal Abu Talhah, who was a (P) in his late thirties, regularly visited the residence with money to pay the rent and he would give (P) and the roommates the money for their living expense.

At the end of the first semester in June of (P), (P) traveled by Egypt Commercial Airlines, to Libya. He paid for the round trip ticket using his own money which was approximately (P) (P). He traveled from , to Cairo and stayed in a hotel named Movenpick. He then traveled from Cairo to was met at the airport by his father, brother and a cousin, named (P) and had traveled to Libya from San Diego during the same period of time. (P) and his family stayed at the residence of his father's sister in (P) and (P) stayed approximately five to six weeks and then returned to San Diego, California. (P) remained living with his Aunt until the end of September (P) During the visit in (P) (P) and his family visited a vacation resort on the beach, visited Greek ruins and visited small cities in route to and from the resort. After his father and brother departed, (P) enrolled in a small Arabic School to study the Arabic language. While enrolled in the (P) Arabic School, he continued to stay in at the residence of his Aunt's.

(P) returned to (P) in October (P) to begin the second semester at the University. During the second semester he resided in an apartment shared by several roommates. He remembered the roommate's names as, Issa who was from Albania, (P) who was from Great Britain, Abdel-Aziz and Anis, who were the same roommates from the first semester, Abdurahman, who was Albanian, and Saddam, who was from Iraq.

The first semester at the University was taught in the Language Center. The center was called (P)

(P) The classes were held five days a week, Sunday thru

Thursday, during the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. A bus would transport the students from the residence to the school which was approximately an hour away. (P) attended a Mosque in the neighborhood near his residence during that period.

The second semester at the University was taught in The Islamic Studies Program. (P) enrolled in five courses, which was thirteen units. The courses included, Jurist Prudence of Act of Worship, The Rules of Reading the Quran, part one, Jurisprudence of Marriage and Divorce, Islamic Culture, and the Introduction to Islam of Jurist Prudence. The classes were taught three days a week, Sunday thru Tuesday, 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m., with a one hour break. The classes consisted of twenty to thirty students.

At the end of November 2001, (P) traveled to Saudi Arabia on a school excursion trip with (P) University for approximately ten days. (P) paid (P) for his portion of this trip and the University paid the remaining expense for the trip.

Other travel by (P) was with his family, in (P) the (P) family relocated from San Diego to reside in (P). In (P), the (P) family relocated back to the United States. They temporarily resided in New York with relatives for approximately four months.

After the four-months, they moved back to San Diego where they have resided since.

(P) and (P) were divorced in San Diego approximately nine years ago. They have had joint custody of and (P)

At the end of (P) thru the beginning of (P), (P) went on a small pilgrimage with several students from San Diego State University to Saudi Arabia. The students were members of the Muslim Student Association on the campus of San Diego State University. Sheik Alaqui, who was the Imam of the Mosque on Saranac Street in Lemon Grove, sponsored the trip. The pilgrimage was an Islamic event for Muslims called Purmul.

(P) heard of the terrorist attacks that occurred in the United States on September 11, 2001, while he was vacationing at his (P) Aunt's house in He saw the pictures of the terrorist attacks on a television news show. (P) called his parents and discussed the events. (P) did not make any comments to the interviewing agents in regards to the terrorist attacks. Shortly after the initial telephone conversations with his parents, (P) recalled his mother calling him back and advising him that the FBI had questioned and harassed her in reference to him knowing two of the (P) telephone number in which his family used to The (P-1) call him was The number was a cellular telephone subscribed to by one of (P) roommates. told the FBI showed her pictures of the two hijackers and asked if (P) had associated with the hijackers while they lived in San Diego.

(P) informed (P) that two Muslims, who attended the same Mosque in San Diego as (P), were identified by the FBI as two of the hijackers on the flight that crashed into the Pentagon. The hijackers were identified as Nawaf Al-Hazmi and Khalid Al-Midhar. At first, (P) did not recognize the names of Nawaf or Khalid. (P) and her other son, (P) refreshed (P) memory of how he knew Nawaf and Khalid. He later recalled both of them from the Mosque on Saranac Avenue in Lemon Grove, California. (P) also received a subsequent telephone call from his father stating the FBI was questioning everyone in the Muslim community of San Diego.

(P) admitted having only two conversational encounters with Nawaf and Khalid during the entire period of time they resided in San Diego, California. The first time (P) met Nawaf and Khalid was the end of the summer in the year 2000. They were introduced to each other at the Mosque on Saranac Avenue by Mohdar Abdullah. Mohdar had previously become acquainted with Nawaf and Khalid. At the time of the introduction, (P) did not speak or understand the Arabic language very well and both Nawaf and Khalid did not speak English. acted in the capacity of a translator at the introduction. described their conversation as casual throughout the introduction type (P) could not recall any significant or pertinent conversation between him and the hijackers. The introduction took place inside the Mosque when they were standing in a room that contained audio and video tapes of Islam. The audio room was located on the second floor of the Mosque.

Mohdar told (P) that Nawaf and Khalid were in San Diego to learn English. (P) later saw Nawaf walking alone on the campus

(P) witnessed Nawaf and Khalid leaving the same Texaco station several times after they visited with Mohdar. Nawaf was the driver and Khalid the passenger of a small white Toyota car. (P) never rode in a car with Nawaf or Khalid. At a later date, (P) saw Nawaf wearing a similar employee work shirt at the Texaco gas station that Mohdar wore. (P) believed Nawaf worked at the Texaco gas station for a short period of time.

(P) learned that Nawaf and Khalid lived at the residence of Abdusatar Sheikh in Lemon Grove, California. (P) had known Sheikh since a child and he was familiar with (P) (P)

(P) Sheikh rented Nawaf and Khalid rooms after Sheikh and his wife divorced. Sheikh's children were grown and had moved out of the residence. (P) never visited the residence during the time Nawaf and Khalid were living there. Mohdar was a close friend of Nawaf and Khalid and would regularly visit or sleep overnight at the residence during the time the hijackers lived with Sheikh. (P) was unaware of how Mohdar, was introduced or first became acquainted with Nawaf and Khalid. Mohdar did tell (P) that Nawaf and Khalid were from Saudi Arabia and Mohdar was from Yemen.

Khalid left San Diego, date unknown, to make a visit back to Saudi Arabia because he missed his wife and kids. (P) could not recall the date, but understood that Nawaf left San Diego to continue his education out of State. (P) did not know any further details of Nawaf's departure from San Diego or his destination.

Nawaf was moving to continue his education in another State within the United States. (P) did not know what type of education Nawaf was going to pursue out of state. (P) was not aware that

Nawaf or Khalid had any interest in flight schools. (P) did not assist Nawaf or Khalid in any of their educational plans.

November or December of 2000. Khalid was not present at the second meet. The second encounter also took place at the Mosque on Saranac Street. (P) had arrived at the Mosque after an all day Muslim/Arabic awareness event which took place on the campus of Grossmont College. On that day, (P) voluntarily worked in the booth that recognized Islam and inform other college students of an event called Ramadan. (P) had a conversation with Nawaf relating to the activities of the event. (P) could not recall any significant or pertinent conversation with Nawaf during their second meet. (P) denied knowledge, participation or awareness of the terrorist activities by Nawaf and Khalid.

Agents showed (P) a booklet containing the photo's of the hijackers who were identified as being involved with the September 11, 2001, attacks. (P) recognized the individuals identified by the FBI as Nawaf and Khalid being the same individuals introduced to him as Nawaf and Khalid at the Mosque by Mohdar.

Previous to P meeting the hijackers, Mohdar Abdullah introduced himself to P in January 1999, at the Mosque on Saranac Street. Mohdar had previously met P father while attending the Mosque. P had just returned from his pilgrimage to Saudi Arabia with the Imam and the students from San Diego State University. Mohdar and P spoke of the events that took place with P pilgrimage. The conversation led to Mohdar asking P for help in learning the English language and vice versa P manting to learn the Arabic language. They informally agreed between themselves to get together and have language lessons. Several language lessons took place and eventually they became friends.

They attended Grossmont College during the same period, however, they did not have class together. (P) frequently visited Mohdar at his apartment which was located in close proximity to the Mosque on Saranac Street. They entered in prayer and ate dinner and discussed Islam. (P) denied being at Mohdar's apartment when Nawaf

and Khalid were visiting Mohdar. (P) did meet Mohdar's roommates living in the apartment. (P) knew Mohdar was interested in marrying a female citizen from the United States. (P) denied assisting Mohdar in any manner in his attempts to seek citizenship status in the United States.

(P) became aware that Mohdar was unhappy with the living arrangements at the apartment on Saranac Street and was looking to find a new residence. At the same time, was looking for a tenant to rent out a room in the apartment. (P) set up the meeting and Mohdar agreed to become the landlord and where tenant at the apartment on El Cajon, California. Mohdar and (P) had contact three to four days a week, however, the contact became more frequent after Mohdar moved into the apartment with . (P) denied participating in target shooting with Mohdar. (P) was unaware that Mohdar possessed or owned any firearms. (P) denied any knowledge or participation of Mohdar being associated with the activities of Nawaf and Khalid. (P) was devastated when he received the telephone call from his mother in which he learned that Mohdar had been arrested by the FBI in connection with the hijackers.

When the interviewing agents showed (P) the photo's in the booklet of the hijackers, he also identified an individual identified by the FBI as Omar Albayoumi. (P) became acquainted with Albayoumi through the Mosque on Balboa Avenue. At one time, (P) (P) Albayoumi occasionally gave (P) a ride from the Mosque to the apartment of Albayoumi. Albayoumi would conduct numerous fund raisers at the Mosque. The fund raisers would consist of different Islamic relief causes such as the Holy Land Foundation and the Islamic Relief Foundation. (P) could not provide any additional information in regards to Albayoumi. (P) was also familiar with Albayoumi from the Mosque, however, they did not like each other.

Another individual in the booklet (P) was familiar with was Omar Bakarbashant. They met at the Texaco gas station mentioned above were Mohdar worked. (P) knew that Mohdar and Bakarbashant were roommates at the apartment on Saranac Street and coworkers at the

Texaco station. (P) could not provide any additional details regarding Bakarbashant.

In addition to discussing his current situation with his attorney, (P) had discussions with (P) as to being arrested in (P) and his deportation to the Unites States.

(P) and his parents discussed their situation with (P)
Attorney at Law, located in San Diego. (P) was aware that his (P) discussed (P) situation with several members of the Mosque on Balboa Avenue. The identities of the members were unknown to (P)

(P) denied any knowledge or participation of terrorist activities while he was living in the Middle East. (P) denied making any incriminating statements to the (P) during his interview subsequent to his arrest. (P) claims the seized personal items from his person, in particular, his college text books and cassette tapes of Islam. (P) did not mention any other items taken from his person at the time of his arrest in (P).

- B. Did you participate in any way in any of those attacks against any U.S. targets? Answer-No.

It is the opinion of this examiner that the recorded responses to the relevant questions on Series II are indicative of deception. In the presence of his attorney, Abdoun was confronted with the results of Series I, and II. After approximately 15 minutes the interrogation was terminated in view of the fact that the defense attorney had a scheduled court appointment. Abdoun provided no additional information.
