

The January 7, 1943, issue of the Daily Worker contained an article on page 2 to the effect that 5,000 Jewish organizations received a call to attend the 1st Anniversary Conference of the Jewish Council for Russian War Relief. The call was announced by Professor Albert Einstein, Honorary Chairman of the Council. The conference was to be an all day affair at the Hotel Commodore on Sunday, February 28. It was to be followed by a "Modern Jacob's Dinner" dedicated to the Jewish forces in the armies of the United Nations.

12 In March, 1943 Leon Denen, official of the Jewish  
13 Labor Committee, 1752 Broadway, New York City, furnished a  
14 history of the activities in the labor movement of Henryk  
15 Erlich and Victor Alter, prior to an announcement by  
16 Ambassador Litvinoff of the USSR that Erlich and Alter had  
17 been executed by the Soviet Government in December, 1942.  
18

19 According to Denen, Irlich was a labor attorney in  
20 Warsaw, as well as an editor and political director of the  
21 Polish organization of the General Jewish Workers Union, an  
22 organization of Jewish laborers in Poland, and Alter was active  
23 in trade union work among the Jewish people.

24 In Lubin, Poland, both men were arrested by the  
25 Russian authorities when Russia occupied Eastern Poland under  
26 terms which grew out of the Hitler-Stalin pact. They were  
27 kept in a Russian prison for almost two years, and no reason  
28 was given by the Russian Government. Following the Hitler  
29 invasion of Russia in June, 1941, an agreement was reached  
30 between the Polish Government and the Soviet Government, in  
31 September, 1941, to cooperate in the war against Germany, and  
32 all Polish citizens interned or imprisoned on Russian territory  
33 were granted freedom, and at this time Alter and Irlich were  
34 set free with the Russian Government's apologies.  
35

36 In October, 1941 the Russian Government discussed with  
37 Erlich and Alter a project to organize a Jewish Anti-Nazi  
38 Committee in Moscow to help in the fight against Hitler Germany.  
39 The proposal was that Erlich and Alter establish communications  
40 for the underground movement in Poland and strengthen the  
41 opposition to the Nazis. In October, 1941 the men were again arrested  
42 in Kuibyshev, Russia.  
43

44 After the second arrest of these men in December, 1941,  
45 many American and British labor organizations pleaded with the  
46 Soviet Government through Ambassador Maxim Litvinoff in Washington  
47 on their behalf because of their widely-known activities for  
48 behalf of laboring people. Well-known American labor men and  
49 progressives who pleaded for their freedom included Philip  
50 Murray, President of the CIO; Clinton Golden, Assistant

18 As late as January 23, 1943 a cable was sent to the  
19 Soviet Government by the group listed above requesting the

23 There was no reply to any of these communications  
24 until William Green, of the American Federation of Labor,  
25 received from Soviet Ambassador Litvinoff a communication dated  
26 February 15, 1943, stating that the men had been executed some  
27 time in December 1942.

In April, 1943, [redacted] caused a search of the Division of Communications and Records, Department of State, to be conducted for all information concerning the Victor Alter-Henrich case. *Xm*

An examination of these files reflected a telegram from J. Baskin, General Secretary, Workmen's Circle, 175 East Broadway, New York City, to the Secretary of State dated December 19, 1941, quoting a cablegram sent to the Soviet Government through Maxim Litvinov regarding the Alter-Ehrlich case. This letter (SIC) stated that Alter and Ehrlich during their prior visits to the United States were active in behalf of the Workmen's Circle. The above-mentioned cablegram stated that the organization was elated several months before to learn that Alter and Ehrlich were among the number of arrested Socialists from Poland, who were liberated in Russia. Then the organization just learned from the American press that Alter and Ehrlich were again arrested. The Workmen's Circle appealed through Litvinov to the Soviet Government to set them free, recognizing the valiant fight Russia was conducting against Hitler. *Xm*

The files also reflected a telegram from Philip Murray, President, CIO, William Green, Albert Einstein and other prominent individuals, dated January 29, 1943, urging the release of Alter and Ehrlich. *Xm*

12            The "New York World Telegram" on February 9, 1943  
13            carried an article by Frederick Voltman, under the caption  
14            "Hads Adopt Jap-American Victory Forum" which stated that the  
15            Communists, following their recent pattern of infiltrating  
16            foreign language groups by setting up "Victory Councils"; had  
17            started to move in on the loyal Japanese-Americans.

19            The article stated that prominent Communists and  
20            leaders of Communist front organizations had virtually taken  
21            over the Forum on Japanese-Americans in the Victory Program which  
22            was to be held the following Saturday in the Hotel Commodore,  
23            New York City.

25            According to the article, the Forum was held in  
26            conjunction with the Japanese-American Committee for Democracy.  
27            The Committee's officers were Japanese-Americans whose stated  
28            purpose was to develop an anti-Axis leadership among their own  
29            group and to help integrate into the American community the  
30            110,000 Japanese-Americans evacuated from the West Coast.  
31            However, the article continued, the co-sponsor of the Forum was  
32            the American Committee for the Protection of Harry Lunn, one  
33            of whose founders and principal backers had been Congressman Vito  
34            Palantonio and who, in its 1941 convention had resailed the  
35            deportation action against Harry Bridges and the attempts to  
36            revoke the citizenship of the California secretary of the  
37            Communist Party as stemming "directly from efforts of the  
38            Roosevelt administration to involve America in the European War."

42            City, listed on its advisory board the late Professor John Hay

[REDACTED] prepared a memorandum for the Bureau entitled "German Communist Activities In The Western Hemisphere." In this memorandum informant stated that the German-American Emergency Conference must be regarded in its organizational set-up mainly as a holding, or a roof organization; besides individual members and memberships also consisted of delegates from other organizations; among those other organizations, the German-American League for Culture and certain branches of the Workmen's Sick and Beneficial Funds were the main supporters.

Informant stated further in this memorandum that "the fact that the German-American League for Culture has the same aims as the German-American Emergency Conference is apparent from the publication in the German-American of May, 1943," which was set out in this reference.

This article stated in part that "the founding of the German-American League for Culture in the year 1939 was occasioned by the unprecedented brutal destruction of culture carried out by Nazism in Germany. The burning of the books on May 10, 1933, the eviction of world-famous German authors and scientists, among them numerous Nobel Prize winners, such as Thomas Mann and Albert Einstein, (from 1901 to 1927, 28 Nobel Prizes were given to German scientists), the brutal interference with artistic and scientific creation, which in the field of music, for instance, led to the results that Germany for the first time in two hundred years, has not even produced a second class composer, placed us under the obligation to protect and to foster German cultural values violated by Nazism, and to combat this Nazism."

This reference is a blind memorandum dated June 8, 1944, entitled "The German-American Writers Association; the Free Tribune of Free German Literature and Art in America." ~~X~~

This memorandum stated that the Free Tribune of Free German Literature and Art in America was also known as Die Tribuene.

Under the heading "Activities" it was stated that the first performance of the Die Tribuene took place in October, 1941, with the showing of a play written by Ferdinand Bruckner entitled "The Races"; that this play was given in the Studio Work Shop Theater at the New School for Social Research, 66 West 12th Street, New York City, under the direction of Ervin Piscator.

This memorandum stated further that since its initial production the Die Tribuene's activities were said to have grown rapidly and during 1943 the organization was reported to have sponsored numerous exhibitions, lectures, theater performances, and other celebrations in furtherance of its endeavor.

On May 10, 1943, according to this memorandum the society celebrated a performance known as the Free World Unity through Free Creative Art, an international commemoration of the 10th anniversary of the burning of books, of famous authors, on the part of the Hitler Regime. This program had as its objective the restoration of burned and banished books in Europe. Ten organizations assisted the Die Tribuene in that endeavor.

The sponsors of that celebration together with the officials of the Die Tribuene according to the memorandum included Albert Einstein and 13 other individuals. (No source given.)

A letter dated July 10, 1943, from the Acting District Intelligence Officer, Second Service Command, War Department, advised of a rally which was held at the Hotel Crown's, New York on July 9, 1943, in honor of Professor Solomon Mikhoels and Lieutenant Itzik Feffer, sponsored by the National Liberation Committee to the Soviet Delegation.

The letter stated further that a message was sent by telephone from Professor Albert Einstein's home in Princeton, New Jersey, calling for the solidarity of the Jewish people. The letter stated further that Herman Hoffmann, Grand Master of the Independent Order of B'nai B'rith, and National Chairman of Executive Board, Jewish Council for Russian in Belief, indicated that "We must fight for the outlawing of race persecution by international agreement. The files of the Immigration and Naturalization Service reflected that Hans Albert Einstein filed a declaration of intention to become a citizen on December 21, 1938. It was filed at Greenville, South Carolina, and Einstein gave his address at that time as 223 Randall Street, Greenville, South Carolina.

The above file contained two depositions. The first was taken August 26, 1938. The first was from Albert Einstein, Professor, 212 Mercer Street, Princeton, New Jersey, who was born at Ulm, Germany and who listed his son as Dr. He stated that he was a citizen of the United States (naturalized October 1, 1910, at Trenton, New Jersey, certificate No. 5073645), and that Hans Albert Einstein was his son whom he last saw since his birth at Bern, Switzerland, in 1904.

He further stated that while Hans Albert Einstein resided at Princeton, New Jersey, from October, 1927, to January, 1928, and from June, 1928, until June, 1929, he saw him every day. (This is the way it is written in the file.) In answer to the question as to whether Hans Albert Einstein had been absent from the United States since he had known him, Professor Einstein answered that his son had been in Switzerland from January, 1929, until June, 1938.

The second deposition was made by Caroline McElroy Hibbs, 22 Westcoat Street, Princeton, New Jersey, who stated that she was a housekeeper for Mr. and Mrs. Einstein, and that she had seen Hans Albert Einstein in Princeton, New Jersey, from October, 1927, until January, 1930, when he went to Switzerland and she again saw him in June, 1938, when he returned to Switzerland.

The INS records also contained a rather extensive file on Professor Albert Einstein of Princeton, New Jersey, but this file was not reviewed in connection with this case.



17 N. Y. Office that the Communist Political Association at 3 West  
18 Front Street, Trenton, New Jersey, had received several letters  
19 with the return address of the Advanced Study School, Princeton,  
20 New Jersey.

21        The files of the Commonwealth College, Arkansas, reflected that  
22 Albert Einstein was listed among the visitors and friends of the  
23 college. It was noted that this school was unprivileged for  
24 Communism by the state officials of Arkansas.

25        The files of the N. Y. Office also reflected that Albert Einstein  
26 stated that he felt that the National Council of American-Soviet  
27 Friendship was very good.

28        On November 23, 1943, the League for American-Soviet Friendship  
29 held their tenth anniversary meeting at the Continental Auditorium,  
30 526 Broad Street, Newark, New Jersey. The program for this occasion  
31 reflected that Albert Einstein was one of the sponsors.

32        The Trenton council for the American-Soviet Friendship had a great  
33 mass meeting on the afternoon of December 5, 1943, to celebrate the  
34 freeing of the Kiev, the ancient capital of the Ukraine. Albert  
35 Einstein was listed as a sponsor for this organization on this  
36 occasion.

37        Albert Einstein was reported to have carried on correspondence  
38 with one Dr. F. Schirokaner, who was a German prisoner interned at  
39 Stringtown, Oklahoma. One letter written to this German prisoner  
40 by Einstein reads as follows:

41        "Your second letter addressed to me and Thomas Mann  
42 is rather thorough in a certain sense; however, not  
43 of such a nature that I have a clear picture of your  
44 ability in any field. If the statements in your letter  
45 are correct, then you should be well known in biological  
46 faculty circles. Such a colleague should be best  
47 qualified and justified to represent your case..."

11 Previous correspondence revealed that the internee had written to  
12 Professor Einstein, claiming to have had a new invention, a spray

16 he would contact a Professor who was an expert in the chemical field.  
17 In addition, he has enclosed the copy of a letter from Ambassador

20 in case of a special mission.

22 Previous correspondence also revealed that the internee claimed  
23 various other inventions and had attempted to obtain his release  
24 from internment.

25 On April 24, 1943, Einstein again corresponded with Dr. F. Schlesinger.  
26 Einstein stated, "The colleague whom sender had asked in reference to  
27 internee's project had answered that he could not give any information  
28 because of military secrecy. Writer suggests, therefore, a written  
29 application to the National Council, Department of Commerce,  
30 Washington, D. C. This is the official place for testing this kind  
31 of suggestion."

32 There appeared in the "Daily Worker", dated October 1, 1941, a list of  
33 sponsors for the American Committee for the Protection of Foreign  
34 Born, 79 5th Avenue, New York City. Professor Albert Einstein,  
35 Princeton University, was listed as one of the sponsors.

On December 14, 1943 the San Antonio Office furnished a translation made by [redacted] of the book "Unser Kampf" (Our Struggle Against Hitler) into the English language. The translation indicated the beginning and ending of a page and the specific page number. The following information is reared on page 107:

"On May 10, ten years ago, National Socialism showed its true face. On the upper plaza in Berlin-- far away from the monument of the humanistic brothers, Wilhelm and Alexander Von Humboldt--under the joyous cries of the Nazi mob, the books were burned which are the pride of the world. Among the books were not only the works of Marx and Engels, but also those of Albert Einstein and Siegmund Freud, of Thomas Mann, etc."

The following information appeared on page 107 of this book:

"The esteem which the movement 'Free German Youth' in the relatively short time of its existence, gained through numerous salutations which were addressed to our Comptrollers of the largest and most influential organizations and unions. There is to be mentioned first the message of the Mexican State Party (IPM), in which it is stated:

"Your attitude and the attitude of your allied countrymen in those countries where still the norms of Hitler rule, not only rehabilitates free German people before the consciousness of the world, but also liberates them from the responsibility for the crime against the civilization, which Hitler and his accomplices have committed by waging war at all times and by murdering millions of innocent children. Our attitude is at the same time proof of the existence of many thousands of Germans who have made the cause of liberty their own who after the defeat of the reactionary Axis powers must return to the fatherland of Goethe, Heine, Beethoven, Marx, and Einstein, to restore an order of law which will be based upon the principles of the Atlantic Charter."

Under the above caption appeared exhibit number 8 which appeared to be an advertisement taken from the "Daily Worker" of September 29, 1949, which set out the sponsors of the Tenth Anniversary U. S. Soviet Friendship Congress. The name of Professor Albert Einstein appeared on this list of sponsors.

(page 181)

Chapter 25 of this same report was captioned "American Rescue Ship Mission". Under the above caption it was stated that the American Rescue Ship Mission made up one of the most influential American lists of Communist Party supporters in the United States. It was stated further that Germany, before Hitler, had many distinguished citizens who contributed their influence and prestige to German Communism, among them Albert Einstein and two other individuals.

(page 182)

Chapter 85 of this report was captioned "Friends of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade". Exhibit number 4 under the above caption appeared to be an article taken from the "Daily Worker" of March 24, 1959.

This article stated in part that among the most active supporters of the campaign to rehabilitate and provide medical care and attention for 140 seriously wounded Americans returning from the Spanish War ~~from~~ <sup>1937</sup> were Professor Albert Einstein and six other individuals.

The January 7, 1943 issue of the "Daily Worker" reported that Sholem Asch, the author of the rev. "Tear Cities", joined Albert Einstein in issuing a call to celebrate the first anniversary of the Jewish Council for the Russian War Relief to be held February 23, 1943, at the Hotel Commodore, New York City.

According to the "Daily Worker" for June 23, 1943, Sholem Asch, President of the Committee of Jewish Writers and Artists, aided in the formation of a national decoration committee headed by Art Minister Ye. Velich, a close friend of the Cultural group from the Soviet Union. The guests invited from Russia reportedly included the founder of the Moscow Jewish Art Theater who was the holder of the Order of Lenin, and the very fine chairman of the Jewish anti-Nazi committee of the Soviet Union. A second meeting was held in Moscow who was also a major in the Red Army.

In August of 1944, Albert Einstein was listed as honorary President of the American Committee of Jewish Writers, Artists and Scientists, Inc. (Source not given)

On October 27, 1944, Lieutenant Martin Webb of the Intelligence and Security Division of the Production Adjustment Board, 205 Broadway, New York City, furnished information to the Bureau. Lieutenant Webb advised that he was told that was the man who first formulated the theory that was responsible for the entire D.S.K. experiment. Lieutenant Webb stated that Zilberg upon conceiving the idea of the D.S.K. projects were based, contacted Professor Albert Einstein who was also impressed with the possibilities of Zilberg's theories and accompanied the latter to Washington, D.C., where they conferred with President Roosevelt. Subsequently, Zilberg engaged in a program of experiments in the U.S.A.

Lieutenant Webb further advised that Zilberg was believed to be acquainted with Louis Finsen, the subject of active investigation by the Military Intelligence Office and who had previously entered into the employ of the captioned case.

This reference is a memorandum from the Office of Strategic Services, Foreign Nationalities Branch, dated October 20, 1944, for the Director of Strategic Services, Secretary of State, captioned the Institute of Democracy.

This memorandum states that the Institute of Democracy, described as part of the New York Branch of Wooschee University in China, announced a program of public instructions on international political subjects to be carried out principally in New York City during the coming fall and winter; further that Louis Delluc, Secretary General of the International Free World Association, approved a Resonse Circular of the Institute of Democracy.

The memorandum stated further that Pierre Loti was named as Director at the Institute of Democracy; further that an International Advisory Council includes Albert Einstein and five other individuals.

On page 60 of this memorandum under the heading "Letterhead of the Free German Institute" it was stated that the names of the persons affiliated with the Free German Institute of Science in Learning could be seen on the letterhead of the institute which was set out in this reference. This letterhead was dated April 1, 1944 and showed Professor Albert Einstein as Honorary President.

On page 121 and 122 of this memorandum appeared a translation from "Freie Tribuene" of September, 1943. Under the heading "Program of the Movement" it was stated that Professor Albert Einstein had accepted the honorary Presidency of the Free German Institute in London.

"No one who has the proper view of things doubts what an indispensable role the churches of all denominations have to play in the building of a new Germany."







In April, 1945 a memorandum dated April 12, 1945, New York, New York on the letterhead of the Federal World Government, Inc., 29 E. 38th Street, New York 16, New York, was furnished the Bureau from an unknown outside source.

The memorandum mentioned above is quoted in part as follows:

"Our first great chance -- maybe our last -- to prevent World War 3 comes this spring in the United Nations Conference at San Francisco....

The goal, as set forth by leaders such as George K. (Harold L.) Stassen and Supreme Court Justice Owen J. Roberts, and in resolutions passed in the last four years by 13 state legislatures, is this:

"A new and higher level of government for the world... A world federation. That means some kind of world body that can make worldwide law. It means courts to settle disputes and try cases under that law. It means sufficient force ready without delay to enforce that law."

This memorandum further urged "wire or write to Secretary of State Edward P. Stettinius, Jr., Washington, D. C., Chairman of the U. S. delegation: 'I want a start made at San Francisco towards institutions for making and enforcing worldwide law!'"

Set out in this memorandum was a list of names of partial lists of sponsors of the Federal World Government; the partial list of sponsors included Albert E. Smith.

A comment was added to this memorandum which stated, "whenever a group is set up, if you look around hard enough one is bound to find a few Communists..... In this outfit we find a few of them and a few more that are <sup>PER</sup> ever playing up with the Communists..."

The June 28, 1945 issue of "The Sentinel" contained an article which stated that Leo Max Nellis was an Executive Board member of the American Birabidjan Committee, Chicago Division, 82 West Washington Street. It reported that the Committee was sponsoring orphans homes in the USSR.

CGO-5419 advised on November 19, 1945, that the Committee planned to hold a dinner to raise funds on December 2, 1945, in the Grant Ballroom of the Stevens Hotel. He further stated that the dinner would be in honor of Professor Albert Einstein as he was heading the whole project in the United States.

On October 22, 1945, [REDACTED] reported that the "American Committee for Spanish Freedom" [REDACTED] was still active in its campaign on behalf of the John F. Coffey's resolution, demanding a break with Franco. According to the informant, the Committee was at the time circulating a letter signed by communist Albert Einstein asking funds for his cause. Keen of the committee, accompanied by a copy of a letter drafted by Coffey himself, attacking Franco and telling about his resolution. The informant advised this letter was a proposal to Congress to pass H.R. 312 (break with France), and was supposed to be signed by nineteen persons.

In memorandum dated December 11, 1945, the New York  
office enclosed copies [redacted]

regarding a dinner given by the "Ambijan Committee for Emergency  
Aid to the Soviet Union", on November 24, 1945, at Hotel  
Roosevelt, New York City, in honor of M. M. Glouser, Chairman  
of the Intorg Trading Corporation. The purpose of the dinner  
was to raise funds for "The Einstein Fund" and about \$87,937.00  
was collected.

According to this report, The Einstein Fund was a  
drive being conducted by the Ambijan to raise money "for the  
settlement, care and rehabilitation of 30,000 Jewish Refugee  
War Orphans followed by Birthijan and the Orphans of the War  
of Stalingrad."

This report stated further that Professor Eliezer A.  
Lowe, of Princeton University, read a letter from "his friend  
Professor Albert Einstein". The letter stated that the Soviet  
Union had saved hundreds of thousands of Jews from being destroyed  
by the Nazis; those Jews were at that time in the Soviet Union  
and were being accorded the rights of full citizenship; because
