This article stated further that this committee according to the announcement by Professor Einstein, its honorary chairman, would participate in the national campaign of the Books for Russia Committee of the American Society for Russian Relief to ship one million books to the Soviet Union as replacements for those burned or destroyed by the Nazis.

The "Daily Worker" for March 11, 1946, reported that it was announced on March 10, 1946 that the American Birobidjan Committee and the Icor Association for Jewish Colonization in the Soviet Union had merged into one organization to be known temporarily as the American Birobidjan Committee. This announcement was made at the closing session of a two day conference of the two groups in the Assembly Hall of Hunter College, New York. Professor Albert Einstein was named as honorary president of the new organization. The delegates were told that the merger was effected because both the Committee and the Association were working to aid Jews living in Birobidjan, the Jewish autonomous region of the Soviet Republic.

"Lana Turner's mother is a Jewess: so what? Her father was Irish. Well, her mother tried to keep it a secret: the same old fault of the Jew, 'ashamed of being a Jew!' The Zionist Movement will never, never get anywhere as long as Jews are ashamed of being Jews. There is nothing in Albert Einstein or Charles P. Steinmetz, etc, etc, to be ashamed of (period)"

"Black Book" was made at the mass meeting in Madison Square Garden on March 27, 1946. (Meeting of the American Committee of Jewish Artists, Writers and Scientists, Inc.) According to informant there were about 10 thousand persons present, and Rabbi Stephen S. Wise acted as chairman for the meeting.

Informant advised that Albert Einstein was to be the main speaker of the evening but sent his message by telephone from Princeton, New Jersey and it was read to the audience by Sam Jaffee. Einstein's message stated that the "Black Book" was intended as an indictment of a nation (Germany) which performed such bestiality against the people, and that the indictment of the Nazi criminals should serve as an example to the rest of the world what happens to a nation that ignores justice and humanity and leads to militarism. Einstein said that the protection of human beings was more important than the sovereignty of the state.

American Committee of Jewish Writers, Artists and Scientists, Inc., maintained its headquarters at 119 West 57th Street, New York, New York, telephone number Circle 7-3987 and that Albert Einstein was listed as Honorary Chairman of that organization.

During his Abwhr activities in Portugal from 1940 to 1945, Paul Fidremuc, although working as an independent agent for Abwhr HQ Berlin, maintained close contact with the Chief of KO Portugal Obst. Lt. Von Karsthoff, frequently assisting him in an advisory capacity. Fidremuc was interested in obtaining reliable intelligence from the United States to substandate or to elaborate on the report of his agents in England and the Near East. Von Karsthoff obliged him by showing him or discussing with him the reports of his agent in the United States, whose name, as Fidremuc found out in the course of his discussions, was Kaul.

While interned in CIE 76 United States Zone of Germany in the Spring of 1946, Fidremuc made the acquaintance of a Dr. Kaul, a fellow internee, whom Fidremuc, from information learned in the course of conversation with him, suspected to be identical with the Abwhr agent Kaul.


By memorandum dated July 1, 1947 the Denver Office forwarded to the Bureau newspaper articles written by Dr. Walter Orr Roberts which appeared in the "Denver Post". Included in this material was an article captioned "Armies and Oceans Offer Little Security in Atomic Age--Roberts".

This article stated in part that Dr. Albert Einstein, one of the great scientists of our age tells us in effect that a state of emergency exists; further that in a recent message he said "a new type of thinking is essential if mankind is to survive and move to higher levels". The article stated further that Dr. Einstein had agreed to head up the "Emergency Committee of Atomic Scientists" to raise a fund of \$200,000 to sponsor a great national campaign for public education on the violent issues of atomic energy.

This article stated further that Dr. Einstein explained why he and the other scientists had acted to raise a large fund to meet the "present crisis;" further that he said "as scientists who work in the interests of our country at a time of national peril, and who presided at the birth of the atomic age, we have this everwhelming responsibility to mankind. As citizens, we saw that the people were wholly unaware of the supreme implications of this new hour, mainly because of the necessities of military security. We are not men of action, the consideration of these factors forced us out of inaction."

Under the sub-heading "Speak Pravely, Says Einstein" this article stated further that Dr. Einstein had specifically appealed for financial aid; further that money could be sent directly to Dr. Albert Einstein, Emergency Committee of Atomic Scientists, Frinceton, New Jersey. Further that gifts ranging from \$1 to \$10,000 had been sent in to Dr. Einstein; together with Dr. Einstein on the Emergency Committee for Leading Scientists of the Atomic Energy Field was Dr. Hans Bethe, Dr. Edward Condon, Dr. Leo Szilard and Dr. Harold Uney.

This article stated further that Dr. Einstein wrote "Science has brought forth this danger but the real problem is in the minds and hearts of men. We will not change the hearts of other men by mechanisms, but by changing our hearts and speaking bravely. When we are clear in our heart and mind-only then shall we find courage to surmount the fear which haunts the world."



Basic purpose of the work of the Committee for Foreign Correspondence was to re-establish contacts between Americant and their acquaintances among foreign scientists.

This press release stated that among the internationally known scientists who were sponsors of the Committee, were Dr. J. R. Oppenheimer, former head of the Los Alamos Laboratory; Albert Einstein, of the Institute for Advance Study at Frinceton, New Jersey; Dr. Harlow Shapley, head of the Harvard Observatory, and others.



The "New York Times" of November 18, 1946, described a meeting that had been held in Princeton, New Jersey, of the Emergency Committee of Atomic Scientists (date not stated). This group, headed by Dr. Albert Binstein, was opening a campaign for \$1,000,000 for the purpose of educating the public to the realization of the peril of atomic bombs and to the fact that the only solution was an international atomic authority and ultimately the elimination of war. Dr. Einstein was named as President of the committee. The campaign was launched formally with a press conference and radio appeals by Drs. Einstein and Urey and later a luncheon attended by invited guests from all sections of the country. The Committee was to maintain its main office at 90 Nassau Street, Frinceton, New Yorse.

In the Army "Weekly Intelligence Summary # 95", covering the period from December 6 to 13, 1946, appeared an article concerning the Emergency Committee of Atomic Scientists. It stated that its leader and chief spokesmen was Professor Albert Einstein, "The in the past has been used by various Communist Front organizations as a 'big name' 'innecent' summer."

The 'naily Worker' of one October 1933, listed Professor Albert Einstein as a member of the Friends of the Abraham Line of Brigade. On 31 December 1938 he was listed as a sponsor of 🗈 New Year's Ball held under the suspices of the Hou-Secturian Committee for Political Refugees, an organization affiliated with the International Labor Defense. In December 1039 he was associated with the German-American Relief Committee for Victims of Pascism, affiliated with the North American Committee to Aid Spanish Democracy. In June 1943, Dr. Einstein was connect ed with the National Council for Soviet American Friendship and at the same time belonged to the Chicago Society for American Soviet Relations, an affiliate of the former organization. December 1943, he was active in the Reichstag Fire Troil Anniversary Committee in New York City which clorified the achievements of George Dimitroff, Head of the Comintern. September 1946, Dr. Einstein was reported as connected with the American Committee for the Protection of the Foreign Born, of these organizations and affairs are Communist controlied and Communist Front organizations."



A Summary of Intelligence furnished the Paltimore Field Division, by Headquarters, Second Army, Fort George G. Meade, Maryland, dated February 13, 1948, reported that in February, 1947, the United World Tederalists (UMF) was formed by merging the World Federalists. Americans United for dorld Government, Student Federalists, World Republicans in Massachusetts, Committee for World Federation and World Citimans of Georgia. This meant a group of some 18,000 members with the goal of world federal government. It had the blessing of Dr. Albert Einstein, Communist adherent.

It was also reported in the Summary that the world government movement had grown ever since Clarence Strail (not identified) originated his "union" outline in 1939, which was incorporated as the Federal Union in 1939 to attain vorld order. This same "idea" in 1942 became the business of Iouis Dolivet, Communist agent in the Free World Association, which in 1945 was consolidated with the Americans United for World Government.

The Emergency Committee of Atomic Scientists, Incorporated was formed in Princeton, New Jersey, with offices at 90 Nassau Street, under the leadership of Dr. Albert Einstein, the noted physicist.

The February 14, 1947 issue of the "Times Hereld" carried an article under the caption "Scientists Seek Funds to Reveal Atom Secrets" which stated that on February 13, 1947 a campaign to raise one million dollars to finance efforts to divulge information concerning atomic energy, which the American Government was trying to keep secret as a safeguard against international trouble was launched by a group of scientists.

According to the article this group was headed by Albert Einstein, the noted physicist and included three University of Chicago Professors as trustees and called itself the Emergency Committee of Atomic Scientists, Inc.

Apparently Dr. Bernstein was prompted to this action after learning of an article that had appeared in the "Bulletin-de la Societe Chimque-de France" concerning a discovery by a Russian Scientist named G.J. Djounkovsky of a procedure for the isolation of beryllium from the ore by a much cheaper and better process as has been the case to the present."

By letter dated April 30, 1947, the alove information was referred to the New York Office.

Dr. Einstein referred Dr. Bernstein's inquiry to Dr. Wigner, an associate of Dr. Einstein. Bernstein than corresponded with Dr. Wigner and requested information as to whether the beryllium isolated by Dr. Djounkovsky's procedure, could be applied, in one way or another to the production of atomic bombs. The Atomic Energy Commission advised that certain phases of the metallurgy concerning the peryllium metal was considered restricted information by the Commission. Dr. Wigner's answer to Bernstein was evasive and noncommittal. Poth Dr. Einstein and Dr. Wigner were at that time located at Frinceton University.

The "Times-Herald" for February 14, 1946, (a mencil notation indicated that this should be 1947) carried as article concerning the campaign of the Emergency Committee of Atomic Scientists to raise one million dollars to divulge information concerning atomic energy which the American Government was trying to keep secret as a safeguard against international trouble. According to the article, the headquarters of the organization was to be located at Princeton, New Jersey, and it also reflected that this Committee disseminated a form letter in which it solicited these funds.

In view of the Bureau's jurisdiction in the control of the atomic energy secrets, it was suggested that a respect of the Atomic Energy Section personally discuss the progress of the Emergency Committee of Atomic Scientists. 

It was reported in Mr. Westbrook Pegler's column in the November 1, 1950 issue of the "New York Journal American" that Doctor Mathryn McHale was a participant in a national conference on the German problem held in New York, New York, in March of 1947. He further reported that many of the sponsors of this conference were members of the Society for the Prevention of World War III.

The "New York Times" in its issue of February 4, 1947, Page 10, contained the following relating to the National Conference on the German problem.

"Pointing out that'twice within a generation, the American people have had to defend themselves against a predatory and ruthless Germany! Mrs. Franklin D. Roosevelt and Edgar Angel Nowrer, newspaperman, invited 500 prominent Americans yesterday to attend a conference on the German problem at the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel on March 6. The letters were sent on behalf of the newly formed committee of the National Conference on the German Problem, 515 Madison Avenue.

"The letters urged Americans to 're-examine the German problem and support the implementation of those principles which were originally established by the Allies to prevent the resurgence of a strong Germany'.

"Among other members of the sponsoring committee are Doctor Albert Linstein, Representative Helen Gahagan Douglas, Henry Morgenthau, Jr., ....."

In its issue of March 7, 1947, on Page 11, the "New York Times" reported as follows concerning the National Conference on the German Problem held at New York on March 6, 1947:

"A National conference on the problem of Germany, convoked by Mrs. Franklin D. Hoosevelt and Edgar Ansel Mowrer, framed yesterday a program to implement the Yalta and Potsdam agreements. It will be sent to the American delegation at the the Moscow Conference and to the United States Government.

"The conference met all day at the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel, concluding with a dinner. Seventy-five persons, many of
