[redacted] advised on July 5, 1962 that while he was in Alcatraz Penitentiary from 1949 to 1952, he was not acquainted with the subjects of this case as they evidently entered Alcatraz after he had left. He stated he has not been contacted by anyone from the Penitentiary and is not acquainted with subjects and would have no reason to know why they would come to the Evansville, Indiana area. He stated the only other former inmate of Alcatraz residing in the Evansville area is [redacted]. He has not seen [redacted] for quite some time but stated [redacted] left Alcatraz prior to his leaving and, therefore, would not have been in the prison at the same time as subjects. He stated he personally does not feel subjects were successful in their escape unless they had considerable outside help and a boat to meet them shortly after they got off the island. [redacted] advised that should he receive any information he would immediately advise the FBI.

Photographs of subjects in this matter were exhibited on July 5 and 6, 1962 to [redacted]

All advised they were not acquainted with subjects nor have they ever observed them or anyone resembling them in the [redacted]

The following investigation was conducted by SA [REDACTED] at Indianapolis, Indiana.

On July 5, 1962, [REDACTED] Inmate at Women's Prison, 410 North Randolph Street, Indianapolis, Indiana, advised [REDACTED]

The Deputy Sheriff who transported [REDACTED] from Evansville, Indiana, to Indianapolis, Indiana, on June 2, 1962, advised the FBI she told him of meeting two men in Evansville, Indiana, in a bar who informed her they had escaped from Alcatraz Penitentiary.

At the beginning of this interview, [REDACTED] was asked whether she had observed photographs of the Alcatraz escapees or read or heard about the escape through news media and she replied she had not.

[REDACTED] related she and [REDACTED] were drinking at the Hub Bar in Evansville, Indiana, on the evening of June 27, 1962, between 5:30 and 6:00 PM and became acquainted with two men in the next booth, who were poorly dressed in overall pants, old shirts and shoes. She further described these men as follows:

[redacted] advised Unsub Number 2 bought beers for her and [redacted] paying for same with several bills from a roll of money, and thereafter, all went to the V. and P. Tavern, Vine and Pennsylvania, Evansville, Indiana, then later they all went to Chick's Bar. She stated both men asked her and [redacted] if they could get identification cards or papers for them. She asked why, and they said they did not have any such cards or papers or wallets. She stated she asked why, and the men told her they had escaped from a penitentiary and were running away. She stated she asked where they escaped from, being skeptical of their story, and they told her they had escaped from Alcatraz.

She stated they advised her three had escaped but one did not make it. She stated they told her anyone could escape from Alcatraz provided he could swim. She stated she had no idea where Alcatraz was located, and the men told her of swimming a "big river" after their escape. She stated these men told her they came to Evansville, Indiana, on Wednesday, June 27, 1962, by bus.

[redacted] stated these men asked if she knew where they could shave and clean up. She stated she took them to [redacted] was away from the house, where these men cleaned up. She stated during

this time, Unsub Number 1 asked her to look at the soles of his feet, which she stated were cut, bruised, and blistered, and she asked how they got that way, to which he answered, "By walking without shoes, of course."

She stated Unsub Number 1 also showed her scars on his back which looked to her like he had been hit several times with a whip. She stated he told her he had been beaten while in prison which left the marks on his back. She stated at this time she began to believe their story of being escapees from prison, and made up her mind she would have nothing more to do with them.

She stated these men told her the only articles of clothing they had between them when they escaped were one pair of shoes and one pair of shorts.

[redacted] stated she informed them, she had to appear in court the next morning in Evansville, and the men tried to talk her out of appearing in court. She stated they tried to talk her into accompanying them. She stated they mentioned they intended to go to Mount Vernon, Indiana, "to look around," and if they "did not make out there," they intended to go over into Illinois.

[redacted] stated her friend [redacted] resided in [redacted] and told her she was taking these men with her to a room at the Vendome Hotel in Evansville, Indiana, for the evening (Wednesday, June 27, 1962). She stated in view of the fact she had to go to court the next day, she did not go to the hotel with [redacted] and these men.

She stated she has not seen her friend [redacted] or these men since 10:00 or 10:30 PM on Wednesday, June 27, 1962. She stated [redacted] had some clothing and a combination pocketknife (with fork, spoon, and other gadgets) at her room over [redacted]

At this point in the interview, photographs of CLARENCE ANGLIN, WF Number 305, JOHN WILLIAM ANGLIN, WF Number 306,

and FRANK LEE MORRIS, WF Number 307, were exhibited to her, and she immediately selected the photographs of CLARENCE ANGLIN, WF Number 305 as the person she referred to as Unsub Number 1, and the photograph of FRANK LEE MORRIS, WF Number 307, as the person she referred to as Unsub Number 2.

The following investigation was conducted by SA [REDACTED] on July 6, 1962 at Indianapolis, Indiana: b7C

[REDACTED] advised that he and [REDACTED] traveled from Indianapolis, Indiana to Evansville, Indiana during the late afternoon of Wednesday, June 27, 1962, and from there drove into Kentucky where they visited some bars. He stated during the course of their stay in these bars they met four girls who were driving an old 1950 or 1951 Chevrolet. He stated he did not know the identities of these girls and they did not volunteer any information. He stated during the early hours of Thursday, June 28, 1962, he and [REDACTED] registered at the Vendome Hotel in Evansville. He stated he would estimate the time at about 4:00 AM. b7C b7D

Personal observation of [REDACTED] reflects he is not identical to any of captioned subjects. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] was exhibited the wanted flyer on each subject and he advised he had never seen these individuals to his knowledge.

[REDACTED] advised that he and [REDACTED] drove from Indianapolis, Indiana to Evansville, Indiana on the evening of June 27, 1962 and arrived at the Vendome Hotel, Evansville, approximately 3:00 AM the morning of June 28, 1962. He denied knowing either [REDACTED] or [REDACTED] and stated he did not associate with any female in Evansville, Indiana during the evening of June 27, 1962 or at any other time. b7C b7D

AT CHICAGO, ILLINOIS

By communication dated June 29, 1962, Springfield Division advised that an employee of [redacted] had observed three men driving a 1954 or 1955 De Soto, bearing Illinois license [redacted]. Two of the car's occupants reportedly resembled the ABELIN brothers.

On July 3, 1962, [redacted] advised SA [redacted] that the above license plate was probably taken by his cousin, [redacted] who drives an early 1950 two-door, green De Soto. [redacted] had visited him for about two weeks recently and left on June 22, 1962, supposedly for Arkansas. [REDACTED] telephonically advised [REDACTED] that during that evening the police switchboard received several anonymous calls from a person who said one of the Alcatraz escapees was in a bar at 705 North Clark Street. According to [REDACTED] the Shamrock Bar at that address was immediately checked out with negative results. Later investigation reflected that one [REDACTED] had in all probability made the above "crank" calls while drunk.

On June 19, 1962, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] advised SA [REDACTED] that he was in the Shamrock Bar, 705 North Clark Street on the evening of June 19, 1962, who did not recall making any phone calls. He stated he was pretty drunk at the time and may have been talking about the escapees from Alcatraz, but did not recall anything specific in this regard. He viewed photographs of the subjects with negative results.

On June 18, 1962, Warden OLIN G. BLACKWELL, United States Penitentiary, Alcatraz, California, made available a postcard postmarked at San Francisco, June 16, 1962, 8:30 p.m., addressed to "Warden, Alcatraz Prison, Alcatraz Island,

"San Francisco Bay, California." The card contained the following information:

"Ha Ha we made it.

"/s/FRANK
JOHN
CLARENCE"

This card was received by Warden BLACKWELL on June 18, 1962. He pointed out that this is probably a "phony" since all prisoners have their mail addressed to Box 1476, Alcatraz, California, and this address is indelibly stamped in their mind.

San Francisco communication to the Director dated June 18, 1962, forwarded this communication for handwriting comparisons with the Escapees. A communication received from the Bureau dated June 21, 1962, advised that the handwriting on the postcard was not written by CLARENCE ANGLIN.

The signatures of JOHN WILLIAM ANGLIN and FRANK LEE MORRIS, as listed on the fingerprint cards maintained in the Identification Division, Washington, D. C., were not sufficiently comparable writings to permit a detailed comparison with the printings on the postcard; however, nothing of particular significance was noted during the comparison of the writings on the postcard with the fingerprint signatures of JOHN ANGLIN and FRANK LEE MORRIS.

AT ALCATRAZ, CALIFORNIA

On June 13, 1962, Associate Warden ARTHUR M. DOLLISON, United States Penitentiary, Alcatraz, advised that at 3:35 p.m. that date he had received a long distance telephone call, reportedly from Atlanta, Georgia, wherein the caller identified himself as FRANK MORRIS.

DOLLISON stated the caller tried to call collect and when the call was not accepted by Alcatraz, the caller then paid for the call.

DOLLISON advised that the caller began his conversation with something to the effect that "I guess you're glad to know I'm alive." DOLLISON inquired as to how the escape was made. The caller replied that a driftwood raft was constructed. DOLLISON asked where the Escapees had landed, and the caller inquired as to the reason for the Warden's question. The caller then replied that they had landed over where the boats come in. DOLLISON stated that the caller was vague and indefinite as to where the landing had allegedly occurred.

DOLLISON volunteered that he had talked on more than one occasion to FRANK MORRIS. He said MORRIS was a quiet individual who did very little talking. DOLLISON advised that it was his opinion the caller's voice was not that of MORRIS.

This information was immediately relayed to the Atlanta Office for identification of the caller.

AT ALCATRAZ, CALIFORNIA

On June 26, 1962, Warden OLIN G. BLACKWELL, United States Penitentiary, Alcatraz, made available an airmail letter dated June 23, 1962, which he had received from [REDACTED] b7D

[REDACTED] described herself as a 73-year-old woman who lived alone on a farm near Lincoln. She said that a man who claimed to have escaped from Alcatraz tied her up and held her captive all night on June 18, 1962. Thereafter, this individual took her gold watchcase, her 12-14 point diamond ring, and \$75.00 in cash. This individual reportedly told her that the Catholic Chaplain at Alcatraz was a [REDACTED] and also that if he is caught, he would get 120 days on number one diet and five years extra time. [REDACTED] b7C b7D said she was able to untie herself after her captor had left and as far as she knows, he has not been found by the police.

Warden BLACKWELL recalls that a [REDACTED] was Chaplain at the United States Penitentiary, Lewisburg, Pennsylvania, but had not been in such a capacity at Alcatraz. In the b7C

On June 27, 1962, [REDACTED] met SAs [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] at her door with a loaded shotgun. Her description of the intruder was at great variance with subjects' and when shown photographs of subjects with many others, she advised the intruder was definitely not one of the subjects.

AT ALCATRAZ, CALIFORNIA

On June 19, 1962, the home of [REDACTED] United States Penitentiary, Alcatraz, was entered in the family's absence between the hours of 11:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. through a partially opened rear kitchen window. The only thing found missing from the house was a quantity of small change from a glass piggy bank in one of the bedrooms, although some of the change was left in the piggy bank, which has a screw top. No food, clothing or other articles which would be considered useful to the Escapees was noted missing by the householders.

This home borders on a large busy playground utilized by the children of employees living on Alcatraz. The backyard, where the window is located, is not visible from any other spot on the island. From the evidence available, entrance to the house was made through the window. The piggy bank is made in the shape of an animal of clear glass with a corrugated or lined surface simulating hair, which prevents recognition and the obtaining of good latent prints. There were latent prints noticed on the window; however, they were very streaked as though the hands had slid over the glass when manipulating the window. There were some possible finger impressions on the wooden window sill. From the size of the prints noted, they appeared to be those of juveniles.

Lifts were made of the prints where possible and the section of the window sill was removed. The aforementioned material was sent to the Identification Division, Latent Fingerprint Section, by San Francisco communication dated June 22, 1962.

By communication dated June 27, 1962, from the FBI Identification Division, information was received that the latent fingerprints consisting of lifts, as well as an examination of the portion of the window sill for latents, had been conducted, and it was determined that none of the prints were of any value.

On July 18, 1962, [REDACTED] was interviewed by SA [REDACTED] of the Atlanta Division. [REDACTED] stated that he was hitchhiking several weeks ago, date not recalled, from Chattanooga to Atlanta, and was picked up at the corner of East Lake and Ponce De Leon Avenues in Atlanta by an individual whom he thought resembled one of the Alcatraz escapees. He stated he rode with this individual only a short time, and got out of the car where U. S. Highways 78 and 278 divide just East of Avondale Estates on the outskirts of Atlanta. [REDACTED] said he was picked up about 11:00 or 12:00 p.m., but could not recall the date. He said several days thereafter he saw a photograph of the three escapees in a magazine, and felt that one of them resembled the individual who had given him a ride. Photographs of the escapees were mingled with photographs of other individuals, and [REDACTED] was unable to make any positive identification.

[REDACTED] stated that he did not recall any distinguishing marks, scars, tattoos, or other identifying data.

No further investigation is being conducted in the Atlanta Division in respect to [REDACTED] report.

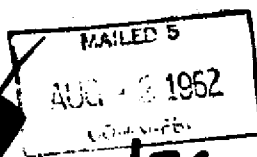

She appears to have little use for CLARENCE ANGLIN, but cannot conceal her feelings for JOHN WILLIAM ANGLIN and she apparently does not want to accept the possibility that the boys might have perished in their attempt to escape Alcatraz. In this regard, it was noted that after seeing two men in the Corvair automobile [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] then after arriving home, he discussed this incident with his wife for over an hour before calling the FBI, and it is suggested that she might possibly have convinced him that he might have seen the ANGLIN brothers.

Immediate re-contacts with all available relatives, associates and sources developed no additional information to substantiate the possibility that the ANGLIN brothers were the men observed by [REDACTED]

Later, [REDACTED] advised she was convinced the men her husband saw were not CLARENCE and JOHN WILLIAM ANGLIN.

All relatives of subjects contacted as set forth in this report, advised that they had no knowledge that subjects were planning an escape from Alcatraz and had no knowledge concerning the actual escape or attempted escape and their knowledge was limited to the information they obtained from newspapers and television.

The ANGLIN brothers' immediate family all expressed the hope that they will be found alive and well, but if alive, they prefer their immediate apprehension by the FBI before the ANGLIN brothers commit serious crimes or are killed in their efforts to avoid apprehension. The family advises that CLARENCE and JOHN WILLIAM ANGLIN were closer to their brother, ALFRED RAY ANGLIN, who is now serving a sentence at the U. S. prison at Atlanta, Georgia than with any other member of the family. It was noted during this investigation that the majority of the members of the ANGLIN family work as fruit pickers and they often travel to other parts of the United States to pick fruit during the harvest seasons.

Relatives contacted were furnished with the telephone number of the FBI Office at Tampa, Florida. All appeared cooperative and all expressed their desire to cooperate with the FBI and advised they would notify the Tampa Division immediately if they receive any information of any nature concerning the escapees.

All relatives contacted were advised of the provisions of the Federal Harboring Statute.

All acquaintances and employers contacted, as set forth in this report, expressed their willingness to cooperate with the FBI in the apprehension of fugitive subjects, should it be determined they survived their escape from Alcatraz, except [REDACTED] as set forth in the report of his interview. b7c

It is noted that the Corvair was first manufactured in 1960. [redacted] advised he did not observe the license plate on the Corvair and the only distinguishing feature he could recall concerning the two men was that the driver had long sideburns, but as he recalls, the driver's face was thinner and more drawn than the photographs of JOHN ANGLIN which appear on the FBI Wanted flyers and identification orders. He said he did not see the features of the passenger in the Corvair. He said that [redacted] has told him that JOHN ANGLIN often wore long sideburns. He said that the only other thing he recalls was that the men wore light-colored shirts.

[redacted] said this incident occurred when he was driving west on Kensington Avenue, which is in the residential area of the southwest portion of Tampa, Florida. He said the Corvair came south on Renellie Drive South, turned east on Kensington Avenue and passed him. He thought the Corvair was headed toward South Manhattan Avenue where he lives, so he went south on Kensington one block to Euclid Avenue to circle the block and follow the Corvair, but the Corvair did not go to South Manhattan, but went south on E. Royal Palm Circle and again passed him on Euclid going west quite fast toward South Westshore Boulevard and Gandy Boulevard which leads directly to St. Petersburg, Florida. [redacted] said he made no attempt to follow the Corvair.

[redacted] He then went home and after he reached home, he discussed the incident with [redacted] until shortly after 11:00 p.m. when they decided to call the Tampa Office of the FBI. [redacted] advised he could furnish no other information concerning the men he observed in the Corvair or the Corvair itself.

On 7/26/62, [REDACTED] of the UPI News Service, appeared at the San Francisco Office. He said he is collaborating with a friend of his, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] in an idea concerning the recent escape of the three subjects involved in captioned case from Alcatraz Penitentiary in San Francisco, namely FRANK LEE MORRIS, JOHN WILLIAM ANGLIN and CLARENCE ANGLIN.

[REDACTED] said that he and [REDACTED] plan to put their idea in writing in the preparation of a script or story concerning this incident which they then hope to sell to some agency or company connected with the television industry with the ultimate thought of having a 30-minute or hour story on television in this regard. He stated he had no formalized plans at this point as to who he would refer such a story or script to, except that the idea is for a television program.

[REDACTED] advised that the over-all general format of such a program would be a short portion of time devoted to the background of the three escapees, including such items as what led their lives to crime, various crimes they have participated in, information concerning their prior incarceration in other penitentiaries and reasons behind their transfers to Alcatraz.

He said the majority of the story would be devoted in a dramatic fashion to the details of the escape. He said their present thinking is that professional actors will be utilized; however, there would be no speaking parts and the entire story would be narrated by someone. He continued that with respect to details of the escape, they intend to develop the idea of two possible endings to the story, one relating to the actual escape on the part of the three individuals, and the second ending relating to the possibility of their having drowned in San Francisco Bay.

With respect to the details of the escape and the enactment of the escape, he said that he did not anticipate any authority from the Bureau of Prisons to utilize the actual Alcatraz Penitentiary but did have in mind the possible reconstruction of the various areas of the penitentiary on a television set.

He said that being in the news media business he realized that the FBI, since the announcement of the escape, has maintained a strict no comment to any inquiry made; however, he said that he was coming to the FBI not in an effort to obtain details relative to the escape but, rather, to ascertain if we could furnish him with certain points relative to the background and past history of the subjects involved. Specifically, he requested the following information:

1. What personality and characteristic background we could give concerning each individual, such as indications of short temper, IQ rating, any indications of mental instability, general attitude toward society, and any other items that go into the make-up of a person.
2. Educational records of these individuals; specifically, the identity of the schools they attended, how far they progressed and grades achieved.
3. The general attitude of each individual involved at the time of their various arrests. For example, as to whether they were cooperative in admitting their violations, whether they were surly, reaction to law enforcement at the time, and any other item along this line.

4. Their family relationship, specifically as to whether they were close to any one person in the family--mother, father, brother or sister; whether they have maintained correspondence with them, received visits from members of the family and if so, which particular member visited or wrote to them more so than the others; their family situation from the standpoint of wife, children, and their attitude toward the family.

[REDACTED] was advised that, of course, the files of the FBI are considered confidential. He said that he realized this fact, particularly with respect to a pending investigation such as the escape. However, he said that he intended to contact the Bureau of Prisons, both here and at Alcatraz and through appropriate authorities in Washington, D. C., in an effort to obtain not only the information requested of this office but, also, any information he can get concerning details of the escape. He said that while he has no deadline he did have in mind formulating his ideas to the point of writing to have a presentation in approximately two weeks. b7C

[REDACTED] was advised that this office would be unable to furnish him the information he requested in view of the fact that this is a pending investigation; however, he was furnished with copies of the Identification Orders which had previously been made available on a nation-wide basis. b7C

This information is being furnished to the Bureau in view of the fact that [REDACTED] intends to attempt to develop this situation into a television program and for the information of the Bureau in the event further inquiry is received from [REDACTED] directly and through the Bureau of Prisons. b7C

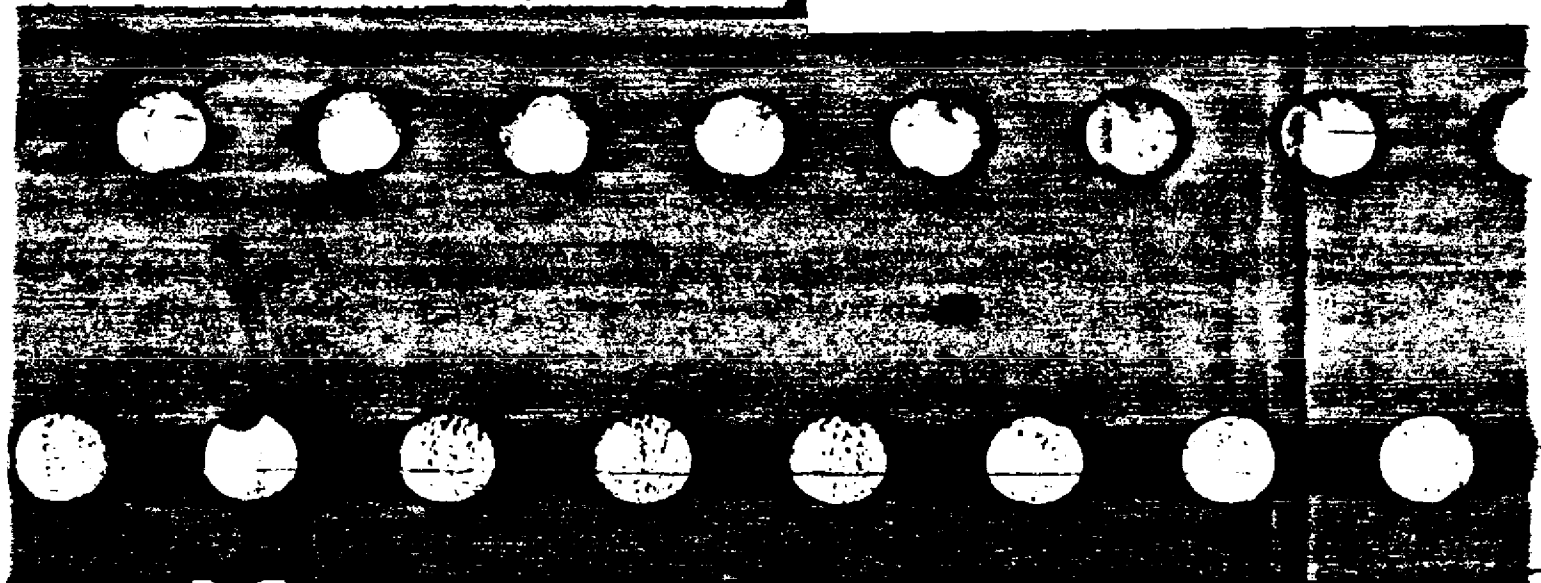
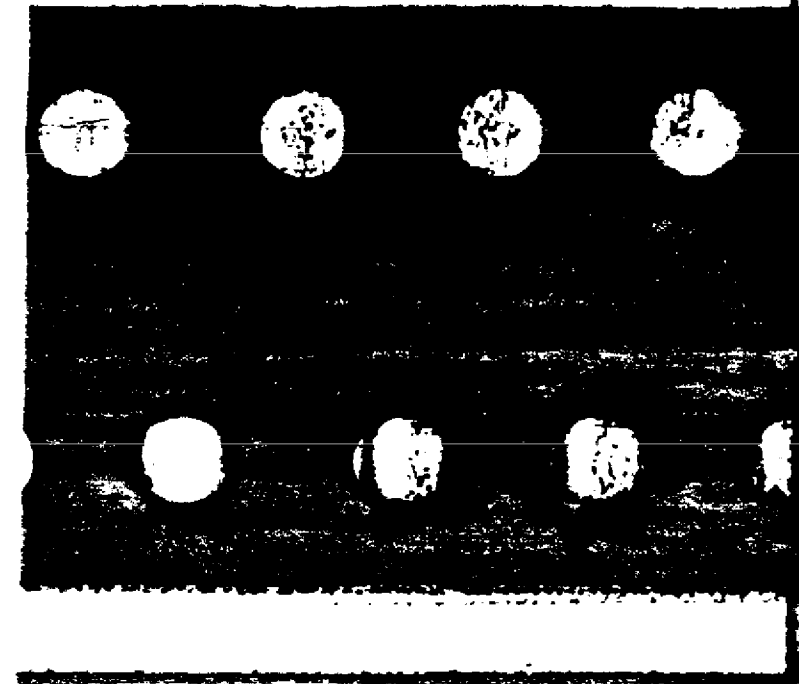

and various hotels, as well as suspicious occurrences during the pertinent period. In addition, day-to-day contact with various police agencies in the Bay area has been made which has necessitated additional inquiries relative to certain crimes being committed. Each such report has been immediately investigated and no evidence uncovered whatsoever relating to the Escapees. The reporting of such investigation would entail the dictation and transcription of some 100 pages of negative information and then serve no useful purpose. The San Francisco file contains the complete record of this type of investigation, and it is not presumed that same will be reported further.

A subsequent report will be written which will set forth the scope of the search in the San Francisco Bay area by this office and other agencies together with a description of the neighborhoods conducted. Also, the results of Laboratory examinations presently being conducted as well as results of pertinent phases of this investigation as it relates to the Escapees will be set forth. It is felt that the inclusion in this report of the results of a voluminous amount of negative type investigation would deter from same since this report has dealt primarily with the evidentiary and positive results of this investigation.

Copies of this report have been furnished to the Los Angeles, San Diego, Portland, Seattle, Phoenix, Las Vegas, Butte and Salt Lake City Offices so that they, as surrounding offices, will have complete details of this escape and in accordance with Bureau instructions.

Copies of this report are being sent to the New Orleans, Tampa and Atlanta Offices since MORRIS' home area is considered in New Orleans and the ANGLIN brothers' pertinent relatives are in the territory covered by the Tampa and Atlanta Offices.

This investigation is being handled as a special by the San Francisco Office, and all leads have been set forth and are being covered on an expedite basis.

ESCAPED FEDERAL PRISONER - CONSPIRACY

Synopsis:

At 7:15 a.m., 6/12/62, officers of the United States Penitentiary, Alcatraz, California, discovered that FRANK LEE MORRIS, JOHN WILLIAM ANGLIN and CLARENCE ANGLIN, all inmates, had escaped from their cells, leaving flesh-colored dummy faces in their beds. The escape route consisted of holes dug through the back of their cell walls near ventilator area; climbing plumbing pipes in utility corridor behind cells to top of cell block, where they broke through bars and ventilator lid onto roof. Apparently climbed down from roof on the bakery smoke stack at rear of cell house, over the fence and to the northeast shore of the island. Investigation indicates escape evidently occurred around 10:00 p.m. the preceding evening. A similar hole found in cell of [REDACTED] as well as a flesh-colored dummy face. [REDACTED] told FBI Agents they had left him about 9:37 p.m. on 6/11/62 supposedly to return and finish [REDACTED] hole, and not seen since. Later that night [REDACTED] completed the hole in his cell, proceeded to roof, and ascertained they had gone. He returned to his cell and to bed. Claimed Escapees had taken a six foot by fourteen foot raft made from rubberized raincoats of inmates and three yoke life preservers similarly made. These articles had been made and stored on top of cell block under cell house roof, and Escapees had worked on same in evening after breaking out of cell. [REDACTED] stated they planned to escape to Angel Island in San Francisco Bay and then to mainland, where they would commit burglary to obtain guns and clothing, steal a car and leave area. Search of cells of Escapees and [REDACTED] uncovered hack saw type blades, spoon b7C

handles with sharpened edges, four flesh-colored dummy faces, "Popular Mechanics" and "Sports Illustrated" magazines containing photographs and description as to making rubberized rafts and lifesaving type vests, paint, paste, tape, and twine between cells, evidently used as a signal device. Search of area on top of cell block indicates same used as workshop by Escapees. A life preserver made from olive drab rubberized material cut from inmates' raincoats, a partially completed raft of similar material, electric drills fashioned through use of a motor from the prison vacuum cleaner and one through use of motor from barber clippers, liquid plastic, a homemade periscope and miscellaneous items located there. A homemade wooden paddle and about 100 feet of heavy black extension cord located on cell house roof, and similar type cord located on beach. On 6/12/62, a wooden paddle was picked up near Angel Island in San Francisco Bay, and on 6/15/62, a homemade life preserver observed to wash ashore on Fort Cronkhite Beach, which is on ocean side of Golden Gate Bridge. On 6/22/62, another homemade life preserver picked up in San Francisco Bay some 50 yards east of Alcatraz. All items similar in appearance and material to those recovered at prison. On 6/14/62, waterproof package, apparently made of inmate raincoat material and containing names, addresses, photographs and personal property identifiable with ANGLIN brothers, picked up in San Francisco Bay between Angel Island and Alcatraz. Inmate [REDACTED] stated to FBI Agents that he and inmate [REDACTED] initially in on escape plot. [REDACTED] claims quit same after digging few holes in cell wall. Says [REDACTED] dug several holes in his cell but stopped along with Escapees to avoid detection while plumbing being installed, and not told by Escapees to start digging again. Eight holes uncovered in [REDACTED] cell and some 36 holes uncovered in [REDACTED] cell, all carefully camouflaged. [REDACTED] stated suspects [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] both inmates, acted as [REDACTED] lookout for about one week each and then quit. Said JOHN ANGLIN in February 1962 showed him two files which ANGLIN claimed obtained from an inmate, suspect [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] deny any knowledge or participation in escape. An authorized complaint was filed 6/13/62 before USC, San Francisco, charging Escapees MORRIS and ANGLIN brothers with violation Title 18 Section 751, U. S. Code. Federal warrants issued and bond recommended in the amount of \$50,000.00 each. On 6/20/62, USA CECIL F. POOLE, San Francisco, advised he would consider prosecutive action at

DETAILS OF ESCAPE

Date June 18, 1962

ARTHUR M. DOLLISON, Associate Warden, U. S. Penitentiary, Alcatraz Island, California, stated that he was advised by the control room at that institution that at about 7:15 a.m. when the inmates were being counted that officers had found three dummy faces in the beds of inmates. He immediately proceeded to the main cellhouse where he ascertained that JOHN WILLIAM ANGLIN, CLEARENCE ANGLIN and FRANK LEE MORRIS were the inmates involved who had escaped.'

They had evidently effected this escape by way of holes which they had made in the ventilator area in the rear of their cells. They had evidently climbed up the plumbing fixtures in the utility corridor immediately to the rear of the cells to the top of the third cell tier. They had evidently spread the bars in the ventilator area to the roof and removed the ventilator lid. An immediate check was made of the Island to locate the inmates.

Later in the same day it was ascertained that there was a similar hole near the ventilator area in the cell of inmate [REDACTED] and that evidently [REDACTED] was to have gone with them but for some reason was left behind. There was also a dummy face located in [REDACTED] cell which he had proposed using. b7C

[REDACTED] indicated that the ANGLINS and MORRIS had escaped from their cells about 9:30 p.m. on June 11, 1962. A check of the area indicated that the ANGLINS and MORRIS after going through the hole in the roof had probably climbed down the large black pipe by the bakery and over the fences. They had then proceeded to the water tower and crawled down two steep embankments to the northeast shore of the island. b7C

Guard, U.S. Penitentiary, Alcatraz, California, advised that on June 11, 1962, he worked the 4 PM to midnight shift in the west gallery. [REDACTED] said the west gallery is the catwalk located at the west end of the cell block.

[REDACTED] advised that at about 10:30 PM on June 11, 1962, he heard a noise which sounded to him like a person hitting the end of an empty 50 gallon oil drum with the heel of his hand. He said the noise sounded like it came from the prison hospital. [REDACTED] said he immediately reported the noise telephonically to [REDACTED] [REDACTED] said he heard the same noise approximately two minutes later and then heard it a third time approximately five minutes after that. He said during this time he was on the telephone with [REDACTED]. He said the last time he heard this noise it sounded like it came from the "dining room cage" which is a guard post located outside the dining room wall over an alley way leading from the cell block to the recreation yard.

[redacted] U. S. Penitentiary, Alcatraz, advised that on June 11, 1962, he was the [redacted] of the 4:00 p.m. to 12:00 midnight shift. He said that at about 10:30 p.m. on June 11, 1962, he was in the prison control center when [redacted] telephonically called him and said that he had heard a strange noise in the cell house. [redacted] said he turned on the listening device (paging system) and listened for noise in the cell house, treatment unit and hospital. He said he got more noise from the hospital than anywhere else in the prison. [redacted] said he then summoned [redacted] and [redacted] admitted him to the cell house. [redacted] said he walked through the cell house and proceeded on to the prison hospital. He said everything appeared to be normal and there were no unusual noises in the prison hospital, so he returned to the cell house. He said everything appeared normal in the cell house and there were no unusual noises, so he returned to the control center. He said his search of the prison hospital and cell house took approximately forty-five minutes.

[redacted] advised that he resides in [redacted]. He advised that he has been an officer at Alcatraz Penitentiary for approximately [redacted]. He stated that he was presently [redacted] and was the [redacted] on guard on June 12, 1962 during the 7:15 a.m. standup count when [redacted] came running up to his desk at 7:20 a.m. and stated "We either have a dead man or a dummy in the cell block, I can't wake him up, I patted on the pillow and nothing happened". "I went to the B cell block, number 150 which is the cell of inmate JOHN ANGLIN. I reached in to tap him on the head and it felt like it crumbled. I immediately slapped at the head and it rolled on the floor. I shouted to the other guards, 'it is a dummy', and I immediately threw off the blanket and stepped to cell 152 and slapped off the blanket noticing this was also a dummy. I immediately checked the cell of FRANK LEE MORRIS number 138 and noted it was a dummy also. I immediately sounded the escape alarm. I then called the control center and alerted [redacted]. I then went to the corridor behind the B cell block because it was obvious that the inmates had not escaped through the front cell bars. I noted the rear air vent partitions on both the ANGLINs cells had been kicked out. I then noticed MORRIS' cell to be the same. At this time I also noted that the air vent on inmate [redacted] cell number 140, was also loose and immediately alerted the other guards that [redacted] had apparently attempted to escape also. I then returned to [redacted] cell and saw him talking with [redacted] where I overheard [redacted] state to [redacted] "No shakedown could ever discover this", and [redacted] was holding up a cardboard duplicate of the air vent and was beating it with his fist. I then heard some officers in the corridor shout that the inmates had escaped through a vent in the corridor roof behind B cell block. I then returned to my ordinary duties."

I started towards them when inmate [redacted] who was in cell block B, number 140, called me over and said, "You may as well look me up too, I planned the entire escape." [redacted] then showed me his escape hole out of the rear air vent into the utility corridor. I then immediately proceeded up to the second floor level corridor and noticed the air vent in the roof was open and was the obvious point of escape to the roof from the cell block. I then returned to my normal duties which was to arrange for the feeding of the inmates breakfast at that time.

[redacted] advised that he is a [redacted] and has held this position for approximately [redacted] and has been an [redacted] since [redacted]. He stated he had been an officer at Alcatraz for [redacted] with one exception [redacted].

He advised on June 12, 1962 at about 7:20 a.m. he heard the escape alarm loud speaker and immediately proceeded to the cell block from his residence which is located at [redacted]. He advised that after being briefed on the details of the escape he took four men to the roof and noted the top of the vent on the roof was pushed off and that the wagon wheel bar had been bent. During a search of the roof they found the black one-half inch diameter electrical extension cord approximately one hundred feet long near the smoke stack near the north end of the roof. They noted scrapings on the smoke stack and that a supporting bar to this smoke stack had been bent and appeared to be the most obvious means of the inmates' escape from the roof to the ground.

He advised on June 12, 1962 he was notified of the escape at 7:30 a.m. by the paging loud speaker system. He advised he and [REDACTED] after being advised of the basic details of the escape, proceeded to the north end of the cell block to the bakery smoke stack. He advised that they noted barbed wire sagging on the top of a cyclone fence located approximately ten feet from the base of the smoke stack. He stated they then noted a strand of cut barbed wire on the top of the catwalk on the outside yard wall fifty feet from the first fence. This spot is in the north east corner of the island. From this spot, he noted grass bent down near the water tower. This is about one hundred feet from the last fence crossing. This bent grass area is towards the beach and there is a forty-five foot downward slope to the road level. He believed that the inmates then apparently crossed the road to the lumber and debris area to the edge of the slope leading to the beach. He noted much torn and bent down grass on a slope located in the northeast corner of the island. It was approximately a seventy-five foot drop to the beach seawall. The seawall is about four to six feet high down to the water's edge and rocks. He advised the found a one-half inch diameter black electrical extension cord about one hundred feet long rolled up in a coil near the rocks below the seawall.
