



The Q2 material from the hole consists essentially of small lumps and loose particles of neat Portland cement mixed with small particles of line mortar, sand grains, small wood particles and paint chips.

The Portland cement has had some moisture in it but is not believed to have had enough moisture to form a slurry. The length of time the cement was in use could not be determined. The Q2 cement was found to be different from the K2 white cement paint submitted.

The particles of blue-green paint which were in Q2 were found to be similar in color, texture and composition to the blue-green paint of specimen K1. The paint chips in Q2 and the paint of K1 could have come from the same mource.

The submitted life preservors were inflated until firm. It was necessary to first seal three small punctures in the life preserver located in San Francisco Bay (your number 4). Weights were placed on these life preservers. The specimen from on top of "B" cell (your number 3) appeared to be completely mixtight remaining firm for several hours. The life preserver located at Fort Cronhite Beach and the one located in San Francisco Bay lost most of these air in about an hour. However, the rate of deflation was slow and pressure could no doubt be maintained by mouth.

appear to be homemade. It appears that pieces of steel from your number 16 and your number 17 could represent materials from which the homemade saws were made. Some of these steel fragments are 11/16" wide and approximately .015" thick. Other fragments are 1/2" wide and approximately .021" thick. In dimensions and appearance the 11/15" steel strips are similar to metal from a large spring. Steel banding strap material for use in preparing boxes for shipment is usually softer than the instant strip metal but it looks strikingly similar. FBI Laboratory advises the life preservers recovered from B Cell Block, on Fort Cronkhite Beach and from San Francisco Bay; the partially completed pontoon recovered from B Cell Block and the Alcatraz inmate raincoat are all composed of same type of material, mainly rubber-coated cotton fabric. The life preservers are all yoke type, placing flotation "Popular contains behind the head as well as in front of the body. Mechanics" March 1962 issue located in cell of article discussing the various types of life preservers. However, the article states that the yoke-type preserver makes swimming difficult. "Sports Illustrated" March 21, 1962, issue located in cell of MORRIS contains article discussing various inflatables, including life preservers and indicates composition of most inflatables as vinyl plastic or rubberized fabric, the latter being durable and more difficult to puncture.

FBI Laboratory inflated life preservers and placed weights on them. Life preserver recovered from B Cell Block discovered completely air tight, remaining firm for several hours. Other two life preservers lost most of their air in about an hour by slow rate of deflation, but pressure could be maintained by mouth.

This portion of the cell block has been enclosed and locked off from the other cell blocks. "A" cell block has not been used for housing prisoners since 1952, because of lack of plumbing and security grill work. The material in the paint room is issued to inmates who are working inside the main cell block in painting and refurbishing the cell block areas. He noticed a five gallon can of white cement paint and took the lid off of it. The paint was solidified, evidently due to someone placing water therein. #### Results of examination:

The life preservers, the partially completed pontoon, the Q7 packet and the K3 raincoat are all composed of the same, type of material, mainly rubber-coated cotton fabric. The adhesive used on these items is a rubber adhesive different from the Rem-Weld glue of specimen Q22.

The life preservers are all the yoke type, that is with a hole for the head, placing flotation behind the head as well as in front of the body.

Specimen K4 (Popular Mechanics, March 1962) contains an article discussing various types of life preservers. The article includes pictures of a man wearing a yoke type preserver similar in shape to Q3 through Q5, with the caption "Yoke-type vest holds swimmer high and upright; keeps unconscious man riding high, face out of water." The article states, however, that the yoke type preserver makes swimming difficult.

Specimen K5 (Sports Illustrated, May 21, 1962) in discussing various inflatables, life preservers, toys, et cetera, states that "The composition of most inflatables.....is either vinyl plastic or rubberized fabric. Rubberized fabric is durable and more difficult to puncture than vinyl."

Specimen K6 (Popular Mechanics, November 1960) contains an article on making decoys out of inner tubes by a vulcanizing process. Neither the material nor the process was used in constructing Q3 through Q7.

The life preservers were tested for their ability to retain air. They were inflated until firm, and then weights were placed on them. It was necessary first to seal three punctures in Q5. Specimen Q3 appeared to be completely airtight, remaining firm for several hours. Specimens Q4 and Q5 lost most of their air in about an hour. However, the rate of deflation was slow, and pressure could no doubt be maintained by mouth.

The hair on the dummy faces was verified as being of human origin.

The dummy faces were examined for the presence of bristles similar to those composing the K7 brush, but none were found.

Specimen Q18 has a base of concrete composed of Portland cement and sand. Over the concrete is a layer of white cement paint similar to the K2 white cement paint.

Specimen Q19 is basically a mixture of Portland cement, sand grains and white cement paint with a layer of white cement paint over the mixture.

Specimen Q21 is similar to Q19 in that it is basically a mixture of Portland cement and white cement paint over which is white cement paint.

Specimen Q20 is formed from soap packed over a small bundle of white cotton rags.

Although the tan or flesh-colored paint on the dummy faces was basically similar to the K7 paint, differences were noted. It appears that paint like K7 could have been used on the dummy faces; however, prior to use other paint ingredients were added to it. For example the paint on Q20 and Q21 contained barium not found in the K7 paint, and the paint on Q18 and Q19 contained more lead than the K7 paint. Paint ingredients, pigments or extenders containing barium or lead could have been added to K7 and then the mixture could have been applied to the dummy faces.

The two paddles, Q24 and Q25, are similar in design and construction and are composed of similar materials.

The blue-green paint used on the cells, specimen Kl (FBI Laboratory report dated July 3) was similar in color and composition to the blue-green paint on Q24 and Q26.

The walls or sides of the periscope, Q23, and the backing on Q26 were composed of a material similar to an artist panel which is a white cotton canvas over a stiff cardboard backing. This panellike material present in the periscope, Q23, bears the trade name "Blue Boy" and "18" X 24". The adhesive on the inside of the periscope is similar to Rem-Weld liquid plastic adhesive as found in specimen Q22.

All of the submitted saw blades in specimens Q8, Q10 and Q13 appear to be homemade. The following information was compiled concerning the saw blades:

It appears probable that the four pieces of steel listed in the last table represent materials from which the homemade saws were made.

In dimensions and appearance the 11/16" wide steel strips are similar to metal from a large spring. Steel banding strap material for use in preparing boxes for shipment is usually softer than the saw blade metal but it looks strikingly similar to it. The prison officials probably can determine the most logical source of the saw blade metal including the 1/2" wide metal.

It is not possible to estimate the age of the saw blades on the basis of the amount of rust on them.

Specimen Q9 consists of the round knurled handle and 1 5/8" of the filing portion of a small, broken file. The information "2 SIMONDS" appears on the handle of the old file which identifies it as a product of the Simonds Saw and Steel Company, Fitchburg, Massachusetts, a large volume manufacturer of saws and files.

In addition to the three thin pieces of steel in Qll which appeared similar to the steel from which the saw blades were made, there were numerous pieces of miscellaneous metal, homemade tools, tablespoon handles, a small wooden block with three set screws and a homemade flashlight.



The wooden block could be used as a chuck on an electric drill.

The flashlight demonstrates the ingenuity of the prisoners in utilizing available material to accomplish their purpose. The housing for the two penlight batteries (one battery is a spare) is a small rectangular plastic box which has a hole in one end through which the bulb is screwed so that the base of, the bulb contacts the center post of the battery. A fastener, similar to an Acco type file fastener, is employed as the means of carrying the electricity from the battery base to the side of the bulb and it also acts as the switch. There is no lens or other protection for the bulb.

No pertinent information was developed from examining the electric motor, Q12, the steel scraping or digging tool, Q14, the electric cords of Q16 and Q17 and the two pieces of steel in Q16.

Specimen Q15 consists of three tablespoon handles, a homemade steel tool with a paper tape handle and some black fabric tape stored around part of a small Singer Sewing Machine book containing some writing. No significant information was developed concerning the tablespoon handles or the small tool.

No blood was identified on specimens Q4 and Q5.
