advised SA on June 12, 1962, that he has not maintained correspondence with FRANK LEE MORRIS since two years prior to Christmas of 1961. At that time MORRIS sent him a Christmas card from prison, but had wanted to terminate his correspondence with MORRIS and did not reply.

stated he had met MORRIS in Louisiana in 1958 and wanted to help MORRIS since he liked him. He communicated with Florida authorities in an effort to get them to drop charges against MORRIS. MORRIS requested Atlanta prison authority to write to him, and they communicated fairly regularly after that. MORRIS' letters were on a standard form supplied by the prison. MORRIS had never mentioned escape, but he is the type of person who accomplishes what he tries.

said he knew none of MORRIS' friends but did think MORRIS would contact him if still alive. He is aware that aiding MORRIS would be a crime, and he advised that he would contact the FBI should he hear from MORRIS.



West Allis and Milwaukee Police Departments were alerted to the fact that FRANK LEE MORRIS had escaped from Alcatraz Prison on June 12, 1962.

On June 16, 1962 advised that he does not know a when advised that a telephone call was made to Atlanta U. S. Prison, Georgia, in April, 1959, at approximately the same time that he went to visit MORRIS at the prison, he stated that he recalled a conversation with the warden at Atlanta Prison at which time reference was made to his aiding MORRIS in escaping from Atlanta.

Stated that he had no such intention and informed the warden that the call must have been made as a joke or out of spite.
