At the end of the aerosol challenge approximately six (6) or seven (7) ml of B.a. would remain. The B.a. that was not used in the challenges was normally autoclaved prior to being removed from the hood. The remaining material, except for the AGIs, that was used in the challenge would be placed into a bag and autoclaved at the end of the day. The AGIs were sprayed with bleach prior to being removed from the hood line, and then taken to room plating. After the plates had been left in the incubator overnight, they would be completely covered with growth. The plates were then read in the morning following a challenge. After the plates were read, they were placed into a bag and clearly marked with what pathogen was in the bag, what strain the pathogen was, and who the investigator was. The bags would remain in room until nearly overflowing, or until the number of bags in the room became an obstruction. The bags often sat in room for noted seve<u>ral</u> days or weeks prior to being removed. that was fascinated with how much growth appeared on the plates after several days or weeks. The bags were then taken to the basement to be autoclaved. The bags were placed into metal garbage cans in the basement, next to the autoclave, in case there was a leak in the bag. The animal caretakers at USAMRIID would autoclave
