As you know investigation was made by the New York Office at the request of Mr. Martin Conboy who was handling the prosecution of "Dutch" Schultz, the investigation being predicated on an anonymous letter received by the New York Office alleging [REDACTED] had harbored "Dutch" Schultz throughout the period he was a fugitive from justice.

This investigation has been completed and fails to reflect any evidence [REDACTED] harbored Schultz or was acquainted with him. [REDACTED] said to have a good reputation in New York City [REDACTED]

He permitted an examination of his records which failed to reveal the name or any of the aliases of Schultz. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] in adjoining office in the same suite with [REDACTED] were interviewed and neither had seen Schultz or knew him or any of his associates.

The investigation has now been closed.

**Dutch Schultz
And Three Aids
Shot at Cafe**

ALBANY, N. Y., Oct. 23 (AP)—Dutch Schultz, a reputed racketeer, and three of his associates were shot and wounded today in a cafe here.

The shooting occurred at the Cafe de la Paix, a popular hangout for gamblers and racketeers. Schultz, who is believed to be a leader in the New York racket, was seen with three other men at the cafe.

The police are investigating the shooting as a possible attempt to silence Schultz. It is believed that the men who shot Schultz were hired by a rival racketeer.

Schultz was wounded in the chest and arm. The three other men were also wounded. One of the men was killed.

The police are searching for the shooter. They believe that the shooter is a member of the rival racket.
