Reference is made to my letter dated July 17, 1935, which was addressed to the U. S. Attorney, Southern District of New York, transmitting a copy of an undated anonymous letter received by this office, stating that [REDACTED] on numerous occasions, during the time that SCOTT was a fugitive, contacted him and rendered medical assistance. A copy of the anonymous letter, together with a copy of my letter of transmittal addressed to the U. S. Attorney, were forwarded to the Bureau.

Reference is also made to my telephone conversation of July 19th, with Mr. Tamm, advising that Assistant U. S. Attorney Klein, Southern District of New York, had informed me that former U. S. Attorney Martin Conboy, who is acting as Special Prosecutor in the DUTCH SCHWARTZ case, had requested that this office conduct the investigation relative to the alleged activities [REDACTED] b7c

In compliance with Mr. Tamm's telephonic instructions, I personally contacted Mr. Conboy and Mr. Klein and informed them that this Bureau would conduct the requested investigation.

This matter is being assigned and will receive prompt and thorough investigative attention.

By reference from the Director's office, I telephonically conferred with [REDACTED] concerning his recent trip to Mexico City, Mex. I told him concerning the Cuban Cuban Attorney General, that I had no objection to his making a statement to the press in a few days concerning an individual being charged with attempting to make contact with Cuba.

[REDACTED] stated that the publicity had presented to be given where it was found necessary to have a diplomatic report and he wanted to know if one would be sent to the Cuban Cuban Attorney's office and later to the U. S. Embassy.

I informed [REDACTED] that I was not certain that any diplomatic report of the Cuban Cuban would be given, but that I could assure him that there were no secret, political or other considerations which would prevent the Cuban Cuban from giving such a report. I also stated that it would take some little time for me to contact the Cuban Cuban Ambassador before I could be positive.

He then stated as we both left Mr. [REDACTED] United States Attorney, and I stated that I would contact him before the time of his departure from the United States. I also stated that I would contact the Cuban Cuban Ambassador and let him know of my intentions to give him a copy of the diplomatic report. I also stated that I would probably leave the country on July 21st.

Dear Mr. Hoover:

I fully expected that incidental to the trial of Arthur (Dutch Schultz) Flegenheimer, now being held at Malone, N.Y., there would be a need for my services in your department, at least for the purpose of passing on the qualifications and selection of the jurors for the case.

I fear that the prosecution has made a poor selection in accepting the present jury, and in my humble opinion, the best it can hope for will be another disagreement. This opinion is based on the fact that I know nearly every one who was drawn for the purpose of selecting the jury for this case. I personally know most of the jury. Then too, I have done much investigative work for the local attorneys who are assisting in the defense. Am familiar with their methods and know the type of men they would select for jury service. Neither of them know that I have been examined for appointment in your department.

In the event of a re-trial of this case, in this county, I am ready to assist your department and render any service which I may be called upon to give.

With respect to the above entitled investigation, I have to inform you that on July 30, 1935, Special Agent [redacted] appeared at Malone, New York, at the trial of the above matter and there gave testimony to prove, in part, that the defendant was a fugitive from justice. The testimony furnished was to the effect that the Bureau instituted a search for the fugitive in the latter part of October, 1934; the addresses visited by the Agents were named and it was brought out that the fugitive surrendered about a month after the Bureau investigation was instituted.
