MENORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR

Re: "Dutch" Schults.

During a telephonic conversation which I had with special agent in Charge Whitley of the New York Office, he commented which the death of "Dutch" Schults as a result of his being that by gangsters, and I asked his what his epinion of this matter is.

Mr. Whitley said that his theory of this natter, which theory he believes is concurred in by the New York Police, is that some of the big-shot gasgeters up there decided it was about time for Schults to step out of the plature; that he refused to gracefully step out, so they took the only other available course. Mr. Whitley said that Schultz did not appear to have been trying to break into many of the other rackets up those, but the others just wanted to gain control of those rackets which he has built up; that Schults was the strongest competition they had, so they just wanted to get rid of him.

Reference is made to (y l)tter dated November 1, 1935, relative to developments in gan; activities leading up to and following the recent killings of gangsters is New York City and transmitting certain records which was in the possession of Flegma-heiner alias Schultz at the time he was killed.

Special Agent of the Treaton office, who is resident agent at Hewark, New Jercey, through contact with the County Prosecutor's office, has excertained that there were quite a few letters, telegrams, cards and other papers found in the possession of Schultz and the three gangsters who were killed with him, which records were not turned over to the Intelligence Unit of the Internal Revenue Bureau. Agents betained possession of all these papers from the County Prosecutor and brought them to the New York Bureau office where Thotostatic copies were east to paper and records were also made for the Tracker and the York offices.

Agent etc. 163 (2) (2) County Prosecutor's office in Newark who originally coerced goodselon of the papers and records, both from the bodies of Schultz and his three associates and from their rocks in the Robert from Make in Nomer, has associated and Agent that all the papers, of every kind and description, were unde switches for photostating. Efforts are being continued through the office of the United States Attorney, Scathern District of New York, to obtain possession of the papers and records allegedly found in the room of Louis (PrettyPinberg, who was also slain, and it is expected that these will be secured and forwarded within the next few days.

As stand previously, I am endeavoring to keep closely in touch with this situation and you will be promptly advised of developments of interest.
