

#### History

#### California State Prison System

In the late 1950's and until the early 1960's, there existed at California State Prison, San Quentin, a group of white inmates known as the Blue Bird Gang. As time went on, it became apparent to other white inmates that a more powerful gang was needed to protect white inmates from the Black and Mexican prison spawned gangs that were in power in the California Department of Corrections prison system at that time.

the creed that was to become the quideline of the Aryan Brotherhood (AB):

I will stand by my brother,
My brother will come before all others,
My life is forfeited should I fail my brother,
I will honor my brother in peace and war.

In 1967, at San Quentin, the name AB was adopted, and the concept of the AB was formed, that is, "one is in for life and the only way out is by death."

Originally, one had to be part Irish in order to be a member of the AB. The AB wanted whites who could stand on their own feet, but they reached a point where they did not care about anyone except the ABs, and became a white racist group. They picked the name because it showed

They use the sign "666", which is the sign of the beast, and the swastika, which means one is an outlaw. The shamrock is symbolic of the AB and especially when there are three 6's in the shamrock.

death Jessie Kenteria Castro (CDC Number B-31838), a La Nuestra Familia (NF), (a Mexican California prison spawned gang) member, at Deuel Vocational Institution, Tracy, California. The NF had been at war with the Mexican Mafia (MM/EME) since 1968 and EME members had been friends with AB members. When Castro was killed, the AB and EME formed an alliance to help each other and to fight the NF.

The AB grew in size in the California prison system and today, it is estimated that there are more than 100 members. They carry out murder contracts, sell narcotics, and control gambling and the sale of "punks" within prison walls.

The AB, in early 1980, formed a three inmate commission to run the AB in the Federal system

now an estimated 100 - 160 members of the AB in the Federal system.

Recently, a Los Angeles source has come forth and provided information regarding the AB. Source has provided accurate information regarding two murders in the Federal prison system, and has also furnished information regarding 58 individuals suspected to be members or sympathizers of the AB and the EME, both in and out of prison.

It is a hard fact that most of the AB will be paroled or discharged at some future date, and in view of members' lifelong commitments, it would be naive to think he would not remain in contact with his brothers. The rule of thumb is that once on the streets, one must take care of his brothers that are still inside. The penalty for failure to do so is death upon the members return to the prison system. Some of the paroled members' duties

would be to supply his brothers inside with drugs, or to make hits on the street as commanded by his brothers.

A review of the atrocities attributed to the prison, gangs inside of our nation's maximum security prisons should shed some light on the potential of what these gang members can do with little or no supervision while out on the streets.

Source information indicates that the AB has a strangle hold on some of the top LCN members who are inside the prison system, so now it allows the AB access to the funding of organized crime.







At approximately 9:30 a m. on December 9, 1982,
U. S. Bureau
of Prisons, U. S. Penitentiary (USP), Lewisburg, Pennsylvania (PA), while in the Institution's east corridor
adjacent to the entrance grille of C-Block, heard what
sounded like loud moaning and screaming coming from the
second floor of that unit immediately proceeded to
the second floor of C-Block and upon arrival at the stairway
landing found inmate Neil Baumgarten, #20586-148, lying
partially on the stairs and half-landing leading to C-2
recreation area entrancedoor. Inmate Baumgarten was bleeding
profusely from the upper portion of his body.

immediately summoned assistance from
Institution staff utilizing the telephone located in the immediate area. With the assistance of two inmates, placed Baumgarten on a stretcher and he was thereafter transported to the Institution hospital.

At approximately 9:40 a.m., Baumgarten arrived at the Institution hospital and was provided emergency treatment by physicians assistants. At time of treatment it was estimated that Baumgarten had sustained approximately 15

puncture wounds to the upper chest, back and abdomen area. Due to the severity of Baumgarten's condition, he was immediately transferred to Evangelical Community Hospital, Lewisburg, PA, at approximately 9:55 a.m., and was pronounced dead at approximately 10:00 a.m.

The crime scene was immediately secured and Special Agents (SAs) of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) responded to the Institution.

Institution authorities initiated a search of the A, B, C and D-Blocks of the Institution. In addition a search was conducted of the outside perimeter grounds in an attempt to locate any physical evidence. The above searches failed to produce any weapon(s), articles of clothing or any suspected physical evidence. Inmates located within the living quarters at the time of the incident were secured and ultimately checked for any possible cuts, bruises, blood stains or torn clothing. All of the above met with negative results.

During the crime scene search physical evidence (blood) was found on the folding gate restraining partition located within the recreation area connecting C-3 and A-3 Blocks. It was discovered that it is possible for an individual to crawl underneath this restraining gate if assisted by a second individual who would hold the gate up from the floor. Further investigation of the area revealed a blood stain on the C-3 recreation area door. This indicates that the escape route taken by the assailants was through the C-3 recreation area door, through the recreation area itself, underneath the partition gate and back into A-3 (A-Block, third floor).

During initial interviews of inmates located within the immediate area of the incident, an inmate eyewitness to the murder was identified and interviewed by a Special Agent of the FBI.

felt that the murder of Baumgarten occurred in retaliation for the murder of Cadillac Smith which occurred at the USP, Marion, Illinois, earlier in 1982.

also believed there was a second inmate involved in the murder of Baumgarten.

was placed in the Institution Administrative Detention Unit.

As the investigation progressed, it was determined necessary to place a number of inmates into the Administration Detention Unit, either for possible involvement in the murder or for having been identified as inmates who would most likely retaliate on behalf of the victim.

During the week of December 13-17, 1982, Institution staff and Special Agents of the FBI conducted numerous interviews of inmates towards the ultimate development of cooperative inmate witnesses.

During the middle part of November, 1982, victim
Baumgarten had arranged to purchase a quantity of cocaine which
was to be received within the Institution from the outside over
the weekend of November 27-28, 1982. Arrangements were made and
\$1,000 was sent to cover the purchase of the cocaine. Due to this
transaction, Baumgarten began purchasing drugs on credit within
the Institution, using the imminent arrival of the cocaine as
collateral.

The purchase of the cocaine was being directed by another inmate within the Institution whose identity was not known to the source. During the period of time that the cocaine was to arrive at the Institution, shakedowns by USP authorities resulted in various inmates getting "busted" for narcotics. This apparently

led to the postponement of the introduction of the cocaine. Simultaneously, Baumgarten continued to purchase drugs on credit and got further in debt.

Baumgarten owed two papers of heroin valued at approximately \$150. began charging interest on the debt and started pressuring the victim for payment.

During the following days, Baumgarten continued stalling for time, in order to obtain the money owed to indicating on three separate occasions that the money had already been sent.





During the period from December 1982 to the present, information has been received and compiled indicating the presence of a large group of inmates within the USP, Lewisburg, which has organized into a retaliatory and murder organization. This group is comprised of Black inmates from the Washington, D. C. area and is known as the "D. C. Blacks". A large segment of this group also has membership and/or ties with the Moorish Science Temple. Information has been received indicating that this group of inmates have banded together and have plotted the murders and attempted murders of white inmates at the USP their "cause" being the retaliation of the killing of Raymond "Cadillac" Smith who was purportedly murdered at the USP, Marion, Illinois, by incarcerated members of the Aryan Brotherhood (AB).

To support the above information, on December 11, 1982, a U. S. Bureau of Prisons transcript of a telephone conversation <u>between</u> which indicated

an imminent "war" between the AB and the D. C. Blacks at the USP, Leavenworth, and USP, Lewisburg. The "war" was in retaliation over the murder of Raymond "Cadillac" Smith.

Joint efforts of the U. S. Bureau of Prisons, USP, Lewisburg; FBI, Philadelphia Division; and U. S. Attorney's Office, Middle District of Pennsylvania, will continue to develop a viable prosecutable case involving the Baumgarten murder.

# ARYAN BROTHERHOOD (AB) LOS ANGELES DIVISION RACKETEERING ENTERPRISE INVESTIGATION

During the last 180-day period, investigation in this matter has been primarily concerned with developing sources of information regarding the Aryan Brotherhood (AB).

### CONTACT WITH OTHER AGENCIES

One such source of information is known as the California Prison Gang Task Force (PGTF). This task force is made up of representatives from various law enforcement and corrections-related agencies throughout the state, and meets on a once per month basis. The meetings offer investigators and corrections officers the frequent opportunity to discuss the latest intelligence and developments relating, not only to the AB, but to other prison gangs, including the Mexican Mafia (EME), La Nuestra Familia (NF), and the Black Guerilla Family (BGF). The Los Angeles Division now has a member representative who will be attending the PGTF meetings on a regular basis.

During this investigative period, the following information regarding members and associates of the AB was derived from various Federal and local agencies in the Los Angeles area:

On January 13, 1983, AB member, Robert "Blinky" Griffen, was found guilty in San beinardino Lounty Superior Court, for the 1980 murder of "T-Bone Gibson."

Griffen was also found not sittly settled in the same weapon.

AB associate were arrested by the California Highway Patrol immediately following the robbery of the Pomoha First Federal Savings and Loan Association, Glendora Branch, in El Monte, California. Island Federal Penitentiary, and is in the Los Angeles County Jail.


Recently, AB associate Eros Timm was found stabbed to death in his cell at the United States Penitentiary, Lewisburg, Pennsylvania. Timm suffered from approximately forty stab wounds to his head, neck and chest. Though many inmates have been placed under suspicion, at this time none have been charged. Investigators at Lewisburg believe that Timm was a victim of the recent retaliation efforts of a group called the D.C. Blacks towards the AB.

On April 5, 1983, also at the Lewisburg Federal Penitentiary, an associate of Eros Timm, Again, inmates associated with the D.C. Blacks are under suspicion.

The retaliation efforts on the part of the D.C. Blacks are believed to be due to the September 27, 1982 death of a member Raymond "Cadillac" Smith Smith was allegedly killed by at the United States Pentitentiary, Marion, Illinois. It is not known if the violence between these groups is solely a race issue,

or not. Investigators claim that the D.C. mob strives for power and control within the prison system. It is also known that the AB also strives for the same type of control. Investigators believe that the violence between these two groups is only in the "budding" stage. It cannot be determined, at this time, whether or not this violence will spill over into the California State prison system.

### SOURCE INFORMATION

During this investigative period, a number of confidential sources have provided information regarding the activities of the AB.

One such source advised that the AB has spread throughout the Federal prison system, and has developed links with other organized crime groups on the streets. In the early 1970s, members of the AB started going to Federal prisons for crimes such as bank robbery and narcotics violations. Two of the first members to do Federal time, were

The Federal prison system held many well-to-do members and associates of Italian organized crime groups, who were powerful on the streets, but were at the mercy of any "nut with a knife" while in prison. In return, the mobsters were safe while inside the walls, and were obligated to offer the AB members a "slice of the pie" on the streets when they were paroled. Other source information

Sources have advised that there has been an alliance with the Mexican Mafia (EME). Once the AB had shown itself to be a valued and respected ally, there was a deal worked out, whereby the AB would unite in war with the EME against La Nuestra Familia (NF). In the Federal prisons, as in the State prisons, the AB and the EME have cooperated in several murders and shake-downs, and together they seem to form an irresistible force. Both the AB and EME look down on

their brethern who still occupy the state prisons. They are looked upon as barbarians who spend their time plotting on each other, rather than bettering themselves by criminal enterprise.

# ARYAN BROTHERHOOD MURDERS IN THE FEDERAL PRISON SYSTEM

Since the inception of the AB in the Federal prison system, the organization has planned and carried out a number of brutal prison murders. During this investigative period, a source has been developed who has provided information, and is willing to testify regarding murders which took place at various Federal penal institutions throughout the nation. These AB Commission sanctioned murders took place and involved victims who were "hit" because they were suspected informants, because they failed to pay drug debts, or just for making disparaging remarks about the AB. These murders involve members and associates of the LCN, AB, EME, and a Washington D.C. based street gang known as the D.C. Mob. One such murder, that of D.C. Mob leader Raymond "Cadillac" Smith in 1982, has been followed by many other murders, thought to be retaliatory in nature. The source has been interviewed extensively and the results have been turned over to the appropriate United States Attorneys for prosecutive decisions and action.



He feels that the killing of correctional officers will escalate in order for the AB's to establish their authority through fear.

He feels that the way to solve the problem of the growing AB population in the Federal and State system is to segregate all of the members of the AB, as well as their associates. The State and Federal systems should get together and put all of the gangs in one prison and keep them locked down as that is the only way they can be kept from growing.

There is a chance that the AB's and MEXICAN MAFIA (EME) could cooperate with the BLACK GUERRILLA FAMILY (BGF), but he feels that in a period of time, that cooperation will deteriorate, as there are some diehard racists in the AB.

All receiving offices are requested to ensure appropriate liaison has been established with the security representative at their reflective FCI, regarding ongoing Bureau interest in prison gang related homicides. It should be noted that recent information indicates a high potential for ongoing efforts by the AB to assault and/or kill prison guards, including the prisons (BOP) personnel. In light of this, efforts will be undertaken through FBIHQ to maintain close working liaison with BOP, washington, D.C. Parallel efforts should be undertaken throughout all receiving offices to ensure the prison gang problem is thoroughly

addressed.

In addition to AB, the MEXICAN MAFIA (EME), who have been allies of the AB, are also housed at Marion. At the present time there are currently 19 confirmed members, one of which is the acknowledged successor to who is

Both the AB and EME have had control over most inmates in the Federal system by use of the activities noted above and have a strong following of non-members who are sympathetic to their activities.

Marion has had numerous murders committed by both groups. On 10/22/38 two officers were stabbed to death by an AB commission member, and a member of the AB.

Since 10/83 the penitentiary has been in a "locked down" status and there has been an obvious "splitting" of allies between AB and EME. There has been noted friction between the two groups and at the present time there is little overt communication between AB and EME except when actually required.

Intelligence indicates that there is a plot in progress to take over the institution by all inmates which is currently being discussed by among his followers. This plot is supposed to occur as soon as the institution "opens up" in the summer, 1984. This information has been furnished to authorities at Marion and emanate from a current member source.



Further, both SSA and SSA stressed the neccessity of full cooperation between FBI and BOP, not only in the investigation of prison gang offenses, but the full dissemination of any and all gang related information regarding stressed the neccessity b these offenses. This dissemination can facilitate, not only the criminal act under investigation, but also the potential impact of these isolated criminal acts on an overall RICO effort against the entire organization.

Throughout the meeting, BOP voiced full willingness and eager cooperation in assisting and joining in the FBI's efforts to address the prison gang problems. This joint cooperation can greatly aid in the investigations of CGR type cases as well as provide timely intelligence information from BOP as to prison gang activities within BOP and anticipated release of identified gang members on parole to a given region.

These two meetings, AB Strategy meeting and BOP Gang Activity meeting, were highly beneficial for both the Organized Crime Section and the Personal Crimes Section as to identified programs within each section. The established direction and mutual areas of concern will be closely coordinated between all effected substantive desk supervisors.
