PURPOSE: To request approval for travel of SA [redacted] and [redacted] to Atlanta for period 4/13 - 16/81.

DETAILS: The Technical Services Division (TSD) is supporting the ATKID investigation with the Investigative Support Information System (ISIS). Eight more support personnel from the field and Headquarters (HQ) have been temporarily assigned to Atlanta to support the ISIS application. The individuals from HQ will train the new support people on the coding of the case information and help organize the flow of ISIS for the eighteen support people that will be assigned to ISIS in Atlanta. HQ training of personnel will help speed up the entry of data into Atlanta's data base.

Estimated travel costs for TSD are \$504 air fare and \$448 per diem.

RECOMMENDATION: That SA [redacted] and [redacted] travel to Atlanta to assist with ISIS training 4/13 - 16/81.

By attached teletype, Atlanta advises that on 3/31/81 the body of an individual identified as Eddie Duncan was recovered from the Chattahoochee River approximately one mile South of the location from which the body of Timothy Hill was recovered on 3/30/81. Duncan is described as a 20 year old Black male, 5'10" tall, 150 pounds, and slightly mentally retarded. The Fulton County, Georgia, Medical Examiner, tentatively listed the cause of death as possible drowning or asphyxiation.

Duncan was a member of the Techwood Homes "Bat Patrol" a group of citizens who armed themselves with baseball bats and patrolled the city housing project in Atlanta to protect residents from the child killer.

Duncan has been added to the list of missing or murdered children and active investigation continues.

Atlanta mayor: Children's killer will be caught

His voice trembling with emotion, Atlanta Mayor Maynard Jackson told 1,000 people at a Texas Emancipation Day Commission Banquet Thursday night the killer of the 23 black children in his city will be caught.

"Our children are under attack. We don't know why this tragedy is happening in our city. We don't know who the killer or killers are. We don't know when, but we will catch him or her or them," he vowed.

"We are getting closer and closer to solving these horrible crimes," Jackson said in his speech to the banquet crowd in VERA Assembly Building.

The mayor of Georgia's largest city was in San Antonio to talk about the importance of economic development.

But, the deaths of the Atlanta children were given precedence in the keynote address and at a press conference Jackson held earlier in the day.

In danger

"Our children are in danger. There is a great sadness in our city because of these murders.

"Why is it happening in our city in which the homicide rate went down by 13 percent last year, and violent crime increased by only 1 percent compared to 13 percent nationwide, I don't know. I do know that the transactions have not

Webster for saying three or four of the killings had been solved.

"That was an extremely unfortunate statement, it was a serious mistake," Jackson said, adding that Webster's remarks only added confusion to an already complicated situation.

Jackson's banquet speech was the second address he has given in San Antonio in the past four months. On his first visit he said he was haunted by the realization the killings had not been solved.

He told the Thursday night banquet audience the same realization remains foremost on his mind.

"But something else I talked about four months ago in this city also continues to haunt me — it is something people won't let me forget. But, I tell you this, I don't regret anything I said then. I make no apologies to no one."

Nov. 14 speech

Jackson's speech to about 700 persons at a United San Antonio meeting Nov. 14, 1981, was similar to that given Thursday night. Both talks stressed the need to understand that economic and social development go together and that similarities, not differences between people, must be magnified.

"Select dreams," he said. "And select those dreams that are common to us all. There is no chance in this great nation to those who are economically oppressed unless there is a genuine partnership between the public and private sectors. The private sector controls the economy-wide private sector sets

Jackson Rebukes FBI Director For Comments On Kids' Cases

Mayor Maynard Jackson strongly rebuked FBI Director William Webster Tuesday, saying Webster's comments that police had "substantially solved" up to four of the slayings of 23 young Atlanta blacks "undermine the public's confidence in our investigation."

One source close to the Atlanta special police task force investigation said Tuesday that police for months have had suspects in the cases of at least four of the victims, including the only two females — Latonya Wilson, 7, whose body was found on Oct. 18, 1986,

and Angel Lenoir, 12, whose body was discovered March 18, 1986.

Suspects have also been identified in the cases of 16-year-old Eric Middlebrooks, whose body was found on May 19, 1986, and 8-year-old Anthony Carter, whose body was found July 7, 1986, the source said.

Public Safety Commissioner Lee Brown could not be reached late Tuesday for comment on the report of suspects.

The source emphasized that he did not know whether those are the same cases that Webster referred to when he made his comments.

The Investigation

There was bad news from the director of the FBI, William Webster, but there was also reason for optimism. He said authorities were very close to finding the killer of a dozen or more youths in Atlanta when the case against the prime suspect fell apart. However, that suspect is under surveillance as are others suspects in the case. The bright spot in all this is the FBI with its extensive training and support facilities is working very closely with Atlanta and there has been progress.

"I really think we are getting to a point where we should have a break coming," Webster said.

The director also indicated that three or four child killings were unrelated to what he described as a string of 10 to 12 slayings by one person or persons. That brings to mind a question — why hasn't someone been charged? District Attorney Lewis Slaton says there is not enough evidence. A police department spokesman echoed that remark.

Only in television cop shows are these baffling cases solved quickly and that's because the script has been written and the identity of the guilty is known beforehand. In real life there are many more problems facing police and prosecutors. Authorities may have several strong suspects in the cases but under our system of justice, the charged are innocent until proven guilty and that is as it should be — to protect the innocent.

But we can take comfort in Webster's assurance that the case has moved along as far as it has. There are dozens of people working on the case representing numerous, local, state and federal agencies. With that much talent, it is only a matter of time be-

fore there is a break that will put us on the road to putting this whole tragedy behind us.

It is unfortunate that Mayor Jackson chose to publicly challenge Webster for his remarks. We understand the mayor's concern about the investigation but we see no sign of great "undirected media speculation and inverteve," as the mayor phrased it. Webster never said the FBI had information the others working on the case didn't have. He was giving an evaluation of progress as he sees it.

The tragedy is too important for needless disagreements among the officials involved and it should be noted that the FBI and local law enforcement officials in Atlanta have probably gone further in close cooperation on a most difficult case than on any other case in modern times.

ments about the Atlanta slaying Monday. However, he added that police do not have enough evidence to bring a case against any of the suspects.

In a letter to Webster Tuesday, Jackson said he assured positively by Atlanta law-enforcement officials that there is no sufficient evidence to any pending child case to justify arrest at this time. If there were, our police would make such arrests.

"Your statements are starting to hurt the good Washington's help, and those problems have now become the FBI's. I do not wish to be under the impact of your casual press statements on our local situation here."

Brown told the City Council's Public Safety and Legal Administration Committee Tuesday afternoon no cases where we have sufficient evidence to make an arrest. There is no reason not to make an arrest if we had enough evidence to contact. We would be as happy as our citizens if we could make an arrest and solve the case.

"But we are not going to arrest someone unless we have evidence that this person is responsible and we can identify and convict him," he said.

Sources said Monday that prosecutors first went to see the mass killer apprehended before going ahead with any individual cases.

Brown told the committee that Webster's Monday remarks had neither materially hurt nor aided the probe.

The committee decided to draft a letter to Webster, asking if he had been quoted correctly in the Atlanta newspapers and warning him of the

problems his remarks were causing.

Brown told the committee he called local FBI officials after learning of Webster's remarks and was told that Atlanta FBI agents were unaware of the statements and "were unaware of anything about the cases that we (on the Atlanta police force) were not aware of."

Webster said that during a press luncheon, "questions were raised about the Atlanta situation" and what he thought was he had not said anything that was not a ready said and he was attempting to explain the difficulty of the investigation and the commitment to the investigation.

He said he tries to point out that there are good leads that crop up, that then after follow-up they turn out to be not what we are looking for, he said that was the context in which he tried to tell the media that three or four weeks ago their hopes were up and it didn't pan out. Brown said: "He said he didn't know anything we don't know."

When asked by a reporter whether he agreed with Webster's comments that 12 to 16 of the cases would be linked, Brown said: "There's been a lot of speculation. That's his speculation."

Brown said he "didn't know which cases" Webster was referring to when he mentioned that three or four weeks ago the FBI had high hopes of solving the crimes. "Our hopes have been up many times, but they always come back down again," he said.

Both Brown and Jackson commended the Atlanta FBI office for cooperating fully with the special children's task force. The source said local FBI officials were as surprised as Jackson and Brown to hear of Webster's comments.

In the news conference before his session with

the public safety panel, Brown said police "know more about some cases than others" but that "we do not have enough information to make an arrest."

Meanwhile, about 150 mourners attended the funeral of Larry Rogers, 23, the latest victim in the string of slayings dating back 20 months.

Also, Atlanta police are looking for a man who kidnapped, robbed, and assaulted a 16-year-old female in north-east Atlanta.

The offenses occurred a month apart, and the man followed the girl several times in between. The most recent offense happened on April 6 at about 5 p.m. as the girl was leaving the Peachtree Mall Shopping Center.

The unidentified man forced his way into her car at a stoplight and made the girl drive to Virginia Place N.E. He then robbed her.

A month earlier, on March 4, the same man assaulted the teenager on Kennesaw Drive N.E.

The man is described as a white male, 25 to 30 years old, with brown hair and mustache and curly blood hair on his arms. On all occasions he has been driving a light blue two-door Ford Mustang, possibly 1967 model, with possible first two tag numbers "911." The car has a "Hebel" tag on the front, and body damage on the front left fender near the radiator.

Anyone with knowledge about the man or his car is asked to call Detective R.T. Ford with the Sex Crimes Unit at 658-8726.

Also Tuesday, the federal government said it will give Atlanta \$304,586 in new federal funds to provide counseling for children and parents to help them cope with the wave of child murders there.

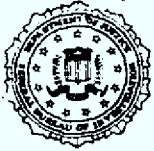

[Redacted] Medical Records Department, Searcy Hospital, Citronelle Highway, Mount Vernon, Alabama, advised that Searcy Hospital discharges approximately 1,000 patients each year and that some 1500 patients would have been discharged from the period of 1/1/78 to 7/21/79. She said all inmates arrive from southern counties in Alabama, and persons from northern counties usually go to a mental facility (Brice in North Alabama. Of those discharged, [Redacted] ventured that five persons would be "relocates" or they are discharged to an address different from that given upon entering Searcy. She added that there is no assurance or guarantee that the discharged person actually goes to the given new address. [Redacted] stated it would be a "major undertaking" to review each discharge as the hospital is not operating by computer and each record must be reviewed for daily discharges and the personal file pulled and evaluated. She stated that State law forbids anyone, including FBI Agent or clerical personnel, from conducting such a survey to assist the hospital staff. She advised that Mr. Terry Bartlett, Administrator of Searcy Hospital, would be the person to approve such an operation, and he would be available on Tuesday, April 14, 1981.

PURPOSE: To set forth projected support personnel requirements for the ATKID Investigative Support Information System (ISIS) application in the Atlanta Field Office.

DETAILS: The ATKID ISIS data base was brought on-line in Atlanta on 2/26/81. The Atlanta Field Office has been conducting investigation in this matter since November, 1980, and as of 3/18/81 had approximately 2,200 serials and 800 1A's in file. Six hundred two serials had been encoded and entered into ISIS by the 10 support personnel, in Atlanta, assigned to this task as of 3/18/81.

Special Agent [redacted] reviewed the Atlanta ATKID ISIS operation on 3/18/81. He held discussion with Atlanta Special Agents [redacted] and [redacted] who advised that there were 30 agents assigned full-time to this investigation that are producing an average of 250 serials a week. *b7c*

From an analysis of the data and the progress to date; Technical Services Division personnel project that to eliminate the backlog of ATKID serials (to bring the file current) will require 8 additional support personnel for approximately 12 weeks. This requirement is above that of the current staffing of 10 support personnel which must be maintained to keep even with the current amount of material being produced by the 30 agents assigned this investigation.

CID has reviewed this matter and concurs with SAC Philadelphia that two Special Agents (SAs) from the Atlanta Division conduct the interview of [REDACTED] a suspect in this case. It is recommended that the interview be conducted during the week of April 20, 1981, with the exact date to be coordinated with the Atlanta and Philadelphia Division.

CID does not concur with the insistence of SAC Philadelphia that an Agent from the Behavioral Science Unit, Training Division, be present during the interview [REDACTED]

It is the opinion of CID that the presence of three SAs during the interview of this suspect would be counterproductive. It is noted that the Behavioral Science Unit has instructional and educational interest and should not be utilized to direct this investigative interview. SA [REDACTED] Behavioral Science Unit, is presently in the Atlanta Division and will assist in the preparation for the interview. This aspect has been coordinated with the Philadelphia and Atlanta Divisions and the Behavioral Science Unit, Training Division. *ERIC*

Since it is anticipated [REDACTED] will furnish a consent to search [REDACTED] it is recommended that appropriate personnel from the Laboratory and Identification Divisions be present to process the search areas.

This matter has been discussed with SA [REDACTED] Atlanta Division, on 4/14-15/81. [REDACTED] to coordinate the date of the interview with the Philadelphia Division.

It was explained that this material was inadvertently sent to the FBI Laboratory and that it would be returned promptly to the Atlanta Office and resubmitted to the Georgia Laboratory for examination. This is pursuant to an existing agreement between the FBI and the Georgia Bureau of Investigation (GBI) regarding the handling of physical evidence in these cases.

After these preliminary remarks, [REDACTED] was asked if he had been able to reach a decision concerning additional assistance which the FBI desires to give him with respect to furnishing personnel and equipment to his laboratory. It was pointed out to [REDACTED] that the Bureau makes this offer virtually without conditions and in this regard, he was assured that such additional personnel would be willing to work off-hours or during weekends in order to alleviate any space problem created by their presence. It was also stated that any additional equipment required by these personnel would be furnished by the FBI Laboratory and that either he or his designee would be coordinating the work of these examiners. Lastly, he was assured that any authorship of academic papers based on this work would be to their credit and that any press releases made as a result of this work would be joint releases subject to approval by both agencies.

[REDACTED] response to this was pleasant and appreciative; however, he stated that he did not perceive his work backlog to be of sufficient size to warrant the acceptance of additional personnel at this time. Upon being asked if there was any other way that the Federal Bureau of Investigation could assist him in this case, he stated that he would be interested in any information that we could furnish regarding the further characterization of the physical surface features of textile fibers currently under study by use of the scanning electron microscope. [REDACTED] was assured that the appropriate inquiries would be made promptly concerning the possibility of this technique being used and that a telephone call would be placed to him at the earliest opportunity regarding this possibility. He also asked if the FBI Laboratory was currently using any optical methods based upon the use of the interference-type microscope in the study of textile fibers. He was advised that the FBI Laboratory routinely employs conventional light microscopy, microspectrophotometry, refractive indices determination and birefringence. It was also stated that upon occasion, a dye examination by use of thin layer chromatography and chemical identification of textile fibers was confirmed by infrared spectrophotometry.

BUT CIVILETTI SAID THE BUREAU ALSO WOULD HAVE TO CHECK INTO THE DISAPPEARANCES OF THE 11 CHILDREN WHOSE BODIES HAVE BEEN DISCOVERED.

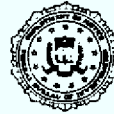

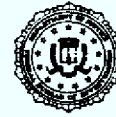

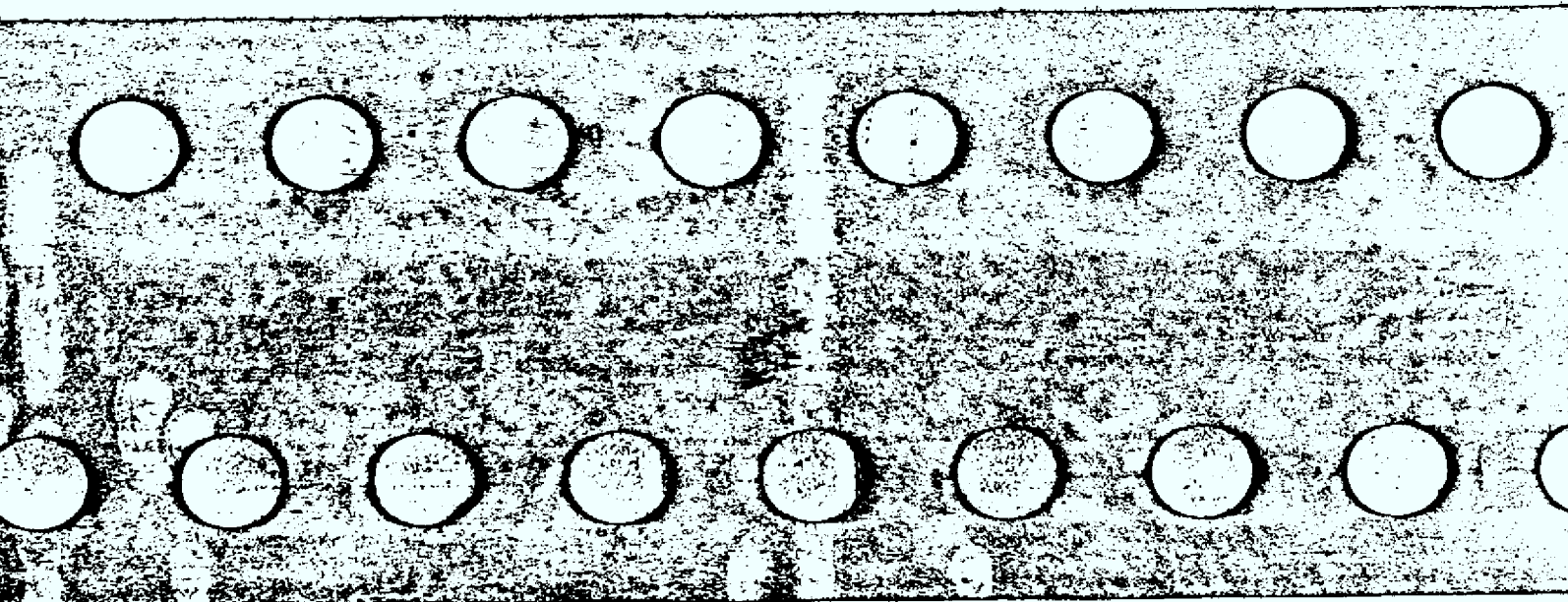
