

Williams was being questioned as to his reasons for being on a bridge above the Chattahoochee River during early morning hours of 5/22/81, after having reportedly dropped an object from the bridge. Two Assistant U. S. Attorneys, Northern District of Georgia, and Fulton County Prosecutor agreed they lack sufficient probable cause to arrest Williams and, therefore, offered him protective custody, which he refused.

A search of Williams's residence, car, and person was conducted on 6/3/81, and the results furnished to the Georgia State Crime Laboratory. The results of the evidence testing is not presently known.

Cater's body was found floating down Chattahoochee River on 5/24/81.

Following a meeting this morning with CID personnel m familiar with ATKID, the following is a status report concerning that investigation:

The room formerly occupied by Nathaniel Cater, the lat ATKID victim, was processed for evidence this past weekend by local ! Public Affs. Off. Telephone Rm. Federal technicians. Permission for the processing was given by Cate Director's Sec'y roommate. Processing was begun and continues on the room formerly occupied by Michael McIntosh, an ATKID victim whose body was found 4/20/81. It is to be noted that the roommates of Cater and McIntosh bd advised FBI Agents that they had seen Wayne Bertram Williams in the company of Cater and McIntosh. Concerning this relationship and its homosexual connotations, Atlanta today is attempting to locate a prominent transvestite in the Atlanta area for interview, noting that Williams is reported to be an associate of this individual.

An examination of a stain in Williams' stationwagon has determined that it is blood and is not older than 90 days. The GBI laboratory states that the stain contains both Type A and Type B blood. It is noted that William Barrett, whose body was found 5/12/81, and who had been stabbed subsequent to strangulation, had Type A blood. At the present time there is no information concerning what type blood Williams has.

Atlanta advises that 64 latent fingerprints were lifted from Williams' vehicle and are being examined in the FBI's Identification Division in an attempt to match them with any of the victims.

The Atlanta Division anticipates that a local search warrant will be issued today for examination of Williams' residence.

Atlanta Police Department and FBI are continuing a tight physical surveillance on Williams to be aware of his whereabouts at all times.

SAC Glover is optimistic that an arrest warrant will be obtained for Williams this week.

DETAILS: Wayne Williams has been a subject in the Atkid investigation since 5/22/81, when agents and police officers on surveillance of the James - Jackson Bridge over the Chattahoochee River in Atlanta observed Williams on the bridge when a large object was thrown into the river. Two days later, on 5/24/81, the body of Nathaniel Cater was found in the Chattahoochee River, about two miles downstream from the bridge. Cater, whose body had been in the water several days, had been asphyxiated, according to the medical examiner.

SA Atlanta's Investigative Coordinator for Atkid, requested additional VIA assistance in a 6/15/81 phone call to VIA Group.

Atlanta feels that enough information has been developed on Williams to warrant VIA networking of facts about Williams, such as his wherabouts, his employment, his residences, his vehicle, his associates, etc., in relation to various factors regarding the victims.

A VIA network on Williams would clarify and organize the information Atlanta presently has and could possibly made the evidence implicating Williams more coherent.

SA Personal Crimes Unit, concurs in the feasability of this VIA application.

At approximately 9 a.m., 6/10/81, SAC John Lanta Division, and I discussed the status of potential local prosecution of Wayne Bertram Williams. The following points of interest were brought up by SAC Glover:

There was to be convened during the late afternoon of Tuesday, 6/9/81, a meeting at the State of Georgia Attorney General's Office with policy level representatives involved in the Williams aspect of the investigation being present. This meeting was not held because earlier in the day Phillip Peters, head of the Georgia Bureau of Investigation, had reviewed the evidence and information gathered concerning Williams and had concluded that an arrest of Williams has to occur based on the known information.

Another meeting was held Tuesday, 6/9/81, between Morris Redding, Deputy Director, Bureau of Police Services, Atlanta, and two assistant district attorneys to determine what additional documentation or evidence was needed before arrest warrants would be forthcoming concerning Williams. It was determined as a result of this meeting that a laboratory report documenting the findings concerning hairs and fibers is needed prior to arrest warrants being prepared for Williams. The definite impression is that once the laboratory reports are forthcoming, prosecutive action will immediately follow by the district attorney's office.

SAC Glover opined there appeared to be a change in attitude on the part of District Attorney Slayton and that two assistant district attorneys had now been assigned to the Williams aspect of the investigation and spent all day Tuesday, 6/9/81, both reviewing information and evidence obtained and discussing aspects of this phase of the investigation with representatives of the Bureau of Police Services.




A fixed surveillance has been instituted at the residence of Wayne Bertram Williams. Intense media coverage is also present at Williams' residence.

The latent fingerprints are not fingerprints of Wayne Bertram Williams, FBI #847900P9. Eleven of these latent fingerprints are not fingerprints of victim Michael Cameron McIntosh, FBI #843967P10. The six remaining latent fingerprints, which are from the extreme side, tip and lower joint areas of fingers, were compared, insofar as possible, with the available fingerprints of McIntosh, but no identification was effected.

These latent fingerprints were compared with the unidentified latent fingerprints, which were obtained from the residence and car of Wayne Bertram Williams, but no identification was effected.

The disposition of the photographs will be furnished in a separate Laboratory report. The copies of finger and palm prints are being retained. The remaining specimens are enclosed.

The latent prints obtained from the residence are presently being compared with the available finger and palm prints of victims in this case and the result will be furnished separately.

This report supplements our LFPS report dated 6/9/81.

By attached teletype, the Atlanta Division advises that on 5/22/81 a bridge surveillance team, including one SA, was in place at the James-Jackson Parkway and Chattahoochee River. At approximately 2:52 am, a loud splash was heard in the river under the bridge, and thereafter an automobile was observed on the bridge apparently immediately above where the sound of the splash originated.

A vehicle was thereafter observed slowly accelerating across the bridge, and after turning around in a parking lot, it was observed proceeding back across the bridge. A moving surveillance instituted by a police officer and the SA culminated when the vehicle was stopped after entering a major thoroughfare.

The driver of the vehicle, a 1970 white Chevrolet stationwagon, was identified as Wayne Bertram Williams. Williams advised that he was a talent scout and had a 6 am appointment in the area of the James-Jackson Parkway. He denied stopping on the bridge or discarding debris into the river. Williams consented to a search of his vehicle and was thereafter allowed to proceed for lack of probable cause to detain him any further.

On 5/22/81 and 5/23/81, the Chattahoochee River in the vicinity of the James-Jackson Bridge was dragged and the roadway thoroughly



Additionally, on 5/22/81, Williams searched. was interviewed at his residence where he resides with his parents. On 5/24/81, the body of victim Nathaniel Cater was found approximately one-half mile downstream from the James-Jackson Bridge. 5/26/81, Fulton County Medical Examiner advised that Cater died from asphyxiation.

Atlanta has determined that the reason provided by Williams for being at the James-Jackson Bridge on 5/22/81 is not credible. Williams is described as a Black male, DOB in Atlanta for impersonating a police officer




