

THE FOLLOWING IS A BREAKDOWN OF THE EVALUATION CONDUCTED BY COMMERCIAL TESTING ON THE WILLIAMS' SAMPLE, JULY 10, 1981:

TEST METHOD: ASIM D 416 "WOVEN AND TUFTED PILE FLOOR COVERING"

MATERIAL IDENTIFICATION: CONSTRUCTION - TUFTED CUT PILE;
COLOR - GREEN; PRIMARY BACKING NON-WOVEN SYNTHETIC; SECONDARY
BACKING - JUTE.

TEST RESULTS: PILE YARN WEIGHT 18.05 OUNCES/SQUARE YARD;
PILE THICKNESS - .502 INCH; STITCHES - 10.7 PER INCH; GAUGE
(NEEDLES) - 6.5 PER INCH.

ADDITIONALLY, COMMERCIAL TESTING PHOTOGRAPHED CROSSSECTIONAL FIBERS OF BOTH LEXAIRE AND WILLIAMS' SAMPLE AND
PHOTOGRAPHED THOSE FIBERS UNDER 200 POWER MAGNIFICATION.
MELT POINT FOR THE WEST POINT PEPPEREL WAS 258 DEGREES
CENTIGRADE; WHILE MELT POINT WAS 260 DEGREES CENTIGRADE FOR
WILLIAMS' SAMPLE. COMPARISONS OF THE PHOTOGRAPHS CONFIRMED
THAT BOTH PRODUCTS WERE MANUFACTURED FROM WELLMAN FIBER.

COMPANY'S EVALUATION OF THE COMMERCIAL TESTING COMPANY'S RESULTS WITH LUXAIRE REVEALED THE FOLLOWING:

PRIMARY BACKING FOR BOTH CARPET SAMPLES WERE MANUFACTURED OF "TYPAR", A SYNTHETIC MANUFACTURED BY THE DUPONT CORPORATION. SECONDARY BACKING FOR BOTH SAMPLES ARE SEVEN OUNCES JUTE WHICH CONFORMS TO WEST POINT PEPPERELL'S SPECIFICATIONS FOR LUXAIRE. THE PILE HEIGHT OF EACH SAMPLE WAS 11/32 OF AN INCH, WHICH AGAIN MATCHED WEST POINT PEPPERELL'S SPECIFICATION FOR LUXAIRE. THE STITCH COUNT FOR THE WILLIAMS' SAMPLE WAS 31 AND ONE HALF/3; AND FOR THE WEST POINT PEPPERELL PRODUCT WAS 32/3. THIS IS EQUIVALENT TO 10.7 PER INCH TUFTING WHICH FALLS INTO THE WEST POINT PEPPERELL SPECIFICATIONS. THE GAUGE COUNT FOR BOTH SAMPLES ARE IDENTICAL AT 6.5 PER INCH.

THE FINISHED WEIGHT OF THE WILLIAMS' SAMPLE WAS 13.05 OUNCES

PER SQUARE YARD, WHILE THE WEST POINT PEPPERELL SAMPLE HAD A

TUFTED SPECIFICATION WEIGHT MINUS FINISHING OF 18.6 OUNCES PER

SQUARE YARD. ACCORDING TO THE WEIGHT DIFFERENCES IN

THE TWO SAMPLES CAN BE ATTRIBUTED TO NORMAL SHEDDING AND SHEARING

PROCESS AT THE TIME OF MANUFACTURE. STATED THAT THE

TYPAR' BACKING FOUND IN BOTH PROJUCTS WAS UNIQUE TO THE INDUSTRY

Thirty-six latent fingerprints, two latent impressions, which are either finger or palm prints, and twenty-seven latent palm prints of value are present on forty-eight of the lifts. No latent prints of value are present in the film or on the remaining lifts.

Eighteen of the latent prints have been identified as finger and palm prints of Wayne Bertram Williams, FBI \$54790079. The remaining latent prints are not finger or palm prints of Williams, These latent prints were compared with the available finger and palm prints of the victims in this case, but no identification was effected.

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Mohasco Corporation, 57 Lyon Street, Amsterdam, New York, along with Product Development Supervisor, and Product Development, were contacted on 7/17/81 and provided with the sample of green carpet from subject's residence which was previously sent to Albany in re airtel. And were re-contacted on 7/20/81 and advised that after extensive tests based on a digestive analysis of the sample carpet, they could state beyond a reasonable doubt that that carpet was not manufactured by the Mohasco Corporation. Basically, outlined the following reasons why the tests conducted on 7/17/81 at their plant in Amsterdam, New York revealed that the sample could not be identifiable with any carpet ever made at Mohasco:

The specs of the carpet manufactured by Mohasco that used the Wellman 181B fiber were obtained at Mohasco on 7/20/81 and are being forwarded to Atlanta for future reference. stated that a true digestive analysis on a sample of carpet should be conducted using a 12 by 18 inch sample. The sample provided to Albany was approximately 7 x 3 inches and from that, Mohasco was able to conduct tests on two 2 x 2 inch portions of the sample. Even so, the digestive analysis revealed the following:

- (1) The sample from the subject's bedroom revealed a gauge of 5/32. Mohasco used the Wellman 181B only in a 3/16 gauge.
- (2) The sample provided revealed 10.5 rows per inch whereas Mohasco used 7 rows per inch in their carpets.
- (3) The pile height of the sample was .300 inches compared to Mohasco's carpet which had a pile height of .400 inches.
- (4) The primary back of the sample compared to Mohasco's was very different. The sample was a non-woven, polypropylene compared to Mohasco's woven polypropylene.
- (5) The face weight of the sample showed the weight per square yard to be 20.5 or 20.6 ounces compared to Mohasco's 22 ounces. Stated that with the error factor thrown in, the face weights could be identical.)
- (6) The total weight per square yard of the sample would be approximately 51.4 ounces compared to Mohasco's 56 ounces.

(7) Most importantly, and so both stated that Mohasco never used any dye in its Wellman fiber carpets which was in any way similar to the green sample provided in referenced airtel.

The representatives at Mohasco stated that even with the error factor, they could state beyond a reasonable doubt that the subject's carpet was never manufactured by their corporation. Stated that his corporation was willing to assist in any future tests and should a request be made of them to conduct an analysis on any other sample regarding this matter, they would be happy to conduct that test at their plant in Amsterdam, New York.



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



DETAILS: During the early part of May, 1981, the Atlanta Office decided to pursue the investigative technique of surveilling selected bridges along the Chattahoochee River since six of the eight last victims had been discovered in the river. The Atlanta Police Department (APD) was approached regarding this investigative technique, and Morris Redding, Deputy Chief in charge of the Atlanta Task Force, was asked to provide manpower to implement this bridge surveillance.

Redding indicated that the only manpower available was to be obtained from the training class of police recruits, and, ultimately, the bridge surveillance was implemented using two police recruits, one FBI Agent, and one APD officer for each bridge.


The events surrounding the incident during the early morning hours of 5/22/81 were ascertained from interviews of the SAC, Atlanta, Agents involved in the ATKID special, and a complete review of the prosecutive report by Atlanta dated 6/17/81.

Representatives from the Personal & Property Crimes Section, which

included the Section Chief and Unit Chief of the Personal Crimes Unit, traveled to Atlanta on 6/16/81 and returned the morning of 6/18/81 with SAC, Atlanta, the acting U. S. Attorney (USA), and Assistant USA to consult with the Department of Justice concerning the prosecution of this matter.

During the weekend of 6/12-14/81 Lee Brown, Public Safety Commissioner in Atlanta, criticized the FBI for the handling of the bridge incident, with Brown specifically stating that the FBI had mishandled the bridge incident. SAC Glover indicated that as the public safety commissioner has responsibility for fire, police, and general safety, Lee Brown is not the most knowledgeable individual concerning captioned investigation. The only specific knowledge he has of the investigation has been obtained through Deputy Chief Redding or SAC Glover. Therefore, the statements made by Lee Brown were based not necessarily on full knowledge of all the circumstances surrounding the bridge incident.

Before the bridge surveillance was instituted, an operational memo was provided by the Atlanta Division FBI to the APD outlining the general framework for each surveillance team and listing an APD officer as the team leader with the FBI Special Agent as the surveillance coordinator. This investigative technique was under the direct control of Major Holley, APD.

Police recruit first became aware of a splash in the water at 2:53 a.m. and instituted a radio call to who was on the opposide side of the police recruit river concealed along the bridge railing at eye level of the bridge transmission saw the who subsequently followed Immediately after the radio transmission saw the car and alerted patrolman Williams' car after it turned around in the liquor store parking lot and proceeded to recross the bridge. Shortly after recrossing followed patrolman , and both the bridge SA shortly thereafter stopped suspect Williams. It had been determined saw Williams' car to the time it was from the time recruit it was the only car on the James-Jackson Bridge. seen by SA

At the time of the stop suspect Williams asked, "What's this all about? I know this must be about those boys." Williams indicated he was in the area trying to contact a Cheryl Johnson concerning an entertainment job with the company he was associated

with, Nova Entertainment Corporation. Williams denied stopping on the bridge, denied driving slowly on the bridge, denied throwing anything off the bridge, and advised there were two other vehicles on the bridge at the same time his vehicle was.

During this questioning Williams was asked if he would allow his car to be searched, and Williams gave his permission for the search. At that time SA using a flashlight, saw two cardboard boxes and a bedspread (white with black and green design), and two brown grocery bags. Williams claimed the bags contained clothes that were both his and his mother's.

Shortly after Williams' vehicle was stopped, SA arrived at the scene and began to interview Williams.

Additionally, Captain who is the SWAT Coordinator for the APD, and another APD officer arrived at the scene. After the arrival of additional people SA returned to the bridge, picked up APD recruit and returned him to the scene to identify the car. and advised, "That's the car." Subsequent to SA returning to the scene he and an APD officer searched the vehicle, with each taking one side of the vehicle to conduct the search. Items found during the search included men's clothing, as previously reported, and ladies' clothing, appearing to be that of a woman whose build was heavy and short.

While the search was occurring, SA left the area to telephonically contact SA to determine what course of action should be taken regarding Williams. SA has the specific recollection of that conversation with SA and he based his decision to release Williams on the following facts: No one had seen Williams' vehicle stop on the bridge; no one had seen the suspect get out of the vehicle; suspect Williams was completely cooperative; nobody was seen; there was no indication that the suspect was other than that of a passerby; and an element of uncertainty existed as to the keenness of the observation of APD recruits since some had only been recruits for several days. Also, Captain APD SWAT Coordinator, was on the scene and saw no reason or indication to further hold Williams for questioning.

It is the opinion of the Criminal Investigative Division and SAC, Atlanta, that the incident which occurred during the early morning hours of 5/22/81 concerning the stopping of then suspect Williams was handled in an appropriate and correct manner. The events leading to the stopping of the suspect's vehicle and the decision made that no further action regarding then suspect

Williams were based on the valid set of facts, and neither the FBI nor APD representatives on the scene at that time had justifiable reason to take further action regarding Williams. It is noted that subsequent to the incident, Deputy Chief Redding had indicated to SAC, Atlanta, that the reason for Captain being on the scene was that he was the most experienced officer, as SWAT Coordinator, to evaluate circumstances which might occur pursuant to the bridge surveillance. The experience level of both the FBI and APD personnel on the scene and in the Atlanta FBI Office was more than adequate to evaluate the situation, and an appropriate decision was made at that time.

DETAILS: Following the arrest of Wayne Bertram Williams on 6/21/81, Judge Webster requested a determination be made concerning the cost of this investigation, as well as to determine the number of field offices that furnished investigative/personnel to the Atlanta Division for this major investigation!

The following are estimated cost figures through indicated dates:

- \$865,779 through 5/31/81, for SA manpower (Turk), per diem, GTRs, supplies, confidential expenditures, and overtime for support employees.
- \$54,300 through 6/22/81, for rental cost of seven surveillance vehicles (\$1,500), field support account (\$8,000), and use of an average of 14 Bureau cars for 160 days at \$20 per day (\$44,800).
- \$119,598 through 6/19/81, for support salariesobserd1 /1981 on an average of GS-5 - Step 5, for 2,238 work days at \$53.44 per day.



I am enclosing the information furnished to the FBI Laboratory by Wellman Corporation Concerning the purchases of Wellman nylon staple fiber Type 181B. One listing includes the Wellman customers from 1967 to 1974, the years when Type 181B was being manufactured, and the amount in pounds sold during each year. The second list gives addresses and contact people for each customer. These customers are all spinners of yarn. A few of the companies also produce carpet but most sell their yarn to a separate carpet manufacturer. These companies have been contacted and information about the purchasers of yarn is presently being obtained.

These customers produce single-ply yarn similar to that in Williams' carpet. As discussed previously we will have to go back to Wellman later to identify other 71862 purchasers of Wellman nylon from 1967 to 1974.

The Wellman people have not been able to locate their 1969 sales records but will furnish this information to us as soon as it is obtained.

I have also enclosed xerox copies of seven polaroid photographs of the Wellman "short leg" fiber like that used in Williams' carpet and a xerox of a regular trilobal which Wellman now manufactures. These photographs were from the Wellman files.

By the time you get this letter you will have probably received a sample of carpet from the West Point Pepperell Company in Dalton. I have not seen the sample yet but it supposedly looks like a match with Williams' carpet. Pepperell manufactured the Luxaire line, of which the sample is a member, from 1970 through 1975. We are only concerned with 1970 and 1971 as Pepperell switched to a DuPont fiber in 1972. We are also getting all available records concerning the customers and amount of this type of carpet sold in the Atlanta area.

I also want to mention several other areas where the FBI may be of some assistance in your present effort. The Laboratory has a Special Projects Section, whose major function is the preparation of exhibits, charts and other types of visual aids that can be extremely useful in courtroom presentations. Let me know if you plan to use any visual aids and if you want our assistance.

If you have had no success in determining the source of the bedspread from Williams' room, our Special Photography Unit may be able through some photographic techniques to obtain some information from the illegible label on the bedspread.


Also, if you decide to pursue the determination of the amount of carpet like that in Williams' automobile, the FBI has contacts at the General Motors Corporation that we can furnish to you or that we can contact ourselves. If there is any chance that the rug fiber from Barrett's shoe which matches fibers from Williams' automobile will be used at the upcoming trial, the contacts with General Motors may result in valuable information.

We are also presently beginning to classify and characterize numerous dog hair samples obtained in the Washington area from Huskies, Malamutes, Keeshounds and Elkhounds. We are also starting to receive German Shepherd hairs. We can make these samples available to you if you wish to conduct additional comparisons.

I've enclosed a few applications for our specialized schools for and others who expressed an interest in attending one of the hair and fiber schools at the FBI Academy. Our next school is scheduled for September 21 through October 2, 1981. We will also be teaching four 2-week schools in hairs and fibers next year.



Result of examination:

The Q96 through Q101 photographs were examined in an effort to locate and identify any specific markings or other characteristics on those items which would indicate whether or not they were produced with the same camera and/or enlarging equipment as the previously submitted photographs designated Q102 through Q114.

Q96 through Q101 do exhibit characteristics indicative of less than professional quality or custom printing. They exhibit chemical stains and other traits which indicate that they may have been printed by hand as opposed to professional automated machinery.

Q96 through Q100 do have some minute edge marking imperfections which are not consistent with each other. The Q96 through Q101 photographs were taken against a very light wall or light colored paper background utilizing at least 2 sources of light.

The Q102 through Q114 photographs were also examined individually in an effort to determine a common source. Q102, Q103, Q105, Q106 and Q108 all exhibit an edge mark which is consistent among those specimens.

Q103 through Q108 and Q112 through Q114 all exhibit markings upon their surface which were placed there during the finishing or drying process. These markings do not appear on any of the other photographs examined in this matter.

Q109 was not associated with these other photographs inasmuch it is a very old print. Both Q110 and Q111 are color photographs which were printed by the Eastman Kodak Company.

As a result of the individual examinations and the intercomparisons it cannot be determined whether Q96 through Q101 are or are not from the same source as Q102 through Q114.

Q96 through Q101 will be returned with the results of the latent fingerprint examination. Q102 through Q114 are returned herewith. You have previously been furnished the results of the latent fingerprint examination of those specimens.

The latent fingerprints are not fingerprints of Wayne Bertram Williams, FBI \$847900P9. Eleven of these latent fingerprints are not fingerprints of victim Michael Cameron McIntosh, FBI \$843967P10. The six remaining latent fingerprints, which are from the extreme side, tip and lower joint areas of fingers, were compared, insofar as possible, with the available fingerprints of McIntosh, but no identification was effected.

These latent fingerprints were compared with the unidentified latent fingerprints, which were obtained from the residence and car of Wayne Bertram Williams, but no identification was effected.

The disposition of the photographs will be furnished in a separate Laboratory report. The copies of finger and palm prints are being retained. The remaining specimens are enclosed.

The latent prints obtained from the residence are presently being compared with the available finger and palm prints of victims in this case and the result will be furnished separately.

This report supplements our LFPS report dated 6/9/81.
