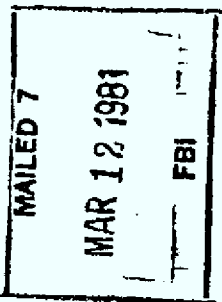

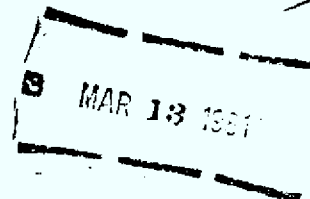

Analysis of Atlanta Killings

Unfortunately, the number of killings of teenagers in Atlanta has surpassed the number that are required to employ advanced statistical techniques as an aid to the investigation. While I assume the Bureau or the Atlanta police have already considered this possibility, I wanted to bring it to your attention. Such techniques, which popular reports suggest were used by Scotland Yard in the Yorkshire Ripper case, involve computer-assisted analysis of case descriptions to identify significant communalities in cases.

The analysis could aid in identifying patterns in the events that are not easily understood through non-computer-assisted processes; provide probability statements concerning questions investigators might ask (e.g., likelihood of one or more perpetrators); and suggest strategies for effective deployment of patrol and investigative resources.

Depending on the status of the records (i.e., if they have already been exhaustively coded and loaded into computers), such an analysis could be done within a 7-14 day period. Any costs could be assumed by the Federal Justice Research Program and the Bureau of Justice Statistics. Please let me know if you think this suggestion is worth pursuing.

It is my understanding that the Atlanta Police Department has automated a considerable amount of data in this investigation. Moreover, the FBI implemented the Investigative Support Information System (ISIS) in the Atlanta Field Office the week of February 15, 1981. For your information, ISIS is a computer-based case management tool designed to provide direct on-line automated data processing support for major case investigations. *Sh*

I have instructed Mr. William A. Bayse, Assistant Director, Technical Services Division, to serve as FBI representative in this matter in order to provide [REDACTED] b7c and his staff with information regarding ISIS and to pursue further the opportunity to apply the suggested analysis.

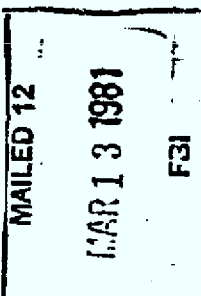

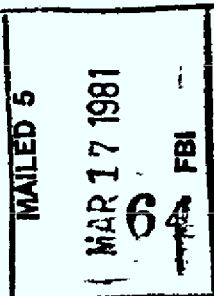

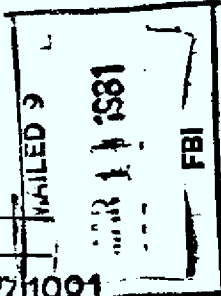

Attached Atlanta (AT) teletype sets forth a request for an extension of 60 days, at the current staffing level of 30 Special Agents, to continue investigative efforts concerning the missing/murdered children in AT, Georgia (GA).

The AT Division is currently reviewing 1,015 files of individuals recently released from GA prisons who were convicted of sex offenses and assaults in an effort to develop a suspect in this case.

As you are aware, on 2/11/81, [REDACTED] age 16, was allegedly grabbed by a black male wearing a security guard uniform and transported around AT, GA, in a car until victim effected his escape. [REDACTED] was afforded two polygraph examinations and no deception was detected. Under hypnosis, victim provided additional facts regarding the incident, including the license plate with the word [REDACTED] appearing thereon. The State of GA Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) revealed one [REDACTED] tag issued, however, the owner, presently residing in Las Vegas (LV), Nevada, advised that tag was thrown away in LV last Fall. All state DMVs have been queried regarding [REDACTED] tags, however, thus far, no suspect tag has been developed.

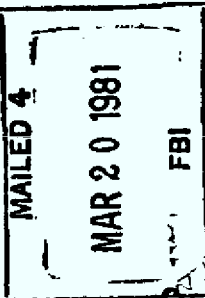

PURPOSE: To request approval for travel of [redacted] to Atlanta to assist with Investigative Support Information System (ISIS) 2/24 - 3/6/81.

DETAILS: The Technical Services Division (TSD) is supporting the ATKID investigation with ISIS. Eight support personnel from the field and Headquarters have been temporarily assigned to Atlanta to support the ISIS application. Six of these individuals have not had ISIS training in the analysis and coding of serials. [redacted] assigned to the Software Operational Support Unit (SOSU), Operations Management Section (OMS), TSD, is fully experienced in the use of ISIS and has a teaching background. Her assistance in the training of personnel and in quality control would speed the entry of data into the system. Therefore, it is recommended that she travel to Atlanta to assist in the ATKID ISIS application from 2/24 - 3/6/81.

Estimated travel costs for the Technical Services Division are \$252 air fare and \$672 per diem.

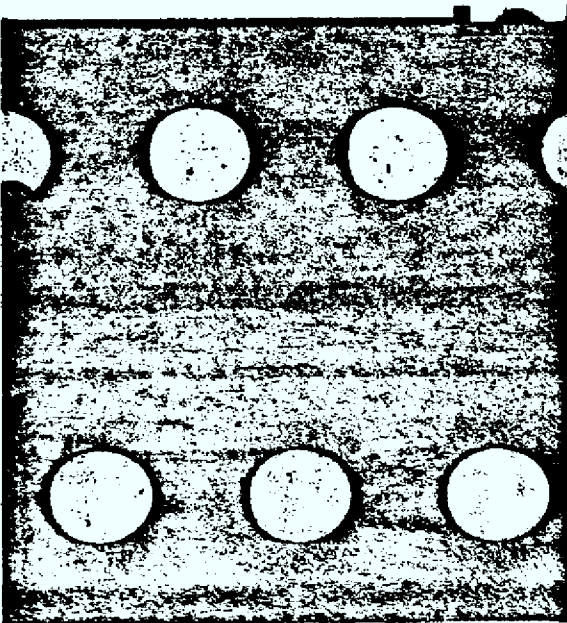

The attached teletype advises that all field offices have checked their respective Department of Motor Vehicle concerning [REDACTED] license plates; however, no lead has been developed that appears to be promising. The Atlanta Division currently checking each county in Georgia to determine if a duplicate [REDACTED] license tag exists. In addition, uniform and police equipment suppliers are being contacted to develop information regarding numbered security badges and security uniforms as described by [REDACTED] during a hypnotic interview.

[REDACTED] a Negro male, aged ten years, on 2/19/81 advised a white male followed him home from school on 2/9/81, opened the front door to his apartment, and ransacked the area while he hid under a bed. No valuables were missing from the apartment after this individual departed. [REDACTED] mother, [REDACTED] stated that on 2/11/81 an attempt was made to gain entry to her apartment. She screamed and according to

her son, [REDACTED] he observed a white male with blue eyes and a scar on his neck looking in the window. Following this incident, [REDACTED] received a telephone call from an unidentified caller who said "I am going to kill the boy within the next 48 hours." On 2/11/81 [REDACTED] observed the suspect in the vicinity of his school. Additionally, while at his grandmother's home on 2/17/81 he was chased by this same person for several blocks.

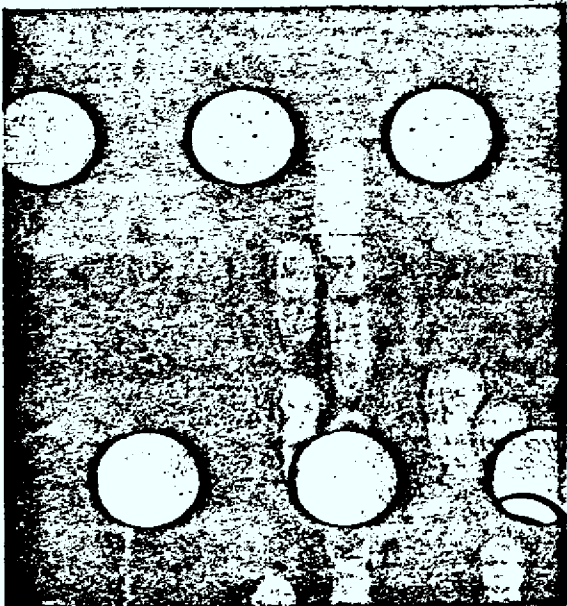
[REDACTED] viewed five photographs and he selected the photograph of [REDACTED] as being the individual he had observed on the above described occasions.

As you will recall, [REDACTED] latent fingerprints have been developed on two magazines found near the site where the remains of two victims were recovered. [REDACTED] stated that on 2/17/81 the suspect had no facial hair. On 3/1/81 [REDACTED] had a full beard.

The Atlanta Division is currently conducting surveillances from 2:00 p.m. until 5:00 p.m. on Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday of each week at selected shopping centers frequented by children.

Presently the files of 1,086 individuals previously arrested for sex offenses are being reviewed for possible suspects in this case.
