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

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JUDGE: (Informal Advice - Not for Retention)

As you know, we have been conducting a Foreign Agents Registration Act (FARA) investigation regarding Billy Carter for over a year. We have worked closely in this regard with Joel Lisker of the DOJ and have interviewed Billy Carter and a number of his associates. To date, Carter has not registered and does not believe that his relationship with the Libyan Government requires him to register since, in his opinion it is covered by the commercial exemption of FARA. HEREIN IS UNCLASSIFIED EXCEPT

On 6/11/80 Carter met with Lisker to discuss registrate. tion. The meeting had been arranged by an attorney who represents Carter, and they met for about an hour. Lisker furnished the following information. Carter received a check for \$20,000 in January or February, 1980, for reimbursement of expenses he incurred when a group of Libyans visited Georgia in January, 1979. In March, 1980, Carter received a \$200,000 check, a renegotiable loan, from the Libyan Government at 10% interest. This loan had been negotiated in December, 1979, by one Randy Coleman, an associate of Carter. Carter also advised Lisker that he was acting as a consultant to Charter Oil, a domestic oil firm located in Jacksonville, Florida, concerning oil purchases from Libya.

Carter further told Lisker that he had an appointment on the afternoon of 6/11/80 with Dr. Brzezinski who, according to Carter, wished to discuss with Carter the possible political implications of Carter's relationship with the Libyan Government. Carter advised that he has also retained an attorney in Washington, D.C., Stephen J. Pollak, who was to meet with DOJ representatives on 6/12/80 to discuss this case. Lisker advised that the Attorney General has decided to wait for approximately 10 days prior to deciding what future action the DOJ should take regarding Carter's registering under the FARA. In the meantime, the FBI will conduct several interviews of representatives of Charter Oil

As you know, we surveilled Carter at the request of Phil Heymann. We did not observe him in contact with any Libyan officials.

This is to bring you up to date as to what happened yesterday and we will formally give you all of the details as soon as Lisker furnishes us with a comprehensive memorandum regarding his contact with Carter as he promised.

OPR-DOJ INQUIRY - BILLY CARTER MATTER

PURPOSE: To provide a summary of attached OPR-DOJ Pinzl Report of Investigation on the Billy Carter Matter dated 4/17/81 and the letter from the Honorable Wade H. HcCree, Jr., Solicitor General, dated 4/21/81.

DETAILS: Mr. Shaheen on 4/22/81 provided a copy of the "Final Report of the Office of Professional Responsibility on the Investigation Conducted Concerning Various Matters Pertaining to Billy Carter," and the Memorandum for the Solicitor General dated 4/17/81 which transmitted the Final Report. In addition, a copy of a letter from the Honorable Wade H. McCree, Jr., Solicitor General, dated 4/21/81, was provided.

The Final Report of GPR-DOJ provided information regarding the additional investigation conducted since the "Status Report" was submitted on 10/29/80.

Former President Jimmy Carter was interviewed and he stated that he had no advance werning, and little direct knowledge, of Billy Carter's dealings with the Libyans. The President at no time discussed the release of aircraft to Libya with his brother and received no pressure from family members for the release of the aircraft. The President indicated he had no knowledge of business negotiations, or loans, from Libya with Billy Carter until they became public in early Summer of 1980. In using Billy Carter to arrange a meeting between Dr. Brzezinski and Libyan Charge to Washington regarding Iranian hostage situations, he did not focus upon likelihood it would increase Billy's status with the Libyans. He responded, in retrospect, it is obvious that it could have had some positive effect.

The Fresident's conversation with them Attorney General Civiletti was related and Mr. Civiletti's recollection was confirmed.

The reinterview of Dr. Braezinski was discussed and he unequivocally stated that meetings between Brzezinski and Admiral Turner on dates other than Earch 31, 1980, did not relate to Billy Carter and that the



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President had no involvement in meeting between Brzezinski and Turner relating to Billy Carter. Brzezinski's use of intelligence information was defended by him as appropriate, justified, and consistent with national interest.

The interview of William Eagleton, American Charge to Libya, was reviewed and the results indicated Billy Carter generally conducted himself with discretion and his visits posed no foreign policy problems.

Mr. Hichele Papa was the last person interviewed. He reputedly has connections with the P.L.O. and European Terrorist groups and initiated the attempt to induce Billy Carter to travel to Libya in 1978. Papa stated the purpose of the trip was to promote the mutual understanding between the Libyan people and the people of the United States, and there was never any intent by Libya to use Billy Carter for Political purposes. He was unaware of monies received by Billy Carter beyond disclosed amounts.

The conclusion was that all relevant and viable investigation has been carried to its logical conclusion, and further investigation is not justified. That no Government officials or employees have been shown to have engaged in illegal conduct, and the conduct of certain officials and departments are reviewed without any actual criticism of any action taken by them.

It was concluded that the DOJ Criminal Division acted appropriately and that all appropriate material relating to this investigation will be forwarded to the Criminal Division which will reassume full jurisdiction under Foreign Agents' Registration Act (FARA).

OPR-BOJ considers its involvement in this matter concluded.

The Solicitor General concurred in the findings and conclusions.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

(1) In accordance with the conclusion of OPR-DOJ, that its involvement is concluded in this matter, it is recommended that the Office of Professional Responsibility - Inspection Division consider this matter closed.

(2) That the Final Report of GPR-DOU be referred to Intelligence Division for any further coordination with DOU - Criminal Division which will reassume full jurisdiction for monitoring Billy Carter's continuing obligations, if any, under the FARA.
