On 4/17/72, Solicitor FRANK J. YEAGER, Winston Salem, N. C., advised that as a result of his appeal the North Carolina Supreme Court reversed Superior Court Judge LONG's ruling and ruled that the North Carolina statutory plan for selection and drawing of jurors is constitutional and provides a jury system free of discrimination. Mr. YEAGER stated barring further appeal, LARRY LITTLE, JULIUS CORNELL, and GRADY FULLER would again be scheduled for trial on the previous charges. Mr. YEAGER pointed out, however, he anticipates defense attorneys for the three BPP members will appeal ruling to the United States Supreme Court. New trial date for the three BPP members has not been fixed as yet. Charlotte will follow with solicitor's office and advise results of further prosecution.

The Free Clothing Program was launched on 3/18/72, at BPP Headquarters. This program, under the direction of BEATRICE FULTON, had solicited new and used clothing which was given away on a first-come first-serve basis on 3/18/72. The supply of clothing was exhausted the first day, however, and FULTON expressed the opinion that it was questionable if the Free Clothing Program would continue.

The George Jackson Liberation School for School Age Children was launched in 3/72, at BPP Headquarters, however, lack of participants and direction by BPP members resulted in the prompt cancellation of this program.

During 3/72, the BPP Chapter was forced to close their location at 400A Loflin St., High Point, N.C. due to lack of funds to pay the back rent. The 2 or 3 members residing in High Point were moved to BPP Headquarters in Winston-Salem. The two apartments rented by the BPP in Winston-Salem, N.C. are located on property that has been purchased by the Urban Renewal Project and are slated to be torn down. The BPP Chapter is undecided about what action to take and continue to utilize these apartments on a temporary basis.

In an effort to boost the sagging moral of the BPP Chapter "Mustang Sally", a well-known local female impersonator, arranged a party at BPP Headquarters on 3/4/72. Prior to the party, "Mustang Sally" made improper advances to a Winston-Salem PD Vice-Squad officer and was arrested. "Sally's" associates carried on in the best tradition and put on an exhibition at BPP Headquarters labeled as a "Belly and Heat Party." Four female impersonators offered a concoction of heroin and spanish fly to those in attendance and to the participants. After consuming this mixture they stripped and did a "belly dance" followed by a homosexual orgy in

Headquarters of the N. C. chapter of the Black Panther Party (RPP) is located at 1333 North Patterson Avenue, Winston-Salem, N.C., and is under the leadership of NELSON LEE MALLOY, JR., Acting Field Lieutenant.

LARRY DONNELL'LITTLE, Head of the N.C. BPP chapter, went to BPF headquarters, Oakland, California, in January, 1972, for an indefinite period of time for training and has not returned to date. Information concerning pads, community activities, public appearances, finances and travel of BPP members set out in this report. Local theft charges against BPP members, LARRY LITTLE, JULIUS WHITESCORNELL, JR., and GRADY FULLER, dismissed in local court. Members of BPP, High Point, N.C., group, LARRY MEDIEY, BRADFORD LILLEY, and RANDOLFH JENNINGS found guilty 2/4/72 in Guilford County Superior Court and sentenced to 7 to 10 years imprisonment on the charge of assault with deadly weapon with intent to kill.

DETAILS:

1. ORGANIZATIONAL AND OPERATIONAL DATA

The Black Panther Party (BPP) is a black extremist organization started in Oakland, California, in December, 1966. It advocates the use of guns and guarrilla tactics to bring about the overthrow of the United States Government.

A. LOCATION OF NORTH CAROLINA HEADQUARTERS

North Carolina chapter of Black Panther facty (BPP), 1333 North Fatterson Avenue, Winston-Salem, North Carolina.

The above headquarters is located in a two story frame house situated in a predominantly black residential neighborhood. The house was purchased under a lease-purchase agreement in the name of HAZEL LEE MACK and LEE FAYE MACK with an initial downpayment of \$500 and menthly rent of \$100 per month to be applied to the purchase price of the house at the end of 5 years. The total purchase price for the house was \$8,500.

On March 8, 1972, HAZEL MACK contacted the United States Post Office, Winston-Salem, North Carolina, and requested Post Office Box 2019, be charged from the name of DAVID CATO to her name. HAZEL MACK changed the name of the firm under which the Post Office box is rented from the National Committee to Combat Fascism to the BPP. Mack advised the Post Office that the office address for the BPP was 1333 North Patterson Avenue, Winston-Salem, North Carolina, Telephone Number 724-6249.

D. COMMUNITY ACTIVITY

1. Free Programs

a. Free breakfast for children program

This program has been operated sporadically since September, 1971, at BPP Headquarters, 1333 North Patterson Street, Winston-Salem, North Carolina. The program is operated under the direction of MARY MC DONALD and feeds an average of 8 to 10 children each day when operating. This program is used as a basis for soliciting donations from local merchants and achieving local support from the community.

b. Free pest control program

Ducing January, 1972, the BPP chapter acquired a hand spray gun which is utilized for spraying houses in the neighborhood. Persons desiring their house to be sprayed for jests must sign up at BPP Headquarters. This program has been administered by GRADY FULLUR who has conducted a door-to-door campaign soliciting business.

c. Free clothing program

This program was launched under the direction of BPP member BEATRICE FULTON and was scheduled for its first distribution of free clothing on March 18, 1972. FULTON and GRADY FULLER have been contacting residents and merchants soliciting donations of new and used clothes.

2. Training Programs

Periodic training sessions and educational classes are held at BPP Headquarters on Wednesday evenings.

These classes are open to prospective members as well as regular members and class discussions are usually directed by one of the officers of the chapter.

A liberation school for school-age children was undertaken on Saturday, March 4, 1972, in which free food was offered to enhance attendance. Lack of food and poor attendance resulted in cancellation of this program.

E. PUBLIC APPEARANCES

1. Solidarity Rally For High Point Four, High Foint, North Carolina, July 25, 1971

On July 24, 1971, an article appeared in the "High Point Following Plans for a solidarity rally for the High Point Four to be held at 2 P.M., July 25, 1971, at Washington Terrace Park, High Point, North Carclina. LARRY LITTLE is quoted as predicting 2,000 persons would attend the High Point rally. Its purpose was to gain moral and financial support for the High Point Four identified as LARRY MEDILLY, GEORGE DE WITT, RANDOLPH JENNINGS and BRADFORD LILLY, who were arrested February 10, 1971, at BPF Headquarters, 51? Holds Street, High Point, North Carolina. All four were accessed following a shoot out with police in which one officer was seriously wounded.

The rally was held on July 25, 1971, with approximately 200 people in attendance. LARRY LITTLE gave the welcoming address and JULIUS CORNELL acted as master of ceremonies and introduced COLDEN FRINKS of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC), the principal speaker for the occasion.

2. Haymarket Square Rally

On August 11, 1971, a rally was held at the Haymarket Square Coffeehouse, 545 Hay Street, Fayetteville, North Carolina. This deffections is a gathering place for anti-war protestors. LITTLE spoke regarding the history and the art of the BPP and requested support of these in attradance for the BPP.

F. ARREST AND TRIALS OF BPP MEMBERS

On September 20, 1971, Superior Court Solicitor, Winston-Salem, North Carolina, advised that the trial of LARRY LITTLE, JULIUS CORNELL and GRADY FULLER commenced that date in Forsyth County Superior Court. LITTLE, CORNELL, and FULLER were indicted by the Forsyth County Grand Jury on various that charges stemming from the theft of a meat track which was located at RPP Headquarters in Winston-Salem, North Carolina. A shoot out with police ensued leading to the arrest of the above three BPP members.

Trial in this matter started May, 1971, however, was continued due to numerous defense motions.

On September 27, 1971, advised that Superior Court Judge JAMES M. LONG quashed the indictments against LITTLE, CORNELL, and FULLER following a defense motion that the Forsyth County Jury Lists was improperly drawn. Stated it was improbable that LITTLE, CORNELL and FULLER would be re-indicted on this charge.

On February 10, 1971, GEORGE DE WITT, RANDOLPH JENNINGS, BRADFORD LILLEY, and LARRY MEDLEY were arrested that date at 612 Holda Street, High Point, North Carolina, following a shoot out with High Point Police. Police Officers were attempting to serve an exaction notice on the occupants of 612 Hulda Street, High Point, Horth Carolina, when the shooting occurred. Police Lieutenant Shak COOKE of the High Point, North Carolina, Police Department, was critically wounded by a bullet fired from a high-powered rifle during the shoot out. Two other police officers were also struck by bullets during the shooting, however, they were uninjured as both were wearing bullet proof vests. As a result of the shoot out, DE WITT, JENNINGS, LILLEY, and MEDLEY were charged with assault with a deadly weapon with intent to kill and assault on a police officer with firearm.

County Solicitor, 1972, that the trial of the four men was scheduled to commence in Guilford County Superior Court, High Point, North Carolina, on January 24, 1972. He pointed out that trial of the four was initially scheduled for the September, 1971, term of Superior Court, however, pre-trial motions by the defense delayed the trial until January 24, 1972. Solicitor advised that the Grand Jury had returned a true bill of the Labout charging each of the four with one count of assault with a deadly weapon with intent to kill and two counts of assault with a firearm on a police officer.

Sources report that during February, 1972, the BPP Chapter at Winston-Salem made a concerted effort to solicit donations under the quise of raising an appeal bond for the three members of the High Point Four" who were convicted and being held in lieu of bond. Sources report that only approximately \$300 was raised for this purpose during February, 1972. Chapter continues to solicit food for their Free Breakfast for Children Program and used clothing for their Free Clothing Program which they are trying to inaugurate. Sources report that the North Carolina BPP Chapter is in arrears in payment for newspaper money owed to the California Headquarters and has made several requests to California Headquarters for financial assistance with negative results.

EXPENSES

Half the price of the newspapers or \$875 would be owed to the California Headquarters of the BPP in addition to an estimated \$20 per week air freight charge. The BPP Headquarters at 1333 North Patterson Ave. is being purchased under a leasepurchase agreement with a mortgage rental of \$100 per month to be applied toward the purchase price of the house. The chapter has also rented an apartment at 210 East 14th St. under the name of RICKIE HOOPER. This apartment is being rented for \$40 per month and telephone service has been obtained for \$9 per month.

The BPP group at High Point, N. C., rents an apartment at 400-A Loflin St., High Point, N. C., at a monthly rental of \$40.

verdict of not guilty on all charges against GEORGE DeWITT. These four, frequently referred to as "The High Point 4", were members of the High Point group of the BPP, and were arrested on 2/10/71, at BPP headquarters following a shoot-out with police when High Point police officers attempted to serve an eviction notice. MEDLEY, LILLEY and JENNINGS have filed notice of appeal and are currently being held in lieu of an appeal bond of \$7,000 each.

FACTIONALISM

During February, 1972, no information was received other than that the Winston-Salem, N. C., group continues to follow HUEY P. NEWTON.

PART II

The following is a summary of BPP activities in the Charlotte Division:

The Free Breakfast for Children Program was operated sporatically during February, 1971, due to lack of funds. Most of the food designated for the program was consumed by BPP members themselves; however, MARY McDONALD, assisted by neighborhood women volunteers, was able to feed approximately eight (8) children approximately two or three times a week with the meager food available.

The BPP Chapter expressed mixed emotions of jubilation over the acquittal of GEORGE DeWITT in Guilford County Superior Court and disappointment over the conviction of the other three High Point members, LARRY MEDLEY, BRADFORD LILLEY and RANDOLPH JENNINGS. Efforts have been increased to raise bail bond money in order that these three BPP members may be released on appeal bond; however, sources report very little money has been collected to date. Several of the BPP members have expressed dissatisfaction with the leadership of NELSON MALLOY and have suggested an appeal be sent to BPP Headquarters for the immediate return of LARRY LITTLE. No action has been taken in this regard to date.

The BPP chapter has also been attempting to set up a Free Health Clinic in Winston-Salem, N. C., and the members have talked to several property owners in the black neighborhood in the vicinity of the BPP Headquarters. No apparent progress has been made regarding opening a Health Center since the chapter has been unable to raise sufficient funds.



The following is a summary of BPP activities in the Charlotte Division:

The Free Breakfast for Children Program which began on 9/6/71, at BPP Headquarters, 1333 North Patterson Avenue, continues to feed approximately eight to ten children each day. This program is headed by MARY McDONALD, wife of RUSSELL McDONALD. Mrs. McDONALD is assisted by several neighborhood women volunteers. The Program is in continuous difficulty, however, as the BPP members have been eating most of the food donated for the program, leaving very little for the children.

The Breakfast Program was discontinued during the Christmas holidays and although MARY McDONALD was very pessimistic about its future, the program was reinstituted on 1/3/72 with eight children in attendance.

Sources report the morale of the Winston-Salem Chapter is very low and there is much discontent regarding the lack of any positive action being taken by the chapter. Members have expressed continuing dissatisfaction with their lack of finances and the continuous day-to-day struggle for existence of the group.

The local trial of the four BPP members called the "High Point Four" has not been placed on the court calendar to

BPP members expressed disappointment in the small donations collected following the speeches by BOBBY SEALE at Winston-Salem and Raleigh, N. C. A total of \$173.20 in donations was collected at Winston-Salem and approximately \$190 at Raleigh, N. C., in contrast to the \$900 to \$1000 anticipated by the BPP Chapter at Winston-Salem, N. C.

Sources report there is much discontent at the Winston-Salem Chapter regarding the leadership of LARRY LITTLE. RUSSELL McDONALD and his wife, MARY McDONALD, appear to be the principal workers among the group and are reportedly upset over the lack of leadership qualities displayed by LITTLE.

LITTLE has berated BPP members for not selling enough BPP newspapers and has voiced his irritation about the failure of the group to raise sufficient money to start additional programs. LITTLE has been very outspoken about the failure to raise sufficient money to have the telephone connected at EPP Headquarters.

The local trial of four BPP members called the "High Point Four" has been postponed until after the first of the year. Two members of the "High Point Four" are still in jail and BPP members have been unsuccessful to date in raising sufficient money to bond them out.

There has been no confrontations by the BPP and police during the past month.

LITTLE have not been getting along; accordingly, McDONALD has not been handling distribution of the BPP Newspaper on a regular DARRELL HOPKINS, a 19-year old high school student and member of the BPP Chapter has been handling BPP Newspaper sales, which has resulted in a backlog of unsold BPP newspapers. BPP Chapter continues to solicit food from local merchants to support the Free Breakfast for Children Program. The Pet Milk Dairy has been donating milk on a regular basis, and the Merita Bakery, which is located in a black neighborhood, has continued to donate food for this program. Sources report that the BPP members themselves have been eating most of the food that is donated leaving very little for the children. MARY McDONALD handles the Free Breakfast for Children Program, which is operated out of BPP Headquarters, 1333 North Patterson Avenue. She has continually complained to LARRY LITTLE about having insufficient food to feed the children and that the program will have to be discontinued unless additional donations can be obtained. RUSSELL McDONALD has suggested the BPP move its headquarters to Greenville, N. C., where he feels that they would have more community support; however, LARRY LITTLE, head of the BPP Chapter, has strongly opposed this idea and insists the chapter will remain in Winston-Salem. LITTLE has instructed BPP members to increase their efforts to sell BPP newspapers in cities outside Winston-Salem, N. C.

"The Black Panther Party (BPP) is a black extremist organization started in Oakland, California, in December, 1966. It advocates the use of guns and guerrilla tactics to bring about the overthrow of the United States Government."

On CE T-1 advised that the North Carolina Chapter of the BPP located at Winston Salem, North Carolina, had made arrangements for BOBBY GEORGE SEALE, Chairman of the BPP, to speak at Winston Salem State University, Winston Salem, North Carolina, on November 14, 1971. CE T-1 stated this speaking engagement was being arranged to raise money for the local BPP chapter as well as the national BPP organization.

On Carolina, CE T-l advised that the North Carolina Chapter of the BPP had obtained a definite commitment for SEALE to speak at Winston Salem State University, and the North Carolina chapter expected to receive nine hundred dollars from the money being paid SEALE for his appearance.

Arts in Winston Salem, North Carolina, was paying transportation expenses for BOBBY SEALE to appear at Winston Salem State University, a predominantly black college located in Winston Salem, North Carolina.

Salem State University had signed a contract for SEALE to speak at the school on November 14, 1971.

further advised he had no information regarding the fee being paid SEALE for his speech and no information regarding the amount of money SEALE was being allowed for transporation expenses.

On November 5, 1971, CE T-2 advised that officials at Winston Salem State University, Winston Salem, North Carolina, had signed a contract with the BPP for SEALE to make a speech at that university on November 14, 1971. Under terms of the agreement, SEALE was to receive one thousand five hundred dollars following the speech, which will be paid by check made payable to Consolidated Productions, Incorporated. CE T-2 stated payment for SEALE is being made from student activity funds at the university and no admission will be charged for students attending the speech. CE T-2 stated that the contract stipulated that there were to be no bodyguards on the stage with SEALE during the speech and there was to be no display of weapons of any sort.

On November 5, 1971, CE T-3 advised that the BPP had approached A&T University, a predominantly black college in Greensboro, North Carolina, for BOBBY SEALE to make a speech at the university. CE T-3 advised SEALE was asking one thousand eight hundred dollars for his appearance, which officials at A&T State University felt was excessive; accordingly, they declined to have SEALE appear at this university.

On November 9, 1971, CE T-4 advised that the Student Government Association of St. Augustine's College, a predominantly black college in Raleigh, North Carolina, had signed a contract for BOBBY GEORGE SEALE to speak at the college on November 15, 1971. CE T-4 advised that SEALE was scheduled to speak at 7:00 P.M. on November 15, 1971, in the Emery Health and Fine Arts Building. This source stated SEALE's speech will be open to the public and no admission will be charged. CE T-4 stated St. Augustine's College had agreed to pay SEALE one thousand dollars for his appearance, which money was to come from student activity funds. CE T-4 advised he did not know whether the fee would be paid directly to SEALE or to the BPP.
