Based on the above, the group's major income appears to be sales of newspapers from which they would receive \$875 per week or approximately \$3,500 per month. It is noted that in referenced communication, mention was made of the fact that DCUGLAS PAUL MIRANDA had traveled from Winston-Salem, N. C., to New Haven, Conn., and information has now been received from San Francisco sources that \$200 was sent from national headquarters to MIRANDA on the instructions of DAVID HILLIARD during June which would have covered his travels.

#### B. Foreign Sources

None reported.

#### C. Expenses

One half of the group's newspaper income or \$1,750 would be required by national headquarters. However, observation indicates the group would have the previous week's newspapers on hand at the time their next shipment arrives which would indicate they are not selling all of their newspapers.

Their rent of \$17.50 per week continues along with their electric bill of approximately \$15 per month.



There are no known salaries or skimming by members, it being noted that expenses for full-time members are paid.

He commented about the police department using war type tactics against the Black panthers and during his discussion it was apparent he had a strong grudge against Chief of Police JUSTICE TUCKER. There was considerable discussion about writing an article concerning the fact that even after BOBBY PAY STOVER received his undesirable discharge from the military, he was still harassed by the Winston-Salem Police Department as a deserter. On July 7, 1970, SP 7-16 reported that information concerning the curriculum for the Liberation Schools was furnished to Winston-Salem, North Carolina, where it was reported that there were twenty people at the Liberation School. According to SF T-16, JOAN KELLY is Director of the Liberation School for BPP Headquarters.

LITTLE states that the Mayor of Winston-Salem is a racist pig and should be dead, but he never recommends that anyone shoot anyone else outright.

he his been saying that NEWEY P. NEWTON has advised that one should be very careful not to get the revolutions mixed up as the revolution in Africa is not the same as the revolution in America, as things are different here. LITTLE calls the liaison officials with the police department "Nigger boot lickers" and says they will be dealt with in a revolutionary manner when the revolution starts. This apparently means that they will be shot. Another favorite topic is that they should take control of all black grocers to meet the needs of the people. Recently LITTLE has been talking about the Constitution of the United States, saying that the Constitution was signed by people who had slaves and it is apparent that the Constitution was not written for Negro people. He calls President NIXON "Tricky Dicky" and says he wants to spread United States'imperialism by barbaric action throughout the world. LITTLE states black people should not fight the war in Vietnam but should group together to kill the avaricious beast, meaning the white power structure. 'I







When planning any operation, the pigs' C.M.I. must be taken into consideration in planning tactics. Practice - Practice - Practice -

Practice - Practice - Practice -In order to perform well in your work on all levels it is necessary to practice, the more you practice the better you perform. Don't think just because you read something you can do it. You can memorize a book on how to drive a car but until you get behind a wheel and practice you still can't drive.

The first things to understand before you ever put a round of ammo in a chamber are basic safety rules, 99% of all accidental shootings happen with runs that aren't "loaded" and, or by people that say "I'm sorry, I didn't know it was tonded." Therefore, rule 41 is: the first thing you do when you pick up a weapon is check to see if it is loaded, keep your finger off the trigger and follow the following procedure Point gun away from area where someone could possibly be shot. If it is a revolver swing out the cylinder; if it is a pistol remove the magazine and pull tack the slide. Even after you have unloaded the gyn or see that it is unloaded treat the



The correct sight picture hasically is having the front not too high or too low, not to t the right or to the left, but havinthe target resting on top of the front sight. The sight picture will not always appear perfect, but if the correct sight picture is under-stood practice will bring improve-

The next thing to get down with is trigger squeeze. That's right you squeeze the trigger, you don't pull it or jerk it, contrary to what ever you saw on i.v., trigger squeeze is a process of putting slow steady pressure on the trig-ger waith a shot goes off. If you try to anticipate the shot, you will jer), and mess up your aim

One other thing to watch for is movement of your piece which coines from breathing, which also messes up your aim. One method of breath control is to take a deep breath, let out half of it, held the rest of it then begin your frigger squeeze.

It would be ideal if you could incorporate into your group a vet-eran of the pigs' military cervice. Veterans are of great value and ausistance in helping with the above training also when you are ready to begin practice with live amm-unition. When practicing with live ammo make sure your location is where you won't be hassled by Ngs. Actual combat conditions can be seadly as a training ground. When practicing with live ammo-remember it is valuable. Don't







Fer patches you can use material like flannel, and some types of cotton, any material that does not pavel on is very limy, cut into circles about 2" in diamoter. All of this cleaning material car be purchased in any gun store.

Your revolver should be cleanand dampaess to avoid rusting. M you do not clean your gim immediately after firing it can cause correction of the barrel and eat away at it causing your shooting. to become inaccurate because of holes that can develop from the powder eating away at the metal or rust from a lack of cleaning and damoness.

1. After firing your barrel and chambers in the cylinder have to be scrubbed with your bore brush and solvent every time. Attach brush to rod, dip brush in solvent, and use a brisk movement in and out of barrel and chambers in cylinder, cleaning out all of the particles out by holding barrel up to light to see if it shines inside, and you will be able to see ony particles still holding on.







'A Match for a Hundred''--t nilitant slogan was put forward by the respected and beloved Leader Marshal Kim Il Sung for the officers and men of our People's Army.

On February 6, 1963, two days before the 15th anniversary of the founding of the glorious Korean People's Army, he visited our army unit which has risen to implement the decision of the historic Fifth Plenary Meeting of the Fourth Central Committee of our Party.

"Our People's Army is well prepared politically and ideologically, and it can keep on fighting for ever with this kind of position...

"You should plant more trees round the positions, If you plant many trees they are good for camouflage, and it isn't hot and you feel cool in the summer because they afford shade. How fine it would be! You can also use them as firewood.

"You should think of camouflage first of all when you build a house..."

After referring to every detail which we commanding personnel had not yet thought of and paid little attention to, Marshal Kim Il Sung taught us specific matters of principle with regard to combat organization commensurate to modern warfare.

He was walking slowly while having frank talks with

powder to his guerillas despite his hunger; he looked after his sleeping men at nights of howling storms and covered them with his overcoat. With his infinitely deep love and care, our guerillas fought the enemy undauntedly and won victory.

He went into the education room of the company and checked platoon leader's lecture materials and found out how the sergeant major looked after his soldiers.

Also he appreciated the instrumental ensemble performed by the red-flag companymen, and encouraged them who were helping and pulling each other forward.

Touching the red-flag badge on the breast of a superior private, Marshall Kim Il Sung said as follows:

"... The army is a fine school.

"You should regard your service in the army as school education.

"In the army, you learn military and political affairs, learn a collective and diciplined life as well as general knowledge and how to lead a cultured life. What is most important is to learn the indomitable revolutionary spirit and collectivist spirit.

"How nice it is to help and pull up with each other! Only by doing this well, can your military and moral

traits be cultivated more finely.

"That's why the red-flag company movement is important..."

After having a chat with soldiers at the outpost, the Leader repeatedly asked us commanders to conduct better the Party policy education, education of the revolutionary traditions, class education and education of socialist patriotism among the armymen.

Reminding us of the fact that the younger generation who had never seen landlords and capitalists came to take service in the army, he said that this younger generation was different from those who had waged the anti-Japanese armed struggle in the past or fought against the Yankees during the last war.

"The mere slogan of downing with landlords and capitalists was enough to embue the people of those days with irresistible hostility against the enemy.

"But the present-day young folks don't know what the landlords and capitalists are. So, you must not just shout slogans. "You should bear this in mind,

"You should therefore conduct ideological education well with patience and arm them thoroughly with the revolutionary ideas of the working class.

"For a revolutionary army the foremost prerequisite to victory is to arm itself ideologically."

He continued to say that commanders should train their bodies, enhance their art of command decisively and equip themselves firmly with the new, ever-developing military science and technique.

"Don't think that you needn't learn any more because you have fought since the days of the anti-Japanese guerilla struggle, and don't rest conient, thinking you can beat the enemy hands down, with the fact that you had advanced us far as the Rakdong River area fighting the Yankee bandits. We should make efforts to read more books in order to master new military science and technique.

"You should make a deep study of the enemy's weapons and strategy and tactics too. You can defeat the enemy when you know him.

"If the Yankees attack us again, we should annihilate them once and for all.

"To do so, each of you should be prepared to be a match for a hundred.

"A general who fought well has been called 'a match for a hundred," from olden times. This means a man who is capable of beating a hundred enemies."

"... The solely correct way is to further strengthen the positions with the military personell you have now, conduct military training better and arm all the soldiers firmly with the revolutionary spirit so that each of them may match a hundred.

"The slogan of the People's Army is 'A Malch for a Hundred."

His remarks reminded me of what he had once said during the period of the anti-Japanese armed struggle.

"...The legend says that in olden times men trained themselves in noted mountains to possess fighting spirit and military knowledge so as to become generals. In other words, they would become good generals if they made a profound study of military lech-

nique, sleeping on the snow in the depth of winter to train their physical strength, and living in the unin-habited forest and enduring solitude to steel their fighting spirit.

"This training of the legendary generals is no mys-

tery for us ..."

In those days we anti-Japanese guerillas, as told by him, developed our bodies and minds and improved combat capabilities and technique in far more arduous circumstances than the legendary generals trained themselves, so that we could annihilate and wipe out the Japanese imperialists who were superior in number everywhere.

We anti-Japanese guerillas under the leadership of Marshal Kim II Sung won victory in the struggle against tens and hundreds of times bigger forces of the Japanese imperialist aggression army with small forces in very difficult conditions. This was, indeed, a great revolutionary struggle in which each one of us matched a hundred enemies.

I still remember the following remarks made by Marshal Kim Il Sung to us guerilla commanders at that time.

"... The Japanese imperialists now admit their impotence, raising a howl that they stand no chance against us even with ten Japanese soldiers against a guerilla or ten to one.

"But we must bear in mind clearly that if we lose one man in wiping out 100 enemy troops, this is no victory for us. Because the life of each guerilla is much more precious than 1,000 enemy troops since he has been seasoned in the guerilla struggle for many years and prepared politically and militarily and his sacrifice is an irrevocable loss.

"Therefore... we should always keep in mind that it is the principle of war, particularly the principle of guerilla warfare, to preserve our forces and annihilate large numbers of enemies without the sacrifice of a single man on our side..."

We anti-Japanese guerillas won victory, guided by these words of Marshal Kim Il Sung.

All of us constantly trained ourselves politically, idealogically, in military technique and physically with

Fat one will to a complish the Korean revolution by are own efforts instead of realing on others. We anti-Japanese guerillas could and always deal a hundred times, a thousand times heavier blows at the enemy, taking advantage of the natural fortresses in the northern border areas of Korea around Mt. Backdu and the broader areas of northeast China.

That is why the Japanese imperialists who had made such tenacious and atrocious efforts to "annihilate" the anti-Japanese guerilla units by mobilizing the Kanto Army and massive regular armed forces in Korea, were forced at last to hold up their hands in despair, saying that "The Communist strategy and tactics are really strange. They wage war with 'tactics' which cannot be found in any book on military science. What is most difficult for us is that they resist as with the methods which have nothing in common with the operations conducted by the 'Imperial Army' in accordance with the combat regulations."

The idea of being a match for a hundred was already embodied in those difficult days of the anti-Japanese armed struggle organized and waged under the leadership of Marshal Kim II Sung.

In fact, both in the period of the anti-Japanese armed struggle and in the Fatherland Liberation War under the wise leadership of Marshal Kim II Sung, we annihilated the "strong" enemies who had boasted of their technical superiority, with our ideological and tactical superiority, each of us matching a hundred.

Indeed, the Korean revolutionaries have given fatal blows to the Japanese and U.S. imperialists, enemy No.1 of our people, with the idea of being a match for a hundred ever since the period of the anti-Japanese armed struggle.

But the U.S. imperialists and their stooges doomed to final destruction are resorting to all means and methods to setp up their manoeuvres for aggression and war provocation.

Marshal Kim Il Sung had made a penetrating analysis of the obtaining situation and taken measures for further enhancing our nation's defence capacities, before he gave his one-the-spot guidance to our unit.

After three days' on-the-spot guidance, he gave a

of the founding of the Korean People's Army.

At the banquet, he stressed again that each of army-men should be prepared to be a match for a hundred and asked us to keep building up the People's Army ranks firmly in the spirit of the decision of the Fifth Plenary Meeting of the Forth Central Committee of our Party and on the basis of the successes already made.

"... The people in the rear now build socialism, holding a rifle in one hand and a sickle and hammer in the oter, while intensifying the struggle against indolence.

"When the entire people are put under arms, conducting military training well in this way and the front and the rear are united as one body, the enemy cannot invade us and our socialist construction can be expedited at a higher speed."

The words of Marshal Kim II Sung instilled boundless strength into the minds of our soldiers.

All the armymen were burning with the determination to implement his teachings thoroughly and were overfilled with the conviction that they could become revolutionary fighters, each being a match for a hundred like the anti-Japanese guerillas.

After the Leader's visit, the Party committee of our unit organized and waged a vigorous struggle to prepare all the personnel into revolutionary soldiers each of whom is a match for a hundred.

As he instructed, we studied all problems cautiously and probed into them deeply and made full combat preparations for our whole unit, envisaging complicated and difficult circumstances that might arise in modern warfare, particularly, in the battle to unify the country.

Since the decision was adopted at the Fifth Plenary Meeting of the Fourth Central Committee of our Party and on-the-spot instructions given us by Marshal Kim II Sung, great changes have taken place not only in our People's Army units but in all parts of the country. The wise military line of our Party the main content of which is to train the whole army into a cadre army, modernize it, arm the entire people and turn

the whole land into a fortress has been brilliantly carried through in the energetic and strained struggle of our people and the soldiers of the People's Army.

Particularly, new innovations and great revolutionary upsurge have been brought about in the vigourous struggle to implement the decision of the historic Party Conference which is of great significance in the development of the revolution.

Marshal Kim Il Sung instructed us emphatically at the Party Conference: "...All soldiers must be reared into revolution and the people, and our People's Army should be turned into an invincible army, each member of which is a match for a hundred."

The changes and developments of the present situation show beyond doubt how wise and correct are the Party's line of carrying out economic construction and defence upholding in parallel and the teachings of Marshal Kim. ## What We Want What We Believe

1. We want freedom. We want power to determine the destiny of our Black Community.

We believe that black people will not be free until we are able to determine our destiny.

2. We want full employment for our people.

We believe that the federal government is responsible and obligated to give every man employment or a guaranteed income. We believe that if the white American businessmen will not give full employment, then the means of production should be taken from the businessmen and placed in the community so that the people of the community can organize and employ all of its people and give a high standard of living.

3. We want an end to the robbery by the CAPITALIST of our Black Community.

We believe that this racist government has robbed us and now we are demanding the overdue debt of forty acres and two mules. Forty acres and two mules was promised 100 years ago as restitution for slave labor and mass murder of black people. We will accept the payment in currency which will be distributed to our many communities. The Germans are now aiding the Jews in Israel for the genocide of the Jewish people. The Germans murdered six million Jews. The American racist has taken part in the slaughter of over fifty million black people; therefore, we feel that this is a modest demand that we make.

4. We want decent housing, fit for shelter of human beings.

We believe that if the white landlords will not give decent housing to our black community, then the housing and the land should be made into cooperatives so that our community, with government aid, can build and make decent housing for its people.


5. We want education for our people that exposes the true nature of this decadent American society. We want education that teaches us our true

history and our role in the present-day society.

We believe in an educational system that will give to our people a knowledge of self. If a man does not have knowledge of himself and his position in society and the world, then he has little chance to relate to anything else.

6. We want all black men to be exempt from military service.

We believe that Black people should not be forced to fight in the military service to defend a racist government that does not protect us. We



We believe we can end police brutality in our black community by organizing black self-defense groups that are dedicated to defending our black community from racist police oppression and brutality. The Second Amendment to the Constitution of the United States gives a right to bear arms. We therefore believe that all black people should arm themselves for self-defense.

8. We went freedom for all black men held in federal, state, county and ely prisons and joils.

We believe that all black people should be released from the many jails and prisons because they have not received a fair and impartial trial.

9. We want all black people when brought to tried to be tried in court by a jury of their peer group or people from their black communities, as defined by the Constitution of the United States.


We believe that the courts should follow the United States Constitution so that black people will receive fair trials. The 14th Amendment of the U.S. Constitution gives a man a right to be tried by his peer group. A peer is a person from a similar economic, social, religious, geographical, environmental, historical and racial background. To do this the court will be forced to select a jury from the black community from which the black defendant came. We have been, and are being tried by all-white juries that have no understanding of the "average reasoning man" of the black community.

10. We want land, bread, housing, education, clothing, justice and peace. And as our major political objective, a United Nations-supervised plabiscite to be held throughout the black colony in which only black colonial subjects will be allowed to participate, for the purpose of determining the will of black people as to their national destiny.

When, in the course of human events, it becomes necessary for one people to dissolve the political bands which have connected them with another, and to assume, among the powers of the earth, the separate and equal station to which the laws of nature and nature's God entitle them, a decent respect to the opinions of mankind requires that they should declare the causes which impel them to the separation.

We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal: that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights: that among these are life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness. That, to secure these rights, governments are instituted among men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed: that, whenever any form of government becomes destructive of these ends, it is the right of the people to alter or to abolish it, and to institute a new government, laying its foundation on such principles, and organizing its powers in such form, as to them shall seem most likely to effect their safety and happiness. Prudence, indeed, will dictate that governments long established should not be changed for light and transient causes; and, accordingly, all experience hath shown, that mankind are more disposed to suffer, while evils are sufferable, than to right themselves by abolishing the forms to which they are accustomed. But, when a long train of abuses and usurpations, pursuing invariably the same object, exinces a design to reduce them under absolute despotism, it is their right, it is their duty, to throw off such government, and to provide new guards for their future security.

On Chicago Street in Winston-Salem, a section of Babylon on the East Side of town, are nothing but rat-infested shacks, where Black people have stayed over 10 years. No. 4 of our 10-Point Platform and Program says, "We want decent housing, fit for shelter of human beings."


When we went into the community to talk to people about these housing problems, one lady by the name of Helen said "these houses have never been repaired" since she has been living there. She also said "all they would do was to come by here to collect the rent. When we told the landlords or shimlords our houses needed repairs they would say O.K. and the next week they would be back for more rent, but still no repairs were performed." Most of these houses do not have hot water, or a bathtub. But when the end of the month or week comes the racist slumlord, the low-down racist dog is always there with their hands out for more rent.

These houses are mostly rented by these two racist purks called "Newton Bros." and "L.F. Reeds and Son". These are the two biggest slumlords in Winston-Salem. We are now letting these two pigs know how the people in the community feel about them. The people in the community know that you are slumlords. But they didn't know how to deal with you until they were educated by the N.C.C.F.

The houses need to be taken from the hands of these two pigs and given to the people, because they have stayed there long enough to have payed for these houses. These houses rent for \$8.00 to \$15.00 a week and we know that they are not good enough for that much money. Even the racist, doggish, pig knows this.

Everytime Reynolds gets a raise, the people's rent goes up. The food also goes up. These pigs are all joined hand and hand together all over the world to keep the people oppressed in the Black community. The same slumlord who owns

Black people throughout the world receive the worst of everything. The people are tired of being oppressed, and being forced to live like animals. They understand what the Platform and Program of the Party is all about, and they know that they are being denied what is rightfully theirs. So to all of the fascist, racist, oppressive forces (pigs) of the power structure, the people want you to know that they have put a time-limit on you. And it won't be long before that time

# DRUGS AND THE BLACK COMMUNITY OF WHISTON SALEM

We see, therefore, an influx of drugs being sent into the communities of the poor and oppressed throughout this racist oppressive system, which we have seen is losing a genocidal war in Indechina, and is rupidly increasing its aims and objectives in another 'was, that war being the total genocide of Black people here in America. The community gets uptight, because the junkie lives with us, therefore, he is forced to steal from us. The following incident took place some time ago, but don't other acist nature of it we think it our duty to expose these acts whenever they occur. By gaining a true knowledge of our history, we can determine what course to take,

On December 21, 1959, Mr. Henry Martin Foy was picked up by the pigs, the racist dogs said that he was picked up for delivering whickey in his car, He was charged with violating an old prohibition law. The brother went to court, and was found guilty and the cost of court was \$300. The racist pigs also put him under a good behavior bond, which he had to pay \$10 a week until he paid \$1,000 (4 years), and if he wasn't caught with whiskey in his possession during this time, he would get his money back. But, he had only paid \$640,00, when he got ill and died. In case of his death, his wife and childrest were supposed to receive the money back. As of today June 1970, Mrs. Foy has been unable to get one penny of this stolen meney.

Mrs. Foy has been trying to get the money that those racist does owe her. She went to lawyer Thinhorton, thinking he would helpher, but he came up with some phony crap that he would have to sue the judge. He later told her that he couldn't do it, and turned her over to racist dog Badjet. He also told her the same thing that Thinhorton told her, plus he said that the money would have to be given to support a school.

This shows how these recist pig dags are oppressing, exploiting the people, and robbing the people. Mrs. Foy has six children to support, three of her own and three of her sister's, who is ill. She really needs this meney and racist pigs will not give it to her. She has been waiting for four years, she probably will continue to wait because those racist dogs are nothing but blood-sucking capitalists.


So, brothers, if you go, bring back the knowledge you gained and put it to use for the people.

The sister was crying so, that she could hardly talk. She wanted to get over to the emergency room of the hospital because her stomach was killing her. So a sister and myself rushed ever to her house at 1:00 cm in the morning and drove her to the hospital, only to find three lackeys at the Reg-Istration Giffice ranting and raving. They said that the sister would have to have twelve dollars before she could see the dector on daty. I told the workers that I would deal with all the necessary information needed, but to just let the sibter see the doc-. tor. The lackeys at the desk got angry with me because I demanded some medical attention for the Someone sister. cise recognized Mary Brooks and said "it's abright, bliss Brooks is a nurse here." So I questioned the people in the office, I wanted to . know why they placed money over the value of human life.

They began to run a lot of rhectoric about people should go see their private doctors at the sign of a headache or some other madness. The sister started blowing, trying to get them to see where they were exploiting the people, for the benefit of the greedy administrators. They were so hung up and tripping out, performing as lackeys, that they could not see the real oppressor.

Huey P. Newton teaches us that it is the lumpen that will be in the vanguard of the struggle. We see that this is true because those with a so-called education are simply being programed to function as puppets in this decadent society. And it is clear that they want nothing changed. If you control a nigger's mind, you con-

trol his body. The tookeys have kipinds, so therefore they find disclves being manipulated by the administrators. The hunden still have their minds to some extent, and therefore cannot be used by the oppressor.

BLACK PANTHER PARTY.
Also Known As
Black Panther Party for Self-Defense

According to its official newspaper, the Black Panther Party (BPP) was started during December, 1966, in Oakland, California, to organize black people so they can take control of the life, politics and the destiny of the black community. It was organized by Bobby Seale, BPP Chairman, and Huey P. Newton, BPP Minister of Defense. Newton was sentenced in 1968 to serve 2 to 15 years after being convicted of manslaughter in connection with the killing of an Oakland police officer

The efficial newspaper, "The Black Panther," which further describes itself as the "Black Community News Service," states that the BPF advocates the use of guns and guerrilla tactics in its revolutionary program to end oppression of the black people. Residents of the black community are urged to arm themselves against the police who are consistently referred to in the publication as "pigs" who should be killed

"The Black Panther" issue of September 7, 1968, contains an editorial by BPP Minister of Education, George Mason Murray, which ends with the following:

"Black men. Black people, colored persons of America, revolt everywhere! Arm yourselves. The only culture worth keeping is a revolutionary culture. Change Freedom everywhere. Dynamite! Black Power. Use the gun. Kill the pigs everywhere."

Included in the introduction to an article appearing in the October 5, 1968, edition of "The Black Fanther" is the statement "...we will not dissent from American Government. We will overthrow it."

Issues of "The Black Panther" regularly contain quotations from the writings of Chairman Mao Tse-tung of the People's Republic of China and feature Mao's statement that "political power grows out of the barrel of a gun."

The national headquarters of the BPP is tocated at 3106 Shaftuck Avenue, Berkeley, California Branches have been established at various locations throughout the United States
