During October, 1971, the Black Panther Party (BPP) Chapter at Winston-Salem, N. C., continued to operate principally from their present headquarters at 1333 North Patterson Ave. The residence of RUSSELL and MARY MC DONALD, 1306-A Underwood Ave., is also utilized by BPP leaders. RUSSELL MC DONALD is the distributor of the BPP newspaper in North Carolina, and his wife MARY is very active at BPP Headquarters where she heads the Free Breakfast for Children Program and solicits contributions from the business community. The BPP Headquarters has been without telephone service since members have failed to raise the necessary deposit for the telephone company.

LARRY DONNELL LITTLE, Head of the BPP Chapter is forced to rely on receiving telephone calls at the residence of his mother OCHIE BELL LITTLE, 1326 Oak St., Winston-Salem, N. C.

A. SOURCES OF INCOME

During October, 1971, the group ordered an estimated 10,000 copies of the BPP Newspaper which were delivered via air freight in the name of RUSSELL MC DONALD,

[REDACTED] sources report the group continues to operate on a cash basis and through the use of bank money orders. The BPP Chapter at Winston-Salem, N. C., contacted several black colleges in North Carolina attempting to arrange speaking engagements for BPP Chairman BOBBY SEALE in an effort to raise funds for the BPP. As a result of these efforts, arrangements were made for SEALE to speak at the Winston-Salem State University on 11/14/71, and at Saint Augustine's College, Raleigh, N. C., 11/15/71. The sources report the Winston-Salem Chapter of the BPP expected to receive \$900 from the fees being paid SEALE for his speeches, however, this amount was not confirmed. It is noted that the speaking arrangements for SEALE called for him to receive \$1500 for his appearance at Winston-Salem State University which was to be payable by check, Stronghold Productions Company, and \$1,000 for his speech at Saint Augustine's to be paid by check made payable to Stronghold Productions Company. In addition, LARRY LITTLE received a commitment from the student government officers at the School of Performing Arts, Winston-Salem, N. C., that they would donate \$500 to cover SEALE'S travel expense for the speaking engagement. The BPP Chapter continues to solicit food from local merchants to support the Free Breakfast for Children Program, however, sources continue to report the BPP members themselves have been eating most of the food donated leaving very little if any for the children. ||

wife of RUSSELL MC DONALD. Mrs. MC DONALD is assisted by several neighborhood women volunteers. The Program is in continuous difficulty, however, as the BPP members have been eating most of the food donated for the program leaving very little for the children. BPP members have continued their efforts to raise bond money for the members of the so called "High Point Four" who are being held in jail awaiting trial. On 10/19/71, RUDOLPH JENNINGS, one of the "High Point Four", was released on a property bond signed by THOMAS WHITLEY of Tarboro, N. C. WHITLEY actually signed the property bond on 10/15/71, however, JENNINGS was not released until a proper validation of the value and ownership of the property could be made. MARY MC DONALD led a contingent of BPP members from Winston-Salem to Greensboro, N. C., and contacted Sheriff PAUL GIBSON, Guilford County Sheriff's Office, demanding JENNINGS be immediately released. Sheriff GIBSON declined to do so until the property bond was cleared through the Clerk of Court's Office. MARY MC DONALD thereafter called a press conference accusing local authorities of illegally holding JENNINGS after his bond had been posted. The remaining two members of the "High Point Four" are still in jail and BPP members have been unsuccessful to date in raising sufficient money to bond out the other two. This Group continues to follow their new peaceful image of community service and there has been no confrontation by the BPP and Police during the past month.

who subpoenaed the Forsyth County Sheriff, the Chief of Police of the Winston-Salem Police Department, the Forsyth County Solicitor, and Resident Agent DAVID B. MARTIN as defense witnesses. The three defendants were being tried for charges stemming from the theft of a meat truck in Winston-Salem, N. C., which was found parked in front of what was then BPP Headquarters during January, 1971. When police attempted to search the BPP Headquarters, a shootout ensued resulting in assault and theft charges being filed against the three BPP members. Defense attorneys filed numerous pre-trial motions, including a motion to quash the indictments because the Forsyth County jury list did not contain 18-year olds and did not contain sufficient percentage of blacks. After one full week of hearings, Superior Court Judge JAMES M. LONG ruled in favor of the defense and quashed the indictments against all three defendants. The Superior Court Solicitor for Winston-Salem, N. C., has advised he is filing an appeal of Judge JAMES M. LONG's ruling in view of the numerous problems in reconstituting a jury selection system of Forsyth County.

BPP members have continued their efforts to raise bond money for the remaining three of the "High Point Four" who are still in jail in lieu of bond. They have been unsuccessful to date in raising sufficient money to bond out anyone of the other three.

There was very little activity at BPP Headquarters, Winston-Salem, N. C., during September, 1971, however, the leaders were tied up in pre-trial conferences with their attorneys and their court appearances. It is noted that the BPP members who appeared in the courtroom during the above trial were very well-dressed and well-behaved, apparently in carrying out their new peaceful image. There has been no confrontation by the BPP and police during the past month.

During September, 1971, the Black Panther Party (BPP) Chapter at Winston-Salem, N. C., operated principally from their new headquarters at 1333 North Patterson Avenue. An apartment, located at 1306-A Underwood Ave., the residence of RUSSELL and MARY McDONALD, is also utilized by BPP leaders. RUSSELL McDONALD is the Distributor of the BPP newspaper in North Carolina and his wife, MARY McDONALD, works at BPP headquarters, 1333 North Patterson Ave., where she handles the Free Breakfast for Children Program. The BPP was able to have a telephone installed at the Patterson Avenue address, however, the telephone company refused to hook up the telephone when BPP members failed to make the required deposit with the telephone company. LARRY DONNELL LITTLE, head of the BPP chapter, continues to receive telephone calls at 1306-A Underwood Ave. and at the residence of his mother, OCHIE BELL LITTLE, 1326 Oak St., Winston-Salem, N. C.

A. SOURCES OF INCOME

During September, 1971, the group ordered or received an estimated 10,000 copies of the BPP Newspaper which were delivered via air freight in the name RUSSELL McDONALD, Distribution Manager. RUSSELL McDONALD, however, was engaged in activities at Ayden, N. C., for most of this period and the newspapers were handled by a young new member, DARRELL HOPKINS. Sources report McDONALD's absence caused a backlog of unsold BPP newspapers. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] however, sources report the group continues to operate on a cash basis. LARRY DONNELL LITTLE has been contacting black colleges in the area attempting to arrange speaking engagements for BPP Chairman BOBBY SEALE, in an effort to raise funds for the BPP. The student body government at Winston-Salem State College, a predominantly Negro school, has expressed a willingness to have SEALE appear; however, no agreement has been reached to date and LITTLE has apparently been unsuccessful in getting a commitment from SEALE to speak in North Carolina. The BPP Chapter at Winston-Salem, N. C., has approached white merchants doing business in the black neighborhoods to donate money for the Free Breakfast for Children Program. They have been unsuccessful in obtaining any regular cash donations. However, several of the merchants, including the Merita Bakery which is located in a black neighborhood, have donated food. Sources report that the BPP members themselves have been eating the food leaving very little for the children. Accordingly, approximately eight children are currently being fed under this program.

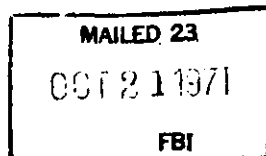

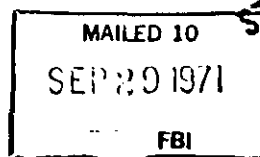

SA Martin appeared at a pretrial hearing on 9/20/71 and was questioned concerning electronic surveillance of the BPP in North Carolina and refused to answer. Hearing postponed until written instructions can be received from the Attorney General regarding electronic surveillance of the BPP. Charlotte Division has advised that none of the evidence pertaining to the State's case was the product or result of electronic surveillance conducted by the FBI and the above letter is being sent to advise the Department in order they may furnish written instructions to SA Martin for presentation in court.

Patterson Ave., where a Free Breakfast for Children Program is being organized for the forthcoming school year. BPP members at Winston-Salem have solicited contributions of paint and other building materials which have been utilized in fixing up their new Patterson Avenue Headquarters. The new headquarters has been painted a bright blue and a large sign has been erected in the front yard identifying this residence as the headquarters of the N. C. Chapter of the BPP. The BPP has also been successful in getting a telephone installed at the Patterson Ave. address; however, LARRY DONNELLY LITTLE, head of the BPP chapter, continues to receive telephone calls at the residence of his mother, OCHIE LITTLE, 1326 Oak Street.

During August, 1971, the group ordered or received an estimated 10,000 copies of the BPP newspaper which were delivered in the name RUSSELL McDONALD, Distribution Manager. This appears to be the major source of income. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] during August, 1971; however, sources report the group continues to operate on a cash basis or through the utilization of money orders. LARRY DONNELL LITTLE announced that the group had been successful in raising approximately \$600 to date in contributions mainly through their efforts to arrange bail for the High Point Four. The High Point Four are four young BPP members who were arrested by the High Point Police Department following a shoot-out wherein one High Point Police Officer was wounded. The BPP was successful in arranging for bond for the youngest member of the High Point Four, LARRY MEDLEY, by posting a \$4,000 cash bond. On 8/27/71, [REDACTED] that he had determined the \$4,000 check used to post bond for MEDLEY was signed by the American Civil Liberties Union Attorney NEIL HIRSCHBURY of Chapel Hill, N. C. This cash bond was received from an anonymous donor with the agreement that the BPP would reimburse the donor following completion of prosecution.

Defendants to be tried concerning charges of theft of meat truck which ended with shoot-out with Winston-Salem police. Testimony desired of SA Martin is unknown since he was only an observer to exchange of gunfire. Assistant U.S. Attorney (AUSA) Cameron stated he would contact U.S. Attorney, Middle District of North Carolina, and consider requiring cause for testimony prior to SA Martin's appearance. Defense attorney in case is believed engaging in delaying tactics and/or attempting to "try the system" and has subpoenaed other local police authorities as witnesses for the defense.

In view of above, Charlotte is being instructed to advise AUSA Cameron that Bureau feels cause for testimony should be required. This action has been coordinated with Office of Legal Counsel.
