NON-BPP COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES

LEE FAYE MACK, self described as advisor to the Winston-Salem, North Carolina, BPP Chapter, is employed as Neighborhood Coordinator in the Planned Variations Section of Winston-Salem, North Carolina, Model Cities Program. MACK was appointed to this position by the mayor of Winston-Salem. The Model Cities Program is Federally funded; however, the exact amount of Federal funds available in the Winston-Salem, N.C., area is unknown at the present time. Mrs. MACK does not hold a decision-making position regarding how funds are spent within the program, and there is no indication at this time of BPP efforts to subvert the activities of the Model Cities Program or to control its funds.

" SPEECHES

The Winston-Salem BPP Chapter sponsored a Survival Day Rally on 12/17/72 at Winston-Salem, North Carolina. LARRY LITTLE, Head of the BPP, spoke to a crowd of approximately 700 persons about the opposition of the black people to the seemingly growing instances when confrontations with police have resulted. LITTLE spoke of oppression and obvious, intentional harassment by the local police agencies. LITTLE stated that the BPP has come a long way from guns to shoes and he expects greater things in the days to come. LITTLE further advised that members of the BPP would be running for local office in the Winston-Salem, N.C., area and urged those assembled to assist in the party's efforts to obtain power for the people.

PART II

The following is a summary of BPP activities in the Charlotte Division:

The Survival Day Rally sponsored by the Winston-Salem BPP held on 12/17/72, was the principal activity of the party during the month of December, 1972. The rally was held at Winston-Salem, N.C., and was attended by approximately 700 persons, a turn out well above the anticipated figure. As a result, the rally was very disorganized. Various items of clothing were given away free, approximately 250 sickle cell anemia shots were given and almost 100 persons were registered to vote. Sources reported how the party gave away almost everything it had at the rally and is now broke again and in dire need of funds. At the conclusion of the rally, a brief slide show was presented by the Panthers during which numerous photographs of the Winston-Salem area comparing the downtown renewal program of a new Federal Building, new city hall, new bank building, etc., against the background of the decaying ghetto. The Panthers attempted to dramatize the point that the ruling class is spending all of the money for the ruling class and nothing for the people who really need help.

As previously indicated, JULIUS WHITE CORNELL, JR., returned to Winston-Salem, N.C., from Oakland, California, sometime during the middle of December, 1972. CORNELL, who has the title of Captain of Defense with the Winston-Salem Panthers, was assisting the BPP in Oakland with the political campaign in that city.

BPP member RANDOLPH JENNINGS remains in North Carolina State Prison, Raleigh, North Carolina, following his conviction on assault charges. JENNINGS is a member of the "High Point 3", three BPP members from High Point, North Carolina, who were convicted on this same charge. The other two Panthers have been released on appeal bond. The Winston-Salem Chapter is continuing in its efforts to raise enough money to cover JENNINGS' bond.

Sources report that the BPP plans to continue its Survival Day Program in the future so a means of winning over the

On December 15, 1972, CE T-1 advised that the Black Conther Party (BPP), Winsten-Salem, Houth Carolina, plans to hold a Contunity Survival Day Impure to be held from 2:00 to 5:00 p.m. at the Houth Elementary Salem! located one block from Black Canther Carby Headquarters, 1333 North Patterson Avenue, Winston-Salem, North Carolina, on December 17, 1972. CE T-1 stated that at the present time there are no planned speakers scheduled for this event and that party members will just circulate within the crowd gathered in homes of uniting the people behind the Black Canther, Carty.

The PDF is a black extremist organization started in Oakland, California, in December, 1965. It advocates the use of guns and guerrilla tactics to bring about the overthrow of the United States Government.

BLACK PANTIER PARTY (BDD) STONSORED SURVIVAL DAY PROGRAM WINSTON-SALEM, NORTH CAROLINA DECEMBER 17, 1972

On December 18, 1972, CE T-1 sivined that the Black Conther Carty coensered Survival Day Tragram was held as scheduled an December 17, 1972, at the North Elementary School in Minston-Salem, North Carolina. CE T-1 stated that the Survival Day Program was held from approximately 3:00 p.m. until 5:30 p.m. CE T-1 stated that there was an estimated crowd of approximately 700 in attendance at this program well above the anticipated number. In view of the large crowd in alterdance, the BDD members were considered disapproximated and illequipped to handle the large crowd.

Of T-I stated that approximately \$2600 worth of merchandise was given away during the Survival Day Program including shoes, pants, pajamas, underwear, coats for children, boots, and other necessary items for the vinter menths about CTT-I stated that there items were alwaying from a discount correlates; however, the exact location is not known at this time.

On December 26, 1972, CE T-1 advised that LEE FAYE MACK is employed as a neighborhood coordinator in the Planned Variations Section of the Winston-Salem, North Carolina, Model Cities Program. Mrs. MACK's position with this program entails handling complaints in the northeast section of Winston-Salem, North Carolina, which section is composed of a population that is approximately 98 percent Negro. Mrs. MACK works at the Citizens Participation Agency Office, 1500 English Street, Winston-Salem, North Carolina; and this office is part of the Model Cities Program. T-1 advised that Mrs. MACK was appointed to this position by the mayor of Winston-Salem and is one of ten such coordinators located within the Model Cities Program in Winston-Salem, North Carolina. T-l advised that the Model Cities Program is federally funded; however, the exact amount of federal funds available for the Winston-Salem area is unknown. Mrs. MACK does not hold a decision-making position regarding how funds are spent within the program; however, she does have influence in regard to the direction of some of the program's activities in Winston-Salem. T-1 stated that Mrs. MACK's position with the Model Cities Program calls for her to do some traveling on behalf of the City of Winston-Salem, and any expenses incurred are paid for by the Model Cities Program.

On December 26, 1972, CE T-2 advised that LEE FAYE MACK is a Negro female, approximately forty years of age, who is self-described as Advisor to the Winston-Salem, North Carolina, Black Panther Party (BPP) chapter.

During 11/72, no information was received other than that the Winston-Salem, N. C., BPP Chapter continues to follow HUEY P. NEWTON.

PART II

The following is a summary of BPP activities in the Charlotte Division:

During the month of 11/72, the Winston-Salem, N. C., BPP Chapter members continued to prepare for the upcoming Survival Day rally, now to be held on 12/10/72 instead of 12/17/72 as previously reported. The rally is to be held in the Happy Hills section of Winston-Salem, a predominantly Negro populated area of town. Sources report that the BPP has received \$1500 in pledges and has on hand \$2600 in cash, to be used for the purchase of clothing and sickle cell anemia shots, which items are to be distributed at the rally. No speakers have been scheduled for the rally, at which, in addition to the items mentioned above, food will be given away free. The Panthers still anticipate distributing 5,000 bags of groceries with a turkey in every bag. No violence is planned for the rally.

The free clothing and free pest control programs continue to function on a very limited basis. The free breakfast for children program is not operational due to a lack of food, and the George Jackson Liberation School has ceased operations.

As previously indicated, JULIUS WHITE CORNELL, JR., remains in Oakland, Calif., helping out with the political campaign in that city. Three other Winston-Salem BPP members also remain in Oakland, Calif., for training.

The BPP has never settled its past due account with the telephone company, and as a result the BPP members utilize a pay telephone which has been installed at the headquarters building.

A. SOURCES OF INCOME

During November, 1972, the party ordered or received an estimated 2,000 copies of the BPP newspaper which were delivered via air freight in the name of RUSSELL MC DONALD. 

Re Charlotte teletype to the Bureau 11/17/72, advising among other things that on 1/12/71, a delivery truck for Chatham Food Co., Siler City, N. C., was reported stolen in Winston-Salem, N. C. The driver reported to Police Officers that he had located the truck parked in front of BPP Headquarters, but when he went to this house he was chased away at gunpoint. When Police arrived to investigate, shots were fired from a window. Officers returned the fire for 45 seconds until the COP ordered a cease fire. A search warrant was then obtained and 20 cases of meat were recovered from the house. Also, a 12 gauge shotgun, two military type rifles, and 150 rounds of ammunition, were confiscated. GRADY FULLER, a BPP member, and a juvenile were arrested at the house. FULLER was charged with larceny and two counts of assault on an officer. On 1/19/71, BPP leaders LARRY DONNELL LITTLE and JULIUS WHITE CORNELL, JR., were arrested and charged with being an accessory after the fact of a felony. In Superior Court on 5/3/71, Attorneys for CORNELL, LITTLE and FULLER filed a motion to quash the Grand Jury indictments, alleging the process of juror selection was unconstitutional.

On 9/27/71, during trial of this case, Superior Court Judge JAMES M. LONG upheld this defense motion challenging the process of jury selection, and quashed the indictments.







PART II

The following is a summary of BPP activities in the Charlotte Division:

During the month of October, 1972, public activities of the Winston-Salem, N. C., BPP Chapter remained, for all practical purposes, nil. The Chapter members are preparing for their next Survival Day Program which is tentatively scheduled for December 17, 1972, at Winston-Salem, N. C. The BPP members are anticipating giving away 5,000 bags of groceries and are planning to advertise a turkey in each bag. In preparation for the December Survival Day Rally, LARRY LITTLE, BPP Chapter leader, has instructed that all members must have full or part time jobs. The reason for this is so that enough money will be available for the December rally. It is reported that even LITTLE has obtained part time employment with a construction firm in Winston-Salem, in order to comply with his instructions.

The free clothing and free pest control programs continue to function on a limited basis. The Free Breakfast for Children Program is not operational; however, reports indicate the George Jackson Liberation School continues to operate sporadically each Saturday afternoon and is attended by approximately eight school age children, who receive free lunches prior to class.

As previously indicated, JULIUS WHITE CORNELL, JR. is in Oakland, California, aiding with the political campaign in that city. Three other Winston-Salem BPP members are also currently in Oakland, California, for training. nature of this training is unknown at the present time.

BPP member RANDOLPH JENNINGS remains in North Carolina State Prison, Raleigh, N. C., following his conviction on assault charges. JENNINGS is a member of the so called "High Point 3", three Black Panther Party members from High Point, N. C., who were convicted on this same charge. The other two BPP members have been released on appeal bond. The Winston-Salem Chapter is continuing in its efforts to raise enough money to cover JENNINGS bond.

 No further information has been received concerning weapons or fortifications by the Winston-Salem BPP Chapter, except that rifles and pistols are stored at Panther Headquarters at 1333 Patterson Avenue, and in several other houses in close proximity to the headquarters building. This information was previously reported in September's Summary Airtel and no further information has been developed concerning the intentions of the chapter members regarding these weapons.

Source reports that the BPP wishes to continue its Survival Day Programs in the future as a means of winning over the black community. LITTLE maintains that for the BPP to be successful, it must have the support of the black community.



I. ORGANIZATIONAL AND OPERATIONAL DATA

The Black Panther Party (BPP) is a black extremist organization started in Oakland, California, in December, 1966. It advocates the use of guns and guerrilla tactics to bring about the overthrow of the United States Government.

A. LOCATION OF NORTH CAROLINA HEADQUARTERS

North Carolina chapter of Black Panther Party (BPP), 1333 North Patterson Avenue, Winston-Salem, North Carolina.

The above headquarters is located in a two story frame house situated in a predominantly black residential neighborhood. The house was purchased under a lease-purchase agreement in the name of HAZEL LEE MACK and LEE FAYE MACK with an initial down payment of \$500 and monthly rent of \$100 per month to be applied to the purchase price of the house at the end of 5 years. The total purchase price for the house was \$8,500.

Source now reports that CORNELL will remain in Oakland until sometime next year. Information previously furnished indicated that CORNELL might return to Winston-Salem, North Carolina, in the near future; however, this does not now appear to be the case.

LARRY LITTLE returned from BPP Headquarters, Oakland, California, on June 6, 1972, and immediately assumed command of the North Carolina BPP chapter. LITTLE spent approximately six months in Oakland for training.

During March, 1972, the BPP chapter was forced to close their location at 400A Loflin Street, High Point, North Carolina, due to lack of funds to pay the back rent. The two or three members residing in High Point were moved to BPP Headquarters in Winston-Salem.

During September, the BPP moved from its opartments at 1306-A Underwood Avenue and 210 East 14th Street, both Winston-Salem, North Carolina. In place of these two apartments, the BPP is now renting two apartments in the name of RUSSELL and MARY McDONALD at 411 14th Street, Winston-Salem, North Carolina, which is one block from BPP Headquarters.

D. COMMUNITY ACTIVITY

1. Free Programs

a. Free breakfast for children program

This program has been operated sporadically since September, 1971, at BPP Headquarters, 1333 North Patterson Street, Winston-Salem, North Carolina. The program is operated under the direction of MARY McDONALD and feeds an average of 8 to 10 children each day when operating. This program is used as a basis for soliciting donations from local merchants and achieving local support from the community. It ceased operation at the close of school May, 1972, and has not started again since.

b. Free pest control program

This program has been in effect since January, 1972 and is administered by GRADY FULLER and RUSSELL McDONALD.

Free clothing program

This program was launched under the direction of BPP member BEATRICE FULTON and scheduled its first distribution of free clothing on March 18, 1972. FULTON and GRADY FULLER have been contacting residents and merchants soliciting donations of new and used clothes. The program functions on a limited basis and clothing is distributed whenever it is obtained.

2. Training Programs

Periodic training sessions and educational classes are held at BPP Headquarters on Wednesday evenings.

These classes are open to prospective members as well as regular members and class discussions are usually directed by one of the officers of the chapter.

A GEORGE JACKSON Liberation School continues to operate each Saturday afternoon and is attended by approximately eight school age children who receive free lunches prior to class.

E. PUBLIC APPEARANCES

1. July 22, 1972, demonstration, Capital grounds, Raleigh, North Carolina.

On July 22, 1972, between 75 and 100 black persons commenced a march from the campus of Shaw University, Raleigh, North Carolina, a predominantly black school. The march began at approximately 10 A.M., and in accordance with their parade permit to demonstrate, the demonstrators marched from Shaw University to the North Carolina State Capitol Building, a distance of five blocks. A speakers platform with a microphone had been previously set up on the capitol grounds for use by the demonstrators. NELSON LEE MALLOY, JR. and Mrs. LEE FAYE MACK, members of the BPP from Winston-Salem, North Carolina, were two of the five speakers who addressed the people in attendance at the demonstration and each talked about the inequities and injustices against black inmates throughout the North Carolina Prison System. They called for the release of all black prisoners and advocated black unity.

2. Community Survival Rally, Winston-Salem, North Carolina, July 30, 1972

The BPP held a rally at the Kimberly Housing Project in Minston-Salem, North Carolina, at approximately 5 PM on July 30, 1972. There were approximately 2,000 people in attendance at the rally and the BPP gave away about 1,000 bags of groceries which had been previously solicited from local merchants. During the course of the rally BPP members gave free sickle cell anemia tests to approximately 800 people and approximately 500 persons were registered to vote.

During the rally it was announced that those persons in attendance could obtain free children's tennis shoes at BPP headquarters, 1333 North Patterson Avenue, Winston-Salem, North Carolina, under the BPP's free clothing program.

HAZEL MAE MACK, an officer of the North Carolina Chapter of the Black Panther Party, acted as emcee for this affair and introduced the following speakers:

- 1. LARRY LITTLE, head of the North Carolina Chapter of the BPP. LITTLE talked about the oppression of black people and called for the unity of all blacks. He spoke of the death of JOSEPH IRWIN WADDELL, a BPP member who recently died in North Carolina Central Prison, Raleigh, North Carolina. LITTLE told the assembled group that the BPP was now a political organization and that he intends to run for an unidentified public office in the future.
- 2. Reverend MOSES SMALL, pastor of a local Baptist Church and a candidate for Winston-Salem City-County School Board. Reverend SMALL compared the BPP's efforts in feeding the poor to that of Jesus feeding the multitudes. He talked about the new image of the BPP and how the BPP was now a political organization.
- 3. Mrs. LEE FAYE MACK, a member of the North Carolina Chapter of the Black Panther Party. Mrs. MACK informed the assembled group that the BPP was no longer a militant group and had great plans to increase their political activity, including BPP members running for various political offices.
- 4. Mrs. RHUDINE COVINGTON, President of the Welfare Rights Organization in Winston-Salem, North Carolina. Mrs. COVINGTON talked about the welfare problems of poor blacks and the inequities in the welfare system. Mrs. COVINGTON praised the BPP for their efforts to help poor black people.

5. CHARLES ZOLLICOFFER who identified himself as a student at Winston-Salem State University, which is a predominantly black university located in Winston-Salem, North Carolina. ZOLLICOFFER talked about the BPP and the need for better education which would help the BPP in solving problems facing black people.

None of the above speakers made any comments regarding confrontations with the police and followed the opening line of LARRY LITTLE about working within the political system. There were no weapons in evidence among the BPP members present and the gathering was very peaceful. The crowd dispersed at approximately 8 PM after the supply of free food had been exhausted.

3. Community Survival Rally, Winston-Salem, North Carolina, August 27, 1972

The BPP held a Community Survival Rally on August 27, 1972, commencing at 5 P.M. and lasting until approximately 8:30 P.M. The party gave away approximately 100 bags of groceries and provided free tests for sickle cell anemia and facilities for voter registration. The rally was attended by approximately 100 to 200 Winston-Salem community residents.

LARRY LITTLE spoke to the area residents urging support of the BPP programs and for revival of the innercity and the needs of the black people to be proud of their black heritage. LITTLE was the only speaker at the August 27, 1972, rally.

F. APPEAL COURT REVERSAL IN TRIAL OF BPP LEADERS AND APPEAL BOND FOR TWO BPP MEMBERS

Superior Court Judge JAMES M. LONG, Forsyth County Superior Court, granted motions of defense attorneys and quashed outstanding indictments against BPP leaders LARRY LITTLE, JULIUS CORNELL and GRADY FULLER. Judge LONG's ruling resulted from defense's claim that jury lists for Forsyth County jury members were improperly drawn as they did not contain either eighteen-year olds or an appropriate percentage of blacks.

Judge LONG's ruling barred scheduled trial of LARRY LITTLE, JULIUS CORNELL, and GRADY FULLER, who had been indicted on charges stemming from the theft of a meat truck and the subsequent shootout with police officers at BPP Headquarters at the time of their arrests. GRADY FULLER was indicted on two counts of assault on police officers and one count of theft of the truck load of meat. LARRY LITTLE and JULIUS CORNELL were each charged with being an accessory after the fact of the meat theft.

On April 17, 1972, Solicitor FRANK J. YEAGER, Winston-Salem, North C rolina, advised that as a result of his appeal the North Carolina Supreme Court reversed Superior Court Judge LONG's ruling and ruled that the North Carolina statutory plan for selection and drawing of jurors is constitutional and provides a jury system free of discrimination. Mr. YEAGER stated barring further appeal, LARRY LITTLE, JULIUS CORNELL and GRADY FULLER would again be scheduled for trial on the previous charges. Mr. YEAGER pointed out, however, he anticipates defense attorneys for the three BPP members will appeal ruling to the United States Supreme Court. New trial date for the three BPP members has not been fixed as yet.

During September, 1972, a second member of the "High Point 3", three members of the BPP from High Point, North Carolina, who were convicted on assault charges, was released on appeal bond from North Carolina State Prison,

Raleigh, North Carolina. LARRY MEDLEY joined BRADFORD LILLEY in obtaining his temporary freedom by posting bond pending appeal of the charges against him. RANDOLPH JENNINGS is the third member who remains in North Carolina State Prison.

G. DEATH OF BPP MEMBER JOSEPH E. WADDELL

On June 19, 1972, Mr.

North Carolina Central Prison, Raleigh, North
Carolina, advised JOSEPH TRWIN WADDELL, Negro male, born
May 27, 1950, Forsyth County, North Carolina, FBI Number
425-683 H, died June 13, 1972 in Central Prison. Dr.
R. PAGE HUDSON, Chief Medical Examiner for the State of
North Carolina, advised that WADDELL apparently died of
severe heart disease. WADDELL's body was moved from
Central Prison to Wake Memorial Hospital in Raleigh, North
Carolina, where an autopsy was performed. Dr. JAMES R.
EDWARDS, M. D., Pathologist, performed an autopsy on
June 14, 1972, and established cause of death in preliminary
findings as severe heart disease.

WADDELL was a member of the North Carolina Chapter of the Black Panther Party for a short time prior to his arrest for armed robbery in High Point, North Carolina. On January 20, 1971, WADDELL was convicted of armed robbery and sentenced to 15-20 years imprisonment. WADDELL was confined to Central Prison, Raleigh, North Carolina, following his conviction.

LARRY LITTLE, head of the Winston-Salem Chapter of the Black Panther Party, attempted to make WADDELL's death an issue in the black community. BPP members claimed WADDELL was in excellent health and that the prison's claim that WADDELL died of a heart attack was very questionable. LARRY LITTLE contacted American Civil Liberties Union attorneys JOSEPH H./TIEGER of Fayetteville, North Carolina, and JERRY/PAUL of Durham, North Carolina, to inquire into this incident with prison authorities. Both TIEGER and PAUL have represented BPP members in the past. LITTLE talked about heading a delegation of BPP members and proceeding to Raleigh, North Carolina, to demand a hearing with the warden of Central Prison regarding the circumstances of WADDELL's death.

LITTLE then attempted to arrange a protest demonstration at North Carolina Central Prison to protest the death of WADDELL. The North Carolina Chapter of the BPP held funeral services for WADDELL in Winston-Salem, North Carolina, on June 21, 1972. LARRY LITTLE was in charge of funeral services and a taped eulogy for WADDELL was delivered by BOBBY SEALE, Chairman of the BPP. Following the funeral LARRY LITTLE announced that the BPP was sponsoring a demonstration at Central Prison on Sunday, June 25, 1972, to focus attention on the death of WADDELL and conditions in the North Carolina prison. LITTLE stated the demonstration would be peaceful. LITTLE also stated GOLDEN/FRINKS, Field Secretary of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference and BENJAMIN/CHAVIS, Assistant Director of the North Carolina - Virginia Committee for Racial Justice would participate in the demonstration. However, both declined LITTLE's invitation and LITTLE abandoned his previous plans to sponsor a protest demonstration at North Corolina Central Prison.

H. BPP FORTIFICATIONS

On June 1, 1972, information was received that there have been no recent incidents or arrests of BPP members for carrying weapons. The BPP Chapter in Winston-Salem no longer maintains an armed guard at BPP Headquarters as they did in the past and there was no information indicating the BPP maintained any sort of weapons or explosive devices in BPP Headquarters.

On June 12, 1972, information was received that 1306-A Underwood Street was periodically used by BPP members, however, it was vacant as of that date. This residence contained no fortifications or protective devices and the BPP maintained no firearms or other weapons at this apartment.

On June 20, 1972, information was received that as of that date, 210 East Fourteenth Street, Winston-Salem, North Carolina, was occupied by a member of the BPP Chapter at Winston-Salem. As of that date this residence contained no fortifications or protective devices.

On June 12 and 26, 1972, information was received that BPP Headquarters located at 1333 North Patterson Avenue, had no fortifications or protective devices at this address. No weapons were observed in BPP Headquarters and no material was observed that could be capable of being utilized to manufacture explosive devices or incendiary devices. A member of the BPP Chapter acts as the Officer of the Day and stays in BPP Headquarters at all times; however, this duty officer is unarmed. Also, there was no indication of any escape tunnels being present in any of the above three locations.

On September 29, 1972, information was received that the BPP presently has some rifles and pistols stored at BPP Headquarters, 1333 North Patterson Avenue, Winston-Salem, North Carolina. Other weapons are stored in houses in close proximity to BPP Headquarters. The intent of BPP is unknown as no discussions have been held regarding any specific assignments which would require the use of weapons.

The BPP recently received correspondence from the National Headquarters at Oakland, California, which instructed the local party to defend the Headquarters at all costs. The local party was admonished for allowing police officers to search the Headquarters last year and directed the locals never to allow this to happen again.

Discussions have recently been held at the BPP Headquarters at Winston-Salem regarding the possibility of instituting a firearms training program; however, there was no indication that this program would be established in the near future as no concrete proposals were made nor was there any indication that additional discussions would be held in this regard.

An unknown member of the BPP is planning to or is in the process of observing the area where the Winston-Salem Resident Agency is located and where the FBI cars are parked. This unknown member of the BPP also wishes to observe the FBI Agents who work at the Winston-Salem Resident Agency. The purpose of this planned observation is unknown.

LARRY LITTLE, leader of the BPP in Winston-Salem, North Carolina, is of the opinion that in order for the party to be successful it must have the support of the black community. A show of force and firepower would not help them improve their image at this time.

I. FINANCES

The principal source of income for the North Carolina BPP chapter is through the sale of the Black Panther weekly newspaper published by the BPP. The chapter receives approximately 4-10,000 copies of the BPP newspaper each month which are sent by air freight from the printer in New York City.

The newspaper sells for 25 cents each and half of the proceeds from newspaper sales is forwarded to BPP Headquarters in Oakland, California.

The BPP also supplements its income by soliciting donations for the various programs as well as for bond money and legal defense money for its various members who have been prosecuted or are awaiting prosecution.

The BPP operates on a cash basis and a cash box is maintained at BPP Headquarters under the control of LARRY LITTLE.

Members of the BPP are unemployed and devote their full time to their BPP activities which includes extensive travel throughout North Carolina selling the BPP newspapers.

LARRY LITTLE, Head of Winston-Salem BPP Chapter, returned from Oakland, California, on June 6, 1972. LITTLE

had been in Oakland since January, 1972 for training. MEMBER OF SUPERT OBGANIZATION

MEND of Three-other Vinston-Salem BPP members are also currently in Oakland, California, aiding in the political campaign. They are HAVEN HENDERSON, BERNARD PATTERSON and WILLIAM McCLAIN.

All BPP members are expected to sell copies of the BPP newspapers and travel to the major cities in North Carolina to sell papers and solicit donations for the various BPP programs.

The Winston-Salem, North Carolina, Black Panther Party (BPP) presently has some rifles and pistols stored at BPP Headquarters, 1333 North Patterson Avenue, Winston-Salem, North Carolina. Other weapons are stored in houses in close proximity to BPP Headquarters. The intent of BPP is unknown as no discussions have been held regarding any specific assignments which would require the use of weapons.

The Black Panther Party (BPP) is a black extremist organization started in Oakland, California, in December, 1966. It advocates the use of guns and guerrilla tactics to bring about the overthrow of the United States Government.

The BPP recently received correspondence from the National Headquarters at Oakland, California, which instructed the local party to defend the Headquarters at all cost. The local party was admonished for allowing police officers to search the H adquarters last year and directed the locals never to allow this to happen again.



The 4,000 copies of the BPP newspaper represent a continuing decrease in the number of BPP newspapers ordered or received by the chapter. Sources report that more than half of these newspapers were sold during the last weekend of 9/72 in various cities throughout the State of North Carolina, with almost twenty different individuals doing the selling. The success achieved during this weekend is attributed to the fact that the BPP paid everyone's expenses.

During 9/72, a second member of the "High Point 3," three members of the BPP from High Point, N. C., who were convicted on assault charges, was released on appeal bond from North Carolina State Prison, Raleigh, N. C. LARRY MEDLEY joined BRADFORD LILLEY in obtaining his temporary freedom by posting bond pending appeal of the charges against him. RANDOLPH JENNINGS is the third member who remains in North Carolina State Prison.

The month of 9/72 saw very little public activity on the part of the Winston-Salem, N. C., BPP Chapter. A Survival Day Program was planned for the weekend of 9/23-24/72, but this program did not materialize. Insufficient funds was the reason for the program not being held. However, sources report that the BPP is planning another Survival Day Program for some time during the middle of 12/72, possibly 12/17/72, to be held at Winston-Salem, N. C. The Party is anticipating giving away 5,000 bags of groceries and has given consideration to getting ANGELA DAVIS as a speaker for that day, however, it has been determined that the chapter could not afford to pay DAVIS the exorbitant fee she supposedly is asking.

During September, 1972, no information was received other than that the Winston-Salem, North Carolina, BPP Chapter continues to follow HUEY P. NEWTON.

PART II

The following is a summary of BPP activities in the Charlotte Division:

During the month of September, 1972, activities of the Winston-Salem, North Carolina, BPP Chapter were relatively quiet. Another Survival Day Program was planned for the weekend of September 23-24, 1972, at Winston-Salem, but this program did not materialize as the BPP members did not receive the necessary community support to carry through with the program. A general loack of interest in the black community coupled with insufficient donations of food and money were the reasons for the failure of the September Survival Day Program.

The free clothing and free pest control programs still function on a limited basis. The free breakfast for children program is not operational; however, reports indicate the George Jackson Liberation School continues to operate each Saturday afternoon and is attended by approximately eight school age children who receive free lunches prior to class.

Sources report that along with JULIUS WHITE CORNELL, JR., three other BPP members from Winston-Salem, North Carolina, are currently in Oakland, California, to receive training, the nature of which is not known. These three are HAVEN HENDERSON, BERNARD PATTERSON and WILLIAM McCLAIN.

Two members of the "High Point 3", BPP members who were convicted of assault with a deadly weapon and intent to kill in High Point, North Carolina, remain in North Carolina

State Prison unable to raise their appeal bonds. The third Panther, BRADFORD LILLY, was released during August, 1972, pending appeal of the charges.

It should be noted that advised on that the BPP presently has some rifles and pistols stored at BPP Headquarters, 1333 N. Patterson Avenue, Winston-Salem, N. C. Other weapons are stored in houses in close proximity to BPP Headquarters. The intent of BPP is unknown as no discussions have been held regarding any specific assignments which would require the use of weapons.

Source further advised that the BPP recently received correspondence from the National Headquarters at Oakland, California, which instructed the local party to defend the Headquarters at all costs. The local party was admonished for allowing police officers to search the Headquarters last year and directed the locals never to allow this to happen again.

Discussions have recently been held at the BPP Headquarters at Winston-Salem regarding the possibility of instituting a firearms training program; however, there was no indication that this program would be established in the near future as no concrete proposals were made nor was there any indication that additional discussions would be held in this regard.

An unknown member of the BPP is planning to or is in the process of observing the area where the Winston-Salem Resident Agency is located and where the FBI cars are parked. This unknown member of the BPP also wishes to observe the FBI Agents who work at the Winston-Salem Resident Agency. The purpose of this planned observation is unknown.
