during August, 1972; however, sources report the group continues to operate on a cash basis and through the use of bank money orders.

The 5,000 copies of the BPP newspaper represents a significant decrease in the number of BPP newspapers ordered or received by the BPP Chapter. Sources report that this decrease is due to the difficulties the Panthers are having in selling their newspaper throughout the State of North Carolina.

During August, 1972, the BPP Chapter continued efforts to raise an appeal bond for two of three BPP members from High Point, N. C., who were convicted on assault charges and who are currently confined in North Carolina State Prison. BRADFORD LILLY, the third member of the "High Point Three" is released from North Carolina State Prison on appeal bond; however, his bond money was raised principally through the efforts of his brother, GARY LILLY, also a BPP member, who operated independently of the BPP Chapter in order to secure his brother's release.

During August, 1972, the BPP Chapter's efforts were directed towards soliciting food for a Survival Day Rally which was held on 8/27/72, on the corner of Oak and 10½ Streets, Winston-Salem, N. C., one of the poorest neighborhoods in Winston-Salem. Through personal and telephonic contact with local merchants, BPP members assembled 100 bags of groceries which were given away at the 8/27/72, rally. They also gave free sickle-cell anemia tests and encouraged voter registration at the rally. Although this number of bags of groceries is substantially fewer than the approximately 1,000 bags of groceries and several hundred pairs of children's tennis shoes, which

were given away at the 7/30/72, rally, the BPP members continue to speak about similar rallys for the future in the Winston-Salem area, with a weekend during the latter part of September, 1972, mentioned as a likely date for the next such rally.

C. EXPENSES

Half the price of the newspapers of \$312.50 would be owed to the California Headquarters of the BPP in addition to an estimated \$20 per week air freight charge. The BPP Headquarters at 1333 N. Patterson Ave. is being purchased under a lease-purchase agreement with a mortgage rental of \$100 per month to be applied toward the purchase of the house.

D. OPERATIONS

LARRY DONNELL LITTLE remains in charge of the BPP Chapter and under his guidance free sickle-cell anemia tests and opportunities for voter registration were provided during the "Survival Day Programs". At this time LITTLE appears to be the undisputed head of the BPP Chapter and is apparently utilizing instruction he received at BPP Headquarters in Oakland, California, to organize these Survival Day rallys.

HAZEL MACK and HAVEN HENDERSON continue to handle the finances for the Chapter.

No estimate could be made of unsold newspapers or the personal expenses of the members; however, sources report newspaper sales have decreased significantly as BPP Members are finding it difficult to sell their newspaper on a regular basis. Informants report that during the month of August there was a definite downswing in the financial condition of the BPP Chapter, and this they attribute directly to the lack of success on the part of the BPP members in selling the BPP newspaper. Sources continue to report that the BPP Chapter still has numerous outstanding bills that are unpaid, and it has fallen behind in its mortgage rental payments on their headquarters building at 1333 N. Patterson Ave., Winston-Salem, N. C.

The following is a summary of BPP activities in the Charlotte Division:

During August, 1972, BRADFORD LILLY, one of the "High Point 3" and BPP member, was released from North Carolina State Prison on appeal bond. LILLY and two other BPP members were convicted of assault charges and his bond was arranged by his brother, GARY LILLY, who was operating independently of the BPP Chapter in order to secure his brother's release.

Under the direction of BPP Leader LARRY LITTLE, the Winston-Salem, N. C., BPP Chapter continued its efforts to promote good will throughout the Black Community with another Community Survival Program held August 27, 1972. With a turn out of one to two hundred area residents, it is noted that the rally was considerably smaller than the

July 30, 1972, rally which saw approximately two thousand persons in attendance. This significantly smaller turn out can be at least partly attributable to the late notice given the Black Community by the BPP Chapter.

The August 27, 1972, rally consisted of the distribution of 100 bags of groceries free of charge, testing area residents for sickle cell anemia and providing an opportunity for voter registration. The Survival Program was held at Oak and 10½ Streets, Winston-Salem, N. C., one of the poorest neighborhoods in Winston-Salem, and the former residence of LARRY LITTLE. Funds and groceries for the rally were obtained through donations to the BPP.

The Free Clothing Program is still functioning in a somewhat sporadic manner, as is the Free Pest Control Program. However, the Free Breakfast for Children Program has not as yet resumed operation, although indications were that it would resume at the start of the school term in the fall. The George Jackson Liberation School continues to operate each Saturday afternoon and is attended by approximately eight school age children, who receive free lunches prior to class.

The BPP Chapter continues to promote its image of community service and has avoided any confrontations or displays of violence.

During 7/72, the BPP Chapter continued efforts to raise an appeal bond for the three BPP members from High Point, N. C., who were convicted on assault charges and who are currently confined in the North Carolina State Prison. BPP member GARY LILLY complained that the chapter was not doing enough to arrange bond for his brother, BRADFORD LILLY, one of the "High Point 3." GARY LILLY has been operating independently of the chapter in an effort to raise an appeal bond for his brother.

During 7/72, the BPP Chapter concentrated its efforts in soliciting food for a Survival Day Rally which was held on 7/30/72 in the parking lot of a predominantly black public housing project in Winston-Salem, N. C. Survival Day Rally was the most ambitious project undertaken by the North Carolina Chapter to date. Through personal and telephonic contact with local merchants, BPP members were able to assemble 1,000 bags of groceries and several hundred pairs of childrens tennis shoes which were given away at the rally on 7/30/72. It is noted that the Black Panther newspaper reported that the North Carolina rally was one of four held throughout the country during 7/72, which were patterned after the original rally sponsored by the BPP earlier in Oakland, Calif. Following this rally, LARRY LITTLE, head of the BPP Chapter, issued a press release stating this rally was the first of many such rallies to be held by the BPP and his group was immediately starting to work on a similar rally to be held in 9/72.

The following is a summary of BPP activities in the Charlotte Division:

Under the renewed leadership of LARRY LITTLE and with the apparent knowledge LITTLE gained during his six month stay in BPP Headquarters in Oakland, California, the Winston-Salem, North Carolina BPP Chapter increased its efforts to promote various so-calk d community survival programs.

The free clothing program, under the direction of MARY MC DONALD, was successful in obtaining a large number of children's tennis shoes which were given away on 7/30/72 in conjunction with the BPP community survival rally.

The free pest control program, under the direction of GRADY FULLER, continues to operate in the black neighborhood and residents are encouraged to sign up at BPP headquarters to avail themselves of this program. A GEORGE JACKSON Liberation School was inaugurated for school age children to be held at 2:00 p.m. on each Saturday. Approximately eight to ten school age children have been attending this school with the inducement of receiving a free lunch prior to each class.

During the month of July, 1972, the entire BPP chapter concentrated its efforts in arranging for a community survival rally which was held on 7/30/72. This rally, under the personal direction of LARRY LITTLE, was an on-again, off-again affair until the last minute, when several local supermarkets donated sufficient food for the BPP to give away bags of groceries. As set forth above, the rally was held at the predominantly black public housing project in Winston-Salem, North Carolina, at which time approximately 1,000 bags of groceries were given away, free sickle cell anemia tests given to approximately 800 people, and approximately 500 people were registered to vote.

All available BPP members participated in this rally which LARRY LITTLE proclaimed as a huge success in view of the large turnout of people. LITTLE used this rally to announce that he plans to run for political office in the future; however, he did not specify what office he has in mind.

BPP members passed out a brochure which accused North Carolina Central Prison officials of the murder of BPP member JOSEPH WADDELL, who died in Central Prison, Raleigh, North Carolina, on 6/13/72, of a heart attack. This brochure stated that the free bags of groceries given away at the rally on 7/30/72 were in memoriam to JOSEPH WADDELL.

BLACK PANTHER PARTY (BPP) EXTREMIST MATTERS

advised that the Black Panther Party (BPP), Winston-Salem, North Carolina, planned to hold a community survival rally at 4 PM on July 30, 1972 in the parking lot of the Kimberly Housing Project in Winston-Salem, North Carolina. The speakers scheduled for this event were LARRY LITTLE, head of the BPP in North Carolina, as well as BPP members NELSON MALLOY and Mrs. LEE FAYE MACK. Mrs. RHUDINE COVINGTON, President of the Welfare Rights Organization in Winston-Salem, North Carolina, was also scheduled to speak at this rally.

CE T-1 stated that the BPP had announced that 1,000 bags of free groceries as well as free shoes and sickle cell anemia tests would be given at this rally. Voter registration would also take place at the same time.

CE T-1 stated the BPP will give away the free groceries in memory of JOSEPH IRWIN WADDELL. BPP member who died in North Carolina Central Prison, Raleigh, North Carolina, on June 13, 1972.

The BPP is a black extremist organization started in Oakland, California, in December, 1966. It advocates the use of guns and guerrilla tactics to bring about the overthrow of the United States Government.

On CE T-1 advised that the BPP rally at the Kimberly Housing Project in Winston-Salem, North Carolina, was held at approximately 5 PM on July 30, 1972. This source estimated there were approximately 2,000 people in attendance at the rally and the BPP gave away about 1,000 bags of groceries which had been previously solicited from local merchants. During the course of the rally BPP members gave free sickle cell anemia tests to approximately 800 people and approximately 500 persons were registered to vote.

During the rally it was announced that those persons in attendance could obtain free children's tennis shoes at BPP headquarters, 1333 North Patterson Avenue, Winston-Salem, North Carolina, under the BPP's free clothing program.

HAZEL MAE MACK, an officer of the North Carolina Chapter of the Black Panther Party, acted as emcee for this affair and introduced the following speakers:

- 1. LARRY LITTLE, head of the North Carolina Chapter of the BPP. LITTLE talked about the oppression of black people and called for the unity of all blacks. He spoke of the death of JOSEPH IRWIN WADDELL, a BPP member who recently died in North Carolina Central Prison, Raleigh, North Carolina. LITTLE told the assembled group that the BPP was now a political organization and that he intends to run for an unidentified public office in the future.
- 2. Reverend MOSES SMALL, pastor of a local Baptist church and a candidate for Winston-Salem City-County School Board. Reverend SMALL compared the BPP's efforts in feeding the poor to that of JESUS feeding the multitudes. He talked about the new image of the BPP and how the BPP was now a political organization.

- 3. Mrs. LEE FAYE MACK, a member of the North Carolina Chapter of the Black Panther Party. Mrs. MACK informed the assembled group that the BPP was no longer a militant group and had great plans to increase their political activity, including BPP members running for various political offices.
- 4. Mrs. RHUDINE COVINGTON, President of the Welfare Rights Organization in Winston-Salem, North Carolina. Mrs. COVINGTON talked about the welfare problems of poor blacks and the inequities in the welfare system. Mrs. COVINGTON praised the BPP for their efforts to help poor black people.
- 5. CHARLES ZOLLICOFFER who identified himself as a student at Winston-Salem State University, which is a predominantly black university located in Winston-Salem, North Carolina. ZOLLICOFFER talked about the BPP and the need for better education which would help the BPP in solving problems facing black people.
- CE T-1 stated that none of the above speakers made any comments regarding confrontations with the police and followed the opening line of LARRY LITTLE about working within the political system. There were no weapons in evidence among the BPP members present and the gathering was very peaceful. The crowd dispersed at approximately 8 PM after the supply of free food had been exhausted.

On July 31, 1972, CE T-2 advised that he had attended the BPP rally on Sunday, July 30, 1972, at the Kimberly Housing Project. This source stated the people in attendance appeared to be principally interested in the free food being given away and he heard no one voicing any special approval of the BPP or its objectives.

CE T-2 stated that the rally had almost been canceled several days earlier due to lack of support and failure of the BPP to obtain any free food to be given away. Several small businesses made donations, however, which enabled the BPP to assemble approximately 1,000 bags of groceries to be given away.

This source advised that LARRY LITTLE commented that he was very pleased with the Sunday rally and he hoped the BPP in Winston-Salem would be able to hold a similar rally at some future date.

Representatives of the Winston-Salem Police Department, Forsyth County Sheriff's Office, Winston-Salem, North Carolina, and United States Secret Service, Charlotte, North Carolina, were apprised of the above information.



During June, 1972, the BPP chapter continued its efforts to solicit donations in order to raise an appeal bond for the three BPP members from High Point, North Carolina who were convicted on assault charges and who are currently confined in the North Carolina State Prison. The BPP chapter suspended their free breakfast for children program during June, 1972, when schools were closed for the summer. The BPP chapter, however, periodically operates a day care center at BPP headquarters principally for children of BPP members who are fed at headquarters. For this reason, the BPP chapter continues to solicit cash and food donations under the guise of collecting for the free breakfast for children program.

B. FOREIGN SOURCES

None reported.

C. EXPENSES

Half the price of the newspapers of \$£25 would be owed to the California Headquarters of the BPP in addition to an estimated \$20 per week air freight charge. The BPP Headquarters at 1333 North Patterson Avenue is being purchased under a lease-purchase agreement with a mortgage rental of \$100 per month to be applied toward the purchase price of the house. The chapter has also rented an apartment at 210 East Fourteenth Street under the name of RICKIE HOOPER. This apartment is being rented for \$40 per month and telephone service has been obtained for \$9 per month.

PART II

The following is a summary of BPP activities in the Charlotte Division:

The Free Breakfast for Children Program ceased on 6/5/72. However, MARY McDONALD, who heads the program, announced they would resume operation when school starts in the fall.

LARRY LITTLE held a press conference on 6/14/72 and announced that he had attended a number of survival conferences at BPP Headquarters, Oakland, California, during the past six months and had observed the advanced programs for community aid that the BPP is developing. LITTLE stated the North Carolina chapter of the BPP will expand their community survival programs and that beginning soon the BPP chapter would undertake voter registration and conduct tests for sickle cell anemia. LITTLE did not give any specific date for this proposed activity.

JOSEPH E. WADDELL, former member of the High Point group of the BPP, died in Central Prison, Raleigh, N. C., on 6/13/72, of a heart attack. WADDELL was afforded a BPP funeral in Winston-Salem, N. C., on 6/21/72. Services were directed by LARRY LITTLE, head of the BPP chapter; and a taped eulogy by BOBBY SEALE was played at the funeral. LITTLE attempted to organize a protest demonstration at Central Prison, Raleigh, following WADDELL's death and funeral; however, the demonstration never materialized due to lack of support.

The latter two apartments are periodically used by BPP members as residences.

On June 1, 1972.

advised there have been no recent incidents or arrests of BPP members for carrying weapons. He stated the BPP Chapter in Winston-Salem no longer maintains an armed guard at BPP Headquarters as they did in the past and he had no information indicating the BPP maintained any sort of weapons or explosive devices in BPP Headquarters.

On June 12, 1972, CE T-1 advised that 1306-A Underwood Street was periodically used by BPP members, however, it was vacant as of that date. This source stated this residence contained no fortifications or protective devices and the BPP maintained no firearms or other weapons at this apartment.

Dr. R. PAGE HUDSOH, Chief Medical Examiner for the State
of Horth Carolina, advised that WADDELL apparently died
of severe heart disease. WADDELL's body was moved from
Central Prison to Wake Memorial Hospital, in Raleigh, North
Carolina, where an autopsy was performed. Dr. JAMES R.
EDWARDS, M.D., Pathologist, performed an autopsy on
June 14, 1972, and established cause of death in preliminary
findings as severe heart disease.

CE T-1 identified WADDELL as a member of the North Carolina Chapter of the Black Panther Party for a short time prior to his arrest for armed robbery in High Point, North Carolina. On Janua y 20, 1971, WADDELL was convicted of armed robbery and sentenced to 15-20 years imprisonment. WADDELL was confined to Central Prison, Raleigh, North Carolina, following his conviction.

The Black Panther Party (BPP) is a black extremist organization started in Oakland, California, in December, 1966. It advocates the use of guns and guerrilla tactics to bring about the overthrow of the United States Government.

CE T-1 advised on that LARRY LITTLE, head of the Winston-Salem Chapter of the Black Panther Party was attempting to make WADDELL's death an issue in the Black community. This source reported BPP members claim WADDELL was in excellent health and that the prison's claim that WADDELL died of a heart attack was very questionable. LARRY LITTLE contacted American Civil Liberties Union attorneys JOSEPH HXTIEGER of Fayetteville, North Carolina, and JERRY PAUL of Durham, North Carolina, to inquire into this incident with prison authorities. Both TIEGER and PAUL have represented BPP members in the past. CE T-1 reported that LITTLE talked about heading a delegation of BPP members and proceeding to Raleigh, Horth Carolina to demand a hearing with the warden of Central Prison regarding the circumstances of WADDELL's death. This source reported LITTLE had not finalized any plans in this regard as of that date.

, CE T-1 advised that LITTLE was attempting to arrange a protest demonstration at North Caroling Central Prison to protest the death of WADDELL. This source reported the North Carolina Chapter of the BPP held funeral services for MADDELL in Winston-Salem, North Carolina, on June 21, 1972. LARRY LITTLE was in charge of funeral services and a taped eulogy for WADDELL was delivered by BOBBY SEALE, Chairman of the BPP. Following the funeral LARRY LITTLE announced that the BPP was sponsoring a demonstration at Central Prison on Sunday, June 25, 1972, to focus attention on the death of WADDELL and conditions in the North Carolina prison. LITTLE stated the demonstration would be peaceful. LITTLE also stated GOLDEN FRINKS, Field Secretary of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference and BENJAMIN CHAVIS, Assistant Director of the North Carolina - Virginia Committee for Racial Justice would participate in the demonstration. According to CE T-1, however, both declined LITTLE's invitation. This source stated LITTLE had apparently abandoned his previous plans to sponsor a protest demonstration at North Carolina Central Prison.



This source reported BPP members claimed WADDELL was in excellent health and that the prison's claim that WADDELL died of a heart attack was very questionable. LARRY LITTLE contacted American Civil Liberties Union attorneys JOSEPH H. TIEGER of Fayetteville, N. C. and JERRY PAUL of Durham, N. C., to inquire into this incident with prison authorities. Both TIEGER and PAUL have represented BPP members in the past. \P also advised that LARRY LITTLE is talking about heading a delegation of several BPP members and proceeding to Raleigh, N. C. to demand a hearing with the warden of Central Prison regarding the circumstances of WADDELL's death. No plans have been finalized in this regard.

Appropriate authorities at Central Prison, Raleigh, N. C., have been alerted regarding possible contact from BPP members.
