At approximately 3 a.m., August 16, 1969, OTIS
BLACKMON, Negro male, who is the owner and operator of the
Chicken-N-Ribs Drive-In, 1100 Beatties Ford Road, Charlotte,
North Carolina, and his son, OTIS JAMES BALCKMON who works
With his father, noticed JAMES MICHAEL BLACK, Negro male, age
31, and JAMES EDWARD PRATHER, Negro male, age 17, prowling APPROX
around the restaurant delivery truck. OTIS JAMES BLACKMON
ordered them to leave and an argument ensued between PRATHER
and BLACKMON. Conflicting stories were furnished
regarding the argument with BLACKMON stating FRATHER
called him an obscene name. PRATHER stated that BLACKMON choked
him and cut him on the arm with a knife.

PRATHER received treatment for superficial outs on the arm which required no stitches and has asked for an assault charge to be filed against OTIS JAMES BIACKMON.

Approximately one hour after the prior argument, PRATHER and BLACK returned to the restaurant with an additional group of unidentified Negroes. All were dressed in the black

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
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

The September 13, 1969, edition of "The Black Fanther," the official organ of the National Black Fanther Farty, contained an article entitled, "Fanthers, Pigs and Fools," indicating that word had reached Black Panther Party National Headquarters that people posing as Black Panthers are popping up in cities across the nation, including Charlotte, North Carolina. The article continued that groups in Charlotte, who alleged to be Black Panthers, had engaged in shoot-outs and so-called community programs. The article indicated that JAMES MICHAEL BLACK, age 31, alleged himself to be a Black Panther. The article stated that the Black Panther Party would like to inform all the people of Charlotte and the United States that no authorized legitimate representatives, members, branches, or chapters of the Black Panther Party exist in the City of Charlotte, North Carolina. The article advised that these individuals must cease representing themselves as Black Panthers and warned them if they did not cease, they would incur extreme anger from people, which might result in extreme bodily harm.



advised that the Fotential Flack ranths r Farty in Charlotte, North Carolina, has been dissolved by its members and its meeting places closed.

Advised that the Potential Black Panther Farty had been velicitarily dissolved due to numerous arrests of the members of the so-called Potential Black Panther Party by local authorities on various charges, and because of a very eminous article which appeared in the Matienal Black Panther Party newspaper on September 13, 1969.

The September 9, 1969, edition of the Charlotte News, a daily newspaper of general circulation, contained an article entitled "Ex-Panther Hit By Shotgun Blast", which indicated that SUTTON had received back and head wounds from a shotgun blast which had been fired at himself and two others the previous evening. SUTTON identified himself as a former member of the local Black Penther organization, a group that is not officially affiliated with the national California-based Black Lanther Party.


The September 11, 1969, edition of the Charlotte Observer, a daily newspaper of general circulation contained an article entitled "Panther Accused In Shooting", indicating that

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APPENDIX

BLACK PANTHER PARTY, Also Known As Black Panther Party for Self-Defense

According to its official newspaper, the Black Panther Party (BPP) was started during December, 1966, in Oakland, California, to organize black people so they can take control of the life, politics and the destiny of the black community. It was organized by Bobby Seale, BPP Chairman, and Huey P. Newton, BPP Minister of Defense. Newton was sentenced in 1968 to serve 2 to 15 years after being convicted of manslaughter in connection with the killing of an Oakland police officer.

The official prospaper, "The Black Constant of which further describes itself as the "Black Constant of News Service," states that the BPP advocates the use of guns and guerrilla tactics in its resolutionary program to end officession of the black people. Residents of the black community are urged to arm themselves against the police who are consistently referred to in the publication as "pigs" who should be killed.

"The Black Pantner" issue of September 7, 1968, contains an editorial by BPP Minister of Education, George Mason Murray, which ends with the following:

"Black men. Black people, colored persons of America, revolt everywhere! Arm yourselves. The only culture worth keeping is a revolutionary culture. Change. Preedom everywhere. Dynamite: Black Power. Use the gun. Kill the pigs everywhere."

Included in the introduction to an article appearing in the October 5, 1968, edition of "The Black Panther" is the statement "...we will not dissent from American Government. We will overthrow it."

Issues of "The Black Panther" regularly contain quotations from the writings of Chairman Mao Tse-tung of the People's Republic of China and feature Mao's statement that "political power grows cut of the barrel of a gun."

The national headquarters of the BPP is located at 3106 Shattuck Avenue, Berkeley, California. Branches have been established at various locations throughout the United States.


Reason for Being Purged

On February 20, 1969, CE T-l advised, to the best of his knowledge, there were no Black Panther Party (BPP) Members or sympathizers at Winston-Salem State University, however, he advised it was his opinion the subject, who was a Senior at that time, was in contact with people who might be BPP sympathizers from the Greensboro, North Carolina, area.

Since that time a Black Panther styled group has developed in Winston-Salem, however, continuing investigation has developed no indication the subject is a member of this group.

On May 23, 1969, CE T-1 advised the subject would and continued he had developed no further information concerning any militant activities or contacts on the part of the subject.

This memorandum recommends that the Special Agent in Charge (SAC) of our Charlotte Office be authorized to furnish the Assistant United States Attorney (AUSA) in Charlotte, North Carolina, an affidavit stating that the FBI had no electronic surveillances on three members of a Charlotte black extremist group or on two addresses where they resided.

On 5/27/69 George Benjamin Hairston and James Curtis Covington, Jr., and in July, 1969, Michael Grant Laney,

were arrested by agents of the Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms Division (ATFD) of the United States Treasury Department and local authorities. Hairston and Covington were arrested for violation of gun control laws and Laney was arrested for interfering and threatening a Federal officer. AUSA Joseph Cruciani has requested that the SAC of our Charlotte Office furnish an affidavit indicating that the FBI had no, // electronic surveillances on the individuals or two residences involved: Cruciani indicated that he would present the affidavit in court at time of trial which is scheduled for 10/8/69.

In addition to the above-mentioned criminal action, the defense attorney has previously brought a civil suit against the ATFD, local authorities, and the FBI charging harassment of his defendants in violation of their civil rights in connection with the arrests and the subsequent search of one of the defendants' residences. action is still pending. We previously advised the Civil, Internal Security, and Criminal Divisions of the Department that no Agent of the FBI took part in the arrests and subsequent search as charged in the civil action. PREC 51 105-165706-8-6

AUSA Cruciani believes defense action in this case involving electronic surveillance disclosure is strictly a stalling tactic in an effort to further delay the trials. Cruciani stated that the black extremists involved are dangerous and should be tried immediately.

We have been conducting an intensified investigation of the Black Panther Party (BPP) across the country in cooperation with local authorities and other Federal agencies. Although we were not involved in the arrests in this case,

and it is to our benefit and the benefit of the general public to insure that these individuals receive swift justice. We did not have and do not have any electronic surveillances on any of the individuals involved or other members of their black extremist group. A review of the electronic indices discloses that two overhearings on an individual believed to be identical occurred on 9/10/69 and 9/15/69 when an individual by the same name telephonically contacted BPP national headquarters at Berkeley, California, and the San Francisco, California, BPP chapter. Since the AUSA has only requested an affidavit concerning electronic coverage on the three individuals and the two addresses as set forth above, it is felt that the Special Agent in Charge, Charlotte, should furnish an affidavit specifically stating that there was no personal coverage on these three individuals or the two addresses and that at the same time he should orally inform the AUSA regarding the two overhearings.

This memorandum sets forth information regarding Black Panther Party (BPP) activities at military installations. Military authoritie sadvised. BPP is a black extremist group.

Newspaper articles have told of agitation by black troops at several United States military bases including Camp Lejeune, a Marine Corps installation in North Carolina. We previously developed data indicating EPP members from New York City and Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, intended to travel to Fort Dix, New Jersey, to deal with a problem (not further explained) that exists there. Military authorities at Fort Dix, a U. S. Army base, were alerted.

we have received information that "something was going to break out soon" at Camp Lejeune in North Carolina. The meaning of this data is not known. It could mean additional agitational activity is planned at that installation. Charlotte has been instructed to alert authorities at Camp Lejeune and to keep the Bureau advised of developments.

These latest developments indicate increased involvement by the BPP among the military. This is exemplified by the latest issue of the BPP newspaper which states on its first page "Free the GI's" and "Our Fight is not in Vietnam." The newspaper carries several articles which are antidraft, anti-Vietnam war and anti-involvement by blacks in United States Military Service. This campaign by the BPP is in line with one of the points of its platform and program which states "We want all black men to be exempt from the military service."



BLACK PANTHER PARTY

According to its official newspaper, the Black Panther Party (BPP) was started during December, 1966 in Oakland, California, to organize black people so they can take control of the life, politics, and the destiny of the black community. It was organized by BOBBY GEORGE SEALE, BPP Chairman, and HUEY P. NEWTON, BPP Minister of Defense. NEWTON is presently serving a sentence of 2 to 15 years on a conviction of manslaughter in connection with the killing of an Oakland police officer.

The official newspaper, "The Black Panther," which further describes itself as the "Black Community News Service," states that the BPP advocates the use of guns and guerrilla tactics in its revolutionary program to end oppression of the black people. Residents of the black community are urged to arm themselves against the police who are consistently referred to in the publication as "pigs" who should be killed.

"The Black Panther" issue of September 7, 1968, —contains an editorial by BPP Minister of Education, GEORGE MASON MURRAY, which ends with the following:

"Black men. Black people, colored persons of America, revolt everywhere! Arm yourselves. The only culture worth keeping is a revolutionary culture. Change. Freedom everywhere. Dynamite! Black Power. Use the gun. Kill the pigs everywhere."

Included in the introduction to an article appearing in the October 5, 1968, edition of "The Black Panther" is the statement, "...we will not dissent from American Government. We will overthrow it."

Issues of "The Black Panther" regularly contain quotations from the writings of Chairman MAO Tse-tung of the People's Republic of China and feature MAO's statement that "political power grows out of the barrel of a gun."

The national headquarters of the BPP is located at 3106 Shattuck Avenue, Berkeley, California. Branches have been established at various locations throughout the United States.

STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY (SDS)

The Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), as it is known today, came into being at a founding convention held at Port Huron, Michigan, in June, 1962. The SDS is an association of young people on the left and has a current program of protesting the draft, promoting a campaign for youth to develop a conscientious objector status, denouncing United-States intervention in the war in Vietnam, and to "radically transform" the university community, and provide for its complete control by students. Gus Hall, Gameral Secretary, Communist Party, USA, when interviewed by 3. representative of United Press International in Sam Francisco, California, on May 14, 1965, described the SDS as a part of the "responsible left" which the Party has "going for us." At the June, 1965, SDS National Convention, an anti-communist proviso was removed from the SDS constitution. In the October 7, 1966, issue of "New Left Notes," the official publication of SDS, an SDS spokesman stated that there are some communists in SDS and they are welcome. The national headquarters of this organization as of July 24, 1968, was located in Room 206, 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois.

SOUTHERN STUDENT ORGANIZING COMMITTEE (SSOC)

On November 1, 1966, a first source advised that the Southern Student Organizing Committee (SSOC) was formed on the weekend of April 3-5, 1964, to stimulate activity of Southern Student groups in Areas of civil rights, peace, academic freedom, civil liberties, capital punishment, and unemployment. Originally, it was to be a white counterpart of the Student Neaviolent Coordinating Committee (SNCC). It has agreed to work with similar interested groups such as SNCC and Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) and Southern Conference Educational Fund, Inc. (SCEF), SSOC is a fraterial affiliate of the SDS.

Beginning in the Fall of 1966, SSOO became a membership organization and embarked on a campaign to form local chapters on anyarious college campuses throughout the South. SSOO publishes, October through May each year, a publication, "New South Student," which according to the above source has increasingly espoused and defended the pro-Communist and anti-United States position on detested and foreign policy.

On July 2, 1968, a second source advised that SSOC continues to be headquartered at 1703 Portland Avenue, Nashville, Tennessee, and continues to defend and espouse the pro-Communist and anti-United States position with particular emphasis on attacking United States policy in Vietnam and emphasis on attacking the Selective Service System. Source two noted that SSOC Chairman Thomas N. Gardner in the Summer of 1967 traveled to Prague, Czechoslovakia, where he met with representatives of the National Liberation Front (NLF) and the Denceratic Republic of Vietnam (DRV), and that SSOC staff members Bruce Smith and Alan Levin traveled to Cuba in the Summer of 1967 and February, 1968, respectively.

By letter dated April 26, 1968, on SSOC letterhead mailed to the general SSOC membership over the signature of Mike Welch. Executive Secretary of SSOC, it was announced that as a step toward close relations with the Students for a Demogratic Society (SDS) and better communications with the movement nationally, SSOC and SDS have worked out an exchange of the "New South Student" and the "New Left Notes," and that SDS and SSOC were exchanging contact lists of their respective memberships for this exchange.

The May, 1968, issue of "New South Student" indicates that the SSOC mailing address is P. O. Box 6403, Nashville, Tennessee, 37212; Telephone Number 615-291-3537, and the mast-head described the organization as "An association of young concerned Southerners deducated to social change," as taken from the preamble of the SSOC constitution.

SOUTHERN CONFERENCE EDUCATIONAL FUND, INC. (SCEF); "THE SOUTHERN PATRIOT" (SP)

An article in the December, 1967, issue of "The Southern Patriot" (SP) commemorating the twenty-fifth anniversary of the publication with that issue recites the following:

The Southern Conference for Human Welfare (SCHW) was organized in 1938; SP, started in 1942 as the publication of SCHW, was taken over by the Southern Conference Educational Fund, Inc., (SCEF), in the late 1940s when SCHW went out of existence. SCEF, originally the "educational wing" of SCHW, continued as an independent organization. For almost two decades, concern of SCHW and SCEF was with racial segregation and oppression of black people. In 1964, SCEF recognized that the legal back of segregation had been broken and economic and political gains were necessary if Southern life was to change. In the past few years, SCEF has also supported battles for academic freedom and the Southern movement for world peace.

The Southern Conference for Human Welfare (SCHW) was cited as a Communist front by the House Committee on Un-American Activities. House Report 592, June 12, 1947. In the same House report, "The Southern Patriot" was cited as an "organ" of the SCHW.

The September, 1967, issue of the SP refers to SCEF as a "community of Organizers and Writers," stating its work is centered in organizing the poor in Appalachia for political and economic power, helping white people in the Deep South find a common cause with black people, helping local groups organize action for peace and working for abolition of the "House Un-American Activities Committee."

The masthead of SP, in its April, 1969, issue, states "The Southern Conference is dedicated to ending racism, poverty, and other injustices in the South; it opposes war as an instrument of national policy."

Carl and Anne Braden are listed in the mastnead of the April, 1969, issue of SP as Executive Director and Associate Executive Director respectively of SCEF.

A source advised on March 2, 1961, that Claude Lightfoot, a Communist Party functionary, stated at a meeting of the Communist Party in Baltimore, Maryland, on February 25, 1961, that the Communist Party has some indirect influence in SCEF.

A second source, familiar with some phases of Communist Party activity in the New Orleans area, advised on June 3, 1966, that during the time that the SCHW was in existence, members of the Communist Party were members of and worked actively in the SCHW; however, since the formation of the SCEF, Communist Party members have not been encouraged to work in SCEF. The source stated that the SCEF is a progressive, liberal organization because it has gone along with the Communist Party on certain issues, particularly on the racial issue.

A third source advised on May 25, 1965, that George Meyers, a Communist Party functionary, expressed great admiration for Carl and Anne Braden and SCEF, which they head. He said SCEF is the best organization in the South as far as doing effective work is concerned and that they have a better idea of what they are doing, where they are heading, and they influence other organizations for the better.

The second source also advised on June 3, 1966, that many people who are officials and supporters of the SCEF, while liberal in their views, are by no means Communists.

The April, 1969, issue of SP lists the editorial and business offices of SCEF as 3210 West Broadway, Louisville, Kentucky; its office of publication 150 Tenth Avenue, North, Nashville, Tennessee; Eastern offices 799 Broadway, New York, New York; and its Western office 5889 West Pico Boulevard, Los Angeles, California.

APPENDIX

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STUDENT NONVIOLENT COORDINATIFG COMMITTEE SNCC

The Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee (SNCC), headquartered at 360-362 Nelson Street, S. W., Atlanta, Georgia, is a nonmembership organization, which was born out of the sit-in movement that erupted across the South beginning in 1960.

Today SNCC identifies itself as an organization in the revolutionary vanguard. It advocates that to be successful it is necessary to develop a revolutionary ideology and revolutionary program.

According to SNCC, the year 1967 marked a historic milestone in the struggle for the liberation of black people in the United States and the year that revolutionaries throughout the world began to understand more fully the impact of the black movement. SNCC declared that "liberation will come only when there is final destruction of this mad octopus - the capitalistic system of the United States with all its life-sucking tentacles of exploitation and racism that choke the people of Africa, Asia, and Latin America. The realities of black life, together with the recognition instilled in SNCC workers forced its members to further popularize the legitimacy of self-defense and rebellions when oppression became too great."

From May, 1966, until May, 1967, Stokely Carmichael was National Chairman of SNCC. As of July, 1968, Carmichael resided in Washington, D. C., where he was affiliated with SNCC and active as temporary chairman of a black coalition group. In May, 1967, Carmichael was replaced by Hubert Geroid Brown, commonly known as H. Rap Brown, who served until June, 1968.

In June, 1968, at the Staff and Central Committee meeting of SNCC held in Atlanta, Georgia, it was decided to restructure the organization by equalization of responsibility by creating ten deputy or vice chairmanships. The primary purpose for this change is to take law enforcement pressure off any single individual.

STUDENT LIBERATION FRONT



On February 10, 1969, a source advised the Student Liberation Front (SLF) is a New Left organization, which was formed at Duke University, Durham, North Carolina, on December 7, 1968, with most of its more active members being people who were formerly active members in the Southern Student Organizing Committee (SSOC) Chapter at Duke. Student Liberation Front was selected as the name because Southern Student Organizing Committee had proved to be too controversial, and it was believed that a new organization with a new name would be attractive to more people at Duke.

An article in the "Duke Chronicle," student newspaper published at Duke, dated February 14, 1969, quoted MARK GIBSON, an officer of Student Liberation Front, as stating that the two purposes of Student Liberation Front were to "reform the university and to educate the students."

The same source, on February 10, 1969, advised DANA DUKE, General Secretary of Student Liberation Front, stated the final and ultimate goal of Student Liberation Front is "the closing down of Duke University."

On February 14, 1969, the same source advised that in a campus riot following a takeover of a Duke building on February 13, 1969, by black militant students, six members of Student Liberation Front were observed agitating students to resist and confront police on the scene and, in addition, were heard shouting obscenities at the police.

On February 27, 1969, the same source advised Student Liberation Front had a Strategy Committee which, in the event of a confrontation or explosive situation at Duke, would have as its mission the creating of as much havoc as possible, doing as much as possible to polarize the student body, provoke law enforcement officials on the scene, and the violent destruction of Duke University property.

AFRO-AMERICAN SOCIETY DUKE UNIVERSITY DURHAM, NORTH CAROLINA

On July 11, 1968, a source advised the Afro-American Society (AAS) was founded at Duke University, Durham, North Carolina, by black students at the university to promote the study and history of Afro-American culture.

On October 29, 1968, a second source advised that the AAS was chartered as an official Duke University student organization during the spring of 1968, and membership consisted of about 85 black students, mostly undergraduate, constituting about 80 percent of the black student population. The AAS had met with the Duke administration to discuss points of interest relating to the status of black students at Duke University.

On February 13, 1969, a third source advised the AAS during the first week in February had sponsored a black festival at Duke including the appearance of DICK GREGORY and other speakers. On February 13, 1969, approximately 30 representatives of AAS seized the Administration Building of Duke University. They voluntarily abandoned it about 5:55 p.m., February 13, 1969, when a police force was en route to evacuate them. On February 15, 1969, this source reported continued negotiations between the AAS and the university administration concerning disposition of AAS demands, particularly with reference to the establishment of an Afro-American Studies Department.

On March 20, 1969, a fourth source advised 47 student representatives of the AAS on March 19, 1969, pleaded nolo contendere to charges arising from the seizure of the Administration Building February 13, 1969, and were sentenced by a Duke University hearing board to suspension for one year, suspended, and placed on probation for one year.

YOUNG SOCIALIST ALLJANCE (YSA)

The May, 1960 issue of the "Young Socialist" (YS), Page 1. Column 3. disclosed that during April 15-17, 1960, a national organization entitled "The Young Socialist Alliance" (YSA) was established at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. This issue stated that this organization was formed by the nationwide supporter clubs of the publication YS.

The above issue, page 6, set forth the Founding Declaration of the YSA. This declaration stated that the YSA recognizes the Socialist Workers Party (SWP) as the only existing political leadership on class struggle principles, and that the supporters of the YS have come into basic political solidarity with the SWP on the principles of revolutionary socialism.

On March 10, 1967, a source advised that the YSA was formed during 1957, by youth of various left socialist tendencies, particularly members and followers of the SWP. The source further advised that the YSA has recently become more open about admitting that it is the youth group of the SWP and that an SWP representative has publicly stated that the YSA is the SWP's youth group.

The National Headquarters of the YSA are located in Room 532-536, 41 Union Square West, New York City.

On October 31, 1967, a second source advised that at the 22nd National Convention of the SWP held in New York City from October 26, 1967, to October 29, 1967, it was stated that the YSA remained as the main recruiting ground for new SWP members.

The SWP has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

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BLACK STUDENT MOVEMENT UNIVERSITY OF NORTH CAROLINA CHAPEL HILL, NORTH CAROLINA (BSM)

On June 6, 1968, a source advised the Black Student Movement (BSM) on December 7, 1967, was extended tentative recognition as a student organization at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, North Carolina (UNC). According to the BSM application, it had no outside affiliation. The primary purpose of the BSM was promotion of black history and culture. Membership was open to all UNC students.

On April 16, 1968, Chief of Police WILLIAM BLAKE, Chapel Hill, North Carolina, Police Department, advised representatives of ESM advocated violence at a meeting on April 5, 1968, at Chapel Hill, following the assassination of MARTIN LUTHER KING. On April 5, 1968, representatives of BSM disrupted downtown Chapel Hill businesses and tried to incite some of the young local school dropouts. On April 7, 1968, ESM led a march which temporarily blocked downtown Chapel Hill traffic; however, no arrests or incidents resulted.

The October 17, 1968, issue of the "Daily Tar Heel," UNC student newspaper, reflected the BSM was to sponsor an appearance of ELDRIDGE CLEAVER, Black Panther Party Minister of Information. The October 20, 1968, issue of the "Daily Tar Heel" reflected CLEAVER cancelled his appearance at UNC.

On November 21, 1968, ARTHUR BEAUMONT, Chief of Security, UNC, advised STOKELY CARMICHAEL, Prime Minister of the Black Panther Party, made a public address at UNC November 21, 1968, sponsored by the BSM and then attended a closed meeting of the BSM.

The December 11, 1968, issue of the "Daily Tar Heel" reflected the BSM had made an extensive list of demands on UNC because the university was guilty of denying equal education opportunities to minority groups and was unconcerned and unresponsive to the needs of the black community and the working conditions of the black non-academic employees.

On April 24, 1969, BEAUMONT, supra, advised throughout February, 1969, the BSM had continued pressure on UNC to grant their demands. On February 23, 1969, BSM supported a strike of UNC Food Service employees by joining in the picketing of UNC dining halls. Then on March 4, 1969, BSM representatives participated in a disturbance of the Lenoir Dining Hall resulting in the closing of this facility. They also unofficially took over the adjoining UNC building which was closed for renovation. The Lenoir Hall was reopened March 6, 1969, and ESM along with other groups erratically picketed it until March 13, 1969, when BSM leaders were arrested for the incident March 4, 1969. Also, on March 13, 1969, ESM voluntarily evacuated the adjoining building prior to evacuation by North Carolina State Police. The five BSM leaders arrested were fined in Orange County District Court and placed on probation. Since that time, ESM has been active primarily in trying to organize the janitors at UNC.

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

Black Panther Party activity or other black extremist activity by members of the military is the responsibility of the branch of the armed forces involved; however, both Offices ould maintain the closest contact with military authorities at the above, mentioned installations to develop information regarding agitational activity by black troops which may involve outside influences and support from the Black Panther Party or other extremist groups. In particular, Offices should be alert for travel to military installations of black extremists both from within and without the respective field divisions.



ISRAEL advised that service of the supplemental summons in this matter had been made by the plaintiff's attorney on the attorneys representing the defendants which is a formal legal procedure, and there would be no need to have SA L. DEAN PAARMANN or any other representative of the FBI serve with the supplemental papers.

Mr. ISRAEL noted that the furnishing of copies to parties other than the defendants tattorneys would have been at the direction of the plaintiff's attorney for information.

This material commenced with a message from (PH), a girl who said she was just out of high school (probably Charlotte, N.C.). talked to secretary at the BPP Headquarters in Berkeley, Calif. She said that there were a lot of "dudes" around Charlotte calling themselves Black Panthers. told that there were no BPP chapters south of saitimore and that the only Field Marshal of the Party now was DON COX, who was in New York.

above complaint. told to cut any clippings or news items concerning these persons and to send them to National Headquarters. said that some of these "Panthers" from Winston -Salem had come down to Charlotte and there had been stories about how the two groups, not further described, did not get along. said she canted to get some of the Black Panther newspapers and explained to her how she could secure them from the New York chapter of the BPP.

said her telephone was out of order and she did not give her address to

in New York and told him about the above message and advised that there were "brothers posing as Panthers in Charlotte and Winston-Salem." She also said there had been some reported fighting.

wanted instructions from the Central Committee if he should take some prothers down to N.C. and to deal with this situation so that he could cool things down. No final instructions were given to that this point.

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Changing the subject of the above conversation, reported to that he was supposed to st to stlanta, Ga., to give a speech at the Atlanta Newsreel. It said he would do if they sent him the tickets for transportation.

Changing the subject again, told that some of the brothers from Boston had come down to help. did not elaborate what these brothers were helping on.

Source advised that planned to go to New Haven on this date to give a speech. He gave the telephone number as to his location when he was in Conn. as having getting on the ballot and he complained that he needed help in his work back there.

It was subsequently learned that had been accompanied to Conn. by a girl named contacted Headquarters from New Haven, claiming that he had just heard over the radio that CARL NICHOLS, "the renegade from N.J." was being referred to on the radio as a spokesman of the BPP and further that the BPP was dominated nationwide by the Calif. Fanthers and there was to be a meeting of all the Panthers and from this meeting they would decide the future of the BPP and the future of the BPP in Newark, N.J.

of the BPP in Berkeley by and said that he would probably have BOBBY PISH of Chicago and DON COX get together and have a press conference back east. Said he would advise COX as to what he should do later this date.

Subsequent to the above a woman giving her rame as from Jersey City talked to at BPP Headquarters. She said she had been receiving telephone calls concerning a radio broadcast concerning CARL NICHOLS (see above). told that she had heard that NICHOLS had made an announcement that the

Panthers were controlled from the West Coast and he was going to have a meeting of leaders of all the chapters to return the control to the other people. Said she had been in touch with the situation inasmuch as some of the Panthers from Boston were staving at a local hotel and a woman there (at the hotel ?) was a friend of hers.

said she had been calling in reports daily on this situation to the Harlem Office of the BPP. She also had been able to get a recording of NICHOLS that said all the things that he was doing and gave information as to all the places where he was going. Sagain alluded to her friend at the hotel and how she was getting information from the men who were staying there.

then made an additional remark on a different Subject to the effect that the "people in N.C. related to CHICO." (CHICO NEBLETT was the former Eastern Field Marshal who was recently purged along with many others from the Boston area allegedly for adhering to the side of STOKELY CARMICHAEL in the dispute between CARMICHAEL and the BPP.)

that DON COX would be down to N.J. on 8/7/69. Then complained to the New York office of the BPP that the material that CLARA had been giving to the Harlem office should have been passed on to the National Headquarters.

Copies of this material are furnished to New York and Newark to assist in its investigation of the current problems of the BPP in that area. Copy was sent to New Haven to indicate the presence of DON COX in that Division. Copy sent to Boston because of the allusion to the brothers from Boston visiting the New York area and also because of the allusion to CHICO NEBLETT. Two copies were sent to Charlotte to indicate the identity of and the problems of the BPP in that area.

You should contact the U.S. Attorney and/or the U.S. Marshal at Asheville, North Carolina, to determine why the certified true copy of the supplemental summons was furnished to the Bureau since previous summons in this matter were executed locally to your office. The true copy of this summons is being maintained at the Bureau and if you determine that this true copy must be executed locally, you should immediately notify the Bureau so it can be furnished your office.

NOTE:

An Agent of the Charlotte Division was previously named in a complaint filed at Charlotte, North Carolina, by attorney George S. Daley, who is representing several black militants in the area in a local matter. Attorney Daley previously was informed that no Agent of this Bureau took part in the arrests of his clients and the subsequent search of their residence which he feels was an illegal search. Daley disregarded this explanation and named Special Agent L. Dean Paarmann as acco-defendant in his motion in U.S. District Court to restrain law enforcement officers from harrassing his clients. The Civil Division of the Department has been furnished full facts concerning this matter and the documents set forth under enclosure # 2 in above airtel were furnished to the Department on 9/8/69. Charlotte instructed to ascertain why the U.S. Marshal sent a true copy of the supplemental summons by certified mail directly to the Bureau instead of to the Charlotte Office which had previously been done.
