Referenced Bureau airtel states that "...The Department, in connection with efforts to develop a prosecutive theory against the BPP for the violation of security statutes, has previously requested this Bureau to develop evidence regarding documents of the BPP which urge its revolutionary doctrines and to also develop evidence showing a cohesion or unity between national headquarters of the BPP and its chapters and affiliates.

"Information regarding the shipment of BPP newspapers and other publications falls within the above categories and it is essential that every effort is made to develop full and complete details concerning such shipments. This should include not only the ascertaining of information contained on shipping papers and invoices but; whenever possible through established sources, the confirmation of exactly what is included in the shipment.

"It is anticipated that in the event of prosecution of the BPP, it may be extremely important to be able to conclusively prove that a specific BPP publication containing revolutionary doctrines was in fact shipped by the BPP to various BPP members and/or supporters. Accordingly, it is essential that this Bureau develop evidence of this nature in order to support possible prosecution of the BPP..."

San Francisco does not desire an answer to this communication. Information that is developed concerning instant shipment should be made a matter of record and included in your next BPP report and/or any other appropriate communication.

██████████ and ██████████ discussed the newspaper sales at Winston-Salem, North Carolina. ██████████ said that Winston-Salem had received 1800 the previous week, but had not been able to sell them so they were only asking for 1,000 on the current issue. ██████████ wondered what the problems were and ██████████ said the weather had been bad and when it got cold, the people just did not go out to sell. ██████████ indicated that Winston-Salem did not have any telephone, but if anyone wished to get in touch with the brothers, they should call a place across the street at 919-██████████ and ask for the Party members.

██████████ gave ██████████ a long lecture on how he should not let the weather stop the selling of the newspaper, and ██████████ agreed with everything that ██████████ had to say. ██████████ wanted to know why ██████████ was in New York and ██████████ denied he was there for "discipline" reasons. He declined however to talk about his reasons on the telephone, claiming he had been there for two weeks.

██████████ commented about the selling of newspapers in Winston-Salem and said the brothers had gone to one white campus where they had had good luck selling newspapers and to a black campus where they had poor luck, having been run off by the students every time they tried to sell papers.

██████████ commented that LARRY LITTLE from North Carolina had to go to check out SAM GILLIAM in Atlanta, Georgia and report back to headquarters as to his findings.

The above material is furnished to the offices indicated for their information at this time.

From the tenor of the conversation, it would appear that the individual known as ██████████ was only temporarily in New York and intended to return to Winston-Salem in the future.

REVOLUTIONARY PEOPLE'S CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION

On November 18, 1970, [REDACTED] advised that at Winston-Salem, North Carolina, the members of the Black Panther Party (BPP) group are going out in the streets trying to sign up people to attend the Revolutionary People's Constitutional Convention, and at the present time approximately two hundred fifty people have indicated an interest. The BPP members are advising everyone that all expenses will be paid, however, [REDACTED] has no information that the BPP group had either money or transportation arranged for these individuals.

On November 12, 1970, [REDACTED] reported that on November 9, 1970, a meeting was held at the Student Union at the University of North Carolina (UNC), Chapel Hill, North Carolina. Seventy-five to one hundred people were present with only about twenty to thirty people being black. CLINT PYNE was in charge of the meeting and identified himself as a White Panther Party (WPP) member. PYNE stated that he and JOHN (Last Name Unknown) had been to Cuba within the past year to cut sugar cane. Most of the discussion at this meeting consisted of plans of the students to go to the Revolutionary People's Constitutional Convention to be held in Washington, D. C. It was mentioned that there would possibly be two bus loads from Chapel Hill who would travel to Washington, D. C. In addition, a number of students from

REVOLUTIONARY PEOPLE'S CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION
ORGANIZED BY THE BLACK PANTHER PARTY (BPP)

Paleigh, North Carolina, possibly from Shaw University, will go to the Convention. During the meeting ~~LARRY LITTLE~~, of the Winston-Salem BPP group, mentioned that the Convention is supposed to be held at Howard University, Washington, D. C., however, the university administration has not definitely given permission.

On November 19, 1970, [REDACTED] Chapel Hill, advised that he had observed CLINT PYNE at the meeting at UNC, Chapel Hill, on the night of November 9, 1970, and on November 20, 1970, advised that he observed forty to fifty "hippie types" meeting at one corner of Memorial Hall under the leadership of ~~JOHN WHEELER~~. PYNE was present, however, WHEELER was furnishing the group information about the Revolutionary People's Constitutional Convention such as, where to stay, arrangements for food, transportation, and so forth.

Characterizations of PPP and Venceremos Brigade are attached as appendices to this memorandum.

BLACK PANTHER PARTY (BPP),
also known as
Black Panther Party for Self-Defense

According to the official newspaper of the BPP, the BPP was started during December 1966 in Oakland, California, to organize black people so they can take control of the life, politics, and the destiny of the black community. It was organized by BOBBY G. SEALE, BPP Chairman, and HUEY P. NEWTON, Minister of Defense, BPP.

The official newspaper, called "The Black Panther," regularly states that the BPP advocates the use of guns and guerrilla tactics in its revolutionary program to end oppression of the black people. Residents of the black community are urged to arm themselves against the police who are consistently referred to as "pigs" who should be killed.

The newspaper, in its issue of September 7, 1968, had an article by the then Minister of Education, GEORGE MURRAY. This article ended with the following:

"Black men. Black people, colored persons of America, revolt everywhere! Arm yourselves. The only culture worth keeping is revolutionary culture. Change. Freedom everywhere. Dynamite! Black power. Use the gun. Kill the pigs everywhere."

The BPP newspaper, issue of October 5, 1968, had an article introduced with the following statement: "We will not dissent from American government. We will overthrow it."

DAVID HILLIARD, Chief of Staff, BPP, in a speech at the San Francisco Polo Field on November 15, 1969, said "We will kill Richard Nixon."

DAVID HILLIARD, in the "New York Times," issue of December 13, 1969, was quoted as follows: "We advocate the very direct overthrow of the government by way of force and violence."

In the issue of April 25, 1970, the BPP newspaper had an article by Minister of Culture EMORY DOUGLAS as follows:

"The only way to make this racist US government administer justice to the people it is oppressing, is...by taking up arms against this government, killing the officials, until the reactionary forces...are dead, and those that are left turn their weapons on their superiors, thereby passing revolutionary judgement against the number one enemy of all mankind, the racist U.S. government."

The BPP Headquarters is located at 1046 Peralta Street, Oakland, California. Branches of the BPP, and Committees to Combat Fascism, under control of the BPP, have been established in various locations in the USA.

VENCEREMOS BRIGADE

The Venceremos Brigade (VB) has been publicly described as a group of American volunteers traveling to Cuba, at the invitation of the Cuban Government, to assist in the harvesting of sugar cane.

The VB, organized in June, 1969, by a coalition of the New Left in open defiance of the United States Department of State ban on travel to Cuba, has already sponsored two contingents to Cuba. One group of over 200 Americans traveled to Cuba via Mexico in November - December, 1969, for a stay of almost two months. The second group of over 500 Americans departed by Cuban vessel at St. John's, New Brunswick, Canada, on February 13, 1970, and returned on April 28, 1970.

Venceremos translated means "we will win," a slogan of the late Che Guevara, Cuban revolutionary leader.



Articles datelined North Carolina continue to appear in the paper and according to [REDACTED] EDWARD MC QUEEN of the Winston-Salem group has been sent to Lumberton, N. C., to organize support for the Revolutionary Peoples Constitutional Convention. In this regard on 10/29/70 at a meeting of the Urban Redevelopment Commission a group of Negroes claiming to be Panthers disrupted the meeting and later gunfire was directed at the building housing the Urban Redevelopment Commission. Shortly thereafter three Negro males were seized, one of whom was carrying a 30-30 caliber rifle.

In connection with individuals purged or expelled from the BPP within the Charlotte Division, it is noted that in the 7/4/70 issue of the Black Panther Party newspaper five individuals were named in an article captioned "Purge Winston-Salem, N. Carolina." This article refers to the reduction to community worker status of the part-time members of the Winston-Salem National Committee to Combat Fascism (NCCF) and the refusal of the individuals affected to accept the reduction, identifying them as ROBERT GREER, JESSE STITT, FAYE SWITZER, JACKIE PEOPLES, and DAVID BLAIR.

Additional investigation is being conducted pursuant to Bureau instructions in referenced airtel.

No underground "cells" or BPP members have been identified; and there is no information that the group in North Carolina is furnishing funds to other underground units,

**I. REVOLUTIONARY PROGRAM AND POLICIES AS
EXPRESSED BY BLACK PANTHER PARTY LEADERS**

[REDACTED] reported that four people, [REDACTED], left Winston-Salem, North Carolina, on Monday, October 19, 1970, in a 1965 Chevrolet, bearing 1970 [REDACTED] traveling to High Point, Chapel Hill, Fayetteville and Charlotte, North Carolina, returning to Winston-Salem, North Carolina, on October 22, 1970. The reason for the trip was to gain support for the Revolutionary Peoples Constitutional Convention (RPCC). During their travels, they visited the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and Johnson C. Smith University at Charlotte, North Carolina. According to [REDACTED] these individuals indicated that permanent information centers were set up in the Fayetteville-Lumberton, North Carolina, area to support the convention.

[REDACTED] Charlotte, North Carolina, advised that around 6 P.M. in the evenings of October 20 and 21, 1970, a 1965 Chevrolet bearing North Carolina License [REDACTED] registered to [REDACTED] Winston-Salem, North Carolina, occupied by six Negroes, was observed at the University of North Carolina, Charlotte campus where they attempted to sell Black Panther Party newspapers.

[REDACTED] indicated that [REDACTED] is a relative of SAMMY BANGER, a member of the Winston-Salem NCCF, and BANGER was apparently operating her automobile.

[REDACTED] reported that three or four individuals from Raleigh, North Carolina, including two from Shaw University, were to travel to Winston-Salem, North Carolina, and join a larger group who plan to travel to Washington, D. C. The reason for this trip is to attend meetings finalizing the plans for the RPCC.

[REDACTED] advised that the Winston-Salem NCCF is now considering the rental of buses for travel





"The Daily Tar Heel," a student newspaper of the University of North Carolina (UNC) at Chapel Hill, North Carolina, in its issue of November 8, 1970, contained an article under the caption, "Revolutionaries Meet Monday," which article sets forth that an organizational meeting to interest students and Chapel Hill residents in attending the RPCC will be held at 9 P.M., Monday in Room 202 of the Carolina Union. The article states the meeting is sponsored by the Radical Coalition which is composed of the New University Conference, Students for a Democratic Society and the Young Socialist Alliance, with the meeting called by JOHN WHEELER, former graduate student of UNC.

[REDACTED] advised that at Winston-Salem, North Carolina, the members of the Black Panther Party group are going out in the streets trying to sign up people to attend the RPCC, and at the present time approximately 250 people have indicated an interest. The BPP members are advising everyone that all expenses will be paid, however, [REDACTED] had no information that the BPP group had either money or transportation arranged for these individuals.

On November 12, 1970, [REDACTED] reported that on November 9, 1970, a meeting was held at the Student Union at UNC, Chapel Hill, North Carolina. Seventy-five to 100 people were present with only about 20 in attendance being black. CLINT PYNE was in charge of the meeting and identified himself as a White Panther Party (WPP) member. PYNE stated that he and JOHN (LAST NAME UNKNOWN) had been to Cuba within the past year to cut sugar cane. Most of the discussion at this meeting consisted of plans of the students to go to the RPCC to be held in Washington, D. C. It was mentioned that there would possibly be two bus loads from Chapel Hill who would travel to Washington, D. C. In addition, a number of students from

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Raleigh, North Carolina, possibly from Shaw University, will go to the Convention. During the meeting LARRY LITTLE, of the Winston-Salem BPP group, mentioned that the Convention is supposed to be held at Howard University, Washington, D. C., however, the University administration has not definitely given permission.

On November 19, 1970, [REDACTED]
[REDACTED] Chapel Hill, North Carolina, advised that he had observed CLINT PYNE at the meeting at UNC, Chapel Hill, North Carolina, on the night of November 9, 1970, and on November 20, 1970, advised that he observed 40 to 50 "hippie types" meeting at one corner of Memorial Hall under the leadership of JOHN WHEELER. PYNE was present, however, WHEELER was furnishing the group information about the RPCC such as, where to stay, arrangements for food, transportation, and so forth.

[REDACTED] there appeared to be 14 or 15 persons who came and went at the headquarters. The sandbagged house is their main office with another place at 14th and Underwood where they keep papers and books.

On October 29, 1970, [REDACTED] advised SA [REDACTED] that at a meeting of the Urban Redevelopment Commission, Lumberton, North Carolina, a group of Negroes claiming to be BPP members broke up a meeting that date and one individual, SAM WILLIAMSON, struck one of the speakers on the nose numerous times with his fingers, telling him he was going to kill all the fascist pigs and was going to chop the speaker's head off. The meeting disbanded at that time and during the early morning hours of October 30, 1970, gun fire was directed at the building housing the Urban Redevelopment Commission, a privately owned house, which fire was returned by two Negro custodians. Shortly thereafter police arrived and 3 Negro males were seized, one of whom was carrying a 30.30 caliber rifle.

The reason for the disturbance was the BPP members were demanding a vacant building be provided for the Breakfast for Children Program.

It is noted that Section V of this report contains a newspaper article which refers to SAM WILLIAMSON mentioned above.

On October 7, 1970, SF T-22 reported that the group at Winston-Salem, North Carolina, ordered 1,500 papers for the next week and were paying for 1,500 paper for the previous week.

[REDACTED] reported that members of the BPP group at Winston-Salem, North Carolina, were to travel to Chapel Hill, North Carolina, area on October 13, 1970, to sell copies of the BPP newspapers. According to [REDACTED] NELSON MALLOY is in charge of the writing of articles for the BPP paper.

On October 13, 1970, [REDACTED] advised [REDACTED] that about once a month, approximately three Negro males sell BPP papers in the 100 block of Franklin Street in Chapel Hill, North Carolina. These individuals are not local, but usually come in for several hours near a weekend, sell their papers and leave.

On October 14, 1970, [REDACTED] reported that on occasion, LARRY LITTLE has been brining a few copies of the BPP paper from Winston-Salem, North Carolina, to Greensboro, North Carolina, to sell on news stands, but no individuals are making an effort to sell the papers

On [REDACTED] reported that on [REDACTED] BPP members from Winston-Salem, North Carolina, sold newspapers at Chapel Hill, North Carolina, and thereafter traveled to Fayetteville, North Carolina.

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


A new constitution is in order because these people, like millions upon millions throughout the United States, are the constant victims of this criminal United States Government. Babylonian ruling class criminals that use an illegal document called the U.S. Constitution to justify their illicit acts against the masses of people within the confines of Babylon. The present constitution states that every citizen has the right to life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness. Yet, as we survey the situation in Lumberton, N.C. we see avaricious businessmen that exploit the people from the stand-point of their labor and on the other end as consumers.

Goodyear Rubber Company, which is a company conceived out of economical exploitation domestically and internationally, has a plant in Lumberton. Burlington Mills, another product of U.S. imperialism also located one of its plants in Lumberton. These two industries of exploitation on an international level continue to reap enormous profits by hooking up with the government, (Industrial-Military Complex), and exploiting the people of Lumberton. The government and these two industries have signed defense contracts. The industries provide rubber foot-

fit for the shelter of human beings. The city is divided by a bridge that runs across a large creek that runs through the city. White people live on one side in good houses, with paved clean streets, and rolling green lawns. In nigger town the streets are made of mud and the houses are nothing more than propped up shanties that have been standing since the days of old slavery. The houses are lo-

move on this problem right away and lets broken sewer lines empty defecation into the Black community. Children in the Black community have to walk three to five miles across busy highways to get to the only available recreation. There are numerous bootleggers throughout the Black community where brothers and sisters go to drink whiskey to attempt to relieve some of the frustrations and pressures of their every day struggle to survive.

The pigs of Lumberton worked no longer than to 2:00 a.m., then all of them go home. They have the niggers in such a state of disillusionment that they don't even find it necessary to maintain all night surveillance on the Black community. The only time niggers run into the pigs is when they have gotten drunk and the pigs come to arrest them. If a brother or sister offers resistance of any kind the pigs immediately send them off to Dorothy Dix, a mental institution for the insane. The pigs do this without even allowing the people a trial, there is no such thing as due process of law. The pigs do this without any pretense, they blatantly violate the supposed constitutional rights of the people

ware, army fatigues, underwear and sandbags among other things for an imperialistic army. Fort Bragg, and Camp Lejeune, two military installations, are close in distance to Lumberton.

Despite their astronomical profits, these two industries see fit to pay their employees a bare minimum wage of \$1.60 an hour, while at the same time pulling in millions. No matter how much the people increase production, they never receive any of the benefits of the fruits of their labor. Little racist farmers also exploit the people that work on their tobacco and cotton plantations. These racist farmers steal land from the people with the aid of state level, bigoted, politicians and pay them little or nothing for their labor.

Housing for Black people is not

that have paths leading up to their back doors through an overgrown field that looks like a jungle. Wood and coal serve as fuel for cook-

ing and keeping warm when the freeze of winter rolls around. The government came into the community about a year ago with a jive urban renewal program (Nigger Removal). They brought a number of dilapidated shacks that still have the toilet on the outside of the house in the backyard. It has been more than a year since these houses were purchased from racist slumlords, but the people continue to live in them because they have no other place to go.

Foul smelling sewage stifles the community as it flows from the White community into the Black community. The city refuses to

One case in particular concerns brother Sam Williamson. Brother Sam was arrested for public drunkenness. The pigs tried to brutalize Sam at the pig pen but Sam resisted to the point that he jammed four pigs pretty good. The pigs, with their warped mentalities, called Sam an insane nigger and sent him to Dorothy Dix for 60 days, without him ever going to trial. At the time of his arrest, Sam was driving a 1969 car. When Brother Sam was finally released from the mental institution after serving his time, the pigs had sold his car and said they knew nothing of the car.

There are some niggers, brothers and sisters, in Lumberton that have said, "enough is enough," we've come to the end of the road; no more can we bear this heavy load. They realize for Black people, especially in Lumberton, that life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness is nonexistent. They realize that instead the masses are plagued by misery, hunger, and the pursuit of fascist dog pigs.

In recognizing their plight these brothers and sisters have vowed to mobilize the people of Lumberton, N.C., and get to the Revolutionary People's Constitutional Convention to write a document that will guarantee all people their human rights and assure them justice and peace from all reactionary elements of this decadent American society.

FASCISM AT CENTRAL HIGH SCHOOL

Malcolm said, "If George Washington didn't get independence for this country nonviolently and if Patrick Henry didn't come up with a nonviolent statement and you taught me to look upon them as patriots and heroes then its time for you to realize that I have studied your books well."

The school faculty at High Point Central High School is very racist. It all started at the beginning of the school year when brothers and sisters were trying to politically educate the students to the fact that they should be able to learn their true history and should be able to choose their own curriculum. They had been opposed in their efforts to get the curriculum they wanted by dog Jerry Shoavers the principal. Larry Medley, one of the brothers, trying to initiate the change was approached and threatened by pig Shoavers, he was told that if he continued to try to politically educate the Black students, he would be thrown out of school. But this did not discourage the brother, because he is strong in his beliefs. After this incident Larry and two other bro-

thers (George Dewitt and William Douglass), went to the office to talk to the principal about the crap that he was handing down. Their rap to the fool about getting Black studies was so strong that the principal called them Black Panthers. After seeing that he couldn't stop them, he moved to kick me out of school on trumped up charges. After the brothers were kicked out, a boot-licking guidance counselor told George that he should go to law school to become a lawyer, because he was a "heavy rapper". After the brothers were told to leave the school grounds, pig Shoavers had the Chief of the Pigs (Prichett) to follow them around like dogs; the excuse for this action was suspicion of them being Black Panthers. How can they be Panthers, when there are no Panthers in High Point?

So pigs, Shoavers and Prichett, harassed and intimidated the students of the school to try to get information on the brothers to see if they really were Black Panthers. One of the brothers who played football, Eugene, was

harassed by Prichett and the brother had to stop playing football. The brother is now planning to leave the school.

Shoaver's true fascist colors showed through once again by intimidating and harassing two sisters. The day before Dora and NeNe were expelled, Shoaver called Dora into his office and questioned her about her political beliefs. They were asked questions such as "Do you believe in the Panthers, What do you have to do bad to become a Panther, Are Larry and George Panthers, Why does your mother let Larry drive her car? etc."

This dog has been intimidating other students in the same manner asking them questions about Larry, George, Dora and NeNe, they are also threatening to put the students out of school if they don't answer. People! How many more students will you let Shoaver put out before you rise up and see justice done? The next person could be you.

PIG RESPONSIBLE FOR DEATH OF 15 YEAR OLD BROTHER

Early Saturday morning about 1:00 a.m. a 15 year old brother, Dan "Snake" Dendy, was fatally wounded by an unknown assailant. An ambulance was called, but didn't arrive until about 1:30 a.m. When the ambulance finally arrived they refused to give the brother medical attention and refused to take him to a hospital. The brother was lying in the ditch breathing very hard which was a clear indication that he was still alive, but still the ambulance attendants refused to remove the brother from the street, let alone give him medical attention. The pigs were first to arrive on the scene, about 10 carloads of the low natured dogs. Instead of their taking brother "Snake" to the hospital or giving him medical attention, they swarmed through the crowd that had gathered asking questions and harassing brothers as they always do.

The people who were around the brother attempted to give the brother some attention, but their attempt was in vain. The foul traducers ordered the people to get back away from the brother. The racist ambulance attendants were simply standing around scratching their thick heads talking to one

another while brother "Snake" was nearing his death.

At the end of this time, which was about two hours, brother "Snake" was no longer breathing. Finally noticing the brother the fascist swine and the racist ambulance attendants went over and covered the brother with a sheet. The people asked them why did they refuse to move the brother until he was dead the pigs blinked as they had before; "We didn't have permission to move him." This is just another clear example for the people. The racist oppressors and their running dogs are waging an all out mass genocide against all poor and oppressed people in particular. All poor and oppressed people have no rights that the exploiting oppressors are bound to acknowledge or respect.

WE FIND THE SLUMLORDS GUILTY OF GENOCIDE

On Thursday afternoon, Nov. 5, 1970, another brother in Winston-Salem died because of the negligence of a slumlord. Ernest Leroy Suber, died from a fire which could have easily been avoided if the slumlord, C.W. Miles, had made the necessary repairs on the house. The house where Brother Suber lived with his wife and 5 children had some faulty wiring and a gas leakage which could have easily been repaired. Because slumlord Miles neglected to make the necessary repairs, the house was hazardous to the occupants.

It is well known throughout the Black community of Winston-Salem that C.W. Miles is a racist and avaricious slumlord who often neglects the needs and demands of his tenants. Brother Suber's family had repeatedly asked pig Miles to repair their home. Each time he

sent some lackey who would always report that the house was in perfect condition and leave. There is concrete evidence that the fire was a gas fire because within two minutes after the fire was spotted there was an explosion and flames erupted everywhere. The house was destroyed, however the pig department says that "they" haven't yet found out why the fire started.

When brother Suber's wife asked slumlord Miles if he could let them stay in one of his other houses until they got themselves together he told them that he didn't have any place for them at all. As a result of the fire Ernest Suber's wife, Barbara, now has no home and 5 fatherless children. Slumlords like Miles should be dealt with because when they deny the people decent housing and a brother dies because of their neglect, they are guilty of

genocide. The fascist pig power structure of Babylon makes things easy for slumlords like Miles because they recognize and endorse this form of genocide. We need laws that will punish slumlords and other pigs for their ill practices on the people. This definitely shows the need for a Revolutionary People's constitution. Poor and oppressed people and Black people in particular have no laws that are relevant to them in today's decadent society.

The people of Winston-Salem and all the people of Babylon find C.W. Miles and other slumlords guilty of genocide and the sentence is..

BLACK PANTHER PARTY (BPP),
also known as
Black Panther Party for Self-Defense

According to the official newspaper of the BPP, the BPP was started during December 1966 in Oakland, California, to organize black people so they can take control of the life politics, and the destiny of the black community. It was organized by BOBBY G. SEALE, BPP Chairman, and HUEY P. NEWTON, Minister of Defense, BPP.

The official newspaper, called "The Black Panther," regularly states that the BPP advocates the use of guns and guerrilla tactics in its revolutionary program to end oppression of the black people. Residents of the black community are urged to arm themselves against the police who are consistently referred to as "pigs" who should be killed.

The newspaper, in its issue of September 7, 1968, had an article by the then Minister of Education, GEORGE MURRAY. This article ended with the following:

"Black men. Black people, colored persons of America, revolt everywhere! Arm yourselves. The only culture worth keeping is revolutionary culture. Change. Freedom everywhere. Dynamite! Black power. Use the gun. Kill the pigs everywhere."

The BPP newspaper, issue of October 5, 1968, had an article introduced with the following statement: "We will not dissent from American government. We will overthrow it."

DAVID HILLIARD, Chief of Staff, BPP, in a speech at the San Francisco Polo Field on November 15, 1969, said "We will kill Richard Nixon."

DAVID HILLIARD, in the "New York Times," issue of December 13, 1969, was quoted as follows: "We advocate the very direct overthrow of the government by way of force and violence."

In the issue of April 25, 1970, the BPP newspaper had an article by Minister of Culture EMORY DOUGLAS as follows:

"The only way to make this racist US government administer justice to the people it is oppressing, is...by taking up arms against this government, killing the officials, until the reactionary forces are dead, and those that are left turn their weapons on their superiors, thereby passing revolutionary judgement against the number one enemy of all mankind, the racist U.S. government."

The BPP Headquarters is located at 1046 Peralta Street, Oakland, California. Branches of the BPP, and Committees to Combat Fascism, under control of the BPP have been established in various locations in the USA.

VENCEREMOS BRIGADE

The Venceremos Brigade (VB) has been publicly described as a group of American volunteers traveling to Cuba, at the invitation of the Cuban Government, to assist in the harvesting of sugar cane.

The VB, organized in June, 1969, by a coalition of the New Left in open defiance of the United States Department of State ban on travel to Cuba, has already sponsored two contingents to Cuba. One group of over 200 Americans traveled to Cuba via Mexico in November - December, 1969, for a stay of almost two months. The second group of over 500 Americans departed by Cuban vessel at St. John's, New Brunswick, Canada, on February 13, 1970, and returned on April 28, 1970.

Venceremos translated means "we will win," a slogan of the late Che Guevara, Cuban revolutionary leader.

The "Daily Tar Heel," student newspaper published at the University of North Carolina (UNC), Chapel Hill, North Carolina, on November 7, 1968, published an article stating that the Young Socialist Alliance (YSA) would hold its first organizational meeting on November 7, 1968, at the University of North Carolina.

On February 20, 1969, a source advised the Young Socialist Alliance National Executive Committee meeting on February 4, 1969, at New York City, approved the creation of a local Young Socialist Alliance at Chapel Hill, North Carolina.

STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

A source has advised that the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), as presently regarded, came into being at a founding convention held June, 1962, at Port Huron, Michigan. From an initial posture of "participatory democracy" the line of the national leadership has revealed a growing Marxist-Leninist adherence which currently calls for the building of a revolutionary youth movement. Concurrently, the program of SDS has evolved from civil rights struggles to an anti-Vietnam War stance to an advocacy of a militant anti-imperialist position. China, Vietnam, and Cuba are regarded as the leaders of worldwide struggles against United States imperialism whereas the Soviet Union is held to be revisionist and also imperialist.

At the June, 1969, SDS National Convention, Progressive Labor Party (PLP) forces in the organization were expelled. As a result, the National Office (NO) group maintained its National Headquarters at 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, and the PLP faction set up headquarters in Cambridge, Massachusetts. This headquarters subsequently moved to Boston. Each group elected its own national officers, which include three national secretaries and a National Interim Committee of eight. Both groups also print their versions of "New Left Notes" which sets forth the line and the program of the particular faction. The NO version of "New Left Notes" was recently printed under the title "The Fire Next Time" to achieve a broader mass appeal.

Two major factions have developed internally within the NO group, namely, the Weatherman or Revolutionary Youth Movement (RYM) I faction, and the RYM II faction. Weatherman is action-oriented upholding Castro's position that the duty of revolutionaries, adventurous, elitist faction which denies the historical role of the working class as the base for revolution. RYM II maintains that revolution, although desired, is not possible under present conditions, hence emphasizes organizing and raising the political consciousness of the working class upon whom they feel successful revolution depends. Although disclaiming control and domination by the Communist Party, USA, leaders in these two factions have in the past proclaimed themselves to be communists and to follow the precepts of a Marxist-Leninist philosophy, along pro-Chinese communist lines.

A second source has advised that the PLP faction which is more commonly known as the Worker Student Alliance is dominated and controlled by members of the PLP, who are required to identify themselves with the Pro-Chinese Marxist-Leninist philosophy of the PLP. They advocate that an alliance between workers and students is vital to the bringing about of a revolution in the United States.

SDS regions and university and college chapters, although operating under the outlines of the SDS National Constitution, are autonomous in nature and free to carry out independent policy reflective of local conditions. Because of this autonomy internal struggles reflecting the major factional interests of SDS have occurred at the chapter level since the beginning of the 1969-70 school year.

A characterization of PLP is attached.

PROGRESSIVE LABOR PARTY (PLP)

"The New York Times" city edition, Tuesday, April 20, 1965, page 27, reported that a new party of "revolutionary socialism" was formally founded on April 18, 1965, under the name of the PLP which has been known as the Progressive Labor Movement.

According to the article, "The Progressive Labor Movement was founded in 1962 by Milton Rosen and Mortimer Schear after they were expelled from the Communist Party of the United States for assertedly following the Chinese Communist line."


A source advised on June 3, 1968, that the PLP held its Second National Convention in New York City, May 31 to June 2, 1968, at which time the PLP reasserted its objective of the establishment of a militant working class movement based on Marxism-Leninism. This is to be accomplished through the Party's over-all revolutionary strategy of raising the consciousness of the people and helping to provide ideological leadership in the working class struggle for state power.





According to the official newspaper of the BPP, the BPP was started during December 1966 in Oakland, California, to organize black people so they can take control of the life, politics, and the destiny of the black community. It was organized by BOBBY G. SEALE, BPP Chairman, and HUEY P. NEWTON, Minister of Defense, BPP.

The official newspaper, called "The Black Panther," regularly states that the BPP advocates the use of guns and guerrilla tactics in its revolutionary program to end oppression of the black people. Residents of the black community are urged to arm themselves against the police who are consistently referred to as "pigs" who should be killed.

The newspaper, in its issue of September 7, 1968, had an article by the then Minister of Education, GEORGE MURRAY. This article ended with the following:

"Black men. Black people, colored persons of America, revolt everywhere! Arm yourselves. The only culture worth keeping is revolutionary culture. Change. Freedom everywhere. Dynamite! Black power. Use the gun. Kill the pigs everywhere."

The BPP newspaper, issue of October 5, 1968, had an article introduced with the following statement: "We will not dissent from American government. We will overthrow it."

DAVID HILLIARD, Chief of Staff, BPP, in a speech at the San Francisco Polo Field on November 15, 1969, said "We will kill Richard Nixon."

DAVID HILLIARD, in the "New York Times," issue of December 13, 1969, was quoted as follows: "We advocate the very direct overthrow of the government by way of force and violence."

On [redacted] reported that [redacted] people [redacted] left Winston-Salem on Friday, October 19, 1970, in a 1965 Chevrolet, bearing 1970 [redacted], traveling to High Point, Chapel Hill, Fayetteville, and Charlotte, North Carolina, returning to Winston-Salem, North Carolina, on October 23, 1970. The reason for the trip was to gain support for the Revolutionary Peoples Constitutional Convention and during their travels, visited the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and Johnson C. Smith University at Charlotte, North Carolina. According to [redacted] these individuals indicated that permanent information centers were set up in the Fayetteville-Lamberton, North Carolina, area to support the Convention.

On [redacted] Charlotte, North Carolina, advised that around 6 PM to the evenings of October 20 and 21, 1970, a 1965 Chevrolet bearing [redacted] registered to [redacted] Winston-Salem, North Carolina, occupied by six Negroes, was observed at the University of North Carolina - Charlotte campus where they attempted to sell Black Panther Party newspapers.

[redacted] indicated [redacted] is a relative of [redacted] a member of the Winston-Salem National Committee to Combat Fascism, and RANGER was apparently operating her automobile.

On [REDACTED] reported that three or four individuals from Raleigh, North Carolina, including two from Shaw University, were to travel to Winston-Salem, North Carolina, and join a larger group who plan to travel to Washington, D. C. The reason for this trip is to attend meetings finalizing the plans for the Revolutionary Peoples Constitutional Convention.

[REDACTED] advised that the Winston-Salem National Committee to Combat Fascism is now considering the rental of buses for travel of their group to attend the Revolutionary Peoples Constitutional Convention; however, the exact plans or the identities of the individuals to attend are unknown [REDACTED]

On November 6, 1970, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] reported there had been no additional information indicating members of the Winston-Salem National Committee to Combat Fascism have been in Charlotte organizing for the Revolutionary Peoples Constitutional Convention.
